About 63 000 SIM cards to be suspended from MTN network

OVER 60 000 MTN Eswatini users will be suspended from tomorrow when the mobile telecommunications giant switches off their SIM cards.

These are users whose SIM cards have not been registered with the network, in an exercise known as Vela through which every customer is mandated to register their SIM cards.

According to MTN Corporate Affairs Manager Mandla Luphondvo, a total of 63 302 SIM cards would be suspended from the network.

The aim is to eventually de-register users who fail to comply with the Subscriber Registration Regulation of 2016 which requires that they should be registered.


According to Luphondvo, these numbers will not be temporarily interrupted as it has been happening through multiple pre-emptive disruptions which were an attempt to remind customers to register their SIM cards. This time, he disclosed, the numbers would be suspended on the MTN network until they are fully registered.

Luphondvo also revealed that they have registered at least 872 913 SIM cards

"According to the latest statistics 21 298 prepaid customers remain partially registered while 42 004 are still not registered," Luphondvo added.

He further disclosed that 6 094 SIM registrations were rejected but have an opportunity to re-register through submission of a national identity document and proof of residence.

Luphondo has reminded these customers who have so far not showed up to register their SIM cards this week, saying that MTN Eswatini has applied another pre-emptive disruption before ultimate suspension of unregistered numbers tomorrow.



DAY CARE CENTRES DEATH

THEY are the place where parents seek refuge for the safety and care of their young ones, while they fulfil their obligations in the places of work.

However, it turns out that day care centres are now literally death traps with an average of a child's death a month in a day care.

Negligence, irresponsibility and carelessness are usually the main causes of infant mortality.

Since the turn of the year, there have been 13 reported deaths at day care facilities. This seemingly growing trend evoked a dire need to do something about the issue as there were fears the trend

could increase.

Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Superintendent Phindile Vilakati said the main responsibility resided with parents as they were the ones who left their children in day cares. Vilakati said the police together with other relevant stakeholders were currently engaged in a nation-wide campaign of visiting and verifying all day care centres were

operating legally and offered the standard and proper environments for caring for children of various ages.

She urged the public to assist the police with identifying illegally operating day care centres as some of them are based in residential areas which would prove challenging for the police to identify them. She added that the crime prevention units from all 24 police stations around the country were engaged in the clean-up campaign. Vilakati insisted that parents should take it upon themselves to conduct background checks of such facilities.

Minister tables Bill to improve Building Society

THOUSANDS of Building Society customers stand a chance to own shares at the bank.

The ministry of finance last month tabled the Building Societies (Amendment) Bill 2019 for deliberation and possible adoption.

In the first reading of the bill yesterday, Minister Neal Rijkenberg said the bill aimed to amend the Building Societies Act of 1962, primarily to allow for a building society to be incorporated as a company in accordance with the Companies Act.

He mentioned that the Swaziland Building Society (SBS) was established in 1962 and was a major provider of long term mortgage lending and savings products in Eswatini. "As a Building Society, the products offered by SBS are relatively limited and largely constrained by the Building Societies Act."

The minister said over the years, there has been a change in customer profile, increasing regulatory requirements and limited agility due to the legal framework under which the society operated.

He added that SBS was now facing key challenges including sustainability and being restricted by the Building Societies Act. He also stated attractiveness of the SBS in the open market was limited due to how a building society was structured and governed as well as a

limited range of products.

Sustainability

He said one of the solutions to ensure sustainability of the SBS conversion of the building society into a bank was envisaged to address the challenges listed above. He said the amendment of the Building Societies Act would allow for the SBS to operate as a commercial bank, thus increasing the number of services provided by the soci-

Senator Prince Magudvulela and Senator Princess Ntfombiyenkhosi commended the minister for taking action towards amendment of the act as it was long overdue.

The senators also enquired how

the conversion of the SBS would benefit customers and citizens in general.

Amendment

The minister said currently, there was one building society in the county and the amendment of the act would also open the door for future societies to become companies as well as commercial banks.

He stated that the host of services for any normal bank which include micro-lending, savings accounts and being able to transfer between accounts would be improved by the conversion of the society into a bank.

The minister said a lot of the banks in the country were owned outside and this would be the first bank that would be owned locally by Emaswati, who are also customers of the institution.

"What would be very special about SBS when it does become a bank would be having all the services and facilities available which would result in the profitability of the bank increasing," he said.

The minister also said the shareholders of the bank would be the current SBS members or customers who would automatically become shareholders.

He stated that automatically there would be a few thousand people that are currently members who would become shareholders at the bank and the bank would be 100 per cent owned by Emaswati.

He stated that opening up services was creating a bank that would be profitable, and have a part to play in the country's economy.

She also urged parents to conduct investigations on the capabilities and training of the day care employees. She said day care centres children were of various ages and needed specific attention depending on their ages and also provided with properly capacitated individuals.

"Parents should not only be attracted by lower rates without having conducted proper background checks on the facility before entrusting them with the care of their children," she said.

She also urged the day care owners and operators to ensure they hired people with the relevant qualifications and training to be able to offer the best care to children under their watch.

Husband denied bail for hacking wife with axe

A man who was arrested for hacking his wife with an axe was denied bail by the court due to the severity of her injuries.

Sabelo Dlamini of Hlobane was arrested and charged with contravening the Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence Act, after he was alleged to have assaulted his wife Siphiwe Shabangu by hacking her with an axe several times all over her body.

Dlamini was said to have committed this offence on Monday.

During his appearance before Magistrate Temantimandze Shongwe yesterday, the prosecution represented by Chris Sibandze applied for Dlamini to be remanded into custody until August 16, pending the setting of his trial date. Before Sibandze could inform the court that Dlamini's bail was opposed, the accused interjected, citing reasons why the court should grant him

"Your Worship, I plead with the court to grant me bail so I can await trial at home. Because of my wife's hospitalisation due to the incident, there is no one at home taking care of my children and livestock. As we speak, the livestock is currently locked up as there is no one to release it,"

Dlamini explained. Sibandze informed the court that the prosecution applies for bail for Dlamini to be opposed, as his wife was still hospitalised as she was being treated for her injuries. "The prosecution would like to monitor the complainant's recovery process, which it is not sure of at the moment. She is still hospitalised and once her condition improves, we can apply for bail. The charges against Dlamini can still be amended according to whether she recovers, or not," Sibandze explained.

A dejected Dlamini was seen walking out of the accused's dock with his head hanging in disappointment, after the magistrate granted the prosecution its application to oppose bail.

200 people go missing in three months

MISSING persons reports continue to rise as over 200 persons were reported missing in a space of three months.

Every now and again, the Royal Eswatini Police Service (REPS) releases statements requesting the public to assist them in searching for people who have been reported missing by their families or relatives. According to the REPS performance report on recurrent and capital expenditure for the period of April to June, reports of missing persons continue to escalate and pose a security threat. The report indicated that most instances resulted from crimes such as human trafficking, murder and suicides.

During the period under review,

a total of 219 cases of missing persons were reported. Of these reported persons, 165 persons were located alive, three were found dead whilst 51 were still under active police investigations.

The trend indicated that there were more reported cases of missing persons that were female compared to cases for males as out of

the 219 reported cases 142 were females compared to 77 cases for males.

The statistics also indicated that there were more cases of missing persons under the age of 17. Under the age of 17, 99 cases were reported, between the ages of 18 and 24 there were 70 cases while 50 cases were for persons above the age of 25. There are various factors attributed to the increase of missing persons ranging from domestic violence related matters, extramarital affairs, female minors below the age of 17 eloping with boyfriends to male adults disappearing in search of employment opportunities without reporting to their relatives.

SNAT goes to court over TSC chairmanship

THE Swaziland National Association of Teachers (SNAT) has promised to challenge the **Teaching Service Commission** Chairperson Simanga Mamba's appointment in court.

SNAT says it is challenging his term of office in court and

will today launch its legal bid to have it nullified.

According to a SNAT National Executive Council (NEC) statement issued by the SNAT Secretary General Sikelela Dlamini, they have a date in court this morn-

SNAT alleges that Mamba has been the commissioner for more than the required number of years. The association says this is against the Constitution Act of 2005.

The secretary general claims that Mamba has been passing verdicts that saw many members of the association losing their jobs.

Alleges

It further alleges that Mamba did all of that while his membership in the commission is questionable.

"Since this case is not an industrial matter, rather a constitutional one, the same shall be argued at the High Court of the land," reads part of the statement.

The association further alleges that Mamba has been deployed to deal with SNAT President Mbongwa Dlamini.

Mbongwa also confirmed that despite Mamba being sworn-in yesterday, they are keen to argue the case in court. He said Mamba's swearing in does not change the fact that he is illegally occupying office.

Govt must include cultural competitions in schools budget

THE Ministry of Education and Training wants government to budget for the cultural competitions so that all learners can participate.

Minister of Education and Training Lady Howard Mabuza said this has been resolved after it had been reported that primary schools' participation in the annual competitions was low due to the Free Primary Education (FPE).

This, according to the minister, resulted to the schools complaining that such events were not budgeted for, thus the institutions have no funds to foot the extra bills that come with joining the competitions. Currently, the total number of schools that participate in the various activities under culture, drama and theatre is 145; 120 high schools and 25 primary schools. The minister was speaking during the Schools Arts and Culture prize giving ceremony at the Macmillan Education Headquarters in Matsapha yesterday. She said beseeching the government to budget for these competitions was at par with the principles of inclusive education advocated for in the contemporary education landscape as well as her ministry's Policy Document that is geared to parity of education for all. In addition, Mabuza lauded Macmillan for its continued support to the ministry of education. She said the company's sponsorship resonated well with the newly introduced Competency-based Education (CBE) that primarily

aims at tapping on learners' creative and imaginative abilities.

The legislator also mentioned that her ministry, through the Culture Inspectorate to enforce that culture is taught as part of the school curriculum, has availed resource personnel and included culture in school timetables. Speaking about her experience with learners during the competitions, the minister said the talent, excitement and dedication displayed by the learners guaranteed that learners were practically learning outside the domain of the classroom.

"It is hoped that when it comes to some of the cultural sections in the syllabus, it will be easier for them to relate and understand what is being taught," she said. Further, Mabuza said the contribution that Macmillan has made annually towards these competitions for the past four years amounts to E850 000. Directing to the executive of Macmillan, the minister said the government appreciated such partnership and contribution in the education of the Swati child. When making her remarks, Macmillan Education Managing Director (MD) Busisiwe Simelane said a child was not complete if they were only exposed to formal education because they also needed to be taught values of Emaswati.

"Macmillan's desire is to influence every child to respect culture. Our futuristic approach says some children are extremely talented in non-academic fields which must be thoroughly nurtured."

"The competition is important in moulding the character of the child which comes with the cultural

aspect of education," she said.

Meanwhile, Eswatini National Council of Arts and Culture (ENCAC) Chief Executive Officer (CEO) Stanley Dlamini said it was high time that pupils charged a fee for their services at events.

The CEO said this was to make them aware that their talents had a huge potential of rewarding them not only in applause and trophies, but also in monetary form


This way, according to Dlamini, children would grow up knowing how much their talent is valued as well as how much it could generate income for them. Dlamini also alluded to the fact that the success of the arts and culture competitions would not be possible without the dedication of teachers, principals and the ministry of education and training.

On another note, the CEO announced that his organisation would be taking five children who outperformed their peers in the Macmillan's Schools Arts and Culture Competition for the Heritage Environment of our History in Robben Island. The conference will be held from August 20 to 28, 2019 and the five children will come from the following categories; drum majorettes, *sibhaca*, *ummiso*, music and theatre.

He worked so hard with the team in improving laboratory diagnosis in all facilities in the country and later in clinics such that clinical diagnosis was done away with in the preceding years and all cases were microscopically diagnosed and later RDTswere used.

While working as a Program Manager, the country was awarded numerous awards for best performer in malaria control, at the level of SADC, AU and the WHO. Through his efforts, the program was elevated from Malaria Control to Malaria Elimination hence the decision by the afore-mentioned institutions to place it in the countries that were targeted to eliminate malaria by 2020. It is during his tenure that two field stations for malaria were built in Ngomane and another in Big bend with donor funds and no contribution from government. It is also during his era that the country got millions of Emalangeni from the Global Fund which money was used to supplement government funding to the program.

In August 2015, he was promoted to the position of Under Secretary (Administration) in the Ministry. He continued working hard and being a trendsetter even in this portfolio.

Mr Kunene was a man of astounding character and intelligence, hardworking and a valuable resource to the Ministry of Health and to the country at large. The Highlights of his career as articulated above, serve as testament of his commitment and passion for his work.





ARBITRATOR WAS PARTIAL IN E30M AWARD TO MEDSCHEME - SWAZI MED

High Court

AS the Swaziland Medical Aid Fund also known as Swazi Med, Medscheme court battle over E30 million award continues, Swazi Med alleges that the arbitrator was biased when granting the award.

Senior attorney representing Swazi Med in his six-hour submission before a High Court fullbench, told the court that the arbitrator, Judge Philip Levinson was impartial when granting the award in favour of Medscheme which leaves a lot to be desired.

Mangaliso Magagula from Mbabane based law firm Magagula, Hlophe Attorneys was making his final submissions since he began arguing the matter on Tuesday morning.

He submitted that Medscheme did not deserve the E30 million award

The full bench compries Judges Mbutfo Mamba, Cyril Maphanga



and Doris Tshabalala at the High Court. Swazi Med had instituted action proceedings in an application in which it seeks to have the award set aside.

Magagula informed the court that Medscheme was happy to get the E30 million, while his client A Member of AfroCentric Group

medscheme

was still adversely affected by the judgment handed down by Judge Levinson. He submitted that the amount of E30 million was too much and Medscheme did not deserve it as they did not in any way sweat for it.

Case postponed to next session, advocates fly back home

AFTER Senior Attorney Mangaliso Magagula's six-hour submissions, it transpired that the matter could not proceed yesterday afternoon.

After his submissions which began on Thesday, Judget Mannba threw the ball in add vocate Paul Kennedy's court as it was time for him to argue the matter. Advocates Kennedy and Christien Bester are instructed by senior attorney Kenneth Motsa from Robinson Bertram

law firm in the matter.

However, advocate Kennedy asked the court's indulgence and indicated that from what they had discussed with his learned friend lawyer Magagula, it transpired that the matter would need to be postponed as Magagula was expected to have an urgent meeting after the lunch adjournment.

Advocate Kennedy also indicated that both he and advocate Bester were also expected to catch a flight in the afternoon, hence they felt there would not be enough time to argue the matter.

"My Lords and Lady we have had occasion to discuss with my learned friend who indicated that he has a meeting, and we are also expected to catch our flight this afternoon, I do not think it would be possible to have the matter continue at this stage, I would need about two hours for my submis-

sions and Magagula would need time to reply, we think a postponement is best at this stage," advocate Kennedy said.

Judge Mamba indicated to counsel that the matter would have to be postponed to the next session of the High Court owing to the fact that the court takes a break on August 16 up until September.

After securing dates in their diary, the matter was then postponed to September 30 for continuation where advocate Kennedy is expected to make his submissions.

MAN'S LIFELESS BODY FOUND FLOATING IN A DAM

A man from Ka-Mfishane under Mtsambama constituency who went missing over a week ago was found dead and floating in a dam near a farm.

It is still unclear as to what happened to Mfiki Sibusiso Mamba (37) who disappeared at home on July 28.

His lifeless body was found Tuesday floating in a dam.

Mamba' who earned a living through piece jobs in the community left many unanswered questions. A search for him started after relatives could not find him in his house as he was last seen there.

Police from Ka-Phunga have taken the body for a postmortem so as to ascertain the cause of death.

His close relative Mfanasibili Maphalala said he was well known in the community and was of great assistance to residents.

Maphalala said on Tuesday Mamba's lifeless body was discovered by a man from the area who was on his way to a hammer mill inside the dam.

"The passerby realised that it was the same person we were looking for and raised an alarm.

The dam is located almost 2km away from his home, we still do

not know how he died, it's a puzzle that police are still trying to solve. Today (Wednesday), the police took the corpse for a postmortem. Maybe we will know what happened once pathologists provide their findings," said Maphalala.

Meanwhile, the area's Member of Parliament Simo Shongwe sounded shocked when informed about the incident.

He said everything should be left to the police to find out what happened.

Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Superintendent Phindile Vilakati confirmed the matter. She said police were still investigating.

Chiefs to become marriage officers

CHIEFS will soon be marriage officers under the Marriage Bill of 2017.

This was said yesterday by Zandile Dlamini (nee Matse) from the chambers of the Attorney General (AG). Dlamini was making a presentation about the Bill to Members of Parliament (MPs) who are members of the portfolio committee of the Deputy Prime Minister's Office (DPMO).

The MPs were having a workshop on this Bill at the Parliament conference room. Dlamini said under this legislation, the chiefs and Tindvuna would be made marriages officers, who would sign each time a marriage was taking place under their jurisdiction.

Dlamini said this would be the case in customary marriages taking place at chiefdoms around the country. In case of civil marriages, marriage officers could constitute pastors and other important officials who had the necessary qualifications.

Dlamini said this piece of legislation was aimed at aligning the marriage issues with the Constitution of 2005, which gave equal rights to both women and men. The Marriages Bill of 2017 would repeal the Marriages Act of 1964, which had many contents that were not consistent with the Constitution.

For example, the Marriages Act of 1964 was enacted by the British government when the country was still under the British protectorate. The legislation did not consider the customary marriage and did not give equal right to both men and women.

The Marriages Bill of 2017 would consider customary marriages and would align itself with the Constitution.

Dlamini said it would be imperative, under this law, that marriages should be registered. During the process of registration, those who had objections to marriages would be given a chance to register the objections.

Mbongeni Mlangeni, who is a

police officer, said there were so many cases reported to them where people were victims to such abuse.

Mlangeni said the executives would have to be careful because even if they committed such crimes in faraway countries like Japan, they would come back to the country and face the wrath of the law.

He said that would be criminal because the executive would have taken the subordinate to a place where he knew that the subordinate would have nowhere to run.

This would be tantamount to rape because the sex would have been forced by the executive at a place where the subordinate would not be able to oppose the sexual advancement, for fear of being left out in the middle of nowhere.

Mlangeni said sexual harassment in the workplace was real and it had to be uprooted.

Some executives would even go to an extent of taking overseas vacations with the subordinates to have sex with them.

Some ladies had a real challenge from their bosses such that they were no longer willing to go to their workplaces. However, they would be forced to go there because that was their place of livelihood.

One lady, according to Mlangeni, once related that every time she had to be promoted, she had to have sex with her superior.

There was nothing she could do about the situation because this was her only source of livelihood and she had children back home, which she had to take care of.

2 housebreaking pupils beg for freedom

TWO Form Five pupils arrested for housebreaking and theft, yesterday begged for freedom at the High Court as they want out of jail in order to sit for their external examination.

The two whose names have been deliberately withheld for ethical reasons, were arrested by the Matsapha, Sigodvweni police and charged with four counts of house breaking with intent to steal around Nhlambeni

Through their lawyer Musa Dlamini of Makhosi Vilakati Attorneys, the two pleaded with the High Court judge to have their E10 000 bail granted by the Manzini Magistrate Court, varied as they cannot afford to pay his suprissions which .ams

They said that that they could afford to pay E3 000 in cash and E71000 in lastorm of a surety and after the crown represented by senior crown counsel Khumbulani Mngomezulu indicated that it was not opposed, Judge Nkosinathi Maseko granted the review application order.

Spree

According to the charge sheet, the two allegedly went on a housebreaking spree as they are said to have on the first count on or about March 28 at or near Nhlambeni broke into a house belonging to Themba Dlamini with intent to steal and did thereby steal items worth E25 200.

On the second count they allegedly broke in another house belonging to Mandla Ngwenya within the same area and stole a Sumsung Galaxy cell phone, tablet, computer set, hard drive, cell phone for VITU money amounting to E250 and food stuffs valued at E3 875.

On the third count they broke into the house of Sipho Hlophe with the intent to steal and did thereby steal from him two bicycles valued at E2 700.

Meanwhile on the last count they unlawfully, and with intent broke into a house belonging to Nkosinathi Phungwanyo and stole a brush cutter valued at E10 000.

By the time this report was compiled, they had still not deposited the bail amount with the treasury department.

Sharing nude pictures can attract SODV charges

BY sending nude pictures through social media, one risks being charged under the SODV Act.

Sending the nude pictures could attract charges under Section 47 of the Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence (SODV) Act of 2018, which talks about flashing. However, the pictures have to show genitals and have to prove that the recipients did not consent to receiving the pictures.

Futhi Gamedze, who is a lawyer from the chambers of the Director of Public Prosecutions (DPP) said it was dangerous to share such pictures on social media like WhatsApp and Facebook groups.

She said this yesterday during the meeting of Members of Parliament (MPs) who are members of the portfolio committee of the Deputy Prime Minister' Office (DPMO).

The MPs met at the Parliament conference room to discuss matters under the DPMO, which included SODV and the Marriages Bill of

Gamedze made an example of a video footage that recently circulated on social media, in which former South African Minister of Home Affairs Malusi Gigaba played with

his manhood.

Gamedze said if Gigaba was a native of this country, with the SODV Act being in full force, he could sue many people.

The reason he could sue was because his pictures were circulated without his consent and he was in a private space when he played with his manhood.

The people who later circulated

the video footage could also risk being charged if the recipients of the video did not consent to have the video footage sent to them.

She made the Gigaba example after she told a story of a certain man who asked a woman out through

The woman did not know the man, but the man insisted that he knew the woman.

The woman was not interested in entertaining the man because she did not know him. This led to a situation where the woman would ignore messages from the man.

This annoyed the man to a point of telling the woman that she did not have to ignore his messages because he had made love with girls who were prettier than her.

He started sending nude pictures of the girls he claimed he had slept with. That was before he started sending pictures of his erect manhood to the lady.

Meanwhile, Gamedze said courting (kusoma) was legal. It did not mean that people were no longer allowed to court because of the presence of the SODV Act.

She said some girls were starting to complain that they were no longer courted because of the fear of the SODV Act. The only thing that the Act was against was the unlawful stalking.

Unlawful stalking, according to Gamedze, constituted instances where fear would be induced to a person that is being courted. In most instances, the person courting would not say words to the person who is stalked.



Man fined E15 000 for over 130kg dagga

important sufficiency of ymater is for the economy.

THE courts are intent on cleaning the forests of illegal dagga dealers, as yet another dagga dealer faces five years in prison for being in possession of dagga without a licence.

Misela Nkambule (40) of Mfeni was arrested and charged with contravening two counts under the Pharmacy Act and Opium and Habit Forming Drugs Act, when he was found to have been in possession of 130.2 kilograms of dagga, and 1.1 kilograms of dagga seeds.

Nkambule was found to have been in possession of the large consignment of the illegal herb at Mfeni area on June 14, without a licence or permit to do so.

Appearance

During his appearance before Principal Magistrate Fikile Nhlabatsi, the forensic report submitted as evidence stated that the consignment was indeed dagga, and it held the scientific name 'African dagga'.

Initially, Nkambule had been arrested with his wife Thulisile Dlamini (23), however, the charges were later withdrawn.

During mitigation, Nkambule pleaded with the court to grant

> "All the dagga found at my home was all that I had. I no longer have any money, or any dagga to sell to make money. I plead with the court to allow me to pay my fine in instalments," Nkambule pleaded.

> > Sentence

Before passing sentence, Principal Magistrate Nhlabatsi informed Nkambule that the court considered the weight and quality of the consignment he was found with.

She also informed Nkambule that the court had considered the prevalence of this offence in the country, as there were an alarming number of cases where people were arrested for being found in possession of the illegal herb without a licence or

Nkambule was subsequently sentenced to pay a fine of E15 000 and in default of payment, serve five years in a correctional facility for being found in possession of over 130 kilograms of dagga. He was further sentenced to pay a fine of E2 000 and in default of payment, two years in prison for the dagga seeds.

MONTIGNYSNIFFER DOGSREADYTOHE

MONTIGNY Investments continues to extend a helping hand to communities in its surroundings by offering sniffer dog services free of charge.

This was revealed by professional dog trainer Ian Pienaar from the Montigny K9 Academy in Mhlambanyatsi.

The company's assistance to the communities around Usutu comes under strict conditions and procedures that must be followed.

"Before we offer assistance to the community, a case must have been reported to the police," he said.

Pienaar said they wanted to assist the police solve criminal cases and ensure that offenders were caught and brought before justice.

The Montigny K9 Academy was started in May 2015 with just two special breed dogs that were originally bought from the Republic of South Africa.

Today, the academy boasts of 20 dogs, the products of the original two and they play an important role in protecting the forest and neighbouring communities. According to Pienaar, the 20 bloodhounds began their training at just three days old and have made great progress.

He said the sniffer dogs have accomplished an impressive success rate of 90 per cent in retrieving stolen property and apprehending criminals and have completed a total of 336 missions.

305 of those missions were success-

Pienaar said the unsuccessful missions could only be attributed to cross border activities.

Offenders

"Some offenders cross over to neighbouring countries, such as South Africa, and this proves a challenge for us. The red-tape makes it impossible to follow leads into South Africa," said Pienaar.

The high success rate is evidence enough that the dogs have been effective in reducing criminal activities, especially in the areas near the forest.

Some weeks ago, the sniffer dogs aided the police in apprehending rape and murder suspect Nkhosing'phile Mbuso Setilo. Pienaar said unauthorised honeyharvesting had declined immensely, thanks to the sniffer dogs who track down offenders.

He added that the company's strategy of incentivising community members who find beehives has been a major contribution.

"To reduce the risk of fires from honey harvesting, the company gives E30 per beehive spotted and harvests the honey on behalf of the person," said Pienaar Attack.

The company has long been plagued with arson attacks that have seen it suffer damages in millions of Emalangeni. However, the introduction of the sniffer dogs has increased the successful tracking of offenders. Pienaar mentioned that in the past the company experienced 168 forest fires per year, which were connected to arson, but they have decreased to only three. "It is a commendable achievement looking at where the company stood in previous years," said Pienaar.

He revealed that the winds experienced in late July present some challenges to the company. Just a few days ago, some parts of the forest were destroyed due to forest fires. "In fact, 10 fire incidences were reported in the last two weeks, which were fortunately spotted by security personnel and put out; but they did cause sizeable damage," said Pienaar.

On May 21 this year, Yster was called out to a break-in case at a local shop, outside the forest.

The break-in happened during the previous night, and entry was made through a window. A clear track was seen and identified as the suspect's track. Yster started on the track at 1010 hours, and followed the trail for 2.52 kilometres. The suspect's track was seen by the tracking team every now and again as they moved. Finally, Yster entered the same homestead on three occasions after checking all around that homestead for scent. The police continued to investigate the three young male suspects living at that homestead.

Woman divorces hubby for absenteeism

A woman has filed an application before the Magistrate's Court seeking an order to annul her six-year old marriage after her husband deserted her for several months.

Nomzamo Mavimbela has filed the application against Mbuyiseni Mavimbela on the grounds that he has neglected his responsibilities of taking care of his family. The applicant stated that she got married to the love of her life through civil rights after they dated for about a year. She alleged that their relationship was rosy until a time when she suspected that her husband was seeing another woman. She alleged that her suspicions were eventually confirmed after she found romantic text messages between her husband and the other woman. Moreover, the applicant claimed that her husband started spending some few nights away from home, something which eventually became a common occurrence. She stated that her husband's behaviour had deprived her of conjugal rights for a number of months. For these reasons, the applicant seeks for an order declaring her marriage as null and void.

Acknowledged

It is acknowledged that the Sexual and Domestic Violence Act of 2018 also describes the act of desertion as one which may warrant a divorce.

The Act states that a spouse may be granted a decree of divorce when it is proven that she or he had been deprived of conjugal rights for a period of three months or above.

In this case, the respondent is yet to file his responding papers, upon which the allegations levelled against him will be tested. In some instances, a divorce may be granted when the respondent does not oppose to the application.

WOMAN ASSAULTS ROOMMATE

A 24-year-old woman of Sidwashini under Chief Mgodzi has been fined E300 for assaulting her roommate over electricity units.

Palesa Kunene unlawfully and intentionally assaulted one Phephile Motsa with fists and kicks several times with the intention to cause her grievously bodily harm.

Motsa then reported the matter to the police. She pleaded not guilty to the offence. Motsa told the Eswatini National Court that she shared an apartment with the accused.

She said on August 2, she switched off the main switch leading to their

electricity supply after Kunene had exhausted electricity units.

"At our apartment, she brings in her friends and they finish electricity units. So I then decided to switch off the main switch with the intention to get her attention and possibly make her buy the units, however Kunene then started assaulting me," said Motsa. Motsa said she was seated on top of her bed when the defendant suddenly attacked her.

"She slapped me on the face and the rest of the body several times. She also kicked me," said Motsa

Kunene was sentenced to five months in custody with the option to pay a fine of E300. Presiding over the matter was Court President Chief Mabhedla Hlophe.





Wife wants in-laws interdicted from hubby's pension, death benefits

High Court

HER husband died while working for Matsapha based sweets company Mondalez (Pty) Ltd. Now the woman has taken her inlaws to court where she has filed an urgent application interdicting the company from paying out any monies from the pension and death benefits of her late husband.

Nelisiwe Valeria Dlamini (nee Mdluli) is also seeking an order declaring her father and mother-inlaw Wilson Dlamini and Esther Dlamini (nee Makuwa) as undeserving beneficiaries of her late husband's pension or death benefits.

She is further seeking an order setting aside a decision by the company to grant the two 95 per cent and only five per cent of the pension and death benefits of her husband Madoda Sameony Dlaminto her.

Represented by Manzinir based lawyer Thabiso Fakudze of Fakudze Attorneys, the applicant (Nelisiwe) of Kwaluseni in her founding affidavit submitted that she was married to her husband who passed on in October 27, 2018 after succumbing to an illness.

Prior to his death, he was employed by the first respondent (the company) and the second and third respondents are his biological parents.

Mondalez is the company that was formerly known as Cadbury based at the industrial hub of the Kingdom of Eswatini.

According to the marriage certificate annexed to the application, she married the deceased through common law in September 30, 2007.

When her husband met her death, he was already staying at his parental homestead according to the appli-

She averred that upon his death, the death was communicated to her by her in-laws telephonically and she duly proceeded to process the death certificate and produced same to the company.

It was then that the company deposited a sum of E20 000 towards the funeral expenses and a further E15 000 was contributed by SwaziMed hence she bought a casket worth E30 000 and the balance was used to cater for the remaining funeral expenses, adding that she was assisted by the human resources officer at Mondalez.

EVERYTHING

She further informed the court that after the funeral had been conducted, her mother-in-law told her that she wanted everything that belonged to her (Nelisiwe's) husband, inclusive of the pension and death benefits.

"She informed me that if I hid anything from her she would dig it up hence I went to the company and advised them of what she had said where I was promised that I should not worry as they would process the benefits on my behalf," she submitted.



She told the court that at no point in time did her mother-in-law accept her as her daughter-in-law such that when her husband deserted their matrimonial home she (mother- in-law) was instrumental in seeing to it that they do not get back together.

She mentioned that before her husband left their matrimonial home, he had already signed the nomination form for his death benefits and he requested that she makes a copy of their marriage certificate which he submitted to his employer.

MEETING

She contended that a meeting was scheduled by the first respondent (company) which took place on Monday this week where the human resources manager told her that the company has decided to grant her in-laws 95 per cent of the pension benefits and she (Nelisiwe) was only entitled to five per cent.

"I objected to the decision of the first respondent of paying out any monies to the second and third respondents. I advised that I would seek legal assistance and the manager said I was at liberty to do so, hence the present application," she submitted.

She submitted that when she enquired on how much were the pension benefits, the manager refused to give her the details.

The applicant also raised another issue of their child where she stated that she was advised by the manager to take the child and undergo a DNA test as the family was of the view that the child was not fathered by the deceased.

The manager, according to Nelisiwe, further undertook to make three quotations and an appointment for the child to undergo the tests which took her by surprise as this was outside the scope of her employment as a human resources manager.

She submitted that the matter is urgent by virtue of the fact that the company has decided to act on its decision adding that it is likely that the payment has already been made to the two.

NERCHA orients HIV/AIDS

THE National Emergency Response Council on HIV/AIDS (NERCHA) has oriented Members of Parliament (MPs) of the HIV/AIDS sessional committee.

NERCHA National Director Khanya Mabuza said it was critical for his organisation to advocate political commitment towards HIV/AIDS.

He said the orientation was meant to help the committee understand the national and global dynamics which included advocating for HIV/AIDS to be part of the national agenda.

"It is also about making them understand the oversight function, that it is multi-sectoral as different ministries each have a role to play, including resource allocation. They will also ensure that HIV activities are disseminated, decentralised and implemented in their various constituencies," he said.

"I know of countries that have had a turnaround in a negative way," he said. HIV/AIDS Sessional Committee Chairman Strydom Mpanza said they were familiarising themselves with NERCHA's work and how they could cooperate with the sessional committee in Parliament.

Obligation

He said as MPs they had an obligation with legislative and policy formation on how NERCHA worked.

Their responsibility was understanding NERCHA's function even in budget issues, how they could influence towards reaching vision 2022 of having zero HIV cases in the country.

"We deliberated on how we would work on HIV issues, if there are existing bottlenecks how we would tackle those and how to deal with different terms of population services. Above all, we were impressed to discover that as a country we have reached a milestone of decreased incidence and death rates tremendously," he said.

Mpanza added that they were hoping to work on a plan to look at wellness of parliamentarians as they were also part of the society.

He said both entities had strategies they had to incorporate and translate these into action as parliamentarians.

"It's just that these can change frequently as they are influenced by many things, including international latest dis-

'Keep suspect poachers in jail pending finalisation of trial'

DESPITE having been granted bail by the High Court, the four suspects charged for attempted poaching might spend more time in jail pending finalisation of their trial.

This follows an urgent application filed by the office of the Director of Public Prosecutions (DPP) seeking an order that the four be interdicted, restrained from enforcing a court order issued by Judge Sipho Nkosi which granted them bail fixed at E50 000.

The order stated that they were to pay E5 000 in cash as E45 000 was in a form of a surety, which they paid.

The four Sipho Mhlanga, Stanley Nhlakalufu, Isaac Mkhabela and Muzi Dlamini are facing a total of 14 counts raging from contravening the Game Act to contravening the Prevention of Corruption Act and murder.

Mhlanga has already paid the bail and was released from custody following the court order.

They were arrested by the Simunye

police and charged in that on August 11, 2017 at or near Hlane Royal National Park, the said accused persons either one or all of them acting jointly and in furtherance of a common purpose being occupants of a Nissan Sulphy and a Toyota Corolla did unlawfully attempt to hunt a specially protected game, a rhino.

One of their colleagues Lucky Mandlati Shabangu was killed during a shootout they had with the police and game rangers, hence the charge of murder.

Trial

According to Senior Crown Counsel Lomkhosi Dlamini in her affidavit filed before court, the trial of the respondents (suspects) has been proceeding before the High Court and the applicant (DPP) has to date led about 12 witnesses and trial might be concluded sooner.

She submitted that the order which the first respondent (Mhlanga) produced when he paid his bail is invalid and of no force or effect because it was subsequently by operation of the law superseded by the order of the Supreme Court.

The Supreme Court on appeal by the DPP, ordered that the matter be referred

back to the High Court for determination, hence the present application they have filed before court.

Flee

The first respondent (Mhlanga) upon being released fled to a place unknown, according to the crown, and indicators are that he will flee the jurisdiction of the Kingdom of Eswatini.

The other respondents are alleged to be making sneaky efforts to gain their freedom since they are aware that the first respondent is out of custody.

She submitted that court orders granting the four suspects bail have already been prepared by the office of the registrar of the High Court and they may pay anytime.

Matter

She averred that the matter is urgent because the first respondent has already benefited from the order challenged by the crown and may likely flee the jurisdiction of this country, which may make it difficult if not impossible to proceed with the trial.

The other respondents, according to Dlamini, are also armed with copies of the orders of the honourable court.

Man 'accidentally' kisses, fondles woman

A man charged with contravening the Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence (SODV) Act of 2018 told the court how he accidently kissed and fondled a woman, after he had spent the better part of the day drinking buganu.

Mfanasibili Dlamini (49) was arrested and charged with contravening the SODV Act after he was found to have, on January 27 at Ezulwini, kissed and fondled a woman.

During his appearance before Magistrate Sifiso Vilakati last Wednesday, Dlamini claimed that most of what happened that day was a blur, as he had spent the whole day drinking buganu.

"Your Worship, I do not want to lie and say that I remember much of what occurred that day. I had been drinking heavily and I could have done some things.

According to witnesses to the incident, I fondled and kissed that woman in my drunken stupor. All I remember is that I slipped and fell, so that must have happened when I committed the offence," Dlamini explained, much to the amusement of the court.

Magistrate Vilakati thus warned Dlamini about conducting himself in a disrespectful manner, and also advised him to stop drinking excessively.

"You are too old to have conducted yourself in such a manner. Stop drinking excessively so that you can avoid doing things that will land you in this court room," the magistrate cautioned.

Magistrate Vilakati further sentenced Dlamini to pay a fine of E1 000 and in default of payment, serverorié year in a correctional

Woman steals E6 400 from employer, business shuts down

WHILE thousands of young people remain idle due to unemployment, a young woman failed to conduct herself honourably when her thieving ways led to the demise of a business.

Nomphilo Dlamini (21) was arrested and charged with theft after she stole E6 400 from her employer Happiness Nhleko. Dlamini is said to have stolen the money in May at the National Fire Station in Mbabane, where she conducted the Mobile Money

According to evidence led by Nhleko before Magistrate Lenhle Zulu last Thursday, she had established an MTN Mobile Money business, and employed Dlamini to take care of the day to day transactions.

"I had gone to check how my business was doing, as I had other businesses that kept me busy. When I arrived, I asked Dlamini to show me the books, which I noted were in a good position.

However, when I asked to see the actual money in cash, it was when Dlamini informed me that she had left it at her home in Mpolonjeni and she only had E200 in her possession," Nhleko

Nhleko explained that she then called Dlamini's mother, who she asked to accompany them to her home so they could search for the money.

"As we were about to enter Dlamini's room, she confessed that she had loaned her brother El 300, and another amount of E2 000 she had paid towards a fine after she was arrested for having committed another offence.

The total amount of money I

had expected as proceeds was E6 400 which was reflected in the books. I asked her where the remaining balance was and she informed me that it had mysteriously gone missing. That was when Dlamini's mother suggested that we take her to the police station where I was likely to get answers," Nhleko stated.

Nhleko claimed that as a result of the loss of the E6 400, she had to shut down her business as she no longer had enough money to maintain it. Before passing Dlamini's sentence, Magistrate Zulu warned Dlamini about the consequences of her actions.

"You failed to practice a degree of trust with your employer, and a crime such as this is serious. With the thousands of unemployed people sitting idle because there are no jobs, your employer entrusted you with the proceeds of her business.

She had to shut her business down because of your actions. Being employed is a privilege, one that one needs to respect and be proud of," the magistrate warned.

Although Dlamini elected to remain silent when given an opportunity to tell the court why it should not find her guilty, she pleaded with the court to allow her to compensate Nhleko, as she had recently gained employment.

Magistrate Zulu granted Dlamini's application, sentencing her to pay a fine of E6 000, and in default of payment, serve two years in a correctional facility.

Dlamini's sentence was wholly suspended, on condition that she compensates Nhleko of her E6 400 on a monthly basis, with the last payment in June 2020.



importantly, an opportunity to forge vital business relationships with suppliers, producers, retailers, and processors," he said.





NEW TERTIARY STUDENTS EQUIPPED WITHHIVPREVENTIONINFORMAT



THE Swaziland HIV Measurement Survey 2 (SHIMS2) 2016-2017 indicates that HIV prevalence in young people aged 15-24 years was higher in ages 20-24 years (4.2 per cent males, 20.9 per cent females) than in ages 15-19 years (3.9 per cent males, 7.2 per cent females).

Further, among HIV-positive young people aged 15-24 years, about one-third (33.9 per cent) were unaware of their HIV-positive status (48.5 per cent males, 29.8 per cent females). Also, SHIMS2 points out that among HIV-positive young people aged 15-24 years who are living with HIV, over half (54.1 per cent) were aware of their HIV-positive status and on ART (46.8 per cent males, 56.1 per cent females) and that among HIV-positive young people aged 15-24 years, half (50.6 per cent) had suppressed viral loads (32.9 per cent males, 55.5 per cent females).

Some of these young people began their tertiary education this August, along with many others that are HIV-negative.

The tertiary environment itself is unforgiving and highly toxic so the group of young people beginning tertiary this year, will have a handful to deal with.

There are many personal freedoms and social interactions, which are unchartered waters for many freshmen. These new freedoms are quickly squashed by academic demands which are intellectually challenging, hence some, for one reason or another, do not meet the academic demands and then try to obtain "sexually trans-

Some freshmen face financial challenges regarding living quarters, travelling expenses and meals, which lead to rising trends of transactional relationships among themselves and with partners older than them - some as much as 10 years or more.

This situation exists for both the female and the male students and they themselves falling prey to those with financial means.

Also, the high levels of sexual networking and cultural and/or spiritual challenges that mean that there is silence around one's sexual orientation, add to ensuring that the tertiary environment offers great opportunities for HIV highrisk behaviour.



NERCHA ROLLING OUT **HIV PREVENTION PROGRAMME** AT TERTIARY

In its leadership role in the country's HIV and AIDS response, the National Emergency Response Council on HIV and AIDS (NERCHA)seeks to fully utilise all available resources (including human resource from different stakeholders) to benefit the people of Eswatini - especially the young people that are the future leaders of the country, but that are held under siege by HIV.

5th August, NERCHA kicked off the 2019 schedule of the "2019 Taking HIV and AIDS Information to Institutions of Higher Learning" programme, at the University of Eswatini (UNESWA) in Kwaluseni.

The programme is facilitated through the National HIV and AIDS Information and Training Centre (Info Centre) and strategic partners (AHF Eswatini, CHAPS, Eswatini Network of Young Positives, FLAS, PSI Eswatini, SNAP, UNFPA's Condomise Project, Matsapha City Council, MSF, Young Heroes and World Vision). The programme tailor-made for tertiary freshmen, aspires to cover all the various institutions of higher learning, countrywide.

New students are offered information on HIV and AIDS and related health issues through a series of activities developed for and targeting young people and rolled out during the orientation week of each institutions.

The programme design notes that with available technologies, especially social media, what young people need to know about HIV is a click away. This year, therefore, the programme endeavors to strengthen its presence on Facebook and other social platforms.

The programme recognises the difficulty faced by young people in figuring out their own personal roles in reducing their risk of HIV infection and provides the information needed to unravel this.

It is conscious too, that most young people find it difficult to think about and express how they feel about HIV, and avoid acknowledging how they feel because of fear, shame or the hurt arising from the loss of loved ones to HIV

The tertiary initiative hopes to persuade the new students to recognise that their lives matter enough for them to empower and protect themselves by accessing preventative care; to realise that caring for self is key and takes many

forms, one of which is to adopt "appropriate" behaviour so as not to contract HIV and not to spread it - if already infected.

PROGRAMME CONTENT

The largely HIV prevention-oriented information is delivered through an interactive programme that includes facilitated presentations, edutainment, videos, question and answer sessions, and the provision of a "Market-place" where partners have information desks as well as provide minimal services. The everpopular, fascinating and informative "The Inside Story" is once again the main feature film.

Though NERCHA and her partners continue to advocate for sexual abstinence or delayed sexual debut among young people, the reality is that the group starting college constitutes those that are already sexually active, those that will choose to start in college, and those that will want to keep their virginity.

To help provide information on how to practice safer sex, the programme continues to benefit from the experienced Lindiwe Malaza (Sexual Reproductive Health Unit, MoH) who offers an entertaining but educational presentation that includes viewing some "not-so-nice" pictures of sexually transmitted infections.

There are also presentations on "Basic HIV and AIDS Facts, including new prevention technologies" offered by the MoH through SNAP and the Public Health Unit, or MSF, depending on venue; "Family Planning" by FLAS; and "HIV Prevention and Condom Use" by the Condomise Project and PSI Eswatini.

The rest of the programme line-up includes a testimonial delivered by a member of the Eswatini Network of Young Positives (ENYP+) who addresses living positively with HIV. Edutainment

is provided by the FLAS Youth Action Movement, through theatre performances and dance that educates students about HIV and AIDS, in an entertaining manner.

To further spice up the programme and encourage participation, CHAPS Eswatini returns this year to deliver the popular educational Male Circumcision for HIV Prevention game outdoor game, Grassroots MC Soccer, for those institutions in Manzini and Shiselweni. The game involves both females and males in penalty shoot-outs, with the facilitators continuously engaging the players and the crowd in discussions around the various levels of the shootouts. Each level makes it more difficult for the shooter to score. The various scenarios that accrue from scored goals versus those missed, are used to represent the reduced or increased HIV risks that are a result of safer sexual practice or lack there off. In some institutions, CHAPS Eswatini has committed to also bring the popular Gedlembane and crew.

There is also a question and answer session for students to seek clarity on burning issues. These issues are earmarked for continued discussion on the newly established Facebook page, Youth Corner; and the NERCHA Facebook pages, as well as the NERCHA Website, for reference.

HIV testing and counseling (HTC) services will be provided by AIDS Healthcare Foundation, the Matsapha Town Council's mobile unit (for the tertiaries around the Matsapha area) and PSI Eswatini, who will also present a session on oral HIV self-testing as well as provide kits on as per dissemination standards.

PARTICIPATING INSTITUTIONS

The initial programme roll out which started at the University of Eswatini on Monday 5 August, saw all freshmen from the various campuses (Kwaluseni, Luyengo and Mbabane) and the Institute of Distance Education converge at the Sports Emporium in Kwaluseni.

The programme moved to Good Shepherd Nursing College yesterday; today, it is at Ngwane Teacher Training College in Nhlangano, and is at the William Pitcher Teacher Training College in Manzini tomorrow.

The Southern Africa Nazarene Universities (SANU) and Eswatini College of Technology (ECOT) will be visited on Tuesday 13 August and Wednesday 14 August, respectively. Tentatively, the programme ends at Gwamile VOCTIM 22 August, though there is still hope that Limkokwing University of Creative Technology (LUCT) will provide a date for the programme to visit the Mbabane Campus.

POSITIVE IMPACT

WHAT ARE THE DRIVERS OF VIOLENCE IN ESWATINI?

YESTERDAY Women and Law in Southern Africa (WLSA) engaged in a march against the increasing violence against women and children along with partner organisations.

These were made up of the Council of Swaziland Churches (CSC), Swaziland Action Group Against Abuse (SWAGAA), World Vision, Kwakha Indvodza (KI), Swaziland National Association of Teachers (SNAT), Trade Union Congress of Swaziland (TUCOSWA), Swaziland Union of Students (SNUS), Swaziland Rural Women's Assembly (SRWA), SOS Children's Village and Coalition of Informal Economy Associations of Swaziland (CIEAS).

The march was also attended by the Regional Member of Parliament for the Manzini region.

This march was triggered by the fact that over the past few months, we have been reading reports of women and children being murdered by their husbands/partners and fathers, respectively. With the Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence (SODV) Act having been passed into law, the question on many people's minds is why the violence and killings are continuing despite the harsh sentences that the Act prescribes.

It would appear that the violence is increasing rather than decreasing and this trend is worrying to say the least. Many are placing the blame of the "increase" on the enactment of the SODV Act, though they are unable to explain why they arrive at this supposition.

Perhaps the supposed "increase" is due to the fact that the offences are now all charged under the SODV Act, whereas previously, the offenders were charged under various provisions of the Criminal Procedure and Evidence Act and Common law.

Whatever the position may be, the prevalence of violence has reached alarming proportions and the country needs to declare it an emergency. Perhaps there is a need to address it in the same manner as the HIV pandemic was addressed, and design programmes specifically for this. Resources should be availed to drive the programmes for their effectiveness.

Before the programmes can be designed, there would need to be action research conducted to inform the interventions that would need to be implemented. The research would have to identify the drivers of violence to ensure that the programs will yield results.

Though a study was conducted on the drivers of violence against children, the findings would not be rel-

evant to the drivers of violence against women. The study commissioned by the Deputy Prime Minister's office in partnership with UNICEF was conducted and published in 2016, when there was no legislation dedicated to sexual and gender-based violence (SGBV) and within a different context.

Interventions

Among some of the interventions would perhaps be programmes specifically designed for perpetrators. Though it is acknowledged that the Correctional Services have programmes for offenders, they are more inclined towards rehabilitation and integration of convicts back into the communities from which they come.

The Correctional Services programmes are not necessarily reformative in nature, with the result of generating repeat offenders. There is also a supposition that perpetrators repeatedly commit the same offence because when in custody, they have all their basic needs taken care of; they have shelter, clothing, three meals a day and basic amenities taken care of by the state. They would trade their freedom for being

free from taking care of their responsibilities towards their families.

This then raises another question of whether the socio-economic situation of the country could be a contributing factor to the alarming rates of violence; the argument here being that men, out of frustration of being unable to provide for their families, then opt to kill them and end all their suffering

Differing views

There are so many differing views and opinions out there, that there is a need to address them all through research and not from assumptions and suppositions. These opinions are very detrimental to the fight against SGBV because they also find their ways into the justice system which should act as the protectors of victims and survivors.

All said and done, there is a very alarming component to the latest murders that people seem not to notice. These killings are not carried out in impulse or in the heat of the moment; what could be called crimes of passion. The latest killings have been premeditated by the perpetrator; this is evident from the choice of weapon that the perpetra-

tor uses. The use of guns, poison and even drowning shows that there was some planning that took place before the crime was committed. So we then come back to the question of why the perpetrator opted for murder than another solution.

This question is particularly relevant when taking into account that some of these murders are committed in the presence of other people, with no attempt to hide the evidence or to evade prosecution.

The intention of all the questions and suggestions in this article are meant to provoke a discussion that should act as a catalyst towards designing interventions that will bring an end to SGBV, including the murder of women and children.

The WLSA director at the march yesterday said "government and the police alone cannot eradicate the scourge of domestic violence" and we wish to add that "strict implementation of the SODV Act" is not enough to end violence against women and children. The problem has reached crisis levels and the nation at large is required to take a stand and address the problem in all sectors.

JAPAN TO BUY E34m WORTH OF TRACTORS FOR ESWATINI

The governments of Eswatini and Japan yesterday exchanged notes on the Economic and Social Development programme which will see the procurement of tractors worth about E34 million by Japan.

Making his remarks during the event held at the ministry of finance boardroom yesterday, Minister-Counsellor in the Embassy of Japan Shuichiro Kawaguchi said through the programme, the tractors would be procured under the Japanese Grant for the people of Eswatini.

He said the purpose of this programme is to support the efforts of Eswatini government in achieving the Sustainable Development Goals, one of which calls for member States to 'end hunger, achieve food security and improve nutrition and the promotion of sustainable agriculture.'

Enhance

"The government of Japan supports this agenda and believes that the programme will assist in increasing national agricultural production, which in turn will reduce agricultural imports and enhance food security.

"The government of the Kingdom of Eswatini supports these farmers because they play an important role in ensuring food security and poverty reduction through small-scale commercial agriculture," he said.

Mabuza said the grant came at an opportune time when the ministry was spearheading the implementation of a robust strategy that seeks to grow the economy through increased export-oriented production and agroprocessing.

"This strategy involves all stakeholders in the sector and we are optimistic that the inclusive approach will lead to the successful implementation and attainment of the desired targets," he said.

AGRICULTURE MINISTRY URGED TO STIMULATE VIBRANCY TO CREATE JOBS

THE ministry of agriculture has been tasked by government with stimulating the necessary vibrancy to create much needed jobs through agriculture, drive the development of upstream and downstream economic activities as well as agro-processing.

This was disclosed by the Prime Minister Ambrose Dlamini during the official opening of the Inaugural cold chain summit at Mavuso Trade and Exhibition Centre in Manzini yesterday.

Sectors

The PM said since the agribusiness sector had been earmarked as one of the key strategic sectors for growing the economy, the ministry was charged with ensuring that it fully embraced a commercial approach across the value chain and with export markets, including beef, goats, poultry, dairy and horticulture sectors.

non-sugar crops," he said.

He further stated that government had identified key groups for specific intervention in stimulating economic growth across all sectors in accordance with the Strategic Roadmap and that these include the youth and women, which have been included and given specific attention in the summit's programme. 

into with Montigny while under the Technoserve banner where communities such as Lundzi, Sigangeni and Ngwempisi around Usuthu where brought together and trained on how to manage their existing wattle jungles with the aim of developing them for local and export timber markets and limiting the environmental impact.

"We are continuing with this project and want to assist the communities to rehabilitate the wattle jungles owned by the different families, thus creating income for them as there already is an open market with Montingny," she said. The main objective of the course was to help the 12 participants think of starting businesses as career option instead of looking for jobs.


Small Enterprises Development Company (SEDCO) Senior Manager Strategy Themba Dlamini said the course was designed for young people who are not currently in business.

Rand weakened after Moody's scathing warning on Eskom bailouts

JOHANNESBURG - Market analyst Andre Botha said yesterday that the scathing statement by ratings agency Moody's Investor Services on Eskom's bailout has caused the rand to weaken even further, trading near R15 to the dollar on Tuesday.

The local currency had already weakened to a low of R14.96 against the greenback on Monday following another escalation in the trade war between Beijing and Washington.

Botha, senior dealer at financial services provider TreasuryONE, said the rand traded all the way down to the R14.77 level on Tuesday, as some of the risks associated with risky assets seem to dissipate as the gen-

eral feeling was that the market was overextended. Moody's released a statement on Tuesday saying that the billions of rand transferred to Eskom will not solve its financial crisis and will not stabilise the company's debt burden. Eskom last week reported a R20.7 billion loss for the year ended 30 March as operational and debt servicing costs keep rising. The power utility was last month allocated another R59 billion for the next two years in the Special Appropriations Bill, but Moody's slammed this. "We view the additional cash transfers as credit positive, but the increased support has become necessary for Eskom to remain a going concern," Moody's

With more than 10 million South Africans unemployed - using the expanded definition of the term - and growing, Mzansi's joblessness is no longer a crisis. No, it's a national emergency eclipsing everything from crime to ruling party infighting. But there's a solution, a solution that has its roots in that most incendiary of terms: white privilege. And for those arguing that it didn't exist, white privilege was tangible in everything from the Group Areas Act to the Bantu Education Act.

ABSA to expand agriculture loan book in Africa

JOHANNESBURG - ABSA Corporate and Investment Bank (CIB) on Tuesday said that it planned to expand its agriculture loan book to countries such as Ghana, Kenya, Tanzania, Uganda and Zambia, due to good long-term growth prospects

in the rest of the continent.

ABSA CIB Agriculture Head Roux Wildenboer said the lender wanted to grow its footprint in both its domestic market and the rest of the continent due to strong demand.

"Agricultural debt is relatively high-

er than it was in recent history and the ability of agricultural businesses to borrow to reinvest has been curtailed, which has a snowball-effect on investment in the sector," Wildenboer said. "This is seen as a cyclical phenomenon, and even though on aggregate borrowing

is not as strong as it used to be, there are still businesses which are growing aggressively.

"This is the reason why ABSA is optimistic about prospects in the agricultural sector." However, ABSA CIB warned that the big concern in South Africa was the economic performance of the economy, which had stymied demand for agricultural machinery and

implements, particularly the sale of tractors and combine harvesters in the past two years. Data from the South African Agricultural Machinery Association (SAAMA) showed that July tractor sales plunged 30 per cent year-on-year in the month from 525 units to 368 units, while year-to-date combine harvester sales were almost 13 per cent down on last year. Mozambique government, rebels reach final agreement

MAPUTO - Mozambique's government and the ex-rebel group RENAMO completed a long-awaited peace pact on Tuesday, inking a final deal aimed at ending years of conflict.

The deal was signed by President Filipe Nyusi and RENAMO leader Ossufo Momade in Maputo's Peace Square and witnessed by former presidents, regional and continental lead-

Thousands of people applauded as the two leaders showed the signed document, an AFP correspondent said. The pact brought the curtain down on marathon negotiations initiated by Afonso Dhlakama, the his-

toric leader of the Mozambique National Resistance (RENAMO), who died in May last year. The UN's special envoy on Mozambique, Mirko Manzoni, said it was a "truly historic day". "This agreement will bring ultimate peace in a country that has seen enough suffering," he declared.

The deal comes just two months before general elections on October 15 that the ruling FRELIMO party, the dominant political force for more than four decades, is expected to win.

RENAMO unleashed a civil war against the FRELIMO government shortly after independence from Portugal in 1975. The brutal conflict lasted 16 years and left around a mil-

lion people dead. The rebel movement then entered politics after a 1992 peace pact was signed in Rome, paving the way for multi-party elections in 1994. RENAMO lost that vote and subsequent elections and became the official opposition party.

But in October 2013, the party renounced the 1992 peace deal after the military raided its bush camp in central Sathundjira. Clashes erupted again between government forces and RENAMO soldiers, lasting until 2016.

On August 1, the two rivals signed a precursor accord in Gorongosa National Park under which they formally agreed to end military hostili-

'Latest missile tests a warning over joint military drill'

SEOUL - Kim Jong-un issued a warning to the US and South Korea over their joint military drills after personally overseeing North Korea's fourth missile test in 12 days.

The so-called Supreme Leader said the launch, described as featuring a new-type tactical guided weapon, was intended to "send an adequate warning to the joint military drill now underway by the US and south Korean authorities."

Seoul announced that a joint military drill with the United States which is thought to largely involve computer-simulated exercises - was underway on Monday.

The test took place on Tuesday, which North Korea's state run media said involved missiles fired over the capital Pyongyang which struck an island target off the country's eastern coast. "The demonstration fire clearly verified the reliability, security and actual war capacity of the new-type tactical guided weapon system," state news agency KCNA reported yesterday.

The North's four rounds of weapons demonstrations in two weeks come during a stalemate in nuclear negotiations with President Donald Trump. Trump has repeatedly dismissed the significance of the tests because they only involve shortrange weapons, while he secured a commitment from Kim not to test their long-range counterparts. However, even at short-range, the weapons are able to strike at US military bases in South Korea and

Experts say Trump's downplaying of the North's weapons displays allowed the country more room to advance its capabilities and build leverage ahead of negotiations, though it is unclear when they will resume. Daily Mail

Drug lord inmate found hanged

RIO DE JANEIRO - A Brazilian inmate, whose masked attempt to break out of jail dressed as his daughter reverberated around the world, was found dead in his cell, after apparently having hanged himself, Rio de Janeiro state authorities said on Tuesday.

Convicted Rio drug dealer Clauvino da Silva, 42, was serving a decadeslong sentence when he was caught trying to break out of jail last Saturday, disguised as his daughter.

He was caught wearing an eerie plastic mask, a long black wig and women's clothes, including a bra.

A video, released by prison authorities, in which he slowly removes his surreal disguise went viral, shining a light on Brazil's longstanding struggle with its violent, overcrowded prison system, the world's third largest. On Tuesday, however, in a gruesome twist, Rio prison officials said Silva had been found dead in his cell in a high-security unit in the state's Bangu prison complex.

"The inmate appears to have hanged himself with a bed sheet," Rio's prison authority said in a statement, adding that an investigation had been opened. Reuters

Uganda's Bobi Wine charged with 'annoying' president

UGANDA - A Ugandan court on Tuesday charged pop star turned leading opposition figure Bobi Wine with "annoying" President Yoweri Museveni, his lawyer told AFP.

The singer, whose real name is Robert Kyagulanyi, appeared in court on a prior treason charge after he and other opposition politicians allegedly stoned Museveni's convoy during a campaign

rally in August last year.

"He was charged with annoying the president in relation to the same case", his lawyer Asuman Basalirwa told

Wine, who entered Parliament in 2017, has emerged as a leading critic of Museveni - who has been in power for over three decades - and has faced multiple detentions while authorities have frustrated his efforts to perform.

He announced last month that he would take on Museveni in 2021 national elections. "This government of President Museveni is in panic mode. At first it was treason and now it is annoying President Museveni. Who on earth can't be annoyed?" Wine told AFP. "It is a ridiculous charge and am ready to challenge it in court," he said.

Cops deny summoning stone-throwing boy

ISSAWIYA - The northern entrance leading to the East Jerusalem village of Issawiya is blocked with about a dozen security vehicles filled with paramilitary border police ready to invade the village where clashes between protesting Palestinians and Israeli security forces erupt on a daily basis. It was here the recent summoning of a four-yearold Palestinian boy for questioning by the Israeli police for allegedly throwing stones has made international headlines. The Israelis accuse the Palestinians of rioting and carrying out stoning attacks on Israeli cars and police, while the Palestinians say they are being subjected to collective and petty punishment with the security forces provoking the clashes. ANA

1 800 dead as malaria 'epidemic' rages

BURUNDI - Malaria has killed more than 1 800 people in Burundi this year, the UN's humanitarian agency says, a death toll rivalling a deadly Ebola outbreak in the neighbouring Democratic Republic of Congo. In its latest situation report, the United Nations Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA) said 5.7 million cases of malaria had been recorded in Burundi in 2019 - a figure roughly equal to half its entire population. Of those cases, a total of 1 801 died from the mosquito-borne disease in Burundi between January 1 and July 21, OCHA said. AFP

Residents tell Trump to stay away

WASHINGTON - Residents in majority-Hispanic El Paso told US President Donald Trump on Tuesday to stay away, amid fury over his antiimmigration rhetoric as he struggles to unite the country in the wake of mass shootings that killed 31 people. Trump was scheduled to travel yesterday to the Texan border city where 22 died in a weekend gun massacre, before heading around 2 400km northeast and to Dayton, Ohio where a second gunman shot nine dead hours later. The president called on Americans in a nationwide address on Monday to condemn bigotry but community leaders say his words rang hollow set against a longstanding refusal to call out white supremacy and a history of provocative tweets widely condemned as racist.

Growing of industrial hemp to be legalised

HARARE - Zimbabwe will change its laws to allow farmers to grow industrial hemp for export, Cabinet ministers said on Tuesday, adding that the government saw the plant as a future substitute for tobacco, the country's biggest export earning crop. Industrial hemp is a strain of a cannabis species that is grown specifically for industrial uses of its derived products. Its fibre is used in textiles and paper, and it also produces edible seeds. The southern African nation's laws only allow cultivation of cannabis for medical and scientific uses.

Fikile Mbalula sets up PRASA war room

JOHANNESBURG - Deadly train Allie Paine told Sowetan on Tuesday crashes and safety concerns for commuters have forced Transport Minister Fikile Mbalula to establish a war room at the Passenger Rail Agency of SA (PRASA).

The initiative is aimed at addressing long-standing passenger safety issues that have plagued commuter trains for years. The war room, to be launched today, will monitor trains, check for arrival times and address infrastructure problems at PRASA.

Mbalula's spokesperson Ayanda-

its objectives included the "accelerated implementation of PRASA's modernisation programme".

"The intervention is aimed at stabilising PRASA's operations and achieve tangible results within the minister's first 100 days in office."

Mbalula met with the Rail Safety Regulator board to discuss, among others, safety concerns around the passenger rail service.

This comes after it emerged last month that PRASA couldn't meet all

special conditions imposed by the regulator and attached to its operating permit issued in October with the North Gauteng High Court assuming an oversight role.

According to the 2017/2018 annual report of the regulator, there were at least 1 027 collisions, 450 train derailments and 588 people who were struck by trains. There were 745 other incidents. PRASA needed a court intervention to get its current operating permit which ensured that trains were not grounded.

The regulator had raised a number of safety concerns including unfilled vacancies in key positions, infrastructure

maintenance backlogs and the reliance on manual train authorisations which were causing crashes.

Last October, the regulator raised concern about the vacant positions of train control section managers as that was mainly to blame for a series of train crashes. ANC backs Ramaphosa

...says leaked e-mails 'calculated manoeuvre'

JOHANNESBURG-The ANC has come out in support of its President Cyril Ramaphosa, dismissing leaked e-mails as "nothing but a calculated manoeuvre to defocus and detract

from the

immediate task of socio-economic issues and dealing with the challenges of our economy".

In a statement issued on Tuesday, party spokesperson Pule Mabe said the ANC was not aware of any illegality in Ramaphosa's 2017 campaign to become ANC president.

This comes after News24 revealed leaked e-mails from the CR17 campaign which showed that Ramaphosa was consulted by his campaign managers on names of some potential donors, despite the fact that he consistently denied that he was actively involved in the fundraising for his campaign.

"The leaked e-mails are therefore nothing but a calculated manoeuvre to defocus and detract from the immediate task of socio-economic issues and dealing with the challenges of our economy. This is also an attempt to undermine public confidence in President Ramaphosa whose leadership has been defined by moral and ethical conduct," Mabe said.

He said the

ANC's national executive committee last week reflected on funding for political campaigning and had resolved that the ANC's top six leaders would look into finding better ways to man-

"The ANC welcomes actions taken by President Ramaphosa who has acted openly and transparently by providing a detailed account to the public protector on these matters," Mabe said. The e-mails that have circulated on social media for two weeks are said to have formed part of Public Protector Busisiwe Mkhwebane's report into complaints by the DA and EFF over a response given by Ramaphosa to DA leader Mmusi Maimane in Parliament in November 2018.

Mkhwebane found in her report that Ramaphosa deliberately misled Parliament, violated the executive ethics code, acted inconsistently with the constitution and further found evidence of money laundering.

She dismissed Ramaphosa's defence that he did not know the inner workings of the CR17 campaign and did not know that BOSASA boss Gavin Watson donated R500 000 to his campaign. Mkhwebane later said in interviews that she had evidence that Ramaphosa knew the details of the CR17 fundraising efforts.

Ramaphosa has since approached the North Gauteng High Court to take Mkhwebane's report on judicial review.

His spokesperson, Khusela Diko, said the e-mails were "just smoke and mirrors" and did not point to illegality on Ramaphosa's part. Times Live

Neighbour Malerato Molato said she was sleeping when she smelled smoke coming from Malefane's shack. "I peaked through the window and saw flames. The last thing I heard were him screaming for help. I called neighbours but we couldn't do anything," she said.

Two prisoners shot dead after attempting to escape

LIMPOPO - Two on-trial prisoners were shot and killed after they attempted to escape at the Thohoyandou High Court, police said yesterday.

Police spokesperson Brigadier Motlafela Mojapelo said the two men were being escorted to the holding cells on Tuesday afternoon after their court appearance, when they attacked a warder.

Mojapelo said the men tried to seize a R5 rifle from the warder. "During the scuffle, several

shots were randomly fired and in the process, the two prisoners were shot dead."

He said the two men were facing 90 charges including for murder, armed robberies, business robberies and cash-in-transit

Police have opened cases of inquest and robbery.

The Independent Police Investigative Directorate (IPID) will investigate the matter.

EFF claims journalists 'colluding' with ANC

JOHANNESBURG - The EFF claims "certain journalists" are colluding with the ANC to "squeeze" smaller parties in the country.

"Certain journalists have positioned themselves to defend President Cyril Ramaphosa and Minister Pravin Gordhan," Advocate Tembeka Ngcukaitobi SC, for the EFF, said in the equality court, sitting at the High

Court in Pretoria, on Tuesday. The court heard arguments over the alleged intimidation of journalists, which stemmed from a speech EFF leader Julius Malema made outside the state capture commission in November 2018. Gordhan was at the time testifying before the commissioner, Deputy Chief Justice Raymond Zondo.

The SA National Editors' Forum

(SANEF) and five journalists want the court to declare that the statements by Malema are hate speech. They also want Malema and the EFF to apologise for the utterances. The journalists are News24 Editor Adriaan Basson, Daily Maverick journalist Pauli van Wyk, Tiso Blackstar's associate editor Renjeni Munusamy, Eyewitness News senior journalist

Barry Bateman and co-editor of Vrye Weekblad Max du Preez.

The EFF has denied intimidating or harassing journalists.

In its responding affidavit to the court, Malema submitted that SANEF's application with the five journalists was a "thinly veiled attempt to silence the EFF and me as an adversarial contender of the media's ability to determine the news in SA". "This is especially true where the media, in effect, collude and close ranks with the majority party so as to unfavourably squeeze a smaller party like the EFF," the papers said. "Respectfully, they are engaged in a calculated process of trying to create a sufficiently damaging atmosphere that will tempt the court into granting them over-inclusive and unduly invasive relief."

He further argued that SANEF did not have judicial standing to bring the application before the court and is seeking to have the application dismissed. Times Live

DOWNFALL NOT PART FEFF'S PLAN... YET

JOHANNESBURG - EFF Deputy President Floyd Shivambu has hinted at a plan for President Cyril Ramaphosa's "downfall".

This after Shivambu reacted to the announcement of a media briefing from ANC leaders who were involved in the CR17 campaign for Ramaphosa to become president of the party and the country.

On Tuesday, Minister in the Presidency Jackson Mthembu announced the briefing on Twitter, before cancelling it hours later after a "discussion with the officials of our glorious movement".

Mthembu said the "glorious movement" was "dealing with the matters relating" to Ramaphosa and decided to call off the briefing. However, before the cancellation was announced, Shivambu shared some strong words about the ANC's "faction".

His response led to a Twitter user asking if Ramaphosa's 'downfall' was part of the EFF's plans. In his response, Shivambu suggested that the EFF's current plan was to let the ANC "dig a deeper hole" for Ramaphosa.

"His downfall is not EFF's plan yet. If it was EFF's plan, he'd have fallen by now. "We are cautioning the faction that they should stop making stupid mistakes because they are going to dig a deeper hole for their president.

There has been no love lost between the president and the EFF. Last month, the EFF put Ramaphosa under pressure, calling for him to fire Public Enterprises Minister Pravin Gordhan from his Cabinet with immediate effect for his alleged role in the establishment of SARS' 'rogue unit'.

The party said failure to do so, "will prompt the EFF to approach courts to enforce this binding remedial action". On July 22, the EFF called for Ramaphosa to

I was right, did nothing wrong - Motsoeneng

JOHANNESBURG - 'We did nothing wrong." Hlaudi Motsoeneng, former chief operating officer (COO) of the SABC said of a report detailing how he and several others abused their power over journalists and the newsroom at the state broadcaster.

He was referring to himself, as well as former ommunications minister Faith Muthambi, who was found to have abused her power as minister to influence editorial decisions by intimidating journalists and insisting on being followed by them while conducting ANC campaign work.

"You can't just be given instructions by someone you don't report to," said Motsoeneng of the findings against Muthambi.

"If people acted on wrong instructions then they are the ones who took those decisions." Defending himself, Motsoeneng said he stood by all decisions he took during his reign.

"Dating back to the time I was there these issues are not new. I stand by my decisions that I took at the time and there was nothing wrong.

We did nothing wrong. It is all public knowl-

edge," he said. "I think what is more important is that they are now hiding behind unlawful decisions and using this report as a distraction."

He was referring to the current stand-off between the SABC and sports broadcaster SuperSport, which has led to a blackout on key soccer events. He claimed the report should not be taken seri-

This week, DA Chief Whip John Steenhuisen said he would write to Speaker Thandi Modise to request that the findings of the report be referred to Parliament's ethics committee. He also intended opening a criminal case against Muthambi.

While the ANC remains mum on whether the parliamentarian could face any disciplinary action, tripartite alliance partner and union federation COSATU have called upon the ANC to act against Muthambi.

"We welcome the fact that management and the board have begun implementing the recommendations and taking on some of those accused of wrongdoing," Matthew Parks, the union's Parliamentary Coordinator said. Citizen





They are keen on having a local event of their own that recognises and gives them the recognition and experience they deserve from any other show they perform at," she said.
















THE THEATRE OF DREAMS COMES ALIVE! - IDOLS SA

JOHANNESBURG - Springbok captain Siya Kolisi will finally return to the pitch after a lengthy injury break tomorrow, when Western Province take on the Pumas at Newlands.

The 28-year-old loose forward won't lead WP, though, with lock Chris van Zyl retained as the skipper for the mustwin clash on Women's Day (3pm kickoff).

In other changes to the WP line-up, coach John Dobson will be delighted to have pacy wing Sergeal Petersen back in the starting line-up, after he came off the bench against the Lions in the 30-28 loss at Newlands.

The Highlands Park coach, who previously served as Bafana assistant under Ephraim 'Shakes' Mashaba, has never hidden his desires on the job and added that Baxter's successor should be local.

Asked if he would consider the Bafana job, Da Gama said: "I think it is too early to discuss that.

"I have previously recommended quite a few coaches in your presence. I said I thought Gavin Hunt. I thought Pitso Mosimane. I thought Steve Komphela.

"So I have recommended those. It is difficult for me to answer you on that.

"But if nobody is available and I'm asked to serve the country, I will serve the country. But as you know I have made my recommen-



The Bafana hot seat remains vacant after Baxter's resignation last week and Molefi Ntseki has been asked to take over on an interim basis while SAFA continues to search for a permanent replacement for the Briton.

Da Gama said Komphela (Golden Arrows), Hunt (Bidvest Wits) and Mosimane (Mamelodi Sundowns) play the kind of football that is needed at Bafana level.

"If you look at the way Wits play, if you look at the way Golden Arrows play, you look at the way Sundowns play, I think we play to our strengths and I think that is important," said

"I just think that the intellectual property of our soccer has to be nourished and has got to grow.

"And with coaches like Komphela, Hunt and Pitso, if we can just nurture and play to our strengths you know, these guys understand the cultural dynamics, the diversified type of approach to the game, I think we can get there."

The Highlands coach thanked Baxter for his services.

"I have always said that Stuart Baxter, I think, has laid a good foundation for us.

"He has brought in a different dimension with a lot of discipline and we thank him for that.

"But I think we have to grow as I said that intellectual property has got to be nurtured and has got to



Philippe Coutinho at crossroads

LIVERPOOL - Sometimes the Germans say it better than us. There is no-single word in the English language that describes taking pleasure in other people's misfortune. And there is no better word than schadenfreude to describe the smugness of some Liverpool fans this summer.

Less than two years have passed since Philippe Coutinho swapped Merseyside for Barcelona and became the second most-expensive player in history. That £145million move was a dream come true for the Brazilian, and a bitter blow to Liverpool's hopes of regaining their place among Europe's elite.

Fast forward to this transfer window, and Coutinho is back on the market. He has rebuffed Tottenham, who made a late move after Barcelona confirmed they will allow the midfielder to leave on loan.

Coutinho has won five trophies at the La Liga giants, amassing 21 goals and 11 assists in 76 appearances. But they are prepared to let him return to the Premier League.

Liverpool have distanced themselves from bringing Coutinho back to Anfield. Don't mistake this for spitefulness, though, rather a reflection of how the club have grown in his absence.

Jurgen Klopp does not seem like one for schadenfreude. But he'd be forgiven for telling Coutinho I told you so.

"Stay here and they will end up building a statue in your honour," Klopp told the Brazilian eight months before his departure. "Go somewhere else, to Barcelona, to Bayern Munich, to Real Madrid, and you will be just another player. Here you can be something more."

His words have proved prophetic, and could serve as a warning to players tempted by bright lights and thick wallets. But his comments also underlined just how talismanic Coutinho had become at Anfield.






