

#### Teen tests HIV+, runs away from home

A teenage boy from the Lubombo region left court officials near tears as he narrated how he dropped out of school and left home after discovering that he was HIV positive, a status which he believes he contracted from his parents during birth.

The 18-year-old boy gave an emotional account of how his parents kept his status a secret and further neglected him after he fell sick while doing Form Four. He was appearing before the court for housebreaking and theft. This was after he allegedly broke into the house of his mother and stole E9 250 in cash.

The court was informed that the teenager disappeared from home for about a year, before returning on January 13,

upon which he committed the said offence. When the charge sheet was read to him, he pleaded guilty to the charge while conducting his own defence before Senior Magistrate Donald Mavuso.

In mitigation he first admitted committing the offence, saying that he committed it out of anger and frustration. He claimed he dropped out of school in 2017 after he fell sick and got admitted to hospital.

It was then that he discovered that he was HIV positive. The boy said what frustrated him the most was knowing the fact that he was still a virgin, and his parents had never communicated anything to him regarding his status.

He said, no dought, he believed that he contracted the virus from his parents during birth.

"I asked my mother about my status but she referred me to my grandmother who was, however, deceased at that time. I then left home out of anger and went to stay with my friends whom I had met while admitted to hospital," said the teenage accused. The boy said he then returned home a year later and stole the said money with the intention of paying for his school fees as he wanted to resume school this year. He told the court that he was already looking for a school when he was arrested by the police.

The accused person's plea and mitigation was accepted by the Crown without objection. Having heard the boy's story, the court extended its leniency and sentenced him to 10 months in a correctional facility with an option to pay E2 000 fine.

The sentence was, however, wholly suspended for a period of three years. This was after the court was informed that about E3 500 of the stolen money was recovered.

#### ... Mom refuses to return son to school

DESPITE her son having indicated his intention to return to school, the mother displayed another level of selfishness before the court as she flatly refused to take responsibility and pay for his school fees.

The juvenile's mother was before the court to testify in the matter of housebreaking and theft committed by her son. She was, however, not called to the witness box to testify after the Crown accepted the plea of guilty without leading evidence to prove commission. The mother was only called into the courtroom to confirm her son's HIV status after he told the court to have tested positive.

Before the matter was concluded, the boy's mother was asked if she would take him back to school as he had already indicated his wish

to do so.

She responded to the negative, saying that she was already in debts following the theft of the aforementioned E9 250 by the very same boy. She alleged that the money belonged to a stokvel, to which she was a member.

"I will not be able to take him back to school as he has already put me through debts," she said. Of note is that the teenage boy also told the court that he stole the money because his mother had already refused to take him back to school.

## BROKE EX-MPS 'PESTERING' MJULUKO FOR GRATUITY

FORMER Members of parliament fighting for payment of their gratuity by government are said to be calling Mjuluko Dlamini time and again in an attempt to find out what is derailing the process of the payment.

The former MPs are stand to be paid in terms of the Finance Circular of 2013. Mjuluko was elected to lead the pack of MPs who formed

the sigejane, to enquire about the gratuity payout.

The former legislators have been fighting for their gratuity since last year. Former Mtfongwaneni Member of Parliament Mjuluko confirmed that he had been spending sleepless nights due to the inundating calls from the former MPs.

He said he understood the situation the members of the 10th Parliament were in. "They are worried because the date of the payment has elapsed. You must also bear it in mind that schools are about

to open, hence the frustration, "he said.

On another note Mjuluko said the payment date they agreed upon was 7-11 January. He said they were left devastated when they did not get their final handshake last week Friday.

In a previous interview with Ministry of Finance's Tsabile Dlamini, the Communications Officer, she said the Mps would be paid before the end of the month. She told this publication that there was no stipulated date for the payment.

He said the political system of the country should be protected in any way possible. However, what happened to them did not show that the prime minister and his government were keen on protecting the system

#### Circumstance

The prevailing circumstance would make Emaswati not to want to serve in the country's political structures. This could also lead the former legislators to prefer other systems other than the Tinkhundla system.

The former lawmaker said it would be unfortunate if the government did this as a way of getting rid of people who once served in the political structures of the country. "That would be a very unfortunate situation because it would hinder the



development progress desired by the country. For the country to develop, we need politicians who are going to be able to challenge decisions that are not in the interests of the people," he said.

Another former MP from the Shiselweni region also wondered why such a thing happened to them because they should have been given their money last year in October. He said he doubted that such a thing would happen during the late former Prime Minister Sibusiso Dlamini's government.

Government Spokesperson Percy Simelane could not comment on the matter. He said the meeting between the prime minister and the former MPs was private, so he could not be privy to its details. He suggested that the former MPs should directly contact the PM.

## Ex-MPs in meeting with finance

THE former Members of Parliament (MPs) who served in the 10th Parliament are now in meetings with the ministry of finance concerning their gratuities.

It is understood that the former legislators met yesterday with officials from the ministry of finance to come up with a long lasting solution to the problem.

One MP, who preferred anonymity when called, confirmed that the meeting took place.

He said the time for the meeting to take place had arrived because it looked like the ministry was also taking them for a ride.

"We want to find out who is busy playing these nasty games with us because we are becoming tired of these games," the former MP said.

It is understood that the meeting took place for the better part of the afternoon, as it ended after 5pm. Another MP stated that they were happy that they were well received by the ministry of finance.

"We are happy that they told us that they were still in the process of giving us our dues. However, we are not going to listen to what they are telling us," the former MP said.

He said they were going to stand up and make a follow-up, putting pressure to anyone who was supposed to contribute in issuing their gratuities

"These people have taken us for a ride for far too long now. We want to communicate with whoever is involved here and tell them to speed up the process. We need the money now to pay our debts," he said.

Former Mtfongwaneni MP Mjuluko Dlamini also confirmed that the meeting did take place and they would also be meeting again today. He said they finally agreed that they had to convene another meeting today so that they could finally come up with solutions to the problem because they badly needed their money.


FIRST semester results of students at the various campuses of the University of Eswatini will be available at stipulated venues of the campuses between 11am and 4:30 on Monday.

## VICTOR'S WIFE ILL-ADVISED - MDLADLA

LAWYER Sidumo Mdladla has claimed that the late businessman Victor Gamedze's wife is ill-advised by certain individuals for their own benefit.

The lawyer refuted all the claims levelled against him by Gamedze's widow, Lungile Gamedze, through her attorney, Mlungisi Khumalo from Khumalo Attorneys. He was fulfilling a promise to react to the allegations earlier put to him when he acknowledged that he had receiced a corrrespondence containing same.

Mdladla said he was concerned by the fact that it may well be that there are some individuals who have seen the demise of the late Gamedze as a spring-board to success by constantly ill-advis-

ing Mrs Gamedze, whom our office still respects. This is contained in a public statement that the lawyer issued yesterday.

Among the allegations that Mdladla was accused of in the letter from Gamedze's wife were that he tried to defraud the estate of the late Gamedze by approaching a certain Thokozani Nkambule to generate a fraudulent invoice in favour of Eswatini Mobile.

Another allegation against Mdladla was that which relates to some purported sale of shares of Stage 1 Connections (PTY) LTD to Swazi Mobile Chairman Michelo Shakantu, which Mdladla also labelled as untrue. The last allegation was that which relates to Mdladla transferring a sum of E25 million from Gamedze's estate account to his personal account, which he also refuted through the public statement.

Mdladla said it was clear that he has not at any point acted out of his mandate nor has he acted in such a manner as to prejudice the estate account.

"The allegations are, therefore, incorrect and they were made as some kind of blackmail to force my hand to accede to certain demands and to finally exit as an executor. I am aware that there will be other efforts to tarnish my name as long as I hold the office of executorship. I am prepared to withstand such insults, threats and acts of defamation, so long as I act as an executor and in the best interest of all stakeholders, not one," he said.

## ...Claims to have made E75 000 interest for Gamedze's estate

LAWYER Sidumo Mdladla has claimed to have made a sum of E75 000 in interest for Victor Gamedze's estate.

This he said in the light of the allegation levelled against him that he transferred a sum of E25 million from Gamedze's estate to his personal account, without the consent of Gamedze's wife.

Mdladla said the account referred to is an Estate account, which was a current account.

The funds in the account had been deposited by him, having collected same in his capacity as an executor and he did not need to report to anyone to transfer these funds save for the Master of the High Court's consent.

#### Circumstances

The lawyer said that in the circumstances, the funds were sitting in a current account, which is a non-interest bearing account and as a means of protecting the interests of the estate, he advised the bank through a written correspondence that it transfers the funds to the trust call account of S. V. Mdladla &

Associates, who are also the attorneys and executors of the estate. This was pending the opening of a call account of the estate.

"When instructing the bank, I made it clear that the interest earned from the funds will be to the benefit of the estate and that is exactly what transpired.

"I am confident that when the funds were transferred to the current account, and then finally the call account of the estate at that point an interest of E75 000 had been accumulated.

#### Estate

"This amount benefitted the estate. I fail to understand the complaint due regard being to the fact that I acted in the best interest of the Estate Account. Furthermore, I had reported this development to the Master's office," reads the public statement.

Mdladla said he was puzzled that with all these defamatory allegations, as baseless as untrue as they are, there is no indication of any motive to secure any personal benefit on his part. (see press statement on pages 14, 15)

### Alleged nurse killer cop remains in jail

POLICE Constable Sibusiso Shongwe, also known as Bhubesi, will remain in a correctional institution for now as his matter has been struck off the roll.

This transpired yesterday at the High Court in Mbabane, when Shongwe, who was referred to as Bhubesi by the nurses, had gone to the High Court to plead to be admitted to bail by the High Court.

The matter was heard by High Court Judge Cyril Maphanga and it took place in Court B, which was almost packed to capacity.

Nurses had turned out in their numbers, in support of their colleague, Lindokuhle Mlangeni, who was allegedly killed by Shongwe. Shongwe was also escorted by warders during his appearance. Lawyer MachaweDlamini, who appeared for Shongwe, stated that he had discussed and reached a conclusion with his colleague, Mandla Dlamini, that they should strike the matter off the roll, in the interest of justice. Dlamini (Mandla), who represented the state, confirmed that he had reached such an agreement with Dlamini (Machawe).


#### Roll

Judge Maphanga duly ruled that the matter, as the counsels had agreed, would be struck off the roll in the interest of justice. This means another application will have to be filed if Shongwe is still interested in being admitted to bail by the High Court. It was reported that Mlangeni, a nurse by profession, was strangulated and

killed during a domestic dispute at her rented flat, which is situated at New Town in Hlatikulu, on Boxing Day last year. Her unresponsive body was found wrapped in a towel inside the flat. The bone of contention is said to be a sum of E4 000, which was allegedly borrowed by Mlangeni from Shongwe. However, Shongwe started demanding the money back and a fight ensued, which allegedly led to Mlangeni's death.

The following day, her boyfriend, Constable Shongwe, was listed as a wanted person by the police. This was after he had disappeared from the Matsapha Police Academy, where he had been attending a workshop.

At the time, police believed that Shongwe's vanishing act after the suspicious death of his lover was no coincidence. Mlangeni



was employed as a nurse at the Hlatikulu Government Hospital at the time of her death, while Shongwe was attached to the Traffic Department at the Hlatikulu Police Station.

Shongwe had been seen in the com-

The couple is said to have been sharing the same flat after the police officer moved in and somehow abandoned his allocated house at the local police camp.

#### ... Nurses complain of Bhubesi's behaviour

NURSES who went to the High Court yesterday expressed their complaints in the manner Constable Sibusiso Shongwe handled himself during his bail hearing.

Shongwe did not want to be seen yesterday during his appearance. It seemed as if he would prefer that his matter be heard privately, had things gone his way. He would ensure that his head and some parts of his face were covered with the hood of the navy-blue jacket he was wearing.

Photo-journalists had a tough time yesterday in Court B, trying to take pictures of him. Sometimes he would remove his jacket to ensure that it covered his head so that he would not be noticed. This whole scenario happened before and after High Court Judge Cyril Maphanga struck the matter off the High Court roll.

Nurses were not happy with Shongwe's

behaviour. They would sometimes mock him when he wrapped his jacket around his head, saying his behaviour resembled that of a person who wanted to steam himself. "Ungatsi usesifutfweni ngendlela lentangayo," one nurse was heard saying.

The nurses wondered why Shongwe would want to hide when he had the guts to strangulate their colleague. They also blamed police officers and warders for allowing Shongwe to hide. At the entrance of the High Court, Swaziland Democratic Nurses Union (SWADNU) President Bheki Mamba was seen addressing the nurses.

Mamba stated that as nurses, they should keep on demanding justice for Mlangeni, who allegedly died in Shongwe's hands. Mamba further said the police and warders were wrong to allow Shongwe to hide in the way he did. He said police should strive to pro-

tect all citizens of the country, not just one of their own. He further thanked the nurses who took their time to go to the High Court to follow on the matter involving Shongwe and the late Mlangeni.

Shongwe was driven out of the High Court in a white Isuzu double cab from His Majesty's Correctional Services (HMCS). The Isuzu was led by a green Isuzu from the same organisation. This was another incident that did not sit well with the nurses.

They questioned the logic behind enabling Shongwe the luxury of being driven by two cars yet he was alleged to have done something horrible. "When we want cars to carry out our duties, we are constantly told that cars are not available yet they are available for alleged criminals. He is also escorted as if he is a King. How can such a thing happen?" one male nurse was heard questioning.







### **GOVT STARTS ROLLING OUT FPE GRANT TO SCHOOLS**

GOVERNMEMNT has started disbursing money to different schools, courtesy of the Free Primary Education (FPE).

Principal Secretary in the Ministry of Education and Training Dr Sibongile Mtshali said as the European Union (EU) tenure to fund FPE had elapsed, government would continue footing the bill

Mtshali said EU's assistance in the programme was not sudden to them, but it's something they knew prior and government budgeted for it.

Mtshali said they have already signed out the FPE grants to two regions and schools will be getting the grants soon.

"FPE is a priority to government, we made a commitment that we will provide the service for Emaswati to benefit, and it can't be stopped because govemment is facing a fiscal crisis. Government budgeted for it and we are currently working with Regional Education Officers in rolling out the grants to schools," she

Mtshali said funding that is less than E100 000 is paid out in cheques, while above that sum, government makes the transfer electronically.

The FPE issue made headlines in recent

times with principals voicing out that the money is not enough to sustain schools' necessities.

Their argument is that the project was implemented years ago when school material was still at an affordable rate, but the inflation rate had accumulated over the years, hence the money does not cover all the provisions.

Schools support staff are sometimes not paid on time owing to the insufficient funding in schools, particularly those in the rural areas. On that note, the PS had said no parent is expected to pay 'Top-Up-Fees' this year, giving the feeling that things are taking a turn for the worse at schools in the country.

#### Deceased ex-PS was Liswati lemdzabu

IF the country's youth can adapt late former PS in the ministry of information, communications and technology Sikelela Dlamini's values, live lingakha.

These were sentiments shared by Prince Masitsela yesterday, referring to the late former PS.

The former PS allegedly took his own life and was discovered by a family member on Sunday morning hanging from shack rafters, at his homestead at Hlane in the Lubombo region.

Yesterday, the prince said the pain of losing the ex-PS was unbearable, especially because he was significant and a humbled family member.

He said Dlamini's skills and the way he led his life was a true image of how men should lead in society. "Eswatini has lost Liswati lendzabu who was also an information centre," Prince Masitsela said adding that royalty, just like the rest of the nation, were truamatised and are mourning the untimely death of the former PS.

Dlamini retired from public service in 2017, his first retirement was in March 2014 and was re-appointed back to the ministry as PS in April, 2014, for three years.

Hlane residents and neighbours said they still in disbelief of losing such a prominent member of the com-

The residents described Dlamini as a humble person, who respected everyone regardless of their status.

Meanwhile, Prince Masitsela said Emalangeni have confirmed and came up with a possible funeral date. However, he said that date is yet to be formaly reported to Their Majesties and members of the public will be notified of that date sooner.

#### Communities can help fund FPE - Economist

IN the event government fails to fully fund FPE, communities need to find sustainable ways to contribute to the programme, an economist has said.

Alternative ways to contribute to the programme need not to be 'top up fees', but community schemes or willing donors. This is according to Economist Sanele Sibiya, who is also a lecturer at the University of Eswatini (UNESWA).

He said the FPE grant was not enough for schools to meet all their necessities.

"Contributing towards the FPE should not be labelled or put under the 'top up fees' umbrella but the reality is, the money is not enough for schools to run all their errands. It is for this reason that schools should find ways of fundraising and contribute towards the programme. This they can achieve through community schemes,

where willing people or communities can contribute financially to meet government halfway," he said.

Sibiya said this would not only help the schools raise enough funds for their necessities, but it will make the role of parents active at schools because they would want to engage more with the pupils in the school school work because under the FPE programme, the level of engagement is low. "Constitutionally, government should provide the FPE grant to schools and it is every child's right to go to school but the funding is not enough. Another factor is that running a school in urban areas is different as compared to one in the rural areas, where the infrastructure needs a lot of upgrading.

Some schools are more disadvantaged than others and they exhaust their resources trying to upgrade while others' infrastructure doesn't need much upgrading."

Principals reportedly asked for top-upfees from government as stipulated in Circular No.6 of the 12 circulars of 2017 under the ministry of education and training. The circular stated that applications for charging additional fees over and above the stipulated Free Primary Education Grant are welcome and all schools shall seek approval from the minister of education and training to charge additional fees. However, they were reportedly told that parents won't be paying up the topup fees by the ministry's Principal Secretary Dr Sibongile Mtshali.

This is despite that the European Union withdrew from assisting government financially in paying for Grade 1 in the FPE programme.


### Warm to hot days ahead

### ONLY TAKE OUT REFUSE BIN/BAG DURING COLLECTION DAYS

Please be aware that waste collection does not happen on a daily basis in the townships. Instead there are designated days on which collection takes place. You are encouraged to ensure that your refuse bin/bag is placed by your gate as early as 7am in readiness for collection by the refuse truck. In the event that the truck has delayed (usually it's due to breakdowns), please do not take your waste bin/bag back to the yard. The Council waste collection team works way into the night during works way into the night during such challenging periods. NOTE: We have published the waste collection schedule as part of this article.



By all means, please avoid littering in the city. Instead make use of the available litter bins.

Also ensure you sensitize your children against such practice. Often than not one sees children (well, adults as well) throwing litter out the window of moving yehicles. That is a crime and (well, adults as well) throwing litter out the window of moving vehicles. That is a crime and must stop. Let's protect the environment and by so doing keep our beautiful city clean. By littering you are not creating jobs for street sweepers. That unacceptable mentality must change. In fact, in the not so distant future fines will be imposed against littering on the city streets. On the same note, dumping of waste on undeveloped plots and other open spaces must stop. If you happen to spot someone committing this offence, please take a picture and send it to 7802 3889. Likewise, when you spot a vehicle dumping waste such as rubble and garden waste on vacant plots please take a picture and ensure the registration plate and date of offence show. The applicable fines are biting!



#### NEVER USE URBAN LAND AS GRAZING AREA

Urban vegetation may be tempting but please know that it is an offence to allow your cattle to graze anywhere within the urban area; even in the townships. Whether or not the herd boy will be there looking after the cattle or goats, it doesn't matter. It is still a crime. If found, the Council security rangers will drive them to the municipal pound and you will be required to pay a fine for their release. The more they are kept at the pound, the more the money you will have to pay for their release. Keeping of cattle and goats is also not allowed in the urban area. the urban area.

#### ONLY 12 CHICKENS ALLOWED

You are not allowed to keep more than 12 live poultry, including chickens, in your residence without Council's permission. Even the 12 chickens must be kept in a properly built poultry house; at least eight (8) metres away from the nearest dwelling building. The structure should be constructed according to the requirements of Council. Also note that keeping of cocks is not allowed in the city. This is because they cause noise and disturb the peace in the neighbourhood.

#### IT IS AN OFFENCE NOT TO PAY RATES

It is a must that you pay rates against your urban property. If, for some reason, you do not receive your rates bills at the beginning of each financial year, immediately visit Council for assistance. Council's financial year runs from April to March the following year. The law says the onus is on the property owner to notify Council of their new contact details; including telephone numbers, emails and postal addresses. It is an offence not to pay rates, no matter the It is a must that you pay rates not to pay rates, no matter the reasons. Rates are property taxes recognised in law and must always be paid in full. Even if you have a number of concerns against Council you have a recognized in full. have to continue paying your rates while you pursue your issues. ### YOU NEED COUNCIL PERMIT TO SELL IN THE STREETS

Regulated street vending is allowed within the urban area but it is strictly restricted to the designated areas. A vendor must have a valid trading permit obtainable from Council and should only conduct trade at the place permitted to conduct should only conduct trade at the place permitted to conduct business. Trading outside the allocated area is a violation of Council's regulations. The vendor must only sell the goods/wares specified when applying for the permit. The vendor is not allowed to relocate from one vending site to another without Council's permission. Any violation of these rules attracts the attention of the Council contracted security company (Presently, Kwekwe Security Rangers).





## 'I DON'T FORGIVE MY ASSAILANT'

A complainant shocked and left the court in stitches when he said he would never forgive the man who assaulted him.

Melusi Dube who was assaulted with a beer bottle on the face by Dumsani Nxumalo of Msunduza said he would rather burn in hell than to forgive his

Nxumalo was arrested and charged with assault and appeared before Magistrate Lenhle Zulu yesterday afternoon. The incident is said to have occurred at Msunduza area at Downtown Bar on January 9.

The accused told the court that hitting the complainant with the bottle was an honest mistake as he had been questioning him about a mugging he had went through a few days back, where he was assaulted and had some of his pocket contents stolen including his phone.

He had been told that some of the items were with the complainant, hence the confrontation which resulted to the assault. He further disclosed to the court that upon committing the said crime, he went and surrendered himself to the

However, Magistrate Zulu was unhappy with the accused's behaviour and told him that he should have left the investigation to the police and not take the law into his hands.

The accused pleaded for leniency and asked for forgiveness from the complainant and his family.

"I would like to sincerely apologise to Melusi and his family for my behaviour. I assure you your Worship that such will not repeat itself," he said.

Magistrate Zulu asked if the complainant and his family were in court and he rose up and was called forward. When he stood before Zulu, she asked him if he was willing to forgive the accused because he was sorry and showed remorse. "Angimucoleli ngoba wangilimata ngatfungwa neti-titch lana," he responded, cracking everyone up.

He further disclosed that he was only in court to see the accused and hoped that he would get a severe sentence.

Magistrate Zulu asked if the complainant knew the prayer in Mathew 6:9-13 which talks about forgiveness and he responded that he did, but still he would not forgive the accused.

Siphila emhlabeni yeMnisi, kuyacolelwa onkhe emalanga, Jesus forgives us daily. We live a life of forgiving and forgiveness," the magistrate said.

The accused was sentenced to 10 months in prison with a fine option of E1 000. However, the sentence was wholly suspended for 10 months, on condition that the accused did not commit a similar offence

#### Teens, man (20) nabbed for housebreaking & theft

A 20-year-old man and two teenagers yesterday appeared before Magistrate Xolile Nxumalo for housebreaking and theft.

## Father, son fight over Mangwaneni home

The house was

divorce decree

document

"I am here to request the court to evict my son out of my house," these were words uttered by a parent in court who wants his son evicted from his home.

Appearing before Magistrate Lenhle Zulu yesterday, Cornelius Dlamini of Mangwaneni a plaintiff stated in court that he wanted his son, Mandla (50) evicted from his alleged home at Mangwaneni.

Dlamini told the court that the home is located at the resettlement township where they were relocated by government after constructing a road where their previous homes were.

He stated that his son was in the house illegally and had moved in without his knowledge after forcefully evicting his sister, whom he had left in charge of the home in his absence.

"Your worship, I left my home to sort out a few issues regarding my livestock and in the process, I asked my daughter to move in and look after it for me. Her stay was temporal," he said.

He stated that the defendant was at William Pitcher at the time, studying.

Graduated

When he graduated, he is said to have come home and allegedly kicked his sister out.

Upon hearing about his son's behaviour, he stated that he then spoke to his son and asked him to vacate his home which never happened.

Evidence presented before the court state that the plaintiff was married to the defendant's mother and got divorced in March, 1973.

The terms of the divorce were clearly stated that Dlamini would get nothing from the marriage because the reason for the divorce was that he had cheated.

The house was included in the divorce decree document.

Dlamini told the court that the divorce submission was a lie, his first wife had eloped and left him.

However, she died later in the years.

However, Dlamini seemed to not understand how the entire process of being moved from the Swazi Nation Land (SNL) to the urban area, because he kept on claiming that government had built him the house at plot nine at the town-

More evidence was presented to court stating that after the divorce, the plaintiff moved to Ngculwini where he built another home with his second wife after allegedly divorcing his first wife, mother to the defendant. He denied those allegations and told the court that it was

He further told the court that his son should have spoken to him when he returned from university and not kick his sister out.

"Your Worship he should have spoken to me and not just evict the person I had asked to look after my home," he continued.

He further told the court that his son was old enough and should be having his own home because he had a job and he could help him to khonta if need

"Ukhulile, nangingamchuba ngimuyise eskhulwini ayokhonta nje, kungalunga konkhe," he

However, when Mandla, the defendant (and son) gave his testimony it was a contradiction to his father's testimony.

He claimed that his late brother by the name of Thulani Dlamini had been residing at the homestead after he completed his training at the police college.

He is said to have gotten married and resided permanently at the homestead until he passed away in 1998.

#### Survived

Unfortunately, he could not be survived by his wife because before he met his death, they had divorced the same year.

After his funeral, it is said umphakatsi called the family and asked who would be residing at the home because it was vacant.

"It was resorted that I be the one that take full ownership of the home because my brother had passed on and my father had not stayed there for years, also my sister was married," he said.

Umphakatsi is said to have called his father and told him of the change in ownership that they were making and he did not oblige.

However, at the time of being declared the owner of the home he had to leave for a while to study. In the event he called his married sis-

ter and asked her to move into the home with intent to look after it.

She is said to have refused numerous times and stated that she was married and could not leave her husband. Eventually it was suggested that she move in with her husband and she succumbed to that idea.

All of this is said to have happened before the construction of the road.

Upon graduating at William Pitcher, he stated that he moved back to Mangwaneni as the only home he knew and stayed with her sister and husband for a while and within a short space of time, he got married and found that

they had two families under one

"In the event that we were all living together under the same roof, it became an unpleasant situation and naturally there was tension in the house which resulted to my sister and her husband moving out to a new place in Ezulwini and they did so whilst I was at work," he continued.

In the event of moving out, his sister is said to have been against it and attempted to fight it, thus

he decided to inform his father.

The family is said to have had a meeting and addressed the matter, telling their daughter that she could not reside at the home with her husband. It was not allowed.

She is said to have listened and peacefully moved out, the fire died down and he peacefully resided with his wife who unfortunately passed on later in the years.

Later in the years, he told the court that his father called him and told him that he wanted to meet with him about a pressing matter and they agreed that they would do so on a certain weekend because he was working at Hlandze at the time. "Upon arrival in town on that weekend, I met up with my father and as I approached him the only words he said were that he needed his home at Mangwaneni back and that was all," he said. At the time his mother is said to have been alive and he stated that he went to her place of residence at Ngwane Park and told her of what his father had said.


Wrong

"We went to lusendvo to report the issue and my father was sat down and told that what he asked of me was wrong and would not happen, they further asked him where my other siblings were to go," he said.

As lusendvo did not side with the plaintiff, he is said to have reported the issue to the court and the defendant and his mother were served with papers. Unfortunately, his mother passed away in 2009 and he has been handling the case by himself since.

"Your worship the only reason I fight my father on the issue is because I know the home at Mangwaneni to be our only home which was built by him and my mother. Being old, working and eligible to get myself my own home changes nothing," he said.

He also pleaded with the court that it considered the part that was in the divorce decree that dispossessed his father of any right to the prop-



### FLAS OPENS NEW CLINIC IN MANZINI

THE Family Life Association of Eswatini (FLAS), in its quest to expand service delivery and bring quality services closer and nearer to the people, has opened a new clinic in Manzini.

FLAS Resource Mobilisation and Communications Officer, Maxwell Dlamini said the aim is to provide health-care services, including family planning, HIV, Tuberculosis, Gender Based Violence (GBV) information and education.

"The HIV situation in the country requires that HIV services are integrated with Sexual Reproductive Health (SRH) services and all sectors of the population targeted without discrimination. Integrated SRH and HIV service delivery therefore remain the core function of the organisation, ensuring that a broadened service package is offered both through the static clinics and outreach activities," Dlamini said.

He said the new clinic is located within the Mzinene Building, office Number 20A, 1st Floor, near the Manzini bus rank. Dlamini said the new clinic would relieve a majority of their clients, especially the poor, marginalised and vulnerable from walking long distances from the bus rank to the current FLAS Manzini building offices.

"The new clinic will assist the organisation in meeting its strategic outcomes in the strategic plan by increasing the number of people reached hence improving their quality of life through the service delivered as well as building a sustainable and accountable organisation,"

Moreover, Dlamini said FLAS strives to provide integrated SRH services through the static clinics and outreach sites prioritising young people aged 10 to 24 years as a primary target and adults above 24 years as its secondary target group.

He said in an effort to expand service provision, the association also focuses on enabling other partners through service provision, capacity building and mentoring.

He explained that the association's strategic plan 2016 to 2020 stresses particular attention in reaching out to a number of people with SRHR services and information.

Dlamini said FLAS pledged and committed

He is said to be currently admitted at the Mbabane Government Hospital.

They further caused malicious injuries to property owned by the complainant, whereby they are said to have broken two windows and a door all valued at E1 160. Reasons for such behaviour were not disclosed.

During their appearance in court it was disclosed that both were still at school, and were to prepare themselves for the opening of schools in a week's time. For that reason Magistrate Zulu was lenient enough to extend the trial date to when schools would be closed for first term.

One is a pupil at Bhunya High School and the other at Mdziba High School. However, Zulu did not refrain from expressing how displeased she was with their behaviour based on the charges shown on their charge sheet.

"If it wasn't that you have to return to school, I would not even grant you bail and have you remanded into custody the entire time until your trial date.

Yekelani lomkhuba wekutsandza kulwa, you are too young to be doing such and right now you don't even have a dime in your pockets, hence it is your parent's responsibilities to be paying your bail money and that is not right," she said.

She ordered that they be released to their parent's custody and were told that they were to behave at school and in the community at large.

They were further told that they were to perform diligently at school and ensure that they produce good results when they return for their trial on May 7. However, Zulu further warned the suspects that if the complainant was still critical or his condition resulted to the inevitable, they would be arrested at their schools and brought back to face the consequences of their doing.

## PRESS STATEMENT

On the 11th day of January 2019 the Swaziland Observer published an article to the effect that MR SIDUMO MDLADLA, a senior partner in the law firm, S. V. MDLADLA & ASSOCIATES had been involved in a 25 Million fraud at ESWATINI MOBILE. The publication went on to publish a letter which we believe is from MRS LUNGILE GAMEDZE. The letter contained some damaging and extremely defamatory allegations levelled against MR MDLADLA.

The article mentioned above together with the allegations were published after a letter dated 9th January 2019 had been delivered to our office by one MLUNGISI KHUMALO who is an attorney and adviser to MRS GAMEDZE, I assume.

I was expected to respond to the letter in writing nor sooner had I received the letter I immediately received a call from an Observer reporter asking me if I had received the letter. My response was in the affirmative. I also received a call from The Times of Swaziland to which I confirmed receipt of the letter. On the 10th of January 2019, I received calls about a damning article in the Swazi Observer. The Observer was now stating that I was involved in a fraud at ESWATINI MOBILE. It is patently obvious that the said letter was drafted and served on me with the sole purpose of leaking the defamatory substance to the press so that it could be published. In a nutshell, the letter was being published and being placed in the public domain. It is for this reason that I have found it appropriate to take the advice of the numerous stakeholders who have called me and requested a press statement on this.

As an individual, I am an attorney of the HIGH COURT OF SWAZILAND and have been admitted for a period of 24 years. I am a Senior Partner in the Law Firm, S. V. Mdladla & Associates. I hold positions in various other interests. I have been Acting Judge of the High Court of Swaziland. I am a founder and a now ordinary member of Montessori Primary School. The law firm, S. V. MDLADLA & ASSOCIATE is a law firm which serves a multiple of corporate clients which operate in the financial sector. I am currently involved in public assignments, the collection of TV licences as well as the collection of scholarship. The recent appointment I have is the one where I was appointed by HIS MAJESTY THE KING MSWATI III to THE ROYAL COMMISSION. All the above appointments are in a position of trust and have automatically placed me in the public domain. This therefore means any allegation of improprietory and criminal nature will impact on me negatively and should be addressed appropriately as the citizens will be concerned. It is for this reason that the office has found it proper that there be a public statement on this issue.

The allegations made against me are levelled to me as an Executor of the ESTATE LATE VICTOR MFANA GAMEDZE. I find it proper that one details properly the mandate of an executor in an Estate, and by extension my mandate. An Executor is appointed in terms of the Administration of Estates Act. An executor's main responsibility is to liquidate the Estate of the deceased person. The executor is answerable to ALL beneficiaries of the Estate, ALL creditors and debtors of the Estate, as well as the office of the MASTER. An executor has to act independently, transparently, without fear or favour. The executor in terms of our law has to finalise its mandate of his appointment within 6 months of his appointment failing which, there has to be an extension. I, as an executor, I am not above these legal dictates. Upon completion of the Estate, I have an obligation to issue a liquidation and distribution account, if there is any individual be it, a beneficiary, creditor or debtor who objects, they do so in writing. This process is transparent.

Having stated the functions of the executor, I wish to state that so far I was performing same. I have been doing so in the interest of the Estate but not a singular individual. This is regardless of the manner in which I was appointed.

I now wish to turn to the matter at hand.

My first address is with regards to the report, the leading article to the effect that "LAWYER MDLADLA INVOLVED IN 25 MILLION FRAUD IN ESWATINI MOBILE". This article is shocking, misleading and extremely defamatory. I have never at any stage been involved in any fraud in Eswatini Mobile. The letter in which the said article is based on says nothing of that sort. I believe that ESWATINI MOBILE has dealt with the issue and I believe it should be attended to.

I now turn to the articles published as accusations against me. I wish to state that these allegations are baseless, vexatious, defamatory and specially designed to cause harm to

my name. The first accusation relates to me trying to defraud the ESTATE OF THE LATE GAMEDZE by approaching a certain THOKOZANI NKAMBULE to generate a fraudulent invoice in favour of ESWATINI MOBILE. I find this accusation not only to be senseless but it typifies this whole episode. The allegation as it stands, would be that the beneficiaries of the funds would be ESWATINI MOBILE and not SIDUMO MDLADLA. Such is the naivety of the accusation however, the important aspect is that the said THOKOZANE denies such allegations. I have in my possession a copy of the letter wherein he categorically denies me ever approaching him. I have attached a copy of the letter.

The second allegation relates to some purported sale of shares of STAGE 1 CONNECTIONS (PTY) LTD to MICHELO SHAKANTU. Again, this is denied. It is my belief that the actual developments which I believe are within the knowledge MR GAMEDZE have been deliberately been misrepresented. In a nutshell, there was never a sale of shares to MICHELO SHAKANTU.

The last aspect of the contents of the extremely defamatory letter relates to transfers of certain monies in certain accounts. Firstly, may I point out that these allegations themselves are not informed.

Firstly, I never ever transferred funds in the late VICTOR GAMEDZE's account. The true position is that I am the executor of the Estate and the signatory of the account and I act with the guidance of the Master's office. The account referred to is an Estate Account which was a current account. The funds in the account had been deposited by myself having collected same in my capacity as an Executor. I did not need to report to anyone to transfer these funds save for the Master's consent. In the circumstances, the funds were sitting in a current account which is a non-interest bearing account. As a means of protecting the interests of the Estate, I advised the bank through a written correspondence that it transfers the funds to the trust call account of S. V. MDLADLA & ASSOCIATES who are also the attorneys and executors of the Estate. This was pending the opening of a call account of the Estate. When instructing the bank, I made it clear that the interest earned from the funds will be to the benefit of the Estate and that is exactly what transpired. I am confident that when the funds were transferred to the current account and then finally the call account of the Estate at that point an interest of E 75,000.00 (seventy-five thousand emalangeni) had been accumulated. This amount benefitted the Estate. I fail to understand the complaint due regard being had to the fact that I acted in the best interest of the Estate Account. Furthermore, I had reported this development to the Master's office.

Having stated the above, it is clear that I have not at any point acted out of my mandate nor have I acted in such a manner as to prejudice the Estate account.

The allegations are therefore incorrect and they were made as some kind of blackmail to force my hand to accede to certain demands and to finally exit as an executor. I am aware that there will be other efforts to tarnish my name as long as I hold the office of executorship. I am prepared to withstand such insults, threats and acts of defamation, so long as I act as an executor and in the best interest of all stakeholders, not one.

The wording of the letter was highhanded, aggressive and very insulting. I am generally concerned by the fact that it may well be that there are some individuals who have seen the demise of the Late MR VICTOR GAMADZE as a spring board to success by constantly ill-advising MRS GAMEDZE whom our office still respects.

The above is our response to the incident which we believe is unfortunate. We have every intention of addressing this issue at the appropriate time and forum so as to vindicate ourselves. It is unfortunate that these allegations have been widely published and disseminated to other parts of the country and world when there was never any efforts to verify them. Lastly, I would like to assure and thank all individuals and corporate stakeholders for their response and concerned showed.

Having said the above, I am baffled that with all these defamatory allegations, as baseless as untrue as they are, there is no indication of any motive to secure any personal benefit on my part.

#### The feud between the Vilakati and Mkhaliphi families in Nkonjwa rages

Siphofaneni police had to rush to the rescue on Saturday night after they were called to intervene in a situation where relatives of slain Nkonjwa traditional healer Gcina Vilakati (42) and his mother Liphinah Vilakati allegedly made threats to burndown the suspects' homestead.

The conflict between the families seems to be escalating as relatives of the murdered traditional healer are alleged to have made threats that they would burn down the suspects homestead on

Saturday. It is alleged thaton Saturday night, a group of young men believed to be friends of the late traditional healer's younger brother had come to pay their condolences to their friend at his

The young men, who are alleged to have been indulging in alcoholic beverages, are said to have been heard talking about burning the suspects' homestead in an effort to avenge the late inyanga.

#### **Threats**

The suspects family, after hearing about the threats, contacted Siphofaneni police and told them that a group of young men were threatening to burn their house down with them in it. They were afraid the men would execute their alleged plan since they were intoxicated and it was night time.

The police responded to the callpromptly and diffused the situation before it could turn nasty.

The Siphofaneni police officers, who responded to the call, are alleged to have taken the young men to Siphofaneni Police Station in a bid to calm them down, they detained the young men. They were later released and no charges were laid against them.

Sithobelweni Member of Parliament Bhekitje Dlamini commented on the events that transpired on Saturday night and pleaded with the families to try and control their tempers.

#### Painful

"I do agree that it's very painful for the families, especially because they are neighbours but the most important thing right now is to make sure that the funeral proceedings go smoothly.

"There is no way to change what has happened, so the important thing is to make sure that the deceased has a peaceful funeral and then the families will have to try and find a way to move past this traumatic ordeal because life has to go on," added Dlamini.

The MP said the Vilakati family plans to have the funerals this coming weekend but a date is yet to be set.

When contacted, Chief Police Information and Communications Officer, Inspector Phindile Vilakati, commented that the Siphofaneni police did respond to a call and amicably calmed down the situation on Saturday and no one was arrested or charged.

### Yet another teen attempts suicide

AS suicide cases continue to be on the rise in the country, yet another pupil has attempted to kill herself after ingesting a poisonous substance.

Ntobeko Ndlela (19), a pupil at Sandleni High School, is currently battling for her life at the Hlatikulu Government Hospital as doctors and nurses are reportedly trying to drain out the poisonous liquid she guzzled in annoyance of being refused to change schools.

She almost ended her life in front of family members on Sunday. The girl was doing Form Three last year and she obtained a third class pass in the recently released results. According to sources, she wanted to be allowed to enroll at a neighbouring school, Nkhungwini High for her Form Four, something which a close relative was totally against and advised her to continue in her current school where she had obtained the third class pass.

#### Change

Sources said the family had a meeting regarding Ntobeko's request to change schools and her father insisted that she should remain in her current schoolthat she hatched the plan to end her life.

"It was while the (family) meeting was taking place that the girl sneaked into her grandmother's bedroom and prepared a mixture suspected to be for maize crops. After having drank the pesticide, she was seen sprawling on the floor and writhing in pain," said a source.

Everyone who was part of the family meeting was shocked as to what was happening but there was suspicion that Ntobeko was planning to take her life because she had been refused to change schools.

There was tension and means were made to save her life. First aid was conducted on her while means were being made to rush her to hospital," said a source.

The girl's father who is reportedly working in South Africa is also said to have witnessed the inci-

"Her father was there and he is the one who made efforts to rush her to hospital.

#### Poisonous

"She was already unable to utter a word and it was clear that the poisonous substance she had drank was piercing her. At the hospital, drips were planted all over her and efforts were made to drain whatever she had drunk. By yesterday (Monday), doctors and nurses were still doing everything to save her life," another relative said.

The girl's grandmother who was only identified as Gogo Ndlela (LaMkhaliphi) who stays with her confirmed that she (granddaughter) attempted to kill herself.

"She is currently at the hospital where she was admitted after taking the poisonous substance," said the girl's grandmother.

Other speculations are to the effect that the girl was not happy as some of her siblings were seemingly given better preference and also taken to better schools.

"There is too much family politics in the whole issue. It's not just that she wanted to change schools but we have also been made to understand that some of her half sisters are given first preference. She feels she deserves equal treatment from her parents. She made it clear that she would rather drop out of school if not allowed to enroll at a school of her choice for her Form Four," a close relative said.



#### Still no breakthrough in businesswoman's attack

POLICE have appealed to the public to assist them in finding assailants of the Mtsambama businesswoman who was attacked and almost butchered to death on Monday last week.

Sexual violence has always been, and still remains the one thing that is a nightmare to women in the country

ALMOST every day there will be a story or two in the newspaper about a woman who has been sexually violated in the country...

Those are just the stories that make it to the newspaper, there are stories that don't, and those that do not even get reported because rape has become so entrenched in women's everyday life that is has become normal.

The thing with sexual violence is that it is rarely perpetrated by strangers, it is always someone the victim is close to.

It could be a boyfriend, a relative like an uncle, a guardian and even one's husband.

One of the many reasons that women keep being victims of sexual violence is the toxic belief that sex is a man's right in a marriage.

The recent chilling statement by a senate is the very reason why rape is still rampant in the country.

The senator said that a husband can never rape his wife, and went

on to say that if a woman does not want to have sexual intercourse with her husband, she must not sleep in the same room as him.

Implying that sleeping on the same bed with someone is an invitation to

This is why some women die of curable diseases, because the husband refuses her from going to the hospital.

Another belief that leads to sexual violence is the belief that girls are responsible for controlling a man's sexual urges.

Many a times women are shamed for the choice of their clothing and told it is 'too revealing'.


Sometimes women themselves feel it is their fault when a man rapes them

> because the skirt she was wearing was too short or too tight.

No one stops to consider the fact that women's clothing is rarely in the mind of a man, and believing that a woman is responsible for what happens to her is a sign of a sick society that needs help. Victims of rape should not be made to take the blame, men who rape must take full responsibility and be

dealt with accordingly. One of the other drivers of sexual violence is the belief that it can be used to put women in their place. It is a dangerous and harmful belief that women need a man if they are believed

to be too difficult, 'too bossy'. Corrective rape, hard to believe that this is even a thing, has been accepted across Africa as a way to turn lesbian women straight.



The same, however, has never been said about gay men. In not so many words, this shows that women are there to please men sexually, and when they don't they can be forced to. Sexual activity, including rape, is believed to be a marker of male masculinity.

Applauded

If a man finds himself in the same room with a woman, he will be applauded by his friends if he can convince her to sleep with him.

And if he fails to convince her, he

will forcefully engage with her, just so he can brag to his friends.

A woman who finds herself in this kind of situation usually doesn't report because she believes it is either her fault, or she didn't do enough to fight him off.

She does not consider it rape.

The best thing to do is of cause encourage women to report any form of violence they experience, and that experienced by someone they know.



"I went to visit the place where the incident happened. I received a call from a source inside. I was informed around 03:00 and so I went there. When I asked around I heard he did it," Vilakazi said.

"Apparently there was physical contact. They fought and apparently Trisha (Modusane) went outside to seek help and went back again," he said.

## RAMAPHOSA SETS OUT A BOLD VISION FOR SOUTH AFRICA

AS South Africa heads for the polls in a few months time in its sixth democratic election, political party electioneering has begun in earnest.

President Cyril Ramaphosa kick started the governing African National Congress's (ANC) election campaign in his January 8th Statement celebrating 107 years since the birth of the liberation movement. This campaign continued with the launch of the ANC's manifesto at the Moses Mabhida Stadium in KwaZulu-Natal on January 12. An estimated 80 000 ANC members and supporters attended the launch.

The ANC declared 2019 the year for 'united action to grow South Africa'. This year sees a continuation of the dominant themes of

unity, hope and renewal, for both the troubled ANC and South Africa, which Ramaphosa has reiterated since he assumed the presidency in February 2018.

Ramaphosa noted that he was presenting a plan: that we have forged together to respond to the challenges of unemployment, inequality and poverty.

South Africa's political parties 285 are contesting the elections will soon be providing the country with their priorities and plans. The key question will be which plan is robust enough to turn the country around from the trajectory of despair that overwhelmed it under former president Jacob

The same applies to the ANC. Are their nuggets of hope that

something different will transpire if it's elected for another five years? The majority of South Africans agree on the challenges, but does the party have effective solutions and the political will to implement them? Can the ANC's vision provide all South Africans with a common agenda and a renewed sense of purpose?

It won't be easy. The roar of support for Zuma as he left the stadium is a telling sign of the deep divisions within the ANC, despite the shows of solidarity. It's still an open question as to whether its change in leadership is enough to ensure that the party - and the country - doesn't make a u-turn and head back towards the path of despair.

For now, all the right noises are

being made to, as Ramaphosa put it, restore our democratic institutions and return our country to a path of transformation, growth and development.

But the ANC still needs to develop the toolbox for mobilisation and implementation to get this

The vision articulated by Ramaphosa has the seeds for galvanising South Africans to get back on the right path. It urgently needs a plan to make it happen.

The 'Rainbow nation' seems to have revealed all its ugly stripes over the past few years: a rise in incidents of racism, tribalism, xenophobia, factionalism and continued high levels of gender-based violence.

#### How to be a good VC running universities in turbulent times

AT least once a month a headhunting firm calls me seeking advice on a search for a university vice-chancellor.

They want to pick my brains because of what I've learnt, someas an academic dean and two years as an administrator of struggling universities.

By the time the headhunter makes the call, the university would have advertised the position more than once but simply couldn't find the right person for the job.

I often advise on three starting criteria. In addition, my long tenure in higher education has also taught me that there's additional knowledge that's useful for a university leader to have, particularly in these turbulent times facing higher edu-

Let me start with the criteria that head-hunters should be looking for.

First, candidates need to be major scholars in their field of expertise. Your credibility as an academic is times the hard way, over seven critical in a serious university. If years as a vice-chancellor, 12 years your Senate cannot respect you, you will sound foolish trying to make the case for enhancing the standards of the professoriate or demanding quality scholarship in learned journals.

Second, a competent manager with broad knowledge across the range of university functions - from information technologies to residence management to internal auditing. No vice-chancellor is an expert in more than one of these managerial disciplines. But candidates must know enough to ask their directors or heads of department the right questions.

And third, an inspiring leader who has the ability to connect with and command the respect - of diverse people across the institution from workers to junior lecturers to senior professors.

 Some pointers for candidate Potential candidates should consider what they need to offer inspiring leadership and effective management to universities. Based on my experience, this is what you need to know, and how you need

 A good dose of humility. The four opening words the best-selling book, in The Purpose Driven-Life by evangelical pastor and author Rick Warren is all you need to read:

It's not about you.

People will sing your praises but they will demand things from you.

They will look up to you but they will also blame you. In good times and bad, remember, it's not about you. You are privileged to lead your institution but on behalf of others. The adulation could go to your head. Keep telling yourself it is about the students, the acade mics, the staff and the workers. You exist to serve them. It definitely is not about you.

A sense of your own limitations. A vice-chancellor stands or falls by the quality and cohesiveness of the senior team. It's crucially important that the absolute best people are hired as deputyvice chancellors for the key portfolios such as finance, research, teaching and information technologies. #### LAUNCHING the governing African National Congress's (ANC) 2019 general election manifesto in South Africa, President Cyril Ramaphosa lauded the successes of the last 25 years of democracy.

He claimed that the governing party had 'given substance to the promise of a better life for all'. He declared 2019 'the year of united action to grow South Africa', with a focus on economic growth and job creation:

Today, we are issuing a call to all the people of South Africa, to join us as we strive to accelerate change in our country, as we strive to build an inclusive economy that creates jobs and as we work towards a better future for our children.

He also emphasised that the ANC's aim was to create a developmental state which would put the people first, and that corruption and factional politics would not be tolerated.

He outlined the ANC's political agenda. This included mobilising for a decisive victory in the 2019 general elections; intensifying the renewal of ANC branches; fighting corruption in govemment, in the ANC and across society; and organising against social ills such as gender-based violence, substance abuse and racism.

But the same golden promises have been made before. They may not have the same shine any more given that South Africa is at a precarious point in its 25th year of democracy. The country faces massive socio-economic and socio-political challenges. Unemployment remains stubbornly high, particularly among

young people. Economic growth is tepid and protests over the government's poor delivery of basic services are on the rise.

A survey by Afrobarometer a non-partisan African research network - shows that South Africans generally believe their current economic conditions are bad. Not surprisingly, most believe that the government is dealing with economic policy badly. More than 60 per cent think the government's performance isn't satisfactory on this front.

More worrying is that South Africans are increasingly becoming disillusioned with democracy because of the government's anorexic delivery on the promise of a better life for all. While the ANC continues to make this promise, its delivery remains elusive.

The next few months will be crucial. The ANC will need to take decisive action if it's going to win over sceptical voters.

#### **Echoes of past manifestos**

A cursory glance at previous ANC election manifestos shows that very similar promises and plans have been made ahead of previous elections.

In 1999, at the launch of its manifesto, the party urged South Africans to vote for it in return for speedy change and the delivery of services, to ensure a better life for all.

The 2004 manifesto, under the banner of "a people's contract to create work and fight poverty", stressed growing the economy, creating sustainable livelihoods, accessing basic services, facilitating comprehensive social security as well as fighting crime and corruption.

Similar sentiments were expressed in the ANC's 2009 general election manifesto. The overarching theme of this manifesto was 'working together we can do more'. The party claimed that a

... vote for the ANC is a vote for a better life.

Focus areas were the creation of decent work and sustainable livelihoods, education, health, rural development, food security and land reform as well as the fight against corruption and crime.

By 2014 the promise of a 'better life for all' remained an elusive dream. Corruption, allegations of state capture, and predatory political factionalism undermined trust in the ANC's abilities to deliver on its 2014 promises. As in 2009, economic growth and job creation, rural development and land reform, addressing apartheid legacies, fighting crime and corruption, and delivering quality health and education were key priorities.

Will the electorate buy those golden promises? It's not clear that they will, given the decline in electoral support as well trust in the ruling party.

A time series by Afrobarometer shows both these trends very clear-

#### Decline in electoral support and trust

The party's electoral support has shrunk. In 1999 the ANC held an overwhelming majority of 66 per cent. By the 2014 general elections, this fell to 61 per cent.



The vice-chancellor's role is to keep them together (not always easy) and listen to their counsel.

- A singular ambition. Sitting in the main office, you tend to overreach by wanting to do everything on a long list of goals. Do one or two big things well and you are more likely to make an impact. That ambition may be to dramatically raise the academic standard of a mediocre university or to stabilise the finances of an institution after a near terminal crisis. Choose a few things that resonate with the university community and put all your energy into making those commitments real.
- A short line to your boss. Your nominal boss is the Chair of Council. It is the single most important relationship you should develop. Most universities that fall into crisis do because of a breakdown between



governance (Council) and management (Executive). Meet at least once a fortnight to build the interpersonal relationship, share your agenda and remind each other of the line that must not be crossedmanagers do not govern and governors don't manage.

- Invest in your own development. Make sure you build into your contract negotiations with Council the necessary time off to continue your own research and writing especially when your goal is to re-enter academic life at a later stage. A vice-chancellor who
- is academically active sets a powerful example to both staff as well as students. Furthermore, taking off regular time to rebuild your energies in a demanding job is the best way in which to continue doing your job well.

## SARFED applauds govt's fiscal adjustment strategy

SOUTHERN African Research Foundation for Economic Development (SARFED) has hailed the government for improving its fiscal challenges from E5 billion to E2.3 billion in three months.

SARFED Regional Coordinator George Choongwa applauded the government having taken a bold stance on improving its fiscal challenges, by having a successful adjustment by half from E5 billion to E2.3 billion within a short period of three

"However, it is relevant that government took prudent measures in ensuring that while fiscal improvements manifested, a growth friendly fiscal structure was maintained by ensuring that remedial measures were put in place to cushion disarrays in aggregate demand caused by the labour force," he said **Growth** 

Fiscal policy, according to Choongwa, plays an important role in supporting strong, lasting and equitable growth. Many African countries, including South Africa, have faced a decline in their fiscal performance in the past five years due to the collapse of external markets, most of them suffered much slowdowns in economic performance like Eswatini.

Choongwa said restoring robust growth is essential for addressing the fiscal challenges, both present and ahead as it would be the only way to remain sustainable. This has a strong effect on the entire economic performance as it can make an important contribution to lifting potential

"The fact that the improvements in the government of Eswatini's consumption spending seem to have

improved, while causing a constraint on the aggregate demand of goods and services as indicated by the zero increase in the wage bill, the govemment can also find alternative measures of cushioning the impact. This would make what can be termed as establishing a growth-friendly fiscal policy," he said.

In addition, Choongwa said the effectiveness of growth-friendly fiscal policy is enhanced when reforms reinforce each other and are accompanied by complementary structural reforms. Combining fiscal reforms, which include scaling up infrastructure investment, improving the public investment process increases their effectiveness.

Complementary reforms such as liberalising trade, labour and product markets can magnify the impact of fiscal reforms by promoting savings, stimulating investment, and unlocking productivity gains at the same time. Choongwa further noted that while fiscal policy is an effective tool for supporting economic growth, it is also a challenge to disentangle the impact of fiscal reforms from other factors and to determine causality with certainty.

#### ...FISCAL ADJUSTMENT TO AFFECT MICRO AND MACRO LEVELS

THE recently-announced fiscal adjustment by the Prime Minister, Ambrose Dlamini, has been positively received and is set to affect micro and macro levels.

"It is relevant to point out that the positive dimension that government has taken in terms of its fiscal adjustment strategy has wider effects for the country in both short and long term basis on both micro and macro levels of the economy,' he said.

The effect on macro level, according to Choongwa, touches on both short and long term macroeconomic stability, which was a prerequisite for achieving and maintaining economic growth, especially in strategic sectors.

On the other hand, it also touches on reduction, which is because in most cases large fiscal deficits reduce increased aggregate savings in the economy.

The adjustment also reduced inflation levels, reduction in interest rates which might in return boost the financial policy at both micro and macro levels; and causes a reductionin the balance of payment pressures, hence improving trade and foreign exchange.

"At micro level, the country can expect a well-designed tax and spending policies which would boost employment, investment, and productivity," he said.

Adding, Choongwa said both long and short term fiscal adjustments play a critical role in lowering the tax wedge and improving the design of labour taxes and social benefits, which strengthen work incentives and induce a positive labour supply

This also helps in reforming capital income taxes to tax rents, reducing distortions and encourages private investment well-targeted tax incentives which can stimulate private investment and enhance productivity.

The fiscal adjustmentat micro level also promotes efficient public investment, especially in infrastructure, which has the ability to raise the economy's productive

Adjustment

"We cannot safely state that government's first policy adjustment outcome is ultimate and will maintain a sustained trend in the long run, this is because empirical evidence suggests that the relationship between fiscal adjustment and growth depends on the level of the fiscal deficit a country was faced with," he said.

Choongwa said this was because from the long term perspective, fiscal adjustments have the potential solving the deficit challenge to the extent of reversing below a threshold of around one and a half per cent of Gross Domestic Product

This would, in essence, bring about higher growth rates, but in the short run, highly responsive sectors, especially the labour force, must have temporary measures to cushion the shock.

#### Fswatini's headline inflation rate at 5.2 per cent

THE country's headline inflation rate in December, 2018 when compared to December 2017 stood at 5.2 per cent, which is 0.1 index points lower than the corresponding annual rate of 5.3 per cent observed in November 2018.

This is according to the ministry of economic planning and development's central statistical office Consumer Price Index (CPI) report for December 2018.

"The annual percentage change in the CPI in December 2018 compared with that of December 2017 for the country is 5.2 per cent. This annual rate of inflation is 0.1 index points lower than the corresponding annual rate of 5.3 per cent observed in November 2018," the report said.

The month on month inflation rate which is the percentage change in the CPI in December 2018 compared with that of November 2018 is 0.1 per cent according to the report.

The lower headline inflation is associated to decreasing annual rates of change reflected in December in the price indices for, transport which decreased from 3.5 per cent in November 2018 to 2.4 per cent in December 2018.

The report revealed that operation of personal transport equipment like

lubricants largely contributed to the decreased index in this category. Miscellaneous goods and services decreased from 1.2 per cent in November 2018 to 0.9 per cent in December

Category

Personal effects, such as jewellery, clocks and watches mainly resulted in the decreased index in this cat-

Furthermore the report revealed that the decreasing rates were slightly counteracted by increasing rates of growth in the price indices for, furnishing, household equipment and routine household maintenance

which increased from 1.7 per cent in November to 2.6 per cent in December.

Household appliances like small electric household appliances and goods and services for routine household maintenance such as non-durable goods largely contributed to the increased index.

"Food and non-alcoholic beverages increased from 0.3 per cent in November 2018 to 0.5 per cent in December 2018. Non-alcoholic beverages, such as coffee, tea and cocoa and food largely contributed to the higher index in this category," the report said.

### Public debt at E14.7 billion

THE Recent Economic Development (RED) report by the Central Bank of Eswatini (CBE) for November/December revealed that total public debt stood at E14.7 billion, an equivalent of 23.8 per cent of GDP at the end of December 2018.

"Preliminary figures indicate that total public debt stood at E14.7 billion, an equivalent of 23.8 per cent of Gross Domestic Product (GDP) at end of December. This reflects a five per cent

increase from the E14.0 billion recorded the previous month," the report said.

At the end of December, according to the report, external debt stood at E5.4 billion, an equivalent of 8.8 per cent of GDP, indicating a marginal increase of 1.9 per cent from the previous month. The increase is mainly attributed to the depreciation of the Lilangeni against the US Dollar and other major currencies in which the country's external liabilities are denominated during the review period.

Domestic debt, on the other hand, was recorded at E9.3 billion at the end of

December, an equivalent of 15 per cent of GDP. This reflects an increase of 6.9 per cent when compared to the E8.7 billion recorded in November 2018.

This increase was due to an improved uptake of T-bills and issuance of CBE advance to government during the review period.

Participation

The report further revealed that while commercial banks continued to dominate participation in government securities on the shorter end of the yield curve, non-bank financial institutions dominate on the longer term securities.

In addition, analysis of data indicates that in the previous month, miscellaneous edibles were E1.343 billion, constituting 56.4 per cent of overall receipts in the month, continuing to be the leading export commodity in the country. Sugar and sugar confectionery exports were E525.4 million, reflecting a month-on-month decline of 9.3 per cent

These exports, according to the report, accounted for 22.1 per cent of total merchandise exports in the month. Wood and wood articles remained among the top five exports for the country, posting export pro-

ceeds to the value of E95.1 million, decreasing by 33.5 per cent when compared to proceeds for November 2018.

Decrease

"Textiles and textile apparel were E191.7 million, showing a monthon-month decrease of 54 per cent in December.

"Major imports for the month included 'mineral fuels', 'Nuclear reactors, Boilers, machinery and mechanical appliances', 'Vehicles other than railway, electrical machinery and equipment and cotton for 36.5 per cent of the import bill," the report said.



He noted that the lecture will take the NDS and SDGs 8 and 9 as sign posts, to present new perspectives on SMEs and industrialisation in Eswatini.

"While the United Nations' goals appear laudable on paper, a different strategy is required to transform them from mere proclamations to actual manifestations. We argue for a return to the land (and all its facets such as value creation) as a starting point for any serious transformative SME sector as well as a new approach to industries of the fifth world based on balance in all spheres of economics, that is, production, distribution, exchange, and consumption," he said.

The director also revealed that they will only be identifying sites to build more stores this year. He said they were planning to resume construction of more stores in 2020 after they have located the right sites to build them.


He said their main focus this year will be to identity sites will have a lot of consumers. The director attested to the fact that survival of a supermarket depends on the number of customers it has.

The week-long training commenced on Monday at the Institute of Development Management (IDM).



### Vodacom's compensation claim labelled as 'lie'

JOHANNESBURG-Vodacom was at the centre of a social media storm on Monday after it said that it had reached a reasonable settlement amount for former employee Nkosana Makate for inventing the Please Call Me product.

Makate has been battling to get the telecoms company to compensate him for the Please Call Me product, which was commercialised in 2000, despite winning a Constitutional Court order three years ago.

Commenting on the Please Call Me matter, Communications Minister Stella Ndabeni-Abrahams told Vodacom on Twitter to 'just shut up'

Her comments followed Gauteng Education MEC Panyaza Lesufi's Twitter comment that people must stand by 'Nkosana 'Please Call Me' Makate' against 'this bully called Vodacom'.

#### Settlement

The company said last Saturday that Chief Executive Shameel Joosub had reached a settlement amount with Makate's lawyers on a 'reasonable compensation' for the Please Call Me product. It said Joosub received oral



and written representations from both parties after the negotiations between the two parties had deadlocked. Oral hearings were held on October 4 and 5, 2018.

"The group chief executive has met with the legal representatives of Mr

Makate and Vodacom to convey his decision and determination. In the spirit of the confidentiality agreement both parties signed as part of the negotiating process, Vodacom will not disclose the amount set by the group chief executive as reasonable compensation. Vodacom considers the matter as finally settled and closed," the company said.

"Vodacom can confirm that Makate's funds will be transferred as soon as we have the banking account details," the company said. Makate said he had

not agreed on a settlement with Vodacom. He told SAFM it was a lie.

"My legal representatives went to Vodacom last week on Wednesday as called by the chief executive, and they were given an envelope that contains the ruling or determination from the chief executive, with the determination. There is no agreement in any way with Vodacom," said Makate.

#### Requesting

He also said Joosub should have outlined that he wanted banking details. "We don't have a letter requesting banking details. Why would you go to the media to ask for details?" He also accused the company of lying.

"It is just PR, because of the statement they released. Vodacom has been running the ticket of reasonable compensation," he said. The Constitutional Court ruled in April 2016 that the two parties should reach a consensus and negotiate how much Makate should be compensated.

Makate previously stated that Vodacom must pay him 15 cents from each Rand of revenue that Please Call Me generated, which could exceed R10 billion. Vodacom previously offered Makate R10 million, claiming it was not able to calculate the revenue derived from the use of Please Call Me.

#### ...over foot-andmouth disease


JOHANNESBURG - Countries neighbouring South Africa have banned the import of cloven-hoofed animals and their products over a foot-and-mouth disease breakout in the northern Limpopo province, government said on Monday.

On Monday, Agriculture Minister Senzeni Zokwana confirmed the outbreak of foot-and-mouth disease (FMD), first identified a week ago in Vhembe district near the border with Zimbabwe.

The outbreak prompted the World Organisation for Animal Health (OIE) to lift the FMD-free status that the country has enjoyed since 2014, allowing it to boost red meat exports.

Botswana, Namibia, Zambia and eSwatini are among the countries that have outlawed imports of South African red meat over the past week.

"These bans have caused serious loss to the industry," the agriculture ministry said in a statement. "The



impact this has had to trade in the past week has been devastating to say the least."

#### Infected

The highly contagious viral disease, which causes lesions and lameness, has so far infected about 50 heads of cattle and the affected area has been placed under quarantine.

South Africa is a net exporter of chilled and frozen beef.

It produces around US\$145 million worth of exports in red meats annually, with agriculture being one of the highest contributors to GDP.

While the disease does not affect human beings, "the movement of such animals and their products,

originating from South Africa, is banned," Botswana's director of veterinary services said.

Agricultural economist Wandile Sihlobo cited Mozambique, Swaziland, Namibia, Lesotho, Mauritius and Angola among the key beef export markets.

CAPE TOWN - A security issue has reportedly been spotted on WhatsApp that could provide full access to your conversations when creating a new account for a new phone number.

According to a report by Softpedia News, an Amazon employee named Abby Fuller claimed that she gained access to another user's WhatsApp archive on her new phone because WhatsApp had failed to remove the chat history linked to the specific phone number.

The report stated that Fuller added

According to WhatsApp's own support documents, the message history associated with a specific phone number is completely removed after 45 days of inactivity.

However, Fuller claims that she had the number for longer than 45 days yet the person's WhatsApp history was still not deleted.

No currency, just a currency crisis

#### Zimbabwe's woes deepen

HARARE - Not having a currency of its own hasn't stopped Zimbabwe from sliding into a currency crisis.

A scarcity of foreign exchange has led to long queues for petrol, bread and medicine and sent prices surging across the southern African country.

Police clashed with protesters in the capital, Harare, on Monday as the main tradeunion group started a strike after the government more than doubled petrol prices to US\$3.31 a litre over the weekend, the highest in the world, according to GlobalPetrolPrices.com

The roots of the pain lie in Zimbabwe's decision to scrap its own currency, the Zimbabwe dollar, a decade ago, and to adopt a basket of foreign units of which the greenback is the most widely used.

The central bank then started printing quasi-greenbacks to fund rampant government spending.

The result is a convoluted system of exchange rates, with consumers charged different prices depending on whether they pay in real dollars, electronic money or socalled bond notes - even though the government insists all three have the same value. It undermined that argument by saying that foreigners could still pay the old price for petrol of US\$1.32 a litre if they used cash dollars.

#### Situation

"There is a system of smoke and mirrors going on," said Stephen Bailey-Smith, senior economist at Danish money manager Global Evolution Funds, which invests across Africa. "It makes it extremely difficult to understand the real situation with the economy."

The crisis is a major headache for President Emmerson Mnangagwa, a 76-year-old former spy chief who promised better times for Zimbabweans when he won elections in July, taking over from long-standing ruler Robert Mugabe, under whom the economy began its descent.

Both were members of the same party when Mugabe was ousted by the military in late 2017.

Finance Minister Mthuli Ncube said on January 12 he'd introduce a new currency within a year. But he gave few details, beyond that the central bank was building reserves, which currently cover barely two weeks of imports. He's also trying to restructure billions of dollars of defaulted multilateral debts so that Zimbabwe can obtain new international loans.

## #StateCaptureInquiry now set to resume today

JOHANNESBURG - The hearings of the judicial commission of inquiry into allegations of state capture, headed by Deputy Chief Justice Raymond Zondo, will resume today, after a month-long hiatus, but will not hear any oral evidence. The inquiry was expected to resume

yesterday, but on Monday afternoon the commission said it would resume a day later.

"The public and the media are hereby notified that the application that was to be heard by the commission tomorrow morning (Tuesday January 15 2019) will now be heard on Wednesday, January 16 2019, before the hearing of oral evidence," the short statement read.

The inquiry, which is investigating allegations of corruption and fraud in the public sector including organs of state, will deal with a procedural application on some of the upcom-

ing evidence.

For the rest of the week, the commission will hear oral evidence but the witness list has not yet been released.

In December, some of the witnesses who meant to testify became unavailable while others asked for a postponement.

The so-called Zondo Commission has heard explosive testimonies from various witnesses, including former mineral resources minster Ngoako Ramatlhodi, head of government communications Phumla Williams and government spin doctor-turned-politician Mzwanele Manyi, among many others.

The President, who is accompanied by the ministers of defence, police and state security, is expected (to head back) to South Africa this afternoon (on Monday)."

Last month, Mabuza held various

#### Solly Msimanga accused of lying about ECG church safety compliance

PRETORIA - Tshwane Mayor Solly Msimanga deliberately lied in the aftermath of the Pretoria church stampede when he said the premises of the Shepherd Bushiri-led Enlightened Christian Gathering (ECG) church was non-compliant with fire and emergency by-laws, the African National Congress' Youth League (ANCYL) in Tshwane said on Monday.

"We wish to remind Mr Msimanga as we have done numerous times before, that indeed lies have short legs. Mr Msimanga lied to the people of Tshwane and South Africa in a press statement that the building used by the ECG church is noncompliant with regulations. We have proof in the form of a (compliance) certificate that was handed over to the church by City of Tshwane officials," said ANCYL Tshwane Regional Chairperson Lesego Makhubela.


"The certificate gave the church permission to host an event on the 31 of December. The ANC Youth League is disgusted by these lies and views this as opportunistic, senseless and insensitive to the families that lost their loved ones during a stampede at that church in December."

#### Mantashe isn't welcome in Xolobeni, committee denies inviting him

JOHANNESBURG-The Amadiba Crisis Committee (ACC) action group yesterday contradicted the statement by Mineral Resources Minister Gwede Mantashe that he would be visiting the volatile Xolobeni community in the Eastern Cape once again on the invitation of the ACC.

This comes as the situation continues to escalate in Xolobeni ahead of Mantashe's planned visit today to the village to engage the community on mining and economic development prospects in the area.

In a statement on Monday, the department of mineral resources said that during his last meeting with the ACC

in November 2018, the ACC had requested Mantashe to come back and meet with the broader community in Xolobeni.

But the ACC said the department had falsely claimed it had asked Mantashe to come back and meet with the broader community in Xolobeni during that meeting at Wild Coast Sun.

The ACC said in a statement: "At Wild Coast Sun in November, our induna Mr Mashona Wetu and the 18-person-strong delegation repeated one message: Any discussion about our land takes place at the Great Place (Komkhulu) of Umgungundlovu, and nowhere else. ANA

## Gigaba, Mbalula's threats to sue public protector come to nothing

JOHANNESBURG - Former ministers Malusi Gigaba and Fikile Mbalula both threatened legal challenges to the public protector's damaging findings against them last year - but, at least for now, it appears they have not followed through.

The public protector's office on Monday afternoon confirmed that Advocate Busisiwe Mkhwebane had not been served with court papers by either of the former ministers.

"The public protector has not received any court papers from the two former ministers relating to their public announcements that they will take her reports on judicial review," her spokesperson, Oupa Segalwe, told TimesLIVE.

In October last year, Mkhwebane found that Gigaba had not only violated the executive ethics code, but also the country's constitution for "deliberately telling untruths under oath".

Her findings came after the North Gauteng High Court in Pretoria ruled in 2017 that Gigaba had lied under oath and violated the constitution in his conduct during a court battle over Fireblade Aviation, a company owned by the wealthy Oppenheimer family.

The application concerned the approval, allegedly granted by Gigaba during his first stint as home affairs minister, for Fireblade to operate a VIP terminal at OR Tambo International Airport.

It was alleged that Gigaba revoked the approval he originally granted under pressure from the Guptas.

Gigaba, who has denied wrongdoing, resigned weeks after the release of Mkhwebane's Fireblade report, after failing to persuade the Constitutional Court to hear his case. He could have sought to review the report in the High Court, but has seemingly chosen not to do so.

## MNANGAGWA DEFENDS FUEL PRICE HIKE AS DEADLY PROTESTS RAGE ON

Harare - Several people were killed and some 200 arrested during protests in Zimbabwe on Monday, the government said, two days after it raised the price of fuel in an attempt to tame the worst economic crisis in a decade.

Police fired tear gas in the capital Harare and second city Bulawayo where protesters barricaded roads, burned tyres and chanted songs against President Emmerson Mnangagwa, who put up fuel prices in the hope of easing a currency shortage.

Security minister Owen Ncube said some people died at the protests, but

gave no further details. He blamed the unrest on the main opposition party and political rights groups. "Regrettably, this has resulted in the loss of life and property, including injury to police officers and members of the public. Full investigations are underway," Ncube said in a statement.

The Human Rights Forum, a collective of local groups, said it had received reports that five people had sustained gunshot wounds. The opposition Movement for Democratic Change said its Harare headquarters was torched late on Monday but the fire had been put

out. It did not say who was behind the attack.

The authorities are keen to avoid a repeat of post-election violence in August in which six people were killed after the army intervened.

Riot police patrolled downtown Harare as army helicopters circled above. Businesses closed early and schools called parents to pick their children, fearing violence.

The main labour union called for a three-day stay-at-home strike starting Monday and central Harare was deserted by 4 pm Commuters walked home

from the city centre because there was no public transport.

"I am stranded in town now and I have no idea how I am going to go home," resident Leeroy Kabanga told Reuters.

Airline Fastjet cancelled its remaining flights to and from Zimbabwe on Monday due to the unrest.

Mnangagwa defended his fuel policy, saying prices in Zimbabwe were the lowest in the region.

Reuters



were deployed to some areas of the capital where police were clashing with protesters over fuel hikes. Several people, including a bystander, were injured by gunfire.

An Associated Press journalist saw three military trucks with soldiers headed for Chitungwiza, a large suburb southeast of Harare, the capital. Clashes between police and protesters have occurred in Chitungwiza.

The deployment of the military came one month after an official report said police and soldiers used "unjustified and disproportionate" force to kill six people during election

#### Cross-border buses to Zim suspend service as unrest deepens

PRETORIA - The International Cross-**Border Traders Association (ICTA)** on Monday said it had withdrawn all buses travelling to different parts of Zimbabwe from neighbouring countries as protests spread in the country.

"As the International Cross-Border Traders Association we have withdrawn all buses. There will be no loading of buses till further notice," ICTA President Denis Juru told African News Agency (ANA)

in Pretoria. On Monday, the military and police were engaged in running battles with protesters in different parts of the small Southern African country.

The country's main cities -- Harare and Bulawayo -- were the worst affected, as angry protesters reacted to the weekend more than doubling of fuel prices by looting several businesses, burning tyres and barricading major roads.

Over the weekend, Zimbabwe's President

Emmerson Mnangagwa announced a more than 100 per cent rise in the price of petrol and diesel, a move he said would improve supplies, but a decision which attracted harsh criticism from the Zimbabwe Congress of Trade Unions (ZCTU), civil society and rights groups. Earlier, ICTA issued a warning, advising its members and travellers in and around Zimbabwe "to avoid Zimbabwean borders and unnecessary movements". ANA

"We hereby call on President Emmerson Mnangagwa and his government to resign enmass and pave way for a broad-based platform for different social groupings in the country, including, but not limited to, political parties, civic organisations and the church to negotiate for modalities to institute a democratic transitional government tasked with returning the country to constitutionalism and prosperity." GABON PRESIDENT HOME FROM MEDICAL LEAVE ONE WEEK AFTER ATTEMPTED COUP

LIBREVILLE - President Ali Bongo returned to Gabon on Monday after a three-month medical leave during which a coup attempt was thwarted, two government sources told Reuters.

His return comes a week after a small military group took over the state radio station. The move to grab power was quickly halted but exposed growing frustration in the oil-producing country over Bongo's secretive absence.

Bongo suffered the stroke during a conference in Saudi Arabia in October and was flown to Morocco Bongo suffered the stroke during a conference in Saudi Arabia in October and was flown to Morocco in November for treatment.

He has appeared in closely choreographed television clips in recent weeks, including a New Year's address in which he slurred his speech and appeared unable to move his right arm. It is not clear if he can walk.

Bongo appointed a new government on Saturday in an apparent effort to shore up his political base, including the nomination of Julien Nkoghe Bekale as Prime Minister.

The new government will be sworn in in Bongo's presence on Tuesday, the two sources said. The media will not be allowed to attend.

The Bongo family has ruled Gabon for over 50 years. Ali Bongo took over upon his father Omar's death in 2009. Ali Bongo won re-election

in 2016 by fewer than 6 000 votes amid widespread accusations of fraud, sparking deadly clashes between protesters and police during which the Parliament was torched.

#### Petition to challenge court over Uganda presidential age limit

KAMPALA - Uganda's Supreme Court yesterday began hearing a petition to challenge a Constitutional Court decision removing an age limit cap of 75 for presidential candidates.

Critics of the decision argue it would allow President Yoweri Museveni, 74, to seek re-election for a sixth term in 2021.

A Bill removing the limit was signed into law in December 2017 after a chaotic passage through Parliament that saw MPS engaging in fisticuffs. The Constitutional Court upheld the amendment in a ruling in July 2018.

Opposition lawmaker Winnie Kiiza and activist Kassim Male Mabirizi of the Uganda Law Society filed the petition challenging the Constitutional Court decision.

They want the court to decide whether the amendment violated the Constitution as it "was rushed through Parliament amidst violence and chaos, where members of the opposition were either arrested or beaten by police and army", Kiiza's lawyer Ladislaus Rwakafuzi told AFP.

"The other element of our appeal is for the court to decide whether the president, who was elected before the constitutional amendment lifting the age limit cap of 75 years, should remain in office after clocking 75 years," he added.

Having seized power at the head of a rebel army in 1986, Museveni is the only president most Ugandans have known in a country where the median age is less than 16.

In 2005, Museveni scrapped a twoterm presidential limit which has allowed him to keep running for office.

Young Ugandans have recently been energised by pop star-turned-MP Bobi Wine, who spearheaded protests against the age-limit amendment and has rapidly become a thorn in the government's side.

## Nigeria Chief Justice forced from office, faces trial

ABUJA - Nigeria's Chief Justice is scheduled to be arraigned at the Code of Conduct Tribunal in Abuja on charges of failing to declare his assets and for holding foreign bank accounts.

The federal government ordered Justice Walter Samuel Nkanu Onnoghen to immediately vacate his office as head of the country's judiciary on Saturday.

The Chief Justice has a key role in resolving election disputes and Nigeria will vote for a new pres-

ident in February. This is the first time a Nigerian Chief Justice is standing trial.

On Monday a team of 94 lawyers arrived at the tribunal to defend Onnoghen, whose appointment had suffered unprecedented delay by President Muhammadu Buhari.

The Coalition of Niger Delta Agitators argues that Onnoghen is being wrongly prosecuted and threatened to resume attacks on oil wells.

#### MDC headquarters burns in Zim rage

HARARE - Four people were feared dead on Monday while more than 20 people were treated for gunshot wounds as violent protests swept through Zimbabwe after government increased the price of fuel.

News broke on Monday that the headquarters of the opposition Movement for Democratic Change (MDC) were attacked by people using petrol bombs. In a Zanu-PF-led government statement, they blamed the protests on the MDC and civil society.

The opposition has steadfastly refused to accept the result of last year's elections.

#### Boko Haram attacks military base

LAGOS - Boko Haram fighters attacked a military base in remote northeast Nigeria, setting fire to shelters for those made homeless by the conflict, military and humanitarian sources told AFP yesterday. The attack in Rann, some 175 kilometres northeast of the Borno state capital, Maiduguri, began late on Monday afternoon and forced civilians to flee. It followed a pattern by the Islamic State West Africa Province (ISWAP) faction of Boko Haram that has called into question government claims the group is virtually defeated.

#### Fayulu says country's ruling party is desperate

KINSHASA - Democratic republic of Congo's presidential runner-up Martin Fayulu, who is challenging his election loss in court, says the government deployed armed soldiers around his headquarters because of the ruling party's "desperation." Fayulu is legally challenging his defeat, saying that he won 61 per cent of the vote, citing figures compiled by the Catholic Church's 40 000 election observers across the vast Central African country. Those figures say that election winner Felix Tshieskedi only received 18 per cent of the vote.

#### Minister blames MDC for chaos

BULAWAYO - The Movement for Democratic Change (MDC), Zimbabwe's main opposition party, has been blamed for the violent protests which erupted in Harare and Bulawayo on Monday, as citizens protested over fuel hikes. Owen Ncube, the minister of state for national security, said the protests were "well-orchestrated", given the widespread scenes of looting, burning of tyres and barricades across roads in both cities. "The prevailing security situation in the country is a culmination of a well-orchestrated series of events by the MDC Alliance, working in cahoots with NGOs, civic society, youth organisations, pressure groups and individuals," said Ncube in a statement late on Monday night. ## US TELLS SAUDIS TO HOLD KHASHOGGI KILLERS 'ACCOUNTABLE'

WASHINGTON - US Secretary of State Mike Pompeo said he told the king and crown prince of Saudi Arabia on Monday that the Trump administration expects the kingdom to hold accountable "every single person" responsible for the slaying of journalist Jamal Khashoggi, who was killed inside one of the country's consulates after writing columns critical of the government.

In talks with Saudi King Salman and Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman, who has been accused by some of complicity in the murder, Pompeo said he had been clear about the administration's expectations.

At the end of a trip to Riyadh

that also focused on Mideast crises and countering threats from Iran, Pompeo said he had raised the Khashoggi case in his meetings with the king and crown prince along with other human rights issues, including the fate of women's rights activists detained in the kingdom.

"We spoke about the accountability and the expectations that we have. The Saudis are friends and when friends have conversations you tell them what your expectations are," the secretary said. "Our expectations have been clear from early on: Every single person who has responsibility for the murder of Jamal Khashoggi needs to be held accountable."

He said the Saudis understood

and had reiterated pledges to pursue the case wherever it leads. He would not comment on US intelligence that has suggested the crown prince may have ordered the killing. The relationship between Riyadh and Washington remains tense following the killing of Khashoggi, who lived in Virginia and wrote columns for The Washington Post, at the Saudi Consulate in Istanbul in October.

Saudi Arabia has charged 11 people in the death, including several officials close to the crown prince but US lawmakers have been critical of its response, demanding that America withdraw its support for the Saudi-led war in Yemen in response.

#### Trump uses one of the worst massacres to mock Elizabeth Warren

WASHINGTON - One hundred years after US soldiers killed and maimed hundreds of Sioux men, women and children at the Wounded Knee massacre, Congress formally apologised in 1990 by expressing its "deep regret on behalf of the United States."

On Sunday night, President Donald Trump used that same massacre as a punchline in his latest broadside against Sen. Elizabeth Warren, D-Mass., the Democratic presidential hopeful whom he regularly calls "Pocahontas" in jeering reference to her claims of American Indian heritage.

## Chinese court sentences Canadian to death as diplomatic row deepens

BELJING/OTTAWA - A Chinese court on Monday sentenced a Canadian man to be executed for drug smuggling, prompting Canada's Prime Minister Justin Trudeau to accuse China of using the death penalty arbitrarily.

The ruling, and Trudeau's reaction, could aggravate already sour relations between Beijing and Ottawa following the arrest of a senior Chinese executive in Canada and China's subsequent detention of two Canadians.

The Dalian Intermediate People's Court in China's northeast province of Liaoning re-tried Robert Lloyd Schellenberg, who had appealed his original 15-year prison sentence, and decided on execution, the court said in a statement.

Schellenberg was told in court he had the right to appeal to Liaoning High Court within 10 days upon receiving the ruling, the intermediate court said in a second statement.

"It is of extreme concern to us as a government, as it should be to all our international friends and allies, that China has chosen to begin to arbitrarily apply (the) death penalty ... as in this case," Trudeau told reporters in Ottawa.

Schellenberg's aunt, Lauri Nelson-Jones, said the family's worst fears had been confirmed.

"It is rather unimaginable what he must be feeling and thinking. It is a horrific, unfortunate, heartbreaking situation," she told the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation.

China-Canada ties turned icy in early December after Meng Wanzhou, chief financial officer of Chinese telecommunications giant Huawei Technologies Co Ltd, was arrested in Vancouver on a US extradition warrant.

China denounced her arrest, warning of unspecified consequences unless Meng was released, and detained Michael Kovrig, a Canadian diplomat on unpaid leave from the embassy in Beijing, and Michael Spavor, a Canadian consultant, on suspicion of endangering state security.

WASHINGTON - "I never worked for Russia and you know that answer better than anybody," Trump told reporters at the White House. "It's a disgrace that you even ask that question. It's all a big fat hoax."Trump's angry comments followed a New York Times report that the FBI investigated suspicions that Trump might be acting on Russia's behalf after he sacked the bureau's director in 2017. A separate Washington Post report said that Trump had also aroused concerns by going to unusual lengths to prevent even his close aides from knowing the contents of conversations he had during summits with President Vladimir Putin. #### Man sentenced for killing, dismembering mom

HONOLULU - A man who admitted to killing and dismembering his mother during an argument in their Honolulu apartment has been sentenced to 30 years in prison. Yu Wei Gong was charged with murder after he called police in 2017 to turn himself in after a suicide attempt. He admitted killing his mother Liu Yun Gong about six months earlier, according to court documents. When officers asked where his mother was, he said "in the fridge." Police found human remains, including two arms with hands and a decapitated head, in numerous trash bags, court documents said. Last year, he pleaded guilty to manslaughter, avoiding a life sentence.

#### Scientist eaten alive by 5m crocodile

**TOMOHON** - A scientist was attacked and eaten alive by a crocodile as she fed it at a research centre.

Deasy Tuwo is believed to have been dragged into the enclosure when the 17ft (about 5.1m) reptile reared up on its hind legs and snatched her from the top of an 8ft wall. The 44-year-old had been throwing meat into the enclosure at the research facility in Indonesia last Friday morning. Horrified staff at the CV Yosiki Laboratory in the city of Tomohon, North Sulawesi, only discovered what had happened later that day when they spotted a "strange shape" in the water. *Daily Mail* 


#### Toddler found dead outside home

### Cavani 'surprised' at Qatar's Copa America inclusion

poHA - Uruguay's Edinson Cavani admitted on Monday that Qatar's inclusion among teams in this year's Copa America was a "surprise" but backed the Gulf state's first ever tournament appearance.

The 31-year-old, who plays for Qatariowned French champions Paris Saint-Germain, said allowing the World Cup 2022 host in to South America's biggest international competition could prove "special".

"To have Qatar is a surprise and I think it is going to be something very nice," the Uruguay striker said to reporters at PSG's winter training camp in Doha.

"To have a team from this continent

at the Copa America, it's something very special to bring a new culture and to mix with the South Americans."

The 2019 tournament will take place in Brazil in June and July this year.

Arguably It was announced in May that Qatar would be one of the 12 teams taking

part. Japan have also been invited. The same month it was also announced that Qatar's state-owned airline, Qatar Airways, would be the shirt sponsor of arguably South America's biggest club side, Boca Juniors of Argentina.

Qatar Airways has subsequently also become the official "global airline partner" of CONMEBOL, the South American football confederation.

Uruguay are the nation with the most Copa America titles, 15, and Cavani said there was a real possibility they could win again.



## PELE OFFERS SUPPORT TO 'SON OF SANTOS' NEYMAR

RIO-Brazil legend Pele has offered his support to compatriot and Paris Saint-Germain forward Neymar.

The 26-year-old Neymar has scored 18 goals in 21 appearances for the Ligue 1 outfit this campaign.

Three-time World Cup winner Pele has opened up on his relationship with Neymar, who joined PSG for a worldrecord £198million in the summer of 2017.

"A father does not criticise, he educates," Pele told France Football. "He is a son of Santos'.

"I want the best for him, for Brazil, for our national team. "I will do anything to help and move him forward."

Neymar has formed part of the lethal attacking triumvirate with Edinson Cavani and Kylian Mbappe for PSG but

his stay in the French capital has often been called into question. He has been linked with moves to Barcelona and Real Madrid.

**Eye-watering** 

The plan for Neymar when he left Barcelona in 2017 was always very clear - win the Champions League and Ballon d'Or in Paris and then make one more eye-watering, record breaking transfer, probably to Madrid.

PSG face Manchester United in the last 16 of the European competition while the elusive Golden Ball was awarded to Luka Modric.

Neymar and his team-mates have travelled to Qatar for a four-day winter training camp - a trip PSG make every year for training and sponsorship reasons.

#### Silva is again dominant in the PSG defence

PARIS - At 34, veteran centreback Thiago Silva has re-emerged this season as the pillar of the Paris Saint-Germain defence as the French champions prepare for an assault in Europe.

The PSG captain spoke to AFP in Qatar as his side prepares for a second half of the season in which they will resume their campaign for a long-coveted first Champions League trophy with a last-16 tie against resurgent Manchester United.

"I think I've already enjoyed some good times in my career," he said, when asked about his form this season. "But at this age it is better. You always have quality, and time gives you the experience. When you put the two things together, you go up a level."

Thiago Silva was one of the scape-

goats in 2017 when PSG blew a 4-0 first-leg lead in second round against Barcelona, collapsing 6-1 as they conceded three times after the 88th

The Brazilian's refound form has come after Thomas Tuchel replaced Unai Emery as coach.

"He's given me the tranquility to play. "He tries to solve problems as quickly as possible and he talks to me to discover the best solution," he said, adding that Tuchel involves him in decision-making.

"That's something I've never felt before, so I'm giving something extra." He pointed to a 3-0 victory away to 10-man Amiens in Ligue 1 at the start of December.

"Against Amiens, I played for him," he said. "He suggested that I play just 45 minutes, but at the end of the "I heard a lot of things: "I'm not a first half, the score was still 0-0. I leader, I'm not this or that," he said. could not leave my team in that position just so I could have a rest for upcoming matches. I told him 'I'll play to the end.' When the team needs me, I'm there."

Thiago Silva agreed with suggestions that this might be the strongest PSG team since he arrived in 2012.

"It's not only the players but the way we play," he said. "We're playing more as a team."

Thiago Silva said that Tuchel's direct and open approach to players helped explain the improved productivity of the team in general and Neymar in particular. AFP

## Juventus and AC Milan to 'hold talks

TURIN - Juventus and AC Milan are set to hold showdown talks in the coming days to discuss the future of Gonzalo Higuain after the Serie A champions rejected Chelsea's 18-month loan offer.

The Argentine striker is currently on loan at the San Siro but Chelsea want to bring him to Stamford Bridge in this month's window and Higuain wants the move too.

Maurizio Sarri is desperate for a new striker with the Blues struggling in front of goal and current forward Alvaro Morata also looks to be heading for the exit.

According to the Evening Standard, AC Milan and Juventus will hold talks when they meet in the Italian Super Cup final in Saudi Arabia

The Bianconeri have rejected the Blues' offer to take Higuain on loan for the rest of the season or for 18 months. Instead, Juventus want Chelsea to take over the terms of the 31-yearold's deal which entails an initial £16m fee with obligation to buy at £32m.

But in 11 successful years serving under Sir Alex Ferguson, there is little anybody can teach Solskjaer about

that. An impressed Pogba said: "As a player he knew the mentality of this club. He has come back to help us and it is going very well. The season is long so let's see how it goes."

History The pair have a long history with Pogba joining the United academy in 2009 when Ole Gunnar Solskjaer was midway through his two-and-a-

He was still only 16 when he was first called up to the reserves in December of his first year at the club, and made three more cameo substitute appearances later in the same season after spending most of his time in the under-18 team.

#### CHELSEA CHARGED OVER ALLEGED RACIST CHANTING

LONDON - UEFA have opened disciplinary proceedings against Chelsea following allegations of racist chanting at a Europa League match in Hungary.

The reported incident in Budapest on December 13 came just days after Chelsea and police launched investigations into alleged racist abuse directed towards Manchester City's Raheem Sterling at Stamford Bridge.

Chelsea Chairman Bruce Buck condemned the actions of "a few mindless individuals at some of our recent matches", and added he "will not rest until we have eliminated all forms of discrimination from our club". #### WAGNER LEAVES HUDDERSFIELD BY 'MUTUAL CONSENT'

LONDON - Huddersfield announced the departure of Manager David Wagner by mutual consent on Monday, with the club rooted at the bottom of the Premier League.

Saturday's goalless draw at Cardiff halted a club-record nine straight defeats in all competitions but they have won just twice in the league all season.

"David Wagner has departed his role as head coach of Huddersfield Town by mutual consent," said a club statement. "The 47-year-old leaves Town after detailed discussions with the board of directors, with both parties agreeing this is the correct move for the future of the club."

Wagner, who signed a new three-year deal in May last year, led Huddersfield into the top tier from the Championship and kept them up last season.

Huddersfield Chairman Dean Hoyle said: "I'd like to begin by thanking David for all he has achieved at Huddersfield Town over the last three-and-a-half years. AFP

#### MAN CITY READY TO POUNCE ON ANY LIVERPOOL SLIP-UPS

MANCHESTER - Pep Guardiola said his Manchester City team will be poised to pounce if Premier League leaders Liverpool falter, following a comfortable 3-0 win over Wolves on Monday that left City four points behind Jurgen Klopp's side.

Two first-half goals from Gabriel Jesus, either side of a straight red card for Wolves' French defender Willy Boly, allowed City to demonstrate that they had banished their shaky December form.

The City manager was in no mood to analyse the table and insisted he is interested only in his own team's performances. "We cannot play the games against Liverpool, we cannot do anything about them," said

Borussia Dortmund winger Christian Pulisic for £58m earlier in the January transfer window and the club are adamant that Hazard is worth double that fee. The figure may prove slightly problematic for Real, who don't have a large transfer budget available. It is hoped that Mateo Kovacic could act as a makeweight in any deal with the Croatian currently on a seasonlong loan from the Bernabeu.

#### DEBUTS AT AUSTRALIAN OPEN 'SERENA-TARD'

SYDNEY - Serena Williams unveiled her latest fashion statement at the Australian Open yesterday, and helpfully ended any confusion about what to call the striking garment.

Some suggested it was a onesie, others said it resembled a romper suit, but for the item's famous creator there could be only one name.

"It's a Serena-tard," Williams told reporters when quizzed about her latest look

Made of jade-green lycra with a blackand-white waistband, the skin-tight outfit looks like a pair of disco-era hotpants attached to a builder's singlet. Williams matched it with fishnet stockings, which she explained were a health measure designed to avoid deep-vein thrombosis (DVT).

Williams almost died in 2017 when blood clots formed in her lungs after she gave birth to her first child, daughter Olympia. She said she still lived in fear of the condition returning and wore compression tights to help stop clots forming. "(I'm) definitely still concerned. I have had some issues and they're not done. So it's just something I just have to do for pretty much probably the rest of my career," she said. "But I'm always at the doctor. With DVTs, it's very scary. I know a lot of people - they're very common. A lot of people have them. Especially for me it's incredibly frightening.'

Williams is renowned for her oncourt outfits, including a body-hugging black catsuit at last year's French Open that caused controversy when

organisers said she would not be able to wear it this year. AFP

#### Osaka powers into **Aussie Open** 2nd round

**MELBOURNE** - Japanese fourth seed Naomi Osaka overcame a nervous start and distraction from flying bugs to ease into the Australian Open second round yesterday.

The US Open champion downed Magda Linette of Poland 6-4, 6-2 in just under an hour to set up a meeting with Tamara Zidansek of Slovakia in the next round.

"I felt really nervous walking onto the court but then when I started playing I just felt really happy and grateful that I'm able to play in front of such a great crowd," she said. The 21-year-old said she enjoyed the warm Australian conditions but had to call for a ballboy's help when a bug was fluttering on court as she prepared to serve for the match.

"I'm not really that great at catching them, I'd accidentally squish it maybe, so it's probably not a good idea" she said. Osaka quickly put aside her brush with Australian wildlife and sealed the match with an ace. Bookies have installed her as second favourite to lift the Australian title after Serena Williams, who she beat in last year's US Open final, sparking the American's infamous meltdown at the umpire.



'Swazi Bolt' for Pretoria training camp

ATHLETICS - LOCAL sprinter Sibusiso 'Swazi Bolt' Matsenjwa will leave the country next Thursday for a training camp in Pretoria, South Africa.

This training camp signals the start of 'Swazi Bolt's preparations for the World Championships to be staged by Qatar in late September. Interviewed yesterday, Matsenjwa said the Pretoria camp would help him gauge his level ahead of a variety of competitions he has to take part in so that he qualifies for the world champs.

"Qualifying for this year's championships is through a ranking system by the International Athletics Association Federation (IAAF). It means I have to run in many high profile events to garner enough points to qualify," he

This will be the first of two camps that 'Swazi Bolt' will attend in Pretoria as another one is slated for the 20th of next month.

He has a long list of major events lined up in countries like Switzerland, Germany, South Africa (Grand Prix), and another race in Angola, which he can use to get the points needed to qualify him for the world championships.

"The bigger the events you compete in, the more points you gain.

I will be working hard with my coach to improve on my time so that I can be in a good position to get as many points as possible," he said.

'Swazi Bolt' is the fastest 200 metres runner in the country. He also specialises in the 100 metres, and will use this year's events to prepare for the Olympic Games in Tokyo, Japan next year.

His best 100 metres time is 10.31 seconds achieved in 2017, and his personal best for 200 metres is 20.09, which he clocked in Pretoria last year.

Matseniwa says he is targeting a time of 10.10 seconds in the 100 metres this year, and 20.30 in the 200 metres.

## BULL, VOVOVO FC CHARGED BY PLE

Highlanders' fans are alleged to have blocked Vovovo FC's supporters, players, and officials from entering the stadium, which led to a skirmish that disturbed an earlier match between Moneni Pirates and Matsapha United.

PLE's Chief Executive Officer (CEO) Simanga Nhleko confirmed that both teams were charged. He said he would not reveal the exact nature of the charges because certain rules prevented his office from doing so.

the nature of the charges. What I can confirm is that both teams have been charged and are expected to appear before the Disciplinary Committee (DC) on Thursday (tomorrow) evening," he said

**Enquiries** 

Asked whether the charges also cover an incident that occurred during the replay at Somhlolo National Stadium, when a Vovovo FC fan was stabbed, Nhleko referred all enquiries to the prosecutor. Mbabane Highlanders' Public relations Officer, Magidzeludzakeni Masilela confirmed that they have received correspondence from the PLE on the matter. He said the team has been charged with contravening Article 10.3 (d) and (f) of the 2018/19 Ingwenyama Cup rules and regulations.

Reads 10.3 (d); "Assaulting a referee (s) or match official (s) or club official (s) or player (s) or fan (s) or supporter (s) or spectator (s) – a minimum fine of E10 000 and a maximum fine of E100 000."

It is said Highlanders' marshals were involved in trying to block Vovovo FC from getting closer to their team's bus, and the fracas was later joined by fans from both teams, which led to an uncontrollable situation spotted by officials on duty at the stadium.

Reads 10.3 (f); "Failure by a club (s) to control their officials or players or supporters or fans – a minimum fine of E3 000 and a maximum fine of E10 000 by the DC."

Vovovo FC's Chief Executive Officer, Stan Dlamini said they had not received anything from the PLE by late afternoon yesterday. He said he would only comment once he was clear on what his team had been charged for.






