

FOCUS ON MATSAPHA TOWN COUNCIL COMMISSION

Iam still mayor Good riddance Gciniwe - Tommy Kirk - Sandlane

"I am still the Mayor of Matsapha **Town Council untill elections are** conducted in 2022," says Sandlane Zwane.

Zwane made the pronouncement before the commission of enquiry probing the affairs of the town yesterday.

Having been thrown with corruption allegations, abuse of the power of unopposed motions and of solely making decisions, Zwane said he acted upon his authority as the mayor.

He said he was guarded by the country's constitution together with the town council standing orders, which gave him the powers to act and make decisions single-handedly, if needs be.

He clarified that he did not abuse any power of motions but acted upon the given powers contained in the standing orders that the chairperson is obligated to intervene whenever he notices unlawful acts.

Furthermore, Zwane claimed that the councillors under his leadership did not familiarise themselves with the constitution and the standing orders, hence they made a fuss

over every decision he took.

He said he had tried boundlessly to edify them on the standing orders and the constitution as well but all those efforts proved futile as they continued with their inexperienced conduct, which later resulted in the chaos in Matsapha.

Zwane said he was impressed by Kholwaphi Dlamini or Mdziniso's presentation during the interview for the Corporate Manager's position, hence she obtained the job. Allegations were forwarded by other councillors last week that Kholwaphi might have secured the job because Zwane knew her.

It was reported that the corporate manager's position requirements were that a Masters degree as the minimum credential which turned out that Kholwaphi had only an affidavit to attest to that.

Kholwaphi claimed to have obtained the Masters Degree in 1999 and the produced affidavit was dated back to the same year where she said the certificate had to be turned back due to a misspell.

What raised eyebrows was that Kholwaphi still had not attained the certificate in 2018 when she went for the interview, raising concerns that the Masters Degree might not be existent.

Commission unnecessary

THE commission of enquiry to probe affairs in the Matsapha Town Council appointed by the minister is not necessary, says Chairperson Sandlane Zwane.

"There were no issues that necessitated the involvement of other parties other than the councillors themselves," Zwane said.

The commission was appointed by the minister of housing to query matters within the Matsapha Town Council, more especially events that transpired between the period of November 2017 to 2018.

He said problems that ensued within the council, the town was capable of solving those tribulations internally without involving outsiders. Zwane said Matsapha Town Council required knowledge on the town's standing orders together with the constitution, to which he said the inexperience of councillors caused the havoc in Matsapha. He said it was unnecessary for the commission to be involved as they (councillors) would have resolved all the issues within the town.

However, questions flared up regarding the fact that Zwane saw it suitable to approach the court when he was being stripped of his duties by the councillors.

He submitted an urgent application to the court when the councillors moved to remove him from office as mayor. Unfortunately, the court threw that matter by the window and councillors were allowed to conduct the scheduled meeting regarding Zwane.

He said going to court was actually a constitutional right which he was obligated to invoke for the reason that there were things that happened within the council that required clarity by a court of law.

MATSAPHA Town Council ratepayer and businessman Thomas Kirk says he was actually happy when former Chief Executive Officer Gciniwe Fakudze left.

Kirk said the former CEO victimised him; she granted investors land which belonged to him without his consent. He said Fakudze was literally out to get him the way she conducted herself while in office.

"I was actually happy when Gciniwe left as she victimised me," the businessman said, adding there were plans of rezoning of his complex by the ex-CEO into a residential category.

Deputy Mayor Siphesihle Sibandze alluded during his submission that he was in possession of evidence of a recording between Councillor Bongani Mkhatshwa and Kirk where Fakudze's name was mentioned numerous times.

Recording

However, Councillor Mfanufikile Dlamini played the said recording before the commission where Kirk and Mkhatshwa were in an 18-minute conversation discussing Matsapha affairs.

Kirk, when asked about having knowledge of a recording of some sort, said he had no knowledge of such, save that he read about it in the newspapers.

Councillor Mkhatshwa's 3-hour dilly dallying

HAVING concurred with Councillor Mavela Shongwe when strongly refuting allegations against Mayor Sandlane Zwane, Councillor Mkhatshwa dragged his submission beyond any imagination on Monday, spending nearly three hours moving backwards and forwards.

Councillor Bongani Mkhatshwa is implicated in an audio recording produced before the commission as evidence which was firstly cited by Deputy Mayor Siphesihle Sibandze. It was played for the commission by Councillor Mfanufikile Dlamini.

Mkhatshwa, for two hours and 45 minules specifically tried to dodge questions directed at him by the commissioners investigating the Matsapha Town Council affairs.

He negated allegations that Zwane was corrupt and abused the power of unopposed motions.

Commissioner Mzwandile Dlamini had to bring to the councillor's attention that he was under oath, hence he was obligated to answer truthfully.

Furthermore, the councillor threw corruption allegations in the direction of the other councillors who are said to be

on Chief Executive Officer Lucky Sukati's side.

He said turmoil erupted in the town when the CEO threatened them with Section 27 of the Urban Government Act. The Act authorises the CEO to submit to the minister issues that surface within the town, which he feels are somehow unlawful.

When asked what the councillors were doing unlawfully, which spurred the CEO to exercise Section 27, the councillor said everything was orderly within the council and there were no feuds at all.

CEO accused of fiddling with minutes

COUNCILLOR Mkhatshwa, after denying having knowledge on a number of issues including corruption allegations levelled against Zwane, he alleged that the record of minutes in the possession of the commission were tampered with by the CEO.

He said what was actually contained in the minutes did not take place. He further denied having knowledge of Zwane prohibiting the CEO access to the council's premises. He said he could not recall hearing Zwane issuing that order. However, Commissioner Benito Jones brought to the councillor's attention that in their possession was a letter served to the CEO with its author being Zwane telling him that he was prohibited to set foot within the council's premises.

Meanwhile, Mkhatshwa said the minister responsible should deal with the corrupt councillors and not dissolve all the councillors.

PUPILS GET HIGH ON COUGHSYRUP

A chemical found in cough syrup, Dextromethorphan, nearly killed several pupils in one of the schools around Manzini.

This follows the latest habit of teenagers finding a way of getting high by ingesting the chemical forming the cough

A boarding master in one of the hostels in Manzini got the shock of his life when he found his pupils behaving strangely at the hostel. It was revealed that the pupils mixed the cough syrup with energy drinks and other soft drinks just to get the fix. Over the years, parents had to watch out if their children are not exposed to alcohol and drugs. The boarding master said he saw pupils at the beginning of each school term coming with quite a number of cough syrups. He said that never raised any suspicion because this was simply nothing but syrup, as far as the administration was concerned.

"Every term we inspect the children's luggage before entering the hostels. We often find different types of medicinal drugs such as pain killers, flu vaccine, and of course, the cough syrups. We never suspected anything; we even encouraged our pupils to ask their parents to buy them these kinds of medicine," he said.

The boarding master, however, confessed that he was caught unawares following what he witnessed last week Saturday in one of the dormitories. He found pupils noticeably high. Surprisingly, when they searched for alcohol or drugs they could not find anything like that. Upon a thorough investigation, they found juice bottles with remains of Coca-Cola.

He said they did not suspect anything dodgy with the Coca-Cola up until one of the pupils spilled the beans about the magic formulae that turned all of them

"One of the pupils who was not part of the 'high' squad alerted us about the Coca-Cola," he said.

The pupil revealed to authorities how the Coca-Cola was spiked with the cough syrup and some other concoction. At first, the boarding master, said he did not believe the 'snitching' pupil because he did not want to make premature

WHAT IS DEXTROMETHORPHAN?

DEXTROMETHORPHAN: This is the active ingredient in more than 100 OTC cough and cold medicines such as Robitussin and Nyquil. One teen in every 10 has reported abuse of cough medicine to get high. Large doses can cause euphoria, distortions of colour and sound, and "out of body" hallucinations that last up to 6 hours. Other dangerous side effects include impaired judgment, vomiting, loss of muscle movement, seizures, blurred vision, drowsiness, shallow breathing, and a fast heart

When combined with alcohol or other drugs, a large dose can lead to death. For example,

judgements, then he tried it himself. "I took the remaining concoction from the juice bottles and tasted it," he said.

Purchasing

One of the parents who were called by the school to her daughter's disciplinary hearing told reporters that she did not even remember purchasing any cough syrup.

'Even if my child asked for money to purchase the medicine, I would have given her without suspecting anything,"

Our own investigations uncovered that cough syrup was one of the easiest over the counter medicines to obtain. There is no doctor's prescription needed and it is relatively more affordable as 50 millitres of the syrup only costs E30, Coricidin HBP Cough and Cold includes both dextromethorphan to treat a cough and chlorpheniramine to treat a runny nose. But chlorpheniramine alone abuse by itself has led to numerous deaths and hospitalizations. Dextromethorphan is also addictive and can cause withdrawal symptoms, including depression and difficulty processing thoughts, when the abuse stops. Not much is known about long-term abuse, but cases of bone marrow and nerve cell damage, high blood pressure, heart damage, and permanent brain damage have been reported. Sourced from the internet

Cop Busta jailed for bashing female colleague

CONTROVERSIAL Pigg's Peak police officer Busta Vilakati has been sentenced to two years in a correctional facility for assaulting a fellow female police officer, Phobhi Motsa, in 2017.

The assault happened outside the Pigg's Peak Police Camp in mid-2017. At the time of the assault, Vilakati allegedly slapped Motsa, who was trying to stop him from taking a young female into his room at the police camp.

After the assault, Motsa went to report Vilakati at the Pigg's Peak Police Station. A medical practitioner who examined Motsa at the Pigg's Peak Government Hospital said she had lost all hearing in the left ear after her unfortunate inci-

Vilakati was then arrested in 2017 for the assault but was allowed to leave the Pigg's Peak Magistrate's Court on his own recognisance until yesterday when he faced returning Magistrate Simangele Mbatha for continuation of his assault trial.

During the trail, Mbatha listened to various renditions of the incident from Vilakati. After hearing all the submissions, Mbatha sentenced

Vilakati to two years in a correctional facility if he failed to pay the E4 000 fine.

Syndicate grabs orphan's home, sells it

A Msunduza orphan residing along Motsa Street, whose name is withheld for her safety, fears for her life as her neighbour threatens her for allegedly refusing to vacate the only home her parents left for her because he has paid for it to strangers.

According to a source, a concerned member of the Msunduza location, who brought the matter to this publication's attention, said prior to the passing of her father in 2014, the child was only 12 years old and had moved to Mhobodleni in Manzini to live with her extended family. However

on seeing vultures hovering over the property, local authorities of Msunduza tracked down the girl and brought her back from Mhobodleni to her parents' property back at Msunduza, where she is the only surviving beneficiary.

A source said after the death of the girl's father, the only person who had inherited the property from her parents, another elder in the community began making enquiries of the whereabouts of the deceased'spersonal belongings that included the particular of the ownership papers for the property, including the title deed. A neighbour who was to later sell the property is said to have denied knowledge of the important papers.

The source added that in 2015, word did the rounds that the property was up for sale.

The buyer and the seller of the property are next door neighbours to the property in question. Their names are known to this publication, but cannot be revealed since the matter is still under investigation.

A source alleged that the new owner of the property is an esteemed engineer in one of the major parastatals. The alleged seller, who is also the neighbour, had earlier implied that they had no recollection of the documents when enquiries were made.

The neighbour, who allegedly sold the property, together with an executor, went on an expedition to locate distant relatives of the deceased and they found these at Mfabantfu, where they convinced them about the coy to falsify transfer documents of the property.

A committee headed by a chairman of the Central Committee at Msunduza, requested the Master of the High Court, through an affidavit, to intervene as they feared that the rightful beneficiary of the property would be left homeless and with no claim to ownership of the property, which rightfully belongs to her, added the source. Elders in the community are now concerned about the safety of the child, who now resides in the one room flat situated within the plot. She says her life is under extreme threat

now that they want her out of the property.

When contacted, a Msunduza community police member said he was aware of the malpractice in the aforementioned property. He said they advised the new owner that he should reclaim his money from the person who allegedly sold him the plot. He further said the new owner was aware when he bought the property that those who facilitated the sale were actually fake owners, but he went ahead with the transaction.

When contacted for a comment, the new owner declined to comment and said the publication should contact his lawyers, who are handling the matter.

POOR ORPHAN ISOLATED, WANTED OUT OF FAMILY HOME

THE alleged buyer of the property, who claims strong backing from lawyers, has constructed a wall fence around the young girl's property and is now allegedly harassing the orphan with the intention to force her to vacate what is rightfully her home.

A Msunduza resident said the new owner allegedly threatened to hit her with a spade during a heated argument, where she was being forced to leave her home as this so-called buyer wanted to demolish the one room structure within the property. "I now fear for my safety as I have been threatened by my neighbour, who has also served me with a court order demanding that I vacate the only home that I know. I was served with court papers ordering me to leave because he wants to develop the property," she added. According to a source, the concerns did not solely lay with her, as prominent community members are also worried that should the child be evicted or end up missing or dead, such corrupt practices would have to come to an end.

In an affidavit dated December 3, 2015, the chairman of the central committee of Msunduza Mbabane West reported a malpractice in the aforementioned plot to the Master's Office. They, therefore, requested to forward the matter to the Deputy Prime Minister's office, where it is being reviewed. The source added that people who claimed that they were the surviving descendants and their owner were not known in the community, an entry that stands out in the affidavit. The complainant together with the chairman of the central committee reported the matter to the Child Welfare Department under the DPM's office. Communications Officer in the DPM's Office Mihla Khumalo said as an office, they were dedicated to dealing with such matters. He further said anyone who lodged a complaint with the office should feel free to contact the office and make a follow up on their matter.

Warder demands E720 000 from HMCS

IN one of the cases that will shake the Correctional Services, a warder is demanding E720 000 from His Majesty's Correctional Services (HMCS).

The warder Sabelo Dlamini based at Bhalekane Correctional facility is demanding the payment of the money and has cited Senior Assistant Commissioner Alexious Nkonyane as the first defendant in the letter of demand served by his lawyers from S.A Nkosi Attorneys.

The commissioner general has been cited as the second defendant, while the accountant general and the attorney general have been cited as the third and fourth respondents.

According to Dlamini in his papers, as a result of an alleged forced illegal and corrupt administrative action, he suffered damages amounting to the £720 000. According to the papers served by S.A Nkosi Attorneys, they act on behalf of their client Dlamini and the defendant is Nkonyane.

It has been stated that the second to fourth respondents are vicariously liable for the illegal and unlawful arbitrary demand of payment to the first defendant of monies for his personal use as the subject matter touches on the plaintiff as a civil servant.

It is alleged that the first respondent committed the misconduct against the plaintiff during the cause and scope of his employment and as such employed and representing the employer.

According to the allegations contained in the papers, it is stated that on August 8, 2014 the first respondent (Nkonyane) found the plaintiff (Dlamini) at work not wearing a lanyard on that particular day and was ordered to pay E250 but no receipt was issued to prove that he had paid same to date.

It has been mentioned that this money was paid to defendant through Bandla Dlamini who was acting under the direct command of the first defendant.

"Again on a date well known to the first defendant, our client was ordered to pay to pay E1 000 for three days yet applicant was not present at work. Despite presenting a sick note, no official general receipt was served following the corrupt abuse of power and this money was received by the first defendant through Lucky Malinga, who was acting under the command of the first defendant," states the papers.

As a result the alleged forced illegal, corrupt and arbitrary administration action is *ultra vires* the powers of the first defendant as a warder and gov-

erned by the Prison's Act of 1964 as amended by the Correctional Services Act of 2017. "We are under strict instructions to demand as we hereby do, the payment of E720 000 at our offices within seven days after receipt of this letter of demand failing which summons will be issued against you without any further notice," states the papers.

The plaintiff is claiming for the alleged forced illegal, corrupt administrative action for damages he suffered as follows:


- Damages for corruption E60 000

Pupil arrested for robbery missing school

A school going juvenile who has been arrested for robbery, housebreaking theft and further assaulting the victim during the incident, wants to go back to class.

The juvenile, who was arrested by the Malkerns police on February 7, says he is now missing crucial classes. He said during this time of the year, their teachers strategise their approach to the end of year exams.

The pupil yesterday filed an urgent application for bail at the High Court.

He submitted that his incarceration is prejudicial to his studies and as a matter of fact, it infringes not only upon his right to liberation but also to education as per the Constitution of the Kingdom of Eswatini.

Represented by lawyer Sanele Mabila in the application, the pupil submitted that on January 7, he was arrested by the Malkerns police and charged with robbery and further, house breaking with intent to steal.

He stated that he appeared before the Manzini Magistrate's Court for his remand and has been advised to approach the High Court for bail application.

He submitted that he is desirous to be admitted to bail since he is a sickly person suffering from stomach ulcers and therefore

lives by constantly seeing doctors, adding that he has been advised the correctional services facilities are not adequately equipped to cater for such illness. "I am further a pupil at a high school in Matsapha where I am doing my senior school leaving certificate and have been missing crucial classes ever since my arrest as during this period of the year our teachers strategise our approach to the end of the year exams," he submitted. He informed the court in his papers that his continued incarceration is prejudicial to his studies and infringes on his right to education.

IMPLICATED

He submitted that the reason he has been implicated in the offences is that he was amongst the mob consisting of his coaccused during the assault of the victim as he only followed around in the chase and further watched whilst the victim was assaulted.

"I happened to get out of my room that Saturday night when I heard people screaming saying my elder brother was stabbed by the victim; Elijah Dlamini.

However, I did not take part in the process of assaulting the complainant, but instead I was supportive and it is evidentiary from the fact that I was the only person who assisted the complainant by taking him to the traffic police who manned a

roadblock nearby requesting the police to take him to the hospital," he submitted.

He averred that he never even noticed that some members of the mob were unlawfully helping themselves with assets belonging to the complainant, arguing that his only interest was to see the complainant taken to the police for stabbing his brother. He further argued in his submissions that he had no control over the actions of the mob since all of them were individuals much older than him hence during the assault and commission of the offences, he tried in vain to drum some sense to the mob but they turned a deaf ear. He strongly believed his innocence will be proven in a court of law and says he is not a flight risk. Further, he will not breach conditions in any manner as he is firmly rooted in this kingdom and has no connections outside the country.

The pupil submitted that it was even easy for the police to apprehend him since he was found at home while preparing to go to school. "I believe my education is important, therefore, I cannot skip the country and leave my family behind," he concluded. He is currently a guest at His Majesty's Correctional Services juvenile facility and is not out on bail in relation to any offence other than the offence he has been been charged with.



Commonwealth capacitates councillors, municipal officers

THE ministry of housing and urban development has hosted a local economic development training workshop for councillors and municipality officers from all the country's towns.

Eswatini Local Government Association Vice President Mayor Billee Fitz-Patrick applauded the Commonwealth Local Government Forum for supporting Eswatini.

"I have no doubt that your presence in this week's workshop will be beneficial to both Eswatini and Zambia. We also hope to learn from your experiences on such projects, and no doubt you will also learn from ours too. I will therefore appeal to all of you gathered here today to ensure that at the end of the training, you should have acquired the necessary LED skills, to ensure that LED capacity and knowledge is entrenched and sustained," she said.

On that note, Commonwealth's Phumla Ndaba said she was looking forward to the fruits that local municipalities would bear after the LED training workshop. Ndaba said after the workshop, municipal authorities should be able to conduct local economic assessments since they would have been exposed to all the tools and methods.

...Promises E3m to fight poverty in towns

COMMONWEALTH Local Government Forum has promised Eswatini Local Government Association E3 million to alleviate poverty through a programme called Local Economic Development.

Gordon Mbuli, Director of Eswatini Local Government Association, said over the years, they have seen a lot of poverty reduction aids channelled to rural areas leaving behind urban residents in extreme poverty. He said they saw it fit to have such workshops so that they are equipped on alieviating poverty in urban areas.

He said research revealed that urban areas have a lot of people living in poverty and these need monetary assistance.

"We have seen over the years that government focused on improving the lives of people living in rural areas, yet the urban areas also have poor citizens. We have seen children struggling to pay rates to municipalities after their parents died," he said.

Taiwan Root Medical Peace Corps gives medical attention to Swazis



According to Taiwan Embassy Third Secretary Violet Mu-hsuan Chen, on Sunday, the medical service was stationed at Medlenya Primary School.





SODV Act not deterring partners from assaulting their lovers

IT seems many are turning a deaf ear towards the SODV Act as more are making appearances before court for assaulting their partners and reaping the fruits of their seeds.

Three men appeared before Senior Magistrate Nonhlanhla Dlamini yesterday.

Sincumo Dlamini (29) of Baha'i was the first to take the stand and he was arrested on February 5 for assaulting his baby mama at the Mbabane bus rank.

He is said to have assaulted Gabsile Hlatjwako with fists several times all over the body and further bit her once on her left arm.

He was charged with contravening Section 77 (1) (a) of the Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence Act 15/2018.

He told the court that Hlatjwako slapped him across the face in public and he felt humiliated, which fuelled his anger and he found himself retaliating.

"Wasuka wangishaya ngemphama phambi kwesive Nkhosi yenkantolo ngabese ngiyahlutfuka nami," he said.

He further pleaded for leniency and told the court that he is the breadwinner in the family and also promised that such will not repeat itself in the future.

He was sentenced to two years in prison with an option of a fine of E2 000.

Another was Davis Dlamini who

was also charged with assaulting his wife Khabonina Simelane with a fist once on her left eye, inflicting severe pain and injuries to her.

The crimes occurred on January 10 at Mangwaneni.

He told the court that he had a misunderstanding with his wife which led to him losing his temper and resulted to him assaulting her.

He further pleaded for leniency and told the court that he was sorry.

He was also sentenced to two years in prison with an option of a fine of E2 000.

Lastly, was Bongani Masuku (32) of Kufikeni area who had allegedly hacked his wife, Fisile Msane with a bushknife on the hands and knees.

He further threatened to stab her with a knife and a beer bottle.

The assault happened at Ekufikeni on December 30, 2018.

Reasons for such behaviour were not disclosed and the prosecution applied that he be remanded in custody pending recovery of his wife. However, bail was not opposed.

Masuku made a bail application and his jaw dropped when he was granted at E3 000.

King's speech debate tomorrow

PARLIAMENT will be debating the speech from the Throne tomorrow when it sits for the first time since His Majesty King Mswati III opened it.

Deputy Speaker Phila Buthelezi announced that both the House of Assembly and the Senate would be sitting tomorrow. He made this announcement soon after His Majesty the King delivered his speech from the Throne.

Buthelezi made this announcement because House of Assembly Speaker Petros Mavimbela had already left the chamber with the King. Senate President Lindiwe Dlamini had left earlier with Her Majesty the Indlovukazi.

The legislators are expected to debate the speech from the Throne, attending Prime Minister Ambrose Mandvulo Dlamini moves a motion to the effect that the speech from the Throne be debated.

Dlamini is expected to be back by tomorrow as he is currently away attending a 32nd Ordinary Assembly Session of the African Union (AU). It took place from Monday in the AU capital, which is Addis Ababa, Ethiopia.

The speaker, when called yester-

day to give details on tomorrow's sitting, said it was procedural for them as legislators to convene a sitting to start debating. He said they would debate the speech from the Throne.

"When the King delivers his speech from the Throne, just like he did, we then convene as parliamentarians to debate the speech from the Throne. We do this before we proceed with any business of Parliament for the current term," Mavimbela said.

He further stated that the motion to that effect was supposed to be moved by Prime Minister Ambrose Mandvulo Dlamini. That business was supposed to take place on Monday, not tomorrow. What made it to happen tomorrow was that the prime minister is currently out of the country

Usually, the House of Assembly elects a Parliament Select Committee consisting of about five MPs that goes to the King to thank him for delivering the speech from the Throne, giving direction to be taken by the country in recovering the economy. The committee is usually led by the prime minister and the House of Assembly Speaker.

It remains to be seen if this will happen this time, mainly because the two chambers are expected to sit on the very same day.

'REFER UNESWAFEES MATTER BACK TO SENATE'

THE impasse in the University of Eswatini's (UNESWA) 400 per cent fees hike between adult education students and the university should be referred back to the Senate.

This is a point of law to be raised by the university through its lawyers from Magagula, Hlophe Attorneys at the High Court.

According to a notice to raise points of law filed by the university, the matter ought to be referred back to the Senate to duly exercise its discretion and arrive at a decision on issues raised, including the issue of the students' registration.

Represented by lawyer Zweli Shabangu from Magagula, Hlophe Attorneys, the institution stated that the university has not had the opportunity to deliberate on the matter and make its findings and decision on it prior to the matter brought

before court.

"The very same matter is on the agenda for the university Senate sitting scheduled for February 12, 2019 at Kwaluseni Campus," according to the notice filed by Shabangu.

Another point of law to be raised is that the matter is prematurely before court as the applicant Jubilee Maziya has not exhausted internal remedies as stipulated in the UNESWA calendar for 2018/19.

Absence

The point of law on *locas standi* (legal standing) raised by the university is that the applicant does not have *locas standi in judicio* to act for other students in the absence of confirmatory affidavits from the concerned students to confirm his authority to act on their behalf

The applicants (students) have filed an urgent application at the High Court seeking an order that a rule nisi be issued returnable on a date to be determined by the court calling upon the respondent (UNESWA) to show cause why an order should not be made final compelling and directing the university to issue the Diploma in Adult Education year one 2018 results to all students who have paid E4 191 in terms of regulation 2.13 of the UNESWA calendar forthwith.

They are also seeking an order of court compelling and directing the university to register all applicants doing first year for the second semester 2019 who have paid the official E4 191 forthwith and further, they are seeking an order reviewing and setting aside the decision of the respondent (UNESWA) to withhold the first semester Diploma in Adult Education applicants' results who have paid the same amount.

The last order they are seeking is for the reviewing and setting aside the decision of the university to charge them a sum of up to E8 548.5 for the first semester (2018) and E7 714.5 for the second semester (2019) plus an order for costs of the application.

Ex-tindvuna, bucopho still waiting for gratuity

FRUSTRATION is mounting as former constituency headmen and bucopho are still waiting for their gratuity.

Lobamba Constituency Headman Bhekisisa Bhembe said only former bucopho from the Shiselweni region have received their gratuity.

He said bucopho from the other three regions are still waiting as they have not yet received their gratuity.

Bhembe said none of the ex-constituency headmen received their gratuity as per the promise of their ministry.

Some of the politicians began receiving their gratuity last week.

He said about 20 politicians had received their gratuity and the rest are still waiting in frustration for their slice of the cake.

The politicians have been at loggerheads with their ministry as they have on a number of occasions engaged government in the matter regarding payment of the gratuity of tindvuna and bucopho who lost the recent elections to no avail.

The politicians are frustrated because they feel government does not consider them. The ex-politicians said they have been counting on the gratuity to settle their loans but are now frustrated as they are continuously overlooked.

In a meeting held two weeks ago at Msunduza in Mbabane, the politicians cited Circular No. 2 of 2013, which states that they are all politicians thus they view this treatment as unfair as now it seems as if other politicians are treated better than others and they view this as segregation.

In the meeting, the ex-politicians decided to engage the services of a lawyer as they feel undermined by government.

Most of the ex-politicians who lost in the elections had still not received their gratuity by the time the meeting was held. Whereas former Members of Parliament have received theirs.

Outlined in the meeting was that they feel undermined by government as they are treated differently from MPs yet they were all serving the same government.

Contacted, Principal Secretary of Tinkhundla Administration and Development Nonhlanhla Dlamini said the ex-politicians would receive their gratuity.

She added that the payments were being processed and confirmed that some of the ex-politicians have received their gratuity.

Dlamini pleaded with the former politicians to be patient as they are working on their payment. "It is a process and they should be patient as they cannot all receive their gratuity at the same time," added Dlamini.

Mozambican man fined E2 000 for 3 counts of DD

A Mozambican man who resides at Mahwalala was arrested and charged with three counts, including drink-driving.

He subsequently appeared before Senior Magistrate Nonhlanhla Dlamini.

Alberto Jose was arrested on Sunday evening for driving under the influence of alcohol.

He refused to take a breathalyser test, thus he was slapped with a second charge of contravening the Road Traffic Act.

His vehicle was also certified unroadworthy

as a door handle was not working and he pleaded guilty to only two charges.

He confessed that he had driven the vehicle while intoxicated and his vehicle had a door handle problem, but did not refuse to take a breathalyser test.

His alcohol content was not disclosed and he was acquitted of the offence of refusing to take a breathalyser test.

Offence

He was sentenced to a year in prison with a fine option of E2 000 on the offence of drink-driving and 30 days in prison or E100 for not having a working door handle.

Also in the same court, Thabo Edwin Fakudze

appeared to answer on a charge of drink-driving, after he was arrested on Sunday at Stonehedge.

Abreathalysertest conducted on him read 1.40mg/l.

He told the court that his mother was ill and the vehicle was usually driven by her but on the day, she was not in a proper state to drive and he did not consider his state of sobriety at the time.

"I apologise for drinking and driving Your Worship; I had to rush my ill mother to hospital when I drove the vehicle in my state. I plead for leniency," he said.

He was sentenced to a year in prison with an option of a fine of E2 000.

PARAMEDIC IN COURT FOR RECKLESS DRIVING

A paramedic appeared in court for reckless driving, resulting to a collision after driving through a red light.



He told the court that he was at work when the accident occurred and he was not driving an ambulance as per protocol but the reason for not

Hot rice lands on man's face, Moza couple fined E1 600

A couple from Mozambique was arrested by the Eswatini Royal Police Service in connection with a case of assault they committed while at Mncitsini in the Hhohho region.

Jose Chizum (38) and his wife Caroline Mashabavu (32) physically and verbally assaulted one Petros Methula (22), also a Mozambican residing at Mncitsini.

The incident is said to have happened on February 6.

Petros met a young boy from the Chizum homestead while on his way to the market and the boy asked Petros for time.

Petros told the boy that his watch was faulty.

House

"I then told the boy to look for time in their house since they have a DStv decoder," Petros said in court.

The Chizum boy verbally assaulted Petros and he retaliated by pushing the boy and he fell to the ground.

The boy went to his parental home to report the matter to his parents.

"I was in the house cooking when my son came in and told me Petros had attacked him. I was upset by the whole incident for I know Petros and he knows me. I then went to ask Petros why he did not approach me and to report the matter other than attacking my child, however, Petros told me to shut up Your Honour," said Mashabavu.

Petros violently sought to gain entry into the Mashabavu house without their consent.

Mashabavu was cooking in the house and about to sieve hot rice when Petros tried to gain entry.

It was at this moment that Petros got burnt by the hot pot of rice on his head and survived with small burns.

Scratched

Caroline reportedly used a 25 litre container that knocked out Petros and had his right cheek scratched.

According to Jose Chizum, who was a defendant on this case, on the day of the incident, he heard noise from outside.

"Your Worship I was in my shorts relaxing at home on a Tuesday when Petros stormed my house. He had a small quarrel with my wife. I then asked him to leave my home and I will come to speak to his mother the next morning," Chizum told the court

Chizum, who has lived in the country since 1998, told the Swazi National Court that on February 6, his child came home crying and when he asked why, he said Petros had attacked him.

When Chizum approached Petros about the matter, he was unwilling to reason with Chizum

Chizum refuted that he confronted Petros while he was at his house

He denied ever strangling him.

The court found the couple guilty of assault and sentenced each accused to four months in jail or pay a fine of E800 each.

lobally studies have shown that females have the highest HIV infection rate including in Eswatini where incidence of HIV among adults aged 15 years and older is 1.36 percent and 1.70 percent among females and 1.02 percent among males.

This corresponds to approximately 7,000 new cases of HIV annually among adults ages 15 years and older in Eswatini (SHIMS, 2017). The country has also made great strides in reaching the 95-95-95 targets by 2020 where 95 percent of all PLHIV will know their HIV status; 95 percent of all people with diagnosed HIV infection will receive sustained antiretroviral therapy (ART); and 95 percent of all people receiving ART will have viral suppression.

The male and female condoms are the only prevention products available that are cost effective and have positive return on investment. Hence emphasis should be made that condoms are indeed still the cheapest and best option. They are the only method that provides triple protection against STIs including HIV and against unplanned pregnancy. Destignatizing condoms and encouraging access to quality condoms, when people need them and in places where they feel the most comfortable gaining that access is critical.

Promoting safe sex practices is also incredibly important in a time when funding for global health has remained flat for the last several years. Lack of funds should not affect money for condoms and promotion for use, so it is critical that we get the message out about how important they are for staying healthy and disease-free, particularly in countries that experience higher prevalence rates for HIV like Eswatini.

Dual protection is hence key as it is the simultaneous prevention of STI and unwanted pregnancy. This can only be accomplished with the consistent and correct use of a condom alone or by the simultaneous use with another FP method.

Hence the country's way of commemorating the International Condom Day events are a fun way to bring people together and get them information about how to keep themselves and their loved ones safe and healthy. International Condom Day also helps remind people that there is still an HIV crisis—and keeping people engaged through the "Always in Fashion", Got it, Get It and CONDOMIZE! campaigns is a great way to raise awareness and fight the epidemic.

As stated by His Majesty King Mswati III during the opening of the 11th Parliament of the Kingdom of Eswatini "The Kingdom's drive to end AIDS by 2022 remains in motion. We all need to take full responsibility in creating favourable condition for the nation to achieve its target in the last mile leading to 2022; where no Liswati should get HIV, die from AIDS related illnesses and no HIV stigma or discrimination should exist within our communities."

The Social Case for Female Condoms
Empowering women through the use of
female condoms decrease maternal
mortality, fewer unwanted pregnancies
and protection from HIV-infection, and
other STIs. Worldwide 215 million
women who like to plan or limit number
of children have no access to
contraception.

Worldwide 21.6 million unsafe abortions cause 5 million women hospitalized each year, and account for 13 % of maternal deaths. Worldwide women and girls account for slightly more than half of all HIV infections. In sub-Saharan Africa 23 million people live with HIV/AIDS: over 12 million are women and nearly 2.5 million are children.

Why the Female Condom (FC2)?

- 1) Only FDA and WHO approved Female Condom and as a result approved for bulk procurement by UNFPA and USAID
- 2) Non allergenic material as opposed to the latex male condom, is made out of Nitrile which holds many benefits:
 - Stronger than latex,
- Can be used by people who are latex sensitive, or allergic
- Can hold both water and oil based lubricants (latex tears with oil)
- Can be inserted hours in advance
- Transfers body heat ensuring a more natural sensation

3) FC2 has been distributed to 149 countries including Kingdom of Eswatini 4) The Female condom is **hormone free**, which means that it does not have the side effects of some hormone based contraceptives.

5) Preferable alternative to a male condom, according to males

- Men don't have to wear it
- Not tight/restricting
- Can be inserted in advance of sexual activity

Certain Myths and Misconceptions among decision makers and users exist which hinder the use of female condom programs in the country and this include that it is too expensive, there is no demand, we already have male condoms and LARCs so the FC is not necessary and men do not like the product, and without them it will never succeed.

1) IT IS TOO EXPENSIVE: FALSE

Return on investment of female condom procurement for governments through 2 ways:

a. 1) Cost savings to the health system,

by focussing on prevention instead of treatment

b. Economic productivity losses averted, as more women are able to join the workforce.

2) THERE IS NO DEMAND: FALSE

Various studies have cited greater comfort and practicality and greater protection and safety as the two main advantages of the FC2 including in South Africa, 80% of women felt the FC put them in charge.

3) WE ALREADY HAVE OTHER COMMODITIES: FALSE

If anything, current use of male condoms and other modern contraceptives increases the use of female condoms. Female condoms thus seemed to complement the existing choice set of regular contraceptives

4) MEN DO NOT LIKE FEMALE CONDOMS: FALSE

Women feel more in control and the more the use the more the support from their male partners.


This means that even if Buy Cash Hardware or any other organisation wants to make a donation to any community project under this Foundation, that donation can be made directly," he

MANREPORTS GUNEROHHING CHIEF TO COPS

A second man from the five who were allegedly threatened with a gun by a chief has also recorded a statement at the Nhlangano Police Station.

First to record a statement was Vusi Thikazi last week Tuesday. The second man who has also recorded a statement is Gigg's Mbhamali. He went to the police station last Friday. Recorded in the police form known as RCCI is a three page long statement where Mbhamali highlights what transpired on February 2. He said it was while together with four other men and a woman at the Nhlangano Correctional Services staff canteen that they came across the chief who, without even bothering to greet them, rushed over to their female companion and kissed her. The recorded statement outlines that the woman who was kissed by the chief while in their company is actually a police officer, employed by the Royal Eswatini Police Service (REPS).

"He approached the female, greeted her and then kissed her in front of us," Mbhamali's statement reads in

Mbhamali could not stomach what the chief was doing and he rebuked him, saying he was undermining them by kissing a woman who was in their



"I said: 'Yemnaketfu kusikhobosa vini lolokwentako kucabuza umuntfu lesihamba naye."

Ordered

He said as he was questioning what the chief was doing, his 'chauffeur' was ordered to block their vehicle as he (chief) wanted to deal with the occupants of the Isuzu twin cab they were travelling in.

"I waited to see what the chief was going to do next. He opened his car, took out a gun and he bridged it while we all watched in dismay and frightened. He said, 'utangati kutsi ngingubani namuhla' which loosely means 'I will show you my true colours today.' He approached me and pointed the gun at me. I froze for a moment

but later told him to go ahead and shoot at me. He was then restrained by his companion who mentioned that they should leave. That was when I called 999 and reported the incident," reads the statement.

He said at the Nhlangano Police Station, police informed them that there were no cars as they had to attend to other incidents. He said he was advised to come to the police station to report the incident but they were uncomfortable in doing so. He said they decided to drive to the T-Junction to buy drinks and the chief advised his chauffeur to follow them.

"I, therefore, lay a charge against him (identifying the chief) for pointing a gun at me and threatening to shoot me," reads the statement.

'Respect king's pronouncements'

NHLANGANO businessman Justice Nxumalo has advised the nation on the importance of sticking to names of establishments and institutions that Their Majesties have given.

Nxumalo said it should be known that when Their Majesties rename a building or place, they do that for a reason. He said even schools, when Their Majesties rename them, people should use the names that have been recommended and forget about the old ones. He said all what Their Majesties recommend should be implemented promptly.

"Take for instance, His Majesty gave a name to the Eswatini Water Services Corporation building here in Nhlangano which he said should be called Esiyalwini. We all should call that building with that name; Esivalwini. The same applies to renamed Lunyati. We should refer to the school as Lunyati and not Tfokotani," said Nxumalo.

The businessman, who served in various bodies including the Land

Management Board (LMB), said he has been following closely several institutions and establishments which have been officially opened by His Majesty to see if the names given by the Ingwenyama were used.

"It is important to stick to the names that the King gives to these places. We should not ignore this as when the King gives a name or renames a structure or an institution, it is for a purpose and not just for fun. Some of the names he gives have to do with the background or history of that particular institution or establishment. Our children can also find it useful as some of the names the King gives usually have something to do with the country's history," said Nxumalo.

Nxumalo said in the Shiselweni region, there were a number of places the King has given names or renamed.

"It's the duty of those in charge of these establishments that the names Ingwenyama recommends are enforced. 'So in the case of schools, if that school was known as Tfokotani but Higwenyama renamed it Lunyati, all Tfokotani Primary which His Majestyllis the boards should be removed and replaced with Lunyati Primary. Even the letterheads, they have to reflect the name given by Ingwenyama," said Nxumalo, who is also a staunch traditionalist.

BULL KNOCKED DOWN BY CAR, OWNER ARRESTED

A cattle owner was arrested after his bull was knocked by a motor vehicle.

German Ndlangamandla (40) of Moti area was charged with contravening Section 77 (1) as read with Section 122 (4) of the Road Traffic Act 6 of 2007 in that last Saturday, at about 1930 hours near Mkhondvo area along MR9 public road in the Manzini region, being an owner of a black and white bullock, with a tag ear branded 562/01323 did wrongfully and unlawfully allowed cattle to be on a public road and as a result it was knocked down by a Toyota Corolla registered DSD 530 BM driven by Mfundo Matsebula. According to the arresting officer, Constable Sicelo Mkhwanazi, Matsebula's car was extensively damaged by the bul-

By the time the accident occurred, Ndlangamandla was not at the scene. However, he was easily located by the tag ear branded on the bullock. That is when he was arrested and charged for the offence. The Royal Eswatini Police Service over the years has been urging members of the public to ensure that their cattle do not stray unto public roads to minimise accidents. One of the ways that was used to minimise the number of cattle on public roads was to detain them. The Swazi government ended up fencing areas along public roads as a way of preventing cattle from straying unto public roads. German Ndlangamandla appeared before Magistrate Xolile Nxumalo at the Manzini Magistrate's Court. He was found guilty of the charge and was sentenced to 10 months in prison with an option to pay E1 200.

.Matter reported to RA

THE matter involving a chief who allegedly threatened five men with a gun in public, is now handled by the office of the Shiselweni Regional Administrator.

The chief, whose identity is known but deliberately withheld as it is a matter that is still being investigated by the police, has distanced himself from the matter. This is despite that the matter allegedly occurred in public and witnessed by several people. While the matter is still under police investigation, this publication has discovered that the office of the Shiselweni Regional Administrator (RA) through the Regional Secretary (RS) Zwakele Dlamini, has also been roped in.

Vusi Thikazi, who is one of the five men who were allegedly threatened by the chief, has since been summoned by the RS and asked to shed light on what transpired. According to close sources, the RS requested Thikazi to come see him after he had met with the chief who denied ever threatening anyone with a gun.

"I received a call last Friday and I was advised to report to the RA's offices to meet the RS on this issue. Today (Monday), I was in that office and to my surprise, Dlamini informed me that the chief has denied everything. I told him my side of the story and it was then that he sounded interested to hear even the other four men I was with on the day in question," said Thikazi.

Stage 4 load shedding

ESKOM has plunged South Africa into darkness, in a more dramatic fashion than usual on Monday.

The energy firm 'lost functionality' in six of their generating units, escalating the load shedding schedule from Stage 2 up to Stage 4. Stage 3 didn't even get a look-in, such is the severity of the situation.

Stage 4 load shedding - what does it mean?

Stage 4 allows for up to 4000 MW of the national load to be shed. It is double the frequency of Stage 2, which means you will be scheduled for load shedding 12 times over a four day period for two hours at a time, or 12 times over an eight-day period for four hours at a time.

Stage 4 is as good as unprecedented ground for South Africa, who only had a brush with it back in 2015. Eskom has already admitted that this electricity nightmare could stretch into April, as the crippled utility giants slump from one disaster to the next.

Unfortunately, their failure also heaps misery on the rest of South Africa. We are certainly not using the term 'disaster' lightly, either. We are taking it from the experts. Ted Blom – a senior energy and mining and commodities strategist – told us that the situation is now 'very serious': "With Stage 4, they've effectively lost a power station. This is a very serious situation, and 20 per cent of the country is currently in darkness.

I would say this is absolutely disastrous. The technical operation problems run deep – old stations are not receiving maintenance, whereas new stations have not yet been commissioned.

"Their application to implement tariff hikes won't help them. My gut feeling is that NERSA will not give Eskom anything. Their case is defective and 15 per cent wouldn't be enough to save them, either."

Here's how close South Africa is to disaster

Matshela Koko sticks the boot in

Meanwhile, the latest omnishambles has seen a few former executives emerge from the shadows. Matshela Koko – you'll remember him for being implemented in several scandals at the power firm – has weighed in with his opinion on the matter.

The former Eskom interim GCEO believes that we are now officially 'in a crisis'. He estimates that 40 per cent of the electricity supply is unavailable, doubling the prediction made by Blom: "We've jumped Stage 3 and this is a crisis. Stage 4 load shedding means the electricity system is short 4000MW to keep the grid stable - which is about the full size of Kendal Power Station. This is the very first time in the history of Eskom." Stage 4 also means that Eskom is failing to meet a peak demand of 27 000MW when it has the installed capacity of 45 000MW. This means around 40 per cent of generating capacity is not available... This is gross incompetence at the very top."

Stage 4 load shedding and beyond: Is there more to come?

But could we see even more drastic measures during these forecast blackouts? Don't be shocked if things intensify further. Eskom Spokesperson Khulu Phasiwe is yet to rule out whether a Stage 5 schedule of load shedding could soon be rolled out. Last November, the utility confirmed that plans for 'Stage 8' were being drafted.

In what would literally be our darkest days, Stage 8 would see consumers go an average of 12 hours a day without power. This has been broken down into two approaches. Either 48 hours of electricity would be shut-off over a four-day period, or alternatively, it could be doubled

to 96 hours over eight days. It all depends on what Eskom have left in reserve. Disaster may loom, but this particular scenario is miles away. Municipalities still have to approve the idea, and there's no guarantee that everyone will be onside with the proposals.

For now, it's another game of 'wait and see' for the citizens of South Africa. Eskom's latest stage of load shedding could keep power off for 12 hours a day

Eskom unveil new load shedding stage

So of course, now is the most opportune time to learn that a new stage of load shedding is ready to roll: Eskom spokesperson Dikatso Mothae told Fin24 yesterday that 'Stage 8' has been added to the schedule.

Granted, Mothae stated that power outages aren't likely to get past stage 4 in 2019. But then, what is a promise from Eskom really worth? We're taking a look at the practical implications of Stage 8, and consider what it would mean for South Africans once the most drastic of all power outages gets the go-ahead.

What Stage 8 load shedding means for South Africa:

For a start, we are talking about enormous amounts of power being taken off the grid. A total of 8000MW would be preserved. To give you some context, that would be twice the size of SA's biggest ever power conservation, which reached 4000MW during Stage 4 load shedding in 2015. It would also account for the longest amount of time the electric has had to be forcibly switched off in Mzansi. Stage 8 is likely to see consumers go an average of 12 hours a day without power.

This has been broken down into two approaches. Either 48 hours of electricity would be shut-off overa four-day period, or alternatively, it could be doubled to 96 hours over eight days.

It all depends on what Eskom have left in reserve. The final plans are currently awaiting municipal approval.

> How to find out if load shedding will affect you

First, you have to see if you're electricity is provided by Eskom or by a municipality. Chances are, if you live in rural areas, you're reliant on the national grid. If you're a city dweller, you get the municipal sup-

If Eskom is your supplier...

Still unsure? Visit www.loadshedding.eskom.co.za and enter your address into their search bar. If it doesn't come up, that means you are on a municipality grid. If you are powered by the utility giant, the aforementioned website will tell you if your property will be affected by load shedding.

If the city is your supplier...

For those of us who rely on our cities to provide the electricity, you can keep up to date with everything that's happening here: This website doesn't just provide the schedule, but also lists some of the essential contact details for each metropole.

Letter from wailing medical student:

Not in the public interest

SIR

Thank you for allowing me space in your highly-esteemed newspaper in the country.

My letter is in response to the article that appeared in onother publication of February 10, 2019; a comment by the director of health services, one Dr Nyawo and the registrar of the Swaziland Dental and Medical Council (SDMC). Firstly, I want to bemoan the level of corruption in our country. It my sincere hope that the new government will deal decisively with corrupt government officials for the benefit of our poor citizens.

Mr editor, the ministry of health (MOH) is one of the ministries that have been infested by the plague of corruption. It is a serious mess. Apart from the looting of public money from Phalala Fund through evil collusions as reported previously, now comes the issue of doctors. Some officials in the ministry are out to scandalise Swazi doctors that have been trained outside of Africa, in particular Taiwantrained doctors.

Through the good relation that our country has with Taiwan, a number of Swazis have been offered scholarships to further their studies in Taiwan.

Scholarships

Included amongst these is a number of doctors. Other than Taiwan, there is no other country that has offered so many scholarships to study medicine. It is worth mentioning that the training of doctors is the most expensive than any other field of study. That is why less scholarships are offered in this field. Our country must indeed be grateful to Taiwan for such assistance.

Furthermore, Taiwan has one of the best health care systems in the world; surpassing most of the countries in Europe and America. This is evidenced by their higher life expectancy.

Taiwan has the best medical technology that you could think of. All major surgeries and treatment modalities are available in Taiwan. No one patient has been referres to be treated outside of Taiwan because their health care system is efficient.

Coming back to our country, the healthcare system is in a mess.

The ratio of doctor-patient is absurdly high. Our country needs more doctors than ever before; not just doctors, but Swazi doctors who will provide cultural relevant care. Our country has a lot of foreign doctors, more than 80 per cent

It is really sad when the ministry of health prefers foreign doctors over Swazis. One just wonders what the officials are benefitting by bringing those foreign doctors into our country. Why are foreign doctors preferred over Swazis?

Due to poor controls and screening, we have seen fake doctors hired by the ministry to treat Swazis. But now because it is Swazis, it is a struggle to hire them. This is really sad and painful.

This is a fight against Taiwantrained doctors more than anything as evidenced by our engagement with the ministry of health. It is really unclear why they are doing this to the Swazi doctors. To insinuate that graduates trained outside of Africa do not practice on real patients is part of the smear campaign, which is based on unfounded truth. I may not be sure about those trained in other countries, but in Taiwan we do practice on real patients and we have all the evidence to prove it.

Because the MoH bases its argument on the premise that the disease prevalence is different from those of Africa, Mr editor, the curriculum of medical schools must meet certain minimum standards. That is why there are bodies such as world medical directory that screen all medical schools to see if they meet such requirements. Even though we may meet few cases of diseases prevalent in our country, we have extensively learnt a lot about all diseases. It does not make sense to say we are lacking in terms of knowledge. Furthermore, all students in Taiwan are post-

Incompetency

We all have first degrees in a medically related field. Most of us have been nurses before with vast clinical experience. Therefore, the issue of incompetency is neither here nor there. There is more than meets the eye in as far as this issue is concerned.

The premise that graduates trained in Africa are better than those trained beyond is invalid. It is not backed by credible and/or substantive evidence. It is assumption based.

There is no credible tool that has been used to quantify graduates to support the claim mentioned thereof. Even if it turns out to be true, the Swaziland Dental and Medical Council (SDMC) ought to develop a programme that will fill such gaps. It is worth noting that diabetes and hypertension in Asia and Africa are the same. The disease prevalence is not that much different, so as to suggest that people must only train in Africa to work in Africa.

There has been a lot of doctors from countries such as Cuba given licences to practice medicine in our country, and the council didn't have qualms with that. Just because now it is Swazis coming back to serve their people, they see a problem

On another note, the other point of argument about our programme is that it is a four-year programme,

whereas they are used to a five year programme. The programme we are doing is an adopted American style MD (Medical Degree), which is highly-respected the world over. The information about the programme structure is easily accessible via google for people to comment on an informed point of view.

The programme is designed for post-grad entrants. Only people with a relevant first degree can apply for the MD programme. That should say a lot about why we do four years before we do the internship. This is the standard for an MD. Furthermore, doing five years is not different from doing four years when the content covered is the same.

The MD programme is accredited and accepted by world medical bodies. It meets all the set requirements of medical education. In our practice, we cover all the required hours of clinical rotation during clerkship.

Finally, the less I say anything about the Swaziland Dental and Medical Council the better. There is so much confusion that has been caused by this body.

It is not understandably why the council seems to be enforcing standards that are not there in the first place. They just come up with standards that are not aligned with the health care act just because Taiwan trained graduates are coming back. There has been an influx of foreign-trained doctors from Russia and Ukraine and there has been no problem with them.

Independently

More importantly, after two years of clinical internship, the students become good doctors. It is not understandably why the focus is on Taiwan-trained doctors. Is it because those from Russia and other universities are children of the elite?

It is worth mentioning that interns are not yet clinically competent to practice unsupervised. It is a pity when the director of services admits that they have been allowing interns to practice independently. Medicine is a vast field and it takes years to sharpen clinical skills. The SDMC does not have a clear policy in place concerning the mentoring and skilfully equipping of interns,

but they are quick to shout 'incompetency'.

Our country must be grateful that other countries are training doctors for us.

We, as a country, must play our part towards the training and sharpening the clinical skills of these young doctors than to expect endproducts like the world is owing us something. The greatest problem with the SDMC is the conflict of interest amongst some of its members. The director of health services and his deputy are also part of the council.

This is not good because, 'the referee also becomes the player at the same time'.

The SDMC is a highly compromised entity.

It is more like a club of friends with common personal interests than a professional body. There is nothing of public interest in what they are doing.

It is not acting professionally as one would expect. If they have seen that graduates' skills are lacking, what have they done to improve same?

On the other hand, the Swaziland Nursing Council is doing exceptionally well in improving nurses'clinical skills. That is why they have amassed several international awards. Preceptors are available in every ward to assist in mentoring nursing students. The SMDC must follow suit.

In closing Mr editor, the greatest challenge we have; not only in Swaziland but Africa as a whole, is that older people are perpetually competing with younger people. Instead of mentoring young people and leaving a legacy behind, they would rather die with 'the relay baton' than to hand over it to the next generation.

This is the pain of being young doctor in Swaziland.

Older doctors find comfort in proving how much you don't know than holding your hand and mentoring you to become a great doctor Our society is sick and dysfunctional. Mr editor, there is no good book that can teach clinical skills, nor there is a store where we can buy experience. Otherwise we could be saving all the money to buy that book or the experience that we so much need. The best experience comes from all the mistakes and bad outcomes we meet every day.

Since it is obvious that our country does not want us to help our people, the doors of opportunities are wide open outside of our borders. We will gladly welcome them and ply our trade where we will be accepted and improve other people's lives. In health, there are no boundaries, every person we meet and treat becomes our relative.

The ministry is also in the process of actively seeking for other private sector partners to take this culture spectacular to another level.

"Both tents will be fully equipped with special packages which I am sure people will like," said the minister. In another matter, the minister recounted how in the past, dignitaries and tourists attending the marula festival went back home without tasting the brew.

Now that the tasting sessions have been officialised, nobody will go back home without having an idea of what the marula drink tastes like.

Economic turn-around imminent for Eswatini - Minister

THE Minister of Tourism and Environmental Affairs Moses Vilakati believes, with the right strategies in place, an economic turn-around is im-minent for Eswatini.

The minister said yesterday that tourism was not only important in the SADC region and Europe but that it has become a competitive industry also capable of economic growth in some countries.

"Firstly, I would like to say Bayethe for His Majesty's pronouncement on tourism during the opening of Parliament last Friday. Tourism is important and can be used to turn around our economy," he said.

Vilakati highlighted that countries where tourism is a pillar for growth, were improving drastically.

Boosting

"Countries like South Africa, Mauritius and Rwanda are doing well and getting billions of Emalangeni through Tourism. "We are looking at having a theme for each month just like we are doing with the month of February being the official marula tasting month. But all this will be revealed once finalised," he said.

His Majesty King Mswati III highlighted in his speech during the opening of the First Session of the 11th Parliament that tourism as a catalyst for growth, tourism has a great potential to reinforce economic and sustainable growth across all sectors, despite the economic uncertainty faced by most economies of the world, of which the kingdom of Eswatini is no exception.

He said this sector had the potential to generate foreign currency through trade, exports and job creation.

"Therefore, we need to adopt a robust investment, strategy in our tourism marketing campaigns, regionally and beyond, to attract more tourists.

Maximise

"We need to maximise on the historical sites, cultural events and utilise the increased hospitality facilities throughout the kingdom, grounded on our peace and stability.

"Our tourism vibrancy should appeal to a wide audience, including the young and old, so as to motivate tourists from all corners of the globe to stay for longer periods in the kingdom, thus spending more, contributing to our revenues.

Renewable energy for Eswatini's energy mix

THE Kingdom of Eswatini is exploring ways of producing renewable energy to reduce the country's overreliance on imported electricity.

This, according to ESERA Consumer and Stakeholder Manager Sikhumbuzo Nkambule, will be done through the Short term Generation Expansion Plan which prioritises solar and biomass technologies for generation of power and

the Energy Master Plan 2034, which is a long term plan that includes a mixture of wind, solar, hydro and thermal generation.

ESERA is the Eswatini Energy

Regulatory Authority.
Nkambule said: "Both plans have renewable energy technologies in them, hence the country is well on track to include renewable energy technologies in its energy mix".

In contrast, the country is not exploring the nuclear power route. In Africa, South Africa is the only country on the continent operating a nuclear power plant.

Nonetheless, in recent years, at least seven other sub-Saharan African states have signed agreements to deploy nuclear power with backing from Russia. Ugandan publication PML Daily reported that Uganda is in the final stages of efforts to start generating some 2000 megawatts of electricity from five nuclear plants it plans to build in five districts scattered in the country's four geographical regions.

In Eswatini, Nkambule said the current planning horizon, which runs up to 2034 do not include nuclear power as an

As if offering some kind of comfort, Nkambule added: "However, because the Energy Master Plan is a dynamic document that will be reviewed periodically, as technologies and the costs of implementing these generation technologies change, technologies included in the master plan are also likely to change to ensure that the most appropriate and most cost effective of these technologies for the Eswatini are implemented at the right time".

No word from Haiti's president as fear paralyses capital

PORT-AU-PRINCE - Sporadic gunfire echoed through the streets of Port-au-Prince on Monday as the government remained silent in the face of protests that have paralysed the Haitian capital and triggered rising violence.

The normally traffic-clogged streets were largely empty as schools, shops and municipal offices were shuttered for fear of more violence that has already left several people dead and an air of uncertainty hanging over the government of President Jovenel Moise.

Barricades have sprung up in some areas of the capital and other cities, as protesters have taken to the streets demanding the president step down over reports of mismanagement and possible embezzlement of development funds in the impoverished Caribbean nation.

After a quiet but tense start to the day, hundreds of youths from the capital's poorer quarters marched toward Petionville, the wealthiest neighbourhood in Port-au-Prince, throwing stones at houses until police opened fire with tear gas rounds to break up the march.

Police also thwarted an attempt to attack a bank during the demonstration, dragging away several blood-stained suspects and making five arrests.

Since the opposition organised widespread demonstrations last week to mark two years of Moise's presidency, smaller and more spontaneous protests have broken out in key urban centres.

US lawmakers announce deal on wall, shutdown

WASHINGTON - US lawmakers announced late on Monday an agreement in principle to avoid another government shutdown, with nearly US\$1.4 billion in money for construction of a wall on the border with Mexico, as President Donald Trump pushed his politically explosive crusade at a rally in the frontier city of El Paso.

That amount is far less than Trump has demanded. But if accepted, the deal would avert another chaotic stand-off in which Trump has threatened to cut budgets from swaths of government this

Senator Richard Shelby, a key Republican negotiator, told reporters an agreement in principle had been reached between Republican and Democratic lawmakers.

Senior congressional aides told AFP the agreement included US\$1.375 billion in funding for a wall on the US-Mexico border, a key campaign promise of Trump, who had demanded US\$5.7 billion for his pet project.

The agreed figure would fund approximately 55 miles (89 kilometres), all to be located in the Rio Grande Valley area of south Texas, the aides said.

The deal still faces White House approval. The news dropped just as Trump was about to climb the stage in the El Paso arena and the president, addressing a raucous crowd, said he did not

Pompeo seeks to woo Orban away from Russia, China

BUDAPEST - US Secretary of State Mike Pompeo voiced hope on Monday that renewed American engagement with Hungary's Viktor Orban would help steer the increasingly authoritarian leader away from Russian and Chinese influence.

But Hungary's foreign minister retorted that Budapest was tired of the West's "enormous hypocrisy".

Hungary, Russia's closest friend within the European Union, agreed with Pompeo to seek closer defence ties and cast itself as a natural ally for President Donald Trump's brand of nationalist pol-

Pompeo had dinner with Orban on the first visit in seven years by a US secre-

tary of state to Budapest, the first leg of his Central European tour.

The US top diplomat opened his trip by meeting representatives of Hungarian civil society groups, who praised Pompeo for the show of support as their ability to promote human rights and transparency is steadily curtailed.

Worries

Pompeo later told Orban's government that he would be upfront about concerns with Hungary and voiced worries about inroads of influence by both Russian President Vladimir Putin and China.

"We must not let Putin drive wedges between friends in NATO," Pompeo said. "An authoritarian Russia will never be a friend to the freedom and sovereignty of smaller nations."

N. Korea may have made more nuclear bombs

WASHINGTON - North Korea has continued to produce bomb fuel while in denuclearisation talks with the United States and may have produced enough in the past year to add as many as seven nuclear weapons to its arsenal, according to a study released just weeks before a planned second summit between the North Korean leader and U.S. President Donald Trump.

However, the country's freeze in nuclear and missile testing since 2017 mean that North Korea's weapons programme probably

poses less of a threat than it did at the end of that year, the report by Stanford University's Centre for International Security and Cooperation found.

Weapons

Siegfried Hecker, a former director of the US Los Alamos weapons laboratory in New Mexico who is now at Stanford and was one of the report's authors, told Reuters analysis of satellite imagery showed North Korea's production of bomb fuel continued in 2018.

US support for Saudis

WASHINGTON - The Trump administration threatened on Monday to veto an effort in the US Congress to end US military support for the Saudi Arabia-led coalition in the war in Yemen, continuing a stand-off with lawmakers over policy toward the kingdom. Demo-crats and Republicans re-introduced the war powers resolution two weeks ago as a way to send a strong message to Riyadh both about the humanitarian disaster in Yemen and condemn the killing of Saudi journalist Jamal Khashoggi.

Syrian forces in battle

WASHINGTON - Syrian fighters backed by artillery fire from a USled coalition battled a fierce jihadist counteroffensive as they pushed to retake a last morsel of territory from the Islamic State group in an assault lasting days.

A war monitor said a coalition air strike killed 16 civilians including seven children trying to flee the holdout on Monday, but the US-led alliance was not immediately available for comment.

Spain's divisions laid bare Opposition prepares protest Israel wants case dropped

MADRID - Twelve Catalan secessionist leaders went on trial in Spain's Supreme Court yesterday, charged for their role in a failed independence bid 16 months ago that deeply divided the country and triggered the biggest political crisis in decades. At around 0625 GMT, a convoy of two vans and police cars left the Soto del Real prison outside Madrid, where the leaders have been detained, heading toward the capital.

Hundreds of police, including from anti-terrorism units, have been deployed around the court building.

CARACAS - Venezuela's opposition announced on Monday a new collection centre for desperately-needed supplies as it prepares to "send a message" to the military that's blocking humanitarian aid from entering the crisis-wracked country with a mass street protest.

Opposition chief Juan Guaido, now recognized by 50 countries as Venezuela's interim president, led a rally yesterday as he steps up pressure on beleaguered President Nicolas Maduro and tries to force the military to back down and allow in the aid.

JERUSALEM - The Israeli justice ministry on Monday said the government has asked a Dutch court to dismiss war crimes allegations against Benny Gantz, an ex-military chief who is challenging Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu in April elections. A Dutch-Palestinian man originally from the Gaza Strip is suing Gantz and Israel's former air force chief, Amir Eshel, for their roles in an airstrike on his family's home that killed six relatives. The dead included a 72-year-old woman and a 12-year-old child.

Maimane told the media last Sunday: "We believe race is a proxy for disadvantage and an accurate reflection of who is still excluded from opportunity.


"The party has not decided to move away from race-based redress policies. However ,we unequivocally reject the ANC's version of redress which operates to enrich and reenrich the connected elite.

"Our offer is truly broad-based in that it seeks to break down the wall that exists been the haves and the have-nots."

He was at pains to point out that the DA's policy on BBBEE differed from the ANC in that it would seek to broaden economic participation, rather than benefit those connected to the ruling party.

"Give equity to employees, educate people, develop enterprise and ultimately broaden inclusion," he said, summarising the DA's position on empowerment.

IRR CEO Frans Cronjé said in his statement: "This past weekend, the DA's Federal Council determined to shut down any debate on empowerment, choosing instead to adopt the ANC's model of Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment (B-BBEE), and the mantra that 'race is a proxy for disadvantage' as a justification for its position. It was the decision of a party that has surrendered itself intellectually and morally to the ANC's grand hege-



monic hold over South African policy."

He disputed that race was a proxy for dis-

"There are many, particularly the rich ANC elite, who have abused B-BBEE in all its iterations for their own purposes, who are not disadvantaged, and who do not require state assistance to accrue capital. The same is increas-

ingly true of a burgeoning black middle class," he said.

"This is well-evidenced and statistically uncontroversial. Even if race was a proxy for disadvantage, the only reason not to use disadvantage itself is a public desire to pander to race. This is likely the hard truth of the DA's current position." News24

COSATU laments 'resurfacing of 1996 class project'

OHANNESBURG - COSATU in Jauteng has lamented what it terms the resurfacing of the 1996 class proect in the ANC government - a project the trade union federation thought it had defeated at the ANC Polokwane conference in 2007.

Gauteng COSATU Provincial Secretary Dumisani Dakile said the '1996 class project' was led by Finance Minister Tito Mboweni and former finance minister Trevor Manuel, who was last week appointed to chair a selection panel that will recruit a new head of the SA Revenue Service (SARS). Dakile said this was now accom-

panied by the re-emergence of a 'hegemonic right-wing' faction within the ANC. Defeated





Man looks like a skeleton with skin

MARGATE - A man claims his body is 'eating itself' due to a condition which makes him vomit every time he consumes food.

Lee Baker, of Margate, Kent, suffers from gastroparesis, which affects the normal movements of the muscles in the stomach, preventing it from emptying properly.

This has left the 45-year-old - who used to work as a chocolate salesman - unable to eat solid food for the past six years and looking like a 'skeleton with skin'.

Surviving on just four milkshakes a day, he is now severely malnourished, going from 17st 9lbs (114kg) two years ago to just 7st 8lbs (50kg) today.

After doctors warned he may be forced to have a feeding tube fitted, Baker is finally making 'good progress' after having a gastric pacemaker fitted to regulate the movement of his stomach.

Speaking of his condition, Mr Baker said: "My body doesn't stop me from physically eating anything solid.

"At the moment, if I put anything in my stomach or down my mouth, within a minute or two, five minutes at the latest, it's back as it went down, doesn't break up, doesn't do anything.

"My muscles now are being eaten away. My fat's already been eaten away by the disease, so they'll be nothing left of me.

"I can't walk very much anymore, so I find it hard to get upstairs. It's changed everything about every aspect of my life."

Baker - who is father to 11-year-old Grace and 10-year-old Kian - is so weak he is barely able to walk and regularly collapses from exhaustion.

His wife Alison said: "He's just a skeleton with skin on at the moment. It's heartbreaking.

"He's not so energetic, he can't do as much as he used to like to do.

'So it has been harder but he always tries to keep a smile on his face.'

Baker believes his gastroparesis was triggered by prescribed treatment for his sarcoidosis a rare condition that

causes small patches of red and swollen tissue in the internal organs.

After being diagnosed with sarcoidosis in 2009, Baker then developed type 2 diabetes around the time he started vomiting.

The father-of-two went without a gastroparesis diagnosis for four years and hit rock bottom.

"The darkest moments I've had with this - well the whole illness from the sarcoidosis down to diabetes and gastroparesis - I was told it was in my head and I was making it up,' Mr Baker said.

"I lost a lot of my dignity. My life was just falling apart."

It was not until his wife read an article about someone with similar symptoms to her husband that Mr Baker finally started to get answers.

The person was being treated by Dr Sri Kadirkamanathan, of Broomfield hospital in Chelmsford, Essex.

The couple contacted the medic who immediately diagnosed Lee with gastroparesis and advised he was fitted with a 'pacemaker', known as a gastric electrical stimulator (GES).

A GES sends mild electrical pulses to the nerves and smooth muscle of the lower stomach, easing nausea and vomiting in gastroparesis sufferers.

Two months after having the GES fitted, Mr Baker is still recovering but has been able to eat something for the first time in six years.

"The first thing I actually ate after the surgery was two slices of toast from the hospital and a peach yoghurt,' he said.

"Although the toast was probably the worst toast you've ever seen – it was the best tasting toast I've ever had.

"And since then it's just been going from strength-to-strength, I've been eating normally, no sickness, my diabetes is now gone as well, which is a bonus we [were] never told about.

Tve put on about 10 kilos (22lbs) in weight in the last two to three weeks. So we're making good leaps and good progress."

And after years of abstaining from food altogether, Baker is even starting to experiment with different cuisines.

"He's been trying foods that he's not eaten before, he's taken a liking to sushi – well it's something he can do on his own because I don't like that!," Mrs Baker said.

"It's small steps, but big strides and it's looking really good and I just can't believe it's finally, finally happened."

The surgery has had an impact on every aspect of Baker's life and given him hope for the future.

"It's given me a goal and a purpose to do something meaningful with my life,' he said.

MNANGAGWA LASHES **OUT AT UK'S STANCE**

ARARE - Zimbabwean President Emmerson Mnangagwa has for the first time reacted angrily to the UK government's position that Zimbabwe be barred from rejoining the Commonwealth.

The 76-year-old Mnangagwa said the view of a single member state, the UK, was not the view of the entire bloc of former British colonies.

The former colonial master also wants the European Union's foreign ministers at their meeting next week in Brussels, Belgium, to extend the sanctions against Zimbabwe and include more top officials from Mnangagwa's gov-

"As of today, the UK would not be able to support this application because we don't believe that the kinds of human rights violations that we are seeing from security forces in Zimbabwe are the kind of behaviour that you would expect to see from a Commonwealth country," said Baldwin.

The frosty relations with the UK mark a significant low point for Mnangagwa, who took over power in a military coup in November 2017 from former ruler Robert Mugabe.

For his first 15 months at the helm, Mnangagwa enjoyed a rare thaw in relations between Harare and London widely seen as crucial in convincing a largely sceptical international community to accept Zimbabwe back on to the global stage. Zimbabwe was last a member of the 53-member Commonwealth

He was last seen by the public when he attended a cabinet meeting together with Zimbabwe's President Emmerson Mnangagwa on February 5. Chiwenga's health issue has been confirmed as minor abdominal pain.

Zimbabwe's Deputy Minister of Information, Publicity and Broadcasting Energy Mutodi disclosed this information on Twitter last Sunday.

He wrote: "The Hon. Vice President CDN Chiwenga is recovering well from some minor abdominal ailment in Delhi, India."

The medical trip to India was first reported on ZimLive.com, where it stated that Chiwenga also travelled to South Africa for treatment last

This medical trip was cut short and he was flown back to Zimbabwe following political protests.

ZimLive.com previously reported that Chiwenga in 2017 claimed that he has been poisoned, during a military coup ousting then-president Robert Mugabe.

A presidential spokesperson, however, verified that Chiwenga was 'exhausted' after his many years of continuous work, and that he 'had a bullet lodged in his lungs from the war period' 40 years prior.

Ivorian president on Gbagbo's ICC acquittal

Someone must account -

IVORY COAST - Ivory Coast's President Alassane Ouattara says justice must be served to the victims of the 2010 post-election violence, following the acquittal of ex-president Laurent Gbagbo by the International Criminal Court.

Outtara told Radio France International, on the sidelines of the African Union Summit in Addis Ababa, that his comments on the acquittal have to be reserved, since 'it's an ongoing trial'.

But he added: "Someone must be responsible for the 3 000 deaths. I hope that justice will shine a light on that, it is what the victims are asking for."

ICC judges acquitted Gbagbo and his aide Charles Ble Goude on charges stemming from a wave of violence after disputed elections in the west African nation in 2010.

More than 300 people died on both sides of the Ivory Coast conflict after Gbagbo refused to concede defeat to Ouattara, his inter-

nationally backed rival.

Gbagbo, the first former head of state to stand trial at the ICC, is currently living in Belgium under conditions pending a possible prosecution appeal following the acquittal on January 15.

He had been held in the Netherlands since 2011. The ICC's unwillingness to let Gbagbo return to Ivory Coast is thought to have been linked to the country's refusal to surrender Gbagbo's first wife, Simone, despite an outstanding ICC warrant for her arrest for her role in the post-election violence. AFP

East Libyan forces say they have full control of El Sharara oilfield

BENGHAZI - Eastern Libyan military forces have full control of Libya's biggest oilfield, El Sharara, a spokesman said, in a challenge to the internationally recognised government in Tripoli.

There was no immediate confirmation or comment from state oil firm NOC which operates with foreign partners the 315 000 barrels-per-day (bpd) field deep in Libya's southern desert.

LNA (the Libyan National Army) based in eastern Libya began an offensive in the south last month to fight militants and secure oilfields.

Last Wednesday, the LNA reached a remote pumping station of El Sharara, but had until now not moved on the main field, which a force of state guards and

tribesmen seized in December demanding funds. Production stopped then.

"Peacefully with no resistance LNA has full control over Sharara oilfield with all its facilities," the LNA spokesman said on Twitter, adding the facility was being

Hours earlier, the LNA's chief of staff, Abdel-Razeq Nathouri, told Reuters the soldiers were negotiating access to the field. The internationally recognized government in Tripoli had tried sending its

own commander, Ali Kennah, to secure the field. El Sharara had formally belonged to the Tripoli administration which in reality had been unable to exercise control.

Kennah had flown on the weekend to the nearby El Feel oilfield and later made it to El Sharara, but failed to take control of it, oil workers have said.

Oil production in Libya, a member of the Organization of the Petroleum Exporting Countries, has been disrupted since conflict broke out in 2011, with protesters and armed groups often targeting oilfields and energy infrastructure.

National production stands at under 1 million bpd, well below pre-2011 capacity of 1.6 million bpd.

Belgium needs to apologise

KINSHASA - UN experts say that racial discrimination 'is endemic' in Belgium's institutions and that the nation needs to apologise for crimes committed during its colonisation of Congo. The UN Working Group of Experts on People of African Descent said on Monday in an interim report on Belgium that 'the root causes of present day human rights violations lie in the lack of recognition of the true scope of violence and injustice of colonisation.' King Leopold's reign over Congo from 1885 to 1908 was notorious for its brutality. Congo gained independence from Belgium in 1960.

Egypt parliament to vote

CAIRO - Egypt's parliament has rescheduled for this week its vote on proposed changes to the constitution that would allow President Abdel-Fattah el-Sissi to stay in office well beyond his current term, which ends in 2022. Parliament spokesman Ahmed Saad el-Din said last Sunday that the legislature would hold the crucial vote today, instead of a scheduled meeting on February 17. The 596-seat assembly had given its preliminary approval to the changes last week. The motion is near-certain to be overwhelmingly approved by the legislature, which is packed with el-Sissi's supporters, but the amendments would also need to be put to a national referendum to become law. AP

LONDON - The Zambian embassy in London has strongly denied an allegation in a report by the UK Sunday Times that President Edgar Lungu tried to kill his political opponent, opposition leader Hakainde Hichilema. Hichilema said he was holding a rally last Friday in Sesheke, south-west Zambia, when police and activists from the ruling Patriotic Front opened fire, the Lusaka Times reported vesterday. The Sunday Times said it had obtained video showing terrified men and women cowering behind vehicles and fleeing through the bush amid the crack of automatic gunfire.

SADC backs Mnangagwa

HARARE - The Southern African Development Community (SADC) on Monday weighed in with support for Zimbabwean President Emmerson Mnangagwa. The support by SADC for Mnangagwa, political observers said, was likely to anger the opposition Movement for Democratic Change (MDC), which had been hopeful of the censure of Mnangagwa by the regional bloc. The 76-year-old president has been under pressure, especially from human rights groups and from sections of the international community, ever since the army was deployed last month, to quell protests. 



Lloris urges Spurs fans to get behind their team

LONDON - Tottenham goalkeeper Hugo Lloris has called on supporters to rally behind the team ahead of tonight's Champions League knockout tie against Borussia Dortmund.

The captain's call to arms comes amid slumping attendances at Wembley. The recent home game against Watford saw less than 30 000 turn up as supporters become disgruntled with the delayed move to the new White Hart

The attendance in the 3-1 victory over Leicester was back up beyond 44 000 but over 82 000 attended when Tottenham hosted Barcelona in the Champions League earlier in the season.

Lloris said: "We need the stadium to push, to help us. In some days it's difficult to deal with Wembley but hopefully in this big game we'll receive this help from the crowd."

In the Premier League, Tottenham remain within five points of Liverpool and Manchester City after beating Leicester. Lloris made a string of excellent stops including a penalty save when Jamie Vardy took the kick with his first touch as a substitute.

Lloris said: "I know him a little more than other players. He usually shoots strong and he can go everywhere (in

the goal). But on his first touch? You need intuition and a bit of luck (to save it)."

Lloris also warned Spurs must produce a better performance against Dortmund after Leicester had 20 shots on goal.

The Frenchman added: "Leicester played in a fantastic way and I think we won the game thanks to our spirit and character. Without that, we could not win this game.

"I think we need to improve the team performance. We won but against a bigger side we couldn't have won that type of game. It's up to us.

The mentality is great in the changing room and we showed that again on a difficult day."



Arsenal's Ramsey joins Juventus

LONDON - Aaron Ramsey will join Juventus this summer on a free transfer from Arsenal, after signing a four-year deal with the Italian champions.

The Wales international has agreed a pre-contract deal to join on July 1 when his Arsenal deal expires at the end of the season. He will eam £325 000 a week, according to Sky sources.

The 28-year-old had been in talks with the Gunners over a new deal for several months, but the club withdrew their offer in October, leaving the midfielder free to discuss a move away from north London.

In a post on social media, Ramsey said his decision to end his 11-year stay at Arsenal was made with a 'heavy heart'.

Last month, Arsenal head coach Unai Emery suggested funds were tight at the Emirates Stadium when he admitted they were only able to sign players on loan in the transfer window.

In the last 13 months, Arsenal have signed Pierre-Emerick Aubameyang, Bernd Leno, Sokratis Papastathopoulos and Lucas Torreira for a combined total of over £100m, but only signed Denis Suarez on loan from Barcelona in January. Sky Sports

Benitez blames Dubravka for Wolves' last-gasp equaliser

LONDON - Rafael Benitez felt Martin Dubravka was partly to blame for Wolves' dramatic late equaliser against Newcastle United on Monday.

Benitez's side looked to be heading for victory at Molineux thanks to an Isaac Hayden strike, but Nuno Espirito Santo's side levelled in the fifth minute of injury time through Willy

The centre-back jumped with Dubravka to meet Adama Traore's looping cross and headedhome after the Newcastle goalkeeper failed to catch the ball, with referee Graham Scott deciding no foul had been committed. Benitez looked furious on the touchline and confronted the officials after the final whistle but, speaking afterwards, he felt Newcastle's defending and Dubravka's failure to punch the cross clear were the more significant problems. "Everybody knew we had the three points and it was really disappointing to concede the way we conceded," he told Sky Sports.

It won't be easy - Owen

LONDON - Michael Owen believes the calibre of Liverpool's front three will make it difficult for the Reds to recruit a world-class forward this summer.

The former Kop favourite is backing his old club to hold their nerve in the Premier League title race, and says the form of Mohamed Salah, Roberto Firmino and Sadio Mane will be key if they are to hold off the challenge of Manchester City.

That trio have managed 44 goals in all competitions this season, adding to the remarkable total of 91 from last term.

But, with Dominic Solanke having joined Bournemouth last month, with Daniel Sturridge out of contract at the end of the season and with Divock Origi likely to be sold too, there is a clear need for Jurgen Klopp to strengthen his forward options in the summer.

Teenager Rhian Brewster is highly rated, but has missed more than a year due to a serious knee injury while Harry Wilson, impressive on loan at Derby this season, has had only one first-team appearance for the Reds.

Owen, though, says it will be tough for Klopp to sign a genuine toplevel striker, despite the obvious attraction of playing in a team such as Liverpool.

"It is so much easier if you're a scout or you're in the recruitment

Antonio demands harsher punishments for racism in football

LONDON - West Ham forward Michail Antonio has demanded points deductions and stadium closures for any team whose fans are involved in racist incidents.

Antonio's calls come after Liverpool forward Mohamed Salah received alleged racist abuse from West Ham fans in the 1-1 draw at the London Stadium this month.

The incident followed Manchester City forward Raheem Sterling allegedly being racially abused by fans at Chelsea in December 2018.

In the same month, Arsenal striker Pierre-Emerick Aubameyang had a banana skin thrown at him during the north London derby which resulted in a Tottenham fan being banned from football for four years and fined.

Antonio told Sky Sports News: "Finding an individual does nothing. That one person, okay, he gets banned for life but to be honest no one has a picture of his face. He can get back into the stadium. If you affect their team - these fans love their team - the fans, his friends, are going to turn on him. If you start playing games behind closed doors and deducting points, then the problem is inside themselves. They are going to deal with it themselves."

A Sky Data Poll for Sky Sports News revealed on Monday that 86 per cent of football fans who regularly attend matches in the UK have witnessed a racist incident, with that figure rising to 93 per cent for Black, Asian and Minority Ethnic supporters. Sky Sports

The fee remains a record for a Spanish teenager to this day, and few would dispute that he has been worth the investment.

World number one Osaka in shock split with coach

TOKYO - World tennis number one Naomi Osaka has split from her coach, Sascha Bajin, just 17 days after completing back-to-back Grand Slam victories at the Australian Open.

"Hey everyone, I will no longer be working together with Sascha. I thank him for his work and wish him all the best in the future," the 21-year-old Japanese tweeted in a shock announcement.

Bajin, a former hitting partner to Serena Williams, responded: "Thank you Naomi. I wish you nothing but the best as well. What a ride that was.

"Thank you for letting me be part of this."

Osaka, who became the first Asian to hold the top ranking after beating Czech Petra Kvitova in the Melbourne final on January 26, had worked with the German for just over a year.


No reason was given for the surprise decision to part ways, but Japanese media cited Osaka's management company IMG in reporting that there had been a breakdown in the player's relationship with the coach since the start of the year.

According to Japan's Nikkan Sports, some practice sessions with Bajin at the Australian Open lasted just 10 minutes and she sometimes hit without him being present.

Osaka, who is scheduled to compete in Dubai next week, began sounding out potential replacements late last year, local media reported.

The Japanese player captured her first Grand Slam crown by stunning Williams at last year's US Open in a final remembered as much for the American's astonishing rant at the chair umpire following a coaching violation.

Based in the United States, Osaka linked up with Bajin in late 2017 and enjoyed a breakthrough year, shooting from 72 in the world to the top of the women's rankings. *AFP*



Swazi internationals need to work on fitness - Siza





Take us to Africa, Birds urge Nyanga

SOCCER - MBABANE Swallows' management has urged new coach Nyanga 'Crooks' Hlophe to qualify the team for CAF competitions

Hlophe was officially unveiled as the new Swallows head coach at the Prince of Wales Sports Ground yesterday. He was introduced to the team's players by Swallows' General Manager Sandile 'Beyond 2000' Zwane.

Zwane said the team was now established as an African team, and needed to qualify for CAF competitions at all costs, even if it meant winning all their remaining matches.

Zwane maintained that Hlophe was part of the Swallows family as he had been with the team on many occasions before. He said they wanted someone who was accustomed to the culture of the team at the helm, and the decision to hire Nyanga had been unanimous.

Zwane further announced that Hlophe will be assisted in his duties by Musa Manyatsi and Etienne Massoye. "People will also recall that the former coach (Koki Vilakati) held the position

of manager as well. This time we have decided that our new manager will be Banele Cindzi," he said.
