Murder suspect cop Bhubesi suspended without pay

MURDER suspect Constable Sibusiso Shongwe, well-known as Bhubhesi, has been suspended from work without pay by the Royal Eswatini Police Service (REPS).

This was with effect from March 25th

2019. This was communicated through a correspondence served to him in prison. Shongwe is currently in custody as his bail was opposed by the state.

This was confirmed by Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Superintendent Phindile Vilakati.

Supt. Vilakati said they followed the Police Act of 2018 Section 43 (8) which empowers the national commissioner

to suspend an officer arrested for a serious criminal act without pay whilst awaiting trial.

Shongwe is currently in custody as his bail is being opposed by the state. The officer is accused of having killed his girlfriend Lindokuhle Mlangeni, who was a nurse after a short argument while they were together inside the nurse's house at Hlatikulu on Boxing

Day last year.

It is alleged that Shongwe strangulated and killed Mlangeni during a domestic dispute.

The bone of contention is said to have been E4 000 which had been borrowed by Mlangeni. It is said as Shongwe demanded the money; a fight ensued that resulted in her death.

106 jobs in jeopardy at Eswatini Beverages

IF the government goes ahead with the proposed hike in levy on alcohol products, about 106 jobs are in danger of being lost at Eswatini Beverages.

Eswatini Beverages is one of the organisations that made submissions to the House of Assembly Sessional Committee, which was having consultations on whether it was viable for government to increase the levy on tobacco and alcohol products or not.

The other organisations that made submissions were Business Eswatini and British American Tobacco Eswatini.

The 106 jobs, according to the submission made by the company, were protected by the fact that Eswatini Beverages was able to produce some of the alcoholic products locally.

However, the proposed levy would make it possible for the jobs to be lost. To make matters worse, the change in this present model of doing business would take away about E45 million spent in the local economy.

Eswatini Beverages, according to the Sessional Committee report, was a leading beverages company in the country and currently employed 232 permanent employees.

Workers

About 75 per cent of these were classified as blue-collar workers. Currently, there were more than 550 licenced beer retailers who were registered tax-paying entities and contribute to the country's economy.

Projections for 2019 (excluding the impact of the proposed seven per cent levy) indicated that Eswatini Beverages

Limited would pay E220 million in taxes to government. This represented approximately 1.7 per cent of the country's total budgeted revenue.

Excise taxes on beer have increased by 120 per cent in nominal terms over the past 10 years. The company was also subject to excise taxes imposed by the Southern African Customs Union (SACU) and any levy imposed by the government would constitute an additional tax on the company and the industry as a whole.

Eswatini, according to the beverage company, was in close proximity to Mozambique and South Africa and a price differential is likely to increase the potential of smuggling. The higher prices would render alcoholic drinks unaffordable in the country for most consumers. This could increase the consumption of illicit alcoholic drinks.

Business Eswatini against 7% increase on tobacco, alcoholic drinks.

BUSINESS Eswatini foresees economic danger should government decide to increase alcohol and tobacco products produced and imported into the country.

Business Eswatini is one of the organisations that made submissions to the House of Assembly Sessional Committee which was hosting consultations on whether it was viable for government to increase tobacco and alcohol products or not.

Minister of Finance Neal Rijkenberg tabled the Alcohol and Tobacco Levy Bill on February 27.

The aim of the Bill was to impose a levy of seven per cent on imported alcohol and tobacco products.

The government, through the Bill, also wanted to impose a levy of two per cent on locally-produced alcohol and tobacco products.

Business Eswatini proposed at least a three per cent levy on imported products and one per cent on locally-produced products. The other two organisations were totally against the imposition of levy on their products. The organisations stated that the imposition of levies could be detrimental to the economy of the country. The levy could make it difficult for Emaswati to buy these products because they would be expensive.

As a result, the legal market of these products would suffer as Emaswati would opt for counterfeit products that would have been illegally produced and smuggled into the country.

Eswatini, according to the submission made by the organisations, was in direct proximity to South Africa and Mozambique, where such products were cheap.

The levy imposition on tobacco products, according to the British American Tobacco Eswatini, would create a situation where tobacco would be six per cent more expensive in Eswatini when compared with the same products in South Africa.

The same thing would apply in Mozambique, where tobacco products in Eswatini would be 213 per cent more expensive.

The organisations stated that imposition of levy was not an effective way of fighting abuse of the substances. The organisations proposed that government should work with them in ensuring that they educated Emaswati about the dangers of abuse of these products.

With the right and sufficient campaign, Emaswati could eventually understand that the abuse of alcohol and tobacco products was dangerous.

The organisations submitted that they were well aware of the health effects their products could cause to the nation. But they submitted that they constantly trained the retailers of these products on the dangers of selling the products to anyone. They invited government to work with them in doing the same so that more jobs could be saved.

Rape accused DJ 'cleared'

IN a bizarre twist of events, it seems the woman who accused Gift Sibandze otherwise known as 'DJ Merca', of rape at an overcrowded show on Saturday has no visual signs of forced penetration.

This is after Sibandze and his alleged rape survivor were both taken to the Pigg's Peak Government Hospital by the police on separate occasions to be examined by medical practitioners for signs of forced sex.

The examinations happened on Monday and practitioners discovered that both individuals had no visible scars on their private parts or on their bodies indicating forced penetration. Instead, medical practitioners concluded that the couple had no signs of rough sex at all.

This evidence then led police to assume that the sex might have been consensual.

Following this evidence, a police officer who spoke on condition of anonymity said the medical practitioners' findings corresponded with Sibandze's version of events, who claimed he did not commit the said offence on Saturday at the Gobolondlo Hall.

He is said to have told the police investigators that he had a casual sexual encounter with a young woman who then demanded money.

"Sibandze when interviewed by police said he had met the young woman a week ago and took her to the show where he performed. During the show the two had casual sex in the changing rooms while police patrolled the venue. After their intimate encounter, the woman wanted a certain amount of money but Sibandze failed to deliver. This then led the woman to report the incident as a rape to us," the officer said.

Police revealed that Sibandze was

arrested but was then allowed to go free after medical practitioners conducted medical investigations, but have not yet closed the case per se.

"We had arrested Sibandze on Sunday for about two hours, however, the medical practitioners concluded that there were no visible scares indicating a rape had occurred. But as Sibandze left the hospital he asked us to investigate the rape survivor who extorted him for money. Currently, the rape survivor is being investigated for extortion because we believe that she wanted money for sex," the source revealed.

Deputy Director of Health Services Dr. Velephi Okello, when contacted on the medical results, said that medical practitioners could only submit their findings to the police but they could not say that the evidence constitutes a rape or not.

"Medical practitioners are not the police. Only the police can charge an individual for rape. Medical practitioners only present their findings to the police who then make an arrest or free the accused. In this case the practitioners have said that there are no visible signs of rough sex, however, further information has to be ascertained by other investigators in this matter, "she said.

Chief Police Information and Communications Officer (CPICO) Superintendent Phindile Vilakati confirmed that the incident was still under investigation by the police.

MHUBHE HIGH PUPILS PETITIONPRINCIPAL

IT is definitely not a good term for principals in the country as pupils in many schools are rioting, calling for the ousting of principals.

Following Monday's riots at two schools, another school yesterday saw pupils protesting over a principal whom they accuse of serious allegations, which the newspaper cannot repeat because they have not been verified.

The learners from Mhubhe High are alleged to have littered the school with pamphlets with names of learners which they claim involved the principal.

The incident happened early yesterday morning. According to the pamphlets, the concerned learners want the principal gone from the school.

This is the third school where there has been drama over a principal who is wanted out as two other schools Mgolo Central Primary and Enhlanganisweni High were involved in a riot on Monday.

Parents stormed the two schools and called for the principals to vacate the premises on allegations of misuse of funds, among other things.

At Mhubhe High, reliable sources said they were shocked when they saw pamphlets scattered all over the school early in the morning with damning allegations against the principal.

It is said the incident happened while

the principal was away. Soon after the incident which sent most teachers into fright as they were not aware what was going to happen next, inspectors came to the school to get the gist of the matter and report back to the Manzini Regional Education Officer Mlimi Mamba.

It is said there were some pupils who were fingered to be behind the incident. The parents of the children were called, however, the pupils denied their involve-

Contacted, Manzini REO Mamba said he had received information about the incident and after getting word of what had happened he sent officers to check

what was the commotion about.

By midday, the commotion had died down and learners were back in class. This incident is happening when schools had just resumed operations after they were closed for the first term. This is the third school this week which has seen pupils rioting, calling for the principal to go. Worth noting is that Mhubhe High is the same school where Swaziland National Association of Teachers President Mbongwa Dlamini was accused of unauthorised absenteeism from work and is facing disciplinary charges from the Teaching Service Commission.

The charges have been interpreted by the SNAT leadership as aimed at frustrating the union activities.

When called about the matter, Schools Manager Macanjana Motsa's phone rang unanswered. Principal Secretary in the Ministry of Education and Training Dr. Sibongile Mtshali said she was not aware of the recent case.

She also said she was not aware of previous allegations leveled against the teacher. Dr. Mtshali asked that she be given time to consult with the Manzini Regional Officer Mlimi Mamba to get details of the matter.

When the school principal was called on the matter last night, she confirmed the incident but declined to discuss the allegations over the phone.

Let's have private auditors - Parents

ANGRY parents Enhlanganisweni High now want the school books of accounts to be audited by a private firm.

This transpired during a meeting which was held at the school yes-

In a highly charged meeting, the parents accused the ministry's auditors of doing a shoddy job, hence the mismanagement of funds and would prefer a private firm to do their books.

As a result, the parents promised to contribute E100 towards the fees for the private auditors.

Present in the meeting was the Regional Education Officer of the Hhohho region Tamari Langwenya, who said that as the office of the REO they had written to the auditor general's office for assistance in resolving issues at the school.

Langwenya highlighted that the AG's office follows certain procedures and will not just come at the time the parents wanted to.

Coming to the matters of the administration of the school, the REO acknowledged that there had been problems between the school and the committee.

"The problem started in August last year. The main issue was the signing for monies that were needed by the school to continue with its operations," she said.

Issues

She added that issues emerged when the Chairperson of the committee Meshack Makhubu refused to sign for money needed for school operations. Langwenya said the chairman would miss some meetings and that would frustrate operations at the school. She said when the matter got out of hand Nomthandazo Tembe, the school principal, reported it to the ministry, which took it upon itself to remove Makhubu from the position as per the constitution which states that if a chairperson of a school committee absconds a meeting three consecutive times, that person has automatically removed themselves from the position.

During that ordeal, Langwenya highlighted that they could not call a parents meeting to inform them of their decision because Makhubu had taken the matter of his removal to

"Makhubu wanted to be reinstated to his position," she said.

The REO added that an interim committee had been put in place whilst the matter was still being resolved.

When the parents were given an opportunity to ask questions, one of them asked the REO who had called the meetings that Makhubu never attended and who had signed the document that summoned the meeting of the school committee because Makhubu was the only one who had the authority to call meetings and sign off any letters that involved the school.

When Langwenya was given the platform to answer, she stated that she could not answer on anything that concerned Makhubu because his matter was in court.

Another parent asked Langwenya what the ministry of education had done after seeing that there was conflict between the school principal and the chairperson. Once again, Langwenya could not give a straight answer.

"With all due respect REO, why does it look like you are the one that is causing division between the principal and Makhubu? You are not handling the matter in a fair manner," one of the parents said.

However, Langwenya insisted that she could not talk about anything that involved Makhubu because his matter was in the court of law. Every decision that was taken was as per the dictates of the Constitution," she said.

Chance

When Makhubu was given a chance to talk, he accused the REO of being friends with Tembe and that all she said was not true.

Makhubu added that all the meetings she said he never attended he did not know about because Tembe and the Vice Chairperson Phindile Bhembe used to call meeting without him knowing.

"They called meetings without my knowledge and signed off the letter sanctioning those meetings as if they had been authorised by me.

"They did this for three consecutive times because they wanted me out as chairperson of the school committee," he said.

Makhubu highlighted that as for the issue of going to court, he won the case which was handled by Judge Nkululeko Hlophe where he was reinstated back to his position.

Makhubu, however, added that when he got back to tell Tembe she told him she only took what was said by the REO and could not allow him back to his position.

"REO I tell you I will not rest till this matter is handled properly and things are done in a professional manner. If Tembe is not removed as principal of Enhlanganisweni High School, someone will die," he said.

Mqolo Primary faces probe

MQOLO Central Primary School will be probed.

This followed the dramatic first day of second school term on Monday where parents and the school committee accused the Head teacher Archie Thwala of some irregularities.

The Hhohho Regional Education Officer Tamari Langwenya revealed that they decided to probe the allegations of mismanagement of funds, the number of churches that are using the school, as well as the unpaid water bills.

This is because the school's financial statements contain figures which are not corresponding to what is happening at the school.

The parents alleged that the school has been without clean tap water for two years because Eswatini Water Services Corporation cut off the school's water supply because it owed the com-

pany E75 000 in bills. Parents also pointed to the over grown vegetation at the school yet they pay for groundsmen services. It was alleged that pupils sometimes have to suspend lessons to fetch water from the nearby

The principal will be probed on all the above stated thorny issues at the school. This decision came about after an urgent meeting that was held yesterday at the school in the presence of the police who were there to ensure peace and safety.

On May 18, a mass meeting will be held at the school whereby a detailed report by the REO will be presented before parents, school committee and the principal on the findings.

Meanwhile, the Principal Archie Thwala remained unshaken by the news of a probe into the school operations as he maintained his innocence in the entire allegations.

Investigation

"As I have said yesterday, I am open to the investigation and I am happy now that the truth will come out," he said.

The Swaziland Network Campaign for Education for All (SWANCEFA) blames government for all the problems that are happening at the school.

Neliswe Nhlabatsi, the Director of SWANCEFA, said it is unfortunate that principals will forever be blamed for operations of schools of which in some "On the issue of learners made to fetch instances, the principal is innocent.

She said looking at the money owed by schools on utility services, it calls for government to increase Free Primary Education (FPE) grant so that schools could have enough money.

She further stated that government should include schools support staff on its payroll to minimise situations whereby schools do not have security ser-

"Again, we are saying government should increase the FPE grant. With the current status quo, schools will continue to suffer. The current E560 paid per child is not enough to run a school smoothly, paying utility bills and pay-

Sikhumbuzo Dube is new Mbabane mayor

THE capital city's new mayor is Ward Six Councillor Sikhumbuzo Dube.

He was elected yesterday after two ballots, which saw a total of three candidates nominated for the position. His deputy is outgoing mayor Zephaniah Nkambule. The nominated candidates were councillors Dube, Arnold Dlamini and former mayor Nkambule.

The elections were directed by Mbabane Municipality Director of Corporate Services Bongani Dlamini, who was the electoral officer. The mayoral elections were guided by the Elections Standing Orders of 2000 as amended on April 29, 2019 and approved by the Minister of Housing and Urban Development Prince Simelane.

It was an understandably tense voting process, which saw the outgoing mayor Nkambule first emerging as the top candidate with six votes out of a total of 12, while Dube emerged with five votes whereas Dlamini managed to have just one vote.

Dlamini was dully eliminated as he had the least votes compared with the other councillors. In the second ballot, the two councilors were neck to neck as they both obtained six votes each. Some of the councillors requested a third ballot, but the electoral officer referred them back to the standing orders which requested a lot on such circumstances.

After a brief deliberation, the councillors unanimously agreed to the conduction of a lot, which meant the mayor would be decided in the lottery of a lot, where both councillors' names were placed in a box and one of the municipality's internal auditors drew the one who would be mayor.

Picking Dube as the new mayor was welcomed with a round of applause from his colleagues.

The outgoing mayor was offered a chance of redemption when he was nominated for the deputy mayor position.

The nomination process saw four candidates being nominated and these were councillors Nkambule, Thulani Dlamini, Sabelo Magagula and Simangaliso

Councillor Magagula declined the nomination which left three nominees. After the first ballot, Dlamini received five votes, Nkambule received four votes and the least number of votes were three, received by Gama, which led to his elimination.

However, Nkambule emerged victorious in the second ballot, with a total of seven votes compared to Dlamini's five votes.

The councillors also voted for the finance committee chairman where councillor Sabelo Magagula was voted as chairman and his deputy is councilor Sithembiso Hlanze. The other two members of the committee are councillor Arnold Dlamini and councillor Sikhumbuzo Gama.

MIXED FEELINGS ON NEW CANNABIS REGULATIONS DRAFT

THERE were mixed feelings from different stakeholders yesterday as the ministry of health invited them to a cannabis 'Indaba'.

The invited stakeholders included League of Churches, Conference of Churches, Eswatini Cannabis Association (ECA), Business Eswatini, University of Eswatini (UNESWA), Directorate of Public Prosecutions (DPP), Truck Logistics, Traditional Healers Organisation, Royal Eswatini Police Service (REPS) Anti-Drug Unit, World Health Organization (WHO), Attorney General's office and rep-

resentatives from the different government ministries.

Thes stake holders expressed their different opinions on the cannabis after going through the draft.

Principal Secretary (PS) in

regulations draft when they were invited by the ministry to comment after going through the draft.

Principal Secretary (PS) in the

Ministry of Health Dr. Simon Zwane said this was the last meeting with cannabis stakeholders.

They were mandated to consult with relevant people, including nongovernmental organisations (NGOs).

He noted that many were interested but they did not really understand what it was all about.

"It's not everyone who will be licensed for cannabis growing, but those who meet all the requirements.

"There is actually a lot of enthusiasm amongst some people, as they think that we are granting licences, when the truth is that after this we will take it to the AG's office before Parliament passes it into a law," Dr Zwane said.

Our members grow dagga - League of Churches

ESWATINI League of Churches member Qaba Dlamini says they are not ignorant of the fact that some of their members make a living through dagga farming.

Dlamini said some have been arrested for dagga possession. He wondered why, under this draft, people who have been charged with the illegal possession of the herb are not eligible to apply for the licence. Bhekiwe Zwane, from Director of Public Prosecutions office, emphasised on the need for education and sensitisation on these regulations so that people would know that it was still illegal to either grow dagga or be found in its possession.

Dlamini said foreign companies should be urged to partner with locals to empower them. He alleged that research has shown that preference be given to foreigners and the country's laws accommodated foreigners more than Emaswati.

Industrial aspect should be considered - ECA

THE use of cannabis goes beyond medicinal and research purposes.

Lusolotja Ginindza, a member of ECA, said there was a need for the ministry of health to look into other products that could be made from dagga, including bricks, clothing apparel and food supplements.

He pleaded that they should consider this a source of income and wondered what the ministry was doing to retain the expertise that is already known by the country's citizens. Ginindza added that there is need for an intense education exercise outside the ministry of health so that

people in the most remote of places could access the information and make decisions from an informed perspective.

Tinyanga Healers Organisation President Dr. Nhlavana Maseko applauded the formation and registration of the Eswatini Cannabis Association, and jokingly suggested that they form a partnership, calling it the Cannabis Development Council (CDC). Dr. Maseko added that value chains should be clearly listed so that Emaswati benefit. He said these include cultivation, processing, packaging and trans-

EDUCATION PS NOT PLEASED

PRINCIPAL Secretary in the Ministry of Education and Training Dr. Sibongile Mtshali says there could have been a better angle of introducing the cannabis consultations because once people hear the word dagga, they perceive it as smoking.

She said the extracts of cannabis oil for medicinal use could have been brought in a different mode, such as tablets.

"We have sold the future of this country, as the agenda is now more on money making processes than the children who are the future. Our children in schools will value growing cannabis more than education because they will make money out of it. The value of the education system has really been downplayed," she said. Dr. Mtshali added that there are already cases in schools where children are involved in dagga trade as a money making venture, lending money to teachers; this is money they make, either through farming or working in the dagga farms. She

said her ministry looks at the social aspect and this has had a negative social impact. This will lead to schools not being manageable, as there is violence in the schools where these children are enrolled. Absalom Msibi said the abuse of dagga as a drug could be minimised and violence decreased if the church is involved. He encouraged all stakeholders to hold hands and speak in one voice, united.

Dr. Nhlavana Maseko condemns lack of

He said they wanted to contribute and work together with the ministry but there was non communication.

Dr Maseko said he had previously presented documents to the previous Parliament on dagga and these were never returned. He then wondered why the ministry wanted to hilistically own this exercise, as if they are the ones who started it as this was an indigenous system that had been used by forefathers.

DECENTRALISATION PROCESS POSTPONED FOR NOW

GOING to the different regions, seeking comments from the nation on the cannabis regulations draft, has been postponed.

The first session, which was slated for tomorrow at Gobolondlo, has been postponed to a later date. PS Dr. Simon Zwane said this was because the House of Assembly wanted to be part of the exercise, as they are the ones who work with chiefs and their subjects. "The mem-

bers of Parliament want to be part of this exercise, hence the need for a postponement. We requested our portfolio committee to communicate with us when they start so that we join them as we started this," he said. STOP ISSUING PERMITS IN DISHONEST MANNER - KOMBI ASSOCIATION

STORIES BY SANDILE NKAMBULE High Court

THE Swaziland Local Kombi Association (SLKA) has alleged that issuing of public transport permits by the Road Transportation Board (RTB) in an unscrupulous manner will result in chaos in the transport industry.

The association has further stated that it is not afraid of fair competition with members of the association but all they are seeking is that the law should be followed when granting permits.

This was a submission made by the Chairperson of the SLKA Thomas Mkhwanazi in his response through a supporting and explanatory affidavit filed at the High Court yesterday.

Making his submission in the urgent application that has been filed by Ding Dong Transport operator Jabulani Gulwako at the High Court, Mkhwanazi submitted that the RTB is supporting the applicant (Gulwako) in the matter not in pursuit of justice but in a misleading manner.

Gulwako has filed an urgent application at the High Court seeking an order interdicting SLKA or anyone acting on its behest against preventing his bus from operating along the Mbabane, Mahlanya, Manzini route.

An interim order was last month issued by Judge Mzwandile Fakudze interdicting the association from preventing the bus from operating along this route.

Making submissions further, Mkhwanazi in his papers said the RTB and its appeals board should do an introspection as to whether they

are still serving the interest of the public transport sector or against same.

"Should operators be allowed to obtain permits in an unscrupulous manner such would result in chaos. This matter clearly leaves the RTB with an egg on its face and what they ought to be requesting is that the matter returns to them to ensure they right all the wrongs they did," Mkhwanazi submitted. SLKA is represented by Mbabane based lawyer Sifiso 'Charlie' Jele of Mbuso Simelane and Attorneys law firm in the matter. The chairperson further informed the court that the RTB is aware or ought to be aware that the central issue in the present proceedings is whether the applicant (Gulwako) has a valid

permit or not and argued that there is no evidence to the effect that the Mbabane station commander was made aware of the applicant and that the Municipal Council of Mbabane was ignored in this matter. He also submitted that there is no evidence brought before court to prove that the application for a public transport permit was advertised in any daily newspaper in the Kingdom of Eswatini.

There is also no evidence that the RTB fulfilled its mandatory duty to cause notice of the application to be published in a government gazette. He added that had such been published the SLKA would have objected to the granting of the permit. SLKA is therefore seeking an order that the application by Gulwako be dismissed with costs.

Permit legitimate – Ding Dong bus owner

IN his application filed in court, Gulwako had submitted that the public transport permit alleged to have been obtained in an unscrupulous manner is in fact legitimate.

ndications are that there is an improvement in the way that the Municipal Council of Manzini provides service to its customers.

A recent customer satisfaction survey which was conducted by Council indicates a satisfaction level of 61.8 percent on a number of services that the Municipality provides. This indicates an 11.8 percent improvement from the last survey which was conducted during the 2015/16 financial year. Interestingly, the survey results also highlight areas in which Council is presently not doing so well.

It is worth-mentioning that, through its 2019-2024 Strategic Plan, Council adopted a customer-centric approach with the view to meeting customer requirements and achieving greater service delivery satisfaction levels. One of the means to achieving that

goal was going to be through implementation of the ISO 9001:2015 Quality Management System which drives the culture of continuous service improvement and customer satisfaction within the organization.

The customer satisfaction survey is an exercise through which Council periodically measures the level of customer satisfaction on municipal services rendered. It also enables the Municipality to better understand its customers' requirements and further stimulate within the organization a culture of continuous improvement towards meeting those requirements. It also helps identify service delivery shortfalls in the city so that appropriate interventions can be solicited

As part of the survey, a questionnaire was circulated during the 2018 Integrated Development Plan (IDP)

stakeholder submission meetings which were held in all 12 municipal wards. The questionnaire covered a number of service delivery aspects in cluding township roads maintenance, maintenance of the road network in the Central Business District (CBD), management of overgrowth in the city, refuse collection in the city. street sweeping and cleanliness of streets, whether or not customers received feedback on requested services, adequacy and efficiency of available options for rates payment, maintenance of recreational parks, public toilet services, processing of building plans, special consent and rezoning applications, citywide health inspection services and the level of customer etiquette amongst employees of Council.

The survey results indicate that

municipal services that customers are most happy about are the adequacy and efficiency of available options for payment of rates and other services, customer care by employees, refuse collection as well as processing of building plans, special consent and rezoning applications.

The results of the survey further show that there is improvement required in the areas of street sweeping, citywide health inspections, maintenance of public toilets, maintenance of recreational parks as well as provision of feedback on requested services.

Where Council was rated lowly is in the area of maintenance of township roads_{iq} maintenance of roads in the Central Business District and management of overgrowth.

Four men attack, rob woman cellphone

A woman lives to tell the tale of how she managed to fight off four men who attacked her demanding her cellphone at Corporation, Mbabane.

According to Khanyisile Dlamini's recollection of the incident during the trial against Bayandza Sibandze and Zamokuhle Ngwenya, who were said to be two of the four men, she was walking home on the evening of February 16 when she was attacked.

"I was walking home from Mncitsini with my three sisters, as we had gone to borrow some pots for a wedding that took place the following day.

"As I was walking further ahead of my sisters, I came across four men, who seemed to be heading straight for me. I did not have time to run when the four men demanded that I hand over my cellphone," she said.

Dlamini said the men did not even wait for her to take her phone out, when all four of them launched a

barrage of punches all over her body.

"All of them began punching me, and when I tried to duck, they continued to punch my hand away. I even struggled to take my phone out as they would hit my hands. As I attempted to throw my phone on the roof of a nearby home, it landed within that home's yard.

"Two of the men stopped attacking me and headed towards the direction where I threw the phone, while the others continued assaulting me."

"After several cries for help, Dlamini's sisters came running towards them and they managed to overpower one assailant, capturing him in the process. They then proceeded to the police station, where the assailant was arrested and charged with robbery.

During the court proceedings, when asked to identify the assailants Dlamini managed to capture with her sisters, she positively identified Bayandza Sikhondze as a suspect.

The matter was then postponed for the continuation of the trial on May 28.

Convicted human trafficker appeals 15-year jail time

YET another person has been convicted by the country's courts for human trafficking, and has been sentenced to 15 years imprisonment.

Agrippa Makhiligi Shongwe of Hluthi has been found guilty by the Nhlangano Magistrate's Court and has been booked as His Majesty's guest at the Matsapha Maximum Correctional facility, where he is doing time for the offence.

Shongwe is a mine worker based at Mandebelt Mine in the Republic of South Africa.

Shongwe has noted an appeal against the 15-year sentence at the High Court, and has filed an urgent application seeking an order directing the Nhlangano Magistrate's Court clerk to transmit the record of proceedings to the High Court.

Represented by Mbabane-based lawyer Noncedo Ndlangamandla of Mabila Attorneys in Association with N Ndlangamandla, Shongwe, in his urgent bail application, submitted that he was arrested by the Hluthi police in a charge of human trafficking and was subsequently arraigned before the Nhlangano Magistrate's Court.

He submitted that on April 18, 2019, he appeared for trial before the same court, and was convicted by Magistrate Florence Msibi on one count of human trafficking and one count of smuggling.

After conviction, he submitted that he was sentenced to 15 years imprisonment without an option to pay a fine on

each count and the sentences were ordered to run consecutively.

"I am currently serving at the Matsapha Maximum Prison and am desirous of noting an appeal against my conviction and sentence, but to date the record of proceedings has still not been transmitted to the High Court, my attorneys have attempted to have same located but in vain hence the present application," he submitted.

He brought to the attention of the court that he is unable to even note the appeal in the absence of the record of proceedings, arguing that time is not on his side as the time to note the appeal will lapse

He is seeking the High Court's assistance in granting an order directing the first respondent (Clerk of Court) to transcribe the record of proceedings and transmit same to the High Court within 14 days to ensure his appeal is enrolled, possibly in the third session of the High Court.

He pleaded with the court to grant him the order, as his job is at stake since he is employed as a miner in Mandebelt in the Republic of South Africa, adding that his continued incarceration may result in him losing his job.

He stated that the interests of justice clearly favour that he be afforded the relief sought in the notice of his application, as he cannot be afforded the substantial redress at a hearing in due course and in particular because there is no prejudice to be suffered by the respondents.

Shongwe averred that he has been advised and verily believes that matters pertaining to personal liberty are by their very nature urgent, hence he has moved the present application through a certificate of urgency, adding that it is stressful to be in custody not knowing his fate.

Regional consultation concluded successfully in Eswatini

CHIEF negotiators from different countries concluded a series of successful meetings in the country.

European Union (EU) Chief Negotiators Neven Mimica and Robert Dussey met with African ministers to discuss the African pillar of the future partnership between the EU and 79 countries in Africa, the Caribbean and the Pacific (ACP).

As with other regional consultations held in the Pacific and the Caribbean regions, the objective was to discuss specific needs and priorities of the region, while exploring how to best address them in the future-ACP-EU agreement. The discussion, which took place on Friday, was expected to fuel and enrich the tailor-made Africa pillar to be created within the future ACP-EU agreement, also known as the 'Post-Cotonou' agreement.



Limkokwing student nabbed for rape of 'girlfriend' (11)

BY SANDILE NKAMBULE High Court

A Limkokwing University of Creative Technology student has been arrested for allegedly raping a 11-yearold girl, whom he says is his 'girlfriend.'

The student, whose name has been deliberately withheld for ethical reasons, on Monday filed an urgent application for bail at the High Court as he wants out of jail since he wants to continue with his studies.

Appearing before Judge Mumcy Dlamini, the student, who was represented by Manzini-based Lawyer Khumbulani Msibi of Dlamini, Kunene Attorneys, was granted bail fixed at E50 000 by the court.

He was, however, ordered to pay E5 000 in cash and E45 000 shall be in the form of surety.

According to the charge sheet, the student is charged with the offence of contravening the Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence (SODV) Act of 2018, in that he raped the 11-year-oldgirl, who, by age, is incapable of consenting to sexual intercourse.

Aggravating the circumstances are that during the commission of the crime, he did not use a condom exposing the minor to sexually transmitted diseases.

According to the 28-year-old student, in his affidavit filed before court, he did not commit the offence he is charged

In fact, the student submitted that the 11-year-old girl is his girlfriend, whom he has a love relationship with.

He further submitted that he did not commit the offence of rape, but his girlfriend consented to the sexual inter-


"I did not commit the offence of rape, but what happened is that we had consensual sexual intercourse with the complainant, who is my girlfriend as we have a love relationship, I must state at this point that we have differences with the mother of the complainant and she used her daughter to get back at me by framing me in the rape charge," the student submitted.

He pleaded with the court to admit him to bail and stated that he will not abscond trial since he is a student at Limkokwing and wants to continue with his studies until graduation, there-

He submitted that he has never committed any crime, and that he is not out on bail for any crime-related mat-

Furthermore, he submitted that upon being admitted to bail, he shall reside at a place far away from where the complainant is, and will not tamper with any of the Crown witnesses, which to this stage are unknown to him.

The Crown was represented by Ayanda Matsenjwa in the matter while the student was represented by Msibi and the student has been warned to appear for his remands at the Magistrate's Court pending setting of his trial date.

Herd-boy sentenced to 15 years no fine for raping child (7)

A herd-boy who was arrested for raping a seven-year-old child has been sentenced to 15 years imprisonment without an option of a

Sabelo Ngozo (26) of Mangcongco area was sentenced by Manzini Principal Magistrate David Khumalo.

The accused was facing a charge of rape, in that while hired to look after cattle at a certain homestead, he raped the child several times without her consent.

The court was informed of how the accused person would lure his victim by calling her into his house after promising her that there were sweets he had bought for her and letting her watch cartoons on his

During trial, it also surfaced that the accused once bought the child a T-shirt and informed her not to tell anyone about the rape ordeal.

It is said the mother of the child noted that there was something wrong with her daughter.

The mother is said to have then questioned the child on what was wrong with her.

She told the mother about her being raped by the herd-boy. It is then that she was taken to hospital for medical examination.

During trial the accused maintained his plea of not guilty, saying he never raped the child.

Evidence brought to court proved that the accused committed the

When asked why she never reported the matter, the victim informed the court that she was afraid that her grandmother would beat her

Examination

The accused person, during cross examination, informed the court that he never at any point lay his hands on the complainant nor did he threaten her.

The prosecutor presented evidence showing that the accused person had previous criminal records, as he was once sentenced to 13 years imprisonment for rape.

The principal magistrate sentenced the accused to 15 years imprisonment without a fine option. The sentence was set to run after the accused finishes his initial 13 year sentence first.

Woman facing SODV charge cautioned, released

A woman who was facing a charge of contravening the Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence (SODV) Act of 2018 after brutally stabbing her lover got out lightly after the court cautioned and discharged

Nonhlanhla Nkambule (24) of KaLanga was appearing before Senior Magistrate Donald Mavuso, where she was said to have contravened Section 77(1) of the said

She was said to have wrongfully and unlawfully assaulted Musa Hlatjwako, by stabbing him with a sharp object several times in the head.

The two were said to have been in an intimate relationship at the time of commission of the offence. Offence

According to the Act, this amounts to a more serious offence than the ordinary assault charge.

When the charge sheet was read to her, the accused person pleaded guilty to the offence.

Despite that the complainant was said to have sustained serious injuries, the accused person's plea was accepted by the Crown without leading evidence to prove commission of the offence

The complainant, who was also present when the matter was brought to court, had visible injuries on the

During mitigation, the accused

person asked the court to be lenient when passing sentence, saying she did not commit the offence intentionally.

She told the court that for some time, the complainant has been abusive to her.

The accused stated that her relationship with the complainant was always filled with drama, as he would beat her up each time they had a disagreement.

She said on the day of the incident, the complainant splashed her with beer, while they were at one of the drinking halls in Siteki.

"I felt like I could no longer take any more of the abuse, and I reacted violently at this instance," said the accused person, as she wept hysterically throughout the presentation of her evidence.

Beer

She admitted to have picked up a broken beer bottle and used it to stab the complainant several times

The accused person alleged that before losing her cool, she had been reporting the abusive nature of her boyfriend to her family.

She said, however, the complainant had no regard of her family and continued to treat her in an abusive manner.

The accused was accordingly found guilty by the court. On sentencing, the accused person was only cautioned and discharged.

The court warned her to refrain from reacting violently to her lover as the SODV Act has made such behaviour to be a serious offence.

PSAS PURPORTED STRIKEACTION WATER GJUDGWENT

PUBLIC Sector Associations (PSAs) will soon know their fate on whether they could go ahead with the planned strike action which was supposed to take place in January.

On Monday, PSAs were informed that the court will issue judgment in due course after hearing arguments from both parties.

The arguments which took place on Monday

at the Industrial Court follow several postponements on the case.

On April 30, government's lawyer Attorney General Sifiso Khumalo, is said to have conceded to have been in receipt of a correspondence from the PSA's counsel on the issues currently under the court's adjudication.

The court proceedings were postponed to last Thursday at 1430hrs to allow further consultations and consideration of positions on the variables at play. This week, the case continued in court and government maintained its stand interdicting the PSAs from proceeding with their strike which was supposed to take place on January 23.

Freedom

Swaziland National Association of Teachers (SNAT) members hope government will lose so that they could continue with the strike action. "The courts of the land have automatically become struggle sites for us as workers.

'Let us relentlessly fight for our economic freedom not as a matter of choice but rather as means for survival," SNAT said in a statement.

PSAs, which were expected to take part in the strike earlier this year include SNAT, the Swaziland National Association of Government Accounting Personnel (SNAGAP), the Swaziland Democratic Nurses Union (SWADNU), and the National Public Service and Allied Workers Union (NAPSAWU.

Consider

The strike was stopped following a stern warning from Prime Minister Ambrose Mandvulo Dlamini that government employees who wanted to take part should consider a number of factors, including risking their jobs.

"Employment is not protected and employees who take part in an unlawful strike action will face disciplinary proceedings and be liable on conviction to be dismissed," the PM said in a statement.

He further pointed out that the principle of no-work-no pay shall apply to any employee engaged in the strike action, including those who will not report for work, employees who will report to work and fail to attend to their duties and those who will report to work and restrict the output of their work in any way.



WE WILL NOT ALLOW CONDOMS IN SCHOOLS

MINISTER of Education and Training Lady Howard-Mabuza says they will not allow the distribution of condoms in schools.

This comes after reports that government is committed to ensuring reproductive health commodity security for a 1 Emaswati to be able to choose, obtain, and use quality contraceptives and other reproductive health commodities, whenever and wherever they need them.

The ministry of education has made it clear that it will not allow condoms to be distributed to schools.

According to a Quantification of Family Planning Commodities report for April 2016 to March 2019, access

to a reliable supply of contraceptives, condoms, medicines and equipment is fundamental to all sexual and reproductive health programming and to the achievement of the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs).

Responding to questions from this publication, Minister of Education said condom distrib-

ution in schools is not something that Emaswati would be happy about. She said condoms should be distributed in homesteads and not at schools, because sex happened at

homes.

The minister said

if government could give the go-ahead on condom distribution in schools, it would be problematic because it will be more like they are encouraging pupils to engage in sex.

"Utobese umsola ngani lomunye umntfwana nasekalele nalomunye leskolweni because ngitsi lestobe simnike lama condom," the minister said.

She said if there is a debate that pupils are already engaging in sex at schools, then condoms must be given to parents so that they could be the ones who talk to their children instead of shifting the responsibility to government.

Engaging

Other stakeholders in the health sector had differing views on the subject.

Meanwhile, Minister of Health Lizzy Nkosi said they were engaging in sexual reproductive health rights education in schools working together with the department of education.

Meanwhile, Eswatini Principals Association (EPA) President Welcome Mhlanga said as EPA their position regarding the matter would be that it is a societal issue so needs to be discussed by different constituencies.

"As an organisation, we cannot pronounce a position on the issue. We can only emphasise that schools are learning institutions and our mandate is to teach.

"As this is a policy matter, government can make a pronouncement after due process," Mhlanga said.

'Ministry of health must be clear on abortion protocol'

FLAS has also called for the ministry of health to be clear on the protocol regarding abortion.

FLAS Communications Officer Maxwell Dlamini said they strive for a society where Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights are respected, supported and protected. He said these rights included the right of women to make their own choices about their bodies.

Dlamini said currently, the national law allows for safe abortion services on medical or therapeutic grounds, in cases of incest, rape, unlawful sexual intercourse with a mentally retarded female or as parliament may prescribe.

He said, however, those women and girls who become pregnant under these conditions are not able to access safe abortion services due to the absence of a clear protocol. He said this is a violation of human rights and as FLAS, they call upon the ministry of health to urgently put in place this protocol, whose absence has contributed immensely to the high incidence of unsafe abortions.

Dlamini said comprehen-

sive abortion care will put women and girls in control of where, when and how they can terminate their pregnancy.

This should be done with view to address structural barriers to the attainment of health rights for women and girls in a bid to develop rights driven health service delivery, which enhances the right to health for all.

The association strongly advocates that discussions with relevant stakeholders can have frank and open discussion in making sure that rights of women are respected, supported and protected including the right to safe abortion.

'Condoms should be readily accessible to young people'

THE Family Life Association of Swaziland (FLAS), which is a non-governmental organisation, established in 1979, working in the area of Sexual Reproductive Health and Rights and HIV with a special focus on young people aged 10-24 years, has a different view on the issue.

Through its Youth Action Movement, FLAS has been engaged in numerous campaigns empowering communities, by ensuring that people, especially young people, enjoy their Sexual Reproductive Health Rights (SRHR).

The Youth Action Movement has been hosting debates in schools on different topics on SRHR.

FLAS Communications Officer Maxwell Dlamini said condoms are a critical component in a comprehensive and sustainable approach to the prevention of HIV and other sexually transmitted infections (STIs), and are effective for preventing unintended pregnancies.

Dlamini said male and female condoms, both reduced the transmission of HIV and other sexually transmitted infections (STIs), and prevent unintended pregnancy.

He said FLAS advocated that Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights information and services, including condoms, should be readily available and accessible to young people wherever they are to be able to make informed choices about their lives and bodies.

"FLAS acknowledges that schools are places for educational purposes and passing knowledge and information to young people, however, we believe that they can be used as a perfect platform to provide SRHR services and information to young people with a view to prevent HIV and other sexually transmitted infections and preventing unintended pregnancies," he said.

He added that FLAS encouraged young people, parents, government and other stakeholders to engage in this particular matter to find a long lasting and mutually beneficial solution on it. He said the solution must be one that will allow distribution of these commodities in schools without compromising and eradicating the moral values and traditions of society, but acknowledge the need to save young people.

He said Eswatini can also learn from other countries, in the region, such as neighbouring Mozambique, where SRH, including HIV services, are provided in schools. Dlamini said, perhaps, making condoms freely available to young people in secondary schools could save the country from the pressing problem of teenage pregnancy. Worth noting is that during Geneva's first Global HIV Prevention Coalition meeting, the country received a standing ovation with condom forecasting, procurement and supply management systems which have improved accessibility.



"Northern Hhohho has vast fields of commercial forest land, which are often privately-owned and require security as individuals often access these areas and commit crimes like arson, illegal hunting and gathering of firewood. It is no secret that the commercial forestry industry is important to this region, that is why as a local company, we have taken the initiative to introduce the rangers division. This department does not operate independently, but operates within Top Two as a specialised security division." he said.

Mhlanga said the rangers first endured months of military style exercises that involved physical training. After passing the many exercises, the rangers receive further specialised weapons and conditional training. This second round of training lasts for three months, meaning the rangers train for about six months before they become fully-fledged rangers.



Three arrested for counterfeit notes at Buhleni in two weeks

NKOSINATHI Makhabane (34) from Mhlangatane has become the third person to be arrested for the possession of counterfeit notes in South African Rands.

Makhabane was arrested at Buhleni on Saturday evening, while trying to purchase alcohol with a fake R100 South African note. Unfortunately for Makhabane, the barman, who

wanted to remain anonymous, called the Buhleni police to arrest the accused who still possessed the counterfeit money.

Possession

According to well-placed sources, Makhabane is the third person to be arrested for the possession of counterfeit money at Buhleni in just 14 days.

"This is the third person to be arrested

with counterfeit money. This has prompted us at the bar here not to accept the South African currency altogether."

Last Monday, Sandile Myeni also from Buhleni was arrested after police found him in the possession of counterfeit money that totalled R400.

After his arrest, Ndumiso Dlamini from Pigg's Peak was also arrested after he was found with counterfeit money that totalled R200. Chief Police Information and Communications Officer (CPICO) Superintendent Phindile Vilakati confirmed the arrest of Makhabane.

She said other authorities like the Central Bank of Eswatini are better suited to comment on the prevalence of counterfeit money in the kingdom.

Rural Women Assembly engages Shiselweni folk on SODV Act

THE Rural Women Assembly is in the process of empowering women from the Shiselweni region on the SODV Act.

Rural Women Assembly is a non-governmental organisation (NGO) that sharpens women and young girls on making good decisions about their lives so that the country could develop.

Rural Women Assembly Project

Coordinator Zakithi Sibandze said they had programmes to educate women on the newly-enacted Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence (SODV) Act 2018 because this legislation does not only affect men, but everyone who fails to abide by the law. "As an organisation. we realised that it is not easy for the relevant people to teach and train people about SODV, especially in the rural areas, so we decided to take the opportunity of helping women on how to raise a girl child," said Sibandze. Sibandze said their main aim was to encourage women to report people who contravene the law.

"We are inspiring rural women to stop accommodating and not reporting lawbreakers in the name of 'tibi tendlu'. Last month, we had a training workshop between where we invited lawyers and police to share their expertise and help differentiate between domestic violence vis-à-vis sexual offences," she added. Sibandze said they currently have an ongoing programme, which started in February, where they train people on the SODV Act. She said in these trainings, they invite different people, including lawyers and police who have an input who are well-versed in this law.

WOMEN ALSO GET FARMING LESSONS

RURAL Women Assembly is not only concentrating on the SODV Act training workshops but also on farming activities.

The organisation's Project Coordinator Zakithi Sibandze said the farming activities helped women in the rural areas to change their lifestyles. She added that with women farming, they are trying to encourage women on healthy lifestyles and they are inspiring them to be independent because most abuse cases occur as a result of not being independent as a woman.

She said though they were running the educational programmes in the Shiselweni region, they have not seen any improvement as yet. Meanwhile, Thobile Simelane from Kontjingila said she has benefited from the assembly's trainings on farming without using fertilizer from the shops. They use organic fertilizer (cow dung and horse excretion) which is cheaper and the crops are

'We are really encouraged and even

considering forming a local cooperative, whereby we will strictly implement what we learnt from the Rural Women Assembly.

Fortunately for us, one of the 80 national organisers is from our community and they brought Blue Green Company, which encourages this type of farming.

We are also encouraged to farm crops that will survive climate change," she said. Simelane also said they did not only sell these crops for monetary gain, but use it as subsistence farming.

WLSA trains paralegals on SODV Act

The organisation has paralegals stationed in different communities, who act as a medium between WLSA and the communities at ground level.


The paralegals were educated on the SODV Act, while also being empowered with knowledge on how to handle cases of abuse or ill-treatment of residents in their respective communities.

One life lost in two weeks

NGWANE PARK RESIDENTS WANT SPEED HUMPS

NGWANE Park residents want the Municipal Council of Manzini to consider erecting speed humps in the area's roads.

This is because a number of pedestrians have been run over by motorists due to overspeeding.

The council in 2017 finished rehabilitating the Ngwane Park road

from Zakhele to Mkhiweni, however, one of the busiest locations was not provided with speed humps. The most noticeable location is Sihlahleni shopping complex along D98 road, with commercial plots on both sides of the road with a high volume of pedestrians.

Before the rehabilitation of the road, there were speed humps separating the two complexes, which in turn deterred motorists from over- crashing into a residential wall

According to the residents, the lack of speed humps has resulted in a total of three pedestrians being run over by speeding vehicles.

Collide

A resident said there have been a number of accidents, where vehicles collide after drivers fail to negotiate the bend.

One such incident resulted in a vehicle veering off the road and

Another resident said they have repeatedly reported the concern to the municipality, but were not satisfied with the response they got.

"It is now unsafe to send my children to the shops, as they are not guaranteed safe crossing on the road, as motorists have a tendency of over-speeding, even when they recognise that the road is busy. There is also no pedestrian crossing in the area and it makes crossing it dangerous," said the resident.

MUNICIPALITY PLANS FOR MORE SPEED HUMPS

MANZINI City Council Public Relations Officer (PRO) Mathokoza Thwala says the municipality has received requests from residents for speed -humps at Ngwane Park.

He said council was considerate of people's safety, be it on or off the road. "As council we are aware of the need for an intervention against over speeding in the city roads; particularly those that have recently been upgraded from gravel to bitumen standard or those that have been rehabilitated. We also acknowledge that, through the various customer feedback platforms available in the municipality, we have received requests for council to construct speed humps in some of the city roads," said Thwala. He added that

while the municipality did not encourage the construction of speed humps as per global standards, they would have to budget for such a project.

He said these have been budgeted for the financial year 2019/20 and, funds permitting, they will be delivered between July and September, 2019. One of them will be constructed at Sihlahleni along D98 road. He further implored motorists to observe the speed limit applicable to the city's roads.

Thwala said there was not even one road within the city boundary that permits speed above 60km/h.

He also advised motorists that council had engaged the traffic section of the Royal Eswatini Police Service with the view to urge them to strengthen their law enforcement initiatives against over-speeding.

MAN FINED E300 FOR DRINKING ALCOHOL IN PUBLIC

A 23-year-old man from Nhlangano, under Chief Mkhulunyelwa Nzima, has been fined E300 for drinking alcohol at the Swazi Plaza in Mbabane.

Eric Simelane was expected to pay the fine or spend three months in a correctional facility.

He was charged with contravening Section 27 (8) of the Liquor Licenses Act No.30 of 1964.

It was said that on Saturday, he was found consuming alcohol in public while at the Swazi Plaza.

Simelane pleaded guilty to the offence. Constable Chakazile Dlamini told the Eswatini National Court that on Saturday while she was on duty in Mbabane, a man identified as Mhlanga approached her and told her that another man was

sitting next to Fish and Chips outlet, he had placed the alcohol cans on the floor."

Dlamini told the court that she then introduced herself to Simelane.

"I introduced myself to the accused, and asked him why he was drinking in a public area.

"However, his reasons were not satisfactory enough and I then asked him to come with me to the Mbabane Police Post so that he could be investigated further," said Dlamini.

Dlamini further told the court that

Simelane was unwilling to go with her to the police post as he frequently stopped along the way.

The officer said she sought help from Mhlanga to marshal Simelane to the police post.

"Did Simelane show remorse when the police arrested him for the offence of drinking in public," asked Court President Prince Ngeto Cindzi.

"Your Honour, I was in full uni-

form but Simelane refused to cooperate," said Constable Dlamini

"I would like to apologise to the court for my actions. May the court hand out a much lesser sentence? I have children to take care of," said Simelane.

Simelane was then sentenced to three months in a correctional facility or pay a fine of E300.


is surrounded by forests, which is not safe for him because he could be attacked and no one would come to his rescue.



Redefine search defies ongoing economic, political uncertainty

CAPE TOWN – Redefine Properties increased its distribution for the six months ended on February 28 by four per cent to 49.2 cents in the ongoing economic and political uncertainty ahead of tomorrow's election.

Chief Executive Andrew Konig said yesterday that their market guidance was that the distribution for the full year would be similar to first-half growth of four per cent, subject to conditions not deteriorating further.

He said in an interview that in the context of returns in previous years, four per cent might seem low, but relative to the current environment, 'where our reference points are constantly being reset... the results are pleasing.'

This was because about 79 per cent of the assets were in South Africa. With an August year-end, most of the past financial year was during the run-up to the elections, through a period of very low business and consumer confidence where business decisions were being deferred due to uncertainty. Internationally held assets contributed 25.4 per cent to income, with total assets under management increasing by R500 million

to R99.2 billion. Offshore expansion worth R1.9bn took place, of which R500m was invested into the Polish Logistics Platform—the logistics sector in Europe was one sector with "promise", said Konig. The local portfolio also received a significant portion of the development spend at R1.3bn.

Konig said confidence needed to return in South Africa to encourage future growth and for the economy to begin driving demand for commercial property space again. "Confidence will return once there is improved policy certainty. If there is any benefit from the election outcome it will probably only be evident in 2020/21, as opposed to the 2019 financial year," he said.

The active portfolio operating margin was maintained at 82 per cent, with tenant retention remaining at a high at 96.6 per cent of leases renewed.

Installing renewable energy interventions was an area for growth, notably to alleviate some of the pressure caused by Eskom blackouts and tariff increases. Another move to calibrate to the 'new normal' was a move into flexible workspaces.

COSATU condemns employers forcing employees to work today

JOHANNESBURG - The Congress of South African Trade Unions (COSATU) yesterday condemned what it called intransigent employers, who are allegedly threatening workers and forcing them to go to work today instead of voting in general elections.

South Africans will be heading to the polls for its sixth general election today to elect a new government.

Declared

President Cyril Ramaphosa officially declared election day May 8 as a public holiday, urging employers to encourage staff to use the day to exercise their right to vote.

But COSATU Spokesperson Sizwe Pamla said the union federation had noted with deep concern the numerous reports from workers that some employers were forcing them to go to work instead of voting.

"We condemn all those intransigent

employers who are victimising workers and reiterate our condemnation of the government's failure to declare elections day a non-trading holiday," Pamla said.

"The federation is encouraging all workers who are being victimised to report to COSATU offices and those of our affiliated trade unions."

Pamla said COSATU was challenging Business Unity South Africa (BUSA) to condemn all those businesses that are intimidating workers, saying that BUSA should make a public statement to the effect that all workers have a right to vote on elections day.

Govt, Eskom hiding dodgy diesel deals - Eskom

JOHANNESBURG - The main opposition Democratic Alliance said yesterday that the government and power company Eskom were blocking its demand for details of diesel deals for the struggling stateowned utility because there were "dodgy".

The DA said it had last month submitted a request in terms of the Promotion of Access to Information Act (PAIA) for Eskom to release copies of all diesel contracts signed between January 2007 and April 3 this year. It said the fact that the terms of an emergency diesel deal for the company were being obscured from the public was an indictment on President Cyril Ramaphosa's governing African National Congress

(ANC). "The ANC's secretive and lucrative diesel deals have been made carelessly, without fear or thought for future consequences," DA shadow minister of public enterprises Natasha Mazzone said. "This is yet another desperate attempt by the failing ANC government to keep the lights on until

election day. The ANC has been in power since the advent of democracy in 1994, but

could see its majority whittled after elections due today against the backdrop of an economy that has struggled to grow over the past decade, with critics largely blaming corruption and mismanagement under the watch of Ramaphosa's predecessor Jacob Zuma.

Executives

Several senior executives at stateowned entities including Eskom -which has struggled to meet electricity demand - have been implicated in the graft.

Earlier this week, online publication News24 reported that it had received information from Eskom in response to a PAIA request which showed that between 2009 and 2019, the utility paid 48 suppliers R47.4 billion for diesel used to keep the lights on. "So desperate is the ANC that it has now resorted to spending billions it does not have in order create a false impression that there will be light at the end of their tunnel," Mazzone said yesterday, adding that South Africa faced a dark and cold

AgriSA concerned about NERSA attitude

JOHANNESBURG - Agriculture industry association AgriSA said on Monday that it was concerned about what it called the National Energy Regulator of South Africa's (NERSA's) reluctance to register smallscale embedded generator (SSEG) projects.

In a statement, AgriSA said that its members had the potential to supply the electricity needed to prevent future rolling blackouts, known as load shedding, through small-scale solar photovoltaic installations.

"It is unacceptable that farmers who want to do their part to relieve strain on the grid are not allowed to do so," the Chairperson of AgriSA's Economics and Trade Centre of Excellence, Nicol Jansen, said.

According to a licensing exemption and registration notice gazetted in November 2017, SSEGs are exempt from licensing, but are required to be registered with NERSA.

"However, by failing to register SSEGs, NERSA is preventing completed SSEG projects to be connected to the grid," AgriSA said. It said non-registration had been the status quo, despite NERSA approving a registration process at an energy regulator meeting last

Voters

"But those who do not have their residential address on the voters' roll will have to furnish a residential address at the polling station before they vote." Those in a different province to that

in which they are registered also need not worry, said Mamabolo.

"If the address locates you in the province in which you are registered, you will get two ballots - national and provincial - but if you are in a province outside your ordinary residence address,

you will get one ballot - for national," said Mamabolo. Oh, and it is possible that your vote won't count even if you go to the polling station and make your mark. This is if you miss one very crucial verification before slotting your ballot paper into the ballot box - the official stamps. Said Mamabolo: "As part of the control measures of the elec-

tion process, every ballot paper has to have a validation stamp at the back. If there is no validation stamp at the back. it means that ballot paper will not be counted." But most importantly, you cannot afford to forget your identity document as you will not be allowed to vote without it - even if you appear on the voters' roll. Sowetan Live

We won't vote, unless mayor addresses us - Ezakheleni residents


Pan African Parliament swears in 8 new members

No survivors after jet crashes

MEXICO CITY - A plane crash in a remote mountain region in northern Mexico claimed the lives of all 13 people on board, including a family of five who were flying back from watching a boxing match in Las Vegas, authorities and local media said on Monday.

The wreckage of the plane that took off from Las Vegas on Sunday was found via aerial surveillance in the northern municipality of Ocampo, the government of Coahuila state said in a statement.

A photograph published on local television network Milenio showed what it said were the burnt remnants of the plane, broken into pieces, spread over charred soil.

Mexican media reported that the

passengers had been to a boxing match between Mexican boxer Saul 'Canelo' Alvarez and US fighter Daniel Jacobs in Las Vegas on Saturday.

Victims

The nationalities of the victims were not immediately clear. The surnames of the three crew and 10 passengers published by the Coahuila government were all Hispanic. The victims were between 19 and 57 years old, according to a version of the passenger list published in Mexican media.

Newspaper Diario de Yucatan said on its website that among the victims were 55-year-old businessman Luis Octavio Reyes Dominguez, his wife, and their three children. Reuters

Cohen tells Trump off before starting jail term

NEW YORK - Michael Cohen, President Donald Trump's former personal lawyer, headed to a federal prison to begin a three-year sentence on Monday, taking a parting shot at his former boss in remarks to reporters as he left his Manhattan apartment building.

Cohen, who once vowed to 'take a bullet' for Trump but now calls him a 'con man,' must report by 2pm (1800 GMT) to the Federal Correctional Institution in Otisville, New York, about 70 miles (110 km) northwest of New York City to serve his sentence for arranging hush payments to two women who said they had sexual encounters with Trump and lying to the US Congress.

He is expected to stay at the prison's minimum security camp.

Cohen told journalists he hoped that once he completes his sentence that 'when I rejoin my family and friends that the country will be in a place without xenophobia, injustice and lies at the helm of our country. There still remains much to be told. And I look forward to the day that I can share the truth.

Cohen then got into a black vehicle and drove off. Cohen's prison term completes a stunning fall for the 52-year-old native of New York's Long Island, whose career was tethered to Trump as he evolved from wealthy real estate developer to reality TV personality to politician. For more

than a decade, Cohen served as Trump's personal lawyer and self-described 'fixer.'

The relationship began to sour after FBI agents raided Cohen's Rockefeller Center office and Park Avenue hotel room in April 2018 as part of an investigation that grew out of Special Counsel Robert Mueller's investigation into Russian interference in the 2016 US election. The information gathered in the raids contributed to a series of criminal charges against Cohen that caused his dramatic split with

Trump.

Cohen publicly broke with Trump in July 2018, telling ABC News he intended to put family and loyalty to his country ahead of the president. Cohen and his wife, Laura Shusterman, 49, have two adult children, Samantha and Jake.

In congressional testimony in February in Washington, Cohen said, "I am ashamed that I chose to take part in concealing Mr. Trump's illicit acts rather than listening to my own conscience. AFP

SA signs for South Sudan oil block after US\$1 billion plan

JOHANNESBURG - South Africa signed a deal on an oil block in South Sudan as part of a US\$1 billion investment in the country emerging from civil war.

The countries signed an exploration and production sharing agreement for block B2, the second such contract since South Sudan's independence seven years ago.

The deal will help restore oil out-

put to levels of around 350 000 barrels a day, according to South Sudan Oil Minister Ezekiel Gatkuoth.

Focusing

South Sudan is focusing on increasing crude production by using oil blocks that were halted during its civil war. South Africa in November reached an initial agreement to invest US\$1 billion in its oil sector.

Militant attacks in Moza kill seven, threaten voter registration

MAPUTO -Suspected Islamists have killed seven people in northern Mozambique in weekend attacks, threatening aid to victims of Cyclone Kenneth and paralysing ongoing voter registration for October elections, local sources said on Monday.

Islamist fighters have terrorised remote communities in Mozambique's gas-rich, Muslim-majority Cabo Delgado region since October 2017, killing around 200 people and forcing thousands from their

Between Friday and Sunday at least four separate villages were attacked in northern Cabo Delgado, local sources

"Armed men invaded the district of Meluco, specifically the village of Minhanha, killed three people, and urned about 100 houses on Sunday night," a local source, who did not want to be identified fearing retaliation, told AFP. Sunday's attack followed another on

Saturday that killed a teacher riding a motorcycle and three other people who were burnt to death in Macomia district. The attacks were the first since Cyclone Kenneth smashed into the country's northern region on April 25, leaving at least 41 dead and more than 240 000 affect-

The delivery of aid to cyclone-hit areas has been underway, but the attacks put aid distribution at risk while they 'paralysed' voter registration. AFP

Mali gets new government after protests

MALI - Mali's president has named a new government after its predecessor resigned last month amid widespread protests over an upsurge of deadly inter-communal violence, a presidency statement said. Ibrahim Boubacar Keita on Sunday announced the new executive of 37 members under Prime Minister Boubou Cisse, who was appointed on April 22 to oversee the formation of a broadbased' government. Last week, Cisse signed a pact with opposition and majority party representatives in the capital Bamako, declaring their willingness to set up a 'politically-inclusive' new government.Cisse's predecessor Soumeylou Boubeye Maiga and his entire Cabinet resigned on April 18 following the massacre of some 160 members of the Fulani herding community on March 23 in the village of Ogossagou near Mali's border with Burkina Faso.

Pilot reveals lightning caused crash landing

MOSCOW, RUSSIA - The pilot of a Russian passenger plane that erupted in a ball of fire on the runway of Moscow's busiest airport, killing 41 people, said lightning led to the emergency landing. Investigators were on Monday working to understand the causes of the blaze after the Sukhoi Superjet-100 had to return to Sheremetyevo Airport shortly after take-off on Sunday evening. Pilot Denis Yevdokimov told Russian media the aircraft lost communication and needed to switch to emergency control mode 'because of lightning' on the Aeroflot flight to the Arctic city of Murmansk. He did not specify if the plane was struck directly. "We managed to restore communication through the emergency frequency on our radio connection. But the link was only for a short time and kept cutting out... it was possible to say only a few words," he told the Komsomolskaya Pravda newspaper.

President Recep Tayyip Erdogan's Justice and Development (AK) Party had lodged an 'extraordinary objection' and asked for a rerun of the election after several previous appeals it made for a smattering of partial and full recounts across the city were completed. Erdogan's party alleged voting irregularities made the results invalid. Turkey's high election Board members accepted the AK Party's objection to the election results on Monday with seven votes in favour and four votes against, state-run Anadolu news agency reported.

ORK - James Harden and the Houston Rockets dug out of a 0-2 hole to even their Western Conference semi-finals series with the Golden State Warriors after another game where they fought, scrapped and held off a late rally to get a victory.

Harden scored 38 points and the Rockets got a 112-108 win on Monday night to even the best-of seven series at 2-2.

"When you're dealing with these guys, if you let Klay (Thompson) and Steph (Curry) run around and shoot 3s you don't have no chance," Harden said. "The only chance we have is to be in to their bodies and make every shot that they take contested."

The Rockets were up by nine before the Golden State scored the next seven points, capped by a three from Stephen Curry, to get within 110-108 with 19 seconds left. Harden made one of two free throws with 11.5 seconds left. Kevin Durant missed a three after that. But the Warriors got the rebound and Curry

also missed a three-point attempt before Golden State was forced to foul Chris Paul. "We got a couple of wide-open looks," Durant said. "They just didn't fall for us."

Paul made one of two free throws with 2.9 seconds left to secure the victory. Golden State coach Steve Kerr was asked about the physical play of the Rockets, who have several players who are much stockier than his squad.

"They've got a lot of middle linebackers on that team," he said. "They're sturdy and we're like volleyball players, long and lean ... everybody tries to be physical with us because they should. That's the best way to try to beat us."

After losing the first two games of the series on the road, the Rockets head back to Golden State for Game 5 tonight with momentum on their side after their overtime win in Game 3 before Monday night's victory. The Warriors got 34 points from Kevin Durant, who had 46 in the Game 3 loss. Curry, who was

criticised after shooting 7 for 23 in Game 3, got off to a good start, scoring 11 points in the first quarter. He cooled off after that, but finished with 30 points on 12 of 25 shooting.

"I didn't think we got great shots for much of the night," Kerr said. "We've got to be more poised and that has to be a focus." Houston made 17 of its 50 three-point attempts, while the Warriors shot just 8 of 33 from downtown with Curry making just four of his 14 attempts.

The Rockets were up by nine after three and used an 8-2 run, with four points from Harden, to open the fourth and extend the lead to 101-86. Golden State used an 8-3 run, with six points from Draymond Green, to cut it to 104-94 midway through the quarter.

Houston had a 10-point lead with about four minutes left before a 5-2 run, with a three from Curry, got them within 108-101.

MUNICH - RB Leipzig coach Ralf Rangnick has hinted that star striker Timo Werner may yet stay at the club for another year before joining Bayern Munich on a free transfer.

Milan back in Champions League race after fiery Bologna win

MILAN - AC Milan revived their Champions League hopes with a 2-1 win over Bologna on Monday as tempers flared with three players sent off and a bust-up between French midfielder Tiemoue Bakayoko and coach Gennaro Gattuso on the sidelines.

Gattuso's side move back into fifth place - three points behind Atalanta who occupy the final Champions League berth - with three games left to play this

Milan had dropped out of the European places after a draw against Parma and loss to Torino but now move level on points with Roma who are sixth.

Champions Juventus and secondplaced Napoli are already assured of Champions League football next season but the battle for the final two berths remains tight with Inter Milan on 63 points, followed by Atalanta (62), AC Milan (59), Roma (59) and Torino (57).

Spanish winger Suso opened for Milan on 37 minutes with the game springing to life in the second half with Fabio Borini tapping in the second on 67 min-

Bologna's Mattia Destro pulled one back on 72 minutes, with Milan playing the final quarter of an hour a man down after midfielder Lucas Paquetá was sent off for arguing with the referee. In a nervy finale, Bologna finished the game with nine men with Nicola Sansone and Mitchell Dijks both sent off late.

There was also pitch-side drama early when Argentine midfielder Lucas Biglia picked up an injury 25 minutes into the game at the San Siro with the Milan coach asking on-loan Chelsea player Bakayoko to start warming up.

Bakayoko - on the bench after arriving late for training - started to warm up without enthusiasm to the fury of Gattuso who instead asked another substitute José Mauri to come on.

Gattuso and Bakayoko were caught on camera exchanging insults with the French player saying twice "Fxxx off, man" and the coach replying "I'll see

Bakayoko joined the club on loan from Chelsea last summer with an option to buy but has been the subject of racist chanting this season several times, notably from Lazio supporters.

Tiger Woods weeps as Trump gives him Medal of Freedom

WASHINGTON - President **Donald Trump awarded Masters** champion and golfing buddy Tiger Woods the Medal of Freedom on Monday evening in a Rose Garden ceremony the athlete's new girlfriend also attend-

The president said that Woods, 43, is "one of the greatest athletes in the history of sports" and has inspired people worldwide with his barrier-breaking victories, capped by a comeback at this year's tournament.

"He's also a great person. He's a great guy," Trump declared. "He ed millions of young Americans with his thrilling wire-to-wire victories. Tiger Woods is a global symbol of American excellence, devotion, and drive." The first African-American to win the Masters and the youngest golfer to take the title, Woods won his first major tournament in 11 years in April after suffering severe injuries that threatened to end his career forever.

Woods cried at the White House as he talked about his late father and spoke about his 'amazing' comeback this year and the' unbelievable experience' of winning the award in front his mother, children,

caddy, girlfriend Erica Herman, the president and first lady Melania Trump.

"You've seen the good and the bad, the highs and the lows, and I would not be in this position without all your help," he told his family. "I've battled, I try to hang in there, and I've tried to come back and play the great game of golf

The citation for the award said that Woods was being honoured for the five Masters tournaments he's won, beginning in 1997 when he became the first black man and the youngest golfer ever to clinch the title. He won again in 2019, becoming the second-oldest champ.

President Trump also noted that Woods has 81 PGA tour victories under his belt - one victory behind the all-time record.

Trump also had another statistic he wanted to point out: he said that Woods' victory in April was "recordsetting ratings" for a Masters tournament.

"We are in the presence of a true legend, an extraordinary athlete who has transformed golf and achieved new levels of dominance," he said.

In winning, Hazard fought off competition from the likes of Liverpool's Mohamed Salah - who was in the running for his long-range effort against Chelsea at Anfield.

Hazard said the strike was among his best for the club, when speaking following the announcement of his success. "It's in the top for sure," Hazard told the Premier League. "Especially because it was a derby as well, in front of the fans at Stamford Bridge."



Hazard's goal was chosen as the winner by a panel of experts combined with a public vote through the Carling website or App. He beat seven other contenders. The award may well be one of the final ones Hazard wins as a Chelsea player, with the Belgian continually linked with a summer move to Real Madrid. Hazard is believed to be among the top priorities of Madrid boss Zinedine

Zidane, who is looking to rebuild the squad at the Bernabeu.

"They [later] told the team manager the players were not going to train.

"The team manager informed us. We then wrote to all the players informing them that tomorrow, which is today (yesterday) they should be at training at 9am, and failing that the club would take action.

"Those actions were stated in the letter, and that we had a right to fine them."

Konco said later Tignyemb returned to the club offices.

"Then Patrick came to the office, alone, around 3pm or 4pm. And then whatever altercation he had at the office, that was what resulted in his services being terminated," Celtic's chief executive said.

"He cannot say it was because he came to represent the players [on the later occasion]. He came alone.

"And the things that he was saying, he was talking about himself. That the club could not do anything to him. He was swearing, abusive, obstructive

"Definitely all of those things were against what is written in his contract." *Times Live*

Following yesterday's game, both sides will have one match remaining as Bucs face Polokwane City whereas the Brazilians take on Free State Stars.



During the time Keet was warming the bench, Bafana rival Williams continued to keep goal for SuperSport United.

Goss got sent off against Baroka FC last Saturday, allowing Keet a final swansong in Wits' colours when they finish the seaon away in Durban. Wits still have an outside chance of winning the title.

Keet, who spent five seasons in Belgium at KV Kortrijk between 2011 and 2016, has made no secret of his hopes to move overseas, notably to the USA where he has

Papy's death mourned

he whole football fraternity the world over is still engulfed with a dark cloud of a player collapsing and a life was lost in the field of play.

Condolences go to Burundians family, Malanti Chiefs director, technical team, management and players, team medics, and all sports people in the country. We are greatly touched and pledge to work hard in eradicating such in future. Today, I will be discussing medical preparedness before a game can start.

Stadium doctor has a role to inspect nedical facilities on match day to e that all planned medical service elements are available and in position, adequately staffed and equipped. He must ensure that the environment is safe.

Te must measure heat stress using alb globe thermometer. Extra ing breaks at the 30th and 75th ute stages are suggested when the 3GT is above 32°C. Collaborate h the match official to suspend the _ame when there is lightning. The 30-30 lightning prevention rule states that there is a danger of someone being

struck by lightning when the interval between seeing a lightning flash and hearing the subsequent thunder is less than 30 seconds.

The second 30 in the 30-30 lightning prevention rule states that resumption of outdoor activities should not resume until 30 minutes have elapsed after the last lightning flash or thunder.

SIDELINE CARE - The field of play medical team is designated to provide immediate treatment or transfer of the ill or injured player or referee on the field of play. Eight advanced life support paramedics sit in two groups of four - on either side of the halfway line. Their key role is to provide assistance as required to the team doctors and ensure the swift, efficient and smooth transfer of injured players to the touchline during a match.

The field of play medical team should comprise medical, nursing or paramedic professionals who are trained in basic life support measures as a minimum level of care and should have at least one member who is qualified and experienced in out-of-hospital advanced life support. The more



experienced clinician should lead and guide other members of the team in the event of a life-threatening injury or illness in a player or referee.

All the members of the field of play medical team should be trained and experienced at least in basic life support, in order to effectively undertake:

- Basic cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR)
- Automated External Defibrillator (AED) use
- Rescue manual resuscitator breathing use
- Spinal injury alignment and

immobilisation

- Fracture and/or dislocation splintage
- External bleeding management Management of the player
- having a seizure Management of the unconscious player
- Transfer of the ill or injured player off the field of play

This medical room must be fully equipped for all emergency diagnosis and treatment; it must have the following items:

- 1 examination and treatment tables
 - 1 portable stretcher
- Defibrillator with rhythm and patient data recording
- Cardiac monitor
- External cardiac pacing
- Infusion mounting and system with all equipment for injections and infusions, incl. venous indwelling cannula
- Pericardial puncture set
- Drug administration equipment
- Intubation equipment
- Automatic ventilator, stationary oxygen min. 2000 l or portable oxygen min. 400 l, stationary non-manual suction device with minimum negative pressure of 500 mm of mercury with a minimum capacity of 1, capnometer, PEEP-valve
- Thorax drainage kit
- Immobilisation equipment like vacuum mattress, spinal board, cervical collar-set.

Two ambulances with AEDs each have to be stationed at every stadium for the care of players, team officials, and VIPs. There should be one ambulance as a backup as replacement in case an ambulance is needed and leaves the stadium. I wish you a productive week, God bless you all.

Dlamini said the team should go and represent the nation well during the return leg of the continent's second premier national competition.


"We wish the team the best of luck during their game against Malawi. We are confident they will play well and advance to the next round of the competition," he said.

Another official, who preferred anonymity, said all this was beyond their control.

chologist to help the players cope after a tragic week in which they lost one of their players during a match.

Problem

"We cannot complain about the fixtures coming thick and fast. We will honour the fixture and play no problem," he said.
