OVER 9 000 JOBS COMING AT KMIII AIRPORT

OVER 9 000 jobs are expected to be created at King Mswati III International Airport (KM III).

This comes after the ministry of public works and transport signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Crowne Aerospace, which will be trading as Inkwazi.

The company, which trades in cargo transportation, will be working from the KMIII Airport and will play a vital role in exporting and importing goods in the country. Around 9 600 jobs are expected to be opened by the over E22 billion (USD 1.5 billion) investment. The company is expected to start operating next year or in 2021. The MoU signing event took place yesterday at Cabinet offices at Hospital Hill, Mbabane.

The MoU signing was done by Minister of Public Works and Transport Chief Ndlaluhlaza Ndwandwe and Douglas Berry, who was leading the Crowne Aerospace team of investors.

The goods are expected to be transported to many places around the world, making the airport one of the busiest in the southern African

Minister Ndwandwe, in his remarks, said the arrival of the company at the airport would bring more activity to the aviation facility, which was officially opened by His Majesty King Mswati III in 2014.

We all know that the airport is there and the activity is minimal and Emaswati are asking on when there would be activity in the airport. We are now happy that a company that will bring more activity is here," Ndwandwe said.

He further stated that there were many Emaswati who were training on how the aviation industry worked. Ndwandwe hoped that those Emaswati would not be jobless because of the presence of this

He urged Emaswati to cooperate in making sure that the company traded successfully from the coun-

Minister of Commerce, Industry and Trade Manqoba Khumalo, who was also present during the signing, said they were happy as the commerce ministry to have such a big company to work from the coun-

He said the company had promised to create 600 permanent jobs and about 9 000 indirect jobs were expected to be created.

Khumalo said the goods transported from Eswatini would be transported to many destinations around Africa, Europe, United States of America (USA), and Asia. More than 180 different take-offs from the airport would be experienced in a month.

Speaking during the event, Berry expressed his happiness to the fact that they were going to start working at the airport.

He said they were confident that they would bring activity to the airport soon. He said their investment was big, as it was around USD 1.5 billion. He stated that they expected to start operating during the last quarter of 2020.

POLICE THWART PEACEFUL PROTEST

MEMBERS of the Royal Eswatini Police Service thwarted what was otherwise a peaceful march by leaders and members of the Political Party Assembly (PPA) yesterday.

The PPA, an assembly of various organisations including political parties, progressive civil society organisations and labour unions under the banner of the Trade Union Congress of Swaziland (TUCOSWA), engaged in a march where they intended to deliver a petition to the South African High Commission.

The march, which was attended by over 300 protesters did not proceed as planned as police denied the marchers from marching to the South African High Commission.

The march, which started at around 9am at Coronation Park saw police officers clashing with leaders of the assembly over routes that they wanted to use. Marchers wanted to march straight through town as the High Commission offices are situated near the bus rank.

However, police flatly refused. The marches were then directed to use another route, which led them towards the Central Bank and once they reached the intersection leading to the Mbabane Municipality, police then blocked the road leading to the High Commission and directed the marchers to a route leading them out of town away from the Commission's offices.

March

This did not go down well with leaders of the march. Police informed the leaders, including Swaziland Democratic Party (SWADEPA) President Jan Sithole that they had no permission to march and they were doing them a favour to let them use the streets in the first place.

Police officers asked the leaders if they had communicated their intention of delivering the petition to the South African High Commission, to which the leaders responded to the affirma-

The officers were given a number of an official from the commission, which

they called and after some time they came back and told the leaders of the PPA that the commission was requesting that only a maximum of four people be allowed to deliver the petition.

When that message was communicated to the members they said they were against such, because they wanted to be there when the petition was delivered.

Police gave an excuse, saying they were not enough to ensure the safety of commuters once protesters got near the bus rank, where anything could happen. The PPA leaders disputed the information from the police, as they said the commission had earlier communicated with them and they agreed to host whatever number within their premises. The PPA leaders said because it was clear that police were denying them the right to deliver their grievances to the High Commission, they will go back without having delivered the petition.

However, the PPA leaders said they took yesterday's event as historic as it was the first time that political parties were granted such a platform.

We were cheated outright - Jan

SWADEPA President Jan Sithole has expressed his disappointment in the manner police officers treated marchers yesterday.

Sithole said they were cheated outright.

He said when they received the mandate of delivering the petition as an assembly on Sunday, their members wanted them to do it on Tuesday, but because they wanted to follow the right channels and comply with the Public Order Act, they decided that yesterday was the best day because they would have given the municipality enough time to grant them permission to use the

Sithole said there was no reason the municipality could not respond because they received the letter on Monday and 48 hours had relapsed.

The president said police went on not to tell the truth, saying the commission said it needed four people to deliver the petition.

He said an officer there made it clear that South Africa believes in freedom of speech and expression.

He said the commission indicated that it did not put any preventive measures or conditions for the PPA to visit the Commission.

Sithole said the conduct of the police presented the country in a bad light to the international community.

The Political Party Assembly warned the police never to repeat such a stunt again.

Overwhelming police presence raises eyebrows

THE overwhelming presence of members of the Royal Eswatini Police Service raised eyebrows yesterday.

This is because despite that there were about 300 people who took part in yesterday's march accompanying PPA leaders to deliver a petition to the South African High Commission, there were over 500 police personnel and correctional services officers.

The marchers stated that it was more like police were expecting them to be chaotic. The marchers held their composure despite that they were denied permission to march to the High Commission.

Jan Sithole who was leading the march said it was very important that at the end of the march everything went smoothly so that they can be able to meet again and strategise on the next move. Some of those who were part of the march included leaders of different unions, including Algamated Trade Union of Swaziland (ATUSWA), Swaziland National Association of Teachers (SNAT), National Public Services and Allied Workers Union (NAPSAWU), Trade Union Congress of Swaziland (TUCOSWA) and Swaziland Democratic Workers Union

'MPs attacking innocent US Diplomat'

MEMBERS of Parliament have been blasted for attacking US Ambassador Lisa Peterson for making comments on the controversial issue of government buying a fleet of cars despite the economic hardships faced by the country.

The Political Party Assembly condemned the attack on the US envoy, saying it was an unjust attack by MPs. The PPA leaders said MPs should be concentrating on asking why government was spending so much money on fleets. The leaders said this was just another sign showing how freedom of speech was limited in the country.

A warning was also sent to the Shiselweni Regional Administrator Dr. Vincent Mhlanga for attacking the US ambassador.

PPA leaders made it clear that Dr Mhlanga should know that he was not the warlord for Shiselweni, but that the region is for Emaswati.

New public fare hike awaits Cabinet approval

UNTIL the Cabinet issues out the new gazette for bus fares, no one is expected to charge the new proposed bus fares.

In a meeting held yesterday between the government and the consumer association, it emerged that only the final and crucial steps were now left for the bus fare hike to be effective.

This is according to Swaziland Road Freight Association (SRFA) President Sihlangu Nhlabatsi following yesterday's meeting.

Nhlabatsi stated that after they were

asked to reduce the hike of local distances, they agreed to charge E8 for these routes.

The chairperson started that the other proposed hikes were not opposed by the stakeholders.

"Today the final proposal will be taken to the attorney general for consideration before it is taken to Cabinet for endorsement," Nhlabatsi said.

He said it would be after it has gone through Cabinet that the gazette would be issued - then the new fares can only be effected.

Nhlabatsi added that their hopes were on the Cabinet to fast-track the whole process. This is because already they were operating at a loss as the new petrol hike is hitting hard on their pockets.

The proposed bus and taxi hike is a result of the 85 cents fuel levy imposed by the ministry of finance last week Friday.

The 85 cents increase per litre follows the fuel tax increase from E3 per litre to E3.85 per litre in line with Legal Notice No. 190 of 2019 (the Finance Act, 2019 commencement dates notice) read in conjunction with the Finance Act of 2019.

Due to the fuel hike, transport associations in an urgent meeting held last week Friday they proposed new fares.

The initial proposed fare was that a charge for any passenger journey up to eight kilometres will be E10 but after



Tuesday's meeting, it was brought down to E8.

Meanwhile, the E0.66 for any journey in excess of eight kilometres but not exceeding 50 kilometres and E0.63 for any journey in excess of 50 kilometres remained unchanged.

ROYAL FLEET CRITICISM

THE criticism on the purchase of the Royal fleet is misinformed.

This was said by Prime Minister Ambrose Mandvulo Dlamini yesterday during a press conference held at Cabinet offices at Hospital Hill in Mbabane.

Dlamini said the delivered royal fleet was privately bought and no money from government was used.

The prime minister said they had noted that some opportunists had taken advantage of the country's current situation. They have used it to ridicule the King through misinformation that served their own agendas.

"Government notes the proliferation of misguided utterances on social media and international media forums and would like to advise Emaswati to refuse to be drawn by elements that intend to destabilise the peace synonymous with our kingdom," Dlamini said.

· He went on to say that the country respected and recognised the rights of freedom of speech and freedom of assem-

These rights, Dlamini said, should not extend to hate speech, inciting violence or supporting organisations that had been proscribed for carrying terrorist

activities in the country.

"Any persons considering taking part in protest action should ensure that they do not violate the Suppression of Terrorism Act of 2008 as amended, or the Public Order Act of 2017 or any other law. Violators of the law will be prosecuted," he said.

He stated that it was the responsibility of all Emaswati to respect and protect the integrity of the King and Ingwenyama as Head of State.

Government, he said, would not tolerate statements that were demeaning to the person of His Majesty and the institution of the Monarchy.

He appealed to all Emaswati to always project the respect for which they were proudly known for, as they had no other country, but Eswatini.

He said currently, the nation was in the season of Incwala, where it was expected that all Emaswati would respect and take part in this tradition.

He said the King was committed to protecting the peace and stability Eswatini had always been known for globally.

"We shall always be open to advice and criticism when our decisions are challenged," he said.

CoLA coming in April

GOVERNMENT has promised to implement the cost of living adjustment in April next year.

This was disclosed by the Prime Minister Ambrose Mandvulo Dlamini.

The premier said the percentage of the CoLA would be determined by the state of the economy at that given point in time.

He said government appreciated

the loyalty and commitment of the nation, particularly civil servants who have continued to work and service the nation.

Government had offered a three per cent once-off CoLA payment for April next year.

It would seem the prime minister's latest comments indicate that the figure may change.

Elderly grants to increase to E500 in January

BENEFICIARIES of the elderly grants will be paid E500 per month from January next year.

This was disclosed by the PM. He said the grant was presently at E400 per month and this was a way of effecting a cost of living adjustment to them as well.

This adjustment would come with an increase in the grants paid to people with disabilities.

Disability grants would increase from E180 to E280 per month and this would be effective from January as well.









WHY ARE SECURITY CHIEFS ESCORTED? MP MAGONGO

MOTSHANE MP Robert Magongo has strongly questioned the decision to provide escorts for security forces chiefs.

This was mentioned during the House of Assembly portfolio committee debate of the ministry of justice and constitutional affairs second quarter performance report in Senate on Tuesday.

Magongo said the security forces chiefs were all of a sudden escorted, which was not necessarily the case in the past.

He was referring to the three security leaders, namely Army Commander Jeffrey Tshabalala, National Commissioner of Police William Dlamini and Correctional Services Commissioner General Phindile Dlamini.

He wanted to find out if there was a new legislation that advocated for the escorting of the leaders as nothing had been communicated to them

as legislators. He said they were escorted normally by a convoy of two or more vehicles. He wondered what was going on, as in the past this did not happen.

He even asked Prime Minister Ambrose Mandvulo Dlamini about this issue during the debate of the prime minister's office second quarter performance report on Monday.

He mentioned that it was not right to let the security chiefs get used to something that would not last as when their time in office came to an end, they would be forced to relinquish their privilege. "Niyentelani intfo letamuhlupha lomuntfu kusasa, ngicela singaboyenta intfo letasehlula kusasa," he said. He mentioned that the speaker and deputy speaker were not escorted. He said in other countries, Parliament speakers were escorted and wondered why the security bosses were escorted. He said the speaker's status was taken for granted in the country.

He enquired when this started and wondered why they were escorted as they were not under any kind of



threat. He said this must come to an end, and if the security leaders were carrying their duties with honesty and dignity, they would not have anything to fear.

He stated that in the past, the security bosses were never escorted and only had designated drivers. He said currently the country was going through an economic crisis and

instead of cutting costs; they committed resources to their escorts, which were not necessary.

Magongo said the only rightful people who needed to be escorted were His Majesty the King, Queen Mother, Prime Minister and Deputy Prime Minister. He said this must come to an end as it was a waste of the country's resources.

TODDLER (2) DROWNS IN

A modern nuclear family at Gelekeceni in Ezulwini has been left engulfed with horror and heartache after their two-year-old baby drowned in a bathtub full of water yesterday morning.

Narrating the ordeal, the mother of the toddler Sihle Lukhele said she was running her bath and getting ready for work. "I thought my daughter was sleeping when I filled my bathtub with water, and all I heard then was a scream from the bathroom and utter silence thereafter,"

The visibly-shaken mother said she could not believe it when she found her only daughter floating in the bathtub. In an effort to try and save her baby's life she took her and tried to apply first aid methods through pumping the chest so that she could cough out the water but this was to no avail as baby Aviwe was not

"I called my husband and he helped me ascertain the situation and unfortunately, our baby did not respond and that is then when we decided to take her to the hospital and she was certified dead on arrival," explained the mother.

The father of the baby, Ncamiso Ndlangamandla said he had nothing to say as he was still in shock and utter pain with the loss of his only child. "My sister, can we have privacy as a family as we are still faced with this situation. I have nothing to say for now," lamented Ndlamangandla. Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Superintendent Phindile Vilakati said nothing has been reported to them regarding a baby drowning incident but she will continue checking if there was any new information. "For now nothing has been reported to us regarding this incident but we do encourage people to report such happenings to us as they are of serious concern in the kingdom," closed Vilakati.

Vilakati then gave safety tips on how drowning incidents can be avoided in homes and make sure that everyone is safe especially toddlers and infants. "Avoid leaving children unattended and always make sure that they play where they can be closely monitored, parents should never leave water filled containers such as basins and buckets which children have easy access to," explained Vilakati. She said if they have to store water for later usage, making sure it is with tightly closed containers. Closing taps tightly also helps especially in bathtubs and

Roads Agency coming next year

THE Roads Agency is expected to start operating next year.

This was said by Minister of Public Works and Transport Chief Ndlaluhlaza Ndwandwe in the House of Assembly. This was during the second quarter performanced of the works ministry, which took place on Tuesday.

Ndwandwe said for now, the Bill on which the agency would work was still with the attorney general's office. He expressed hope that the Bill would be tabled in Parliament next year and be passed by the Legislature

The Roads Agency's role will be to help the public works ministry to maintain the country's roads so that they would be in the right condition. The agency's operation will depend on what the Bill would say. However, the idea behind the operation of the agency was that motorists would pay a certain fuel levy so that it could enable the agency to

operate and have money to build and maintain the country's roads. For every fuel filled up in any vehicle, a certain percentage would be taken from the money paid for that fillup towards the survival and role of the agency.

In short, the agency would survive like the Sincephetelo Motor Vehicle Accident Fund (SMVAF), which is commonly known as the MVA.

Ntfonjeni MP Sifiso Sompisi Magagula said they were happy with the development. However, he was worried that such developments could be delayed because the process was not entirely in the hands of the minister. He called upon the minister to make use of the public works portfolio committee, should some challenges arise.

The idea of the Roads Agency was reportedly conceived in 2011, during the ninth Parliament. The 10th Parliament was set up and dissolved, without anything being done in terms of setting up the agency. The agency is said to have the potential of making around E60 million a year and it could make more than that, as time went on.

HUMAN RIGHTS COMMISSION

THE Commission on Human Rights has been accused of underperforming by members of Parliament (MPs).

The legislators have questioned the visibility and efforts made by the commission in advocating, prevention, promotion and monitoring of human rights violations through promotion and fostering the rule of law and good governance.

The Commission on Human Rights and Public Administration (CHRPA) was established in terms of Section 163 of the Constitution of the Kingdom of Assembly portfolio committee

VER 5 000 CUMCISED

THE Voluntary Medical Male Circumcision (VMMC) has seen over 5 000 males being circumcised in the past three months.

This is reflected in the ministry of health quarterly report, which shows that a total of 5 629 circumcisions were performed in the past three months.

During the three-month period, 51 per cent of the total number of circumcisions were performed in August during the second 'Back to School' campaign conducted nationally across all regions.

August saw 2 841 males circumcised while in July 1 432 were circumcised. The VMMC is one of the prioritised interventions that the country has adopted as an additional way of strengthening HIV prevention over the past months.

This is one of the projects that target males directly and also extends to sexual partners once they commence sexual activity.

The report states that it is also offers a package that includes HIV testing services, age appropriate condom promotion and distribution, screening and treatment of sexually transmitted infections and risk reduction counselling.

The report also states that the programme aims at reaching a target of 70 per cent of males, aged 10 to 49 circumcised by the end of the year.

The circumcisions were conducted across multiple health facilities in all four regions.

In order to prepare healthcare professionals for the circumcision exercise, a total number of 473 completing cohort of students from Southern Africa Nazarene University, University of Eswatini (UNESWA) and Christian Medical University and 25 nurses from facilities were trained. However, the ministry laments that it is unable to conduct in-service training of health care workers.

The ministry further reports that some clients who have tested positive for HIV are not initiated on ART immediately due to individual based reasons, including readiness.

Another HIV prevention tool, which is still new, introduced by the ministry is oral pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP).

A total of 1 534 people were initiated on oral pre-exposure prophylaxis in the current quarter.

The 1 534 comes from 73 health centres in the country. Hhohho region has 24 facilities that offer PrEP, making it the region with most people. Manzini comes second with 18 facilities, Shiselweni with 17 and lastly, Lubombo with 14.

Hlane council member accused of stealing sickly man's land

A member of a council which oversees Hlane has been accused of abusing his powers by allocating himself land which belongs to a chronically ill resident.

Hlane is under the leadership of a traditional council which is referred to as Libandla. The council is responsible for allocating land to residents, either by kukhonta, or those who want to extend already existing homesteads.

A member of the council, Gadla Tfwala is being accused of taking advantage of a sickly resident and grabbing his land for his own use.

The owner of the land, Gary Vilane has reported the matter to the King's Liaison Officer (Ndabazabantu) Makholokholo Khumalo for redress.

When speaking to this publication, Vilane disclosed that he acquired land at Hlane near Njojane through kukhonta in 2004. He was allocated land near the late Prime Minister Barnabas Dlamini's home and other notable figures in the community.

Vilane said he underwent all the traditional norms before the land was endorsed as his. A couple of years later, Vilane said he acquired a chronic illness which compelled him to visit hospital in South Africa, Johannesburg at least once every month.

He decided to stay at one of his homesteads in Matsapha to minimise the travelling costs.

Fast forward to 2019, Vilane said he received a report to the effect that his homestead at Hlane has been invaded by a person who is preparing to erect a structure of his own. It transpired that the person was a member of the traditional council.

Upon making an inquiry, Vilane said he was told that his land was too big for one man. Vilane said what confused him more was the mere fact that the person who was 'forcefully' occupying his land was the very same individual who has a voice in allocating land to residents.

"When I enquired about this anomaly, Tfwala boasted that he has royal blood and I would never win a case against him," said Vilane as he struggled to maintain his strength. Vilane said he eventually reported the matter to Ndabazabantu where it was deliberated intensively.

The King's Liaison officer confirmed having received a complaint from Vilane. Khumalo said his office attended to the matter and made a ruling.

"Our findings indicated that Tfwala abused his powers and trespassed into another resident's land and it was ordered that he must vacate the said land," said Khumalo. Khumalo said, however, it has been gathered that Tfwala defied the ruling and continued to clear the land in preparation to erect a structure. He said his office has once again summoned both parties to a meeting which is scheduled for next week.

UNDP buys over E600 000 equipment for 8 border posts

THE United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) has once again sponsored the Kingdom of Eswatini with 11 ozone depleting substances identification equipment worth E617 804.

The handover was held at the Mountain Inn Hotel yesterday. The equipment was specifically donated to the Eswatini Revenue Authority (SRA) and it will be used by the customs officers in the eight commercial border posts in the kingdom.

When handing over the equipment, Minister of Tourism and Environmental Affairs Moses Vilakati said the Kingdom of Eswatini is grateful to the international partners, the Ozone Secretariat under UNEP and Multilateral Fund for the continued support in enabling the country to comply with the obligations of playing a pivotal role in eliminating ozone depleting substances.

The 11 refrigerant identifiers will assist custom officers to analyse the contents of refrigerants being imported, thus preventing the smuggling of ozone depleting substances into the country. The minister said identifiers would assist in verifying the contents of each ozone depleting substance cylinder as importers may

falsely label them. "This material is useful in the analysing of the composition of the ODS, refrigerants, their blends and also in the identification of hydrocarbons which have zero ozone depleting potential and low global warming potential," Vilakati said.

He further stated that the Eswatini Environment Authority (EEA), through the National Ozone Unit, collaborates with the SRA in the effective implementation of the regulations by monitoring importation or exportation of ozone depleting substances in all the ports of entry in the kingdom as mandated by Section 14 of the Ozone Depleting Substances Regulation of 2003.

He said the collaboration between the two organisations was highly recognised by the government as demonstrated by the multitudes of illegal ODS consignments detained in the ports of entry. Vilakati said since the inception of the ODS phase out programme, 130 custom officers have been trained as part of the capacity building component of the programme.

"It is of paramount importance that we continue to collaborate as well in the ODS training of the officers and if possible sustain these capacity building initiatives to ensure that our officers are aligned with what is happening within the region and globally," he said.

ESWATINI LEADS WORLD IN CERVICAL CANCER RATE

CERVICAL cancer is a grave threat to women in Eswatini, and must be taken seriously as the country has the highest rate of cervical cancer in the world.

This was revealed by United Sates Ambassador to Eswatini Lisa Peterson during the launch of the Hhohho and Shiselweni regional police clinic facilities held at Mbabane old police station yesterday.

She said in Eswatini, more that 75 out of every 100 000 women had cervical cancer in 2018, which was the highest rate among the 185 countries evaluated. She mentioned that by comparison, in the US, the cervical cancer incidence rate was 7.6 per 100 000 women.

The ambassador encouraged all women to go for cervical cancer and breast cancer screening.

She also encouraged men to consider voluntary medical male circumcision, which could both prevent cervical cancer among their partners and improve men's chances of not contracting HIV. Peterson commended the collaboration between the ministry of health and the REPS for setting up police wellness centres.

"It is through joint efforts such as these that vital health and well-being services were brought to communities, improving health care access for everyone," she said.

She said it was often difficult for people in for-

mal sector employment to find time to visit health facilities and a facility tailored to the needs of police officers improved the likelihood that they would seek services in a timely manner.

She noted that a majority of police officers were men, and there was a growing body of research that suggested that men globally had poor healthcare seeking behaviour, especially for preventive and wellness services, as well as when conditions became severe.

She said men in Eswatini were much less likely to be aware of their HIV status than women and came for treatment later. She added that this behaviour actively exposed the men's partners to the risk of contracting HIV.

She added that these centres located on site would provide police officers and the neighbouring communities with comprehensive health care and easy, confidential access to HIV testing and improved medication.

The ambassador stated that the US Government through its President's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief (PEPFAR) was proud to have partnered with the ministry of health and the REPS to help make health services more accessible for the police and communities around the facilities.

She thanked the implementing partners for their support in ensuring these wellness centres were fully functional and met the standards required for a full-service health care facility.

She further applauded Cabinet for steps taken as it sought to provide quality health services for all the people of Eswatini.

POLICE HEALTH FACILITIES TREAT OVER 320 PATIENTS DAILY

ROYAL Eswatini Police Services (REPS) health facilities provide services to over 320 patients on a daily basis.

The REPS is committed to providing quality health care services, not only to their members but the general public as well.

This was revealed by the National Commissioner of Police (NatCom) William Tsitsibala Dlamini during the official launch of the Hhohho and Shiselweni regional police clinic facilities held at the Mbabane old police station yesterday.

These facilities are an addition to two other clinics which became operational in 2016, located at the Matsapha Police Academy and Ngonini OSSU Base.

He said on a daily basis, the clinics combined rendered public health services to over 70 police officers and about 250 private patients, specialising in the provision of primary prevention services, quality medical care through treatment, care and support, as well as anti-retroviral therapy in a customer friendly environment with particular emphasis on cost-effectiveness, confidentiality and customer satisfaction.

Dlamini said the police service's endeavour to decentralise health services was an effort to implement the Police Health Strategy 2016-2022 whose primary aim was the provision of high quality preventive, curative and rehabilitative services that were relevant and accessible.

He said the initiative started as a mere human resource welfare issue, and has now become an essential instrument to address, not only the

health, wellness and safety challenges for officers and their immediate family members, but also extended to clients and members of the public in the neighbouring communities.

He mentioned that the very nature of police work predisposed officers to a wide variety of diseases, danger, threat and traumatic experiences. All these elements contributed to making officers' lives susceptible to sicknesses and psychological overload.

"As we launch these two health facilities, our aim is to cushion officers from the impact of sickness, which invariably culminates to staff attrition due to obvious factors, such as low performance and poor service delivery in the workplace," he said.

He challenged all police officers to adopt and develop positive and healthy lifestyles by going for routine health check-ups, eat balanced meals, exercise regularly and keep fit, as well as proactively attending to personal health issues.

He conveyed the REPS' sincere gratitude to the Government of the United States of America through the Ambassador to Eswatini Lisa Peterson, for taking the initiative in leading from the front in all matters relating to health, particularly on HIV prevention and treatment.

"The two clinic projects we are launching today would not have been such a great success without the generous funding and technical support from the President's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief (PEPFAR) in conjunction with Elizabeth Glaser Pediatric AIDS Foundation (EGPAF) in terms of on-site refurbishment, furniture and medical equipment," he said.

He also complimented Minister of Health Lizzy Nkosi for her astute leadership acumen and her resolution to renew the long existing relationship between the police service and ministry of health. He said the ministry played a pivotal role in the procurement of appropriate medical supplies for the health facilities despite the challenging socio-economic environment in the coun-

He added that the ministry also seconded two qualified nurses who were working with police nurses in an effort to effectively attend to the high number of patients attended to each day.

The NatCom also mentioned that as a police service, they would always prioritise occupational health and safety and ensure there was psycho-social support readily available for stress and trauma incidence victims.

Mabila Attorneys dump socialite 'Gauzen'

MBABANE entrepreneur and socialite Menzi 'Gauzen' Gama has accused his attorneys of breaching their initial agreement due to incessant hike of legal fees.

Gama, who was represented by Mabila Attorneys in a case where he has been accused of raping a young woman, revealed that he had paid the law firm a specific amount of money, which both parties had agreed upon.

This was after Gama's attorneys approached the court to apply for a withdrawal of legal services.

It is worth mentioning that Gama's trial was set to commence today and continue on November 20.

"My agreement with my attorneys stated that I was to pay a certain amount of money for them to handle the case throughout the duration of the trial.

I had already paid the full amount; however, every time there was to be an appearance before the court I was made to pay more money. I can no longer afford to pay more money than I already have," Gama stated.

Gama further informed the court that his attorneys recommended a South African attorney to handle his matter, however, he was discouraged when he discovered that the new attorney would charge almost E18 000 for each court appearance.

"Your Worship, my business is not doing as well as it used to and I am only a small time businessman. I had requested a lawyer friend ...as socialite claims breach of agreement due to hike in legal fees.

of mine to represent me during the course of the trial, at lower rates. I cannot afford the kind of money that Mabila Attorneys wants from me," he emphasised.

Presiding Principal Magistrate Fikile Nhlabatsi informed Gama that the court's hands were tied, as it was unaware of the country's attorney fees.

"The court cannot comment or issue an order with regards to the agreement you had with your attorneys.

Please attempt to seek legal counsel so that your matter can commence," the judicial officer stated.

After informing the court that he needed at least two months to hire an attorney to represent him, the court postponed his matter to February 6, 2020 for resetting of his matter.

According to previous reports, Gama was arrested and charged with rape on March 25, 2018, when he was said to have raped a 28-yearold woman.

Gama reportedly committed the offence at his place of abode in Mahwalala, after a drinking spree at the popular hangout spot Solani's Shisanyama.

After his arrest, Gama vehemently denied commission of the offence in his urgent bail application before the High Court.

Through his attorney Linda Dlamini of Mabila Attorneys, he stated that the sexual intercourse between the two parties was consensual.

Wife told me to tear marriage certificate - dejected man

AFTER having been married for a year, a man claimed that his wife asked him to tear up their marriage certificate, as she was no longer interested in the marriage.

A heartbroken Leonard Simelane claimed that after a few months of marriage, his wife packed her bags and left for her paternal homestead.

Simelane has since approached the court to file for divorce on grounds of malicious desertion, after his wife deserted their matrimonial home on July 3.

"She just started displaying anger towards me for no reason whatsoever, and she would tell me numerous times that she would pack her bags and go back to her paternal home. This was until she eventually did so in July 2019," Simelane stated.

According to Simelane, his wife's words stung him, as she asked that he must not refer to her as his wife, and he should not refer to himself as her husband.

"She told me in the face that I should tear our marriage certifi-

cate apart, and that I should do whatever I wanted with it as she did not care about our marriage anymore. That was when I approached her father to ascertain the root cause of his daughter's anger. However, I never received any responses from them," Simelane ended that he knew

Simelane added that he knew his marriage was in trouble when, after meeting with her father, his wife sent him a text message asking him to burn all her belongings. "The heated text message from my wife stated that I should burn all her belongings she had left in our home, as she did not intend coming back to get them. She emphassed that she did not want to see me again.

I am pleading with the court to request her to come back to me, so that we can resolve our problems as I still love her," he added.

Simelane and his wife weremarried through civil rites in November 2018 in Matsapha, after which they established their matrimonial home at Sidvwashini.

The court ordered that Simelane be granted a final decree of divorce, in the event that his wife did not restore conjugal rights within 14 days.

On Time investors run to court

SOME of the individuals who invested their monies into On Time Investments (Pty) Limited have run to court where they are seeking a relief.

Ten of the investors yesterday filed an urgent application at the High Court

for an order compelling the company to compensate them of their investments.

Sibusiso Dlamini and nine others who are applicants in the matter filed the application under a certificate of urgency.

They are represented by Mbabane based lawyer Vusi Thomo of Thomo, Maziya Attorneys law firm in the matter. On Time Investments is the same company whose offices were recently stormed by over 100 people who were demanding an explanation after being informed that it had cut off its business relationship with them.

Dlamini is demanding payment of E158 125 in respect of his investments with the company.

Family of four attacked set alight inside family car

FOUR members of a family, including their father, were attacked with the family car doused with petrol and set alight.

The head of the family was torched to death. The gruesome incident happened at Etimphandze in the Shiselweni region, where four men were eventually arrested in connection with the murder of the deceased. Simon Ngomane Zwane, Sipho Mfanimpela Zwane, Veli Mcandzeni Mamba and Sibusiso Zwane have since been indicted at the High Court for the murder of Mndobandoba Masuku.

According to the indictment, they are facing a total of four counts with the first being the murder of the deceased, the second being assault with intent to cause grievous bodily harm in that they assaulted Ntsandvo Masuku by hacking him with a bushknife with the intent to kill him. The third being assault common in that they unlawfully assaulted Phila Masuku with stones on the head while on the last count, they are charged with malicious injury to property in that they

set the car alight.

According to one of the witnesses Melusi Masuku, who is a victim and was present at the scene of crime, he was in the car with the deceased, Ntsandvo and Ndoda Mathunjwa as Mathunjwa was driving for his father, the deceased while he (Melusi) was seated on the front seat of the vehicle and the minor child, Ntsandvo was at the back seat.

One of the other applicants who recently filed a similar application Zwelithini Mndzebele of Manzini, claimed to have invested a sum of E143 750 with On Time Investments.

The applicants in the matter informed the court that they entered into an agreement with the company and alleged that it was the material term of the agreement that the company would lease photocopying machines to third parties for rental and in turn would be paid monies for the period agreed upon.

Agreement

Mndzebele averred that in the agreement he had with the company, they were to pay him a sum of E12 500 per month per machine for a period of 48 months and the intended lease, rental agreement was to commence on June 6, 2019 and expire on June 6, 2023.

Mndzebele informed the court that in compliance with the agreement, he paid a total sum of E143

750 to the defendant's (company) bank account on June 6, and was issued with a receipt. But in breach of the agreement, the defendant has not paid the plaintiff (Mndzebele) the monthly sum of E12 500 for the months of September and October.

He averred that in the premise, the defendant was liable to him for the rentals for September and October in the sum of E25 000, plus the sum of E143 750 being a refund of the money invested plus inter-



Mphandzeni road, they suddenly came across rocks which had blocked the road and in a bid to gain access to the road leading home, the vehicle stopped and he came out to remove the rocks.

However, just when he was removing the rocks, a hail of stones flew towards their car and that is

This witness then got the opportunity to flee but the first accused pursued him.

He managed to outpace the accused person who only hit him with a stone on his ear.

The witness further stated that he ran towards a homestead belonging to a Sihlongonyane family where he reported the whole ordeal and sought for help.

By then deceased's car was up in flames as they were at a distance.

Other residents were alerted and they proceeded to the car and found that the deceased had been burnt to death inside the car before members of the Royal Eswatini Police Service were called.

More children, adolescents on ART in 2019

THERE was an increase in the number of children and adolescents on antiretroviral treatment (ART) in 2019.

According to a second quarter performance report for the ministry of health, there is a significant increase in the number of children and adolescents who are on ART compared to 2018. Currently, there are 8 908 children and adolescents under the ART

In every six weeks this year, compared to 2019, there was a noted one per cent increase. The report states that new formulations have been improved by World Health Organisation raltergravir for neonates. New adolescents are being initiated.

This is due to the fact that adolescents are sexually active and are being infected by HIV. Since 2014, teenage pregnancy has been increasing by 14.6 per cent.

The ministry, according to the report, has introduced several activities to improve the numbers. The ministry has launched teen clubs which are supported by regional health partners in order for them to function.

Secondly, the use of DBS viral load which help with paediatrics phlebotomy. This has been a problem for health workers and targets only the under fives.

The ministry also has an Early Infant Diagnosis Point-Of-Care (EID POC) pilot and 19 platforms have been placed in facilities and the project will end next month.

Global Fund was asked to fund the project. The ministry has also strengthened birth testing where government working with SRH will be using POC and convectional method till next month. The future of the above stated programmes will be determined by Global Fund support.

The ministry also listed several challenges that they encounter in the ART. In the report, the ministry stated that the paediatric has not reached the targeted 90 per cent.

This is because some parents refuse or delay. their children from being enrolled on ART despite getting HIV results early.

Another challenge highlighted in the report is that the viral suppression has not reached 90 per cent. In addition to the challenges, it was noted that teenage pregnancy is still on the rise as well as new infections in adoles-

A total number of 210 sensitisation workshops on PCS concepts to healthcare workers and community care givers were held. These figures are contained under psychological care and support programme activities for the period of July to September.

These orientation workshops provide an excellent opportunity to introduce the concept of self-care, stress management and team building concept to health-care work-

These were regional psychologists, 120 juvenile educators were also trained. Regional psychologists were able to counsel 28 patients.

The individual counsellings were sessions carried per request and in collaboration with the wellness focal person

MTN records increase in MoMo deposits

AFTER witnessing a two-month decline in the funds deposited into MTN Mobile Money, there is a notable increase in deposits at the close of October.

In the last two months, the total amount deposits dropped by E6.6 million in August, while in September it dropped by E5.6 million. However, by the end of October, the total funds deposited into MTN MoMo increased by E18.4 mil-

MTN Eswatini Corporate Affairs Manager Mandla Luphondvo said the increased rate was also notable in the last month. There was also an improvement in the payment of water and

He said this meant that MTN MoMo customers were using the payment platform to enjoy the convenience of paying for different services in the convenience of their home.

"A few years ago, MTN introduced the paynent of nine different government taxes through MoMo. The money deposited and used within MTN MoMo has also improved by E7.5 million by the end of October," he added.

Luphondvo said from an overall drop of E9.7 million in September, MTN MoMo registered an overall improvement of E53.7 million by the end of October.

He said as the festive season draws closer, it is expected that the performance of MTN MoMo would continue to improve as users distribute annual savings and make payments in the convenience of their homes rather than physically moving from one outlet to the next.

He added that MTN Eswatini encouraged the use of safe platforms like MoMo to reduce incidents of lost or stolen cash.

"As customers move their salaries, annual savings and bonuses, to pay for different services, they must always keep their PIN safe to ensure that the platform remains safe for users," he said.

Luphondvo said as they head towards the festive season, there would be different typologies of fraud. He said most of these approaches used by fraudsters appeal to different vulnerable groups, and promise prospects for employment,

MANCLAIMS HE WATCHED GANG MEMBER RAPE WOMAN

IN a rather bizarre case, a witness in a rape case testified to the effect that the suspect raped the survivor while he 'watched'.

In his evidence in chief, Mxolisi Thwala told the court that he was returning from a night vigil at Gelekeceni when the incident occurred.

"I offered a young lady a lift, who requested that I drop her off at her rented flat near Siwela *Umphakatsi*. Along the way, I stopped to buy myself a cold beverage and I noticed a large group of men seated around a bonfire, where it seemed they were burning stadium chairs. After discovering that the bar was closed, I drove towards the woman's place of abode to drop her off," Thwala recalled.

Thwala added that as he dropped the woman off, she asked him to accompany her to her door, as she was afraid of thugs, especially the notorious gang, AmaBenjamini.

"I walked her to her door and as I turned around to return to my car, the large group of men accosted me and forced me into her one-room flat. I noticed that the ring leader was carrying a 60 centimetre long knife, which also seemed to have been home made.

The other members of the gang entered the flat and helped themselves to various items belonging to the woman, while the ringleader threatened to stab us with the knife," he stated.

According to Thwala, while the other gang members left the flat to break into his car parked outside, the ringleader instructed both of them to undress.

"He ordered me to remove my trousers and climb on the woman's bed. He also ordered me to close my eyes, or he will stabs us.

I obliged, and as I sat on the bed, I heard him order the woman to undress so that he could rape her. All this time, she was begging him not to rape her, as he had already helped himself to her belongings.

At this point, I was helpless as I was afraid he would kill us," Thwala stated, much to the shock of the court. The ringleader, true to his word, proceeded to rape the woman, while Thwala sat

on the bed with his eyes closed.

However, Thwala claimed that after some time, he decided to open one eye and when he did, it was his saving grace.

"With one eye open, I noticed that the perpetrator had placed the home made knife beside the bed and on the floor.

I also observed that the knife had a shoelace attached to it, which I knew that if I pulled it, I would get the knife and finally have the upper hand.

Perpetrator

Unfortunately, the perpetrator saw me reach for the knife and a scuffle ensued.

We fought over the knife and after some time, I overpowered him and after seeing that he did not stand a chance, he ran off into darkness.

That was when we raised an alarm and the woman was taken to the hospital for examination," Thwala explained.

Thwala informed the court that, before he handed the knife over to the police as an exhibit, he elected to conduct his own investigation on its owner.

"I asked people around the community to assist me in finding the owner of the knife and I discovered that it belonged to a man named Sibusiso Dlamini, who was linked to the AmaBenjamini gang. I duly informed the police of my findings, thus handing the knife in as evidence.

Funny enough, before I dropped the woman at her place of abode, I saw Dlamini sitting around the fire with a large group of men.

They must have seen me and followed us to the woman's home," Thwala concluded. Sibusiso Dlamini, alongside Delisa Vilakati, are facing charges of rape and robbery in another matter.

The victim in that case gave evidence to the effect that one of the perpetrators was carrying a knife similar to the one Thwala described.

The knife handed in as evidence in the case by Thwala was linked to the rape case, which saw another woman being raped at knife point, allegedly by two perpetrators.

Vilakati, who is the area's *umgijimi*, has disputed all evidence presented to the court, claiming that none of the evidence brought by the Crown's witnessed directly linked him to the rape.

The matter was postponed to a later late.

Mother claims she sells dagga for food

A mother has claimed that starvation has been the main reason why she saw it fit to sell dagga.

Lobayeni Magagula (49) will join the thousands of dagga dealers behind bars, after she was found to have been in illegal possession of dagga.

Claiming that her four children needed to be fed, Magagula explained that she was unemployed and the businesses she had started had failed, dismally. "Your Worship, I am aware that dagga is an illegal substance, however, the returns of sale for the product are profitable. I needed to feed my children and I saw that selling dagga was the only way to do so. Magagula was arrested and charged with contravening the Pharmacy Act, after she was found to have been in possession of 5.5 kilograms of dagga. She was found to have been in possession of the illegal substance on November 11, 2019 at KaNcesi area.

After hearing her mitigation, Principal Magistrate Fikile Nhlabatsi sentenced Magagula to pay a fine of E3 000 and in default of payment, serve two years in prison for being in possession of dagga.

Upon arrival at the homestead, the police searched the house where the three were sleeping and dagga consignments were found stashed in refuse bags.



She added that this year was the 10th anniversary of the disease. She said pneumonia affected people of all ages, however, it is severe illness that may result in death.

"In the country, pneumonia is one of the top five causes of all illness and deaths in children," she said.

Due to the seriousness of the condi-

RAPE CHARGES A FABRICATION BY FAMILY - SUSPECT

A suspect who has been charged with rape told the court that the charges against him were a fabrication by some of his family members who want to see him sent to jail.

Sonkhe Masina appeared before the Magistrate's Court where he faced a charge of rape. He is alleged to have wrongfully and unlawfully had sexual intercourse with an elderly woman.

The charge is accompanied by aggravating factors in that the accused person inflicted the complainant with lifetime trauma following the incident.

the accused person pleaded not guilty to the charge while conducting his own defence.

The crown paraded two witnesses who presented their evidence before court. One of the witnesses told the court that she found the accused person in the act of committing the crime. She stat-

During cross-examination, the accused person disputed the evidence of the witness. He stated that the charges were fabricated by some of his family members who had personal issues with him. He alleged that the real feud between him and his family members was an estate which he was entitled

"Some family members want to send me to jail so that they can have access to my father's estate which includes farming fields," he said.

The accused person admitted to have visited the elderly woman's home on the day of the alleged incident. He stated that he went there to check on the elderly woman as per the norm for neighbours. ed that the accused person sneaked into the hut The matter was eventually adjourned and ordered to return to court next Tuesday.

Man jailed three years for brutal assault of another

A domestic fight between two neighbours saw one of them being sent to the correctional services facility for three years after he was found guilty of assault.

Bhekithemba Ndzabandzaba (38) of Maphungwane was alleged to have assaulted Sifiso Matsebula by hitting him with a knobstick several times on the head and body, leaving him with multiple injuries. The accused person appeared before the Magistrate's Court where he faced a charge of assault with intent to cause grievous bodily harm.

When the charge sheet was read to him, the accused pleaded guilty while conducting his own defence. He, however, argued that he acted in self-defence, saying the complainant was the one who attacked him.

Engaged

The two men were said to have engaged in a fierce fight after they met along a pathway in their home area. They reportedly had long standing differences which emanated from a woman who was in a love triangle with both of them.

When presenting his evidence, the complainant told the court that he had to receive a number of stitches on the head and face after the accused person hit him with the knobstick. He said he was rescued by a neighbour who intervened in the assault as he attempted to fight back.

In mitigation, the accused person asked the court to be lenient when passing sentence. He maintained his stance that he acted in self-defence.

When issuing sentence, the court noted that the complainant sustained serious injuries which could have resulted to death if he was not rushed to hospital. For this, the accused person was sentenced to three years in a correctional facility with an option to pay E3 000 fine. The accused person was taken to the facility after he falled to pay for the fine.

KEY ISSUES TO CONSIDER AS COUNTRY ROLLS OUT WAC



LAST week Wednesday marked an important milestone in the National HIV and AIDS Multisectoral Response to HIV and AIDS in the Kingdom of Eswatini.

The Prime Minister Ambrose Mandvulo Dlamini in a historic event held at the Royal Villas in Ezulwini, launched two key national documents (the National Prevention Policy 2019 and the Eswatini Stigma Index Report 2019); a Regional Small Grants Programme for People Living with HIV; and the 2019 World AIDS Campaign/World AIDS Day (WAC/WAD).

The launched documents and initiatives will contribute to the national efforts towards the vision of Ending AIDS as a public health threat by 2022, which is ultimately the HIV Response's contribution to the First World Eswatini envisaged by His Majesty King Mswati III.

The prime minister, as head of government and line minister for the HIV response, noted that ending AIDS is possible only when all of us commit ourselves to unapologetically and steadily work towards this goal and further-committed to support the national HIV response.

Currently, the response to HIV and AIDS is implemented against a background of a very tight fiscal space.

However, government has continuously protected investment to HIV and AIDS and the social sectors, with over 40 per cent of resources required currently sourced from domestic investments.

This did not stop the prime minister from announcing that the Government of the Kingdom of Eswatini through NERCHA will provide a kick-start programme (E800 000 pledged) directed at supporting PLHIV at grassroots level.

The Regional Small Grants Programme will ensure that befitting groups of PLHIV access small grants to implement livelihood programmes on HIV at community level. The programme will be monitored closely and depending on annual performance, decisions will be made on future investments.

The grants programme is a commendable initiative indeed. However, for the country to achieve the goal of ending AIDS, eight years earlier than the world, there is need for even-more deliberate to reduce new HIV infections,

reduce AIDS-related deaths, prevent mother-to-child transmission, and eliminate stigma and discrimination. These are key advocacy issues as the HIV and AIDS response rolls out WAC/WAD 2019.

REDUCE NEW HIV INFECTIONS

In the Kingdom of Eswatini, globally and within the SADC region, new HIV infections have dropped, which is good news.

Since 2014 new infections have dropped by 44 per cent from a high of 2.9 per cent in 2014 to 1.5 per cent in 2017. The HIV Estimates and Projections report shows that new infections will further drop to 1.24 per cent by 2024.

I encourage you to maintain your focus on the interventions that have resulted in the reduction of new HIV Infections.

At the same time there are still pockets of concern, where some subpopulations have not been reached with prevention and treatment services.

A higher proportion of new infections occur among young people aged 15-24 – with HIV incidence among adolescent girls and young women continuing to remain worryingly high - and about 15 per cent of People Living with HIV and AIDS (PLHIV) remain unaware of their HIV status, with a majority being men and children below 14 years.

Also, the final transmission rate at the end of breastfeeding, estimated at 7.8 per cent in 2018 and projected to be 4.87 per cent by 2024, is a concern

This evidence both challenges us and best equips us to design innovative programmes to ensure our HIV response leaves no one behind.

The current HIV incidence of 1.5 per cent among those aged 15-24 is not enough to achieve epidemic control, if the vision of Ending AIDS is to be achieved.

In response, the country has in the National Multisectoral HIV and AIDS Strategic Framework (NSF) 2018-2023 set ambitious targets of:

Reducing HIV incidence among persons aged
 15-49 years by 85 per cent;

Reducing new infections among infants aged
 0-1 year to less than 0.05 per cent;

We need therefore to find new and innovative ways to reinvigorate the prevention response to be able to achieve reduction of new infections as stated in the NSF. The recently published Sitakhela Likusasa study carried out in the Kingdom provides evidence that it is possible to find innovative ways to improve prevention programming.

Development partners and key stakeholders in the response need to look at the Sitakhela Likusasa study closely and implement some of the recommendations while continuing to investigate other new ways to deliver prevention services.

REDUCE AIDS-RELATED DEATHS

Additional to reducing new HIV infections, the country needs to focus on reducing AIDS deaths.

Since the country introduced life-saving antiretroviral therapy (ART) in 2003 and further upscaled its delivery in 2010, over 70 000 lives have been saved.

Further, through the continued and decen-

tralised provision of ART, the country has realised a steady decline in annual AIDS deaths to an estimated 3 500 in 2017.

The 2019 HIV Estimates and Projections Report indicate that in 2018, AIDS-related deaths with ART were estimated to be 2 400 and will decline to 1 900 in 2024. AIDS-related deaths were estimated at 300 among children, 0-14 years in 2018 and projected to decline to 100 by 2024.

This reflects that though it is possible to achieve our goal, there is quite an amount of work that still needs to be done to reach the 2022.

Targeting the 'hard to reach' populations, which include adolescents and young people, adult men, key populations, mobile populations, prisoners and persons with disabilities, will help strengthen our resolve as a country to end AIDS by 2022.

To ensure that all PLHIV know their status, we need to expand and deliver interventions to reach the 'left-behind' populations.

The government of the Kingdom of Eswatini continues to ensure that people living with HIV have access to numerous HIV services, including antiretroviral therapy (ART) which government remains committed to fully funding, especially for adult formulations.

Ensuring not only full access to the life-saving drugs but expanding into and ensuring proper nutrition for those living with and affected by HIV, will result in an improved quality of life and will contribute to long and productive lives – which should positively impact the economy.

PREVENT MOTHER-TO-CHILD TRANSMISSION OF HIV

The country has for the last couple of years been providing the universal access to ART approach (also known as test and treat).

This strategy involves providing ART to all people living with HIV upon diagnosis of an HIV+ status, regardless of CD4 cell count

eligibility or WHO clinical staging. The introduction of this strategy led to the adoption of the World Health Organisation recommended Option B+ guidelines to prevent mother to child transmission, in which all pregnant women living with HIV immediately start lifelong ART.

There has since been a notable increase in the number of women of reproductive age who are receiving antiretroviral therapy regardless of pregnancy status, though the number of HIV positive pregnant women needing ART is projected to decline from 10 900 in 2018 to 8 500 in 2024.

In 2018, the MTCT rate at six weeks of age was estimated at 4.45 per cent and projected to remain the same by 2024. The final transmission rate (at the end of breastfeeding) was estimated at 7.8 per cent in 2018 and projected to be 4.87 per

cent by 2024

ELIMINATE STIGMA AND DISCRIMINATION

Stigma, discrimination and human rights prohibitions are barriers that hinder access to HIV services.

Among PLHIV, self-stigma and fear partly accounts for late initiation on ART, especially among men, and hinders status disclosure and adherence to treatment.

As a result, most people testing HIV positive prefer to seek treatment services in distant health facilities where they are not known.

On the other hand, discrimination deters people from getting tested; it discourages open dialogue and safe practices (around issues of HIV and AIDS in general, condom use, and support for PLHIV), and lowers self-esteem, thus increases the spread of HIV and AIDS.

Stigma and discrimination expose PLHIV to numerous social exclusions and oppressions, and often, the negative social labels they are given, create a negative perception of self, resulting in social withdrawal and self-exclusion as well as self-protective and survival mechanisms.

Ultimately, this undermines preventative strategies, affects health seeking behaviour, and drives the epidemic underground, which perpetuates the vicious and silent nature of the epidemic.

It is everyone's role to ensure that Zero Stigma and Discrimination is achieved in Eswatini. There is need to harness and encourage all (PLHIV and/or affected by HIV) to contribute positively to creating an enabling environment where stigma and discrimination only remains in history books.

COMMUNITIES MAKE THE DIFFERENCE

There is no doubt that the massive scale-up of ART, along with targeted preventions efforts, has improved the survival of people living with

HIV and has become more effective over time to protect their partners and offspring. The Swaziland Vulnerability Assessment

Committee (VAC) back in 2004 predicted that the HIV prevalence rate would lower life expectancy to just 40 years by 2010 but according to World Health Organization data published in 2018, life expectancy in Eswatini is now at 57.7 (55.1 males and 59.9 females).

In the future, AIDS Orphan-hood is expected to subside largely due to declining AIDS-related deaths, with AIDS orphans projected to decline to 28 000 by 2024 from 45 200 in 2018.

But we can still do more to achieve greatness. As the country's HIV and AIDS response engages in the World AIDS Campaign activities that will culminate in World AIDS Day on December 1, there is a need for all of us, in our different geographic communities and sub-populations, to find and stick to an HIV prevention and treatment package and make the difference in the HIV and AIDS response.

LEADERSHIP GREETINGS FOR POWERFUL GIRLS

WE live in societies where leadership is seen as an exclusive preserve for men.

Women and girls are socialised to support men and assist them to flourish in their lead-

They have been made to believe that they do not have it in them to lead. How many times have you heard that women do not have what it takes to become leaders? But what is it really that makes a leader?

If Warren Bernis' definition is anything to go by, then we can make the assumption that leaders are people who are able to express themselves fully. It does not take anything outside of oneself to become a leader.

It requires integrated people who know who they are, what their strengths and weaknesses are, and how to fully deploy their strengths and compensate for their weaknesses. They also know what they want, why they want it, and how to communicate what they want to others, in order to gain their cooperation and support.

Finally, they know how to achieve their goals.

The key to full self-expression is understanding one's self and the world, and the key to understanding is learning—from one's own life and experience.

Young girls and women living in patriarchal societies are already set to not meet this benchmark because their everyday interactions and environments emphasise the need to deny who they are and assume identities defined by selfinterested agents of stagnation and oppression.

These agents, so powerful, then "confer" these identities on the women who struggle to identify with them as they are in conflict with who they are and so fail to become what they set out to be. If society is always quick to point out that women are natural nurturers, why is it difficult to see that the very same nurturing trait is an ingredient for leadership- servant leadership?


This is the kind of leadership that will take us far as societies especially because we do not want people that will become leaders and just put that in their CVs; we need people who will make change and leave a legacy and for something as timeless as that, we need nurturers who have "Ubuntu".

Warren Bennis argues that timeless leadership is always about character, and it is always about authenticity. To underscore this point, psychologist William James wrote, "I have often thought that the best way to define a man's character is to seek out the particular mental or moral attitude in which, when it came upon him, he felt himself most deeply and intensively active and alive.

At such moments, there is a voice inside which speaks and says, "This is the real me."

Young girls, you are encouraged to discover and cultivate that authentic self, the part of you that is most alive, the part that is most you.

Now, as then, finding and nurturing that authentic self is the one sure way of becoming a leader. But that is the hardest part for most of us. Rightly so, because becoming a leader is not easy, just as becoming a doctor or a poet isn't easy, and those who claim otherwise are



fooling themselves. But learning to lead is a lot easier than most of us think it is, because each of us contains the capacity for leadership. In fact, almost every one of us can point to some leadership experience; at home, school, in the church or the community. So, what made us leaders in those instances?

The first thing that our girls need to have for them to become timeless leaders is integrity. This is a difficult one because it calls for ignoring the hypocrisy and double-standards that are pervasive in our societies. The dictionary defines integrity as "the state of being complete, unified." John C. Maxwell sums it up nicely when he says, "When one has integrity, their words and deeds match up."

We struggle everyday with situations that demand decisions between what we want to do and what we ought to do. Integrity establishes the ground rules for resolving these tensions. It determines who we are and how we will respond before the conflict even appears.

It welds what we say, think and do into a vhole person so that permission is never granted for one of these to be out of sync. It binds our person together and fosters a spirit of contentment within us. It will not allow our lips to violate our hearts.

When integrity is the referee, we become consistent- our beliefs are mirrored by our con-

To earn trust, a leader must be authentic. It appears that traditional definitions of leadership makes leadership overrated in our time. It gave so much room for us to be discouraged, based on superstitions, outdated beliefs and oppressive mea-

Today, young people understand that time is of essence. They think on their feet, make rules as they go- even bending and breaking some of them. This new way of thinking is what is going to lead our young people to uncharted worlds.

The leaders of today's digital age, whose world is never still or quite in focus, must depend on compasses, according to Weick.

He explains, "Maps, by definition, can help only in known worlds—worlds that have been charted before. Compasses are helpful when you are not sure where you are and can get only a general sense of direction.'



AFRICANS CHARGED MORE THAN 3.5 TIMES THE 'AFFORDABLE' RATE FOR MOBILE DATA

PEOPLE living in Africa are charged an average of 7.1 per cent of their monthly salary for a gigabyte (GB) of mobile data, more than 3.5 times the threshold considered affordable.

That's according to a report by the Alliance for Affordable Internet (A4AI), which classifies the affordable rate as two per cent of month-

It finds that progress towards competition is stalling across low- and middle-income countries amid consolidation between mobile and internet operators.

The trend threatens to jeopardise the push towards affordable internet access for all, with half the world's population still unable to connect. Even though the 50 per cent mark was reached at the end of last year, that's still far short of the UN's goal of universal access.

The 2019 Affordability Report, published on October 22, estimates that people in countries with low levels of mobile and internet competition pay about US\$3.42 per gigabyte (GB) of data more than those in competitive ones. This premium, says A4AI, is "unaffordable" for many people in low-income countries.

A4AI estimates that 1GB of data costs US\$7.33 more in a country with a monopoly market than one with two mobile operators - with an estimated 260 million people worldwide having access to just one operator, and 589 million living in low-competition countries.

The impact of limited competition is substantial in regions such as Sub-Saharan Africa, where that price equates to about 5.8 per cent of average monthly income.

In a range of countries that A4AI tracked for affordability between April and June 2019, African nations made up the bottom 13, with the price for a gigabyte in those countries at 10 per cent of average monthly income or more.

The figure was as high as 26 per cent in the Democratic Republic of the Congo, and more than 20 per cent in the Central African Republic and Chad.

Lack of competition

Less than half (65 out of 136) of the low- and middle-income countries studied in the report have fully competitive markets, says A4AI.

"This trend underlines the urgency of promoting competition to support healthy markets that provide affordable internet access," it adds. "Policymakers and regulators must work to encourage competition and support new entrants."

Dhanaraj Thakur, research director at the World Wide Web Foundation, which runs A4AI, believes competition must be boosted through regulation to encourage new entrants, more options for public internet access and joint initiatives between the public and private sector, and municipally owned or community

Villages or groups of villages can set up their own not-for-profit networks with services that are relevant to them, Thakur suggests, pointing to examples such as the Zenzeleni communityowned network in rural South Africa.

"Access to broadband internet is still too expensive," he says. "One of the ways to help reduce costs is through greater competition and a greater mix of solutions... We believe not enough is being done in that regard." This requires a concerted push from governments, he adds.

Moving forward

Although progress is slow, Thakur says governments are gradually adopting policies and affordability is improving. The report names Cameroon and Mali, among countries that have helped boost affordability with new national broadband plans.

Fekitamoeloa Katoa 'Utoikamanu at the UN Office of the High Representative for the Least Developed Countries, Landlocked Developing Countries and Small Island Developing States

says the world has seen "tremendous advances" in digital technology, but that millions of people are being "left behind".

She calls for support for the world's poorest countries to form policies, regulations and projects to foster internet access and adoption. "We know all too well that internet access and use significantly shape human, social and eco-

GOVT GETS E600M ADVANCE FROM CBE

GOVERNMENT has accessed an advance of E600 million from the Central Bank of Eswatini (CBE) at the end of October.

This is contained in the Recent Economic Development (RED) report released by the CBE which stated that government accessed the money in the 2019/20 financial year after paying an E1.7 billion advance accessed in the 2018/19 financial year.

"According to the Central Bank Order of 1974, government is expected to repay any Central Bank advances made to her by the end of the first six months after the end of the financial year.

"Accordingly, government repaid the entire E1.7 billion advance which was accessed in the financial year 2018/19 at the beginning of July upon receipt of SACU funds, in line with the requirement of the CBS Order.

"In the financial year 2019/20 government once again accessed an advance of E600 million as at the end of October 2019," it stated.

The RED highlighted that the total domestic debt outstanding stood at E10.6 billion, an equivalent of 15.8 per cent of GDP at the end of October 2019, representing a 7.9 per cent decrease when compared to the previous month.

It stated that the decrease was attributed to the 64 per cent fall in the amount of CBE Advance to government.

During the month of October, the bank on behalf of government issued a total of E160 million in three year, five year, seven year and 10 year bond re-openings.

Total bids received amounted to E174.6 mil-

lion indicating a bid cover ratio of 109 per cent; while allotments made amounted to E133.6 million reflecting an allotment ration of 83.5 per cent

While commercial banks continued to dominate participation in government securities on the shorter end of the yield

curve, non-bank financial institutions dominate on the longer term securities.

Also contained in the reports is that in the month of September, the country recorded an increased trade surplus of E689.3 million compared to E543.1 million the previous month.

The trade balance benefitted from weaker imports in the month.

Exports for the month increased marginally amounting to E2.702 billion, from E2.697 billion in the month of August. The import bill declined in the quarter to register E2.013 billion, down by a monthly 6.6 per cent.

The RED released by the Central Bank of Eswatini noted that an analysis of exports for the month of September show that exports of miscellaneous edibles increased by 3.8 per cent,

to record E1.214 billion from E1.169 billion in August. The commodity continued to dominate Eswatini's exports contributing 44.9 per cent to total exports for the month.

Sugar and sugar product exports, which were valued at E777.3 million, reflecting a

1.0 per cent month-on-month increase.

Meanwhile, receipts from textile and textile apparel declined by 13.5 per cent in the month, amounting to E314.9 million. Wood and wood articles totalled E137.6 million in the month of September, down from the E141.4 million in the previous

On the import side, the country's leading import of energy products increased by 4.9 per cent to total E361.6 million. Imports of machinery, appliances and elec-

trical materials were worth E203.5 million in September, down by 17.5 per cent when compared with August.

Vehicle imports took a downward turn in the month, amounting to E109.8 million from E142.0 million the preceding month. Invoice from plastic and plastic articles declined by 7.4 per cent, totalling E83.7 million.

INFLATION RATE SLOWS TO 1.9 PER CENT

THE country's headline inflation rate was at 1.9 per cent in September, down from 2.0 per cent recorded in August.

According to the Recent Economic Developments (RED) report released by the Central Bank of Eswatini (CBE) consumer inflation mainly benefitted from lower growth in the price indices for furnishing and household equipment, 'transport' and 'miscellaneous goods and services'.

The index for 'furnishing and household equipment' grew by a slower rate of 2.1 per cent in September from 2.9 per cent in August, owing to a decline in the prices for 'furniture and household appliances.'

Transport inflation maintained a downward trend, decreasing to 0.2 per cent in September from 0.3 per cent in the previous month, mainly due to base effects.

Additional inflationary pressures emanated from the price index for 'miscellaneous goods and services' which recorded a deflation of 0.6 per cent in September, down from a deflation of 0.1 per cent in the previous month.

The RED highlighted that the above decreases were partially offset by increases in the price indices for 'alcoholic beverages and tobacco'



and 'clothing and footwear,' which grew by 3.1 per cent and 0.6 per cent, respectively, in September.

On month-on-month basis, consumer inflation grew by a slower 0.1 per cent in September from a 0.3 per cent growth in the previous month, driven by the price index for 'furnishing and household equipment', which recorded a month-on-month deflation of 0.3 per cent

in September.

Food inflation grew by 0.4 per cent in September from 0.1 per cent the previous month.

Core inflation, which is CPI excluding volatile items such as food, fuel and energy, slightly declined to 1.9 per cent in September, lower than 2.0 per cent in August. On month-onmonth rates, core inflation was lower at 0.0 per cent in September.

LILANGENI WEAKENS AGAINST MAJOR TRADING CURRENCIES

DURING the month of October 2019, the Lilangeni/Rand was generally weaker against the major trading currencies.

The Lilangeni was weaker on a monthly average of E14.91 in October 2019 compared to E14.84 to the US Dollar in September 2019.

Against the Pound Sterling, the Lilangeni depreciated from E18.33 in the previous month to E18.82, while against the Euro it depreciated from E16.34 to E16.47 in October 2019. The local unit received mixed pres-

sures from economic and political developments experienced both in South Africa and externally during the month.

Positives came from the improvement in the global trade conditions following the progress in the US-China trade talks, and the improving sentiments with regards to the Brexit. Gained

The Rand also gained as the Fed cut their interest rates to between 1.5 per cent and 1.75 per cent. Furthermore, Moody's decision not to downgrade SA's credit rating to junk status saved the rand from anticipated losses. However, the planned load shedding

by Eskom across South Africa; the reactions to the details revealed in Mid-term Budget Policy Statement at the end of October; the downward review of South Africa's economic growth forecast; all somewhat counteracted the positives and slumped the rand.

'Small businesses don't need handouts'

JOHANNESBURG – Small, medium and micro-sized enterprises (SMMEs) are lauded as the backbone of any economy and collectively they are the largest employer and contributor to sustainable income for millions of households.

Yet in reality, they are the pariahs of big business and the outcasts that bear the brunt of a capitalist world that favours the established and moneyed.

The fact that about 50 per cent of small businesses fail to survive beyond their second year of doing business says it

The main reason SMMEs fail is that

they are heavily regulated with very little or no support from big business

or government, save for loads of talk and PR rhetoric. That SMMEs are expected to adhere to the same levels of reporting and compliance as big companies is a shame. The playing, therefore, is neither level nor in their favour.

icial management and reporting. Like any other big company, SMMEs are expected to comply with the same laws in terms of filing their returns ie income tax, PAYE and VAT etc. And they absolutely should be expected to comply. However, this has been proven not to be their strength and it is a no brainer to understand why. SMMEs are not experts in this field and do not have the necessary budgets to outsource this function to professional accounting firms. Understanding Legalese and effecting it. Closing deals requires SMMEs to have sound legal advice, support and understanding in order to protect their interests.

Often SMMEs find themselves agreeing to contracts drawn out for them by the other contracting party with little input or influence on the contractual terms. For them to have an equal input on their contracts they need to pay for legal opinion and again this is a luxury they can't afford. The desperation of having to take whatever job comes because that might just be the only one you get regardless of the terms and conditions of the contracts is their everyday reality.

Payment

This ranges from payment terms to exit clauses to the ownership of the intellectual property of the work done et al. I don't know how many times I have had to turn down business from prospective clients who insist on signing a 90-day to 60-day payment terms. My argument has always been once the work is done, I must pay my employees for work done on a monthly basis, why should I subsidize multimillion if not multibillion-rand companies with my little resources. *Business Report*

Zimbabweans enjoy improved fuel supplies

HARARE - Zimbabwean motorists, particularly in the capital Harare, have enjoyed a steady supply of fuel over the past week with queues at filling stations drastically reduced, while dealers continue to notify them of the availability of either petrol or diesel for sale.

Unlike in recent months when motorists had to queue up for several hours before fuelling up, the past week has seen them driving straight to the courtyard and being assisted immediately by filling station attendants.

Zimbabwe has not been able to import enough fuel to satisfy customer demand for several years now because of foreign currency constraints. It is not clear why the situation has improved during the past week.

A Zimbabwe Energy Regulatory Authority (ZERA) spokesperson did not respond to queries from Xinhua last week over the improved supplies. Taxi driver Alfred Paradza said the situation could have improved because of rising prices which were limiting motorists to buying fuel for immediate use. "I don't think supplies have improved. Fuel is now very expensive and not many motorists can afford to buy in huge quantities. Things are now tough and we only buy enough to keep us on the road," he said. Paradza said that there were still some filling stations which continued to have relatively long queues. "I don't know what's with those filling stations. People continue to queue up there yet there will be other filling stations where they can just drive in and buy fuel. Maybe they just don't know that other filling stations also have fuel," he said.

BUMPER BLACK FRIDAY ON CARDS'

JOHANNESBURG - FNB Merchant Services Chief **Executive Thokozani Dlamini** has predicted bumper Black Friday transactions based on the growth in sales volumes recorded over the last three

Black Friday falls on November 29, while Cyber Monday falls on December 2. The days have changed the way South Africans shop ahead of Christmas.

"This year we anticipate a 15 per cent increase in the total number of transactions between November 29 and December 2," said Dlamini.

Dlamini said over the past three years, FNB had seen a substantial increase in transaction volumes for the period between Black Friday and Cyber Monday.

According to BankServAfrica, Africa's leading automated clearing house, South Africa's card transactions reached R3 billion on Black Friday 2018, up 16 per cent from 2017. "The total number of transactions processed through our payment system over the course



of the Black Friday weekend were 10 million on Friday, eight million on Saturday, 5.9 million on Sunday and six million on Cyber Monday," Dlamini said.

Black Friday is a huge discountdriven shopping day held annually the day after the American

Thanksgiving holiday. In 2018, Google reported that South Africa topped the list of the most online searches for Black Friday globally - more than any other country.

Dlamini said historically, both card present (CP) and Card Not Present (CNP) transactions, which included online and app purchases, increased during this period.

"While we still expect that CP transactions will reflect the majority of consumer spend, online and app purchases have shown strong growth in recent years in line with the increase and adoption of eretailing in South Africa and globally," said Dlamini. Dlamini said over the last two Black Fridays, CNP grew 26 per cent year-onyear, while CP grew by 14 per cent year-on-year. "Merchants like Takealot continue to be one of the top 10 merchants for FNB customers to spend on Black Friday, accompanied by the eBucks shop which offers consumers significant discounts," said Dlamini. "As a proactive strategy to maximise sales from shoppers seeking to take advantage of Black Friday deals, we have noted that some retailers are now spreading specials over two or three days prior to Black Friday in order to manage the volumes," Dlamini said.

Job cuts at South African State firms gather pace

JOHANNESBURG - South Africa's post office is cutting several hundred jobs, the second state-owned company in as many days to detail plans to lay off workers as the government looks to slash its wage bill.

Finance Minister Tito Mboweni signaled last month he's intent on lowering the government's payroll costs, which consume 35 per cent of national spending. The cuts are part of a plan to defend the nation's last remaining investment-grade credit rating, which has a negative outlook.

The Post Office will pay voluntary severance packages to about 776 employees at the end of November, as part of a phased reorganization, company executives told parliament on Tuesday.

A day earlier, cash-strapped South African Airways announced plans to cut 944 jobs. The Public Servants Association, which represents more than 240 000 state workers, this week called for urgent talks on the plans to reduce the state

The Congress of South African Trade Unions, the nation's biggest labour group, called the SAA plans 'a reckless announcement.'

The two biggest unions at Eskom Holdings SOC Ltd., the debt-stricken state power utility, last week threatened to stage demonstrations and strikes to protest against plans to split the company into three units. The National Union of Mineworkers and the National Union of Metalworkers of South Africa are concerned there may be job losses and want the company and government to start formal negotiations with them.

SAA warns of strike over planned retrenchments

Cape Town - The SAA Board has warned Parliament that there will be no flights to take off if a strike by the unions goes ahead.

This was after the National Union of Metalworkers of South Africa and the SA Cabin Crew, Association issued a strike notice over the planned retrenchments of 944 workers.

SAA Board acting Chairperson Thandeka Mgoduso told the Standing Committee on Public Accounts yesterday if the strike went ahead it would cause more financial damage to the airline.

The Board was appearing before SCOPA over its finances. Mgoduso said the consultations with the unions have not succeeded on the restructuring at SAA. "We have received notifications from NUMSA and the Cabin Crew Association this morning. Once there is no cabin crew there is no flight that can take off," said Mgoduso. She said MPs should not be surprised if the financial situation does not improve after the strike. The unions are demanding salary increases and to stop the retrenchment of the 944 workers. Drought threatens SA's food security

JOHANNESBURG - AGRI SA has issued a stern warning that the prevailing drought conditions could collapse rural economies and decimate the country's entire agricultural

The lobby group said in a drought report vesterday that farmers faced potential foreclosure by banks and that those whose farms would not be attached would be unable to obtain any production credit to plough maize.

Agri Northern Cape deputy president and head of Agri SA disaster management centre Willem Symington said farmers had taken massive financial losses with 37.5 per cent of rural South Africa affected.

'Yields per year are down and farmers are planting less,' Symington said.

"In animal production we see lessened production due to drought. In the Western Cape we have seen a loss of 25 per cent in the value of export crops. They are also shedding jobs due to drought. Job losses are around 20 to 25 per cent in the Northern Cape and the Free State."

Agri SA said grain and livestock producers had been particularly affected by the unnatural dry weather conditions, below normal rainfall and warm weather. It said the Ugu District on the South Coast of KwaZulu-Natal, for instance, was highly distressed, with Harding, a small town off the coast, the hardest hit as the local dam has virtually dried up.

The group said several Karoo towns had suffered the same fate as boreholes and dams had dried up. Symington said while South Africa was one of the most food secure countries in the world the current drought can result in an entire economic downturn.

"As a country, we are not managing climatic disasters very well," he said. "We have a lot of work to do. Drought can change our status as a food secure country." In its climate advisory last month, the Department of Agriculture, Land Reform and Rural Development warned that drought conditions would persist and water restrictions would remain in place in several provinces.

Agri SA said it had agreed with the department to collaborative efforts, including establishing an inter-sectoral task team representative of the agriculture value chain to assist with efforts to help farmers and farmworkers.

HOW PREACHER SENT **GUNNEN INTO SCHOOLS**

FAUBE - When an Islamist preacher took up the fight in Burkina Faso's northern borderlands almost a decade ago, his only weapon was a radio station.

The words he spoke kindled the anger of a frustrated population, and helped turn their homes into a breeding ground for jihad.

Residents of this parched region in the Sahel - a vast band of thorny scrub beneath the Sahara Desert - remember applauding Ibrahim 'Malam' Dicko as he denounced his country's Western-backed government and racketeering police over the airwaves.

"We cheered," said Adama Kone, a 32-year-old teacher from the town of Djibo near the frontier with Mali, who was one of those thrilled by Dicko's words. "He understood our anger. He gave the Fulani youth a

new confidence." Mostly herders, people were feeling hemmed in by young men like Kone from the Fulani

more prosperous farmers, whom they

felt the government in Ouagadougou favoured.

The preacher successfully exploited their conflicts over dwindling land and water resources, and the frustrations of people angered by corrupt and ineffective government, to launch the country's first indigenous jihadi movement. That cleared a path for groups affiliated with al Qaeda and Islamic State. Since Dicko's first broadcasts, Burkina Faso has become the focus of a determined jihadi campaign by three of West Africa's most dangerous armed groups who have carved out influence in nearly a third of the country, while much of the world was focused on the crisis in neighbouring Mali. Militant Islamist fighters close schools, gun down Christians in their places of worship and booby-trap corpses to blow up

At least 39 people died last week in an ambush on a convoy ferrying workers from a Canadian-owned mine in the country. There has been no claim for that ambush, but the modus operandi – a bomb attack on military escorts followed by gunmen unleashing bullets - was characteristic of Islamist groups.

Since 2016, the violence has killed more than 1 000 people and displaced nearly 500 000 - most of them this year. In 2019, at least 755 people had died through October in violence involving jihadist groups across Burkina Faso, according to Reuters' analysis of political violence events recorded by the Armed Conflict Location and Event Data Project, an

Actual numbers are likely higher researchers aren't always able to identify who is involved in the violence. The teacher Kone is one of many of Dicko's former supporters who regret their earlier enthusiasm.

"We handed them the microphones in our mosques," he said. "By the time we realised what they were up to, it was too late." Reuters

Trump helps break deadlock between Egypt, Ethiopia on Nile Dam talks

JOHANNESBURG - United States President Donald Trump has helped break the deadlock in talks between Egypt and Ethiopia on the construction of the Grand Ethiopian Renaissance Dam (GERD) by Ethiopia following intensive talks between the two North African countries, as well as Sudan, in Washington DC.

Trump tweeted that yesterday's meeting went well and that discussions on resolving the issue would continue after Sudan, Egypt and Ethiopia's foreign ministers agreed to reach a comprehensive, cooperative, adaptive, sustainable and mutually beneficial agreement on the filling and operation of the dam and to establish a clear process for fulfilling that commitment in accordance

with the 2015 Declaration of Principles. Cairo asked for Washington's intervention after years of fruitless talks with Addis Ababa over GERD's construction - which began in 2010 specifically over the filling of the dam and the timetable for its opera-

Egypt, which claims historical rights to the Nile River resources and relies on it for supplying the majority of its water, expressed concern that filling the dam would impede its water supply while Ethiopia argued that its construction is vital for an improved electricity supply. Sudan has not been directly involved in the confrontation between the two countries but is the third country situated on the Nile so is also affected. African News Agency

Long queues as Zimbabwe releases new bank notes, coins

HARARE- New bank notes and coins finally hit the streets of Zimbabwe on Tuesday after a false start the day before, with depositors forming long queues at banks and ATMs.

The new notes are part of President Emerson Mnangagwa's monetary reforms to have Zimbabwe revert to using its own currency in place of the US Dollar and the Rand. In June, Finance Minister Mthuli Ncube banned the usage of foreign currencies for the settlement of local transactions. On Tuesday, depositors started withdrawing the new notes, in five and two Zimbabwean dollar denominations, as well as two dollar bond coins, from banks and cash machines. The new currency was supposed to be available on Monday but the introduction was delayed. "We are overwhelmed today because people want the money to avoid paying premiums for their cash on the streets. I am not sure how much we will give out today but we are prepared for a busy day," said a bank teller at a local finance institution in Harare.

By mid-morning depositors pushed and shoved each other in long queues at most of the banks in the capital.

67 arrested in gay-friendly bar charged with 'nuisance'

KAMPALA - Sixty-seven people arrested by police in a Kampala bar popular with gays were charged with 'common nuisance' on Tuesday, but rights activists said it was a bid to intimidate the LGBT community.

The police raided the Ram Bar in the heart of the Ugandan capital on Sunday and arrested 125 people, 58 of whom were subsequently freed.

Police Spokesman Patrick Onyango initially told AFP they did not know the bar was hosting an LGBT event on the night of the raid, which was targeted at illegal tobacco and opium use. The 61 men and six women were subsequently charged with the unrelated offence of common nuisance. Clare Byarugaba

from the human rights organisation Chapter Four Uganda told AFP that the police deliberately targeted the bar.

"The police knew who they would be targeting. It's a crackdown on any space seen to be LGBT-friendly," Byarugaba said. "This was intended to intimate and scare LGBT individuals."

Forces fire in the air to quell protest

ABUJA -Nigerian security forces used teargas and fired in the air on Tuesday to disperse protesters seeking the release of an opposition figure held since August after calling for a revolution. Omoyele Sowore, the founder of local news site Sahara Reporters and a candidate in February's presidential polls has been detained for 'treason.' At the end of September, the Nigerian Judiciary ordered his release but the authorities have not complied. About 80 protesters gathered outside the headquarters of the Department of State Services (DSS) in the capital Abuja, shouting slogans against President Muhammadu Buhari, an AFP journalist said. AFP

Algeria jails 22 protesters

ALGERIA - Twenty-two Algerian demonstrators were handed one-year jail sentences on Tuesday for 'undermining national unity' by bearing the Berber minority's flag during anti-regime protests, a prisoners' rights group said. The CNLD committee said on its Facebook page that a court in the capital's Sidi Mhamed district had sentenced the accused to 12 months in prison - half of it suspended - and fines of 30 000 dinars (US\$275). Said Salhi, vice president of the Algerian human rights groups LADDH, condemned the ruling as 'heavy, hard and unexpected', adding that defence lawyers would appeal. AFP

Russia wants end to embargo

MOSCOW - Russia backs lifting an embargo on diamond exports from the Central African Republic, the deputy finance minister said Tuesday as Moscow was preparing to chair a global scheme regulating the gem trade. Russia has made moves to strengthen its influence in the poor but strategic CAR in recent months, sending military instructors to the country and receiving mining concessions as part of a plan to boost its presence in Africa. Next year Moscow will be chair of the Kimberley Process, a global scheme established in 2003 to eliminate the so-called 'blood diamonds' produced in rebel-controlled areas. AFP

Rights are not up for negotiation

NAIROBI - Natalia Kanem, executive director of UNFPA, had a strong statement at the opening of the International Conference on Population and Development (ICPD25) in Nairobi, Kenya, on November 12: Reproductive and sexual health rights for women and girls are not up for negotiation, and we will protect and defend them. The firmness of Kanem's words inform the commitment of the UN agency and its partners to move forward despite the progress made, 25 years after, in the fight against gender-based violence, maternal and infant mortality, child marriage, schooling for girls, access to family planning. 'You're nothing compared to your parents'

JOHANNESBURG - EFF leader Julius Malema has fired a broadside at DA MP Ghaleb Cachalia, describing him as a political underachiever hiding behind his family

This was after the conservative DA MP told the National Assembly during a debate on a Malema-sponsored condolence motion about late Zimbabwean former president Robert Mugabe, that Malema "was only six years old" when Cachalia travelled to Harare to attend the commemoration of the anniversary of the universal declaration of human rights. In closing the debate, Malema hit back at Cachalia, accusing him of being an ageist who was using his family name to advance his political

Ghaleb is the son of the late antiapartheid struggle icons Amina and Yusuf Cachalia. Malema said Cachalia was resorting to using the issue of age in a political debate because he did not have credentials of his own.

"I heard someone saying here that in 1988, Malema was this or that age. That's a problem of ageists. You're an ageist of note because whether I was eight years at the time, politically if I were to compare what I've achieved and what you've achieved,

you don't come anywhere close," said Malema, to loud applause from his MPs. "You always hide behind the dress of your mother's credentials. You use your family wrongly for personal accumulation and you always irritate us with your parents' credentials as if they're yours. They're not yours. You have no credentials at all." At that moment, Ghaleb rose on a point of order to object to Malema's accusations.

"The honourable Malema accused me of using my family's name for personal accumulation. He must withdraw," said Ghaleb, but Malema would not have it. "Honourable speak-



er, I never mentioned anyone. But if the shoe fits, wear it.

"You're too old, chief, to be saying 'my mother this, my father this and that'. Write your own history, which is going to be the ugliest history because of the side you chose. You will never have credentials close to your parents. You're nothing compared to your parents." In the end, the Mugabe condolence motion was adopted by all parties with the objection of the DA, while the IFP and the ACDP abstained. Times Live

intervene in various regions facing upcoming conferences or problems in their councils. "The programme is primarily focused on municipalities faced with various chal-

lenges. These include cases where provincial and regional structures intend to bring changes to the leadership of the municipalities," the letter reads.

Nelson Mandela Bay has been rocked by scandal after scandal since UDM Mayor Mongameli Bobani took over from the DA with the aid of the ANC and other opposition parties, including the EFF.

Four motions of no confidence have been tabled against Bobani. All have failed. The most recent motion was orchestrated by the DA and the ANC. With the

recent resignation of DA leader Mmusi Maimane, and the reemergence of Helen Zille as the party's federal council chair, the ANC's top brass say this has affected the "functioning of municipalities", "hindering service delivery."

"[Consequently] the situation has necessitated a need for the NEC to give guidance and political perspective on the approach in which the ANC caucus must handle these matters."

NEC delegates Nomvula Mokonyane, Dakota Legoete, Jeff Radebe, David Masondo, Meogo Matube and Tony Yengeni will form part of the delegation which will engage with party volunteers and branches.

At the heart of the interventions are two valuable metros the party lost in the 2016 municipal elections - Nelson Mandela Bay and Johannesburg. The party has been wooing DA coalition partners in Johannesburg to regain the metro, following executive mayor Herman Mashaba's dramatic resignation from the liberal party.

A provincial leader who sits on the NEC said the party is considering fresh elections in both metros to leverage the DA's very public power struggles, marked by the resignations of high-profile leaders.

Durban man sells coffin as a 'Goth bed' on Facebook

DURBAN - What do you do when you want to get rid of a coffin that has been sitting in your garage for nearly 10 years?

Tony Symes of Queensburgh was faced with this very conundrum recently when the last completed coffin from his coffin manufacturing business from 10 years ago was taking up just too much space in his garage.

"I decided that it was time to sell it and I decided to put it up for sale on Facebook's Market place," he explained.

"I used to manufacture coffins but as a one man show it was tough and I had to find other sources of revenue so I stopped making coffins.

I initially tried to sell it as a coffin but it became joke central for people on Facebook so I decided to rename it a Goth bed to widen the customer base but the jokes have just carried on," he said. Symes said that Facebook users have among other things asked

whether the coffin he was selling was the same one used by Pastor Alp Lukau to resurrect a congregant earlier this year. "They think this is a joke but it is not. I genuinely want to sell this coffin," he said. Symes said he started making coffins 10 years ago with a friend but the business did not work out. Initially he had dozens of coffins around his house and even had to store some in the lounge.

"My partner and her daughters did not like it very much and said it was macabre.

They did not even invite any of their friends over because they were too embarrassed," he said.

He, however, managed to sell most of his coffins but was left with one completed coffin which he stored in his garage. "My brother and I made a pact that whoever between us died first, would get to use the coffin."

Rape suspect burnt to death by mob in Limpopo

LIMPOPO - The South African Police Service (SAPS) in Mphephu outside Makhado, Limpopo, are on the lookout for suspects who assaulted and set alight two men during separate mob justice incidents that took place last Friday.

In the first incident, police responded to a complaint from community members at about 08:00 after a body of man was found at Tshituni tsha Fhasi village near the Nwanedi River, SAPS spokesperson Brigadier Motlafela Mojapelo said.

"When police arrived at the scene, they found the charred remains of a 27year-old man, identified as Elikana Makondelele.

The deceased has been identified as stage but police investigations are ongoing," said Mojapelo.

That evening, at about 18:00, the community of Raliphaswa Tshikhwani village allegedly stoned and set alight a man they suspected of raping a girl.

"Police attended to an attempted rape incident of a six-year-old girl.

While they were busy with their investigations, they received a complaint of mob justice, and responded immediately.

When they arrived at the scene, the person was already dead and community members had left the scene. Various

The body had open wounds and his objects like stones and bricks were left

Lutendo Raswiswi, 35, from Matanda village. In both incidents, police have opened cases of murder and no arrests have been made yet.

"A manhunt has been launched for the suspects responsible for these acts of criminality," said Mojapelo. The provincial commissioner of the SAPS in Limpopo, Lieutenant General Nneke Ledwaba, has condemned the killings and urged all members of the community to report any criminal activity to the police and refrain from resorting to acts of vigilantism.

Steenhuisen, Gana's final days of lobbying for DA job

CAPE TOWN - The DA's John Steenhuisen and Makashule Gana have only four days to lobby support in their bid to become the party's interim leader.

The party will once again be thrust into the spotlight when it elects Mmusi Maimane's replacement, as well as a new federal chair.

The party has been in a state of political wilderness after the two heavy hitters Maimane and federal chair Athol Trollip made shocking resignations shortly after Helen Zille was elected as the new federal council

Without any direction from its own Constitution in the sudden turn of events, the party elected on voting for an interim leader and federal chair. The two party interim leaders would hold the fort until its early congress in 2020

Much like the federal council elections, which resulted in a discord between the major party players, party presiding officer of federal council elections Desiree Van Der Walt said the rules will remain the same.

With the withdrawal of Western Cape leader Bonginkosi Madikizela from the race, the 160 council members who would normally use a ranking system (single transferable vote ranking system) to elect a new leader, will find it easier to choose the preferred

candidates. "There are only two candidates, so [each] member will choose their preferred candidates. Unlike the system which will be used to select a federal chair. In that election we have four candidates. The first candidate to go on the ballot will be selected from a draw and the other three will be chosen alphabetically," she said.
The four candidates vying for the

federal chair position include: Dharmesh Dhaya - DA chief whip in the Buffalo City Metropolitan Municipality; Ivan Meyer - deputy federal chairperson and Western Cape finance MEC; Khume Ramulifho - MPL in the Gauteng legislature and Nomafrench Mbombo -DA Women's Network leader and Western Cape health MEC.


Van Der Walt explained that all candidates will address the federal council during Sunday's session to convince delegates to support their respective bids. For the position of federal chair, delegates will rank the leaders from the most to the least preferred. On Tuesday, News24 learnt that Gana sent a letter to party members ahead of this weekend's election. In the letter, Gana makes the argument that the party cannot ignore race in formulating its redress policies.

threw his weight behind Public Protector Busisiwe Mkhwebane granting her permission to peruse his tax files - a move that could see Mkhwebane freely accessing the tax records of politicians and government officials as part of her investigations. "This may in the future include finance details of President Cyril Ramaphosa's 2017 presidential

campaign which have been sealed from being made public following a court order in August. "The move by Zuma also comes while SARS seeks to stop Mkhwebane from obtaining Zuma's records.

> "I need to clarify that I have never refused the office of the PP access to investigate my affairs. This country knows very well that the former PP @ThuliMadonsela investigated me on a number of occasions and made findings against me," tweeted Zuma.

SARS Commissioner Edward Kieswetter on Tuesday said the impending court case by the organisation was not about withholding Zuma's record but that SARS rather wants the courts

to clarify the legal principle of a taxpayer's privacy as contained in the Tax Administration Act of 2011

SARS is fighting attempts by Mkhwebane to obtain Zuma's records as part of an investigation emanating from allegations that he received monthly payments of R1million from Durban businessman Roy Moodley while he was president.

The allegations are contained in investigative journalist Jacques Pauw's book The President's Keepers and prompted former DA leader Mmusi Maimane to ask Mkhwebane to probe the allegations. Kieswetter admitted that SARS regulations stated that organisations may release tax information to third parties but only if the taxpayer involved consents in writing.

"There are, however, specific provisions that allow 'taxpayer information' to be disclosed to a person who is not a SARS official (this happens if) a taxpayer gives written consent,"

But while it may not be in a formal document, Zuma appeared to give consent, throwing his weight behind Mkhwebane's mission, saying he had no problem with his records being perused as he 'had nothing to hide'.

EFF's Shivambu, Gardee facing the chop

JOHANNESBURG - As the EFF elective conference draws closer, it has emerged that party Deputy President Floyd Shivambu and Secretary-General Godrich Gardee might find themselves out in the cold as there is a growing call for them to be removed from the executive.

Sources within

the EFF said Shivambu might be replaced by National Chairperson Dali Mpofu and Gardee by either National Executive Committee member Marshal Dlamini or party Spokesperson Mbuyiseni Ndlozi.

Independent Media has learnt that there was growing discontent about Shivambu and Gardee's performance, including failure to sell the party throughout the continent.

A senior EFF leader who declined to be named said party President Julius Malema was the only one who wa secure in holding on to his position

The EFF is due to hold its confer ence at the Nasrec Expo Centre in Joburg between December 13 and 16. Sources said the EFF had been

split into two factions and both of them were fully behind Malema. "One of the groups (factions) wants the deputy president removed and only kept as an ordinary member of the national executive committee. He is accused of having failed to perform his duties, of which one of them was to promote the party across the continent," said the source.

During the EFF leadership's site visit at Nasrec late last month, Malema took a swipe at Gardee about the party's failure to sell itself in other African states. Political Bureau

Springboks symbol of white resistance to change - Ndlozi

PARLIAMENT - Economic Freedom Fighters member of Parliament (MP) Mbuyiseni Ndlozi on Tuesday reiterated his scorn of the Springbok rugby team and said there would be no racial unity in South Africa until wealth was shared equally and land returned to those from whom it was taken.

Ndlozi, in a debate on a motion to congratulate the Springboks for winning the Rugby World Cup, said calls to rally behind the team was a form of collective abuse of black people, who were being asked to sanctify a sport and a symbol that remained redolent of white supremacy.

"Because the Springbok is a sign that cannot be whitewashed, it stands in parallel continuity with Die Stem entrenching white supremacy in our

That is why the rugby team in question is white-dominated. It is a perfect reflection that white people have successfully resisted change in our society for 25 years," he said.

He said the mass street celebrations that have met the returning rugby champions were 'fake' because it asked black people to buy into a false notion of transformation.

"Out there, people say what is happening is racial unity on the streets, but the truth is out there is (sic) scores of black people extending their exploited, marginalised, scandalised and brutalised humanity to a white-dominated team.... the white community to this day has not recognised the humanity of black people." Ndlozi said Springbok captain Siya Kolisi had to go to a white school he attended Grey High School in Port Elizabeth to win acceptance and dismissed the narrative that wing Makazole Mapimpi was a rare case of an Eastern Cape player who had to overcome adversity to achieve success on the field

Political opportunism led to Marikana tragedy - COSATU

JOHANNESBURG - Trade union COSATU has called on workers, members of the Tripartite Alliance and communities to rally behind its Marikana rally on Sunday in the North West province.

COSATU said the Marikana tragedy of August 2012, which claimed the lives of 34 protesting miners, was a 'classic example of the immorality of capitalism and its festering greed'.

The union's National Spokesperson Sizwe Pamla said the union was committed to confronting the deteriorating situation that had led to many workers still getting killed after the tragic events of 2012. "The federation condemns the ongoing violence and intimidation of workers in Marikana and we strongly support the principle of freedom of association, especially for the working class, membership of any union or any party should not be a death sentence in a democratic country," said Pamla. He said that the ongoing killings and violent attacks on National Union of Mineworkers (NUM) members

had to be stopped and urged law enforcement agencies to start apprehending the perpetrators. "Political opportunism, populism and the culture of warlordism has undermined the efforts to find lasting solutions to the problems that led to the tragedy in the first place. The legacy of the Marikana tragedy should have been about changing the conditions of the mineworkers and holding the mining companies accountable for the damage that they have inflicted on the workers and communities for centuries." LAND DISPUTE BLOODBATH LEAVES 3 DEAD

THAILAND - Three people died in a courtroom gun battle in Thailand yesterday after the defendant pulled out a handgun as he waited for the verdict in a land dispute.

Retired policeman Thanin Chantratip shot dead the plaintiff and his lawyer before he himself was killed by police.

Witnesses said Thanin pulled a Glock .22 handgun from his waist after arguing with opposing lawyer Wijai Sukharom. Wijai was killed and his client Bancha Porameesanaporn was later pronounced dead in hospital.

A court policeman returned fire in the melee and shot Thanin, who also later died in hospital. Two others, including the claimant's wife Supaporn, are in critical conditions after the gun battle in Chanthaburi yesterday morning.

Onlookers said Thanin and Wijai had started arguing after they arrived in court to hear the verdict.

The land dispute had been running for more than 10 years. Police Major General Charan Jitchuejun, deputy commander of Chanthaburi police, said an investigation had been opened into the shooting. He added: "We are sure that the

culprit is Mr Thanin Chantratip and that the victim was his rival in court. "The injured parties were the wife of the victim and two other lawyers. "The cause of the dispute is a civil lawsuit relating

HILLARY CLINTON ATTACKS BORIS JOHNSON

LONDON - Hillary Clinton has attacked Prime Minister Boris Johnson for his "inexplicable and shameful" decision to block publication of a report into Russian interference in UK elec-

The former US presidential candidate told the BBC's Emma Barnett that she was "dumbfounded" by the UK government's refusal to publish the report, which was intended for publication before the general election. The UK Parliament's Intelligence and Security Committee sent Prime Minister Johnson its report weeks ago. However, the government is refusing to publish it until after the general election on December 12. "Every person who votes in this country deserves to see that report before your election happens," Clinton said. She added: "Because there is no doubt

- we know it in our country, we have seen it in Europe, we have seen it here - that Russia, in particular, is determined to try to shape the politics of westem democracies. "Not to our benefit, but to theirs." She told the BBC: "I find it inexplicable

that your government will not release a government report about Russian influence. Inexplicable and shameful." Clinton added that the Kremlin would seek to interfere in future elections in the West.

"So there's no doubt of the role that Russia played in our [US] 2016 election and is continuing to play. "I would hate to see that happen here [UK.] Whatever the outcome. I don't know what's in it, [the report] any more than anybody else does. "But certainly, people who are about to vote in a month or so deserve to know what is in a report that one has to speculate, must have something of concern, otherwise why wouldn't it be publicly disclosed?" Reacting to Clinton's remarks, Chuka Umunna, the Liberal Democrats foreign affairs spokesperson, said the UK government's refusal to

publish the report "implies there is something to hide" and said "Boris Johnson is morinto phing Donald Trump more and more, day by day.' Business Insider

'Death toll up to 7 in post-election unrest'

BOLIVIA -Seven people died in Bolivia in violence that broke out after Evo Morales was declared the winner of a recent presidential election, the attorney general said on Tuesday.

Four of those fatalities were from gunfire, Juan Lanchipa said. Until now, the toll was three dead. Morales resigned on Sunday and went into exile in Mexico on Tuesday. "All of these cases will be investigated until we establish the truth and find out who is responsible so they can be punished under the law," Lanchipa said. He also called on Bolivians to

return to calm after Senator Jeanine Anez proclaimed herself acting president in a move endorsed by the country's Constitutional Court. Anez, formerly deputy speaker of the Senate, proclaimed herself Bolivia's new interim president on Tuesday during a session of Congress that failed to reach a quo-

Lawmakers had been summoned to formalise Sunday's resignation of Evo Morales and confirm Jeanine Anez, 52, as interim president, to end a power vacuum. Citizen

Hong Kong on the 'brink of total breakdown'

HONG KONG - Hong Kong is on the 'brink of total breakdown,' police have said after officers were filmed pepper-spraying a woman and tackling her to the ground on another day of violence in the city.

A video clip shared by leading activist Joshua Wong purports to show heavily armed officers scuffling with a pregnant woman.

One policeman is seen squirting a can of pepper spray in the woman's face while several others help him

wrestle her to the ground. The clash was the latest violent episode on a day which saw protesters fire catapults at police and occupy the centre of Hong Kong where officers fired teargas in reply. Tensions are higher than ever after an activist was shot and another man set on fire by protesters in angry confrontations on Monday. "Our society has been pushed to the brink of a total breakdown," Senior Superintendent Kong Wing-cheung told a briefing yesterday. Police said masked 'rioters' had committed 'insane' acts, throwing trash, bicycles and other debris on to metro tracks and overhead power lines, paralysing transport. TV footage showed activists dropping heavy objects from overpasses on to traffic below, just missing a motorcyclist. In the pepper-spray clash, which reportedly took place in Hung Hom at around 10am yesterday morning, the woman turned away in agony after being sprayed but then continued to argue with the officer. Mass pig slaughter stains river red

SEOUL - A river near the inter-Korean border turned red with the blood of pigs slaughtered as Seoul attempts to curb the spread of African swine fever. South Korea has culled around 380 000 pigs since the first case of the haemorrhagic disease - which is not harmful to humans but is highly infectious in swine - was reported in September. Pig cases are nearly always fatal and there is no antidote or vaccine, with the only known way to prevent the disease from spreading being a mass cull of livestock. A local NGO said that heavy rains last week caused blood from a burial site near the inter-Korean border - where some 47 000 pig carcasses were piled up - to seep into the Imjin River on Sunday, turning some of the stream red. AFP

Teen gets double lung transplant

MICHIGAN - A 17-year-old Michigan boy facing "imminent death" from vaping injuries has undergone a double lung transplant, the first in a patient suffering from the effects of e-cigarettes, a Detroit hospital said on Tuesday. The announcement by Henry Ford Hospital came a day after President Donald Trump said he would meet with industry representatives as his administration weighs new regulations, amid a nationwide outbreak of vaping-related illness and deaths. "This teenager faced imminent death had he not received a lung transplant," Dr Hassan Nemeh, surgical director of thoracic organ transplant at Henry Ford Hospital, said in a statement announcing the mid-October procedure, which he carried out with two other surgeons, assisted by a team of experts.

Nurse charged for murder

NEW YORK -The man took the same route every morning down 92nd Street, walking his dog past the cornfields in Raymond, Wisconsin. But on the morning of July 21, 1999, as he walked with his teenage daughter, the drag marks caught his eye. They led from the road down a slight embankment beneath the power lines and into the corn, straight to a woman's limp body. Peering through the cornstalks, the teenager, Megan Rios. would never forget the sight. The dead woman was skinny, wearing black sweatpants and a gray denim western shirt embroidered with red and black flowers, still wet from the night's rainstorm. The Washington Post

'No complications' from Carter surgery

GEORGIA - Former US president Jimmy Carter was recovering in a Georgia hospital following surgery on Tuesday to relieve pressure on his brain after he suffered multiple falls, an aide said. "There are no complications from the surgery to ease the pressure caused by a subdural hematoma," said a statement from the Carter Centre, adding that the 95-year-old Nobel laureate will remain in hospital "as long as advisable for observation".





Artists slam Burna Boy on Africans Unite concert line-up

PRETORIA - South African musicians and event organisers have objected to Nigerian rapper Burna Boy's inclusion at an anti-xenophobic concert, claiming the star incited hatred with his comments on SA.

In a series of tweets in September, Burna Boy urged black foreigners living in SA to defend and protect themselves against xenophobic attackers. In a now deleted tweet, he also told SA rapper AKA to beef up his security, before giving him the middle finger.

He promised to never set foot in based in Nigeria. SA again until the government "wakes the f*ck up and really performs a miracle."

A month later it was announced that Burna would be performing in SA as part of the Africans Unite line-up to "unify all Africans and speak out against femicide."

Ticket listings and promotional material for the event claimed the concert was sponsored by the department of sports, arts and culture and is organised by Play Network Africa, which, according to its website, is

Musicians and event organisers, under the umbrella of Tshwane Entertainment Collective, wrote a scathing letter to the minister raising objections against the concert and calling for the department to pull its sponsorship of the event. The group questioned the exclusion of artists and event organisers from Tshwane in the process, the lack of financial support for artists from the area, and claims that communities affected by xenophobia are located far from the areas where

Cristiano Ronaldo's Portugal team-mate refutes injury claims

PORTO-One of Cristiano Ronaldo's international team-mates has insisted the Portuguese star isn't carrying an injury - directly contradicting the claims of Juventus Manager Maurizio

Sarri had claimed that Ronaldo is suffering from 'an ongoing knee problem' after taking him off early in their last two matches.

Ronaldo reacted furiously to being substituted in the 55th minute during Juve's 1-0 win over AC Milan with reports in Italy suggesting he called his manager a 'son of a whore' before storming down the tunnel.

However, after reporting for international duty with Portugal for their concluding Euro 2020 qualifiers against Lithuania and Luxembourg, Goncalo Paciencia has insisted Ronaldo isn't struggling with an injury.

"I don't have a medical degree, but he's looked fine to me,' forward Paciencia told the A Bola newspaper. "The most important thing is that he's here because he's the best in the world."

Portugal need Ronaldo to be fit and ready for action as they try to secure their place at next summer's Euro finals.

They are currently second in Group B but third-placed Serbia are just a point behind and could yet pip them to an automatic qualification place.

Paciencia's comments will only heighten speculation that Ronaldo and Sarri have fallen out. Ronaldo was substituted eight minutes from time in Juve's Champions League win over Lokomotiv Moscow in Russia last week.


The 34-year-old has completed the full 90 minutes in every other Serie A and Champions League match this season aside from the last two.

According to Gazzetta dello Sport, the 34-year-old will also not be fined for his outburst at Sarri but will be expected to apologise to his team-mates for not returning to the bench.

Ronaldo also risked receiving a twoyear ban due to anti-doping regulations after there were concerns that he left the Allianz Stadium early.

Sky Sport Italia, as per Football Italia, reported that Ronaldo left the stadium three minutes before full-time on Sunday.

JOHANNESBURG - Bafana Bafana coach Molefi Ntseki has been probed whether former striker Benni McCarthy could join his technical team.

The 42-year-old McCarthy was recently sacked as head coach of Cape Town City following a run of poor results as the Mother City side won just two of their last 18 matches.

McCarthy has reportedly returned to Scotland to enjoy some quality family time as he ponders his next move, with reports linking the Champions League winner to Soweto giants Orlando Pirates.

South African Football Association (SAFA) President Danny Jordaan also weighed in on McCarthy's sacking, revealing he will have talks with the coach to discuss a possible role within the association.

Meanwhile, Ntseki is hoping to build an overseas-based scouting network in the next few months with a view to roping in McCarthy.

"Yeah, because when you look at our roll-out plan I presented to the president and technical committee, we need to have a scout overseas," said Ntseki ahead of Bafana Bafana's crucial Africa Cup of Nations (AFCON) Qualifier against Ghana today

"Basically we are saying we must have two, who will be helping each other for senior and all the junior players, because if we are to have only one scout then it would be very difficult to be all over and give us a technical report on players we have overseas.

"So, it's just unfortunate that coach Benni had to lose his job at Cape Town City, but that doesn't mean anything bad about him - he's a good coach and a legend of the game, and he's qualified to do the job for us.

"When that time comes, we'll be able to consider him."

Hlatshwayo has big dreams for Bafana

JOHANNESBURG - Bafana Bafana captain Thulani Hlatshwayo doesn't want to look back on his international career and his highlights are only participating in major tournaments.

The tough-as-teak defender has represented his country at all levels - from the Under-17s, to the Under-20s he played in the 2009 Under-20 World Cup with, as well as captaining Bafana in the 2019 Africa Cup of Nations (AFCON) in Egypt.

But apart from participating in major tournaments with those teams, the 29year-old has no silverware to show for

He would like to change that in Cameroon in 2021 by leading Bafana to continental glory at the AFCON.

The road to that glory starts tomorrow against Ghana at Cape Coast in the opening match of their AFCON qual-

Bafana will then host Sudan on Sunday in the second match.

"It is really important for us to achieve things with the national team, we are not getting any younger," Hlatshwayo said. "We've done well against Mali and we did well against Egypt, now it's for us to make sure that we get a tro-

"Because I don't want to look back and say, 'Thulani you played at the Afcon in Equatorial Guinea and at the Afcon in Egypt but what have you achieved?'

"It has to be a norm for South African teams to qualify for these major tournaments, but we also have to win something."

Bafana held their only proper train-

ing session yesterday having flown to Accra on Monday and then driving to Cape Coast by bus.

Today they will get a feel of the stadium they will face the Black Stars on. Even though Ghana brought in seven new faces, there is a lot of familiarity between the two teams.

Hlatshwayo, for instance, has played against Ghana's captain Andre Ayew since 2009 when the two national Under-20 teams met in the Last 16 of the World Cup. The two led their senior national teams in Dubai in a training match before the Afcon.

Bafana went on to have a better AFCON than Ghana who were meek and crashed out in the Last 16, while Hlatshwayo and company reached the quarter-finals after knocking out the hosts Egypt. IOL

Messi back from three month ban

BARCELONA - Lionel Messi returns from suspension for Argentina as they face bitterrivals Brazil in a friendly in Saudi Arabia tomorrow, a repeat of the summer's COPA America semifinal.

Messi was banned by the South American football confederation CONMEBOL for three months after criticizing the officiating as Brazil knocked Argentina out of the tournament in July.

Brazil earned a 2-0 victory over their rivals to progress to the final, beating Peru 3-1 to lift the trophy at the Maracana in Rio de Janeiro.

Messi, who was also sent off in Argentina's 2-1 third-place playoff win over Chile, missed four international matches after claiming CONMEBOL was 'corrupt' and had set the tournament up for Brazil to win.

The match will take place in Riyadh at the King Saud University Stadium, little over a year after Brazil beat Argentina 1-0 in Jeddah.



Messi will return to Saudi Arabia in January with Barcelona, after the Spanish Football Federation announced on Monday that the Spanish Super Cup will take place there for the next three seasons.

Despite Brazil's strong recent record against Argentina, they are without a win in four matches and Messi's availability leaves the game wide open.

"We have to pay a lot of attention to him," said Chelsea's Brazilian winger William. DPA

Thiem produces one of his finest performances of 2019

The Austrian became the first man through to the semi-finals when he beat the world No 2 6-7, 6-3, 7-6 in just over two and three quarter hours.

His brilliant display means that Djokovic and Roger Federer will play off tonight to see who joins him for the weekend at the O2 Arena.

As one of the event's best matches of recent years

approached its climax it looked like the younger player had blown his chance, having been cloyed by nerves as he failed to serve out the decider at 6-5 and then fallen 4-1 behind in the tiebreak.

But the tally of winners from Thiem, who has never passed Wimbledon's fourth round, hit 51 as he roared back to clinch it 7-5. Now it comes down to the simple equation of whether Federer can avenge this year's SW19 final loss against the Serbian, who has been in prime form and did little wrong on Tuesday night.

On Tuesday he went out against world number eight Matteo Berrettini and kept his hopes of making the weekend semi-finals alive by beating the Italian 7-6(2), 6-3 in effectively a must-win match.

It is at this stage of the event that the mathematics can become infernally complex - a weakness of the format - but it sends him into today's match against Novak Djokovic in renewed good

Djokovic was last night facing Federer's conqueror of Sunday Dominic Thiem, and what-

ever the result it is most likely Federer would have to beat the Serb to have any chance of making the last four. The Swiss said his day off had helped him: 'There are plenty of ways to get rid of that loss, to hang out with my kids. We had a good time as a team."

Britain's Joe Salisbury and American partner Rajeev Ram find themselves in a similar position to Federer after recovering from their loss on the opening day to keep themselves in the hunt for a place on Saturday.

Needing a win to realistically keep themselves alive, the debutants came back to defeat Ivan Dodig and Filip Polasek 3-6, 6-3, 10-6 in the sudden death 'champions' tiebreak used in the doubles competition.

They are now most likely going to need a win on Thursday against second seeds Lukasz Kubot of Poland and Brazilian Marcelo Melo to sustain a home presence into the last couple of days.

TOKYO - Star striker David Villa, Spain's top goalscorer, yesterday announced he will retire next month, ending a glittering career in which he won the World Cup, European Championships and Champions League.

> The 37-year-old Vissel Kobe striker said he will call it a day at the end of the 2019 J-League season after a 19-year career that took him to Barcelona, Atletico Madrid and Valencia while accumulating 98 caps for his country.

I have decided to retire," Villa told reporters in Kobe, his voice occasionally breaking with emotion.

"I've been thinking about this for a long time. This is the result of discussions I had with my family and people around me... I wanted to retire from football, not be forced to retire from football," he said.

Villa will become an investor in Queensboro FC, a new franchise based in the New York district of Queens that will play in the second tier of US foot-

"Even though I will no longer be on the pitch, I will continue to be involved in football in other ways and will continue to contribute to the football world," he said.

Villa played in three World Cups and was a member of the Spanish side that lifted the trophy in 2010 and won the European Championships in 2008, though he missed out on the 2012 triumph through injury. He scored 59 times for Spain, a national record.

Champions

His club honours include the 2010/11 Champions League, the 2011 UEFA Super Club, 2011 Club World Cup and two La Liga wins in 2010/11 and 2012/13 with Barcelona.

Villa scored the third goal for Barcelona at Wembley in the 3-1 win over Manchester United in the 2010/11 Champions League final.

He won a third La Liga with Atletico Madrid in his one season there in 2013/14 after leaving Barcelona. After leaving Atletico, Villa embarked on a successful spell in Major League Soccer for New York City, where he scored 80 goals in 124 appearances. Villa was New York City's first-ever signing and his haul included the first goal scored at Yankee Stadium in an opening home victory over the New England Revolution.

Here is Africa's most-valuable XI!

Ajax Amsterdam shot-stopper Andre Onana is the most valuable African goalkeeper in the world at present. The Cameroon international, who is an undisputed starter for the reigning Eredivisie champions, is valued at a reported €35 million (R574 million).

Onana is supported by a backline that includes countryman Joel Matip, who shares the same

valuation, and Senegal defender Kalidou Koulibaly, who has a remarkable market value of ϵ 75 million (R1.2 billion).

The pair of centre-backs are flanked by €30 million-rated (R492 million) Morocco right-back Achraf Hakimi and Algeria left-back Faouzi Ghoulam, who is valued at €23 million (R377 million), although the latter's value is influenced by the short length of time remaining on his Napoli contract.

Guinea's Naby Keita and Ghana's Thomas Partey, who are both valued at €50 million (R820 million), make up a two-man midfield, while Mali's Moussa Marega takes up an advanced role. The Porto star is said to be worth €30 million


"I always like to speak for local coaches, because I believe I'm a local coach, and local coaches have done it and they are doing it," he said.

ESWATINI TAEKWONDO FEDERATION NAMES BOTSWANA OPEN SQUAD


