Over 1 500 at Nkonjwa double funeral

IT was a full house at a Vilakati homestead as people from almost all corners of the country turned out for a double funeral at Nkonjwa.

The double funeral was that of a wellknown traditional healer (inyanga) Gcina Samson Vilakati (42) and his mother Liphinah Gumbi (78). Both individuals were shot dead allegedly by members of the Vilakati extended family at Nkonjwa.

The incident happened on January 6, 2019. Vilakati (Gcina) also doubled as a bishop at his church, Sambulo Church in Zion. The highly-emotional funeral was held at Nkonjwa under Sithobelweni Inkhundla in the Lubombo region. The funeral, which was attended by people estimated to be over 1 500, was preceded by a night vigil, which started at about 10pm. The night vigil was held at Vilakati's homestead, which is about one kilometre from Gumbi's (Gcina's mother) homestead.

The night vigil was conducted by Sambulo Church in Zion members and was characterised by more singing and less talking. Zionist songs were sung for the better part of the night vigil, by members of Vilakati's church and some other churches under the Zionist faith. They were dressed in different Zionist gear, with some being white, while others were navy blue and green.

However, what was slightly different here was that all of the songs rendered during the funeral service, including the night vigil, were sung with an aid of Swazi traditional drums.

Nkonjwa residents now concerned of their image

THE community of Nkonjwa is now known for being a rural place full of violent people who are prepared to kill at any time.

This was said by some of the residents during Gumbi's funeral. They said this as they talked among themselves, wondering what could have trigerred the killings in that place.

One lady, who was speaking to her friend, said encountered such a situation a week ago when she told other people in Siphofaneni that she was from Nkoniwa.

The attendant said this was because the assailants were now known and anyone could pounce on the assailants' relatives. "The community is of the view that the assailants possibly discussed the assassination with their relatives and friends and their children could have been involved.

"Remember that Gcina was helpful even to people beyond our borders. Anyone can just come and do anything to the assailants' relatives," he said.

and Gauteng in South Africa, who all spoke highly of Vilakati's work while he was still alive. Vilakati is survived by his wife, who was identified as LaMamba, his 14 children, his grandchildren, brothers, and sisters.

Gumbi, on the other hand, is survived by seven children, 51 grandchildren and 10 great grandchildren.

Vilakati's wish not granted

VILAKATI'S wish of being laid to rest at noon could not be granted as he was laid to rest at about 8am yesterday.

Many attendants at Gcina Samson Vilakati and his mother Liphinah Gumbi's funeral were heard talking to each other, stating that Vilakati had expressed his wish to be buried at noon. This resulted in many attendants deciding to leave the funeral service before it ended because they could not be able to wait until noon to bury Vilakati. Some claimed they had other pressing matters they had to attend.

One could tell though that the intention to implement Vilakati's wish was there. The night vigil was held for both Vilakati and Gumbi at Vilakati's homestead. At about 5am, both caskets were taken down to Gumbi's homestead, which was about a kilometre from Vilakati's homestead.

Gumbi's funeral lasted up until about 7am and the attendants took Vilakati's casket up to his homestead, where it was initially placed for the duration of the night vigil. Vilakati's casket was driven in a white Isuzu van, which had a canopy.

Upon reaching Vilakati's homestead, the attendants took his casket to one of the houses where the night vigil tents were attached. Members of Vilakati's church sang with the casket for sometime inside the house. They then took the casket to the gravesite, just next to Vilakati's home. His casket was lowered to his grave at about 8am.

Jealousy main cause of death

JEALOUSY has been identified as the main cause of the death of Gcina Samson Vilakati and his mother Liphinah Gumbi.

This was contrary to the view that was doing the rounds among other people, who believed Vilakati could have been suspected of witchcraft. Many people who attended the funeral stated that Vilakati was killed by relatives from his very own extended family.

Vilakati's cousins, according to some related attendants, became jealous of the fact that Vilakati was becoming successful because of his ability to treat people in a traditional way. What irked the other Vilakatis, it was alleged, was that they were also traditional healers and were not that successful as Vilakati (Gcina).

kill Vilakati and his mother. It was stated that on the fateful day, the assailants invaded Vilakati's home. They allegedly found Vilakati with his family and that was when, it was said, they killed Vilakati, in full view of his wife and children.

Failed

The assailants are said to have been wearing balaclavas on their faces, trying to hide their identities. Gumbi was at her home at that time, not aware of what was coming her way.

Attempts to save Gumbi failed because the people who tried to alert her were very late in doing so. Some attendants stated that a phone call was made to Gumbi, telling her that assailants were on their way to attack her, so she should

Attendants

However, the assailants were not wise enough to cover their tracks in their assassination attempts.

They could have been successful in killing Gumbi, but were not successful in killing her grandchild, who was present during the incident. The attendants stated that the assailants were not accurate in shooting the grandchild, whom they thought was dead after shooting her.

In a sheer act of carelessness, the assailants removed their balaclavas and were not aware that the grandchild, whom they thought was dead, was actually still alive.

The grandchild was able to identify the assailants without their knowledge. This, according to the attendants, led to the arrest of some of the assa

Security tight at event

Members of the Royal Eswatini Police Service (REPS) played a sterling role in ensuring safety during Gcina Vilakati and Liphinah Gumbi's funer-

Two police vans were visible during the night vigil and the funeral of the two individuals. The police were there to ensure no violence of any sort took place and were successful in doing so as the highly-emotional event was peace-

It was anticipated that violence could take place at the funeral, judging from the way the two died.

Even though the event was peaceful, some people who attended the event could not contain their emotions, as they cried hysterically, especially when the caskets were lowered to their respective graves.

One could see that the two people played a very special role in the lives of many who attended the tune

Ex-SwaziBank MD Kuhlase hacked

FORMER Eswatini Bank (formerly Swazi Bank) Managing Director Sam Kuhlase is in a critical condition after he was hacked all over the body with objects suspected to be bush-knives at his residence, Esiphumelele outside Nhlangano.

Because of the seriousness of his injury, he was immediately transferred from Nhlangano Health Centre to Hlatikulu Government Hospital where he was again moved to Mbabane Government Hospital where he is currently battling for his life.

Kuhlase is a businessman who owns properties and also operates Ekupholeni Bar and Restaurant in Nhlangano and resides at Esiphumelele, a fast growing suburb past the notorious and crime infested Mathendele Township.

It is still unclear what could be the motive of the incident but others said these could be the work of criminals who targeted Kuhlase by attacking him while at the gate to his residence the previous Wednesday night. He was allegedly kidnapped and discovered the next morning dumped in a forest with deep wounds all over the body and he could not even talk. It is reported that Kuhlase could have been mugged by the criminals while entering his residence at night on his way from transporting home one of his helpers. Unconfirmed reports are that the criminals pounced on Kuhlase as he was still preparing to open the gate leading to his home.

It is said when taking one of the helpers home, Kuhlase left behind the TV set on with the hope of coming back to watch some programmes before going to bed. It is said his gardener was also at the residence but in another room. Other claims are that the crim-

inals probably took advantage when Kuhlase drove out of his residence to take home the helper as they broke into the house and ransacked it. Everything was found turned upside down. A TV set he had left on, drew the attention of the gardener when it was suddenly switched off. The gardener went to check what could have happened, and found it missing at the lounge.

It is believed the TV was among the items the criminals took with them when they ransacked the house.

"It's highly likely that when Kuhlase drove out of his residence, the criminals sneaked inside and ransacked it. They took whatever they were looking for and then camped somewhere close to the residence, waiting for him to come back. It is believed Kuhlase was probably preparing to open the gate when the criminals pounced on him," said a source. It is believed that after mugging Kuhlase

they kidnapped him to an unknown place and later dumped him in a forest where he was later found with serious injuries and soaked in blood.

"The gardener who was waiting for his boss to return from taking the other helper home was first amazed how the TV set suddenly went off. When he checked if it was his boss who switched it off, he did not see it at the sitting room and when he looked around the house, to his shock he found almost everything turned upside down.

Curious

"It was then that he went out of the house for further inspection and a little while later; he noticed his boss' vehicle by the gate. He went to the gate and to his surprise; he did not find Kuhlase in the car. It was then that he became curious and wondered what exactly was happening," said a source.

After searching for his boss all around the premises, the gardener then raised an alarm and a search began. The search started in the evening and went on until Thursday where he was found in a forest with injuries all over the body.

"He was taken to Nhlangano Health Centre and because of the critical state he was in, he had to be transferred to Hlatikulu Government Hospital and then later to Mbabane Government Hospital. By the time he was transferred, he was still unable to utter a word," said a source.

Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Superintendent Phindile Vilakati confirmed the attack of the businessman, adding that he is presently admitted at Mbabane Government Hospital in a critical state.

"We are told that his house was ransacked and we are not yet sure what was taken. No arrest has been made as of yet but police are doing all they can to find the culprits," said Supt. Vilakati.

Former soldier brutally murdered at KaLanga

A former member of the Umbutfo Eswatini Defence Force (UEDF) was yesterday brutally murdered by unknown men while at his home at KaLanga.

The former soldier, identified as Mandla Ntuli, died after he was hacked several times with bush-knives on the head and body. Ntuli (47) is said to have retired from the army some years ago on medical grounds. According to a relative, Ntuli was attacked by four men in the early hours of yesterday, just after midnight. He is said to have been at his home together with his wife and children when the unwelcomed visitors arrived and headed straight to the main house.

The brutal killing of Ntuli was confirmed by his cousin, Sikelela Mabuza. Information gathered was that the alleged assassins arrived and knocked once on the door, before forcing their way into the house. After noting that the men were already forcing their way in, the deceased is said to have attempted to block them as he rushed to the door while still half-paked.

However, he was met with vicious blows as the men started assaulting him with un-identified weapons, and further hacked him with the bush-knives. This unfolded in full view of his wife and children aged between three and 15. Ntuli is said to have attempted to escape from his assailants as he ran towards the gate. He, however, fell onto the ground before he could get out of the premises after he had already sustained gaping wounds on the head.

"The assailants are said to have been overheard uttering some words which suggested that they had unresolved disputes with him. "They were overhead saying words like 'usicaphatelani', before they hacked him with bush-knives," said a relative who asked not to be named.

Some additional information gathered was that Ntuli had recently sold the same homestead to another family about a year ago. Ntuli and his family vacated the homestead early last year, but only to return in December after it became evident that the said buyer was failing to pay the agreed amount. This means the sale of the homestead remained incomplete as Ntuli had only received about half of the agreed amount. However, this is not to suggest that the killing of the former army man had anything to do with the sale of his homestead.

Chief PICO Superintendent Phindile Vilakati confirmed the murder incident, saying they were currently investigating the matter.

'Fake' Form 5 results hit social media

EXCITEMENT and anxiety sparked as a 'fake' list of top 50 excelled 2018 SGCSE pupils hit social media yesterday.

SGCSE is the Swaziland General Certificate of Secondary Education.

The fake list surfaced just when every parent who has a child in Form Five patiently awaits the release of the results at the edge of their seats. Some parents who had the chance to have a glimpse of the fake list began celebrating and posted on social media platforms, mostly Facebook and WhatsApp.

However, members of the public wondered if the list was really fake or it was an authentic one but leaked from the Examinations Council of Eswatini (ECESWA).

ECESWA Registrar Dr Edmund Mazibuko refuted those sentiments and clarified that the Council had not met yet regarding the Form Five results.

has not been compiled as of yet, the Council is scheduled to meet this week regarding the results. That list is not official," Dr Mazibuko said.

Dr Mazibuko said the Council had the proper forum to release results and that was through local newspapers, radio and television stations. He said Swazis should not consider the circulating fake list but wait for the official release of the results through the correct platforms.

Moreover, the Minister of Education

and Training, Lady Howard-Mabuza said it is so troubling that people go as far as creating a fake list of passes while parents and pupils are nervously waiting for the results. "It is impossible that results can be released to the public without touching base with the ministry of education and training together with Cabinet," Mabuza said.

Results

The minister said the Form Five results had not even reached the ministry and the Cabinet. She said there was a scheduled meeting with the ECESWA on Thursday, regarding the release of the results

Mabuza explained that usually, the ministry and the ECESWA indulged in a meeting during the early hours of the morning, 8am before she delivers them to the Cabinet thereafter. She said it was only then that media houses were engaged at a press conference, where the well performed pupils are announced.

Without the minister saying it, calculations are that the Form Five results will be released on Thursday and the members of the public will receive them the following day, Friday.

Angry dad stones pastor for kissing daughter

A shocked father (53) from Pigg's Peak pelted a married pastor with stones (34) after he caught him kissing his teenage daughter (17).

The father, who had gone to buy a few groceries at a nearby shop spotted the pastor kissing his daughter inside the pastors blue Mazda.

The Mazda was parked at a secluded area near Killarney Sports ground last Friday.

The name of the pastor as well as the name of the father are known but have been withheld to protect the iden-



tity of the minor.

Speaking to this publication yesterday sources said after the father spotted the two kissing he approached the Mazda and opened the driver's side door to confront the pastor.

"The father saw the two kissing and confronted the pastor. The angry father pulled the surprised pastor out of the car. The pastor started explaining himself only to be slapped multiple times. After, the pastor decided to flee the scene only to be pelted twice on the back with stones.

Escape

The pastor managed to escape and came back about 30 minutes later to get his car," the source said.

"After the incident a man who is very close to the pastor approached the angry father asking that the incident be forgotten or the pastor would open up an assault case, "he added.

When asked to comment about the incident the father said the pastor was

Under attack cop bites off man's cheek

A hospitalised member of the Royal Eswatini Police Service (REPS) is being investigated by his colleages for biting and then assaulting a man with a wheel spanner.

The incident happened outside the Pigg's Peak Club last Friday evening.

The name of the assaulted policeman as well as the name of the complainant are known but have been withheld so as to not impede ongoing police investigations.

Speaking to this publication yesterday sources said the whole incident had two versions, resulting in police recording two different statements.

"In the first statement the complainant alleges that he was assaulted by the uniformed policeman who had been arguing outside the club with a young lady. The lady in question is romantically connected to the complainant. During the argument the complainant confronted the policeman and a fight ensued. During the fight the policeman bit the complainant on the cheek



and then pulled out a wheel spanner from his car," said the source.

He added, "the policeman then used the spanner to assault the complainant on the back. The incident ended when members of the public intervened and rushed the complainant to the Pigg's Peak Police Station to open an assault case against the police officer."

However when asked for comment other sources claimed that the policeman was in fact hospitalised after the assault.

"The information we have is that the policeman was standing outside the club talking to a young woman, during this time four bar patrons who know the lady approached the scene.

When approached the police man said something that angere the men and the assault hap pened. The policeman wa kicked and punched multiple times. The assault was so sen ous that the policeman's uniform was torn. Eventually the policeman fled the scene but left his boots behind. After the incident the policeman opened an assault case against the men who assaulted him," they said.

Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Superintendent Phindile Vilalant confirmed both incidents, saying police were investigating the matter as both the policeman and the complainant opened assault cases against one another.

DISCIPLINARY HEARING FOR SEX PEST MANAGER FAILS TO TAKE OFF

THE disciplinary hearing of the ramp manager who allegedly sexually abused two employees at King Mswati III International Airport was a non starter last Thursday.

An impeccable source said the manager failed to show up on Thursday after reporting that he was not feeling well.

A ramp manager is a supervisor responsible for assisting with scheduling ramp agents. He also assists

the general manager by overseeing, coordinating and participating in all activities related to ramp operations.

The ramp manager, was suspended last year after reportedly sexually abusing two employees of Specialists Pest and Control, a cleaning company based at King Mswati III International Airport.

The source said the manager allegedly sexually abused the employees and threatened to report them to their superiors in Mbabane that they were failing to do their clean-

He would take pictures whenev-

er there's litter on the ground and threaten to send it to the Specialist Pest and Control boss in Mbabane, showing him that the female employees were not doing their job.

Demand

For deleting the pictures from his cell phone, the ramp manager would demand sex from the poor employees and they obliged," said the source.

The source revealed that after some time the employees became tired of the ramp manager's shenanigans and decided to report him to their superiors.

An internal investigation was

launched at the airport and the ramp manager was suspended.

Specialist Pest and Control Supervisor Fikile Mavimbela refused to comment when contacted. All she could say was that the matter was supposed to be heard last Thursday.

"I'm not aware if the disciplinary hearing took place or not, better contact my manager for more information," she said.

Maimane calls for independent audit on govt contracts with Bosasa

JOHANNESBURG- The Democratic Alliance on Sunday called on President Ramaphosa to institute an independent audit on all ANC government contracts with Bosasa.

Former Bosasa COO Angelo Agrizzi's testimony before the Zondo Commission into state capture "shattered the myth that corruption in the ANC was simply a feature of [former president] Jacob Zuma and the Gupta family", DA leader Mmusi Maimane said in a statement.

"A system of corruption that builds a wall between insiders and outsiders - the 'haves' and the 'havenots' - is in the very DNA of the ANC," he said.

It should come as no surprise that the awarding of ANC government contracts to Bosasa was tainted with allegations of bribery, corruption, and fraud. Many of these contracts remained active.

In this light, the DA's legal team

had written to Ramaphosa to "immediately call for an independent audit on Bosasa's dealings and contracts held with government and state-owned enterprises (SoE) by instructing your cabinet to audit their individual departments"; instruct functionari"We have requested that the president respond with these undertakings by no later than 29 January 2019 as this matter is urgent. Criminal charges should be brought against (Bosasa) CEO Gavin Watson with haste," Maimane said.

The president could not continue to sit on his hands, being selective on investigating corruption. Swift action was required.

"If the president will not act, the electorate have the opportunity to punish the ANC government at the polls in the coming months," he said.

THE illegal possession of guns seems to be worsening as, in a period of a month, the Royal Eswatini Police Service (REPS) has arrested seven men for the offence.

Data collected from the weekly police press release statements, states that there were six suspects arrested for the illegal possession of guns last week.

Adding to the list is a 30-year-old man of KaPhunga who, according to the REPS press statement released yesterday, was arrested for the unpermitted possession of a 7.65 mm pistol.

"On January 19 at about 0630 hours, KaPhunga police arrested a 38-yearold man of KaPhunga for being found

in possession of a 7.65mm pistol which was loaded with four live rounds of ammunition without a licence while at Mbosi area," Deputy Chief Police Information and Communications Officer, Inspector Nosipho Mnguni said yesterday.

On December 7, a 22-year-old man of Ka-Nkonjwa in the Lubombo region was arrested and charged for the unlicensed possession of a berretta pistol. The pistol was loaded with eight live rounds of ammunition.

The 22-year-old man is part of the suspects arrested for allegedly shoot-



ing to death a 46-year-old traditional healer and a 79-year-old woman of the same area. The incident was reported to have occurred recently and had also left a 17-year-old pupil injured.

On Christmas Eve, the REPS nabbed

a 48-year-old man for the possession of a pistol without a permit.

Chief Police Information and Communications Officer, Phindile Vilakati previously reported that the man was arrested at 23:45 hours by the Manzini police officers on December 24. She said the suspect was originally from Ngwane Park.

She said upon arrest, the suspect had the pistol loaded with seven live rounds of ammunition while next to Riverstone

On a similar note, nearly three weeks ago, Pigg's Peak police officers arrested three men for being found in possession of a single barrel shotgun (12 Bore).

The trio was nabbed while at Nkonjaneni area in the Hhohho region.

Three men aged 45, 25 and 29 of Zibonele and Nkonjaneni, respectively, were arrested for being found in possession of a single barrel shotgun (12 Bore) without a licence or permit while at Nkonjaneni area, previously stated a police press report.

Meanwhile, Insp. Mnguni said the KaPhunga suspect is yet to appear before court.



Man with high alcohol content fined E3000

SIPHO Ngwenya (52) who was three times above the legal blood alcohol limit was fined E3 000 at the Pigg's Peak Magistrate Court for driving under the influence of alcohol.

Ngwenya, who was driving a Daihatsu sedan, was arrested by patrolling police officers on Saturday evening near Buhleni.

At the time of his arrest, the police noticed that Ngwenya was swerving his car dangerously inbetween lanes.

This neglegent driving caused the patrolling police officers to stop Ngwenya and administer a breathalyser test on him.

Ngwenya failed the breathalyser test as his blood alcohol content read 1.26ml.

This reading is well above the legal blood alcohol limit of 0.37ml of alcohol for every 1 000ml of blood. Speaking in court yesterday, Ngwenya said he did not know who drove his car back to his homestead after the arrest.



A weekend of highly intoxicated drivers Drink-driver gets E2 500 bail

THIS past weekend was a weekend of highly intoxicated drunk drivers, as readings of suspects that appeared before the Magistrate's Court showed to be dangerously high, resulting to many being fined over E2 000 each.

A drink and driving suspect pleaded not guilty to all counts that he was charged with after he was arrested allegedly for drinking and driving on Saturday. He made his appearance before Magistrate Lenhle Zulu yesterday morning.

Simangaliso Maphumulo (40) of Msunduza was charged with three counts for contravening the Traffic Act, including that for drink-driving.

Influence

He is said to have been arrested at Four Square by the old police station by Dlanubeka, where he is alleged to have been driving under the influence of alcohol as his alcohol content read 0.59mg/l hence contravening Section 91 (1) as read with Section 122 (2) of the Road Traffic Act No. 6 of 2007.

He told the court that he was called in the police station because his brother had been arrested and was told to drive his brother's car, whilst they saw that he was also under the influence of alcohol.

He was thereafter arrested immediately as he vacated the police station and charged with two counts for contravening Section 70 (a) as read with Section 122 (7) of the Road Traffic Act of 2006, whereby he is alleged to have driven through two red lights that being Four Square traffic lights and Asakhe traffic lights.

He is also alleged to have failed to stop at two stop signs at Dlanubeka stop signs and by so doing he contravened the said Act.

He pleaded not guilty on all counts and was granted bail fixed at E500.

MTFOKOTISI Dlamini (34) of Makholokholo was arrested and charged with the offence of drink and driving yesterday morning. He was highly intoxicated as he had 2.0mg/l of alcohol in his blood

He was charged with contravening Section 91 (1) as read with Section 122 (2) of the Road Traffic Act 6 of 2007.

He pleaded for leniency and told the court that he was unemployed and was a father of two.

He also told the court that he had spent a night in prison.

He was sentenced to two years in prison with an option of a fine of E2 500.

E3 000 bail for unemployed intoxicated driver

CHRIS Gama (29) of Nkoyoyo was charged with two counts after being nabbed for drink-driving at Sidvwashini yesterday morning. He made his court appearance before Magistrate Lenhle Zulu.

Gama being a driver of a VW Polo Sedan is alleged to have been driving under the influence of alcohol as 2.0mg/l of alcohol was found in his system, thus contravening Section 91 (1) as read with Section 122 (2) of the Road Traffic Act 6 of 2007. He was also charged with the offence of driving on a public road without a driver's licence. He pleaded for leniency and told the court that he



was a first time offender and would not repeat such. He also stated that he is unemployed and has two children.

He was sentenced to two years in prison

with an option of a fine of E2 500 on the first count and five months in prison with an option of a fine of E500 on count

2 counts for highly intoxicated driver

SAM Dingizwe Nkambule (56) of Motjane was nabbed for drink-driving vesterday morning and was charged with two

He appeared before Magistrate Lenhle Zulu.

He is said to have been driving along the Siteshi road whilst under the influence of intoxicating liquor and the alcohol content read 1.46mg/l, thus contravening Section 91 (1) as read with Section 122 (2) of his Road Traffic 6 of 2007. SITEKI TOWN COUNCIL TO HIKE RATES THIS YEAR

PROPERTY owners within the boundaries of Siteki town must get ready for a hike in rates this year.

The urban rates hike is likely to be effected upon commencement of the 2019/2020 calendar after an urban rate survey, which has already been launched, is completed. This was disclosed by Siteki Town Clerk Sithembile Simelane during a

public consultation meeting on Saturday. The 2018/2019 General Valuation Roll was the main agenda of the meeting which was attended by a handful of ratepayers and residents of the steadily growi n g

town. Simelane reported that the council has engaged a surveyor to evaluate the value of properties within town. The report will then determine the percentage hike of rates, against the value of properties. Simelane explained that the survey was a normal exercise which is done once in five years. She stated that the council found it proper to engage the ratepayers so that they have a clear understanding of the process so that they know what is expected from them.

"This is a normal exercise which we use to determine the percentage of raising rates, which is the main source of income for the council. However, we can assure ratepayers that when the hike is effected, it will be a reasonable one as we understand that the town is still developing and has a very low income," said Simelane.

Meanwhile, Mayor Bhekumuzi Ngomane said the council was working tirelessly to bring devel-


opment into the town. Ngomane acknowledged that the town was faced with a high rate of unemployment and poverty. As a result, the mayor said the council was looking at a possibility of establishing exhibition sites where residents would manufacture and sell their wares. He disclosed that, for instance, councillors were currently working on a strategy to develop Mabhodweni Dam into a tourist attraction centre. The dam is situated along the road to Mhlumeni Border Gate, near the textile

Residents blast council for inefficiency, corruption

A consultation meeting between the Siteki Town Council and the community was almost thrown into disarray when residents started throwing verbal missiles at the council, accusing it of being corrupt and incom-

The residents alleged that the councillors were the very same architects of the under development which has been witnessed over the past many years. This was after the residents were given an opportunity to ask questions regarding the valuation process which will be carried out by the council to determine a hike in rates. The residents used this platform to voice out their grievances which ranged from being evicted from some plots, to the town having seen very little development over the years.

A resident Sebenele Maziya alleged that over the past years, councillors seemed to be more concerned about their own interest instead of that of the town. Maziya went to the extent of naming some former councillors, saying they delayed development of the town by rejecting some development projects as they claimed ownership of land right within the town centre. "The councill has absolutely no intention to develop the town as each councillor appears to be protecting his or her own personal interests," said Maziva, throwing the room into silence as he named and shamed

As part of reducing the high number of young people roaming the streets, Sunny William Byrnes decided to offer gym services to the young people of the area. Byrnes, who serves as a community police officer and senior citizen of the township, provides gym services for

The reason the fit as a hurdle senior citizen said he wished everyone could be part of a gym to stay fit and healthy. This will also contribute to their well-being, thus prolonging their days

Byrnes added that what also pushed him to open the gym is that he wanted to keep fit after he had an Asthma attack early last year. The doctors advised him to exercise. Upon trying to find a professional gym membership, he realised that he could not afford the costs. Then he opted to open his own gym to keep himself

However, upon working as a community police, he noticed that there were so many young people roaming the streets and caught in wrong places at the wrong time. He then invited the youth to the gym. Currently, the gym is utilised by eight young people around Ngwane Park

Thulasizwe Vilakati (21), who is a regular at the budding gym, said he started using the gym last August. He said since he joined the gym, he noticed a huge change in his life. He is not easily attacked by sicknesses like flue. In addition, he has learnt self-discipline since he started using the gym.

"Spending time at the gym saves me from a lot of bad things that my peers engage in," he

Byrnes dreams of expanding his gym to make it a community owned facility.

"My dream is to make the facility a community gym. However, I am short of funds because even the small equipment that we use I bought it using my elderly grant which is not enough," he said.

Furthermore, he made some of the equipment himself from recycled material.

Byrnes further pleaded with the public to help to improve his facility so that it can accommodate quite a number of people.

"I would like to ask for assistance from the nation. We do not have enough equipment, limiting the numbers of people who can join the gym. As you can see, the structure we are using is not big enough," he said. He went on to plead with hardware stores to sponsor them with equipment to build a proper structure.

Rumours





The accused person told the court that he intends to plead guilty to the charge. The matter was however postponed to a later date as the Crown intends to lead evidence to prove commission of the





Registration for Ingwenyama Cup Culture opens

REGISTRATION for this year's instalment of the Ingwenyama Cup Culture Competition is now open and dates for regional eliminations have been reaveled.

He added that the competition starts on February 3 at Buhleni for the Hhohho region which will take place on the same day with the Lubombo region, which will happen in Siteki.

Competing

The following weekend will be the Shiselweni region on February 9 at the Mbangweni Army base with the last one staged at the Mavuso Exhibition and Trade Centre where the Manzini region will be competing.

He said there were five categories to compete at each region being Sibhaca, Ingadla, Lutsango, Timbongi and Emajaha. "Groups are reminded that there are special songs to be competed for in each of the five categories. All the information is contained in the registration forms they will get from the RA's offices. For praise singers, they are expected to either do for His Majesty King Mswati III or for Her

What's in Your Mind Features & Opinions Refresh What you Think KENYA'S SECURITY FORCES DID BETTER THIS TIME are still gaps

THE Riverside terror attack on January, 15, 2019 was staged to reclaim the ground that terrorists have lost in Kenya's geo-political territory.

But this time, the attack had fewer casualties compared to other ones. This was despite the fact that the Dusit D2 complex hosts a great number of offices as well as business outlets, including the luxurious Dusit D2 hotel.

The attack could have gone down as one of the worst in modern African history were it not for the fact that Kenya's security apparatus sprung into action with amazing speed.

And despite word going around that terrorists had struck again, people in the area didn't panic as was the case in previous attacks. I know this as I was at the University of Nairobi's Chiromo campus which is just blocks away from the complex where the attack occurred.

This latest attack came on the same date as the El Adde attack on the Kenya Defence Forces in Somalia in 2016, and five years after the Westgate Mall attack.

Because Kenya has become a frequent target of terror, the government has taken steps to prevent and contain the attack.

COUNTER TERRORISM EFFORTS

Since the Westgate attack in 2013, Kenya has put in place stringent measures to counter terrorism.

This has included state of the art surveillance equipment and the establishment of the National Counter Terrorism Centre.

The centre has overseen the adoption and implementation of both hard and soft power policies to protect Kenyans from external

Today, Kenya has an anti-terrorism police unit specifically charged with detection and neutralisation of terror threats.

Authorities also run programmes to counter violent extremism, including deradicalisation and rehabilitation projects for potential and repented terrorists.


As a result, Kenyans are much more informed about what to do in the event of a terror attack. This was seen in the recent attack where it was possible for the rescue operation to save more civilians compared to the Westgate fiasco.

The Riverside operation was also hugely successful due to the swift and precise security response and proper inter-agency cooperation. The security operation went smoothly with officers helping to evacuate a majority of the people.

First responders were on hand to support the security apparatus with ambulances, evacuation assists, personnel and medical staff on standby.

The coordination between the various response agencies was well done when compared to previous attacks. For example, in the Westgate attack, there was a marked failure in coordination especially among the security forces who didn't have central line of command.

After the Westgate attack, attempts were made to enhance real-time coordination between

the National Police Service, the National Intelligence Service, Kenya Defence Forces (KDF), and other security organs.

As a result, during the Riverside attack security officers from the Special Forces of the Kenyan Defence Force, the General Service Unit's Recce Squad, and investigators from the Directorate of Criminal Investigations worked together under one commandant.

FIGHTING TERROR WITH INTELLIGENCE

After the Westgate attack, Kenyan authorities realised they needed to improve intelligence if they were to become more effective in the fight against terrorism.

A number of new policies were put in place. Community policing was beefed up, intelligence collection approaches were rethought and surveillance systems were upgraded.

Despite these advances, there are suggestions that security operatives didn't act on terror intelligence in subsequent attacks.

For instance, it has been reported that Kenya's security agencies failed to heed warnings of an impending attack in the weeks before the Dusit D2 complex was hit.

In the end, Kenyan security launched a reac-

tionary response rather than intelligence-led preemptive action.

Security agencies also ignored the warning of a terrorist attack 19 days before the Westgate attack. A general warning was issued on impending terror attacks on malls. It was not acted on,

Clearly, Kenya's security apparatus needs to work on this as the country assesses the Riverside

This is particularly urgent given that the ter-

ror threat to Kenya and the East African region could be getting worse. For example, there is now an active ISIS cell spreading from Somalia through Kenya to other East Africa states.

This new development has been triggered by the international pressure on ISIS in Iraq and Syria."

ISIS is committed to establishing an Islamic caliphate. This gives it a stronger ideological foundation than al-Shabaab whose main grievances seems to emanate from Kenya's 2011 incursion into Somalia.

The group has also claimed that this latest attack was in retaliation against US President Donald Trump's declaration of Jerusalem as the capital of Israel.

WHAT NOW?

Kenya has made remarkable efforts to put into practice lessons learnt since the Westgate attack. But there's yet a lot that needs to be done to improve security and effective counter

The country must put more effort into collecting, disseminating and implementing intelligence briefings so that it can effectively prevent and counter future terror attempts.

'Giving us jobs,' one of the ANC's most broken promises

IF the ANC goes ahead with its latest command economy plans, it will preside over the biggest disinvestment in SA's history.

In 1994, the promises on the ANC's first-ever election posters were 'Jobs! Jobs!' and 'Jobs, Peace, Freedom'.

The bold pledges of 'peace and freedom' have been pretty much fulfilled. Jobs, not so much suc-

The 1994 undertaking was between two million and five million new full-time jobs. In addition, there would be part-time employment and training of "about 2.5m people over the next 10 years" through a national public works programme.

It didn't work out like that. While joblessness briefly fell sharply, work creation soon ran out of steam and by mid-1997 the unemployment rate was hitting new highs. Since then, the rate has only

twice momentarily dropped to what it was when the ANC gained

That hasn't discouraged the ANC spinners of fairy tales.

In the 1999 election, the ANC promised to halve unemployment within 10 years. This would mean almost seven million new jobs. It didn't happen.

In 2004, despite unemployment having grown from 16.5 per cent in 1995, to over 25 per cent, the ANC implausibly claimed to have created two million new jobs. It still promised to halve unemployment, as well as to provide 1 million "job opportunities" - brief, low-skill, casual work.

The 2004 manifesto conceded that although the ANC could conjure "some employment" through public service jobs, "long-term employment depends largely on higher rates of private investment". In 2009, under the fantasist Jacob

Zuma, the ANC boasted it had created half a million new jobs per year since 2004. Henceforth the emphasis would be on creating "decent" jobs and, following the worldwide failure of neoliberal policies, this would be achieved under the guidance of the "developmental state".

In his 2010 address, Zuma said the SA economy was now "creating jobs rather than shedding them". In 2014, the ANC manifesto emphasis was on the public works programme, which would create six million job opportunities by 2019 - "many of which will be of a long duration" - as well as 275 000 real, full-time jobs. In 2017, Zuma promised to deliver six million job opportunities by March, 2019, with an additional one million jobs specifically for youth, as well as 61 000 jobs through environmental programmes like Working For Water.

President Cyril Ramaphosa's 2018 state of the nation address was more sober. SA had created jobs, he said, "but not at the pace required to absorb new entrants to the labour market".

The 2019 ANC manifesto promises to create 270 000 real jobs a year. The manifesto launch coincided with the release of the latest Spectator Index, which identifies SA's youth unemployment rate as the world's highest at 52.8 per cent. How does Ramaphosa's "new dawn" ANC intend to deliver on a quarter century of broken promises? By heavy-handed state interference: expropriate land; possibly nationalise the Reserve Bank; and possibly force financial institutions to place a prescribed percentage of investor and retirement funds towards government-designated "social and economic development".

Reconsidering deployment, place of politics in public service

THE appointment of Advocate Shamila Batohi as the National Director of Public Prosecutions (NDPP) in December 2018 can be regarded as the first shot in what is likely to be a long running battle against graft, incompetence and political meddling in the public service.

It will be recalled that the National Prosecutions Authority (NPA) is one of those institutions regarded as having been instrumental in enabling the rot in government and society in general to go unchecked for a very long time under former president Jacob Zuma. The manner of her appointment is instructive of the difficult task that she faces in restoring the credibility of the organisation.

The president has sought to distance himself from the fallout that will ensue when she pursues senior politicians in the ANC for their role in degrading the South African state. The establishment of an advisory committee to advise the president on who to appoint to the role, despite the power to appoint being vested solely in him, also speaks of his quest to curb the unholy interference of the ruling party in the running of the state, particularly the employment of senior civil servants.

During his January 8th address at the Moses Mabhida Stadium in Durban on 12 January 2019, President Ramaphosa once again reiterated his commitment to running a public service that is free from corruption and responsive to the needs of South Africans. This is encouraging in an environment in which the vast majority of citizens cannot afford to

procure private services for health, security and many other vital areas of their lives.

2 priorities for meaningful

In my view, there are probably two overarching priorities that South Africa ought to be obsessed with to achieve meaningful progress; one is the provision of quality education for all. The other is the establishment of a competent and responsive public service.

On the former, much has been said in the recent past. It thus does not warrant a repetition in this piece. However, it would appear to me that not much focus is paid by society at large on the need to have a fully functioning, competency driven public service that is capable of carrying out the many important tasks

that confront South African soci-

At the core of South Africa's policy conceptualisation and implementation weaknesses is the ANC's deployment policy. By itself, deployment is a necessary mechanism to ensure that the ruling party's objectives are translated into programmes of action by government and that all are focused on the same vision. However, over the years, the practice has become bastardised with successive administrations in the ANC using the public service as a place to park senior party members who could not be deployed in political roles.

Strategic roles in government have in the past been used as a reward mechanism for those who support the president or some sort of loyalty retainer.

The result is that capable civil servants have been pushed out of their important roles in favour of politically networked individuals who do not necessarily have the skill nor the inclination to carry out the job at hand.

In the process, the performance of government against set objectives has consistently come in below government's own expec-

Being deployed from one of the most important institutions in the land (Luthuli House), deployees tend to come into their government positions with an oversized ego and know-it all attitude. On arrival at these institutions, they encounter highly capable public servants who have been overlooked for leadership positions despite their extensive experience in their portfolio. Inevitably, conflict ensues. In such cases, the experienced public servants tend to either retreat to the sidelines and do as little as possible. Some are pushed out of the service entirely. Think of the likes of Lungisa

Fuzile and Vusi Pikoli. To add fuel to the fire, ministers and their advisors tend to involve themselves unduly in matters of departmental administration. In the worst cases, this includes ministers seeking to influence the employment of lower level managers such as assistant directors and deputy directors.

This disempowers the director-general who is the accounting officer of the department to the detriment of general discipline and focus on policy objectives. News24

MEDSCHEME NOW AT PEACE WITH SWAZIMED

MEDSCHEME Eswatini Chairman Prince David said they ultimately accepted the fact that their contract with SwaziMed came to an end.

The chairman recounted how in 2016, Medscheme Eswatini received notice of non-renewal of their contract from SwaziMed who were their only client at the time. He said whilst they engaged in negotiations with them to try retain the contract or portions of it, it was eventually apparent that SwaziMed was determined to continue with implementing self-administration of their fund.

"During that process, a dispute erupted on the actual date of the termination of the contract. This led to the much publicised dispute that was ultimately referred to arbitration, as per the provisions of the contract," he recalled.

He said the loss of their only client threatened the existence of their administration business in Eswatini, a business that had successfully operated in the kingdom since 1980.

"Given the length of time, investment and potential loss of employment, the ultimate shareholder of Medscheme Eswatini, Afrocentric Investment

Corporation, expressed their desire to remain in the Kingdom of Eswatini," said Prince David.

Medscheme Eswatini eventually formulated a turnaround strategy with three pillars which are:

 Establishment of Medscheme Eswatini's own fund to compete in the medical aid sector in the Kingdom of Eswatini

· Finding local shareholders that would be strategic partners in the turnaround

· Implementing a diversified business approach that would mirror that of Afrocentric which Medscheme Eswatini would implement together with their partners in the short to medium term.

Only 6 per cent Swazis have medical aid

VERY few Emaswati actually have access to medical aid as only six per cent of the entire population is covered under medical aid or private insurance.

These statistics were announced on Friday by Medscheme Eswatini Chairman Prince David.

The prince did not hide the fact that in their quest to aggressively grow the business over the past 12 months of operation, Medscheme observed a real gap in the market in terms of medical aid cover. Sabelo

TURKEY has opened its doors to local pupils by availing scholarships to study in that country's prestigious universi-

This was announced by Turkey's Honorary Consulate General to Eswatini Ismail Olmezon Wednesday at their offices at Sidvwashini in Mbabane. Interestingly, local pupils who only possess the Swaziland General Certificate of Secondary Education (SGCSE) qualification are also eligible to gain entry to Turkish universities. National

Senior Certificate (NSC) and The Independent Examination Board (IEB) exams students are also eligible to apply.

The scholarships are both for undergraduate and postgraduate programmes, specifically Bachelors, Masters and PhD qualifications.

The consular said under-graduate applicants should be less than 21 years old and be Swati citizens.

There are currently over 30 students from Eswatini who are studying in Turkey, 10 of whom are graduating this year. Encouraging local students to apply, the consular said: "With the help of such scholarships, you will be able to study at some of the best universities in Turkey and gain very useful insight, skills, and perspectives.

All of these things will prove to be

extremely useful as you move on with your career and go into a more demanding phase," he said.

The scholarships are not only limited to mere financial support as university placements are also provided to awardees at all levels of higher education.

In the meantime, the consular also assured that students who secure scholarships would be provided with necessary services and procedures in order to feel at home once in Turkey.

Such assistance includes providing a dormitory, health insurance, student bank account, and a student residence permit, as well as a one-year language course.

The consular expressed his country's eagerness to improve mutual relations and understanding with other countries, including Eswatini. All applications are for free and are strictly online based.



DRC court declares Tshisekedi winner of disputed elections

KINSHASA - DR Congo's top court yesterday declared opposition leader Felix Tshisekedi the winner of disputed presidential elections after throwing out a legal challenge by the runner-up.

Announcing the final results of the much-delayed poll, the Constitutional Court said Tshisekedi had won by a simple majority, paving the way for him to take over from longterm leader Joseph Kabila.

Runner-up Martin Fayulu, who has previously described the outcome as an "electoral coup" forged by Tshisekedi and Kabila, immediately called on the international community to reject the results. "I ask the entire international community not to recognise a power that has neither legitimacy nor legal standing to represent the Congolese people," he said of Tshisekedi, declaring himself "the only legitimate president".

Victory

Tshisekedi's victory was provisionally announced earlier this month by the Independent National Election Commission (CENI) but it was challenged both at home and abroad, with the African Union appealing for the final results to be delayed.

Yesterday, the Constitutional Court said Fayulu's claims were "unfounded" and he had failed to prove any inaccuracies in the figures, describing his call for a recount as "absurd".

"Only the CENI has produced authentic and sincere results,' judge Noel Kilomba said.

The head of the court, Benedict Lwamba Bindu, went on to declare Tshisekedi as the "President of the Democratic Republic of Congo by simple majority"

The ruling was considered unsurprising, with the court made up of Kabila's allies.

Hundreds of supporters of Tshisekedi had gathered outside the court holding placards saying "No to interference" and "Independent country" as riot police stood nearby.

The CENI had previously scheduled the swearing-in of the next president for tomorrow.

May pushes Britain towards a chaotic no-deal Brexit after refusing to budge

LONDON- After the historic defeat of her Brexit deal in the House of Commons this week, there was widespread speculation that the prime minister would swiftly make major concessions to her opponents in a bid to salvage something from the wreckage of her deal.

At first, it appeared that such a move may be on the cards, with May announcing to Parliament that she would seek talks with opposition parties about finding "a way forward."

"I would like to invite the leaders of parliamentary parties to meet with me individually, and I would like to start these meetings tonight," May told MPs in the aftermath of winning a no-confi-

However, responding to her statement, the opposition Labour party leader Jeremy Corbyn surprised many by refusing.

"Before there can be any positive discussions about a way forward, the government must remove clearly, once and for all, the catastrophe of the prospect of a nodeal Brexit with the EU," Corbyn said. His refusal was immediately jumped on by May, who later staged a late-evening speech from the front steps of her Downing Street residence in which she lambasted the Labour leader for refusing to talk.

Commentators also rounded on Corbyn, comparing his unwillingness to speak to the prime minister with his previous public support for talks with Hamas and President Assad of Syria.

However, Corbyn's team sensed straight away that May's request was not a serious attempt to reach out, with sources close to the Labour leader telling Business Insider that there had never been any real intention to engage in a discussion between the two leaders, and absolutely "no attempt to reach out through the back-channels."And as the talks began, the Labour leader's decision to boycott the talks was arguably vindicated after MPs from all parties described a prime minister and her advisers who refused to give ground. At the meetings organised by May, opposition MPs all had their own lists of demands and conditions for backing a Brexit deal rejected. The Liberal Democrats, Scottish Nationalist Party, Plaid Cymru and Green Party all demanded a second Brexit referendum and called on the prime minister to promise to rule-out a no deal Brexit. AFP

Trump offers concessions on immigrants in return for wall funds

WASHINGTON - US President Donald Trump on Saturday offered to temporarily shield a million immigrants from deportation if Congress authorises funding for his Mexican border wall - an idea Democrats rejected, making the US government shutdown likely to continue.

Trump attempted to seize the initiative in ending the 29-day partial shutdown, a funding freeze that has left many important government departments relying on unpaid or highly reduced staff.

His bargain, announced in a televised White House address, held out the carrot of protection from deportation for two categories of immigrants.

These include 700 000 so-called "Dreamers," children of people who settled illegally in the US, and who have become a favourite cause of the Democrats, as well as 300 000 other immigrants whose protected status is expiring, Trump said.

The president said these concessions would "build the trust and goodwill necessary to begin real immigration reform."

In return, Trump demanded the \$5.7 billion he says is needed to extend fences on the border with Mexico, something the opposition Democrats have repeatedly refused to authorise. That has prompted the president to retaliate with the government shutdown, which he triggered by not signing off on funding to swaths of departments.

"I'm here today to break the logjam and provide Congress with a path forward to end the government shutdown and solve the crisis on the southern border," Trump said in his address.

Trump describes the US-Mexico border - for decades a magnet for migrants and asylum seekers, as well as a major drug smuggling route — as overwhelmed, posing a threat to US national security.

Democrats, who accuse Trump of using his illegal immigration crackdown to score political points with his right-wing base, spurned the latest negotiating offer as soon as it was leaked in the media prior to the speech.

Death toll in fuel pipeline blaze rises to 73

TLAHUELILPAN - An explosion and fire in central Mexico killed at least 73 people after hundreds swarmed to the site of an illegal fuel-line tap to gather gasoline amid a government crackdown on fuel theft, officials said.

Hidalgo state governor Omar Fayad announced that the toll had increased to 73 after the discovery of five additional bodies.

The blast -- which Fayad said injured 74 people -- occurred near Tlahuelilpan, a town of 20 000 people about an hour's drive north of Mexico City. AFP

Uneasy calm returns in some parts after protests

HARARE - An uneasy calm has returned to parts of Harare after a week of deadly protests and a security clampdown.

But some activists are in hiding, the army is still out of the barracks and WhatsApp and Twitter remains blocked for many users. Today's Triathlon is going ahead in Harare's Mount Pleasant suburb. On Saturday, a popular farmers' market was bustling in Harare's upmarket Alexandra Park suburb and supermarkets were busy. Despite this semblance of normality, tension and uncertainty are high.Reports say soldiers and police set up road blocks on a road between Harare and the nearby town of Chitungwiza, and that some commuters were assaulted. Leader vows to combat widespread corruption

ANTANANARIVO - Madagascar's new president has been sworn in and vows to establish independent bodies to combat the Indian Ocean island nation's widespread corruption.

Andry Rajoelina, who led the country from 2009 to 2014 in a transitional government after a military coup, told a crowd in the capital on Saturday that for the first time since independence Madagascar is seeing a peaceful, democratic transfer of power between two elected leaders.

JOHANNESBURG - Facilities management company Bosasa's former chief operating officer (COO) Angelo Agrizzi's testimony before the Commission of Inquiry into State Capture this week will reportedly leave the country in disbelief as he is set to drop high-profile names who allegedly also benefited from the compa-

Earlier in his testimony, Agrizzi took the commission through his black book which he used to record all the names and amounts of bribes paid to individuals. It included former SA Broadcasting Corporation boss Hlaudi Motsoeneng, who allegedly received R1.1 million from the controversial company for his legal woes following his axing from the SABC, and President Cyril Ramaphosa's son Andile Ramaphosa.

Also read: Agrizzi confirms Hlaudi Motsoeneng received R1.1 million from Bosasa.

City Press says it has obtained a document that contains names of senior politicians and civil servants who Agrizzi claims received money from the controversial company. Two of his friends reportedly told the publication Agrizzi had a hard drive that contained CCTV footage, videos, photographs and emails from Bosasa's server he obtained before the system was apparently wiped. News24 further reports that Agrizzi will implicate former president Jacob Zuma.

Matshela Koko questions Eskom's failure to meet demand

JOHANNESBURG - Former Eskom head of generation Matshela Koko, who is now consulting for several African countries, is questioning how the embattled power utility can fail to meet the demand for electricity.

Koko left Eskom after an inquiry into irregular contracts linked to the Gupta family. In the light of recent episodes of load shedding, Koko this week told The Sunday Inder ndent that something was amiss with Eskom failing to supply power during plant breakdowns and planned maintenance. In November, Eskom reportedly shut down 11 power stations which were due for major maintenance because of a lack of funds to fix them. According to Koko, Eskom delayed the maintenance process because the utility planned to spend R200 billion on Independent Power Producers (IPP). "Think about it. You are saying you put aside R11.5bn for maintenance and you said to the public 59 units are due for maintenance, and you prioritise them.

Horrors Zimbabwe doesn't want the world to see:

Hundreds are beaten and killed in protest crackdown by Mugabe's successors that has been hidden behind a news blackout

HARARE: Hundreds Zimbabweans have been beaten, detained or killed in recent days as the government cracks down on protesters speaking out against the regime.

Violence has erupted in the country after a huge fuel price hike which saw the cost increase by more than 200 per cent to \$3.31 (£2.57) per litre.

Children as young as ten are reported to have been injured by police and soldiers after people took to the streets to vent their anger.

In a bid to hide the state sanctioned violence the internet is being shut

of down and foreign journalists are being forced out of the country, The Sunday Times reports.

Hundreds of people have been seen by the paper in safe houses, hospitals and courts after being attacked and having dogs set on them, while a diplomat said there had been reports of '200 deaths'.

The current President Emmerson Mnangagwa is heading to Davos in Switzerland this weekend for an international summit as he seeks investment in his bankrupt nation.

He had promised a better Zimbabwe after seizing power from dictator Robert Mugabe but witnesses to the latest violence say it is more of the same for the nation's people.

The Crisis in Zimbabwe Coalition said the President is 'using murder of unarmed civilians as a tool to retain power' in the country.

A medic in the capital Harare, at the city's biggest hospital, said the morgue was 'full'.

Zimbabwe Human Rights NGO Forum reported 844 human rights violations while others in the country say people have been detained and refused bail.

The Zimbabwe Association for Doctors for Human Rights said they have attended to 172 people, 68 of

whom have been treated for gunshot wounds.

Other injuries include dog bites from people in police custody and injuries from beating with sticks and sjamboks which are a type of leather

Among those arrested is prominent pastor and activist Evan Mawarire. He faces 20 years after being accused of inciting the protests which the government has liked to 'terrorism'.

Outrage has spread across the nation of the killing of 22-year-old Kelvin Tinashe Choto from Chitungwiza.

Taking SWAMA to grassroots

FOLLOWING the SWAMA Executive's first scheduled meeting of the year which was held last Saturday in Mbabane; the association in its membership mobilisation, as well as decentralisation drive, has decided to establish its regional branches with immediate effect.

According to the President of the association, Melusi 'Zox' Dlamini, the regional branches were meant to take the association to the grassroots, where a lot of arts and arts-related activities were already taking place informally. Dlamini said this exercise was also

meant to decentralise the association's impact and services from the Mbabane-Manzini corridor into all corners of the country for the ultimate nurturing and development of artists based within and outside & the said corridor.

"More than anything, this exercise is also meant to promote the arts at grassroots levels into becoming not just a past-time activity but an alternate economic activity; hence comprehensive arts business development plans

modelled around each region's socio-economic profile will be developed and implemented," said Dlamini.

To implement this exercise, the association has drafted a plan.

"SWAMA Regional Committees (RCs) will be elected by SWAMA members or artists in Hhohho, Manzini, Shiselweni, and Lubombo regions. The RCs will consista of a regional chair; who will be appointed by the SWAMA National Executive Committee (NEC), and three elected members.

'The three elected members will be elected by the SWAMA members and/or artists at regional AGMs, whose dates will be announced in due course. Setting up of these structures is expected to be concluded within the first half of 2019," Dlamini articulated.

Interested

The SWAMA NEC has also invited interested and capable SWAMA members, artists, arts managers, arts activists, and interested individuals who wish to be considered for appointment as regional chair to send in their Expressions of Interest (EOIs) with immediate effect, attaching their arts profile or CV, as well as a brief cover letter that motivates why they should be considered.

'Aspirants should note that the position is a voluntary post not a remunerated one. Aspirants should state the region they are interested to head as regional

chair, and should preferably reside in or originate from that region. They should send to Bongani 'Tizalami' Dube or me," said the president. From the EOIs received, Dlamini

said the NEC would use its own discretion to appoint the regional chairs.

The NEC and the successful regional chairs would then work on the dates for the regional AGMs where the SWAMA membership would choose the rest of the SWAMA Regional Committees (RCs).

The full mandate of the Regional Committees will be unveiled and openly discussed at the regional AGMs, and will be duly adopted through a constitutional amendment.







Currently ranked 35 in the world, Collins had never won a match at a Grand Slam in five previous attempts before arriving in Melbourne. But she has now dispatched three seeded players on her way to the last eight, where she will meet either compatriot Sloane Stephens, the world number five, or Russia's Anastasia Pavlyuchenkova. Kerber, the 2016 Australian champion and a semi-finalist last year, is undoubtedly the biggest scalp of her career. Daily Mail

Kvitova is on a nine-match win streak this year after claiming the Sydney International warm-up title and is yet to drop a set in four matches at the season-opening Grand

But the 28-year-old said she was wary of Anisimova, who defeated her last year in Indian Wells.

"It's always difficult when you play someone who's beaten you before," she said.

"I started very well and when the nerves went away I was much bet-

Kvitova's best result at Melbourne Park was a semi-final appearance in 2012 and this year's advance to the last eight is her most successful run since a burglar slashed her left hand with a knife in December

The attack, which happened at her home in the Czech Republic, left injuries which required extensive surgery and forced her out of the game for six months.

Kvitova said she was enjoying her red-hot run of form.

"I'm feeling good. I'm really enjoying my time on the court and playing tennis, which is the main thing for me," she said.

Anisimova, who shares an agent with her childhood idol Sharapova, made a nervous start, committing three unforced errors in the opening game to go down a break.

The teenager, the youngest player to reach the fourth round at Melbourne Park since 2006, regathered as the Czech went hunting for another break.

She double faulted and was caught off guard with a drop shot but stubbornly defended her serve in a game that went to deuce seven times.

Kvitova was relentless though, picking off the youngster's second serve to snatch a second break then claiming the first set after 32 min-






