'ICE CAN'T TIGHTEN A FEMALE'S PRIVATE PARTS'

DEPUTY Director of Health Services Clinical Dr Velephi Okello has said that ice cubes can never be used to tighten a woman's private parts. Dr. Okello's statements come after commercial sex workers stated to medical practitioners that they used ice cubes before sex to create a tighter feeling for males.

The sex workers who were speaking at a closed meeting over the weekend in Pigg's Peak said they would wrap the ice cubes with a clothe that would be placed on the private parts a few hours before

The sex workers went on to say that the ice cubes were also perfect in creating a feeling of numbness during sexual intercourse that would become painful if repeated multiple times. For ethical reasons, the names of the sex workers as well as the name of the organisation that hosted the meeting has been withheld.

Speaking to this publication after the meeting, Dr. Okello said the ministry of health knew about the ice cube practice, noting it was clearly a miss informed practice. "I have heard about the myth that some women use ice cubes to tighten the feeling of sexual intercourse, however, the practice is false and is not scientifically proven. Such myths should be dispelled to create public awareness," she said. Other medical practitioners also said that the ice cube practice was a myth that had no substance.

COPS TO 'PUT DOWN' CRIMINALS

POLICE are considering taking a new approach in combating crime in the country.

And if advice given to Acting National Commissioner of Police William Dlamini is anything to go by police will be 'putting criminals down'.

The acting NatCom, when addressing throngs of police officers and Prime Minister Ambrose Mandvulo Dlamini at Matsapha Police Academy yesterday, said there had been an increase in the number of armed

robberies in Manzini.

He said people had become so ruthless having the guts to enter private properties with the intention of committing crime.

Ruthless

Dlamini said he has had talks with some of his counterparts where they had time to share ideas on how they combat crime in their countries. He said they told him that they had adopted a ruthless approach when dealing with criminals "he said they put them down", NatCom stated, which can roughly be translated to mean that they shoot to kill.

"It is time we change our policing strategy," he said, much to the applause of police officers.

Even though Dlamini did not specifically say which police service shared the "we put them down" idea with him, it has been reported that the acting NatCom was fresh from a visit in South Africa where he visited Birchwood SAPS in Johannesburg after an invite sent by General Khehla Sithole. Worth noting is that South African Police Services are currently under the National Police Commissioner Bheki Cele, who is well known for his infamous 'shoot-to-kill' statement. Police officers in South Africa are known for their ruthless approach when dealing with criminals, especially armed robbers.

PASSING OF BUDGET IN LIMBO

IT looks like the budget speech, as it is right now, will not pass any time soon.

The budget speech was delivered in Parliament by Minister of Finance Neal Rijkenberg last week Wednesday in the House of Assembly. The budget was debated yesterday by Members of Parliament (MPs), but the debate could not be exhausted as the legislators felt it

was already late. It was 7pm at that time, with the debate having started at 2:30 pm. The legislators are expected to continue with the debate today afternoon in the House of Assembly.

The MPs yesterday were of different views regarding the budget. Some were of the view that it should be taken back to the ministry of finance so that certain components could be fixed. Other MPs, on the other hand, were of the view that the ministers and MPs should go into a caucus and discuss the budget privately, with the view of making the right corrections so that the two sets of legislators

(MPs and ministers) could move forward together. No one was for the idea that the budget should pass as it is right now.

There were many components of the budget that did not rub the MPs the right way and that made them feel they should not allow the budget to pass as it was. The hike in fuel and electricity VAT was one of the things that made the MPs to

state from the onset that they could not allow the budget to pass. The lawmakers felt the addition of VAT on electricity was not fair as the same thing was done last

Imposing

To some MPs, it looked like the Cabinet or government officials had not done a proper homework before imposing the VAT on electricity. They wanted the budget to provide solutions on how the country was to generate its own electricity. On the issue of fuel hike, some MPs felt the government was too much on that one. They felt the people were being taxed to the bone and they could not allow this to happen. The legislators felt it would be better for the hike to be channelled towards the roads agency so that the roads in the country could be

improved as the situation was so horrible. Driving on some of the country's roads was becoming almost impossible.

The MPs said government should not increase the utilities because Prime Minister Ambrose Dlamini stopped such hikes in November last year. They also felt the hike will not be fair on workers, whose cost of living adjustment (CoLA) was not catered for in the budget. The hikes would trigger price hikes in other sectors, such as public transport.

Other MPs also raised concern on the fact that the budget touched on corruption, but did not state how the corruption would be addressed. Some even stated that the Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) had become a haven for corruption such that there was a scuffle at Cabinet as two members fought over the ownership of the commission. The MPs also questioned the transparency of the budget because it did not seem to represent the interests of the people. They felt the budget was formulated by people who had their own interests and used Parliament to rubber-stamp and passed the budget. Some MPs felt they should know and own the strategy of the budget so that they could support the budget. However, the MPs felt they were exhausted yesterday at 7pm and decided to adjourn and resume the debate today. Minister Rijkenberg will be responding to the MPs' concerns today.

EEC workers storm Parly

ESWATINI Electricity Company (EEC) workers yesterday stormed Parliament, soliciting intervention of the Members of Parliament (MPs).

The workers' intention was for the MPs to address the matter in the House, asking for clarification from government on what was really happening concerning them. The workers went to Parliament because they no longer trusted their management on the matters that made them strike.

The workers were seen standing outside Parliament yesterday afternoon, showing that their hopes were now on MPs to get clarity on what was really happening at EEC. Lobamba Lomdzala Marwick Khumalo stood on a point of privilege (Standing Order No. 58), acknowledging that they were supposed to debate the budget, but it was equally important for MPs to talk about the EEC matter first. "We are representing the people and they are complaining that they are no longer getting the right service. They are no longer getting the electricity as it is switched off. I urge the speaker to allow us to talk about the matter and get govemment to say something because it affects all of us," Khumalo said. Khumalo's motion was seconded by Kwaluseni MP Sibusiso 'Mabhanisi' Dlamini.

House of Assembly Speaker Petros Mavimbela gave an opportunity to Minister of Natural Resources and Energy Peter Bhembe to explain what was happening. Bhembe said government was fully aware of what was happening between EEC workers and management.

He said the bone of contention between workers and management was the alignment of salaries for workers at EEC. The problem was that some workers found themselves earning more than their colleagues yet they were in the same grade. The workers thought some workers were given preferential treatment yet that was not the case.

Bhembe told MPs that the workers approached government after they lost trust with management. At the end of everything, government sorted the issue and corrected the anomalies identified by the workers. It was for that reason that the executive of Swaziland Electricity Supply Maintenance and Allied Workers Union (SESMAWU) urged workers to go back to work. SESMAWU is a union of EEC workers.

However, what was surprising, according to Bhembe, was that workers decided to go to Parliament yesterday and he wondered what the workers were going there because the matter was sorted. Bhembe stated that even during that time, SESMAWU continued to tell workers to go back to work because government had done the alignment. Bhembe said other workers headed the call and went back to work while others stayed in Parliament.

This made Bhembe to think that there were deep seated problems than the alignment of salaries. The problem was that the workers were not talking about it. Bhembe said government could then be forced to find ways of dealing with those individuals who were apparently breaking the law.

SIBUSISO SHONGWE IN E200 000 BRIBE

FORMER minister of justice and constitutional affairs Sibusiso Shongwe is alleged to have offered former High Court judge Justice Mpendulo Simeon Simelane E200 000 to preside over the **Eswatini Revenue Authority** (SRA) and Impunzi Wholesalers'

This is the case in which Shongwe was charged for 'Contravening the Prevention of Corruption Act in that upon December 2014' at or near Mbabane he did wrongfully, unlawfully and with intent directly or indirectly, being a politician accepted or agreed to accept an advantage from another person unknown to the prosecution money amounting to E2 million from Impunzi Wholesalers.

Shongwe faces a total of 22 counts related to the contravening of the Prevention of Corruption Act of 2006.

With the indictment having been filed by the Director of Public Prosecutions (DPP) at the High Court, this means Shongwe's trial is nigh.

ARRESTED FOR SPIKING BUGANU

IN a rather shocking discovery, an elderly man of Mbelebeleni had been arrested for allegedly poisoning his son over the past

The senior citizen, identified as Shongwe (92), is said to have poured a poisonous substance into a container full of marula and gave his son Jovi Shongwe (49) to drink last Saturday. Mbelebeleni area falls under the Manzini Region.

Impeccable sources within the community revealed that Jovi and his father had a long standing misunderstanding that prompted the duo not seeing eye to eye. The bone of contention between the two could not be ascertained.

"On Saturday, Shongwe went to a nearby drinking spot and purchased marula using a small container. Along the way home, he allegedly poured a substance, which is suspected to be

While doing this, he was seen by some of the people who were passing by and alerted his son that he must not take even a sip of the marula brought by his father," said the source.

The source mentioned that Jovi did not heed the warning from the concerned people of the community and imbibed the marula given by his father. "Wavele watsi cabu cabu," said the

The source mentioned that some few minutes later, Jovi complained of stomach pains and was rushed to the nearby community health centre at Dvokolwako where he is recuperating. Deputy Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Assistant Superintendent Nosipho Mnguni confirmed the incident. "An old man aged 92 years has been arrested for poisoning his son. He will soon appear before a magistrate," she said.

FURTHERMORE, on the sixth count Sibusiso Shongwe is facing a charge of perjury in that upon the month of July 2013 at or near Mbabane while acting in his personal capacity, he did unlawfully and with intent, depose to an affidavit in a court case involving Rudolf Diamond and Tsakane Rudolf Shilubane and three others where he made aver-

The averments were to the effect that he had read the answering affidavit of Shilubane and confirmed that he is the lawful owner of a property (plot) Lot 1532 in Mbabane at Thembelihle and stated that he procured the plot of E450 000 from the late Paul Mhlaba Shilubane during his lifetime by virtue of a special power of attorney signed by the late Shilubane as he duly paid E100 000 deposit.

He is alleged to have deposed to the sworn affidavit knowing very well that he was not the lawful owner of the property or he did not procure the property for the sum of E450 000 during Shilubane's lifetime since he did not even pay the E100 000 to him.

Further, it has been stated that he did not even view the property with the late Shilubane and no offer for sale of property was made, hence he was not the legitimate owner of the said property. He is also charged with fraud in that with a furtherance of a common purpose with pose certain immovable property the others, he unlawfully falsely at Thembelihle.





DAGGA SMOKING PUPILSRECEIVE 12 STROKES EACH

DESPITE the fact that Deputy Prime Minister Themba Masuku's office recently issued a statement calling for positive discipline of children, some pupils of Ezulwini Community High School were allegedly beaten to a pulp for misconduct, this publication has gathered.

About 20 pupils of Ezulwini Community High School received 12 strokes each for allegedly smoking dagga in the school premises.

The pupils were whipped by their parents and teachers at the school on February 19. Each pupil is said to have been given 12 strokes on his or her back while lying down on a table at the teacher's staff room.

Culprits

According to reliable sources, among the culprits who received the corporal punishment were 16 males and four females.

It had been gathered that most of the pupils are in Forms One and Two.

The highly placed source said it all started some few weeks back when one of the teachers found the pupils gathered inside a class and one of them was having a note of paper in his hand, writing something.

It turned out that the list the pupil was writing was an order for those who will be buying dagga, according to the source. The concerned teacher is said to have asked the pupils what the list was all

"Initially, they duped the teacher about the list, however, after much interrogation; they later confessed that it was an order for some of the pupils who are smoking dagga," said the source.

It is said the parents came on Tuesday morning where it was explained to them that their children were involved in the smoking of dagga. It had been mentioned that the principal of the school asked the parents to whip their children in front of her and the other teachers. The pupils were ordered to lie down on a table while the parents carried out the beating. "The parents were lax when beating their children and this prompted the principal to ask one of the teachers to take the stick and whip the pupils to a pulp. Each pupil received 12 strokes on his or her back," said the source.

The source said after a thorough beating, the principal asked the parents to take the pupils to the nearby police station so they are counselled for their engagement on drugs.

A team from this publication visited the school on Monday morning. The principal was reportedly out attending other school duties. The Deputy Principal, who identified herself as Mrs Khumalo, said she is not allowed to talk to the

'The principal of the school is the right person to comment about this matter you are asking," she said. Chief Police Information and Communications Officer, Superintendent Phindile Vilakati confirmed that some of the pupils were reported at Ezulwini Police Post where they received counselling.

Webster, Floyd lose appeal against Macford's victory

ELECTIONS losers under Manzini North Inkhundla Webster Lukhele and Floyd Mlotshwa lost their bid to challenge MP Macford Sibandze as the Supreme Court has dismissed their appeal.

The Supreme Court handed judgement in the application which was before the Chief Justice Bheki Maphalala, who was sitting with Judges Majahenkhaba Dlamini and Jacobus Annandale.

Judgement

When handing down judgment, the court noted that it is apparent from the evidence that the heads of argument and list of authorities from the applicants (Lukhele and Mlotjwa) was caused by the negligence of the applicant's attorney who willfully disregarded the rules of court.

The court stated that reasons given by the applicants for the delay in the late filing of the heads and list of authorities are not reasonable and do not constitute a reasonable explanation for the delay and further observed that the application for condonation does not deal with prospects of success on appeal.

"The applicants must present a reasonable explanation for the delay in complying with the rules of court and must also show that applicant

has prospects of success on the merits which the applicants failed to satisfy both requirements for con-

Accordingly, the following order is made; the application for condonation for late filing is dismissed, the appeal is truck off the roll and may not be reinstated without the leave of court," CJ ordered.

Both judges concurred and there was no order as to costs.

The two losers lodged an application at the Supreme Court on August 30, 2018 challenging the nomination and subsequent election of Sibandze as MP for Manzini North as they contended that he is not a resident of Makholweni under the constituency.

Application

Subsequently and before the main application could be heard, the applicants lodged an interlocutory application for the recusal of High Court Judge Mzwandile Fakudze arguing that he had previously worked for the Elections and Boundaries Commission (EBC) and could, therefore, decide the matter in favour of the respondents (EBC, Sibandze and the AG).

The interlocutory application was dismissed after the hearing on the same date and the appellants then lodged an appeal against the judgment of the High Court.

Labour ministry flooded with complaints from UNESWA students

IN the past weeks the Ministry of labour and social security has been inundated with a series of questions and complaints pertaining to the University of Eswatini (UNESWA) students' financial assistance.

The pressing issues with the UNESWA students leadership relate to the late release of allowances, perceived reduction of book allowances and the fate of 26 students who were erroneously included in the 2018 scholarship award list.

Minister Makhosi Vilakati said since January 2019, the ministry has met with UNESWA Students Representative Committee (SRC) on three occasions, talking and explaining these issues to the students' representatives.

He said every time the ministry was getting the impression that the students understand the explanations and that they will

be able to in turn explain to their student body.

The minister said they acknowledge that understanding does not necessarily mean agreeing to all the explanations. However, the ministry's take is that they should continue to engage on the explanations until they reach a common ground with a view to finding the solutions that are so desired to extend tertiary education to all school leaving graduates.

Vilakati said there is no way to achieve the economic transformation desired as a country if students, who are the human resource input for tomorrow, are beset by so many peripheral problems to learning.

He said however, that there is a need to be mindful that the ministry is operating within a limited budget, hence the reason each year government is only able to award scholarships to only 1 000 new students to UNESWA, which is in addition to about 4 000 ongoing students against over 5 000 who qualify.

"Processing allowances for this number of students is an arduous job," he said. Vilakati added that they are improving the current disbursement systems and hoping that in future years students will get their allowances timeously.

He added that they shall discuss the proposed new allowances disbursement system with students and institutions, as well as suggestions on how it could possibly be strengthened for successful implementation.

"I hope students will understand and give us time to finish designing the system and then engage. We will invite students and institutions for discussion on this item in April 2019," added Vilakati.

Minister apologises about erroneously awarded scholarships

THE minister has apologised to faculty of agriculture and health sciences students who were erroneously included in a list of students awarded scholarships.

Minister Moses Vilakati said this was a genuine human error, which was realised a day after the initial list was sent to UNESWA. Unfortunately, the UNESWA administration had already posted the list on the notice boards and informed the students. "We were still seeking a way of balancing these two strong views and in the proposals that we were working on as a ministry the interest of the students was paramount.

"We regret the recent incident where students had to flock in their numbers to the ministry with apparent frustration that the university had not registered them," said the minister. Vilakati added that this is a clear sign of lack of effective communication between the ministry and the university on some of these issues.

Government could not give students an open cheque, rather it was decided that students be given an initial E2 000.

The minister added that in the event a student would require any top up depending on the list of prescribed text books, that would be required for that particular course or programme, the student would first have to provide proof that the initial E2 000 was used

MINISTER of Labour and costs at the university's exclusive to buy books and learning material amount for all the remaining books that he or she requires.

Allocation

"In the subsequent allocation (year after) of book allowance" verification will be undertaken to determine if indeed every cent in the previous year allocation, the allowance was used to procure prescribed text books, stationery and learning material before issuance with new one.

"Anyone, therefore, who says book allowance has been reduced is spreading lies intended to confuse and flair students' emotions for reasons we can only imagine," added Vilakati.







"This case has been adjudicated by a court of law, so it is very difficult for us to comment more.

However, we have not received a comprehensive report from the branch which will help us in deliberating and getting the accused teacher's side."

Electricity

The building has been without electricity since last Wednesday. Speaking to this publication, some of the business owners disclosed that they were on the verge of shutting down as they cannot operate without the use of electricity.

"The most selling products I have in my shop are ice blocks, cold drinks and potato chips. All these need the use of electricity," said David Dlamini. The business owners disclosed that they have been frequently reporting the outage at the EEC Siteki Depot since last week, but nothing has been done. Meanwhile, other areas which were said to have had similar outages last week reported that they were finally attended to on Sunday. These include Moyeni, KaMdodi and Lugongolweni. However some areas remain in the dark, such as Kalanga and Mpoloonjeni.

SODV ACT TACKLES CRITICAL ISSUES

AN informative training conducted by the department of gender and family issues under the DPM's office was held last week.

In association with the GBV Referral Network Partners, the training focused mainly on unpacking the Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence Act 2018 to the attendees at The George Hotel in Manzini.

The training started on Wednesday and was attended by the UNFPA and government ministries that deal with SODV matters on daily basis. These included ministry of health; Public Health Unit, Sexual Offences Unit, social workers and the police from regions.

Attendees were in high spirits when discussing the SODV Act.

They wanted the Act unpacked so they could pass this information to their other colleagues and members of the community in their various constituencies.

United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) representative Sipho Dlamini said the issues being addressed by the newly-enacted Act are important to everyon

He mentioned his willingness to get more insight on the Act and how it would assist the nation.

Dlamini further commended the Kingdom of Eswatini for passing the SODV Act 2018 which would help address gender inequalities.

The department of social welfare, under the DPM's office, was pleased that such a tool had been passed and now want to reach out places like health institutions, schools, churches and bus ranks.

Meanwhile, Director of Gender and Family Issues Jane Mkhonta-Simelane said without UNFPA's support, it will have not been possible to come up with the strategies to address gender based violence in the country.

She said the workshop was for the trainers to be trained so they in turn train others in their constituencies and that duplicate effort should be avoided since a lot of people need to be trained.

She said if more people were trained on the Act, there will be no need for the recruitment of more police officers, since violence cases would have gone down.

'Report abuse cases to cops'

IT is important to report SODV cases to superiors first, says Principal Crown Council Lomvula Hlophe.

During the training, Hlophe urged the trainers that as a team, they should ensure that whatever cases brought to their attention are reported to the authorities first, who will then collect necessary evidence to help with the conviction.

She added that it is only through the police that the case would be taken to court. Hlophe said when cases are brought to the trainers in their constituencies, all should be taken seriously and people should be advised to report the matter to the police. "There is need to have more one stop centres in the country as there is one in Mbabane, which is currently running. We are hopeful that more centres will be opened at regional level.

As leaders we should not focus mainly on the cases on a legal point of view, but also focus from the victim who is left emotionally drained by the case and making sure they are not victimised," she said.



Nzima said it was no secret that children or adolescents were crafters of their own future.

"Young people can make a choice about their future. If they want a positive future, they can decide and it's also up to them to decide if they want it to be bleak. Their future is determined by the choices they make," said Nzima.

Nzima said with the country experiencing high teenage pregnancy, something needs to be done.

Eswatini ranked 9th in Africa's child friendliness index

ESWATINI is currently ranked ninth in the Africa Child Friendliness Index of 2013.

This is a major step as the nation was ranked 45th in 2008 said DPM Themba Masuku.

Masuku shared this as he condemned all forms of brutality against children.

He said corporal punishment would jeopardise the Kingdom of Eswatini's vision to be a developed country by 2022.

He noted that children are expected to be safe at all times as well as receive and enjoy love, support and protection.

"Severe corporal punishment hugely affects the positive rankings of the country," he noted.

Masuku added that the country had a progressive constitution and has further aligned itself with a number of international conventions which seek to assist and guide the delivery of better services to the people.

He added that all these legal instruments put emphasis on human rights and dignity as captured in the nation's vision of 2022.

"Teachers and community members are encouraged to make efforts towards engagement of positive discipline measures, which will be characterised by engagements with children leading to a common understanding and solutions," said Masuku.

He further urged children to exercise utmost respect to teachers and parents in their daily lives which is the social and legal responsibility of the child. He added that schools and community structures are encouraged to reinforce their career guidance and counselling programmes.

Churches were also urged to develop programmes which seek to address issues affecting children and also empower parents on alternative measures relating to the discipline of children

He concluded that his office and stakeholders should be approached to capacitate each other on better handling of issues regarding raising children and dealing with emotional stress.

RECIPROCATED EFFORTS THAT GO A LONG WAY IN LEADERSIP - RESPECT

EFFECTIVE leaders know that respect is not a commodity that has to be demanded from followers, but rather a reciprocated initiative that followers bestow in recognition of the influence the leader has.

Leaders need to be respected in order to be successful, but earning that respect takes time and consistent effort from the leader.

When team members and employees respect the leader, they are more likely to work harder to accomplish the shared goal they believe in.

Leaders need to realise that employees are people just like them, and they have basic needs that must be met and nurtured in order to enhance performance.

Every person wants to be recognised as a human being regardless of the position he occupy in the organisation. Hence, leaders who show respect to employees earns respect and that is a component that is critical for the leader to succeed.

EARNING AND BUILDING RESPECT

People will notice.

Forgive mistakes: Humans are not perfect, and neither are leaders. When you make a mistake, show others how to shake it off. And do not penalise those who try to be creative in solving a problem and do not succeed.

Show Respect, always: It is easy to criticize when others mess up. It is better to support someone, even in error, in order for them to bounce back strong.

Be Proactive: Not everyone is as good as your best workers. Help those struggling, but be firm. If people continue to undermine the team, do what is best for the team to succeed.

Though respect is reciprocal, the other side of the coin is that, the business environment is far different than in years past. Younger employees do not hold the same views of work and management as their parents did. Distrust and entitlement can be crippling traits to over-

That is why it is more important that leaders embrace their position and actually lead. It is imperative that leadership show others respect so to gain respect.

SUICIDAL STUDENT DIES AS CROWD CHEERS

Fake pastors, violent youth - we must act now before all is lost to our nation

JOHANNESBURG - For anyone who has followed the news in our country last week, some profound questions emerge that must force us to confront the spectre we, as a society, appear to have become.

We are forced to ask whether we, as a collective nation, have lost our way.

We are compelled to question whether we are so broken a society, whether we live in such a suffocating moral vacuum, that we are willing to be duped by religious charlatans who, among other fakeries, claim they are able to bring people back from the dead.

While the public ridicule at the absurdity of Pastor Alph Lukau bringing to life a man in a coffin appears rational to the rational-minded, the church is rich and has many who have faith in him and continue to pay money to hear him preach.

This is just the latest in a series of religious quackery that this country's citizens blindly and zealously follow.

Eating grass, being sprayed with insect poison, drinking petrol. In some churches, accusations of human trafficking, abuse and rape are being investigated.

Others are under scrutiny for defrauding congregants who handed over hard-earned and not-so-meagre monies in the hope of a quick return that did not materialise.

While the congregants lose money in blind faith, these so-called pastors have private jets and drive multi-million rand cars.

Surely this is not religion? Surely this is not faith? How can this be spirituality? How can this be Christianity?

As these churches take root and flourish in our country, we must question what profound levels of desperation drive scores to worship at them.

We must acknowledge that this is fraud and manipulation. It is coercion and abuse.

It should not be tolerated and, while the state must intervene and act, as a society we must engage in some brutally honest introspection about how we worship and what shape that worship should take.

VIOLENCE

As we ask hard questions about our faith, so too we must ask if we are so broken, so far removed from an understanding of our collective responsibility, that our youth, in this instance teenagers, think little to nothing of beating a man to death on the streets of a city.

Thoriso Themane's brutal murder in Polokwane, caught on video and sent around the world, is a damning indictment of the erosion of our social fabric.

One of the teens arrested in connection with his death boasted on video that he was untouchable because his father is a policeman.

In the Western Cape, gang violence in Bonteheuwel has claimed 18 lives so far this year.

In North West last week, in one case among many, a 17-year-old was sentenced for stabbing his teacher to death.

As we ask hard questions about our faith, so too we must ask if we are so broken, so far removed from an understanding of our collective responsibility, that our youth, in this instance teenagers, think little to nothing of beating a man to death on the streets of a city

And in KwaZulu-Natal, several youngsters were arrested for repeatedly raping a 90-year-old relative.

What's worse is that the family reported them to the police only after the young men had defied reprimands and continued raping the granny.

Has the violence in our homes, in our schools, on our streets become so fundamentally pervasive that taking human life is common place?

What compels these so-called future leaders to engage in such violent behaviour and kill other humans?

Nationally, the commission of inquiry into state capture keeps us riveted daily with revelations of cash handouts, bags, booze and security systems for our politicians.

It continues to open corruption's can of worms. It continues to expose the rot at the head of our nation. It shows that we are a society that is not happy with what we get paid to do.

As a result, we engage in corrupt and fraudulent acts to earn extra money at the expense of the services expected to be rendered to the citizens, often the poor and needy.

If those elected to lead our country are exposed as corrupt, or revealed to be alleged rapists and women abusers, where law enforcement appears complicit in preventing or hampering investigations, then what real hope do we have?


As dark as all this appears, there must be light at the end. We must stand up against charlatans. We must resist violence.

We are compelled to develop our society, to rid it of superstition, to help our neighbours, to uplift our youth, to reduce inequality and pover-

Kenya should let ICJ settle maritime dispute with Somalia

NAIROBI - The last three weeks have witnessed a strange diplomatic spat between Kenya and Somalia.

The Kenyan government summoned back its ambassador from Mogadishu and kicked out the Somali ambassador, claiming that Somali leadership had attempted to sell off parts of Kenyan territory.

The two neighbours have been locked in a dispute over their maritime boundary, with both claiming a narrow 100 000km2 triangle of sea shelf thought to contain significant deposits of oil and gas.

After five years of attempts by both to negotiate a compromise, Somalia eventually filed a case at the International Court of Justice (ICJ) in 2014, which is still to be adjudicated. However, Kenya has continued to operate as if there was no dispute and has already sold mining licences to international companies in the triangle.

The latest flare-up centres, at least nominally. on proceedings at a controversial public meeting organised in London by Somalia's Federal ministry of petroleum and mineral resources and Spectrum Geo, a Norwegian seismic data processing company.

The agenda for the meeting was somewhat unclear, with government officials initially suggesting it would be inviting bids for exploration, and only later clarifying that the meeting would present seismic data collected by Spectrum and offer for sale more detailed information about offshore blocks.

This confusion led to Somali citizens living in London storming the meeting to protest against the presumed auctioning of the offshore blocks to foreign investors, a boycott of the meeting by opposition parties and members of Somalia's Upper House, and then the bust-up with Kenya.

INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY

The tone of the statement issued by Kenya on February 16 regarding the summoning of its ambassador in Mogadishu was startling. It fell short of declaring Somalia an enemy state, claiming the latter had indeed auctioned off "oil and gas blocks in Kenya's maritime territorial area".

It thundered about a map that had apparently been displayed at the conference showing the disputed territory as part of Somalia, and indirectly threatened to use as leverage "four hundred thousand Somali refugees and asylum seekers" in Kenya.

It also "reminded the Government of Somalia and the international community" of the fact that it had troops serving in the Africa Union Mission ened Kenya to think it can similarly bully its in Somalia (AMISOM), which is helping battle the al-Qaeda-linked armed group, al-Shabab. "The patience of the people of Kenya is not infinite," it warned.

Somalis are a more patient lot it seems. In a measured rejoinder a day later, the Somali government averred that no auction had taken place, explained that the map in question mirrored Somalia's long-standing position, and reiterated that the country has no intentions to undertake any unilateral actions (of the type Kenya has) in the disputed area until the ICJ renders its

What accounts for such an overreaction by Kenya? Well, perhaps it could be panic over the possibility of actually losing the case at the ICJ. Clearly, Somalia seems the more confident of the two about its prospects at the court, which is expected to hand down a verdict sometime this year.

Somalia has already won the first round after the court in 2017 dismissed Kenya's challenge to the proceedings on the basis that the two countries had previously agreed to settle the matter out of court.

ILLEGAL TRADE

Further, this is a strategy Kenya has deployed before. The perceived success of its obnoxious and hardnosed campaign against the International Criminal Court's indictments for crimes against humanity against President Uhuru Kenyatta and his deputy, William Ruto, may have embold-

The Kenyan government summoned back its ambassador from Mogadishu and kicked out the Somali ambassador, claiming that Somali leadership had attempted to sell off parts of Kenyan territory

northeastern neighbour.

Kenya is not new to playing the bull in Somalia's china shop.

The Somali government was not consulted in October 2011 when Kenya sent forces across the border, nor when the objectives of the invasion morphed from pursuing kidnappers to taking southern Somalia's second-largest port, Kismayo.

Against Mogadishu's wishes, Kenyan troops brought former al-Shabab ally, Ahmed Madobe, to power as president of the newly created Jubaland State administration.

The country ignored a resolution of the Somali Parliament calling for its troops to leave. Moreover, the Kenyan forces in Somalia have been accused of engaging in illegal trade in charcoal and sugar, which enriches the very terror group they are meant to be fighting.

According to an article in the Standard newspaper, one of Kenya's demands for restoring diplomatic ties was that Somalia withdraw its case at the ICJ. This insistence is perhaps most telling of Kenya's true intentions.

WEAKER DIPLOMATIC POSITION

It thus appears that having already sold prospecting rights within the disputed zones to companies such as ENI, Total, Anadarko and others, and facing huge claims for compensation should the ICJ rule in Somalia's favour, Kenya has fabricated a diplomatic incident to pre-empt that judgment and force Somalia to agree to a negotiated solution.

The Mogadishu is already in a weaker diplomatic position having already angered its international partners at the beginning of the year by kicking out the top United Nations official in the country, Nicholas Haysom. Perhaps Kenya smelt blood.

Such tactics are, however, a double-edged sword. A serious rift with Somalia would have repercussions on Kenya's participation in AMI-SOM as well as risk radicalising border communities and legitimising Somalia-based terrorists targeting Kenya.

It would also harm the regional cooperation that AMISOM depends on, weakening the fight against al-Shabab and endangering people across

It is thus in everyone's interest that Kenya dials down its rhetoric and, as The Star editorialised, commits to abide by the decision of the ICJ. -AIJAZEERA

ESWADE ENTRUSTED WITH E241M PROJECT

THE Eswatini Water and Agricultural Development Enterprise (ESWADE) has been tasked implementing a E241 million worth Smallholder Market Led Project (SMLP).

The project is aimed at reducing poverty and food insecurity through investments supporting increased agricultural production, productivity and commercialisation of smallholder agriculture while maintaining and sustaining a resilient environment.

This was revealed by Minister of Agriculture, Jabulani Mabuza during the launch of the Chiefdom Development Plan (CDP) held at Lulakeni Royal Kraal over the past weekend.

He said ESWADE was a government entity which seeks to empower communities improve their quality of life through projects in commercial agriculture and associated enterprises, thus providing innovative services in infrastructure development and management.

"The ESWADE ethos is not just focused on lifting project beneficiaries from abject poverty to running businesses that are both profitable and sustainable, but also include access to potable water and sanitation for the project's targeted communities," he said.

The minister said these interventions were designed to provide better health and play an integral yet supportive role in the economic expansion taking place within those development areas.

He said people with access to sanitation facilities stood at 42 269 at the beginning of the five

years and 48 461 at the end of the period. The SMLP is set to cover 37 chiefdoms in the rain fed Middleveld and Lowveld areas of the Lubombo, Shiselweni and Manzini regions, covering a total of 12 tinkhundla.

Agricultural production in these areas will generally be individual, however, market supply or infrastructure maintenance may be jointly organised. He also disclosed that the SMLP conducted a market scoping study which found that goat production, beekeeping and indigenous chickens have a huge potential at the Lulakeni Chiefdom.

The study further uncovered that there is a high demand of these selected value chains in the market, thus encouraged the community to pursue the value chains for commercialisation.

The minister also highlighted that revenue from businesses initiated by ESWADE stood at E1.4 billion for the past five years alone.

He said this was from enterprises such as sugarcane, livestock and other diversified crops and from these enterprises, farmers from the project development areas under ESWADE have remitted taxes which are in excess of E210 million.

CMA agreement presents opportunities for locals

EmaSwati now have the opportunity to invest in international stock markets, including the JSE and the NYSE through various brokers that have aligned themselves with collaborating with Common Monetary Area (CMA) members and mandate.

One of the brokers, First World Trader, which is a brokerage firm from South Africa, offers the opportunity for CMA member states to invest on the Johannesburg and New York stock exchanges through an Equity trading platform known as Easy Equities.

A representative of First World Trader, Lucas Herrick said during an interview that CMA citizens have a wide range of investment opportunities under the Easy Equities platform. "Easy Equities account holders who are citizens of the CMA Area (South Africa, Namibia, Swaziland and Lesotho) have access to accounts including the Rand account, Tax Free Savings Account and an offshore USD account limited to NYSE and NASDAQ shares and ETFs," Harrick said.

According the Easy Equities website, account holders can buy shares for a min-

Asked about the existence of other trading platforms that stimulate the CMA, Harrick said it was likely that other platforms do exist.

"There are other platforms similar to this one but Easy Equities however is the most user friendly. But you may ask some other brokers in regards to them allowing EmaSwati to open accounts with them.

Harrick also confirmed that they do have EmaSwati with registered accounts with us

Sought for comment on the existence of such platformsJoyce Dlamini, a manager at the Eswatini Stock Exchange said the use of electronic interfaces was common in equity trading worldwide.

She said the stock exchange, its self, was a larger entity which is independent of stock brokers.

"Regarding trading platforms similar to the one question, there are many platforms currently being used worldwide to sell and buy on stock markets. For instance, our local stock market has launched the automated trading system, which is an electronic trading platform more or less similar to other electronic platforms used," she said.

Dlamini also mentioned prospects of regional stock exchanges stimulating the Common Monetary Area (CMA) Agreement through introducing linkage projects between stock exchanges in SADC member states.

"It is possible to gain access to international equity markets, but this has to be done through engaging with a trusted stock broker. In the case of stock market relations between Eswatini and other countries, some progress is being made; SADC is currently in the process of making it simple to gain access to markets in the SADC region. The Committee of SADC Stock exchanges is working on improving the multination aspect of equity trade," Dlamini elaborated.

RETIREMENT FUND COMPLAINT

"For a complaint to be attended to by the Office of the Ombudsman, it should relate to the administration of the fund," among other things, said our presenter.

- That the fund has made a decision outside its powers or that the complainant has been prejudiced as a result of maladministration by the fund.
- That a dispute of fact or law has arisen in relation to a fund, between the fund and any person or the fund and the complainant.
- That an employer who participates in the fund of the fund or the law.

FORMS

SUBMISSION AND CONSIDERATION OF COMPLAINTS

1. A complainant shall first lodge a written complaint with the authorised financial services provider

2. If a complainant is not satisfied with the response to the complaint lodged with the authorised FSP or if no response is received by the complainant within 30 days, the complainant may lodge a complaint with the Office of the Ombudsman.

3. Notwithstanding, 1 and 2 above a complainant may, on the basis of the urgency of a complaint, lodge a complaint in the first instance with the Office of the Ombudsman.

4. The Ombudsman shall, in situations like 3 above, in his/her discretion, determine whether or not good cause has been shown to warrant a complaint being considered as a matter of urgency in terms of the Ombudsman's rules.

MATATA

Alongside the Financial Services Regulatory Authority (FSRA), the Office of the Ombudsman took part in the latest FSRA roadshow at Matata on February 23, 2019.

On this day, the FSRA took the lead by educating consumers about their rights and responsibilities under the financial services products that FSRA regulates.

ESTABLISHED

The Ombudsman of Financial Services, having been established through the promulgation of the FSRA Act 2010 by way of Section 74, also resolves other complaints in addition to retirement fund complaints.

A SAVINGS AND OR CREDIT COMPLAINT

The subject treated by the Office of the Ombudsman on the day included a matter relating to a savings and/or credit complaint.

For a complaint to qualify under the savings and/or credit complaints criteria, it must relate to instances where a financial services provider:

- Breached any applicable laws, regulations, bye-laws or duties imposed by the agreement.
- Failed to give effect to a right provided to the consumer by law, regulation or bye-law in respect to the subject matter of the complaint.
- Failed to adhere to any applicable code of conduct provided for by financial services laws and other legislation applicable to industry.
- Failed to meet the standards of good practice required by financial services laws and instruments there under.
- Treated the complainant unfairly or acted in an unconscionable manner towards the complaint.


Volvo cars to end limitless autobahn thrills by capping speeds

GOTHENBURG - Car buyers who want to drive at breakneck speeds on Germany's autobahn highways are about to lose Volvo as an option.

The Swedish car brand, which has long taken pride in its attention to safety, will design all models by 2020 to preven drivers from going faster than 180 kilometres (110 miles) per hour.

The measure takes aim at excessive speed, which along with intoxication and distraction is one of the three main factors behind serious road accidents, Chief Executive Officer Hakan Samuelsson said.

"There is no reason why you should be able to drive a Volvo faster than 180," Samuelsson said in a phone interview. "When you look at German highways, a large part of accidents are



due to overspeeding, and in a German context that surely includes anything above 180."

The measure comes as Gothenburgbased Volvo, which is owned by China's Zhejiang Geely Holding Group Co.,

faces headwinds as a trade dispute between the US and China disrupted production plans and pushed last year's

margins lower for the first time since 2012. The CEO expects that strengthening Volvo's safety credentials will offset any negative impact from losing customers who want to be able to drive as fast as they see fit.

"We can have a discussion about whether we are acting as a 'big brouler and we are happy to debate that," Samuelsson said. "I think we will attract more buyers than we'll lose."

Volvo started a campaign in 2007 aimed at eliminating injuries and fatalities in crashes involving the company's cars by 2020. After addressing extreme speeds, Volvo will be looking at technology to prevent accidents caused by driving while impaired, or by distractions such as mobile-phone use.

"With new technology, we can address those," Samuelsson said.

Egypt releases prominent photojournalist after 5-year term

CAIRO - A prominent Egyptian photojournalist was released after five years in prison and returned home on Monday to hugs from his family and friends, pledging to continue working despite having to spend the nights at a police station nearby.

Mahmoud Abu Zaid, popularly known as 'Shawkan', was convicted of involvement in a 2013 sit-in protest by Islamists that was broken up by security forces in an operation that left hundreds dead.

He was taking photos at the Rabaa Square in Cairo where Muslim Brotherhood supporters had staged a sit-in that August, 2013, to denounce the ouster and detention by the military of the country's freely elected but divisive Islamist President Mohammed Morsi.

"I was heading out to take photos. I come back to my home after five years," Shawkan told The Associated Press at his home in Cairo's neighbourhood of Giza.

His lawyer, Taher Abuel-Naser,

said he was released from a police station earlier in the morning. An Egyptian court had ordered Shawkan's release last September after he had served out his term, but he remained behind bars as authorities said his release was still being processed.

Unprecedented

Egypt under President Abdel-Fattah el-Sissi, a former general, has launched an unprecedented assault on journalists in recent years, imprisoning dozens and occasionally expelling some foreign journalists.

Shawkan said he has to report to the nearest police station and spend every night there from 18:00 till 06:00. But he said he would continue working as a photojournalist. "I am not the first or the last journalist to be detained," he said.

"I feel like I was born again, I feel relieved," said his mother, Reda Mahrous. "I used to stay awake at night thinking, telling myself that Mahmoud will come back today or tomorrow."

Zim land a dead asset, says finance minister

HARARE - Zimbabwe's controversial land reform programme, which left most of its land without collateral value, has meant the country is now carrying a dead asset, its Finance and Economic Development Minister Mthuli Ncube has said.

Before land reform, most farmers had title or property rights to their land, but close to 20 years after the programme, most of the land has no title and as a result, farmers have little access to loans.

The cancellation of property rights and security of tenure imposed such limitations on farmers and have had a negative impact on the southern African country's econo-

Ncube, however, believes government can restore the collateral value of land and restore farmers' access to billions of dollars-worth of credit that would immediately improve the country's production vol-

He believes dealing with the issue of land tenure and farmer compensation is critical for the country to be able to securitise its land assets.

Speaking at a breakfast meeting to review the 2019 Monetary Policy Statement, Neube said it is critical that government restores property rights on land.

'We have created a dead asset in the form of land, and we need to turn it into a pro-

"One of the issues that needs to be dealt with is the issue of 99-year leases, there is still some work to do to close that off. Because without 99-year leases, we can't create enough cover in terms of property rights for banks to extend credit to farmers," said Ncube.

Union will offer Britain a long delay to Brexit because of upcoming European elections, British trade minister Liam Fox said on Sunday. About a third have returned to Germany, another third are believed to have died, and the rest are believed to be still in Iraq and Syria, including some detained by Iraqi forces and USbacked fighters in Syria.

JOHANNESBURG - As political parties intensify their campaigns to woo voters ahead of the May elections, analysts have weighed in on the Freedom Front Plus' (FF Plus) manifesto launch at the weekend.

The party called for the scrapping of affirmative action and quota policies at universities and other organisations. FF Plus leader Pieter Groenewald labelled black economic empowerment (BEE) as black elite enrichment. "Black economic empowerment is nothing more than black elite enrichment. Now it is broad-based black economic empowerment? The only thing they broadened was the base to make the ANC elite more rich than they are at the moment."

Groenewald has also called for the scrapping of affirmative action and BEE and says race mustn't be the criteria to help poor people.

"Don't make race the criteria to support people that are really poor. Black and white and brown and Indian, there

are people who are poor."

The FF Plus is also opposed to land expropriation without compensation and gun laws.

Transform

Political analyst Somadoda Fikeni said: "The Freedom Front Plus may contest for the same constituency as the DA because the DA is busy trying to transform itself and be more inclusive of blacks."

Meanwhile, Alex Boraine says the FF Plus may gain votes from "unhappy white" DA supporters who feel the party is too liberal.

"What the DA is trying to do is to reach out to the black middle-class and it could table that it's losing the old whites that have hung on to the party and painted the DA as a white party. So, they might make some gains out of it [and] I think it's a marginal







Lesarato Events Director Mandla 'Cheeks' Nxumalo facilitated a discussion on marketing and promotion of artists and music.

He touched on the impact of marketing as an artist and the importance of creating a relationship with key players as an artist.

"It is important to create relationships with the media and support each other as local artists in order for you to grow," said Nxumalo.

The workshop helped most artists understand the music business and also the importance of copyrights.





Kane holds key to Spurs' European ambitions

LONDON - Harry Kane insists Tottenham will shake off their Premier League collapse as the England star looks to fire his team into the Champions League quarter-finals against Borussia Dortmund today.

In the space of seven days, Tottenham's hopes of winning the Premier League have been shattered by defeats at Burnley and Chelsea and Saturday's north London derby draw against Arsenal.

It was just the latest Tottenham failure when the stakes have been at their highest since Mauricio Pochettino took charge five years ago.

Only a last-minute Hugo Lloris penalty save from Pierre-Emerick Aubameyang prevented Arsenal inflicting Tottenham's third successive loss.

But Kane is convinced Tottenham are capable of recovering from a painful week and he challenged his team to use their Champions League last-16 second leg in Dortmund as fuel to speed up their revival

"Two disappointing results in a week, this was the perfect game, a north London derby to show passion and show fans we are ready to fight for the rest of the season," said Kane, who scored their penalty equaliser against Arsenal.

"It's a point, we wanted three but it stops the losing streak and we can focus on Dortmund and then Southampton.

Crunch time for Solari

MADRID - Santiago Solari's future is likely to hinge on Real Madrid again winning the Champions League but two defeats by Barcelona in four days have brought old problems back to the surface.

After being knocked out of the Copa del Rey and effectively deemed irrelevant in the title race, a third loss in as many games could see Madrid's season wiped out in a week.

"We have to react," said defender Dani Carvajal.

"It's probably been one of the tough-

est weeks in my time here."

Ajax deserved more from the 2-1 loss in Amsterdam that, in theory, puts their opponents firmly in charge ahead of the second leg today.

But three consecutive defeats at the Santiago Bernabeu for the first time in 15 years means Madrid will be feeling the heat.

Solari too, the coach that was handed a contract until 2021 when appointed only five months ago but who might not last the season should Ajax do the unthinkable and reach the quarterfi-

nals. Jose Mourinho's criticism as a pundit for bEIN Sports on the latest Clasico will be seen as opportunistic but the reality is he is still well-regarded at Real.

Pep Guardiola's side sit in pole position having played the same number of

The tense stalemate represented a fourth draw in six Premier League matches while they have failed to score in two of their last three.

Were it not for an imperious performance from Virgil van Dijk, matters might have been worse against what Klopp described as "wild" opponents. Liverpool now

sit one point off City in second place with nine games remaining, and they face Bayern Munich in the second leg of their Champions League last 16 tie in-between their next two Premier League games against Burnley and Fulham.

Having drawn 0-0 at Anfield in the first leg last month, Neville believes Klopp should be encouraged to make the pursuit of leaders City their priority. Speaking on the Gary Neville Podcast, the former Manchester United defender said: "Getting points on the board is a big advantage. I always thought that if Liverpool could win the league this season then they'd need a clean fixture list.

"I'm going to say it: go out against Bayern Munich. That sounds like madness. "Of course, you'd never play to lose a game but it will be in Liverpool's favour if they have a clean run as they can get everyone fresh. City have got a couple of FA Cup games, where Liverpool could go five or six points in front." Sky Sports

'Selling Fellaini proves Solskjaer has the mettle for Man Utd'

MANCHESTER - Rio Ferdinand has banished the notion that his former team-mate Ole Gunnar Solskjaer lacks the steel to succeed as Manchester United's permanent manager, suggesting one of his first big decisions as Old Trafford boss highlighted his ruthless streak.

The smiling Norwegian has lifted the mood around United since he replaced Jose Mourinho as the club's manager in December, with Ferdinand revealing Solskjaer was a leader during his time at the club and should be handed a long-term contract to guide the club's

Speaking exclusively to Goal, BT Sport pundit Ferdinand has given insight into Solskjaer's winning mentality, as he suggested the decision to sell Marouane Fellaini to Shandong Luneng in January was evidence of his desire to make clinical decisions.

"With Ole Gunnar Solskjaer, we can all sit here and say he is the baby faced assassin, but that is just the guise he uses," states Ferdinand. "Behind that, there is a coldness to him. He won't shirk responsibility, he won't shirk a oneon-one to tell someone you are not for me. "Look at Fellaini." Goal

'Tottenham were better two years ago'

LONDON - Mauricio Pochettino's Tottenham side were stronger two years ago, according to the club's former manager Harry Redknapp.

A 1-1 draw against arch-rivals Arsenal at Wembley on Saturday left Spurs 10 points behind Premier League leaders Manchester City in the table, with nine matches remaining this season.

The Gunners were unlucky not to emerge with all three points on the day, as Pierre-Emerick Aubameyang squandered a golden late chance from the penalty spot.

Tottenham have dropped seven points out of a possible nine in their last three outings, having also suffered damaging away defeats at Chelsea and Burnley.

Pochettino's men had looked like genuine title contenders for much of the 2018-19 campaign, but they are now in real danger of being dragged into the battle for a fourthplaced finish. Dele Alli has been out of action since January with a hamstring injury and Redknapp believes that Spurs have suffered in his absence, with Harry Kane and Christian Eriksen shouldering too much pressure going forward. The ex-Spurs boss also discussed the impact of selling Kyle Walker and Mousa Dembele, which has ultimately left Pochettino's squad lacking strength in depth. "I honestly think Tottenham were better two years ago when Kyle Walker was playing right-back and absolutely on fire, Danny Rose was in his pomp absolutely flying and Dembele was top drawer," Redknapp told TalkSport.

"They were absolutely incredible then. Rose has had his injuries and has not been quite the same, Walker obviously moved on and Dembele has moved on.

"But I'm sure they will regroup again in the summer, one or two, a little bit of tweaking and they will be strong again next year."

Sanchez fears a two-month absence

MANCHESTER - Alexis Sanchez fears he could miss up to two months with knee ligament damage suffered on Saturday.

The Manchester United forward was forced off seven minutes into the second half of the 3-2 win over Southampton after a collision with Jan Bednarek.

Chile's national team physio, Pedro Onate, claimed Sanchez is likely to miss between six and eight weeks. "We spoke to the player and he had scans on the injury (on Sunday)," Onate told El Mercurio.

"He will be available for the Copa America, but he will be unavailable to play for between six and eight weeks. "The medial ligament strain is an annoying injury but not such a complex one." Sanchez's absence represents a significant blow for Ole Gunnar Solskjaer, who could be without up

to 10 stars for tomorrow's Champions League date with Paris Saint-Germain.



NAPLES - Juventus closed all talk of a challenge to their Serie A dominance after coming through a second-half onslaught at Napoli to win 2-1 in an engrossing match that saw each side have a man sent off and stretch their lead at the top to a huge 16 points.

Massimiliano Allegri's unbeaten leaders have now as good as sealed their eighth straight Serie A title after a match that looked dead at half-time with Juve two goals and a man up, but sparked back into life when goalscorer Miralem Pjanic was sent off for handling a Napoli pass and picking up a second yellow card just after the break.

"I fell asleep, I should have replaced Pjanic when he had the first card. He was at risk, but I didn't expect him to handle," said Allegri, whose future at Juve is uncertain after what will be five seasons in Turin. "I already said we'll sit down to talk about this season and the next. I am very happy to be at Juventus." Midfielder Pjanic swept home his free-kick opener in the 28th minute, which came immediately after Napoli were reduced to 10 men, thanks to goal-keeper Alex Meret slicing down Cristiano Ronaldo after the Portuguese nipped in

Pogba criticism total nonsense - Ferdinand

LONDON - Rio Ferdinand has branded the criticism aimed at Paul Pogba earlier this season "total nonsense", with the former Manchester United star claiming to have never had any doubt that a World Cup winner would come good.

Despite helping to lead France to global glory on Russian soil in 2018, a highly-rated midfielder struggled to make his mark on a domestic scene when the current Premier League campaign got underway.

Reports of a rift with then Red Devils boss Jose Mourinho did Pogba's cause few favours, with the 25-year-old stripped of vice-captaincy duties before eventually being unceremoniously dropped to the bench.

Questions were asked of his form and future as the January transfer window approached, but United acted before the turn of the calendar year to relieve Mourinho of his duties and draft in Ole Gunnar Solskjaer.

Pogba has thrived under a member of United's 1999 Treble-winning squad, with United's £89 million (\$118m) record signing now delivering the talismanic performances expected of him.

Ferdinand believes such a turnaround was always likely, with the ex-Red Devils defender telling Planet Football: "A lot of people wrote Pogba off, said he wasn't trying hard enough, said he was not good enough to play for United, but I knew that was nonsense, total nonsense.

"This is a guy who has already won so much in his career, who scored in a World Cup final last summer and people were saying he wasn't up to the task of playing at the highest level? Give me a break. "Instead of picking out the negatives

and trying to find what Pogba can't do, find the positives and realise that he is the most effective midfielder in the Premier League when he is played in his proper position and utilised in the right way.

"Ole and Micky [Phelan] didn't need


long to understand how to get the best out of Pogba and almost from the moment they arrived, his performances changed. The same can be said of Marcus Rashford, Anthony Martial and a few others because they are now enjoying their football again."

Ferdinand believes Pogba

now has the potential to help United rediscover the glory days of the past, with Solskjaer's arrival as interim boss having breathed new life into the club.

He concedes that a number of mistakes have been made in recent seasons, particularly in the transfer market, but there is now the promise of better times to



POLICE FINE UNRULY SUPPORTER E500, NO RECEIPT



SOCCER - A Mbabane Highlanders supporter claims she was made to pay E500 for misconduct at Somhlolo National Stadium this past Sunday and was not issued with a receipt by the police.

The supporter in question is the woman who was hauled away by police during the team's 1-0 loss to Matsapha United after a can appeared to have found its way onto the pitch after referee; Letticia Vienna, failed to award a penalty when Thabiso Mokenkoane was brought down inside the box in the second half. Highlanders' supporters were in the process of assaulting the female supporter when police came to her rescue and led her away through the royal box enclosure. Police disappeared with her beyond the stands as they alleged she had too much to drink and was behaving in a disorderly manner. Interviewed later, the woman acknowledged the police warning and said she obliged and left the stadium. However, before she could go, the police allegedly ordered her to pay a fine of E500, which she said she paid. "They even refused to allow me to take my shoes, hence was forced to leave the stadium barefoot," she said. The supporter, who declined to have her name published for fear of victimisation, added that when the referee made a decision against her team, she did not agree with it. "I agree that throwing the can onto the field was wrong. I agreed to pay the fine because I was afraid that they would arrest me or ban me from the stadium if I did not," said the supporter. The supporter says she wondered as she travelled back home to Manzini if the police had not taken the money for their own benefit. When contacted Assistant Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Nosipho Mnguni said there was nothing on record with the police. She also stated that police who are stationed at the stadiums were only there to maintain order and safety. "They do not make a person to pay fines as that is the responsibility of the football authorities." She further advised the said supporter to report the matter to the police so that investigations could be made.
