

E130 000 hidden in car boot stolen

A 63-year-old man learnt the hard way that hiding money in a spare wheel is definitely not the safest place to keep money.

This is after the money kept in the spare wheel was stolen by unknown people. Information gathered is that the 63-year-old man had kept about E130 000 in the car boot.

Chief Police Information and

SUPERVISOR DEFRAUDS ESWATINI MOBILE E12 000

A 23-year-old former Eswatini Mobile supervisor was arrested for swindling his employer of a sum of E12 036.

Thobeka Kunene of Ngwane Park appeared before Manzini Senior Magistrate Simangele Mbatha on Friday on charges of theft.

Kunene's superior Sibusiso Dumisani Gwebu, who is employed as a Retail Manager by Eswatini Mobile, told the court that Kunene had sent a cash deposit slip via WhatsApp to his supervisor; one Nozipho Kunene.

The deposit slip is said to have reflected that the cash deposit was done on June 5, 2019. However, the account that the money had been deposited into could not be established by the supervisor, hence she called Gwebu to inform him of the anomaly. The supervisor is said to have told Gwebu that she could not verify the authenticity of the slip because the printing on it was faint.

Kunene's supervisor's efforts to find the bank deposit book that Kunene had used also proved futile as it was nowhere in the store. It is said that she was then advised to call Kunene in so that he could show them where he had placed the bank deposit book.

Worth noting is that when Kunene sent the deposit slip, he had already left his job at Eswatini Mobile Experience Centre at Bhunu Mall where he was employed as a supervisor. The basis of him leaving his job could not be ascertained. As part of his duties, Kunene was expected to receive all monies from cashiers, bank it and prepare financial reports. He is said to

have misused his authority to steal the money from his employer.

After being called in by his superior, Kunene is said to have taken two days before he showed up and he also could not find the deposit book he presumably used. To make matters worse, Gwebu said the E12 036 that was collected from the Bhunu Mall shop did not reflect in the bank statements. Since this was suspicious, Gwebu said the police were then roped in. When Kunene was given an opportunity to state his defence before the court, he opted not to say anything. This was construed by the court as admission of guilt. The magistrate also mentioned that remaining silent meant that the money was never recovered as he had used it as

"It's a pity that the court is left in the dark about the challenges you faced that resulted to you committing this offence. Still, with your actions, the other employees will be watched with a hawk's eye and the employer will have to come up with measures to prevent such happening in the future," the magistrate said.

"You were lucky to be caught the first time you committed the offence because if it were not the case, you might have continued stealing until you stole even a bigger amount of money," she continued.

In mitigation, Kunene told the court that it was a mistake for him to allow his financial challenges control his decisions. He pleaded for leniency from the magistrate when meting out his sentence, as he was a new father with a new-born baby who is dependent on him.

Kunene was sentenced to two years imprisonment with an option of E6 000 fine.

As Libutfo leader Princess Temaswati danced to songs 'ngeke ngisale sakha live', 'tekatakho ndabazezwe', she was joined by maidens from Engabezweni Royal Residence and Hlophe who had earlier on raised speculations following her adorning red feathers 'emagwalagwala' which are known to be worn by Royalty at events.

There was already abuzz on the day following her appearance during Sunday's activities where she spotted *emagwalagwala*.

As Princess Temaswati was still dancing, Emazinyane had to come and do what is called *kudlalisela*. There was abuzz around the arena as *Emazinyane* approached the maidens, as Prince Majaha went straight towards Hlophe, who was next to the princess dancing beautifully.

Before dancing next to her, Prince Majaha stood before her and Hlophe blushed shyly. They exchanged a few words chatting and smiling at each other momentarily.

At the end of a beautiful afternoon, Imbali indvuna announced that there was a token from the King, "Lalela mbali, Inkhosi isiphe tinkunzi. Inkhosi iphekile," she said as the proceedings concluded, much to the screams and shouts of 'Bayethe!'

Truck drivers warn of economic crisis

TRUCKS from Eswatini are now warning Emaswati about a looming economic crisis.

Trucks from Eswatini have been stuck at border posts shared with South Africa for the past five days now.

The reason for this unfortunate incident is as a result of the drivers, who now fear for their lives in South Africa.

Speaking yesterday to this publication, one of the truck drivers said many of the trucks were stuck at Ngwenya and the situation was the same in other border gates shared with South

Vusi Ngozo said this was likely to affect the whole country, if government did not act swiftly to engage the government of South Africa about this issue. He said the problem was that they were being killed as truck drivers in South Africa, hence they were now stuck at the border gates.

Wondered

Ngozo wondered why the government of this country allowed trucks from South Africa to enter into this country. He said this was unfortunate because the country would now find itself having to import its products, yet no exports were going out.

He said companies like Conco Limited in Matsapha were also affected by this. "A truck from Conco is also stuck at Ngwenya Border Post, as we speak. The products are rotting in the trucks and this means the companies will lose money," Ngozo said.

The driver further stated that in South Africa, they attacked any truck driver that drove a foreign registered truck.

He said some of the trucks affected in this matter carried sugar, timber products, food, loin skins among other products. He said such products had to be transported within a certain time frame from a point of production to the market.

Situation

He further warned of a situation where the country would find itself with no fuel to transport goods and people.

"Fuel is imported from South Africa and trucks from Southern Star were the ones that imported fuel from South Africa. The problem now is how these trucks are going fetch the fuel from that country to Eswatini," he said.

He said if South Africa did not allow trucks to enter into their country, Eswatini should also do the same.

Otherwise the two governments should engage one another and come up with a lasting solution to the problem.

The problem of truck drivers seems to be far from being over, as it was already one of the topical issues by last year.

The truck drivers have reportedly come under severe attack in South Africa, as South Africans are said to be of the view that the truck drivers took away their jobs from them. The South Africans are said to have resorted to attack trucks with foreign registration.





Mother of 8 advised to stop having more kids

"I'd advice that you stop having any more children."

These were words by Manzini Senior Magistrate Simangele Mbatha to a 38-year-old mother of eight; Philile Nkambule of Stoneboy in Ngwane Park.

The magistrate said this before meting out sentencing for Nkambule who was arrested for neglecting her 10-month-old twins.

The crime was committed on June 12, where Nkambule left the minors unattended while she went to Manzini Bus Rank to sell sausages. Evidence brought before court suggested that the twins were crying without anyone attending to them and after social welfare workers were anonymously tipped by concerned neighbours, it is said the twins were found on a bed alone. The house they were in is also said to have been filthy and not fit for children occupation. Also found at the scene, according to a social welfare worker who provided evidence, were two feeding bottles filled with tea.

When responding to this, Nkambule said the children's formula had run out and that she hoped to buy some on her way home from selling the sausages in town. She told the court that she had left the tea for the twins for them to drink while she was away.

In this regard, the magistrate said Nkambule should have prepared them thin porridge with which was way more affordable than the formula milk instead of the tea. Further, it was brought before court that Nkambule was not

a first time client at the social welfare department as back in 2017, one of her other children was also taken away from her and was placed at a safer place after she neglected him in the same fashion she did with the twins.

Magistrate Mbatha said although she was fully cognisant of the fact that having children was one's choice, she also thought it would be best if Nkambule stopped having them so that she could have more time and energy to look after the ones she already has. The magistrate said before she could raise her children with the motherly love they deserved, Nkambule needed psychological assistance first in order for her to deal with her problems. "Once you've learnt to forgive and love yourself, then you surely can take good care of your children. For now, it looks like your children come second in your life and your first priority is what you want for yourself," the court said.

The magistrate said this after Nkambule had told her that her eight children had different fathers because she was an impatient woman who could up and leave once the relationship stopped serving her.

In her mitigation, Nkambule asked that the court be lenient so that she could return home to her children whom she asked for permission to see at least twice a month. She asked that the father of the twins should not be allowed to see them because he was the one responsible for her behaviour.

Nkambule said this was more so because he only provided formula milk until they were only four months, yet he knew that she was unemployed and could not afford to buy the milk. She was sentenced to two years imprisonment with an option of E5 000 fine.

IMPORT CAR DEALERS

IN the wake of the trucking strike action which has grounded the movement of trucks across Eswatini and South Africa, dealers of import cars in the country have reportedly suffered a major blow.

Trucks make it across the border on a daily basis ferrying cars and car parts from Durban to the dealerships especially around Manzini, Matsapha and Mbabane.

Over the past two days, these dealerships have felt the effects of the strike action taking place in South Africa. This is because according to some dealers they are now unable to ferry cars and car parts from the Durban port to Eswatini in fear of having their cars damaged by angry protesters.

By yesterday reports were to the effect that three trucks had been damaged since Sunday

It is suspected that the damages are linked to the national truck strike. According to information released by the South African Police Service (SAPS) in the first incident, a truck en route to Johannesburg from Coega was forced to stop on the N2 at Olifantskop Pass at 15:00 on Sunday.

The SAPS stated that three suspects used a silver VW Polo to block the road and caused the truck to stop. They then set the truck alight by throwing flammable objects at it. It is said the driver escaped unharmed, however the truck was severely damaged. A case of malicious damage to property was opened at Paterson Police Station.

At 0300 hours, the police said a truck turning at the R335 off-ramp on the N2 towards Markman was shot at by an unknown suspect. "The windows of the truck was damaged however the driver managed to drive the truck to safety.

A case of attempted murder was opened at Swartkops Police Station," the statement read. Again at 0500 hours according to SAPS another trucking incident happened at on R335 where unknown suspects threw stones at a truck.

The windscreen of the truck was damaged in the process but the driver managed to drive to safety. A case of malicious damages to prop-

SNAT blasts govt for tertiary strike, truck drivers

THE Swaziland National Association of Teachers (SNAT) says government has failed tertiary students and truck drivers working in South Africa.

In a four-page statement, SNAT said it had learnt, with utter shock and dismay, of govemment's failure to address two pertinent issues that have a potential to plunge Eswatini into a cliff.

SNAT Secretary General Sikelela Dlamini said these two issues included tertiary students' grievances and the xenophobic attacks on Emaswati who drive trucks between South Africa and Eswatini.

Dlamini said the litany of issues raised by students in tertiary institutions were, in actual fact, supposed to be raised by parents (guardians) since they shall certainly impact on parents in a negative way, should the Mandvulo-led Cabinet implement them in their current form.

The demands included awarding scholarship to all admitted students in tertiary institutions, increase of all allowances in line with the skyhigh Cost of Living, stopping the proposed

monthly disbursement of allowances through mobile money or e-Mali, timely release of all allowances due to the scholars and full involvement of students in major decisions that will affect them.

He stated that it escaped one's logical reasoning why a government that had adopted the 2030 Sustainable Development Goals, would now seek to defeat Goal No.4 - a goal that remains instrumental in ensuring that the country is set on the correct trajectory to make it a truly developmental state by 2030.

Dlamini said in any case, education remained a fundamental and constitutional right of every Liswati.

"Clearly, CoLA affects every living local, including our children, and it is high time that the allowances they receive be ones that will make them cope with the escalating cost of goods and services in the market."

Dlamini said proposing to disburse the allowances on a monthly basis would create unnecessary stress and frustration to students.

The SAPS reported that on Sunday, at 2140 hours, four suspects were arrested for possession of an unlicenced firearm with 15 rounds of ammunition. It is said the suspects were also found in possession of three bottles containing petrol; seven cell phones and a pair of gloves. Police indicted that they also seized the vehicle that the suspects were travelling in.

LENCE OF GOVT ON TRUCK DRIVERS WORRYING

SNAT has expressed its concern on the manner in which government is handling the case of Emaswati who earn a living through driving trucks between the Republic of South Africa and Eswatini.

SNAT Secretary General Sikelela Dlamini said truck drivers have been in serious life threatening situations in the recent past and as SNAT they have it in authority that the campaign to have them killed in South Africa is escalating daily.

Worrying

"What is worrying is not actually the way our neighbours treat our colleagues, but it is the quietness of government and its continued failure to intervene in this impasse-burying its head in the sand," SNAT stated.

The union continued to point out that this is not new, but up until now, nothing concrete has been done to save both the lives and jobs of truck drivers.

Timeously

Dlamini said as SNAT they felt that all demands by tertiary students as genuine, thus should be timeously addressed by all stakeholders including the ministry of labour and social security, colleges and universities instead of the medieval stunts exhibited of late.

Dlamini said government should cease to cower away from grabbing the bull by its horns on the truck drivers issue by ceasing to conceal itself under the sovereignty card.

"Bilateral talks between South Africa and Eswatini must immediately ensue to end this madness."


SA MAN ACCUSES COPS

SOUTH Africans who had visited the country with the aim of watching Imbali during the Umhlanga Reed Dance returned home disappointed after spending the night behind bars as they were nabbed for driving while under the influence of alcohol.

The worst part according to some of the drink-driving offenders was that they were intentionally targeted by the police because they were South Africans.

This was revealed by one drinkdriver offender who appeared in court over the weekend. Oscar Nkosi, a South African employed in the mines appeared before Manzini



Magistrate Mthokozisi Dlamini on Sunday. Nkosi was arrested on August 31, while driving his foreign registered car near Liqhaga Centre in Manzini.

A breathalyser test conducted on him read 0.82mg/l.

Nkosi was also slapped with a

charge of stopping his vehicle in the middle of the road, driving without a licence and resisting arrest.

He pleaded guilty to all the four charges. When asked to mitigate, Nkosi pleaded for mercy.

He refuted that he did not want to comply with police orders.

The accused informed the court that he was in the country for Umhlanga and had booked himself in one of the guesthouses. He said he was just shocked with the attitude police displayed on him.

He said he was just leaving the hotel going to his guest house which is just a stone's throw away from where he was. He said as he stopped next to the road and turned on his hazards to drop off a friend, police pounced on him. He said when he tried to explain that his driver's

There is nothing wrong with kushinga – Magistrate

A drink-driver was informed by the court that there was absolutely nothing wrong with *kushinga*, but the problem was drinking alcohol and getting behind the wheel.

Bukhosibethu Ginindza appeared before the court for driving while under the influence of alcohol. His breath specimen read 0.53mg/l.

He pleaded guilty to the charge he was slapped with. He informed the court that he had visitors who came from outside the country and they

bought him alcohol so he could not leave them. The accused informed the court that he was unemployed and was being taken care of by his wife.

WINE IS MY PROBLEM - DD ACCUSED

A man has pinned wine as his biggest struggle, and which led to his arrest for driving while under the influence of alcohol.

This was revealed by 37-year old Innocent Magagula of Dvokolwako before Magistrate Sifiso Vilakati.

Magagula had been arrested and charged with contravening the Road Traffic Act on Saturday evening. During his appearance before the court on Sunday, he was found to have the second highest blood alcohol content reading.

Magagula explained that he apologised for his actions, admitting that he was addicted to drinking wine.

Lady with the highest alcohol content

A 40-year-old woman got more than she bargained for when she was arrested and spent a night in jail, after being caught driving under the influence of alcohol in Mbabane.

Appearing before Magistrate Sifiso Vilakati, Nomsa Ndzimandze of Malkems cited her experience behind bars as 'terrible' and appalling.

"Your Worship, if I had known how cold, smelly and overall disgusting jail was, I would have thought twice before getting behind the

"Your Worship, drinking wine is my weakness and it is very difficult to stop drinking it. I apologise for my actions and I hope I will be able to act responwheel while under the influence of alcohol. I promise never to commit this offence again, as I have truly learnt my lesson," Ndzimandze said.

The only woman to be charged for drink-driving at Extension 3 with a blood alcohol content of 1.51mg/l, Ndzimandze was charged and found guilty of driving under the influence of alcohol. She was sentenced to pay a fine of E1 600 or in default of payment, serve 16 months in prison.

After receiving this harsh warning, Magagula was sentenced to pay a fine of E1 600 and in default of payment, serve 16 months in a correctional facility.

MAGISTRATE ATTENDS TO 12 DRUNK MOTORISTS ON SUNDAY

DESPITE the long weekend, Mbabane residents seemed to have been well behaved this weekend, as very few appeared before the Mbabane Magistrate's Court for drink-driving cases on Sunday morning.

Only 12 accused appeared before Magistrate Sifiso Vilakati. Most of these drivers were nabbed in the early hours of Sunday morning, while oth-

ers were apprehended in the late hours of Saturday evening.

They were charged with contravening Section 91(1) as read with Section 122(2) of the Road Traffic Act 6 of 2007

Two South African nationals were arrested at Extension 3 in Mbabane, after they were found to have contravened the Road Traffic Act.

William Fakudze (54) of Likazi was found to have been driving his Ford Ranger while under the influence of alcohol.



It started with a roadshow at Lobamba, where the foundation had organised entertainment which comprised drama performed by pupils from Mbabane Central High School.



Leave your lover principal magistrate to abusive man

A Mozambican man charged with contravening the Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence (SODV) Act of 2018, was warned by the court to leave his lover after he informed the court that he was also being abused.

"Your Worship, Maziya has displayed abusive traits for a long time, where she would lift her hands to hit me. I reported this abuse to the police station, however my case was never taken seriously and I would be turned back several times," Mtshali stated.

Robert Mtshali revealed this during his appearance before Principal Magistrate Fikile Nhlabatsi last Thursday, where he stood accused of assaulting his lover, Khumbuzile Maziya.

According to his charge sheet, Mtshali was arrested and charged with contravening the SODV Act of 2018 when he was said to have, on August 27 at Mpolonjeni area, assaulted his girlfriend with open hands and fists.

Explained

This Mtshali was said to have done several times on Maziya's head and face, thus contravening the Act. While mitigating, Mtshali explained that Maziya did not take care of their three children, as she refused to buy them food.

"I plead with the court to allow me to take them into my custody so that I can take care of them. I run a business as a welder and I make good money from it, something which can go towards catering for my children's needs," he

Before meting out sentence, Principal Magistrate Nhlabatsi advised Mtshali to separate from Maziya, as it was clear that they were involved in an unhealthy relationship. Mtshali responded that he was only with her because he wanted to create a family environment for his children, however he admitted that several attempts at mediation by police officers have proved futile. After hearing this, Principal Magistrate Nhlabatsi sentenced Mtshali to pay a fine of E5 000 and in default of payment, serve two years in a correctional facility. Mtshali was further informed that E3 000 of his fine, and one year sentence was suspended for a period of three years.

Man arrested for stealing King's cow

A man was arrested for being found in possession of meat of a stolen cow belonging to the King.

Sanele Nkomonye of Ngculwini was arrested by Mliba police under the antistock theft department after he was found with packed portions of the meat.

Nkomonye was arrested by the police who followed leads pertaining to the theft of the King's cow that was stolen while grazing at a farm near Luve.

Police are said to have received a tip off about two men who were stealing from the King on Monday evening.

With this information, a reliable source said the police acted promptly and went to the suspects' home. Indeed, it is said

that at around midnight the police found a group of men roasting meat at the homestead. However, upon noticing the officers of the law, the two suspects are said to have fled and evaded being engaged by the police. The men who were roasting the meat one of them was identified as one of the suspect cousin and the other was unidentified but it is said he knew of the plot to steal the cow.

Invited

After it was stolen, the unidentified man is said to have been invited over by the two suspects who said they had already slaughtered it. For the love of meat, the man is said to have heeded the invitation. Likewise, Nkomonye, who resides at Ngculwini is also said to have been informed about the meat galore at Mliba.

Since he was related to one of the suspects, Nkomonye is said to have been given permission by his mother to use a family vehicle to ferry some of the meat from Mliba to Ngculwini.

He allegedly took the cow's four legs back to Ngculwini. He is said to have also informed the police about the whereabouts of the portioned meat.

It is said 40 meat portions, a bucket full of cow offal and two rib cages were found in a neighbour's freezer where they had asked to store them, supposedly, before they could be sold.

The Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Superintendent Phindile Vilakati confirmed the incident. She said Nkomonye and the unidentified man were taken in for questioning and Nkomonye was arrested and charged. Nkomonye is expected to appear in court

Eswatini workers' rights ratings decline

ESWATINI has declined in ratings in terms of the guarantee of workers' rights, the International Trade Union Confederation has revealed.

According to the sixth edition of the ITUC Global Index, Eswatini is among the worst countries when it comes the guarantee of rights of workers

Eswatini with Iraq, Sierra Leone, Thailand and Vietnam have seen all their ratings worsen in 2019 to category five (no guarantee of rights) with attacks on workers' rights. ITUC pointed out that the breakdown of social contract between workers, governments and businesses had seen a number

countries excluding workers from the right to establish or join a union increase from 92 in 2018 to 107 in 2019.

Increase

The report further states that all regions in the world had an increase in the exclusion of workers with the greatest increase occurring in Europe.

The 10 worst countries for workers this year include Algeria, Bangladesh, Zimbabwe, Turkey, Colombia, Brazil,

Saudi Arabia and the Philippines. ITUC rated Eswatini as a country that had an increase of no rights guarantee of workers. Trade Union Congress of Swaziland (TUCOSWA) Secretary General Mduduzi Gina said the ratings by the ITUC were that a lot still needed to be done to achieve the rights of workers in the country. Stolen herd of cattle found slaughtered in Mozambique

AT a time when stock theft was said to have declined over the past few months, farmers around Lugongolweni have been hit hard again, with a herd of 14 cattle reported stolen in one day.

According to Lugongolweni community police, the herd was stolen early last week.

It has been reported that the stolen cattle were taken from three homesteads around Lugongolweni.

Report

For the first few days, the owners of the cattle did not report the cattle as stolen as they believed that they could be somewhere in the bushes.

It was only a week later that they believed that the cattle could have been stolen. Community police leader Kaizer Mathonsi said they then received a call from some residents of Sitatweni who reported that they had found somecowhides in the forests.

Sitatweni is one of the Mozambican communities which

Upon receiving this report, some farmers and the community police went to that country to make an inspection of the cowhides. Mathonsi said it was confirmed that the slaughtered cattle were from Eswatini, identified with the ear tags. "At least nine were positively identified as that of Eswatini," said Mathonsi.

Recovered

About six other cattle were said to have not been recovered yet. Mathonsi said they then reported the matter to the police with the intent to recover the rest of the stolen cattle.

It is recalled that the local government entered a bilateral agreement with their Mozambican counterparts with regards to stock theft. The bilateral agreement is to the effect that the local police and that of Mozambique will work cooperatively in eradicating stock theft. The agreement is said to have worked effectively over the past three years as some cattle rustlers were reported to have been arrested and convicted in that country.

MAN HELD FOR POSSESSION OF 7KG DAGGA

A man of Maphungwane appeared before the Magistrate's Court after he was arrested and charged for dagga pos-

The illegal herb he was nabbed with weighed seven kilogrammes.

Simphiwe Matsenjwa (28) faced a charge of contravening the Pharmacy Act. He was said to have wrongfully and unlawfully possessed the said amount of dagga, a habit forming drug.

The accused person was said to have been arrested while on his way to meet a buyer at Siteki.

During his appearance before the court, the accused person was informed of his right to legal representation. He elected to conduct his own defence in the matter. The accused person was however not asked to plead to the charge as the crown indicated that it intends to lead evidence to prove commission of the offence. He successfully filed an application to be admitted to bail which was granted at E2 000. The matter was ordered to return to court next week Thursday for commencement of trial. Meanwhile in another matter, Samkelo Mazibuko faced a charge of assault with intent to cause grievous bodily harm. He was said to have wrongfully and unlawfully assaulted Bongiswa Dlamini by stabbing him once on the shoulder with a knife.

Accused

When the charge sheet was read to him, the accused person pleaded guilty to the charge.

The crown presented a medical report as evidence before the court. When asked if he had any objections, the accused person did not object to the medical report. He was therefore found guilty by the court on account of his own plea. He was accordingly sentenced to a year in a correctional facility with an option to pay E2 000 fine





WHATTHIE LAW SAYS

WARRANT TO SEARCH FOR, SEIZE TAINTED PROPERTY

74. (1) For the purposes of this section and section 75 "tainted property" means—

(a) the instrumentality of an offence referred to in the Schedule; or (b) the proceeds of an offence referred to in the Schedule.

(2) Any court which, on an application in writing made on oath or affirmation, is satisfied that there are reasonable grounds for believing that there is in or on any site, vehicle, vessel or aircraft any tainted property, may issue a search warrant in respect of that tainted property.

(3) An application for a warrant under subsection (2) may be made by the Director of Public Prosecutions or by an authorised member of the police force.

(4) A court shall not issue a warrant under subsection (2) unless the application contains, or the applicant otherwise supplies to the court, information which the court requires concerning the grounds on which the warrant is sought.

(5) A warrant may be issued under subsection (2) in relation to tainted property whether or not a person has been charged with the commission of the relevant offence, but where a charge has not been laid in respect of that offence at the time when the application for the warrant is made, the court shall not issue a warrant unless it is satisfied that a charge will be laid in respect of the offence within 48 hours of the issue of the warrant.


(6) Every warrant issued under subsection (2) shall be in the prescribed form.

(7) A warrant issued under subsection (2) shall be directed to a specific member of the police force, to a specific group of members of the police specified in the warrant, or generally to any member of the police force.

(8) A warrant issued under subsection (2) is subject to any conditions which the court may specific in the warrant

ify in the warrant.

Powers conferred by warrant 75. (1) Subject to any conditions specified in the warrant, every warrant issued under section 74 authorises the member of the police executing the warrant to—(a) enter and search the site, premises, building, vehicle, vessel, train or aircraft specified in the warrant at any time by day or night during the currency of the warrant;



(b) use such assistants as may be reasonable in the circumstances for the purpose of the entry and search;

(c) use such force as is reasonable in the circumstances for the purpose of effecting entry, and for breaking open anything in or on the place to be searched; and (d) search for and seize any property of the kind described in the warrant that the person executing the warrant believes on reasonable grounds to be tainted property.

(2) Every person called on to assist any member of the police executing a warrant of this Act has the powers described in subsection (1)(c) and (d).

(3) If a member of the police, in the course of executing a warrant finds any property the member believes, on reasonable grounds, to be—

(a) tainted property in respect of an offence other than the offence specified in the warrant; or

(b) tainted property in relation to any offence specified in the warrant, although not of a kind specified in the warrant,

the warrant is sufficient authority to seize that property if the member of the police believes on reasonable grounds that seizure is necessary to prevent loss, destruction or concealment of the property.

(4) This section, in so far as it authorises the interference with the right of a person's right to privacy of the person and home as guaranteed section 14 of the Constitution, is enacted on the authority of that section.

Request for information

76. (1) An authorised police officer may request any person employed in or associated with

an agency, office or ministry or statutory body to furnish the police office free of charge and within a period specified in that request, with all information that may reasonably be required for any investigation in terms of this Act and that person shall, notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in any law which prohibits or precludes the person—

(a) from disclosing any information relating to the activities, affairs or business of any other person; or

(b) from permitting any person to have access to any registers, records or other documents, or electronic data which have a bearing on those activities, affairs or business,

furnish that police with that information and permit that police to have access to any registers, records, documents, and electronic data, which may contain the information.

(2) If a person from whom the authorised police has requested information in terms of subsection (1) fails to provide that information within the specified period, the Director of Public Prosecutions may request a judge or magistrate to require the attendance of that person before that judge or magistrate, or any other judge or magistrate for examination by the Director of Public Prosecutions.

(3) Subsection (1) shall not be construed as prohibiting any Minister by whom or any other Ministerial or institutional authority by which, or under the control of whom or which, any law referred to in that subsection is administered, or any board, institution or body established by or under any such law, from mak-

ing any practical and reasonable procedural arrangements with regard to the furnishing of the information or the granting of the access contemplated in that subsection and according to which the information or access shall be furnished or granted or with regard to any reasonable safeguards which that minister, authority, board, institution, body or person, subject to subsection (4), requires to maintain the confidentiality of the information, registers, records, documents or electronic data.

(4) A person shall not, without the written permission of the Director of Public Prosecutions, disclose to any other person any confidential information, registers, records, documents or electronic data which came to the knowledge of that person in the performance of the functions of that person in terms of this Act and relating to the activities, affairs or business of any other person, except—

(a) for the purpose of performing functions in terms of this Act; (b) in the course of adducing evidence in any criminal proceedings or proceedings in terms of this Act; or

(c) when required to do so by an order of a court of law.

(5) A person who-

(a) without lawful or reasonable excuse, fails to appear before a judge or magistrate in terms of subsection (2) or refuses or fails to give the information referred to in that subsection; or

(b) contravenes subsection (4), commits an offence and is liable on conviction, to a fine not exceeding four hundred thousand Emalangeni or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding twenty years or to both.

Sharing of information

77. Notwithstanding the Income Tax Order, Order 21 of 1975, or its successor, and with regard to any other secrecy provision in similar legislation, whenever any investigation is instituted in terms of this Act, including an investigation into any offence referred to in the Schedule and an investigation into the property, financial activities, affairs or business of any person, the Minister responsible for finance or any official designated by the Minister for this purpose shall be notified of that investigation with a view to mutual co-operation and the sharing of information.

Black South Africans explain who they voted for

THE election affirmed the pattern of ANC decline, with its worst electoral performance to

The Economic Freedom Fighters (EFF), founded in July 2013 by expelled former ANC Youth League President, Julius Malema, and which describes itself as a farleft political party, saw growth in its support. Meanwhile the official opposition, the Democratic Alliance (DA), a broadly liberal party, saw a decline in support.

BUT WHO VOTED FOR THESE PARTIES AND WHY?

To answer this question, the Centre for Social Change at the University of Johannesburg surveyed over 5 000 voters in an exit poll on the day of the election. Twenty three sites across eight of South Africa's nine provinces were surveyed, with most sites concentrated in Gauteng, the economic hub of the country. The survey focused primarily on townships and informal settlements, whose residents are mostly poor and black; 91 per cent of respondents were black African, and 22 per cent lived in informal dwellings or shacks.

Similar surveys were also conducted on the day of the 2014 national and provincial elections and the 2016 local government election.

The survey asked a range of demographic questions - such as age, gender, race, ethnicity and employment status - as well as



questions about participation in protests, and who respondents voted for and why.

The survey sample was not nationally representative. But, the areas chosen provide a crucial insight into the historic heartlands of support for the governing ANC.

WHO VOTES FOR WHAT PARTY?

The survey asked about all political parties but we concentrated our analysis on the three largest political parties: the ANC, the DA and the EFF.

As the ANC continues to experience declining electoral support, our survey provides some understanding of the patterns that lie beneath deepening electoral competition in South Africa. Age, gender, ethnicity, receipt of government benefits, and participation in protest were all found to significantly correlate with voters' choices of different parties.

Our analysis shows that the ANC

and the DA secured their greatest support among older voters, while the EFF secured the greatest support among younger voters, as one might expect.

In line with our previous surveys, we found that women were more likely than men to vote for the ANC. Nearly two-thirds of women (64 per cent) voted for the ANC, compared to only 55 per cent of men.

Nearly half of all DA voters surveyed had full time jobs compared to about a third of ANC and EFF voters.

The data also revealed interesting ethnic differences. IsiXhosa speakers were most likely to vote for the ANC while Sepedi speakers were most likely to vote for

In previous surveys, we found that the ANC, then under the leadership of President Jacob Zuma, drew particularly strong support from isiZulu speakers. But in this round of the survey, we observed that while support for the ANC was still strong among isiZulu speakers, they were also the most likely to vote for opposition parties beyond the EFF and DA.

The findings also reveal that those who had reported taking part in some form of protest action over the last five years were more likely to vote for opposition par-

WHY DO PEOPLE VOTE?

The survey included a series of six questions that asked respondents to rate the reasons that they came to vote by 'a lot', 'a bit' or 'not at all.' The two most influential reasons were 'because it is my responsibility to vote' and 'to improve the economy,' with 90 per cent and 87 per cent of respondents, respectively, saying that these factors influenced them 'a lot.' Mokonyane is proof that Ramaphosa cannot unite ANC, beat corruption

AN ANC veteran who supports President Cyril Ramaphosa but is growing tired of the slow pace of the Thuma Mina project, recently told me something that made a whole lot of sense.

"The president cannot afford unity. Who do we want to unify with? The crooks? Unity for its own sake is untenable. We can't have unity between the corrupt and the anti-corrupt."

The veteran made the case for Ramaphosa to step up the pace of getting rid of corrupt comrades in the ANC and elevating the "good" ones to crucial positions. If he drags his feet, Ramaphosa will 'paralyse good people.'

Since the ANC's Nasrec conference in December 2017, the lie has been peddled that unity will be good for the party and by extension, the country. The 'logic,' if you can call it that, behind the unity rhetoric was that the ANC would tear itself apart if it continues with bruising leadership battles between two factions, and that it was a good thing that the top six officials ended up being from both the Ramaphosa and



Nkosazana Dlamini-Zuma camps. This is, of course, nonsense.

Anyone who supports Ramaphosa and believes that he is the right man for the moment to steer South Africa back onto a path of order and economic growth will agree that he needed all the support he could get to back his cause.

The fact that Ace Magashule, the former premier of the Free State who is implicated in a litany of corruption scandals, is running Luthuli House as the secretary general of the ANC, is a major headache for Ramaphosa.

Let's take Bosasa boss Gavin Watson's death as a case in point. On the one hand, Ramaphosa has rejuvenated the National Prosecuting Authority under Advocate Shamila Batohi to fast-track cases like the delayed Bosasa prosecution and other cases that implicate ANC politicians and backers.

My understanding is that Watson would have been added as an accused in the corruption case against several former Bosasa executives in the coming weeks.

On the other hand, the ANC, through its press statement sent out after Watson's tragic death last week and through Mokonyane's eulogy at his memorial service on Friday, elevates Watson to a national hero. Mokonvane is back at Luthuli House, after Ramaphosa dropped her from his Cabinet and she declined to go back to Parliament.

With Ramaphosa allies, Senzo Mchunu and Zizi Kodwa, gone from the ANC headquarters after their deployment to the executive, the president's support network in the top echelons of the party has been seriously diminished.

His deputy, David Mabuza, and ANC Chaimerson Gwede Mantashe. as mineral resources minister, have also been assigned executive duties.

Magashule, who is shamelessly undermining Ramaphosa's leadership whenever he gets an opportunity, has brought back Mokonyane and Malusi Gigaba, another Ramaphosa casualty, to bulk up Luthuli House. Between Magashule, his deputy, Jessie Duarte. Mokonyane and Gigaba, Ramaphosa is risking losing control over the party he leads. News24

Afdb invests over E9bn in ESWATINI

THE African Development Bank (AfDB) has invested over E9 billion (\$590 million) in the country in various projects.

AfDB President Dr. Akinwumi Adesina during a press conference held at the Royal Villas yesterday said the current portfolio is over E33.5 billion (\$238 million) covering various sectors especially water and sanitation, energy, infrastructure and agriculture.

He said Eswatini has had 45 years of development partnership with the bank and it is a partnership that has produced significant results.

"Over 11 000 hectares of land have been irrigated, supporting about 3 000 farmers of which 41 per cent are women.

Impacts

"Farmer companies have been formed, producing sugarcane. I was amazed with the impacts: jobs have been created, wealth creation is visible.

"The project has impacted 20 479 people who have benefited from the project, including over 11 673 men and 8 806 women," he said.

Adesina said the farmer-managed businesses were working successfully as 40 out of the 55 sugarcane farmer business companies had paid back their loans fully and the rest were on track.

Households with regular income had risen from nine per cent to 20 per cent. Employment has risen

from 46 per cent to 71 per cent.

"When farmers are rich enough to hire their own managers that is great success. I saw the African Development Bank at work as we travelled on the Mbabane to Manzini road that's funded by the bank to the tune of \$48 million.

We are upgrading this road with another \$30 million for the Manzini-Mbabane Interchange that'll further ease transport," he added.

Support

He added that the bank's support of \$24 million to the FINCORP helped provide much needed finance for small and medium sized enterprises and their support of \$23 million for the Ezulwini Water Supply and Sewerage had helped to provide much needed water and sanitation.

"Just last year, the bank approved the Manzini Regional Water Supply and Sanitation project for \$50 million. All these projects contribute to the goal of Eswatini to drive inclusive growth. However, challenges exist that we must continue to work together to resolve," he said.

He said on Sunday he traveled to see Lower Usuthu Smallholder Irrigation Project II, which was supported with \$61 million by the African Development Bank.

"The project is amazing and is transforming lives," he added.

Bank to continue supporting Eswatini, mostly private sectors

AfDB will continue supporting Eswatini until the first world status is attained.

AfDB President Dr. Akinwumi Adesina said the biggest challenge was to grow the economy faster and contain budget deficits.

"There is a lot to be done. Growth is very low, with a GDP growth of 1.1 per cent in 2019, down from 1.8 per cent in 2018.

"Greater efforts are needed to diversify the product and export base of the economy, expand manufacturing, boost tourism and service sectors and reduce volatility from over-reliance on SACU receipts," he said.

He added that the bank welcomed, has and would continue to strongly support efforts of the government on fiscal consolidation and public financial management further stating that the aim is to drive growth as there is need to also significantly improve private sector investments.

"AfDB will strongly support more private sector financing in the country. The bank just held a business opportunity seminar with Business Eswatini in May 2019, to explore how to provide more support," he said.

Strong

He said strong public debt management would continue to be needed.

While external debt is not a problem and is sustainable, standing only at 27.8 per cent domestic debt has risen substantially, now accounting for 62 per cent of total debt, most of this from payment arrears.

"I'd like to commend the government for its commitment to clear arrears by the end of 2019 a bold move.

"Equally important is the need to significantly reduce the very high recurrent expenditure as share of total budget at 75 per cent and boost greater capital expenditures to ramp up growth.

"There's need to address structural challenges on the economy, especially high levels of poverty, unemployment especially for the youth. The African Development Bank will continue to strongly support Eswatini government's efforts to build strong macroeconomic and fiscal environments to drive faster paced growth," he

ESWATINI HAS BIG AMBITIONS

AfDB President Dr. Akinwumi Adesina says Eswatini has big ambitions - as it should.

He said African countries must never think small.

never think small.
"Though a small nation, Eswatini must do big things," he said.

He said one of those big things was to turn the nation into an industrial hub for manufacturing, ICT and agribusiness. That's why the AfDB has been highly supportive of the National Development Plan (2019-2022).

"The Bank is looking forward with you. We will be developing together, our new Country Development Strategy that'll run from 2019-2023.

The bank has already lined up a pipeline of projects worth \$528 million.

I am especially keen to have the bank support the development of Special Agro-Industrial Processing Zones across the country, to help the Eswatini to develop world class food and agribusiness processing PROJECT AMOUNT

capacity, create wealth and jobs, and transform its rural economies to zones of economic prosperity," he said.

He added that the bank would be supporting the Eswatini railway project that'll help with regional integration and competitiveness.

Studies

"To help provide more electricity, the bank is supporting the feasibility studies for the 94MW Ngwempisi Hydro Power plant. That'll further make the country bright!

There's no doubt that the future for Eswatini is bright. For this nation must shine. It must shine like a star in the middle of the night. It must be all it can be. For it is destined to

be a great nation.
You can be sure

You can be sure that the African Development Bank will be there with you all the way," he said.

He further disclosed that the AfDB has impacted greatly the Southern Africa region having provided over \$13 billion to support SADC countries. And every dollar invested by the SADC region in the bank has leveraged \$19 for the region. Afdb to open Office in eswatini

THE African Development Bank will soon be opening an office of the bank in Eswatini.

AfDB President Dr. Akinwumi Adesina made this revelation during a press conference held at the Royal Villas in Ezulwini yesterday.

He said currently the bank has a regional office in Pretoria, South Africa.

"We have since discovered that we need to be close by and provide real time support on the ground. We look to the future and we are content that there is quite a lot we are going to do in Eswatini, hence we will have a very strong office presence," he said.

"You can count on me as its president to continue to strongly support Eswatini. And you can be sure that

there'll soon be an office of the bank right here in Eswatini!"

He further disclosed that the bank would be launching programmes to provide access to finance and economic opportunities for women in Eswatini.

The name of the programme is called Affirmative Finance Action for Women in Africa (AFAWA) and is intended to ensure to reduce the risk of lending by banks and all financial institutions to women enterprises in the country.

"The bank will mobilise US\$3 billion for the businesses of women in this country. The African Development Bank will also strongly support efforts to expand jobs for the youth as well," he said. He stated that the unemployment rate in the country is too high, which is worrying hence they

as a bank will provide financial assistance to businesses run by young people in the country.

"We will be supporting businesses by young people in three areas, agriculture as a business, ICT sector and SMEs," he added.

He further disclosed that the bank has a programme for the youth called Enable Youth in Agriculture, which is a programme directed at training young people to see agriculture as a business and deem it as 'cool'.

"The programme will also support these young people to have access to finance, set up and run their businesses," he said. He added that by 2030 the size of food and agribusiness in Africa will be at US\$1 trillion.

Future of sugar industry threatened

WITH the future of the sugar industry looking gloomy, there is an increasing need to redefine the thinking.

This was mentioned by Ubombo Sugar Ltd Managing Director Oswald Mangwenzi during the Federation of SADC Sugar Producers (FSSP) Conference held at Royal Swazi Convention Centre on Wednesday.

Mangwenzi said there was a need to change the perception from being a sugar industry to a sugar cane industry.

He mentioned that for the sugar industry to be able to thrive, there was a need for diversification, creating partnerships and need to find more sustainability by diversifying into more products that could be produced from the cane crop.

He said establishing more partnerships was key in ensuring the industry remained successful moving forward.


He added that there was a need to ensure that the industry was still around for years to come.

Trix Trikam from the South African Sugar Association said radical change in the sugar industry was normal. He said global sugar markets were basically what government policies made them to be

He noted recently there has been a global decline in consumption of sugar and sugar products.

Sugar has been growing by two per cent for a number of years, and as of late there has been a decline which prompted for more radical thinking. He added that the sugar cane crop was one of the agricultural crops that were critical and important for any developing country. He said sugar cane was a development crop that dealt with empowering people in rural areas.

He said Africa still remained an opportunity as there was still consumption of sugar in Africa. He said this can be a blessing as well as a curse; it was a blessing in the sense that the African conti-



nent was still developing which offered an opportunity for markets. He added this could also be a curse as the development within the continent was still slow.

"The intra trade in Africa was slow as the markets were flooded by products from countries such as Brazil and the local products were being left behind, something needs to be done and there was a need to be faster and the new Africa trade needed to be finalised soon in order to have more trade within the African continent instead of relying too much on imported products," he said.

Products

He stated there were many other products that could be made from sugar cane and there was a need to diversify and take advantage of the markets for other products besides sugar. He added that there was also a need for sugar to survive and he believed in Africa there was a possibility for sugar to survive.

Devesh Dukhira from the Mauritius Sugar Syndicate said as sugar producers, there was a need to be more competitive and get the maximum value from the crop. He said there was a need to exploit all that could be derived from the cane crop.

Instance

He said in Mauritius for instance, the sugar cane by products such as molasses and ethanol represented about 20 per cent of the country's revenue. He added that there was a growing demand for sugar in Africa that could always be supplied and what was important and needed was political support.

"As sugar producers we need to use our diplomatic skills at government level to protect the African market from distorted prices," he said.

He mentioned within the SADC region there was no distorted prices within the different industries that existed within the region, if there were any distorted prices, was imported price distortion caused by allowing sugar from outside the region to get into market.

He added it was a priority to protect the local market and need to promote trade within SADC and promote competitiveness within the producers in the region.

Gordhan's private office gets R20m

JOHANNESBURG - A total amount of R20.7m has been budgeted for the private office of Public Enterprises Minister Pravin Gordhan for the 2019/20 financial year.

The majority of the budget is allocated towards remuneration of his staff.

In a written reply to a question from member of Parliament Adrian Roos, about the costs of his private office, Gordhan shared details of the qualifications of the 12 people working directly for him and their job titles.

Of the R20.7m budgeted for Gordhan's office, R16.5m is allocated towards salaries.

A private secretary and an assistant private secretary, a media liaison officer, administrative secretary, receptionist, two drivers or messengers and a food service aid are among those employed in Gordhan's office. The minister did not indicate how much each employee earned.

In a separate reply to DA MP Baxolile Nodada, another minister within the economic portfolio, Minister of Small Business Development Lindiwe Zulu shared details on the budget of her private office and that of the deputy minister, which collectively totals R15.8m.

The minister has 10 employees in her office, while Deputy Minister Cassel Mathale has five employees.

Fin24 previously reported that Transport Minister Fikile Mbalula's private office has a budget of R22.7m.

The minister's 13 staff members were budgeted to receive a total remuneration of R9.3m. Similarly, Home Affairs Minister Aaron Motsoaledi's budget totals R22.8m. Motsoaledi's staff have

a budgeted remuneration of R13.25m.

So far it appears Minister in the Presidency Jackson Mthembu's and Minister of Environment, Forestry and Fisheries Barbara Creecy's private offices have the biggest budgets. Each of their budgets total more than R30m.

THE Office of the Ombudsman of Financial Services (the Ombudsman) joins the Kingdom of Eswatini in celebrating the 2019 Umhlanga Reed Dance by taking a moment to reflect upon our role when considering the girl child, as part of our mission to achieve inclusive public education about good practice in the non-bank financial services industry.

Acknowledging that financial inclusion is a key factor for sustainable economic growth and development in Eswatini, the Ombudsman exists to resolve non-bank financial services disputes, free of charge, in a fair and accessible way for all. 'For all' in our tag line means all citizens of Eswatini, including the girl child.

THE GLOBAL GENDER GAP

The Global Gender Gap Index is 'a framework for capturing the magnitude of gender-based disparities and tracking their progress over time,' with respect to Economic Participation and Opportunity, Educational Attainment, Health and Survival and Political Empowement (The Global Gender Gap Report 2018). The score is measured on a scale of 0-1, where a number close to 1 indicates that the gender gap is relatively narrow, meaning gender-based inequalities are low.

According to the 2018 World Economic Forum statistics, the Kingdom of Eswatini is ranked 80 out of 149 countries, with an overall score of 0.694. This indicates the strides that have been taken to reduce the inequalities between men and women in Eswatini. This is an ongoing effort that we need to continue as part of the development and prosperity of our nation. This is not only significant for women who are economically active, but it is also significant to consider the gap that exists for young girls, specifically relating to matters of financial inclusion.

CONSTITUTIONAL MANDATE

Article 20 of our Constitution, states that "All persons are equal before and under the law in all spheres of political, economic, social and cultural life..." and should not be discriminated against based on gender, birth, age and other factors. However, studies show that children in Eswatini are more vulnerable socially, economically and otherwise, particularly amongst girls and young women. So, what can we do to curb this vulnerability of girls and young women in the country? Our mandate as a public service organisation is to uphold the Constitution in relation to our operational duties. Therefore, the Ombudsman considers children of all genders equal when investigating complaints; applying the law and making decisions.

OMBUDSMAN: TOWARDS INCLUSION

Earlier this year, the Ombudsman reported on a stakeholder engagement with Umhluma Women and Youth Foundation, which 'strives to become a solution of improved lives to widows, youth, the girl child and the disabled and victims of Gender Based Violence.' This is a community-based project and we viewed engaging with Umhluma as a strategic partnership, developed with the aim of further promoting financial inclusion and inclusive growth through consumer education and pub-

lic awareness for vulnerable groups in our society, such as girl children. We are also looking forward to participating in the Money Matters Student Workshop where we will be afforded the opportunity to educate the country's future leaders of all genders, to not only teach them about what we do, but to also help them understand how they are included in one of our key objectives of being accessible to all of our stakeholders.

As a part of our consumer education and stakeholder engagement efforts, we observe that 53 per cent of the complaints lodged at the Ombudsman have been brought by women.

FINANCIAL INCLUSION IN THE RETIREMENT FUNDS SPACE

The Ombudsman, being established under Section 74(1) of the Financial Services Regulatory Authority (FSRA) Act, 2010, receives, investigates and resolves complaints against financial services providers (FSPs) that are regulated by the FSRA. We work towards promoting a level playing field between non-bank FSPs and their customers by resolving complaints

about retirement funds, insurance, medical aid schemes and funds, investments and savings and/or credit. An example of the inclusion of the girl child in the non-bank financial services industry can be illustrated through the law relating to retirement fund benefits.

The Retirement Funds Act of 2005 specifically recognises/includes children to be considered amongst those who receive pension benefits when it defines a dependant as a child of the member and shall include a posthumous child, an adopted child and an illegitimate child...' Therefore, if, for instance, the Ombudsman receives a retirement fund complaint relating to the pay-out of a deceased member's pension benefit, all the children of the deceased are legally entitled to be considered for a share of the benefit. Although this law does not discriminate or favour the gender of a child, it is important to highlight the existence of the law for the benefit of girl children - whom we can identify here as a vulnerable group.

OMBUD'S SEPTEMBER CALENDAR

The above is only one example of the sce-

narios where the Ombudsman is empowered to resolve disputes.



he beauty of Umhlanga is its nonexclusionary nature. It doesn't matter if you're a young maiden, or you have had more life experience; so long as you are still Imbali, Umhlanga is for you.

Imbali Leader Nonduduzo Zubuko, who has served in this role for 8 years, emphasized this, saying, "kute lonjani, sonkhe siyafanana la. Kute loncono kuna lomunye

There is an old adage that says: "cynicism is the refuge of cowards." Based on the unfettered optimism I witnessed at the Reed Dance, Swazi girls are the bravest heroes in the world. There was nary a hair of cynicism around - excitement and jubilation was the order of the day. Anyone harbouring doubts about Umhlanga should attend once, to see how beautiful the Reed Dance is.

The beauty of the Swati culture is on

display during Umhlanga - from the dances to the language. SiSwati is a language of poetry more than prose, and the songs were littered with idioms that required one to think and mull them over. A popular new song had the lyrics:

Tsine sabehlula ngeTinkhundla Sibong Ingwenyama yeMaswati Netinkhundla tisibuko seMaswati Sangena ngato ku2022 Sakubona sabehlula ngeTinkhundla Sibon'Ingwenyama yeMaswati Netinkhundla tisibuko seMaswati Lobucili benu Mhlab'uhlangene Sakubona sabehlula ngeTinkhundla Sibong'Ingwenyama yeMaswati Netinkhundla tisibuko seMaswati Lobucili benu Mangisi Sakubona sabehlula ngeTinkhundla Sibong Ingwenyama yeMaswati Netinkhundla tisibuko seMaswati"

usic is said to be the most connecting form of com-Lmunication, that transcends the limitations of language and social prejudice.

This can be felt at the Reed Dance as the sound of over ninety thousand young women fills the atmosphere with song.

Song Writing

As a song writer myself, I was curious about the process of song writing and the distribution of the songs. Besides the known catalogue of songs that have been used for over seventy years, each year Umcambi(composer) is selected to come up with songs.

The lyrics are a social reflection of the world and the times. Upon completion and approval by the Royal house, the songs go through an interesting distribution process.

They are broadcasted on radio, television and sang at "Imimemo" (swazi social gathering). The girls gather in their respective Tinkhunda to come up with songs as well and to teach each other songs they will want to parade with. Each year they are given a unifying theme that guides them.

The melodies are typically the same, but the lyrics change to tell the girls stories. Songs like "Bayosala betiteka bodywana, s'yawabonga emakhos 'etfu", express their collective aspirations.



Now if you know me well, you know I am not much of a dancer, but I do try. I've come to accept that dancing requires rhythm and counting techniques that only a few are born with. It's easy to get lost in the music and dance, but the most impressive sight is seeing the synchronized movement when the girls showcase their routines.

Now, it's easy to assume that you can just join in on the action, but the girls spend weeks before hand practicing and learning the songs they derive for the Reed Dane

So, if you're like me, born with two left feet, you know to sit in the arena on the last day and savor the action from the sidelines. I had promised myself not to expose my challenged dance techniques, but I had to write about the complex foot work that some moves are on a "one, two, three, four" count; my latest Umhlanga experience introduced me to a "one, two, three and half step" technique, that was so complicated an old man offered to teach me.

Rhythm

The initial impression of over nine-

s someone who spent years working in events management, I am no stranger to the tedious work required to successfully organize an event of this magnitude. Though it has been simplified over the years as institutions have it down to a formula. I was curious about the grand organization of an event of this extent. The Eswatini Reed Dance has been running for over seventy years and the number of attendees grows every year. So how do they do it?

Mobilization

Under the Royal office, Umhlanga has a team dedicated to organizing it efficiently. The arrangements start months before hand. If you are in events organization, you know the process is simplified with a set date. You start counting from the date and work the

planning backwards. Umhlanga never has a set date. Each year the country waits for the Kings call and the dates are set. You almost have to appreciate this style of organization as it requires disciplined planning and sound communication.

I discovered the most interesting resource mobilization in Eswatini. Umhlanga is run strictly by the Royal house, despite it being fully funded every year, the people come to offer

support in the most communal process called "Kuhlehla". Kuhlehla is when people come to offer support to the King, though not limited to The Reed Dance, the help comes in different forms. I was fascinated by the support required and offered during the Reed Dance.

From companies to people, the support almost makes the organization unified. From cattle that feeds the girls; to fleets of transportation that assist in

transporting the girl, people come together to show homage to the Royal family.

Understanding the Support

Now if you understand resource mobilization, you know one needs to write presentations and go out to find help. Yet during national events like Umhlanga, the people understand the nations needs and come to offer their support. News of the event is run on all media platforms, where the people are made awe


al times over. Imbali are looking onward to 2022, and expressing support for His Majesty's

t may be confusing many people, especially those that do not understand the reason behind this ceremony, why so many maidens every year attend the Reed Dance.

Some have their own ideas of what happens during the ceremony and have decided they would never attend the Reed Dance. Not to blame or judge any of them because I was one of them. At 23 I this year attended for the first time and it made me realise one thing; I regret not attending when I was younger.

The joy and smiles that are plastered on those maidens when they dance and sing in front of the King are to die for. When you ask most of them why they attend the ceremony without fail you realise it is simply because of the love of their culture.

Many have tried to fault this ceremony but these young women feel their best during the eight days that the ceremony lasts. "I can be myself around here. I meet other girls and all of a sudden I gain confidence to be the person that I really am," said Thobile Matse, one of the maidens who have attended the reed dance for the past seven years.

Eswatini without Umhlanga is just not Eswatini. This culture goes back in the day of our grate-grandparents and will go on for future generations. It is quite amazing how the reed dance is still relevant to this date.

In as much as not all maidens in the country attend but the majority make it a point that they attend at least once in their lifetime. Eswatini's personalities also attend the reed dance. The ceremony is also attended by popular stars from other countries especially from South Africa.

The relevancy of this festival grows each year and with the help of social media it is quite obvious that it will continue to encourage other young people to come to the event.

Most people who have never attended the festival may think it is out of fashion to attend but the maidens that do make sure to keep it relevant and still preserve its cultural values. For instance, weaves and make up were banned, this was to ensure that maidens accept themselves the way they are and be proud of their natural beauty. That is one of the many things that keep this festival grounded in the roots of the

IT'S SIMPLY FOR LOVE

Talking to most maidens during the cutting of the reed they said the reason this was still relevant was because they loved it so much.

"If you love something, you never let it stay out of touch or let it be irrelevant. I am this year cutting the reed for the 11th time and the reason I keep coming back is simply because I love it," said Noxolo Tfwala from kaNdinda.

Tfwala said she also loved the fact that the King cares about everyone that comes to the reed dance. "He does not only say it but shows it, he makes sure we are protected by deploying forces to guard us throughout the night and ambulances to ensure our health is taken care of at all times, why wouldn't you come back," said Tfwala.

Listening to comments from the maidens it is even clearer to me that they simply loved their King and culture.

My entire experience of Umhlanga proved to me just how much it was important to love culture. Some may think traditions are archaic and no longer relevant, and that they are unnecessary during these modern times. Perhaps for some, they aren't; but for Swazi maidens, exploring cultural heritage offers a robust variety of benefits.

Culture gives people a connection to certain social values, beliefs, religions and customs. It also allows them to identify with others of similar mindsets and backgrounds. The maidens were not shy to say they enjoy the Umhlanga experience because it helps them understand life better.

"I love coming to the reed dance because I meet more young girls that are like me, young girls that relate to what I go through and we get time to talk about life and other things that I am not usually able to talk about with my parents back home," said Noncedo Ndlangamandla from Gege.

This proves that cultural heritage can provide an automatic sense of unity and belonging within a group and allows people to better understand previous generations and the history of where they come from.

he Swaziland Action Group Against Abuse (SWAGAA) has launched a drive to register maidens for their anti-abuse hot-

Speaking from their desk at Engabezweni, SWAGAA Project Manager Gcinaphi Ndlovu noted that the Reed Dance is an opportunity to connect with girls on a large scale.

The sad truth is a number of girls

have seen abuse, or even experienced it first hand. Statistics say that you are more likely to be abused by someone you know, thus making it difficult to report, particularly if it is a parent or guardian. This week may very well be the only time afflicted maidens can reach out to someone, without undue influence.

The SWAGAA offices are located in Manzini, which is not easily accessible to all maidens. As the leading organization against Gender Based

Violence in the Kingdom, they have been seeking ways to reach girls from all the corners.

A major challenge for SWAGAA is a lot of the girls do not have mobile phones, thus signing them up becomes difficult. Nevertheless, they have managed to register at least 400 maidens at Engabezweni Royal Residence.

The outreach project provides girls an avenue to report abuse anonymously. They register using their mobile numbers, then add a pseudonym to protect their identity.

Gcinaphi Ndlovu, registering a maiden at Engabezweni, explained that they can add a name that no one else could associate them with, to protect maidens from any retribution arising from reporting abuse. They can also choose whether or not to share other details, such as their birthdays or the region they reside in...

SWAGAA hopes that this will help to encourage maidens to report abuse, as the vast majority of abuses go unre-


According to the CDC, 1 in 3 Swazi girls is a victim of abuse. That means up to 30,000 at the Reed Dance have been abused in their lifetimes. Unfortunately, the vast majority of abuses go unreported.

By allowing maidens to report anonymously, SWAGAA is hoping this will provide them with the security to tell their truth.

This protection of identity is to also prevent secondary victimization, which according to SWAGAA is "when social service providers display behaviours or attitudes that are insensitive

She also said it was not her first time coming to cut the reed as she had done it two times before. "I come here because all my sisters come every year and I wanted to see what they enjoy so much about the ceremony because they always come back with fun and exciting stories," said 6 year old Ntsikayezwe. The young girls come to the reed

dance because their older siblings came but also found something they loved about the festival.

They also get the opportunity to cut the reed at a place suitable for them.
They are also well taken care of and are also led by younger princesses.

Most of these young girls enjoy walking to where they cut the reed and back. "It is fun, we get to sing with other children and have fun," she said. "I now see what our siblings rave about and I am also going to come back every year."

The way these children respect the ceremony proves that the reed dance also instills values in children. Some of the values the young maidens are taught here are the only values they will ever learn from adults.

There are older women who attend the reed dance with the maidens and their duty is not only to guard the maidens but to also instill important life lessons and it shows when talking to the maidens.

There are many benefits for raising children in a respectful manner.

They're less likely to do destructive things, the benefits of teaching the value of respect early include children who are happier, more successful, and have healthier relationships.

Are unselfish, considerate, caring, and generous.

This also means the country is raising powerful women who will be more than capable to lead the different ministries the country has.



to the experiences of the victim."
Unfortunately, the inability of some social service providers to provide adequate care to people reporting abuse discourages them from seeking justice. Thus, maidens can now be assured they will be protected from re-traumatiza-

tion. Girls are advised that SWAGAA provides counseling services, to help them process their traumas; more importantly, if they are still in danger, SWAGAA will also help them find safe shelter. For victims of sexual abuse, they are also given dignity packs, which

include sanitary towels/pads, underwear, toiletries, and fresh clothing. At their stand Engabezweni, girls were also advised about what to do if they are victims of sexual abuse: avoid showering, using the restroom or changing their clothes.

How to get ready for Umhlanga - Tips for 2020

ith the Reed Dance over, maidens are already looking forward to next vear's.

After quering several members of imbali, this list of advice to make sure one is adequately prepared to cut the reed was drawn up.

1. Attend the practice sessions (kulandza Ingoma).

This is where maidens are taught songs and the appropriate behavior expected of them. It also provides an opportunity to meet the girls one will be traveling with, and build bonds before the trip.

2. Make sure imvunulo is right.

Purchase any traditional attire ahead of schedule, because the very limited number of hawkers who sell it charge 'tourist friendly' prices. Moreover, there is a larger variety to choose from if you buy it beforehand. Wash your *emahiya* and tidvwashi to remove starch, and make sure they are pressed right.

3. Know your Indvuna (by name, and by telephone number).

The Indvuna are well trained to keep an eye on maidens. Nevertheless, it is possible to get lost during the fun. Finding your contingent is virtually impossible if you lose them, so always be aware of where your leader is.

4. Travel with any medication you may need.

While the walk is long, but not particularly treacherous, it would still do well to carry medication for asthma, sinusitis and other common ailments. There are medical personnel on hand, however sometimes your specific prescription is tailor made to you and it would be more convenient.

5. Have emergency tolletries Maidens should pack sanitary towels/pads with them. Whether you have never had your period, or the Reed Dance does not coincide with your cycle, it is advisable to pack this essentials in case "Aunty" comes out of the blue.

Carry warm clothes for the night Batsi litjitji aliweva emakhata but Mphisi Farm can get chilly.

This year's Reed Dance was warmer than yesteryears, but temperatures drop at night.

Once there..

1. Don't treat your stomach as a dustbin.

The excitement of being away from home and restrictions means a lot of girls want to go wild and eat everything on display. Medical personnel said they were inundated with complaints about stomach aches and nausea. To keep from falling ill, make sure to eat healthily. Their Majesties provide enough healthy food, but maidens may want to buy snacks. Make sure to eat real food before chips and other junk food.

2. Stay in the camp.

Imbali's behaviour continues to be exemplary. While Umhlanga weekend is often abound with temptations to abscond from camp, with the Green Life Festival, Eswatini Rally, and Home Brew Festival all falling on the same weekend, it is important to stay there. It is not only safer, but it also maintains the good reputation of you and your chiefdom. Their Majesties emphasised the importance of respect and good behaviour.

3. Follow instructions

The Umhlanga Ceremony is a tightly run ship; it has to be, with 90 000 young girls patricipating. To ensure yours and everyone else's safety, listen to what you are told. The people giving instructions have done this before, and they have heard whatever complaints you may have. The system they have is one that works.

he Reed Dance is the Crown Jewel of Eswatini's traditional ceremonies. Every year, tens of thousands of maidens congregate at Ludzidzini Royal Residence to register, yet even though it is held annually, there are still many girls and young women who are yet to participate.

Many young women have said they are afraid that they are too old, or that they are unable to

Indvuna yeMbali, Nonduduzo Zubuko encouraged maidens who may be feeling nervous over their perceived inability to dance to participate in the Reed Dance, regardless. The only shame is being a maiden sitting at home.

Speaking to Zubuko during the first day of the Umhlanga Reed Dance, she was excited and willing to share her life story.

The way she commands the maidens proves just how confident she is. Zubuko oozes confidence and always has a smile plastered on her face which makes every maiden feel comfortable talking to her. As she goes about her duties during the Reed Dace, she walks with her head high and her voice strong and commanding, no wonder she was chosen to lead the maidens of Eswatini.

Catching up with her during the ceremony at Engabezweni Royal Residence she explains how her journey has been over the years. She says she has realised she was born for the position.

her grandmother and understood why she had to be the one for the job.

"Even after accepting the fact that I was chosen, it was still not easy for me to fully comprehend the reason behind my appointment. Coming from a poor family and having to work with different people I felt I did not fit in but because of God's grace I was able to execute my duties."

She quoted the bible saying when David was chosen to fight Goliath, he was chosen and had to do the job. "In everything that I do I remind myself that I was chosen and think of why I was chosen. It's all the grace of God. I remember after crying I said to God if this is your will then who am I to refuse. No journey is easy but if you have God by your side it becomes easy."

She narrated what she has learned through her journey as the leader. "This position has taught me that it is important to love what you do, respect and know that it is important to respond when you are being summoned, be resourceful."

When talking about her duties and role as a leader she refers to her mother and grandmother's teachings ad values.

"My grandmother sort of molded me for this. She made me fall in love with our culture from a really young age. She would host dancing competitions for her grandchildren and the winner would get the best maize cob roasted by her. As children we appreciated such moments because they are the moments that taught us a number of things. I am proud to say that I can dance because my grandmother taught us."

She shares that her mother taught her that people are the same. "Understanding that people are the same helped me treat people the same. I never look at people differently, when I conduct my duties as Indvuna I take everyone as people of the King. That makes everyone feel comfortable to interact with me."

Seeing her go about her duties throughout the ceremony, Zuzu does everything with respect. When she talks to the maidens she approaches them with love and respect. She admits to have taken that trait from her mother.

"My mom always took care of me even though she did not live with me on a full time basis, she made sure I felt love at all times so loving the next person comes easy for me."

Respects

"The world is quite a small place and you might need someone you treated badly in the future so it is always important to be aware of the way you treat people, make it a point that you treat people the way you would like to be treated." Zubuko also expressed how much she respects being summoned by the King. "Responding when 'emakhosi' summon you does not only teach you respect but it also molds you into something great. It also makes you a strong person, imagine when the King thinks someone to send and then he thinks of you, it is an

absolute honour."

'Zuzu' is also proud of the fact she gets to lead thousands of maidens in this journey and said she was looking forward to the final day where they get to present what they have to the King.

Her confidence comes from within. She acknowledged her upbringing, admitting that if it was not for the way she was brought up she would not have been able to lead the maidens with the confidence that she does now.

"Being indvuna yetintfombi has taught me a number of things.

These young women have also impacted on my life in a way that I can explain. It may seem that they look up to me but I also look up to them. Every day of the ceremony I learn a new lesson from someone I would never have thought would teach me something."

"It is not every day that you get to impact on people's lives and it is not every day that you get to lead so many beautiful and strong young women, so every day I wake up and ask guidance from God because it is not easy. I am also grateful to be given the opportunity to do this and for so many years it has become part of my life, I cannot imagine not doing it anymore."

"I can never be thankful and not mention how grateful I am to King Mswati III for trusting me with this position and every day I work hard to ensure that I fulfill his purpose, Bayethe WenaWaphakathi."

conception that someone may be too old to cut the reed.

"Nawusese yintfombi, ute umnyaka." Maidens, whether they may be young or mature, have a place among the regiments, for as long as they remain maidens, however old they may be. According to Indvuna, only once a young man asks the maiden's father for her hand in marriage does she then stop being eligible for the reed dance. Even at the age of 50, a maiden is still a maiden. Indvuna Nonduduzo drew from her own experiences, saying she has been Imbali Leader for eight years, and has never felt old even once.

The fun and camaraderie that the Reed Dance evokes in maidens every year is why they keep coming back.

Indvuna yeMbali spoke about how a maiden need only participate once to fall in love with Umhlanga. She says, "kuyangenana. Utsi ungakucala, kute nalokutjelako, weva nje Indvuna imemeta, uve lolusinga lengekhatsi." Thandeka Ngcobo, who was attending her first Umhlanga, shared that sentiment. "I am coming back next year," she said.

Having just cut the reed for the first

time, 15-year old Thandeka said that she decided to come because she felt pride in her virginity.

When queried, most maidens said their favourite part of the week was kugeca, or the cutting of the reed, and kushuca, which is the walk back to Ludzidzini from Mphisi Farm. Zandile Madonsela, who was dancing her 8th Umhlanga, said her favourite part was the cutting of the reed.

"When we get into the mud, some people would be afraid to get dirty, but we like doing it because we love our King."

Testament to this love of their Sovereign is how no inclement weather can prevent the multitudes of Imbali from participating in the Reed Dance. Others said they enjoyed the walk back to Ludzidzini because of the singing in unison, as well as the dance breaks whenever Imbali rest along the route. From ingadla to the popular vosho, Imbali have fun showcasing their best moves in a safe environment

Indvuna encouraged first time participants to bring their friends next year, because no one should feel left out of this most special experience.



Israel is making the case for war in public

JERUSALEM - Israel's military went on a propaganda offensive against Iran and Hezbollah using social media to drastically increase tensions with neighbouring Lebanon hours after Benjamin Netanyahu warned the nation's enemies, in Arabic, to 'watch it.'

The Israeli prime minister was on the campaign trail ahead of elections scheduled for September 17. But the barrage of agitprop by the Israel Defense Forces (IDF) represented a dramatic shift towards a warning of outright war.

The casus belli, Israel says, is Iran's efforts to modernise Hezbollah's Lebanon-based arsenal of what Israel says is more than 100 000 rockets into precision-guided missiles.

Since the ill-fated Israeli invasion of Lebanon in 2006, during which the IDF lost nearly 120 troops and scores of civilians and about 270 Hezbollah fighters and 50 Lebanese soldiers and police died, there's been an understanding between the two enemies that neither would do anything that could spark a return to allout conflict. Both sides have, until now anyway, recognized a degree of



MAD (Mutually Assured Destruction) in that scenario.

But Israel has now named three senior Iranian officers, two brigadier generals and a colonel, whom the IDF said were in charge of the missile programme for Hezbollah in Lebanon. It also pointedly observed that the leader of the group, the Iranian Quds Force, was in the country 'with his family.'

The names and faces of the three men appear in one IDF video that alleges the weapons facilities are being deliberately built in civilian areas using locals as human shields against potential Israeli attack.

Another video says that Hezbollah could soon have the capability to fly a missile onto an Israeli address as simply as if it was using the popular Waze navigation app. The propaganda clip even uses an animation of the app itself to drive its point home. Ironically, the video doesn't note that Waze was invented by an Israeli company.

Environment, poverty, corruption on agenda for Pope's Africa trip

VATICAN CITY - Pope Francis 'Laudato Si' on environmental leaves tomorrow for Africa, where poverty, the environment, foreign exploitation of resources and corruption are expected to be high on his agenda as he visits the continent where Catholicism is growing

He will spend most of the 4-10 September trip in Mozambique and Madagascar and briefly visit Mauritius at the end.

Fires in the Amazon have given new urgency to the pope's calls to protect the environment, tackle climate change and promote sustainable development.

Aides say the trip, his second trip to sub-Saharan Africa, is a key opportunity to renew appeals enshrined in his 2015 encyclical protection.

Rampant deforestation has plagued Mozambique and Madagascar. Deforestation, along with soil erosion, made Mozambique more vulnerable when two cyclones hit the country this year.

According to the World Bank, Mozambique has lost 8 million hectares of forest, about the size of Portugal, since the 1970s.

"Here in Mozambique we like to say that not even our wood is ours because the Chinese are taking it all away, said Costantino Bogaio, head of the Comboni religious order in Mozambique. "The earth is ours and we have to protect it more."

UK's Johnson threatens to purge lawmakers from party

LONDON - British Prime Minister Boris Johnson has threatened to purge any lawmaker in his party who votes against the government on Brexit in a dramatic escalation of tensions ahead of a crucial week at Westminster.

A senior source in the whips office, responsible for party enforcement, said any Conservative lawmaker who votes against the government this week would be thrown out of the parliamentary party and banned from standing for the Conservatives in the next election.

"The whips are telling Conservative MPs (members of Parliament) today a very simple message - if they fail to vote with the government on Tuesday they will be destroying the government's negotiating position and handing control of Parliament to Jeremy Corbyn," the source said.

"Any Conservative MP who does this will have the whip withdrawn

and will not stand as Conservative candidates in an election."

The battle for Brexit will enter the endgame this week when opposition lawmakers from all parties seek to either change the law, or the government, in their drive to block what they say would be an economically damaging no-deal Brexit. Reuters

Students boycott classes after weekend of violence

HONG KONG - Thousands of Hong Kong university and school students swapped classes for democracy demonstrations yesterday, the latest act of defiance in an anti-government movement that has plunged the Chineseruled city into its biggest political crisis in decades.

The boycott follows a weekend marred by some of the worst violence since unrest escalated more than three months ago, with protesters burning barricades and throwing petrol bombs, and police retaliating with water cannon, tear gas and batons.

Riot police yesterday patrolled the subway, known as the MTR, where some of the most violent clashes have erupted.

Hundreds of students gathered outside the Chinese University of Hong Kong, one of the city's largest, taking turns to make speeches from a stage with a black backdrop embossed with 'Students in Unity Boycott for our City.'

"I come here just to tell others that even after summer holidays end we are not back to our normal life, we should continue to fight for Hong Kong," said one 19-year-old student who asked to

be identified as just Chan.

"These protests awaken me to care more about the society and care for the voiceless.'

On the first day of the new school year, secondary students were seen singing, chanting and forming human chains, some wearing hard hats and

Many primary schools were closed because of a typhoon warning.

Matthew Cheung, Hong Kong government chief secretary, told reporters that schools were no place for protests.

Tunisia unveils 26 candidates for Sept

26 candidates out of 96 who are eligible for the September 15 presidential election.

Thus 70 candidates were disqualified from contesting in the polls. "As long as there is no legal decision that prevents someone from running in the presidential elections, they have the right to do so. And we have 26 candidates who enjoy all their rights to run for president. Their names have been added to the primary list. We announced today that they are definitely candidates for the presidential election," Nabil Baffoun, Head of the Electoral Commission told a press conference on Saturday.

Negotiations still ongoing for a final govt

on Sunday in Sudan to reach the formation of the government, four days after the date initially planned for the announcement of this new cabinet, which should mark one of the main stages of the post-Bashir transition.

Bathabile's support of Mkhwebane shows ANC deeply divided

JOHANNESBURG - A political analyst says the decision by the ANC Women's League President, Bathabile Dlamini, to show support for under-fire Public Protector Advocate Busisiwe Mkhwebane, while some within the ruling party want her gone, is a sign that the ANC is deeply divided.

Durban-based independent analyst Thabani Khumalo says it's a farce that the party was ever united, adding that there are two main factions that have people helping their cause.

He said most of Mkhwebane's decisions have helped one of the factions, which includes Dlamini, hence the latter's decision to show up in Mpumalanga on Friday to attend a prayer service organised for the Public Protector.



"If (President Cyril) Ramaphosa was actively responding to the ongoing fight back campaign we would be seeing fire versus fire. There is no unity here and people must not be deceived," Khumalo said.

He said Dlamini's support further underlined the divisions within the

ruling party as it came days the National Assembly changed rules to enable it to remove the sitting Public Protector unhindered.

As a result of that, the ANC which enjoys majority powers in the assembly, will remove her.

Liquidator issues 'termination' notice to Bosasa youth centres

JOHANNESBURG - The future in the centres. of the children at 10 Bosasa youth development centres across the country hangs in the balance after liquidators for the company, now known as African Global Operations (AGO), sent notice to stop rendering services by the end of October.

The centres house youth who have severe behavioural challenges and/or are in conflict with the law.

A letter was sent to the centres on August 8, titled: "Notice of termination of the service level agreements - and termination of employment." The national social development department, however, said it was waiting for a redrafted version of the letter that cited adequate reasons for the 'termination.'

In the August 8 letter, liquidator Ralph Lutchman said: "The fact that we have been operating while in liquidation has placed a tremendous strain on the business operations and staff morale has been significantly impacted."

He added this had caused the liquidators to reconsider the 'commercial viability of the current security and secure care operations' with-

Lutchman informed staff their last day would be on October 31.

"We urge you to continue your normal duties in a professional matter until the service is terminated."

The letter raises questions about what will happen to the children at the centres.

According to the Bosasa website, Mogale was the first and largest secure care centre to be privately managed in South Africa when it opened outside Krugersdorp in 1995.

"During that time, the government recognised the need for young offenders to be relocated from adult-occupied correctional facilities and cells to safer environments," the website stated. Citizen

Gavin Watson will take secrets to the grave

JOHANNESBURG - The death of African Global Solutions chief executive Gavin Watson, 71, has raised many questions, but to those in the struggle, he and his Eastern Cape family were pathfinders who turned their back on apartheid.

Gavin, was one of the four Watson brothers - Valence, Ronnie and Daniel, popularly known as Cheeky - grew up on a Somerset East farm in the Eastern Cape.

Their father, according to Wikipedia, was a lay preacher who preached racial equality during apartheid.

Gavin, the eldest of the brothers, met his death on Monday morning when the vehicle he was travelling in plunged into a bridge pillar near the OR Tambo International Airport.

He had apparently used the company's Toyota Corolla for the weekend after his BMW X5 experienced mechanical problems.

He died on the eve of a South African Revenue Service tax inquiry into African Global Solutions, formerly known as Bosasa, with Times Select revealing Watson 'funnelled' much as half a billion rand into 1 Juernsey tax haven offshore.

I is family has since appointed a ensic engineering and accident econstruction expert Konrad Lotter to investigate the crash.

Gavin's death has obviously arked speculation and there is a

general view that he may have taken many of his company's tax secrets to the grave.

This week, Port Elizabeth activists remembered Gavin and his family for their role in the liberation Struggle.

They told how the family sparked controversy in the 1980s when leadership in the mass democratic movement, United Democratic Front (UDF) was divided on whether a consumer boycott should apply to their businesses.

Businessman and anti-apartheid activist Mkhuseli Jack said the Watsons were a unit that was exemplary. "They continued to subscribe to strong family values as the foundation of any society to start with," Jack said.

Moloto plans to remove newly-elected PAC president

Pooe said Moloto had defied an order of the North Gauteng High Court in Pretoria instructing ting Moloto to refrain from holding an elective conference under the banner of the PAC.

He said Moloto and his supporters ignored the court order and "decided to hold a get-together in which they elected themselves into positions."

RAMAPHOSA TASKS SIU WITH PRASA PROBE

JOHANNESBURG - The awarding of tenders for security services and forensic services will form part of an investigation by the Special Investigating Unit (SIU) into the affairs of Passenger Rail Agency of SA (PRASA).

This emerged in a schedule published in the Government Gazette published on Friday by Justice and Correctional Services Minister Ronald Lamola.

Lamola said the contracts and payments that would come under scrutiny include those that were not cost-effective, not in line with circulars issued by the National Treasury as well as unauthorised, irregular or fruitless and wasteful expenditure.

The schedule come after President Cyril Ramaphosa authorised the SIU to conduct a probe into the affairs of Prasa. In a proclamation published on Friday, Ramaphosa said allegations have been made in respect of the affairs



of the Prasa. "I deem it necessary that the said allegations should be investigated and civil proceedings emanating from such investigation should be adjudicated upon," he said.

The investigations will cover the period between January 2010 until or after the proclamation was published.

Ramaphosa said the SIU investigation would examine allegations of serious maladministration and unlawful conduct by the state-owned entity's (SOE) employees.

Taking the crowd back in time were Nomalungelo and KrTC, who rendered 'Gwayimane' for the audi-









ZURICH - FIFA have unveiled its three-man shortlist for the 2019 Best Men's Player award -with Cristiano Ronaldo, Virgil van Dijk and Lionel Messi all competing for the top prize.

The European superstars will battle it out to win the prestigious gong, currently held by Real Madrid's Luka Modric, in a ceremony held in Milan on September 23. All three names were recognised for their formidable achievements at both the front and rear of the pitch throughout the last year. The trio are also set to contest in the final three of the Balon d'Or award, which is to be announced later this year - and van Dijk remains the current favourite.

CRISTIANO RONALDO

It comes as no surprise that Juventus' Portuguese star has been nominated. His 21 goal haul in Serie A last season helped the Italian giants retain the title for an eighth successive season.

After opting to move from Real Madrid at the start of the last campaign, the mercurial forward played a crucial role in Juventus' battle for silverware across several fronts.

He also excelled on the international stage, having lifted the UEFA Nations League with Portgual

Ronaldo's competitive streak and hunger for improvement has seen the 34-year-old remain at the pinnacle of the sport and continue to prove a menace for defences all across the continent.





The meandering PLE CEO sideshow drama must end

AT the weekend we woke up to a fresh addition to the showboating, unnecessarily meandering and never ending Premier League of Eswatini Chief Executive Officer attention seeking drama involving our elite league and several characters over the last decade.

Just when we thought our former high profile international referee, Simanga Nhleko was settling well into the office, like a lightning bolt from the blue the news of his exit was confirmed leaving us with more questions than answers.

What bemused most of us was the reason given for this exit: "contractual provisions disagreement" between the two parties and like really wasn't it a clumsy exposure of a glaring constitutional delinquency.

We surely await the PLE board of governors to raise a red flag over such constitutional delinquency which more than possible could add a court room episode.

To many they may be forgiven to feel the post is being used to either settle old scores, agenda setting, cronies rewarding or all the above three added together more than moving our league, which once rose to 14 in the continental stands, to the next level.

Unnecessary

It is now tumultuous and messy PLE CEO's office if anything degenerating into an unnecessary sideshow stealing away the on field excitement, mileage on the terraces that could cost the game of sponsorship packages.

Will Nhleko add to a litany of ex-CEO court litigation? This is the big question against any grain of hope judging by the nature, nurture and texture – this is a marathon discussion for another day or forum.

The Premier League of Eswatini heartbeat top post—the Chief Executive Officer—has had its fair share, a share

ranging from advertisement, interviews, hiring, unveiling, suspension, termination, restructuring and everything in between.

From time immemorial for what many football pundits who thought the premiership nerve centre officer was to bring football development, awash sponsorships, smooth running and every positive expectations associated with it, sadly our league has not known constitutional peace.

In some common cases the errors or is it the eras that thereof have unnecessarily found spillage rapturous and gratuitously stinking in our busy courts, yes stinking as the court cases have literally washed the football league's dirty linen in public.

For many that may not be in the know how here are some of the notable cases littering the hot potato office that seemingly and endlessly becoming the biggest administrative sideshow beyond the intended soccer field thrills, spills and everything in between.

Disowned

Remember how the Premier League of Eswatini openly disowned an affidavit submitted by the then resigned CEO Sydney Simelane in 2010 in the play offs saga involving Hellenic merely a year after the Vulindlela Kunene episode of court drama.

In a sudden twist of events in 2009, embattled Premier League of Eswatini CEO Vuli Kunene had withdrawn his application against his employers from the Industrial Court after deciding to pull out the matter, which had sought an urgent certificate, even before it was registered before the Industrial Court.

The withdrawal came after the PLE had filed opposing affidavits to the one filed by Kunene following the suspension of the entire staff at the office including the office administrator

Neamsile Mkhonta and accountant Sonnyboy Dlamini to allow a probe on the Top Lotto ticket scandal.

Kunene argued in his affidavit that the suspension was unconstitutional and in contravention of the labour laws of the country in that he was never afforded any hearing nor was he charged for any misconduct.

And eventually Kunene exited the office and in came Simelane who didn't last long.

Error

As that episode entered Zwelonke 'Sport' Dlamini's era which the esteemed PLE Board of Governors felt it was an error a couple of months down the line giving birth to another protracted court room episode.

In what became an interesting legal showdown between the PLE and 'Sport', the latter's lawyers appealed his contract termination for his last appointment as Development Officer and Dlamini took his case to the Conciliation, Mediation and Arbitration Commission (CMAC) and coincidentally the current chairman Peter 'Touch' Magagula was the acting CEO.

The PLE had re-deployed Dlamini (Sport) to the position of Development Officer after he was replaced as CEO by shortest serving Nqobile Magagula, now with Eswatini Posts and Telecommunication Corporation.

SACKED: Premier League of Eswatini CEO Simanga Nhleko. Dlamini was discontent about the salary offer and the condition he would also report to office administrator Neamsile Mkhonta, arguing that this was demotion to a junior position but he later stripped of the job offer.

And the search for the new CEO which was in motion eventually landed at Nqobile Magagula whose reign was as short as a sneeze and we all thought we had seen enough of the never ending and meandering episodes of drama surrounding the office.

In 2013, the PLE got their man in former Tennis Association President John Mazibuko who was appointed the organisation's new Chief Executive Officer (CEO).

Egos

Mazibuko replaced

departed CEO

Ngobile Magagula

who only served

a few months

before a top

post at Eswatini Telecom where she works now. Magagula had joined the PLS as Brand Manager, a position that Mazibuko will also double-up as while CEO and had replaced 'Sport'.


Somehow for the serenity to the end of this drama, egos must be put into the trash cans of the game and forgotten for good, self-fulfilling agendas must not be given manoeuvring and manipulating room remember even meandering rivers end into big oceans and seas which for our game has to be absolute development.

SOCCER - THE Eswatini Football Coaches Association (EFCA) has noted that local coaches are dominating in winning trophies than their expatriate counterparts.

Speaking on Sunday during the EFCA Annual General Meeting held at Sigwaca House, General Secretary Musa Mamba acknowledged that the Eswatini coaches won all trophies that were at stake last

"It is good to announce that we can see great improvement in the standard of coaching in the country. This is manifested by the tournaments where local coaches are winning in the elite leagues, he said. Mamba also highlighted that they had challenges as expatriate coaches were still failing to mix with Emaswati in whatever they were doing.

"Our expatriate friends in the profession are still failing to mix with Emaswati in whatever we are doing, and this indicate that they are not part of us. In future, the membership will need to take a dire decision."

He added that coaches were still failing to subscribe in time, while others pass unpalatable remarks when reminded. He said some coaches, who are coaching at the highest level were still without coaching licenses.

'We had a fairly good year as there were no disciplinary cases, and this is a sign of growth from us. However, the only unbecoming conduct that we had was the issue of one coach, who coached two teams in Eswatini and outside the country. We could not deal with that one as his team played hide and seek about the issue but we are happy he was disciplined by his native country," he said.

Meanwhile, EFCA Chairman Anthony Mdluli explained that they had reached an agreement with EPTC and MTN to create platforms where coaches and the public would vote for best coach in the Premier League, National First Division, Super League and Women Football.

He urged coaches and football supporters to continue to vote.

He also highlighted that the association also targeted at raising funds to acquire land to build a coaches centre.

EFCA targets 300 coaches in 2019/20 season

SOCCER - THE EFCA is targeting to have not less than 300 coaches registered in the 2019/20 season.

This was disclosed on Sunday during

General Secretary Musa Mamba said in the past season they had 70 coaches, who were paid-up members which was lower than the 2017/18 season as it was an elective year. "In this past year we saw prominent coaches failing to pay their subscriptions, thus added to the decrease in membership, "he said.

Mamba mentioned that as coaches they had an obligation of taking the association to the next level.

He said the association was not a political field where they needed to show their political strengths and mock the weaknesses of others but they needed to assist one another and move forward.

"Let us all be professional and stop belittling one another. May I also take this opportunity to thank coach Pastor Mbazo Zembe' Gamedze for being handy for the whole year in so many ways to the coaches," he said.
