MINISTRY ISSUES STERN WARNING ON STRIK

WOE unto all civil servants who will attend the planned mass action on September 25, which is in two weeks time.

Leading to this day, where workers have declared that they will strike and march to Mbabane to deliver petitions calling for the payment of the Cost of Living Adjustment, otherwise known as CoLA, Public Service Principal Secretary Sipho Tsabedze has issued a stern warning to all public servants who will not report at work on the announced

dates by the Public Sector Associations (PSAs).

The PSAs have announced that starting today and on the 17th, 23rd and 24th they will be staging activations to sensitise workers about their planned strike action.

Dates

Tsabedze speaking in an interview stated that the dates announced by the Public Sector Associations are official working days.

"All civil servants are expected to be at work on the dates they have announced including the 25th September," he said.

He added that drastic measures will be taken against all public servants who will absent themselves from work.

Tsabedze said any one who plans to join the said activations should seek permission to be off work from their supervisors.

The Swaziland National Association of Government Accounting Personnel (SNAGAP), Swaziland National Association of Teachers (SNAT), National Public Service Allied Workers Union (NAPSAWU) and Swaziland Democratic Nurses Union (SWADNU) all make up the PSAs.

However, SWADNU will not participate in the planned strike action because they are classified as an essential service.

According to SNAGAP General Secretary Dumsile Dlamini she described the upcoming strike as lawful.

Strike

Dlamini said this comes after the court upheld their rights to strike in its July 29th judgment. Workers are demanding a 7.85 per cent Cost of Living Adjustment (CoLA).

Building up to the big day the National Public Service Allied Workers Union (NAPSAWU) Secretary General Thulani Hlatshwako said they have been visiting branches in the regions throughout the country mobilising their members towards the strike.

...All systems ready for big march - PSAs

PSAs are not backing down despite government stern warnings.

The Public Sector Associations of Swaziland are ready to fight tooth and nail for the 7.85 per cent Cost of Living Adjustment.

SNAT General Secretary Sikelela Dlamini called up all civil servants to take part in the huge march set to take place on September 25.

Building up to the main day, Dlamini said on September 17 and 23 protest marches would be held in all four regions of the country.

He said on the 20th September they will hold a mass meeting for all civil servants at the SNAT Centre in Manzini.

Dlamini added that on September 24 a night vigil shall be staged at SNAT Centre in preparation for the big day.

The last time public servants had a salary adjustment was in 2016 which was popularly known as dvuladvula.

The PSAs call for CoLA has been a battle with government since last year.

A planned strike action in January this year was declared illegal by government, hence the matter went to court, to which in July 29 a ruling delivered by Industrial Court Judge President Sifiso Nsibandze that the strike was legal so long as proper procedures were followed, hence the planned action in two weeks time.

TSC to fill vacant posts

IN what is likely to come as a relief and joy to those in the teaching profession, government has since given the Teaching Service Commission (TSC) the green light to fill-up vacant posts in schools which have been created by teachers who have left, dead or retired.

It was explained that with some teachers having taken retirement and others having left the profession for various reasons, this has necessitated government to allow the TSC to fill up the posts. Government led by Prime Minister Ambrose Dlamini resolved shelving of hiring and filling up of posts in the public sector until the economy which has taken a nosedive improves. Freezing of hiring and filling up of posts within some of the government departments and institutions being led to some areas operations has greatly affected.

The ministry of education was not

spared when the decision was taken as some of the schools have been without teachers for sometime now.

However, in a gathering yesterday at Joppa Primary School, TSC Executive Secretary Ncamsile Mtshali announced that as an employment agency for the ministry of education, they have been now given the go ahead to fill up the posts in schools created during the course of the

This is where a TSC team headed by its Chairman Simanga Mamba attended a get together for the Alliance Church schools.

The TSC boss was a guest of honour in the event which was combined with the farewell function of retiring teachers.

The Alliance Church has a total of 13 schools around the Kingdom, 11 are primary schools and two are high schools while one is a tertiary.

Mtshali said the decision was a relief not just to the schools but even to the commission as a heavy burden had been removed from its



shoulders.

She said the TSC was fully aware of the challenges in schools caused by the freezing of posts which, however, was understandably necessitated by the ailing country's econ-

"We are now in the process of seeing to it that affected schools get teachers. We are thankful to government for seeing the necessity to review its position as per the circular which froze hiring," an said Mtshali, a statement that led to unbelievable thunderous applause from the crowd

TSC boss Simanga Mamba said the posts that the commission would fill were only those created by departure of teachers during the period of the second and third term. He said it was not like government had allowed the commission to start a full scale hiring process.

"What government has done is allow us to identify posts that need to be filled in schools. We call this

"We are replacing teachers who have retired and we do this with the permission endorsed by Cabinet," said Mamba.

Govt owes KISS E300m for ICCFISH

GOVERNMENT is owing the KISS Joint Venture contractors who are constructing the five star hotel and convention centre in Ezulwini over E300 million.

This transpired yesterday when Members of Parliament (MPs) who are members of the ministry of economic planning and development's portfolio committee toured the multi-billion project yesterday in Ezulwini.

The MP wanted to see what exactly was needed to finish the project.

The project is known as the International Convention Centre and Five Star Hotel (ICC-

The money owed on the side of the FISH is said to be E116 784 413.91 and on the side of the ICC, an amount of E279 197 220.05.

This brings the total amount of the owed money to E395 981 633.96.

The MPs were informed that the project needed more money to be finished and government was in the process of drafting a Loan Bill that would ensure that money was raised to finance the project.

An amount of USD 83 million is needed by government to continue with the project. At the time of writing this report yesterday, this amount of money was equivalent to just over E1.2 billion (E1 214 290 000 to be exact).

Dvokodvweni MP Mduduzi Magagula said the situation was not so good at the site because the contractors were owed.

The contractors working at the site include Kukhanya Civil Engineers, Inyatsi Construction, and Stefanutti Stocks and the team of the contractors is known as the KISS Joint Venture.

Income

Magagula, who is the chairperson of the portfolio committee, said the joint venture was now affected because it was not receiving any income, yet it was expected to deliver the required results. The situation, according to Magagula, was not favourable to the workers working on the project and government needed money to ensure the conclusion of the project.

The Dvokodvweni MP stated that on the ICC side, the money used by the contractors was E1 134 893 152.05 yet the money received on this project was E855 695 932. On the FISH side, Magagula said the money spent by the contractors amounted to E1 144 409 658.38 yet the amount paid to date was E1 027 625

The MP said the officials from the economic planning ministry also informed them that the operator to operate the building had also not been found as government was still in the process of finding one.

Magagula pleaded with the nation to support this project because it was supposed to be finished.

He said leaving the project half way would not benefit the nation and if things went his way, Parliament would pass the Loan Bill for the project to proceed.

With the deadline to sign re-admission forms today...

STUDENTS DIVIDED

... "For us as students it is not easy to give up on all our rights and hand them over to management"

THE country's tertiary institutions students remain divided over the ultimatum given by their administrations to sign and submit re-admission forms before the end of today.

Some appeared keen to sign the forms whilst others are still not happy, hence the University of Eswatini students will have a meeting today to decide on the matter. It was the same case at Limkokwing University of Creative Technology (LUCT) in Mbabane yesterday when some students went to resume classes, whilst others convened at the university gates.

LUCT Student Representative Council (SRC) President Sibusiso Mathebula said they were gathered at the gate hoping that management would call them inside so they could have a dialogue.

He said all they wanted was a chance to explain to management what they as students wanted, as they felt they were being victimised and intimidated by the declaration to sign peace forms. He said they felt the forms were forcing them into compromising the quality of their education.

"For us as students it is not easy to give up on all our rights and hand them over to management," he said.

Mathebula added this made the students feel they would no longer be able to express their grievances.

He said in the institution, normally they had a number of problems they faced every semester such as no Wi-Fi and lack of machinery that was operational in labs which also affected their education.

On the same note, he said at the moment there was some division as some students had already signed the forms yet others had not

"What we have gathered is that those who have decided to sign the forms want to carry on attending classes as that would affect their education. However, our concernshave not been attended to and we have been waiting here since morning for management to engage us so we can say our piece," he said.

our piece, he said.

He added management was not interested in giving them a chance but expecting them to just show up and sign the forms.

The other main concern that has not been fully resolved is the distribution of the allowances by government.

He said they were worried government would not honour the promise of distributing allowances on time.

"The scenario we envisage is that if we agree to the proposed method, what would happen to us if government does not honour the agreement when we have already signed the forms? Where does that put us as we would no longer be able to express our concerns and grievances," he stated.

Calendar

Mathebula mentioned the other issue they were facing was with regards to the semester calendar as of now they were expected to be in week seven. They were

worried about signing the form without management informing them on how they would make up for the lost time.

UNESWA Mbabane campus students also expressed the same sentiments. At first glance, one would have assumed all was well as the students were seen calmly going about their business.

However, upon enquiries, the students revealed they were neither happy nor comfortable with the manner in which their grievances were handled by relevant authorities.


Mbabane Campus Student Representative Council Secretary Lungelo Mthethwa said they would not be happy until they received their allowances from government.

He mentioned that as much as they wanted to get back to class, they were doing so under unfavourable conditions as they had no idea when they would receive their allowances.

He said as much as they appreciated the efforts made by government in increasing their allowances, they were still concerned with whether government would be able to honour their stance. On the issue of the university banning night meetings or gatherings by the students, Mthethwa said the abolishing of night meetings was suggested by them as the SRC.

He stated that they were also of the idea that conducting meetings at night put the safety of the students at risk as it allowed people who were not even students to join them.

"As the SRC, we are totally against vandalism and we suggested that meetings should be held during daytime hours to ensure the safety of the students. Sometimes

people who are not students attended the meetings and sometimes insinuated the vandalism under the auspice that they were students while they were not," he said.

He also mentioned they welcomed the initiative by the university authorities as it promoted the safety of the students. He also suggested they would appreciate if the joint meeting dates were included in the almanac (unitimetioned they would appreciate if the joint meeting dates

so they would be able to know when meetings were scheduled and be conducted during the day-

At Kwaluseni Campus almost all students had signed the form out of fear that they might be expelled.

"'We will sign but there is no guarantee that we will not protest again."

This was a response by the University of Eswatini's Student Representative Council (SRC) Chairperson Sakhile Mndzebele when asked how the students reacted towards the re-admission form signing. The SRC chairperson stated that the government-sponsored students were about 53 per cent while the self-sponsored ones were at 47 per cent.

Here, he said the self-sponsored students were of the view that they had nothing to do with the protests by their colleagues hence they signed the forms without a problem.

On the other hand, some of the government sponsored learners are said to have had challenges comprehending the stated consequences because they claimed that it somehow dispossessed them their rights.

For instance, Mndzebele said although they would sign the form because they were under duress, but there was no guarantee that they would not participate in protest actions because it was the last resort that students had when their grievances were not

addressed by the relevant authorities.

He was adamant that even groups that are still to enrol with the institution would inevitably engage in protest actions so signing the readmission form might not be a barrier for them.

Further, Mndzebele said other students had since panicked since they thought refusing to sign would end with government in revoking their scholarships.

However, amid the mixed emotions towards the form signing, Mndzebele said the SRC was prepared to convene a students' meeting where the repercussions of signing the forms would be discussed.

"We're still waiting for the students to sign the petition so that we can lawful-

ly convene the meeting to discuss this matter," Mndzebele said.


When the UNESWA Registrar Dr Salebona Simelane was asked on how the students reacted to the process, he said it was still too early to tell since the students were given until today to sign and return the forms.

"We can only do a proper assessment after the deadline which is tomorrow. We hope that they will all sign and further adhere to the conditions stated in the re-admission forms," he said.

Dr Simelane further confirmed that classes had resumed yesterday and that there were no disruptions.

MAN SENTENCED TO 15 YEARS, NO FINE FOR RAPING WOMA

A young man's promising future has come crashing down after he was sentenced to 15 years in prison for raping a 47-year old woman without her consent.

Madoda Bhembe (26) will be 41 years old by the time he is released from prison, after the court convicted and found him guilty for having committed the offence of rape.

According to the survivor's account, Patience* arrived at a local drinking spot with the hope of utilising its Mobile Money services.

"When I arrived, I found that Bhembe was drinking at the bar. When I approached the Mobile Money agent, Bhembe initiated a conversation with me and offering to buy me an alcoholic beverage.

I refused, as it was not my intention to stay at the bar for long. I refused politely and left, not suspecting that Bhembe would be following me," Patience stated.

After she had walked for a distance, Patience felt a man's hands grab her from behind and when she turned around, she was shocked to see that it was Bhembe, who she immediately recognised as the man who offered to buy her alcoholic beverages at the shebeen.

Bhembe was then said to have used force, while threatening her and further dragged her to his house, where he was said to have raped her,

Patience's swom statement revealed that Bhembe had unlawful sexual intercourse with her twice, without her consent. She also stated that Bhembe did not utilise a condom for both instances of forced intercourse.

After he was done raping her, Patience was said to have escaped from Bhembe's house and preceded to her own home. She was then said to have spent the night, and only informed another party of her ordeal on the next day, when her colleague at work noticed that she looked like she had been crying

Revealed

That was when Patience revealed what had befallen her on the previous day, prompting her colleague to encourage her to report the matter to the police station.

According to his charge sheet, Bhembe was said to have, on August 11, 2019 at Lobamba area, had unlawful sexual intercourse with Patience* twice, without consent and without the use of a condom.

The aggravating factors accompanied by Bhembe's offence state that he was said to have committed the offence without the use of a condom, thus exposing the survivor to the risk of contracting sexually transmitted infections (STIs) and HIV and AIDS.

Secondly, an additional factor stated that Bhembe committed the offence by using threats and force

to induce his victim to have sexual intercourse with him.

During his mitigation for a lesser sentence, Bhembe pleaded with the court to consider the fact that he was still a young man who had a promising future ahead of him.

Choices

"Life behind bars has made me evaluate my life and choices. I have a better understanding of right and wrong, and I take full responsibility of the events that took place when I committed the offence. I have since changed my lifestyle, after having accepted Jesus Christ as my Lord and Saviour. I am a born again Christian and I intend to live my life that way, from now onwards," Bhembe pleaded.

Before passing her sentence, Principal Magistrate Fikile Nhlabatsi informed Bhembe of the factors which led her to his sentence

"Crimes of this nature strip the victim, whether male or female, of their dignity and they suffer great humiliation from them.

With the increase of these crimes reflected in the media on a daily basis, it is important that the courts make an example of those who commit them, to deter those who even think of committing them. It is the court's duty to ensure that justice is served, and that the victims have peace in the way that their cases are handled.

These sentences need to be harsher so that offenders think twice before committing such offences," the principal magistrate stated.

After which, Principal Magistrate Nhlabatsi found Bhembe guilty of having committed the offence, and further sentenced him to serve 15 years in a correctional facility, without the option of a fine.

E4.7bn collection deceptive - Minister

THE E4.7 billion that was collected by government during the first quarter of this financial year can be deceptive.

This transpired when Minister of Finance Neal Rijkenberg responded to questions on the future collections of government's revenue.

Deputy Senate President Ndumiso Mdluli asked the minister to state if it was correct to assume that government could collect E18.8 billion or more this financial year. Mdluli posed this question during the debate of the first quarter performance of the ministry of finance.

The debate was done by senators who are members of the ministry of finance's portfolio committee in the House of Assembly recently. The minister could not give an answer back then, but promised to give a written response.

In his written response, Rijkenberg gave a pic ture of a situation whereby government could not be able to collect the amount of money which Mdluli enquired about.

Mdluli asked such a question because the ministry had reported that during the first quarter of this year (which runs from April to June, 2019), the government was able to collect E4.7 billion.

This gave the impression that government could potentially collect E4.7 billion or more in each of the four quarters of the current finan-

Mdluli asked the minister to tell him if he was right to think that the country could make E18.8 billion or more this year. "Based on the revenue collection in the first quarter, can it be sustained for the next three quarters of the financial year 2019/20?" Mdluli enquired.

Rijkenberg responded by saying the total revenue amounting to E4.7 billion collected in the first quarter was attributed to an over-performance by the value added tax (VAT), company taxes, and other income taxes. The higher performance, according to the minster, was due to provisional payments made by some large taxpayers.

"However, such payments will not be made in the second quarter and that might cause a decrease in the second quarter's revenue collection," Rijkenberg said.

The minister stated that there had been a 37 per cent decline in debt recoveries to date, and that could have a negative impact on the revenue collection.

Currently, the country mainly collects its revenue from the Southern African Customs Union (SACU) and from domestic taxes like pay as you earn (PAYE), corporate taxes, and consumption taxes like the VAT.

However, the country's heavy reliance on SACU has come under scrutiny in the previous years, with economists and others stating that such reliance could not be healthy for the country's economy, more especially because free import and export of products is now encour-

The lawyers will be hosting the oneday workshop today at Royal Swazi Spa, starting at 8:30am. The workshop is expected to help the lawyers understand the contents of the SODV Act, in order to improve on their work as far as the Act is concerned.

LSS Secretary Thulani Maseko said the LSS found that it was important for the lawyers to have a workshop about the SODV Act. He said lawyers dealt with all aspects of the law and it was important for them to understand the contents of this law.

Maseko further said some lawyers in the country dealt with family and criminal law, hence it was important for them to understand what this Act was all about.

Lawyers who deal with family and criminal law were the ones that had to acquaint themselves with the contents of the Act.

The Swaziland Action Group Against Abuse (SWAGAA) is one organisation that is passionate about getting people to learn about what the SODV Act is all about.

The organisation has been concerned about the rate at which sexual offences and violence had been occurring in the

SWAGAA Communications and

Advocacy Officer Silindele Nkosi-Nxumalo said what was done by the lawyers was very important and needed to be encouraged. "Such initiatives are encouraged by the organisation because lawyers are the backbone of legal issues," Nkosi said.

She further stated that with the lawyers' full understanding of the SODV Act, cases of gender-based violence and abuse would be comprehensively dealt with.

The workshop, according to Nkosi, would assist in attaining one of the Act's main objectives, which was to adequately deal with sexual and domestic offences.

Nkosi said for a very long time, the local justice system had overlooked the fact that men and boys were also victims of gender-based violence and this was very unfair.

Over 50 graves a sorry sight at Manzini Cemetery

DOZENS of collapsed graves at the Manzini Golf Course Cemetery are a sorry sight.

Some of the over 50 out of 8 500 graves are said to have been neglected by their owners for a long time yet they have been weather-beaten.

Information sourced from concerned citizens was to the effect that the people responsible for the graves had last been at the site after burial, which was years ago since the utilisation of the site for new burials was stopped in 2009.

It is said some of the neglected graves have their concrete top parts plummeted as a result of poor enactment. This was confirmed by the Manzini Municipal Council's Public Relations officer Mathokoza Thwala when sought for comment on the matter.

Thwala said the council had also received the reports about the malformed graves at the cemetery and that it was a cause for concern. He said it was for this reason that an assessment was then undertaken by the responsible department form the council.

Collapsed

This, he said, yielded that the Manzini Golf Course cemetery was not the only gravesite to have collapsed graves, as others at different sites in Ngwane Park have suffered the same fate.

When asked what might have resulted to the current state of the graves, Thwala said rains greatly contributed while also poor construction skills of tombs could not be ruled out.

In addition, Thwala said the fact that most people neglected their relatives' graves soon after burials was another cause that has resulted to the graves being in that state. In this regard, the council's mouthpiece said some people neglected the graves because they thought that the council was responsible for taking care of them when it was actually not the case.

Thwala said the council's parks, gardens and cemetery department could only maintain the site by clearing overgrown vegetation and ensuring that the sites were clean.

'When it comes to the graves' maintenance and repairing, the council is not in any way responsible because we cannot interfere or even touch the graves. As Emaswati, we've known this to be a personal matter that families needed to attend to the best way they know how,"

He then urged relatives of people that are buried in these cemeteries to visit their loved ones and see to it that their graves are in good shape.

To ensure that the graves don't collapse again after being rehabilitated, Thwala advised the members of the public to ensure that they engaged skilled builders for preparation of their loved one's graves as it is not average who is skilled to prepare a grave, especially where the grave will be lined with a brick wall and a tombstone placed.

Unskilled

The PRO said the engagement of unskilled labour during funerals is one of the contributors to the obtaining situation in the cemeteries.

For those who would want to enact tombstones, Thwala said they should first compress the soil and wait for about three weeks before the tombstone could be placed.

He said tombstones were important in that they helped in easily identifying a grave since it would have a burial number on it.

For the graves that currently do not have tombstones, Thwala emphasised that relatives who would want to enact some, may first apply with the council to ensure that the grave they want to install the tombstone on, is the right one and that they do it the proper way.

Furthermore, Thwala mentioned that double burials were permitted at the Manzini cemeteries. He explained that double burial is when two corpses are buried in one grave. Here, Thwala said the bones of the corpse that would have been buried earlier would be removed from the grave and the pit be extended by 300 metres more before the older bones could be replaced. A 30 centimetre slab would be constructed before the new corpse could be buried on top.

She said through the 5G network, it was possible to connect motor vehicles as well as electrical appliances in households. "This is what we call the internet of things,"

She said in terms of timelines, it was tricky to state exactly when this could be attainable without having a spectrum that allowed for the introduction of the service.

She said during the course of next year, if the spectrum would be available, the company would then begin considering introducing the service. For now, it is still early to provide the service since the company was still in the process of securing the spectrum.

She said a spectrum basically was waves that enabled connection between communication devices; she stated they could be considered as the road that enabled communication between individuals. She mentioned the spectrums differed depending on the technology in use.

She said the spectrum used for 2G was different to that used for 3G and sometimes the spectrum could be the same. She said basically a spectrum was an enabler that allowed customers to connect with one another.



SA commits to end xenophobic attacks

GOVERNMENT has teamed up with the government of South Africa to address the on-going xenophobic attacks in South Africa.

The aim of the meeting was for the Heads of Mission to be briefed by South Africa's Minister of International Relations and Cooperation Naledi Pandor.

During the meeting, Pandor expressed concern about the xenophobic attacks currently going on in South Africa.

She assured the Diplomatic Corps that they were working as a team to find lasting solutions to the prob-

The minister further stated that it was now evident that these actions were as a result of a deep-rooted anger expressed by the citizens who felt that their government had failed to address their socio-economic

During the meeting, the government informed the Diplomatic Corps that police and other law enforcement agencies had been

strategically placed to monitor and deal with the spate of what had turned out to be xenophobic attacks. Of note was that some of the perpetrators of the xenophobic attacks were arrested by the South African

The minister pleaded with respective missions to request their governments to engage their citizens in an effort to prevent retaliation towards South Africans residing in their countries.

Revive human rights commission - Senators

THE ministry of justice and constitutional affairs has been asked to prioritise overcoming challenges faced by the Commission on Human Rights and Public Administration (CHRPA).

This was a motion moved by Senator Mkhululi Dlamini and seconded by Senator Leckina Magagula on Wednesday

Senator Mkhululi said in the country's Constitution, there was an entire Section dedicated to the protection and promotion of fundamental rights and freedoms. He mentioned that human rights were fundamental and it was important for every nation to ensure that all their citizens' rights were pro-

Dlamini said the most critical of the human rights was the right to life which ideally every individual had to enjoy. He made an example of the right to access portable water which was one of the most basic of the human rights.

In the motion, the senator requested the ministry to submit a comprehensive report to Senate detailing the challenges relating to fully operationalising the Commission on Human Rights and Public Administration.

He stated the report should also indicate the measures that would be employed by the ministry to overcome the challenges faced by the commission. The minister was requested to submit the report within 21 days after adoption of the motion.

The senator said the commission was different from others in that it dealt with human rights.

He mentioned the operations of the commission were subject to investigation as among their main prominent responsibilities was ensuring legislators declared their assets when taking their seats in Parliament.

"But what about the other functions of the commission that would ensure that an ordinary citizen who may not have enough money to hire legal representation would be able to approach them for assistance and be able to get the needed help," mentioned the sena-

One of the functions of the commission was to ensure that all citizens enjoyed their rights to the fullest.

He enquired who would call to order members of the Anti-Corruption Unit in case they committed crimes if the commission did not fulfil its mandate as was the current situation.

Position

Dlamini mentioned there was a need for every citizen in the country to be accountable regardless of their position in society even a position as high profile as the prime minister. There needed to be an entity that would be responsible for maintaining order and protecting human rights in the country.

He also mentioned it was important to also ensure that when enabling to commission to perform it's duties, they were not overly empowered as they also needed to be accountable for their actions.

Senator Leckinah Magagula, who seconded the motion, asked the commission to stand up and be vocal. She mentioned Section 163 (64) of the Constitution clearly outlined the responsibilities of the commission included investigating corruption cases.

"The issue of corruption is another matter that was of serious concern as it had engulfed the country, the commission should be able to play a role in addressing the issue," she said.

She also mentioned the commission had a mandate to investigate corruption cases and submit the findings to the Attorney General, as well as the

Commissioner General to name a few. She insisted the commission should emulate the deputy prime ministers office as they have been vocal with regards to the SODV.

Senator Isaac Magagula concurred with the senator: "On a light note, we did not discuss this but I also feel the need to say something on the matter," he said.

Popularised

He mentioned that just as the SODV had been so popularised in the country, the commission and duties should also be popularised. He mentioned it was imperative not to accept understaffing to effect the functions of the commission. He requested the minister to ensure that the commission was open for business, seen and visible in terms of their mandate as inscribed in the country's Constitution.

Minister of Justice and Constitutional Affairs Pholile Shakantu said the ministry welcomed the motion and the request to formulate a report.

She said it was clear that the commission had a bill of rights.

She also said the submissions by the senators to ensure that the commission was visible were also welcomed and the ministry would conduct the investigations for ensuring the commission was visible and fulfilled it's mandate and responsibilities.

The minister also said the ministry would compile the report and submit it to senate within the stipulated 21 days.

Senators demand update on Sidvokodvo Industrial Park

THE ministry of commerce industry and trade has been ordered to provide a detailed update on the Sidvokodvo Industrial Park.

Through an oral question submitted by Senator Ndumiso Mdluli on Wednesday in Senate, the senator asked the ministry to explain to Senate what progress had been made in establishing and operationalising the Sidvokodvo Industrial Park.

Minister Manqoba Khumalo said the issue was proving to be challenging. He said the national industrial hub Matsapha was currently fully occupied. He said for investors to be able to secure working space in Matsapha was almost impossible at this stage.

He said all the factory shells that were constructed in the town were occupied



and there was no space to allocate to new businesses.

He also mentioned that the ministry was faced with a challenge in establishing the Sidvokodvo Industrial Park due to governments financial constraints. "Since government obtained the 310 hectors of land in Sidvokodvo, the country's economy has been on a downward spiral, thus there were no resources to utilise the space," he said.

Khumalo also mentioned the new Cabinet had instructed the ministry to utilise the route of Private Public Partnerships (PPP).

He mentioned the ministry was currently undertaking the process of securing funding though engaging private companies as well as private investors.

PSs told to respect, recognise Secretary to Cabinet

SENATORS want more respect and recognition for the Secretary to Cabinet from principal secretaries.

This was mentioned by Senator Mkhululi Dlamini during the debate of the cabinet first quarter performance report in senate on Thursday.

The senator said when the prime minister was appointed by His Majesty King Mswati III, he felt pity for him as he inherited a cabinet and country that had very little, if any to go by, but at the same time he was required to deliver.

He said the most concerning thing was that all the other ministries were under the prime minister's office.

This meant the performance of these ministries is on the prime minister's shoulders and this meant if there was any minister who was under performing; it would mean that the PM had underperformed.

He also said the same applied to the Secretary to Cabinet, who was overseeing all principal secretaries. If there was a PS who was underperforming, that would mean the Secretary to Cabinet had under performed.

"My main concern was that nowadays, the Secretary to Cabinet office is treated like an ordinary department and was no longer given the respect and impetus he deserved.

The Secretary to Cabinet needed to have their own report as they were the

ones who were responsible for ensuring parliament operated accordingly in relation to the performance

It should also be the norm that when PS's underperformed, the blame was placed on the Secretary to Cabinet. He emphasised that this should be addressed by the office of the prime minister as Secretary to Cabinet was in charge of the PS's and should be respected and allowed to engage with them.

ETA wants stakeholders to play role in tourism boost

She said they are also engaging the police force in their campaigns because they are also one major stakeholder in the tourism sector. She said police are also interacting with tourists when they are in the country, while on the country roads or any point where tourists happen to visit such as busy places during festivals.

Nxumalo then urged the nation to take domestic tourism seriously so that they can know more about their country's tourist sites other than jetting off the

Collapsing pyramid schemes change names

IT would seem that members of the public are yet to lose more money to new pyramid schemes which are mushrooming, allegedly founded by the same fraud-

The fraudsters open a new pyramid scheme under a new name after shutting down the old one. This publication yesterday reported on one of the pyramid schemes which are currently on the process of collapsing, with members dropping out after getting their invested money back.

It was further gathered that however, there are more than two pyramid schemes sharing a similar name, which is known as GDN.

These are Gold Diggers Network (GDN) and Global Dream Network (GDN).

Worried members of these pyramid schemes flooded this publication with calls as they wanted to enquire about the veracity of a collapsing scheme.

Further investigation revealed that the former was indeed in the process of collapsing. This was after more people claimed to have been members of the scheme, but eventually dropped out after noting that chances of getting profits, as they had been promised, were getting slimmer with each passing day.

"There are a few members remaining, and those are the ones who are still hoping to get their invested money back before they could drop out," said a source who claimed to have been a member of the pyra-

Meanwhile, another pyramid scheme which is known as Grace Prosperous Networkers (GPN) was also reported to have completely shut down after collecting approximately E30 000 from members. According to members who have since reported a case with the police, the scheme had a membership of 100 people. Each of the members contributed E300 as joining fee.

Unlike in other pyramid schemes, the members of this particular scheme were not compelled to recruit more members, but were only advised to wait for their turn to receive profits within a week.

"We were told that this was a stockvel, and not a pyramid scheme," said one of those who were members. The source alleged that members were promised sums of E4 500 each as profits. This however, did not happen after the members disappeared after collecting the join-

"Right now I am at the Nhlangano Police station to report a case against the founders of the scheme as it has since disappeared with our money," the member said when called by this publication.

Further information gathered was that a number of the pyramid schemes were being founded by the same people. When sought for a comment, Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Phindile Vilakati confirmed having one of the pyramid schemes being investigated.

Vilakati said one of the cases was reported in Manzini.

"We have already made an arrest in this particular case with further investigations still ongoing," said Vilakati.

A pyramid scheme is a form of investment (illegal in most countries, including Eswatini) in which each paying participant recruits two further participants, with returns being given to early participants using money







Man fined E2 000 for possession of dagga

A man of Mpaka has been fined a sum of E2 000 after he was found guilty of possession of dagga weighing 2.3 kilogrammes.

Sandile Tsabedze appeared before the Magistrate's Court, where he faced a charge of contravening Opium and Habit Forming Drug Act of 1922.

He was said to have wrongfully and unlawfully possessed the said amount of dagga without being a holder of a valid permit. He was nabbed by police at Mhlumeni Border Gate while attempting to smuggle same into

When the charge sheet was read to him, the accused person pleaded guilty to the charge. His plea was accepted by the crown without leading evidence to prove commission of the offence.

On mitigation, the accused person asked the court to be lenient when passing sentence, saying that he was a first time offender. He told the court that he was asked by a friend at the neighbouring country to bring him some amount of the herb.

He claimed that his friend used dagga for medical purposes. The accused person was eventually found guilty by the court. He was sentenced to 10 months in a correctional facility with an option to pay E2 000 fine.

Meanwhile, Musa Sihlongonyane of Mpolonjeni faced a charge of house breaking with intent to steal and theft. The accused was said to have broken into a house belonging to Miriam Dlamini and stolen items valued at E4 720.

The accused person was not asked to plead to the charge as the crown indicated that it would lead evidence to prove commission of the offence. The matter was postponed to a later date pending setting of a date of trial.

Vendors to make a killing at Shiselweni Umhlanga

"IT is usually at this time of the year that we make reasonable amount of money from what we sell."

Market women and vendors feel the annual regional Umhlanga Ceremony remains an important event in the calendar in terms of their business.

Those interviewed ahead of the Shiselweni Umhlanga Ceremony starting today, said such an event was a blessing to them as they make more money there than any other day. The regional ceremony takes place at Mbangweni Royal Residence from today untill Sunday. The Shiselweni Umhlanga Ceremony is held immediately after the national ceremony held at Ludzidzini.

The vendors who benefit from the event by selling their wares said they have now prepared enough stock to last for the duration of the event.

"I sell food and I usually make a killing during the ceremony here at Mbangweni. I hope to cash in



more money even this year and I have prepared enough stock. Business to some of us usually flourishes during such an event," said Zodwa Khumalo.

Others involved in the chicken dust business also said they were hoping to generate good money during the ceremony. "It is true that during such events we make more money than any other normal day. We always plan for such events. There are now many of us in the same business but it is how you prepare yourself that will

see you smiling at the end of the day.

I have been in this business for almost five years. It's only during the regional ceremony where I make a killing in terms of sales,' said William Nkambule.

Other vendors sell the traditional regalia and other accessories including bracelets which are worn with the attire. Private photographers also said even though there were known areas where they were prohibited and restricted from taking pictures, it was usually during the regional Umhlanga where they make reasonable amount of money.

"We all know there are restricted areas within the royal premises when it comes to taking of photos. We are careful regarding this because as Emaswati we have to do things the right way.

We don't just take pictures anyhow but we have to be far away from such restricted areas. But we still get customers and sell pictures to them. It's usually good business for us during this event," said Muzi Dlamini.

NEIGHBOUR SAVES GIRL FROM SUICIDE

THE arrival of a neighbour at a homestead at Mahlalini saved the life of a little girl who was planning to kill herself, after being admonished by her mother for poor performance at school.

The girl, who is doing Grade Six in one of the schools under Shiselweni II Constituency, was angry at the manner her mother reprimanded her as she felt ridiculed.

The mother was angry when she was shown her daughter's school work Monday as she had gone to fetch her report and she scolded her to be in more trouble once her moth-

for open day, a day before the official opening of the third term and were given the reports of their children for the second term.

Schools re-opened for third term on Tuesday.

Information gathered is that the girl (13) was frightened by the manner her mother ridiculed her in front of her teachers. On arrival home, she went into her bedroom and hatched a plan to avoid the wrath of her mother whom she had left at another homestead.

"The girl was scared she was going

for the poor performance there. er arrived home. She did not want Parents had been invited to the school to face her after having been shouted at for poor results.

It was then that she decided to find a way of killing herself so that she did not experience what she went through at school," said one of the residents.

As the girl was planning to end her life a neighbour arrived carrying a school bag she had left at her neighbour's home last term when schools closed. The neighbour had considered that the girl would need the bag as schools were opening the next day.

The neighbour found her in the bed-

room crying. She wanted to know what had happened and it was then that the girl explained how she was scared after her mother ridiculed her for poor performance. It is said as the neighbour was keen to know more and she noticed that the girl was carrying plastic bag full of tablets and this raised curiosity.

"The girl was found with tablets but these were not the deadly weevil

They were part of the medication for someone in the family. It was clear that girl intended to ingest all of them once and thus overdosing. The tablets were confiscated from her and her mother was immediately called to rush home. On arrival, the mother was informed how her

daughter almost ingested tablets being ridiculed her for poor school work," explained a neighbour.

The matter was not reported to the police or anyone but it was concluded and finalised between the girl's family members.

'It's a matter which we ended up discussing as neighbours with the girl's family. The good thing is that the girl was seen going to school on Tuesday and no one knew at school that she almost took away her own life. The mother never showed interest in approaching anyone to provide counselling for her daughter and did not want to even involve the police," said a neighbour.

Attempts to get comment from the mother proved futile.

Thieves break into teachers' quarters, steal E20 000 worth items

THE thieves who broke into the teachers' quarters at Nkulungo Primary made away with items worth close to E20 000.

The burglary occurred while the teachers were away on holidays. It is said the teachers were forced to cut short their holidays after learning that their houses had been broken into and valuable items stolen.

The thieves are said to have done



their homework as they carried the burglary without anyone noticing,

leaving all the doors wide opened. Community members noticed doors opened at the teachers' quarters and wondered as to how that could be the case as the occupants were away on holidays

However, after a closer look it was discovered that thieves had broken into the houses as even the burglar doors were found destroyed, enabling the thieves to gain entrance and clean the houses.

Claimed

A security guard employed by the school, strangely, claimed to have not even noticed that there were burglaries.

According to the Principal of the school Thulani Kunene, there were

five teachers whose items were stolen by the thieves.

He said the thieves broke into three houses occupied by the five teach-

He explained that these could be people who were aware that the occupants of the houses were away.

"What we found is that the teachers had items such as TV sets, music systems, videos, CDs and several other belongings.

When doing calculations of the stolen items, the figure reached almost E20 000. It's a setback for the teachers as now they need to buy the goods they lost," said Kunene.

He added that he had carefully thought about the issue and he was now more prepared to name all those he considered as dangerous people with bad influence not only in the community but even within the family.



While these cars were still halted in the middle of the road, and their drivers assessing what had happened, an Isuzu doublecab that was driven by a 56-yearold man is said to have come speeding and knocked the mini truck which went on to bump on the VW Polo sedan that was driven by the woman.

This resulted to all the cars being eventually smashed both at the back and front.

The Isuzu is said to have been badly damaged upon impact while the rest of the cars incurred minor denting.

Sustained

Luckily, all the drivers of the vehicles sustained minor to no injuries at all, save for the Isuzu driver who is said to have been treated and discharged at the Raleigh Fitkin Memorial (RFM) Hospital.

When sought for comment, the Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Superintendent Phindile Vilakati confirmed the incident.

She said the police were undertaking the necessary process to find out more evidence relating to the case.

Dagga suspect escapes from police custody

A suspect who thought that he would succeed in running away from his problems learnt the hard way after he was re-arrested after attempting to escape police custody.

According to reliable sources, 34-year-old Wandile Maseko of Malanti appeared before the court on dagga related charges on Tuesday morning, where he was said to have been remanded into custody until a later date.

While his arresting officer Constable M Fakudze was preparing to take documents pertaining to Maseko's arrest, Maseko was said to have saw that as an opportunity to quietly slip out of the Mbabane Police Station and making his escape to 'freedom'.

According to Fakudze, he turned his back for a split second to prepare to take Maseko's fingerprints and when he looked back, Maseko was nowhere to be seen. After police offi-

cers located Maseko, he was re-arrested and further charged with contravening the Criminal Procedure and Evidence Act for escaping police custody

According to his charge sheet, Maseko was said to have, on Tuesday at Mbabane Police Station, did wrongfully and unlawfully escape the law-

ful custody of Constable Fakudze, after he was arrested for a Pharmacy Act offence.

During his appearance before Magistrate Sifiso Vilakati on Wednesday, the prosecution informed the court that Maseko had appeared before the court on Tuesday, where he was advised to make a bail application at the High Court.

This was because Maseko was accused of being in possession of 24 kilogrammes of dagga.

According to the law, accused persons found in possession of dagga in excess of 15 kilogrammes have to move for a bail application at the High

Maseko was further advised to make his bail application at the High Court, however, he was reminded that he had jeopardised his chances as he had shown the courts that he was a flight risk. The prosecution then applied for the court to remand Maseko until September 27, to which it was granted its application.

BRINGING OUR CHILDREN INTO THE BUSINESS EARLY

When the country was abuzz during the Eswatini International Trade Fair, chanting about Eswattini being Open for Business, the Central Bank of Eswattini joined in and brought the country's children on board to learn about business too.

When parents were learning about how they could beef up their businesses at the CBE stand children were given a head start in becoming the entrepreneurs of the future. Our aim was to get them interested in finance, problem solving, saving, budgeting for a good course while building their entrepreneurial mindset through a fun and games approach ---- and what naturals we discovered our children to be!

The logic is simple, 'Lugotjwa Lusemanti', meaning, teach them while they are still young and fresh to grab ideas. We all know why this is so right? Well besides the wellknown fact that children are our future generation blah, blah, blah, the CBE is really about helping children prepare for a healthy financial future. This is in line with the Bank's realization that investing in our children and young people's financial education as parents and education system is a great investment that will give us

Financial education not only helps people manage their financial affairs and improve their standard of living, it also makes a positive contribution to the soundness and efficiency of the financial system and performance of the economy.

As Governor, Majozi Sithole stated in his speech at the launch of the Global Money Week earlier on in the year, our young people have become financial consumers earlier in their lives than ever before. This calls for decision making on their part. We are talking about decisions that have lasting consequences if not well managed. While it is the role of many players to teach financial education and entrepreneurship to our children, the main responsibility lies on parents. No parent wants to toss their children into the water and hope they will figure out how to swim. But more often than not, when it comes to money and business, that is what parents do. But where do we even begin?

1. The Cartoon Mania!

Chances are your kids already have TV time, so why not use their favorite cartoons to turn this into an opportunity for business education by exposing them to cartoons

that teach money and business concepts. At the CBE stand, we went beyond this and discussed the messages with the children after the cartoons has sparked their intrigue. We used all sorts of cartoons and educated children about entrepreneurship, money and business concepts like reputation and revenue.

2. Business Simulation Games

We played board games like Monopoly or Payday; online games such as the Needs and Wants game that seeks to help prioritize spending. We also taught them about making business decisions along the way. Parents too, can use these games to introduce the concepts you learn from your business education in a way kids can understand through practical simulation experiences. You can even find business simulation games online that put your child in the shoes of a business owner.

3. Read Business Books with Your Kids

There are books about entrepreneurship that appeal to kids of all ages. For kids as young as preschoolers and kindergarteners, read a book like "Lemonade in Winter: A Book About Two Kids Counting Money." Find books that can entertain and inspire teens. You can also find books for childrenabout historical innovators like Benjamin Franklin and Thomas Edison, whom they've probably been introduced to in school.

4. We even made and watched financial educational Videos!

The Central Bank has locally made cartoon videos that will teach your children about learning, saving, budgetting and earning. Your child will relate to these videos; they will also appreciate the use of our 'Lilangeni' currency. Some of these videos and other resources can be downloaded from the Eswatini Finance website on www.eswatinifinance.org.sz.

We had something for adults too:

1. Workshops on Counterfeit and Mutillated Banknotes

This workshop aimed at educating the public on how they can detect genuine notes through looking, feeling and tilting. If you hold the original Lillangeni banknote against light, you should be able to see features like the watermark - an image integrated in the paper structure that shows the portrait of His Majesty King Mswati III with a highlighted necklace. When you touch the banknote, you should feel the raised printing on the ligcebesha worn by His Majesty and on the. When you tilt the banknote you should see a colour changing ink security feature in the E50, E100 and

E200. On the E10 and E20, the silver security thread colour does not change.

The workshop also covered mutilated banknotes. Mutilated means the banknote is torn, defaced, stained, dirty or defective in some way. Unfit banknotes are those that are mutilated and soiled. Any unfit banknotes and coins can be exchanged for the same value in good quality, at a commercial bank branch or the Central Bank of

2. Workshops on Financial education and Awareness

The workshop entailed educational information on making smart decisions about saving, investing and credit. The importance of saving money was explained in detail. The public was encouraged to save for expected life events such as education and retirement. They learnt that saving helps them avoid debts by providing a safety net for rainy days and also makes it possible to live a debt-free life.

They also learnt how they can invest their money, set investment goals and how long you plan to invest. By talking to financial institutions or investment companies, they were advised to seek suitable investment options and understand the costs and risks associated with that investment. Beyond investments, the workshop covered credit and debt; when you should and should not use credit, signs that you are in a debt trap and tips to avoid these traps.

3. Workshops on Government bonds and treasury bills

This workshop focused on educating the public about the risk-free Government bonds and treasury bills. Treasury bills are short-term debt. instruments (91, 182, 273 and 364-day papers) issued by CBE on behalf of Government of Eswatini. Bonds are long-term debt instruments (1 year and above). The public can invest in either of the two in large denominations with a minimum of E10, 000. Bonds are sold at a discount, par or premium to their face value, meaning that you can pay less, equal or more than the par amount, but at maturity you receive the par amount if the bond is held to maturity. Further information on bills and bonds can be found on the CBE website at www.centralbank.org.sz or the Financial Markets department at 2408 2258.

4. Workshops on Investment Scams

These workshops were meant to assist the public to easily identify a scam. Scams promise very-high guaranteed returns on the investment over a short period of time. Frequently, there is no clear product or how the company makes money. Other signs include pressure to make a quick decision or borrow money (especially against your retirement fund) to invest into their company. The public was taught how they could avoid scams and what to do once they have identified one. Everyone was encouraged to report any scams or suspected scams to the Central Bank of Eswatini Ethics Hotline at 800 40 80 or call the Ethics office at 2408 2114.

Workshops on the Small Scale Enterprise Loan Guarantee Scheme

These workshops focused on the SSELG scheme that was established for all. Eswatini SMEs which are owned by Eswatini nationals or by legal entities in which Eswatini nationals have at least 75% ownership and effective control. The scheme is available to Eswatini SMEs that are start-ups or already engaged in any of the following different industries: manufacturing, agriculture, tourism, construction, services, transport

The SSELGS is very helpful to SMEs in that it has lower lending rates of interest as compared to the lending rates charged by financial institutions in their different products that they offer for businesses. The lending rate of interest for SMEs is staggered from the ruling prime rate (currenlty10.25%) plus a minimum of 2% up-to a maximum of 5% depending on the risk profile of applicant as assessed by the financial institutions. The lower interest rates contribute to access and affordability of loans by the SMEs resulting in the growth of the SME sector and the economy of the country as a whole. WITNESS PROTECTION ACT 2018

Access to minor under protection

16. If a judge of the High Court in an *ex parte* application made in chambers by the Director, is satisfied that the safety of a minor or a mentally impaired person who is under protection might be endangered by the exercising by anyone of a right of access to that minor or mentally impaired person, the judge may suspend that right of access or make any appropriate order with regard to the exercising of that right in a manner aimed at-

(a) Preventing the disclosure of the identity or whereabouts of the said minor or mentally impaired person; or

(b) Achieving the objects of this Act.

Confidentiality and disclosure of information

17. (1) The Director and every other member of the Office shall, upon taking office, take an oath or make an affirmation in the form specified in the first schedule, before the Attorney-General.

(2) No person shall disclose any information which that person has acquired in the exercise of powers, performance of the functions or carrying out the duties conferred upon, assigned to or imposed by this Act, or in the course of the performance of any functions relating to the provisions of this Act, except-

(a) For the purpose of giving effect to the provisions of this Act;

(b) When required to do so by any competent court;

(c) If authorised to do so by the Minister; or (d) In terms of subsection (3).

(3) The Director may, subject to subsection (5), and after consideration of any representations referred to in that subsection, on such conditions as the Director considers fit, disclose any information in respect of a protected person-

(a) With the consent of that protected person or the parent or guardian, if the person is a minor or mentally impaired person;

(b) If the protected person has previously disclosed such information or acted in a manner which resulted in the disclosure;

(c) If the disclosure-

(i) is required for the exercise or protection of any rights;

(ii) Is required for the compilation of a voter's role; or

(iii) Is in the public interest; or

(d) In any criminal proceedings if the disclosure is necessary to establish the guilt or innocence of a person.

(4) The Director may not disclose any information in respect of a minor or a mentally impaired person referred to in Section 13 without the prior approval of a judge in chambers.

(5) The Director shall, before disclosing any information in respect of a protected person, take reasonable steps to notify the protected person or the parent or guardian of the protected person, if the protected person is a minor or mentally impaired person, of the contemplated disclosure and shall allow the protected person, or where applicable, the parent or guardian, to make written representations within the prescribed period and in the prescribed manner in relation to any matter regarding the disclosure.

(6) Subsection (5) shall not apply where the



Director is of the opinion that the notification may jeopardise the purpose for which the information is disclosed.

(7) The Director shall in determining whether information in respect of a protected person should be disclosed as contemplated in subsection (3), take into account-

(a) The reasons for the disclosure;

(b) The probability that the disclosure may endanger the safety of the protected person concerned or that of any other protected person or the integrity of a witness protection programme under this Act;

(c) Whether the need for the disclosure can effectively be met by any other means;

(d) Whether there are effective means available to prevent any further disclosure of the information; and

(e) Any other factor that, in the opinion of the Director, should be taken into account.

(8) No person shall disclose any information referred to in subsection (3)-

(a) Which came into the possession of that person or which was disclosed to that person in contravention of the provisions of that subsec-

(b) If the person ought to have reasonably suspected that the information was disclosed in contravention of the provisions of that subsection. (9) Notwithstanding any other law, no person in respect of whom proceedings are, or may be, or have been instituted or conducted, or who is a suspect in such proceedings, shall have access to any information, record, document or statement relating to the proceedings concerned, including any information, record, document or statement which is contained in, or forms part of a police docket or is held by any police official charged with the investigation relating to the proceedings, which may disclose any information referred to in Section 18, unless the Director otherwise directs.

Protection of information concerning protected person from publication

18. Notwithstanding any other law, the presiding officer-

(a) At any proceedings or at civil proceedings

in which a protected person is a party or a witness; or

(b) At proceedings instituted or conducted in terms of any law, in which a protected person is a party or a witness and in respect of which the person is in terms of any law compellable to answer questions or to give evidence or to produce any book, record, document or object in such proceedings,

may make an order prohibiting the publication of any information, including any drawing, picture, illustration, painting, photograph, whether produced through or by means of computer software on a screen or a computer print-out, pamphlet, poster or other printed matter, which may disclose-

(i) The place of safety or location where the person is under protection or been relocated in terms of this Act;

(ii) The circumstances relating to the protection; (iii) The identity of any other protected person and the place of safety or location where that person is being protected; or

(iv) The relocation or change of identity of a protected person,

unless the Director satisfies the presiding officer that there are exceptional circumstances which are in the interests of justice.

Protected person not obliged to disclose certain information

19. Notwithstanding any other law, a protected person shall not be obliged to disclose any information referred to in Section 18-

(a) When giving evidence or producing any book, record, document or object in the possession or control of that person, in any proceedings or in any civil proceedings before a court; or

(b) If the person is in terms of any law compellable to answer questions or to give evidence or to produce any book, record, document or object in the possession or control of that person, in any proceedings instituted or conducted in terms of any law, when answering the questions or giving the evidence or producing that book, record, document or object in such proceedings.

LETTER TO THE EDITOR

WESTERN-STYLE OF DEMOCRACY DOES NOT ALWAYS WORK

LAST week, on 3rd September to be more precise, I received an unexpected email purporting to be from the producer of an international news talk show, based in Washington DC in the United States, which apparently broadcasts to over a billion televisions around the world.

The producer was so keen to get me on the television programme, CGTN America's Global Business, to talk about the Kingdom of Eswatini that, I was even offered a car with personal driver, to transport me to the nearest television studio.

Whilst obviously very flattered by the invitation, it did raise two questions in my mind.

Firstly, how did the producer get my email contact details and secondly, why me to talk "about the monarchy that remains there and the issues faced in that nation?"

Rightly or wrongly, the conclusion I reached from the limited information available was that, it would just be a continuation of the negative press over the last 10 to 15 years led by the Mail/Mail on Sunday in the United Kingdom, which has focused on the supposedly undemocratic political system in Eswatini and the role of the Ngwenyama, His Majesty as hereditary Head of State. So, I declined the producer's kind invitation.

Yes, there are economic, social and political issues which need to be addressed urgently, such as an early investment in education and health; corruption in Eswatini's political and economic life; a redistribution of wealth; the role of women in our society to include gender based sexual abuse

And yes, Eswatini would welcome more inward investment from countries outside of the African Continental Free Trade Agreement to achieve Vision 2022.

But, are these not issues which the government of the Kingdom of Eswatini needs to be allowed to address itself?

After the war in Iraq, it should be very selfevident now that, a western-style version of democracy cannot just be exported to or imposed



upon other countries. It just does not work.

So, imagine a country with a constitutional monarchy, where the role of the Head of State is purely symbolic, with no input into the political decision-making process, apart from attending the opening of a new session of Parliament and the giving of royal assent to any legislation.

Decided

A country that has decided to leave a mutually beneficial trade agreement with its nearest neighbours and where its Prime Minister on Monday, made a unilateral decision to suspend Parliament for five weeks until the 14th October (subsequently judged to be "unlawful" by the highest civil court in Scotland), in an attempt to avoid his no-deal Brexit option being sabotaged by legislation passed by Parliament and which has received royal assent.

No, I am not referring to the Kingdom of Eswatini and that is the ability to lead in times of stress and of difficulty. Leadership through difficult times means having the moral courage to stand up and take charge and not succumb to the childish playground behaviour that threatens to derail any hope of recovery.

It means having the ability to rise without being embroiled in emotion, to set out a plan, with the confidence of knowing that no plan is perfect. More than that, it requires the ability to identify a common goal that everyone can work towards. Like saving the 69 Chilean miners. Like saving the Thai soccer team.

Like saving South Africa. The story of the Chilean miners and the story of the Thai boys are examples of what we are capable of. When hope was all but lost, the magical blessing of human cohesion transformed the situation. What could have been dire and tragic became wonderous and awe inspiring.

South Africa has done it before. We know we are capable of it. We just need to recognise the immense power and value that there is if we just work together.

So, there is a certain irony that, despite all the ongoing negative criticism in the West of the current political system, the United States has an embassy located in the Kingdom, a politically stable African country when compared to its nearest neighbour.

And to its credit, the United Kingdom has recently appointed a High Commissioner to the Kingdom of Eswatini, who will hopefully focus his energies on supporting post-Brexit bilateral trade agreements and inbound investment to facilitate a knowledge based economy, rather than the stated desire of his Foreign Office to promote UK values (Times of Eswatini – Thursday, 5th September 2019). For the record, Eswatini ceased being a British Protectorate in 1968.

Nearly 200 Nigerian migrants repatriated from SA after xenophobic violence

ABUJA - Almost 200 Nigerian migrants were repatriated from South Africa on Wednesday afternoon following a wave of xenophobic violence that swept through the country and sparked sharp exchanges between the two countries.

A flight carrying 189 Nigerians landed in Nigeria's commercial capital Lagos, with some of those onboard punching the air and singing their national anthem while waving pictures of burnt shops.

"I ran for my life, they would have killed me," said Samson Aliyu, a clothes seller who lived in South Africa for two years.

"They burnt my shop, everything," he added. More than 600 Nigerians are expected to return from South Africa this week, the Nigerian government has said.

"We were expecting 317 but from the information we have 189 are on board," said Nigeria's minister for diaspora affairs Abike Dabiri-Erewa. "There was about a five-hour delay courtesy of the South African authorities who actually frustrated this return of Nigerians," she said, blaming authorities in Johannesburg for failing to help Nigerians without travel documents. "There was a lot of frustration in get-



ting them back home but we're glad that they will be here," she added.

Leading the returnees in singing the national anthem, Dabiri-Erewa promised the government would provide financial support.

Johannesburg and surrounding areas were rocked by a series of deadly attacks on foreigners last week, including many directed against Nigerian-owned businesses and properties. At least 10 people were killed in the violence and hundreds of shops destroyed while more than 420 people were arrested.

No Nigerians were killed but the violence led to condemnation across Africa, particularly in Nigeria, fuelling diplomatic tensions between the continent's two leading nations.

The violence also prompted reprisal attacks against South African firms in Nigeria and the temporary closing of South Africa's diplomatic missions in Lagos and Abuja.

Commercial transportation disruptions a great concern

BUSINESS Eswatini has raised concern over the xenophobic attacks which have led to the disruption of the flow of commercial transportation between the Kingdom and the Republic of South Africa.

The organisation denounced the protest, saying they have not only dodged transport companies in the kingdom but have also affected cross-border in general.

The organisation said it was of mutual benefit for both countries to ensure continued flow of trade between the countries.

Adding that the continued violence and threats directed at foreign truck drivers in South Africa have almost put paid to cross border trade, thereby robbing companies and families alike of a legitimate livelihood.


President of Business Eswatini, Andrew le Roux, said that it was unfortunate that these upheavals were occurring at a time when the economies of both countries were under severe stress and also that both countries were battling persistent economic stagnation and runaway unemployment which are issues that need bilateral coordination; and not bilateral confrontation.

Agreements

Over and above this, the president mentioned that Eswatini had bilateral agreements with South Africa, and the whole of SADC stating that what has been happening in recent days could not be said to be in the spirit of these agreements.

"We cannot at this point over-emphasise the growing importance of trade integration between our economies. Our private sector remains a net importer of goods and services from the Republic of South Africa. That's an inescapable fact. As a private sector body, we count on both governments to effect the necessary measures of protection at this time and for them to communicate with businesses so that we minimise damage to goods and persons."

"We therefore condemn the unlawful actions that the perpetrators of violence have taken, and we, at this time, add our voice to those calling on the prompt action by the responsible structures to implement decisive measures against this disruption that has resulted in economic loss to businesses," he said.

The president said they had also noted the call by business organisations in South Africa for an end to the violence and destruction of property, to which they fully support and are grateful for.

"In the positive spirit with which Eswatini and SA have engaged at a political, economic and social level, we are confident that the economic harm that has been experienced recently will not happen again and that through the measures taken, we will again experience uninterrupted commercial traffic flow between our

countries without any intimidation and fear of reprisal to truck drivers or any of our people." he said.

Meanwhile the CEO, E. Nathi Dlamini, said he stood by the words of the president and further hoped that hard lessons were learnt from this dark episode and would not be repeated.

He said in the recent spate of looting and burning of trucks, as far as he was concerned there were no winners because the situation scared off much needed investors away, which both countries are desperate for.

ESA looking to achieve sugar price exceeding inflation in 2021

AS part of their strategic objective, the Eswatini Sugar Association (ESA) is looking to achieve a sugar price in 2021 that exceeds inflation.

This is part of the company's strategic goal, which is to double the industry's revenue in 10 years, namely 2017-2026.

This is contained in the company's Integrated

Annual Report for 2018/19, which also highlights the exploring of viable value addition initiatives to benefit the industry as another objective for the company.

The organisation also plans to promote and support sustainable Industry Expansion in the near future.

As part of their strategic Action, ESA is looking to optimise sugar pricing, deliver sustained profitability and competitiveness, supporting initiatives for provision of adequate water

resources and long-term water security and also creating a sugarcane fund to finance industry needs and ensure stability.

The action plan also talks to the supply chain efficiencies, including containing and controlling costs, implementing innovative costs saving financing structures and models. Also part of the plan is to implement an efficient industry payment system for sugar and sucrose delivery as well as the continuous improvement in technical services.

Annual consumer inflation unchanged at 1.7 percent



THE country's annual consumer inflation remained unchanged at 1.7 per cent in July 2019, same as it was in June 2019.

According to the Recent Economic Developments by the Central Bank of Eswatini (CBE), the price index for 'food and non-alcoholic beverages' continued on a gradual upward trend from low base effects, recording 2.9 per cent in July 2019 from 2.5 per cent in June 2019. The increase was largely driven by growth in the prices for 'bread and cereals', 'oils and fats', 'sugar and sugar products' as well as 'coffee, tea and cocoa'.

The above increase was however counteracted by decreasing rates of growth in the price indices for 'transport', 'clothing and footwear' and 'alcoholic beverages, tobacco and narcotics'.

Transport inflation decreased to 0.5 per cent in July 2019 compared to 1.3 per cent in June 2019, owing to a deceleration in the prices for 'fuels and lubricants'. In the same line, the price indices

for 'clothing and footwear' and 'alcoholic beverages, tobacco and narcotics' declined by 1.0 and 0.8 percentage points, respectively. On month-on-month basis, consumer inflation grew by 0.1 per cent in July 2019 from a similar growth recorded in the previous month.

The price index for 'food and nonalcoholic beverages' grew by 0.4 per cent whilst on the other hand, the price indices for 'clothing and footwear' and 'alcoholic beverages, tobacco and narcotics' decreased by 0.6 and 0.3 per cent respectively. Core inflation, which is CPI excluding volatile items such as food, fuel and energy, grew by 1.6 per cent in July 2019, from 1.7 per cent in June 2019. On month-on-month rates, core inflation recorded a zero growth from 0.1 per cent in the previous month.

The PSPF which is a pension fund for Civil Servants owns 51 per cent of the shareholding while Tanzania Reinsurance Company which itself is owned by the Public Service Pensions Fund of Tanzania owns 49 per cent.

The company's Chairman Musa Hlatshwayo said this was as strategic partnership to ensure the safety of the insured both as insurers and ordinary clients.

"As you are already aware that for the past three years, our company is operating in a highly competitive open market scenario without riding on the obtaining compulsory cession legal framework.

He said the new developments would ensure the branch is more business friendly.





SAAUTHORITY FINES STEINHOFF A RECORD R1.5BN

JOHANNESBURG-The Financial Sector Conduct Authority (FSCA) has fined Steinhoff an administrative penalty of R1.bn.

"The requirement for Steinhoff to make multiple, significant restatements of its accounts subsequent to December 2017 supports the conclusion that Steinhoff failed to meet its obligations under the FMA 2012. The FSCA has therefore found that the Steinhoff Group made false, misleading or deceptive statements, promises or forecasts in its public statements to the markets in the prior period," the regulator said in a statement.

Given the scale and severity of the offence, it has issued a fine of R1.5bn.

But given Steinhoff's current financial position, it will waive the bulk of it to only levy a penalty of R53m.

This is to avoid penalising innocent Steinhoff shareholders further, and due to the fact that the fraud was committed by former execs and staff.

It is also "in acknowledgement of the co-operation of management to date and Steinhoff's commitment to continue co-operating fully with the FSCA in all future actions taken against any persons allegedly responsible for the wrongdoing." "While, in light of Steinhoff's current financial position, we have made the decision to remit a substantial proportion of the penalty, even after this reduction it remains the largest single fine ever imposed by the FSCA. We would like to thank the current Steinhoff management team for their co-operation and constructive engagement through this difficult and complex process," FSCA said. Steinhoffs share price dropped 1c to 105c - its lowest level in three weeks. The company has lost 99 per cent of its market value over the past two years amid revelations of fraudulent accounting, which amounted to more than R250BN.

Last month, the share slumped to below 90c at one point, as investors continue to fret over whether the company can survive the massive legal claims against it. *Fin24*

'Slowdown in global growth poses risks for local economy'

JOHANNESBURG - Risks to the SA Reserve Bank's growth forecasts are on the downside because of uncertainty over global growth, Bank Governor Lesetja Kganyago warned.


The bank projects the economy to grow 0.6 per cent this year rising to 1.8 per cent in 2020 and two per cent in 2021, with global growth of 3.4 per cent forecast for 2019, but it is expected to slow thereafter.

Kganyago told members of Parliament's finance committee that global growth is unlikely to become more supportive of domestic growth because of US-China trade tensions and the negative impact of Brexit. Geopolitical tensions are affecting commodity prices, he said, with lower global demand resulting in lower exports.

"We cannot be saved by the global economy as it is actually slowing down," Kganyago said. "With trade tensions globally not abating we see the risks to global growth on the downside.

The timid rebound of global trade at the beginning of the year was not sustained."

While domestically there was a rebound in real annual growth in GDP in the second quarter of 3.1 per cent after the contraction of more than three per cent in the first quarter, domestic growth remains volatile. Economic activity remains

weak with insufficient investment and job creation. "Potential growth, an outcome of investment — both physical and human — remains very low. We need to lay the basis for sustained growth if we are going to make any impact on the jobs situation," Kganyago noted.

To get the domestic environment right, he said, requires ensuring a sustainable fiscal framework and a commitment to macro-stability. Reducing supply-side disruptions, such as load-shedding and strikes, and improving policy certainty across several domains are a basis for driving business confidence.

Low business confidence is hitting

investment and reducing growth and will have to be restored to stimulate economic growth, he said, adding that flows of foreign direct investment into SA are low compared to its emerging-market peers. Kganyago noted that "restoring confidence is the cheapest form of stimulus" and that he and President Cyril Ramaphosa are at one about the need to strengthen business confidence. Despite having called for structural reforms of the economy, the bank has played no role in the formulation of the Treasury's economic plan. Kganyago said this is because it is the preserve of the government. Business Live

SA mining output rises for first time in 9 months

JOHANNESBURG - South African mining output increased for the first time in nine months in July as coal and iron ore production surged.

Mining production rose 2.4 per cent from a year earlier compared with a revised 4.1 per cent decline in June, Pretoria-based Statistics South Africa said in a report on its website yesterday. The median estimate of five economists in a Bloomberg survey was for a one per cent increase.

Iron ore was the big driver of the swing in mining output after its production surged by 23.7 per cent.

Coal, which is the biggest contributor to total mining, rose 8.6 per cent in July and platinum-group metals, the second-largest mineral group, rose 2.7 per cent.

Gold production continues to lag the rest of the industry and declined 13.1 per cent, the 22nd consecutive month of contraction. Gold mining in South Africa, which has lost its status as the continent's biggest producer of the metal to Ghana, is becoming less lucrative as it costs more to extract from deeper ore bodies. A 39.1 per cent drop in diamond production also weighed on the sector. FIn24

Regulator takes a hard line on retirement funds costs

JOHANNESBURG-The country's top financial services watchdog says it is going to crack the whip to ensure pension funds accelerate efforts to drive down costs that eat into people's retirement savings.

Speaking at the Financial Sector Conduct Authority's (FSCA) retirement industry conference yesterday, the regulator's divisional executive of retirement funds supervision Olano Makhubela said they will soon be looking at retirement funds statements to see how their average costs compare against the industry average. Funds whose costs deviate significantly will have to explain themselves. Makhubela said the regulator will be looking at everything, from administration costs to asset management, consulting and litigation fees, which he said are on the rise, eating further into members' savings. "We have to

address this issue of costs differently and urgently because it is a real problem," said Makhubela.

He said the FSCA will conduct research to get a sense of industry averages. It will be looking at large umbrella funds as these have the economies of scale that the FCSA and National Treasury want to see all funds achieve. "We'll need to design a model to see what the optimal number of members is that yields the economies of scale we need to bring down costs and then we will address the outliers," said Makhubela. He said the regulator is, however, cognisant that some investments, such as private equity and alternatives that allow pension funds to invest in development projects, do not come cheap. He added that the drive to have funds whose costs exhibit economies of scale will undoubtedly lead to more consolidation in the industry.

Gas industry will exploit Mozambique like all the others

MAPUTO - Gas in Mozambique is yet another example of what happens when a fossil fuel development is whitewashed by the usual rhetoric of "infrastructure development", "education" and "socioeconomic progress".

The country's nascent gas industry is straight out of the textbook on fossilfuel exploitation in poor countries — mass human rights violations, irreversible environmental destruction and government corruption that renders any chance of a trickle-down effect null and void.

This is unfolding just as the "resource curse" operates in so many other parts

of Africa and the world. The only economy that will change is the padding of the pockets of corporate and government individuals in power. The idea that the two current gas projects — Mozambique LNG, led by Anadarko (and soon Total), and Coral LNG, led by Eni and ExxonMobil — will actually double the GDP of the country, as the industry is promising, is laughable. Mozambique has been one of the leading producers of coal and ruby resources in Africa for many years, yet it remains the sixth poorest in the world, with only about 20 per cent of the population hav-

ing access to electricity. What makes anyone think the gas industry will have more of a conscience or effect?

The idea that the huge profits from the gas industry will seep down to the population is a copy-and-paste from press releases of nearly every energy company the world.

Thrilled

Standard Bank is, of course, thrilled with the lightning-quick growth of the industry — with 20 per cent of the bank owned by the Industrial and Commercial Bank of China, they are collectively the largest lenders to the project.

In 2018, Mozambican organisation
Justiça Ambiental! (JA!) asked for and
was granted a meeting with the relevant
executives at Standard Bank, but on the
agreed day the bank cancelled just two
hours in advance.

Insurance Corporation of SA (ECIC)

had clearly informed it of the terrible
effects of the industry. While it was still
in the "agreed level".

When JA!, whose employees had travelled from Maputo, still insisted on the meeting, the two executives we were planning to meet were claimed to be busy, and instead were attended to by more junior employees who began the meeting by saying they "can't give you any answers because we know nothing about the projects".

Standard Bank has refused to hold another meeting since. The Export Credit

Insurance Corporation of SA (ECIC) has been completely irresponsible in agreeing to finance this project after JA! had clearly informed it of the terrible effects of the industry. While it was still in the "consultation" phase, JA! and other organisations communicated with the COO, and on two occasions provided the ECIC with detailed information gathered from the ground and from affected communities — communities that have now been forcefully removed from their homes, lost their lands and livelihoods, and face violence from military and private security companies if they try to resist.

Grace Mugabe sobs next to husband Robert's coffin

HARARE - Grace Mugabe wept by her husband's coffin today after the body of Zimbabwe's former dictator was returned to his home in Harare - with his family apparently gaining the

upper hand in a row about his funeral.

Mugabe, who died last Friday at the age of 95, has proved troublesome even in death with his family and his successor Emmerson Mnangagwa

at loggerheads about how his burial should be handled.

Today his family insisted he would be buried in a private ceremony in his home village early next week not, as Mnangagwa wanted, at the

Heroes Acre shrine in Harare where a grave is waiting for him.

A family statement demanded that Grace, who was once a rival to Mnangagwa for the presidency, should be front and centre during the funeral.

At the Mugabe residence in Harare she sat by her husband's coffin and was consoled by opposition leader Nelson Chamisa on Thursday.

In the meantime, mourners paid their respects to Mugabe's coffin at a stadium in Harare today.

MUGABE TO BE BURIED NEXT TO HIS MOTHER - NEPHEW

HARARE - Zimbabwe's founding prime minister, Robert Mugabe, will be buried next to his mother, Bona, at Kutama village on Monday or Tuesday.

His nephew, Leo Mugabe, confirmed this to TimesLIVE in a telephone interview yesterday.

"We are very busy right now, but yes, he will be buried next to his mother," he said, adding weight to an AFP report that the family had snubbed the national Heroes' Acre in Harare and opted for a private burial at the family homestead.

In a strongly worded statement, Mugabe's other nephew, exiled Patrick Zhuwao, said the family noted with "extreme concern" that the government had gone ahead with preparing a funeral programme without consulting them. He also accused the government of trying to coerce them into giving



in to its demands.

According to Zhuwao, his uncle demanded that in the event he died, his widow, Grace, should not lose sight of his remains until they were laid to rest. "One of the wishes that

the late Robert Gabriel Mugabe indicated was that his wife, Dr Grace Mugabe, must never leave the casket bearing his remains for the duration of the funeral proceedings whilst in Zimbabwe up until his mortal remains

have been entered [sic]," he said in a statement. A traditionalist, Sekuru Banda, said such customs were practised in many African families and they helped the departed spirit to rest in peace. Times Live

Botswana under UN pressure to sign cultural rights treaty

GEVEVA-GABORONE - The United Nations Special Rapporteur on Minority Issues, Fernand de Varennes has expressed disappointment at Botswana's failure to sign the International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights

In a report seen by APA, de Varennes noted that while Botswana is not a State Party to the ICESCR, various provisions of the country's Constitution and other pieces of legislation implicitly recognise

"The Special Rapporteur is disappointed that the government has not started progress in considering the signing and ratification of the ICESCR and its Optional Protocol," de Varennes said.

He said the explanation of the government as to why the ICESCR and its Optional Protocol have not been ratified indicates that Botswana has the ambition to respect, protect and fulfil the rights contained within the covenant and already recognises the importance of some of the provisions within its national laws.

"Whilst Botswana may currently regard itself as being unable to ratify the ICESCR and its Optional Protocol as it is not yet in a position to implement the provisions therein, the Special Rapporteur makes clear that ratification of the ICESCR is a necessary step towards achieving the government's ambition to ensure these rights," de Varennes

The official said when he visited the southern African country, the government explained that "Botswana is not oblivious to the importance of the treaties".

Ten dead at Mozambique president's rally ahead of elections

MAPUTO - At least 10 people were killed in Mozambique during a stampede at a campaign rally of President Filipe Nyusi, the ruling party said, just over a month ahead of general elections.

The small stadium in the northern city of Nampula where the rally was being held on Wednesday was overcrowded and a crush occured as people rushed for the exits at the end, according to witnesses.

"Unfortunately 10 of our party's militants died," the ruling Frelimo party said in a statement, adding that 85 people were injured.

The scene was "total chaos", rally attendee Benjamin Nhumaio told

"What happened is that the gates were closed and they were only opened after the departure of Frelimo candidate, President Nyusi," said Nhumaio. "Hence everyone inside the 25 de Junho Stadium wanted to leave at the same time and there were people who were pushed and they fell and were trampled," he added.

The incident claimed the lives of at least six women and four men, according to the party.

Nyusi is hoping for a second term in office at general elections scheduled for October 15. His Frelimo party has dominated power for more than four decades and he is expected to win. His government and ex-rebel group-turned opposition party Renamo completed a long-awaited peace pact last month, 27 years after the end of the first civil war.

CAIRO - Sudan's newly appointed government and rebel leaders have agreed on a roadmap aimed at ending war in the country by year end, following the military's ouster of autocratic President Omar al-Bashir in April.

Sudan, rebels agree on roadmap

The two sides signed an initial deal after three days of negotiations in Juba, capital of neighbouring South Sudan. Sudan has been convulsed by rebellions in its far-flung provinces for decades, resulting in tens of thousands of people being killed.

Fighting in the western Darfur province has largely died down in recent years, but rebels and bandits are still active there as well as in the southern provinces of Blue Nile and South Kordofan. AP

This petition is hereby dismissed in its entirety," Justice Mohammed Lawal Garba said in announcing the ruling on Wednesday afternoon.



Sisi selects new public prosecutor

CAIRO - Egyptian President Abdel Fattah al-Sisi has selected long-time judiciary official Hamada al-Sawy as Public Prosecutor, judicial sources said yesterday, the first such appointment since the constitution was amended earlier this year.

Egyptians approved constitutional changes in April, giving the president the power to choose head judges and the public prosecutor from a pool of senior candidates pre-selected by the judiciary. Rights activists say Sisi has overseen a crackdown on dissent in Egypt since he was elected president in 2014, a year after the military he then commanded overthrew Islamist President Mohamed Mursi after mass protests against his rule. Ramaphosa's trip to the event would have been his first since his election earlier this year. "This is a time for leadership from across society to mobilise their respective constituencies in support of economic progress

and rebuilding the social and moral fabric of society. Government is stepping up its own contribution to this collective effort," the president said.

"Over the next few days and weeks, President Ramaphosa will be meeting communities, civil society and structures of government on concrete actions to address public concerns and challenge," Diko said. Times Live

Bateman was caught on camera using the word p**s while in conversation with another reporter after an impromptu press briefing by Malema outside the Hawks' offices on Tuesday.

The video and the phrase has been trending on social media.

TimesLIVE reported that Eyewitness News issued a statement, saying: "As EWN, we demand that our reporters abide by the same high standards that we expect from others.

"Bateman was taken off air immediately after we were made aware of the video. EWN will hold an internal probe that will deal with the matter appropriately."

The EFF, however, has rejected the apology, saying it was a "delayed lukewarm apology".

"We have long warned that journalists are responsible for the toxic environment that the EFF has to operate in, within the media generally.

"One must simply imagine what would have happened had the EFF



responded to Bateman on the scene of his naked provocation. It is obvious that many would blame the EFF for being intolerant of the media and suppressing media freedom," said the

The EFF said the broadcaster must take action against Bateman.

"Had it been a black journalist who would have insulted a white journalist, he would be under suspension with immediate effect," the party argued.

"Bateman must be dealt with the same way and not be accorded the white privilege of kid gloves."

Taking to Twitter, Zille said the EFF's "fragility over an expletive" was ironic.

"They won't accept the apology because it was not grovelling enough,' she said. Times Live

Gumede gets a spot on ANC's eThekwini regional task team

DURBAN - The ANC in KwaZulu Natal has included former eThekwini chairperson Zandile Gumede in its regional task team (RTT) to prepare the embattled region for its upcoming elective conference.

Party spokesperson Ricardo Mthembu told News24 that the provincial working committee had resolved issues previously raised over its RTT by those aligned to Gumede.

Gumede's regional executive committee was disbanded in June after failing to go to conference last year.

Mthembu said the new task team had to take the region to conference by the end of this year. It comprises of Mluleki Ndobe as coordinator, Bheki Ntuli as his deputy, Lwazi Mshengu as convenor, and Gumede as deputy convenor.

Ndobe, who is the deputy speaker of council, was previously arrested in connection with the murder of Sindiso Magaqa, but charges were provisionally dropped.

According to sources, Gumede - who's been known to be close to former president Jacob Zuma - will go head-to-head with another RTT member, Thabani

Nyawose is a branch leader and has a long history of being involved in the student movement and the ANC Youth League.

Nyawose is also believed to be close to current ANC President Cyril Ramaphosa and former KwaZulu-Natal ANC Chairperson Senzo Mchunu.

It also claimed by some in the region that his ascendency could lead to better relations between the powerful region and its provincial leadership structure.

Gumede is seen in some circles as a controversial figure. The former eThekwini mayor is out on R50 000 bail, after being arrested earlier this year on corruption charges relating to a R208m Durban solid waste tender. She has also been blamed for poor performance in the metro.

Businessman Musa Nciki is said to have teamed up with the Gumede in her bid to return to the helm. He is expected to contest the regional secretary position.

Former regional secretary Bheki Ntuli, who is reported to be on Nyawose's slate, also wants to retain to his old posi-

Ntuli was recently appointed the province's MEC for transport, community safety and liaison.

Motsoeneng then asked to take a crack at the negotiations, according to

"I went and engaged them, it was not easy.

We were fighting, because when I approached the CEO of MultiChoice, he said to me sometimes it seems like

I said it's a good madness because it's in the interest of the SABC.

"That meeting didn't go well. He left the meeting. Now I was in trouble, because I was

not achieving what I wanted to achieve ... I had to find a way so that I could engage him again," he said.

In a second meeting, Motsoeneng said he proposed that MultiChoice host the SABC's 24-hour news channel on DStv as a pilot project, until the SABC completed its digital migration pro-

MultiChoice agreed, hosting the channel and another called SABC Encore.

"When you talk about my legacy, it is those two channels and the employment of people," he said.

Asked what was in it for MultiChoice, Motsoeneng said "nothing".

In 2015, it emerged that as part of the deal, the SABC undertook to back MultiChoice's position on digital migration, which involved set-top boxes to convert the digital signal to analogue after migration not being encrypted.

Motsoeneng received an R11m success fee for concluding the negotiations, a matter which is now the subject of litigation.

WAYS WE COME UNDER ATTACK

PRETORIA - A total of 21,022 people were murdered in South Africa between April 1, 2018 and March 31 this year, while 52,420 were victims of sexual offences.

This is an increase of 3.4 per cent and 4.6 per cent respectively.

Shockingly, there were 736 murders committed by children.

The weekend contributes 60 per cent of the murders (Friday to Sunday). If you include Monday, that figure goes to 70 per cent.

These are some of the latest SAPS crime stats released in parliament on Thursday morning briefing by National Police Commissioner General Khehla Sitole, SAPS Statistics Chief Major General Norman Sekhukhune and Police Minister Bheki Cele.

"There is a very high number of people that are murdered by people they know," Cele commented.

"Why do people behave like they are coming from the moon on weekends?" Cele asked. He said they are seeking help from experts, including sociologists, in a bid to find answers to this question. WORST AREAS

All provinces have recorded increases when it comes to contact crimes.

Nyanga station in the Western Cape leads when it comes to trio crimes. But Gauteng has 19 stations featuring in the top 30.

Murder cases reported were highest in Nyanga (289), followed by Delft, Khayelitsha, Inanda, Philippi East, Mthatha, Umlazi, Harare in the Western Cape, Plessislaer and Gugulethu.

WEAPONS AND REASONS FOR CRIMES

Attempted murder cases across SA increased by 4.1 per cent to 1,898.

A 23.1per cent decrease in cash-intransit heists was recorded while a 1 per cent increase was noted in aggravated robbery with 140,032 cases.

Property-related crimes as a whole decreased by 12,804 (2.5 per cent). Stock theft saw the biggest increase in this category (up by 2.9 per cent).

VEHICLE CRIMES

Most (5 098) of the more than 16 000 car hijackings that were reported in the year occurred in townships.

More than 1,500 cars were hijacked in city centres, 110 on national highways,

97 in suburbs, and one at a port of entry.

The most car hijackings were reported at Nyanga police station in the Western Cape.

The statistics revealed that 12 857 drivers were threatened with a weapon of some kind, mostly a firearm.

In 12 cases, a brick was used while in five other hijackings an axe was the weapon of choice.

At least 351 drivers reported that hijackers had "knocked on the window or another part of the vehicle" to hijack them. In 14 cases, objects were thrown on the road as part of the modus operandi.

In 51 cases, hijackers used a fake stop and go detour to target their victims.

The most hijacked vehicles were Toyotas, followed by Volkswagen. According to the statistics, Chrysler was the least hijacked car, with three taken in the 12-month period.

WEAPONS USED, CAUSES OF CRIMES

Looking at the weapons used in crimes, the SAPS data reveals that knives are most common (4 720), followed by unidentified sharp objects (1 552) while in 506 cases, a brick was used to attack the victim. Bottles, sticks, sjamboks and machetes were also used while in 68 cases, the weapon was fir and matches.

Among the causes of murders were domestic violence (1,115 cases) and

mob justice and vigilantism (789).

Arguments/misunderstandings accounted for 1,727 cases, armed robbery (751), gang-related (1,120), illegal mining (62) and taxi violence (321). The Institute for Security Studies noted that domestic violence tied with gangsterism for the second-leading cause of murder in South Africa, with personal arguments being the primary reason. Almost 60 per cent of women who are murdered by their partners are shot dead, which shows the importance of tighter controls of gun licences, the ISS said.

The DA's Andrew Whitfield highlighted gender-based violence and attacks on children as serious causes of concern. He said:

- An average of 113.9 rapes are reported a day, reflecting an increase in 3.9 per cent.
- Murder and sexual offences against children have both increased by 2.9 per cent and 3.8 per cent respectively
- Children make up 46.5 per cent of all reported sexual assault in South
- 69.8 per cent of all sexual offences committed are against women

"Police need to display extreme professionalism in dealing with victims of crime and we need higher police visibility in crime-ridden areas."

'QUEEN COULD GIVE UP THRONE DUE TO INCURABLE HEALTH ISSUE'

LONDON - Queen Elizabeth II could be forced to abdicate her throne giving it to Prince Charles due to a heartbreaking health condition, a royal expert has claimed as they said there wouldn't be any other option.

The Monarch's health has been a growing concern for royal fans as the Queen holds the title for the longest-reigning monarch at 66 years and counting. The 93-year-old sparked worry when she was photographed with a large purple bruise on her left hand at Buckingham Palace after meeting Jordan's King Abdullah and Queen Rania. Doctors have since said the bruise was most likely caused by a minor injury as people who age are more prone to bruising.

Speaking on Royal Central's podcast, editor Lydia Starbuck said: "It does raise questions.

Hypothetically in the future if someone who was ruling were to develop a condition like dementia.

"At what stage can others step in to either become regent or to take responsibility away because often it's a very difficult area that people are capable in some areas of their life and losing abilities in others."

Royal expert Brittani Barger added: "In the past when dementia wasn't really known

we know that had to have been monarchs across the globe who had it.

"They may have had their child or whatever doing all the grunt work but that was before a time we knew what

"The media now, if some monarch does get something like dementia, ALS or any disease like that, I think they would really have no option but to get a regent."

Starbuck added: "I think

if anything happens it is more likely she will make Charles regent instead of completely abdicating.

"I think it's very unlikely that she will completely abdicate." As regent, Prince Charles would assume the majority of duties Queen Elizabeth II currently carries out but would not be crowned king until the passing of his mother.

The last regency in the UK took place between 1811 and 1820, when future King George IV took over control from his father George

Royal biographer Phil Dampier believes Charles is already gaining more duties from the monarch.

Mr Dampier said: "He is starting to do that already, being at the state opening in Parliament and the Commonwealth conference. express.co.uk

Brexit court ruling prompts calls to reverse parliament suspension

LONDON - British premier Boris Johnson faced calls on Thursday (Yesterday) to reverse his suspension of parliament after a Scottish court ruled it illegal, as government documents warned a no-deal Brexit could lead to civil unrest and shortages of food and medicines.

The Operation Yellowhammer documents, which the government was forced to release on Wednesday, revealed that preparedness for a nodeal Brexit remained "at a low level", with logjams at Channel ports threatening to impact supplies.

They also warned of "a rise in public disorder and community tensions" in such a scenario.

The government stressed that it was "updating the assumptions" in the document, and that it was "neither an impact assessment, nor a prediction of what is most likely to happen. "It describes what could occur in a reasonable worst case scenario,"

wrote minister Michael Gove.

But the release, after MPs voted last week to compel the government to publish, fuelled lawmakers' fears that a disorderly divorce would be hugely disruptive to the UK.

The government, meanwhile, has appealed the Scottish court ruling, with the case set to be heard in the Supreme Court next Tuesday, and parliament will for now stay shut.

Johnson has said suspending, or proroguing, parliament until October 14 is a routine move to allow his government to launch a new legislative agenda.

But critics accuse him of trying to silence opposition to his plan to leave the European Union on October 31, even if he has not agreed exit terms with Brussels.

Johnson argues that while he is working to get a deal, Britain must leave the bloc regardless, three years after the referendum vote for Brexit.

Al Qaeda leader calls for new terror attacks against US, allies

NEW YORK/TEHRAN - Al Qaeda leader Ayman al-Zawahiri called for Islamic terrorists to strike at the US, Israel and their "European allies" in a new video tied to the 18th anniversary of the Sept. 11

In an Arabic-language speech addressed to "Muslim brothers the world over," al-Zawahiri urged his followers to be "inventive and creative" as they concoct their diabolical plans.

"The interests of Israel and its American, British, French, Russian, and European allies are spread all over the world," he said, according to an English-language transcript distributed with the video.

"So just as they conspire and join forces against us everywhere, we must chase them down everywhere, at a time and place of our choosing."

Al-Zawahiri noted that that "18 years have passed since the blessed raids in New York, Washington, and Pennsylvania" and also appeared to reference President Trump's recent decision to cancel secret peace talks with the Taliban.

"The Islamic Emirate dealt severe blows to America.

This is why the Americans showed keenness to negotiate with them a withdrawal from Afghanistan," he

The 33-minute recording was discovered Wednesday morning by Raphael Gluck, co-founder of JihadOScope, a company that monitors terrorist communications on the Web and elsewhere.

The video, produced by al Qaeda's propaganda arm, "Al-Sahab Media" was uploaded to several Internet cloud-computing storage sites after being "teased" in messages posted Tuesday on the encrypted Telegram app, he said.

Versions were released in various qualities so the video can be viewed on different types of devices, including smartphones, he said.

Speaking after a trip to Africa, the Pope took issue with conservative clergymen who have criticised him.

Those men do not "want good for the Church", but only care about 'changing popes, changing styles, creating a schism', he said.

US Catholic leaders have attacked the Pope in the past for his views.

It is the first time he has spoken so openly about the chance of a split in the Church, which has more than one billion followers worldwide.

Pope Francis made his comments on

a flight back to Rome after a trip to Madagascar, Mauritius and Mozambique.

He was asked by a reporter about attacks from conservative Catholic leaders, TV channels and websites in the

Some Catholic leaders, particularly in the US but also some others around the world, have accused the Pope of diluting their faith, and have even called for his resignation.

They are unhappy with his stances on the environment and immigration. But in particular they are opposed to his moves to allow divorced and remarried Catholics to take Communion. BBC News

Denied


Messi denied requesting the signing of Neymar although he did admit to giving his opinion to the club over the Brazilian's possible return.

He said they wanted to continue where they left off in their previous MTN Premier League victory against Green Mamba.





The former Sihlangu assistant coach further expressed his excitement at rejoining the maroon and white ensemble.


