

Murder supect 'suffering' from schizophrenia

LAMGABHI Etiyeni's 16-year -old murder suspect could be suffering from schizophrenia.

On Tuesday, members of the Royal Eswatini Police Service, Lukhozi Department arrested Sibahle Zwane for the allged murder of Maswati Fakudze (15) from the same area.

He is alleged to have hit the deceased with a stone on the head and further submerged him under water and in doing so, resulted in Fakudze's death.

Zwane appeared before Magistrate Sifiso Vilakati on Wednesday morning, where he made a confession and was formally charged with the murder. Following his first appearance in court, the suspect was remanded in custody and was set to be subjected to an evaluation by the social welfare department to determine if he was fit to stand for trialor not.

Suspect

Chief Police Information and Communication Officer Superintendent Phindile Vilakati said the suspect was still under investigation by the police.

Vilakati said following the evaluation, the suspect would return to court where the magistrate would determine whether he would be subjected to a psychological evaluation.

She mentioned that due to the reason that the suspect

was a minor; the procedure required that he was evaluated by social workers.

During his arrest, members of t h e LaMgabhi community were dumbfounded by the suspect's demeanour as he showed no remorse for the committed crime.

A doctor from the Manzini

A doctor from the Manzini Psychiatric Centre said in an instance like this, if an individual showed no feelings of guilt or remorse, they would be suffering from severe schizophrenia.

He mentioned incarcerating an individual suffering from the disorder without treatment was futile, as they would need treatment for the disorder.

"In this instance, the suspect would need to be examined and offered treatment for the condition," he said. He stated that a combination of approaches were needed for treatment, including medications, psychotherapy, social support and family education, vocational and housing support, treatment for co-occurring issues, and sometimes electro-convulsive therapy, which was most effective for most patients.

ABOUT SCHIZOPHRENIA

What is Schizophrenia Schizophrenia is a serious mental disorder in which people interpret reality abnormally. Schizophrenia may result in some combination of hallucinations, delusions, and extremely disor-

delusions, and extremely disordered thinking and behavior that impairs daily functioning, and can be disabling.

What causesSchizophrenia

The exact causes of schizophrenia are unknown. Research suggests a combination of physical, genetic, psychological and environmental factors can make a person more likely to develop the condition. Some people may be prone to schizophrenia, and a stressful or emotional life event might trigger a

psychotic episode.

XENOPHOBIC SOLDIER GETS 10 YEARS

A member of the Umbutfo Eswatini Defence Force (UEDF) was sentenced to 10 years imprisonment with an option of E14 000 fine for being xenophobic.

Velaphi Dlamini (35) of Ticantfwini under Chief Mandanda appeared before

Senior Magistrate Sindisiwe Zwane yesterday on a charge of assault with intent to cause grievous bodily harm after he stabbed a Mozambican national; Antonio Emilia Matsolo, with a beer bottle several times in the face.

The incident happened on September 4, 2019. Dlamini stabbed the Mozambican man because he claimed he was annoyed by the fact that Matsolo was conversing in Portuguese with his wife while in a

kombi. Narrating the events leading to his injury, Matsolo told the court that he was chatting with his wife in a kombi about an elderly man who had beer bottles with him.

Kombi

When Dlamini boarded the kombi, the two are said to have continued conversing in their native language. It is then that Dlamini told them that they were annoying him by speaking in Shangaan.

MPs divided over cannabis legislation

OUTSIDE pressure to urgently pass the Opium and Habit Forming Drugs (Amendment) Bill of 2019 which sought to regulate the planting of cannabis has divided the House of Assembly.

On Wednesday some Members of Parliament expressed their unhappiness with the way the Amendment Bill was passed.

They felt they had to give themselves time to scrutinise the Bill and not give in to the alleged pressure that was placed on their shoulders.

The Bill seeks to make it possible for cannabis to be regulated by the Medicines Regulatory Authority (MRA) in the country.

The division was first seen when Kubuta MP Musa Mabuza moved that the MPs adopt a report on the Bill.

When he moved the Bill, Kukhanyeni MP Vincent Sihlongonyane stood on a point of order to inform the House that he was part of the health portfolio committee, but he did not know anything about the report on the Bill.

However, his attempt to register the concern did not yield positive results because he had been overtaken by events.

House of Assembly Deputy Speaker Phila Buthelezi, who was presiding over the business of the House stated that Sihlongonyane was supposed to raise that concern when the report was tabled in the

When making his submission on the report, Sihlongonyane wondered why the



amendment of the Bill was hastily done because there were so many things that needed to be fixed and other legislations that affected cannabis.

He said the Bill did not only address cannabis, but also addressed other habitforming drugs like cocaine and heroin, which also needed to be addressed by the MPs.

Sihlongonyane said he had a problem when MPs would be told that they had to hastily put the legislations to bed because of outside pressure.

Phondo MP Xolani Vilakati also urged MPs to scrutinise the cannabis legislations because it seemed as if some MPs did not want to be part of the cannabis licensing exercise because they have already sensed some form of danger ahead. Kwaluseni MP Sibusiso Mabhanisi

MP Dlamini could not understand why that was the case because he said he was made to understand that the health portfolio committee was going to go around making consultations at Tinkhundla level.

failure to go to his Inkhundla.

Minister of Health Lizzie Nkosi assured MPs not to fear anything concerning the Bill. She told the lawmakers that the only thing that was done on Wednesday was to amend the Opium and Habit Forming Drug Act of 1922 so that it could be possible for cannabis to be regulated.

MP Mabuza, who moved for the adoption of the report, promised to fix the problems that the other MPs could have. He said the reason why they did not go to Kwaluseni Inkhundla was that they were informed very late, hence they could not make it.

He apologised to Dlamini for that.

As if that was not enough, Dlamini also insulted the Mozambican couple by using unpalatable words.

Matsolo's wife then responded and told Dlamini that they were not talking to him, but were discussing family matters.

By this, Matsolo said he and his wife were discussing how they would use some money he had just received to build their house.

Insults

The insults are said to have continued and when the couple alighted from the kombi at their drop-off station, Dlamini broke a beer bottle. After paying the kombi conductor, Matsolo bended over to pick up his grocery bags.

When he got up, Matsolo is said to have met a broken bottle and he was stabbed on the face. He is said to have sustained a 3-centimetre wound in his nose and a 7 centimetre injury from his lower lip and up his

Matsolo is said to have been rescued by his wife, who pushed Dlamini away and he fell on the ground.

While doing all this, Dlamini mentioned that he was a soldier but Matsolo said he did not believe him.

Opportunity

In court, when Dlamini was given an opportunity to state his defence, he opted to remain silent. Before delivering judgment, Magistrate Zwane said it was such assault cases that usually culminated to murder cases that have become prevalent in the country.

She said people usually quarrelled over trivial things but end up injuring each other.

Such cases are not common in the country and this one should rank amongst the firsts, where a person is imprisoned for just assaulting another on the basis that he/she spoke in a language that annoyed the accused. In some countries, lives have been lost on the basis of being a foreigner and are accused or blamed for an assortment of issues, including being responsible for their high level of unemployment and taking over of their businesses.

'Give us Micro-Projects money'

MEMBERS of Parliament are now demanding money that is allocated for Micro Projects within 14 days.

In the present financial year, Micro Project is supposed to get E120 million from government and nothing has been released so far.

In the last financial year (2018/19), government only managed to release E20 million, out of the E180 million that was budgeted for. This left the organisation in a deficit of E160 million. The non-availability of Micro Projects budgetary allocation has brought restlessness to the MPs.

Restlessness

The restlessness is caused by the fact that there are no activities at the Tinkhundla level, where they were elected. It has been a year now since the legislators were elected from their respective Tinkhundla and signs of development are very minimal, if they are at all. Many MPs rely on organisations like Micro Projects and funds like the Regional Development Fund (RDF) to implement developmental projects at their respective constituencies. What is now a problem to the MPs is that money for Micro Projects has not been released for the first and second quarters of the 2019/20 financial year. It was for that reason that Maphalaleni MP Mabulala Maseko moved a motion to order Minister of Finance Neal Rijkenberg to ensure that he released at least E60 million (first and second quarters budget allocations) for the present financial seconded by Nkwene MP Philemon work on the matter.

Vulimpompi Nhleko.

MP Maseko, when motivating the motion, stated that the situation was terrible at Tinkhundla level because nothing was happening because of the lack of money. He further said the people were now beginning to think that they were not working at the Tinkhundla and they did not understand that such was happening because of the lack of money for Micro Projects.

He said what was even sad was that Micro Project had a budget deficit from the budget of last year. He further thanked the ministry of Tinkhundla Administration and Development for releasing around E52 million for Tinkhundla development, through

However, Maseko said this was just the tip of an iceberg because that money was supposed to pay for debts created in the last financial year.

He also said Micro Projects also owed Eswatini Electricity Company (EEC) and some of the money to be released by government had to pay off those debts. Seconding the motion, Nhleko said government had to cooperate with Tinkhundla Centres by giving some money to the Tinkhundla Centres. This, according to Nhleko, would make government to be seen to be doing something in improving the lives of the people in constituencies. Acting Minister of Finance Moses Vilakati promised the MPs that the finance ministry would

Govt bars teachers from celebrating Teachers' Day

In a move reminiscent to that of last year, government has barred teachers from celebrating the annual Teachers Day today.

This was relayed to teachers yesterday through a press statement released by the Ministry of Education and Training.

Teachers through their union, the Swaziland National Association of Teachers (SNAT), had released a statement weeks before, saying they will celebrate the day today at Bosco Skills Centre in Manzini starting at 9am.

Preparations

After all the preparations done by teachers in anticipation for the big day, government issued a press release on the last day informing teachers that Friday (today) is a normal working day and everyone is expected to report for duty.

According to the press release, the Ministry of Education Principal Secretary Bertram Stewart said he would like to remind all teachers that since Friday is a normal working day, the ministry expects all teachers and pupils to be at school and that they observe their normal working hours. Bertram stated that the ministry was cognizant that teachers were enthusiastic to commemorate the World Teachers Day. He said, however, as it has been said before, such a commemoration cannot be held on a working day.

The principal secretary said teachers are free to commemorate the day on any other day rather than a day when they are supposed to be helping pupils get ready to write their examinations. "This is a critical period for pupils, as a result stakeholders in education should grab every opportunity to ensure the realisation of the goals set at the beginning of the year," part of Stewart's statement reads.

The ministry further urged parents to play their part and ensure that pupils attend class as expected today.

Teachers have not been pleased by the latest developments. SNAT Secretary General Sikelela Dlamini said as teachers they know from history that government has never taken education seriously in such a way that everything that is done by educators and requested from the ministry is always turned down.

Dlamini said interestingly enough, when the ministry needs teachers the most, they don't consider whether it's a normal working day or not. The Secretary General said for example if there is a policy review where they want inputs from SNAT, they never say that meeting should be on Saturday or it must be after working

He said such meetings are called even on working days. Dlamini said these are the sort of things that portrays, the country in a bad light from the international community.

Dlamini said this is a professional day and there is a theme 'Young Teachers the Future of the Profession'.

The secretary general said this day is commemorated worldwide. He said as SNAT, they are part of the over 30 million educators that are part of Education International, who decided on the theme.

Dlamini said other unions throughout the world have commemorated the day and they were never disturbed because their governments are clear that education is one of the important sectors in any country. Dlamini said as teachers, they cannot turn back now as they have already paid for venues, rented facilities, cooked food and made all the preparations.

Dlamini said teachers who have been attending Teachers Day in previous years know that this is an old trick and they will attend no matter what.

SNAT president runs to court

SWAZILAND National Association of Teachers (SNAT) President Mbongwa Dlamini has applied for his misconduct charges to be withdrawn from the Teaching Service Commission.

Dlamini, through his lawyers filed an application at the Industrial Court on Wednesday afternoon.

The applicants in the matter are Mbongwa Dlamini as First Applicant and SNAT as Second Applicants. The respondents are the principal secretary in the Ministry of Education and the Chairman of the Teaching Service Commission. The application is to be heard before court on November 12. Dlamini is represented by Alex Fakudze.

Argues In papers filed by Dlamini's attorneys ,he argues that the Commissioner of Labour intervened in the matter and suggested that the disciplinary proceedings which had already been set in motion by the Ministry of Education and Training be withdrawn from the Teaching Service Commission, as the same matter cannot be dealt with by two separate structures concurrently, which is the Commissioner of Labour and the TSC at the same time. It was submitted that on July 3, 2019 the intervention process took a rather surprising turn in that the ministry had still not withdrawn the matter from TSC as per their agreement. The reasons given were that the TSC Act, 1982 in terms of which the TSC was established makes no provision for a withdrawal

Today

of a matter once it has been referred to it by the schools manager in terms of Regulation 15(3).

The TSC is alleged to have attempted to persuade the commissioner of labour and SNAT that it was not necessary to withdraw the matter because at the time, the members of the TSC had not been appointed, as such it was as good as the matter had not been referred.

Intervention

The commissioner of labour according to the court papers, on the other hand was of the view that the intervention would have no effect on the matter if it remains not withdrawn from the TSC.

It was stated that the outcome of the intervention could have direct implications to the charges and such charges could not be affected by the schools manager if the matter remains as is with the TSC. The intervention stalled.

The SNAT President, in his court papers revealed that he is desirous for the intervention process to be proceeded without any hurdles that may even affect the implementation of the outcome.

Dlamini made it clear that he is advised that the reasons for the withdrawal of his case from the TSC are lawful, fair and reasonable in the circumstances.

He said in fact prior to the agreement to withdraw the matter from the TSC, the principal secretary together with the schools manager requested and were granted leave to seek for permission from their principals to withdraw the through a letter dated April 3, 2019

matter from TSC.

The two are said to have subsequently reported that such permission was granted by the minister.

Dlamini submitted that, therefore there is no reason for the failure to withdraw the matter from TSC.

He indicated that the failure by the principal secretary and schools manager to comply with the terms of the agreement necessitated this application.

Dlamini was expected to appear before the Teaching Service Commission earlier this month, where he was to answer on a number of charges including absenteeism, neglecting to submit official school records for inspection, disobedience and bringing the Teaching Service Commission into disrepute. These charges were relayed to the SNAT leader by Schools Manager Macanjana Motsa



ACC's application to arrest ex-minister

GIDEON BACK ATHIGH COURT

BY SANDILE NKAMBULE Supreme Court

THE application to have former minister of Commerce Industry and Trade Gideon Dlamini's home searched and have him subsequently arrested has been referred back to the High Court by the Supreme Court.

This was yesterday an order issued by the Supreme Court following an appeal application that had been filed by the Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) through the office of the Director of Public Prosecutions (DPP).

Before referring the matter back to the High Court, the Supreme Court comprising Judges Phesheya Dlamini, Robert Cloete and Stanley Maphalala noted that the matter was supposed to be heard by the High Court sitting as a Constitutional Court as a constitutional point of law has been raised by the applicant (ACC) in the matter before it could be entertained by the Supreme Court.

Judge Robert Cloete noted that the Supreme Court is not the Court of first instance and that following an order that was issued by the High Court dismissing the ACC in the matter, the applicants should have approached the Constitutional Court as a constitutional point has been raised.

Judge Dlamini also concurred with Judge Cloete, as he observed that the matter should not have been brought before the Supreme Court but should have been dealt with by the Constitutional Court first.

Judge Dlamini also observed an anomaly in the matter making it an extraordinary one in that one of the respondents' attorneys Mzwandile Ntshangase filed an affidavit on behalf of the crown and was to take the witness stand, while on the other hand he was representing the second respondent in the matter, a thing which he has never heard of or seen.

The court noted that there was a misdirection in the filing of the appeal application before

the Supreme Court adding that the Court should not be seen as entertaining that misdirection as such would serve as a bad precedence in the future hence it needed to be corrected by removing the mater from the roll and have the applicant approaching the Constitutional Court.

Both the Crown represented by advocate Gerald Lepan who is instructed by senior crown counsel Ngcebo Lukhele and lawyer Ntshangase for the respondents,

acknowledged the misdirection and agreed that the matter be removed from the Supreme Court roll and filed at the High Court which will be sitting as a Constitutional Court.

Sought

Initially, the ACC had sought the authorisation of both the search

and arrest warrant in respect the first second and third respondents in the matter being the former minister of the crown, Fred Ngeri and Sindile Ngeri before the High Court.

In support of the application, the ACC filed an affidavit detailing the investigations carried into the alleged corruption against the respondents and the nature of the evidence gathered, thereof including the charge sheet which was also referred to several common law offences of fraud.

The charge sheet indicated that the former minister and the respondents were charged for Contravening the Prevention of Corruption Act of 2006 in that they were in fraudulent activities involving the Fred Ngeri and his wife Sindile and their company in defrauding government.

The matter was thereafter brought before the court *aquo* where the ACC was seeking the search and arrest warrant and a detailed judgment was handed down in which the ACC was dismissed. It was for that reason that the ACC brought the matter before the Supreme Court for consideration on appeal however the matter was not properly filed and the applicant filed an application for condonation.

The facts of the matter are that a Public Private Partnership (PPP) was created between the Small Enterprise Development Company (SEDCO) and Ngeri Holdings (NGH) which is essentially a business for the second respondent.

It has been stated that this was created to set up an on-line trading platform and referred to as the Swazi Traders Link (STL) and the intention was to operate an on-line business centre and an on-line shopping mall which was to collect funds to train small and medium enterprises to operate in the

information technology dominated business world.

The principal participants involved were the respondents and the second respondent allegedly made monetary and material donations to the first respondent and it was gathered that the ordinary channels for the establishment of such a PPP were not followed and Cabinet was effectively excluded from this process.

It was also submitted that strangely if not suspicious, the first respondent (former minister) appointed the second respondent (Fred Ngeri) as his personal advisor, a post that did not exist in Government, but thereby further cementing the relationship between the first and second respondents and again excluding Government scrutiny by the Principal Secretary.

The former minister was then charged by the ACC and the application for the search and arrest was made before it was dismissed by the High Court hence the present application.

Women who use sex for money are sex workers

REPRESENTETIVES of commercial sex workers have said that any woman who uses sex or her body to persuade men to give her money or favours can be categorised as a sex worker.

The representatives went on to say that the young ladies who are often seen dating older married men are also engaging in a form of commercial sex work.

This volatile statement was made at the recently held stake-holder's meeting that was hosted by the Alliance of Mayor's Initiative on Community Action on AIDS at the Local Level (AMICAALL) at the Gobolondlo Hall on Tuesday.

During the aforementioned meeting, representatives of commercial sex workers, as well as representatives of the Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender and Queer (LGBTQ) community were present to make presentations to the police, medical practitioners and others.

Due to ethical reasons, the names of the representatives have been withheld.

Speaking at the meeting, the representatives of commercial sex workers said most commercial sex workers were brave and honest compared to other women who acted innocent yet they used sex for money.

"Poverty and lack for young mothers are the main reasons why young girls are getting involved in the commercial sex trade. Education is no longer important to many young girls because they grow up watching their mothers who are often young themselves struggle without employment or money. These young mothers who are often school drop outs teach their young daughters unwittingly to devel-

op a dependency on males for their livelihoods. This causes girls to ignore school and focus on men instead. Many young women believe that they need a man to survive and that alone is not the truth," they said.

One of the representatives added that it is very important for parents, especially mothers, to educate their young girls on the importance of having a tertiary education and pursuing a career to succeed in life.

"Unfortunately most mothers are so focused on basic survival that they fail to teach their girls to pursue an education and a career. This oversight makes most young girls view men as providers of money. Due to the fact that the girls want money, they resort to relationships with men who sexually abuse them at a young age. After a few years of this abuse, some girls think the abuse is normal, hence over time we see girls use their bodies as tools to be used by men for money. This is commercial sex work as there is no love but just money involved in this form of sex. Many women lie to themselves and say they are not sex workers because they don't sell their bodies on the streets but many other women sell their bodies to older married men in secret. This is sex work because money is still exchanged for this service. At least sex workers are brave and honest by walking the streets and selling themselves, while other women prefer to be liars and sell sex in private," they added.

The PAP was sanctioned by the African Union to observe the elections in Mozambique. The PAP MPs, according to sources close to

the matter, left last week Saturday to Mozambique so that they could take part in an observer mission workshop aimed at sensitising the

African legislators on how they were supposed to observe the elections.

According to the

According to the sources, the PAP members, including Nxumalo and Magongo, joined other organs of the African continent in observing the elections, like the AU, which is led by

former Nigerian President Olusegun Obasanjo.

They are expected to come back

They are expected to come back tomorrow and the observer mission clerk attached to the PAP MPs will be expected to compile a report on the elections. The report is expected to be discussed by the PAP members in their next sitting in May next year.

Mozambicans went to the polls on Tuesday, October 15, 2019 and, according to an online publication, The South African, vote count-

ing is still continuing. The Mozambican Electoral Commission, according to the online publication, promised to olish the elections results

publish the elections results after 15 days from Tuesday. The publication further quoted Mozambican President Felipe Nyusi as saying this year's elections was the most monitored in Mozambique's history. About 4 000 election observers

are said to have been deployed across the Mozambican territory.

The two MPs were elected during the Third Ordinary Session of the Fifth Parliament of the PAP, which is ending today at Gallagher Estate, Midrand, South Africa.

Nxumalo and Magongo attended the sitting with their fellow local PAP members, who included MPs Victor Malambe (Mhlume) and Senator Sylvia Mthethwa. The PAP sitting which the legislators attended ed started on Sunday October 6, 2019 and is supposed to end today.

According to the PAP website. The October statutory meeting is being held under the African Union (AU) theme of 2019: 'Refugees Returnees and Internally Displaced Persons: Towards durable Solutions to Forced Displacement in Africa.'

PARENTSRESOLVE TO PRAYER, FAST

PARENTS of Ekukhanyeni High have resolved to fast and host a prayer session at the school in a bid to drive out the evil spirits that have engulfed the institution.

This transpired yesterday during a parents' meeting held at the school. The meeting was chaired by the school committee's Mfananjalo Mkhonta in the presence of the Deputy Headteacher Bongiwe Zuke. The meeting was held after the school recently lost two teachers in a space of about a week, while also six pupils and another teacher have died since August 2018.

Part of the agenda was the discussion of the pupils' ill-health and parents unanimously decided on fasting fast and prayer.

When making their submissions, the parents said they were cognisant of the fact that the school usually had a mass prayer at the beginning and end of every academic term. The parents arrived at this decision after some suggested that every parent should pray for their children at home, and also give them advise on how they are expected to behave as scholars.

However, others were of the view that even if one could do this with their children at home, it would not be effective because it was most likely that they ended up being

affected by the influences of others who would not have had the same teachings and divine protec-

Therefore, the parents ended up assenting that the common ground in which the children meet should be the venue for the prayer session.

Further, the parents suggested that it would be proper for the scholars and teachers to also attend this session regardless of the difference in religious denominations.

Another parent suggested that the parents should set the date for this and also agree on the pastors who will be asked to grace the event so as to prevent incidents similar to ones that occurred last year after the school administration availed some clergymen after it was resolved by parents that there needed to be prayer sessions.

This was after there were several

deaths of learners at the school. After the prayer, which is said to have been snubbed by most parents, parents complained because there were more deaths even after the prayer session was held.

The parent said the continued deaths saw parents blaming the school administration for bringing the pastors whom they suspected to be in collaboration with someone they blamed for the scholar's deaths.

Appreciated

In response to the parents' suggestions, Deputy Headteacher Zuke appreciated the parents for using prayer to fight the attacks in the school.

Zuke said the parents' move was the best because God knew why the school had to go through such tribulations.

However, Zuke said it was inap-

propriate for the parents to have a night vigil at the school for reasons such as the children could not be controlled at night, and that some people could take advantage of the situation to pursue their ulterior

Also, Zuke mentioned that parents were to be sure they wanted to have the prayer as she referenced to last year's event where only a few parents pitched for the session as planned during a similar meeting. In justification, the parents said the prayer gathering was held midweek while most of them were away

To avoid the repetition of this, the parents suggested that the upcoming prayer session should at least be set for a day over the weekend. After all was said and done, the parents eventually agreed that the gathering will be held during the day.

Tensions rise as vote counting continues

MAPUTO - Fears over serious voting irregularities have marred the electoral process.

Mozambique election results are being tallied following its high-stakes ballot, as tensions spiked over claims of voting irregularities and concerns that results will not be revealed for days.

President Filipe Nyusi's FRELIMo party, which has ruled the southern African country since independence from Portugal in 1975, is widely expected to win the polls held on Tuesday.

The vote has been seen as a key test of a peace deal sealed in August between former civil war foes FRELIMO and RENAMO, a rebel group turned main opposition party.

While voting day appeared mostly calm, civil society groups said they found evidence of suspected election rigging, including several attempts to stuff ballots and election observers being kicked out of polling stations.

Election watchdog Sala da Paz said police fired teargas and warning shots in the central province of Nampula a Renamo stronghold after opposition supporters refused to leave polling premises to "protect their

"So far, from the issues that have been reported, we cannot say that the process has been 100 per cent free and fair," Sala da Paz spokesman Hermenegildo Mulhovo

He said that police had killed a voter in Nampula city, the provincial capital, in circumstances that were still unclear.

Disturbances

The authorities were not immediately able to confirm the incident, but said 73 people had been arrested for "disturbances in polling stations".

Mozambique's electoral commission, meanwhile, indicated it will not publish provisional tallies as it has in the past, only committing to releasing the final results within the mandated 15-day period after

"The more they delay publishing the results, the more you create lack of trust and risks of tensions," Mulhovo said.

"Most of the problems and irregularities happen after the vote, during the counting process."

Lutero Simango, an MP of the country's third biggest party MDM, said the reports "only confirmed what we were afraid of the competition was not fair".

"The will of the people has not been respected, our democracy is headed down a very dangerous path," he told AFP.

RENAMO's presidential candidate Ossufo Momade issued a warning as he voted on Tuesday. "If these results are manipulated we will never accept them, we do not want a return to the problems of the past," the opposition leader said.

On Wednesday, RENAMO's Secretary-General Roque Silva urged Mozambicans to "keep calm during vote counting."

Around 13 million of Mozambique's population of 30 million citizens were registered to vote in the presidential, parliamentary and provincial elections.

Peace deal under pressure

FRELIMO and RENAMO fought a brutal civil war from 1975 to 1992, and an election campaign marred by violence raised fears that conflict could return to one of the world's poorest countries. The peace deal signed between the two groups has come under pressure after an armed breakaway faction of RENAMO rejected the agreement, spurned Momade's candidacy and vowed to attack campaign

Dros rapist Nicholas Ninow sentenced to life in prison


PRETORIA - The Gauteng North High Court has sentenced convicted Dros rapist Nicholas Ninow to life behind bars for rape and five years for drug possession.

Handing down the sentence, Judge Mokhine said he took into account the fact that Ninow is a young adult, has an infant child of his own and that there was a good chance that he could be rehabilitated. He said that Ninow had failed to prove that he was genuinely remorseful.

Mosopa said that a happy family outing became a nightmare for the victim and her family after the little girl was raped. This, he said, has had far-reaching implications for the entire family.

The judge said that Ninow's introduction to hard drugs at the age of 13 by his mother was the start of the young man's spiral into addiction. He said that Ninow had himself been a victim of physical and sexual abuse as a child and appears to be a "broken person".

Earlier, Judge Mosopa called a break in proceedings when a group of people appearing to be EFF



when Mosopa delayed the start of the post-lunch session.

Ninow's sentencing comes after two days of testimony from Ninow, his grandmother and various experts both in mitigation and aggravation of sentencing.

The convicted rapist kicked off proceedings on Wednesday using his testimony to detail his con-

Captain Karin Botha, a forensic social worker, testified in detail about the trauma experienced by Ninow's young victim. She told the court that the young girl still had nightmares about the rape.

A female employee of Metropolitan Life has allegedly been dismissed for having siphoned E180 000 from the company's coffers.


Metropolitan Life operates as an insurance company and provides affordable financial solutions through a range of investment and retirement products that address the needs of the insurance market.

The female ex-employee has since appeared before the Magistrate's Court, where she reportedly made a confession in Magistrate Temantimandze Shongwe's chambers. This, she was said to have done in connection with the case of fraud.

The female employee cannot be named as yet as the veracity of the allegations are yet to be tested before the court. However, she has been formally charged with fraud, after she was alleged to have siphoned varying amounts of money with a total of E180 000.

Information gathered was to the effect that the female employee was employed as an administrator within the insurance company, where she was alleged to have had access to the company's coffers.

She allegedly started off by siphoning a small amount of money, and when she realised that there were no red flags, continued to transfer the varying amounts of money into her personal bank account.



A top official within Metropolitan Life confirmed that the female employee was dismissed after having been found guilty of embezzling company funds.

When the company noted that there were irregular payments being made to one specific bank account, she was called in and later dismissed as the company discovered that the funds were being transferred into her personal bank account, instead of the beneficiaries listed.

"A female staff member was charged and found guilty of the embezzlement of company funds," the top official stated.

The ex-employee is set to make an appearance before open court today, where she will be arraigned.

Vincent to give evidence in Muzi Mhlanga's case

THE case in which former Swaziland National Association of Teachers (SNAT) chief Muzi Mhlanga is suing government E1 million for his lost tooth, has resumed at the High Court.

The matter was yesterday before Judge Nkululeko Hlophe and one of the witnesses, who is expected to give evidence in the matter is unionist Vincent Ncongwane of the Swaziland Union of Financial Institutions and Allied Workers (SUFIAWU) who was present when Mhlanga was allegedly assaulted by members of the security forces during one of their protest actions.

Mhlanga, a seasoned unionist, is represented by lawyer Sabelo Mngometulu and he was the first witness in the trial that began in the last session of the High Court.

A teacher by profession, Mhlanga, who lost a tooth after an assault by police during a Trade Union Congress of Swaziland (TUCOSWA) meeting.

Mhlanga, who is the plaintiff in the matter, had stated in his papers that the police officers who assaulted him were acting in the scope and course of their employment under the guide of the first respondent, who is the national commissioner of police.


Government is represented by lawyers from the AG's office in the matter.

Mhlanga was injured and lost his tooth during the incident that allegedly happened when police officers stopped a meeting organised by TUCOSWA scheduled for the SNAT Centre in Manzini in 2015.

Mhlanga alleged that he was dragged for nearly 20 metres while about 15 police officers held him by his private parts.

He stated that he was from a meeting in Zambia on the day and upon return home on Friday afternoon, he found that there would be a meeting of executive officials of TUCOSWA and the meeting was to be held at the SNAT Centre.

"As I approached the main gate to the venue of the meeting, I found a contingent of police officers who were all over the gate. I walked inside and found other officials in the boardroom. While preparing to start our meeting, the police came and ordered us out of the boardroom.

"They told us we cannot proceed with the meeting. They then drove us out of the board-room. We moved out and got inside our bus and locked ourselves inside.

While inside, police surrounded the bus. They then moved to the back of the SNAT bus and forcefully opened its back side. That is when they grabbed me and pulled me out of the vehicle," Mhlanga alleged.

He said they then dragged him for about 20 metres from the bus before they started kicking him all over the body and while sprawled on the turf, one of them kicked him in the mouth and he felt like there was sand stuffed in his mouth.

All this happened outside the SNAT Centre premises on the road leading to Manzini Central High. He stated that when he tried to spit, blood and a white stone-like thing came out of his mouth; he took it and discovered that it was one of his front teeth and blood oozed out.

Police left him lying on the ground. In his papers, he stated that he was taken to hospital where Dr Themba Ntiwane treated him for bruises all over his body.

The report annexed to his papers states that the clothes Mhlanga was wearing were slightly soiled and he had bruises on the back of his shoulders and neck.

Other injuries that he suffered, according to the report, were on his private parts and there were also bruises on his calf and upper hip.

Representing the Ambassador of the Republic of China (Taiwan), Jeremy Liang was Minister Chancellor Oliver Harn who mentioned that renewable energy is one of future power sources.

"The government of China (Taiwan) makes efforts to speed up the associated planning and deployment of green energy, in order to make Taiwan's energy system more resilient, more efficient and cleaner

The Kingdom of Eswatini is wisely planning to utilise abundant sunlight to serve its people as well,"

Harn mentioned that the government of the Republic of China (Taiwan) has committed financial and technical assistance to the Kingdom of Eswatini over the past 51 years to develop in the areas of rural electrification, health care, agriculture, ICT, and education,

He also stated that the donation of these solar PV systems, again, is a token of our bilateral long-term friendly and cooperative relationship between the two countries.

He further mentioned that the two nations were on the right track to diversify their power generation sources and ensure energy safety with an aim to protect their environment and further enhance the wellbeing of the public. "Taiwan and Eswatini are essential to the full implementation of the 2030 Agenda for sustainable development," he said.

Harn indicated that with Taiwan's continuous assistance, Eswatini will proceed to, slowly but surely, fulfil His Majesty's Vision 2022. 'Promise made, promise delivered.'

Speaking on behalf of the University was Vice-Chancellor Professor Justice Thwala, who stated that the launch of the centre came at a time when the institution had embarked on a new strategic plan of 2018-22, where research is placed as a priority amongst the areas of focus for the institution going forward.

'Churches should not encourage tibi tendlu'



THE church has been encouraged to bring an end to sexual violence by not only speaking against it, but taking a step further and reporting criminal cases which are perpetrated by and against church members.

This call was made by World Vision Eswatini led 'It takes Eswatini to end sexual violence against children' Campaign Manager Nontobeko Mbuyane while imploring pastors to be part of the campaign.

This was during the sensitisation of about 100 pastors affiliated with the Conference of Churches (CoC) at Esibayeni Lodge.

Mbuyane reminded pastors of their leadership role in the communities where they hold services and how congregants accede to their counsel. She stated that they were influential as their preaching impacted on various behaviours and this trait should be used to nurture change. Mbuyane reminded the pastors how some survivors of

gender-based violence spoke that they were counselled by their pastors and nothing happened thereafter. Imploring them to be objective in the manner they counsel members of their church who come before them, she said it was unfortunate that pastors were prone to favour the men and use language which defeated the reason the couple sought counselling in the first place.

"As such, after a session a pastor can be heard using words such as, 'I don't want to hear that you have been arguing again'. The couple is likely to suffer in silence because this will not encourage them to return in the event nothing changes," she stated.

She further noted how men were likely to be revered due to their social standing and hence find comfort in the church where they are welcomed and celebrated despite being perpetrators of heinous violent crimes against their partners.

Mbuyane called upon the church to not only speak against sexual violence and gender-based violence, but also act against it and not harbour perpetrators.

"Pastors are duty bound to protect the vulnerable within their churches. This includes ensuring that children live in spaces where they are well protected against abuse. Also, in cases of sexual violence, they are compelled by the Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence Act of 2018 to ensure that these cases are reported to the relevant authorities," Mbuyane said.

She cautioned that preachers need to find a balance between being spiritual counsellors as well upholding the law which calls for witnesses to sexual violence and GBV cases to report such. This was met with resistance from some pastors who stated that they were commissioned to rely on the Word of God which calls for them to foster forgiveness.


PASTORS MORE POWERFUL THAN CONGREGANTS

PASTORS have been urged to use the power they wield over congregants correctly.

Swaziland Action Group Against Abuse Communications and Advocacy Officer Slindele Nxumalo said it was up to the pastors to avoid situations where they are vulnerable to unwanted sexual advances by congregants.

Nxumalo stated that even though pastors were called upon to live a holy life, there were circumstances which called for them to reach for strength beyond the canal and be bigger than a situation.

She stated that in terms of seduction within the church, it was up to them to fight against this by talking to women who pose a threat to their own marriages and counsel them with a level head.

"It might be found that such women have been through abusive episodes in their lives and do not even realise that their behaviour is defective. It is, therefore, important that such situations be treated with empathy as well," said Nxumalo.

Further, the preachers were also trained on the Women and Law in

Southern Africa's Eswatini chapter (WLSA-Eswatini) case against government which successfully challenged common law marital power and the Marriage Act of 1964.

Conclude

"This came about because married women could not conclude contracts without her husband's permission nor administer property," said Legal Officer Dumisani Dlamini.

He clarified that their decision to challenge this law was not to say women were more important than men in a marriage.

It was to ensure that women were not denied their right as prescribed by the constitution that they are equal before the law with men and should be afforded equal treatment.

Pastors to preach for an end to sexual violence

ONE of the actions suggested after the training was that pastors should use their various platforms to speak against sexual abuse at every turn.

The fervent call was made by Conference of Churches Chief Executive Officer Themba Ngozo who decried the alarming rate at which women and children were being killed and violated. This was after extensive training on pertinent issues which affect the church where the law is concerned.

Ngozo suggested that every time they take to the pulpit should be an opportunity to remind their congregants about the need to end sexual violence and gender-based violence in their churches. Various pastors also called for the nation to come together in prayer in order to seek divine intervention on the scourge.

The training was made possible by World Vision as part of the nation-wide campaign commissioned by government, 'It takes Eswatini to end sexual violence against children'.

"Let us go out and make a differ-

in the country. We will be a respected stakeholder if we do that," Ngozo said to the pastors who were also empowered on the Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence Act of 2018.

They were also taught on their role in reporting crimes committed by or against congregants.

Enable

Ngozo stated that it was imperative for pastors to attend workshops such as this one as it would enable them to be better informed and nurture their congregants in the correct manner. "The churches that we lead will expand simply because we are empowered," he said.

Adding, he stated that empowerment sessions would ensure that submissions made in such meetings were informed. "When some make submissions in such meetings, it raises doubts about where they come from," he further said.

He called upon those who took part in the training to revert back to the CoC and inform them of how they would either like to be assisted further or give suggestions on how further trainings can be facilitated.

He further expressed his disappointment that only a handful of pastors attended whereas the country has over 3 000 who lead various denominations weekly.

E10 000 fine for being found with 244kg dagga

BY VUYILE DLAMINI Mbabane Magistrate's Court

A 25-year-old man faces seven years in prison after he was found guilty of being in possession of 244 kilograms of dagga.

A police raid led by Detective Constable Thami Mabuza was fruitful when they found 244.2 kilograms of dagga and 2.8 kilograms of dagga seeds concealed in Mduduzi Shabangu's homestead at Maphalaleni.

Shabangu was initially arrested alongside Thandekile Dlamini and Lethu Mavimbela, however, Dlamini and Mavimbela were acquitted and discharged after Shabangu pleaded guilty to possession of dagga and dagga seeds. Sentence

Along with Mabuza's statement before court, a forensic report submitted by the prosecution confirmed that the consignment was indeed dagga.

Before passing his sentence on Tuesday, Magistrate Sifiso Vilakati stated that dagga cultivation seemed to be a source of livelihood for dozens of families in the country.

"However, several cases of assault with intent to cause grievous bodily harm and murder have been linked to dagga and dagga wars.

Destroying

The court is in a better position to send a strong message to dagga farmers because the youth finds itself abusing this substance, thus destroying their futures in the process.

So many of the youth have been enrolled at the juvenile correctional centre because their lives have been ravaged by this poisonous substance and it must come to an end," the magistrate emphasised.

Magagula

Cultivation

Magistrate Vilakati further stated that it was the duty of the court to ensue that those involved in the cultivation and sale of dagga do not go unpun-

"However, if the court were to mete sentences without the option of the fine the correctional facilities would be packed to the rafters, when there is already a high number of prisoners held for having been in possession of dagga," he stated.

He further cited the Magistrate's Court Act of 1938, which states that the court in that jurisdiction cannot mete a sentence exceeding E10 000 or 10 years.

Conducting

After cautioning Shabangu to desist from conducting himself in this manner, the court sentenced Shabangu to serve seven years in a correctional facility, with the option to pay a fine of E10 000 for having been in possession of 244.2 kilograms of dagga.

E2 000 or two years of Shabangu's sentence was suspended, meaning he would pay E8 000 fine or serve five years in prison.

UK company to equip local pupils

A United Kingdom (UK) based company aims to contribute towards Vision 2022 by capacitating pupils through design and technology.

In that regard, eight schools from around the Manzini–Mbabane corridor will take part in a Makeathon Inspire Project.

The project will be staged at Elangeni High School tomorrow and on Sunday.

The project is funded by Formech International, a United Kingdom company in collaboration with the ministry of education and training.

Senior Inspector for Design and Technology Saxton Dlamini said the UK based company manufacturers supplies and services vacuum forming machines which are also included in the school curriculum under the design and technology departments.

Problem

He said the two-day Makeathon was a problem solving inspired project where pupils are expected to solve problems on environmental issues common not only locally but across the African continent.

He said these problems were divided into four key categories being water management, food security, sustainable energy as well as waste management.

One expert in each environmental matter has been identified by Formech and would assist and guide pupils on the two-day Makeathon projects.

Dlamini said Formech was not new to the kingdom as in 2017 and 2018, the company conducted workshops where they engaged two schools, namely Evelyn Baring and Ka-Boyce High.

He added that the company had expanded to eight high schools being Ngwane Park, Manzini Central, Elangeni, St Mark's, Ka-Schiele, St Mary's, SOS and Swazi National, where six pupils from each school were selected.

He stated that participating pupils had been selected on merit-performance on subjects by their teachers.

Selection

The selection was done in the format with two pupils from design and technology and one for the following subjects, science, agriculture, geography and consumer science.

He added that the pupils would be divided into eight teams where two teams from different schools would be competing separately on the environmental matters.

"A secret ballot system will be used to apportion the teams on the challenges they will be working on," he said.

He said Formech would provide resources and materials, experts as well as other provisions.

Pupils would design and make artefacts that solve each of the environmental challenges.

He said on the last day, the winning teams would be awarded prizes and certificates and the programme would start at 0800 hours to 1600 hours to allow pupils to reach their destination on time.

ESWATINI infrastructure has been ruled as the worst in terms of withstanding disasters.

The Construction Industry Council (CIC) has expressed concern on the standard of infrastructure in the country, mostly regarding government infrastructure.

This was raised during the commemoration of the International Day for Disaster Reduction Programme which is commemorated on October 13 worldwide.

However, Eswatini commemorated the day on Wednesday due to the fact that the 13th fell on the weekend.

National Disaster Management Agency (NDMA) Chief Executive Officer Russell Dlamini said this year's theme was 'Building to last'.

The day was aimed at equipping their stakeholders on building infrastructure that would last and withstand climate

change and disasters.

The NDMA was joined by CIC, Micro Projects, ministry of public works, ministries of health and education, amongst other stakeholders. Dr Gcebekile Dlamini from the CIC stated that Emaswati liked state-of-the-art infrastructure but they are not willing to spend.

"Emaswati believe that constructing infrastructure is cheap," she said.

Dlamini added that in the country 80 per cent of the time, the material used does not match or it is not the required material for that particular infrastructure.

Construction

She said there was a lot that needs to be done in order to capacitate construction stakeholders of the importance of using the correct material for each structure that is constructed.

The reason wrong material was used in building was the shortage of funds. The biggest culprit in the cutting of cost in infrastructure was government.

It was brought to the table that ever since government hit rock bottom in terms of the economy; every year it would be engaging the cheapest contractor in infrastructure.

The cutting of costs produces weak and prone to disaster infrastructure.

She stated that in as much as there was the cutting of costs; but there is lack of vigilance.

Delegating

Dlamini said government and individuals have a tendency of delegating all the work to contractors who might not be always trusted in terms of providing the much needed material and doing their work to the tee.

Dlamini also emphasised on the standard of material that is available in the retail stores.

"There is a lot of sub-standard material in the country's stores because currently the county does not manufacture a lot of building material," she said.

She further urged Emaswati to stay away from building stick and mud houses and explore the use of construction material

She said not every form of house required bricks, hence she advocate for exploring the material that is out there.



Recurrent spending at E3.3bn

SO far the total recurrent government spending of the overall annual budget allocated is at 28 per cent, which translates to E3.3 billion.

This has been hailed by the ministry of finance since this spending is in line with expectations.

According to the ministry of finance second quarter performance report, this is an outcome of the budget department efforts of striving to re-establish fiscal discipline sustainability, which remains key to macroeconomic sustainability.

The reason for the lower spending according to the report was because of controlled release of funds, cash management and commitment control by the ministry of finance aimed at managing available cash against government financing obligations.

Report

The report stated that the early release of funds for the second quarter amounted to E398.9 million, which was 2.67 per cent of the overall annual budget.

The report added that during the second quarter, the cash flow committee continued to meet frequently to discuss issues of revenue collected within the quarter by both government and the Eswatini Revenue Authority (SRA).

They agreed on solutions to challenges faced with regards to cash availability to run government business, particularly on prioritising payments against these revenues.

Spending on salaries was to E1.7 billion in the second quarter, which was around 51 per cent of a second quarter recurrent expenditure and 25 per cent of total annual personnel bud-

It is said expenditure on transfers (subsidies, grants and social benefits), expenditure on internal and external transfers amounted to E929.7 million and E24.8 million, respectively, in the second quarter.

This, according to the report, was 19 per cent of the total allocation for transfers

Under goods and services; it is said spending amounted to E724.76 million in the second quarter, around 27 per cent of total annual budget allocated for goods and services in 2019/2020.

As efforts to control expenditure, government indicated that the award of tenders has only been limited to urgent and priority expenditure.

During the quarter, the Eswatini Government Tender Board awarded tenders amounting to E2 billion of which E324.7 million is for pharmaceuticals and other medical supplies, E127.5 million being for roads and E1.55 billion for goods and services for various government ministries.

The report stated that the controls on the award of tenders would continue to ensure that commitments are contained within the available resources.







TRADE wars, protectionism and nationalist rhetoric are combining to weave the possibility of a nightmare debt crisis that could be worse than any previously experienced.

Global borrowing is now at the highest levels since the 1950s and history suggests we should take this as a warning that a debt crisis could be looming.

Were one to materialise, it could inflict greater dislocation on international financial systems and national economic stability than ever previously witnessed, especially in this highly uncertain environment characterised by the trade war and regional disintegration.

This would be particularly tragic in view of the extraordinary global commitment to delivering Sustainable Development Goals, and as so many nations seem finally to be in earnest about tackling the causes and impact of the climate crisis.

The impact of a parallel crisis in global debt would derail this and could make much needed international cooperation on poverty and progress impossible.

Governments would be diverted by the need to stabilise local economies devastated by unmanageable debt.

Yet such a scenario can be averted.

Haunting memories of the economic chaos, poverty and suffering caused by previous debt crises are the reason that the finance ministers of Commonwealth are working together to prevent the needless recurrence of an avoidable crisis.

The breadth and inclusiveness of the Commonwealth mean that when our member countries meet, many perspectives are brought to the table.

These can be shared to decisive effect when Commonwealth countries work together to ensure the voices and views of all are taken into account at forums such as the G20 and other international and regional gatherings.

It is no longer feasible for policies on debt, trade and other economic matters to be considered in isolation from the increasingly extensive impacts of climate change, which are becoming more frequent and more stark.

Disaster

Small island states tend to be the most vulnerable to extreme weather and natural disasters, and also to have the least resilience or resources with which to recover from the damage to their infrastructures and economies.

With interest rates at historically low levels, borrowing becomes an attractive proposition yet heightens the concomitant risk of debt ballooning to levels which are unsustainable over the longer term.

This raises the possibility that countries which have 'borrowed their way out of trouble' following a setback will eventually face very severe debt distress.

Preventing such eventualities is a global challenge which requires collective and coordinated responses.

The Commonwealth is particularly and perhaps uniquely well-placed to ensure that the perspectives and needs of developing nations are fully considered in multilateral discussions on policy for tackling future debt crises.

This is the purpose of our Commonwealth Finance Ministers Meeting taking place in Washington DC alongside the annual meetings of the World Bank and International Monetary Fund.

THE WORLD MUST NOT SLEEP-WALK INTO ANOTHER DEBT CRISIS

The ministers of our 53 diverse and widely distributed yet closely connected nations will this year examine proposals designed to improve debt transparency.

They will consider ways in which debt contracts can be specially amended to provide relief during disasters.

Such initiatives will be supported by collating the perspectives of ministers from developing countries so that their Commonwealth counterparts from countries with advanced economies can carry them forward for the attention of the G20.

The way to a stable and sustainable economic future is for developing and developed countries to work together inclusively on shaping the global debt rules which affect them all. So our Commonwealth approach is to focus on the roles of creditor and indebted countries.

There have been instances of hidden national debt burdens, and this places responsibility on creditors as well as debtors.

In countries where fiscal regulation is weak, debt may be acquired or accumulated in ways which are not transparent, and very seriously to the detriment of citizens.

Those who provide credit in such circumstances are also culpable, and they too must be scrutinised and be made to bear responsibility – particularly as those who suffer the most pain from unsustainable debt and carry the greatest burden at times of crisis tend to be the poor and marginalised – those least able to cope.

Among topics and actions being considered at our 2019 Commonwealth Finance Ministers meeting are:

Debt Relief – with an agreement to be sought for debt contracts with vulnerable countries to include provision for relief if a severe natural disaster strikes.

Transparency in debt through innovation – encouragement to use the Commonwealth Meridian debt management system which helps to improve the accuracy with which government debt is recorded.

Dialogue on debt – the re-launch of the Commonwealth debt management forum to encourage international dialogue on the consequences of over-indebtedness so that sounder debt policies are adopted in order to prevent crises. ● Easier access to financing to reduce debt burdens – through mechanisms and facilities such as the Commonwealth Climate Finance Access Hub and Commonwealth Disaster Finance Portal which offer added capacity for developing countries to access to affordable debt financing.

By working together in such practical ways, and on programmes that draw together a broad and inclusive array of nations, crises can be averted.

It is essential for there, to be honest, and open collaboration between creditors and debtors in a spirit of trust and goodwill.

This the Commonwealth can offer, building on the depth of our connection and the basis of equality on which our family of nations comes together.

Rather than sleep-walking towards yet another debt crisis, and the misery such nightmare reality would bring, the Commonwealth can open up pathways toward horizons of hope, with rich and poor walking in harmony towards a fairer, more secure, more sustainable and more prosperous future in which all can share.

Increases in credit limit under credit agree-

56. (1) A credit provider may increase the credit limit under a credit agreement -

(a) temporarily, as contemplated in subsection(2);

(b) by agreement with the consumer, subject to subsection (3)-

(i) in response to a written or oral request made by the consumer at any time; or

(ii) with the written consent of the consumer in response to a written proposal by the credit provider, which may be delivered to the consumer at any time; or

(c) unilaterally, in accordance with, and subject to the limitations set out in, subsection

(2) An increase in the credit limit under a credit agreement is temporary where-

(a) the credit provider honours an instrument issued by the consumer, despite the fact that it results in a debt that exceeds the established credit limit; or

(b) the increase is to accommodate a particular transaction, on condition that the preceding credit limit will again apply within a specified period, or after a specified occurrence has taken place.

(3) Prior to the increase of a credit limit in terms of subsection (1)(b), the credit provider shall undertake another assessment of the ability of the consumer to meet the obligations that could arise under that credit agreement as required in Section 26.

(4) Where the consumer has, at any time, in writing, requested the option of having the credit limit automatically increased from time to time, a credit provider may unilaterally increase the credit limit under that credit

(a) once during each year, as measured from

(i) the date that the credit facility was estab-

(ii) the date on which the credit limit was most recently altered in accordance with subsection (1)(b); and

(b) by an amount not exceeding the lesser

(i) the average monthly purchases or cash advances charged to the credit facility by the consumer; or

(ii) the average monthly payments made by the consumer, during the twelve (12) months immediately preceding the date on which the credit limit is increased.

(2) Where, in increasing the credit limit under a credit facility, the credit provider alters any other term of the credit agreement, the credit provider shall comply with the requirements set out in section 24.

(5) A credit provider shall not make an offer to increase the credit limit under a credit facility, or induce a person to accept such an increase, on the basis that the limit will automatically be increased unless the consumer declines the offer.

Unilateral amendments by credit provider

57. (1) Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary in a credit agreement, a credit provider shall not unilaterally change-


(a) the period for repayment of the principal

(b) the manner of calculating the minimum payment due periodically under a credit facility, subject to Section 55(4).

(2) Except as otherwise provided for in section 42, a credit provider shall give the

consumer written notice of at least five days of a unilateral amendment to a credit agreement and in that notice shall set out the particulars of the amendment. Rescission and Termination of credit agreements

THE CONSUMER CREDIT ACT OF 2016



Rescission of credit agreement

58. (1) A consumer may rescind a credit agreement within five days after the date on which the agreement was signed by the consumer, by-

(a) delivering a notice in the prescribed manner to the credit provider; and

(b) tendering the return of any money or goods, or paying in full for any services, received by the consumer in respect of the agreement.

(2) Where a credit agreement is terminated in terms of this section, the credit provider-

(a) shall refund any money the consumer has paid under the agreement

within seven (7) days after the delivery of the notice to terminate; and

(b) may require payment from the consumer for-

(i) the reasonable cost of having any goods returned to the credit provider and restored to saleable condition; and

(ii) a reasonable rent for the use of those goods for the time that the goods were in the consumer's possession, unless those goods are in their original packaging and it is apparent

(iii) reasonable cost incurred by the credit provider in initiating and delivery of the credit.

that they have remained unused;

(3) In this section, 'reasonable costs' means an initiation fee and delivery cost.

(4) A credit provider to whom property has been returned in terms of this section, and who has unsuccessfully attempted to resolve any dispute over depreciation of that property directly with the consumer, may apply to a court for an order in terms of subsection (5).

(5) Where, on an application in terms of subsection (4), a court concludes that the actual fair market value of the goods depreciated during the time that they were in the possession of the consumer, a court may order the consumer to pay to the credit provider a further amount not greater than the difference between-

(a) the depreciation in actual fair market value, as determined by the court;

(b) the amount that the credit provider is entitled to charge the consumer in terms of subsection (3)(b).

Termination of credit agreement by consumer

59. (1) A consumer may terminate a credit agreement at any time by paying the settlement amount to the credit provider, in accordance with Section 97.

(2) In addition to subsection (1), a consumer may terminate an hire purchase agreement, secured loan, by-

(a) surrendering to the credit provider the goods that are the subject of that agreement in accordance with section 99; and

(b) paying to the credit provider any remaining amount demanded in accordance with Section 99 (7).

Termination of agreement by credit

60. (1) A credit provider may, at any time or where a consumer is in default under a credit agreement, terminate a credit agreement.

(2) A credit provider may, in respect of a credit facility-

(a) suspend that credit facility at any time the consumer is in default under the credit agreement; or

(b) close that credit facility by giving written notice to the consumer at least ten (10) days before the credit facility is closed.

(3) A credit agreement referred to in subsection (2) remains in effect to the extent necessary until the consumer has paid all amounts lawfully charged to that account.

(4) A credit provider may not close or terminate a credit facility solely on the grounds

(a) the credit provider has declined a request of the consumer to increase the credit limit; (b) the consumer has declined the offer of

the credit provider to increase the credit limit; (c) the consumer has requested a reduction in the credit limit, unless that reduction would reduce the credit limit to a level at which the credit provider does not customarily offer or establish credit facilities; or

(d) the card, personal identification code or number or other identification device used to access that facility has expired.

(5) The unilateral termination of a credit agreement by a credit provider as

contemplated in this section does not suspend or terminate any residual obligations of the credit provider to the consumer under that credit agreement or this Act.

COMMEMORATING INTERNATIONAL DAY FOR **DISASTER REDUCTION**



International Day for Disaster Reduction 13 October

THE International Day for Disaster Reduction celebrates how people and communities around the world are reducing their exposure to disasters and raising awareness about the importance of reining in the risks that they face.

It also encourages governments to participate in building more resilient communities and nations. Held every 13 October, the 2019 edition continues as part of the 'Sendai Seven' campaign, centred on the seven targets of the Sendai Framework. This year will focus on Target (d) of the Sendai Framework, reduce disaster damage to critical infrastructure and disruption of basic services. The International Day for Disaster Reduction began in 1989, after a call by the United Nations General Assembly for a day to promote a global culture of risk-awareness and disaster reduction.

Many people around the world have lost their lives, homes or access to essential facilities, such as hospitals, due to natural disasters, including earthquakes, droughts, tsunamis, heavy flooding, hurricanes or cyclones. Some of these disasters have caused economic damage to some countries, including Eswatini. Education, training, and information exchanges are effective ways to help people become better equipped in withstanding natural disasters.

What is Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR)?

Disaster risk reduction is the concept and practice of reducing disaster risks through systematic efforts to analyse and reduce the causal factors of disasters. Reducing exposure to hazards, lessening vulnerability of people and property, wise management of land and the environment, and improving preparedness and early warning for adverse events are all part of disaster risk reduc-

NDMA operates a comprehensive mandate of promoting and managing the overall disaster risk management function of the country by entrenching the concept of disaster risk reduction in the overall development practice of all institutions, sectors and systems.

Disaster risk reduction strategies include, primarily, vulnerability and risk assessment, as well as a number of institutional capacities and operational abilities. The assess-

ment of the vulnerability of critical facilities, social and economic infrastructure, the use of effective early warning systems, and the application of many different types of scientific, technical, and other skilled abilities are essential features of disaster risk reduction.

The Sendai Framework for Disaster risk reduction presents some lessons from the Hyogo Framework for Action 2005-2006. It lists among others, that it is "urgent and critical to anticipate, plan for and reduce disaster risks in order to more effectively protect persons, communities and countries, their livelihoods, health, cultural heritage, socio-economic assets and ecosystems and thus strengthen their resilience".

Why DRR is essential for Eswatini?

The Kingdom of Eswatini is already experiencing changes in climate such as higher temperatures, changing rainfall patterns, and varying frequencies of natural hazard events. Natural hazards and climate change extremes pose a significant development challenge to the country.

A single disaster event has the potential to erode many years of economic development gains by damaging critical infrastructure and by diverting resources away from development spending, such as health and education services, toward disaster response and reconstruction efforts.

Disaster risk reduction, resilience building and promoting sustainable development are key to achieving a number of goals.

Disaster risk reduction is the only way to ensure that disasters do not derail sustainable development and poverty alleviation.

The disaster risk profile of Eswatini is characterised by slow onset natural hazards such as droughts including quick/rapid onset hazards like floods and the impact from these phenomena is exacerbated by the stagnant economic growth. All these hazards occur in complex economic and socio-ecological systems.

Over the years, Eswatini has been confronted by a variety of hazards that are influenced by many dri-

vers that include climate change, poor land-use planning, poverty and inequality, weak disaster risk governance, rapid population growth and rapid urbanisation. These hazards have added to the frequent reoccurrence of disasters such as storms (hail and wind), droughts, fires, heat waves, disease outbreaks among others. These disaster events cause significant damages and considerable threat to the development of the country by destroying infrastructure, loss of crops and injury to people, affecting the livelihoods of the already vulnerable commu-

The impacts of disasters in the Eswatini context ties the country with experiences of massive economic losses which affects the country's GDP and in turn erode livelihood means causing a significant population size to be chronically dependent on food and other humanitarian aid.

What needs to be done?

Addressing the challenges posed by the economic impacts of climate change and natural disasters requires risk-informed planning across sectors, levels of government, and organisations. It is important that individuals, ministries, and agencies from both public and private sectors take concrete actions to understand risks, address vulnerabilities and make development plans that take these risks into account. In the planning process, actions must be well funded and integrated into the development process of each sector.

Working in partnership, government can create an enabling environment for disaster risk reduction - empowering farmers and workers to better understand how disasters will impact them, ensuring that people have access to accurate and clear information, and promoting effective risk management approaches that can leverage public investment.

It is clear to all and sundry that Eswatini needs to institutionalise and mainstream disaster management and disaster risk reduction within organs of state, the private sector as well as municipalities. Disaster risk reduction must form part of the planning of every institution. This in turn will reduce the risk of disasters and further help protect development investments, thus enabling societies to accumulate wealth, in spite of the hazards they face.

Eswatini needs to generate and make a more effective use of scientific data and information, identify knowledge, use indigenous knowledge and capacity gaps and co-produce solutions that can effectively support decisions and actions towards resilience building. Education and public awareness programmes can also go a long way in ensuring that all communities understand the different disaster risk factors and scenarios and are able to apply preventative measures.

As we mark the International Day of Disaster Reduction, we should be mindful of the need to do everything we can to reduce exposure to hazards, lessen the vulnerability of people and property and manage land and the environment wisely. Eswatini needs to also improve preparedness and early warning systems for adverse events. Lastly, achieving disaster risk reduction and increased resilience requires increased collaboration across governments and key stakeholders.

MARKET FOR MEAT, LIVE **GOAT GENERALLY HUGE**

THE market for both live goats and their meat both locally and internationally is generally huge.

This was disclosed by the Minister of Agriculture Jabulani Mabuza during the smart-innovative goat farmer's workshop held at Edwaleni Farm Lodge yesterday.

He said the goat population in the country was over 500 000 compared to cattle, further stating that in comparison to cattle, goats are affordable, easier to keep and take much less supplementary feed, yet they are breeders giving two to three off-springs per year.

"I am informed that the national population of goats has increased to match that of cattle by over 500 000 and 95 percent are in the traditional sector where they are kept for mainly domestic meat, cultural uses and as source of income. However, there is a need for concrete strategies on how to access the supply market and since joining the ministry, I am learning a lot about agriculture and I now appreciate both the opportunities and challenges facing the farming community," he said.

He said there was a good breeding population of goats on one side and an undersupplied market on the other side and what was missing was a reliable link between the


Mabuza also mentioned that the ministry's Livestock Development Policy of commercialisation has evolved overtime to embrace the overarching objective to promote entrepreneurship in order to increase livestock productivity. It is also to contribute to employment, food security, income generation, GDP and stewardship for indigenous genetic resource and the environ-

"Commercialisation, to you the individual goat farmer, in simple terms means producing goats for the purpose of selling to the markets to make money

"We, therefore, encourage our farmers to produce goats in the quality and numbers required by the markets and make money," he added.

As the ministry implements commercialisation the focus is on:

- Inculcating the spirit of entrepreneurship in livestock farming
- · Focusing in agri-business training /practices
- Accessibility to credit lines/finance
- · Linkage/Contract to market
- Group formations/dynamics/ Partnerships



Farmers urged to work with abattoirs in contract farming arrangements

MINISTER of Agriculture Jabulani Mabuza believes, in terms of contract marketing and partnerships, it is very critical and strategically for farmers to work with a buyer or abattoir in a contract farming arrangement.

Mabuza said this during the smartinnovative goat farmer's workshop held at Edwaleni Farm Lodge yesterday.

"Typically in contract farming, the farmer or group of farmers commit to provide agreed quantities/ number of quality slaughter goats timely. The buyer/abattoir also commits to buy all the slaughter goats at a predetermined price per kg live weight," he said.

He further stated that in well advanced contract partnerships, the buyer may also support production through the supply of inputs and/or extension services.

Third partners such as financial institutions etc. may also be involved in the contract farming.

"Our experience has taught us that large-scale farmers are vanguards or forerunners in the establishment of production systems, mass production and maintenance of a healthy supply of primary products of animal origin to the processors," he said.

He added that these farmers were usually conscious of required or prevailing production standards and also have a better voice in the negotiations for

The necessity for small scale farmers

is not only to increase their scale, but also to access the formal market secured or anchored by the large scale farmers. "Under this arrangement, there must
It is advisable that a reasonable share growing scale farmers.

"Currently, there are at least 16 buyers who are constantly looking for slaughter goats to buy. However, to expand the value chain to supply export market; there is an urgent need for a larger scale export standard abattoir. This is another opportunity to consider.

Government's expectation is that with a national goat population of 500 000, the value chain should be able to deliver more than 100 000 slaughter goats per annum to the formal market, with a meat yield of 1500 tonnes (plus 15kg meat per goat)," he added.

Mboweni may present mid-term budget earlier

JOHANNESBURG - Finance Minister Tito Mboweni said yesterday that he was looking at presenting his Medium Term Budget Policy Statement (MTBPS) at an earlier date than the announced October 30.

This comes after National Treasury shifted the MTBPS from the usual week of 23 October due to international commitments by both Mboweni and President Cyril Ramaphosa.


Speaking ahead of the third colloquium on the SA economy in Pretoria, Mboweni said that Ramaphosa would be out of the country on the planned date.

"I need to say here that the MTBPS is likely to be presented earlier than the 30th. We had initially planned on the 30th of October and planned it around the president's diary. It turns out he will be out of the country," Mboweni said.

"So we needed to pull back the date. I'm saying this to avoid any rumour mongering in the markets. And the date we are looking at now is the 29th of October, but

the Cabinet Secretariat will make the announcement probably later today."

Mboweni's much-anticipated MTBPS will be watched with a keen eye by investors and Moody's

"It must prove a breakdown in trust and confidence. More importantly, a court of law has decided that the alleged breakdown is not complete or irretrievable. That decision whether it is correct or not stands as we speak," Moyo said in the court documents.

Moyo has also sued Old Mutual and its directors for contempt of court after refusing to let him resume his duties

"If Old Mutual is unable to establish facts, which would objectively entitle it to conclude that there has been a breakdown in trust and confidence, it is illegal and unlawful to simply terminate my employment relationship," said Moyo.

Confidence

Moyo was suspended from the board in May for a breakdown in trust and confidence.

He was fired in June, and again in August in an open letter to shareholders in which the company said it was clearly in the best interests of the company and its stakeholders that the employment relationship with Moyo should come to an

One of most traded commodities discovered by goat herder

CAPE TOWN - One of the most traded commodities in the world, which has been very lucrative, came into being after it was discovered by a goat herder.

Kaldi, a goat herder from Ethiopia, noticed his goats "dancing" after eating bright red berries off a certain bush. He took the berries to an Islamic monk in a nearby Sufi monastery who disapproved of the berries and threw them into the fire, from which an enticing aroma billowed and coffee was born. The name coffee came from the region in which the berries were discovered, Kaffa.

Ethiopia, formerly Abyssinia, is a country in East Africa with the fastest growing economy in the world, and the only country in Africa that has never been formally colonised. It is also the second most populous country in Africa, with an estimated population of 109 million people (2018).

With a population that big it is characterised by dozens of ethnic groups with competing claims to land, resources and influence. Ethiopia's Prime Minister Abiy Ahmede has struggled to contain ethnic clashes.

In 2018, nearly three million Ethiopians were displaced by conflict, the highest figure recorded worldwide, with Islamist militant groups al-Shabaab and Islamic State planning attacks on the country recently

Prompted

Emperor Haile Selassie, the former king of Ethiopia, asserted that the people of Africa should join forces and form a singular race. This prompted the introduction of Pan Africanism. This idea emerged to become what is known as the African Union today, headquartered in Ethiopia's capital, Addis Abba.

Ethiopia's economy experienced strong, broadbased growth averaging 10.3 per cent a year from 2006/07 to 2016/17 (African Development Bank 2017), compared to a regional average of 5.4 per cent. Bordered by six countries, Ethiopia's location gives it strategic dominance on the Horn of Africa, close to the Middle East and its markets.

Ethiopia's main challenges are sustaining its positive economic growth and accelerating poverty reduction, which require significant progress in job creation as well as improved governance.

Despite the economic growth, only 60 per cent of the population have access to electricity; 65.7 per cent of households have access to potable water; and the paved-road density is among the lowest in Sub-Saharan Africa. Economic growth has not translated into human development or improvement in the quality of life, as poverty is

RETAIL SALES FALL BELOW MARKET EXPE

JOHANNESBURG-Retail sales moderated to 1.1 per cent year on year in August, following a two per cent increase in July, falling below the market consensus of 1.7 per cent.

Data from Statistics South Africa (StatsSA) on Wednesday showed household furniture, appliances and equipment recorded the largest annual growth rates at 4.5 per cent and all 'other' retailers at 3.8 per cent.

StatsSA said the print reading ever, dragged down by weakening growth in all other categories, including the textiles and clothing segment and the pharmaceutical and medical goods grouping.

Senior FNB economist for property and consumer Economics, Siphamandla Mkhwanazi, said the year-to-date retail sales growth continued to depict a muted demand environment.

"This is reflected in the persistently low retail inflation readings, which remain below consumer price inflation levels, averaging just 2.4 per cent year-to-date," Mkhwanazi said.

"This demonstrates retailers' inability to pass on price increases, amid intensi-



fied bargain hunting by consumers."

Mkhwanazi said their expectations of lower interest rates combined with strong unsecured credit lending will provide auxiliary support for consumer spending.

"This, however, is counteracted by the persistent pressures on consumers' discretionary income, via weaker labour markets and higher income taxes," he said.

Seasonally adjusted sales decreased 0.9 per cent compared with July, following month-on-month changes of 0.2 per cent in July and 0.7 per cent in June.

StatsSA, however, said the seasonally adjusted sales increased 0.7 per cent in

the three months ended in August, compared to the corresponding quarter.

The retail inflation rose moderately to 2.9 per cent in August, but was still notably below consumer price inflation.

Investec economist Lara Hodes said August's modest reading was reflective of a still-constrained consumer demand environment, underpinned by muted economic growth. Hodes said rising unemployment amid weak economic growth over the past 10 years had gradually weakened consumers' financial health, with consumption growth likely to remain constrained in the near term. JOHANNESBURG - South Africa's rand inched lower early yesterday, extending the previous session's sharp drop as the latest nationwide power cuts by state utility Eskom renewed fears of credit ratings downgrades.

At 0610 GMT, the rand was 0.08 per cent weaker at 14.9520 per dollar, after sliding as much as one per cent to a one-week low 15.0550 in the previous session. Eskom said break-downs at some of its coal-burning plants hit its power generation ability, forcing it to shave supply to the national grid. Debilitating power cuts in February and March pushed first-quarter economic growth into contraction and raised the likelihood of South Africa losing an investment-grade rating.

Moody's is the last of the big three credit rating agencies to have an investment grade rating on South Africa and is due to deliver its latest credit review on November 1, two days after Finance Minister Tito Mboweni gives his midterm budget speech. Bonds were flat in early trade, with the yield on the benchmark government issue due in 2026 steady at 8.265 per cent. *Fin24*

SA faces possible tax revenue shortfall of R50bn

JOHANNESBURG - Perhaps most critically of all, if SARS is to be successful, it has to regain the confidence of taxpayers.

By the end of August, the South African Revenue Service (SARS) had collected 37 per cent of the total tax budget for the 2019/2020 year. By the same point last year, it had reached 39 per cent.

This suggests that the organisation is going to have a hard time reaching its tax collection targets.

"Extrapolating tax receipts year to date points to a R97.9 billion shortfall in tax revenue for the full year 2019/20," says Sanisha Packirisamy, economist at Momentum Investments.

"But after taking account of seasonality and a normalisation in Vat [value-added tax] refunds, the shortfall falls to around R50 billion."

If this does materialise, it would be a fairly significant chunk out of the country's revenue. It is more than the entire amount Finance Minister Tito Mboweni budgeted to spend on public transport this year

Undoubtedly, South Africa's weak economic growth is affecting how much tax SARS is able to collect

It is, however, difficult to know how much should be ascribed to this, and how much is due to the revenue service still struggling to reconstitute its operations after years of mismanagement.

As the Nugent Commission of Inquiry into Tax Administration and Governance at SARS found last year, "integrity and governance" at the organisation had failed under its previous leadership. Nobody should be under any illusions that this, and the degradation of capacity it led to, can be corrected in a matter of a few months.

PIC backtracks on AYO allegations

CAPE TOWN – The Public Investment Corporation (PIC), reacting to a letter received from AYO Technology Solutions, has backtracked on the allegations made – by its acting executive head of legal, governance and compliance, Lindiwe Dlamini – in Parliament that Sekunjalo Investment Holdings, through AYO, was siphoning PIC-invested funds offshore.

During a question-and-answer session of the Standing Committee on Finance's proceedings, one of the committee members raised a question directed at the PIC's investment in Sekunjalo.

The question was raised with concern around allegations that Sekunjalo was in the process of moving its assets or funds offshore. In a statement yesterday, the PIC said it was aware of the allegations and indicated that it was considering the allegations very seriously.

The asset manager said it was engaging with relevant stakeholders to determine necessary action to be taken in order to safeguard its rights and assets invested in Sekunjalo through AYO. AYO Chief Executive Howard Plaatjes yesterday rejected these claims as baseless, categorically stating that the company's funds are intact and invested within South Africa. AYO has disclosed to the PIC where the funds have been invested.

"We respect and co-operate with local authorities the same way the PIC says in their statement today. We are open to engagement and the PIC as shareholders are free to raise their concerns directly with us instead of on public forums, which negatively impacts shareholder value," said Plaatjes.

AYO Chairperson Dr Wallace Mgoqi said AYO, as any company operating in South Africa today, would need to apply to the South African Reserve Bank (SARB) to obtain the proper regulatory approval to engage in a transaction of this nature. Plaatjes shared the sentiment, reiterating that AYO had neither made any application for SARB approval, nor did the tech firm intend to do so.

Low prices not pulling shoppers into stores anymore

CAPE TOWN - The "lowest prices" are not pulling shoppers into stores as much as they used to - value for money and the shopping experience is pulling feet through the door, according to the latest research by Nielsen South Africa.

"Today's consumer is demanding. Their mantra is 'it's all about me' and they want the experience, want to be entertained, want to be appreciated and respected. We need to create a simple and enjoyable experience for these consumers. Most of all, we need to make it personal," said Craig Tagg, MD of Retail Network Services, who spoke ahead of the South African Council of Shopping Centres Congress in Cape Town that started yesterday.

Quality

"Shoppers have become more savvy and critical of retail environments and despite being hyper aware of price changes, they also love quality products and demand an experience-driven retail environment. This has put pressure on retailers and manufacturers to innovate and convince shoppers to choose their stores and products over others," said Nielsen South Africa Consumer Insights Director Kim Reddy.

Shoppers now had more than one store in mind when they shopped, according to data from the 2019 Nielsen South Africa Shopper Trends Report.

This alluded to more bargain seeking behaviour and they also sought novelty, with 68 per cent claiming they would "check out" a new store in their area, the report showed.

Brochures

In terms of triggers for consumers shopping at new or different stores, 22 per cent of shoppers said it was because "a new store opened nearby," 20 per cent said word of mouth, while the same amount said they "were visiting friends/ family and went to a store that they usually shop at," while 18 per cent visited a new store because of "media leaflets, a brochure or direct mail."

"With shoppers always on the look-

out for promotions, new stores are seen to be attractive, as these are perceived to have enticing promotional campaigns running," said Reddy.

The majority of consumers still did their main shopping once a month, however, the frequency of weekly top up shopping was increasing.

"Everyday needs, special offers and meal prep shopping has increased with consumers more willing to spend outside of the monthly shop," said Reddy.

When it comes to how often shoppers visit specific store types, the penetration and frequency with which they shop at Supermarkets had increased. Spazas on the other hand had shown a decline in penetration, or the percentage of people who have visited the store over the past week and month. However, the frequency of visits to spazas remained the same as in 2018.

The research found that consumer perceptions around food prices were stable, with only a one per cent increase (to 87 per cent) in those who believed that food prices were increasing versus 2018, and 12 per cent who believed that food prices were stable, the same percentage as the previous year.

Views

Respondents also said they were less averse to purchasing luxury items.

Cragg said small brands and independent retailers would play a key role in differentiating shopping experiences in what would become an increasingly challenging retail environment. "In light of this, property investors, landlords and shopping centre management companies need to develop symbiotic relationships and take responsibility for nurturing and growing these small businesses," he said. the risk "is just crazy". However, opting for the opposite of that, which means you and your spouse keep your wealth separate is also not wise.

"In practise, if you're starting a family there's usually one person in the relationship who is going to take a backseat on their career and their earnings aren't going to be quite what they used to be," she says.



'RESTAURANTS CREEP ME OUT'

...7-year-old girl relives rape ordeal in nightmares

PRETORIA - The seven-year-old girl who Nicholas Ninow admitted to raping has nightmares about him every night.

This is according to forensic social worker Karen Botha, who compiled a victim impact assessment report on the girl and her family.

"She [the child] says she still sees the accused when she goes to bed," Botha said.

Ninow who was jailed for life yesterday admitted raping the child in a female toilet at the Dros Restaurant in Silverton, Pretoria, in September 2018. He pleaded guilty to rape, possession of drugs and defeating the ends of justice.

Botha said the child was anxious and nervous when she consulted her early in October, 18 months after the

"The victim was extremely nervous and anxious. She spoke softly. She remembered what happened at Dros

and how she got hurt," Botha said.

Botha said the child told her that Ninow had threatened to kill her if she told anyone about what he had done to her.

"He told me if I told anyone, he would kill me. I'm scared of restaurants, they creep me out. Now I know you need to go with someone to the bathroom," the child told Botha.

Botha was told that she had wet her bed a day before she testified in court.

Botha said the child's maternal grandparents told her that the child's grades at school had dropped and that she had become emotional and tended to cry a lot, since the incident happened. "The family indicated that they want to keep the incident a secret," Botha said.

The child's mother, according to Botha, feels she has failed her daughter and that she feared she would no longer trust her to protect her.

"The mother wants the accused to

be handed a life sentence. The victim said he should be in jail to learn his lesson," Botha said, adding that the incident severely affected the child's wellbeing. She said the full impact of the rape on the child might become evident in years to come.

Meanwhile, Ninow's grandmother Pauline Gericke earlier told the court that Ninow was an impulsive person and had anger issues. She said she was once called at his school because he had gotten into a fight with other children. "He displayed anger towards himself at home."

She described her grandson as a "bubbly" person who would "go out and do it".

Gericke also pleaded with the public to not judge Ninow's mother, who introduced him to drugs. "My daughter is clean (now). I ask that you don't judge her too harshly. She lives with the guilt ... '

Free State bought 4 000 copies a day of Gupta newspaper

JOHANNESBURG -State capture-implicated former Free State finance MEC Elizabeth 'Elzabe' Rockman detailed to the state capture inquiry on Wednesday various meetings she had with members of the Gupta family and The New Age executives while she worked in then-premier Ace Magashule's office.

Rockman, who is accused of wrongdoing relating to the controversial Estina dairy farm project in Vrede, worked as a director-general in Magashule's office between September 2010 and March 2013 when she joined the Legislature.

She told the commission that she first met members of the Gupta family in August 2011.

"... The New Age newspaper (owned by the Gupta family) made a presentation to the provincial executive committee to get support for advertisements.

"My engagements were

mostly with [CEO] Nazeem Hawa and Ashok Narayan," she said.

2011, I was on the way to an executive committee meeting in Bethlehem. I was informed that

I was to meet people from The New Age. I was called by the premier (Ace Magashule). They wanted to meet before the exco started ... I don't know who organised the logistics

of the meeting. "They presented a proposal where we should enter into a subscription

agreement from The New Age. One of the Gupta brothers was present but I can't remember which one."

She said it was "not strange" for people outside government to arrive at venues where executive committee meetings were being held.

"The idea was that the office of the premier would enter into the subscription agreement on behalf of all departments," she said.

Magashule's office thereafter agreed to purchase 4 000 copies of The New Age (TNA) per day.

Rockman said she met the brothers again at a TNA business breakfast in May 2012 in Bloemfontein and again in December that year at the ANC's national conference.

"They were in the environment; it was not like they were not known and nobody ever engaged with them," she said. Rockman also visited the family at their Saxonwold home in April 2013.

"It was after I had left as director-KwaZulu-Natai general when appointed

Hawks arrest 20 officials for KZN driving licence fraud

DURBAN - Twenty officials were arrested on fraud charges for helping people pass their driving licence tests at a Midlands testing centre.

The 20 were arrested in an ongoing national investigation by the Road Traffic Management Corporation's (RTMC) National Traffic Anti-Corruption Unit and the Hawks.

Among those arrested was administrative clerk Thandazile Shelembe, one of 16 officials arrested at the uMngeni Driver's Licence Testing Centre in Howick.

She has pleaded guilty to charges of fraud and will be sentenced on Monday in the Durban Commercial Crimes Court.

From the same office, learner's licence examiner Waheed Monsoor will go on trial following an investigation into licence fraud.

Monsoor has already been found guilty by an internal disciplinary tribunal.

RTMC spokesperson Thulani Zwane said Monsoor was accused of filling in eye test sheets for learner's licence applicants.

"Monsoor has been criminally charged and her trial is set down for February 2020."

According to stats issued by RTMC, five officials, including the clerk, were arrested for learner's licence fraud, and one cleaner/groundsperson was arrested for participating in fraudulent activities regarding learner's licences.

The stats also reveal that nine applicants for learner's licence tests were arrested for committing fraud.

The chief in charge of the Howick Test Centre, Roger Everton, was among those arrested for learner's licence fraud. News24

I intentionally raped girl (7) at Dros Restaurant - Nicholas Ninow

JOHANNESBURG - Convicted rapist Nicholas Ninow has told the court that he started using drugs with his mother at a young age.

Ninow, who was convicted for life yesterday in the North Gauteng High Court in Pretoria where he was found guilty of raping a seven-year-old girl, told the court that he had taken drugs three days before the incident in September last year.

He admitted to raping the child in a female toilet cubicle at the Silverton Dros Restaurant in Pretoria.

Ninow told the court that he left work early three days before the incident. He called his drug dealer, who delivered drugs to him.

When he was at the Dros, he ordered

beer. He said he did not intentionally choose to sit in the kiddies' area. He also denied telling the waitress that he was waiting for someone.

On the day, Ninow said he consumed large quantities of alcohol and drugs. "I started drinking and it got out of control."

He said he moved to the bar area where he sat with a man he did not know. The court heard that Ninow did not

have money to pay his bill. This despite evidence before court that he told a waitress that she should tell him when his tab had reached R650.

He said he remembered going to the female toilet to take drugs.

"It's difficult to say what happened," Ninow said, breaking down in tears.

"This is something I have to live with... I made a mistake. I intentionally did those things to her.

"I knew what I was doing. I was in a different mind state. There was no emotion attached," he said.

Ninow told the court that he started using drugs at the age of 13. He was introduced to 'chemical' drugs by his mother. "The first time I consumed chemicals was with my mother."

He said his mother had always been on drugs. He described his relationship with his mother, who is 37 years old, as that of brother and sister.

He claimed drugs gave him a different personality and that they were a coping mechanism for him.

NO MORE EXCUSES, NPA TOLD

CAPE TOWN - Parliament's Standing Committee on Public Accounts (SCOPA) says its patience is wearing out on excuses provided by the National Prosecuting Authority (NPA).

This comes after National Director of Public Prosecutions, Advocate Shamila Batohi, said her organisation needed time to crack complex commercial crime cases and fix broken state institutions.

But Scopa insisted the honeymoon was over for Batohi, and it needed to start seeing action.

This was after the NPA said it had only managed to prosecute nine cases out of 881 referred to it by the Special Investigating Unit (SIU).

Batohi said one of the major challenges for the organisation was that it had vacancies for 700 prosecutors. But since 2015, the NPA's budget to hire more staff had been frozen by the National Treasury.

The Special Commercial Crimes Unit (SCCU), previously headed by advocate Lawrence Mrwebi, also has a huge vacancy rate.

"In the SCCU, the vacancy rate is 21 per cent to 28 per cent. It will take capacity and skill to deal with these complex cases," said Batohi.

She pointed out that the Hawks also had a huge vacancy rate.

"Corruption in these entities add to the problem," she said.

"We know what happened to the Hawks in recent times, like the NPA. It's such a dysfunctional situation. General Godfrey Lebeya (who is head of the Hawks) and I are working very closely. There are initiatives to unlock these logjams."

SCOPA Chairperson Mkhuleko Hlengwa said the committee's patience with the NPA was running out and they wanted to see the prosecution and conviction of officials for corruption.

Scopa members also indicated that levels of corruption in municipalities needed to be dealt with. Hlengwa also said there were several forensic reports on municipalities, but officials involved in corruption were not being held accountable.

On state entities and departments, Hlengwa said Scopa had not seen action by the NPA, and were concerned about the figures presented.

Hlengwa said South Africa was emerging from an era of corruption and state capture, but wanted to see results soon. "It's not an easy exercise, but it requires urgency," he said.

SIU head Andy Mothibi said the unit had conducted a number of investigations in various municipalities and would in time hand over their report to President Cyril Ramaphosa. Mothibi and Batohi also told Scopa they were now reviving the anti-corruption task team to clamp down on corruption in the state. The task team was criticised by Scopa a few years ago when it failed to prosecute cases worth R10bn in provinces and national departments.

Girl, 7, dies after succumbing to injuries sustained during 'rape'

LIMPOPO -A seven-year-old girl has died after she was allegedly raped two-and-a-half weeks ago, Limpopo police said yesterday.

Police Spokesperson Brig Motlafela Mojapelo said the girl was reported missing on September 29 in the Nebo policing area, outside Groblersdal.

"On the same day of her disappearance, the community went out and looked for the girl. It was reported that she was last seen with a known man," Mojapelo said.

Mojapelo said the girl was later found brutally raped. She died in hospital on Wednesday.

A 34-year-old man, who was assaulted by community members, was arrested.

He was charged with kidnapping and rape, and is expected to appear in the Nebo magistrate's courtyesterday.

Mojapelo said a murder charge would be added at his court appearance.

SAPS rubbishes NMB council claims

PORT ELIZABETH - Eastern Cape police refuted claims yesterday that a Nelson Mandela Bay council meeting was called off based on advice from police.

The meeting intended to unseat United Democratic Movement (UDM) Mayor Mongameli Bobani was cancelled amid 'imminent threats against councillors'.

A motion of no confidence brought by the Democratic Alliance (DA) was expected to be debated, but because of a 'high security risk', Council Speaker Buyelwa Mafaya of the African National Congress (ANC) cancelled the meeting at the eleventh-hour. Municipal Spokesperson Mthubanzi Mniki earlier said the meeting was cancelled in the interest of protecting the democratic processes of council and to execute council's duty to ensure the safety of office bearers. "Although we received threats in the past, the sheer intensity and viciousness of those received the last 24 hours necessitated us to make this decision in consultation with SAPS," said Mniki. Mafaya said the cancellation was due to advice received from police of a high security risk associated with the meeting.

However, Provincial Commissioner Lieutenant General Liziwe Ntshinga refuted any statement indicating that the meeting had to be called off on the advice of the SAPS.

"As a standard operating procedure, the SAPS monitors all possible volatile events. In this case, planning was done and we are in a state of readiness as the SAPS is mandated to maintain law and order."

We can't accept overspending on power stations

CAPE TOWN - Outa has slammed power utility Eskom over the announcement that load-shedding will take place for the rest of the week, saying the company is not improving public confidence in the utility.

"We cannot accept the constant overspending on new power stations and have Eskom fail to explain why they can't keep them running," said Heinrich Volmink, Outa's Executive Director on Policy.

Taxpayers

Outa said in a statement released on Wednesday that the 'excuses of malfunctioning boilers and conveyer belts' will fall on deaf ears, as electricity tariffs continue to rise.

"Eskom's slow pace of addressing the high costs of coal procurement and excessive manpower costs are a frustration to taxpayers, who have positioned Eskom as a burden that lacks the necessary expertise to keep the power on," said Outa's CEO Wayne Duvenage,

Eskom has blamed the power constraints on a broken coal conveyor belt at the Medupi power station in Limpopo, which cut its power output by half.

Blame

Five electricity generating units have also been reported to be unavailable due to boiler tube leaks.

Eskom also blamed outages on delays in the return to service of units that were on planned maintenance and said it is struggling with a limited diesel supply.

Members of Parliament have also expressed concern over the rotational power cuts implemented by Eskom as reports emerged that several matric exams centres were left in the dark.

The exams started on Wednesday

and learners were meant to do their Computer Applications Technology (CAT) practicals.


"The NSC examinations are normally a very stressful period for our young people.

When something like this happens and the examination must be halted, only to be continued when the electricity supply is restored, it can add to more stress," said Bongiwe Mbinqo-Gigaba, Chairman of Parliament's portfolio committee on basic education.

She said MPs were encouraged by the basic education department's commitment to alert Eskom to the fact that loadshedding could impact national exams.

The department has stated that it has backup exams in place for pupils who could not finish their practicals.

Cabinet approves longawaited energy plan

PRETORIA - Cabinet has approved a new plan mapping out the energy mix for the country up until 2030.

According to a Cabinet statement issued yesterday, the Integrated Resources Plan 2019 will be gazetted and made available on the department of mineral resources website. No date was given, but energy expert and advisor on the Presidential Sustainability Task Team for Eskom, Anton Eberhard said in a tweet on Wednesday night that the plan would be gazetted on Friday.

Mineral Resources and Energy Minister Gwede Mantashe will today brief media on the plan.

The IRP is the national electricity infrastructure development plan. It sets out the future of energy generation and includes projections for electricity demand, cost estimates, and sources of power, Fin24 previously reported. According to government, the plan is based on a least-cost electricity supply and demand balance. It takes into account security of supply and the environment.

Cabinet had first approved a draft IRP2018 in August 2018 – ahead of public consultations that took place between September and November 2018. "Most of the inputs received from the public, academics, experts from the energy sector and relevant stakeholders such as the National Economic Development and Labour Council and the Portfolio Committee on Energy, were included into the IRP2019," Cabinet said. Four nabbed for allegedly attempting to smuggle dagga


JOHANNESBURG-Four people have been arrested for dealing and smuggling in dagga, Gauteng police said yetserday.


FULL HOUSE: The compressed dagga worth an estimated R4.2m which was discovered by the cops.

ZIVI TEENS CALL FOR ACCESS TO BIRTH CONTROL

HARARE - Civil society organisations are calling the Zimbabwean Government to remove age restrictions in accessing reproductive health services among adolescents.

Civil organisation that work with adolescent girls and young women said access to preventive tools would also help reduce AIDS-related deaths and unsafe abortions.

The organisation said laws and poli-

cies regulating access to such services in Zimbabwe created barriers for adolescents and blocked their access to vital services to protect themselves.

"The age of consenting to sexual activity and the minimum age of marriage should not be linked to the age at which adolescents can access sexual and reproductive health information, education and services," said the organisations. The organisations said

22 percent of adolescent females aged 15 to 19 years had begun child bearing,17 percent had given birth and another five percent were estimated to be pregnant with their first child.

Statistics also showed that 48 percent of young people in the country did not know their HIV status as they required parental consent to get test-

UK chose Brexit to build ties with Africa - official

LONDON -The United Kingdom chose Brexit not because it does not like the Europeans, but because the UK believes the future of trade lies in a broader relationship with the fastest-growing regions in the world – Asia and Africa.

This is according to Nick Latta, Councillor: Prosperity at the UK High Commission in SA. Latta told delegates at the Africa Ports and Rail Evolution conference in Durban on Wednesday that the goal set by the UK was to be the largest G7 investor in Africa in six years' time.

'Big ambitions'

"Brexit is quite complicated. I am not going to try and predict what will happen over the next 10 days or so. If I had a good answer to that, I would be a forex trader, not a diplomat," Latta said during a presentation which formed part of the KwaZulu-Natal Export Week segment.

"We have big ambitions for trade with Africa, and especially South Africa, which is a leader and influencer for rest of Africa.

"It is clear South Africa is a gateway for many businesses wanting to enter Africa, and many large African companies have headquarters in Johannesburg." He assured the audience that "[b]ar a few administrative details, any SA exporter will have the same access and experience when exporting to the UK which they have had until now. ANA

UN-backed Tripoli government is restricting our oil revenues

BENGHAZI - The head of Libya's parallel government in the east said rival UN-backed authorities in Tripoli have restricted oil revenues to areas under its control, as easternallied militias battle to seize control of the capital.

Libya remains split between two governments — one based in the eastern city of Benghazi, the other in the historical capital of Tripoli — after descending into chaos in 2011, when an international military coalition helped rebels overthrow longtime autocrat Moammar Gadhafi.

Benghazi-based Prime Minister Abdullah al-Thani told The Associated Press Tuesday that the country's eastern regions were receiving only about US \$126 million monthly for public salaries, despite holding most of Libya's oil facilities.

However, he said the Tripoli-based government, which controls Libya's Central Bank, has continued to give oil revenues to "outlawed groups and militias."

He said his government resorted to loans to carry on with its administrative tasks such as providing health and other services in its region.

Nigerian president vows crackdown on abusive Islamic schools

ABUJA - Nigeria's president ordered a crackdown on abuse at Islamic schools, after a second police raid in less than a month revealed men and boys subjected to beatings, abuse and squalid conditions.

Nearly 300 had been held captive at a school in the Daura area of Katsina, the home town of President Muhammadu Buhari, where police said they discovered 'inhuman and degrading treatment' following a raid on Monday to free the remaining students.

Late last month, police freed hundreds from similarly degrading conditions in neighbouring Kaduna state.

"President has directed the police to disband all such centres and all the inmates be handed over to their parents," said a presidential spokesman. "The government cannot allow centres where people, male and female, are maltreated in the name of religion," he said.

Prior to this week's raid, hundreds of captives had escaped the centre, police said on Tuesday.

The 67 inmates who were freed by Katsina police were shackled, and many were taken to hospital for treatment, police superintendent Isah Gambo told Reuters.

"I tell you they were in very bad condition when we met them," Gambo said.

A freed captive told Reuters on Monday

that the instructors beat, raped and even killed some of the men and boys held at the facility, who ranged from 7 to 40 years of age. It was not immediately possible to verify his account.

While the institution told parents it was an Islamic teaching centre that would help straighten out wayward family members, the instructors instead brutally abused them and took away any food or money sent by relatives.

Police said they had arrested the owner of the facility and two teachers, and were tracking other suspects.

The more than 200 captives who escaped were still missing, Gambo said. Police were working to reunite the others with family members.

"The inmates are actually from different parts of the country - Kano, Taraba, Adamawa and Plateau States," he said. "Some of them are not even Nigerians. They come from Niger, Chad and even Burkina Faso and other countries." News24

Zimbabwe bread price jumps 60%

HARARE - The price of bread, Zimbabwe's second most-consumed staple, jumped 60% overnight due to escalating costs of production, the national bakers' association said on Wednesday, adding more woes to consumers grappling with triple-digit inflation. Zimbabweans are experiencing severe economic hardship that has evoked memories of the hyperinflation horrors during late President Robert Mugabe's rule, when citizens lost pensions and savings and businesses were forced to shut down. *Reuters*

TRUMP TWITTER **ATTACK BACKFIRES** AS PELOSI OWN

NEW YORK - US President Donald Trump's Twitter attack on House Speaker Nancy Pelosi following an acrimonious White House meeting appears to have backfired spectacularly.

Trump tweeted a picture of the encounter on Wednesday showing a standing Pelosi pointing at the president while he and everyone else in the room was seated, with the caption "Nervous Nancy's unhinged meltdown!"

However, far from being upset at the picture, Pelosi posted it as her Twitter banner, and her supporters said it showed her literally standing up to Trump.

"Can a woman beat Donald Trump? Yes. Speaker Pelosi does it every day," Democratic Senator Amy Klobuchar said as she retweeted the picture.

"Thanks for the new cover photo @realDonaldTrump!," tweeted Pelosi's deputy chief of staff Drew Hammill.

Others pointed out that several members of Trump's cabinet looked as if they would rather be somewhere else.

"The men on your right reflect the embarrassment we all feel," tweeted actress Mia Farrow.

Pelosi has previously gone viral with her apparent trolling of Trump, with her slow clapping of his last State of the Union speech becoming an instant meme. After leaving the White House meeting, she told the press she prayed for the president and his family "all the time"

"Now we have to pray for his health, because this was a very serious meltdown on the part of the president," she said.

Hours later, Trump suggested Pelosi had mental problems of her own.

"Nancy Pelosi needs help fast! There is either something wrong with her 'upstairs,' or she just plain doesn't like our great Country. She had a total meltdown in the White House today. It was very sad to watch. Pray for her, she is a very sick person!," Trump tweeted.

One of the Democrats who attended the meeting, Senate Minority Leader Chuck Schumer, said Trump launched into a 'nasty diatribe' against them, while Pelosi said the president experienced a 'meltdown'. News24

Global darknet child porn probe leads to 337 arrests

US - International law enforcement authorities announced on Wednesday that a global investigation into child pornography sold for bitcoin on the underground internet had reaped 337 arrests and the shutdown of the dark web's most notorious paedophile site.

Authorities from the United States, Britain, South Korea and other countries said they had rescued at least 23 minor victims of sexual exploitation who were often video-recorded by abusers who then sold the videos on the now-shuttered "Welcome to Video" site on the darknet. The website sold the videos to users for bitcoin, which makes it extremely difficult to track the buyer. From June 2015, when 'Welcome to Video' started up, to

March 2018, the website received at least 420 bitcoin virtual currency - around US \$370 000 at the time of the payments - in at least 7 300 transactions, the US Justice Department said in an indictment.

The server, which had about 250 000 videos, was seized by US, British and South Korean police on March 5, 2018 and the operator, 23-year-old Son Jong Woo was arrested and jailed in Korea.

Since then hundreds of users from 12 countries have been tracked down and arrested. On Wednesday, US authorities unsealed a US indictment of Son as well as announcing the seizure of virtual currency accounts of 24 people in five countries that had been "used to fund the website and promote the exploitation of children". Saudi bus crash: 35 killed, four injured near Medina

MEDINA - Thirty-five people have been killed and four injured after a passenger bus collided with a truck in the Saudi province of Medina, a police spokesman said.

The 'private chartered bus', carrying 39 pilgrims from Asian and Arab countries, collided with a 'heavy vehicle' in the town of al-Akhal on Wednesday, the spokesman was quoted by official Saudi Press Agency (SPA) as saying.

The agency said the crash happened

around 7pm (16:00 GMT) on the road linking Mecca to the city of Medina.

The injured have been transferred to Al-Hamna Hospital, SPA added, and authorities have launched an investigation. The accident comes after four British pilgrims were killed and 12 others injured in Saudi Arabia when their bus collided with a fuel tanker in April

In January 2017, six Britons, including a two-month-old baby, were killed in a minibus on their way to Medina after making a pilgrimage to Mecca.

In September 2015, a stampede killed up to 2 300 worshippers - including hundreds of Iranians - in the worst disaster ever to strike the Hajj annual pilgrimage.

Earlier that month, 100 people were killed when a construction crane toppled into a courtyard of Mecca's Grand Mosque.

Liverpool head to United with widest gulf in years

LONDON - Premier League leaders Liverpool head to Old Trafford on Sunday to face Manchester United and rarely have the odds been so in favour of an away win.

Liverpool have won just five times at United in the Premier League era and the Red Devils have won the fixture 16 times, but the gulf in quality between the sides has widened sig-

nificantly in recent vears.

> While Jurgen Klopp's side have a 100 per cent

record in the Premier League, United have just two league wins this season and after their 1-0 defeat by Newcastle United the international break, they are down in 12th place, 15 points behind their archrivals. To add to their problems, United look set to be without goalkeeper David De Gea who picked up a groin injury on international duty with Spain. "David needs a scan. I think he'll be out. It certainly looked like it anyway...so it's just one of those things," said Manager Ole Gunnar Solskjaer.

Argentine Sergio Romero is expected to stand in for De Gea and can expect a busy time against Klopp's potent attack.

French midfielder Paul Pogba has not yet recovered fully from his ankle injury but there is better news on the fitness of on the fitness of forward Anthony Martial and full backs Luke Shaw and Aaron Wan-Bissaka.

"I can't tell you 100 per cent (who) is going to be fit as something might happen," said Solskjaer.

"But hopefully Aaron and Anthony will last the training this week and be available for selection. If it's for half a game or 30 minutes I don't know but let's see where they're

at," he said. United's Spanish midfielder Juan Mata believes the clash with their old rivals offers an opportunity to kick-start the season.

"We have a great chance to change the dynamic and we are all very motivated to take the win. We are United, we are playing at home and we will give everything to be able to take the victory that our fans deserve in such a special game," Mata said.

Champions Manchester City face a tricky trip to Selhurst Park to face a Crystal Palace team who beat them at the Etihad in January. Reuters

United want six signings in next two transfer windows

MANCHETSER - Manchester United want six big signings over the next two transfer windows to halt an unrelenting slide away from their rivals.

Manager Ole Gunnar Solskjaer has presided over the club's worst start to a season in 30 years. United sit 12th in the Premier League table, just two points above the relegation zone.

There is an acceptance at United that the squad requires a major overhaul, with the club targeting two strikers, two central midfielders, a central defender and a left back.

United have spent almost £1 billion since Sir Alex Ferguson's retirement in 2013 and are committed to financing anoth-

er raft of signings in a stark admission that their recruitment strategy has been inadequate.

The £80 million summer capture of Harry Maguire showed what United are prepared to pay to try

to reverse their fortunes. While there is an acceptance that January is a troublesome month to do business, United are aware of the

need to strengthen now. Goals have been in short supply - United have scored only seven times in their last 10 games - and there is a desire to add two strikers to ease the burden on Marcus Rashford and Anthony Martial.

One, they hope, will arrive in January, with Mario Mandzukic of Juventus and Lyon's Moussa Dembele of interest.

Solskjaer has already started phasing out the old guard, with Chris Smalling on loan at Roma, and Alexis Sanchez and Romelu Lukaku at Inter Milan. More departures will follow in the coming windows. Daily Mail

'My critics just repeat what they heard others say'

LONDON - Arsenal playmaker Mesut Ozil says his critics are missing the mark when they claim he does not perform well in the 'big'

Ozil has long been criticised for his inability to dictate or change the course of games against Arsenal's direct rivals. In 42 Premier League games against Chelsea, Liverpool, Manchester City, Manchester United and Tottenham, the German has scored six goals and assisted nine, while three Champions League meetings with Barcelona have garnered none of either. He has scored twice and assisted once in seven matches against Bayern Munich. The German says he is always blamed when Arsenal themselves perform poorly in such

games, also pointing out that 'small' games 'don't really exist'. "It always happens that an ex-player stands there on TV and criticises me," he told The Athletic. "Others just continue the theme and it gets in everyone's heads.

"If we don't do well in a 'big' game, it's always my fault. If that's true, how do you explain our results in the 'big' games when I wasn't involved? There's no real difference. I know people expect me to offer more, dictate play and make the difference -I do, too - but it's not that straightforward. 'I'm not the only player in the team and, don't forget, some of our opponents are simply better than us. Also, what is a 'big' or 'small' game? In the Premier League, anyone can beat anyone. Look at Wolves and Norwich beating Man City, or Newcastle and West Ham beating Man United.

"So, you can't say my good performances only came in 'small' games because these games don't really exist. The intensity is there in every match and often the 'small' teams raise their standard against the 'big' teams." AFP


Watford saved me - Rock legend Elton John

LONDON - British rock legend Elton John says Watford football club were his unlikely saviour as he experienced the 'worst period of my life' in the 1980's.

The 72-year-old Englishman -- known for his zany outfits when performing on stage and hits such as 'Rocket Man' and 'Goodbye Yellowbrick Road' -- has been chairman of 'The Hornets' twice. He says in his new autobiography 'Me' Watford "might have saved my life" in his first spell as chairman (1976-1990) when they enjoyed huge success under the late Graham Taylor rising from bottom of the old fourth division to the heights of being runners-up to Liverpool in the 1982/83 title race and beaten by Everton in the 1984 FA Cup final.

"I was chairman throughout the worst period of my life: years of addiction and unhappiness, failed relationships, bad business deals, court cases, unending turmoil," he writes.

"Through all of that, Watford were a constant source of happiness to me. "For obvious reasons, there are chunks of the eighties I have no recollection of - but every Watford game I saw is permanently etched on my memory."




