

Power blackout ends in police camps

POWER supply to police camps around the country was on Wednesday afternoon restored after it was cut Tuesday afternoon.

This caused untold troubles for the women and men in blue such that they sought assistance from private residences.

It is said the Eswatini Electricity Company (EEC) cut the power supply as a result of a bill amounting to millions of Emalangeni, which government has not settled.

The disconnection also saw some of the officers suffering huge losses in terms of foodstuffs loaded in their refrigerators.

The police officers said the almost two day blackout was hellish it was like it happened for

"What annoyed us was that we were not informed that we would experience a black-

"At first, we thought it was just the power interruption or failure, which is something we are used to here in Nhlangano, It was when hours passed that we later learned that EEC disconnected the power for unpaid bills," said one of the police officers.

Things returned to normal at around 3pm on Wednesday.

Shift

"For some of us who were doing morning shift, when we left our houses yesterday (Wednesday), there was still no electricity and we could not even prepare breakfast.

"We went to work without having eaten anything. At around 3pm today (Wednesday), the power was restored but that did not help some of us considering what we had lost in terms of the food which was spoiled in the fridges," said another officer.

Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Superintendent Phindile Vilakati confirmed that things had since returned to normal in all the police camps which were affected.

"We are thankful to government for making sure that whatever led to EEC deciding to cut the power supply in police camps, it was given the necessary attention," said Supt Vilakati.

AN Indian man was arrested for failure to declare E500 000 upon arrival into the country at the Ngwenya Border Gate.

He appeared before Senior Magistrate Nonhlanhla Dlamini yesterday morning.

Abdul Baten (34), of Oshoek, failed to declare the said amount on Tuesday and by so doing he was arrested and charged with two counts, including that of contravening Section 80 as read with Section 87 of the Customs and Excise Act 1971 as amended.

Bad cop Busta pulls yet another stunt

CONTROVESIAL police officer Busta Vilakati was the centre of attention after he impeded security guards hired by the Pigg's Peak Town Council from removing illegal roast meat roadside vendors, Shisanyama.

He is fresh from being found guilty and sentenced for assaulting a female police colleague. The aforementioned vendors work only at night outside the Polani Bar selling roasted meat and porridge to hungry customers.

The incident took place outside Polani Bar on Wednesday evening.

Vilakati, who was operating not as a police officer but in his capacity as administrator at the Pigg's Peak RatePayers Association, said Pigg's Peak was the only town within the Kingdom of Eswatini that disallowed Shisanyama vendors after dark.

"Why is Pigg's Peak the only town in the kingdom that refuses Shisanyama vendors to operate? You can go to any town in Eswatini and you will find vendors operating at night, selling cooked food and roasted maize.

"Why is it not the same in Pigg's Peak? Another

Town Council composed of non-Pigg's Peak residents so they abuse local folks for personal gain. The truth of the matter is that Pigg's Peak Town Council does not care about the people and that is why they are denying the vendors a good honest living," he said.

Also speaking to this publication at the scene

were removing the vendors because the Pigg's Peak Town Council told them to do so.

"As security guards, we are just doing our jobs as we are hired by the Pigg's Peak Town Council. We are not fighting with the vendors and since Vilakati has chosen to react in such a manner, we will leave the vendors to operate for now but we will involve the Pigg's Peak police if the situation remains unresolved," they said.

In a previous article written by this publication pertaining to the above subject matter, Pigg's Peak Town Clerk/CEO Mzwandile Ndzinisa said the Urban Government Regulations Act of (1969) stated that no person was allowed to sell in the street or public place, without a valid permit from council. Therefore, the sale of roasted meat by the vendors is illegal, since it is a contravention of this Act.

"To add to that first statement, any sale of unwholesome or unhealthy food is not allowed in town, as stated in the Public Health (Food Hygiene) Regulations.

"This is due to the fact that unhygienic food compromises the health of the public, because it is prepared or served in unhygienic settings. For instance, the regulations state that food must be prepared in an area that has clean running water, unfortunately the Shisanyama you're referring to lacks water facilties," he added.

FOCUS ON MATSAPHA TOWN COUNCIL COMMISSION

'ZWANE, COUNCIL REJECT MUSLIM CHURCH'

STORIES BY SAMKELISIWE KHOZA Matsapha

MATSAPHA Town Council Chairperson Sandlane Zwane and his councillors are accused of xenophobic attitudes towards the Muslim community for rejecting an application to build a mosque in the municipality.

The on-going public submissions are conducted at the Matsapha Town Council by the commission of enquiry appointed by Minister of Housing and Urban Development Prince Simelane. It comprises Lungile Magagula (Chairperson). Mzwandile Dlamini (Secretary), with commissioners, Ayanda Sigudla, Benito Jones and Ocean Zibuse Simelane.

The Muslim community representatives said their application to construct the mosque was chucked through the window by the councillors together with their Zwane.

When the councillors assumed office in 2017, the community applied for the construction soon thereafter. However, that application was declined and construction subsequently barred.

The community submitted that the councillors told them that they were of the Christian faith, therefore, they cannot allow the construction of that mosque.

During the submissions, the Arabs explained that all they wanted from the Council was to be granted permission to build the house of worship. They

explained that the construction site or plot legally belonged to them, they were not asking for land.

Investor

They also brought forward that they had in the bag an investor from Kuwait who was to finance the construction of the mosque. Unfortunately, the investor packed his bags together with his money and left when he realised he was faced with xenophobic and religious intoler-

Furthermore, council and Zwane cited that if they were to construct anything it had to be an industrial structure because that was an industrial site. Therefore, every construction must be industrial and provide employment to a significant number of citizens.

Meanwhile, a deafening question that made the room so quiet one could hear a pin drop was that why other towns in the country had mosques yet their administrations are Christians.

The Muslims said that xenophobic act by Zwane and the councillors dented the trust Arabic countries, especially investors, held for Eswatini.

...Muslim community regrets voting for Zwane, councillors

THE Muslim-Arabic Community says they strongly regret voting for the councillors and Chairperson Sandlane Zwane.

During their submissions yesterday, the communal said they were so disappointed at how the councilors, especially Zwane, had turned

They said they trusted and believed in the councillors that change and development would follow after they were elected.

They brought forward that Zwane was a very smart man and well versed with the law and the constitution, hence he can get away with murder. Zwane's cleverness, they alleged, granted him the eye to notice and see every hole there is within a system or a person and use that hole to achieve personal gains. Moreover, the minister of housing and urban development was begged to order for re-elections and make Matsapha live again.

'Councillors must be investigated'

Ngwenya was chucked out of a meeting by Zwane and told to come back with a letter that grants him the leeway to double up as Member of Parliament and a councillor.

A question, however, lingered on how Ngwenya's being an MP and a councillor turned into an issue simply because it was recorded that Zwane congratulated him when he won the elections.

When making his submissions, Zwane strongly argued that he could not let corruption dwell under his leadership hence Ngwenya and Councillor Mfanufikile Dlamini were sent packing. Dlamini was an His Majesty's Correctional Service officer when he was elected into council.

Tunes

However, tunes changed when he was transferred to the Umbutfo Eswatini Defence Force last year.

He was also chucked out of the council by the then chairperson who requested a letter from his employer explaining the double up.

Interestingly, Ngwenya submitted that soon after he was suspended by Zwane, his payment was halted by the council.

He said the possibility of having a productive and peaceful working environment under Zwane and the councillors were very slim.

Ngwenya concurred with other councillors that an interim council team should take over till 2022 when elections would be conducted.

MURDER SUSPECT SIPHO'S SON GETS 3 YEARS IN JAIL

MURDER suspect Sipho Shongwe's son, Sifiso Mbusi, was sentenced to three years in prison with an option of a fine of E10 000 yesterday by Magistrate Lenhle Zulu.

Shongwe was arrested on January 19, 2018 at Ngwenya Border Post after he failed to declare E60 000 to customs officers and the police. The money was found in his vehicle, a VW Polo Vivo at the point of entry into the Kingdom of Eswatini and it was in South African currency.

Declare

He was charged with contravening Section 41 (1) as read with Section 41 (2) of the Money Laundering and Financing of Terrorism (Prevention) Act 2011 which states that one is required to declare an amount that is above E15 000.

During his court appearance on



January 21, 2018, he was granted bail at F3 500

Shongwe was represented by his lawyer Sipho Mnisi, who applied before the court that his travel document and car be released back to his custody. He further applied that the E10 000 be taken from the money that was forfeited by the state on arrest.

The undeclared cash, his travel doc-

umentand vehicle were forfeited in terms of Section 57 of the above cited Act on the day of his arrest.

According to the magistrate, his arrest was also based on the fact that he had exited and quickly returned to the country as his father was a suspect in the murder of the late Victor Gamedze and anyone close to him was under police investigation.

ANGERED BY BROTHER-IN-LAW, HE BEATS UP WIFE

COULD it be true that some women are assaulted for absolutely no reason by their lovers?

This is the question which lingered in the minds of many when a man appeared before the Siteki Magistrate's Court for assaulting his wife, for no apparent reason. In fact, the accused person admitted before court that his wife did nothing wrong to deserve the said assault.

Christopher Gamedze (45) was charged with contravening Section 77 of the Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence Act 15 of 2018. He was said to have wrongfully and unlawfully assaulted his wife, Sibongile Mkhonta by chocking her and further banging her head several times against the floor. When the charge sheet was read to him, Gamedze pleaded guilty to the charge. His plea was also accepted by the Crown without leading evidence to prove commission of the offence.

When asked by the court to explain how he ended up assaulting his wife, Gamedze blamed his reaction to a fight he had earlier with his brother in-law (a brother to his wife). He narrated that on the fateful day, he came home and found his brother-in-law sitting in the lounge and playing loud music. The said brother-in-law was visiting his sister. Gamedze said he asked his brother in-law to reduce the volume, but he refused.

He said instead, his brother in-law started an argument with him, something which eventually resulted to them exchanging blows.

Beating

The accused person told the court that he was overpowered by his brother in-law during the fight. He alleged that his wife then made some comments which did not go down well with him. "Watsi kulo mnakabo sale angikhawula sengenele," said the accused person, meaning; "She told her brother to stop beating me because I have already had enough".

Gamedze said he felt belittled by this statement, hence he assaulted her. He stated that, however, he later realised that he beat his wife for no apparent reason.

Senior Magistrate Donald Mavuso warned Gamedze against venting his anger on his wife, saying this could see him spending years in a correctional facility. The accused was sentenced to a year imprisonment with an option to pay E1 000 fine.

Boy (12) hits road in aunt's car

WHAT was supposed to be a Valentine's Day outing with friends ended badly for a Qedusizi Primary School pupil who was bundled off by the police for stealing a relative's newish looking Golf 5 and driving around with classmates.

The Grade Seven pupil (aged 12), who resides in Makholo-kholo, allegedly drove off with the vehicle in the early morning and collected his four friends with whom he attended a sports' day event which took place at the Prince of Wales Sports Ground.

Just before lunch time, the five boarded the vehicle as they were going to their next destination, presumably their different homes.

Unfortunately for them, the vehicle had been parked in a muddy puddle and they were unable to drive out.

Four of the pupils got out and started pushing the vehicle with their equally short friend trying all means to steer out of the mud and instead got more stuck.

A passer-by who was attracted by the spectacle became worried and called for the boys to explain what was happening.

After much back and forth, with denials and much finger

pointing, it emerged that the boy had convinced his friends that the vehicle belonged to his mother.

What was worrysome was that the boy alleged that his friends convinced him to take the vehicle whereas he had money for transportation and didn't need to use it.

He further provided contacts of an adult who he alleged would collaborate his story, especially the part that the vehicle was his mother's. The police were called and also told the same tale.

Tearfully

Of note, the same boy boldly alleged that all five took turns in driving, something which the others tearfully tried to refute.

When a family member was contacted, it was revealed that the boy had spun a tale and lied throughout the questioning.

Instead, the family member, who asked not to be named as he feared family reprisals as he is a distant relative, said the car belongs to an aunt to the boy only identified as Phindile.

"The car is hardly ever used as Phindile says it is waiting for her child to complete his education so as to make use of the vehicle," the neighbour said.

Adding, he said the boy was taught how to drive by a church mate who is normally called upon to wash the car whenever it gets dirty from dust. Added to that, the boy is said to at times

take his pastor's car and move it around the church premises whenever his church mate is called upon to wash it as well.

"He found the keys on a television screen in Phindile's house after entering to make as though he was greeting Petros who was painting in the house," said the relative and the boy is alleged to have driven off.

Attempted

On seeing that the car was no longer in the yard, Petros is said to have attempted to look for it to no avail while telling everyone he came across that he wanted to sort the young boy.

Upon arrival at the Coronation Park, the police took the car together with the pupils to the Mbabane Police Station and their parents were called.

Royal Eswatini Police Service (REPS) Chief Information and Communications Officer Superintandent Phindile Vilakati confirmed the matter when sought for comment yesterday. She said the pupils were advised not to engage in such unbecoming behaviour, especially because they pose a threat to themselves and other motorists on the road given that they were still minors not authorised to drive.

"Their parents were also cautioned to keep a close eye on their children to avoid such occurrences and the minors were handed over to them," she



This was an observation made by senators yesterday when thanking His Majesty King Mswati III for the Speech from the Throne he delivered last Friday.

The senators observed that there was a huge need for Parliament and the executive to work as a unity if the country was to move out of the financial mess.

Before the senators made their submissions, Prime Minister Ambrose Dlamini was asked by Senate President Lindiwe Dlamini to move that the senators thank the king for delivering the speech last week.

Senator Prince Magudvulela commented on the speech saying it called upon both the legislature and the executive to work together to achieve what the king had set out in his speech.

Prince Magudvulela said the executive should engage the legislature on decisions it would take when doing its work.

"It will not be good for the legislature to learn about the moves of the executive in the media," he

The prince further said it was imperative for the executive to act fast on the directives from the legislature. He acknowledged that sometimes, implementing those directives could be hard, but engaging the legislature would make things easier.

He made an example of electricity supply in the country, saying as legislators had called for the executive to look for other ways of generating electricity besides relying on South Africa. He said they called for that to happen in 2008, but to date, nothing had happened.

Minister for Commerce, Industry and Trade Manqoba Khumalo said government should ensure the disharmony between the wings of government was addressed. He said the disharmony was found between different government ministries, emabandla and other

Khumalo added that the King's speech was based more on resuscitating the economy and that called for the whole government machinery to work in unity. He said there was a need to attract foreign direct investment by making it easy for people to do business in the country.

OPEN THE MINES - MPs

This was said by Members of Parliament (MPs) yesterday in the House of Assembly after thanking His Majesty King Mswati III for delivering His Speech from the Throne. Most of the MPs who commented on the King's speech said it was imperative that government made it possible for mines to operate in the coun-

Deputy Speaker Phila Buthelezi said it would be ideal if Minister for Natural Resources and Energy Peter Bhembe was present in Parliament yesterday. However, Bhembe was not present in the House yesterday and no rea-

sons were stated for his absence. Bhembe was present at Senate when the senators met in the morning. Buthelezi urged ministers to inform Bhembe that he was also expected to attend House sittings even though he was a senator.

Buthelezi quoted the King on his 2017 speech, where he called for a speedy enactment of legislations that would regulate the mining industry.

Buthelezi said he was disappointed that two years down the line, nothing was done to implement that directive from the King. Buthelezi said he wanted to make that submission in the presence of Bhembe, so that he could hear for himself what was expected from

Mhlume MP Victor Malambe also called for government to ensure that the revival of the mining industry was done speedily.

Malambe also called for government to ensure that whatever mining companies that would be engaged, they should be challenged to process the minerals into finished goods right here in the country.

He also stated that local companies should also be considered for such tenders for Emaswati to benefit.

This is despite the fact that they were advised last Friday that they should present them yesterday before the house.

The ministers were advised to submit the reports to House of Assembly Speaker Petros Mavimbela.

House of Assembly Speaker Petros Mavimbela, when making the announcement yesterday in the House of Assembly, said he was disappointed to inform his fellow MPs that he had not received any of the reports. He pleaded with Prime Minister Ambrose Dlamini to ensure that ministers adhered to calls from the legislature.

Minister for Tinkhundla Administration and Development David Cruiser Ngcamphalala informed Mavimbela that he had submitted his report. He asked that the speaker go and look for it in his office.

Mavimbela promised to do as Ngcamphalala asked.

Deputy Speaker Phila Buthelezi urged ministers last Friday to submit the reports before yesterday. This was during the opening of the first session of the 11th Parliament, which was opened by His Majesty King Mswati III. The reports were to be submitted to House of Assembly Speaker Petros Mavimbela.

Mavimbela had been asked on Tuesday on how ministers were expected to submit the annual reports when they were barely two months in office. Mavimbela said the reports

belonged to the ministries, not the ministers. They were supposed to find the reports because they were compiled during the time of their predecessors. This meant the ministers had to take over what they found when they took over the

Annual performance reports are accounts that will give a picture to MPs and senators on how the different ministries have performed over the outgoing financial year. The current Cabinet ministers have only been in office for the past two months.

This means that they were not there when this outgoing financial year started, but they now have to account to the legislators on how their various ministries have performed over the past financial year. They have to do this more so because the legislators also have an obligation of taking the same reports to the people who elected them in various constituencies.

The MPs were also elected in October last year and only had a sitting for the first time in the following month. This means when the present financial year started, they were not in office. However all of the legislators, including the Cabinet, have to familiarise themselves with what the previous go ernment was doing.

This would help in ensuring that they work according to what was done by the goals set by the previous government. The previous government was given the task of improving the country's economy such that it would be easy to achieve the first world status by 2022. The present government has to ensure it takes from where the previous government left. This government has a task of ushering the country to 2022.

ILO delegation in the country

THE International Labour Organisation (ILO) delegation is in the country for a three-day mission where several stakeholders will be engaged, including workers unions and authorities.

The team led by Director Joni Musabayana arrived in the country on Wednesday where it held a meeting over dinner with workers federations' representatives. In this meeting, the delegation was updated on the progress made by the country in as far as workers issues and the social dialogue are concerned.

Yesterday, the team had a cour-

tesy meeting with the Minister of Labour and Social Security Makhosi Vilakati, who was joined by the principal secretary, the commissioner of labour as well as other government officials. The team was scheduled to also have a meeting with the United Nations (UN) offices team and Business Eswatini.

Today, the team is expected to meet with the head of government, deputy prime minister, minister of foreign affairs, and the Cabinet as a whole. Early in the morning, the US embassy is scheduled to have a meeting with the team.

Musabayana said on Wednesday, his delegation met with the workers unions who highlighted several challenges and issues that need to be addressed. "They raised issues around taxes, funding of orphaned and vulnerable children (OVC), electricity, costs of passports and the labour market. We will be engaging other stakeholders including the business community and the country's authorities, and we gathered that they have created an enabling environment," he said.

Dialogue

Asked of the assertion that the unions were to report the government to ILO, the director encouraged the parties to engage in social dialogue and try to address matters at home before reporting to them.

He said some serious issues are resolved amicably by unions and government if they engaged in dialogue and there was no need to report IIIOI

the countries involved to ILO, making an example of the Marikana case in South Africa.

Minister of Labour and Social Security Makhosi Vilakati said his ministry was more than willing to engage the labour unions in social dialogue and encouraged them to come forth and table issues they had. "Let them come, let's talk, we are open to dialogue. To us they are a stakeholder not enemies. Whenever there is an issue, they should come see us as our hands are open," he said. The minister said the ILO team was invited to establish a relationship as well as to be kept abreast on the expectations of the ministry. He thanked the team for assisting the country in formulating labour related legislations in the past.


Businesses affected as Siteki without water for three days

SITEKI is currently without the basic commodity, water, making life very difficult for the general public and businesses.

The town and its surrounding communities have been without water since Tuesday, owing to renovations currently being undertaken by the Eswatini Water Services Corporation (EWSC). The situation has also seen a number of businesses reporting huge losses in productivity as they cannot operate without clean running water.

Amongst the businesses which have reported losses is the sole textile factory, JS Clothing, which is situated near Mabhodweni area. The factory has been compelled to reduce its operation hours into half to ensure good health amongst the workers. Speaking during an inter-



view at the factory premises, Production Manager Soodesh Sivram disclosed that the management was left without a choice but to halt operations at midday. At least, this was the case on Wednesday and yesterday. Sivram said the management noted that it would have been a health hazard to keep workers in an environment which had no running water.

"We could not keep the over 550 staff in an environment where they could not use toilets, hence we had to halt operations at midday," said the manager.

Sivram said the situation has translated to huge losses as they had to cancel some orders which were due today.

Meanwhile, other businesses such as eateries within the town centre, also reported a similar situation. The EWSC has pleaded for patience from members of the public. ESWC's Sakhiseni Khumalo, who spoke on behalf of Public Affairs Manager Nomahlubi Matiwane, said the situation was caused by problems which have been experienced with the water network.

Khumalo said the company was currently working on repairing the said network.

"We are hoping that the situation will be back to normal on Saturday as our team is on the ground working hard to address the problem," said Khumalo when sought for clarity.

GENERATION CAPACITY PROCUREMENT THROUGH **COMPETITIVE TENDER**

Eswatini Energy Regulatory Authority (ESERA) is pleased to announce that it will shortly launch the first competitve tender process for the procurement of new renewable electricity capacity in Eswatini.

Following the Minister of Energy's announcement on the 25th July 2018, and in accordance with section 25 of the Electricity Act of 2007, ESERA has commenced the process of preparing a tender process for the first round of generation capacity procurement as envisaged in the Short term Generation Expansion Plan (SGEP). ESERA has established a procurement committee which includes representatives from the Government of Eswatini and the Eswatini Electricity Company to assist in the procurement of new renewable generation capacity, and is taking the necessary steps to launch an initial call for tenders in line with Government's policy.

This tendering process is being adopted to advance Government's partnership with the private sector and also to ensure the orderly development of new generation capacity to help achieve the country's strategic objectives of increasing the amount of renewable energy in our generation mix while improving our country's selfsufficiency at the same time. This competitive tendering process will benefit electricity users in the country as bidders will offer the most competitive tariffs for the new generation capacity.

- 1. In line with the above statement, the procurement of new capacity will now be led by ESERA and will be conducted through a competitive bidding process. In Executing this function, ESERA will be guided by the SGEP, the Energy Policy and the Energy Master Plan of Eswatini.
- 2. The tendering process will be conducted in accordance with the Eswatini Public Procurement Regulatory Agency Act of 2011 and the Electricity Act of 2007. There will be a request for qualification (RFQ) followed by a request for proposals (RFP) and this process

will be launched openly by inviting bidders through the media.

- 3. Screening and evaluation of the submitted proposals will be undertaken by the procurement committee which may be supported in this regard by a technical committee, that will be comprised of key technical representatives from relevant key institutions.
- 4. The procurement committee will report directly to ESERA on the outcome of the evaluation process. ESERA will make the final adjucation decision in cooperation with the Minister as required in terms of secton 25 of the Electricity Act 2007.
- 5. Licensing of the Independent Power Producer (IPP) will follow the normal process in Eswatini.
- 6. In the spirit of competitiveness, fairness and transparency, and in line with regional and international procurement best practices, unsolicited bids for generation capacity will no longer be considered
- 7. All interested parties will be given an opportunity to compete equally and fairly to qualify and, if pre-qualified, to bid for the capacity to be procured as advertised.
- All necessary preparations and consultations with all relevant stakeholders are being done to ensure that the transition to the new procurement approach is seamless.
- 9. We call upon all our esteemed stakeholders to participate in this process and to assist us in developing this sector in accordance with Government policy.





ALLEGED CON ARTIST TEACHER UNFAZED

"I hardly hide and I will never hide, the police will come and find me at the school where you reported me to the head teacher."

This is the bold statement of Welile Dlamini, the teacher who is accused of conning up to 191 people through a dubious pyramid scheme.

The 191 were allegedly conned E57 000. She is employed in one of the schools around Ezulwini.

The scheme began in early December 2018 where Dlamini allegedly promised the members that they would quadruple their investment of E300 over a short period of time by simply recruiting more people to join.

The members were led to believe that they would receive a payout of E5 400 for the mere E300.

The accused is alleged to have created a WhatsApp group in which she coordinated the flow of cash. She is alleged to have offered them an opportunity to join a pyramid scheme operated through mobile money.

The pyramid scheme is called the Strategised UCN Eswatini. It is alleged that in order to become a member, one pays E300 joining fee to a mobile money account

The accused teacher has resorted to eluding the victims. She is alleged to have removed one of the victims from the WhatsApp group and told him to go ahead and report her to the police. A source who is one of the victims said he has already reported the matter to the police.

He also vowed to pursue the matter and will not let her get away with what she did to them. In a story published last week by this publication, allegations are that more people are coming forward.

A source said people from all over the country have alleged that they also fell victims of the accused's dirty tricks. She is alleged to have done the same ...Teacher accused of conning up to 191 people boldly says bring it on

to other people.

However, the source said many are reluctant to come forward due to various reasons. Only two have reported the matter to the police.

Victim

One victim is said to have reported the matter in one of the police stations in Mbabane while the other opened a case at Lobamba Police Station on Tuesday.

In a heated argument between the accused and one of the victims, the victim who was removed from the Whats App group said; "Removing me from the group will not change anything; it only shows your guilty conscious. The fact is we are coming for you, you can remove us but you cannot hide, just know that."

In her response, she arrogantly told the victim to go ahead with pursuing the matter as she will not hide. The text reads: 'I hardly hide and I will never hide, the police will come and find me at the school where you reported me to the head teacher." Another victim who also reported the matter to the police, when contacted by this publication, said her wish is to see the law taking its

"Now when we speak to her, she arrogantly refers us to the police, when we call her demanding our refunds she tells us to go to the police. It is impossible to speak to that woman as she is so arrogant," said the victim.

She further stated that she is completely the opposite of who she was when she recruited them. Now all they get when contacting her for their refunds are threats.

Contacted, Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Superintendent Phindile Vilakati said the matter had not been formally reported to the police. She further encouraged the complainants to open a case with the police so investigations can be conducted.

Angry dad sprints after man accused of raping daughter

AN angry father (41) from Pigg's Peak literally chased down and apprehended a man (23) who he claimed had raped his daughter (19) in a Honda Fit last Saturday evening.

The chase unfolded in the presence of shocked on-lookers outside U-Save Shoprite in Pigg's Peak on Sunday afternoon.

Due to the fact that the incident is still under police investigation, the identities of all those involved shall be deliberately withheld, for now.

Speaking to this publication on condition of anonymity on Wednesday, some police officers said the angry father had caught his daughter exiting the Honda Fit that is owned by the alleged rape suspect. "The whole drama began last week Friday when the father, who lives behind the Pigg's Peak Government Hospital, came home late from work only to find a Honda Fit parked outside his residential gate. The father walked past the car only to see his unsuspecting daughter exiting the passenger's side door of the car while fixing her T-shirt. The daughter, who was surprised to meet her

father, screamed when her eyes met her father's angry gaze," said the police.

According to the police sources, the agitated father then tried to open the passenger's side door of the Honda Fit but the driver pressed the car's central lock system and drove off towards the Pigg's Peak Police Station.

"After that incident, the daughter confessed to have had sex with the Honda Fit driver. On Sunday afternoon, the alleged rape suspect was walking past Shoprite only to hear the angry screams of a man behind him. Out of fear, he ran into the bushes behind Puma Filling Station but the escape attempt was futile as the angry father chased and caught him. After concluding the chase, the father dragged the suspect to the Pigg's Peak Police Station in full view of shocked onlookers. However, the whole incident may have been unnecessary as the alleged rape victim is 19 years old, meaning she is legally an adult who is capable of consenting to any adult activity," added the police source. Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Superintendent Phindile Vilakati confirmed the incident but said the police were investigating it.

Disgruntled man burns tyres on public road, arrested

WHILE stock theft persists, a livestock farmer vented his anger by burning tyres on the road after his herd of goats were stolen, and police seemingly did not take his case seriously.

The farmer was eventually arrested for his conduct. Samuel Tsabedze (28) of Malindza appeared before Siteki Senior Magistrate Donald Mavuso after he was charged with contravening Section 83 as read with Section 122 of the Road Traffic Act.

He is said to have wrongfully and unlawfully placed or abandoned stones on a public road, posing danger to users of the road. Particulars of the offences also included that the accused person further burnt tyres on the same road, blocking traffic in the process.

When the charge sheet was read to him, the accused pleaded guilty. His plea was accepted by the Crown without leading evidence to prove commission of the offence. When asked by the court what led him to commit the said offence, the accused stated that he acted out of anger and frustration.

He told the court that before committing the offence, he lost a herd of goats.

He said he later gathered infor-

mation to the effect that his goats were stolen by a fellow resident who was notorious for stealing goats in the area.

The accused said he relayed this information to the police, but they seemingly turned a deaf ear.

He said burning tyres on the road was meant at drawing the attention of the police. Moreover, the road on which he burnt the tyres leads to the homestead of the person he suspected to have stolen his goats.

The accused person asked the court to be lenient when passing sentence.

He was accordingly found guilty by the court and was sentenced to four months in a correctional facility with an option to pay E1 000

The sentence was wholly suspended for a period of a year on condition that the accused person does not commit a similar offence.

'PAKANI' COMING TO NHLANGANO

"This is not something we will implement overnight but we will follow all the processes, including seeking Parliament's guidance.

The people are expected to contribute recommendations on how best we can go about this. The business community will also make its own recommendations. Some of these businesses will have loading zones reserved once we have 'Pakani' in this town," said Anderson. Anderson said the way the town was growing is an indication that achieving Vision 2022 is possible. "By the look of things, as a town the vibe of Vision 2022 is already upon us," said Anderson.

Robbery suspect pupil granted E50 000 bail





ENERGY giant Eskom, fountain of the lifegiving breast milk for stunted baby Eswatini Electricity Company, announced stage 2 load shedding from 8am to 11pm yesterday, Valentine's

Eskom could as well be heralding the return of blockbuster NBC 'Revolution' series, which begins with the switching off of power supply to mark the start of apocalypse era. But Eskom announced some reprieve due to "some improvement in generation performance and the notable strides made in replenishing water and diesel reserves"

On a similar note EEC might as well be having a template ready each time the parent screams 'load shedding': 'There won't be load shedding for now, we're monitoring the situation closely.'

No doubt the power system remains vulnerable in South Africa and authorities say "while there has been some improvement, should Eskom experience significant unplanned generator trips, this could impact the magnitude and risk of loadshedding.'

Eskom is technically insolvent and at the current trajectory, it will not survive beyond April.

Burden

Acting DG of the department of public enterprises Thuto Shomang told South African Parliament on Wednesday morning that Eskom's E420bn debt burden represents 15 per cent of the sovereign's debt and that if the power utility defaults on its debt, it will threaten the economy.

The escalation of municipality and Soweto debt at around E28bn is another problem facing Eskom, including the increase in the number of Eskom employees from 32 000 in 2007 to 48 000 in 2018, with associated costs growing from E9.5bn to E29.5bn, reports Times Live. The costs for the plants have escalated significantly to more than E300bn - Medupi from E24.9bn to E145bn and Kusile from E80.7bn to E161.4bn.

Last July, Eswatini and Eskom met over the possible expansion of the 25-year power supply deal between the two countries whereby South Africa supplies the kingdom with about 80 per cent of electricity was in its 18th year and coming to an end in 2025.

Officials said Eswatini's average demand for electricity was between 191 and 223 megawatts. In order to meet this demand, the country planned to increase its internal generation capacity by developing some renewable projects (Solar PV).

It was said Eskom had offered some assistance during the commissioning of such projects so to ensure that the quality of supply was not compromised. The country is reported to be generating only 10 per cent of the electricity it requires and imports the other 10 per cent from Mozambique.

Archives are filled with impressive research work on alternative sources of energy as opposed to importing on relying on neighburs.

Anne Wheldon, 1990, for instance, says Eswatini has many energy resources including biomass, coal, hydro and solar. These resources, in particular biomass, supply a major proportion of



energy consumption, but all petroleum products and most coal and electricity are imported from or via South Africa.

Eswatini could increase self-reliance, at a financial cost, by substituting local coal for imports, and by generating more electric power from biomass, coal or hydro sources.

Ethanol for 20 per cent petrol blending should soon be produced from molasses. Deforestation is evident in the country and suggests that fuelwood demand exceeds the sustainable supply from accessible land: this is an issue in both national and individual self-reliance.

Supply and demand could be matched by using wood more efficiently; increasing the supply; and substituting other energy sources. Stoves and afforestation programmes can succeed only if they meet the perceived needs of individual consumers, and require proper market research and

Fuel substitution shows limited promise, but hydro and photovoltaic systems might assist rural development.

Incentives

According to Eswatini Power Africa Fact Sheet, the biggest issues are; Lack of clarity in roles for procurement between the Swaziland Energy Regulatory Authority (SERA) and EEC; Need for incentives to improve electricity service performance and system to track performance standards; Historical reliance on power imports from South Africa; Limited ability to provide credit enhancement; and utility concerns about large scale integration of intermittent renewable.

Around the same time, in 2017 the whole of Southern African Development Community (SADC) announced to the world that it was experiencing surplus electricity-generation capacity

The country is reported to be generating only 10 per cent of the electricity it requires and imports the other 10 per cent from Mozambique

as a result of regional cooperation in energy planning, that was of about 2 616 Megawatts (MW)

Experts observed that that excess in electricity supply was partly a result of an economic slow-

Just day before yesterday, it was reported the world over that Zambia had stopped importing

"In the first quarter of 2018, and for the first time in its history, Zambia stopped importing electricity and now its surplus electricity production is expected to power the SADC."

Zambia has been importing power from neighbouring countries such as Mozambique and with the new milestone, the country's constant power cuts are now a thing of the past.

"The turnaround is due to a robust hydro and solar power generation industry in recent years making the country self-sufficient in energy.

For the Southern African nation, electricity production could soon be in surplus and citizens could enjoy the benefits of exporting power to the neighbouring countries which are not energy sufficient." But Eswatini is not neighbouring Zambia to tap on the windfall.

Not that Eswatini Electricity Company is a crybaby, that it has been drooling since independence, as a matter of fact over the years it has generated myriad ideas and strategies of coming out of the quagmire of dependence to either of the neighbours.

It is true, as a matter of fact that the lifestyle of the average resident has changed drastically since rural electrification of the entire countryside, courtesy of the Taiwan - Eswatini Cooperation Agreement that is equally as old as half a century, the country's age since independence.

Now this speaks volumes, it means without electricity the average person in Eswatini cannot be expected to revert to lubhaca, lighting of the grass stock prior to settling down into bed or the use of luvatsi to start a fire for cooking in the same way the Bushmen or the Koi and San still

Rather people would contemplate the use of solar power as an immediate alternative or the generator, the problem now lies with sustainability of the generator and also affordability.

Our life is undoubtedly centred around electricity, all round, any deviation from the norm is doom, unless a miracle happens over night, the time when there will be no electricity. Hope it was no so much a blackout Valentine, or is it a matter of time?

THE CHURCHAGE

FROM a young age, our parents instil a church discipline in us.

I, too, had to go through this church 'ritual'. It didn't matter whether I felt like church or not, it was a non-negotiable rule at home.

I know most of you can relate, we've all gone through it. From that out of tune songs meted out by the Sunday school teacher we referred to as auntie, to the main service's gruelling two hours sermon, yet all we wanted was to just play.

I guess our parents had gone through same during their time and, well, we had to feel it too. But did we really have the time to think what all the fuss was all about? No. All we knew was, Sundays were non-negotiable.

This custom culminated throughout my teen years straight into adulthood. It is then that I somehow got to understand what attending church was all about and here I am today doing the same thing to my own child; the church cul-

It was not until I gave it some thought what could church or religion might be about, hence the birth of this interesting column. We will try, bit by bit, to untangle the mysteries behind the coming about of the church, down to unpacking the different denominations we have in our beautiful country, Eswatini.

So, what is the church age? Where does it fit in biblical history?

An 'age' is a historical period of time or an era. Some historians divide human history into many epochs and name them according to their defining characteristics: Middle Ages, Modern Age, Postmodern Age, etc. Biblical history, too, can be divided into different eras.

When those divisions emphasise God's interaction with His creation, we call them dispensations. More broadly, biblical history can be divided into two periods, roughly following the division of Old and New Testaments: The Age of the Law and the Church Age.

Therefore, the church age is the period of time from Pentecost (Acts 2) to the rapture (foretold in 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18). It is called the Church Age because it covers the period in which the church is on earth. It corresponds with the dispensation of Grace. Jesus predicted the Church Age in Matthew 16:18 when He said, "I will build my church." He has kept His promise, and His church has now been growing for almost 2000 years.


The church is composed of those individuals who have by faith accepted Christ Jesus as their Lord and Saviour. Therefore, the Church is people rather than denominations or buildings. It is the Body of Christ of which He is the head. The church is universal in scope but meets locally in smaller bodies.

The Church Age will end when God's people are raptured out of the world and taken to be with the Lord.

The rapture will be followed in heaven by the Marriage Supper of the Lamb (Revelation 19:6-9) as the church, the Bride of Christ, receives her heavenly reward. Until then, the church carries on in hope, exhorted to "stand firm. Let nothing move you. Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labour in the Lord is not in vain".

When did the church begin/start? The church began on the Day of Pentecost, 50

days after the Passover when Jesus died and rose again. The word translated 'church' comes from two Greek words that together mean 'called out from the world for God.



The word is used throughout the Bible to refer to all those who have been born again through faith in the death and resurrection of Jesus. The word church, when used to reference all believers everywhere, is synonymous with the term 'Body of Christ.'

The word church first appears in Matthew 16 when Jesus tells Peter, "On this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not overcome it." (verse 18). The 'rock' here is the statement Peter had made, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God" (verse 16). That truth about Jesus is the bedrock of the church that has flourished for over 2 000 years. Everyone who makes that truth the foundation of his or her own life becomes a member of Jesus' church.

Jesus' words, "I will build my church," were a foretelling of what was about to happen when He sent the Holy Spirit to indwell believers (John 15:26-27; 16:13). Jesus still had to undergo the cross and experience the resurrection. Although the disciples understood in part, the fulfilment of all Jesus had come to do had not yet been accomplished.

After His resurrection, Jesus would not allow His followers to begin the work He had given them, to make disciples of all nations, until the Holy Spirit had come (Acts 1:4-5).

The Book of Acts details the beginning of the church and its miraculous spread through the power of the Holy Spirit. Ten days after Jesus ascended back into heaven, the Holy Spirit was poured out upon 120 of Jesus' followers who waited and prayed.

The same disciples who had quaked in fear of being identified with Jesus, were suddenly empowered to boldly proclaim the gospel of the risen Messiah, validating their message with

miraculous signs and wonders.

Thousands of Jews from all parts of the world were in Jerusalem for the Feast of Pentecost. They heard the gospel in their own languages and many believed.

Those who were saved were baptised, adding daily to the church. When persecution broke out, the believers scattered, taking the gospel message with them, and the church spread like wildfire to all parts of the known earth.

The start of the church involved Jews in Jerusalem, but the church soon spread to other

The Samaritans were evangelised by Philip in Acts 8. In Acts 10, God gave Peter a vision that helped him understand that the message of salvation was not limited to the Jews but open to anyone who believed.

The salvation of the Ethiopian eunuch (Acts 8:26-39) and the Italian centurion Cornelius (Acts 10) convinced the Jewish believers that God's church was broader than they had imagined. The miraculous calling of Paul on the road to Damascus set the stage for an even greater spread of the gospel to the Gentiles.

Jesus' prophetic words to Peter before the crucifixion have proved true. Though persecution and 'the gates of Hades' have fought against it, the church only grows stronger. Revelation 7:9 provides a glimpse of the church as God designed

"After this I looked, and there before me was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, tribe, people and language, standing before the throne and before the Lamb."

The church that Jesus began will continue until the day He comes for us and we are united with Him forever as His bride.

Eswatini's sunshine to finally be profitably used as:

ESERA opens tenders for renewable electricity

THE days of Eswatini's heavy reliance on South Africa for electricity could slowly be coming to an end as ESERA Chief Executive Officer Vusumuzi Mkhumane yesterday announced that everyone interested in producing renewable electricity will now stand an equal chance to do so.

This is because ESERA has finally conformed with the dictates of Section 25 of the Electricity Act of 2007 which calls for competitive tendering processes for the procurement of renewable energy in the country.

ESERA is the Eswatini Energy Regulatory Authority, formerly SERA.

Mkhumane acknowledged in a press briefing held in the company's boardroom that the manner in which the country previously solicited its electricity was unstructured and to a great extent unsustainable. "We previously procured through unsolicited bidding which was unstructured because this depended on individual investors coming through and presenting their case on what they had to offer.

"This was not competitive bidding, and this resulted in the few investors we found easily slipping away" Mkhumane admitted, adding that now that the situation had been rectified, renewable energy producers would stand an equal chance to get tenders through competitive bidding processes

Mkhumane reiterated that the country's renewable energy production would be staggered in two phases: solar and biomass electricity production.

Produced from sunshine, solar energy is touted as the cleanest form of electricity and highly reliable too, which means Eswatini will now be using its good days of sunshine into profitable use. Biomass electricity, on the other hand, encompasses a large variety of materials, including wood from various sources, agricultural residues which are converted into electric power through sever-

Making his remarks, Mkhumane made an assurance ESERA would issue the first tender notice.

In the meantime, Mkhumane pointed out that the latest developments in the country's energy production, transmission and distribution sector were in line with good international practice.

Relief as electricity tariffs projected to go down

WHERE healthy competition exists, consumers are bound to get value for money.

In Eswatini, it is projected that the levelling of the playing ground in in the production, transmission and distribution of electricity could lead toelectricity tariffs going down.

Consumers are currently reeling from exorbitant electricity costs as unit prices went up from E1.48 to E1.75 in April last year. This means that one only gets 28 units for E50 electricity and 57 units for E100 electricity.

Eswatini Energy Regulatory Authority (ESERA) Chief Executive Officer Vusumuzi Mkhumane yesterday reiterated that competitive tendering processes in the procurement of electricity would make the country energy secure, increase FDI inflows and most importantly result in tariff decreas-

Bidding

"Critically, through healthy bidding, tariffs will become affordable as the competition will most likely impact the electricity price structure," he said, emphatically stating that ESERA is looking for Independent Power Producers (IPPs) to take the country's energy sector to another level.

ESERA's tendering processes will be guided by the ministry of natural resources and energy's Short-Term Generation Expansion Plan (SGEP) and the country's Energy Policy.

In the meantime, Africa has taken the renewable energy production route as the African Development Bank for instance has committed about E350 million to improve access to sustainable energy across the continent.

How Lilangeni firmed up against major currencies in January

IN January, the external value of the Lilangeni strengthened against major currencies, the Central Bank of Eswatini reported in its Recent Economic

Developments report. Against the US Dollar, the local unit strengthened by 2.4 per cent to average E13.87 compared to December. "The local unit rallied as investors cheer a policy U-turn by the Federal Reserve to a dovish stance throwing emerging market economies a lifeline," the Central Bank said, also adding that international financial pressures on the Rand had eased as the now-market-friendly African National Congress rides high in polls ahead of the May election.

Against the Pound Sterling, the local

unit appreciated by 0.7 per cent to close January at E17.87 on average. The CBE attributed the Lilangeni's strengthening against the Sterling to the unexpected political chaos in the UK resulting from slow progress and mounting uncertainty around the delivery of a prudent Brexit plan.

The UK government has a looming deadline of March to conclude the Brexit

Against the Euro, the Lilangeni strengthened by two per cent to average E15.84 compared to the previous month.

Stronger

At the end of the month, the local unit was stronger at E13.37 to the US Dollar, E17.56 to the Pound Sterling and E15.38 to the Euro after closing the month of December at E14.39 to the US Dollar, E18.24 to the Pound Sterling and E16.44 to the Euro. In the meantime, the South African load shedding debacle by power utility firm ESKOM seems to have had adverse effects on the Rand. Businessday newspaper reported yesterday that the Rand, which is pegged to the Lilangeni on a one-on-one basis was back at the R14/\$ mark from R13.73/\$ on Wednesday.

Confusion over power investment in Africa

DESPERATE times call for desperate measures.

So Tanzania, where 80 per cent of the population has no reliable access to electricity, is planning to import biomass as fuel from Ethiopia this year and is building a \$2 billion hydropower project threatening the Selous Game Reserve.

Meanwhile, several thousand Tanzanians are finding an easier, eco-friendly solution: solar-powered LEDs available through a pay-asyou-go model.

Tanzania's woes aren't unique. The World Bank says annual outages in sub-Saharan Africa can range from 50 hours to 4600 hours at the latter end, that's more than half a year. So an off-the-grid solution is proving valuable in the region and throughout Africa.

From Kenya to Tanzania, Uganda to Rwanda, Nigeria to Ivory Coast and even war-torn Somalia, Africans are embracing solar energy solutions that help them power their homes even without being connected to the grid, on an unparalleled scale. Nairobibased M-KOPA started the revolution. Launched commercially in 2012, M-KOPA allows low-income families access to solar energy for as little as \$1 per month.

This is cheaper and more environmental than the alternatives, kerosene or diesel fuel, and offers a metered payment system tracked through their phone SIM cards.

The first firm in the world to develop that innovation, M-KOPA now has 600 000 customers across Kenya, Tanzania and Uganda, and is bringing solar power to 500 new homes every day.

It has received \$162 million in investments since 2014. But the firm is no longer alone.

Solar

International solar energy players are increasingly focusing on African nations too. Dutch startup Lumos entered Nigeria in 2016. It had sold 73 000 units by the end of 2017. In 2018, it entered the Ivory Coast. Its kits include a solar panel, battery, power sockets, LED light bulbs and



a mobile phone adapter. BBOXX, which launched in the UK in 2010 and has raised \$100 million, has over the past two years moved its operational headquarters to Kigali, Rwanda. It distributes its solar kits through agents in 10 African countries and uses remote monitoring technology to improve battery life and users' experience.

And there's plenty of market space still for more home-grown and international solar energy startups to support the growing demands for electricity on a continent home to several fast-growing economies that are mostly not yet connected to the grid, say experts.

The World Bank estimates that the sector will see sales worth \$8 billion by 2022.

Market

"There's this incredible market opportunity that's not being met by the relatively small handful of companies that are operating on the continent," says Jem Porcaro, Senior Director for energy access at the United Nations Foundation.

For sure, the spread of solar energy to off-grid communities isn't unique to Africa. From Quetsol in Guatemala to Simpa Networks in India, a few startups have made similar attempts in parts of Latin America and Asia too.

But both the scale of the problem and the spread of nations where solar off-the-grid solutions are being accepted are unique to Africa.

The continent had 580 million people who were off-the-grid in 2016 and is expected to be home to 80 percent of the world's off-the-grid population by 2030, according to the International Energy Agency.

Africa-based startups in this sector have received comfortably more than half of the total global investment in this sector, pegged at \$922 million by the World Bank.

What's more, the key technology that's the backbone of the payment model used by most of these low-cost, smart-tech solar energy providers in Africa is also homegrown. Customers

use mobile payments, revolutionised by the Nairobi-based M-PESA. "The widespread uptake of mobile money has provided the right environment for off-grid utilities to operate and grow," says Mansoor Hamayun, CEO and co-founder of BBOXX.

Costs

The sharp reduction in costs globally of solar panels and batteries over the past 15 years has helped make the solar kits these firms offer affordable. For the M-KOPA kit, users need to pay an initial deposit of \$35, with 365 payments of 45 cents each after that.

They can spread the payment out, with a minimum of \$1 a month. Once completed, they own the kit — and can access solar energy free after that.

But the spread of off-the-grid solar energy solutions in Africa is also helping the emergence of other local firms that help distribute these kits. PEG-Ghana, for instance, distributes solar kits in three countries and has raised \$50 million in investments.

These firms are well-placed to take on distribution because they either have local relationships they can leverage to develop sales networks, says Porcaro.

Getting to this point hasn't been easy. "The main challenge has been developing this new category," says Jesse Moore, CEO and co-founder, M-KOPA.

"We have had to build the business and technology from scratch." But he's confident they've now demonstrated the scalability of the platform. "The entire off-grid tech category has come of age."

A lack of access to finance remains a challenge, according to Porcaro. Energy sector finance is still largely skewed toward large infrastructure projects that don't always reach the underserved, he says. "We see ... a relatively small amount of financing" going toward firms working in remote communities.

They're "leveraging some really innovative technologies and business models but the amount and the type of capital is just not there yet." Still, the benefits of off-the-grid solar solutions are clear.

According to the GoGLA, the global association for the off-grid solar energy industry, 58 per cent of households connected to off-grid tech undertake more economic activities because of their solar home system, while 36 per cent of households generate additional income once they connect to off-grid tech.

And there's consensus that there will only be expansion in this energy market, as the off-grid consumer becomes increasingly commercially viable, creditworthy and loyal. "It is already clear," says Moore.

Chinese exports unexpectedly perk up

BEIJING - Chinese exports unexpectedly rose last month, according to official data released yesterday just as China sat down for crucial trade talks in Beijing with its top trade partner the United States.

Exports rose 9.1 per cent in January from a year earlier, data from the customs administration showed, ahead of forecasts and turning a corner after exports fell in December.

China's imports, however, continued to fall in January, down 1.5 per cent from a year earlier, though at a slower pace than a 10.2 per cent decline forecast by Bloomberg News.

Analysts cautioned that it is difficult to compare trends at the start of each year due to the Chinese New Year holiday, which came in early February this year and can affect business activity.

"The broad trend in shipments still appears to be pointing down," said Julian Evans-Pritchard of Capital Economics.

"The downbeat outlook for global growth means that this year is likely to be challenging for Chinese exporters, even if the ongoing US-China trade negotiations culminate in a deal," Evans-Pritchard wrote in a research note.

Officials from the world's top two

economies have been holding negotiations in Beijing since yesterday and ending today in a bid to resolve their thorny trade dispute.

China and the US have already imposed new duties on more than \$360-billion in two-way trade, which has weighed on their manufacturing sectors and shaken global finan-

cial markets.

Pressure to seal an accord ahead of a March 1 deadline set by Donald Trump appears to have eased slightly after the US president indicated he was open to extending a trade truce depending on progress in Beijing.

Trump in December postponed

plans to sharply hike tariffs on \$200billion of Chinese imports to allow more time for negotiation.

SA currency breaches R14 to dollar as ESKOM sours outlook

JOHANNESBURG - The rand weakened past R14 per dollar yesterday as power utility Eskom entered a fifth straight day of blackouts that have discouraged investors over the economy, days before the annual budget.

At 0630 GMT, the rand was up 0.2 per cent to R14.0425 per dollar, halting a slide that has seen the currency tumble around three per cent in three sessions as a rising dollar compounded the pain of the Eskom crisis. "The heightened domestic risk premium has prompted selling, with almost R2 billion of net outflows from the domestic bond market yesterday," analysts

at Rand Merchant Bank said in a note.. The dollar out-stripped most other currencies, supported by good inflation data and weak growth in Europe. On Wednesday, the government said power utility Eskom was technically insolvent and needed an urgent bailout to help it manage its more than \$30 billion of debt as it battles to keep its plants running. Yesterday, Eskom said it would cut 2 000 megawatts of power from the national grid from 0600 GMT. Eskom poses a threat to the country's credit rating, which is hanging by a thread with Moody's, the last of the top three agencies to rate it investment grade. Reuters

'SA mining output down 4.8%'

JOHANNESBURG - Mining production decreased by 4.8 per cent year-on-year in December, with negative contributions coming from gold, iron ore, other metallic minerals, copper and chromium ore, Statistics South Africa said yesterday.

Total mining production was 1.6 per cent lower in 2018, following an increase of 3.9 per cent in 2017.

Gold output fell 31 per cent on a year-on-year basis in December, contributing a negative 4.6 per centage points to the overall number, while iron ore was down 14.3per cent, adding a negative 2.1 percentage points. Other metallic minerals declined 18.4 per cent , while copper output dropped 30.8 per cent, contributing -0.3 percentage points, and chromium ore fell 9.3per cent. Stats SA said mineral sales increased by 17.4 per cent last December compared with the same month in 2017, with the largest contributors being platinum group metals, coal, iron ore and manganese ore. Total mineral sales were 5.2 per cent higher in 2018 compared with 2017. The rise compared with increases of 8.4 per cent in 2017 and 12.9 per cent the year before. African **NewsAgency**

UK's May faces revolt from Euroskeptic tories in Brexit vote

LONDON - Prime Minister Theresa May is facing a revolt from pro-Brexit members of her Conservative Party who are unhappy at signs she's planning to take a no-deal split off the table.

Members of the anti-EU European Research Group met with Chief Whip Julian Smith on Wednesday evening to insist that leaving the bloc without an agreement must remain an option, according to people familiar with the matter.

The issue came to a head yesterday when the House of Commons votes on what should happen next in the Brexit talks, as May seeks to renegotiate her deal with the European Union. In just six weeks the UK will leave the EU with or without an agreement. May's draft withdrawal contract was rejected by a huge margin in the Commons last month. No new accord has so far been reached.

May is aiming to mollify her critics and earn herself another two weeks of breathing space, promising Parliament further opportunities to have a say over what happens next if she can't get a deal. Pro-Brexit members of her Tory party are demanding she re-writes the deal because they say it keeps Britain tied too closely to EU rules, potentially forever.

Many euroskeptics would prefer a no-deal Brexit to leaving on May's terms, despite fears it would cause severe damage to the UK economy. Yesterday, May will ask the Commons to endorse the result of previous voting on January 29, when members of Parliament backed calls to re-write her Brexit agreement but opposed the idea of a no-deal divorce.

Wednesday's meeting between euroskeptic Tories and May's chief whip broke up without resolution, meaning some Conservatives in the ERG could vote against the government or abstain. As May doesn't have a majority in Parliament, that raises the prospect that she could be defeated. While this would be embarrassing for the prime minister, its main practical effect would be to signal to Brussels how little room she has for maneuver. *Fin24*

Nigeria 'Delta Avengers' militants vow to cripple economy if Buhari re-elected

ABUJA - A militant group in Nigeria's oil-rich southern Niger Delta threat-ened yesterday to cripple Africa's top oil producer if President Muhammadu Buhari is re-elected in a vote due to be held tomorrow.

The Niger Delta Avengers - who have been demanding a greater share of the oil revenue produced in the impover-ished southern region - said in a statement they hoped to end Buhari's rule through elections and that opposition candidate Atiku Abubakar was their

preferred choice for president.

Buhari faces a tight contest against Abubakar, a business and ex-vice president, in tomorrow's elections in Nigeria, Africa's biggest democracy.

The Niger Delta Avengers were behind a 2016 wave of violence that helped push Nigeria into recession.

The group warned that if Buhari is reelected there would be "a perpetual recession for Nigeria" and that if elected, Abubakar should start a "restructuring of Nigeria" within six months to forestall further attacks in the Niger Delta.

No substantial attacks have been carried out by any groups in the Delta region since January 2017.

Attacks on pipelines and other facilities in the Niger Delta in 2016 cut Nigeria's crude output from a peak of 2.2 million barrels per day (mbpd) to near 1 mbpd - the lowest level seen in Africa's biggest economy in at least 30 years.

That, combined with low oil prices, pushed the OPEC member state into its first recession in a quarter of a century - crude sales make up two-thirds of government revenue and most of its foreign exchange. *Reuters*

Nestle profit surges as Swiss food giant eyes selling Herta

ZURICH - Swiss food giant Nestle said yesterday that profits surged last year, boosted by income from the disposal of businesses, and it would consider selling its Herta charcuterie business.


Net profit leapt 41.6 per cent to 10.1 billion Swiss francs in 2018, Nestle said in a statement.

Sales grew by 2.1 per cent to 91.4 billion Swiss francs, helped by net acquisitions of 0.7 per cent but hit by changes in exchange rates in several emerging markets that reduced

sales by 1.6 per cent.

The company also announced it will "explore strategic options" for its subsidiary Herta as "a further step in positioning the portfolio towards attractive high-growth categories". Nestle CEO Mark Schneider welcomed the results.

"We made significant progress with our portfolio transformation and sharpened our group's strategic focus, strengthening key growth categories and geographies in the process," he said in the statement. AFP



Baby born inside intact amniotic sac

VILA VELHA - These impressive images show a baby boy who was born while still inside his amniotic sac after it failed to burst in an almost one-in-100 000 rare occurrence.

The startling images were taken at the Praia da Costa Hospital in the city of Vila Velha in the Brazilian state of Espirito Santo by photographer Jana Brasil, who specialises in photos of births.

In the photos, the newborn baby, named Noah by mother Monyck Valasco, can still be seen inside the amniotic sac after he is born by caesarean section.

Noah's whole body is engulfed by the sac, giving him a startling, alien-like appearance.

Experts say the special births occur in every 80 000 or 100 000 natural births and do not put the baby or mother at risk. They are believed to be less common during caesarean section because the scalpel typically punctures the amniotic sac.

Mother Valasco, 34, told reporters: "People all around the world are reposting the photos and looking for us. I saw him being born. They lowered the screen so I could see. I cried a lot. It's an emotion that has no size." Brasil dedicated herself to photographing births as a full-time job three years ago and

said: "It's indescribable to register that moment. Last year I took photos of babies in the sacs, I have two awards. "But nothing like the photo of Noah, it surprised me. I thought I had been through all the emotions, but he pulled a face and did a little pout."

Gynaecologist Rafael Angelo Baggieri said: "An en-caul birth occurs when the baby is born without breaking the amniotic sac, in other words, within a little house which shelters it during gestation."

Baggieri says the special births occur in every 80 000 or 100 000 natural births and do not put the baby or mother at risk.

They are believed to be less common during caesarean section because the scalpel typically punctures the amniotic sac. Noah is reportedly still in hospital as Baggieri says the newborn was 'tired' after the birth but the tot is expected to be allowed to go home by the end of the week. *Daily Mail*

WHAT IS AN EN CAUL BIRTH?

eing born 'en caul' means a portion of the amniotic sac or membrane remains on the baby's head at birth.

It affects less than one-in-100 000 newborns.

A caul is a thin, filmy membrane that may be attached to the head, face and ears or could drape over the head and cover part of the torso.

The caul is harmless and can be removed by healthcare professionals by peeling it back from the skin.

Incisions must be made at the nostrils to allow the baby to breathe.

The loops can then be carefully removed from behind the baby's ears.

In folklore, children born en caul are said to possess supernatural abilities and be destined for greatness.

KHARTOUM - Sudanese President Omar al-Bashir, who has faced weeks of protests against his threedecade rule, pledged to promote peace in the country's war zones in an address to paramilitary

"I assure you that the year 2019 will be the year of peace in Sudan," the president told members of the Popular Defence Force (PDF), a paramilitary unit that has been widely used to fight longstanding rebellions in Darfur and in regions near the South Sudan bor-

"We want to keep our guns completely silent," said Bashir, wearing military uniform.

His remarks came weeks after he extended ceasefires in Blue Nile and South Kordofan states, where troops and paramilitaries have been battling rebels with pre-independence links to South Sudan.

"We want you to go to the war zones, not for fighting but for building schools and health centres," Bashir said.

The paramilitaries of the PDF are civilians, many of them young students. Before South Sudan broke away in

2011, they played a major role in the brutal decadeslong civil war against the independence movement.

The PDF has also fought in Sudan's western region of Darfur, where ethnic minority rebels took up arms in 2003, drawing a scorched response from the government that prompted war crimes charges against Bashir from the International Criminal Court. The president has repeatedly denied the charges, which also include genocide and crime against humani-

Opposition welcomes firmer stance from US against army violence

HARARE - The Nelson Chamisa-led Movement for Democratic Change (MDC) on Wednesday welcomed the US government's call for "a neutral third party" to preside over dialogue between Zimbabwe's political rivals.

The US issued a strong statement on Tuesday, in which it condemned the violence that broke out last month and the heavy-handed response from security forces that followed.

Deputy government spokesperson Robert Palladino said the US wants soldiers accused of rape and torture during the crackdown to be tried for their crimes.

"The US remains seriously concerned about the excessive use of force by government of Zimbabwe security forces since January 14, which has resulted in at least 13 deaths, 600 victims of violence, torture or rape, and more than 1 000 arrests," he said in a statement.

"The US calls on all sides to come together immediately in national dialogue. The dialogue process must be credible, inclusive and mediated by a neutral third party.

"In order for such a dialogue to succeed, the government of Zimbabwe should end its excessive violence and intimidation, immediately release the civil society activists who have been arbitrarily detained, and hold security force members responsible for human rights violations and abuses accountable."

Palladino's statement came a day after Namibian President Hage Geingob, the Chairperson the Southern African Development Community (SADC), weighed in on Monday with support for president Emmerson Mnangagwa's administration. SADC's response angered civic society groups and the MDC for failing to censure Mnangagwa for deploying the army. This is the second time in six months that the army has been deployed onto the streets to quell protests. Times live

Cameroon's opposition leader formally charged with 'rebellion'

YAOUNDE - Cameroon's opposition leader Maurice Kamto was on Tuesday charged with rebellion, insurrection and hostility against the homeland, more than two weeks after his arrest on 28 January, one of his lawyers said.

Kamto lost what he says was a fraudulent presidential election in October and was detained late last month after organising a small rally against longserving President Paul Biya. Security services broke up that rally with live fire, shooting and wounding six people, and have put down other rare anti-Biya protests across the country, including the main commercial city Douala and the capital Yaounde, since the vote. There was no immediate comment from Kamto's party and supporters whether the charges

made against him on Tuesday would trigger more demonstrations.

"The investigating judges charged Maurice Kamto at the military tribunal," his lawyer Christopher Ndong told Reuters. "This is not a judicial matter. This is politics.'

Another of his lawyers, Emmanuel Simh, told Reuters the charges he faces include: "hostility against the homeland, incitement to insurrection, offence against the president of the republic, destruction of public buildings and goods." Twenty-two members of his Cameroon Renaissance Movement (MRC) are also on trial for the same charges, lawyers said.

'Death toll in election stampede now at 15'

PORT HARCOURT - Fifteen people were killed in a stampede at an election campaign rally in southern Nigeria held by President Muhammadu Buhari, health officials said on Wednesday, in an updated toll.

Kem-Daniel Elebiga, spokesman for the University of Port Harcourt Teaching Hospital, said "a total of 15 bodies were brought in" on Tuesday. Three were men and the others were women, he added.

Twelve injured people were brought in, nine of whom remain in hospital. "They are all responding well to treatment," he said.

Police in Rivers state, of which Port Harcourt is the capital, earlier gave a toll of four dead and four injured, while Buhari's office said "several" people lost their lives.

Conflicting death tolls are not unusual in Nigeria, although the authorities often issue lower numbers.

Local media said the stampede happened when panic broke out at the end of a rally, held in the city's Adokiye Amiesimaka Stadium.

Crowds tried to force their way through a locked exit.

"Those from behind were pushing and putting pressure on those in front, leading to some persons falling on the ground and being trampled upon," said journalist Egufe Yafugborhi, of the Vanguard newspaper.

'Respect legal right to free speech'

PARIS - France has officially reacted to the arrest of Cameroon opposition chief Maurice Kamto and hundreds of his supporters. The French foreign ministry said it was following developments in Cameroon and called on the government to respect the rights of people to freely express their opinions. "We are concerned at this legal development and are continuing to follow the situation of Mr. Kamto and that of approximately 200 of his supporters who are being held in detention. "The Cameroonian opposition, of which Mr. Kamto is a leading figure, must be able to freely express its opinions, in accordance with the law," a response to Q&A daily press briefing read.

Election No Be War

LAGOS - President Muhammadu Buhari's party has issued a stern warning to the United States and other foreign allies for allegedly making "unguarded" public statements ahead of Nigeria's presidential polls this weekend.

The US, Britain and the European Union have in recent weeks publicly warned against vote-rigging and election violence, and also expressed concern over President Muhammadu Buhari's suspension of Nigeria's top judge last month.

"Nigerian security services must provide a safe and secure environment for the Nigerian people to exercise their rights," read part of a statement issued by the US State Department last week.

US-Libya forces raid al Qaeda site

CAIRO - Joint US-Libyan forces raided an al Qaeda site in the Libyan city of Ubari on Wednesday. according to a statement by a Libyan official.

The spokesperson for Fayez al-Sarraj, Head of the Presidency Council of the Tripoli-based Government of National Accord of Libya, said in a statement late on Wednesday that a site with a number of al Qaeda members in Ubari was "raided" but gave no details. "This joint work between the Presidency Council of the government of National Accord and the US government coincided with the meeting of US Secretary of State Mike Pompeo and Foreign Minister Mohamed Sayala at the Global Coalition To Defeat Islamic State meeting last week", spokesperson Mohamed El Sallak said in the statement. Reuters

AU calls for peace conference

ADDIS ABABA - The African Union (AU) has proposed a global conference in July to try to resolve the Libya conflict with the aim of holding elections in October. A statement on Tuesday said the 55-member body would like to hold "an international conference on reconciliation in Libya under the auspices of the AU and UN" during the first half of July. The declaration also requested the AU commission, alongside the United Nations and the Libyan government, take "all the necessary measures for the organisation of presidential and legislative elections in October 2019".

US fails to halt Iran's bid to free frozen billions

WASHINGTON - An international court on Wednesday ruled Iran can proceed with a bid to unfreeze assets in the United States, rejecting Washington's claims the case must be halted because of Tehran's alleged support for international terrorism.

Washington had argued that Iran's "unclean hands" — a reference to Tehran's suspected backing of terror groups — should disqualify its lawsuit to recover \$2 billion in assets frozen by the US Supreme Court in 2016. The International

Court of Justice in The Hague threw out some of the US challenges, and said it had the right to hold full hearings at a later date as to whether Tehran will get the money back. Chief judge Abdulqawi Ahmed Yusuf said the UN's top court "unanimously rejects the preliminary objections to admissibility raised by the United States of America". The court also "finds that it has jurisdiction in the case," Yusuf said at the end of an hour-long reading of the decision. Washington, however, called the court's ruling a "significant

victory" for America because it threw out a key issue pertaining to Iran's claims of sovereign immunity. The case is one in which "the Iranian regime seeks to misuse legal process and distort principles of international law," the State Department said. Tehran said the United States had illegally seized Iranian financial assets and those of Iranian companies -- and with Iran's clerical regime facing economic difficulties after sanctions and a fall in its currency, resolving the case remains crucial. *AFP*

US, China seek deal to prevent trade-war escalation

BEIJING - US and Chinese negotiators yesterday kicked off two days of high-level talks that President Donald Trump says could decide whether he escalates the bruising tariff battle between the world's two biggest economies.

Trump indicated this week he was open to extending a trade truce beyond March 1 depending on progress in Beijing. In December, he postponed plans to sharply hike tariffs on \$200 billion of Chinese imports to allow more time for negotiation. The two economic superpowers have already imposed duties on more than \$360 billion in twoway trade, which has weighed on their manufacturing sectors and shaken global financial markets. US Trade Representative Robert Lighthizer and Treasury Secretary Steven Mnuchin are meeting with China's top economic czar Liu He, seeking to build on progress made in Washington last month. "We are looking forward to discussions today," Mnuchin said as he left his hotel yesterday morning for the talks.

Expectations for a trade deal have grown as China faces pressure from slowing economic growth, and as swooning global markets pose a challenge to Trump and his economic advisors.

Data released yesterday in China showed its trade surplus with the US -- a major source of anger within the Trump administration -- narrowed in January to \$27.3 billion, even as its American imports plunged 41 per cent for the month from a year earlier.

China's total imports also sank for the month, pointing to weak demand, amid slowing economic growth. Chinese President Xi Jinping plans to meet with the US officials in Beijing this week, a report in the South China Morning Post said on Wednesday, bolstering hopes for the talks and world markets.

Venezuela opposition takes steps to seize oil revenue

CARACAS - Venezuela's oppositioncontrolled congress named new temporary boards of directors to stateoil firm PDVSA on Wednesday, in an effort to wrest the OPEC nation's oil revenue from increasingly isolated socialist President Nicolas Maduro.

Maduro lashed out at the congress leader, Juan Guaido, saying in an interview that he would face the courts "sooner or later" for violating the constitution, after Guaido invoked constitutional provisions last month to assume an interim presidency.

Although many Western countries have recognised Guaido as legitimate head of state, Maduro retains control of state institutions and Guaido needs funds if he is to assemble an interim government.

Controlling PDVSA's US refiner Citgo Petroleum, Venezuela's most valuable foreign asset, would go some way to helping in that, though seizing the reins of PDVSA itself seems improbable while Maduro remains in power. "We have taken a step forward with the reconstruction of PDVSA," Guaido said on

Twitter, just after congress named the directors. "With this decision, we are not only protecting our assets, we also avoid continued destruction." PDVSA's crude output has slumped to 70-year lows, due to crushing debts, widespread corruption, and little maintenance of its infrastructure. The administration of US President Donald Trump, which backs Guaido, imposed sanctions on Venezuela's oil sector on Jan. 28, aimed at curbing exports to the United States and upping the pressure on Maduro. *Reuters*

Brussels proposes adding Saudi Arabia to money-laundering blacklist

BRUSSELS - Saudi Arabia expressed "regret" yesterday over EU proposals to add it and six other countries to a money-laundering blacklist of governments that do too little to thwart the financing of terrorism and organised crime.

The move comes amid heightened tensions between Riyadh and European capitals over the murder last year of the columnist Jamal Khashoggi at the Saudi consulate in Istanbul. The European Commission said on Wednesday it wanted to add seven countries including Saudi Arabia and Panama to another 16 already on the register -- such as Iran, Iraq, Pakistan, Ethiopia and North Korea.

Inclusion on the list does not trigger sanctions, but it does oblige European banks to apply tighter controls on transactions with customers and institutions in those countries. *AFP*

Brazil's Bolsonaro leaves hospital

BRASILIA - Brazilian President Jair Bolsonaro left the hospital in Sao Paulo on Wednesday early afternoon and is returning to Brasilia to resume his duties, his spokesman said.

Bolsonaro had an operation on Jan. 28 to remove a colostomy bag that was attached to his intestine after he was stabbed in the abdomen while campaigning for the elections in September.

"In the last five months, there have been three surgeries and one month in hospital," Bolsonaro tweeted. "I just have to thank God and everyone for finally being able to return to work."

Black eye for Chinese diplomacy

CARACAS - China and Venezuela seemed like natural bedfellows: one is the planet's top crude-oil importer and the other possesses the world's largest reserves. But Venezuela's descent into crisis -- with President Nicolas Maduro and self-proclaimed leader Juan Guaido vying for control as the economy unravels -- has highlighted the gamble inherent in China's \$60 billion investment in the South American nation. Over the past decade, Beijing has extended vast amounts of credit to Caracas for oil shipments and infrastructure deals, in what China has touted as a "mutually beneficial" relationship.

Sanctions-proof energy technologies explored

NAMPO - Power-strapped North Korea is exploring two ambitious alternative energy sources — tidal power and coal-based synthetic fuels — that could greatly improve living standards and reduce its reliance on oil imports and vulnerability to sanctions. Finding a lasting energy source that isn't vulnerable to sanctions has long been a top priority for North Korean officials. Leader Kim Jong Un used his New Year's address last month to call on the country to "radically increase the production of electricity" and singled out the coal-mining industry as a "primary front in developing the self-supporting economy." For the longerterm, he stressed the importance of atomic, wind and tidal power. AP

Possibility to weather new sanctions

MOSCOW - Russia has the tools to shield its economy from possible new US sanctions, and the central bank and finance ministry have already created a buffer to protect the country's banks, the Russian finance minister said yesterday. US Republican and Democratic senators on Wednesday introduced a bill seeking to punish Russia for meddling in US elections and for its aggression in Ukraine by imposing sanctions on its banking, energy and foreign debt.

Buying an album is out dated

NOW that technology has become more widespread and common, it's safe to say that 'physical' methods of buying just about anything have decreased dramatically. Music is not an exception.

There's easy access to free and paid for music streaming services such as Spotify, Apple Music, Deezer and so on. When an artist releases new music, I'm sure that most, if not all people, will turn to YouTube before running to the nearest music store. It's about money, convenience and precious time. CDs are mainly used for decoration nowadays.

Building on the last point, if people can get the same goods for free, why bother paying? This means that piracy is on the rise.

Downloaders

The main examples are the 'Deezloader' software and 'YouTube to MP3 downloaders that allow high-quality music to be downloaded instantly. Roughly 80 per cent of the country's population stopped buying CDs because of the price tag. Of course, some people prefer to buy music in order to support artists – usually in the form of CDs. But those numbers continue to drop as piracy software make advancements.

The problem with the music industry is that it still hasn't adapted to the internet era. It's easy to blame fans, but we need to acknowledge the fact that the business, as a whole, is failing musicians. The problem is, the music business has changed, but the record labels have not. Artists don't need to have physical albums printed. They don't necessarily need a record label's pricey public relations hype machine in order to become a success. A singer or band can use

social media as PR and put their album online without the help of a major label.

It's my opinion that music should not be free, and my prediction is that individual artists and their labels will someday decide what an album's price point is. I hope they don't underestimate themselves or undervalue their art.

So what do you do instead? How do you support an artist that you really love?

Purchasing

Buy merchandise directly from the artist if possible. Many stores will take cuts for distribution and sales, so purchasing directly from the artist is the best way to ensure your money is going to them.

If you do want to buy an album, don't do it through iTunes or at a store. Do it through the artist's personal site or at a show, where there are fewer middlemen taking a cut of the revenue

Ultimately, there's no ideal way to support your favourite musician at this point in time. Streaming hasn't stabilised itself as a consistent form of income, touring can be expensive, and only a big fan is going to buy a T-shirt. But buying albums is not a solution to this problem.

LONDON - Tottenham produced a scintillating second-half performance to beat Borussia Dortmund 3-0 in the first leg of their Champions League last-16 tie at Wembley.

Heung-Min Son scored for the fourth game in a row to put Spurs ahead in the 47th minute.

Jan Vertonghen then volleyed in from Serge Aurier's cross in the 83rd minute before substitute Fernando

Llorente headed in from a comer (86). Dortmund looked shell-shocked and now have a mountain to climb in the return leg on March 5.

The Bundesliga leaders had looked the brighter side in the first half but they could not match Spurs when they raised their level after half-time.

Son's goal - his

ninth in 11 games against Dortmund set the tone for a dominant finish from Mauricio Pochettino's side that has put them on the brink of the last eight for the first time since 2011. Such a onesided result in favour of Tottenham looked unlikely early in the game as Dortmund started positively. Spurs did see an eighth-minute shot from Lucas Moura whistle just past the post, but

> they were fortunate not to fall behind when Juan Foyth lost the ball in his own box and Christian Pulisic failed to beat Lloris at the

near post. The lively Jadon Sancho asked questions of Tottenham's defence, but Dortmund could not find the final pass.

Thomas Delaney's shot from outside the box was palmed out by Hugo Lloris before Spurs started to threaten as Christian Eriksen fired over and then Roman Burki saved with an outstretched leg from Son.

Dortmund went close to breaking the deadlock late in the first half but Lloris produced a brilliant diving save to claw away a header from Dan-Axel Zagadou on the line.

Spurs looked a team transformed after half-time as they attacked with more vigour and intensity.

Son opened the scoring in the 47th minute when he volleyed in from Vertonghen's cross, before Vertonghen fired over after a driving run and then Eriksen shot at Burki. Dortmund were pinned back inside their own half and Spurs added to their lead late in the game.

BARCELONA - Lionel Messi will stay at Barcelona and his relationship with the club will last "forever", according to Club President Josep Maria Bartomeu.

Messi, 31, is enjoying another fine season with the Catalan giants, having scored 21 goals in as many La Liga games this season, with Barca six points clear at the summit.

The Argentine star has just over two years left on his Barca contract and will be 34 when it expires. Messi has previously stated his desire to play in his native Argentina with Newell's

Klopp faces touchline ban

LONDON - Jurgen Klopp has been charged by The FA over comments he made about referee Kevin Friend following Liverpool's 1-1 draw at West Ham.

The FA wrote to Klopp the day after his side had been held at the London Stadium to ask for his observations over an interview he gave to Sky Sports; Friend and his assistant linesman had failed to spot James Milner was offside in the build up to Sadio Mane's goal.

"It is alleged that comments he made in a postmatch interview following Liverpool's league game against West Ham United on February 4, 2019, breached Rule E3(1) as they questioned the integrity of the match referee and/or implied bias.

Mashaba, who coached Rantie in the senior national team, gave his thoughts on the matter, saying clubs need to know their players.

"I am more worried, because I worked with that boy. I know what he can offer," Mashaba said with a look of a man who is really concerned.

"But what we don't know his private life. Unfortunately we did not have time, which is what we need to do as teams. Know at least part of your players" lives, how they live, what they do, are they married and where are they are staying. PSL to announce new date for Nedbank Cup clash

JOHANNESBURG - The Premier Soccer League last night confirmed Black Leopards and Bidvest Wits did not agree on playing their Nedbank Cup last 16 clash

The match at Thohoyandou Stadium was called off last night due to heavy rain which left the pitch waterlogged.

"We just met the two clubs. We were trying to discuss the possibility of playing on Thursday (yesterday), unfortunately there is no agreement, which means that the League will set a new date for this fixture," PSL head of communications Lux September told the media after the game last night.

"Obviously we have to look at the conditions of this stadium, the conditions of the field to ensure the pitch is playable. We will be in contact with the

stadium and the home club."

Rule 14.20 in the PSL handbook says: "If a match is postponed or abandoned due to the unsuitability of the ground caused by inclement weather, the state of the pitch or for any other reason, but not because of insufficient illumination from floodlights, the league will set another date on which the match will be played. In such an event all records of an abandoned match will be expunged except that any dismissals that occurred will remain in force."

Rule 14.21 says: "In the event of a replay because of the unsuitability of the ground due to inclement weather the league will be responsible for all reasonable costs incurred."

Despite being 1-0 up at the time it was abandoned, Leopards coach Dylan Kerr says they did not for one second think they

had the game in the bag. Kerr feels sorry for supporters who came out to the stadium hoping to see a good game of foot-

"No, no, no, I never think that. It was only at half-time, knowing Gavin [Hunt] he would have come out in the second half more determined not to lose," Kerr said.

"I feel for the supporters, they had to make their way home and it was night time as well, it was loadshedding at the time and they couldn't see where they were stepping in.





Wanderers to introduce Supporters DC

SOCCER – HUB giants Manzini Wanderers are currently working towards establishing an inhouse supporters' Disciplinary Committee to reprimand their misbehaving fans.

The new committee is part of the club's on-going restructuring exercise that also saw the recent disbanding of the club National Supporters Committee (NSC).

The club's Executive Officer Pat Mahlalela confirmed the news through a press statement released yesterday.

"A Disciplinary Committee will in time, be set up to enforce rules and regulations. Stakeholders are informed that in the initial, all fans and sympathisers that want to be official supporters need to register and pay a general subscription fee to be announced soon.

To be considered a supporter, an individual must be of a good standing (in the Manzini Wanderers structures), meaning that consideration of the previous instances of bringing the club good name into disrepute, will be made.

Underway

"Currently, effort is underway to develop a Manzini Wanderers handbook that will act as a guide to acceptable behaviour by various members, including committee members, officials by providing rules and regulations," reads the statement.

Mahlalela further stated that their supporters would be expected to have a minimum of 50 supporters in order to form a branch.

"To qualify to be considered a supporters branch, there should be a minimum of 50 registered and subscribed members in that specific branch designated area.

Only fully registered members will be allowed to stand for elections and even vote. Please note that the every person within the Manzini Wanderers structure (from Council of Elders to MC) will have to affiliate to a branch.

"The task team with the support of the marketing and communications department is expected to start in the earnest, the role out of the registration process is expected to begin in March, with nine major branches by the end of March 2019.

To promote and popularise the registration process, there will be road shows. Also, the now popu-



Papic could not be drawn for comments on the matter when also reached.



This comes after the suspended Mbabane Highlanders National Supporters Committee's decision to challenge the existence of the newly appointed interim supporters committee.

The estranged NSC Chairman Kenneth Dlamini says the new committee has no right to be in office since they have not been constitutionally elected by the team's supporters.

Dlamini said this during an interview with this publication, following the appointment of the interim committee by the team's Directors Chairman Zweli Jele on Monday night.

"We are still shocked by the announce-

ment of the interim committee as we are still waiting for the report of the probe which was announced by the directors some time ago when they suspended us through media statements.

"We still want to hear about the report of the said probe before we can be dissolved by the supporters in a mass meeting. All we know is that we are still constitutionally in office since the relevant procedures have not been followed during the said sus-

pension of our committee," he said.

Dlamini further stated that they would still execute their duties in the team.

"We will continue serving the interest of our team until the supporters dissolve the committee and we want to see the team achieving great things within the local football fraternity," he said. Highlanders Board of Directors Chairman Zweli Jele declined to comment on the matter when contacted.

"I cannot comment on hearsay and I can only be in a position to do so

once I receive something formal," he said. Attempts were also made to get Chairman of the Patrons Isaac Shabangu but his cellphone rang answered when tried several times.

The rift between the estranged supporters committee started four months ago after the committee announced an MTN Mobile Money number for the supporters during a meeting which was held at the Lobamba National High School, something that did not sit well with the directors.
