BISHOP Vusumuzi Maculuve, who doubles up as a gospel artist and a bishop, has confirmed to the newspaper that indeed he will be marrying a second wife.

When the public was quizzed on the matter, some people they said they were not really shocked as they knew something like this was coming therefore they were not raising eyebrows.



Stefanutti Stocks awarded E423m interchange tender

THE ministry of public works and transport has awarded Stefanutti Stocks, a E423 million Manzini Golf Course Interchange tender.

The construction of the interchange bridge is financed by the African Development Bank. This is according to the announcement made yesterday by Ministry of Public Works Principal Secretary Khangeziwe Mabuza.

The actual cost of the project which is expected to take 18 months is E423 731 680.17 and construction is expected to start in March 30, 2020.

They won the tender ahead of Eswatini company, Inyatsi Construction Limited, which had offered to construct the interchange for E22 million less than the quoted figure by Stefanutti Stocks price. Inyatsi Construction tendered a bid for E401 675 703.76 for the project.

Stefanutti is expected to construct a 600 metre dual carriageway of the main road, 10 slip roads of a total of 3.6 km, nine box culvert with numerous minor culverts and associated drainage channels and kerbs.

It will also construct two reinforced

concrete bridges with other ancillary and complementary structures.

The company is also expected to install road furniture including street-lights and make provision for utilities and services including ICT ducting as well as safety structures such as overhead bridges.

Stefanutti Stocks beat two other companies

The other companies that bid for the tender were WBHO/ AG Thomas JV, Raubex Construction.

WBHO/AG Thomas JV was rejected because it was the least evaluated bidder, Raubex Construction on the other hand was rejected for technical responsiveness which was said to have not been substantial.

"Bidder did not provide forms for

some equipment as per the requirements. Four key personnel did not meet similar work experience requirement and two of the four had no relevant experience on their proposed positions. Bidder did not meet specific requirements," reads the announcement by the PS.

Inyatsi Construction on the other hand, is said to have been rejected because it was not commercial and technically responsive.

Requirements

"Bidder altered, omitted and substituted conditions in the letter of bid and requirements which was a violation of the Instructions To Bidders (ITB). The bid had material deviation and reservations. Not all pages of the bid entries were signed or initialled by the person signing the bid as per the ITB," reads the announcement in part.

The PS further stated that the company submitted an incomplete bid in that it did not submit forma for contract price adjustment which it highlighted that it was applicable for its bid while it was a requirement as per the ITB.

"Bidder mentioned that the bid did not incorporate in the respective pay item in the Bill of Quantities, the production of working drawings as per the requirement in the Bid Technical Specification and it was none responsiveness to the bid and a deviation," further reads the announcement.

The PS added that the company failed to meet the requirement of specific experience for three similar projects within the last five years as required, instead she said Inyatsi submitted only one completed project.

An expert in the construction industry said the reasons for not considering the Inyatsi tender were not substantive that their bid would not be considered in full to the extent of evaluating the price.

A footnote in the PS statement stated that any bidder who wishes to ascertain the grounds, on which its bid was not selected, should request an explanation from the Executing Agency.

In any event, the bank reserves the right to review any complaint of a bidder at any time following the award, the statement read.

Meanwhile, a South Korean company, Chiel Engineering Company Ltd in Joint Venture with Dongsung Engineering Company Ltd have been awarded a tender to be supervising engineers for the above project. Their bid was the lowest of two others from companies from India and German at US Dollars 1.646 000. They scored 93.5 points, whilst the others scored 84.25 and 80.45 points respectively.


SANDILE'S PARTING SHOT TO FSRA:

THE outgoing Financial Services Regulatory Authority (FSRA) Chief Executive Officer Sandile 'Chief' Dlamini has bowed out in typical style, by instructing his former charges to revive the ill-fated probe into the Public Service Pension Fund (PSPF).

Speaking at his farewell function held at the Royal Villas yesterday, Dlamini left well-wishers in no doubt about his feelings about the task ahead for the staff he leaves behind at the authority, telling them that they would have failed in their duties if they did not reinstate the probe into PSPF that he was stopped from pursuing last year. Dlamini took the moment to remind the audience, which included Finance Minister Neal Rijkenberg, Central Bank Governor Majozi Sithole and Supreme Court Judge Senzangakhona Dlamini, that there was political inter-

ference that stopped

"This requires not only the strengthening of balance sheets but also the changes in behaviour and in the culture of the authority. You should aim for a fundamental shift in the overall mindset on how to meet the needs of our society," he said. Not only did Dlamini stun the audience with the tough talk of what should happen now that he has left the position of CEO, he went further to warn FSRA to make sure they kept a close eye on the PSPF and four other entities; SwaziMed, Eswatini National Provident Fund, the Eswatini Royal Insurance Corporation and the SACCOs.

Enough

As if that was not enough, Dlamini then made further startling remarks by alleging that the country's labour organisations were captured by 'clever execwatch jazz shows in Cape Town and football at the Soccer City. Taking to the podium to make his remarks, 'Chief', as he is popularly known, made it clear that he was in no mood for the niceties, stating that the event was and should not be about him, but should be about the work of the FSRA and what they had achieved in the 12 years of existence. He raised his concerns about the level of corruption in this country, warning that Emaswati were too nice and as a result were watching as the country was being destroyed by corruption. Dlamini retired from the FSRA at the end of November, and yesterday's event was meant to be a farewell function to celebrate the work that he has done for the authority since taking over the helm. Bukhosi Dlamini, who spoke on behalf of the FSRA staff said they had first-hand experience and appreciation of a great leader in Dlamini, stating that he had mixed feelings of formally bidding farewell to Dlamini.

Milestone

He, however acknowledged Dlamini's success in that taking over leadership of the FSRA 12 years ago marked a milestone for the authourity as he was second Liswati to take up the position. "His departure will not be felt by the authority alone but other stakeholders. We were lucky to have worked under the leadership of Dlamini and words may not be enough to express how much we are going to miss him," he said. Central Bank of Eswatini Governor Majozi Sithole said he worked a lot with Dlamini, stating that they will remember him for dedication and commitment in fostering the interest of all stakeholders in the non-bank financial services industry.

Describing the remarkable work done by 'Chief', the governor said Sandile took deliberate steps in transforming the non-banking services sector in a manner that ensures its resilience and stability against adverse effects which have previously engulfed the global economy. Meanwhile, Minister of Finance Neal Rijkenberg said the success of the financial service sector would depend on the consistent application of supervisory reforms that help to deal with changes in the financial services environment in order to create certainty and confidence in the financial system. Rijkenberg stated that the ministry of finance highly appreciated the technical support given to the authority by the IMF.

"I have been advised that a lot has been done in terms of reviewing the existing financial services laws in order to strengthen the regulatory and supervisory framework," he said. He further emphasised on the importance of cooperation from all stakeholders and that such amendments should not be viewed as an infringement, however as a collaborative effort towards enhancing the resilience of our financial system. "Even while the economy is facing tough times, we still believe that living standards can still rise as government remains committed to its National Development Strategy Goal of ensuring that Eswatini is in the top 10 per cent of the medium human development group countries on sustainable economic development," he said. Furthermore, the minister said they were encouraging the better implementation of good corporate governance by the leadership of financial institutions and in a manner that prioritised accountability and better-decision making. On the same note, Rijkenberg congratulated Dlamini for leaving a legacy that was defined by the level of achievements the non-bank financial services sector had attained to date. "We will miss you in all the endeavours you so dearly held to your heart as a committed citizen and bearer of the ministry's vision," he said.

'I fought against corruption at all costs'

SANDILE Dlamini stated that he played his part in fighting against corruption while at FSRA, saying it was easy to deal with corruption.

He said ever since the establish-

ment of the authority back in 2006, he had never hired staff members on his own, however they used the recruitment agency, KPMG to recruit staff. "Corruption is a major bottleneck to achieving the Sustainable

Development Goals (SDG) and a global concern. People often feel that they are at the mercy of corruption and think that it is just a 'way of life'.

"However, every society, sector and citizen can take action and benefit from getting united against corruption. Leaders should play a huge role in strengthening accountability and developing innovative solutions to prevent and curb corruption," he said.

Emphasising on Dlamini's loyalty as a leader, Central Bank of Eswatini (CBE) Governor Majozi Sithole described Dlamini as someone who could not stop talking about corruption and further stating that a lot had happened while working with Dlamini.

He said they had guided each other in coming up with working strategies.

HOME AFFAIRS CONDEMNS BANGLADESHI KILLING

THE ministry of home affairs has strongly condemned the weekend Asian gang war, which resulted in the murder of Yusuf Miah.

Following reports that some Bangladeshi nationals have been involved in a gang war, where one of them was killed, the ministry has made it clear that this was not acceptable because these nationals were breaking the laws of the kingdom.

The ministry's Communications Officer, Mlandvo Dlamini said as a ministry they were the ones responsible.

sible for the granting of citizenship to deserving individuals after some thorough processes had been followed.

He said it was disappointing to learn that there were some foreigners who came all the way from their own countries to be involved in such behaviours.

Wars

However, Dlamini mentioned that so far there had been no formal reports that they received as a ministry.

He said the wars that involved Bangladeshi nationals and other violent incidents that have happened involving Asian nationals need the

attention of the police.

Dlamini said as a ministry, they tried

by all means not to grant citizenships to undeserving people. He said before granting permits and other paperwork to foreign nationals, they first considered the safety of the nation.

"We are very disappointed to realise that some nationals are not following laws of the country. This is not acceptable at all, and there is no country in the world that takes it lightly when its immigration laws are violated," Dlamini added.

He went on to say that every foreign nationals including locals were expected to obey the laws laid down by the country's Constitution, and it was a punishable offence to violate any of these laws.

Offenders will be deported - Ministry

THE ministry of home affairs has come out clear to state that all those Asians tobe found guilty of the gang wars will be deported back to their home countries.

This was revealed by the ministry's Communications Officer Mlandvo Dlamini. He said the country would not tolerate such behaviour and offenders will be shown the door. Dlamini said it was not what the country expected from foreigners, more especially if they were here for businesses.

He said there was no way businesses could prosper if the was violence. He said peace and security were put at stake due to such acts. "As a ministry, what we can say is that if there is someone who is found guilty, that person will be deported back to their home countries," he said.

However, Dlamini said it would be hard to easily deport them because of the current financial woes the country was facing. On another note, Dlamini said the ministry would continue to make sure that people from other countries were screened to determine if they deserved to be granted citizenships.

TROUBLED COP COMMITS SUICIDE AT POLICE CAMP

AFTER battling with personal prob-Tems, a Manzini-based police officer ended up committing suicide the police camp.

Sandile 'Nyosi' Dlamini of Mhlatane in Mankayane was found by his superiors reeling in pain while in his house at Zakhele Police Camp yesterday morning after supposedly ingesting lethal pills. He is said to have been rushed to the Raleigh Fitkin Memorial (RFM) Hospital, where he died while undergoing treatment. Information gathered from those close to Dlamini claimed that he had been under a lot of stress lately. Signs of this are said

to have been evident in his conduct, both in and outside the work environment. Nyosi, as he was widely known by those close to him, was employed under the traffic department. For some time, Dlamini is said to have frequently absconded work and would be seen around Manzini in a drunken stupor.

Although it was obvious that he had problems, most of his colleagues said they were not sure of what exactly was troubling him because he never opened up to them. A day before the incident, sources said he was seen around Manzini drinking like a fish, a thing that he was lately fond of doing presumably in an effort to drown his sorrows.

This behaviour is said to have been the deceased's new norm, as he would sometimes not report for work, but would be seen imbibing. "It seemed like he had given up on life. He would miss work and would only seem better when drinking alcohol," a source who was close to Dlamini said, as he remembered his colleague's rash behaviour. Sources further claimed that yesterday morning, Dlamini was supposed to report for duty but he did not show up. Worried, his superiors from the Manzini Police Station are said to have gone to check up on him and upon seeing his car parked outside his quarters, Dlamini's bosses reportedly had hopes that they would find him home.

Indeed, they found the outside door unlocked and he was there, only that he was not in good health, as he was heard groaning from his bedroom.

The superiors are said to have found him on the floor and they rushed him to hospital, where he puked several times before he became unconscious.

When sought for comment, Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Superintendent Phindile Vilakati confirmed the death of the police officer. However, she said she could not divulge much about the matter as investigations on what exactly caused his death were underway. "We still haven't informed his family, so I cannot say anything more for now," she said.

STD. 5 RESULTS TO BE RELEASED AFTER XMAS

RESULTS for the Eswatini Primary Certificate (EPC) candidates might be released after the Christmas holidays, it has been gathered.

This was disclosed by the Exams Council of Eswatini Registrar Dr. Edmund Mazibuko in an interview with Eswatini Observer yesterday.

Candidates who sat for the examinations should hold their breath for now, according to Mazibuko as the final lap of marking for the Grade VII scripts had not yet been completed. The registrar hinted that the marking was still ongoing, although a small part of the scripts was expected to be marked yesterday by the last group of markers. Mazibuko did, however confirm that they had long finished marking the Form Five scripts and said they normally started marking these before they could move on to the EPC papers.

The registrar could not confirm when the results would be released, but assured that people can expect Form Five results to be released next year as done in previous years.

Judging from the time that they have finished the marking process, this indicates that the JC results will be out by the end of December 2019, the registrar noted.

Passports crisis: Home Affairs can't keep up with demand

THOUSANDS of Emaswati intending to travel outside of the country might need to look for alternative places of interest in the country as the ministry of home affairs is unable to keep up with the demands for travelling documents.

Since two weeks ago when the ministry announced that travelling documents of all sizes were available, throngs of Emaswati rushed and applied for them, only to be disappointed. Due to the high number of people applying for this precious and vital document, more specially around this time of the year there has been an obvious delay of their issuing. Normally, the application process for a travelling document is from one day to five working days. However, due to the high

demand the process takes up to two weeks. Yesterday, throngs of Emaswati had their patience tested while waiting for their passports to be issued at home affairs offices in Mbabane. Some of the people who were at the offices mentioned that they had applied for travelling documents about a week ago but they had not received them. The furious members of the public were throwing unpalatable words to staffers at the ministry, who tried their best to explain why their passports had not been issued within a week. The ministry's offices were fully packed as some of the services were carried outside to ease the congestion. Some of the officers were outside issuing the readily available travelling documents. The officers were even bold enough to tell members of the public that they were not going to obtain travelling document the same day. "If you applied today just go home and come back maybe next

week Monday," said the officers. Some of the applicants expressed their disappointment, as some of them mentioned that they came from as far as Siteki with the hope of getting their travelling documents on the same day. One the applicant, Reginah Mngometulu from Lubulini said she applied at Matata but opted to fetch the passport from Mbabane. However, she was disappointed after finding the queues and discovering that there are people who had waited much longer than her. Meanwhile, Ministry of Home Affairs Communications Officer Mlandvo Dlamini pleaded with the public to exercise patience. Dlamini said the ministry was doing everything it could to ensure that every Liswati was issued with a travelling document. He added that people should not panic as they will not have to cancel any plans as the ministry had come up with alternative ways to beat the backlog.

Staff working on weekends to address backlog

THE ministry's mouthpiece Mlandvo Dlamini has said employees were working extra hours to attend to the thousands of passport applications.

"Our workers after close of business remain behind to ensure that they speed up the application process," he said.

He said over the weekend, some of the officers were processing the applications. Worth noting, Dlamini said the reason there was a backlog was after the announcement of the availability of travelling doc-

uments where people came out in their members.

He explained that the applications processed by at the headquarters were not only from Mbabane, but from the regional and subregion offices. He emphasised on the ministry's dedication to offer flawless services to the nation.

3 teenagers arrested for robbery, firearm

THREE teenagers yesterday appeared before the Magistrate's Court where they faced charges of robbery and being in possession of a firearm and live rounds of ammunition.

The accused persons, who are all aged 19 years, are namely; Ntokozo Magagula, Mancoba Sibandze and Thandokuhle Shongwe. They were arrested in Siteki after they allegedly committed a robbery at KaMartin area, near Lonhlupheko.

The accused persons were said to have acted jointly and robbed Celiwe Simelane of her items valued at E2 600. They are said

to have brandished a pistol and threatened to shoot at the complainant if she resisted to the taking of the items.

On the second count, the accused persons are charged for contravening Section 11 of the Arms and Ammunition Act 24 of 1964.

They were said to have possessed a 9mm pistol while not being holders of a valid permit. The accused persons face a similar charge on the last count, in that they possessed four live rounds of ammunition without being holders of a permit.

During their appearance before
Acting Magistrate Cebsile
Ngwenya, each of the accused
persons elected to conduct their
own defence after they were
informed of their right to legal

representation. They were remanded into custody and ordered to return to court on December 27 pending the setting of a date of trial. Meanwhile, in the same court, Mittimbane Morries Maziya (40) of Maphungwane faced a charge of attempted murder. This was after he allegedly stabbed a woman with a knife several times in the body, inflicting her with serious injuries. The woman, Futhi Maziya was admitted to the Good Shepherd Hospital after the incident. An application for bail filed by the accused was opposed by the Crown. He was advised to file his application at the High Court. In the meantime, the matter was postponed and ordered to return to court tomor-



THE MTN Mobile Money short-term loan product is ready to be launched for the benefit of the entire Mobile Money base of about 670 000 people this week.

The product was piloted in June this year with selected users, and was started with a revolving fund of E3 million which has grown by about 726 per cent.

As of last week, the MoMo loan pool was sitting at E21.8 million. The pilot of this product started with a revolving fund of E3 million and has registered massive growth as the fund now stands at E21.8 million in barely six months.

MTN Corporate Affairs Manager Mandla Luphondvo confirmed that Mobile Money loans were now ready for the market which meaning every active Mobile Money user should be able to access a short-term loan linked to their use of the platform.

"The most exciting aspect is that from the pilot of this product, over 50 per cent of our

valued MTN MoMo customers voluntarily pay back the money advanced of the agreed timeline," he said.

Luphondvo further said this was important because customers would be eligible to come back for another short-term loan when they need it.

One of the primary objectives of MTN Mobile Money is to improve financial inclusion by making it possible for people from all walks of

life, to have access to a payment system. The issuance of MoMo loans is the latest addition of many MTN MoMo products.

Mobile Money loan allows customers to have access to short-term finance of not more than E200. Through this finance, customers can meet personal emergencies like fuel shortage, buying electricity units, for instance.

Currently, there are over 20 services which may be settled through the Mobile Money platform without making withdrawals.

MTN MoMo loans have shown a great potential to grow. About two

months after the start of the pilot, over E2.5 million had been issued in loans while 84 per cent of the loans issued were repaid. By the first week of September, about 100 000 loans with a total value of E8.2 million had been issued. Luphondvo further encouraged MTN MoMo customers to exercise caution as the festive season has begun. "While MTN MoMo is safe, our valued customers are advised not to share their PIN with anyone. We also discourage our customers from sending money to strangers, with the hope of securing a job, or any other kind of favour," he concluded.

Girl (19) stabs man for calling her a prostitute

A 19-year-old girl stabbed a 33-year-old man for calling her a prostitute.

Setsabile Stewart of Mabovini in Mankayane appeared before Senior Magistrate Sindisiwe Zwane yesterday charged with assault with intent to cause bodily harm.

This followed that the teenager stabbed one Sicelo Nkambule twice in the chest and once on the arm. The incident happened at Dondelani Bar in Mankayane.

When narrating the events that led to his injury, Nkambule told the court that he was enjoying some alcoholic beverages with his two friends at the bar when he and Setsable started arguing.

Degrading

When the argument got heated, Nkambule told the court that he ended up accusing Setsabile of selling her body to men. After uttering the degrading statement, Nkambule and his friends are said to have decided to leave the drinking place.

However, while Nkambule and his friends walked away from Setsabile and company, the teen girl is said to have grabbed a knife from her brother and stabbed Nkambule in the chest and arm and left him for dead. The bartender is said to have rescued Nkambule by ferrying him to Mankayane Government Hospital, where he was admitted overnight.


The 33-year-old man told the court that as a result of the injury on his arm, he is no longer able to carry heavy things, and he was still on medication.

Even so, Nkambule admitted that he provoked the teenage girl by labelling her a prosting

Meanwhile, when mitigating for a lenient sentence, Setsabile appealed to the court to consider that Nkambule instigated the offence by provoking her.

She also mentioned that she had a one-yearold child who depended on her. "I regret what I did. I'm also a high school dropout," she

She was sentenced to three years imprisonment with an option of E5 000 fine.



Eswatini's Judiciary lacks independence - SALC report

THE Judiciary of the country has come under scrutiny once again for its alleged lack of independence.

The report from Southern African Litigation Centre (SALC) further states that this dates back to 2017, where the Human Rights Committee expressed its concern about reports of political interference in the Judiciary by the Executive arm of government.

The committee recommends that Eswatini takes measures such as implementing specific constitutional guarantees to protect judges and prosecutors from any form of political interference or pressure.

The first issue cited is the way

judges are appointed in the country. The report states that they act to please a certain body not the law.

It further states that the system of allocating of cases has also undermined the Judiciary dependence in a context where the practice is for the Chief Justice to take full control of the process, eroding the powers of the registrar known to be responsible for case allocation.

The lack of judicial independence as perceived by the public resulted in low levels of public confidence in the judicial system.

It is submitted that this situation erodes the functions of the judiciary as seen by the wider public as an effective or accessible instrument to obtain justice and reinforces the notion that the court is incapable of enforcing the Constitution and the law, added the report.

Eswatini subscribes to dual legal system - report

ESWATINI has been under scrutiny for the use of dual law.

The Southern African Litigation Centre Report on Human Right of Eswatini states that the country subscribes to a dual legal system, where customary norms exist alongside positive law.

Part of the report states that the customary norms have been used to explain disregard for human rights standards under the banner that certain Siswati customs do not correlate with enforceable human rights standards.

The report further states that this assertion has been used by government to avoid legislative action needed to align domestic laws with recommendations made by human rights monitoring mechanisms.

For instance Section 252(2) of the Constitution states that, 'Subject to the provisions of the Constitution, the principles of Siswati customary law are hereby recognised, adopted and shall be applied and enforced as part of the law of

Eswatini.'

However, section 252(3) states that "The provisions of subsection (2) do not apply in respect of any custom that is to the extent that it is, inconsistent with a provision of the Constitution or a statute, or repugnant to natural justice or morality or general principles of humanity."

The report outlines that these two provisions represent the clash between the rights enshrined in the Constitution and customary laws.

The Constitution is reiterated as the supreme law of Eswatini in Section 252(3) and thus appears to overrule customary law and custom where that law is repugnant to the rights in the Constitution.

However, traditional law and custom can be perceived by the common law courts as operating outside of their jurisdiction and there is still some doubt about whether traditional matters can be successfully challenged in the common law courts, the report states.

LAW WILL TAKE ITS COURSE ON E150 000 FRAUDSTERS-METROPOLITAN CHURCH

THE Board of Directors of Metropolitan Evangelical Church International have vowed that the law will take its course on those involved in the E150 000 embezzled funds.

This was disclosed by the board during the church's extra-ordinary general meeting held at Ekhwezi Mission on Saturday.

Chairman of the Board Mhlonipheni Khumalo said the issue of the money had been a thorny issue and needs to be dealt with.

The E150 000 was lost through unclear payments that were made to some individuals which the current Board of directors claims is not aware of.

Khumalo said in the history of the church, there had never been any pastor or any individual who had helped themselves with the church's funds. He stated that there was no way the Board can fold arms and watch the church's money being misused by individuals.

"Even the founder of the church, Mkhulu Kaiser Fakudze once mentioned that he has never taken the church's money illegally and it is surprising how someone is able to sign out cheques to individuals, whose services rendered are not known to the church," Khumalo said.

He did, however mention that the church had corrective measures for wrong-doers and that only applies if that person is willing to cooperate with

them so that he can be corrected without involving the law. He said if that person was not cooperative, then the law will take its course.

"The church has some structures put in place to help those who find themselves on the wrong side of the law and it all depends on how cooperative that person is," he said.

Adding, Khumalo urged the Metropolitan Church to guard against all sorts of evil that sought to divide the church. He said it was painful to see a big church like the Metropolitan going through such a feud. He mentioned that for the church to continue growing from strength to strength there needed to be more prayers to seek

God's guidance in everything.

"It is true that the church is going through such a situation, but we hope this will be soon over and as a church, we pray that God gives us the strength and guidance we need," he added.

On another note, Khumalo clearly stated that as the substantive Board of directors they were not after firing pastors as it was understood by some members of the church, but they were there to oversee the operations of the church as per the church's manifesto.

He said there was no way they could fire pastors willy-nilly as it had been suggested. Khumalo said as a board they were there to make sure there was peace, stability and unity in the church.

'Holy thief' steals Bible, gets bail fixed at E7 000

A man in serious need of divine intervention was arrested for stealing a Siswati version of the holy Bible, amongst other items from a car at LaMgabhi over the past weekend.

Zakhele Mamba (30) of Buka area has since been granted bail fixed at E7 000, after breaking into the car and stole over E15 000 worth of valuables belonging to Sipho Magagula. The accused person is said to have committed the offence

on October 27, 2019 at LaMgabhi, where he is said to have broken into Magagula's Honda Civic sedan and stole the items and according to the charge sheet, he was charged for contravening the Theft of Motor Vehicle Act. Amongst Magagula's valuables, he is said to have also stolen a Willard car battery valued at E1 150, a spare wheel valued at E450, Duplo ink and master roll valued at E7 500 plus two books, including the Siswati

When making his appearance before court, Mamba was remanded back into

custody until December 24, 2019 pending his trial date set for March 6, 2020.

According to the Criminal Procedure and Evidence Act, (CPE) an accused person found to have stolen items, has his bail set at half the value of the total amount of items stolen.

Following his remand, Mamba filed an application for bail before Magistrate Sifiso Vilakati and his application was successful as he was granted bail fixed at E7 000. However, by the time this report was compiled yesterday afternoon, he had not paid the bail amount.

Khumalo defends video authenticity

MHLONIPHENI Khumalo, Board Chairperson of the Metropolitan Evangelical Church International, has defended the authenticity of the video footage where the church's founder Reverand Kaiser Fakudze was appointing Solomon Nhlengetfwa as his successor.

Bangladeshi national makes court appearance





He stated that the signing was about constructing the blocks towards that envisioned transformation. He further added that the signing of the MoU was one landmark partnership, in that it came at a time, where for the past few years,



"The new police station is in its final stages of construction, but due to unknown reasons, construction of the structure seems to have slowed down. "Initially, we all thought that the new station would become operational in late December 2019. However, that is no longer the case, hence we are looking at an early 2020 opening," added the source. When reached for comment, Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Superintendent Phindile Vilakati said the new Buhleni police station would be operational as from a date that is yet to be announced.

SA man arrested for dagga en route to inyanga

A South African national who had gone to consult a traditional healer at Mhlangatane was arrested for dagga possession.

France Dephani and his co-accused Kwanele Simelane were both arrested near Nyakatfo while travelling in a red Honda Civic yes-

Inside the aforementioned vehicle, police found 1.6 kilogrammes of dagga hidden under the passenger seat, resulting in the

Appearing at the Pigg's Peak Magistrate's Court yesterday, both Dephani and Simelane pleaded guilty to the charge of dagga possession. First to speak was Simelane, who said he had purchased the dagga to resell as he was unemployed.

"I am an unemployed father of four children. I make a living by making bricks and selling them around Mhlangatane. I had purchased the dagga to sell around my area during the festive season," he said.

Dephani, on the other hand said he was visiting Eswatini. "I came to Eswatini to see a traditional healer near Mhlangatane. I have a few personal and spiritual problems that need special attention. "I am not the owner of the dagga. I was the driver but I did not know that the car had dagga hidden under the passenger seat. I am a father of five children and I work in Mozambique," he said.

After hearing both submissions, Pigg's Peak Magistrate Sakhile Hlophe sentenced both individuals to one year each in a correctional facility or alternatively, to pay a fine of E2000.

Man found closing car windows, arrested for DD

AN intoxicated Senzo Dlamini was fined E1 000 after he was arrested while closing car windows seated in the driver's seat of a parked vehicle.

Dlamini was arrested at Buhleni on Sunday evening.

At the time of the arrest, police found Dlamini seated inside a parked Toyota sedan, closing the driver's side windows.

The police then proceeded to arrest Dlamini, who was found to have a blood content of 1.06ml of alcohol for every 1000 ml of blood a breathalyser reading, which is way above the legal limit.

After the arrest Dlamini appeared in the Pigg's Peak Magistrate's Court, where he tried to mitigate

after his arrest. "I was arrested for helping the driver of the car. What happened was the driver of the Toyota, who is my friend had parked the car on the road side for an unknown reason. I was very intoxicated while in the passenger seat and I ended up sleeping. I awoke to find the driver gone, but his window was open so I climbed out of the passenger seat and into the driver's seat where I started to close the open window. During this time, the Buhleni police came and arrested me as the driver of the car but that is not true," he said. Dlamini added that at the time of his arrest, he explained his situation to the police who just ignored him." I tried to speak to the police but they

Asian man assaulted for impregnating brother's wife leaves Pigg's Peak

THE Pakistani businessman who was heavily assaulted by his relatives for impregnating his elder brother's wife has relocated from Pigg's Peak.

The assault victim Muri Patel was assaulted by his elder brother Ali Patel and two others at Glen Township on November 3rd.

According to well-placed sources, both siblings lived and worked together in Johannesburg, South Africa since 2012.

However, in early 2018 when elder brother Ali visited Pakistan for two months, he returned to find that his Asian wife had been impregnated by his younger brother and business partner Muri.

The pregnancy led to the birth of a son, however after the birth Muri then fled South Africa and settled in Pigg's Peak, where he worked with his fellow countrymen in a grocery shop.

During this time, the angry Ali located his brother in Pigg's Peak and assaulted him for not paying child support.

After the assault, Ali was arrested by Pigg's Peak police and fined E2000 by Senior Pigg's Peak Magistrate Siphosini Dlamini on November 4.

Speaking to this publication yesterday, police said the whole scandal led to Muri relocating back to South Africa.

"Following events of those months, we are very sad to report that Muri left Pigg's Peak Town two weeks ago .We had asked his flat mates and business partners about his location, as we wanted to follow up on his case but they said he had since relocated to another place that they don't know. All we can say is we hope he is safe as he and

his brother have a troubled past," they said.

The police added that the siblings had deep hate for each other following the incident.

"The elder brother, Ali who committed that assault subjected all his three children to DNA tests because he believed his younger brother may have fathered another child with his wife. Also, the assaulted brother Muri reported the assault to his relatives in Pakistan. All we as police can say now is this relationship between these two brothers seems destroyed," they added.


Dlamini claimed he was treated badly by the supermarket manager when he laid the complaint.

Dlamini said he was disappointed about the way they handled the matter.

The customer said he was worried not only for himself but the nation at large. He said this was

because the residue could have contained harmful substances.

Fearing for his life because he had already eaten part of it, and the treatment he received from the store, he reported the matter to Mbabane Municipality soon after living the store.

He further went to the hospital where he alleged they discovered a bug in his system which was supposedly caused by the residue.

At the time of the report he was awaiting his refund from the food outlet for the E700 hospital bill he had claimed after being attended

to by doctors.

Mbabane Municipal Council Assistant Information Public Relations Officer Siphesihle Nkwanyana confirmed that the matter was reported at the municipality.

She said when they took the sandwich for laboratory tests, it was discovered that it was indeed rot-

The lab tests discovered that the food was prepared in a dirty frying pan, or in oil that had been used several times and over burnt.

Nkwanyana said this does not make the practice right meaning using oils over and over may cause food poisoning even when it had not yet expired.

"It is unhygienic and unhealthy for public consumption," she said.

She added that after receiving the news health inspectors sprang into action and went to the shop the same day the issue was reported.

She said they condemned the health practice by the store. They admitted that it was their fault.

Nkwanyana added that inspections of food outlets are conducted on monthly basis depending on the category of the food premises.

She further stated non-comply-

City Council cautions consumers

MEMBERS of the public are cautioned to be on the lookout for any defects on food items and carefully consider the following details before buying food, according to Nkwanyana.

She urged the public not to buy food that has lapsed its expiry date, and with tampered seals. "Do not buy unlabelled foods, rusted or leaking food cans as well as those that are dented, bulged or blown food cans," she said.

Nkwanyane said people must ensure that the person serving the food is clean, in full light coloured overalls (protective clothing) with head covered to prevent hair from dropping into food.

She stated that if people are not sure about the safety of a food product then they should not buy it.

The public is further encouraged to look for grading cards displayed before making a purchase.

She said food outlets Graded A and B were safe to buy from, whereas C means be cautious and D poses a risk to the pub-

ing food premises are served with notices to rectify the short comings. In cases where expired or unsafe food is found in shops, the food is seized and disposed at the landfill. Nkwanyana has reminded residents and the general public to stay away from unsafe food substances this festive season.

Disabled man injured by cops after assaulting rival

A man with a disability on his left arm is alleged to have been injured by police officers on Friday.

Relating his traumatic experience to the court, Zwelithini Thomo explained that he had a long-standing feud with Bheki Maseko, who worked as a shopkeeper at Nkhaba.

"My feud with Maseko has been long-standing since last year and he even told me I should never set foot anywhere near his shop. That day, I decided to confront him and our argument got heated," Thomo

He informed the court that Maseko's colleague called the police, who asked them to sort out their differences but opted to ask for a protection order against Maseko.

Forced

Thomo stated that the police officers then turned against him after he had called his brothers for help, and forced him into a police van. "I did not understand why they were now taking me into custody, as we had agreed that Maseko and I needed to sort out our differences. I have a disability on my left arm yet the police forcefully held me by the arm forcing me into the van and I got injured in the process and as I speak, I have not received medical

attention since my arrest on Friday," he added.

Thomo was arrested and charged with assault common, in that he was said to have threatened to hack Maseko with a bush knife. He was also said to have resisted arrest by police officers

Rights

Upon hearing this, Magistrate Sifiso Vilakati reminded police officers that Thomo still had rights even though he was a suspect.

"Officers, why has Thomo still not received medical attention since his arrest? Yes, he is a suspect but he has rights. What if something were to happen to him behind bars, or if his injuries were fatal? The

court cannot stand by and watch a man's rights being abused in such a manner," the judicial officer warned.

The police officer who brought Thomo to court responded by stating that the arresting officer was not present in court, as he was attending Incwala Ceremony.

After finding him guilty as per his own plea, the court warned Thomo to avoid confrontation with Maseko. The court sentenced Thomo to serve five months in prison, with the option to pay a fine of E500 on both counts.

His sentence was wholly suspended for a period of one year after Thomo explained that he was unemployed and survives through his sister's disability grant.

Suspect rapist beaten up by mob during citizen arrest

RESIDENTS of Siteki on Sunday apprehended a man suspected to be responsible for a string of rape

For the past weeks, residents have been flocking to the police station to report rape incidents which were said to have happened in different parts of the town.

Information gathered was that the complainants would give a similar description of the suspect whose mondus operandi was to threaten his victims with a knife, ordering intention to rape her. them to comply with his demands. The rape incidents have been the talk of the town over the past week.

One of the victims who related her experience to this reporter said she was mugged by the suspect while on her way home from work but was lucky to slip lose from the grip of the man after screaming for help just after 17:00 hours.

The suspect is said to have tried his luck on another victim on Sunday, as he attacked a woman who was on her way from church. The man is said to have attempted to drag the woman into a nearby bush with the

According to sources who witnessed the subsequent assault of the man, the victim's spouse responded promptly to her screams. The suspect was seen dashing away from the scene, prompting more residents to pursue him.

The mob of residents who were armed with sticks and other weapons eventually caught up with the suspect rapist near the Central Transport Administration (CTA) offices. The residents beat the suspect and made him confess to his shenanigans. He is said to have confessed to have attempted to rob the woman, and

not to raping her.

When reached for comment, Chief Police Information Communications Officer Phindile Vilakati confirmed the arrest of a suspect rapist.

"It's true, a 39-year-old man was arrested in connection with a series of rape cases which have been taking place around Siteki," she said. Vilakati said so far, the man has been linked to five cases of rape.

She lauded community members for assisting the police in the arrest of the man who has been in the list of most wanted criminals. The suspect is expected to make his remand appearance before the Magistrate's



MHATTHE LAW SAYS

REFUGEES ACT 2017

ARTICLE 2

1. Member States of the OAU shall use their best endeavours consistent with their respective legislations to receive refugees and to secure the settlement of those refugees who, for well-founded reasons, are unable or unwilling to return to their country of origin or nationality.

2. The grant of asylum to refugees is a peaceful and humanitarian act and shall not be regarded as an unfriendly act by any Member State.

3. No person shall be subjected by a Member State to measures such as rejection at the frontier, return or expulsion, which would compel him to return to or remain in a territory where his life, physical integrity or liberty would be threatened for the reasons set out in Article 1, paragraphs 1 and 2.

4. Where a Member State finds difficulty in continuing to grant asylum to refugees, such Member State may appeal directly to other Member States and through the OAU, and such other Member States shall in the spirit of African solidarity and international cooperation take appropriate measures to lighten the burden of the Member State granting asylum.

5. Where a refugee has not received the right to reside in any country of asylum, he may be granted temporary residence in any country of asylum in which he first presented himself as a refugee pending arrangement for his resettlement in accordance with the preceding paragraph.

6. For reasons of security, countries of asylum shall, as far as possible, settle refugees at a reasonable distance from the frontier of their country of origin.

ARTICLE 3

Prohibition of Subversive Activities

1. Every refugee has duties to the country in which he finds himself, which require in particular that he conforms with its laws and regulations as well as with measures taken for the maintenance of public order. He shall also abstain from any subversive activities against any Member State of the OAU.

2. Signatory States undertake to prohibit refugees residing in their respective territories from attacking any State Member of the OAU, by any activity likely to cause tension between Member States, and in particular by use of arms, through the press, or by radio.

ARTICLE 4

Non-Discrimination

Member States undertake to apply the provisions of this Convention to all refugees without discrimination as to race, religion, nationality, membership of a particular social group or political opinions.

ASYLUM

Utsini umtsetfo -

ARTICLE 5

Voluntary Repatriation

1. The essentially voluntary character of repatriation shall be respected in all cases and no refugee shall be repatriated against his will.

2. The country of asylum, in collaboration with the country of origin, shall make adequate arrangements for the safe return of refugees who request repatriation.

3. The country of origin, on receiving back refugees, shall facilitate their resettlement and grant them the full rights and privileges of nationals of the country, and subject them to the same obligations.

4. Refugees who voluntarily return to their country shall in no way be penalized for having left it for any of the reasons giving rise to refugee situations.

Whenever necessary, an appeal shall be made through national information media and through the Administrative Secretary-General of the OAU, inviting refugees to return home and giving assurance that the new circumstances prevailing in their country of origin will enable them to return without risk and to take up a normal and peaceful life without fear of being disturbed or punished, and that the text of such appeal should be given to refugees and clearly explained to them by their country of asylum.

5. Refugees who freely decide to return to their homeland, as a result of such assurances or on their own initiative, shall be given every possible assistance by the country of asylum, the country of origin, voluntary agencies and international and intergovernmental organizations, to facilitate their return.

ARTICLE 6 Travel Documents

1. Subject to Article III, Member States shall issue to refugees lawfully staying in their territories travel documents in accordance with the United Nations Convention relating to the Status of Refugees and the Schedule and Annex thereto, for the purpose of travel outside their territory, unless compelling reasons of national security or public order otherwise require. Member States may issue such a travel document to any other refugee in their territory.

2. Where an African country of second asylum accepts a refugee from a country of first asylum, the country of first asylum may be dispensed from issuing a document with a return clause.

3. Travel documents issued to refugees under previous international agreements by States Parties thereto shall be recognized and treated by Member States in the same way as if they had been issued to refugees pursuant to this Article.

ARTICLE 7

Co-operation of the National Authorities with the Organization of African Unity

In order to enable the Administrative Secretary-General of the Organization of African Unity to make reports to the competent organs of the Organization of African Unity, Member States undertake to provide the Secretariat in the appropriate form with information and statistical data requested concerning:

(a) the condition of refugees;

(b) the implementation of this Convention, and

(c) laws, regulations and decrees which are, or may hereafter be, in force relating to refugees.

ARTICLE 8

Cooperation with the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees

1. Member States shall co-operate with the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees.

2. The present Convention shall be the effective regional complement in Africa of the 1951 United Nations Convention on the Status of Refugees.

ARTICLE 9

Settlement of Disputes

Any dispute between States signatories to this Convention relating to its interpretation or application, which cannot be settled by other means, shall be referred to the Commission

for Mediation, Conciliation and Arbitration of the Organization of African Unity, at the request of any one of the Parties to the dispute.

ARTICLE 10

Signature and Ratification

1. This Convention is open for signature and accession by all Member States of the Organization of African Unity and shall be ratified by signatory States in accordance with their respective constitutional processes. The instruments of ratification shall be deposited with the Administrative Secretary-General of the Organization of African Unity.

2. The original instrument, done if possible in African languages, and in English and French, all texts being equally authentic, shall be deposited with the Administrative Secretary-General of the Organization of African Unity.

3. Any independent African State, Member of the Organization of African Unity, may at any time notify the Administrative Secretary-General of the Organization of African Unity of its accession to this Convention.

ARTICLE 11

Entry into force

This Convention shall come into force upon deposit of instruments of ratification by one third of the Member States of the Organization of African Unity.

ARTICLE 12

Amendment

This Convention may be amended or revised if any member State makes a written request to the Administrative Secretary-General to that effect, provided however that the proposed amendment shall not be submitted to the Assembly of Heads of State and Government for consideration until all Member States have been duly notified of it and a period of one year has elapsed. Such an amendment shall not be effective unless approved by at least two thirds of the Member States Parties to the present Convention.

ARTICLE 13

Denunciation

1. Any Member State Party to this Convention may denounce its provisions by a written notification to the Administrative Secretary-General.

2. At the end of one year from the date of such notification, if not withdrawn, the Convention shall cease to apply with respect to the denouncing State.

ARTICLE 14

Upon entry into force of this Convention, the Administrative Secretary-General of the OAU shall register it with the Secretary-General of the United Nations, in accordance with Article 102 of the Charter of the United Nations.

ARTICLE 15

Notifications by the Administrative Secretary-General of the Organization of African Unity

The Administrative Secretary-General of the Organization of African Unity shall inform all Members of the Organization: (a) of signatures, ratifications and accessions in accordance with Article X; (b) of entry into force, in accordance with Article XI; (c) of requests for amendments submitted under the terms of Article XII; (d) of denunciations, in accordance with Article XIII.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF WE, the Heads of African State and Government, have signed

this Convention.

MOST OF THE WORLD'S PROBLEMS ARE DOWN TO 'OLD MEN NOT **GETTING OUT OF THE WAY - OBAMA**

FORMER President Barack Obama has said a lot of the world's problems come from leaders not knowing when it's time to step down, suggesting there are a lot of 'old men, not getting out of the way.'

The former commander-in-chief made the comment during a private event on leadership in Singapore, the BBC reported, during which he also discussed the benefits of women being in positions of power.

"Now women, I just want you to know; you are not perfect, but what I can say pretty indisputably is that you're better than us men," Obama said, according to the BBC.

"I'm absolutely confident that for two years if every nation on earth was run by women, you would see a significant improvement across the board on just about everything...living standards and out-

comes." He added that: "If you look at the world and look at the problems it's usually old people, usually old men, not getting out of the way. It is important for political leaders to try and remind themselves that you are there to do a job, but you are not there for life, you are not there in order to prop up your own sense of self importance or your own power."

It is not the first time that Obama has said there should be more women leaders, with a recently released book detailing the relationship between Obama and his former vice president, Joe Biden suggesting that Obama was keen to pass the baton along to a woman.

"Joe, despite his many virtues, was just another white guy, one in a long line of American presidents-hardly the symbol of the tectonic change that Obama hoped would mark his place in the history books," wrote Steven Levingston in the book Barack and Joe:



The Making of an Extraordinary Partnership, instead observing that Obama had hoped his successor would be his colleague, former Secretary of State Hillary Clinton. "Barack had placed his bet on Hillary, the one he believed would confirm his revolutionary stamp on American's political culture—the first black president passing the baton to the first woman president," the book added.

Despite Obama maintaining what

appeared to be a close relationship with Biden throughout his time as president and beyond, he has refused to endorse Biden's bid on several occasions. However, most recently, Biden has suggested that he would prefer Obama not to endorse him in order to maintain a level playing field in the Democratic race.



The cheque handover took place at the Hilton Garden Inn yesterday morning.

Initially the entrepreneurs were 15 in total but after the training, only 10 were eligible for the

Making his remarks, FNB CEO Dennis Mbingo said they had very broad levels of participation and engagement from the nation.

"Starting with the hundreds of qualifying conversations that ended up being well over a thousand, to the different targeted engagement sessions to filter individuals who were ready, to the deep bench we had of judges, and right to the basic technology deployed to engage candidates, this process has been exemplary in its quality and seriousness of intent," he said.

MINISTER of Finance Neal Rijkenberg says the Financial Services Regulatory Authority (FSRA) in conjunction with the Central Bank of Eswatini (CBE) have made remarkable progress in the automation of the Eswatini Stock Exchange.

The minister was speaking during the farewell function of former FSRA Chief Executive Officer (CEO) Sandile Dlamini held at Royal Villas yesterday.

He said the Stock Exchange was an open platform for entities to raise the much-needed capital to boost their operations.

"The FSRA together with the CEB are key strategic agencies that help shape the future of the financial services industry landscape in the country," he said.

"I applaud Dlamini for his personal

As government, he said they were grateful for the milestones he had drive and attention to this task.

"The regulation and supervision of the financial sector has never been as crucial as the threat of another global financial crisis becoming imminent.

"It is no longer enough for regulators to play catch-up with the continuously evolving financial sector but to work tirelessly to anticipate and implement risk-based supervision measures that minimise exposure of our society to the worsening global financial environment," he said.

Rijkenberg further mentioned that considering where the industry was prior to 2007 when the office of the Registrar of Insurance and Retirement Funds was established, followed by the enactment of the FSRA Act in 2010, which now provides for the oversight of the entire non-bank financial services sector, the industry's reform journey was a story that articulated the ministry's mission statement of promoting macro-economic stability in Eswatin, formulating and implementing fiscal and financial policies that optimise economic growth.

On behalf of the ministry and government, Rijkenburg thanked Dlamini and the entire FSRA team for dedicating themselves to see the vision of government being accomplished.

The minister also appreciated the collaboration, support and participation of all stakeholders, especially the regulated entities and other supporting structures of government that continue to contribute towards the reform of the financial system in the country.

Achievement

He said another achievement that could be attributed to Dlamini's stewardship was the enforcement of the 30 per cent mandatory local investment regulation for insurers and retirement funds.

"First, the (Retirement Fund) RIRF office and later the FSRA office resolutely enforced that at least 30 per cent of all assets from insurance and retirement funds are invested within the kingdom to develop the local economy.

"The FSRA under Dlamini's leadership enforced the investment regulations and ensured that all

entities supervised by the FSRA compiled with the investment regulations," he said.


Simelane stated that the country was very fortunate to have Dlamini as CEO of the FSRA in that he laid a solid foundation in the regulation and supervision of the non-bank financial services sector. He further described Dlamini as some-

one who was never hesitant to throw the book at non-compliant entities.

"To him transgression is transgression, corrective measures must be applied irrespective of who the perpetrator is."

Moreover, the chairman said Dlamini sought to improve collaboration between FSRA and the CBE by signing a series of MOUs ranging from information sharing to provision of technical assistance to FSRA by CBE.

What a E100 note can buy Liswati

WITH the ever-increasing inflation rate and the recently announced public transport and bread fees hike, its seems a E100 note in Eswatini can now only get the citizen breakfast.

The Eswatini Observer took onto one of the popular supermarkets in the capital city and shopped a regular breakfast, inclusive of a half dozen of eggs, bread, milk, teabags, cooking oil, margarine, slices of cheese and a copy of the Eswatini Observer.

The 12 slices of cheese cost E23.99, 1 litre Umcenge milk cost E13.99, 40 teabags costs E27.99, white bread costs E10.95, half a dozen eggs cost E14.99 and then a Sunday copy of the Eswatini Observer cost E7, and together these items costs E98.60, which can be rounded up to E100.

Interviewed inside the supermarket, one consumer Temalangeni Dlamini revealed that she had four



dependants, three of them being less on children and once grand-child and said times were only getting tougher for her, especially because her salary hadn't moved an inch since her lastborn (now 4 years) came to life.

"The issue of inflation is really one that is going to kill us. You journalists should be ready to write about suicides and all amongst us parents because just as you see, a E100 note can only just buy breakfast, now imagine some of us with four dependants looking at you to come back home and put food on the plate. ESWATINI HOSTS AETRADE GROUP REGIONAL OFFICES

While the Kingdom could not bring home the AfCFTA Bid, we managed to catch another big fish; the regional offices of the African Electronic Trade (AeTrade) Group. This after the Kingdom bid to host the southern African regional offices earlier in the year. Eswatini did not only win this bid; but also launched the project during an impressive event held at Mandvulo Grand Hall in October this year. The project was launched by His Majesty King Mswati III and was attended by representatives of various African Heads of State, diplomats and officials from regional economic communities such as the African Union Commission, COMESA, SADC and others.

The AeTrade Group will bring an estimated 4 000 jobs within the next four years; making it a major contributor to the country's socio-economic status. It is an enabler of the AfCFTA; and comes with direct and indirect benefits for the Kingdom of Eswatini through job creation and development of MSMEs in the Information Technology space.

OVER 7 000 JOBS CREATED FROM **FOREIGN DIRECT INVESTMENTS**

On the investment side, Eswatini made great strides to attract investments into the Kingdom. Through the Eswatini Investments Promotion Authority (EIPA), the ministry had a series of investment seminars that were all aimed at bringing investments into Eswatini. Among the countries that were successfully engaged were Germany, Taiwan, Mozambique, France and Mauritania.

Subsequent to these seminars, the Kingdom announced investments to the value of E1.3bn from Kellogg's and Johnsson Workwear, among other multinational companies. The two organisations will bring a combined 2 300 jobs. Other investments were from Care First, Taiwan Avocado. RME Bullion and AvaPharm. Air Liquide, a French company, and Clockwork Giant Clothing both announced expansions. These investments were over and above those launched by the minister earlier in the year, such as Kingsgate Clothing and EuroSwazi Investments in Buhleni as well as Casa De Vino wine plant in Matsapha.

Towards the end of the year, Eswatini also announced new investments from TRIOMF Fertiliser Company and Artemis Pharmaceuticals. Also, the Kingdom, through the relevant ministries, was able to sign Memorandums of Understanding with other potential investors in the area of energy, mining and aviation.

With all these investments and more in the pipeline, it is clear that indeed Eswatini Is Open for Business.

Mining sector wants to generate its own electricity

industry has called for the government to intervene urgently to enable greater private electricity generation for own use, as Eskom's power cuts have severely affected production.

Public Enterprises Minister Pravin Gordhan and Mineral Resources Minister Gwede Mantashe briefed the Cabinet on Friday to discuss proposals to stabilise the electricity supply.

Early last week, President Cyril Ramaphosa said Eskom had requested the government to consider some proposals such as self-generation and floating generators to alleviate pressure on the national grid. "They also proposed to help relieve the pressure on the system as a whole," Ramaphosa said.

Last week, the mining industry was forced to scale back production and suspend underground operations after Eskom ramped up load shedding from Stage four to Stage six, cutting 6?000MW of electricity from the national grid.

The power outages also contributed to the mining industry' 2.9?percent loss year-on-year in October as output fell for a third month in a row, throwing the sector's contribution to the economy further into a tailspin. The Minerals Council said the situation was desperate. The council demanded urgent action

JOHANNESBURG - The mining that we should look at self-generation by Mantashe to enable the rapid establishment of self-generation facilities to supplement Eskom's constrained capacity, and open the way for further generation by independent power producers. Minerals Council Chief Executive Roger Baxter said Stage six load shedding basically meant that mines were confined to "essential demand", as Stage six alone requires a 20?per cent demand curtailment. "The impact of Stage six and Stage four load shedding is devastating for the mining sector, as most mining companies will not only lose their week's production, but that this affects the viability of many of these mines," Baxter said. Bringing an end to SA's power struggle CAPE TOWN - South Africa

remains one of the best mining jurisdictions in the world with more than \$2.5 trillion (R36.2 trillion) mineral wealth still in situ.

This is according to Mineral Resources and Energy Minister Gwede Mantashe, who told delegates at the Africa Down Under event earlier this year that as things stood no country could match South Africa in terms of mineral diversity offerings. Data from Statistics SA shows that South Africa's mining industry is one of the key economic sectors in the country, contributing about 7.5?per cent to gross domestic product (GDP), 30?per cent of export earnings, and more than

450?000 direct jobs. However, all this is in vain if there is no power to run these mines. For mines to operate, there needs to be access to power and it needs to be reliable.

Power outages in recent times have risked production levels and in turn thousands of jobs as well as put pressure on the country's ailing economy. A potential solution has been for mines to generate their power. This has its advantages and disadvantages. In some cases, private power generation has worked well when regulations allow for mines to build their Power plants and also supply to local communities.



49 journalists murdered in 2019

LONDON - 49 journalists were killed across the world in 2019, Reporters Without Borders said yesterday, the lowest death toll in 16 years.

The "historically low" number mostly died covering conflicts in Yemen, Syria and Afghanistan, the Paris-based watchdog said, which warned that "journalism remains a dangerous pro-

Some 80 journalists a year have lost their lives on average over the last two decades, said the organisation, which is known by its French initials RSF.

But its head Christophe Deloire warned that the number of journalists murdered in countries supposedly at peace was

10 dying in Mexico alone.
"Latin America, with a total of 14 reporters killed across the continent, has become as dead-

still alarmingly high, with

ly as the Middle East," he added.

While he said that the fall in the number of fatalities in conflict zones was something to celebrate, "more and more journalists are being assassinated for their work in democratic countries, which is a real challenge to democracy."

Journalists

While fewer journalists are dying, more are ending up behind bars, according to RSF.

Some 389 were locked up in 2019, up 12per cent on last year.

Nearly half were imprisoned in three countries - China, Egypt and Saudi Arabia, which was blamed for the gruesome murder of columnist Jamal Khashoggi at its embassy in Istanbul last year.

"China, which has intensified its repression of the (mostly Muslim) Uighur minority, alone holds a third of the journalists locked up in the world," RSF said.

Meanwhile, 57 journalists are being held hostage across the globe, mostly in Syria, Yemen, Iraq and Ukraine.

"There has been no notable freeing of hostages this year despite major developments in Syria," the RSF said, which has led it to fear for the worst for many of those abducted.

'Mormon Church misled members on \$100bn investment fund'

WASHINGTON - A former investment manager alleges in a whistleblower complaint to the Internal Revenue Service that the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints has amassed about \$100 billion in accounts intended for charitable purposes, according to a copy of the complaint obtained by The Washington Post.

The confidential document, received by the IRS on Nov. 21, accuses church leaders of misleading members - and possibly breaching federal tax rules - by stockpiling their surplus donations instead of using them for charitable works. It also accuses church leaders of using the tax-exempt donations to prop up a pair of businesses.

A spokesman for the church did not respond to detailed questions from The Post about the complaint. "The Church does not provide information about specific transactions or financial decisions," spokesman Eric Hawkins said in a statement.

The complaint provides a window into the closely held finances of one of the nation's most visible religious organisations, based in Salt Lake City. It details a church fortune far exceeding past estimates and encompassing stocks, bonds and cash.

The complaint was filed by David Nielsen, a 41-year-old Mormon who worked until September as a senior portfolio manager at the church's investment division, a company named Ensign Peak Advisors that is based near the church's headquarters.

Nonprofit organisations, including religious groups, are exempted in the United States from paying taxes on their income. Ensign is registered with authorities as a supporting organisation and integrated auxiliary of the Mormon Church. *The Washington Post*

Ex-Trump campaign official to be sentenced

WASHINGTON - Former Trump campaign official Rick Gates, who was charged in special counsel Robert Mueller's Russia investigation, will learn how much his extensive cooperation with the Justice Department has paid off when he is sentenced in Washington's federal court. Neither his lawyers nor federal prosecutors are seeking prison time for Gates, who pleaded guilty in February 2018 to charges relating to lucrative political consulting work he did in Ukraine. The Justice Department says Gates provided "extraordinary assistance" in multiple investigations and that prosecutors will not oppose his request for probation. *AFP*

China's Xi gives leader 'unwavering support'

CHINA - Chinese President Xi Jinping told

beleaguered Hong Kong leader Carrie Lam on Monday that she had Beijing's "unwavering support"



after another huge pro-democracy rally earlier this month and her government's thrashing at recent local elections. Extradites 'butcher' of Argentine dictatorship

PARIS - An Argentine ex-police officer linked to the murder of hundreds of people during the country's "dirty war" was on a plane to Buenos Aires on Monday, after France extradited him to face trial over the disappearance of a student.

Mario Sandoval was arrested last Wednesday at his home near Paris, after French authorities gave the final go-ahead for his extradition, ending an eight-year legal battle. The 66-year-old who had been living in France since 1985 and obtained French citizenship with few aware of his full identity, was sent back on a plane that left Paris around midnight on Sunday. *AFP*

Brothers jailed for meat grinder bomb plot

AUSTRALIA - Two brothers were handed lengthy jail terms in Australia yesterday for plotting to bring down a Sydney to Abu Dhabi flight with a bomb carried in a meat grinder by their unwitting brother. Australian-Lebanese brothers Khaled and Mahmoud Khayat were convicted of terrorism offences for trying to bomb an Etihad Airways passenger jet in July 2017 under instructions from the Islamic State group. Khaled was sentenced to 40 years with a minimum of 30 years without parole, while Mahmoud received 36 years' jail time and ordered to serve at least 27.

WIFE CHARGED FOR TRYING TO KILL ZIM'S CHIWENGA

HARARE - Mary Mubaiwa, the estranged wife of Zimbabwe's vice-president Constantino Chiwenga, has been charged with attempted murder of the former military general.

The murder attempt apparently took place when he was in hospital in SA.

Mubaiwa spent the weekend in police custody over graft charges involving about US\$1m and forgery of a marriage certificate.

On Monday, she made an initial appearance at the Harare Magistrate's Court where her lawyer, Beatrice Mtetwa, told of how Mubaiwa was arrested on Saturday evening while taking a bath at their home in Borrowdale, the richest square mile in Zimbabwe.

The new attempted murder charges surfaced on Monday morning.

According to the State, on June 22 this year Chiwenga was airlifted to Pretoria -but instead of going to hospital, he was booked in and given medicine at the Sheraton Hotel, where he stayed for a lay. It is alleged Mubaiwa was determined

for Chiwenga not to go to hospital, but his security detail moved in swiftly and he was admitted at a Netcare hospital the following day.

Chiwenga spent weeks at the medical facility, where he was given an intravenous drip so that fluids, medication and blood products could be administered.

His condition improved, but he was still only able to move around with assistance. On July 8, it is alleged that around 8pm, Mubaiwa went to the hospital and told her estranged husband's security to give them privacy. It was then that, according to the state, she 'unlawfully removed

She was stopped, but as hospital staff tried to re-insert the intravenous line and the catheter and resuscitate Chiwenga, she allegedly made her escape.

Zambia approves cannabis exports to boost economy

LUSAKA - Zambia has legalised the production and export of cannabis for economic and medicinal purposes, the government's chief spokeswoman said on Monday, becoming the latest country to shift its position on the drug to give its finances a boost.

The approval for the export of cannabis was granted at a special cabinet meeting on December 4, spokeswoman Dora Siliya said in a statement. It was not clear from the statement if the use of cannabis for medicinal purposes in Zambia had been legalised.

The southern African country joins a host of nations that have legalised, or are considering legalising cannabis to some degree, as attitudes towards the drug slowly change and investments in its medical benefits grow.

Zambia's motivation is rooted in a hefty fiscal deficit and growing debt burden. Growth in external debt to US\$10.5 billion at the end of 2018 from US\$8.74 billion a year earlier has raised fears the country is headed for a debt crisis.

Zambia cut its 2019 growth forecast in September because bad weather had hit crop production and electricity generation while the International Monetary Fund has said growth is likely to remain subdued over the medium term.

Zambian opposition Green Party President Peter Sinkamba, who has been advocating the export of cannabis since 2013, said the move could earn Zambia up to US\$36 billion annual-

"Depending on how properly this is done, this could just change the face of Zambia's economy," Sinkamba told Reuters. "This could be a blessing or a curse, like diamonds and gold, depending on the policy direction."

Siliya said the government had directed the ministry of health to coordinate the issuance of the necessary licences while a technical committee made up of ministers from a range of departments would come up with guidelines. *Reuters*

SA reiterates call for lifting of sanctions against Zimbabwe

JOHANNESBURG - National Assembly Speaker Thandi Modise has reiterated South Africa's stand on the lifting of targeted economic sanctions against Zimbabwe.

In October, National Council of Provinces Chairperson Amos Masondo tabled a motion at the 3rd Ordinary Session of the Pan African Parliament (PAP), held in Midrand, urging members of the PAP to demand the immediate lifting of the economic sanctions imposed on Zimbabwe.

At the 46th Plenary Assembly Session of the Southern African Development Community Parliamentary Forum, Josefina Perpétua Pitra Diakite - an MP from Angola, tabled a motion calling for the lifting of the economic sanctions imposed on Zimbabwe.

Supporting Diakite's motion, Modise said: "We stand as South Africa to say to our brothers, our sisters, our neighbours - in fact our family, because we have intermarried, that your pain is our pain. Without South Africa standing up and joining up with other neighbours, the economic progress of the region will be retarded. The issues of child mortality, of hunger, will continue to besiege the region."

Concerned

In her motion, Diakite said Angola was deeply concerned that these "economic sanctions had negatively affected people's livelihoods, economic development and access to health, particularly the poorest and most vulnerable population, including young girls, women, children, the disabled and the elderly people."

"The economic sanctions are a violation of the human, economic and social rights of the people of Zimbabwe and have a negative impact on the government's efforts to leverage the economy and boost the living standards of the Zimbabwean people."

BERLIN - The US Africa Command (AFRICOM) said it killed a member of Islamist terrorist group al-Shabaab in an airstrike in Somalia's south on Monday. Africom said that the strike, carried out in coordination with the Somalian government, killed one terrorist near Dujuuma, some 350 kilometres south-west of the capital Mogadishu. "We currently assess no civilians were injured or killed as a result of this airstrike," a statement by the command said. "The removal of al-Shabaab terrorists increases the security of the Somali people as these terrorists indiscriminately attack and extort innocent civilians and destabilize the elected government." NIGERIA - On the outside, the Federal Neuro-Psychiatric Hospital Yaba seems tranquil. But on the inside of this century-old facility - one of only a half-dozen psychiatric centres in Lagos, and the only one run by the federal government of Nigeria - tensions are running high. At the outpatient clinic, the crowd of people waiting to consult with doctors is so thick that it spills into the hallway. The workload is so overwhelming that Dr Dapo Adegbaju, a psychiatrist rushing to attend to an agitated patient, has slept in the hospital for the past two nights. In the emergency ward, a patient named Jide languishes in a queue where he has been waiting since 7am. AFP

Ramaphosa hailed for freeing Abathembu king, Cekeshe

JOHANNESBURG - As Fees Must Fall activist Kanya Cekeshe and Abathembu King (Buyelekhaya) Dalindvebo prepare to leave prison and head home, the government has vowed that the perpetrators of heinous crimes against the country's women and children will not realise freedom any time soon.

On Monday, the EFF was among the parties that lauded the decision by President Cyril Ramaphosa to grant a handful of prisoners, including Cekeshe and King Dalindyebo, presidential pardons.

According to EFF leader Julius Malema, he had been informed by Ramaphosa on Sunday of Cekeshe's impending parole.

"I got excited when the president told me Cekeshe

would be going home. I got excited when he told me that King Dalindyebo would be going home. I got more excited when he told me that he would be releasing them with other prisoners, but that those prisoners arrested for rape, domestic violence, for killing women and those types of related crimes, would not be released," Malema said.

He added: "When the president spoke about Khaya Cekeshe, he said this young man that the EFF has been campaigning (to have) released, would be released." Malema pointed out that Ramaphosa had been the first to inform the EFF about Cekeshe, because the red berets had been leading the campaign for his release. Meanwhile, Minister of Justice and Correctional Services Ronald Lamola on Monday explained that Cekeshe qualified for immediate parole. He announced this in Pretoria - minutes after Ramaphosa announced his decision to grant a special remission of sentence to certain categories of prisoners in a Reconciliation Day speech in Bergville, KwaZulu-Natal.Ramaphosa was adamant that those convicted for sexual offences and other violent crimes did not qualify for remission. Lamola told the media that 14 647 inmates were eligible for the special remission. Reacting, King Dalindyebo's spokesperson, Prince Mthunzi Ngonyana, said they were happy about his imminent release, but expressed concern about the parole conditions.

Malema slams EFF structures' failures

JOHANNESBURG - EFF leader Julius Malema slammed some of the party's structures for failing to capitalise on the ANC's internal problems to increase voter support of the red berets.

He said the party was losing support at the hands of the ANC in some regions due to ineffective campaigning.

Malema was delivering the closing address at the EFF's second national people's assembly (NPA) at NASREC, south of Joburg, where the party elected new leadership.

Malema was re-elected unopposed together with his deputy Floyd Shivambu, EFF Head of Security Marshal Dlamini while EFF MP Veronica Mente was elected chairperson, EFF MP Ompile Maotwe was elected treasurer -general and Poppy Mailola deputy secretary-general. He singled out the Ekurhuleni metro, where he warned that leaders would be removed from positions if they failed to work the ground and recover the gains made by the EFF in the 2016 local elections.

"In Ekurhuleni, the ANC took the

'It's impossible to give Cape refugees emergency shelter'

CAPE TOWN - Refugees staying in the Central Methodist Church and surrounding areas were given a reprieve from an eviction threat after Judge Kate Savage decided to postpone their eviction case to next month.

The case was already postponed on December 9, when the judge gave the involved parties a chance to meet and find asolution, which didn't happen. The City of Cape Town, which brought the interdict to the High Court on that date, wants an order to stop refugees breaking health and safety by-laws. This includes urinating and defecating on the street, washing clothes and cooking in the square. The City also maintains that the protesters represent a threat and intimidation to its officials and also to tourists, locals and business.

During Friday's court appearance there was a disagreement between Home Affairs and the City about providing an emergency shelter for the refugees. Senior counsel for Home Affairs, advocate Seth Nthai, said that the department can't conduct their role

to verify refugees' documentation in the circumstances and poor conditions they are living in at the moment in the church.

According to news website GroundUp, the Home Affairs advocate exposed results of a preliminary investigation conducted by the department that said there were about 500 people occupying the area, 100 of whom have expired asylum permits, 80 were undocumented and 68 claimed to have lost their documentation.

"The City's advocate, Adiel Nacerodien, argued that the refugees don't require emergency shelter since they have homes to go to. At the same time, he told the court that the negotiations Tuesday (December 10) are at a deadlock," according to the website. Cape Argus

"So I made the western monkey - white with blue eyes - the Asian monkey -


THE MBABANE DERBY FACTOR!

Primary prevention-This involves preventing injuries from occurring in those with no history of injury.

Secondary prevention-This involves the practice of trying to prevent re-injury. A good example here is the use of an eccentric strengthening programme to try prevent hamstring muscle re-injury.

Teams that have fewer injuries perform better in both their domestic leagues and in the Champions League.

How can football injuries be prevented?

- Have a pre-season health and wellness evaluation.
- Perform proper warm-up and cooldown routines.
- Consistently incorporate strength training and stretching
- Hydrate adequately to maintain health and minimise cramps hydrate adequately to maintain health and min-

imize cramps

- Stay active during summer break to prepare for return to sports in the fall.
- Wear properly fitted protective equipment, such as a helmet, pads, and mouthguard.
- Speak with a sports medicine professional or athletic trainer if you have any concerns about injuries or preven-

tion strategies. There is an increasing body of evidence that shows that it is possible to reduce the risk of sustaining a hamstring muscle injury. Strategies which have been proposed include different kinds of stretching activities, eccentric strength training, core stability and combinations of these.

Strategies which are widely used to

try to limit the risk of injury.

Stretching-increase visco-elastic properties of a muscle and decrease the strain in a muscle. Several stretch episodes a decrease muscle stiffness.

Eccentric strength-the greater mechanical tension and strain exerted upon the muscle fibers yielding increases in muscle fascicle length that consequently increase muscle shortening velocity and force production at longer muscle lengths.

Core stability- comprises the lumbopelvic-hip complex and is the capacity to maintain equilibrium of the vertebral column within its physiologic limits by reducing displacement from perturbations and maintaining structural integrity.

Balance- exercises are part of comprehensive neuromuscular warm-up programmes, like the FIFA 11+, which have clearly been shown to be effective in reducing injuries.

Strapping and bracing- in players with a history of ankle instability. In these players, taping or bracing the ankle to limit inversion can reduce the risk of subsequent ankle sprains by about 50%

Loading- The influence of loading and training volume has been identified


as a risk factor for injury. This is especially true in adolescent and youth players. Too much loading, and sudden changes in loading, have been associated with an increased risk of injury. Times when loads typically increase include during the pre-season, when returning from injury or when players enter an elite training environment. It is especially important to have a carefully designed training programme during these times.

Fitness and conditioning- Muscle injuries occur most frequently towards the end of each half. Given the demanding nature of football, it has been suggested that this is due to fatigue. As a result, a low level of fitness may be an injury risk factor for players. Improving fitness may therefore reduce the risk of injury. It is, however, possible that increasing fitness may be a risk factor for injury. Players with greater physical fitness typically work harder and, as a result, may be more likely to become injured.




