## 'Mass' funeral for slain Shongwe family


DUE to the violent nature in which they died, the corpses of Nokwanda Magagula (26), Zweli (34), Senkhosi (9) and Mahle (7) Shongwe will not enter the Shongwe homestead for the funeral on Saturday.

This comes after the aforementioned individuals passed on under terrible circumstances the past Sunday and on Tuesday, respectively.

As earlier reported Zweli Shongwe, the father of two and husband to Nokwanda, committed suicide after ingesting a potent insecticide at his parental homestead at Vusweni after he had killed his two children by giving them the same poison.

Before committing the suicide, Shongwe believed he had killed his wife, by hacking her on the face several times and ditched her into a donga.

Nokwanda was rescued by paramedics, who rushed her to Pigg's Peak Government Hospital before she was transferred to the Mbabane

Government Hospital, where she died on Tuesday due to the severity of the cracked skull wounds.

All the corpses of the four family members are kept at the Pigg's Peak Government Hospital morgue in preparation for the mass funeral at Vusweni.

Relatives of the Shongwe family, who wanted to remain anonymous, said the deceased's corpses will be taken to Vusweni on Friday evening (tomorrow).

"According to Eswatini Law and Customs the corpses of individuals who pass away in such a violent manner cannot be placed inside the homestead during the night vigil. In this case, we have a whole family of four, whose corpses will have to be placed outside the homestead on Friday evening where a tent will be mounted.

"After the night vigil on Friday, the deceased family will be laid to rest in the nearby graveyard in the early hours of Saturday. But plans can change at the last minute due to circumstances beyond our control," they added.

At the time of going to print the elder of the home, Edward Shongwe (71) confirmed that the funeral will take place on Saturday morning.

# COLA BACK ON

IT now appears government has finally given in to the demands of Public Sector Associations (PSAs) to include the contentious cost of living adjustment (CoLA) in this year's negotiations agenda.

Last week, PSAs had marched to Cabinet offices, where they delivered a petition calling for CoLA to be paid in this month's salary cycle.

Previously, the Prime Minister Ambrose Mandvulo Dlamini had stated that government was not in a good financial position to pay CoLA in this financial year, but assured them that it will definitely be considered for the 2020/21 financial year.

Yesterday, when the Government Negotiating Team met the Public Sector Associations in what is known as the Joint Negotiation Forum, disclosed that it was now ready to engage on the subject when they reconvene for negotiations in two weeks time.

Initially, government was ready to discuss any matter with PSAs so long as CoLA was not part of the agenda.

So, yesterday when they met on the nego-

tiating table, PSAs pushed for the matter to be included on the agenda for negotiations.

Sources close to the negotiations revealed that there wasn't much which was deliberated during yesterday's meeting, except agreeing on the agenda.

Information gathered is that government was reluctant to include CoLA in the negotiations, however, the PSAs pushed for it to be included. Eventually CoLA was included on the agenda.

#### Issues

Some of the issues that PSAs want discussed during these meetings is the failure to award the Cost of Living Adjustment (CoLA), trade union bashing, failure to remit trade union dues and a lot of other issues.

Earlier on, PSAs had indicated that it is an indisputable fact that public servants have not been awarded CoLA for three years now (2017/18, 2018/19 and 2019/20) and according to them, this is an unfortunate state of affairs.

The PSAs said they were not convinced by government's argument, that because it is going through a rough economic path, it was therefore having serious cash liquidity prob-

# Citizens make food donations to Mbabane Govt Hospital

AS government continues to struggle paying suppliers, resulting in drug shortages and food in public hospitals, citizens have responded with food donations for the Mbabane Government Hospital where the challenge is said to be huge.

A concerned Emergency Disaster Network of about 91 people, created by Bongani Mamba and coordinated by lawyer Gigi Reid-Miles, has responded with various food items, ranging from several bags of beans, bags of rice, chicken portions, sugar and many other items.

Director of Health Services Dr. Vusi Magagula has thanked the pro-activeness of all concerned citizens who did not want to get invitation but when they read media reports responded in this fashion

In fact, it is not the first time this network has responded to such a call, but have done it in the past when the same situation occurred, and have even contributed to the national call to assist Idai victims in Mozambique.

tor as, it services the nation on a daily basis and some of the challenges it faces cannot be hidden.

#### Response

The Health Minister, Lizzy Nkosi, has found herself having to explain the reported drug shortages in public hospitals and Parliament has asked for immediate government response on this situation. The minister has explained that some of the shortages were as a result of suppliers cutting supply because

of outstanding payments, which runs into millions of Emalangeni.

These concerned citizens have come together and are now collecting food parcels to be donated to the Mbabane Government Hospital.

Some have even gone as far as contributing money that will be used to buy the groceries. Some of these individuals include some few Members of Parliament, high ranking attorneys, business individuals, companies and

Please drop Food Items at S&B Restaurant (Matsapha), in Manzini at Gigi-Reid Miles offices behind Cashbuild)...and at Portuguese Club Mbabane," part of the message appealing for help reads.

Member of Parliament Lutfo Dlamini was among one of those who donated, the MP donated bags of rice. Others who donated include Gigi Reid Attomeys, Dr Sikhomba Gumbi and many others.

#### Obligation

Reid-Miles donated bags of mealie meal, bags of rice, bags of beans, cooking oil, boxes of Rooibos tea and a lot of other items.

When asked about the donation initiative, Reid-Miles said she believes that as citizens of the country, people have an obligation to help each other.

"At the end of the day, it doesn't help to say what the country can do for me all the time, what about saying what can I do for my country sometimes. And as far as I am concerned, it could be me in that bed struggling for my life, taking medication that I can't take on an empty stomach," Reid-Miles said.

She said they are collecting quite a bit and yesterday they collected vegetables, cheese, chicken, cooking oil, jam and a lot of other items.

By close of business yesterday, a total cash amount of E2 500 had been contributed towards buying other items to assist the patients.

## PSAs DEJECTED OVER NO RESPONSE FROM INDUSTRIAL COURT

PUBLIC Sector Associations (PSAs) have been left dejected after seven days passed without them getting any response from the Industrial Court pertaining judgment on the issue of whether they should engage in a strike action or not.

By the close of business yesterday it was gathered that there was no form of communication PSAs received from the Registrar of the Industrial Court.

In the petition which was delivered last week Wednesday by PSAs in one of the demands it was stated that; "As Public Sector Associations we therefore demand that the long awaited judgement on case 15/2019 be issued by close of business on Wednesday (03-07-2019)".

SNAT Secretary General Sikelela Dlamini confirmed that as PSAs they haven't received anything from the Registrar. Dlamini said they will make means tomorrow to see what they can do.

#### Disappointment

Earlier last week the Swaziland National Association of Teachers (SNAT), The National Public Servants and Allied Workers Union (NAP-SAWU), The Swaziland National Association of Government Accounting Personnel (SNAGAP) and The Swaziland Democratic Nurses Union (SWADNU) registered their disappointment in the way and manner in which the Industrial Court has treated the workers who are under the employ of government.

The PSAs said the Industrial Court of Eswatini has failed to act expediently on an urgent issue that is



actually one of life and death to the majority of workers in the country.

"The Government of Eswatini, the employer in this case rushed to court to interdict these organisations and their members from proceeding with a legitimate course of action on the eve of the strike commencement date (27-01-2019).

"A protracted legal battle then ensued between the two parties. The final arguments on the merits of the case were made on Monday (06-05-2019) after countless postponements and adjournments and that marked the closure on the matter in principle. The Industrial Court Judge – Judge Sifiso Nsibande who presided over the matter assured the parties that the judgement on same was to

be made very soon" part of the statement from the PSAs directed to the registrar read.

#### Impartial

The PSAs indicated that the Industrial Court being a court of equity and one whose grinding wheels need not be given an impetus of whatever kind by any external force to maintain its independent posture, the industrial court was given time to produce its independent and impartial judgement as promised by the presiding judge.

The PSAs in the petition indicated that from the time on which the arguments on the matter were made, up to date as Public Sector Associations they patiently waited for that judgement, which has however not been

delivered

The civil servants went on to state that when the presiding judge made the promise that the judgement was to be made very soon, he himself said he was cognisant of the fact that this matter was one of urgency and that it indeed touched upon many people who have an interest on same.

They said this was an indication that the Judicial officer was understanding this issue to be truly one of national interest, because this judgement will obviously have an effect on over 44 000 government employees and that its ripple effect shall spread far and wide to negatively affect a larger portion of the society since as workers they are members of their own families and

communities first and last.

When delivering the petition the workers indicated that seven weeks have elapsed since this matter was closed and such an act leaves them as workers with an opinion that is difficult to quell, that this delay is actually socially engineered by your office so that the workers are prevented from engaging further with the Cost of Living Adjustment issue, which this case (15/2019) was all about.

However yesterday PSAs went on to meet with the Government Negotiating Team (GNT) to continue with the negotiations but still they wanted a response from the Industrial Court on whether the strike action shall continue or not.

# Baholeli vow to make bus ranks a safe haven for children

MARSHALLS, drivers and bus conductors have committed to making Eswatini bus ranks a safe haven for children and all citizens of the country.

They were embracing World Vision's 'It takes Eswatini to end sexual violence against children' campaign at the bus rank yesterday. Mbabane Rank Manager Themba Dlamini said they would try their best to make ranks a safe place for their customers mostly children.

"Our way of life should promote safety first for children. As much as the rate of sexual violence in ranks has decreased, it still exists especially to the younger female generation.

We looked at the situation and acknowledged our role in sexual harassment and violence and thought we should address this as a collective as much as we come from different areas. Our customers come here and they should feel safe," Dlamini said. He said they also requested the Royal Eswatini Police Services (REPS) to join hands with them in ensuring that the ranks were safe

They will also make sure that these children do not loiter around during school hours or be involved in substance abuse as they witness a lot of such. When they rebuke them they make sure to remind them that they are neither a parent or guardian.

"You should take note that we are of

different characters, some of us allow these incidences because they have been either paid, know the children or turn a blind eye on purpose. The police will clean these places," he said.

#### Echoed

Nkosinathi Manana, the assistant rank manager echoed Dlamini and said ranks should be safe for children even to an extent that they can cry for help and receive instance. He said they see their own at times being perpetrators, 'bayabahhohha' at times even touch them.

"We try by all means to discourage that but people can never respond the same as some listen and some don't," Manana said Meanwhile, It takes Eswatini Campaign Manager Nontobeko Mbuyane stated that this was a national campaign intending to cover all sectors and involve all, hence the transport industry's involvement as it was crucial too. She said they had seen cases where a lot of the perpetrators had been identified as being part of their industry. "We are trying to make sure that they are educated and counselled into making ranks a safe place for children and all other people. We want to make sure that as much as they are drivers and conductors they are still responsible citizens' fathers, brothers and uncles to these children," she said

## Campaign aims to change bus rank mentality

IT Takes Eswatini Campaign Manager Nontobeko Mbuyane disclosed that through the involvement of kombi drivers and bus conductors they wanted to zero down on any sexual violence happening in bus ranks in the country.

They were so grateful to transport operators and happy that they had embraced this campaign very well as well as acknowledged that they were a huge sector of the perpetrators.

They'd even shown the willingness to change that behaviour as they had taken the initiative to identify peer educators amongst themselves to train each other to ensure that this activity didn't end in the Mbabane bus rank but translated throughout

"Their key focus area was on the behaviour change amongst the members of the transport sector. It's been two weeks now since initiating to join the campaign that seeks to address these issues, they wanted to be a part of it because they acknowledged that a large number of incidences happening within their space could also play a role," Mbuyane revealed. She added that even from a business front the transport operators were losing a number of customers especially children.

Menzi Stewart who is a marshal said they'd rather be gatekeepers to ensure the safety of their clientele.

He said they started off with a briefing in all the platforms, both long and short distances.

"We have nominated peer educators amongst ourselves and, today you can identify us by the orange jackets. They will educate the others on child protection and violence. From here we are going to the other ranks to educate our own," he said.

He reckoned that it would be productive coming from them as they knew even the language and understood the extent of the violence.

Thabsile Matsebula a Corporation platform marshal who has worked for eight years at the rank said she at times saw harassment taking place and some of her colleagues would say that it was a result of the children dressing skimpily.

"They ignore the fact that some of us don't dress to cover our knees. This campaign is great as we are the ones who have decided to do this. I have experienced incidents where my colleagues were the perpetrators of violence against children. I try making sure that the children are safe and take them to the police post when need arises," she said.

# SIBONGILE VETTING REPORTSALIE

PENSIONERS believe that there was no vetting conducted on nominated Board members, instead they term the rejection of Sibongile Mazibuko to the Public Service Pension Fund Board of Trustees as a ploy to disorganise them.

"There was never any vetting on any member; this is a lie," one member of the Mbabane Pensioners Association said during the meeting.

The meeting followed after the Pensioners National Executive Committee on Monday decided to replace Sibongile Mazibuko with another candidate on the PSPF Board. The replacement of Mazibuko with Cuthbert Khumalo did not sit well with the branch.

Speaking during the urgent meeting, the pensioners said they do not believe that there was any vetting that was carried out on the Board members.

Mazibuko told the pensioners that after her name was submitted along with other members who were selected to represent different stakeholders in the PSPF Board, she said she was ordered to submit her CV. She stated that in her CV, she had the schools she went to, the uni-

versities as well as the course of study. She said she believes her auditing qualification was the problem with the minister, and those allegedly looting PSPF

Shortly after she was ousted from the PSPF Board, her home was then invaded by detectives, who told her daughter that they were investigating her debts. Mazibuko said she was surprised that police officers now collect scholarship loans. The pensioners then called for the minister, as well as the police intelligence unit to publicize Mazibuko's vetting report instead of speaking in riddles and playing hard to get.

Chairperson of the branch Osvart Sukati said there was never any vetting that took place, instead it was just a strategy to eliminate Mazibuko. "We will not back down until Sibongile is a member of the PSPF Board," he said.

Sukati said they were told that they were not going to be shown any evidence on how she could not make it to the PSPF Board, instead she should visit the intelligence unit, where it will be shown to her. "Police have no right to hold evidence," he said.

#### Looting

The chairperson added that Mazibuko is victimised because she is always telling the truth, yet they want 'yes men' in the Board so that they can continue looting the PSPF. He further stated that the minister is being used by a certain group of people who are looting PSPF money. He said they will not back down until a report is presented before them about Mazibuko. "Sibongile's name has been dragged through the mud, we want the report so that she could be cleared, bantfu bakhombana ngaye," he said.

In fact, the pensioners are saying Sibongile's constitutional rights have been violated and one of them being freedom of association.

#### **THE National Executive Council** of Pensioners has been accused

of siding with the Minister of Public Service Christian Ntshangase in the rigmarole involving former SNAT president Sibongile

Mazibuko.

The pensioners said it was proof enough that the NEC does not have the pensioners' best interests at heart, as they are easily swayed by the minister, as well as the other forces. Mbabane Pensioners Secretary General Dominic Nxumalo said the NEC, instead of coming back to them after a meeting with the minister, opted to replace Sibongile, which they call it absurd. As a result of the NEC, decision to replace Sibongile, they opted to take the matter to court "The legal route would be taken if Sibongile Mazibuko is not considered for, PSPF Board,"

he said. The secretary added that to prove that the minister and the NEC were now buddies, he wrote a letter that he was supposed to address to the Secretary General instead it was addressed to the President. In the letter, the minister told the pensioners to replace the chosen candidate, who was Sibongile. "As per our discussions, the candidate that was nominated by the Pensioners Association was required to go through the vetting process just like all the other candidates from the different stakeholders that are nominated for appointment in the PSPF Board of Trustees. "All candidates submitted the required documents for the vetting process, where unfortunately your nominated candidate was not successful," reads part of the letter from the minister of pub-

lic service.

MBABANE pensioners have accused Minister of Public Service Christian Ntshangase of over-stepping his boundaries by interfering with PSPF business yet he is responsible for workers

be dealing with operational stuff not the owners who are the pensioners. Mbabane Branch Chairperson Osvart Sukati said the minister was in fact a servant, not a master but he is now behaving like a master.

"I am as good as a prisoner," she said. The former SNAT president stated that the vetting report that is hanging over her head is indeed a stumbling block in her life. She stated that being investigated by a national intelligence unit can have a lot of negative effects on anyone.

In her case, it is said that the vetting results were not good at all, as a result she had to be kicked out of the Public Service Pension Fund Board a month ago.

Mazibuko said the fact that there are circulating news about her failing a vetting process and a report about her vetting that is somewhere, where no one is allowed to see it, does not make her sleep at night. She stated that she was as good as a prisoner, as it is reported that the intelligence unit has unpalatable findings about her.

"The hanging vetting report could mean that I cannot obtain an

## Friends stab another to death during drinking spree

A drinking spree by three friends ended tragically when a petty argument erupted between them, resulting to one of them being stabbed to death with a knife.

The incident, which has left a sombre mood in the community of Moyeni in Siteki, happened at one of the popular drinking halls within the town centre.

Following this incident, two men from the same area were arrested and charged with murder. Mthokozisi Shepherd Dlamini (27) and Lwazi Wiseman Dlamini (28) made their first appearance before Principal Magistrate Dumisani Magagula yesterday. According to the charge sheet, the accused persons acted in furtherance of a common purpose and intentionally killed Mkhuleko Mnisi by stabbing him with a sharp object in the upper body. Information gathered was that the accused persons and the deceased have always been friends, as they also came from the same community.

On the day of the incident, they met at the drinking hall for the purpose of having a drinking spree.

An argument between the second accused person and the deceased erupted after they had a disagreement on some issues. The two are said to have started exchanging fierce blows in the midst of other patrons

#### Source

A source close to the matter said the first accused attempted to separate the two, but eventually joined the fight. He is alleged to have withdrawn a knife from his pocket and planted it on the deceaseds' upper body, a few inches from the neck.

The fight immediately subsided as the deceased fell onto the ground. Police were called to the scene, upon which the wounded man was rushed to Good Shepherd Hospital. He is said to have died a few minutes after arrival at the hospital.

During their appearance before court, the accused persons were informed of their right to legal representation. Each of them elected to conduct his own defence. They were remanded to Big Bend correctional facility pending their committal to the High Court.

#### A former Limkokwing University of Creative Technology employee has taken the institution to court over the unlawful termination of a contract.

According to the Industrial Court papers submitted by the applicant's legal representatives, Simelane Mtshali Attorneys, Mphilisi Mlungisi Simelane, who is the applicant, was employed on April 11, 2011 as an Operations Supervisor.

The employment was on contract basis and it was renewed in December 2015. Consequently, an employment contract was entered into between the applicant and Limkokwing University, the respondent, on December 21, 2015.

The substantive contract was for a period of three years and the parties had

an option to renew it on December 20, 2018. The contract would be renewed based on performance and availability of a position and resources.

The applicant performed his duties in accordance with the substantive contract of employment until such time that he was up for appraisal in November 2018.

#### Conducted

The appraisal was conducted by the applicant's direct supervisor, Gideon Shumba.

At the conclusion of the appraisal, Shumba recommended that the applicant's contract be renewed.

The respondent did not give any notice of its intention to terminate the substantive contract of employment on December

1 201

The contract was therefore, tacitly renewed on December 21, 2018 as the applicant was still under the employment of the respondent by January 1, 2019.

The applicant based his submissions on the following factors; there was an existing contract of employment between the applicant and the respondent by January 1, 2019.

The respondent fully appreciated the fact that a notice of termination of the substantive contract of employment had to be made on or before December 1, 2018 and that failure to do so would constitute a tacit renewal of the agreement.

The respondents' conduct was an unequivocal act of renewal of the substantive

contract of employment, as the said contract emanated from the recommendations made by the applicant's direct supervisor.

The respondents terminated the applicant's contract on January 4, 2019.

The termination of the contract was unlawful and un-procedural due to the following premise; the contract of employment between the parties had been tacitly renewed on December 29, 2018 when the respondent failed to give notice of its intention to terminate the contract of employment.

There was also no substantive reason for the termination of the tacitly renewed contract of employment, as the applicant had neither committed misconduct nor unilaterally left the respondent's employ.

The respondent also failed to adhere to any procedure in the termination of the contract of employment, therefore, the termination was un-procedural.

#### Claims

The applicant's claims against the respondent are as follows; setting aside the respondents' letter of the termination of the tacitly renewed contract of employment, the respondent reinstates the applicant to his job and pay for legal costs of the applicant or alternatively payment of the total remuneration that would have been earned by the applicant in the 36 months, which amounts to E594 333.33, as well as pay for the legal costs of the applicant.

# THE national deworming campaign which ended last week, reached a total of 148 868 school children both in primary and high schools.

This equates to 98 per cent coverage of the country's schools. Vusi Lokotfwako from the epidemiology department at the ministry of health stated that at the end the deworming team reached a total number of 406 schools in all four regions.

"There were 216 schools from Hhohho, while Manzini covered 22, Lubombo covered 141 and Shiselweni covered 27 schools. About 98 per cent of the initial targeted number of children was reached being 148 868 children out of the initial targeted 152 012 were dewormed," he revealed. Lokotfwako said the drug's uptake was satisfactory with no difference between girls and boys dewormed. The overall deworming tablets uptake by children was satisfactory and also the high uptake was also seen among teachers. He said the campaign was fully funded by government and World Health Organization

(WHO). This year's deworming exercise was officially launched by the Minister of Health Lizzy Nkosi at Mlumati High. It was also graced by WHO Representative Dr. Alice Akunga, different government ministries, teachers, community leaders,

members of Parliament and community members. The event was also graced by of teachers and principals from neighbouring schools. This year's campaign was targeting all schools from 23 Tinkhundla Centre.

#### Regions

"Deworming teams were accommodated in their respective regions to reach schools as early as possible. The teams were administering Albendazole 400mg for intestinal worms to the children in line with WHO guideline. The teams continuously gave health education to children pre and during the deworming," he said.

# Very few side-effects reported

VUSI Lokotfwako from the Ministry Of Health's epidemiology department has revealed that since inception of the campaign the teams had noticed very few side effects with no adverse events seen.

By the end of the campaign, the teams reported a total of 12 side-effects countrywide and there were no adverse effects seen.

The common side effects seen were vomiting, diarrhoea with and without blood, abdominal pains and severe headache.

The side effects were managed by the teams and children experiencing side effects after the teams had left were are attended by local health facilities and EMS through the toll free 977.

"The campaign was supported by a total of 35 cars from the following ministries: Health, Education and Training, and Deputy Prime Minister's Office.

The cars are fuelled and maintained by the Government of Eswatini. Transport support is also provided by the following supporting partners: ICAP, MSF and Young Heroes," he stated.

Lokotfwako said this year's campaign progressed very well and unlike previous campaigns there was a positive response even from private schools. As such, all targeted private schools (both primary and high) were reached during the 2019 campaign.

# Brothers assault man for having affair with mom

TWO brothers of Malindza were fined a total sum of E1 200 after they assaulted a man from the same area, whom they accused of having an illicit affair with their mother.

The accused persons, Mbongeni Mamba (22) and Siyabonga Mamba (21) were charged with assault with intent to cause grievous bodily harm.

When the charge sheet was read to each of them, both accused persons pleaded guilty to the charge. In evidence, the complainant told the court that the accused persons attacked him, while he was coming from a local drinking spot.

He said they accused him of having an illicit affair with their mother, something which he disputed. The com-



plainant said it was not the first time that the accused persons accused him of the same thing.

"I assume that the problem emanates from the fact that I usually go to the same drinking spot with the accused persons' mother," he said, adding that he had no relationship with the woman.

However, when presenting their defence, the first accused person claimed to have proof that the complainant was having an affair with their mother.

The accused person said the com-

plainant was taking advantage of the fact that their father was sickly, hence they decided to take the matter into their own hands.

They admitted to have assaulted the complainant, saying that they only wanted him to stay away from their moth-

Both accused persons were accordingly found guilty by the court. Each of them was sentenced to six months in a correctional facility, with an option to pay E600 fine.

# Driver bumps quantum, injures 11 passengers

THE driving skills of one public transport driver failed him after a car crashed into his quantum, injuring 11 of his passengers.

25-year-old Bheki Mdluli of Matsapha was arrested and charged with negligent driving after he knocked a Toyota quantum driven by Mfanzile Dlamini, injuring 11 passengers on board.

Mdluli, who was also charged with contempt of court after he did not appear before the court on Sunday, is said to have, on June 9 near the Kia Traffic lights in Mbabane, did drive his Mahindra LDV negligently and knocked from behind a Toyota quantum registered KSD 378 BH. Mdluli is said to have done this, injuring 11 passengers who were all treated and discharged by 977 personnel.

According to Mdluli's charge sheet, he drove at an unreasonable speed, disregarding the wet weath-

er conditions, since the surface of moscouthe toad was wet. Mdluli is also said to have failed to keep a safe following distance, failed to apply service brakes, further failing to avoid an accident.

During his appearance at the Magistrate's Court, Mdluli pleaded guilty to both charges.

Presiding over the matter, Principal Magistrate Fikile Nhlabatsi asked Mdluli if he had undergone any measures to compensate the owner of the vehicle that he had knocked. Mdluli informed the magistrate that he was doing so.

He further apologised before the court for being caught on the wrong side of the law.

He pleaded with the magistrate to exercise her leniency when passing sentence, whilst stating that he was unemployed. On count one he was sentenced to pay a fine of E500 or five months imprisonment, and on count two, Mdluli was sentenced to pay a fine of E800 and in default of payment, six months imprisonment.

#### Stepson suffocates, drags stepmother

IT is well known that relationships between stepmothers and their stepchildren are nothing short of bitter, which proved evident when a teenager strangled and dragged his stepmother after an argument ensued between them.

Luyanda Dlamini (18) of Siphocosini stands accused of contravening the Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence (SODV) Act, after he was said to have assaulted his stepmother Fikile Mavuso.

According to his charge sheet, Dlamini is said to have, on Sunday at Siphocosini, assaulted Fikile Mavuso, by grabbing her by the neck and suffocating her. Dlamini is then said to have dragged her by pulling her by her jacket.

During his appearance before Mbabane Principal Magistrate Fikile Nhlabatsi on Tuesday, Dlamini pleaded guilty to the charge. However, he disputed the wording of the charge, denying that he strangled Mavuso. When his charge was read before the court, sounds of disbelief and shock could be heard from the court gallery, with some heard saying "umentanjani make wakho intfo lefana nalena?"

In his mitigation for a lighter sentence, Dlamini claimed that he had intentions to apologise to his stepmother.

"I have requested a meeting with make so that I can express my apologies. I did not intend for our argument to escalate in the manner that it did. I apologise sincerely for my actions and I plead with the court to grant me a lighter sentence," Dlamini pleaded.

After hearing his sincere mitigation, Principal Magistrate Nhlabatsi sentenced Dlamini to serve two years in a correctional facility, with the option to pay a fine of E2 000.

### Man arrested for throwing beer bottle at friend

VIOLENCE at watering holes continues to hog the headlines after a man threw a beer bottle at his friend, which caused him to sustain injuries on his face and body.

However, Brian Dlamini (19) of Siteki, disputes a medical report brought forth by the prosecution in his assault case, claiming that when he threw a beer bottle at Mlandvo Mngometulu, the broken bottle only injured Mngometulu face and not his body.

During his appearance before Principal Magistrate Fikile Nhlabatsi on Monday, he was informed of the results of a medical examination conducted on Mngometulu at Mbabane Government Hospital on June 17, 2019, a day after the incident occurred.

The medical report revealed that Mngometulu sustained a six centimetre cut on his left cheek, with abrasions on his chin and on his left hand.

According to his charge sheet, Dlamini is said to have been arrested and charged with assault with intent to cause grievous bodily harm after he assaulted Mlandvo Mngometulu with a beer bottle. The incident is said to have occurred at Corporation in Mbabane, on June 16. Dlamini informed the court that he was not aware that he had injured Mngometulu on his left hand.

"Your Worship, I threw the bottle towards Mngometulu's head thus, I do not know that I injured him on his hand," Dlamini claimed.

To this, the prosecution applied for

the matter to be postponed for August 7, where the prosecution will lead evidence in the matter. This will also allow for Dlamini to prepare evidence for his defence.

The prosecution informed the court that bail for Dlamini was not opposed, with the court granting him bail of El 000.

Dlamini was further informed that in the event that he was unable to make payment towards his bail, he would be remanded back into custody until July

Bail conditions for Dlamini were to the effect that he was not to interfere with the prosecution's witnesses or investigation and that he was not to commit a similar offence, while out on bail. Dlamini was warned to appear on the said date of his trial.

MINISTRY of public works and transport staff has been implicated in a job scam currently making rounds conning desperate citizens of the Kingdom their hard earned money.

Members of the public have been scammed various amounts of money by people claiming to be recruitment officers from the ministry.

One of the desperate citizens scammed is Phumlile Mamba from Maloma, who is an Eswatini College of Technology (ECOT) graduate. The building engineering graduate said she had applied for employment at the ministry a few months ago.

Mamba said one of the good days she received a phone call from someone claiming to be a recruitment officer from the ministry. "She called me using a cellphone number 7636 3194 and identified herself as Mrs Tsela," she said.

Mamba said Tsela asked if she still needed the job she had applied for at the ministry. However, Mamba said she suspected something was not right because usually govern-



ment officers use landlines to make phone calls or the popular contract numbers starting with 7606.... or

Despite her suspicion she told her that she was still interested. She said Tsela then gave her a number that she was supposed to call to make the necessary arrangements in order for her to be employed, which was 7698 7434.

"She said I should call a certain Mr Dlamini who will help me with the recruitment process," she said.

She then called the number which supposedly belonged to a Mr Dlamini, as she was talking to him she was convinced that he was indeed from the public works because he confirmed that he was indeed looking at her application.

"The man used both my names

as they appeared in all my certificates and identity card. He was reading my curriculum vitae word by word," she said.

Mamba said she was fully convinced that the man was from the ministry of public works because he even quoted all the documents she had submitted.

However, as the conversation continued she was told that her CV lacked experience.

The man told her he was not the only one involved in the recruitment process. He asked her to bring at least E1 500 so he could to persuade the others involved in the recruitment process. This was because the man told her that he could sense that she was in need of a job.

# Scammers have access to applications

Days went by and she was not called for any job at the ministry of public works, where she then called the ministry asking about the recruitment. She was surprised to realise that the ministry had not been recruiting for quite some time.

Mamba said she was told by some of the officers that the cleaners at the ministry had a tendency of going through the thousands of applications at the ministry and calling people to offer them jobs and that is why a lot of people believed them.

She said they always have the correct details because they go through the applications.

Ministry of Public Works communications officer Mayibongwe Dlamini confirmed that the ministry had been receiving countless reports of people being scammed by individuals that promised them employment.

Currently, the ministry is working on busttow saw bing all those involved in the scam. "We are currently working on verifying and validating these reports because they paint a bad picture about the ministry as well as the employ-

Dlamini pleaded with members of the public to report every suspicion by calling the ministry or police, whenever a person wants some money in order for them to be employed.

He added that whenever the company is recruiting, vacancies will be advertised in the national newspapers.

# Eswatini to formulate labour

THE absence of a labour migration policy has left local labour migrants vulnerable.

They are also said to be facing serious and life-threatening challenges and risks.

Thus, the ministry of labour and social security is in the process of formulating a labour migration policy in a bid to assist and protect, both labour migrants coming into the country, as well as Emaswati working in other neighbouring coun-

Since independence, the country has not had a labour migration policy to provide guidance in the management of labour migration.

The vacuum caused by the lack of a labour migration policy led to difficulty in negotiating bilateral agreements with neighbouring coun-

tries in dealing with the labour outflows and inflows.

Subsequently, it compromised the protection of local citizens in the receiving countries and presenting uncertainty to immigrants coming into the country for employment.

Recently, the ministry of labour and social security engaged various stakeholders in a validation workshop for the draft national labour migration policy held at Maguga Lodge.



Among the participants were principal secretaries from the ministry of labour and home affairs, experts from the international organisation for migration, senior government officials, employers and workers representatives as well as association for mine workers.

The engagement of the stakeholders was to ensure all their views were captured to come up with a policy that would be owned, not just by government but the whole country as all relevant stakeholders were duly represent-

Minister of Labour and Social Security Makhosi Vilakati said since the early 1920s, labour migration has played an important part in the history of the Kingdom of Eswatini and the Southern African region as a whole.

He said labour migration in the South African mining sector has benefitted

the country over the past years in terms of providing employment for many Emaswati, which also resulted in increased incomes, mostly for rural households through remittances sent by migrants.

He mentioned official statistics between the years of 1966 and 1991, an average of 8 000 Eswatini migrants per year were working in the South African (SA) mines.

Apart from benefiting through remittances, this impacted positively to the country as it greatly reduced the unemployment rate, hence it was very low during those years.

"This helped in strengthening the country's economy as the remittances from mineworkers circulated within the economy, these remittances are still relevant and beneficial to the country today as they were in the past years," he said.

Vilakati said with changes in the business of the mining sector in SA, the number of migrant mineworkers had drastically decreased from about 8 000 to an average of 4 000 per annum.

He added that there was however a sharp increase of migrants in other sectors including domestic workers, manufacturing, service industry and commercial vehicle drivers, where a majority of these workers are without work permits in the receiving country.

#### Challenges

"This includes over 20 000 Emaswati truck drivers and so many other undocumented domestic workers who are facing challenges and risks with some having lost their lives in clashes with workers in SA," said the minister.

He said government of Eswatini and that of South Africa had agreed to collaboratively work on these challenges and risks. The policy being developed would be key in guiding on how to deal with the complex


issue of labour migration.

The minister said it had been discovered the some of Emaswati working and those who have stopped working in SA enterprises, particularly mining companies due to various reasons had difficulty in accessing their social security benefits.

These included unemployment insurance benefits, pension, severance benefits, and compensation for occupational diseases and disabilities suffered due to accidents.

Vilakati said among other things, the policy would give guidance on how to deal with the issues of protection of rights of workers including portability of social security benefits.

"Once the comments and inputs were incorporated to the draft policy, the document would be tabled before cabinet for approval before its implementation by government," said the minister.

Recently, there has been an incline in the number of migrants in other sectors, including domestic workers and manufacturing industry labourers which are predominantly female.

Women and Law Southern Africa (WLSA) Eswatini National Director Xolani Hlatjwako said any law or policy seeking to protect any person's rights was welcome.

"For some time now, we have heard of reports of the exploitation of Emaswati workers due to the lack of protective mechanism, as an organisation we look forward to our sisters and brothers being equitably remunerated for their work, and receiving the benefits which are due to them," she said. She added that they hoped that this policy would foster an environment within which Eswatini would be able to enter into the bilateral agreements spoken of, and be in a position to negotiate for better terms and conditions for Emaswati workers.







# GUNDVWINI RESIDENTS DECRY WATERSCARCITY

**RESIDENTS of Gundvwini under** Manzini Region have been without clean water for three weeks now.

Some of the community members are now complaining of stomach ache as they use water from local rivers.

According to Masoyini Community Caregiver Julia Myeni, the residents said the people of the area are now forced to share water with animals after tap water supply to the area was cut by a local water scheme.

"Three weeks ago, we were called to a meeting by the local water scheme, Bugeleni and Njelu Water Scheme, and were we told that water supply would be stopped for at least a week, as a new generator was being installed. We were also advised to collect enough water for the days that the tap would be nonfunctional. However, it's been

three weeks now but we have no water,"

It is said the water scheme was established in 2007, and its engine pump is old thus consumes more electricity that it was actually meant to.

Myeni said she had been receiving reports from members of the community that they were suffering from stomach aches because they had to use unclean water from the river.

"Water is an important resource, as the community's caregivers, we use it when giving medication to patients. Water makes sure that a nation stays cleans.

Reports

"There have been reports that members of the community are now becoming sick as they have been consuming unsterilised water from the local rivers. I understand that a child from this area fell ill after drinking water from the

"There have been many reports in

the community from members complaining about stomach aches and diarrhoea after consuming water from local rivers," said Myeni

Meanwhile, a member of the Njelu Water Scheme Gabisile Mkhatshwa said residents of Masoyini were informed prior that the water supply would be stopped.

Supply

"The water supply was cut as a new water generator was being installed. The old water pump was consuming more electricity than it should as it was old," said Mkhatshwa

On that note, ministry of health's Nomfundo Dlamini said the department has not yet received reports from members of Masoyini community yet.

She said no one has been admitted to hospital in relation to the matter.

She then advised members of Masoyini to contact her office.

"The department is yet to investigate the matter," said Dlamini.

AIDS CANGO concerned with ARVs shortage

THE Coordinating Assembly for Non-Governmental Organisations (CANGO) has raised concerns over the lack of a budget towards debt repayment, especially on issues concerning stock out, including anti-retroviral drugs (ARVs).

CANGO Communications Officer Nkosingiphile Myeni said they would work hand-in-hand with the Eswatini HIV and AIDS Consortium (ESHA-CO) concerning the main issue of lack of drugs in the country.

Myeni said they were concerned with the lack of drugs in government's health facilities. He said CANGO would do its best to support ESHACO.

ESHACO Chairperson Hlobisile Nxumalo said under the prevailing situation, it could be concluded that the ministry of health might be facing a politically-motivated headache when government released meagre funds towards health development.

Concerned

"We are concerned that the issue of budget allocation has not been adequately handled by government, and we wonder why government is not priotorising health," she said.

Nxumalo said they were following developments about reports that government released only E68 millions of the initially allocated E270 million, adding that such was another cause for concern.

She said ESHACO members were aware that the country was facing serious financial problems.

However, health was initially one of the top priorities for the country through the budget allocations.

"If reports are anything to go by, about E100 million would have gone to pay overdue monies owed to suppliers," she said.

She urged for a political solution to the problem through releasing more money towards the budget initially allocated to ensure health development was a priority in the country.

She said over the years, the coun-

try has not complied to the Abuja Declaration and there has been no obvious trend.

Meanwhile, appearing in Senate on Monday, Minister of Health Lizzy Nkosi admitted that the country was indeed hit by a shortage of medicines and medicinal commodities.

The Central Medical Stores is reportedly with a stock to last for four months than ideally a seven-month stock.

Nkosi stated that the country was introducing a new regiment of ARVs and reduced the three-month's dosage to a month for patients across health facilities in the country.

Nxumalo said two things appeared to be irregular in allaying fears to the public.

Drugs

She said while the country pronounced that it would strengthen HIV response through the introduction of better quality drugs, not coming out about it in the first place was partly the cause of the pandemonium. She said it would have been easy if the ministry was proactive in this and alert patients of the benefits of the new drug specimen.

"We encourage government to put in place an engagement and communication mechanism for people to be aware of the current change in drugs, explaining how they are better than the ones they are used to," she added.

Nxumalo said it might seem the three months dosage is good a strategy to minimise queues and travelling costs, especially of the most vul-

She noted that the country has come a long way in the fight against HIV/AIDS, with much progress made over the years.

Nxumalo said they appreciated investments made by development partners and the country's commitment towards the fight against HIV/AIDS.

"However, this progress and the country's aspiration to eradicating HIV and AIDS would be all for nothing if they fail to address these issues with the speed it deserves.'



# ZWELITHINI'S ANNUAL IMBIZO TO INCLUDE WOMEN

KWAZULU-NATAL - Zulu King Goodwill Zwelithini has convened an annual *imbizo* for the Zulu nation in Ulundi today where he will address his subjects, which will include women for the first time.

The *imbizo* was announced by IFP leader Mangosuthu Buthelezi, who is also the prime minister of the Zulu nation, on behalf of the king, through an advert in various Zulu newspapers last month.

Buthelezi said previously the *imbizo* was attended by men only but now it was important to emphasise that the monarch was inviting his entire nation, men and women.

#### Imbizo

The *imbizo* was preceded by a church service for all congregations, which was held at the old KwaZulu-Natal government legislature building in Ulundi last Sunday.

The church service was followed by discussions about the importance of education in the development of the nation, the importance of the Zulu language and a nation built on culture, and discussions about singing and traditional dancing in building the nation.

While Buthelezi did not say what the focus of this year's *imbizo* would be, King Zwelithini used last year's gathering to wage a war against threats to dissolve the Ingonyama Trust Board and cede thousands of hectares of tribal land to the state.

The king's response emanated from recommen-

dations made by the high-level panel headed by former president Kgalema Mothlanthe that the Ingonyama Trust Act be repealed or amended. The Ingonyama Trust administers 2.8-million hectares of land in the province on behalf of King Zwelithini, who is its sole trustee.

The panel's recommendations incurred the ire of the Zulu monarch, the architect of the Ingonyama

Trust Act, Buthelezi, and traditional leaders, who warned of a clash of nations should the government make good on moves to dissolve the trust.

"What I want you to know about our history is that the issue we are faced with now is very similar to the one our forefathers were faced with. This will be the second clash," the king told thousands of his subjects in Ulundi last year. *Times Live* 

#### Prepare yourselves for presidency of Mabuza - Malema

JOHANNESBURG - The EFF has urged South Africans to prepare themselves for a new president after Public Protector Busi Mkhwebane announces her findings into allegations of money laundering against President Cyril Ramaphosa.

EFF leader Julius Malema made the remarks on Tuesday while briefing the media about the preparation for his party's national elective conference in Nasrec in December.

Malema was adamant that Mkhwebane's final report would severely affect Ramaphosa's job as president, saying people should prepare themselves for the presidency of David Mabuza, the deputy president.

The investigations against Ramaphosa followed a complaint laid by DA leader Mmusi Maimane last year after reports the president received a donation of R500 000 from Bosasa for his ANC presidential campaign in December 2017. "The president is in trouble," said Malema.

Malema's comments came as a COSATUaffiliated union - the National Union of Mineworkers (NUM) - broke ranks with its mother body which had asked Ramaphosa in May to ignore Mkhwebane's remedial action until the courts had pronounced on them. *Diamond Fields Advertiser* 

#### ANC mum on Mayor Zandile Gumede's suspension

DURBAN - With just eight days left before the expiration of eThekwini Mayor Zandile Gumede's 30-day suspension, her future was still a mystery on Tuesday, with the ANC still keeping its cards close to its chest and Gumede keeping a low profile.

ANC spokesperson Nomagugu Simelane-Zulu said the party had been engaging in processes to decide on the Gumede issue.

The party forced the mayor to take a month's leave after being arrested and appearing in court on fraud and corruption charges relating to a R208million waste-collection ten-

Simelane-Zulu said the processes engagaged in included the provincial executive committee (PEC) briefing the provincial working committee, and making recommendations before a final decision on Gumede's future is taken.

The municipality is in turmoil after last Thursday's full council meeting, at which it is thought an attempt was made on acting mayor Fawzia Peer's life after she drank bottled water suspected to have been laced with paraffin. Peer said she was still waiting for the laboratory results on Tuesday afternoon.

"I have not received the results. The information I received is that the lab is still working on testing the water. "I did not expect the results would take so long. The bottle was sent to the lab last Thursday, so I expected to have the results by now," she said, adding that she was also waiting for video footage from the council chamber to be made available to her. *Daily News* 

#### 'EFF entourage sipped French champagne'

JOHANNESBURG - Did an EFF entourage quaff bottles of French champagne, while racking up a bill of R60 000 at a luxury villa in Camps Bay when they travelled to Cape Town for the State of the Nation Address (SONA)?

The contents of at least 14 bags of rubbish, a business class SAA ticket stub and a reservation made by Larry Mavunda, bodyguard of party leader Julius Malema, suggest they did, the Daily Maverick reported on Wednesday. # 45 KILLED IN NIGERIAFUEL TANKERBLAST

ABUJA - The truck overturned near shops while travelling through the village of Ahumbe in Benue state on Monday.

At least 45 people were killed and more than 100 injured in central Nigeria when a petrol tanker crashed and then exploded as people gathered fuel, emergency services said on Tuesday.

The truck overturned near shops while travelling through the village of Ahumbe in Benue state on Monday.

Local residents rushed to the scene and collected leaking gasoline for over an hour before the fuel caught fire, causing a blast that tore through the surrounding area.

"We have recovered 45 corpses of the dead while 101 others sustained serious fire burns," Benue state Federal Road Safety Commission Sector Commander Aliyu Baba told AFP.

"From the look of things and considering their condition, many of them might not survive."

Baba said a pregnant woman and at least two children were among the dead and two firefighters sustained serious burns.

He said the blaze was sparked when a bus laden with passengers drove past the scene and its exhaust pipe scraped along the ground, causing sparks to

fly. "Sixteen of the passengers in the vehicle, including the two children and the pregnant woman, were instantly burnt to death," Baba said.

Police and emergency services crews were working to clear the tanker's charred hulk from the road, an AFP reporter at the scene witnessed.

At least one building was gutted in the explosion. Locals spoke of their shock. "I lost a brother and two others are seriously burnt and in the hospital. They were trapped in the fire when the truck exploded for a second time," resident Ade Derfer told AFP. At the Bishop Murray hospital in the state capital Makurdi, patients with serious burns were recovering.

Survivor Ochuole Imaje said she had been on the ill-fated bus.

"We warned our driver to park but he went ahead and in a bid to pass the spilling fuel an explosion occurred and we were trapped in the fire and fought for our lives," she told AFP.

"I managed to escape but many others died. I cannot tell how I got here to the hospital."AFP

## ESKOM CONFIRMS ZIM PAID BACK SOME OF THE MONEY

JOHANNESBURG - Eskom has confirmed that payment from Zimbabwe regarding outstanding debt is reflecting in the power utility's account.

Earlier on Tuesday, Fin24 reported that Zimbabwe Energy minister Fortune Chasi posted proof of the country's US\$10m (about R139m) payment to Eskom on Twitter. The country has been suffering power outages due to outstanding debt.

Eskom is owed a total of US\$33m from Zimbabwe. On Tuesday afternoon, it said in a statement that it had received a payment from Zimbabwean authorities, but did

not name the amount. "Discussions will continue with the Zimbabwe Electricity Supply Authority (ZESA) to find a mutually beneficial solution to the outstanding debt. Eskom is a commercial operation and will be guided by the contracts we have in place with ZESA," Eskom's statement read. In his Twitter post, Chasi also said that further discussions with Eskom would be needed, as the repayment of debt did not guarantee power supply. "Whilst we have paid US\$10m, this is no guarantee for power. We need to negotiate," he Tweeted.

#### Trump's \$2.5m Fourth of July spectacle

WASHINGTON - The National Park Service is diverting nearly \$2.5 million in entrance and recreation fees primarily intended to improve parks across the country to cover costs associated with President Donald Trump's Independence Day celebration today the National Mall, according to two individuals familiar with the arrangement.

Trump administration officials have consistently refused to say how much taxpayers will have to pay for the expanded celebration on the National Mall this year, which the president has dubbed "Salute to America." The two individuals, who spoke on the condition of anonymity due to the sensitivity of the matter, confirmed the transfer of the Park Service funds Tuesday. The diversion of

the park fees represents just a frac-

tion of the extra costs the government faces as a result the event, which also includes expansive displays of military hardware, flyovers by an array of jets including Air Force One, the deployment of tanks on the Mall and an extended

pyrotechnics display. By comparison, according to former Park Service deputy director Denis Galvin, the entire Fourth of July celebration on the National Mall typically costs the

agency about \$2 million. The White House is also distributing VIP tickets for Trump's planned speech at the Lincoln Memorial to Republican donors and political appointees, prompting objections from Democratic lawmakers who argue the president has turned the annual celebration into a campaignlike event.

#### US aid of \$600 000 to help Zimbabwe farmers rebuild lives

JOHANNESBURG - Zimbabwe's smallholder farmers in Chimanimani District are to be provided with an additional \$600 000 to help them recover and rebuild their lives following March's deadly Cyclone Idai which wrought massive destruction across Malawi,

Mozambique and Zimbabwe,

leaving over 1 200 people dead

and many more missing.

The United States Agency for International Development (USAID) will provide funds to its local partner, LEAD Trust, to spearhead these recovery efforts over the next 12 months, a Monday press release stat-

The programme will help smallholder farmers grow high value crops, cereals, and pulses, and

improve nutrition and hygiene. As part of these efforts, USAID will provide smallholder farmers with 138 000 kg of locally procured seed and 305 000 kg of fertiliser.

This additional contribution complements previous Cyclone Idai relief efforts through USAID's Office of Food for Peace and Office of Foreign Disaster Assistance, and brings the total US government commitment to \$3.2 million.

Ebola case confirmed near South Sudan border

JUBA - The first cross-border cases were reported in Uganda last month when two members of a family from the DRC travelled to the country.

South Sudan is facing another potential threat with the first confirmed case of Ebola near its border with the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) reported. This is specifically significant as the country's healthcare system has been weakened by years of civil war, making it vulnerable to the potential spread of the deadly

A media outlet, RBC, cited an unnamed military source as saying the submarine was nuclear-powered, but Russian officials made no comment on the type of vessel involved. The incident was the deadliest involving a Russian naval submarine since August 2000, when the nuclear-powered Kursk sank to the floor of Barents Sea after two explosions in its bow .Reuters

#### Man pours water on chief executive

Shanghai/Beijing - A man poured a bottle of water over Baidu Inc Chief Executive Robin Li on Wednesday at the opening of an annual conference for the Chinese search giant. Li was speaking of applications for artificial intelligence (AI) in a speech when the young man approached him, spilled the liquid over Li's head, and walked away. "What's your problem?" Li shouted in English."There are many difficulties on the road to achieve AI, but it will not impact Baidu's determination," Li calmly said to the applause of the audience. Lukhele said the company was working on 100 per cent coverage for Eswatini, despite the numerous challenges the company faced. He also urged subscribers based in remote areas not to worry about the network coverage, as the company had tightened screws in most rural areas, which previously did not have coverage. He further mentioned that some rural areas have better network coverage compared to urban areas, especially those close to the Central Business District in Mbabane.

The marketing officer mentioned that a number of people who use their network are situated close to the CBD, which contributes to it being slow at times.

"When it comes to our network, you find that some areas further away from the towns have more coverage compared to those in towns. This is because in urban areas, it is used the most, therefore, it gets to be slow at times, which has also contributed to some nual areas having an excellent network," he said.

# Eswatini ranked 7th in sub-Saharan region's paying tax index

**ESWATINI** is currently ranked 63rd in the World Paying Tax Index and 7th in sub-Saharan Region.

This was revealed by Minister of Finance Neal Rijkenberg during the launch of the Eswatini Revenue Authority (SRA) Filing Season 2019 held at the SRA Auditorium at Ezulwini on Monday.

The minister said two of the key indicators in which the SRA contributed were the: Trading Across Borders and the Paying Taxes Indices:

He commended the SRA and all stakeholders who work at the country's ports-of-entry for the great work they have done over the years to keep the country at the ranking of 32nd in the world and 1st in Sub-Saharan

"As a government, we are already

on a drive to gradually reduce

Corporate Tax from 27.5 per cent to 12.5 per cent by 2023 and we are positive that that this will eventually improve our ranking on this index and render us more attractive for foreign investment," he said. He said there was also a need to simplify things further for our Small and Medium Enterprises to assist them with the cost of compliance. "We are looking at doing this mainly through the introduction of the small taxpayer regime, commonly referred to as presumptive tax. Once this is implemented, we anticipate that it will be much easier for the small and medium businesses to comply with our tax laws, thus improving our compliance rates," he said. Rijkenberg said the 1st of July marked a very important period in the calendar of our country, beginning of the new tax year.

"This is a period where all those who

are called upon to submit their returns MUST start preparing for their submission. As the Commissioner General has mentioned, various classes of taxpayers will be expected to submit their income tax returns and what is of utmost importance is that this be done on TIME and in full compliance with legislation. Income tax returns are by no means any form of tool to frustrate anyone. These are merely a means through which every proud LiSwati and resident proudly declares that they have indeed played their part in the financing of the building of our nation," he said. The minister stated that the SRA had done a great job of improving and simplifying the process of submitting returns in a bid to ensure that no one is left out, therefore falling foul of their legal obligation.

"I therefore urge us all to take this process very seriously by submitting our returns. They have assured me that they take the simplification of their processes and form very seriously and are open to suggestions from their key stakeholders on how to achieve this objective effectively," he said.

The minister also highlighted that the ministry was currently involved in legislative processes to bring about some strategic policy changes, which once approved by Parliament, will have a positive impact on revenue administration in the country.

These include the Revenue Appeals Tribunal Bill, Alcohol and Tobacco Levy Bill and the Eswatini Revenue Authority (Amended) Bill - which aims at providing clarity and support to enable the SRA to take-over the overall Government revenue collection responsibility; obtaining third party information as well as dealing with integrity issues amongst others.

The minister then passed gratitude to all those who continue to diligently make their contribution towards the fiscus by paying their taxes on time and correctly.

"It is through your continued cooperation that our country will realize its short, medium and long term goals "Thank you all for Paying Your Taxes correctly and on time!!!". To those who are willing but struggling, may ! encourage you to take advantage of the SRA's services, including the Voluntary Disclosure Programme and ensure that you "get back on track".

"The last group I want to address are those that refuse to comply. I want to remind you that this is a violation of the country's laws and a criminal act, which deprives our great country of much needed resources for our social and economic development. The SRA has the full support of my office and Cabinet to use all means provided for in law to curb this criminal activity." he said.

# ARTISTS SPEAK OUT ON BEING BOOKED LOCALLY

BY NOKWANDA SIBANDZE

PEOPLE in the entertainment industry are always praising how much it has grown but no one wants to address the issue of local artists owing each other.

When will it end? The questions how does it work; how do local artists get paid when booked locally; do they have verbal agreements or do they draw up written contracts?

The Entertainment Desk found that most artists use contracts unless they choose to perform for free but at times, the agreement is a verbal one.

Speaking to one artist who is booked almost every weekend DJ Supa CDQ, he said only festivals in the country have established contracts, which they present to them before bookings but clubs and other venues do not use contracts.

"I personally prefer and like contract agreements because during the booking process, it entirely ensures that all your needs as an act are met on time in the right way and by your rules," he said.

Singer Zoe Genesis said contracts were safer to use.

"If we have reached an agreement not to charge then it is usually verbal, but if I will be getting paid then there should be a contract. With contracts any misunderstandings can be solved easily," she said.

DJ Zulu D said it solely depends on the gig and the amount of money that would be paid.

"If it is a big event, then a contract should be drawn and signed but for small events I feel it is unnecessary to have to draw up contracts. Also if the money we agreed on is a lot then a contract should be in place, I mean we cannot have a contract for less than E2 000 that is just too much admin," said the DJ.

Case in point, recently this publication's Entertainment Desk has received two complaints about a stable that has not paid them their dues.

One said he produced a song for the stable but was not paid even though he had proof that the stable was getting money for the song.

Fezile Simelane said he produced the song in 2017 yet has still not been paid. He admitted that the agreement between him and the stable was verbal but he had paper work for the rights to the song.

This challenge also affects managers.

Speaking to one Harristheniner Manager Bonga Shongwe, he believes the main challenge is that promoters know most of the artists so they tend to bypass managers and approach artists directly without discussing terms or charges for an appearance with them.

"Most artists are always more excited to be part of the show than to think about the logistics of contracts and payments. They only start thinking of that with about a week to go and by then it's too late because they have put in the work to advertise the show not only for their slot time but for the whole show really," he said.

He said control was needed because people were getting exploited.

"I am asking myself how many more have been going through this and for how long," he

"Anytime there is an agreement between a



promoter and performer, that agreement actually constitutes a contract.

The importance of the paper is prove of what was agreed on. A written contract is the preferred way to outline everyone's expectations. Even if it's just an email exchange outlining details of the offer and negotiations leading up to acceptance," said Dlamini.

He said having a contract is generally a more thorough way to assure that artists get what they expected.

"A signed contract also exists to protect you in case the promoter is not living up to their end of the deal and to help everyone understand what the deal is/was to begin with.

"This is why you need to actually read the contract," he said.

He also said contracts can be complicated but they do not have to go at it alone, Dlamini said there were lawyers managers and agents who make it their business to read, understand and advice their clients.

## Madagascar president charters plane for Africa Cup fans

MADAGASCAR - 'Barea', who take their nickname from a breed of local cattle, play DR Congo on Sunday for a place in the semifinal.

Madagascan President Andry Rajoelina has chartered a special plane to take football fans to Egypt for the Africa Cup of Nations after the country unexpectedly qualified for the round of 16.

Excitement has been building in the Indian Ocean island nation as the team emerged top of group B after beating three-time tournament winners Nigeria 2-0.

"Barea", who take their nickname from a breed of local cattle, now play DR Congo on Sunday for a place in the semi-final.

"After hearing the demands of supporters, President Andry Rajoelina and the Madagascan state have decided to mobilise an Airbus 380, with 480 seats, to transport supporters," Rinah Rakotomanga, communications chief for the presidency, told AFP.

The flight will leave Antananarivo on Saturday and return immediately after the game.

But the adventure will not be for free — tickets cost about \$600 (530 euros) including the flight, a seat at the match and meals. Rajoelina had announced that he would attend the match, sparking a campaign to enable other fans to travel.

#### CAIRO - Bafana Bafana coach Stuart Baxter believes their Africa Cup of Nations (AFCON) last 16 encounter against host nation Egypt won't 'over-

whelm' his players. After winning only one of their three Group D matches, South Africa finished third behind Morocco and the Ivory Coast. Namibia ended their tournament in last place.

However, after Tuesday's final round of group fixtures, South Africa qualified for the next round via the 'best of the third-placed teams' route alongside Guinea, DR Congo and Benin. Baxter and his charges will now face Egypt on Saturday, (kick-off at 21:00 SA time) at the Cairo International Stadium.

"It's a great challenge. It's the one the whole squad is looking forward to," said Baxter on the upcoming clash as quoted by the official SAFA website.

"I think the group (stages), for most parts have been tight, our group was really tight.

"(Every game) was seconds a way of being a different result. The people will think 'well you know, you've got through

## Africa Cup of Nations group stage tops and flops

ALEXANDRIA - Hosts Egypt swept into the last 16 of an expanded Africa Cup of Nations and were joined by the rest of the continent's elite, while newcomers Madagascar delivered the shock of the tournament by advancing as group winners.

AFP Sport takes a look at the standout performers and those who failed to hit the heights during the group phase:

Trezeguet and Ahmed Elmohamady

(Egypt)

Mohamed Salah arrived at the tournament shouldering the weight of expectations for a country of almost 100 million, but while influential in his side's safe passage to the knockout phase he was ably supported by Mahmoud 'Trezeguet' Hassan and captain Ahmed Elmohamady. Kasimpasa midfielder Trezeguet bagged the winner in the opening 1-0 defeat of Zimbabwe and shone again as the hosts rode their luck in a 2-0 win over DR Congo, setting up Salah to open his account with a gliding run and incisive pass. Elmohamady, who helped Aston Villa earn promotion back to the Premier League, popped up with a pair of goals of his own - the first an alert finish against DR

to seal a 2-0 victory against Uganda. Madagascar

Ranked so low that they had to beat Sao Tome e Principe just to reach

Congo and the second a sweet strike

the qualifying competition for this tournament, Madagascar assured themselves of a spot in the knockout rounds

in emphatic style with a shock 2-0 win over three-time champions Nigeria. Midfielder Ibrahim Amada insisted "there is no secret" to their success and said the team was simply "trying to make the most of each second" in Egypt. After a commendable 2-2 draw with Guinea, Nicolas Dupuis' side earned their first win by edging fellow debutants Burundi by a single goal. That set the stage for a remarkable upset of the Super Eagles, with Charles Andriamatsinoro netting his second goal in three games after Lalaina Nomenjanahary opened the scoring in front of Malagasy CAF President Ahmad Ahmad.

North African sides

Egypt, Algeria and Morocco marched into the next round with a perfect three wins from three, the

African conditions clearly suiting a trio of teams capable of going far. Riyad Mahrez's Algeria got the better of Sadio Mane and title favourites Senegal, while Herve Renard, who is looking to lift the trophy with a third different country, guided Morocco to a series of 1-0 wins -- most notably silencing an Ivory Coast attack led by prized asset Nicolas Pepe. However, Elmohamady warned Egypt not to get carried away. "Nine points out of three games is something Egypt is used to - the difficult part is what comes next."

Knowledge Musona (Zimbabwe)

Zimbabwe crashed out in disheartening fashion after a 4-0 rout by the Democratic Republic of Congo, but it was the preceding 1-1 draw with Uganda that will leave the Warriors feeling the most regret. Zimbabwe fell behind to an early Uganda goal before rallying strongly, but a number of glaring misses -- the team's leading scorer in qualifying Musona the chief culprit -- saw them fail to collect maximum points which could well have prolonged their adventure.

Amr Warda (Egypt)

Egypt brushed their group opponents aside but the host nation's title push has been overshadowed by sexual harassment allegations surrounding midfielder Amr Warda. The Greece-based player was initially booted from the squad after multiple women posted screenshots and testimonies of Warda's alleged lewd comments, as well as explic-

perceptions - one refereeing decision or one missed shot or one mistake can change perception."

Baxter added: "We've got this opportunity now to play against the host nation in front of a load of people in a very, very hostile environment and that's the time you want people to stand up and I think the group are looking forward to it."

The Bafana players performed poorly in the three group matches, scoring one goal and failing to register a single shot on target against either Morocco and the Ivory Coast.

However, Baxter is confident that for Saturday's clash he won't need to motivate the players as they will be up for the challenge.

"The word 'need' is not in our language, it's not 'must', it's 'want' - it's they want to go and they have strong reasons that they want to do it - that's going to be the motivation... that they want very badly to get past this hurdle," he said when asked about the mood in the camp after it was confirmed that South Africa will play Egypt.

"I don't think I have to change anything, I think we have to strengthen some

things - our attacking play has not been at its best, our defensive play has been for the most part, very good - but we've got to add on to that a functioning attacking game.

"And against Egypt, I'm guessing they're going to come at us, I'm guessing there's going to be more space on offer (to attack) - so we believe that if we can up our attacking game by 15 per cent then we'll be able to give them problems.

"Now against the home nation, that may all fall to the ground they'll overwhelm us, but I don't think that is going to happen."

The Scotsman said the Bafana players want to have 'revenge on themselves' for not performing at the required standard that is expected of them.

"We sat together watching the Mali game on the big screen... once it was over we knew that we'll get Egypt, everybody was buzzing, they're looking forward to it." Baxter continued.

"I don't think mentally we have to lift them. Mentally, they know each game was very close in both the games that we loss

"That happened all during the game. At the first glance of contact, they ruled in their (Brazil's) favour and this kind of distracted us from the game."

Messi added: "The truth is we're angry because we played very well, we put in a huge effort and for it to end like this makes us sad ... I spoke to the referee and he said he would ... After Brazil kill dreams of Argentina glory again



respect us that he would look after us but at no moment did I see that.'

In the extraordinary rant, Messi also called on the footballing authorities to look into the refereeing of the tournament.

#### Refused

But the 32-year-old claimed Brazil hold too much sway within the South American Football Confederation CONMEBOL for anything to be done. "Throughout the tournament they called handballs, stupid penalties, and fouls. But somehow today, they refused to use VAR.

"There is no excuses for us, but we need to review this, analyse it and let's hope CON-MEBOL does something about it - but surely not, because Brazil commands too much power in the organisation.

"I think we played a great game. We made a great effort and they were not superior to

Messi's sentiments were echoed by Aguero, who claimed he would prefer not to have VAR if this is how it is going to be used.

"They told us that VAR would be like a fifth referee but when things turn out like this I'd rather it wasn't there," he said.








