

 UNESWA students sign scholarship agreement form Minister, PS visit campuses to oversee signing

LABOUR and Social Security Minister Makhosi Vilakati and Principal Secretary Thulani Mkhaliphi defused what appeared to be a cold war between the ministry and students yesterday, by visiting the institutions of higher learning to explain the contentious form.

Students had vowed that they were not going to sign the scholarship addendum agreement form until the ministry answers certain questions and indicate how much they were signing for.

Yesterday, which was the final day of signing the forms, Minister Vilakati and PS Mkhaliphi decided to visit the institutions to explain and the students were happy to sign after that.

The minister and the PS were accompanied by the ministry's officials who assisted the students, parents and guardians in filling and signing the agreement forms.

PS Mkhaliphi said it was comforting that the situation had normalised and the students and their parents or guardians were cooperative in signing the forms.

He mention it was encouraging

to finally make headway in terms of reaching an agreement with the students with regards to the form as now they could be focused on a way forward.

He mentioned that the ministry attempted to address the concerns raised by the students with regards to the forms and decided to visit the campuses to reassure them that the agreement would be honoured.

"There is no reason why the students should doubt government's commitment," he said. With regards to moving forward, Mkhaliphi urged the students to remain calm and exercise patience as they would receive their allowances as per the agreement. He mentioned that starting from today, the ministry would begin processing the forms of over 7 500 students.

"As much as the process would take time, as a ministry we are committed to working tirelessly in an attempt to carry out the process timeously," he said.

The PS also said the ministry had an open door policy and students were welcome to engage them whenever they had any issues they needed to be addressed.

He said next week the ministry would issue a memo to inform the students when they would be receiving their allowances.

We appreciate ministry's presence - Students

WITH students and parents queuing and scrambling to sign the agreement forms, students have expressed their appreciation with the presence of the minister and PS.

Scores of students and parents from both Kwaluseni and Luyengo campuses yesterday took advantage of the last day granted to sign the forms.

Students Representative Council, Luyengo Campus Chairperson Siphiwesihle Lulane said as students they were reassured about government's commitment when the Minister of Labour and Social Security Makhosi Vilakati and Principal Secretary Thulani Mkhaliphi, accompanied by the ministry's officials, personally paid them a visit.

He mentioned that the situation was calm as students complied and signed the agreement forms. He said the changes observed in the forms was also another encouraging thing as the previous forms did not request the students to provide their account numbers, which was included in the new forms as well as the government letterhead.

"We are happy that things will finally get back to normal as we have already lost a considerable amount of time and were already behind in our syllabus. he said. He also mentioned they were content with the new personal allowance figure as it was a significant improvement from the amount they were receiving before. He stated things were looking promising now and all they could do was wait for their allowances to be

Police presence calms situation

THE presence of the Royal Eswatini Police Service came in handy yesterday, as students and parents pushed and shoved each other in an attempt to sign the scholarship addendum agreement form as quickly as possible.

With thousands of students and parents trying to sign the forms, police officers were required to calm the situation which proved ideal as they managed to control the inflow of students into the venue used for signing the forms at Luyengo Campus.

PARENTS, UNESWA HAPPY WITH PROGRESS

UNESWA Registrar Dr Salebona Simelane said as an institution they were happy that the matter was finally resolved.

He said as much as the issue was between students and government, it was unfortunate that the university schedule was affected, as students had not been able to attend classes due to the conflict they had with government.

He however said they were happy that the matter had been addressed and students would now be able to fully focus on their education which was getting affected. When questioned on how the situation had affected the institution with regards to the payment of tuition for the enrolled students, he said the issues between the students and govemment did not affect the institution as what was required for them was to bill the sponsor which is government for the tuition fees, which was separate from the student's personal allowances.

Parents also expressed their relief that an agreement had been reached between government and the students.

A parent, whose child is enrolled at Kwaluseni campus, said as parents their role was to support their children and if the students said they were comfortable with the arrangement, they would support them and sign the forms as they only wanted them to pursue their education.

"We are not against government and at the moment we cannot say much. We will monitor the situation going forward," he said.

Some students still have reservations

EVEN though the students complied and signed the forms yesterday, some of them still have their reservations.

A student from Kwaluseni campus said they felt bullied by government.

"Honestly I feel bullied into the whole thing. I do not trust that we will get the money on time and also for all the 10 months, but let's wait and see if they will keep their promises," the student said.

She also said there were too many changes which she feels shouldn't have affected them but rather should have come into effect with the first years.

Another student said they were still uncertain when they would receive the promised amount.

"We still do not know how much we are signing for, but it is a good thing that we have finally signed. My mother travelled all the way from Maseyisini yesterday and today which is very expensive," he said.

He also said they were expecting government to deliver on its promises.

He also said they need last month's allowance as they have not yet received it and also want their allowance to be paid on time.

William Pitcher, SANU students sign

SOUTHERN Africa Nazarene Pitcher College students have even- before the end of business yesterday. tually signed the amended scholarship forms.

As it was the last day for signing the forms, all students from the two institutions have adhered to the ministry of labour and social security's call for them to sign the addendum forms for their scholarships without fail.

However, the students said they were still longing for answers and clarification on some of the terms imposed to them by government.

On behalf of the SANU students, out-

going SRC President Tholulwazi Simelane said in the morning when students arrived at school, the Chief Electoral Officer (CEO) Celumusa Mnisi announced that all students who University (SANU) and William had not signed the forms should do so

> The CEO is said to be the one in charge in the absence of an SRC for the students. This means that should students have issues emanating from their failure to sign the forms, the one person that would help them challenge the matter in any level such as in court, is the CEO.

> Mnisi's order is said to have been preceded by that of the Principal Secretary for the Ministry of Labour and Social Security Thulani Mkhaliphi who was on radio in a morning show where he

strongly advised the students to comply with his ministry's call.

Failure to do so, Mkhaliphi said students were bound to have their scholarships revoked.

Sign

In this case, since he was for the idea that the students sign from the start, the students felt they would have no one on their side should they defy the CEO's order.

According to the outgoing SRC president, students started going to the administration offices where they signed the forms, not because they wanted to, but due to that they feared having their scholarships rescinded.

When the students were signing there was still no representative from the ministry of labour and social security,

a thing that provoked the students.

Since this was done suddenly and since the students and parents had agreed that they would not sign until the addendum form was further amended, some students are said to have filled in their parents personal details on the forms in their absence.

It is said that this was more so because some of the parents had gone back home, some as far as Lavumisa, on Monday after the agreement was reached.

"They felt pressured to sign the forms before the deadline. Most of the students signed because from the start, the CEO was for the idea of signing the forms so without him on our side, we had no chance of winning this against government," Simelane said.

When sought for comment,

SANU's Marketing Manager Petros Mavuso confirmed that all the students had signed the forms by end of business yesterday.

He further conceded that the scholars had signed although they felt they still needed to get answers from the ministry's officials who were not there, unfortunately.

For William Pitcher students, the SRC President Ayanda Zwane also confirmed that his colleagues had all signed the forms.

When asked what the students would do in the event that government adjust their allowances as per one of the terms in the scholarship forms, Zwane said he was not sure at the moment because students felt that their hands were tied since they were threatened with the revocation of their scholarships.

TRADITIONAL HEALER COMMITS SUICIDE

A traditional healer, Sam Shongwe, of the Jericho Sect aged 51 years, committed suicide last week at Mkhulamini.

The 'inyanga' who killed himself by drinking several weevil tablets eventually succumbed to death at Manzini Raleigh Fitkin Memorial (RFM) Hospital four hours after he was found at his home by his younger brother.

A source close to the matter who wanted to remain anonymous *Samantha Dlamini revealed that Shongwe had been arrested for alleged rape a few days before he committed the horrendous act

"Shongwe was good hearted, people from around here and all over knew how he was. Actually, none of us believe that he had raped the woman," she said.

Dlamini said a few days before the incident, Shongwe was arrested after a woman came with a teenager and police claiming that the child was conceived through rape that happened a long time

She came forward after being educated on the Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence (SODV) Act and she realised

that what had happened to her was rape.
Shongwe was apparently arrested and granted E5 000 bail which he paid the pext day.

According to his younger brother who found him Scorpion Shongwe, his broth-

er didn't leave any suicide note.

He only narrated the humiliation he experienced whilst police interrogated him.

He said the police tore his sashes and beads '*emajiva*' when he refused to say he indeed committed the said crime.

"He had been saying that we shouldn't try to change his mind in the decision he had taken. At that point in time we didn't fathom that he meant he was going to commit suicide.

"My brother said the humiliation he underwent was regarded as a portent of evil, an ill omen. He didn't even want to imagine what would happen to the perpetrators," said Shongwe's younger brother.

The poisonous weevil tablets couldn't be pumped out of his system as there was already too much damage to the intestines due to the large intake of the tablets. Royal Eswatini Police Services (REPS) Information and Communications Officer Superintendent Phindile Vilakati could neither deny nor confirm this as they couldn't find this report at the time of compiling this story.

"The desk officer who was working then is not at the office today and the person we were referred to is not able to help right now," she said.

Another death at Kukhanyeni High

KUKHANYENI High School has once again been rocked by another death as two pupils from the same area are reported to have ingested weevil tablets last week.

One of the pupils is reported to have died and the other survived as she was rushed to hospital where she got treated.

The pupil is expected to be buried this coming weekend. According to impeccable sources the pupils are alleged to have ingested weevil tablets, which now appear to be the pattern, as the school has been rocked by similar incidents in the recent past.

The deceased pupil, a teenage boy is reported to have been staying with his grandmother and uncle at Sigombeni.

It is also reported that the boy died while undergoing treatment in hospital.

According to a family member who only identified herself as Gogo Simelane, the teenager never even on one single day showed any signs that she was suicidal.

She said they were very shocked to learn of the news of the passing away of the minor.

"We are still shocked and traumatised by the death of our child and we still have many questions than answer on her death," she said.
Simelane mentioned that they were still banking hopes that he was going to be helpful to the family and never showed any signs of

being suicidal.

"The family is still trying to figure everything out and we are in a very bad state as I am speaking to you. But in all this we trust God's will that He will heal and bind us these wounds," Simelane continued.

When sought for comment the school's Head teacher's phone rang unanswered for the better part of the whole day yesterday.

The pupil met his death while he was doing Form I. Police Information and Communications Officer Superintended Phindile Vilakati confirmed the incident, saying that a 17-year-old pupil from Ekukhanyeni was reported to have ingested weevil tablets and was admitted to hospital where he later died on Thursday last week.

Ekukhanyeni is not new to such controversies, as last year similar incidents occurred where about five students died under unclear circumstances.

To date, six pupils have died in the school since May last year and they are Mthunzi Dlamini, who died in May, Ndumiso Shongwe, in July, Sibusiso Simelane, in September and Nokwethu Masilela, in October last year.

More rains expected in ploughing season

ESWATINI Meteorological Services has predicted normal to above rainfall during the summer season.

The meteorological services yesterday with its stakeholders issued the seasonal weather forecast for the country.

Present during the briefing were the meteorological department, ministry of agriculture, Eswatini Electricity Company, National Disaster Management Agency and Eswatini Water Services Corporation amongst others.

Chief Meteorologist Sifiso Nzalo announced that the local seasonal forecast shows that the country will receive normal to above normal rainfall this summer which is the ploughing season. Nzalo explained that the 2019/20 is

divided into four quarters.

The first quarter of the season is October, November and December. During this quarter almost the whole country will experience normal to above rainfall.

However, the lowveld region will experience normal to below average rainfall. Nzalo explained that in as much as the rainfall is predicted to be normal to above, it does not mean the season will be wet.

Nzalo however said because of the ever rising temperatures because of global warming, dry periods are anticipated.

During the second quarter of the season which is December, January and February the whole country will experience normal to above rainfall.

Worth noting is that the highveld normal rainfall is not similar to that of the lowveld's normal rainfall Nzalo stated.

The same is predicted during the last quarter which is February, March and April. Also echoing Nzalo was Dumisani Sithole who added that there will be a shift in the beginning of rainfall season.

Sithole explained that in as much as September is official spring but rainfall will not be expected in September.

"Rain season will officially begin in October," he said.

Meanwhile Climate change co-ordinator Khetsiwe Khumalo said during the 2019 and 2020 season rainfall is likely to be erratic especial during the second half season.

Khumalo added that there is a possibility of inter seasonal dry spells. She said this will be because of the heat wave that is expected to hit the country from time to time. She further stated that violent storms are predicted accompanied by extreme lighting.

"Flash floods cannot be ruled out as the season proceeds," she said.

Khumalo emphasised on the need to

put in place early warning signs for every season, in order to reduce the impact of disasters as well as preparation for farmers and all stakeholders.

CLIMATE CHANGE

The country is looking for means to make sure that food production is not threatened as the government is looking into mitigating climate change.

Principal Secretary in the Ministry of Tourism and Environmental Affairs Emmanuel Dlamini said they have noticed the late start of rainfall season and drought and other extreme weather conditions, therefore the country is looking into reducing the impacts of the climate change.

As projections show that there would be more dry spells and shift in the rain season, the PS said the country is looking for means to mitigate climate change in order to ensure that food production is not threatened and economic development proceeds in a sustainable man-





One of the means the PS said the ministry is doing this is by providing weather and climate forecast.

This is to allow different sectors to plan their activities in a way that minimise any possible negative impact that may come with the weather to optimise the benefits, Dlamini said.

The principal secretary added that in order to ensure that Eswatini Meteorological Services continue with predicting accurate weather patterns, the ministry is working on capacitating the department with systems that will allow them to provide more detailed forecast

PSAs deliver petitions in govt depts

IN an effort to mobilise members for next week's much-anticipated strike action, Public Sector Associations (PSAs) yesterday delivered petitions to various government departments in Mbabane.

The PSAs consisted of Swaziland National Association of Teachers (SNAT), Swaziland National Association of Civil Servants (SNACS), Swaziland Nurses Association (SNA) and Swaziland National Association of Government Accounting Personnel (SNAGAP).

The purpose of the march was for the workers to raise issues of concern to the heads of the government departments. The workers delivered the petitions to the Regional Administration (RA) offices, Regional Education Offices (REO) and Hhohho Police Regional Headquarters.

The same action was undertaken in all the regions, namely, Lubombo, Shiselweni and Manzini, where civil servants delivered the same petitions to the same offices.

Conditions

They wanted the heads of the departments to contribute in helping them get their Cost of Living Adjustment from government. They also wanted the departments to help in improving their working conditions.

The march in Mbabane started from

SNAT is calling upon government to reinstate teachers who were fired after investigations made by officer Knowledge Ngwenya.

In a petition delivered to Hhohho REO Tamari Langwenya, the teachers stated that they wanted teachers fired as a result of Ngwenya to be reinstated. The petition was signed by SNAT Secretary General Sikelela Dlamini.

"As SNAT, many of our members

have lost their jobs because of one Knowledge Ngwenya, the self-acclaimed private investigator, who unfortunately did not possess the appropriate qualifications," reads part of the petition.

There were about 60 civil servants who participated in the march in Manzini while Nhlangano there were about 200 who delivered petitions, led by SNAT Secretary Sikelela Dlamini.

'Sikheshekheshe must be suspended'

"We expect not less than 15 000 workers to take part in this strike action. If you happen to have a relative in Mbabane, make sure you sleep at his or her house a day before September 25," Ndlovu said.

Mobilisation

Yesterday, Ndlovu said they were still mobilising workers from all over the country to take part in the strike.

As part of the mobilisation initiatives, the Public Sector Associations (PSAs) started by holding regional marches. Such marches also took place in Manzini, Siteki, and Nhlangano.

The PSAs, according to Ndlovu, would meet again this coming Friday at SNAT Centre in Manzini. The meeting would start at 10am

The purpose of the meeting was to keep track of the progress made by the PSAs concerning the preparations of the strike.

SNAT president's charges dropped to 3

SWAZILAND National Association of Teachers (SNAT) President Mbongwa Dlamini's charges have been dropped to three.

This was revealed by a letter from the Teaching Service Commission (TSC), which Dlamini received from the Acting Manzini Regional Education Officer (REO) Nhlanhla Dlamini yes-

The president was in the company of comrades from SNAT and other Public Sector Associations (PSAs), National Public Services and Allied Workers Union (NAPSAWU) and Swaziland National Association of Government Accounting Personnel (SNAGAP) who had come to support him.

The comrades said it was degrading for the president to be called on radio notifying him that he should report to the REO's office to collect

This development on Dlamini's case follows that in May 2019, he was charged with 10 counts of misconduct. In April 2019, the president was first slapped with four charges which included absenteeism, neglecting to submit official school records for inspection, disobedience and bringing the teaching service into disrepute.

These charges were preferred by Schools Manager Macanjana Motsa in a letter dated April 3, 2019. Dlamini has been called to give reasons in writing why disciplinary action should not be taken against him in respect of the alleged misconduct charges.

Responses

"After you have submitted your responses through a letter dated February 11, 2019, it has come to my attention that certain dates and/or complaints were not covered in the complainants that were forwarded to you. Therefore, you are kindly requested to answer on the added complaints," read part of the letter by the schools

This means that in May, Dlamini faced a total of 14 charges of misconduct. According to the charge sheet that Dlamini received yesterday, four charges were levelled against him. On the first count the president is accused of negligence and laziness to complete the scheme book.

It is said in March 2019, Dlamini, who is a Mathematics and Science teacher at Mhubhe High, had failed to indicate target and completion dates, complete preliminary pages and provide pupils' test scores in his Scheme Book.

On his second count of negligence and laziness to prepare for lessons, the president is accused of failing, without cause, to perform his duty of teaching with proper care in that he failed to prepare for lessons as expected.

As a result, it is alleged that Dlamini submitted substandard and incomplete lesson plans and daily Preparation Book for his Form 1B, 2B, 4B and 5C Mathematics and Science classes, respectively. The last count further stated that the president failed to give his Form 2B Mathematics learners adequate work as expected in 2018 while they were still in Form 1.

In the Form 1 Maths book, it is said that Dlamini covered only 11 topics instead of 19 and further started a new book in Form 2 while he had not finished the Form 1 syllabus. "You did this knowing that your actions have a detrimental effect on the pupils' learning process," the charge sheet

In the previous charge sheet, the first complaint against Dlamini was that he had failed to indicate target and completion dates in the scheme book for four classes namely; Form 1B, Form 2B, Form 4B and Form 5 in various classes.

In the second complaint, Motsa further stated that during inspection Dlamini also failed to submit the content to be taught in the scheme book in the aforementioned classes.

Syllabus

"The content is actually the topics of the syl-

labus to be taught for that year, per class and per subject," wrote Motsa. It was further alleged that Dlamini failed to provide the record of teacher which was official information about the teacher, which helped identify who the teacher was, including their

teaching experience. Upon inspection the inspectors would know who they were helping in terms of teaching experience and identify areas where the teacher needed assistance and support.

When sought for comment, Dlamini said he was confused because all the charges laid against him were not supposed to be ones to cause him to appear before a disciplinary committee. He said if the working environment was as it

was supposed to be, the faults cited in the charge

sheet should have been conveyed to him verbally and should have been made a serious case after he had failed to correct them. "This shows that the inspectors were on a faultfinding mission and not to correct mistakes for

the betterment of education," he said. Dlamini further stated that the TSC had refused to go to the labour commissioner on the same case, which was worrying because if the commission felt that it was on the right, they should not be worried when the matter is taken to any platform for evaluation of a neutral person.

Furthermore, Dlamini said he could not go to the TSC for a trial date setting, as instructed by a letter he only received today.

He said this was unfair in that his other colleague with whom he was suspected with had received his letter last week.

Crown closes its case in 'Obama' murder trial

Please note that it is a legal requirement to allow the valuers into

Many might be wondering what a general valuation is and why it is so important to Council. This is an exercise wherein Council measures the values of all immovable properties within the Manzini urban area including developed and undeveloped pieces of land (plots). It is a tool through which Council measures the city's worth in economic terms. The valuation also provides relevant data which is often used for various purposes by Council and various institutions. An increase in property value gives confidence to the property owner regarding their investment. The general valuation is a requirement of the law as contained in the Rating Act, 1995, and is conducted every five years. It helps the Municipality to note the economic trends that indicate positive or negative changes which serve as a guide to determine whether the city is growing, stagnant or regressive in terms of economic

activity. These trends are one of the performance of the municipality. tools that are used to measure the





Son stabs dad over family dispute

A long standing family dispute saw a man stabbing his biological father after the two had a disagreement over ownership of a homestead.

Nhlanhla Dlamini (43) appeared before Acting Magistrate Cebsile Ngwenya after he was charged with stabbing his father, Joseph Dlamini with a screwdriver.

The accused person was charged with contravening section 77(1) of the Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence Act 15 of 2018.

According to the charge sheet, the accused person was said to have unlawfully and physically abused the complainant by assaulting him and further stabbing him with a screwdriver on the body.

The complainant was said to have sustained a life threatening injury as a result of the assault.

When the charge sheet was read to him, the accused person pleaded guilty to the charge.

Accused

He told the court that he committed the crime while reacting in self-defence.

The accused alleged that his father was the one who attacked him, and that he only used the screwdriver to scare the complainant away.

It was gathered that the two had a long standing dispute which revolved around the ownership of a homestead.

Court records also indicated that the two have at some instance, appeared before the same court for a peace binding order.

In the case before court, the accused person asked the court to be lenient when passing sentence, saying that he was a first time offender.

His plea was accepted by the crown without leading evidence to prove commission of the offence.

The accused person was accordingly found guilty by the court.

He was sentenced to a year in a correctional facility with an option to pay E2 000 fine.

MACMILLAN Education Eswatini says it is about time schools start an electronic education, seeing that school children are bent on digital migration, than the hard copy system in which the education system is currently embracing.

The lessons aired on the screens, were chosen by Macmillan and were on tradition and culture and sourced from Eswatini's traditional structures such as Emsamo in Lobamba.

"The children were captivated the moment the lessons started, right through to the end, and it was clear that they had followed every bit of what the lessons were about, from the answers they gave afterwards," said Shabangu.

He said for the introduction of the technological mode of teaching it was imperative that the concerned parties, children, parents and teachers were taken through training, getting them started on a life long journey of exciting methods of learning, which would change their lives for the better.

Nhancal further told the court that he obtained the illicit drug after he was approached by someone, a dagga dealer, in Manzini who had found him smoking around town. The supposed dealer is said to have asked if Nhancal could assist him get the dagga so he could sell it

around town. It was then that the Mozambican saw an opportunity to make money which he said he wanted to use to buy some disposable nappies and formula milk for his fourmonth-old baby.

When he was arrested, Nhancal said he was going to deliver the package to the dealer in town. The dagga was

cunningly packaged in Supa Naks packets which were sealed with sellotape. The packets were then loaded in the Supa Naks branded plastic, giving the impression that it was the real snack that is usually sold for E1. When the evidence was brought before court, Magistrate Mbatha was shocked to learn of the way the dagga was packaged. He asked whether Nhancal had been selling the dagga to children and the response was to the negative. Magistrate Mbatha further asked who supplied Nhancal with the illicit drug and he said it was someone residing at a Khumalo homestead. "Batakulaya!" Magistrate Mbatha said, much to the laughter of those present in court. In mitigation, Nhancal said he was only a herdboy who wanted to provide for his child at the time. He was remanded in custody pending judgment that will be meted out on September 23,



IMPLEMENTATION OF THE ALCOHOL AND TOBACCO LEVY

The Alcohol and Tobacco Levy Act of 2019, which provides for the imposition and collection of a levy on alcoholic drinks and tobacco products has been enacted and will be effective from 1 October 2019.

This levy will apply as follows:

Collection Point	Affected products	Rate of levy
At time of importation	Alcoholic beverages of all kinds other than traditional beer All Tobacco products	7%
Local sales	Locally manufactured: Alcoholic beverages of all kinds other than traditional beer All Tobacco Products	2%

Points to note:

- On locally manufactured goods, the levy will be collected at the first point of sale after the manufacturing process.
- Calculation of the levy will be based on the value of the product exclusive of VAT while VAT will be charged on the amount inclusive of the levy amount
- Local manufacturers will be expected to submit returns on their sales of the preceding month by the 20th of the subsequent month. These returns should be accompanied by payment.
- On imports of these products, the Levy will be charged at the point of first entry of the product into the territory of the Kingdom of Eswatini.
- On imported goods, the levy will be calculated on the customs value plus the amount of customs duty, excise tax and any other fiscal charge other than VAT.

Single mother of two wins E5 000 Lotto

A first time lotto machine player and single mother of two from Pigg's Peak won E5 000 cash after betting E50 at a lotto machine.

The lucky lady (26), who works at a local salon, tried her luck in the lotto machine located within the Super Slots Lotto machine arcade, opposite the PEP car park last Monday.

Speaking yesterday, the woman who will not be named for safety reasons, said she will use her winnings to pay for her daughter's high school fees.

"I am very happy with the win and I plan to use the money to pay school fees for my daughter.

"It was the first time that I have ever gambled with the lotto machines. I have always wanted to play the machines but I was sceptical because I heard a lot of stories about people gambling all their money with the hope of winning a cash prize that never came.

"Since late 2017, I used to watch my colleagues gamble and they would either win or lose. However, on Monday I felt like trying my luck for the first time and I am so happy that I was brave," she said.

Nxumalo added that her colleagues gave her tips on how to win money on the lotto machines.

"My three female colleagues have only managed to win about E1 000 each on different occasions after losing E800 each.

"They told me that I should use a machine that another individual had been using for a long time.

Logic dictates that if an individual has been playing on a certain machine for more than 30 minutes but failed to win anything then that machine is filled with tokens. Once the original player leaves, you can then use the same machine because it has enough tokens to release the money.

I refuse to believe that this theory is wrong because it worked for me but it cannot always work for other people.

"I will return in the future to try my luck again but I don't want to make such things a habit," she added.

When asked to comment on the theory used by a recent winner at Super Slots Lotto machine's Pigg's Peak she said the theory was not true, as the machines were working on a digital network that was serviced in South Africa. After the initial interview the recent winner added that they were not allowed to speak to the media as their head offices are located in South Africa. The win came after the two owners of Super Slots Lotto machine arcade had a disagreement leading to the issue being reported to the Pigg's Peak police on Sunday.

During the disagreement, operations at the location ceased for a few hours. However, normal operations resumed on Monday much to the delight of local lotto machine players.

Businessman still not compensated for storm water damage

AFTER 23 years of complaining, a senior businessman has still not found respite, as he claims that storm water collected from the Pigg's Peak Plaza roof continues to damage his plot.

The complaint has previously received extensive media coverage numerous times since 1996 and the Pigg's Peak Town Council has also been approached various times throughout the years but nothing has happened.

King Mziyako approached this publication again last week, saying even though the Pigg's Peak Plaza constructed new water drainage system in 2018, the water damage to his building was still visible.

"I own a residential and commercial plot in Pigg's Peak that I constructed in 1996. A few months later, the Pigg's Peak Plaza was also constructed and labourers forgot to construct proper water drainage system.

This oversight resulted in storm water collected on the Plaza roof being dumped on my plot, which is located below the building. As we speak, the value of my building and plot continues to fall as it is being devalued by the water. My building already has wall mould caused by the water," he said.

Mziyako added that he was receiving no help from the authorities. "I saw in your publication that you mentioned the new storm water drainage, however, they are useless because the damage has occurred already.

As I said before this is a very old issue and it was reported at various times by different media houses. All the media coverage has not helped me as I am stuck in an even worse situation, due to the time it

has taken to fix the problem. I really need help and cannot afford legal representation as many people have told me that this is a civil matter that will require expensive lawyers. My only option now is to sell my plot but I need the money to find an individual who will value it for me," he added.

When approached again for comment, manager of the Pigg's Peak Plaza Costa Ginindza said the new storm water drainage was actually constructed in 2017 and not 2018 as first reported by Mziyako.

"As the Pigg's Peak Plaza, we constructed new storm water drainage in 2017. The last time this story was published your ported that the drainage were constructed in 2018, which is not true.

The new storm drainage connects to the Pigg's Peak Town Council system away from the plot in question. As we speak no storm water is being dumped on to the Mziyako plot. I hope this issue ends as I keep repeating myself every few months," he said.

Pigg's Peak Town Council Clerk/CEO Mzwandile Ndzinisa said the issue was between two owners of private land hence after careful consideration an official statement from the council was not necessary as the council did send an engineer to the site in question.

E142 000 WORTH DAGGA BUSTED AT MANANGA BORDER

ROYAL Eswatini Police Services busted dagga weighing 178kg at Mananga.

According to a source, the dagga was packed in eight bags.

It is not clear whether the dagga was hidden or was abandoned by people

who were scared off by patrolling soldiers at the border line.

The dagga was found near a fence separating Eswatini and the Republic of South Africa.

According to the source, the place where the dagga was discovered is a hotspot used by the illegal drug dealers who smuggle dagga to the neighbouring country.

Meanwhile, the police information

and communications office confirmed that eight bags of dagga weighing 178kg with a street value of E142 400 were discovered abandoned by an unknown person at Mananga near the fence separating Eswatini and the Republic of South Africa last week Friday.

The police are still investigating the case.

Meanwhile, a local kombi operator was busted with drugs at Oshoek Bor-

der Gate on the South African side last Tuesday. It is reported that the kombi driver operates cross border transport. He had already crossed the Eswatini side when he was busted with the drugs.

Details of his arrest are sceptical. However according to an impeccable source he was taken to custody for being found with the drug. Meanwhile, Matsapha police are investigating a suicide case whereby it is reported that on Friday at around 1730 hours police were called to a scene after a 43-yearold woman of Luve was found lying dead inside a rented house at KaHlobile in Matsapha.

It is suspected that the woman ingested weevil tablets and died.

Investigations are still on-going, police reported.

Heartbroken woman's 4-year sentence suspended

A dejected woman has been sentenced to four years in prison after she stood accused of house-breaking charges for allegedly breaking into her lover's home and repossessing items she had bought with her hard-earned money.

This was after her trial came to conclusion on Monday, after she submitted documents proving that the items she 'stole' from her ex-lover's home lawfully belonged to her.

When the trial began on March 6 before Magistrate Lenhle Zulu, Khetsiwe Mamba of Mobeni led evidence to the fact that she was young and in love when, in June 2016, her boyfriend Sabelo Dlamini asked her to purchase household items on credit, with the promise that he would start a business to pay off the monthly instalments.

"Although Dlamini was unemployed at the time, I believed that he would make enough money selling sour milk (emasi) to pay the monthly instalments and as a woman in love, I proceeded to Best Electric store in Mbabane to enter into a hire purchase agreement with the store," Mamba claimed.

Mamba is said to have, on her lover's request, purchased a refrigerator valued at E10 000 and additional items including a hot plate stove, a kettle and an iron.

The total value of the items amounted to E13 268. As Dlamini hadn't started his business as yet, he then borrowed an additional E500 to stock his *emasi*.


Mamba admitted that for the first two months (June and July 2016) after the purchases were made, Dlamini paid off the monthly instalments as per their agreement.

However, unbeknownst to Mamba, Dlamini started defaulting payments with the furniture store, until September of 2016, when she received a call from the store, informing her that it was taking legal action against her for breaching the hire purchase agreement.

"As we were not living together at the time, with him living in Mangwaneni and in Mobeni, I proceeded to his place to question him about breaching the agreement we had.

When I arrived, I was stunned to find that the fridge I had bought was no longer there, instead he was in possession of a smaller fridge I was unfamiliar with

When I questioned him about this, he admitted to me that he had to surrender

the fridge to a woman he owed copious amounts of money to," she reacted.

Mamba then informed the court that an argument ensued, to which Dlamini started physically assaulting her, claiming that it was none of her business where the second fridge came from.

"I then asked him to return the documents pertaining to the fridge I purchased, to which, when I perused through the said documents, I came across a similar hire purchase agreement with another furniture store, this time purchasing the second fridge in question. The documents suggested that the buyer was one Sibongile Maseko," she testified.

As she revealed this new information to the court, Mamba was overwhelmed by emotions, as she was seen wiping her tears.

After Mamba approached Dlamini with the new discovery, she decided to seek his mother's advice, who further urged her son to pay Mamba her money so she could avoid being blacklisted.

"Even after his mother's intervention, Dlamini refused to pay back the money. I then decided to approach the Swazi National Court with the issue, who then ordered him to pay the money. Again, Dlamini did not make good on the court's orders," Mamba submitted, with her voice breaking at each word.

As she had had enough of being passive about the whole debacle, Mamba is then said to have, in the company of her brother, hired a van and preceded to Mangwaneni to take back the items under her name.

"A few days after I left for school in South Africa, a female police officer

called me and informed me that I was to be arrested and charged for house breaking and robbery.

I saw no alternative but to end this mess as I was left with no fridge and no money, yet Dlamini was still making money off of my name," Mamba concluded.

MITIGATION

During the continuation of her trial on Monday, the prosecution made closing submissions to the effect that, although Mamba had taken similar items to the ones stated in her higher purchase agreement, they were not the exact items she had bought.

In her mitigation, Mamba admitted that when she arrived at Dlamini's house, when she saw that the actual items she had purchased were no longer at his house, she decided to take the ones that were already there.

"Your Worship, I apologise for having taken the law into my own hands. I admit that the items that I took were not the ones I had initially purchased, however the reason I took them was because I wanted to open a dialogue with Dlamini about breaching our verbal agreement. I was of the view that if I took his items, he would approach me and we would come to an amicable agreement to see things through," Mamba mitigated.

After hearing her sincere mitigation, the court found Mamba guilty of having committed the offence.

Mamba was further sentenced to serve four years in prison, with the option to pay a fine of E4 000. Her sentence was wholly suspended, on account that she was to conduct herself in a respectable manner.

Driver taking friends to Moza fined E800 for permit

A trip to Mozambique was cut short when a driver of a sevenseat Toyota Voxy was arrested for not having valid public transportation documents.

The accused person, James Khumalo (51) of Manzini appeared before Principal Magistrate Dumisani Magagula where he faced a charge of contravening Section 32 of the Road Transportation Act of 2007.

He was said to have wrongfully and unlawfully transported seven passengers from Manzini to Mozambique for financial gain whilst not a holder of any public transport documents.

Particulars of the offence included that the vehicle which he was driving was also said to have been without a fitness certificate.

When the charge sheet was read to him, the accused person pleaded guilty to the charge.

His plea was accepted by the crown without leading evidence to prove commission of the offence.

The accused person pleaded with

the court to give him a lenient sentence.

He told the court that he was approached by a group of friends who asked him to take them to Maputo.

As a norm, the accused person said he asked the group of friends to contribute money towards the expenses of the trip.

Each of the seven passengers were said to have contributed E200. Nonetheless, the accused person was accordingly found guilty by the court.

He was sentenced to six months in a correctional facility with an option to pay E800 fine.

Meanwhile in the same court, Sihle Maseko faced a similar charge of contravening the Road Transport Act.

He was said to have driven a motor vehicle while under the influence of alcohol.

The accused was said to have had 0.61 mg/l in his system, an amount which is above the legal limit which stands at 0.37 mg/l.

The court found him guilty according to his own plea.

He was fined E1 000 for the offence.

Two charged with attempted murder

A man who was stabbed by two men will finally see justice served as the men have been arrested and charged with attempted murder.

James Dlamini (35) and Lungelo Maphosa (26) of Kupheleni were arrested and charged with attempted murder, after they were said to have stabbed one Zwakhie Sebaka simultaneously with two knives all over his body, inflicting near fatal wounds.

According to their charge sheet, Maphosa and Dlamini were said to have, on August 24 at Kupheleni area, acted jointly in the furtherance of a common purpose, did wrongfully and unlawfully stab one Zwakhie Sebaka with two knives several times all over the body.

The duo were also said to have kicked Sebaka while he was lying on the ground.

During their appearance before the court, the prosecution applied for the duo to be remanded back into custody until September 27, pending their committal to the High



Court, to which the court granted the application.

The duo was also advised that, if they so wished, they could make a bail application at the High Court while they awaited his trial date.

Magistrate Lenhle Zulu informed that the duo due to the severity of the offence that they had committed, she had no choice but to allow the highest court of law to grant them their bail application, thus advising them to make that application.

NEWS AND THE EX-MP?



OVICATION LAW SAN

Small claims court Act 2011

PART III

9. Presiding officers.

The officer presiding at a court shall be known as a Commissioner for Small Claims Court and shall be appointed under section 10.

10. Appointment of commissioners.

(1) Subject to the provisions of subsection (2), the Minister in consultation with the Chief Justice, may appoint one or more commissioners for any court under this Act.

(2) An officer in the employ of the Government, with the exception of the Law Officer, shall not be appointed as a commissioner.

(3) A principal magistrate who establishes a court in terms of Section 3(2), may, subject to the provisions of this section, appoint a commissioner for such a court.

(4) A person shall not be appointed as a commissioner unless that person is qualified —

(a) To be or is admitted as an attorney of the High Court in terms of the Legal Practitioners Act, 1964;

(b) As an admitted advocate of the High Court in terms of the Legal Practitioners Act, 1964;

(c) To be appointed, at least, as a senior magistrate; or

(d) As a law lecturer,

and for an uninterrupted period of at least five years practised as an advocate or attorney or occupied the post of senior magistrate, or for that period was involved in the teaching of law at a higher level in a recognised university, and is a fit and proper person in the opinion of the Minister to be appointed as a commissioner.

(5) A commissioner shall hold office at the pleasure of the Minister.

(6) A commissioner may resign by notice in writing to the Minister.

(7) The Minister may at any time withdraw the appointment of a commissioner if in the opinion of the Minister there is sufficient reason for doing so


(8) A person appointed under sub-Section (1) or subsection (3) shall, before commencing with the functions of a commissioner, take an oath or make an affirmation subscribed by that person in the form set out in the First Schedule.

(9) The oath or affirmation referred to in Subsection (8) shall be taken or made in open court before a Commissioner of Oaths and the Commissioner of Oaths shall at the foot thereof make a note to the effect that it was taken or made, before that Commissioner of Oaths, and of the date on which it was so taken or made, and append a signature thereto.

11. Procedure in case of absence or incapacity of commissioners.

Where by reason of absence or incapacity a commissioner is unable to complete the hearing of an action, that hearing shall be commenced afresh before another commissioner.

PRESIDING OF FICERS AND OFFICERS OF THE COURT



12. Officers of court.

(1) The Civil Service Commission, or such other authority prescribed by law, shall appoint clerks and assistant clerks of the court, interpreters and legal assistants for any court as may be necessary for the performance of the prescribed functions.

(2) The messenger of the court appointed under Section 10 of the Magistrates' Courts Act, 1938, for the Magistrate's Court exercising jurisdiction over the Small Claims Court, shall act as messenger of the Small Claims Court.

(3) The Government, a clerk of the court, an assistant clerk of the court or a legal assistant shall not be liable for any damage or loss resulting from assistance given in good faith by that clerk of the court, assistant clerk of the court or legal assistant to any party or prospective party to an action before a court or to the enforcement of a judgment or order in terms of Section 42 in the form of legal advice or the compilation or preparation of a summons, statement or other document.

(4) The Commissioner shall not be liable for any civil claim, damage or loss arising from any matter he has presided over in good faith.

PART IV JURISDICTION

13. Area of jurisdiction.

The area of jurisdiction of a court under this Act shall be the area or region for which it is established.

14. Transfer of actions.

An action may, with the consent of all the parties, or upon the application of one of the parties who satisfies the court that the hearing of the action in that court may result in undue expense or inconvenience to one or such party, be transferred by the court to any other court under this Act, and in such a case the latter court shall, notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this Act contained, have jurisdiction to hear that action.

15. Jurisdiction in respect of persons.

(1) Subject to the provisions of subsection (2), a court shall have jurisdiction in respect of —

(a) Any person who resides, carries on business or is employed within the area of jurisdiction of the court;

(b) Any partnership, as defendant, which has business premises situated or any member of the partnership who resides within the area of jurisdiction of the court;

(c) Any person in respect of any proceedings incidental to any action instituted in that court by such person:

(d) Any person, whether or not that person resides, carries on business or is employed within the area of jurisdiction of the court, if the cause of action arose wholly within that area;

(e) Any defendant, whether in convention or reconvention, who appears and takes no objection to the jurisdiction of the court;

(f) Any person who owns immovable property within the area of jurisdiction of the court in actions in respect of such property or a mortgage bond aver that property.

(2) An action shall not be instituted against the Government in the court.

(3) A court shall not have jurisdiction in respect of any claim or counterclaim based in whole or in part upon a cession or assignment of rights.

Jurisdiction in respect of causes of action.

(1) Subject to the provisions of this Act, a court shall have jurisdiction in respect of causes of action in —

(a) Actions for the delivery or transfer of any property, movable or immovable, not exceeding in value the sum of E10 000 or such an amount as may be prescribed by the Minister from time to time by notice in the Gazette, after consultation with the Attorney General and the Chief Justice;

(b) Subject to paragraph (c), actions for ejectment against the occupier of any premises or land within the area of jurisdiction of the court;

(c) Actions for ejectment where the right of occupation of the premises or land is in dispute between the parties, that right does not exceed in clear value to the occupier the sum of E10 000 or such an amount as may be prescribed by the Minister from time to time as provided in paragraph (a);

(d) Actions based on or arising out of a liquid document or a mort-gage bond, where the claim does not exceed the sum of E10 000 or such an amount as may be prescribed by the Minister from time to time as provided in paragraph (a);

(e) Actions based on or arising out of a credit agreement, sales, purchases, loans, recovery of monies paid over or delivered and such similar debts where the claim or the value of the property in dispute does not exceed the sum of E10 000 or such an amount as may be prescribed by the Minister from time to time as provided in paragraph (a);

(f) Actions other than those already mentioned in this section, where the claim or the value of the matter in dispute does not exceed the sum of E10 000 or such an amount as may be prescribed by the Minister from time to time as provided in paragraph (a):

(g) Actions for counterclaims not exceeding the sum of E10 000 or such an amount as may be prescribed by the Minister from time to time as provided in paragraph (a) in respect of any cause of action mentioned in paragraph (a) to (e).

(2) No person shall eject another person from land which is on Swazi National Land unless the cause of ejectment is a transaction involving a lease agreement on the land and that right does not exceed in clear value to the occupier the sum of E10 000 or such an amount as may be prescribed by the Minister from time to time as provided in paragraph (a).

THERE is a lot to be said about the feeling of entitlement and actualisation that one feels over the purchase or acquisition of land or property.

Deemed as one of the ultimate in investments, land ownership in Eswatini as in most places around the world, advantageous when it comes to accrued wealth. This is why when the High Court of Eswatini ruled that women married in community of property can now administer matrimonial property; it was considered a victory for not only just Eswatini's women, but the country as a whole.

IN TIMES PAST

Outside of a prenuptial or an out of community of property marriage, women married in community of property under customary law were not permitted the rights to attain land unless their husbands were involved. This stripped women of their rights to form contractual agreements as the country's citizen, an obstacle that their husbands did not face.

DISCRIMINATION

The judgment has been in law for decades and served to perpetuate the societal discrimination against women. The fact that women needed the consent of their husbands to attain property only served to instil the biased notion that women are inferior to men. This discrimination seeped into family ties as well since many a time, widowed women would be robbed of their rightful inheritance after the passing of their spouses by their in-laws who would

claim such possessions as their own. A practice observed under the guise of "protecting the family wealth for the benefit of the children of the deceased".

KUNGENA

This practice birthed the common practice of Kungena, which was observed after the passing of a woman's husband where the family would take it upon themselves to give the widow a husband from within the family. This was often the deceased's brother, uncle or any male within the deceased's immediate family. The widow's consent was at times forgone, but in cases where her consent was sought, she would be advised that should she refuse this practice, she would then be asked to leave the homestead with no inherited possessions and at times, without her children.

Given the odds against them, widows would often accept the "order" to remarry within the family. This was due to the fact that for them, parting with their children was no option at all. With the new law in effect and more and more women owning property, this practice may very well be on its last legs as it too exacerbated this discrimination.

POT OF GOLD

The possibilities that come with this ruling are great. Perhaps one that is paramount is the fact that Eswatini is turning a tide in recognising the role that women play in society. This is testament to the importance they put in empowering women for the betterment of our economy and the healthy perception of women in power. A judgement of this nature has far reaching effects on a women's standing in society as it not only empowers women but through their endeavours of accumulating wealth through the purchase and owning of property, women too can reach the proverbial pot of gold at the end of the rainbow and use it to better their families and raise self-reliant children who will steer Eswatini to great

The ripple effect that comes with this ruling is that; women will finally get the long overdue respect and acknowledgement from their family members as worthwhile members of the family to be custodians of their children's legacy, this will in-turn curb the biased practice of marrying them off to family members outside of their will and thus ensuring that this country's future in the form of the children raised by widows and women married in community of property is bright.

FIRST WORLD STATUS For many, His Majesty King Mswati

III' dream of seeing Eswatini being counted as one the world's first world countries by the year 2022 has merely become a slogan. In order to reach this status, it is imperative that all of the basic human rights of the citizens of Eswatini are met. Dignity is one such right, a right that was grossly infringed upon when women married in community of property were deprived of the ability to purchase property without their husband's consent or involvement. In the case of Sacolo vs Sacolo that was brought forth and heard by the High Court of Eswatini in July 2019, a reference was made to Misra CJ that stated "life without dignity is like sound that is not heard." To live your life as though you never existed is what women of Eswatini faced as they often had no legacy to leave their family, particularly their children after they have passed on.

HAPPY ENDING

The issue of dignity is now thankfully a thing of the past as the judgement that was passed by the high court of the country has directly restored it to all women across the country, giving a happy ending to a matter that had pained Eswatini's women for decades.

This Side Of Paradise - By F Scott Fitzgeral

CONSIDERED scandalous and brilliant when it was published in 1920, this side of paradise describes the intellectual, and sexual education of young Amory Blaine in the tumultuous America of the early 1900s.

Highly sophisticated yet hopelessly romantic, Anory flounders from prep school to Princeton to glittering Jazz Age New York, confident that he is destined for greatness but unsure how to go about it. Banks in SSELGS expected to appraise MSME projects

Banks involved in the Small Scale Enterprise Loan Guarantee Scheme (SSELGS) are expected to appraise MSME projects, ascertain viability and ensure that only fully Swati SMEs that operate in the country benefit.

This was disclosed by Minister of Finance Neal Rijkenberg when responding to a question asked by Senator Busi Dlamini during the debate of the ministry's first quarter performance in parliament. The response is contained in the ministry's report of the first quarter.

The minister said credit guarantee mechanism is a commonly used risk transfer instrument to overcome constraints.

He further stated that in many countries, the demand for the collateral increased significantly during the financial crisis and the sharp drop in property prices has had a strong negative impact on the availability of credit to SME.

"CGS is key economic tool that helps SMEs to obtain credit due to unavailability of collateral and lack of positive credit history and audited financial statements.

The lack of sufficient information required by banks to finance SMEs causes banks to be hesitant to lend to MSMEs as they are perceived as high risk. The Government of Eswatini response was the establishment of the SSELGS in 1990 as a catalyst to financial institutions to increase their lending portfolio to small-scale enterprises, by de-risking with a guarantee of 75 per cent," he said.

Capitalisation

He further stated that having been created together with the now doormat Export Credit Scheme (ECS), initially the capitalisation made by the government of Eswatini was E5 million for SSELGS and E13.5 million for ECS.

Over time, E12.4 million was reallocated from ECS to SSELGS in light of the few demands for export credit guarantees.

"As at June 2016 the total number of guaranteed loans was 1 191 for global value of loans amounting to E100.5 million.

The outstanding loan portfolio guaranteed amounts to E40.5 million for a maximum liability of E35 million as at June 30, 2016.

The SSELGS objectives are to fos-

ter the effective localisation of smallscale businesses that is preserving certain industries for local MSMEs especially in commerce, construction, tourism, agriculture and services," he said.

He also mentioned that achieve-

ment of this objective was through the provision of adequate capital to take over existing shops or workshops and establish new ones.

He added that the SSELGS would further enhance the appetite of the financial institutions to lend to the ABOUT THE SSELG:

A new MoU was entered into in May 2019 and aims to improve the uptake of the scheme and promote visibility of it.

Rijkenberg also highlighted that the SSELGS requires a securitisation of 25 per cent and the loan term may not exceed 10 years in the long term with a maximum credit of E50 000 per customer. The interest levied may not exceed three per cent of the prime lending rate.

"The loan portfolio guarantees on current capitalisation or leverage of 3.2 and is low on comparison to similar instruments globally.

There is no precise accepted leverage amount but the global trend ranges between eight and 12.

One such issue is that the scheme is competing with commercial banks ordinary SMEs lending practices and therefore is not being advertised by the banks.

The banks have noted that the process of claiming the guarantee is cumbersome and therefore it is not worthwhile," he added.

Tourism role in job creation often undervalued

The Eswatini Tourism Authority (ETA) has noted with concern that the sector's part in job creation, not only in Eswatini but other countries is undervalued, and many have ignored opportunities that come with the sector.

Despite that tourism generates 10 per cent of world jobs and is included in Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) 8 for its potential to create decent work, a lot are ignorant of the impact the sector plays and the potential to do more if given the attention.

The 2019 World Tourism Day Concept Document has issued that tourism is a leading people-to-people sector, with growth rates outpacing world economic growth and international trade.

Impact

It says tourism is one of the main global export categories and with such a high impact on human workforce it serves as a natural ally of ILO's human-centered agenda for the future of work.

However, new policies are needed to maximise tourism's potential to create more and better jobs, especially for the often prejudiced and vulnerable groups in women and youth.

"New policies are also needed

to reflect and incorporate ongoing advances in technology, with policies and actions being geared towards addressing the current mismatch between tourism skills that are taught and those that tourism employers need," says an extract from the 2019 World Tourism Day Document.

The document says this requires a holistic approach to the future

of work in tourism, with heightened cooperation between all actors, including the public and private sectors.

Ensuring

"Creating and ensuring equitable employment is essential to increasing social inclusion, peace and security. The potential of every economic sector to provide decent jobs should be utilised to its fullest,"

reads the document, which adds that the emergence of new technologies has led to the development of new forms of work that are rapidly changing production processes worldwide.

"This both provides opportunities for, and puts pressure, on existing employment, welfare and education agendas," reads the docu-

In addition, it is stated that making the new wave of technological breakthroughs as inclusive as possible will require considerable investment in training and skills for life and work and everyone should have a chance to develop their full potential so as to benefit from the new technological era.

Growth

To do this the need to examine the impact of technological change on socio-economic growth, jobs and inequality is essential, and the need to provide tools and skills to those who are looking for a job and as well as to those whose jobs are at risk of automation.

According to the International Labour Organisation (ILO), global unemployment remains high, reaching more than 190 million in 2018.

All sectors and countries, therefore, need to create the conditions for more and better jobs and embracing new technology can play a key role in achieving this goal.

No great performance expected despite good rains – Agbiz

CAPE TOWN – The agricultural sector is set to underperform in the 2019/2020 season despite the prospects of predicted adequate rainfall, data shows.

The Agricultural Business Council (Agbiz) confidence index released yesterday rose to 46 in the third quarter, after easing to 44 in the second quarter, still at a level below the neutral 50-point mark, which implies that agribusinesses have a bleak view of business conditions in South Africa. The Agbiz composite index comprises 10 sub indices, most of which are still generally subdued compared to the long-term average levels since its inception in 2001.

Four of the 10 sub indices that make up the composite index underpinned the slight improvement in sentiment in the third quarter. These positive sub-indices were general agricultural conditions, volume of exports, market share of agribusiness and employment sub-indices.

Expect
Wandile Sihlobo, the Chief Economist at Agbiz, said: "It signals a potential mild uptick in SA agriculture gross domestic product in the third quarter, but we generally expect South African agribusiness to under perform in 2019. We see a two per cent year-on-year contraction in South African agricultural fortunes this year."

He noted that although the uptick in confidence was always a welcome development, it was important to be mindful that the Agbiz/IDC Agribusiness Index had been hovering at levels below the 50-point mark for the past five quarters.

"We worry that remaining at these levels for a prolonged period could lead to declining investment in the sector, albeit this is not the case at the present moment," he added.

LAST week was a historical week for SADC's Micro Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) as the Kingdom of Eswatini hosted the 25th Session of the Inter-Governmental Committee of Senior Officials and Experts (ICSOE) of Southern

Under the theme 'Strategies and policies for the integration of micro, small and medium scale enterprises (MSMEs) in the industrialisation process in Southern Africa', delegates from the SADC region and other Regional Economic Communities (RECs) such as COMESA met at Royal Swazi Spa from September 10-13 to discuss the challenges and opportunities faced by MSMEs and what roles SADC member states should play to ensure the sustainability of the sec-

Under the theme; several presentations were made; including reports on the economic and social conditions in Southern Africa; the implementation of regional and international agendas and other special initiatives in the sub-region; such as the African Continental Free Trade Area (AfCFTA), as well as panel discussions on the integration of MSMEs into agro-processing value chains; the growing MSMEs in Southern Africa and the role of regional institutions in promoting MSMEs.

There was also a high level discussion on financing models for MSMEs as well as a presentation of the Ad Hoc Expert Group on the harmonisation of regional industrialisation strategies and policies in Southern Africa. On the sidelines of the meeting, the 2018 Eswatini STEPS (Structural Transformation considering three dimensions of Employment, Production and Society) Profile and the Economic Report on Africa were also launched.

Recommendations

Following four days of intense discussions, the following recommendations were made under each of the main areas of deliberation:

(a) Strategies and policies for the integration of Micro, Small and Medium Scale Enterprises (MSMEs) in the industrialisation process in Southern Africa

(i) Member states should;

 Set conditions to enable MSMEs to tap into and strengthen regional value chains capitalising on the regional industrialisation strategy and the AfCFTA;

 Strengthen platforms and networks to enable collaboration, peer learning, nurturing entrepreneurship and scaling up of private investment;

 Develop support mechanisms such as preferential public procurement, local content policies, venture financing and tax incentives to promote the growth and sustain-

 Support MSMEs to harness innovative and creative approaches to improve productivity, quality of products, competitiveness and enhance market access;

(ii) Concerted efforts should be made to support the development and implementation of transboundary projects to facilitate the growth and participation of MSME's in the regional value chains.

(b) Harmonisation of regional industrialisation strategies and policies in Southern Africa



Global advertising conference halts SA launch over xenophobia fears

JOHANNESBURG - International media, marketing and advertising conference Advertising Week has postponed its inaugural African edition to 2020 due to concerns about xenophobic violence in South Africa.

Earlier in September Gauteng was rocked by violence that left at least 12 people dead, as foreign-owned shops were looted, and vehicles and property destroyed. According to police, close to 700 people were arrest-

President Cyril Ramaphosa has apolo-

gised for the violence, including at a memorial service for Zimbabwe's former President Robert Mugabe.

Advertising Week Africa was set to take place from October 28 to 31 in Johannesburg. The other editions of the event take place in the US, UK, Japan, Mexico and Australia.

Advertising Week Africa is now set to take place in the first half of 2020, with the new date to be confirmed, organisers Stillwell Partners said in a statement yesterday.

"Advertising Week - the world's largest annual gathering of advertising, creative, entertainment, marketing, media and technology industry leaders - has shifted its maiden Africa edition to 2020," the statement said.

"The date change comes after a joint decision by the event's Africabased Advisory Council and other local and international stakeholders, following unrest in South Africa and the resulting reprisal attacks across several African countries."

Stillwell said the commitment to launching Advertising Week Africa was "only stronger" despite the postponement, and several events that had been planned for the lead-up to Advertising Week Africa elsewhere would go ahead as planned. These include a gala reception honouring the 20th anniversary of the Nelson Mandela Foundation in New York on 25 September, as part of Advertising Week in New York.


RAMAPHOSA SENDS RADEBE TO NIGERIA TO APOLOGISE

JOHANNESBURG - A South African envoy expressed the country's "sincerest apologies" to Nigeria on Monday, after a wave of anti-migrant attacks swept through Johannesburg and surrounding cities in recent weeks, fuelling diplomatic tensions.

A meeting with Nigerian President Muhammadu Buhari in the capital Abuja was held to convey President Cyrial Ramaphosa's "sincere apologies about the incident that has recently transpired in South Africa," the special envoy, Jeff Radebe, told reporters.


"The incident does not represent what we stand for," he said, adding that South African police would "leave no stone unturned, that those involved must be brought to book."

In a statement after the meeting

Nigeria's presidency said "President Buhari responded to profuse apologies from the South African president, pledging that relationship between the two countries will be solidified." Johannesburg and surrounding areas were rocked by a series of deadly attacks on foreigners in



recent weeks, with many directed against Nigerian-owned businesses and properties. At least 12 people were killed in the vio-

lence that left hundreds of shops destroyed.

No Nigerians were killed according to
South African authorities but the violence
led to condemnation across Africa, particularly in Nigeria, fuelling diplomatic tensions between the continent's two leading nations.

The violence also prompted reprisal attacks against South African firms in Nigeria and the temporary closing of South Africa's diplomatic missions in Lagos and Abuja.

Last week, almost 200 Nigerian migrants were repatriated back to Lagos, Nigeria's commercial capital, following the unrest. *AFP*


Will Donald Trump back off on Iran again?

WASHINGTON - Donald Trump famously canceled a missile strike on Iran in June, but Tehran will not be resting easy following the unpredictable president's warning that the United States is again "locked and loaded."

After giving diplomats whiplash last week with reversals on Afghanistan, Trump now has the world on tenterhooks over his response to a weekend attack on Saudi oil facilities that his top diplomat has blamed on Iran.

"We'll see?" he tweeted Monday in a phrase that encapsulated the lack of clarity.

Just last week, the White House dangled out the possibility of a



meeting between Trump and President Hassan Rouhani, which would mark an extraordinary thaw in US-Iranian relations.

Even though the Iranians showed little sign of being ready, Trump



aides and Trump himself hinted at openness to at least an informal encounter during the UN General Assembly in New York next week.

As Secretary of State Mike Pompeo said: "The president has made very

clear he is prepared to meet with no preconditions."

Then came Saturday's attack by drones setting ablaze oil processing facilities in Saudi Arabia, both a close US ally and a bitter enemy of Iran.

Forces

Iranian-backed Huthi rebels fighting Saudi-backed forces in Yemen claimed responsibility. The Saudis and Pompeo pointed the finger at Tehran, which in turn insisted it was not responsible.

The intensifying back and forth put Trump in the role of referee and, as is his style, he's leaving the players in suspense.

Israel votes in second general election this year

JERUSALEM - Israelis began voting yesterday in an unprecedented repeat election that will decide whether longtime Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu stays in power despite a looming indictment on corruption charges.

Netanyahu, the longest serving leader in Israeli history, is seeking a fourth consecutive term in office, and fifth overall.

But he faces a stiff challenge from retired military chief Benny Gantz, whose centrist Blue and White party is running even with Netanyahu's Likud. *AP*

Rescuers search for 39 after accident

NEW DELHI - Indian authorities were engaged in a major search and rescue operation Monday to find 39 people missing after their tour boat capsized in a fast-flowing swollen river. Police told AFP that eight bodies have been recovered, down from a previous tally of 12, after the accident on the Godavari river in the southern state of Andhra Pradesh. The boat was carrying a total of 73 passengers, of whom 26 have been rescued, local police official Adnan Asmi said. Almost 300 personnel using boats and a helicopter were engaged in the search operation on Monday including from the Indian Navy and the National Disaster Response Force. AFP

US legal battle victory for Arizona artists

phoenix - Two Arizona artists who refused to create invitations to same-sex weddings due to their Christian beliefs were within their legal rights, the US state's top court ruled. The state Supreme Court's decision invalidates previous judgments against the two women for violating a "human relations ordinance" introduced by the southwestern city of Phoenix to safeguard LGBTQ rights. According to their lawyers, the two artists could have faced up to six months in prison and a \$2 500 fine each time they refused to make invitations to gay weddings. AFP


Militiamen death toll rises to 38

CENTRAL AFRICA - The death toll of militiamen killed in rival group fighting in the Central African Republic at the weekend has risen to 38, according to an internal United Nations report seen by AFP on Monday. The UN Mission in Central Africa (Minusca) initially put the death toll at 23. The two armed groups had signed a peace deal in February. Fierce clashes between militias in recent months have raised concerns about whether the peace accord aimed at ending years of violence in CAR will hold. The country's President, Faustin-Archange Touadera, this month told AFP that the agreement was "quite strong" -- but Minusca on Saturday said fighting had broken out in Birao, a city close to the Sudanese border. AFP

Prosecutor appeals acquittal of Gbagbo

HAGUE - The chief prosecutor of the International Criminal Court appealed on Monday against the shock acquittal of former Ivory Coast leader Laurent Gbagbo over post-electoral violence that killed around 3 000 people. Gbagbo, the first head of state to stand trial in The Hague, and his deputy Charles Ble Goude, were both cleared of crimes against humanity in January and released the following month.

"The appeal will demonstrate that the trial chamber committed legal and procedural errors which led to the acquittals of Gbagbo and Ble Goude on all counts," Prosecutor Fatou Bensouda's office said. *AFP*

JOHANNESBURG - Zimbabweans who booed President Cyril Ramaphosa during former statesman Robert Mugabe's funeral on Sunday were expressing their anger, frustration and disappointment in South Africa, and not at him personally.

That's what Ramaphosa told delegates on Monday when he addressed hundreds of Southern African Clothing and Textile Workers' Union (SACTWU) members during their 14th national congress held in Durban.

Ramaphosa began his address by reiterating the government's stance on genderbased violence, and again condemned violent attacks which in the past weeks have claimed the lives of foreign nationals.

He said Parliament will today convene to discuss ongoing violence within the country. When speaking about the hostile reception he received from the crowd in Harare at the weekend, he said: "They expressed their disappointment. They expressed their unhappiness. They expressed their anger against us as South Africans, and they saw me as representing all of us in South Africa.

Their reaction was against us. The whole stadium, some 40 000 people, booed me.

"It was only when I said I regret what has happened in our country and apologised on behalf of all of us in South Africa, that is when they responded positively. I have apologised on your behalf, and I hope it does sink into our consciousness that the world expects us to act in a way in which we will respect the rights of people of other nations."

'Don't remind us of apartheid'

JOHANNESBURG - Gauteng MEC for education Panyaza Lesufi has slammed an Afrikaans university that is set to open late next year.

Taking to social media on Monday, Lesufi said that a "race-based institution" would fail in SA. Lesufi insisted that the university intended to segregate and remind the country of the past.

TimesLIVE reported that Lesufi had spearheaded efforts to rename schools in Gauteng that had the names of apartheid leaders.

Last month he removed former prime minister Hendrik Verwoerd's name from a school in Pretoria, changing it to Rietondale High School.

Lesufi also slammed the university for representing only one group of people, saying that "we have been here before don't remind us what your ancestors used to say to us".

Responding to a comment that the intentions of the university are innocent, Lesufi said "non-racialism is the future".

According to Cape Talk, the R300m university in Pretoria has been funded by donations and trade union group Solidarity.

Speaking on the radio station, Lesufi said the idea of the university was started "out of anger" when universities across the country began changing their language policies to promote inclusivity.

"It's very important to understand where we come from, that there was a certain language that was used to oppress people in this country," he said.

He also defended himself against accusations that he was anti-Afrikaans, adding that he believed all languages should be treated equally.

"We're not saying this because we are attacking Afrikaans but because the message of 'we only need one language' is bad."

Breaking down the costs of the State Capture inquiry

JOHANNESBURG - Justice and Correctional Services Minister Ronald Lamola has revealed that R356,127 million has been spent since the establishment of the Zondo Commission of Inquiry into allegations of State Capture.

In a written response to a parliamentary question from DA's Mergan Chetty, Lamola said R244.573m was spent in 2018-19 financial year and R111.553m as at August 2019.

His response showed that R15.5m was spent on compensation of employees, R286.4m on goods and services, R88.4m investigators, R52m legal services, R1.9m travel and subsistence, R10.5m communication and R53.6m machinery and equipment.

Lamola also said the Nugent Commission into tax administration and governance by the SARS cost the state R8 106 113.

He was responding to DA's Solly Malatsi who asked for total cost and breakdown of costs incurred by the Nugent Commission.

He said R7 114 421 was paid in 2018-19 with R205 838 towards compensation of employees and R6 908 582 for legal advisory ser-

vices while R991 692 was paid for legal advisory services.

The cost on the commissioners come in the wake of an Independent Media report last week that Public Works and Infrastructure Minister Patrica de Lille said R14.8 million has been paid to a media company and property group for the housing of the Zondo commission of inquiry.

"The total amount paid to date is R14 837 975.97," she said.

A breakdown of the cost also shows that monthly rental for offices at Tiso Blackstar building was R72 846.52 and the rental of the media company's auditorium was R796 950.

The monthly rental of offices from Redefine Properties was R374 900.61.

De Lille said the lease agreement between the government, Redefine Properties and Tiso was signed between May and July last year.

"The lease agreements with Tiso Blackstar were signed for 12 months and have been extended for a further period of seven months. The lease agreement with Redefine was signed for three years," she said. *Political Bureau*

Herman Mashaba in multimillion-rand conflict-of-interest scandal

JOHANNESBURG - Allegations of a multimillion-rand conflict-of-interest scandal have again rocked Joburg Mayor Herman Mashaba over claims he influenced the funding of an NGO that he chaired for years.

Field Band Foundation (FBF), which Mashaba chaired for more than 10 years, received an R11 mil-

lion three-year contract beginning in December 2017, apparently after a recommendation from the mayor to the city's social development department.

Following an uproar within the city council, a decision was taken in March last year to suspend the contract pending a forensic investigation into allegations Mashaba used

his influence and knowledge of FBF to benefit the organisation.

However, there seems to be confusion over when FBF were informed about the suspension. The NGO claimed to have been told eight months after the council resolution was taken.

Despite the resolution halting the lucrative funding, Mashaba's office

confirmed that R3.5m was given to FBF. This followed a council question asked by ANC councillor Raynet Moabi on August 22. The Star sent questions to Mashaba and City Manager Ndivhoniswani Lukhwareni's offices.

Responding on their behalf, Joburg spokesperson Nthatisi Modingoane confirmed that FBF had received

He said the impact of Chinese imports, both legal and illegal, was being addressed: "We have raised these issues with the Chinese authorities."

The president said a number of operations undertaken by SARS had resulted in the confiscation of goods worth more than R1bn, with most of these connected to the illicit side of the clothing and textile industry. Times Live

AfriForum and Roets win in apartheid flag case

JOHANNESBURG-AfriForum and its deputy CEO, Ernst Roets, have won in a court case brought against them by the Nelson Mandela Foundation (NMF), after Roets tweeted the old South African flag hours after gratuitous displays of it were ruled to be hate speech.

The foundation believed the lobby group was in contempt of court following the hate speech ruling, but Judge Colin Lamont has dismissed the NMF's application, ruling yesterday morning at the Equality Court sitting in the Gauteng High Court that Judge Phineas Mojapelo's earlier ruling was a declaratory order, and contempt of court only applies to a court order where someone is instructed to do something.

This isn't AfriForum's first victory with Lamont presiding, with the judge having ruled in the lobby group's favour when they argued that Julius Malema's singing of struggle song Dubula iBhunu often translated as "kill the boer" – was hate speech back in 2011, when the EFF leader was still president of the ANC Youth League (ANCYL).

The Nelson Mandela Foundation filed the application after Roets took to Twitter and posted the apartheid flag, asking: "Did I just commit hate speech?", just hours after a scathing judgment banned its gratuitous display.

Arguing before Judge Colin Lamont on September 4, the foundation submitted that Roets had insulted the dignity of the courts and should be found in contempt.



Deputy Judge President Phineas Mojapelo declared that the "gratuitous display" of the flag constituted hate speech in terms of Section 10(1) of the Equality Act, unfair discrimination in terms of Section 7 of the act, and harassment in terms of Section 11 of the act.

Roets, however, claimed that he had posted the flag for academic purposes and in his own capacity and not that of AfriForum.

He also argued that he and AfriForum could not be held in contempt of court because no order was granted against them specifically and that his tweets fell under the proviso that the display of the flag must be confined to genuine artistic, academic, or journalistic expression in the public interest, in terms of Section 2 of the Equality Act.

Arguing on behalf of the foundation, advocate Tembeka Ngcukaitobi said there was no way that AfriForum and Roets were not aware that the judgment prohibited the gratuitous display of the

He also argued that Roets' argument in the matter had no academic context and questioned why it was necessary for Roets to have an academic enquiry.

"They commit contempt the moment they conduct themselves in a way calculated to bring about disrepute to this court," Ngcukaitobi said.

Roets' lawyer, senior counsel Cedric Puckrin, argued that his client's version stating why he tweeted the picture of the apartheid flag after there was a judgment banning its gratuitous display should not be ignored, News24 previously reported.

He also argued that the matter had nothing to do with AfriForum because Roets tweeted in his personal capacity. Citizen

DA livid over Bathabile's 'new post'

CAPE TOWN - The DA has warned President Cyril Ramaphosa against appointing former minister Bathabile Dlamini into any diplomatic position, threatening to sue if he goes ahead with the rumoured plans to deploy the ANC Women's League president.

DA lawyers wrote to Ramaphosa on Friday amid media reports that Dlamini would be appointed into SA's foreign service as an ambassador for the country.

They cited International Relations and Co-operation Minister Naledi Pandor's response to DA MP Darren Bergman's parliamentary question on whether Dlamini was being considered as an ambassador. Pandor said she did not appoint ambassadors and Ramaphosa would announce a new ambassador at an appropriate time.

She said: "But seeing that I'm smiling, I'm sure you know why I'm smiling," which some interpreted as an indication that Dlamini would get a diplomatic posting.

The letter from Minde Schapiro and Smith Inc argues that Dlamini's possible appointment as a diplomat concerned the DA because "it would seem ambassador positions are reserved for those politicians who have failed their country and who



Ronaldo 'embarrassed' by rape allegations

LONDON - Juventus star Cristiano Ronaldo has admitted he felt "embarrassed" as he tried to shield his family from allegations he raped a woman in the United States.

Ronaldo was accused of sexually assaulting Kathryn Mayorga in a Las Vegas hotel in June 2009.

The Portugal forward, a five-time Champions League winner, strongly denied the claims and the investigation was originally closed 10 years ago.

It reopened in August 2018, shortly before Mayorga filed a civil lawsuit in September and offered details she initially withheld.

Prosecutors announced in July this year that they would not be prosecuting the case because the allegations could not "be proven beyond a reasonable doubt."


The former Manchester United great revealed the allegations had taken a mental toll on him as he sought to protect his children from the reports.

"They play with your dignity," Ronaldo told 'Good Morning Britain' in an interview with Piers Morgan that will air on Tuesday.

"It's hard. You have a girlfriend, you have a family, you have kids. When they play with your honesty, it's bad, it's hard.

"I remember one day I was at home in the living room with my girl-friend watching the television to see the news and they speak about 'Cristiano Ronaldo this and that.'

Disgraced Russian footballers freed from prison

MOSCOW - Russian footballers Pavel Mamaev and Alexander Kokorin were released on Tuesday after spending nearly a year in prison over a night of drunken assaults.

Russian state television showed Krasnodar midfielder Mamaev, 31, and Zenit Saint Petersburg forward Kokorin, 28, leave the prison where they were held in the southwestern Belgorod region.

Russian news agencies reported that Zenit Saint Petersburg has already signed a new contract with Kokorin.

"We decided to conclude a contract with Kokorin to run to the end of the season," the club's general director Alexander Medvedev told the RIA Novosti news agency. The football season ends in May next year.

Wearing black hoodies, the

pair rushed to a car while refusing to take questions from the media gathered outside the prison.

A court this month granted the footballers early release following their convictions in May for last year's attacks in Moscow.

Including time in pre-trial detention, they had served 11 months of their 17-18 month sentences for hooliganism.

In a booze-fuelled night last October, Mamaev and Kokorin first assaulted the chauffeur of a TV presenter as he waited in a car park.

In an assault caught on video, they then attacked two government officials in an upmarket cafe, hitting one of them with a chair.

The assaults sparked outrage in Russia, where the pair had previously caused scandal when a video

All Blacks attack game against Boks

CAPE TOWN – Renowned New Zealand rugby writer Phil Gifford, in his book Loose among the Legends, writes that in 1996 he celebrated his wife's 50th birthday at the Sumner Yacht Club.

The invitation asked people to come dressed as their fantasy.

Gifford recalls being one of those tragics who came as an All Black, while former New Zealand prop Richard Loe, infamous for being nasty on the field, came as the devil.

Gifford writes: "Former All Black flyhalf Andrew Mehrtens arrived clothed from head to toe in a real Springbok uniform, complete with the No 10 on the back of the jersey.

"When there was a chance to have a private word with him, I said: 'Mehrts, I know you were born in South Africa, but please don't tell me your fantasy is to be a Springbok?' Mehrts responded: 'No, not at all.

This is Joel Stransky's gear, when we swapped after the 1995 World Cup final last year.

My fantasy is to be the guy who kicks the winning goal in a World Cup final, not the di** who misses it.'

Famous

Mehrtens is also famous for his exchange with Springbok flyhalf Henry Honiball, who had announced his retirement after the Boks had beaten the All Blacks in the 1999 World Cup third-place playoff. Mehrtens thanked Honiball for their battles and asked him never to come

back to international rugby.

Such was the relief Mehrtens felt that he wouldn't have to line-up opposite the Bok hard man.

There was such respect back then for the rivalry and there was equal respect in 2009 when Richie McCaw described the Springboks as the best team he had ever faced and admitted in his autobiography that in 2009

he doubted if the All Blacks would find a way to beat the Boks after three successive defeats.

The Bok formula in 2009 was a well-conditioned and powerful pack, the line kicking genius of Fourie du Preez and two wings in Bryan Habana and JP Pietersen whose chase game could turn any kick into a good one.

It took the All Blacks an entire year to find a way to combat the Boks' game plan and win again.

> Now the All Blacks find themselves doubting their attack again, with the rivalry at a peak after two decades of one-sided results. *IOL*


'Kolisi lifting World Cup would be 'hugely symbolic'

TWICKENHAM - Springbok captain Siya Kolisi receiving the Rugby World Cup trophy would be a "hugely symbolic moment" for the country, South African coaching guru Alan Solomons told AFP.

If the 28-year-old flanker, the first black player to captain South Africa at a World Cup, were to lift the Webb Ellis Cup on November 2, it would become one of the most iconic images in World Cup history.

It could even rival the picture of the white Springbok captain Francois Pienaar receiving the trophy in 1995 from South Africa's first black president Nelson Mandela in a country where rugby was considered a pillar of apartheid.

"Siya has done really well, he is a



fabulous player and it would be fantastic for him to win the World Cup," said Solomons, who was assistant to Springbok coach Nick Mallett during the 1999 World Cup.

"It would be a great thing for the

country to win and a hugely symbolic moment if he lifted the trophy.

"It would have positive connotations all round for the country and the people."

Solomons, who is director of rugby at English Premiership side Worcester Warriors, believes the final will be between the Boks and the two-time defending champions New Zealand but says this is the most open World Cup of all time.

"Ît is massively competitive," said the 69-year-old, who helped Mallett's Bok side win the 1998 Tri-Nations title and beat the All Blacks in the third-place playoff in 1999.

"In 1999 our pool games were a joke, we knew our first serious game would be England in the quarter-finals."

Shock as sprint queen Carina fails drug test

JOHANNESBURG – The legacy of Carina Horn, South Africa's fastest woman, is under a cloud after she was provisionally suspended after testing positive for banned substances on Friday.

The first South African woman to dip below 11 seconds in the 100m dash, Horn will miss out on this year's International Association of Athletics Federations (IAAF) World Championships after an adverse analytical finding in a sample she provided.

The Athletics Integrity Unit (AIU) which operates the IAAF's anti-doping programme yesterday revealed that Horn had been provisionally suspended for the presence of the growth hormone Ibutamoren and LGD-4033.

Horn, 30, was suspended pending an IAAF disciplinary tribunal outcome.

Her suspension comes a month after Springbok wing Aphiwe Dyantyi tested positive for multiple anabolic steroids and metabolites. He was charged with a doping offence after his B-sample returned the same results.

Felix, touted as the heir to Ronaldo's throne, will make his debut in Europe's top competition when the Portuguese pair meet at the Wanda Metropolitano, with the La Liga outfit keen to shoot down the five-time Ballon d'Or win-

Juventus dumped Atletico out of the competition last year as Ronaldo scored a sensational hat-trick that overturned a 2-0 first-leg deficit and put the Italian champions in the quarter finals.

The former Real Madrid man rounded off the evening by celebrating provocatively in front of the away fans at Juve's Allianz Stadium. Now Felix is charged with bringing the old master down a peg or two.

The 19-year-old has been hailed as the new 'CR7' after his breakout season at Benfica last year, scoring 20 times as the two-time European champions won the Primeira Liga and reached the Europa League quarter finals.


Ronaldo's former manager at Madrid

Coutinho expected to spark Bayern CL charge

BERLIN - As Bayern Munich launch their Champions League campaign against Red Star Belgrade tonight, Bavarian hopes of reclaiming European club football's top prize rest to a large extent on the shoulders of Philippe Coutinho.

Following seven semi-final appearances in the last decade, the former Liverpool midfielder has been hailed as the man who can take Bayern the extra step in European football's flagship competition this season. Last season's defeat to Liverpool

BERLIN - As Bayern Munich in the last 16 sparked fears that Bayern's Champions League aura campaign against Red Star was fading.

The departure of veteran stars such as Franck Ribery and Arjen Robben seemed to confirm the end of an era, but Coutinho's arrival on loan from Barcelona has prompted fresh hope that Bayern can be restored as one of the continent's most feared sides.

"There are always big expectations at Bayern and of course the Champions League is a goal," said Coutinho at his unveiling in August. Many believe that the 27-yearold can inspire Bayern to their first Champions League title since 2013. Earlier this month, his Brazil teammate and Manchester City goalkeeper Ederson told German newspaper Bild that Coutinho's arrival put Bayern among the title favourites this season. Fellow Bayern midfielder Corentin Tolisso echoed that sentiment in an interview with Sky last month, saying that the loan signings of Coutinho and Croatian winger Ivan Perisic would be decisive for Bayern. "Before those two arrived, we didn't necessarily have a team that was capable of winning the treble," said Tolisso. "With this team, we can go very far in the Champions League. I think the title is possible." Such expectations could weigh heavy on Coutinho, who is looking to reboot his career after struggling to hold down a first-team spot in a year and a half at Barcelona.

Neymar's suspension cut to two games

LAUSANNE - Neymar's Champions League ban for insulting match officials on social media has been reduced from three games to two following an appeal, the Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS) ruled yesterday.

The world's most expensive player following his move from Barcelona to Paris Saint-Germain for 222 million euros in 2017 will miss the fixtures against Real Madrid today and Galatasaray in two weeks' time due to the original ban from UEFA.

However, he will now be free to face Belgian side Bruges on October 22.

"The Sole Arbitrator partially upheld the appeal and reduced the suspension imposed by UEFA on Neymar Jr. to two UEFA competition matches for which he would otherwise be eligible," CAS said in a statement.

The Brazilian criticised the referee and his assistants after PSG's last-16 collapse against Manchester United in March which he watched from the stands due to injury. United were awarded a penalty deep into injury time after a protracted VAR decision, which Marcus Rashford scored to knock the French side out in the last 16 of the Champions League. "It's a disgrace. They get four guys who don't understand football to watch a slow motion replay in front of the TV," Neymar posted on his instagram account after the 3-1 defeat. AFP

Guardiola chases CL vindication

MANCHESTER - After a series of painful Champions League failures, Pep Guardiola is on a mission to seal his Manchester City legacy by finally getting his hands on the trophy again.

City start their latest bid to win the club's first European Cup with a trip to Shakhtar Donetsk in the Group C opener today.

The long flight to the Ukraine will give Guardiola plenty of time to ponder his curious streak of Champions League flops in recent years.

Guardiola has conquered English football

spectacularly after winning the last two Premier League titles, the first in record-breaking fashion and the second as part of an unprecedented domestic treble last season. Yet the Champions League has proved impossible for Guardiola to master since he arrived at the Etihad Stadium.

In fact, Europe's elite club competition has been a cruel mistress for Guardiola for most of the last decade, with a series of frustrating exits during his spells in charge of Barcelona, Bayern Munich and City. Guardiola first won the Champions League as a manager in 2009 with Barcelona. *AFP*

Time ticking for Spurs to prove they are winners

LONDON - Tottenham's improbable rollercoaster run to the club's first ever Champions League final last season has masked a steady decline in results for Mauricio Pochettino's men stretching back to February.

The tension, emotion and elation of the late drama that saw Spurs past Manchester City in the quarterfinals and Ajax in the last four will live long in the memory.

But having ultimately fallen shot in the final against Liverpool, Pochettino remains without a trophy after five seasons in charge.

That does not diminish the impact the Argentine has had in transforming Tottenham from

Europa League regulars to Champions League contenders.

Yet, it may well be that the window for this Spurs squad to win the Champions League closed with defeat to Liverpool on June 1.


DE GEA FINALLY SIGNS NEW LONG-TERM MAN U CONTRACT

MANCHESTER - David de Gea has become Manchester United's highest-paid star after finally signing a new £375 000-a-week contract at Old Trafford.

The deal, which runs until June 2023 with the option for United to extend it by another 12 months, was confirmed on Monday after two years of talks between de Gea's camp and the club. It guarantees the 28-year-old Spaniard £75million in salary and makes him the biggest earner at United ahead of Paul Pogba on £290,000 following Alexis Sanchez's loan move to Inter Milan.

It also cements de Gea as the highest-paid goalkeeper in world football above Real Madrid's Thibaut Courtois, Kepa Arrizabalaga of Chelsea, Bayern Munich number one Manuel Neuer, and Atletico Madrid's Jan Oblak.

De Gea, who came within minutes of joining Real Madrid in 2015 before signing a new contract, could have

left as a free agent next summer.

Negotiations over his latest deal have been protracted, not least because Sanchez's £500 000-a-week contract - which is now shared between United and Inter - disrupted the pay scale at Old Trafford and has led to the club's other stars demanding parity.

De Gea also wanted assurances over

United's direction and ambition before committing himself to another long-term deal. However, he was impressed by the loyalty shown by Manager Ole Gunnar Solskjaer at the end of last season when there were calls for the former Atletico Madrid keeper to be axed over a loss of form.

They have to bear in mind that they are the only remaining team representing the country in this continental competition.





REFEREE instructors are attending a course that started on Monday at Thokoza Church Centre.

The course which will run until Friday is aimed at improving the technical knowhow of local referees. We welcome Carlos Henriques, who is the facilitator from South Africa. Today we are looking at referees medical needs. The football referee, also considered the 23rd player in a football match, is supported by two assistant referees. Together, the three officials play a crucial role in officiating a match by ensuring that players follow the laws of the game.

Like the players, the referees show a mixed walking and running profile low, medium, and high intensity. Therefore, high demands are put on the cardiovascular and musculoskeletal system of the referees, who are on average ten to fifteen years older than the players. But, in addition to being older than the players, the referee exhibits further unique characteristics, he is rarely a full-time professional, he does not play the ball and he normally cannot be substituted during the match exception if an acute injury occurs. During a match, a referee may cover a mean distance of 11.5km which is comparable to the distance covered by a midfielder. 16-17 per cent of this distance is run at high intensity, while up to 12 per cent of the total match distance is covered in a sprinting manner. Referee needs to be prepared to perform at high intensity throughout the

match. Elite referees may perform up to 1,270 activity changes and make more than 130 decisions during a match, this indicates the high level of physiological and cognitive demands experienced by the referee.

Injuries and musculoskeletal complaints

While contact injuries are not a major consideration, non-contact injuries and overuse injuries may be a concern. The most common acute injuries are hamstring strains, calf strains, and ankle sprains, knee lesions meniscus and cartilage injuries, and quadricep muscle strains. In general, more injuries occur during training than during matches, which might be explained by the greater

exposure time in training than in matches. Problems in the thigh and lower leg muscles are common in referees, while problems in the groin/adductors and calf muscle are more common in assistant referees. Possible explanations for these is related to the different movement patterns that are typical of the two positions: the referee's job involves a considerable amount of changing direction, sprinting and backwards running often with rotated trunk and head neck, during which the dorsal muscle chains lower back, hamstring must control the eccentric load, and the knee and ankle joints have to master the rotational movements. The movements of the assistant referee are, in contrast, characterised by rapid lateral shuttle runs often on their toes, which stress in particular the groin area, the calf and the knees.

Nutrition and hydration

Without an appropriate training programme and good nutritional preparation, the referee may become fatigued and may not be able to exert proper control over a match. The referees should tailor their intake prior to and during a match to the demands of the game.

Pre-competition medical assessment

As many referees are 'older' athletes, an exercise ECG is often recommended. The leading cause of sudden cardiac death in people over the age of 35 years is related to coronary artery disease. An exercise test should be conducted for all athletes with an increased cardiovascular risk profile, and for individuals above the age of 35, or both. Finally let's treat referees as professionals thus love and respect them. They are humans they do have mistakes like everyone. Till next week, God bless you all.











THANDAZA GETS 4 YEARS SUSPENSION FOR DOPING

ATHLETICS - CORREC-**TIONAL Athletics Club athlete** Thandaza Zwane has been suspended for four years by Athletics Eswatini (AE) following a doping violation.

This was revealed by AE President Zakhele Dlamini during a press conference held at Eswatini Olympic and Commonwealth Games Association (EOCGA) premises yesterday.

The suspension comes after the athlete was found to have a banned substance in his system following an out of competition doping test by the Regional Anti- Doping Organisations (RADO). The substance is listed under the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) as banned for use by professional athletes.

Findings

"We would like to confirm that the top athlete Thandaza Zwane has been suspended following findings by RADO that the athlete had a prohibited substance GW1516 in his system. The test was conducted on the 25th of May with a hearing conducted by RADO held on August 30. Following its findings, his suspension period of four years will end on July 16, 2023," he said.

Dlamini went on to clarify that the athlete did not intentionally take the banned substance.

"Due to his level of experience and exposure to extensive antidoping education, Zwane was found to have been negligent and, there-

fore, at fault. As an association we understand what happened but do not under any circumstances condone doping," he said.

The president also said as a member of the International Association of Athletics Federations (IAAF), the association would conform to the ban as stipulated by article 40 of the AE constitution.

His Majesties Correctiona (HMCS) Public Relations Officer (PRO) Gugu Dlamini said they would support the athlete and they would meet to figure a way forward in due course.

"Zwane is our athlete and we stand behind him.

We cannot comment on what our next step is at the moment and are just here in show of support," she said.
