PRIVIE IVIINISTER AMDROSE IVIANOVUlo Dlamini has finally laid out the Eswatini Strategic Roadmap to economic recovery 2019-2023.

The prime minister launched the much anticipated roadmap yesterday at Royal Swazi Spa Convention Centre. Outlining how the country will work in turning around the economy for the better, Dlamini made it clear that this would be a private sector led economic turnaround strategy.

He pointed out five key focus areas that must be tackled in order for the strategy to work.

Dlamini said the first thing that government would do is to stop the bleed-

He said currently, government is in serious debts which amount to about E5 billion.

The PM said government would try and be control of the situation by sta-

UNESWA Vice Chancellor hails new Strategic Roadmap

UNIVERSITY of Eswatini (UNESWA) Vice Chancellor Professor Mandla Thwala has hailed the Kingdom of Eswatini's Strategic Roadmap 2019-2023 launched by the Prime Minister Ambrose Mandvulo Dlamini yesterday.

Speaking after the event during an interview, the professor said it is a good strategy which has all the key pillars which were listed as Mining and Energy, Tourism, Manufacturing and Agro-Processing, Agriculture Education and ICT. He said what is good with it is that it is focusing on how to deal with corruption.

The professor said what must be considered is that after all has been said and done, government must look at ways of securing funds which would help in implementing the strategy. He said it must be considered whether the funds will be sourced internally or externally. He said if it is externally, government must consider if the country has the capacity to get funding from the outside world. Professor Thwala said the strategic roadmap is on point because it is private sector led. "For any economy to be stable, we need the private and public sectors joining hands and working together," Thwala said.

bilising the current budgetary issues, control deficit and current accumulation of arrears. He said government would clear sufficient amount of arrears per year to allow the private sector to breathe and participate in the recovery of the economy.

Dlamini said the second area of focus was growth stimulation which is focused on promoting the private sector, promoting conducive business environment to stimulate private sector and SME led growth.

He added that government would also reprioritise expenditure (including CAPEX) towards growth enhancing projects. He said government would need to inculcate the culture of excellence.

The PM said this would include; improved efficiency and effectiveness of public sectors (including parastatals). Dlamini said as government, they would also be looking at poverty and unemployment reduction interventions. Under service delivery, Dlamini said government would also



be exploring other technological innovations. On the fourth aspect of economic recovery focus, the prime minister highlighted that there is need to work on the country's image

Under the country's image, Dlamini said there is need to focus on the independence of arms of government in doing their work and the respect for rule of law.

The last area of focus, according to the prime minster, is credibility and sustained confidence in government, policy implementation. He said improving Eswatini's business environment would be crucial to facilitate the private sector led recovery envisaged in the Strategic Roadmap.

'This is not a quick fix'

THE prime minister has pointed out that with the Strategic Roadmap having been launched, members of the public must know that this is not just a silver bullet (quick fix).

The PM said the strategy is a living plan that would take time to work and people must not expect results after three months. The PM said this is a call to action for all Emaswati.

Meanwhile, the Deputy Prime Minister Themba Masuku assured the nation that he knows the prime minister to be a person driven by private sector principles, a man dedicated to his work.

Protect public purse from fraudsters -PM

PRIME Minister Ambrose Mandvulo Dlamini has urged government to protect the public purse from fraudsters as it gears towards implementing the Strategic Roadmap 2019 -

He said this is a journey whereby no one must be left behind. He said everyone must push for social stability instead of personal accounts. Dlamini urged for the public purse to be protected from fraudsters. He said the challenges might seem daunting, but they would be conquered if the nation could work together. Among some of the challenges the PM pointed was a very high skills gap which stands at 47 per cent. He said this meant that people are productive up to 47 per cent. Dlamini said this issue should be a priority. The PM said as government, they are hoping to stabilise unemployment by 30 per cent. Another challenge pointed out by government is the lack of health care practitioners caused by government's decision to stop hiring.

The PM promised that going forward, government would hire if the economy recovers. The PM made an example of Rwanda which was far worse off than Eswatini but they managed to turn the situation around for good. Speaking

about the Strategic Roadmap, the prime minister said this strategy has been linked to the National Development Plan (NDP) so as government, they are improving something that is already there.

The PM said he believed that he is one of the luckiest prime ministers as his cabinet team is dedicated and goal driven.

He reaffirmed government's commitment to achieving the strategic

He said the Strategic Roadmap was developed several years back and his team is building on it. "Ours is just to build and go forward," he said.

PM gives government a new definition

AS the country works towards a new era, Prime Minister Mandvulo Dlamini has set up a new definition of government.

He said this is a government that would enable the kingdom to successfully implement the Strategic Roadmap. The PM said this emerging government is focused on private sector growth and rapid policy response to deliver the strategic road map. He said this is a government that is accountable to its citizens and outcome oriented a government that would collaborate and respond to deliver a social safety net and promote information, communication and technology.

Dlamini has pointed out that the core function of the Strategic Roadmap was to bring government expenditure and revenue to sustainable levels, manage public debt and arrears accumulation. He said as government is the largest player in the economy of Eswatini, streamlining its function is crucial for the success of the recov-

Outlining the strategic goals, the prime minister said these goals included creating an enabling environment in which Emaswati, investors and strategic partners can thrive. He said the goals also include creating an adaptable and progressive legislative environment that promotes peace, stability and prosperity. He said the plan also included creating space and regulation required for the private sector to thrive. He said Eswatini government also intended to be an efficient, dependable and modern government service provider.

Legalise Cannabis

THE much debated cannabis legalisation issue is among the key areas of economic recovery in the new Strategic Roadmap launched by government yesterday.

Prime Minister Ambrose Dlamini said among the things that are in the strategy, was the plan to legalise cannabis in order to improve investments in agro-processing. The prime minister pointed out that this strategy is not something new but his team improved on what has already been worked on. He said under cannabis there would be a review on legislation to legalise cannabis. With cannabis being legalised it is hoped that there will also be an increase in employment. The prime minister said there would be defined tax regime for legalised cannabis.

'PSAs must be brought on board'

AS part of forging a way forward, the Prime Minister Ambrose Mandvulo Dlamini has identified key ministries who will be pivotal in resuscitating the country's econ-

Some of the identified key ministries include the ministry of tourism and environmental affairs, ministry of public service, ministry of natural resources and energy, ministry of information communications and technology, ministry of finance, ministry of economic planning as well as the deputy prime minister's office.

The Minister of Public Service Christian Ntshangase promised the implementation of a changed management which was goal oriented and results driven.

THE ministry of natural resources and energy wants the ministry of finance to pay back E420 million for the strategic oil reserve fund.

The natural resources ministry wants the money so that it could cushion the prices of fuel against the volatility of the prices of the commodity. The ministry said this yesterday in the House of Assembly before the Public Accounts Committee (PAC). Ministry of Natural Resources and

Energy Under Secretary (US) Dumisani Mngomezulu said the problem was that the prices could fluctuate and find there was nothing to help in cushioning them.

The money, according to Mngomezulu, helped in protecting Emaswati so that they were not affected by the price fluctuations. Mngomezulu said this in his capacity as controlling officer, standing in for his Principal Secretary (PS) Winnie Stewart, who is the substantive controlling officer.

The E420 million was borrowed by the ministry of finance to pay salaries for civil servants.

This was said by Accountant General in March 2017. Ngwenya said the However, Ngwenya told the PAC (AG) Dumsile Ngwenya, who was acting as controlling officer at the ministry of finance.

She was acting on behalf of her PS Bheki Bhembe, who is the substantive controlling officer at the min-

Ngwenya confirmed that the ministry of finance had taken the E420 million from the ministry of natural resources and energy.

The finance ministry took the money at two intervals. The ministry first took the money in September 2016 and it was taken for the second time money was used to pay salaries for the civil servants.

Ngwenya said the ministry of finance went to the Cabinet to state that government was encountering problems in paying the civil servants. The Cabinet finally approved that the ministry of natural resources should lend the finance ministry money to pay salaries for civil servants. Ngwenya said the Cabinet further allowed the finance ministry to tap into the special accounts so that civil servants could be paid.

The ministry of finance had promised to pay back the money in April 2017.

MANDUULO REVEALS HIS BLUE PRINT

PRIME Minister Ambrose Mandvulo Dlamini yesterday set out not only the tone, but also the tempo on how government is going to deliver the First World Status His Majesty King Mswati III has mandated them to achieve.

This he did at the launch of the government turn-around strategy, otherwise known as the 2019-2023 Eswatini Strategic Roadmap held at the Royal Swazi Convention Centre yesterday.

He was clear though that what he was presenting was not a silver bullet that would get the country back on its economic feet in an instant, but was delivering a living strategy that is ready to be altered to accommodate new facts.

If there was one significant trait about this event, is that the Prime Minister demonstrated to all and sundry that he believed and was passionate about the work he was doing by taking the audience through the strategy bullet-by-bullet; on how he aimed to accelerate the country's pace towards achieving Vision 2022.

"We are all gathered here today to reaffirm our commitment to the rapid and sustained development of our country under the guidance and leadership of His Majesty King Mswati III. "This is the day when we commit to step intentionally into a firm path of economic renewal and inclusive growth, driven by the need to create a better life for all Emaswati. It is a day when we seek to restore confidence in the strength and resilience of our economy, a day when our unyielding resolve to the economic and

He said of immediate concern would be to stabilise the economy through fiscal consolidation, deal with the arrears and make quick steps to address the concerns around the Ease of Doing Business. Dlamini said also amongst the short term goals would be to strengthen the social safety net to protect the vulnerable citizens, ensure no liSwati is left behind.

He said his medium term target would be to mobilise revenue, do structural reforms, improve the Ease-of-doing business, focus on ICT and infrastructure and improve social indicators.

Dlamini said the aim was repositioning of the Kingdom of Eswatini for innovation and inclusive growth.

Beginning in July 2020, government wants to reduce corporate tax to 20 per cent, then to 17.5 per cent in 2021, 15 per cent by 2022 and ultimately 12.5 per cent by 2023. He said the idea was to ensure that the country remained competitive thus enhance private sector growth. The Prime

The prime minister said this Strategic Roadmap is a culmination of extensive research and consultations on feasible quick wins combined with long term goals as directed by the King's pronouncement.

"Today we are launching a Roadmap that introduces a new range of measures that have the most potential to kick-start the journey to economic revival and inclusive growth. This is a journey that should not leave anyone behind, and whose success depends on the collective commitment of all of us gathered here, and all Emaswati in Eswatini and in the diaspora.

He said their plan to action would amount to nothing if they did not ensure that all resources were channelled to national development, social cohesion and stability instead of personal accounts. "His Majesty and the nation spoke in one voice during Sibaya, instructing government to ensure that the public purse is protected from fraudsters, calling for a Government of integrity. And as famous Nigerian writer Chinua Achebe once stated; "One of the truest tests of integrity is its blunt refusal to be compromised." "We remain resolute to rid the country of corruption and all its remnants, and we will not be compromised," the Prime Minister said.

With regards to what will now happen, the Prime Minister said, some actions would require Parliament to seek the amendment of some Sections of the law to implement the plan.

He said the work had already begun and they would not fail.

Auditor General (AG) staff moves to Dlanubeka

STAFF members of the office of the auditor general (AG) will breathe a sigh of relief from next month as they are expected to move to Dlanubeka Building in Mbabane.

The staffers now occupy the leaking Deeds Offices, which forces them to work under filthy conditions. The AG staffers will start working at Dlanubeka from next month and government will pay E175 000 per month as rent in Dlanubeka. The lease agreement, according to Madlopha, was also signed.

The auditor general staffers will be moving out with workers from the offices of the Registrar of Deeds and

34 fire fighters employed without posts

ABOUT 34 workers at Eswatini National Fire and Emergency Services (ENSES) were employed without posts.

The fire fighters were allegedly employed under questionable circumstances as it is also not known how they are paid without posts. Ministry of Public Service Principal Secretary (PS) Evart Madlopha said he knew nothing about this matter. He wondered how the fire fighters

those from the accountant general (AG), among other workers, currently occupying the Deeds offices. Ministry of Public Service Principal Secretary

were remunerated because a civil servant needed to have a post in order to draw a salary.

Madlopha said there was once a time when about 126 posts were vacant at the fire department. However, he did not know how these positions were filled and how the 34 ended up not having posts. He asked the PAC to give him an opportunity to investigate the matter and find out how it happened.

(PS) Evart Madlopha said this yesterday in the House of Assembly when his ministry appeared before the Public Accounts Committee (PAC). Madlopha

was giving progress made by his ministry on the relocation of the staffers occupying the Deeds office, as directed by the PAC to do so last month. Madlopha told the PAC that they had other options other than this space, but found that Dlanubeka had a better deal that was working to government's advantage.

The other deal was done with the Public Service Pensions Fund (PSPF) at Mbabane Office Park. The PSPF wanted E265 000 per month.

Another advantage that came with Dlanubeka, according to Madlopha, was that government was offered a one-year contract, with an option to renew. Other establishments wanted lease agreements of least three years, which placed government at a disadvantage. Dlanubeka's conditions would allow government to move out easily after the renovations of the Deeds

Madlopha further highlighted that the Dlanubeka offices were still undergoing renovations.

The renovations would continue until June 1, which was the time at which the civil servants will move into the offices. The renovations, according to Madlopha, will allow the civil servants to work efficiently in the new offices.

Auditor General (AG) Timothy Matsebula said it was unfortunate that he was not involved in acquiring the new office space for auditor general's staff members. He said he went to see the new office space at Dlanubeka and found that it was not sufficient for them because his office had 105 staff members. He urged the ministry of public service to improve in cooperating with his office in future negotiations.



DRATDLAMINI CONGRATULATES PM ON ROADMA

FORMER Prime Minister and Tibiyo TakaNgwane Managing Director Dr. Absalom Themba Dlamini, otherwise known as AT, has congratulated the Prime Minister Ambrose Mandvulo Dlamini on launching the fouryear Eswatini Strategic Roadmap.

"We are happy with this strategy and as nation we will support him as he needs our support.

The presentation of what the strategy entails and the processes that were involved showed that they gave themselves time to think of what the country needs to achieve the First World Status as commanded by His Majesty King

"What now needs to happen is the implementation and monitoring of the strategy. What I like most about it is that it addresses the good governance part, because without it nothing goes right," he said. Dr. Dlamini said good governance goes hand in hand with discipline, delivery of services, performance and reality on how things get done.

"I was also happy about him talking about the need to respect the rule of law. Rule of law and the law in general makes me to be happy about that. Good governance gives confidence in the country and makes a commitment to investors that they can trust us.

In the past we had experiences where our neighbours at some state were reluctant to do business with us and it took some effort from government to re-assure them that we can be trusted and we are capable of honouring our obligations.

Intentions

"So in short, you can have a good plan, but if you don't have good governance it becomes a challenge. Big business becomes sceptical in dealing with a government that does not respect good governance principles. They tend to have doubts about the entire institution, like the courts," the former PM said.

Dr. Dlamini applauded the Prime Minister and said this roadmap is a clear statement of intent by this government. "He enhanced confidence in the country. What remains is to market the image of the country and the roadmap itself. We also need to market our intentions, because the roadmap alone cannot be enough," he said.

Dr. Dlamini pleaded with the other arms of government to work with the Prime Minister, saying if there is something they want to add, they must do so.

"But to reject it, this is out of question. They must improve what the prime minister has said and he has opened up his heart to the nation. This is what he says he would like to do. He is not an Angel, he is human like all of us. If he has left to put a full stop there, it means he doesn't know what he is doing. Yours is to improve what he has presented and make it work," Dr. Dlamini said. The former Prime Minister said he was further impressed by the premier when he indicated government's commitment to pay service providers.

He said that was key for economic recovery.

"You cannot talk about improving business if money is not circulating in the economy. Money must circulate.

For instance, there are many suppliers who are owed by government huge amounts of money, if you don't pay those people it means money

is not going to circulate. For the country to improve, pay these people or meet them somewhere, halfway. This will work with a balanced budget. Let's not spend money we don't have because if we do, it will be a problem for the country. Government has a very sophisticated, complex network which has controls.

There is no way, by any means that money can just disappear without trace. It is impossible. It

means that someone in the processes or systems is not doing his or her work diligently and that person deserves to be seriously disciplined. We cannot say titawufa ngamvuyinye, it cannot be. In my

view all that government is doing, some people are so pessimistic and doubt, why do they do that? They must come in and play their role," Dr. Dlamini


ESWATINI faces a number of challenges that must be addressed to ensure economic growth and stability.

He said government's goal was to bring the fiscal deficit, the debt to the GDP ratio and arrears stock to sustainable levels.



Pouring cold water on lover lands man in prison

THE different shades of the Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence Act have surely come to light, as a man found out hen he poured a bucket of cold water on his girlfriend.

Vusi Tfwala is said to have acted out of anger and found himself lifting a 20L bucket and emptying cold water all over the woman he claimed was the love of his life, Nozibusiso Sibandze.

Covered

This was after Tfwala discovered that Sibandze had lied to him about spending a night with his love rival. Tfwala is said to have been washing his car by the river next to where

he resides with Sibandze, where he got word that Sibandze was seen prancing around his rival's yard during the early hours of er the energy to lift a 20L buckthe previous morning.

Driven

driven to where he resides with Sibandze, and a fight ensued.

After several heated words were exchanged, Tfwala's anger got the best of him and he grabbed the nearest 'weapon' he could find, thus contravening the Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence Act.

During his appearance before Mbabane Magistrate Sifiso Vilakati yesterday, Tfwala explained that it was not his intention to commit the offence, and that he was surprised that he was arrested for it.

Much to the amusement of

the court gallery, the magistrate jokingly questioned Tfwala on where he was able to gathet, as he had a slim and fragile body structure, to which Tfwala Tfwala is then said to have responded by saying that he was angry enough to lift it.

However, Magistrate Vilakati warned Tfwala to desist from any violent actions, as pouring cold water on his lover was a clear act of violence.

Sentenced

The magistrate found him guilty as per his own plea, and Tfwala was sentenced to serve two years in a correctional facility, with the option to pay a fine of E2 000.

His sentence was suspended for a period of one-year, so he was to pay a fine of E1 000 to gain his liberation.

'UNREGISTERED MAR-RIAGE OFFICERS TO BLAME FOR ILLEGAL MARRIAGES'

ALL marriage officers that are not listed in the government gazette issued by the ministry of home affairs are criminals, Christian bodies have said.

The Eswatini Conference of Churches has condemned the act of conducting wedding ceremonies by some church leaders without proper licence from government.

This follows a statement issued by Women in Law in Southern Africa (WLSA) Director Colani Hlatjwako during a widows' status report that was hosted by Umhluma Women and Youth Foundation.

During her report, Hlatjwako said they have since realised that a lot of weddings hosted by some churches were illegal. By illegal she meant that they are sometimes carried by unlicensed ministers and they then fail to produce a certificate at the end of the day. In the report, Hlatjwako said these pastors sometimes carry out these weddings without conducting a proper background check on the people they would marry. As a result, they marry people who are

already married which then turns to cause a lot of problems to the woman after the passing on of the husband.

Chairperson of Conference of Churches Bishop Stephen Masilela did not dispute the report by WLSA.

He condemned those pastors who carry out weddings yet they knew very well that they are not licenced to do so. He labelled them as tigangi. "Leto tigebengu letibhace ngelisontfo," he said.

He said they are ruining the church's reputation because once it is discovered, every church would be included in their wrongful doing.

Masilela pleaded with government to help them as a Christian body and Emaswati to put an end to this criminal act. Masilela also highlighted how people could spot a licenced marriage officer. All licenced marriage officers are listed in the government gazette from the ministry of home affairs. "All marriage officers are listed at the home affairs," he said. Also, before a wedding takes place, couples should attend counselling sessions which are carried out by the marriage officer.

In addition, the bishop said before a wedding takes place, baans of mar-

riage should be read in churches for three Sundays before the wedding takes place.

The banns of marriage are the most important and crucial step before the wedding as this is an open period whereby everyone that opposes the wedding or marriage is given the chance to come forward.

This is meant to avoid the problems stated by WLSA of marrying a person who is already married.

Masilela said only a licenced minister would carry out such duties and signs them for the three Sundays these are read. He added that the Conference of Churches is a law abiding organisation that will not sit and watch commen take advantage of Christians in the name of Jesus. He emphasised that churches are only used as a venue for the wedding, but marriages are conducted according to the rules set by the ministry of home affairs and that is why these ministers are licensed by the ministry not churches.

Meanwhile, League of Churches Chairperson Bishop Samson Hlatjwako said some of these people who carry out the weddings are indeed licenced ministers, but would be paid to turn a blind eye on the underlying issues.

"We blame this on money, it is the root of all evil."

Hlatjwako said it all begins when pastors married divorced people. He added that prominent people are to be partially blamed for this as they get married in front of everyone then divorce to marry another one. He said what is embarrassing is that even respected Christian leaders are seen taking the front seat in such weddings. "Money has made some pastors to forget what God has called them to do in this world, that is why you would find them marrying a divorced person yet their partner is still alive thus ignoring the Bible," he said. Hlatjwako further urged people who are aware that they are not satisfied with one wife to stay away from civil rights marriage and go for Swazi law and custom marriage.

Coming to the issue of unlicensed marriage officers, he said in his church they make sure that they double check with the ministry 30 days before the wedding to ensure that they do not find themselves in such shenanigans.

Cop drowns on Mother's Day

A police officer based in Manzini died tragically after drowning in a pool at Dwaleni Farm Lodge on Sunday.

The police officer identified as Thabo Mkhatshwa (36) from Mpaka allegedly took his family out to the lodge to celebrate Mother's Day which is commemorated every second Sunday of May.

It is said he was with his wife who is also a police officer based in Mafutseni and their children when the

tragic incidence occurred.

Dwaleni Farm Lodge is a 10-minutes' drive from Matsapha. Mkhatshwa reportedly left his wife and children in the restaurant and went to the pool to swim as it was hot on Sunday.

A source revealed that attempts to rescue him from the pool proved futile as he was already dead when retrieved out of the water. Mkhatshwa was based at the Manzini Regional Police Headquarters.

An official comment from Dwaleni Farm Lodge management could not be gathered as they referred everything concerning the incident to the police.

Police Information and Communication Officer (PICO) Superintendent Phindile Vilakati confirmed the matter.

"On 12/05/2019 at 1715hours, a 36-year-old man of Mpaka drowned while swimming in a pool at Dwaleni Farm Lodge," read a report from the police.

Drunk warder knocks down two teens, one dead

A drunk officer of His Majesty's Correctional Services (HMCS) has 'bulldozed' two teenagers with his car, killing one.

Kheta Dlamini (33) stationed at Bhalekane Correctional left residents of Mliba reeling in shock after knocking down the two teenage boys (aged 16 and 17), whilst under the influence of alcohol on Saturday evening at around 1730 hours.

It is said the victims were walking on the pedestrian walkway, when out of nowhere the car knocked them down, leaving them in a critical state.

Both boys were taken to the Dvokolwako Health Centre,

however, after further assessment by medical officers, one aged 17 was later taken to Mbabane Government Hospital, where he later died.

The boys were related.

When reached for comment on the matter, His Majesty's Correctional Services (HMCS) Public Relations Officer Gugulethu Dlamini confirmed the incident.

Reported

She added that it had been reported to the commissioner general's office.

Dlamini stated that after the accident, the officer surrendered himself over to the police.

"He appeared at the Manzini Magistrate's Court on Sunday, but he was denied bail due to the severity of the case. During his appearance, the accused was remanded back to custody. He is expected back in court tomorrow.

Dlamini was arrested and charged with contravening the Road Traffic Act of 2007 on two counts; that of driving his motor vehicle negligently and for driving under the influence of alcohol.

He also faces a charge of culpable homicide. On that note, Royal Eswatini Police Service (REPS) Chief Police Information Communications Officer Superintendent Phindile Vilakati confirmed the matter.

She stated that the 16-yearoldboy is still at the Dvokolwako Health Centre fighting for his life, while the 17-year-old one was confirmed dead upon arrival at the Mbabane Government Hospital.





OUT of curiosity to operate a cellphone, a four-year-old received a lashing she will never forget.

Cynthia Mkhwanazi (33) of Nkiliji was arrested and charged with assault with intent to cause grievous bodily harm to the minor. Mkhwanazi is alleged to have assaulted the minor last Monday while at Nkiliji.

She appeared before Manzini National Court President Majahodvwa Khumalo at the Eswatini National Court last Friday.

When narrating the story before the court, Mkhwanazi said she assaulted the child with a cable charger on the back after she found that the young one had been playing with cellphones

that were being charged.


According to Mkhwanazi, some people had asked to leave their cellphones charged at her home in the presence of the child.

When she left the room where the phones were being charged, Mkhwanazi claimed that the minor tempered with them to a point where one was blocked.

Upon realising that the phone was blocked, Mkhwanazi claimed that the four-year-old then dropped and broke it.

"I used the cable of the charger to assault her on the back because I was angry about the trouble that she has put me through," Mkhwanazi said.

"After beating her, I said I would not give her food," she continued. When Court President Khumalo asked why she threatened not to give the child food, Mkhwanazi said it was a

that he took his daughter to the clinic the following day after failed attempts to take her the same day the

incident happened.

He said due to the injuries that were sustained by his daughter, the nurses requested a police report which he failed to produce since he had not reported the matter. It is said the police were called by the nurses.

The medical examination report stated that the child looked weak and she was injured on the back, hands and arms.

The report further stated that 24 loops of the cable were noted on the back of the child.

"An uncle reports that this is not the first time that this has happened but the child's grandfather withholds her medical documents," read the report.

Mkhwanazi was sentenced to 10 months imprisonment with an option of E1 000 fine.

Mozambican defrauds Liswati E8 200, flees

A man desperate to purchase local traditional regalia found himself being duped by a Mozambican hawker claiming to sell loin skins at a discounted price.

Sithembiso Mabuza was adamant in obtaining loin skins (emajobo and umdada) at a cheaper price than was sold nationally, so when he was approached by Charles Makama on April 15, he was elated to make a discounted deal.

Makama is said to have promised to order the emajobo and umdada for Mabuza, informing him that he could sell the items to him for E8 200.

It should be noted that the price of emajobo ranges between E300-E500, whereas umdada is sold at E5 000 by various traditional retailers country wide.

Mabuza could not believe his stroke of luck and did not hesitate to furnish Makama with the above mentioned amount.

Arrested

After days of Makama dodging his phone calls, Mabuza ran to the police station to report the suspect, after which Makama was arrested and charged with theft by false pretences.

It was said that Makama had taken the money and attempted to cross the border into Mozambique.

During his appearance before Mbabane Magistrate Lenhle Zulu on Wednesday, the court learnt that in addition to Makama's charge of theft by false pretences, he was found to have contravened Section 14(2) of the Immigration Act of 1987.

According to Makama's charge sheet, the second charge laid against him stated that last Sunday at Elangeni, he was not a holder of a valid entry and resident permit and was found to have entered and remained in the Kingdom of Eswatini.

Magistrate Zulu ordered Makama to be remanded into custody pending his trial date.

Jackson said the implementation of the system was motivated by the desire to meet the ISO standards and, in as much as possible, exceed the requirements of the customers.


He added that the strategy was to promote and protect the physical and mental health of the workers, while also maintaining balance between the environment, society and the economy.

Some women don't exercise kids' rights to registration, identification'

"WOMEN are the cause of their suffering after their spouses' death."

This was said by Nomphumelelo Sibeko; the National Civil Registrar for the department of civil registration and vital statistics under the ministry of home affairs.

Sibeko was speaking during the launch of the widow's report by Umhluma Women and Youth Foundation held last Friday in Manzini.

The objective of Umhluma Foundation is to address the plight that widows face after the demise of their spouses while also improving the lives of the youth and the girl child as a result of the death of the head of the family.

According to Sibeko, some of the contributing factors that result to widows' suffering include the non-registration of marriages and birth of their children.

Explaining this, Sibeko said there were instances where women did not exercise the rights of their children to registration and identification. She said due to disagreements between partners, some women dumped their children with their fathers without the birth certificates.

Sibeko said her department had dealt with cases where the men's lovers then register the children as their own. After the death of either of

forced into the situation by their in-laws.

This was revealed by His Majesty's Correctional Services' Chief Assistant Commissioner Nomkhosi Maseko when making her remarks during the launch of the widows' report last Friday. She said after listening to several speakers sharing their sad stories of how they were ill-treated by their in-laws after their husbands died, it was appalling.

Maseko said some of the predicaments faced by widows landed them in jail, not because they were wrong but they find themselves breaking the law while trying to protect their children's inheritance.

Maseko shared a story of one young widow

SOME widows who are behind bars are who was arrested and sent to prison for accidentally killing her sister-in-law with whom she was fighting over her late husband's prop-

> Maseko said the widow's sister-in-law wanted to seize some items from her house claiming that her late brother had given them to her. Upon realising that she was overpowered by her sister-in-law, the widow allegedly grabbed a plank with a nail and hit her rival on the head, resulting to her death.

> Maseko said although the widow was trying to protect what was rightfully hers, she ended up in jail because circumstances forced her to protect herself from the spite of her sis

the biological parents, she said the children sometimes were unable to claim their share of inheritance because their birth certificates render them as belonging to another person other than their biological parent.

On another note, the registrar said women with old marriage certificates should encourage their husbands to change them to the latest ones.

She said this was to mitigate a situation where the men would marry more than one wife through Swati customary law and civil rites marriages.

She said when a man was married twice through the different types of marriages, it was easier to spot with the new marriage certificates.

Failure to do this, Sibeko said, women found themselves in a position where their marriages were deemed null and void after their spouse had died. This, she said, resulted to strife over inheritance that the women and their children would be entitled to if they had made things right while their husbands were still alive.

On the bright side, the registrar said if it was discovered that a man had more than one wife, the law detected that they all benefited from his estate after he had died.

His plea was also accepted by the crown without leading evidence to prove commission of the offence. During mitigation, Malindzisa first asked the court to be lenient when passing sentence. He told the court that he did not intend to commit the offence. The accused said he received a call from his friend who reported that he was sickly and needed to be taken to hospital. At the time of receiving the call, Malindzisa claimed that he had

taken some alcoholic beverages at home.

The owner of the vehicle, a white Honda Fit registered KSD 035 CM only came across his wrecked vehicle when he was from the assignment with a senior officer. It is also not clear how and why Hlatshwayo took the vehicle without its owner's permission.

Traffic officers were called to attend to the accident near Mkhondvo where a car rolled and they found that it was a colleague who was driving a car belonging to the senior officer.

"Traffic officers discovered that their colleague was under the influence. When subjected to a breathalyser test, the alcohol content found was too high," said a source.

Paramedics were also spotted at the

scene.

Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Superintendent Phindile Vilakati confirmed that a police officer based at Ka-Phunga was arrested for drink-driving as well as negligent driving.

As a result, Hlatshwayo was then detained by his colleagues at Ka-Phunga Police Station where he spent a night in the cells and on Saturday, he was taken to court where he was charged with two counts, drink driving as well as negligent driving. He appeared before Shiselweni Principal Magistrate Florence Msibi on Saturday where he was convicted on both counts. For drink-driving, he was sentenced to five years or a fine of E5 000. For negligent driving, he was sentenced to six months in jail or a fine of E800.

Dlamini said the youth would be assist-

ed by the project to put what they learnt into practise so that they make necessary contributions. Through the savings and credit component, the youth is expected to fund income generating activities and other self-developing endeavours.

He added that after the campaign, the different communities must be able to engage in sustainable food production activities.

Man accused of forging drivers licence gets E4 000 bail

A Manzini-based forgery bigshot was slapped with two counts of being found in possession of fake public driving permits.

Wandile Dlamini (34) of Gucuka was arrested on Wednesday and appeared at the Manzini Magistrate's Court last Friday for the offences.

His charge sheet stated that in the first count, Dlamini was found in possession of counterfeit public driving permit purported to belong to Celumusa Thusi.

When the police raided his offices on the day of arrest, not only was he skilled in producing public driving permits for customers who wanted to bypass the two-year waiting period before one obtained the permit, but he also specialised in producing counterfeit sick notes from government and private institutions, driver's permits, birth and identity documents, among other documents.

The suspect was admitted to E4 000 bail pending his reappearance before the court.

The country has over the past few months received impressive rainfall, leaving grazing lands green and fertile. This statement was made by Minister of Approulture Jabulani Mabuza duringothe offiicial opening of Malindza veterinary offices.

The offices are government's plan to decentralise services to the communities, to the convenience of the general public. When making his keynote address, the minister first highlighted the importance of indigenous farming, where residents practice vegetation and livestock farming for both domestic and commercial purposes.

Mabuza noted that the 2018/2019 farming season was the best for livestock farming as the good rains translated to highly nutritious and palatable grazing land for cattle

The minister, therefore, urged farmers to take advantage of such and produce more so that they are

able to sustain themselves.

He pointed out that, for instance, an ordinary farmer in the community could make huge profits at the end of the year after selling

some of his livestock, minus plant products.

On average, Mabuza said a farmer could make up to E60 000 profits

Meanwhile, the minister commended Malindza farmers for their cooperation in the establishment of the veterinary offices.

The farmers contributed about E70 000 in the project. This was after it was realised that the old offices were too small to provide all the necessary services.

The offices will house veterinary assistants and health inspectors, officials who are mandated by govemment to provide livestock health services and extend animal health programmes to farmers. Such services will include national dipping services, immunisation and issuing of livestock permits.

The offices will service 25 dip tanks from the various communities under Malindza.

The minister also thanked government for funding the project through the Regional Development Fund (RDF).

"The ministry is pleased to note this level of partnership and enthusiasm shown by farmers of the area as they ensured that the project comes to realisation," said the min-

Minister assures farmers of available beef market

DESPITE some challenges which are faced by the meat industry worldwide, Minister of Agriculture Jabulani Mabuza has assured farmers of available market for beef.

The minister said farmers must continue striving for a higher production of beef as there was a ready market in some countries.

Mabuza urged farmers not to undertake livestock farming only as something for prestige, but see it as an income generating project and for better living stan-

The minister said livestock farming had the potential to contribute immensely in the economic growth of the coun-

He disclosed that government has signed a trade agreement with Taiwan to include beef exports from Eswatini. At present, the country sells beef to Europe.

The minister said it was encouraging to note that there was so much potential in the Lubombo region, especially around Malindza where farmers are said to own an average of 12 cattle each.

Furthermore, the minister encouraged the farmers to embrace the practice of selling livestock yearly to avoid instances where livestock ends up killed by natural disasters such as drought.

Dvokodvweni gravel roads to be rehabilitated

DVOKODVWENI Inkhundla is reportedly working on rehabilitating all gravel roads which lead to the main Simunye-Manzini and Mbadlane-Sikhuphe roads.

A number of gravel roads under this constituency are in bad condition following the recent rains which were experienced over the past few months. The roads left huge potholes, posing a danger to motorists. One of such roads is Mpaka-Lubhuku road.

The constituency's Member of Parliament Mduduzi Magagula has reported that the inkhundla is attending to the roads as a matter of urgency.

Magagula was speaking during the official opening of the Malindza veterinary offices last Thursday.

The MP said his committee has received several complaints from residents over the condition of the roads. The residents pointed out that they now have difficulty accessing some areas, especially during rainy days.

It was said that in some instances, some schools suspended lessons during rainy days as the pupils and teachers would have difficulty getting to school.

"We are happy that finally, the inkhundla has embarked on rehabilitating all the affected roads starting with Mpaka-Lubhuku road which was already in a bad state," said the MP.

REPORT CHANGE OF EMPLOYMENT TO STUDY LOAN RECOVERY CONSORTIUM

THE Study Loan Recovery Consortium wants all beneficiaries who have changed employment whilst doing repayments to come forward to clear their debts before being classified as defaulters.

Project Manager of the Consortium Khanya Magagula said they had noted that a number of beneficiaries, who recently changed their employment, had failed to inform them about the changes.

"It is through our reconciling exercise that we picked up that some beneficiaries had changed their employment without alerting the Consortium,"

Magagula said alerting the Consortium was especially crucial for beneficiaries who were paying through the employer as the deduction needs to be effected by the new employer.



He said not informing them Consortium about a move, led them to expect the beneficiaries' portion of study loan repayment from the old employer and when not received, the beneficiary unfortunately becomes classified as a defaulter and the matter referred for litigation.

"As stated previously, defaulters'

will be referred to the Consortium's attorneys for litigation.

The litigation route is not one that we want to take, but we are forced as we have realised that some beneficiaries are deliberately refusing to make the necessary repayment," Magagula

He highlighted that letting them off the hook would be unfair to beneficiaries who took their time to make the repayment arrangements and are religiously repaying monthly.

Magagula said beneficiaries should understand that paying back the money was an obligation they have to honour not a choice, so that the money would be able to assist others in future.

He advised beneficiaries who have changed jobs to contact the

Consortium and request for a balance statement which they would take together with their signed consent form to the new employer so that the study loan deduction would continue.

He said beneficiaries should not use the employment changes as a way of shying away from their obligation of making repayments for

the study loan. He added that like any other debt, once a beneficiary misses a few payments, that debt must be recovered and the monthly instalment must also continue.

"Beneficiaries, who think that they are cheating the repayment system, are actually cheating themselves as they will be expected to fully repay the incurred balance. I strongly advise against missing payments because one would be shooting himself in the foot,"

He further advised beneficiaries paying through the bank to make sure that they reference their payments correctly. He said correct referencing would ensure that one's payments are correctly allocated.

Magagula said the Consortium had noted cases where beneficiaries were thought to have not made repayments only to find that they had not referenced correctly.

He added that all beneficiaries have a unique computer number and this was the only appropriate form of reference to be used.

"Now that the Consortium is taking the litigation route, it is imperative that beneficiaries use the correct reference for proper identification," he said.



ESWATINI is looking to get at least E5 billion from Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) per annum.

A Foreign Direct Investment is an investment in the form of controlling ownership in a business in one country by an entity based in another country. It is thus distinguished from a Foreign Portfolio Investment by a notion of direct control. This was disclosed by Minister of Commerce, Industry and Trade Manqoba Khumalo during the launch of the Kingdom of Eswatini Strategic Road Map 2019-2023 at the Royal Swazi Convention Centre yesterday.

He stated this was part of the country's targets in the roadmap officially launched by the Prime Minister Ambrose Dlamini.

He said it was essential that the Eswatini Investment Promotion Authority (EIPA) have a global mindset as this would make it easier for the country to meet this target.

Not only is the kingdom targeting the said amount from FDI but they are looking at creating at least 10 000 employment opportunities for EmaSwati per year.

Gross Reserves should cover at least 4 months of export - PM

PRIME Minister Ambrose Dlamini says it is essential for the country to ensure the Gross Official Reserves cover at least four months of export.

Addressing the gathering during the launch of the Kingdom of Eswatini Strategic Roadmap 2019-2023 at the Royal Swazi Convention Centre yesterday, the PM said it was important for the country to be in line with international standards, where the reserves are concerned.

"Thave seen that there has been a slight improvement in the reserves and that we are currently sitting at 2.3 months cover. As a country we have to strive to be at more than four months cover. We are a small country and our market is very small hence we need to focus on growing our export," he said.

The minister also highlighted on the country's dependence on SACU receipts, something

he said should be reduced. "We are currently sitting at 36 per cent in

SACU receipts and we want to take this to less than 30 per cent. We are all aware that our economy is intertwined with that of South Africa and if things don't go well there we get affect-

"We need to work on our concentration risks where SACU receipts are concerned so that we are not too dependent on them.

She also mentioned that MTN foundation understood that there were two primary objectives of vocational education training.



"We have also taken strides in as far as the registration of companies and business licences are concerned. For instance, we have managed to reduce the number of days it takes to register a company to one," he said.

He stated that according to information gathered from the Ngwenya Border Officials, the peak of arrivals was noted from the beginning of the holidays on Thursday at around 10pm until Friday, signalling the need for 24hour border operations during peak periods.

Significant

The highest number of arrivals over the four days was recorded on Good Friday with over 20 000 arrivals.

"The Easter Period tends to be one of the significant times in the year where Eswatini welcomes a high volume of visitations, with visitors travelling for varied purposes which include leisure, religious and visiting friends and relatives," he said.

He further stated that the perfor-

mance of visitations during the Easter period tends to vary depending on both economic and social constraints confronting the decision to travel

during this period. For years the Easter holidays have been towards month end. Monthend holidays tend to coincide with the remuneration period of the month for most workers thus the economic constraint for travel is relatively

Predict

The high volume of religious visitors typical of the Easter period is sensitive to factors that are rather difficult to predict. These include decisions on which country hosts Easter revivals for churches with branches in South Africa and Eswatini.

He also disclosed that during the Easter holidays, average room occupancy rate recorded 69 per cent reflecting a minimal decline of 2.7 per cent compared to 2018, where average room occupancy of 71.7 per cent was recorded.

However, hotels tend to perform more favourably in comparison with the other types of accommodation facilities.

"I always remind myself that the aim of MM Farm Fresh Produce is to grow and diversify its livestock.


"This is how I keep myself motivated and avoid using profits for personal reasons but instead inject it back into the business as capita.

Understanding Insurance Excess

THE different aspects and provisions of insurance policies can be tricky to an ordinary consumer.

Such aspects may include insurance excess which is an important matter that an insurance agent, broker or an insurer should speak to you or you should ask about when taking a policy.

What is an insurance excess?

Insurance excess is the additional sum of money that an insurance company requires policyholders to pay when they make an insurance claim. The insurer pays the amount of the claim that is more than the excess. When the amount of the insurance claim is less than the excess, your insurer may not make any payment depending on your policy agreements. For instance; Mrs Dlamini took a short-term insurance cover for her

The car was then involved in an accident and she got a quotation for the repair of the damages amounting to E30 000 which she submits to her insurer.

In her insurance policy she signed up for an excess of E5 000 and, therefore, her insurer will pay out E25 000 for the claim and she is liable to pay the remaining E5 000 out of her own pocket.

The excess may be paid to the garage repairing the damaged car or as per an agreement between the insurer and the policy holder.

What are the different forms of excesses?

There are different forms of excesses namely; standard or compulsory, voluntary, graduated and imposed excess;

Standard or compulsory excess refers to the amount of money imposed



by insurer onto the policyholder.

2. Graduated excess normally applies in car insurance whereby the standard or compulsory excess is increased for new, younger or inexperienced drivers.

3. Voluntary excess refers to what is being accepted by the insured in return for premium discount but it is higher than the standard excess. The higher your voluntary excess the lower the premium you will pay to the insurer. However, you should be prepared to be able to pay the excess should anything happen to your car.

4. Imposed excess is when the insurer enforces a non-standard excess in a policy, because of the number of claims you have made or other factor on how likely you are to make a claim.

How can policyholders know about their insurance excesses?

When policyholders are buying short term insurance they should ask an insurance agent, broker and insurance company they are dealing with to explain to them the additional amount they will pay for the loss against their insured valuables.

In addition to that, policyholders should also carefully read and under-

stand the conditions of their insurance contracts.

What is the difference between a high excess and a low excess?

A high excess insurance cover means that policyholders will pay more out of their pocket when a claim arises and a low insurance excess cover means that the policyholder will pay a lesser amount out of their pocket.

What are the reasons for policyholders to pay high excess or low excess?

Policyholders can pay high voluntary excess if they want to do so.

The higher your excess, the lower your insurance premiums are going to be.

However, should a claim arise you must be able and prepared to pay the excess out of your own pocket. A high insurance excess is derived from high risk policyholders i.e. policyholders that a specific insurer have rated or classified as high insurance risk and low risk policyholders that an insurer have rated them as low insurance risk.

What if I agree for excess and do not have money at the time of claim?

The nature of an excess is that it is usually paid to the service provider. For instance, if Mrs Dlamini referred to in the above example does not have the excess of E5 000, the garage may not release the car until she paid up the excess amount she agreed upon.

How does the low or high excess affect my insurance premium?

A high insurance excess means that policyholders will be paying low monthly insurance premiums while a low insurance excess means that policyholders will be paying high monthly insurance premiums.

This is because of risk-sharing between insurer and insured.

Can my high claim ratio affect the excess I have to pay?

Yes, a high claim ratio will cause your excess to increase and this will result in your monthly premium to increase

The more claims you submit to the insurer to pay out, the more your claim

ratio goes up and you might be classified as a risky client.

When don't I have to pay excess?

In most cases, you may have to pay the excess amount when your claim is accepted regardless of fault, however, some policies have provisions which means if you were not at fault and the person who caused the accident is known by you and you have clear evidence e.g. accident record from the police station, the insurer mostly will pay out the whole claim and pursue the person at fault to recover the money.

Why does a policy have an excess?

Insurance policies have an excess because:

1. The excess is a measure of selfinsurance on you which should encourage you to take extra care of your property.

2. The excess eliminates small claims which have a high administrative cost relative to the value of the claim. Elimination of small claims most often helps keep premiums lower.

Excess is very crucial to both the policyholder and the insurer. Hence, policyholders should make sure that they understand this concept to avoid complications and disappointments when an insurance claim arises. Remember, the more voluntary excess, the less your insurance premium.

But you will be paying more out of your pocket should you incur a claim.

A research done by the Harvard Business School in 2002 cites that, for people engaged in leadership positions 90 per cent of them squander their time in all sorts of ineffective activities.

In other words, a mere 10 per cent of leaders and managers spend their time in a committed, purposeful, and reflective manner.

Such a position means there is need to identify which managers and leaders in your organisation are making a real difference and which just look or sound busy.

Furthermore, this means that there is need to improve the effectiveness of leaders and managers, as well as your own personal effectiveness.

Leaders are not paid to make the predictable happen. In most organisations, the ordinary routines of business continue along without much managerial and leadership oversight. The job of leaders and managers, therefore, is to make the business do more than continue and that is to move it forward in innovative ways.

Research cites that, leaders who take effective action are those who make difficult, even seemingly impossible things happen relying on a combination of two traits which are focus and energy.

ability to zero in on a goal and see the task at hand through to completion. Focused leaders and managers are not in reactive mode; they choose not to respond immediately to every issue that comes their way or get sidetracked from their goals by distractions like; e-mail, meetings, setbacks, and unforeseen demands.

Because they have a clear understanding of what they want to accomplish, they carefully weigh their options before selecting a course of action.

Moreover, because they commit to only one or two key projects, they can devote their full attention to the projects they believe in.

Focused leaders do not waiver on the task at hand until it is completed. Once they are convinced of what needs to be done to move the organisation to the next level, they stick to their guns. Such a people know that they have to challenge old paradigms and breathe new life into the organisational operational practices, even when some of their superiors balked at their ideas. Often new ideas are barked at and are met with skepticism but when the leader remains focused, eventually the people both superiors and followers do come on board.

MAINTAINING ENERGY

Energy is the vigour that is fueled by intense personal commitment. Energy is what pushes the leader/ manager to go the extra mile when tackling heavy workloads and meeting tight deadlines and often it is deadlines of innovation and change.

While both focus and energy are positive traits, neither alone is sufficient to produce the kind of purposeful action organisations need

most from the leaders.

Focus without energy transfers into listless execution or leads to burnout. Energy without focus dissolves into purposeless busyness or, in its most destructive form, a series of wasteful failures.

Heiker Bruch and Sumanthra Schoshaf (2002) designed a matrix that offers a useful framework for diagnosing the causes of nonproductive activity as well as the sources of purposeful action.

The exhibit 'The Focus-Energy Matrix' identifies four types of behavior which are: disengagement, procrastination, distraction, and purposefulness.

The analysis made by Bruch & Schushaf cites that 10 per cent of leaders are purposeful and that is both highly energetic and highly focused. They use their time effec-

tively but carefully choosing goals and then taking deliberate actions to reach them.

Leaders that fall into the other groups, by contrast, are usually just spinning their wheels: some procrastinate, others feel no emotional connection to their work, and still others are easily distracted from the task at hand. Although they look busy, they lack either the concentration or the liveliness required for making any sort of meaningful change.

All leaders need to find a way to be effective through combining focus and energy and further identify ways to motivate their teams to stay on track so that the organisation is able to take meaningful strides into the future.

Ramaphosa's 3 biggest challenges right now

JOHANNESBURG - After finishing off Jacob Zuma's term, President Cyril Ramaphosa will officially be sworn in as president of the republic on May 25 after 57.5 per cent of the electorate voted for the ANC with his face on the ballot paper.

The lights at the national results centre in Pretoria were barely switched off when the Zuma faction in the ANC, unofficially led by Secretary-general Ace Magashule, started grinding their axes.

It is no secret that Magashule and the other Zuma supporters in the ANC's national executive committee (NEC) despise Ramaphosa. Whereas Zuma abused his executive powers to keep himself and other crooked comrades out of jail, Ramaphosa has emboldened and encouraged the law enforcement agencies to act against state capturers inside and outside the ANC.

His presidency is literally a threat to the livelihood of Magashule and his ilk. A stronger Ramaphosa will be met by an equally stronger opposition to undermine and hoodwink him at every turn.
These three challenges are Ramaphosa's most urgent inbox matters right now.

1. WATCH YOUR BACK AND THAT OF YOUR DEPUTY

Ramaphosa's power will immediately be challenged from Luthuli House as the Zuma camp regroups to undermine and ultimately unseat him. It won't be easy—the ANC performed better at the polls than most anticipated and there is no doubt that Ramaphosa contributed vastly to this electoral victory.

Magashule's psychological warfare against Ramaphosa, by repeatedly stating that he was not individually important for the ANC to win the election, is aimed at undermining his stature and respect in the party. Magashule is hoping to convince ANC leaders and members that Ramaphosa is replaceable.

The Sunday Independent reported yesterday that Lindiwe Sisulu and Nkosazana Dlamini-Zuma are both waiting in the wings to take over from David Mabuza

as deputy president.

There are different versions of the back story to this, but one theory in the ANC is that Magashule and co are betting on Sisulu's blind ambition to become president to unseat Ramaphosa. It is no secret that the relationship between Ramaphosa and Sisulu has been strained. Do not be surprised if she does not make it back to Cabinet. The Zuma camp has never forgiven Mabuza for turning against them at NASREC and giving his votes to Ramaphosa for president. Ramaphosa needs Mabuza's loyalty to buffer him from Luthuli House attacks.

A major headache for Ramaphosa is the list of the ANC's integrity committee with names of people they recommend should not represent the ANC in Parliament. Mabuza's name alongside that of other Ramaphosa allies Gwede Mantashe and Fikile Mbalula apparently feature on this list. The list also includes the names of unsavoury characters like Nomvula Mokonyane, Bathabile Dlamini and Malusi Gigaba, but Ramaphosa can hardly only

act against those "rogues" who are seen to be Zuma supporters.

3. HIS RELATIONSHIP WITH THE EFF

Ramaphosa has a charming relationship with EFF leader Julius Malema, but the party is the biggest threat to the ANC's long-term existence. If it wasn't for suburban voters in Johannesburg taking their national votes from the DA to the ANC, the governing party may have lost Gauteng due to the large increase in township voters turning to the EFF away from the ANC.

The EFF has made major inroads in black communities in this election. The party appeals to a cross-section of middle-class and township voters who may feel the ANC is not actively championing the rights and issues of black people.

How does Ramaphosa champion nonracialism and issues pertaining specifically to the majority African population? Land and race will be central to the EFF's continued erosion of ANC support. Ramaphosa will simply have to deal with these matters in a way that stops the bleeding of ANC votes in townships and doesn't alienate white, coloured and Indian voters who have turned to the ANC in support of Ramaphosa's "thuma mina" call.

2. CUTTING CABINET WITHOUT SPITING YOUR FACE

Ramaphosa has promised to shrink his Cabinet and it is the right thing to do. South Africa's executive has 36 members and 35 deputy ministers on top of that. It is obscene and could be cut in half.

He simply has to cut back, but who to cut? Although Ramaphosa's position in the ANC has been cemented by the electoral victory, he is not untouchable and firing a number of experienced, senior ministers could spell danger for his long-term game

Ramaphosa is still a politician and will have to reward his support bases like the SA Communist Party when he decides on a Cabinet. He can also not afford to alienate the ANC Women's League (ANCWL) and will have to find a way of giving something if he fires Dlamini.

Cyril Ramaphosa under pressure to appoint untainted Cabinet

JOHANNESBURG - President Cyril Ramaphosa is under pressure to drop ministers implicated in wrongdoing when he assembles his new, trimmeddown Cabinet.

On Sunday, the governing party's alliance partner, COSATU, and the Ahmed Kathrada Foundation were among organisations that called on him to drop rogue ministers, some of whom were also outed by the ANC's integrity committee.

This comes after it emerged that groupings in the ANC were embroiled in a debate over the deputy presidency of the country, with indications that Deputy President David Mabuza was no longer guaranteed his position.

Former AU Commission Chairperson Nkosazana Dlamini Zuma and International Relations Minister Lindiwe Sisulu have been touted to replace Mabuza.

The president is expected to announce his new Cabinet after his inauguration on May 25. Today, the ANC's national executive committee (NEC) were expected to meet to decide on the premiers of the eight provinces that the party will be governing.

COSATU expected to be consulted by Ramaphosa before announcing his Cabinet. Spokesperson Sizwe Pamla told Independent Media that the labour federation's last central executive committee meeting at the end of February was clear about the requirement for meaningful consulta-

Pamla said COSATU had warned its

ally against being legalistic about its senior leaders implicated in wrongdoing by stating they have not been found guilty by courts of law.


Several senior ANC leaders have been implicated in corruption and in evidence before the Zondo inquiry into state capture, including NEC members Nomvula Mokonyane, Nathi Mthethwa, Thabang Makwetla and secretary-general Ace Magashule.

COSATU's secretariat was scheduled to meet today to discuss the elections and the Cabinet appointments.

Pamla said the federation could call its political commission, which included its affiliates' sharpest political minds, to discuss the new cabinet and also extend it to include at least one national officebearer from each affiliate.

According to Pamla, COSATU would demand reasons for recycling long-serving ministers such as Jeff Radebe, who has been in the Cabinet since 1994; former SA Reserve Bank Governor Tito Mboweni; Dlamini Zuma; and Aaron Motsoaledi, who has been health minister since 2009.

JOHANNESBURG - Several DA leaders on Sunday threw their weight behind under-fire party leader Mmusi Maimane, demanding that he complete his term and that he not be solely blamed for dwindling electoral support.

Ahead of Monday's federal executive meeting in Joburg, Maimane is under siege from senior DA figures unhappy with its performance in last week's national and provincial elections, where the official opposition's support fell from 22.23 per cent in 2014 to 20.77 per cent.

The party also shed almost 500 000 voters, dropping from nearly 4.1 million in 2014 to just above 3.6 million this time.

Six of the nine DA provincial leaders backed Maimane, saying the party took collective ownership of its successes in the 2016 local government elections and should do the same now.

Free State and Limpopo leaders, Patricia Kopane and Jacques Smalle, respectively, said there had not been any calls for Maimane to step down. KwaZulu-Natal provincial leader Zwakele Mncwango said the sentiment that Maimane should go was misplaced because decisions in the

DA were taken collectively. "Mmusi is not going anywhere," he insisted.

Kopane admitted that the elections were tough and complex, but Maimane should not be blamed.

She challenged Maimane's detractors to wait for the end of his term in 2021 and contest for the position. Northern Cape provincial leader Andrew Louw said nobody had the legal standing to ask Maimane to step down.

Louw said Maimane would stay as leader.

Mpumalanga and Eastern Cape provincial leaders Jane Sithole and Ngaba Bhanga, respectively, backed Maimane, saying it was through opposition parties' efforts that the ANC was below 60 per cent for the first time.

MAYSETS OUT TIMETABLE FOR HER DEPARTURE

LONDON - Prime Minister Theresa May does not need to spell out a timetable for her departure, Prisons Minister Robert Buckland said on Sunday, adding the leader had already announced she would leave office after the first phase of Brexit.

May, who offered to quit if her deal to leave the European Union was passed by Parliament, is under pressure to detail when she will leave office from angry Conservative lawmakers who want a new leader to try to improve the party's fortunes.

"The prime minister's said that she is going to go once the first phase of Brexit has been delivered," Buckland told Sky News, adding that meant after the deal agreed with the EU in November was ratified by Parliament.

"If that can be done quickly, then we have that timetable set out already. I don't think she needs to say any more about that. What we need to do is to get on with the job," he said, adding that the deal could be passed in the next few months.

Argentine lawmaker dies after being shot near Congress

BOGOTA - Argentinian lawmaker Hector Olivares died on Sunday after being shot in Buenos Aires's Congressional Plaza three days earlier, his party confirmed.

Olivares, a lawmaker with the centrist Union Civica Radical (UCR) party, was shot by individuals sitting in a parked car as he was walking near the Argentine Congress with government aide Miguel Yadon early on Thursday.

Yadon was also shot and died at the scene.

"Hector Olivares died," UCR said in a tweet late on Sunday. "We will demand justice and that the killers serve an effective sentence." "All those involved in the attack on lawmaker Olivares and Miguel Yadon have been detained, one day after committing the crime, thanks to the impressive work of our community forces," Argentinian President Mauricio Macri said on Friday.

Six people were arrested following the attack, Telam state news agency reported, adding that all six were "part of a gypsy clan."

On Friday, Security Minister Patricia Bullrich said that Yadon appeared to be the target of the attack. "Amafia clan ... killed a person over issues of a personal nature," she said.

It's time to rise up, Venezuelan general tells military officers

CARACAS - A Venezuelan general called on the country's armed forces on Sunday to rise up against President Nicolas Maduro, who has relied on the backing of the military to hold on to power despite an economic collapse.

Ramon Rangel, who identified himself as an air force general, said the Venezuelan government is being controlled by the "communist dictatorship" in Cuba - a key Maduro ally.

"We have to find a way to get rid of the fear, to go out into the streets, to protest, and to seek a military union to change this political system," Rangel, dressed in a suit with a copy of the constitution in his hand, said in a video posted on YouTube. "It's time to rise up."

While Rangel's pronouncement marks another blow to Maduro after a handful of similar defections by senior officers this year, there is little to indicate that he will tip the scales.

Officers who have disavowed Maduro have fled the country and the military top brass - most notably those who command troops - continues to recognise Maduro.

The information ministry did not respond immediately to a request for comment. Reuters was also unable to obtain com-

ment from Rangel.

Air Force Commander Pedro Juliac posted a picture of Rangel on Twitter on Sunday with the words "traitor to the Venezuelan people and the revolution" printed across the image.

Rangel was an active military officer who fled to Colombia last month, according to a source close to Venezuela's military who asked not to be identified.

Unlike other officers who have made similar pronouncements, Rangel did not voice support for Juan Guaido - the opposition leader who invoked the constitution in January to assume the interim presidency, arguing that Maduro's 2018 re-election was a fraud.

More than 50 nations, including the United States and most South American nations, call Guaido Venezuela's legitimate leader.

Guaido and a group of soldiers called on the armed forces on April 30 to turn on Maduro, but the military never joined and the uprising collapsed. The government called the event a coup attempt and accused a group of 10 opposition legislators of treason for joining rallies that day.

Venezuela is suffering a hyperinflationary collapse that has fuelled a migration exodus of some 3.5 million people in the past three years.

Fake blood flows at antiextinction protest in Paris

PARIS - Environmental protesters spilled fake blood on Sunday on the steps of the Trocadero, a Paris tourist landmark, in a stunt to highlight the accelerated loss of biodiversity on Earth, AFP journalists reported.

As sightseers and police looked on, members of the Extinction Rebellion campaign group emptied canisters containing around 300 litres of red liquid on the famous esplanade across from the Eiffel Tower.

Brandishing banners with the slogan: "Stop the sixth mass extinction," the protesters then observed a few minutes' silence before cleaning the steps.

Also on Sunday, six Extinction Rebellion activists were detained in the south-west city of Bordeaux for putting up a banner overnight on the scaffolding of the Chamber of Commerce and Industry, a popular tourist site.

In a landmark report last week, the United Nations warned that a million of Earth's estimated eight million species are at risk of extinction.

Cuban LGBTI activists hold pride parade

CUBA - Cuban gay rights activists held an unauthorised independent pride parade in Havana despite the Communist government warning against it and calling it subversive, an unprecedented show of civil society in the one-party state. More than a hundred Cubans chanting "long live a diverse Cuba" and carrying rainbow flags joyfully marched nearly one kilometre from Havana's Central Park down to the seafront boulevard before being stopped by dozens of security officials. At least three activists were arrested by plainclothes policemen while others were ordered to disperse given the activity did not have an official permit.

Indian cyclone death toll rises

DELHI -The death toll from a major cyclone that hit eastern India and Bangladesh in early May rose to 77 yesterday as anger grew over millions of people still without power and water. Cyclone Fani, the first summer cyclone to hit India's Bay of Bengal coast in 43 years, made landfall in Odisha state on May 3 packing winds up to 200km per hour. The winds damaged half a million houses, uprooted hundreds of thousands of trees and knocked out power, telecommunications and water for millions of people in one of India's poorest states. The Indian death toll, which earlier stood at 41, shot up with fresh casualties reported from Puri and Khurda districts on Sunday. *AFP*

Mystery surrounds killing in German

MUNICH - Arrows were found in the bodies of three people found dead in the southern German city of Passau on Saturday, police confirmed. Employees found the bodies of a 53-year-old man and two women aged 30 and 33 in a room in a guest house alongside two crossbows. The group had rented the room on Friday. They arrived late on Friday evening in a white pickup truck, the news portal merkur.de reported. All of them are German nationals, according to police. The 53-year-old man and the 33-year-old woman were from Rhineland-Palatinate state in south-central Germany while the 30-year-old was from Mecklenburg West Pomerania in north-eastern Germany. **DPA**

Sri Lanka blocks social media

SRI LANKA - Sri Lanka blocked access to Facebook and WhatsApp yesterday after a posting sparked anti-Muslim riots across several towns in the latest fallout from the Easter Sunday suicide attacks.

The country has been under a state of emergency since the suicide bombings.

Christian groups attacked Muslim-owned shops in the northwestern town of Chilaw on Sunday in anger at a Facebook post by a shopkeeper, police said.

Security forces fired in the air to disperse mobs, but the violence spread to nearby towns where Muslim businesses were also attacked.

MOMS, GRANNIES TELL EARTBREAKING STORIES

MAPUTO - On March 15, a cyclone ripped through central Mozambique. Heavy rains caused the banks of the Buzi river to break, creating an 'inland

Floods tore through communities, destroying everything in their path. Thousands of families, many of them with young children, sought safety on top of high buildings, waiting to be rescued.

On assignment for the United Nations Children's Fund (Unicef), photographer James Oatway met with communities across Sofala province. In the aftermath of the catastrophe, these mothers show us what strength, courage and resilience truly look like.

Marta went into labour in the Muada accommodation centre in Tica, outside

"I arrived in the camp on cyclone day. That day we suffered a lot," she remembers. "The whole house collapsed. I was running. We were seeing all the houses collapsing. I fell when I was running." Marta went into labour two weeks after arriving in the camp. Her husband took her by bicycle to the nearest hospital where she gave birth to twins. One of her babies died the next day. She thinks he was injured when she fell while running to safety. She is now devoting all her energy to keeping her remaining baby, Malina Seba, alive and

healthy." My baby boy, he has no name, I still haven't given him a name. The villagers helped me bury him because I couldn't be there. I am recovering, but sometimes I feel pain. I am sad. Malina is doing okay. Sometimes she doesn't breastfeed. I don't think she knows she lost her brother.

"If I get a future, if I go home, I will go back to farming to survive. I want my baby girl to have food and clothing. We have no money; the cyclone has taken everything. I want her to go to school. I can protect my family. Things will get better."

'Immoral acts' lead South Sudan to ban clubs

JUBA - All clubs in the South Sudanese capital Juba are to be banned and the operating hours of bars limited due to allegations of 'immoral acts' taking place involving girls as young

The presidency confirmed the ban in a statement released over the weekend, the East African reported. "Jubek state government has banned all night clubs, bars and night music shows in Juba city," read the presidency statement.

Augustino Wani, Juba's Governor, posted a video on Facebook explaining that bars would only be able to operate for a limited number of hours in the early evening and would be forbidden from operating during the day. "Discos we ban it totally because what is happening there is really very dangerous for the future of this country," he said, quented these clubs. "We are serious and we are going to make sure discos

are not working in this country." In other crackdowns, couples checking into hotels would have to produce marriage certificates before they could book a room. Meanwhile, the world's newest country is now in its sixth year of civil war as the government and the opposition continue to bicker over the implementation of the new peace agreement signed last September in the Ethiopian capital Addis Ababa.

Cameroon opposition calls for ceasefire to end crisis

CAMEROON - Cameroon's main opposition party on Friday called for an immediate ceasefire and the release of all political prisoners, during talks with Prime Minister Joseph Dion Ngute on resolving the country's regional conflict with anglophone separatists.

At the meeting in Bamenda, capital of the restive anglophone Northwest Region, Social Democratic Front (SDF) leader Ni John Fru Ndi also called for the appointment of a mediator for resolving the conflict. "Everyone must be listened to. The SDF is for inclusive political debate on the crisis...," said SDF official Jean Robert Wafo.

"We can listen to the secessionists without, however, agreeing to the principle," he said, explaining that a "clear and unambiguous" against secession, had to be taken. During Friday's discussion, the federalist SDF recommended four measures to resolve the crisis, according to a party statement received by AFP.

The federalist party called for "an immediate ceasefire" and the demobilisation of all separatist forces as well as "the immediate release of all political prisoners held as part of this crisis" as well as the naming of a mediator to prepare nego-

On Thursday, Dion Ngute arrived in Bamenda with the message that the government was ready for dialogue to resolve the regional conflict with separatists, while stressing that independence was not on the table.

He said President Paul Biya was "ready to organise a formal dialogue to resolve the socio-political crisis" while stressing that independence was not on the table.

Zimbabwe gets 10-hour electricity cuts as drought hits hydropower

HARARE - Zimbabwe has implemented 10-hour a day power cuts countrywide to avert the risk of running out of electricity within four months.

The Zimbabwe Electricity Supply Authority (ZESA) said the water level at the Kariba Dam, which has been supplying the country with an average of 542 Megawatts through the hydropower station, has dwindled.

"We had very little in terms of rainfall influence into the lake and we have reached a point whereby the power generation has scaled down. If we do not scale down, we may have to shut down the entire situation around October because we won't be having water," said ZESA spokesman Fullard Gwasira.

Zimbabwe received its lowest rainfall in 40 years over the past rain season, a situation that could also see at least five million peo-

ple in need of food aid. The last time Zimbabwe had acute power shortages was in 2016 following a devastating drought.

But if Zambia and the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) receive rainfall, the water level at the Kariba Dam will rise and the electricity situation should improve.

"The patterns that we depend on are not from Zimbabwe, it is from Zambia and DRC. Their significant rainfall upkeep should be able to rejuvenate the situation as the year progresses," Gwasira said.



"We had one or two opportunities in the second half where we could have caught them on the counter, but wrong decision-making and soft passes cost us.


"At times we just panicked and kicked the ball away, and there were one or two occasions when we nearly caught them on the counter. "

Ferrari left disappointed, with 'much to learn'

BARCELONA - Ferrari had hoped to step up and take the fight to dominant Mercedes at the Spanish Grand Prix on Sunday but ended up with their weaknesses exposed and even further off the pace.

Team boss Mattia Binotto said the experience would ultimately make Ferrari stronger but the disappointment was evident.

Mercedes have now won the first five races one-two while Ferrari have taken just three third places and were off the podium entirely at the Circuit de Catalunya, behind Red Bull's Max Verstappen.

"Before we judge our performance, I think compliments to Mercedes," Binotto told reporters, with drivers Sebastian Vettel and Charles Leclerc alongside. "They have been really very strong so far in the season.

"On our side, we can work very hard and well and the season is still long. We will never give up. I think that is our approach.'

Binotto said there was much for Ferrari, who brought upgrades to the first round of the traditional European season, to learn.

"We are disappointed for the race, disappointed for the performance in the weekend. Our hope was to deliver more," he added. "We brought some upgrades, aero and engine, and were expecting somehow to be in the fight but it has not been the case.

Van Persie retires

LONDON - The curtain came down on Robin van Persie's glittering career with his Feyenoord side defeated 2-0 by ADO Den Haag on Sunday.

The 35-year-old made his final career appearance in Feyenoord's last home league match of the season rather than round off his career in tomorrow's away fixture against Fortuna Sittard. He hit the woodwork in the first half and was substituted off in stoppage time, where he received a rapturous reception from the Feyenoord supporters. They held a banner aloft during the match to pay tribute, reading 'legends are forever'.

Van Persie started his career with Feyenoord and rejoined them in January 2018. He has kept up an impressive scoring record in that time, netting 25 times in 49 appearances in his second spell. The striker also bows out of football as the Premier League's highest scoring Dutchman with 144 goals from spells with Arsenal and Manchester United.

Van Persie spent eight years with Arsenal, who he left Feyenoord for in 2004. He won the FA Cup under Arsene Wenger before leaving for United in 2012.

There, he spearheaded United's charge to Premier League glory in Sir Alex Ferguson's final season as manager at Old Trafford. He left United and England in 2015, spending three years in Turkey with Fenerbahce before returning to hos boyhood club.

On the international scene, Van Persie scored 50 goals in 102 appearances for Holland.

He started the 2010 World Cup final, which Holland lost 1-0 to Spain in South Africa.

Hughton leaves despite guiding Brighton to the FA Cup semi-finals and retaining their Premier League status for a second succes-

The decision may well have come as a shock to 60-year-old Hughton, who had spoken of his desire for players to bounce back from the final day 4-1 defeat by Manchester City on Sunday and other disappointing spells during the campaign.

However, the slump in their league form in the latter part of the season - which saw Watford sucked into a relegation battle forced Bloom's hand.

"Undoubtedly, this has been one of the most difficult decisions I have had to make as chairman of Brighton & Hove Albion, but ultimately one I have made due to how we struggled in the second half of the season," said Bloom in a club statement.

"Our run of three wins from 23 Premier League matches put our status at significant risk." Daily Mail



LONDON - Chelsea forward Eden Hazard has confirmed that he has made a decision on his future, with the Belgium international suggesting that he will be leaving Stamford Bridge for Real Madrid.

Talks between Madrid and Chelsea regarding Hazard have been ongoing for some time, though there has been some hope in west London that the former Lille man may still sign a new contract, with his current deal set to

JOHANNESBURG - It was so close for Orlando Pirates fans when their team almost lifted the PSL trophy on Saturday.

Even though they won the match against Polokwane City, Mamelodi Sundowns snatched the trophy away from them by beating Free State Stars. In 2017 Orlando Pirates were looking good - until they lost in the finals of the Telkom Knockout Cup to Polokwane City.

And Senzo Meviwa's family insists this will always be the case for the PSL team until justice is done. "My son's spirit is haunting them," said Sam Meyiwa, the 66-yearold father of Senzo, who was the Bucs and Bafana Bafana goalkeeper.

He died in 2014 after being shot in Kelly Khumalo's mother's house in Vosloorus, Ekurhuleni. The devastated father is

in a wheelchair now and his speech was affected after he suffered a stroke in August last

He told Daily Sun his son's case has brought him pain and suffering. "He loved Pirates so I'm not surprised that the team is losing in trophy games. "Pirates management must not ignore the matter. They must do something about it," he said. "They can play convincing football but nothing more."

He said it has been five years since his son died but no one has been

"People are being killed and arrests are made. But my son's murderer is still out there living as if there is nothing wrong or as if they killed an animal," he said.

"This is wrong. Someone must be arrested and justice must be done for my son. I'm not even sure if the investigation is still open." Daily Sun on Sunday spoke to Senzo's cousin Siyabonga Miya, who said they are fighting for justice. "I want those who killed my cousin to be arrested. I cannot comment on the performance of Orlando Pirates," he said.

Police spokesman Brigadier Jay Naicker said that, five years later, the investigation is still continuing. "No arrest has been made yet," he said. Daily Sun





"We just need to win this match. We lost in the EswatiniBank Cup finals and we have put that loss behind us. We are focusing on this match" he said.





HLANGUPLAYERS WEDALLOWANCES

SOCCER - OLD habits die hard!

Just four sleeps after the away 1-1 against Malawi in the CHAN Qualifiers, and we're hearing that there is unhappiness in the Sihlangu camp about bonuses.

Despite the gallant performance against the 'Flames', it has emerged that the players have not received their salaries dating back two months ago when they were participating in AFCON Qualifiers against Tunisia.

Information gathered from reliable sources is to the effect that the players were said to have been promised their training and match allowances after their away game against Tunisia on March 23, but that has not happened up to today.

The source said that the players were last paid after their international friendly game against Mozambique early March, where they received E400 each. The game was played in Pretoria High Performance Centre, where Sihlangu drew 1-1 with Mozambique. Sihlangu Semnikati goal was scored by Young Buffaloes onform striker Sandile Gamedze.

It was proposed that each national team player would be entitled to E200 for training allowances and E1 500 for winning bonuses. The source said even national team coach Kostadin Papic was

also not aware his players had endured two months without pay.

"Papic was not aware the players had not received their allowances and he expressed his disappointment during a pre-match meeting in Malawi.

Ensured

He, however, ensured us that he would on our behalf to the mother body."

When asked yesterday, some of the players confirmed that they had not received their allowances.

"It's true we haven't received our allowances up to date. We were last paid early in March after the friendly game against Mozambique where each player was given E400. We still haven't lost hope that the mother body will pay us."

Money

Another player, who preferred anonymity, said they were hoping to get the money ahead of their CHAN game against Malawi but it did not happened.

"This is really painful because we sacrifice a lot for the national team. This is not the way to go. Imagine playing for the national team and getting E400. It can only happen in the country,"

When sought for comment, Eswatini Football Association Marketing and Communications Officer Muzi Radebe said this was an administrative issue. "The players know where to raise their complaints if they are not happy," he said. The 'hungry' players led by Serbian born coach Kostadin Papic will heard for camp on Monday in preparation for the COSAFA Castle Cup to take place in Durban, South Africa from May 25 to June 8.

Zweli Jele Bongani 'Bhanyaza' Mdluli

It is comprised of 'learned friends' in Zweli Jele, who will assume the Chairperson position while former Mbabane City director, Manzini Wanderers legal advisor Bongani 'Bhanyaza' Mdluli and Desmond Manda have been appointed as members.

The appointed committee is expected to usher some new changes in the PLE.

Amend

The committee is expected to amend the PLE Constitution in order to enable clubs to have full rights at the beginning of their first PLE AGM, articulate the hosting rights of teams, articulate the position of executive members whose clubs are relegated from the Premier League, review and present an update PLE Constitution in line with current global best practices.

Furthermore, the new committee will articulate functions of the office of the Premier League of Eswatini Chief Executive Officer and the organisation's COO. The three-member committee is also expected to compile the PLE policy documents and general rules in line with the new Constitution.

It is expected to report to the board on its activities, findings and recommendations at the meeting of Board of Governors on or before June 30, 2019.

Premier League of Eswatini Chief Executive Officer Simanga Nhleko did confirm that the committee was appointed some time ago.
