



# Ex-parliamentarians overtaxed by E15 000

FORMER parliamentarians, who served in the 10th Parliament, claim to have been overtaxed by Eswatini Revenue Authority (SRA) by about E15 000.

The former parliamentarians, who

include MPs and senators, reportedly discovered that they were overtaxed by SRA from their gratuities of E507 000, which resulted from government slashing E45 000 in October last year.

They said they were overtaxed by about E15 180, which was their monthly tax from their basic salary of E46 000 per month.

The argument by the former legislators is that they were double taxed in October.

However, the truth of this information will be tested when the former politicians claim their tax rebates.

Rebates

The former legislators were advised to apply for tax rebates after they complained that they were overtaxed in October last year, which was their last month in office.

They said they had already

paid taxes in October last year. This transpired during a meeting of ex-politicians that was held at Caritas in Manzini on Thursday. When the Eswa-

EFPA's Secretary Saladin Magagula stated that government did overtax them. He said they raised the issue with Minister of Finance Neal Rijkenberg when they met him in May.

The former politicians were sup-

posed to be given the ex-gratia pay-

ment in October, but started being

paid from January this year.

Magagula said they had already paid tax for October and no amount of money for that month was supposed to be taxed in their gratuities.

Advised

Magagula said the minister advised them to get their tax certificates in order and fill up forms which they would submit to Eswatini Revenue Authority so that they could get the overtaxed money.

He said during the meeting on Thursday, they informed the membership of that development and they accepted the report by the executive committee.

It was imperative for government to pay gratuities to the former leg-

date of the executive was to approach the ministry of finance to sort out the over taxation issue. islators, which are referred to exgratia payment or informally referred to as handshakes.

The handshakes are usually paid to parliamentarians when they leave office and they constitute annual payment of the former legislators.

Slashed

The former legislators earned E46 000 as monthly basic salaries. This translated to an annual pay of E552 000. SRA, according to the sources, taxed 33 per cent from the E552 000, which left each ex-legislator with E369 840.

The former parliamentarians' handshakes were slashed by E45 000 because government discovered that it had overpaid the former politicians.

It was said that the former parliamentarians were supposed to be paid a salary that was equivalent to 10 days in October, but were paid for 30 days. That was the reason they had to pay back the money which was an overpayment.

The E45 000 slashing meant the former legislators each pocketed E324 840.

### ASSOCIATION HAS 40 SUBSCRIBERS

ESWATINI Former Politicians Association has made E8 000 from subscriptions in a space of about two months.

The E8 000 has been generated from the 40 subscribed members of the association, who forked out a yearly subscription of E200.

This was confirmed by Eswatini Former Politicians Association's Secretary Saladin Magagula.

Magagula said they agreed that the E200 would be the yearly subscription but it is subject to review. He said the former politicians were warming up to the idea of forming a body to look into their welfare because they had discovered that after their term of office elapsed, lives for some of them became miserable.

Problematic

What was also problematic, according to Magagula, was that the former politicians did not have access to adequate information about their money, which they had invested into some schemes, including MOPADO.

Magagula said he was happy with the response shown by former politicians since the association was formed about two months ago. He said during their meetings, they were still seeing many new faces from the former politicians and that meant the association was growing.

The secretary further urged their members to pay the E200 subscription fee so that the association could execute its tasks in an efficient and effective manner.

Challenges

He commended those who joined the association as he felt they were helping other former politicians so they could speak in one voice in addressing the challenges facing them.

Magagula said they had many burning issues that they need to sort out. This includes the sudden stop of medical aid when the former politicians vacated office. They wanted to know why their medical aid was stopped. Another issue was that of their burial scheme.

They said the information about their burial scheme was not consistent, as former politicians were not paid the same amount. Magagula said they needed to look into that as well.

ASSOCIATION SETS UP REGIONAL BRANCHES

IN an effort to easily reach its members, Eswatini Former Politicians Association has set up branches in the country's administrative regions.

The decision to open the regional branches was reached after it was felt that most of the former that government did overtax them.

The decision to open the regional branches was reached after it was felt that most of the former politicians did not have

enough money to travel from all corners of the country for a meeting in Manzini. Eswatini Former Politicians Association's Secretary Saladin Magagula said it was for that reason they chose convenors for the country's four administrative regions.

The convenors include Magagula himself, who would be responsible for convening meetings of former politicians in the Hhohho region.

Former Manzini South MP Owen Nxumalo would be responsible for all former politicians in the Manzini region.

Convene

Former Mkhiweni MP Gideon Dlamini would convene all former politicians in the Lubombo region, while Jobe Kunene, who is a former constituency councillor (Bucopho), would be responsible for all former politicians in the Shiselweni region.

Magagula said the convenors would be responsible for convening meetings so that they could take suggestions from regional to national level.

Magagula further mentioned that the association was now in the process of registration and judging from the response of its members, the registration process would be done sooner rather than later.

THE Kingdom of Eswatini has lost its bid to host the Secretariat of the African Continental Free Trade Area (AfCFTA).

This follows the decision by African Heads of State and Government to endorse Ghana as the winner of the bid during the African Union Extraordinary Summit held in Niamey in Niger yesterday.

This was officially communicated by the Minister for Commerce, Industry and Trade Senator Manqoba B Khumalo. Appreciated

"During the 35th Ordinary Session of the Executive Council held at Palais Des Congres yesterday, it was revealed that Ghana amassed 69.5 out of 70 points. Eswatini came third with 66.5 points, hot on the heels of Kenya; who had 66.75 points," he said.

### SMVAF MANAGER SUSPENDED

A senior manager at the Sincephetelo Motor Vehicle Accidents Fund (SMVAF) has been suspended for gross misconduct in relation to recruitment of staff.

The manager was put on ice by the Acting SMVAF Chief Executive Officer Sizakele Dlamini after discovering that there were some irregularities in staff ecruitment

Insiders told the Swazi Observer that the manager who cannot named at this stage because he was not available for comment when sought last night is alleged to have bypassed the office of the acting CEO when confirming certain new recruitments into the organisation.

Permission

It is alleged that instead of getting the endorsement of the acting CEO who now has the power to approve all organisational issues, the manager is said to have sought permission of the former CEO, who is currently out of contract, something which was found to be gross and

undermining the authority of the acting CEO. It is alleged that upon discovering or being alerted of the new staff which had been approved to join the organisation, the acting CEO did not take kindly to the manager's action and sent him home pending further investigation and internal disciplinary processes

When sought for comment, the Acting CEO Dlamini could only confirm the suspension of the manager to allow for an internal investigation into the alleged irregularities in the hiring of staff.

Investigating

The manager was not available for comment when sought last night.

Dlamini is also the Ministry of Finance Under Secretary and was seconded to act as CEO at SMVAF pending issues which the board was still investigating before deciding the fate of former CEO Helmon

Vilakati's contract elapsed and there was a recommendation from the previous board chaired by lawyer Zweli Jele for it to be renewed.

But because the ministry was not happy with the manner in which the salary review

for staff was handled, it appointed through the board a committee headed by Dr Sikhomba Gumbi to investigate what caused the delay in implementing the report that looked into the salary review.

The committee was due to submit its report last week or this week; hence the acting CEO's three month contract which had elapsed last Sunday was renewed.

### Eswatini, Senegal agree on co-operation, trade

DAKAR – The Kingdom of Eswatini has set its eyes on doing big business with Senegal, which is recording an impressive six per cent average growth annually.

This emerged during bilateral meeting between His Majesty the King and Senegal President Macky Sall on Friday evening, which was concluded with a mutual cooperation and trade agreement signed by the foreign affairs ministers

World Bank projections indicate that Senegal is expected to substantially accelerate its economic growth when production of offshore oil and gas begins in 2022. Senegal has a population of about 15.4 million according to 2016 World Bank statistics.

Speaking after the talks which preceded a state dinner in honour of the king's visit, His Majesty highlighted the opportunities presented by the exchange visits. President Sall was in Eswatini in July last year.

"We get to share our continental initiatives that are meant to drive us towards developing sustainable development programmes and projects to overcome the social, economic, poverty and unemployment challenges, among oth-

ers, that affect the wellbeing of our people," he said. With a relationship between the two countries dating back many years, the king described the signing ceremony of friendship and mutual cooperation agreements and the joint bilateral committee between the two countries, as a good step in the right direction.

"We are confident that it will bring handsome dividends to our two peoples.

As members of the African Union, as well as global organisations, our shared common goals should provide the required impetus to increase trade between our two countries," he said.

He said the introduction of the Continental Free Trade Area (AfCFTA) would further enhance this trade as it should remove all barriers to the free movement of our peoples so as to reduce dependence on foreign markets.

The king shared the country's national vision 2022 aspirations aimed at transforming the country to achieve first world status.

"With an agro-based economy, the country is also host to vast opportunities in the mining, energy, tourism and ICT sector, to name but a few, and we welcome investment in these industries," he said.

### COMMENTARY

### Statement of Compliance

The summarised consolidated financial information, which has been audited, has been drawn up in compliance with the recognition and measurement criteria under International Financial Reporting Standards and in the manner required by the Companies Act of the Kingdom of Eswatini.

### Accounting Policies

The Group has consistently applied the accounting policies as set out in the RSSC March 2018 Integrated Report, with the exception of the change in accounting policies arising from the Group adopting IFRS 9 Financial Instruments and IFRS 15 Revenue from Contracts with Customers during the current year, in preparing these results.

### Changes in Accounting Policies

The Group adopted IFRS 9 Financial Instruments and IFRS 15 Revenue from Contracts with Customers during the current year. The effect of the adoption of these standards for the first time are fully disclosed in the Group's statutory financial statements.

### Commentary on Results

RSSC achieved record cane and sugar production during the 2018/19 season. Cane crushed at 3.7 million tonnes, was 15% higher than cane crushed in the previous year. Estate Cane yields were higher at 112.9 tc/ha, as compared to 99.4 tc/ha for the comparative period.

Sugar production at 505,575 tonnes, 96° pol sugar was 16% higher than the 435,763 tonnes of 96° pol sugar produced in the previous year.

Ethanol production at 29.8 million litres was 17% higher than the production in the prior year due to higher molasses processed through operation.

Total comprehensive income attributable to the Owners of the Company amounting to E217.8 million was 27.7% lower than the results achieved in 2018. This decline in profitability is mainly due to the sugar price that was 12.3% lower than the previous year owing to a lower world market sugar price and continued pressure on SACU prices. The valuation of bioligical assets reflects an increase of E76 million, recognising an improvement in pricing for 2019/20, with tarriff measures in place in the SACU market, and higher expected sucrose volumes.

The consolidated statement of financial position for the Group shows a strong balance sheet with total assets of E3.1 billion. Phase 1 of the Integrated Growth Programme sheet with total assets of 15.1 billion. Phase 1 of the Integrated Grown Programme ("IGP"), was successfully commissioned in May 2018 at a cost of E145 million. Phase 2 of the IGP, commenced during the current financial year. These works will be completed in the early part of the 2019/20 season. The closing cash position does not reflect the drawdown of loans against capital expenditure for Phase 2 of the IGP amounting to E130 million. The drawdown for this and subsequent expenditure, occurred in April 2019. The financial ratios show a general decline when compared to the last year but still show good returns given the depressed sugar market conditions.

The sugar markets remain difficult, more so in the SACU and world markets. The view is that there should be a moderate recovery in SACU sugar prices in the medium term. The business will need to continue to improve efficiencies in its pursuit to be a low cost producer of sugar.

### Corporate Governance

The Group auditors, KPMG Chartered Accountants (Swaziland) have audited the consolidated financial results for the year ended 31 March 2019 and have issued an unmodified report. This summarised consolidated financial information has been derived from the audited statements and is consistent in all material respects. The report of the independent auditor is available for inspection at the registered office of the Company.

### Contingencies and Commitments

There have been no material changes to contingencies while capital commitments have reduced by E178.6 million when compared to the disclosed amounts in the March 2018 Integrated Report. ### PAC embarks on site visits today

THE Public Accounts Committee (PAC) will be embarking on its sit visits starting from

According to a statement issued by the PAC, the site visits by this sessional committee are expected to start from 10am and sites to be visited include Fonteyn High in Mbabane, where the committee would be inspecting solar water pumps that were installed in the school.

At about mid-day, the PAC will be visiting the ministry of Public works and transport in Mbabane. The purpose of the committee's visit there would be to inspect the ministry's fleet management system. About two weeks ago, PAC Chairperson Phila Buthelezi had promised that the site visits would be done last week.

However, that could not happen, as the House of Assembly had business. It was for that reason why the PAC starts its site visits today. The site visits are part of the session of the committee, which started in April this year.

After the site visits, the PAC is expected to compile its report. After compilation of the report, Buthelezi will then table the very same report before the House of Assembly.

The report will be debated in the House of Assembly and a resolution, based on the report, will be passed by the House. One of the site visits the PAC is expected to make concerns one company known as Heptagon Company. There are certain properties worth E986 000 that are said to have been used by Heptagon Company while working on the site.

### **Furnished**

The E986 000 is part of the over E79 742 609.28 that was lost by the commerce ministry to Heptagon

The properties were eventually taken by the company and are said to be in its possession now. The properties included furnished temporary offices, telephone systems, name boards, kitchen unit, motor vehicles, and other properties.

The properties, according to the contract between the ministry and Heptagon, were to be returned to the ministry when the work was finished.

PAC members recommended that the properties should be recovered from Heptagon and be kept within premises of a government structure. The PAC members would then go and conduct an inspection to appreciate the condition of the government properties.

The PAC has already made one site visit to the Nhlangano-Sicunusa road project. The visit was made last week Thursday.

Buthelezi said Emaswati were still going to lose millions of Emalangeni to see it finished. The PAC directed the ministry of public works and transport to engage forensic auditors to investigate. He said the works ministry would then find out how much would be needed for the government to spend in order to finish the project.

# Govt to borrow from PSPF

GOVERNMENT is planning to secure loans from the Public Service Pension Fund (PSPF) in the near future.

This was revealed by Minister of Finance Neal Rijkenberg, when he told MPs who are members of the House of Assembly Finance Sessional

The conversation between Rijkenberg and the legislators is contained in the report of the Ministry of Finance Sessional Committee on the Arab Bank for Economic Development in Africa (BA-DEA) for the (Lower Usuthu Smallholder Irrigation Project Phase II 'LUSIP II') Loan Bill, 2019 (Bill No. 13 of 2019).


The minister was responding to a question posed by one MP during the meeting with the ministry of finance. The MP who asked the question was not named in the report.

"PSPF has enough funds to lend to government. Why are we not sourcing the funds from those institutions," the MP asked.

Rijkenberg responded by saying his ministry would consider that option.

"Yes, that is an option that can be considered. However, borrowing from PSPF would be very expensive to finance a project of this magnitude.

Government prefers the concessional loans as they tend to be very affordable and some come with an element of a grant," Rijkenberg said.

Some MPs, during the meeting, expressed concern over the country's focus on sugar production. They wanted to know why this country did not consider venturing to other crops. Their concern was based on that this loan was also secured to beef up the sugar production

Government has borrowed about E211.5 million (USD 15 million) from BADEA to finance this project, which would boost the sugar cane industry.

According to Manzini South MP Thandi Nxumalo, the country was still within the 35 per cent of the GDP threshold, as it was now at 28 per cent, with the debt stock currently at E17.3 billion.

Nxumalo was speaking on Wednesday last week in her capacity as Chairperson of the Finance Sessional Committee, which motivated for the Bill to be passed by the House.

She said contracting the new loan would increase the country's total debt stock to E17.51 billion, which would be equivalent to 28.2 per cent of the country's GDP. She said the implementation of Phase II of LUSIP II was to extend the gains of Phase I of LUSIP I to a wider area in order to increase the number of hectares of the irrigated agricultural production. The total area to benefit from this project would be 6 034 hectares. The project component consisted of the main conveyancing system, including the canal and branches, the secondary distribution, the on-farm irrigation network, and project management, which would be funded by the government of Eswatini. The Bill was debated by about 20 MPs and it was finally passed, after the MPs adopted the report on the Bill.

# NETWORK BLACKOUT **GROUNDS COUNTRY**

WILD fires at Malagwane Hill caused a national blackout of network services in the whole country yesterday.

Most people had difficulties in accessing network services offered by MTN, Eswatini Mobile as well as Eswatini Posts and Telecommunications Corporation (EPTC) services for the better part of the day.

This caused an outcry and panic amongst many people as banking services, including ATMs, were not working. According

MTN Corporate Affairs Manager Mandla Luphondvo, the wild fire burnt backbone fibre which is responsible for connections across network providers in the

country. The effects of the burnt EPTC fibre caused connectivity problems in many services that required network connection either from MTN, Eswatini Mobile and EPTC.

"Because of the fire, inter-connection had been compromised," he said. Phone calls



works were unsuccessful because of the burnt fibre. Services such as Mobile Money and e-Mali were also compromised. People were only able to make on net calls. The internet was moving at a snail's pace while other services were jammed.

Luphondvo promised that they had engaged all stakeholders and the network would be restored soon.

Meanwhile, Eswatini Posts and Telecommunications Corporation Communications Manager Nqobile Magagula assured the nation that the company was working on restoring the burnt fibre so that connections can be restored.

"We are trying to reboot the fibre so that services can be restored in no particular time," she said. Since the beginning of the winter season,

The last individual to be arrested for driving under the influence of alcohol was Vusi Matsenjwa (32), who was sentenced to 15 months in a correctional facility if he failed to pay the E1 500 fine option.

# ONLINE STORYTELLING CONTEST FOR EMASWATI



# 1 200 pupils benefit in dental outreach

MBABANE Rotary Club reached out to 1 200 pupils who were in need of dental care in four schools in the Northern Hhohho region.

The Schools Dental Outreach is a project of the Mbabane Rotary Club.

The project embodies the rotary club principle of service above self and is in line with one of the six areas of focus of Rotary namely Disease prevention and treatment.

Other areas of focus include peace and conflict prevention and resolution, water and sanitation, maternal and child health, basic education and literacy and economic and community development.

Dr Musa Mthethwa, who is a dentist at Mbabane clinic and also a member of Mbabane Rotary Club, said the Dental Outreach project was conceived to provide amongst other things, standard of care oral health to school children, many of who would never have access in their lifetime to a dentist.

### Outreach

This year the outreach went to the Northern Hhohho and was based at Timphisini High, where the facilities were most appropriate for the setup of the treatment centre.

The outreach covered four schools, namely, Timphisini Primary and High School, Ndlalambi Nazarene Primary and Ngonini Primary. "A total number of 1 200 pupils have been helped through the Dental Outreach," he said.

The outreach was carried out by an entirely local team of volunteers comprised of dentists and hygienists from within the country and rotarians from Limkokwing Rotary Club of .

### Procedures

Satellite teams were sent out to participating schools, where oral health education and screening of for oral diseases were carried out with the least possible interference to normal classroom activities.

"Those found in need of further care or dental procedures were then transported to the base treatment centre at Timphisini High where they were attended to," he said. The pupils accessed to different dental procedures which included cleaning, restoration work including fillings and in extreme cases unsalvageable teeth were extracted

They also received a parting gift of a goody bag which contained amongst others personal items such as clothes and educational items on oral health to nurture the seed of oral health care that has been planted during the week long exercise.

**Temptattions** 

She appealed to the police who directly deal with visitors and economic transactions to uphold the virtue of being trustworthy and working with honesty so that the country becomes a destination of choice for tourism and business investment alike.

"I implore you to stay away from the lurings and temptations of car

theft syndicates and dagga smuggling gangs who promise you quick rewards yet have long term repercussions both for you as an individual and the country as a whole,' Dlamini said.

She said as the police they are aware that border police officers are faced with acute shortage of technical equipment to conduct searches and detect falsified documents at the border crossing points as technology is part of a wider response to this problem.

**Impact** 

Dlamini said the introduction of biometric and innovative technologies can have a significant impact to improve surveillances in the country's borders and these would be exploited to enhance border control.

She encouraged the spirit of working together on common border and security challenges, particularly on tackling illegal cross-border activ-

She said an integrated border management approach is crucial for improving peace and stimulating economic activity as it facilitates the legitimate movement of much needed goods and services.

Dagga

Dlamini also pointed out that dagga smuggling at the country's borders has turned to be a multi-faceted phenomenon and has manifested itself in different activities, especially the formation of illicit groups and net-

Dlamini also advocated for the acting national commissioner's call to support the National Strategic Roadmap by joining hands with government to embrace the recently launched operational plan directed on economic recovery and sustainability.

"The five-year blue-print instrument provides an overview of key economic reforms," Dlamini stated. She highlighted some key features related to the border control functions.

Self-confidence

These features, according to Dlamini, include synchronising all multidimensional tasks involved in border policing sectors to eradicate the plague of crime and corruption, employing diverse and multidisciplinary approaches on controlling movements of goods and people with the highest degree of diligence and self-confidence.

She further pointed out that another feature is adopting zero tolerance on crime which undermines economic growth and erodes public confidence on law enforcement efforts to carry out its mandate.

Enforcing

The deputy national commissioner told the border police that as forefront operatives in the bilateral service delivery, they would be instrumental in formulating and enforcing innovative strategies aimed at eliminating cross-border crime.

Dlamini said stricter border security enforcement is essential for the state security sector as domestic security of any country starts with

She said it is a fact that transnational organised crime networks are the main threats to socio-economic development and state security.

## RUNK WARDER DRIVES TH LIGHTS SWITCHED OFF

AN officer from His Majesty's Correctional Services was arrested over the weekend for driving while under the influence of alco-

Mciniseli Simelane (35) was nabbed with an alcohol content of 0.58mg/l, which is over the legal limit of 0.38mg/l. He made his court appearance yesterday before Manzini Magistrate

Simelane was slapped with three counts. The first count was that of driving while under the influence of alcohol while the second one was failing to stop when ordered to do so by a police officer.

Driving

The last count was that of driving a vehicle at night with its lights switched off. Simelane pleaded guilty to all the charges.

In mitigation, he informed the court that it was a mistake as he had taken



one too many the night before and did not have enough rest.

Simelane said he thought that the alcohol was no longer in his system.

The accused pleaded for leniency saying he was a first time offender.

The magistrate informed the correctional services officer that since he knew that driving while under the influence is a crime he should have avoided doing that in the first place. Zwane said there was no excuse for committing a crime.

Accused

For driving while under the influence of alcohol the accused was sentenced to two years imprisonment with a fine option of E2 000, for failing to stop when ordered to do so by the police he was sentenced to a year imprisonment with a fine option of E2 000, for driving his vehicle with its lights switched off he was sentenced to six months imprisonment with a fine option of E800.

### Drink-driver suspect fights off three cops in police cell

A driver who was arrested for driving while under the influence of alcohol surprised police officers when he kicked and wrestled with three police officers at Mankayane Police Station.

Muzi Ndlela made his court appearance yesterday before Manzini Senior Magistrate Sindisile Zwane. He was charged with three offences.

The first offence was that of driving while under the influence of alcohol. The accused person's breath specimen read 0.63mg/l which was way over the limit of 0.38mg/l.

The second charge was that the accused person failed to stop when ordered to do so by the police. The third charge was that of resisting arrest.

For driving while under the influence of alcohol the accused person was sentenced into two years imprisonment with a fine option of E2 000. For failing to stop when ordered to do so by the police the accused was sentenced to a year imprisonment with a fine option of E2 000.

For fighting police officers, while inside the holding cells he was sentenced into a year imprisonment with a fine option of E2 000.

He was fined a total of E6 000.

### Drunk driver causes accident, pleads not guilty to charges

A driver who was arrested for driving while under the influence of alcohol is alleged to have ended up causing an accident.

Xolani Malindzisa appeared before Magistrate Sindisile Zwane yesterday as he was charged with two counts.

On the first count it is stated that the accused person drove his vehicle an Isuzu van, while under the influence of alcohol. His breath specimen on the alcometre read 1.12mg/l, which is way higher than the legal limit of 0.38mg/l. The second charge was that the accused person drove recklessly and caused an accident as he crashed on a stationery mini truck. The accused pleaded not guilty to both charges. He was remanded back into police custody and told to appear in court on 11 July. He was informed that should he want to be released on bail he should pay E5 000.

### CLIENT TAKES LAW FIRM TO COURT, DISPUTES E67 000 LEGAL FEES

A client who had sought services of a law firm in prosecuting his divorce proceedings has now taken the law firm to High Court where he is disputing legal fees amounting to E67 000.

Bongani Sibanyoni, who is employed by Royal Swaziland Sugar Corporation (RSSC), has dragged Empandze based law firm Nkomondze Attorneys to court, where he is seeking an order for rescission and setting aside the default against him which was granted in favour of the law firm.

He has filed an urgent application further seeking an order that pend-

ing determination and finalisation of the present matter before court, the defendant (law firm) be interdicted and restrained from attaching and taking into execution any of the plaintiff's (Sibanyoni) property.

Represented by lawyer Sebenele Nhlengetfwa, Sibanyoni in his founding affidavit submitted that he is currently resident at Tshaneni and he is the judgment debtor in the main matter which was ruled in favour of the law firm.

He submitted that this is an application where he seeks an order preventing the law firm from attaching his property.

Giving a background of the matter, he submitted that in 2016 he entered

into an oral agreement with the law firm at their offices in Simunye and in terms of that agreement, the law firm was to provide him with legal

services in his application where he was seeking a final decree of divorce.

He submitted that

the proceedings
while the matter was

while the matter was in court and on both instances he was informed that his lawyers were attending same in court, adding that he was further informed that he was not required in person in court.

"However after these two instances,

I never heard from my lawyers again as I was expecting to attend court to plead my case but this did not happen. After a while at the end of 2017 I called my lawyers and enquired about my case but was taken aback

when informed that I am owing E67 224.92 in respect of legal fees,"

he averred. He submitted that it became clear to him that the default judgment had been against him for this amount as he was furnished with a warrant of execution against his property and averred that such judgment was granted in error since he was not served with summons calling upon him to defend the action.

"Further, I do not know how the sum of E67 224.92 was arrived at, especially because I never received any information on the court's judgment in my divorce proceedings on whether it was in my favour or was dismissed," Sibanyoni added.

He submitted that he verily believes the order directing him to pay such an amount cannot be substantiated in a divorce matter where pleadings were not closed and matter not finalised. The matter is before Judge Cyril Maphanga and it has been postponed to allow the parties file their papers before being argued.



### 350 screened in cervical cancer project

CERVICAL cancer screening project collaboration between the ministry of health, Korean doctors Kosin and Pukyung Universities resulted in 350 individuals screened for free last week.

This was revealed by Swakor Medical Centre's Daniel Kim who coordinated this project. He said a local registered medical non-governmental organisation (NGO) named People for Medical Cooperation International Eswatini joined hands in this project.

"A team of three South Korean gynaecologists collaborated with local health facilities doing the cervical cancer screening for free for three days at Lobamba, Satellite, and King Sobhuza II Clinics and we checked about 350 cases," he said.

He added that the Korean team came with a pathologist as well and joined hands with the National Laboratory after the Pap smear.

People for Medical Cooperation Eswatini is a group of South Koreans medical experts that has been operating since 2014 in the Kingdom of Eswatini. They also invited a urologist, paediatric surgeon and vascular surgeon to help government health facilities, save lives and medical funds



as well. Kim said this kind of screening would continue next month.

Mgcineni Ndlangamandla, focal person for cervical cancer at the ministry of health, said they had about 30 precancer stage cases which they treated. He said this was carcinoma in situ (CIS), the earliest form of cervical cancer because the cancer cells in CIS are only in the surface layer of the cervix; they have not grown into deeper layers of cells.

He said it was good that this project immediately followed nine doctors training where they were taught how to treat cancer. These doctors were from all the health facilities except for Nhlangano and Sithobela Health Centres. "Part of the training had practical sessions where most cases were treated; the rest who were not treated was a result of them not coming back as instructed.

These people leave home without showing any sign of sickness and not knowing that they were at this stage of cancer," he said. Ndlangamandla disclosed that last year the Korean doctors came with a different mandate to treat only Hlatikulu Government Hospital patients because they had a backlog of cases there.

# MINISTER TOURS 3 BORDER POSTS

BY SIZWE DLAMINI Pigg's Peak

AFTER touring border posts in the Shiselweni region last week, Minister of Home Affairs Princess Lindiwe toured the Mananga, Matsamo and Bulembu Border Posts last Friday.

Present during the tour were Ludlawini Chief Senator Mphatfwa Dlamini, Senator Isaac Magagula and Portfolio Committee Chairperson Madala Mhlanga.

During the tour the minister spoke to immigration officers at all the aforementioned border posts.

At the Matsamo Border Post, immigration officers complained about being understaffed and lack of accommodation.

"The Matsamo Border Post is a very important entry and exit point in Northern Hhohho as it is mainly used to export Eswatini timber to the Republic of South Africa.

However, due to the fact that the border post is understaffed, the timber trucks spend a longtime there thus angering the truck drivers.

Matsamo also lacks suitable accommodation for immigration officers. All these problems cause us staff to be less friendly with tourists," one of the employ-

ees said.

After touring the Matsamo Border Post, the minister travelled the 18km long gravel road to the Bulembu Border Post. where she spoke to police officer, Sibusiso Dlamini.

During his speech, Dlamini said tourists coming to the country enjoy using the Bulembu Border Post instead of the Ngwenya Border Gate.

"About 19 tourists from the Republic of South Africa and beyond use the Bulembu Border Post daily. Out of these, six may be of African descent while the rest are European.

The main reason why the tourists prefer this border post is because it is less congested compared to Ngwenya Border Post.

Furthermore, most of the tourists own off-road cars that they use for rally racing on the terrible Bulembu to Pigg's Peak road.

A major problem at the Bulembu Border Post is electricity outages. In many cases, electricity blackout will last for more than 24 hours. This hinders our work because we use computers at the border post," he said.

Dlamini added that the tourists often visit the Bulembu museum.

"It is also important to mention that a lot of tourists complain about the Bulembu to Pigg's Peak road because at the border post a tourist is expected to pay a road tax fee of E50.

However, after paying the money that same tourist drives on the terrible gravel road to Pigg's Peak.

After the drive, the same tourist complain to us manning the Bulembu Border Post and that he or she will never pay the fee again due to the poor road conditions.

Lastly, we are asking the minister to allow the Bulembu Border Post to close later than 4pm," he added.

We wholeheartedly welcome him and he is guaranteed of our full support and cooperation. We urged him to approach us on any issue he needs to know," said Chief Dambuza.

On the other hand, Dr Mhlanga said he would also be meeting Members of Parliament (MPs) from the 15 constituencies under the region.

"I am meeting MPs for the first time.

The plan is to also have a meeting with the MPs monthly," said Dr Mhlanga.

# **BUCKSWOOD SCHOOL** RETURNS TO THE KINGDOM FOR ANNUAL SUMMER TRIP



### Breaking down the Public Protector's findings against Gordhan

**DURBAN - Public Protector Busisiwe** Mkhwebane has laid down the law to President Cyril Ramaphosa, instructing him to take action against embattled Public Enterprises Minister Pravin Gordhan for violating the Constitution and deliberately misleading Parliament about the SARS rogue unit and his meeting with a member of the Gupta family.

In her report released on Friday, Mkhwebane found Gordhan guilty of improper conduct, abuse of power and maladministration for approving the establishment of an illegal spy unit during his tenure as SARS commissioner between 1998 and 2009.

Here is a summary of the public protector's findings:

### 1. COMPLAINT NUMBER ONE

Regarding whether Public Enterprises Minister Pravin Gordhan violated the Executive Ethics Code by deliberately misleading the National Assembly in failing to disclose that he had met with a member of the Gupta family since taking office.

Finding: According to Gordhan's affidavit to the State Capture Commission of Inquiry (the Zondo Commission), he only remembered this meeting... after being reminded of it by former chief of staff Dondo Mogajane. I find this rather implausible when one considers the prominence of the subject of state capture in South Africa. I therefore find that his conduct in this regard is in violation of Paragraph 2 of the Executive Ethics

Code and accordingly amounts to con-unit had already started operating. Pillay duct that is inconsistent with his office reported directly to Gordhan as a comby Section 96 of the Constitution.

### 2. COMPLAINT NUMBER TWO

Regarding whether, during his tenure as SARS commissioner, Gordhan established an intelligence unit in violation of South African intelligence prescripts, and if so, whether such conduct constitutes maladministration.

Finding: Evidence indicates that even prior to Mr Gordhan's memorandum to Mr Manuel, SARS had already begun operating a unit that gathered information covertly. However, as the accounting officer, Gordhan should have been aware and, I believe, was aware that the missioner of SARS.

The establishment of the unit with the approval of Gordhan as the erstwhile accounting officer was in breach of section 209 of the Constitution, in terms of which only the president may establish such covert information-gathering unit. I further noted that Magashula had misrepresented himself under oath by denying the existence of an intelligence unit. Even if the unit was never called the Rogue Unit at SARS, the operations and functions of the CBCU, a unit that existed, were similar.

The conduct of Gordhan as referred to in the establishment of the intelligence unit at SARS, is improper and in viola-

tion of Section 209 of the Constitution and therefore amounts to maladministration, as envisaged in Section 182(1) of the Constitution and abuse of power, as envisaged in Section 6(4)(ii) of the Public Protector Act.

### 3. COMPLAINT NUMBER THREE

Regarding whether SARS failed to follow correct procurement processes in the procurement of intelligence equipment which the intelligence unit utilised for gathering intelligence, and if so, whether such conduct amounts to maladministration.

Finding: SARS failed to provide me with documents relating to the procurement of equipment for the CBCU, NRG, and subsequently the SPU. Evidence at my disposal confirms the existence of such equipment as well as the acquisition thereof. Citizen

The DPM despite his pro-active engagement in similar cases, which were reported in various companies or communities is having his hands tied on this one.


His position gives an impression that there is nothing bigger than him, but administratively his hands are tied on this one.

### SODV Act 2018

144. (1) The Registrar of the High Court or a clerk of a Magistrate Court may, by notice given to a person, summon the person to attend the hearing of an application for a protection order at a time and place specified in the summons-

(a) to give evidence; and

(b) to produce any record in the possession of that person and specified in the notice.

(2) A person served with a summons to attend as a witness shall not fail, without reasonable excuse-

(a) to attend as required by the

(b) to attend from time to time in the course of the hearing as required by the Court; or

(c) to produce any record that the person was required to produce by the summons served on the person.

(3) A person attending as a witness at a hearing shall not fail-

(a) to be sworn or to make an affirmation; or

(b) without reasonable excuse, to answer a question that the person is required to answer by the Court.

(4) If a person served with a summons fails to attend as mentioned in subsection (2)(a) or (b), the Court may order the issue of a warrant for the person to be taken into custody by a police officer and to be brought before Court.

(5) Any Magistrate may issue a warrant for the purposes of sub-Section (4). 92

(6) Subsection (4) does not limit any other powers of the Court.

Court may set aside a summons

145. (1) A Court may set aside a summons issued under Section 144 if the Court is satisfied there are sufficient grounds for setting the summons aside, including-

(a) want of relevance;

(b) privilege; or

(c) oppressiveness.

(2) The Court may act on the application of the person served with the summons or on its own initia-

(3) If a Court sets aside a summons under Subsection (1), the Court may make an order for costs for the benefit of the person on whom the summons was served.

### **PART XXIV** SERVICE

Service etc. of documents.

146. (1) A summons, order or other document to be served for the purposes of this Act may be served in the manner prescribed by the Criminal Procedure and Evidence Act with respect to service of summonses under that Act, and if it is so served, the provisions of that Act as to proof of service shall apply to proof of service for the purposes of this Act.

(2) A document to be given to any person for the purposes of this Act shall be taken to have been duly



given if-(a) it is given to the person personally or to a person authorised by the person to whom it is directed to accept delivery of documents on behalf that person, either generally or in a particular case;

(b) it is left at the place of residence or business of the person to whom it is directed last known to the person who gives it; or

(c) it is sent by post to the place of residence or business of the person to whom it is directed last known to the person who gives it.

(3) A document shall be deemed to have been received by the person to whom it is directed-

(a) where it has been given in the manner referred to in subsection (2)(a), on the day it is so given;

(b) where it has been given in the manner referred to in subsection (2) (b), on the day next following the day it is left at the place specified therein; or

(c) where it has been given in the manner referred to in Subsection (2)(c), unless the contrary is proved, at the time it would be delivered in the ordinary course of post.

(4) A summons or warrant issued to cause a person to appear or to be brought before a Magistrates Court in connection with proceedings under this Act may be served or executed on a Sunday as on any other day.

### Service of Court orders.

147. (1) This section applies if a

(a) has made a protection order; (b) revokes a protection order; or (c) varies a protection order (including the conditions imposed by it).

Court may summon persons to appear

(2) Subject to Subsection (3), the clerk of Court shall-

(a) cause-

(i) a copy of the order; and

(ii) in the case of an interim protection order, a copy of the application for a protection order to which the protection order relates (if a copy has not already been

(a) in the case where a copy is to be served on the respondent, cause two copies of the order to be given to the officer in charge of the police region in which the respondent was last known to the clerk to ordinarily reside; or

(b) in the case where a copy is to be given to the aggrieved person, cause one copy of the order to be given to the officer in charge of the police region in which the aggrieved person was last known to the clerk to ordinarily reside.

4) The officer in charge of a police region who receives a copy or copies of an order from the clerk of Court under Subsection (3) shall cause a copy of the order to be served on the respondent or, as the case may be, given to the aggrieved personas soon as is practicable.





# Betting on local SMEs for ong-run economic growth

IT is time for economic policies that will put a fair share of Eswatini's economy in the hands of local entrepreneurs.


According to the World Economic Forum (WEF), Africa is becoming the most exciting economic frontier with small and medium enterprises (SMEs) at the forefront of this transformation. Africa's SMEs, which are now responsible for about 80 per cent of employment, play a central role in establishing the continent's new middle class, thus fuelling the demand for new goods and services.

As the name suggests, SMEs are small businesses though they cover widely different types of firms in the various sectors of the economy. They include fragile micro-firms generating subsistence level revenues through one or two employees, to fast growing medium-sized firms with up to 250 employees. These SMEs can range from fruit vendors to sophisticated software engineers.

However, as with all small things, SMEs tend to be overlooked for all the wrong reasons. Too often, they are easily forgotten in the shadows of 'big business' and 'big money' despite the fact that SMEs create the bulk of employment for the growing urban and rural labour force.

A study by the Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development (2016) reveals that SMEs contribute over 55 per cent of gross domestic product (GDP) and over 65 per cent of total employment in high-income countries. In Europe, small businesses constitute 99 per cent of all businesses that employ approximately 95 million people, an equivalent of 55 per cent of total private sector jobs. In low-income countries, SMEs account for over 60 per cent of GDP and over 70 per cent of total employment.

Although SMEs are growing at a smaller pace in Eswatini, in 2010 there were 4926 SMEs in the country, each employing about three people. To date, there are 68 536 local SMEs generating E2.8 billion monthly profits, about 5.2 per cent of the E53.5 billion worth of GDP in 2016 (FinMark Trust, 2017). Furthermore, the SME sector provides jobs to 92 643 people (43.7 per cent of the 212 130 employed in Eswatini). Hence, SMEs contribute to the economy in a big way.



Research shows that SMEs are recognised worldwide as significant contributors to national output and employment creation; they facilitate growth in exports and are the bedrock for entrepreneurship and innovation. Most importantly, SMEs have the ability to create opportunities for the youth to engage in business activities for locally produced goods and

They can grow the middle class as well as increase disposable incomes for locals, and in tandem, SMEs can create new market opportunities for local and foreign investors.

It is a winning position that the country needs to capitalise on more boldly. With more investments directed to Eswatini's SMEs, the economy can grow beyond the two per cent GDP growth rate glass ceiling.

### UNPACKING THE FDI TRAP

Economic policies for developing countries tend to focus on foreign direct investment (FDI) and attracting 'big business' as a key catalyst for growth and employment creation. The immediate response is that FDIs come with big companies that offer an unprecedented number of jobs and capital. Understandably, we equate 'big money' and many jobs with increased output and economic growth.

For example, the Economic Recovery Strategy (ERS) launched after the fiscal crisis in 2011 emphasised the importance of large-scale foreign and domestic investment. It pushed for FDIs and 'big business' as good sources of substantial capital, sophisticated equipment and machinery, technical expertise, and access to the global market. The view was that FDIs would lay the foundation for commercial and industrial development, while at the same time become perfect spawning ground for SMEs

Government's focus on attracting FDI is not without good reason: FDIs provide jobs, expertise, technology, state revenue, and when set up right, can transfer skills through learningby-doing. However, there is an issue of sustainability. What history has taught us is that big international firms operate at economies of scale with watertight business value chains linked to their home economies. What it means is that local SMEs usually get little to no opportunity to linkup with the business chains of the FDI companies.

Some FDI companies specifically set up shop in developing countries just to take advantage of tax holidays and cheap labour, among other benefits, so that when they have made their lucrative profits and sent them back to their home countries, they close shop and move on to the next perfect host economy.

In the case of Eswatini, the departure of some foreign investors has been followed by an economic vacuum and a plethora of issues, such as decreased government revenue, job losses, de-industrialisation, and a mass exodus of skilled labour to other countries.

Indeed FDIs create jobs; however, under the premise of sustainable economic growth, Eswatini has to consider the type and quality of jobs offered by the FDIs, the participation of local firms, and the linkages of the foreign company to the local economy. A good example is the textile industry, where a majority of low or unskilled labour is employed on low salaries tethering below the minimum wage, which is not even enough to cater for basic needs.

Nevertheless, the newly launched Eswatini Strategic Roadmap 2019-2022 recognises that to sustain longterm economic growth, the country will have to invest a little more aggressively on its SMEs. In other words, the country will have to deliberately formulate and implement economic policies that will support the creation of local entrepreneurs, with special focus on the youth.

### **SMES FOR LOCAL DEVELOPMENT**

The country desperately needs a more diversified and vibrant private sector for economic growth to occur. A one-sided focus on FDIs and 'big business' will most likely yield the same 0.9 - 1.9 per cent GDP growth rates and fail to pull the country out of stagnation.

A paper published by the Eswatini Economic Policy Analysis and Research Centre (ESEPARC) finds that the country has put in place numerous institutional frameworks aimed at enhancing trade and creating an attractive macroeconomic environment favourable to both local and international investors. The study finds that for the most part, Eswatini has been importing more than it has been exporting. As a result, the trade balance remains largely negative. Moreover, Eswatini's export basket consists of a limited number of export products with very little change in the type of export commodities over the years. This is despite all the efforts (institutional, trade relations, and infrastructure development) aimed at promoting local production and

Therefore, government and the private sector need to direct investments to the SMEs owned by local entrepreneurs to ensure the production and circulation of money within the economy. If all these reasons are not convincing enough, the high unemployment rate (23 per cent) makes a strong argument for raving up support towards Eswatini's SMEs. For instance, the Eswatini Labour Force Survey of 2016 reports youth unemployment as high as 47.4 per cent. This implies very low income generation and wealth creation opportunities for the country's future generation.

### **FOCUS ON** SUSTAINABLE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

It is time the country reconsiders the role of FDIs in shaping our economic path in Eswatini. At the very least of the FDI agenda, the country should leverage FDIs to nurture and grow Swazi-owned businesses, particularly SMEs. At the same time, the point is not to dismiss FDIs; they too can incite real growth if they are well targeted in certain sectors of the economy.

Sustainable development is about making investments in the things that matter in the long-term. In that spirit, government should deliberately increase support to SMEs to ensure that they sustain the integrity and growth of the economy in the long-

The aim of the visit by RSTP and UNESWA was to seek best practices and strengthen already existing relations with some of the institutions as they are already doing some work with them.

"We saw the need for us to partner with institutions like CECI Engineering to assist us as we work towards establishing world class national laboratories for our Biotechnology Park. CECI Engineering will undertake the assessment of our needs, demands, requirements, designs and implementation plan to ensure that the Kingdom of Eswatini establishes national laboratories that uphold international standards." he added.

Dlamini mentioned that RSTP and

CECI signed a Professional Consultancy Agreement for the provision of preliminary planning services for the establishment of National Laboratories in the Kingdom of Eswatini. He highlighted that there is a need for the national laboratories to meet international standards for among other things all product testing and certification as they will lead to the promotion of the biotechnology industry. "The laboratories will assist the country in ensuring that there is value addition in a number of sectors which may include agriculture, pharmaceuticals, electronics, clinical testing, cosmetics and computing among other," said Dlamini.

The company also signed a Master Agreement on ICT Cooperation and a Service Order for collaboration programmes for ICT Capacity Building and e-Learning Platform development with International Integrated Systems, Inc, Taiwan. According to

Dlamini, this agreement is a result of the good relations and bilateral relations between Kingdom of Eswatini and the Republic of China on Taiwan. It will see collaboration and exchange programmes between the Advanced School of Information Technology (ASIT) which is a business unit at RSTP and the Taiwan Institute for Information Industry (III) and the Industry Technology Research Institutes (ITRI).

He further disclosed that the Taiwanese government will be funding this project with an approved budget of almost E2 million, and that this project will help them a great deal as it will enable ASIT to provide online training, which will not only assist in making the institution competitive but also assist a number of locals to upskill, while they continue to be productive at work or in their businesses.

### LAND DEGRADATION NEUTRALITY TARGET SET-AGRICULTURE

TO achieve Land Degradation Neutrality by 2030, Eswatini will increase net land productivity by 10 per cent in all land cover categories through Sustainable Land Management practices, amongst others.

The Minister of Agriculture Jabulani Mabuza disclosed this information during the UN Convention to Combat Desertification (UNCCD) commemoration day at KaNdinda community on Thursday.

"The main drivers of land degradation include population pressure and unsustainable land use practices such as over-grazing, over cultivation and deforestation. These result in the depletion and extinction of species (loss of biodiversity), increasing frequencies of droughts, water stress, dwindling production and pro-

ductivity," he said.

The minister said the direct and indirect causes of land degradation in Eswatini included, improper land use, rapid conversion of communal range lands into settlements, climate effects, uncontrolled fires, invasive

alien plant species, population increase, road infrastructure development, effects and impacts of poverty, crop farming practices, livestock farming practices, and others.

"Here at home, there are clear evidences of recovery and restoration of degraded landscapes through Sustainable Land Management (SLM) practices over the years.

Degraded For example, degraded land has been restored through rehabilitation (using gabion baskets and planting of trees) in Sithobela, Nceka, Sihlangwini, Gucuka, Kukhanyeni, Ngculwini, Ezulwini and many other places," he said.

He further stated that since its adoption in 1994, the UNCCD has contributed to the advancement of sustainable land management further disclosing that to this day, its 197 Parties implement the Convention under coordinated and results-oriented actions with clear targets to recover and restore degraded land.

Goal

The end goal is to protect the country's land, from over-use and drought, so it can continue to provide everyone with food, water and energy.

"It is also critical that the three Rio conventions should coordinate efforts and work together: that is the United Nations Convention to Combat Desertification (UNCCD), United Nations Convention on Biodiversity (UBCBD) and the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate change (UNFCCC). This is important as all of them are addressing the environment for sustaining livelihoods," he added.

### The targets set by the country for achieving Land Degradation Neutrality by 2030 include:

- Increase forest cover through Afforestation/Agroforestry in existing forests, range lands; areas of shrubs/grassland; wetlands; croplands by 465 290 Ha by 2030
- Increase by 10 per cent net land productivity in all land cover categories through Sustainable Land Management practices by 2030.
- Improve by 50 per cent productivity and Soil Organic Carbon stocks in cropland and grasslands by 2030 as compared to 2015
- Increase Protected Area land coverage from 70 000 Ha to 113 000 Ha by 2022
- Rehabilitate 115 000 hectares of degraded and abandoned land for crop production by 2030
- Reduce current annual loss of forest to cropland of 9.1 km2 to 4 km2 by 2022 and achieve 0 km2 forest loss by 2030
- Reduce the rate of conversion of natural forest to settlements (conversion to artificial land cover) by 30 per cent by 2030 as compared to 2010

Land degradation is a process in which the value of the biophysical environment is affected by a combination of human-induced processes acting upon the land. It is viewed as any change or disturbance to the land perceived to be deleterious or undesirable

THE Eswatini Revenue Authority has expressed concern over the slow uptake of E-Tax Registration and Filing platform.

Making his remarks during the launch of the Filing Season 2019 at the company's Headquarters at Ezulwini, Commissioner General Dumisani Masilela said even the utilisation amongst those that are registered

The SRA launched the e-filing platform in 2015, which started with VAT registered entities and has been expanded to include the filing of all income taxes, the viewing of statements, payment of taxes and the lodgement of queries. "We have promoted e-tax amongst the taxpaying community for a few years now and as at the end of March 2019 we had 2 399 taxpayer registered. "We are, however, very concerned about the very slow uptake of this very convenient platform and the low utilisation among those are registered," he said. He said they do realise that there may be reasons behind this outcome and are happy to receive comments from taxpayers so they could improve it.

He added that in other jurisdictions, online filing was compulsory for certain categories of taxpayers.

# SAMSUNG ELECTRONICS FLAGS 56% FALL IN Q2 OPERATING PROFIT

SEOUL - Samsung Electronics said on Friday it expects operating profit to tumble 56 per cent for the second quarter of this year in the face of a weakening chip market.

Operating profit for the April to June period is forecast to reach around 6.5 trillion won (US\$5.6-billion), down 56 per cent from a year earlier, the world's largest maker of smartphones and memory chips said in a statement.

The firm is the flagship subsidiary of the giant Samsung Group, by far the biggest of the family-controlled conglomerates that dominate business in the world's 11th largest economy, and it is crucial to South Korea's economic health.

It has enjoyed record profits in recent years despite a series of setbacks, including the jailing of its de facto

But now the picture is changing, with chip prices falling as global supply increases while demand weakens.

Samsung launched its top-end S10 5G smartphone earlier this year, after



South Korea won the global race to commercially launch the world's first nationwide 5G network.

But in April it made a high-profile decision to push back the release of its new Galaxy Fold phones after reviewers provided with early devices reported screen problems within days of use.

While Samsung's device was not the first folding handset, the smartphone giant was expected to help spark demand and potentially revive a sector that has been struggling for new innovations.

The South Korean firm had spent nearly eight years developing the Galaxy Fold as part of its strategy to propel growth with groundbreaking gadgets.

The firm is yet to announce its new release date.

# AMAZON FACES REVIEW BY UK WATCHDOG

LONDON - Amazon.com Inc. is facing an initial review by the UK competition regulator into its bid to buy a slice of fast-growing food delivery startup Deliveroo.

The Competition and Markets Authority on Friday said it has "reasonable grounds" to believe that Amazon and Deliveroo have either ceased to be separate businesses, or will merge in the near future, according to the enforcement order posted online on Friday.

The initial review means that Amazon won't be able to close the deal and that both companies will have to continue acting as independent entities.

While reviews into mergers by the CMA are relatively common, it is unusual for the regulator to examine acquisitions of minority stakes. In May Amazon said it would invest US\$575 million into Deliveroo to help the London-based startup expand its technology team and network and compete against the likes of Just Eat Plc and Uber Technologies Inc. in Europe's fiercely competitive food delivery indus-

"Deliveroo and Amazon have

been working closely with regulators to obtain regulatory approvals." said a Deliveroo spokesman in a statement.

The UK food delivery marketplace - Deliveroo's home market - is arguably one of the most competitive. Amazon closed down its London-focused food delivery business last year. Amazon has signaled its growing ambitions in the UK with Prime Now, which offers deliveries to major British cities within two hours.

But it faces stiff domestic competition from the likes of Ocado Group Plc, an online grocery pioneer that licences its technology to the likes of Kroger Co. and aims to halve that time with a service called Zoom.

London-based Deliveroo has raised US\$1.5 billion in venture capital since it was founded in 2012 and its self-employed riders have become a familiar sight in many large cities. It now wants to reach half of the UK's population of 65 million by the end of the year, up from the 33 per cent who can currently use its mobile app, said Chief Executive Officer Will Shu. Bloomberg



### DENEL ASKS FOR R2.8Bn STATE CASH INJECTION - CEO

PRETORIA - South African state defence company has asked the government for a R2.8 billion (\$200 million) cash injection to help it emerge from a financial crisis and secure lucrative export deals, its chief executive said.

Denel, a cornerstone of the country's once-mighty defence industry, is one of several state firms whose finances were damaged by years of mismanagement during former President Jacob Zuma's tenure.

CEO Danie du Toit, appointed late last year to oversee a turnaround plan, said recovery efforts were progressing well and Denel could win R30 billion of deals in the next two years if it received help to overcome acute liquidity constraints. Denel produces military equipment from ammunition and armoured vehicles to missiles and attack helicopters for the

South African armed forces and for export. "We have an excellent return on investment potential on recapitalisation," he said in an interview at Denel's offices outside Pretoria.

He said he hoped the cash injection would be announced this month and that the funds would arrive in world September or October.



### Jaguar boosts UK auto industry with electric cars commitment

LONDON - Jaguar Land Rover plans to build a new range of electrified cars in the UK, safeguarding thousands of jobs and providing a boost for a British automotive industry that's been rocked by job cuts and plant closures.

The move, announced Friday, involves hundreds of millions of pounds in investments. It guarantees the future of the company's Castle Bromwich plant in central England and comes after JLR committed to offering electrified options of all new models from 2020. The first vehicle off the production line will be an all-electric version of Jaguar's flagship XJ saloon.

Brexit, a slowdown in China and flagging demand for diesel-powered vehicles have taken a toll on JLR, which owns the iconic Jaguar sportscar and Land Rover sport-utility brands. The company, part of India's Tata

Motors Ltd., said in January it would slash 4 500 jobs worldwide to conserve cash, and Tata is exploring options for the business, Bloomberg reported in March.

toward electrification. While the Jaguar I-Pace SUV, its first all-electric car, is being made in Austria, the company is retooling part of its Solihull plant to make electric versions of Land Rover's top-end Range Rover mod-

### **IRAN REDUCES** COMMITMENT TO 2015 NUCLEAR D

DUBAI - Iran said yesterday it would further scale back its commitment to the 2015 nuclear deal with world powers, raising its uranium enrichment level beyond agreed levels to produce fuel for power plants.

The announcement, confirming what Reuters reported on Saturday, signaled a growing challenge to escalating US sanctions pressure.

In a news conference, senior Iranian officials said Tehran would keep reducing its commitments every 60 days, unless signatories of the pact moved to protect it from US sanctions, but they left the door open to

Before the deal was sealed, Iran produced 20 per cent enriched uranium needed to fuel its Tehran reactor and the level of enrichment for its southern Bushehr nuclear power plant was five per cent.

### Enrich

"We will enrich uranium based on our needs ... right now we don't need to enrich uranium needed for Tehran reactor," said Behrouz Kamalvandi, Iran's Atomic Energy Organisation spokesman.

'We will enrich uranium to the level that is needed for the Bushehr reactor." In a sign of heightening Western

concern, French President Emmanuel Macron said he and Iran's President Hassan Rouhani had agreed to seek conditions for a resumption of dialogue on the Iranian nuclear question by July 15. Macron's office added that he would keep on talking with Iranian authorities and other involved parties to "engage in a de-escalation of tensions related to Iranian nuclear issue." Long-tense relations between Tehran and Washington took a turn for the worse in May 2018 when US President Donald Trump pulled out of the 2015 nuclear deal reached before he took office, and reimposed sanctions. # Trump administration is inept and insecure - UK ambassador

WASHINGTON - The Trump administration has been labelled "inept", insecure and incompetent in leaked emails from the UK ambassador to Washington.

Sir Kim Darroch said that the White House was "uniquely dysfunctional" and "divided" under Donald Trump.

But he also warned that the US president should not be written

The Foreign Office said the leak of the memos to the Mail yesterday was "mischievous" but did not deny their accuracy.

The White House has not yet responded to the revelation of the contents of the memos, but it could test the so-called "special relationship" between the US and UK.

In the messages, Sir Kim said: "We don't really believe this administration is going to become substantially more normal; less dysfunctional; less unpredictable; less faction-riven; less diplomatically clumsy and inept."

He questioned whether this White House "will ever look competent". Although Sir Kim said Trump was "dazzled" by his state visit to the UK in June, the ambassador warns that his administration will remain selfinterested, adding: "This is still the land of America First".

### Climate

Differences between the US and the UK on climate change, media freedoms and the death penalty might come to the fore as the countries seek to improve trading relations after Brexit, the memos said.

To get through to the president, "you need to make your points simple, even blunt", he said. In a message sent last month, Sir Kim branded US policy on Iran as "incoherent, chaotic".

### Russian-led assault in Syria leaves over 500 civilians dead

AMMAN - At least 544 civilians have been killed and over 2 000 people injured since a Russian-led assault on the last rebel bastion in northwestern Syria began two months ago, rights groups and rescuers said on Saturday.

Russian jets joined the Syrian army on April 26 in the biggest offensive against parts of rebel-held Idlib province

and adjoining northern Hama provinces in the biggest escalation in the war between Syrian President Bashar al Assad and his enemies since last sum-

The Syrian Network for Human Rights.(SNHR), which monitors casualties and briefs various UN agencies, said the 544 civilians killed in the hundreds of attacks carried out by Russian

jets and the Syrian army include 130 children. Another 2 117 people have been injured.

"The Russian military and its Syrian ally are deliberately targeting civilians with a record number of medical facilities bombed," Fadel Abdul Ghany, Chairman of SNHR, told Reuters.

Russia and its Syrian army ally deny their jets hit indiscriminately civilian

areas with cluster munitions and incendiary weapons, which residents in opposition areas say are meant to paralyse every-day life.

Moscow says its forces and the Syrian army are fending off terror attacks by al Qaeda militants whom they say hit populated, government-held areas, and it accuses rebels of wrecking a ceasefire deal agreed last year between

Turkey and Russia.

Last month US-based Human Rights Watch said the Russian-Syrian joint military operation had used cluster munitions and incendiary weapons in the attacks along with large air-dropped explosive weapons with wide-area effects in populated civilian areas, based on reports by first responders and witnesses. Italy's Interior Minister Matteo Salvini had earlier vowed he would not allow migrants to disembark. "I saw that the German government wrote me a letter today asking to reopen the ports and to let all the migrants disembark," he said on a Facebook live stream.



# MBOWENI, MAKHURA REBUKE

JOHANNESBURG - President Cyril Ramaphosa on Saturday issued a stern rebuke to Finance Minister Tito Mboweni and Gauteng Premier David Makhura following their heated exchange on social media over the contentious e-tolls saga.

Mboweni and Makhura were embroiled in a Twitter spat after the finance minister sparked the debate on Thursday night when he insisted "users must pay" for e-

So, when you invest in a toll road infrastructure, you expect a return for many years ahead as per contract. Right? Not the cost of your investment today. Future returns. That is what you do in business. Premier Makhura, correct? Or am I missing something here?

His tweets appeared to have been sparked by Makhura's comments during his State of the Province

Address this week, where the premier reiterated his stance that etolls were not part and parcel of the future he envisaged for Gauteng.

The heated exchange, which even saw Makhura's executive weigh in on the matter, caused a furore on social media and massive backlash against Mboweni from users.

### Statement

The Presidency has since issued a statement on the matter, saying Ramaphosa viewed the exchange between the Mboweni and the Gauteng provincial government as "unfortunate and deeply regrettable"

"The president says such exchanges on social media are unbecoming of their high offices and fail to provide the leadership required in this instance. "The public interest is best served through collaboration, not conflict, and the appropriate platform for leaders to express and reconcile differing views is Cabinet and other coordination forums."

The Presidency also confirmed that Ramaphosa had mandated Minister of Transport Fikile Mbalula. together with Mboweni and Makhura, to submit to Cabinet a solution to the impasse around electronic tolling on Gauteng freeways.

He called on the ministers and premier to table proposals to Cabinet by the end of August 2019.

"While the user-pay principle remains a policy of government, the electronic tolling system as part of the Gauteng Freeway Improvement Plan (GFIP) presents challenges in its current form.

"The president expects that the consultations within government over the coming weeks will produce workable outcomes," the Presidency said.

### Public Protector's decision questioned over probe into nepotism

CAPE TOWN - A complainant has asked for a review of a decision by Public Protector (PP) Busisiwe Mkhwebane with regard to an investigation into allegations of mismanagement and nepotism at one of the City of Cape Town's departments.

Mkhwebane's office was asked in 2017 to investigate complaints of alleged maladministration, wasteful. truttess and irregular expenditure related to the contract between the City and asset management company Pragma, which, initially valued at R12million excluding VAT, quickly ran to over R100m.

The appointment of the consulting company for water-related infrastructure maintenance work was also questioned as the department had, according to the complainant, suitably qualified employees.

However, the PP said that she planned to exercise her "discretion on the resolution of complaints" and close the

matter as she was satisfied that the issues raised by the complainant had been thoroughly dealt with by an internal forensic investigation that was conducted by the City's forensic services department (FSD).

A spokesperson for the PP, Oupa Segwale said: "She was favoured with a copy of the FSD's report. She gets progress reports on implementation of the FSDs".

Mkhwebane was asked to investigate whether the City acted properly with regard to:

 Appointments of senior managers in the water and sanitation department in that the advertisements of the posts were amended to suit certain individuals.

 Awarding a tender contract to Pragma Africa in 2016 to conduct certain water-related functions. Weekend Argus

### Ramaphosa heads in Niger for 'historic' AU summit

PRETORIA - In a statement, the presidency said President Ramaphosa was accompanied by International Relations and Cooperation Minister Naledi Pandor, Finance Minister Tito Mboweni, and Trade and Industry Minister Ebrahim Patel.

"The summit marks the entry into force of the Agreement on the Establishment of the African Continental Free Trade Area (AfCFTA) and formally launches the operational phase of the African Internal Market," said the presidency

"The summit will also decide on the location and structure of the AfCFTA Secretariat."

At the open session of the summit, Ramaphosa would - alongside President Paul Kagame of Rwanda - participate in the launch of the Tariff Concession Portal.

"The password-controlled tariff concession portal was created to allow countries ready to extend tariff preferences and/or give concessions to do so in a secured manner

. To this end, the aforementioned prod-

ucts will attract minimal or no tariffs, thus making them more competitive," the presidency said.

The summit was preceded by the 35th Ordinary Session of the Executive Council, and the AfCFTA Business Forum which took place on Saturday.

The presidency said that since its adoption, the AfCFTA had been signed by 52 countries, with 24 ratifications, thus ensuring its entry into force after it surpassed the threshold of 22 ratifications by AU member states. South Africa deposited its Instrument of Ratification of the agreement establishing the AfCFTA in February

### **Destinations**

Currently, South Africa's primary export destinations on the continent were mainly within the Southern African Development Community (SADC), followed by East Africa.

The AfCFTA presented South Africa with an opportunity for expansion to new markets in West and North Africa for the export of value-added goods as well as services.

"The AfCFTA aims to make doing

business on the continent easier and encourages African countries to trade among each other while addressing issues that stifle intra-African trade, such as high transport costs, cumbersome customs, among others," the presidency

In a "historic" moment for the 55-member bloc, according to its chairman Moussa Faki, heads of state will officially launch AfCFTA at the two-day summit in Niamey, the Nigerien capital.

### Agreement

The agreement comes after 1 / years of tough negotiations, and was formalised at the end of April when it crossed the launch threshold.

Nigeria, Africa's most populous country and largest economy, announced this week it would after all join the pact in Niamey, having unexpectedly pulled back from the agreement last year.

Nigeria's Chief Trade Negotiator, Ambassador Chiedu Osakwe, said President Muhammadu Buhari would sign the landmark agreement, "opening Africa up to abundant opportunities.

### Ramaphosa tasks Mbalula, Mboweni, Makhura to find solution

PRETORIA - In a statement on Saturday, President Cyril Ramaphosa's office said he had mandated Minister of Transport Fikile Mbalula to work with Finance Minister Tito Mboweni and Gauteng Premier David Makhura to submit to Cabinet a solution to the "impasse" around electronic tolling on Gauteng freeways.

Some of Mboweni's tweets have subsequently been deleted.

"The public interest is best served through collaboration, not conflict, and the appropriate platform for leaders to express and reconcile differing views is Cabinet and other coordination forums."

He wants them to table their proposals by the end of August.

"While the user-pay principle remains a policy of government, the electronic tolling system as part of the Gauteng Freeway Improvement Plan (GFIP) presents challenges in its current form.

"The President expects that the consultations within government over the coming weeks will produce workable outcomes."

Earlier, the opposition DA said in a statement on Saturday that Mboweni's Twitter outburst attacking Makhura's comments during his State of the Province Address about e-tolls had confirmed that e-tolls were here to stay.

"Taking to Twitter, Mboweni lambasted Makhura, stating that the unjust user-pay system on Gauteng's freeways will not be removed under his watch," said DA Gauteng leader Solly Msimanga.

"It is Minister Mboweni, not Premier Makhura, who pulls the country's purse strings and has the final say on how taxes are raised," said Msimanga.

### Granties

"Since the gantries were switched on in December 2013, the ANC has consistently spoken with a forked tongue on the matter. When it is convenient, they claim that the system will be scrapped. But when the truth comes out, it is clear that they care not for the plight of Gauteng's residents."

Mboweni then responded saying "I am certain that the Premier of Gauteng knows that you have to be careful before you pick up a fight with a National Minister of Finance..."

During his first budget speech earlier this year, the minister made it clear he was against the scrapping of e-tolls.

"If we want a road transport infrastructure that works, we need to pay our tolls. Government remains committed," he said.

"There's nothing for mahala. It doesn't exist mahala. To get something you must first get something from Paul."

Makhura hit back saying he has referred the matter to President Cyril Ramaphosa.


### SUDAN'S MILITARY LEADER WELCOMES OWER-SHARING DEAL

KHARTOUM - Sudan's Vice-President of the Transitional Military Council and senior military leader, General Mohamed Hamdan Dagalo, welcomed a power-sharing agreement on Saturday.

The military council that has ruled the country since the fall of President Omar al-Bashir in April and a coalition of opposition and protest groups have temporarily agreed to share power for three years.

"The long-awaited agreement has been reached and this agreement needs unity and purity of intent", General Dagalo said.

The agreement, which is due to be finalised today, has rekindled hopes for a peaceful transition of power in a country plagued by internal conflicts and years of economic crisis that have contributed to the overthrow

of Al Bashir.

The two sides agreed to establish a sovereign council to be led for the first 21 months by the military and for the last 18 months by civilians.

That's according to a statement by the Sudanese Professionals Association, which has been behind several months of protests against Bashir and the military rulers. Reuters

### Sudan rebels criticise protesters' deal with the army

KAHRTOUM - Sudanese rebel groups have criticised a power-sharing deal between the military and the country's pro-democracy movement aimed at ending weekslong political dead-

The protest leaders in the capital, Khartoum, and the ruling military made public an agreement to form a joint government on Friday.

A faction of the Sudan Liberation Movement, led by Minni Minnawi, said late Friday a peace deal had to be reached with rebel groups before embarking on the deal's planned transition.

Another faction of the SLM, led by Abdel Wahid al-Nur, slammed the deal as a "betrayal of the revolution."

The SLM — then fighting an insurgency in the Darfur region - split into rival factions in 2004. AP

### German migrant ship denied entry to Maltese waters

VALLETTA - A German rescue ship heading to Malta after being refused entry into Italy has not been given clearance to enter Maltese waters, authorities said yesterday.

Italy's migration policy has led to clashes between NGOs and Italian authorities over rules that effectively close off the country's ports to their boats. The Alan Kurdi is the latest of several vessels carrying migrants that has faced problems trying to dock in an Italian port in the past couple of weeks. The German-flagged vessel named after the three-year-old Syrian refugee Alan Kurdi who drowned in the Mediterranean in 2015, decided on Saturday to change course for Malta after a standoff with Rome.

On Sunday, the Maltese armed forces said the government would guide it on the appropriate action to take should the ship enter Maltese waters.

The ship, which has 65 migrants on board, was expected to arrive near Malta

yesterday afternoon. In a tweet on Saturday the German NGO running the Alan Kurdi said it had decided to change course for Malta because it could not wait for a state of emergency to develop on board. "It remains to be seen whether European governments support Italy's position. People are not bargaining chips," the NGO

### Coalition

Italy's coalition government, which includes the right-wing League, blames European partners for leaving it alone to deal with sea arrivals.

New rules were adopted last month threatening NGO ships entering Italian waters without permission with a fine of up to 50 000 euros and the impounding of their vessels. On June 29, Italian police arrested the German captain of the Dutchflagged Sea-Watch 3, operated by a German charity, after the vessel docked at the island port of Lampedusa though she was later released. Reuters

# Tax alcohol, tobacco, to tackle cancer: African Union first ladies

NIAMEY - First ladies attending the African Union summit in Niger on Saturday called for a rise in taxes for cancer-causing products such as tobacco and

Speaking on the sidelines of the summit at Niamey, Sika Bella Kabore, the first lady of Burkina Faso, read out a joint appeal for more effective measures to tackle cancer. As well as calling for cancer to be included in strategic planning, they called for higher taxes on tobacco, alcohol and other carcinogenic products. Both drink and cigarettes are cheaper in most African countries than in western countries, where a tax on such products tends to be incorporated into health policies. Cancer specialist Alain Toledano of the Rafael Institute in Paris welcomed the initiative.

"Africa is rightly concerned most of all with contagious diseases," said Toledano, who is also president of the Franco-African Cancerology Association.

### Issue

But he added the major issue they had forgotten was cancer.

"Nineteen million people will die in a year from cancer, 70 per cent of them in the poorest countries," he said. "So there will be millions of deaths in Africa. "If we want to succeed in our objective of raising life expectancy from 60 to 75 by 2063, we have to fight cancer," he added. Times Live

### NIGERIA TO CONFISCATE US\$40M OF ITEMS FROM EX-OIL MINISTER

ABUJA - A Nigerian court has ordered the imminent seizure of \$40 million worth of jewellery and a customised gold iPhone belonging to former oil minister Diezani Alison-Madueke, the country's anti-graft agency said on Friday.

The items, including hundreds of bangles, rings, earrings, necklaces and watches, were found at a property owned by Alison-Madueke, the Economic and Financial Crimes Commission (EFCC) said in a statement.

Alison-Madueke, who ran the

petroleum ministry from 2011 to 2015, was charged by the EFCC in absentia with money laundering in 2017. Her whereabouts are unknown, and a London-based lawyer who has represented her did not immediately respond to a request for comment.

The order gives the EFCC 14 days to print the charges in any national newspaper and allow for her or "anyone interested in the items" to show why they should not be permanently forfeited to the federal government.

> The Head of State accused organisers of the protest of plotting to overthrow his government and warned them that the authorities would treat them harshly. "The violence you see is calculated to make Malawi a lawless state.

### Boko Haram kills at least five soldiers

Haram ambushed Nigerian soldiers in the northeast of the country, killing at least five and injuring more than a dozen, sources told Reuters yesterday.

The sources said the death toll could increase as a number of soldiers were still missing after the attack on Thursday in Damboa, in Borno state in northeastern Nigeria.

The soldiers had gone to the area to clear a Boko Haram camp, but were ambushed, the sources said. Boko Haram militants have killed thousands and displaced millions in Nigeria during the group's decade-long insurgency against the government. Reuters

# AFCON 2019 UPDATES



#### Ighalo's brace sends Super Eagles into Afcon quarterfinals

CAIRO - Nigeria defeated Cameroon 3-2 in a thrilling Round of 16 fixture at the 2019 Africa Cup of Nations.

A brace from Odion Ighalo and Alex Iwobi's strike were enough for the Super Eagles to see off the reigning African champions at the Alexandria Stadium on Saturday.

The encounter, as expected, started as a physical contest but Nigeria had the better chances in the opening minutes.

through Odion Ighalo's effort, which was deflected into the back of Andre Onana's net.

After breaking the deadlock, Nigeria lost control of the game and Clarence Seedorf's men started applying pressure for an equaliser.

In the 24th minute, Clinton Njie benefitted from a defensive slip and then passed to Pierre Kunde, but the Mainz 05 midfielder blasted his effort wide

was punished for a late and reckless tackle on Oghenekaro Etebo.

Cameroon's push for an equaliser finally paid off in the 41st minute, with Stephane Bahoken slotting Bassogog's cross past Daniel Akpeyi.

The situation turned sour for Nigeria as Njie fired the Indomitable

> Lions ahead a minute before the half-time

break.

Five minutes after the restart, Ola Aina nearly made it three for Cameroon after deflecting Njie's cross goalwards, but Akpeyi came to the rescue with his save.

Moses Simon was replaced by Samuel Chukwueze on the hour mark as the Super Eagles pushed for a leveller.

Ighalo inspired the comeback in the 63rd minute after turning a pass from Ahmed Musa into the back of the net to set up a thrilling finale.

Even after getting the equaliser, Nigeria kept pushing for the lead and it came three minutes later, with Alex Iwobi finishing a fine assist from Ighalo.

While the Indomitable Lions worked to fight back, the Super Eagles held their ground to advance to the last

Two-goal hero Ighalo, who was named the Man of the Match, was later replaced by Paul Onuachu, while Leon Balogun came on for Iwobi at the death of the encounter.

Nigeria are still in the hunt for their fourth Afcon title and will meet South Africa in the quarterfinals on Wednesday.

#### Egyptians light up stadium in tribute to fallen fans

CAIRO - Even as Egypt struggled against South Africa in the last 16 of the Africa Cup of Nations on Saturday, the home fans took time to honour a recent tradition.

In the 20th and 72nd minutes of a match that the Egyptians were to lose 1-0, hundreds of supporters switched on their mobile phone flashlights -- a simple tribute to victims killed in deadly stadium clashes after the 2011 revolution. "This is our tradition that we pull out our mobiles," said 19-year-old

Mostafa Atef. "The blood of martyrs has nothing to do whether we support (rival clubs) Al Ahly or Zamalek."

The timing of the flashlight tributes reflect the numbers of fans killed in two separate incidents. There is still uncertainty at the number of fans who died in February 2012 when security forces stormed the field at the Port Said stadium of Al Masry during a match with Cairo-based Al Ahly.

Some reports claim 74 fans died that day, others say 72. Whichever, it was

one of the world's deadliest football

Three years later, almost to the day in 2015, 20 Zamalek fans – some reports say 22 – died after a mass stampede at the June 30 Stadium's gates, prompted by police use of teargas and live bullets. That led to the reinstatement of a total ban on attending domestic games which is still in effect.

For sales representative Islam Abdel Sadek, 30, the tragedies are a reminder that security in football stadiums will

still be necessary after the tournament.

"Egypt is strong and safe now," said Sadek. "But it's a poignant memory and we are praying for the martyrs. So of course we will always turn our lights on." In a tournament designed to promote the country's international image, Egyptian President Abdel Fattah al-Sisi told the national squad that preparations for international audiences were more important than their results on the pitch.

Under Sisi, who led the army's overthrow of President Mohamed Morsi in 2013, a focus on political stability and crushing dissent has meant that even football has been heavily scrutinised by the security forces.

The Cup of Nations has been a testing ground for fan attendance when the domestic league resumes. "Fans going back to the stadiums has been a great thing for Egyptian football," said Ahmad Yousef, editor of website KingFut.

Authorities, though, have been selective in their choice of who attends matches with a new online system requiring a background check using an Egyptian national ID.

CONMEBOL hit back at him yesterday, however, with an official statement describing Messi's comments as 'unacceptable.'

"Said accusations represent a lack



CAIRO - Debutants Madagascar continued their fairy-tale Africa Cup of Nations campaign by defeating Congo DR on penalties to advance to the quarter-finals.

The islanders were aggressive early in the match and were rewarded in the ninth minute as Ibrahim Amada sent them ahead with a sensational strike from range that found the top corner.

The Leopards got themselves back in the game in the 21st minute as Cedric Bakambu headed home a cross from Ngonda Muzinga at the back post, following a quick attack from their own half.

Florent Ibenge's charges got their confidence back after equalising and Chancel Mbemba had a chance to give them a 2-1 lead in the 32nd minute after being sent through on goal by Muzinga but he struck his shot over the bar.

Following a frenetic start in the first two quarters of the first stanza, the sides were going easy on the attacks in the closing stages, with chances few and far between to go to the break level pegging at 1-1.

Congo DR took the initiative to attack in the early stages of the second stanza but Nicolas Dupuis' men almost restored their lead ten minutes in as Jerome Mombris had a clear sight of goal but was denied by shot-stopper Ley Matampi while Charles Andriamatsinoro failed to capitalise on a rebound.

Bakambu should have bagged his



brace for the Leopards two minutes before the hour-mark after being sent clear on goal but with only the goalkeeper Melvin Adrien to beat, he scuffed his shot, giving the Malagasy shot-stopper a comfortable save.

Congo needed a creative spark in the last third with 20 minutes remaining, to break-down the rigid Madagascar defence and they called upon Yannick Bolasie in place of Akolo.

of the box, following a great delivery by Meschak Elia from a corner-kick to send the game to extra-time.

The Leopards had the upper hand in the early exchanges of the first period of extra-time and nearly went ahead in the tenth minute of added time after Metanire guided a header towards the bottom post following another good cross from Elia, but shot-stopper Adrien made a last-ditch save.

Bolasie almost snatched a sensational winner for Congo in the last five minutes of extra-time with a curling strike from the edge of the box, that missed the far post by inches after a quick shotcorner by Elia as the encounter went to penalties, where Madagascar held their nerve to triumph 4-2 and booked their spot in the last for the first time in their history. *Kick Off* 

# 'Sancho should snub Man U and stay at Dortmund'

LONDON - Wayne Rooney has urged Borussia Dortmund winger Jadon Sancho to snub overtures from Manchester United and continue to build his career in Germany.

# FIFA boss and Macron booed at World Cup final ceremony

LYON - The crowd at the women's World Cup final booed FIFA Chief Gianni Infantino and French President Emmanuel Macron as United States fans demanded equal pay for the players after their team claimed a fourth global title by beating the Netherlands 2-0 yesterday.

Macron and Infantino, the head of soccer's world governing body, were turned on by the supporters as they approached the ceremony podium – a sharp contrast with the hero-like reception given to player of the match Megan Rapinoe by the 57 900 crowd.

The US captain, the leading voice for equal pay in a sport where the men are far better paid than the women, scored the opening goal with a VAR-awarded penalty in the 61st minute at the sold-out Groupama Stadium.

Rose Lavelle rounded off the victory eight minutes later as the Americans added to their 1991, 1999 and 2015 world titles.

Earlier this year, members of the US squad were named as plaintiffs in a lawsuit against the national soccer federation alleging gender discrimination.

It was filed in federal court last month and says the women are not paid the same as their male counterparts.

On Saturday, Rapinoe launched a scathing attack on FIFA, saying the organisation did not respect the women's game.

Rapinoe said FIFA's decision to allow the men's Copa America final and Gold Cup showpiece to take place on the same day as the women's final was "unbelievable". Rapinoe shook Infantino and Macron's hands as she received her medal.

"It's unbelievable to know all the people who put in so much in this group," she said.

For Highlanders to be successful, proper structures must be put on place and make the team a company," he said.


Shongwe added that the team must follow club licensing to the latter and get a fully-fledged office.
