Senator Mphatfwa now at PSB

SENATORS yesterday elected Senator Prince Mphatfwa to represent the upper chamber at the Parliamentary Service Board

Prince Mphatfwa was elected ahead of Senators Princess Ntfombiyenkhosi and Isaac Magagula. Prince Mphatfwa's election came after Senator Cleopas Dlamini moved that Prince Mphatfwa be automatically elected into the board.

Senator Cleopas reminded Senate that they had nominated three senators in December last year.

"The senators we nominated included Senator Prince Mphatfwa, Senator (Isaac) Magagula, and Senator Princess Ntfombiyenkhosi. I propose that we elect Senator Prince Mphatfwa to represent Senate at PSB," Senator Cleopas said.

The senators agreed with the proposal of Senator Cleopas and voted for Senator Prince Mphatfwa. The senators did this in accordance with Section 4 (5) of the Parliamentary Service Act, Act No. 6 of 2015. The existence of the PSB is also provided for in Section 131 of the Constitution.

The Legislature, acting jointly with His Majesty King Mswati III has already filled six of the positions of the PSB.

The remaining vacancy is yet to be filled on a date yet to be announced. It shall be filled by a Joint House Committee.

Two former legislators are contesting for that position. They include former Minister of Sports, Culture and Youth Affairs Hlobisile Ndlovu together with former Senator Menjeni Mahlalela. Ndlovu was nominated by the House of Assembly in December last year, while Mahlalela was nominated by Senate in the same month.

The House of Assembly automatically elected Mhlume MP Victor Malambe to represent the House at the PSB in December last year. Eswatini Water Services Corporation Managing Director (MD) Jabulile

Mashwama was appointed by His Majesty the King to be part of the board in February this year.

The PSB is responsible for the proper and effective administration of Parliament, according to Section 131 (3) of the Constitution. The seven positions of the PSB include the Senate President and Speaker, who preside over the PSB on rotational basis.

Other members include two current legislators from both the House and Senate and one former legis-

The sixth person to be a member is the Clerk to Parliament, who becomes an ex-officio member of the board. The seventh is the person appointed by the King.

The senators we nominated include Senator Prince Mphatfwa, Senator Isaac Magagula, and Senator Princess Ntfombiyenkhosi. I pro-

Cyclone Idai: First consignment goes Monday

THE first consignment to help cyclone victims in Mozambique is supposed to go on Monday.

This was said by Deputy Prime Minister (DPM) Themba Masuku. He said this yesterday at Senate when responding to calls from senators to help the victims of the cyclone in Mozambique. Masuku said the money that was already donated by Emaswati towards this cause was now about E250 000.

He further told the senators that the first consignment would be transferred to Mozambique on Monday. He said his office was already getting the consignment ready now so that by Monday, it was ready to go.

The DPM said people should deposit their offerings in police stations, Tinkhundla centres or Baphalali Eswatini Red Cross Society. He further urged people not to forget bringing pots and dishes because it was highly possible that such items also vanished when the cyclone struck.

"We keep learning as we do this job. We have been emphasising on mobilising money and clothes for this cause. We forgot that we also need to give pots to the people because they will need the pots to cook the food we are donating,"Masuku said.

He further praised Senator Tony Sibandze for raising a motion calling on senators to also contribute in helping Cyclone Idai victims.

Sibandze had pleaded with his colleagues to also be counted amongst those who forwarded assistance to the people of Mozambique.

The senators finally agreed that they would donate and ensure that their items were among those that would be moved on Monday to Mozambique. The DPM also told the senators that the consignment to go on Monday would not be the last one. People should continue donating as other consignments would go on dates to be announced in due course.

Senators worry about corruption rate

SENATORS expressed concern at the rate in which corruption was prevalent in the country.

The senators raised this concern yesterday when Minister of Finance Neal Rijkenberg tabled Loan Bills before the senators. One of them was that of a water project that would be taking place in the Manzini region and the other one was that of the Manzini Golf Course Interchange Project.

Both loans are to be secured from the African Development Bank (AfDB). For the water project Loan Bill, Minister Rijkenberg was supposed to be authorised to raise a loan not exceeding E720 million, while for the golf course project, he was supposed to be authorised to raise not more than USD30 020 000 (about E428 million).

Senator Alberto Samuels urged the minister to ensure that corruption was prevented at all costs when these loans are made. He said what was the problem was that corruption made it possible for projects not to be finished. He urged the minister to ensure that these

projects were finished.

Senator Moi Moi Masilela wanted to know why another loan was secured when other projects were not finished. He said the road from Mbadlane to Sikhuphe was not finished yet another loan for the golf course was now being secured. He said such acts should not be allowed because they were dangerous for the country.

In response, Minister Rijkenberg assured the senators that corruption would be prevented this time around. He said the

other projects were not finished because some problems came along the way yet some of these problems were not envis-

He said these loans were from AfDB and loans from the African Bank hada track record of being successful. He said the AfDB usually deployed experts at sites where projects were taking place. The role of the experts was to ensure that such loans were used for what they were intended for, hence projects under this bank hardly failed.

BUSINESSMAN WASKILEDFOR HIS E100 000'

SUSPICIONS are rife that the late Asian businessman, who was found dead with a gashing head wound in his apartment at Park View Heights in Mbabane last Friday, was killed for his E100 000.

This money was owed to the deceased by one of his countrymen.

Some of the deceased's countrymen are refuting allegations that their countryman's alleged murder may have been a robbery gone wrong.

One of his countrymen, who owns a business in Manzini, alleged that the murderer may have been closer to the deceased than suspected. The business man said Saruare Hossain was someone who was always willing to help others.

This sentiment was also shared among his employees. One of his employees who works as a cashier in his supermarket noted that he was friendly and sociable, adding that Hossain was more like a father to his employees.

He offered that his suspicions were that one of Hossain's close friends who were indebted to the deceased was probably unable to pay him so they may have opted to kill him or have him killed instead. They alleged that the people claiming to have been closest to the deceased were giving inaccurate information to the police in an attempt to recuse themselves from investigations.

They said since his close friends were alleging that he may have been killed by a local, why were they not providing the police with plausible leads as to who they suspect.

They also claimed that the close friend, who said they called Hossain on his mobile phone on Friday morning and he did not answer, allegedly misinformed the public as they were informed by the late businessman's brother-inlaw that his mobile phone had been off since Thursday night at around 2300

In actual fact, the friend was contacted by Hossain's brother-in-law on the Friday morning to inquire about his whereabouts as he had not answered his phone the previous night, they said.

Deputy Police Information and Communications Officer (DPICO) Inspector Nosipho Mnguni said they still did not have a breakthrough with the case and investigations were ongoing. She stated that on Saturday, a postmortem was conducted on the deceased's body and they were still waiting for the results.

One of his countrymen who

wanted to remain anonymous said Hossain is survived by two children and his wife who are back in his home country in Bangladesh.

"Our biggest worry as his countrymen and as any human a breadwinner," he said.

Govt to introduce surveys to test service delivery at ministries

GOVERNMENT employees will now be put under test to determine the service delivery handed to the nation at the different ministries.

The exercise will be introduced once government has gathered enough funding to implement it and it is aimed at measuring how effective service delivery is to the nation at government service points.

This was revealed by Prime Minister Ambrose Dlamini during his tour of the ministry of home affairs yesterday.

Dlamini was welcomed by Home Affairs Minister Princess Lindiwe and Principal Secretary Anthony Masilela before addressing the ministry's staff then proceeding to a tour of the offices inside the ministry.

"As government, we are not a profit making organisation but our profit is giving efficient service to the satisfaction of the nation.

However, what you can't measure. you cannot manage and it is for that reason that we would introduce surveys that will measure the service delivery at different ministries so that we are in a position to determine areas that need more focus and improvement for the benefit of the nation," he said

Innovation

Dlamini said the move should be complemented by innovation and digitising services at the ministries. He made an example about services that require one to stand in long exhaustive queues, which he said should be a thing of the

"We are blessed to have a leader who is visionary and development oriented in His Majesty King Mswati III whose 2022 vision is possible when we innovate, digitalise and apply a high level of professionalism so that the nation that we serve can benefit. Integration and collaboration within and among the ministries are also key elements we encourage and advocate for," he added.

Dlamini also highlighted that government has finalised the country's strategic roadmap and it has also been blessed by the King. It would thereafter be disseminated to the ministries in due

Hope

The PM also brought a glimpse of hope to the employees by revealing to them that staff welfare was government's priority and by April 2020, government should be able pay salary increments and the Cost of Living Adjustment (CoLA).

"My ambition in my duration as head of government is to have salary adjustments annually from the beginning of the 2020 financial year going forward. For now, the situation is worse than it was in 2010 but we anticipate things to turn out for the better in the mentioned period," he said.

Senator Cleopas wins again at Supreme Court

SENATOR Cleopas Dlamini, who successfully obtained a finally decree of divorce against his former wife Cynthia Simelane, yesterday was also victorious in an appeal application filed by her at the Supreme

This after the Supreme Court struck off the roll Simelane's appeal in which she was challenging the judgment of the High Court which ruled in the former Public Service Pensions Fund (PSPF) Chief Executive Officer, now senator.

When the matter was supposed to be heard, it appeared that the applicant's (Cynthia) lawyers had not put their house in order as some papers were not properly filed with the two applications for condonation also not filed according to the Rules of the Supreme Court.

Supreme Court Judge Phesheya Dlamini, who was sitting with Judges Jacobus Annandale and Acting Judge Sabelo Matsebula, expressed concern in the matter the application was brought before court and wondered how the two condonation applications could have been dealt with as the first one had not even been ventilated before court.

It also transpired that the record of proceedings from the court a quo filed by the applicant was not complete. After both parties had made their brief submissions, Judge Annandale issued an order that the matter be struck off the court's roll.

"The court had been tasked to determine this appeal which cannot be determined with the papers filed before which are not void to prospects of success. The court cannot proceed with hearing the appeal proceedings; it is also of note that the matter has been in and out of court. The appeal is hereby struck off the roll and is not



to be reinstated without leave of court," Justice Annandale pronounced.

The applicant (Simelane) was represented by lawyer Sikhumbuzo Simelane of Simelane, Mtshali Attorneys while Dlamini was represented by lawyer Fezile Ndlovu in the matter.

Senator Dlamini was last year granted a final decree of divorce between him and his estranged wife Cynthia and they have been embroiled in a court battle since 2006.

The final decree of divorce was issued by Judge Cyril Maphanga after Cynthia reportedly failed to restore conjugal rights as previously ordered by the court.

Dlamini had instituted divorce proceedings against his wife because, among other things, she practiced religious beliefs obsessively and intolerably and another major source of disquiet was that Cynthia became extremely preoccupied and would neglect her duties due to her heavy engagement in church activities which often entailed frequent church services even during the course of the week and weekends, being away from home to attend prayer meetings for

Dlamini had submitted in his evidence that what really led to the marital difficulties was the radical transformation in the attitude and personality of Cynthia which he described in court as being obsessive and overzeal-

SODV sends three men to jail for 18 years

AT least three men were yesterday sent to the correctional facility after they were found guilty of contravening the Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence Act of 2018.

All three accused persons were accordingly found guilty by the court. Each of them was subsequently sentenced to 18 years in a correctional facility without an option of a fine.

Aviation Company obtains order to attach E4m chopper

IN one of the rare Court applications to be heard by the High Court of Eswatini, an aviation company has filed an urgent application seeking an order that a helicopter belonging to Namibia CC trading as HELWORX (Pty) Ltd be attached and restricted or interdicted from flying out of the country.

Further, the Matsapha Airport based company KIMULIMULI (Pty) Ltd is also seeking an order that the person of a Namibian helicopter company HELIWORX be attached and that he be restrained or interdicted from leaving the Kingdom of Eswatini until the matter is finalised.

High Court Principal Judge Qinisile Mabuza yesterday granted the orders in terms of the prayers sought by the applicant (KIMULIMULI) and a rule nisi was issued calling upon the respondents to show cause why the prayers sought by the applicant should not be made final.

The court further ordered that the Royal Eswatini Police Service (REPS) whose commissioner has been cited as the fourth respondent in the matter, is duly authorised to assist the Deputy Sheriff in executing the orders and preserve peace and that the rule nisi was returnable on April 12, 2019.

Sidumo Mdladla of SV Mdladla and Associates, Glenton Combes who is the co-director of the applicant (KIMULIMULI) in his founding affidavit submitted that he is a Kenyan, British

Registered

"The applicant (KIMULIMULI) is a company duly registered and incorporated in terms of the company laws of the Kingdom of Eswatini having its principal place of business at Matsapha International Airport," Combes submitted.

The first respondent according to Combes is HELIWORX Aviation Services Namibia t/a HELIWORX, a company based in Namibia and the second respondent was Silver Falcon t/a 288 (Pty) Ltd, a company based in the Republic of South Africa.

He stated that the third respondent was Gary Fox, a male businessman currently in Namibia and occasionally resident in South Africa and the director and shareholder of the first and second respondents. He submitted that KIMULIMULI was an aviation company providing services regulated by the Eswatini Civil Aviation Authority and the company had relations with other companies in South Africa and that it provided aircraft services including inter-alia crop spraying, charter or wildlife herding, capture and other wildlife conservation related work.

The application was filed on an ex-parte basis according to Rule 6 (4) of the Rules of the High

HELIWORX' Aviation's Gary Fox approached us - Combes

IN his affidavit, Combes of the Matsapha Airport based company stated to be able to effectively offer these services when the third respondent (Gary Fox) approached them (KIMULIMULI) for purposes of purchasing his aircraft, they thought it prudent to purchase it.

This they did to the extent that they agreed to purchase the aircraft from the Gary Fox and Silver Falcon.

The aircraft in question is an Augusta Bell 206 helicopter registered V5 further stating that the Fox is an individual who is well acquainted with the aviation industry adding that he (Combes) is a partner to Leon Mellet who is a director and shareholder of the applicant (KIMULIMULI) and that they were quite aware of Fox's experience and advised that he (Fox) owns aircrafts both in Namibia and South Africa.

He submitted that when Fox approached them for the purchase of the aircraft they met and negotiated the deal and eventually agreed on a sale with an agreement of sale prepared by both parties and in terms of the agreement, amongst other things was that Silver Falcon would sell the helicopter to them, one Allison Rolls -Royce 250-c 20b engine and that all equipment, accessories and parts belonging to, installed in or appurtenant to such aircraft or engine and the aircraft document would be part of the sale.

"It was further a term of agreement that the first respondent would sell, grant transfer and deliver all rights, title and interest in and to the aircraft to the applicant dated December, 2017 in respect of the aircraft to have and to hold it forever," he stated.

The parties according to Combes further agreed in particular Silver Falcon through its Director Fox that the helicopter was free and clear of any lien and that the purchase shall defend such title forever.

The agreement was signed and executed on December 17, 2017 and the helicopter was bought for an amount of \$285 000 and the applicant made full payment to Silver Falcon and Fox wrote a letter acknowledging payment.

Chopper can't be utilised in Eswatini unregistered - Combes

AFTER the helicopter had been paid for in full, Combes submitted in his affidavit that it was expected that HELIFORX Aviation Services or any of its associated companies through Gary Fox, was to utilize it for its business for

He submitted that it was a tacit term that Gary Fox and Silver Falcon would deliver the invoice to the applicant for purposes of importing the helicopter into the Kingdom of Eswatini and to further register same with the Eswatini Civil Aviation Authority. Combes submitted that the chopper was flown into Eswatini at the Matsapha International Airport but was unable to be utilis ed due to the applicant's agreement with ESWACAA and Fox that the helicopter would be imported and registered in the Kingdom within six months as per the international laws, but it could not be registered without the invoice.

"The applicant through my partner Leon Mellet and I approached the third respondent (Fox) on separate occasions requesting him to provide us with the invoice but without any success," combes submitted.

He informed the court that on or about March 5, 2019 his partner (Mellet) once again approached Fox as he was in the Kingdom of Eswatini and requested that he provide them with the invoice but Fox's response was to the effect that he would issue the invoice through HELIWORX Aviation Services Namibia. This request was turned down as they requested the proper invoice would have to be issued by Silver Falcon as per the sale agree-

He submitted that there was no legal reason given by the respondents for the refusal to issue the invoice and that as indicated the applicant still cannot register the helicopter without the invoice and that the applicant has further approached the Eswatini Revenue Authority (ERA) which stated that the invoice is material for the purposes of Value Added Tax (VAT) account.


Guilty



A 34-year-old man, who has been arrested for contravening the Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence Act (SODV), claims he has been framed in the whole matter.

He alleges that the father of the complainant is getting back at him for reporting him to the police on dagga death threats he (father's complainant) uttered at him. Sibusiso Manji Sikhondze has filed an urgent application at the High Court where he is seeking an order to be granted bail pending finalisation of his matter. However, his bail application is opposed by the Crown which filed a notice of intention to oppose yesterday morning.

The matter was before Principal Judge Qinisile Mabuza yesterday and it was postponed to tomorrow for arguments by both parties.

According to the charge sheet, Sikhondze is accused of contravening the act in that he allegedly had unlawful sexual intercourse with the minor girl (13) who is incapable of consenting to sexual intercourse.

Represented by Mbabane based lawyer Noncedo Ndlangamandla of Mabila Attorneys in Association with N Ndlangamandla, Sikhondze in his affidavit submitted that he is innocent of the charges preferred against him.

Offence He alleged that he never committed the offence, but what transpired is that the he, together with father of the complainant, do not get along after continued accusations by the complainant's father that he (Sikhondze) is stealing his dagga.

According to Sikhondze, this went on to the extent that the complainant's father issued death threats at him and seeing that the threats were intensifying, he (Sikhondze) reported the issue to the police.

The police are then said to have approached the complainant's father at his home where they indeed found and destroyed dagga fields and the relationship between him and the complainant's father soured even more.

"On the day of the alleged incident, I was with the mother of my children and it was getting dark when we met complainant's father along the way home. I assume that is when he devised the plan to make the unfortunate allegations against me; I have never had any sexual relationship with his daughter," Sikhondze submitted.

He further told the court that at the police station he even asked the complainant in front of the police where the incident happened and she responded by saying it was in his (Sikhondze's) house, however, he alleged that when he asked him to give the police a brief description of the set up in his house. she allegedly failed to do so.

PAC shocked by filth at AG's offices

YESTERDAY, the Public Accounts Committee (PAC) toured the auditor general's (AG's) offices, only to be 'welcomed' by filth.

The offices of the AG are situated at the Deeds Office, just next to the offices of the ministry of education and training in Mbabane.

Abandoned

The situation in those offices is so dire such that other offices were abandoned because they were considered not fit for human occupation.

Some office floors were covered in water, which exposed the wiring to excessive moisture as a result some offices had no power, thus some officers in that building were forced to work in the dark as there was no power. Some workers in the building have blamed all this chaos on the poor plumbing system in the building.

Hazard

They said it made the whole building a health hazard because even not so clean water from the toilet in upper storeys descends onto some offices located at the base of the building.

The workers said the situation had been going on for a long time and they found it difficult to continue working under such conditions.

"The roofs are leaking and we experience leaking during rainy days. Our offices are full of buckets that are for

containing the water when it rains. Have you ever seen a situation like that in an office occupied by professionals?" enquired one officer in the Deeds Office.

Vanishing

The information stored in the building is also in danger of just vanishing into thin air. The store room, where most of the information was kept, was dark yesterday.

Paper files were found scattered, yet important information is on them, it was as if the people responsible for

storing information just did not care. Other officers and MPs were heard asking when the e-government was going to be implemented if information was still stored in this way.

Conditions

The PAC was told by some of the officials in the building that working under such conditions was not safe at all, as they also feared for their lives.

They stated that they wished for the conditions to be improved so that they could work freely and be more pro-

E3m for AG offices rentals


Yesterday the company presented Bhembe with E1 000 for designing the winning logo. Mazwi Dlamini came second and went home with E500.

'CANNABIS ASSOCIATION FAILING TO AVAIL ITSELF'

THE Eswatini Cannabis Association is supposed to iron out a few issues concerning its registration.

Registrar of Companies Msebe Malinga shedding light on why the association was allegedly struggling to register with them, said Eswatini Cannabis Association knew the truth about the matter.

Knew

He said Association's administrator Trevor Shongwe knew exactly what he was supposed to do to be registered.

"Let Shongwe tell you the truth about this matter because ever since they applied to be registered, we have been calling them to our offices so that they could tell us what their intention with their association is," Malinga said.

The registrar said people should be mindful of the fact that it was not automatic to register companies in the country. He said it was their duty to register companies knowing fully well what

their intention was. Malinga said cannabis was still unlawful in the country, hence it was imperative for them to engage with the founding members of the association.

He said they did not want to be in a situation whereby they register an organisation that would then turn out to cause complications.

Suprise

Malinga said he was surprised why Shongwe spoke as if the registrar was the one that was making it difficult for the organisation to be registered.

The truth, according to Malinga, was that his office was ready to engage with the founding members of the association about the intentions of the association.

Shongwe's cell number, at the time of writing this report, was not available for comment on the matter.

The association interim's chairperson Saladin Magagula was surprised when contacted on the matter. He said he had heard this for the first time as they were never informed of such a thing at any stage since they applied to be registered.

Magagula mentioned that the Registration of Companies Act of 2009 was clear on this matter. He said they were not anonymous and their contact details were clearly written on their application papers.

The former MP said they did not receive any formally written letter to the effect that there were issues that they needed to sort out with the registrar. Maybe that was the reason why he found himself hearing about this for the first time. "You might find that all of these things were verbally communicated," Magagula said.

doctors are aggrieved that they will not be paid for overtime.

An impeccable source alleged that on Monday they were informed that all interning doctors at the hospital will no longer be paid for working overtime even if required to.

It was alleged that there was a directive from cabinet which informed management to implement a new working system in an attempt to cut down on remuneration costs.

Doctors

The source said there were normally four doctors on call, but they would be reduced to just one doctor on call per day.

They alleged that they requested the instructions to be formalised in writing instead of the verbal directive. The source said they were still waiting for the changes to be communicated to them in the form of a memo, and by the time of compiling this report yesterday they were still waiting for the memo.

"Earlier this year the ministry announced that there was a shortage of doctors and other supporting staff, and they promised to hire more personnel. This did not come as a shock when they informed us because we were already under staffed and forced to work for long hours on end.

The cutting of the overtime and reduction of staff on call is tantamount to lead to insufficient service delivery," alleged the source

Another source stated that the only Annaore oznetwi vinterespeople who would not be affected MBABANE Government Hospital birby the changes were the nurses and the maternity staff, presumably due to their union affiliation.

"We feel we are being victimised by management as we are not affiliated with any union, we already work long hours for instance we previously worked post calls, where we would be on duty for 24 hours and also be expected to be on call for 12 hours after meaning we would be on standby in case of an emergency," they mentioned.

The sources also mentioned that the casualty officer who normally was expected to stay on call will now knock off at 1700 hours. This will mean that the interning doctors will be expected to take over the duties at the casualty department which would increase the workload of the doctors without the monitory benefits expected.

Director of Health Services Dr Vusi Magagula said he could neither confirm nor deny the matter. however he mentioned that they had a contingency plan in case they were confronted with an influx of patients at the hospital while they were understaffed.

Deputy Director of Clinical Services Dr Velephi Okello said she had no authority to comment on the matter and said the Director of Health Services Dr Vusi Magagula should be sought for comment.

Minister of Health Lizzy Nkosi could not be reached for comment.

40% of crops lost through late harvesting

ESWATINI loses 40 per cent of ready crops yearly due to late harvesting.

This was disclosed by the Director of Agriculture and Extension Nelson Mavuso yesterday when encouraging farmers to start harvesting early before maize gets spoiled.

Mayuso noted that government was doing everything possible to feed the people and that farmers must work with it in making sure that they do not lose ready crops due to late harvesting.

"Farmers must be aware that the harvesting season is almost here, harvesting at the right time is very essential in immature crops and lower yields," he order to prevent crop losses," he said. Noted

He noted that the goal of good harvesting was to maximise crop yield and minimise any crop losses and quality deterioration.

Mavuso stated that delaying in harvesting ready crops could lead to crops being effected by field animals, plant diseases, insect pests or certain weather conditions. He mentioned that timely harvesting ensured good crop quality and market value.

"However, harvesting too early or too late can result in a larger percentage of stated.

Meanwhile, he mentioned that Emaswati had enough land to farm. He added that even people who live in townships could practice urban agriculture by using flower pots to farm vegetables which could be very helpful to them since they would save money for buying vegetables such as spinach. He said if people could engage in urban farming they could improve their state of health because some people cannot afford buying vegetables.

This was disclosed by Director of Sebenta Tibekile Manana when speaking during the Eswatini LIBRACY IS ANIARD Broadcasting and Information Services' (EBIS) Letishisako programme vesterday morning.

Manana said the number of Emaswati that register for Grade

One was increasing every year, adding that the number is not only increasing in rural areas but also in the urban areas.

She said it is very important that every Liswati should be able to read, write and count.

Manana said if the country was serious in improving the literacy rate, this

meant every Liswati should be able to write at least a paragraph in both English and Siswati.

"If someone is not capable to read and write, he/she is being left behind in many things

so we are encouraging Emaswati to come and register for the lessons that we offer at Sebenta.

Therefore we want everyone to be functional, which means that if you know how to read and write you can do everything that you want to do as opposed to asking someone to help you," she said.

Manana said Sebenta was founded in 1960 of which the number of Emaswati enrolling with the institution should have declined but instead they are growing in big numbers.

"This means there are a lot of people who are not engaging themselves to learn and they need to come out and engage themselves for a better future," she

Manana said Sebenta had three different categories of learning which includes basic literacy where one is able to read, write

and count in SiSwati.

They also have basic English ,whereby one is enabled to speak and write in English.

There is a post basic where everyone is able to write a small paragraph in both English and SiSwati.

Manana said there would soon be formal upper primary education which includes Grades Six and Seven.

"We encourage Emaswati who cannot read and to register in their communities. We offer our services in all the regions around the country," she added.

However, the Municipal Council of Manzini Public Relations Officer Mathokoza Thwala noted that residents of Manzini townships who are keeping roosters in their residences must get rid of them.

Thwala said roosters make noise in the still of the night and that irritates neighbours who are enjoying their sleep.

"Residents are only allowed to keep not more than 10 hens and not even one rooster, even then, the hens must not be allowed to move out of the residence," he stated.

He urged landlords to educate their tenants about the rules of the city.

Keeping goats, cows, and donkeys is not allowed in the city. He also emphasised that the city council is not expecting to see anyone living in any of the townships owning a kraal, noting that a few years ago the council demolished about two or three kraals.




Tourism curriculum might be introduced in schools

THE ministry of tourism and environmental affairs, in collaboration with that of education and training, will work towards increasing tourism content in the school curriculum.

This was disclosed by the Minister of Tourism and Environmental Affairs Moses Vilakati when senators debated the 2018/2019 annual performance and the 2019/2020 budget estimates for the ministry of tourism.

Vilakati was responding to a question posed by Senator Chief Mvimbi Matse who wanted to know what the ministry was doing to encourage



tourism in rural areas and to sensitise rural communities on hospitality and treatment of tourists, espe-

cially during national events.

The minister said in the past, the ministry undertook customer service training for all front line staff that happen to be in contact with visitors.

These include border officials, petrol attendants and other industry front-

This activity played a key role in equipping service providers in the tourism supply chain with service excellence skills.

However, he noted that funding has not been sufficient to maintain this key activity. As such, training has been limited to tourism product owners. The minister appreciated the importance of extending the customer service excellence to the entire nation who in one way or another become hosts to international visi-

Vilakati said tourism education played a major role in preparing pupils to gain professional and practical skills required by the tourism indus-

He said increasing the tourism content in schools would allow pupils to know more about tourism and that would add to the national income of the country. Moreover, he stated that tourism had enormous potential to create jobs and thus combat widespread unemployment in the country. He said tourism played a quintessential role in the socio-cultural integration of a country, while domestic tourism encourages intermingling of members of different communities. "Tourism is a huge source of encouragement to cottage industries associated with textiles and local handcrafts, thus so increasing the tourism content will ensure that pupils enter the tourism industry in full appreciation of the need to be courteous towards visitors," he said.





ABOUT 41 counsellors have been empowered to spread the message and spirit of Brothers Reaching Out (BRO) to their clubs in their respective communities.

Boys Reaching Out (BRO) Eswatini convened for a new and all counsellor training at Institute of Development Management (IDM) over the past weekend.

About 16 new and 25 experienced counsellors from all four regions of Eswatini convened to discuss some of the issues the country faces.

The new counselors were taken through an intensive day long training to acclimate them to BRO culture and teach them facilitation skills.

Following the new counsellor training, more experienced BRO counsellors came in to submit about HIV, gender equality

and gender based violence.

HIV testing was provided by PSI and an informative session about the newly enacted Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence (SODV) Act was facilitated by Kwakha Indvodza.

BRO Eswatini Director James Wayne said though the country had made great strides in its fight against HIV there was still much work to be done.

Fact

According to the SHIMS data which was released in 2017, young men lag behind their opposite gendered peers in knowing their status and adhering to HIV medication.

"One striking statistic that was discussed at our training is the fact that only 45 per cent of HIV positive men aged 20-24 know that they are HIV positive. This statistic inspired the club counsellors to get tested for HIV themselves and in turn, encourage the boys in their clubs to be tested as well," he said.


The training concluded with counsellors practicing their facilitation skills, learning new and engaging games, and receiving BRO T-shirts, awards, and certificates for a job well done.

Empowering

Boys Reaching Out (BRO) is a US Peace Corps Volunteer initiative aimed at empowering local male youth with the knowledge and skills necessary to plan for their futures, realise gender equality and mitigate HIV transmission. BRO does this by helping Peace Corps and local volunteers to create clubs where male youth meet once a month or more to discuss male-focused issues and to role-model positive behaviour.

BRO is giving young men an opportunity to discover their voice and define for themselves what it is to be a man.

DAMS STILL FULL

WATER levels at Lubovane and Hawane dams are full to capacity following the rainsthat were experienced from last week.

This was confirmed by the acting director for water affairs department Edward Mswane and Emelda Magagula Senior Water Engineer under the ministry of natural resources.

This is because the dams, Lubovane, which draws water from the Mhlathuzane River and Great Usuthu River have recorded storage capacities of 100 per cent while Hawane in the Hhohho region is currently at 100 per cent.

Magagula said with the rainfalls currently experienced in the country

it is highly possible that their capacity would increase even further.

Maguga Dam located in the Komati River Basin is currently standing at 99.5 per cent while, Mnjoli in the Mbuluzi River basin is currently at a capacity of 90 per cent. Luphohlodam in the Hhohho region is currently at a carrying capacity of 94 per cent

Capacity

Magagula said it is too early to state that water stored at these dams could last the whole year.

"Even though the dams are in full capacity, it is however still early to judge if this water will last the country to the next year," she said.

Despite the high carrying capacity of the dams, people are still encouraged to save water and practice water harvesting.

MAN GETS E15 000 IN CAR THEFT CASE

A 34-year-old man of Mbabane has been arrested for the theft of a motor vehicle.

Sandziso Tsabedze was arrested by the police in March 4, 2019.

According to the charge sheet, Tsabedze, who originates from Mangwaneni area, was charged with contravening Section 3(1) of the theft of Motor Vehicle Act 16 of 1991.

He is alleged to have on or upon February, 2019 at or near Ezulwini, wrongfully, unlawfully and with intent stole a Honda Fit which was white in colour and registered as NSD 420 AL, valued at E50 000.

He appeared before Principal Magistrate Fikile Nhlabatsi.

Representing the crown was prosecuting Counsel Lomkhosi Dlamini who did not oppose the bail set at E15 000.

Surities

The court granted him bail to the amount of E15 000, however, he was ordered to pay E3 000 cash and the rest shall be in a form of sureties.

He submitted that during his arrest, he co-operated well with the arresting officers from the first day he was investigated as he personally approached the police and during the discussion of the matter he was subsequently charged and arrested for car theft.

His matter will continue on May, 9 2019.

GOAT STEALING SYNDICATE NABBED

WHILE goat theft in the Lubombo region persists, five men have appeared before Senior Magistrate Donald Mavuso facing six counts of stock theft and money laundering.

The accused persons namely; Mayibongwe Dlamini, Nkhululeko Dlamini, Sanele Ntshangase. Mbongwa Dlamini and Mlungisi Dlamini are said to have acted in furtherance of a common purpose in the commission of the offences.

They are accused of stealing 33 goats on different occasions.

Witnesses who presented evidence in court on Tuesday said vehicles were used to transport the goats.

Described

One of the witnesses told the court that he managed to identify a motor vehicle which came to his home in the middle of the night where three goats ended up being stolen from the kraal.

Of note is that the motor vehicle, as described by the witness, matched another vehicle which was owned by an Asian national working in

one of the shops in Siteki. The witness, Nhlanhla Matsebula of KaLanga said he jumped out of bed and did an inspection around his compound after hearing the sound of a motor vehicle approaching his homestead.

He said however, the vehicle stopped a few metres away from the homestead, before making a U-turn.

Matter

In the morning, he realised that three goats were missing from the kraal. A similar version was shared by the second witness in the matter.

The evidence which was presented by the witnesses tally with information which has become common knowledge amongst livestock farmers. The information is to the effect that a syndicate was stealing goats and selling them to Asian nationals.

Meanwhile, the third accused person also faced a charge of contravening Section 4 of the Money Laundering and Financing of Terrorism (Prevention) Act of 2011.

The accused person was said to have wrongfully and unlawfully kept money amounting to E22 650, while knowing that it was money made from the illegal sale of goats. The matter returns to court on May 14, 2019.

He said as the church is known to defend the poor, they were appealing to church members and the nation at large to lend a helping hand to assist Idai victims.

"Caritas has a primary mission through our church to serve, accompany and defend the poor. "There is immediate relief and support needed following the natural disaster Cyclone Idai that has devastated our brothers and sisters in neighbouring Mozambique. The ANC's Tony Yengeni said in a tweet during the fallout over the verbal altercation on Tuesday night: "I fully support comrade Jessie. Our ANC DSG for putting Maseko into his miserable DA little corner..!"

Malema retweeted the message to his own followers. He, too, has had his fair share of scraps with journalists.

In the latest, the Electoral Commission of South Africa (IEC) is investigating whether he should be held liable for electoral misconduct for endangering journalist Karima Brown by tweeting her cellphone number and saying she was "not a real journalist".

Malema famously had a run-in with

a BBC journalist, Jonah Fisher, during a press conference in 2010 at Luthuli House.

At the time, he was the leader of the ANC Youth League.

MEDIA WORLDWIDE UNDER SIEGE - SABC REPORTER

SOUTH African Broadcasting Corporation (SABC) Senior Reporter Chriselda Lewis says the media worldwide is under siege.

Lewis was speaking on Friday during the Bible Society Eswatini media dialogue held at the Royal Swazi.

All media houses in the country were invited into the dialogue which started at 1800 hours and ended after 2200 hours.

Another guest which was organised was Dr Mohammed Girma.

Lewis also doubles up as an anchor of the show Full View SABC on DSTV 404 which aires between 1800 hours-2030 hours and SABC 3 2100 hours (weekends).

She is also a news anchor on SAFM Radio.

Lewis has been in the media industry for 15 years. Before making her remarks, Lewis stated that she was supposed to be in court on Friday for the Duduzane Zwane case, however, she asked a colleague to stand in for her as she had to honour the invitation forwarded by the Bible Society. She was also assigned on the Prophet Bushiri alleged fraud case.

Verifying

She said the dialog came in a time when Christianity and the church was being questioned. "According to my understanding, journalism at this point is under siege," she said.

She said some journalists take bribes while some do not write about those who give them money in brown envelopes. Lewis added that some reporters write without verifying allegations.

"What happened to journalists who used to be a voice for the voiceless? What happened to journalists who as far as we are concerned held

politicians to account," she expanded.

She said journalists are supposed to be custodians of giving information to the people after giving a right to reply to individuals talked about.

Corruption

Meanwhile, Dr Girma presented about integrity in storytelling. During his presentation he explained that corruption was deeper than the abuse of power or receiving brown envelopes.

He said these were just the manifestations of corruption which runs deeper than them (manifestations).

Also making his remarks was Pastor Zakhele Malaza who talked about Bible value and reporting. In his remarks, he urged journalists to report fearless and not allow to be captured.

Meanwhile, the Master of the Ceremony Wilton Mamba mentioned that journalists in the country were being poisoned.

He said he knew this because he had been in the field for some years.

Also present was Swazi Observer Managing Editor Mbongeni Mbingo, Anti-Corruption Commission Senior Investigator Linda Dlamini, Swaziland Conference of Churches President Bishop Stephen Masilela as well as Bible Society Eswatini Chief Executive Officer Ngcebo Mbuli to name a few.

FREE HEALTH SERVICES AT PRINCE OF WALES THIS SATURDAY



IT is often said that the wealth of a nation is its health.

In keeping with this assertion, the Kingdom of Eswatini will on Saturday host the national commemoration of World Health Day at the Prince of Wales in Mbabane.

World Health Day commemoration is to remind the nation (including government, the private sector, and civil society) that everyone should be able to access health care when and where they need it.

The ministry of health and partners will use the event to fuel the aggressive campaign on promoting health and well-being which was kick-started last year – where they ignited focus on mobilising individual and community action for preventive interventions that reduce the risk of ill-health and increase public awareness about the importance of primary prevention of diseases.

The oncoming event is earmarked to provide awareness and encourage lifestyles that will help in preventing illnesses - especially non-communicable diseases (NCDs). The day will start with a walk around the Mbabane city to the Prince of Wales. There, a 'Health Market' model will be available where various preventive health care services and information to promote health and well-being will be provided.

In line with Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) 3 and the National Healthy Policy's statement on prevention, the country will host the event through the slogan, 'Know your health numbers'. The emphasis will be on increasing access to communicable and non-communicable disease screening services, immunisation, high impact child survival interventions, family planning, antenatal care, education and counselling for risk factors for diseases—for example, smoking and harmful use of alcohol cessation, physical inactivity, and unhealthy diet.

The 2019 World Health Day will serve to inculcate a new culture in which Emaswati seek promotive and preventive health services.

Emphasising Primary Health Care in World Health Day



World Health Day is used to commemorate the founding of the World Health Organisation (WHO). The organisation was founded on the principle that all people should be able to realize their right to the highest possible level of health, with the guiding vision of 'Health for all'. For the Kingdom of Eswatini, UHC is regarded as the hallmark of the government's commitment to improving the wellbeing of all the citizenry. In celebrating the 70th anniversary last year, the WHO introduced the #HealthForAll movement aimed at supporting countries move towards Universal Health Coverage (UHC). Universal health coverage itself, means ensuring that all people have access to needed promotive, preventive, curative and rehabilitative health services they need, when and where they need them, without financial hardship.

As experience has often illustrated, UHC is achieved when political will is strong. The WHO is also calling on world leaders to live up to the pledges they made when they agreed to the SDGs in 2015 and commit to concrete steps to advance the health of all people. With the adoption of the SDGs, world leaders unanimously set the target: to achieve universal health coverage, including financial risks protection, access to quality essential health care services and access to safe, effective, quality and affordable essential medicines and vaccines for all, by 2030.

The belief is that this starts with strong primary health care. Primary health care is a whole-of-society approach to health and well-being centred on the needs, circumstances or preferences of individuals, families and communities. It addresses comprehensive and interrelated physical, mental and social health and wellbeing.

Primary health care is about providing wholeperson care for health needs throughout life, not just treating a set of specific diseases. It ensures that people receive comprehensive care, ranging from promotion and prevention to treatment, rehabilitation and palliative care as close as feasible to people's every day environment.

Primary health care is the most efficient and cost-effective way to achieve universal health coverage around the world. However, huge investments are needed from both public and private sectors in health worker education, as well as the creation and filling of funded positions in health sector and the health economy, to close the gap on the number of health work-

ers needed to meet the workforce requirements of meeting the SDGs and universal health coverage targets.

Importance of the UHC strategy

UHC has emerged as a key strategy to make progress towards other health-related and broader development goals. Access to essential quality care and financial protection not only enhances people's health and life expectancy, it also protects countries from epidemics, reduces poverty and the risk of hunger, creates jobs, drives economic growth and enhances gender equality. However, to improve access to services, universal health coverage efforts will need to remove many barriers, including: stigma and discrimination, poor quality of care, low capacity and other resource limitations undermining health service provisions. Lifting these barriers requires significant political commitment and improved performance and delivery from government and other critical service providers.

Since the 2018 World Health Day, WHO has strived to inspire, motivate and guide all stakeholders to make commitments towards universal health coverage. Inspire by highlighting policy makers' powers to transform the health of their nation, framing the challenges as exciting and ambitious, and inviting them to be part of the change; Motivate by sharing examples of how countries are already progressing towards UHC and encourage others to find their own path; and Guide by providing tools for structured policy dialogues on how to advance UHC domestically or supporting such efforts in other countries (e.g. expanding service coverage, improving quality of services, reducing out-of-pocket pay-

The HIV response and the UHC strategy

UHC is a critical component of sustainable development and poverty reduction, a key element of any effort to reduce social inequities in any country. Without universal access to quality health care, thousands of people would die unnecessarily every year, and preventable diseases including HIV which leads to AIDS, tuberculosis (TB) and malaria would continue to ravage families and communities. The HIV response has to date, embraced many of the principles of universal health coverage and contributes significantly to its goals. Investment in HIV and TB promote quality health ser-

vices of all kinds, as well also strengthen health systems with a powerful multiplier effect that can improve a community's overall health status, as well as its economic and well-being. Focus on removing gender and human rights related barriers and on strengthening community action on health, is critical to improving access to health services for vulnerable and excluded groups.

Over time, the delivery of prevention, treatment and care programmes have evolved to provide a range of services - not just focused on HIV and TB. Through the provision of integrated services, the HIV response attempts to address people's multiple health needs at different points in their lives, improving overall health outcomes and resulting in a more costeffective and efficient approach. In integrating HIV and TB services, barriers that traditionally prevented TB patients from being tested for HIV, or HIV patients from receiving prophylaxis against TB, have been broken; while the prevention of mother-to-child transmission (PMTCT) of HIV programme has been integrated into antenatal and post-natal care platforms.

There are opportunities to refocus the HIV response using the universal health coverage framework, to address some of the key short-comings in the response so far. Universal health coverage can focus greater attention on promoting health equity, improving the quality of services, ensuring financial and social security, strengthening health and community systems, building coherence across different health areas, addressing the social and economic determinants of HIV and guaranteeing human rights.

Be part of the movement

The Kingdom of Eswatini still suffers from the initial mistake of basing early health initiatives on curative approaches, which led to a stereo type that contributed to an increased burden of NCDs, and further contributes to the ever-increasing numbers of communicable diseases including TB and HIV.

The challenges need a change of focus. There is need now to promote health and well-being of people through creating an enabling environment for adopting healthy behaviours, health education and communication. The #HealthForAll movement continues at the Prince of Wales on Saturday starting at 0700 am. Don't be the odd one out - Everyone, everywhere!

7 WAYS TO TURN YOUR SPIRITUAL FIR AMIGHTY BI

HOW is your relationship with the Lord right now? Is it stoked or is it choked? Is the fire burning strong or only smoldering? Are you ablaze or amazed at the struggle? The reality is that every fire diminishes and eventually dies if not tended. A fire must be consistently maintained, or else it becomes nothing more than smoldering ashes.

And, while it can be hard work getting the fire started, intentionality is necessary to keep the fire

People cool off to their jobs, grow tired of their cars, houses and clothes. Too often, people grow cold in their relationships, with their family and friends. And marriages that began in the whitehot passion of true love can sadly become nothing more than embers to survive.

TIMOTHY'S STRUGGLE IN OUR STRUGGLE

This potential exists for each of us in every relationship we possess, including with Jesus and our passion for His purposes. It happened to the mighty apostle Paul's number one son in the faith, and it can happen to any of us as well.

Paul addresses the struggle his young protégé is experiencing: "Remembering the genuine faith that first lived in your grandmother Lois and your mother Eunice and that I am persuaded lives in you also. Therefore, I remind you to stir up the gift of God which is in you by the laying on of my hands" (2 Timothy 1: 5-6).

Timothy struggled with intense intimidation from the surrounding culture. Ephesus was home for one of the seven wonders of the ancient world, the temple of Artemis, where pagan worship was passionate, sensual and prosperous. Witchcraft abounded in the region, and persecution increasingly became the norm toward Christianity. The two years Paul lived there were years of glorious revival and tremendous impact, but now Paul is in prison, and Timothy is struggling.

His fire is waning, and he needs help. Paul writes from prison and says, "You've got this if you do this"! He reminds him of the genuineness of his faith, his ordination and the gift released in his life. He says, "I am reminding you to keep constantly blazing the gift of God which is in you" (2 Timothy 1:6).

SEVEN (7) WAYS TO KEEP THE FIRE BURNING


To keep a blazing fire requires the intentionality of adding fuel and stoking the fire. No one falls into long term success. Here are a few practical steps to take to keep the fire burning strong

1. WORSHIP GOD.

As you worship, you bring your life into focus. Billy Joe Daugherty wrote, "you were born to live in worship just as fishes were born to live in water'. True worship creates the environment in which you were created to thrive. David said, "you will make known to me the path of life, in your presence is fullness of joy, at your right hand, there are pleasures for evermore" (Philippians 16:11). Notice the intentionality of David in Psalms 34:1, "I will bless the Lord at all times, His praise shall continually be in my mouth".

2. PRAY

I know it sounds simple, but it works. Real prayer is both practical and powerful. It isn't vomiting out to God what we want and hoping He will do it all. It is consistent communication with the Lord. Prayer is a two - way conversation that includes listening. Jesus said it is necessary always to pray and that this faithful praying will keep us



from loosing the fire - (Luke 18:1).

Key to fueling and stoking the fire in you through prayer is the practice of praying in the spirit. Jude wrote, "But you, beloved build yourselves up in your most holy faith. Pray in the holy spirit". (Jude 1:20). "Pray in the spirit always with all kinds of prayer and supplication" (Ephesians 6:18). Learn how to engage the help of the Holy Spirit in your prayer life and enjoy refreshing.

3. PRAY FOR OTHERS

As part of prayer, it is vital to get out of our world into the world of others. Nehemiah experienced radical change personally and became an agent of change as he prayed for others. (Nehemiah 1:4). Isaiah prophesied, "If you give yourself to the hungry and satisfy the afflicted soul, then your light shall rise in obscurity, and your darkness shall become as the noonday" (Isaiah 58:10).

This is what The Nations Pray Clarion Call stands for - getting out of your own world, your church and denomination and join other believers into someone else's world and be a blessing.

4. MEDITATE ON GOD'S WORD

The Bible? Yes! If we want the fire to burn bright in us consistently, the word must become the first priority and final authority in our lives. Jesus said, "it is the Spirit who gives life. The flesh profits nothing. The word that I speak to you are spirit and life" (John 6:63). In a season of deep discouragement, Jeremiah wrote, "His word was in my heart as a burning fire shut up in my bones" (Jeremiah 20:9b).

At the death of Moses, the Lord gave Joshua the key to his success, "This Book of the Law must not depart from your mouth. Meditate on it day and night so that you may act carefully according to all that is written in it. For then you will make your way successful, and you will be wise" (Joshua 1:8). ing, we must learn and practice the power of reading, studying, meditating, praying and speaking the word!

If you want the fire blazing in your life, you must associate with those who are blazing. If you spend the bulk of your time with lukewarm and comprised, you too will cool off.

But time spent with hungry, thirsty true disciples of Christ will stoke the fire in you.

After being imprisoned and threatened, the apostles "went to their own people and reported what the chief priests and elders had said to them" (Acts 4:23b). Their companions joined them in prayer, and the Bible says, "When they had prayed, the place where they were assembled together was shaken, and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and spoke the word of God with boldness" (Acts 4:31). Choose your friends wisely -association matters.

6. READ AND LISTEN TO THOSE WHO POSSESS THE FIRE OF GOD

One way to associate with those who are on fire for the Lord is by reading and listening to them. The psalmist said, "Your testimonies are my delight and my counsellors" (Psalms 119:24). It is amazing how their stories can inspire and educate us. "So that you may not be lazy, but imitators of those who through faith and patience inherit the promises" (Hebrews 6:12).

7. PUT INTO CONSISTENT ACTION WHAT YOU KNOW

Belief informs action. We all practice what we genuinely believe. So, James writes, "Be doers of the word and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves" (James 1:22). To only read and hear but not follow through with corresponding actions is to live in deception. Jesus said, "if you know these things, blessed are you if you do them" (John

As we put these seven principles into practice in your daily life in a consistent way - the fire from heaven that Burns in us will continue to flourish. This fire will move you for the fulfilment of God's purpose in you and through you for His glory! Stay stoked!

How not to handle migration in SA: Lessons from West Africa

FORMER Nigerian president Olusegun Obasanjo has proffered advice to African political parties and citizens on the thorny issue of migration across the continent.

In an exclusive interview on POWER 98.7, Obasanjo said: "Migration is something that must be handled with dexterity, with responsibility and with sensitivity on the continent of

He appealed to political parties who are apprehensive of migrants to "think again".

The elderly African statesman, who was in South Africa last week to attend the Southern African Development Community (SADC) Solidarity Conference on Western Sahara, said: "What you think you will gain in terms of jobs for your people by keeping other people from other countries away will amount to nothing."

NIGERIA-GHANA EXPERIENCE

Referring to the January 1983 Executive Ordinance by the then Nigerian president, the recently deceased Shehu Shagari, which expelled over two million - most of them Ghanaian citizens - from Nigeria, Obasanjo said: "We tried it in Nigeria; it didn't work."

He added: "You will know we have something ... there is a particular type of bag we call "Ghana must Go"

This was when Nigeria was trying to drive Ghanaians out of Nigeria. It didn't work. And if anything, it put [a] sour taste because you're now separating families."

The Shagari Ordinance came against the backdrop of a cocktail of socio-economic fortunes and misfortunes rooted in the complex West African and African history.

The years 1973 – 1981 witnessed a rise in the oil price - Nigeria's main source of revenue which enabled the state to make significant investments in public works and light industries. This pull-factor brought greater numbers of migrants from neighbouring countries into Nigeria, a process further propelled by the 1973 and 1974 drought in the Sahel region.

Things would predictably take a different turn by the early 1980s. The oil price fell sharply in 1981, the Nigerian economy declined, along with industrial investment, while urban unemployment - affecting two thirds of urban workers - rose. Worse still, widespread corruption during the period of the Shagari government only served to aggravate the situation.


An International Monetary Fund (IMF) Structural Adjustment Programme which imposed unpopular cuts in social expenditure followed in 1983, an election year in Nigeria.

The confluence of negative socio-economic circumstances impacted on the political sphere, drawing into the potent mix, migrants who, until then, had not featured prominently in the Nigerian public discourse.

On January 17, 1983, the Nigerian government ordered all unskilled and undocumented migrants to leave the country within 14 days. They were accused of taking away jobs from citizens, engaging in crime and other forms of deviant social conduct, while allegations of conspiracy to register migrants as voters in the general election of August that year were levelled against the opposition.

As Daouda Gary-Tounkara has noted: "It is common knowledge that in countries experiencing immigration and having difficulties dealing with crisis and unemployment, some political leaders try to scapegoat foreigners and tighten conditions of residence. This is a means of acquiring legitimacy..."

In typical rabble-rousing form, Shagari pub-

licly stated that: "If they (migrants) don't leave, they should be arrested and tried, and sent back to their homes. Illegal immigrants, under normal circumstances, should not be given any notice whatsoever. If you break a law, then you have to pay for it."

WHAT GOES AROUND COMES AROUND: THE 1969 GHANAIAN **EXPULSION OF NIGERIANS**

Fourteen years earlier in 1969, the Ghana government had expelled 150 000 Nigerians who had lived in Ghana for decades, eking out a livelihood as traders, workers, farmers and other professions

At the time, the Ghanaian economy was cocoadependent, and the commodity provided for over 70% of foreign exchange earnings. The 20 years from 1950 - 1970 witnessed a continuous decline in the world cocoa price which had dropped by 75% by 1969.

A pattern emerges here: the greater the economic hardship, the louder the anti-immigrant decibels become. Nigerian academics Johnson Aremu and Adeyinka Ajayi would later note, in a paper published in 2014 that, "With Ghana's continued economic misfortunes, the government and popular press really had no difficulty turning to aliens as scapegoats for their malaise.

"The expulsion order may also be seen as an attempt by [Prime Minister] Kofi Busia to win the confidence of the masses and restore the legitimacy of his government. Since government was losing its grip on the economic survival of the country, Busia and his cabinet members were left with little or no choice than to seek solace in sending away non-nationals as a way of appeasing the anger of the masses."

CONSEQUENCES OF THE GHANA-NIGERIA EXPULSIONS AND SOME **NIGGLING QUESTIONS**

The consequences of the expulsions were multiple. For purposes of this article, we will consider at least three.

Firstly, the Ghana Ministry of Interior was "directed to comb" the country "thoroughly" for any would-be defaulters who were accordingly arrested. Such words conjure up ideas of a siege and encourage an atmosphere in which all manner of abuses can be tolerated and trig-

Secondly, echoing Obasanjo's concern about the disruption in family life, Aremu and Ajayi have noted that, "A multiplier effect of this forced, sudden exit of Nigerians from Ghana was that it led to family disorganization and family separation. Many Nigerians who were already married to Ghanaians could not come with their wives or husbands and had to live a dejected life ever since then. Re-uniting such separated families has been less successful even after the dust of the expulsion saga had settled

Thirdly, in both Ghanaian and Nigerian cases, bilateral relations between the two countries naturally suffered and placed a needless freeze on the regional and continental economic integration project which is vital to the resolution of many of the continent's challenges, not the least important of which is the matter of economic migration.

But all of this begs many questions. Aremu posed some of these questions in a 2013 paper published by the African Research Review.

He asked what progress had been made in turning Nigeria's fortunes with respect to reducing unemployment and poverty as well as diversifying and growing the economy since the 1983 purge. This would naturally include the fight against crime, which migrants were accused of spear-heading.

These questions about Ghana and Nigeria equally interrogate the situation in all other African countries: does the expulsion of migrants provide a silver bullet for the resolution of a country's complex socio-economic and political problems?

ENEMIES OF AFRICA

Last week, President Obasanjo had strong words for those who hold and propagate antiimmigrant positions. "Anybody who is a party to it," he said, "I would say he's an enemy of Africa. And if any political party is doing that, I would say, they should think again." He stressed that he, as a matter of principle, would never be party to "stopping any African from moving freely within Africa. I will never be a party

He said that law enforcement agencies of immigrant recipient countries should address measures against criminal conduct among immigrants rather than tarnish everyone with the same brush. "If they are criminals, of course you shouldn't allow criminals."

He implored political parties to understand that migration is an age-old phenomenon which pre-dates the formation of the nation state. "Migration is what has kept the world going. And I believe that nothing should stop [it]" adding that "migrants have a lot to offer" to host countries. News24

Over E180 million Eswatini goods exported to France

ESWATINI has exported close to E180 000 000 and imported about E195 000 000 worth of goods to France in the last three years.

Export products from Eswatini to France mainly consist of baby vegetables, handicraft and artworks, organic compounds and sugar, amongst others, while the imports consist of precision machinery for various uses such as health equipment, electrical and power equipment components, as well as other various acids, lubricants and chemical compounds.

This was revealed by Prime Minister Ambrose Dlamini during the Eswatini - France Chamber of Commerce business seminar held at the Royal Villas yesterday. Addressing the gathering during the event, the PM said they were delighted to host the French investors as they explore the various business opportunities offered by the kingdom.

The PM said within the broader trade framework of the SADC Economic Partnership Agreements, commonly known as SADC—EPA), they noted with pride that Eswatini engaged in trade talks with France for the import and export of vari-

Over 40 000 jobs created by French investors in SA

This was revealed during the Eswatini-France Chamber of Commerce business seminar held at the Royal Villas yesterday. President of the French Chamber of Commerce and Industry (South Africa) Dr Yves Guenon said during the event, which also attracted a number of potential investors, that they were committed to working together with Eswatini.

"We are a very active chamber In South Africa as we represent about 200 groups, approximately 500 companies. We also organise about 40 events a year through local companies in South Africa and in Mozambique," he said.

He said they were looking forward to doing business with Eswatini in what they were hoping will be a winwin situation. Dr Guenon added that the most important thing for any investor is stability on the rules.

"If the rules are changing every month, it then becomes difficult for the investor to invest but other than that there are usually no problems," he said.

Meanwhile, Thuli Phiri, one of the organisers of the event and leader of the French delegation, highlighted that the chamber had key investors across all sectors of the economy.

"The investors' cut across three sectors of the economy which are also key to Eswatini and these include agriculture and agro-processing, mining and energy, ICT and infrastructure development.

MINISTRY OF TOURISM PROPOSES CLIMATE CHANGE COORDINATION STRUCTURES

THE ministry of tourism and environmental affairs has developed terms of reference that will guide the different climate change coordination structures.

This is a proposed structure developed to coordinate both the mitigation and adaptation components of climate change across the country. The structure is multi sectoral, and it involves government, private sector and civil society and some key national bodies and associations.

This was said by Nicolette Ndlovu, a consultant, during her presentation at the National Adaptation Plan (NAP) process stakeholder workshop held at Happy Valley, Ezulwini yesterday. She said studies indicated that the Kingdom of Eswatini was already affected by a changing climate with some of the climate change impacts experienced including inter alia significant variations in precipitation patterns, higher temperatures and increasing in frequency and intensity of severe weather events such as droughts, floods and cyclones.

The workshop was attended by a number of stakeholders including World Vision, RSSC, Eswatini Bank, Water Aid and more. The purpose of the workshop was for the stakeholders to interrogate the proposed structures and inform the new structures to ensure that adaptation is mainstreamed in the different sectors in the country.

"The proposed structure has been developed taking into account previous lessons, present structure and inputs from consultations with various stakeholders in the country including the government. The structure will involve both the mitigation and adaptation components, however for the purpose of this assignment, more emphases will be on the adaptation.

There are subsidy bodies called Multi-Disciplinary Teams that should be established to support implementation on the ground for both adaptation and mitigation," she said.

She further stated that Cabinet was the supreme body for decision making at government level and composed of ministers from different sectors in the country. The Cabinet is constitutionally elected every five years and the ministry of tourism and environmental affairs is responsible for climate change coordination and ensuring that climate change issues are well coordinated at cabinet level.

Ndlovu further stated that the Cabinet shall be responsible for providing overall strategic and political guidance on climate change issues in the country as advised by the National Climate Change Council(NCCC), approval of all climate change policies and rec-

ommend legislative channels pertaining to climate change for parliament enactment, to endorse all high level and strategic decisions that pertain to climate change coordination in the country, to ensure that the country is well aligned with international conventions and commitments and to provide the political mandate for both adaptation and mitigation.

The NCCC and the Government Advisory Committee is composed of key Cabinet ministers including the ministry of finance, health and agriculture and the Principal Secretaries from these key ministries shall represent their ministries in the advisory committee and any delegated member to the advisory committee shall be a senior management member at the ministry.

"The main purpose of this committee is to advise both the NCCC and the council on the position of the government regarding climate change.

Other key members of the council include the National Climate Change Focal Point, secretary to Cabinet and the elected chairperson, vice chairperson and secretary of National Climate Change Executive Committee and members of the Government Advisory Committee. It provides political guidance to the National Climate Change Executive Committee and Cabinet therefore government on climate change issues," she added.

She also mentioned that the council shall be co-chaired by the Principal Secretary of the ministry of tourism and environment affairs and the secretary to Cabinet. It is responsible for high-level coordination, guidance and direction on climate change policies, ensuring that climate change is present in the national development agenda, oversee the implementation of the national climate policy strategies and plans and to create an enabling environment that shall promote broader multi-stakeholder participation and integrate climate change mitigation and adaptation.

ABOUT THE NAP

THE government of the Kingdom of Eswatini, through the Ministry of Tourism and Environmental Affairs received grant support from the Green Climate Fund (GCF) to build capacity to advance the National Adaptation Plan (NAP) process in the country.


The United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFC-CC) established the NAP process to facilitate adaptation planning in least developed countries and other developing countries.

JOHANNESBURG - The rand strengthened yesterday amid growing appetite for risk on hopes for progress in trade negotiations between China and the United

At 0700 GMT the rand was up 0.53 per cent at R14.1330 per dona compared with a close of R14.2100 in New York.

Demand for emerging-market currencies grew after the Financial Times reported China and the United States had resolved most of the issues standing in the way of a trade deal.

The rand had reached a sixweek high of R14.0750 after Moody's struck a surprisingly positive note in a credit opinion on Tuesday, following the agency's decision on Friday to delay a review that might have removed South Africa's last

investment-grade rating.

The rand lost steam late in the session as concern resurfaces over Eskom, the struggling state power company.

"Although the rand posted additional gains after Moody's comments, these were short-lived as comments

from the African National Congress that it did not wish to see job losses at Eskom, despite previous comments to the contrary, saw the markets turn cautious," analysts at Nedbank said in a note. Demand for Pretoria's bonds was benefited from Moody's

benign view, with yields on the benchmark 10-year government bond reaching a one-year low 8.42 percent. In early trade on Wednesday, the bond traded at 8.515 per cent. News24

Austria sees 'absolutely no reason' for Brexit extension

VIENNA - There is currently "absolutely no reason" for another extension to Brexit because the situation in Britain's Parliament has not fundamentally changed, Austria's Chancellor Sebastian Kurz said yesterday.

British Prime Minister Theresa May said on Tuesday she would seek another delay to agree an EU divorce deal with the opposition Labour leader, in a gambit to break an impasse over Brexit that enraged many in her party. May said she wanted another short extension beyond April 12.

"There is, from the current point of view, absolutely no reason for an extension since the chaos in Britain has not changed. There is no Plan B capable of being supported by a majority in the British lower house of Parliament," Kurz told a news conference after a weekly Cabinet meeting.

"Let's cross our fingers for Theresa May for her efforts, let's hope that she can convince the members of the lower house of Parliament and maybe find a way to avoid a hard Brexit after all," he said.

Having negotiated a withdrawal agreement with Britain that Members of Parliament in London have now rejected three times, the options for Brussels are currently limited, Kurz said.

Kurz and other EU leaders have repeatedly said that any extension should be for a clearly defined reason and not just in order to buy time.

BRUNEI INTRODUCES STONING TO DEATH FOR GAY SEX, ADULTERY

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN - Brunei vesterday introduced harsh new sharia laws, including death by stoning for adultery and gay sex, despite a storm of global criticism from politicians, celebrities and rights groups.

The tough penal code in the tiny country on tropical Borneo island -- ruled by the all-powerful Sultan Hassanal Bolkiah -- fully came into force following years of delays.

The laws, which also include amputation of hands and feet for thieves, make Brunei the first place in East or Southeast Asia to have a sharia penal code at the national level, joining several mostly Middle Eastern countries such as Saudi

Rape and robbery are also punishable by death under the code and many of the new laws, such as capital punishment for insulting the Prophet Mohammed, apply to non-Muslims as well as Muslims.

The decision to push ahead with the punishments has sparked alarm around the world, with the United Nations labelling them 'cruel and inhumane' and celebrities, led by actor George Clooney and pop star Elton John, call-

In a public address to mark a special date in the Muslim calendar, the sultan called for stronger Islamic teachings but did not mention the new penal code.

"I want to see Islamic teachings in this country grow stronger," he said in the nationally televised speech at a convention centre near the capital Bandar Seri Begawan.

The sultan, who has been on the throne for over five decades, also insisted that Brunei was a "fair" country and the environment for visitors was "safe and harmonious". Government officials later confirmed the laws had entered into force. The sharia laws have triggered worldwide condemnation, and Phil Robertson, Deputy Asia Director at Human Rights Watch, described the code as "barbaric to the core, imposing archaic punishments for acts that shouldn't even be crimes". The European Union said in a statement that some of the new punishments "amount to torture, acts of cruel, inhuman or degrading treatment".

They are particularly upsetting for the country's small lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender (LGBT) community. Before the new laws, sex between men was already illegal in Brunei and punishable with up to 10 years in jail.

Congo Ebola outbreak spreading faster than ever -WHO

KINSHASA - Democratic Republic of Congo's Ebola outbreak is spreading at its fastest rate yet, eight months after it was first detected, the World Health Organisation (WHO) said on Monday.

Each of the past two weeks has registered a record number of new cases, marking a sharp setback for efforts to respond to the second biggest outbreak ever, as militia violence and community resistance have impeded access to affected areas. Less than three weeks ago, the WHO said the outbreak of the haemorrhagic fever was largely contained and could be stopped by

September, noting that weekly case numbers had halved from earlier in the year to about 25. But the number of cases hit a record 57 the following week, and then jumped to 72 last week, said WHO spokesman Christian Lindmeier. Previous spikes of around 50 cases per week were documented in late January and mid-November. More alarmingly, more than half of the Ebola deaths last week occurred outside of treatment centres, according to Congo health ministry data, meaning there is a much greater chance they transmitted the virus to those around them.

Niger president serves quit notice, party elects candidate for 2021 polls

NIAMEY - Niger President Mahamadou Issoufou has given a strong signal that he is ready to leave office in 2021 when his current term of office expires. Issoufou became president in 2011 and secured re-election in 2016.

The ruling Nigerian Party for Democracy and Socialism, PNDS, over the weekend elected Interior Minister, Mohamed Bazoum, as its presidential candidate with two clear years to the next polls.

The nomination and selection of

Bazoum which took place at the Palais des Congrès in the capital, Niamey, was broadcast by several television stations, in front of thousands of activists from the 50 or so parties under the ruling coalition.

In a speech, Bazoum "paid tribute" to President Issoufou and indicated that his nomination was "the first act that symbolises the fulfillment of Mr. Issoufou's desire to respect the law on the limitation of mandates" (two five-year terms).

The 59-year-old Bazoum is a close

friend of Issoufou, whose decision to leave after the expiration of his mandate will be seen as progressive unlike others in the region who have altered laws to stay in office. The candidate has been minister of the interior since April 2016, having previously served as a deputy minister and holding the minister of foreign affairs post. Political watchers have labelled him one of the most powerful men in the country since the election of Issoufou.

After she was detained, she offered an additional story: that she was asked by a Chinese friend named Charles to travel from Shanghai to attend the event and attempt to speak to a member of the president's family about US-China economic relations, the document said. Black, gay woman elected Chicago mayor

American woman was elected mayor of America's third largest city on Tuesday, as Chicago voters entrusted a political novice with tackling difficult problems of economic inequality and gun violence. Lori Lightfoot, a 56-year-old former federal prosecutor and practicing lawyer who has never before held elected office, was elected the midwestern city's mayor in a lopsided victory. She beat out Toni Preckwinkle, who is also an African American woman, by a wide margin of 74 to 26 per cent in early voting results with most ballots counted.

Lightfoot will become Chicago's first openly gay mayor and the first African American woman to hold the post. Since 1837, Chicago voters have elected only one black mayor and one female mayor.

Thousands homeless after Yumbi massacre

"No pans, no plates, no beakers, no clothes, not even a bucket to wash in. That's what it's been like for the last three months," explains Moseka, who is in her 50s, adding that she sleeps on a mat on the floor. AFP

Moza cholera cases now above 1 400

have risen above 1 400, government offic said on Tuesday, as hundreds of thousands of vaccine doses arrived in an attempt to limit the rapid spread of the disease.

Authorities announced a second death from cholera, which causes acute diarrhoea and is spread by contaminated food and water-conditions that some 128 000 displaced cyclone survivors now risk daily while living in temporary, often crowded, shelters. Cholera can kill within hours if not treated.

The cholera outbreak has grown swiftly since it was declared last week with five confirmed cases. Now there are 1 428, most of them in the hard-hit port city of Beira, which has been the hub of relief efforts since Cyclone Idai roared in on March 14.

JOHANNEBSURG - Fikile Mbalula, the ANC's elections head, defended the party on Tuesday after tweeps slammed him and the ANC for "rejecting" Winnie Madikizela-Mandela's name in the process of renaming Cape Town International Airport.

This as scores of South Africans celebrated the life of the late struggle icon, who died a year ago, on April 2. Tributes and messages of remembrance flooded social media platforms as ordinary South Africans and politicians shared their fondest memories of Madikizela-Mandela.

Mbalula, who was among the politicians who shared their memories, received backlash as tweeps accused him of being a member of a party and system that 'erased' the contributions made by Madikizela-Mandela in the struggle for freedom.

On March 5, the EFF proposed in Parliament that Madikizela-Mandela's name be considered in the renaming of the airport.

EFF leader Julius Malema lamented the exclusion of women who contributed in the struggle against apartheid. He said women like Madikizela-Mandela were not just the wives and backers of male activists, but freedom fighters too.

This proposal was shot down by the ANC. Citing the reasons for this, the party, through its chief whip, Jackson Mthembu, said the decision to include Madikizela-Mandela's name on the list was not theirs to make, but that of Airports Company South Africa (ACSA).

During the same sitting of Parliament, the party's Dikeledi Magadzi said the ANC was of the view that the multiaward-winning airport should be named after someone with "substance and virtue," someone who had been "tried and tested".

Info about R80m cash in car boot handed to Zondo commission

JOHANNESBURG - Investigators at the Zondo commission into state capture have been given information relating to R80m in cash that was allegedly found in the boot of a car belonging to a Free State government official, Network24 reported on Tuesday.

According to information obtained by Network24, the official who found the money called a senior ANC official who rushed to the scene. The investigation into the suspicious cash was then reportedly halted.

The incident took place earlier this year near the farm of now-deceased Sandile Msibi, the former head of the Free State Department of Police, Roads and Transport, north of Heilbron. The official in question reportedly worked for the same department.

Msibi was a confidant of Ace Magashule,

former Free State premier and current ANC Secretary General. Both are originally from Parys.

The information relating to the R80m forms part of an investigation into the movement of cash that was allegedly operated as part of a corrupt network run by Magashule. The book 'Gangster State - Unravelling, Ace Magashule's Web of Capture' by investigative journalist Pieter-Louis Myburgh, also notes the practice of using cash for corrupt transactions. Following the book's publication, Free State DA leader Patricia Kopane revealed yet another corruption scandal allegedly implicating Magashule relating to contracts of stateowned buildings. At a media conference in Bloemfontein, Kopane said the R30bn that allegedly "disappeared" owing to corruption during Magashule's decade-long tenure in the Free State could be "a drop in the ocean".

It is alleged that Magashule ensured that he received a handling fee and "favour payment" of 10 per cent of the value of all contracts awarded by the Free State government.

In addition, the DA has received information that at least one rental contract of a state-owned building was written in such a way that allowed a female friend of Magashule to purchase it. In terms of the agreement, she could use government money to pay for improvements to the building.

The former Saambou building, located on the corner of Charlotte Maxeke Street and Aliwal Street, has been rented at R726 167.36 since February 1 last year. During his last days in office as premier, Magashule allegedly insisted that she be awarded the rental contract.

EFF member dies in North West car crash, farmer helps other passengers

NORTH WEST - An EFF member was killed when the bakkie she was travelling in rolled on a dirt road on the way to the party's North West rally at the Lethabong Stadium.

Elizabeth Masemola was one of nine passengers travelling in a convoy with another bakkie when the driver lost control.

Masemola died on impact, while another passenger sustained serious injuries. The remaining seven passengers escaped injury, EFF North West Secretary Papiki Babuile told News24 yesterday. "On their way to the rally, they took a gravel road," Babuile said.

"The bakkie travelling at the back was carrying nine people and lost control on the gravel road and it overturned. "The bakkie that was travelling in the front immediately made a U-turn to assist the passengers. They helped them out of the car," Babuile

"They were joined by one white farmer, whom we want to thank for helping our members. He assisted them in getting people out of the car."

According to Babuile, Masemola was trapped inside the vehicle and could not be moved. "I joined them shortly after the accident and waited

for the ambulance and police to arrive. They arrived an hour later."

UGANDA'S BICYCLE AMBULANCES HELP THE PREGNANT, SICK AND INJURED

KIBIBI, UGANDA - In the early months of her pregnancy, Sandra Naigaga had to walk more than four kilometres to get to antenatal care at the health centre in Kibibi, Uganda.

Uganda has high maternal and newbom death rates, with 15 women dying every day from childbirth and pregnancy-related issues. That worried Naigaga in those initial months of pregnancy.

That fear however subsided in late 2018 when the NGO First African Bicycle Information Organisation (FABIO) introduced its free bicycle ambulance service to the two major health centres in the region.

Naigaga is one of the hundreds of women, elderly persons, children and the sick in her area who regularly use bicycle ambulances to get prompt medical attention. In many remote areas, many of the roads are impassable for vehicles, so the bicycles with their specialised trailers to carry patients are the only way for many to get to a health centre.

"As pregnant women, we are always weak," says Naigaga, "They take us to hospital, we get treatment and they take us back home."

In Uganda, 77 of the country's 121 districts lack an ambulance service and fewer than seven per cent of patients arrive at hospital by ambulance.

That lack of transport prompted FABIO to develop its first bicycle ambulance service in 2006 in Uganda's then war-torn northern region.

Their goal since has been to create something that is both environmentally friendly and easy to maintain.

"We wanted to create a sustainable way or a cheaper way for people to

be able to access health centres," says Executive Director, Katesi Najjiba.

The ambulances are built by locals, with locally sourced materials, using as a base the black bicycle whose spare parts are easily found in the villages.

Jeremiah Brian Nkuutu, a field officer at FABIO, says the ambulances are "African solutions to African problems". Some terrain can be challenging for the cyclists.

"The hilly areas are most times not easy for me to go pick the patients," says Mukasa Harid, a bicycle ambulance cyclist. "It's only possible when one helps me push it and we manage."

To address that concern, FABIO introduced the e-scooter, a rechargeable electric bike used in place of bicycles in areas where the terrain is hardened like the region around the Kibibi Health Centre. *Aljazeera*





Police said that 29-year-old Eric Holder was taken into custody after a witness spotted him in Bellflower, about 20 miles from the shooting scene. Police said they believe the shooting stemmed from a personal dispute between Holder and the 33-year-old rapper.

What we know: Eric Holder, 29, of Los Angeles, was taken into police custody on Tuesday.

Police described a dispute between Holder and Hussle of a 'personal nature' and said Holder appeared in front of Hussle's clothing store more than once before shooting him. The LAPD chief said Holder is a member of a gang.

LAPD Commissioner Steve Soboroff read a letter Hussle wrote to the LAPD prior to his death. Soboroff said a planned meeting between the department, members of Hussle's family and his label Roc Nation will continue as scheduled.

The rapper planned to meet with officials to discuss ways to fight gang violence in the city.

Holder was transported to a Los Angeles Police Department facility and will be booked for murder.







Bucs could face Wits without Memela

JOHANNESBURG - Orlando Pirates team doctor Ezekiel Matebula has revealed the extent of midfielder Luvuyo Memela's injury suffered against Mamelodi Sundowns.

Memela was stretchered off immediately after colliding with Sundowns skipper Hlompho Kekana, who has since issued a public apology for his challenge, at the Orlando Stadium on Monday.

The 31-year-old has had terrible fortune with injuries this season, having missed the first seven months of the campaign through a knee injury before returning in February.

Having managed two goals and an assist in his eight games recently, Amigo is now at risk of missing his side's next league assignment away to Bidvest Wits this weekend.

Laceration

"Luvuyo suffered a deep laceration to the right anterior thigh," Dr Matebula told Pirates' website.

"The laceration was 4cm by 2.5cm deep extending to the fascia and was bleeding profusely [on Monday night].

"The wound was cleaned and sutured on the inside and the skin closure done with four nylon stitches.

Precaution

"Anti-tetanus toxoid vaccine and antibiotics were also given as precaution."

As things stand, Thembinkosi Lorch is already ruled out for Saturday's encounter after picking up his fourth successive yellow card this season against Sundowns.

'You can reach 1 000 goals'

PARIS - Football legend Pele told Kylian Mbappe on Tuesday that he believes the French World Cup winner can emulate his own achievement of scoring 1 000 career goals.

The 78-year-old Brazilian claims to have netted over 1 000 goals in his career, while Mbappe has so far managed 103 in total, with 92 of those coming at the top level.

"It's possible, I scored exactly 1 025, so 1 000 goals is possible for him," Pele told AFP in Paris, where he met Mbappe at a sponsor event for Hublot watches.

Mbappe, who last year became only the second teenager to score in a World Cup final after Pele in France's 4-2 victory over Croatia, played down Pele's comments.

"I think that even if we count the goals on inter-city pitches and goals on the PlayStation, I won't be able to reach the 1 000-goal mark," said the 20-year-old Paris Saint-Germain forward

"We will try to get as close as we can, but I think I'll be a long way off it at the end of my career."

Mbappe has scored 32 goals in all competitions for PSG this season, including 27 from only 24 Ligue 1 appearances.

Pele was only 21 when he won his second World Cup in 1962, adding a third eight years later.

"There's only one 'King' and he's there," said Mbappe. "I'm just Kylian, I'm trying to do my best to help my team and my national side.

"The comparisons are flattering but I know very well that I will never do what he did."

It was not the first time that Mbappe has had to temper comparisons with Pele, after a rush to crown him a future footballing great during the World Cup in Russia, where he scored four goals in total.

LONDON - Joel Matip has claimed that Liverpool team-mate Virgil van Dijk is so good that he has improved the rest of Jurgen Klopp's squad.

Van Dijk has been in incredible form for the Reds this term, making 39 appearances in all competitions and helping them to the top of the Premier League table.

The Dutchman is one of the favourites to win the PFA Player of the Year award, but Matip believes he brings more to Liverpool than just his own performances.

"He's a great defender," Matip told Premier League Productions.

"And being around him, I think everybody improves. He has had a big impact on the improvement. It's great to play [with] him. He's a complete defender and he knows what to do.

"Every defender does things a little bit differently. You always need some time to really know each other. This is normal. I think we need this time in a good way and this is working most of the time quite well."

Matip has also impressed this season, starting each of the last 12 games after recovering from a fractured collarbone.

However, with competition from Joe Gomez and Dejan Lovren, the Cameroon defender is not taking his place in Klopp's starting XI for

Ozil best player I've played with - Marco Reus

DORTMUND - Marco Reus has named Mesut Ozil as the best footballer he's had the chance to play alongside in his career, with the Borussia Dortmund star having lined up with the Arsenal man in the German national team.

Reus has played alongside the likes of Robert Lewandowski, Mario Gotze, Toni Kroos and Germany's all-time top scorer Miroslav Klose throughout his career, but it was the Gunners' midfield orchestrator that stood out above the rest for the Dortmund captain.

Sadly for Reus, Ozil has retired from international football following a breakdown in relationship with the German Football Association (DFB), alleging discrimination from the body and the German media, meaning a future collaboration seems unlikely.

Following that, the 30-year-old found himself on the firinges of Arsenal's first team after the appointment of Unai Emery, with the playmaker seemingly struggling to adapt to the rigours of the Spanish boss' training and tactical approach.

Award

A recent 2-0 win over Newcastle saw Ozil-old pick up the award for man of the match, however, and Reus hopes that his favourite player will be able to kick on and become a more permanent feature in Emery's starting XI.

"Mesut Ozil," Reus told Copa 90 when quizzed on the best player he has played with. "The way he creates goals... he's a player with a really good eye for his team-mates. He has so many assists in the Premier League and with the national team.

"He's just an intelligent player and you can see that right away with a first glance. I always enjoyed playing with him and that's why it's a pity he's taken a step back. I hope he'll get back to form and return to playing regularly for Arsenal."

A dip in his own club's form saw a healthy lead at the top of the Bundesliga table drop down to just two between Dortmund and Bayern Munich, with a clash between the two German powerhouses taking place on Saturday.

A run of three straight wins since that hiccup has restored some momentum ahead of the weekend's big match and the Dortmund captain has been doing his best to ease the pressure on his teammates as they target their first Bundesliga title since 2011-12.

How Ole Gunnar Solskjaer must be sick of Molineux. Having already been denied their best chance of a trophy here, United's top-four ambitions have now taken a major dent too.

Games

In truth, it was a different kind of game and United were far from poor. They started strongly, taking the lead through Scott McTominay, and had 12 shots to Wolves' two in the second half despite seeing Ashley Young sent off before the hour mark.

The only two saves that David de Gea made after the interval were from Chris Smalling and Victor Lindelof.

With Rui Patricio in fine form at the other end, it was that sort of evening and



Ole Gunnar Solskjaer could only bemoan his misfortune against Wolves.

Solskjaer argued as much afterwards by reminding everyone that this is football, not mathematics.

"You cannot control the result can you? We can control what we do on the pitch, performance wise, and we have played well enough tonight to win the game."

Nevertheless, it will grate with Solskjaer that both goals his team conceded were sloppy ones - the sort of mistakes that can undermine any good work. "We created our own downfall really," he admitted.

What hope does Italy have of kicking out racism

...when Bonucci justifies Kean abuse?

TURIN - The American political activist Eldridge Cleaver once said, "There is no more neutrality in the world. You either have to be part of the solution, or you're going to be a part of the problem."

On Tuesday evening, Leonardo Bonucci chose the latter.

After seeing and hearing his club and international team-mate Moise Kean racially abused throughout Juventus' 2-0 win at Cagliari, the defender staggeringly accused the Italian-born son of Ivorian parents of provocation.

Kean's crime? Having the temerity to silently celebrate scoring his side's second goal in front of those who had spent the preceding 85 minutes abusing him.

"Kean knows that when he scores a goal, he has to focus on celebrating with his team-mates," Bonucci told Sky Sport Italia. "He knows he could've done something differently too."There were racist jeers after the goal, Blaise heard it and was angered. I think the blame is 50-50, because Moise shouldn't have done

that and the Curva should not have reacted that way.

"We are professionals, we have to set the example and not provoke anyone. "I prefer to talk about the great performance." And with that, Bonucci moved on, apparently feeling that he had adequately addressed the issue that had completely overshadowed the game in Sardegna, and continues to overshadow the game as a whole.

Happily, former Italy defender Daniele Adani wasn't done talking about it. He was understandably mortified by this latest embarrassing episode for Italian football and even more depressed by his certainty that, once again, nothing would be done about it. "We have made a sh*t impression on the world for the umpteenth time," he told Sky Sport. "It is a defeat for everyone. It's truly disgusting.

"We need to identify those 20, 100, however many imbeciles, and get them the f*ck out, as happens in foreign leagues."

Jantjie had R4.5m contract signed with Wits

"What I can say is, this is sad news, it's sad the way this boy left us. Rantsi called me early in the morning at 6am to inform me," Mulovhedzi tells KickOff.com.

"What hurts is I had managed to get him a contract at Wits that was supposed to start in two months, his contract was worth R4.5-million at Wits.

"I spoke to him yesterday [last Sunday] and he was telling me that he wanted to leave Free State Stars knowing that the team is safe [from relegation]. He said he wanted to score against Baroka and Highlands Park.

"We had already found a house for him in Joburg, and another thing again we made an investment at Old Mutual. Another thing is I was his 'parent' because me and him we talked about everything. I scouted him in Cape Town, now I'm doing all the arrangements [for his funeral]. Kickoff



Mamelodi Sundowns, Wayne Arendse found guilty

JOHANNESBURG - The Premier Soccer League yesterday released the verdict handed down by the Disciplinary Committee regarding Mamelodi Sundowns' fielding of Wayne Arendse.

Arendse was drafted onto Sundowns' teamsheet beyond the prescribed deadline in their 1-1 ABSA Premiership draw with Bidvest Wits over a month ago, and was subsequently fielded in the starting line-up.

Upon review of the matter, the PSL DC have since found the club and the player guilty of contravening the rules, but have reserved their sanction until defence submissions have been made by The Brazilians.

"The Premier Soccer League Disciplinary Committee has delivered verdict on matters involving Mamelodi Sundowns, Mr Wayne Arendse and Mr Pitso Mosimane," read a statement from The League.

"In the first matter involving Mamelodi Sundowns and Wayne Arendse, the Disciplinary Committee found both the club and the player guilty of misconduct.

"This is after Mamelodi Sundowns fielded Mr. Arendse whilst he was ineligible to play in the ABSA Premiership fixture against Bidvest Wits on 7 October 2018.

"Sanction will be handed down once all the parties have made submissions to the Disciplinary Committee."

Meanwhile, coach Pitso Mosimane has also been found guilty over the incident in which he was accused of assaulting one of AmaZulu's officials, with the DC similarly reserving the sanction.

"In the second matter arising from an incident between AmaZulu and Mamelodi Sundowns on 01 September 2018, Mr Pitso Mosimane was charged with misconduct after he allegedly assaulted AmaZulu team security official, Mr. Satchmo Ngwenya by punching him in the face," further read the statement.




When quizzed about an interim Management Committee, the director said it was only him and the head coach (Thabo 'Koki' Vilakati) handling the administration issues of the team until further notice.

PLE to refer Bull to DC

SOCCER – THE Premier League of Eswatini (PLE) will refer Mbabane Highlanders to the Disciplinary Committee (DC) for breaching Article 13 (3) of the MTN League's rules and regulations.

This is in relation to the team's utterances in the media yesterday where they implied that they had written to the PLE requesting 70 per cent of Sunday's gate collections, when actu-

ally they had not. PLE's Chief Executive Officer, Simanga Nhleko said they had requested the DC to look into whether or not Highlanders had not brought the name of the organisation into disrepute by doing this.

Offence

Reads article 13 (3); 'Clubs, officials, supporters, fans, shall not publish or make statements that may bring the sponsors, the PLE, and all its subcommittees into disrepute. Anyone or any club that commits this offence shall be brought before the DC for

disciplinary action, and if found guilty, the person (s) and/or the club (s) shall be fined an amount not exceeding E10 000 by the DC'.

Nhleko said it was a pity that instead of following protocol, their members decide to use the media to further their goals.

"People now have different perceptions about how the PLE conducts its business yet those responsible for creating these perceptions are fully aware of the rules," he said.

The CEO added that it was the DC

that would decide if Highlanders committed an offence or not, and if they did, they would be charged.

Contested

He maintained that not at any stage had they received a letter from the 'Bull' addressing Sunday's gate collections. Instead, the CEO said they wrote to Green Mamba and then copied the letter to him. Highlanders drew 0-0 with Mbabane Swallows in a tightly contested derby on Sunday, while Green Mamba beat Manzini Wanderers 1-0 earlier.
