Eswatini re-assesses poverty, SDG progress

WHAT is the true poverty situation in the Kingdom of Eswatini?

A detailed answer to this question will be presented to the United Nations community in July. It will form part of a progress report on implementation of Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) by Eswatini.

This was disclosed by His Majesty King Mswati III yesterday during the second United Nations high level conference on South - South Cooperation held in Argentina to deliberate on how developing countries can cooperate in order to be able to implement the SDGs by 2030.

SDGs are part of the UN Agenda 2030, which is a call to action to end poverty, protect the planet and ensure that all people enjoy peace and prosperity.

South-South Cooperation involves the exchange of resources, technology and knowledge between developing countries of the Global South.

The king informed the conference that the government of Eswatini received financial support from India, through the United Nations South-South Cooperation facility, to conduct a participatory poverty assessment. This was done in November and December 2018.

"The outcome of the assessment will feed into policy revision and programme development for coming up with new intervention measures," he said.

The king assured that government took seriously the poverty challenges and did not want to leave any citizen behind in its development agenda.


"I am pleased to inform this august Assembly that in July this year government will be presenting a comprehensive report on the implementation of the SDGs during the high level forum on sustainable development in New York," he said.

Currently, the official status is that 63 per cent of the population in Eswatini lives below the poverty datum line; or less than a dollar a day.

His Majesty said the country was open to the adoption of favourable national policies and regulations to promote cooperation that would leverage the pace towards achieving her national vision 2022, the 2030 UN Agenda, Africa's Agenda 2063 and other emerging global agendas.

under the theme; 'Role of South-South Cooperation and implementation of the 2030 Agenda for sustainable development: challenges and opportunities.'

His Majesty said the theme was highly appropriate as developing countries would be able to share the challenges they face in the implementation of the universal goals.

It was during the UN General Assembly in 2015 that Heads of State and Governments agreed to implement the SDGs in order to achieve a better and sustainable future for all.

The king called for a more visible show of commitment to fully address most of the SDGs, especially those relating to food security, clean water, education, health, inequality, jobs, land and climate change.

Issue

He noted that SDG (1), was all encompassing and poverty was a cross cutting

"Addressing it will have a multiplier effect in almost all the other sustainable development goals, ensuring that no one is left behind," he said.

He recognised that much had still to be done to assist the global south to have access to affordable appropriate technologies to propel structural transformation globally, as underscored by the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.

This would entail working together to undertake beneficiation and value addition on our primary products, as this was also the spirit of our regional economic bloc SADC.

"Our concerted effort would leverage the competitive edge of the south within the global market and therefore, enhance integration of the south into the global economy," he said.

He informed the conference that Africa was also working towards the Continental Free Trade Area, which would enhance trade between the South - South regions.

... Every country has a niche

EVERY country and region possesses some unique advantage that needs to be exploited and shared across the global south, through South-South cooperation.

Speaking at the second United Nations high level conference on South-South Cooperation, His Majesty the King cited the example of Argentina which had realised significant growth in its agricultural and ICT industries. He said this offered lessons and experience to be learnt at the forum.

He said it was imperative that South-South countries strive to work together to promote collective interests within the global South and at the multilateral level, because they shared a fundamental goal of poverty eradication and sustaining the desired development.

"Our strategic strength must be stimulated from our solidarity and 'unity in diversity," he emphasised.

His Majesty highlighted that a high proportion of economies of the global south are anchored in agriculture, a sector where the main upkeep of the southern population is dependent.

He shared that in Eswatini, agriculture was the backbone of the economy where the majority of her people are subsistence and commercial farmers.

Lifeline

He said the agricultural sector provided a lifeline for many nations and was fundamental in ending hunger and poverty, particularly to the rural populations.

It is, he added, also an important sector for value-addition prospects, thus promoting product and market diversification as well as industrial development, among others.

However, he is concerned about the drawbacks brought about by the effects of climate change which continue to immensely derail the productivity of farmers.

"It is also having devastating effects on human lives as witnessed with tropical Cyclone Idai that has claimed the lives of hundreds of our fellow countrymen in Mozambique, Zimbabwe and Malawi. Let us join hands to support initiatives to avert these tragedies," he urged.

The king said this requires greater investment in appropriate technologies and innovations that would lead to increased agricultural productivity at the national, regional and inter-regional levels in order to produce enough food for ourselves.

He further submitted that the global south was endowed with a vibrant demographic dividend of young people that need to be harnessed, supported and empowered with appropriate knowledge, skills and technical know-how that would transform economies of the south.

This could best be done through creating exchange programmes for the youth to benefit from experiences from the South -South cooperation, he said.

Currently, the kingdom is encouraging our schools and tertiary institutions to design an entrepreneurial curriculum.

He believes that such modalities would increase opportunities for young people to be competitive in the global job markets of the future as well as integrate their skills into the global value chain.

The king further said integration had become an important catalyst to regional trade, investment, industrialisation and a stimulant to job creation, innovation and technology advancements, among others.

The king concluded his remarks by extending appreciation to all countries and institutions that have continued to provide a range of South-South cooperation modalities over the years.

King meets three presidents

HIS Majesty the King held bilateral talks with the presidents of Argentina, Estonia and Uruguay.

This was on the sidelines of the South-South Conference being held to discuss development cooperation strategies aimed at attaining the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals targets by 2030.

The king met Argentina President Mauricio Macri, Estonia President Kersti Kaljulaid and Uruguay President Tabare Vazquez.

The behind-closed-doors engagement were aimed at strengthening bilateral relations and deliberating on possible areas of cooperation, trade and investment.

Forming part of these engagements were the Minister of Commerce, Trade and Industry Manqoba Khumalo, Foreign Affairs Minister Thuli Dladla, Eswatini ambassadors to Washington DC and New York Njabu Gwebu and Melusi Masuku, respectively.

EX-MAYOR SHOCKS WITHRAPEFBPOST

FORMER Mbabane Mayor Thulani Mkhonto caused a stir on social media vesterday after posting provocative remarks that 'rape should be enjoy-

The former mayor, who now works as a technician at Eswatini Posts and Telecommunications Corporation, hadposted 'life is like being raped: if you can't fight it, enjoy it'. To many Facebookers, the statement was insult ing and inconsiderate to those who suffered the act and consequences of rape. Mkhonto trended on social media for all the wrong reasons yesterday. An hour later, the former mayor posted another statement, apologising to the public, having deleted his previous state-

However, his apology fell on deaf ears (or should we say eyes according to Facebook users) as users typed nonstop condemnation of his post. Many complained about the danger and threat that he allegedly put women under by suggesting they should enjoy rape if they cannot fight it as per his initial state-


"To all Facebook users and Eswatini nation I will (sic) like to apologise for the recent post, especially rape victims and families. I have deleted my post and I am very, very sorry. Yes, I realised it sounds insensitive and inhumane. Liphandlwa libhekile, I am very sorry Maswati Lamahle ayidle itishiyele," reads the post.

Swaziland Action Group Against Abuse Communication and Advocacy Officer Silindele Nxumalo said the former mayor's post was not the first incident that has been seen degrading and putting women at risk

"This is not the first incidence we have seen on social media, much as we have the freedom of expression, we need to be careful of our actions and behaviour, as they may have major implications on the next person.

"This is a concerning a statement that needs to be viewed beyond what it seems to be. The poster needs to be further engaged to unearth the deep-rooted issues behind this statement. People

should take cognisance in making such statements because they have traumatic psychological effects to the public and are insensitive towards survivors of rape," she said.

Women in Law Communications Officer Zanele Vilakati said this kind of thinking would not attain the desired development and growth of the coun-

Revolting

"Let me start by saying that this comment is a very revolting one which shows how weak the perception of society is on key issues that hinder the success of the country.

"This comment shows how some people are insensitive and cannot appreciate the nature of rape as a gross violation of a person's personal space and dignity. With such thinking, the country will not attain the desired developmental growth which comes with all people fighting against violence," she

In a press statement issued by Eswatini Posts and Telecommunications Cooperation's Corporate Affairs department they condemned the Facebook post by the employee. The company agreed that the post had an effect of belittling the impact of rape.

"EPTC notes with deep regret the publication of a Facebook post which was posted by a profile user who is an employee of the organisation. The post had the effect of belittling the impact of rape. The organisation strongly condemns any act of abuse against women, children and men.

"We denounce any act committed against members of all societies by taking advantage of their vulnerability. EPTC will continue to advocate for change of attitudes towards any act of violence against vulnerable persons," reads the statement.

The corporation regretted the subsequent effect of the post and disassociated itself from the insensitive statement posted by Thulani Mkhonto, who is an employee of the organisation. Lastly, the organisation assured the public at large that the issue was dealt with internally.

Former minister to know fate Monday

FORMER minister of justice and constitutional affairs Sibusiso Bonginkosi Shongwe will now know his fate on Monday in his application to have 22 of his corruption charges quashed.

High Court Judge Mbutfo Mamba, who last week indicated that the ruling would be made yesterday morning, postponed the matter to Monday March 25, where he will make the ruling following arguments made by counsel last Thursday.

Shongwe has filed an application before the High Court as he wants the 22 charges of Contravening the Prevention of Corruption Act preferred against him and his law firm quashed by the court.

He is seeking an order quashing the indictment against him and his law firm and he is represented by lawyer Sabelo Bhembe in the matter, while the state is represented by South African Advocate Gerald Lepan who is instructed by Principal Crown Counsel Thabo Dlamini.

Shongwe submitted that the charges should be quashed on the basis that they are calculated to prejudice and embarrass him and his law firm in their defence as they do not disclose offences cognisable by the court.

Submissions

Making submissions through his lawyer, Shongwe submitted that there is absolutely no evidence which shows that the E2 million deposited in the Sibusiso B Shongwe and Associates law firm account was illegitimately received and that the money was from criminal proceeds.

Bhembe had argued that even the E950 000 which he is said to have laundered as alleged in the indictment, was never laundered but was paid to the Eswatini Revenue Authority (ERA) in respect of Impunzi Wholesalers, wondering as to how could that be viewed as

"The charges against the first and second applicants (Shongwe and his law firm) my Lord totally make no sense, in fact the Crown used a wrong approach in crafting the charges against the applicants hence they should be quashed," Bhembe

Bhembe argued that it would be embarrassing for the applicants to plead on such charges as the section the Crown has charged them with does not in any way disclose the offences.

Overboard

In his further arguments, Bhembe argued that the Anti- Corruption Commission (ACC) went overboard as Shongwe should have been investigated by the Law Society of Swaziland (LSS) not the ACC if there were suspicions of illegal dealings in the matter.

Bhembe submitted that there is an Act of Parliament which specifically states how trust accounts held by attorneys should be investigat-

He argued that the people who should have investigated any wrong doing by the applicants, as alleged by the ACC, is the Law Society acting under the instruction of the Attorney General as guided by the Legal Practitioner's Act.

"My Lord in this case, the ACC Commissioner acted ultra vires (beyond his powers) by investigating the applicants, such an investigation is the prerogative of the Law Society acting under the instruction of the AG, not the ACC," Bhembe had argued.

He told the court that it would have been a different case had the ACC acted on the instruction of the Law Society arguing further that the whole process of investigation Shongwe by the ACC was illegal hence the charges should be quashed.

On the charges of intimidating the ACC Commissioner by using government letterheads in a letter he addressed to the ACC, Bhembe submitted that such a charge also makes no sense as there was nothing wrong in Shongwe using same as he was served at his work place and in the letter addressed to him by the ACC he was addressed as a politician.

Further, Bhembe argued that on the charge of accepting a court record from then Chief Justice Michael Ramodibedi, Shongwe did nothing unlawful as same was already a public document, which everyone could have accessed, hence the charges should be quashed.

ACCORDING to Tobacco Amendment 2013 No: 66 of 2013 smoking at an outdoor area is not allowed.

An individual must not smoke within 10 metres of a state park that is in an outdoor or public space, also a person must not smoke at or within 10 metres of a sporting venue that is an outdoor public, at a residential premises or a land at which residential premises are built or may lawfully built.

However, the Municipal Council of Manzini Information and Public Relations





Eswatini not exempted from social, economic hurdles - AT

THE Kingdom of Eswatini has not been exempted from a range of social and economic hurdles.

This was said by Tibiyo TakaNgwane's Managing Director Dr Absalom Dlamini during a Master of business administration lecture at the University of Eswatini (UNESWA) Kwaluseni Campus.

He stated that the country, and indeed the globe, was facing enormous challenges and threats to stability, development and peace as the deep levels of poverty and high unemployment were driven by negative, stagnant and low economic growth as well as the threat of HIV and AIDS, among others.

"Ecologically, economically, politically and indeed socially, we are facing a range of crises, which, if not responded to collaboratively and decisively, will threaten our exis-

The markets are unstable, the global economic systems are crashing, companies are retrenching, and governments are struggling to keep up with the growing infinite needs of their people.

There are growing trade tensions and rising protectionism in the global markets," he said.

Prepare

Dlamini further mentioned that the world was developing at an unprecedented pace and Eswatini needs to take her ingenuity and innovation to prepare for the next 50 years.

"Our partnership with the govemment and the people of this country is underpinned by our founding principles and the socio-economic pillars I have already mentioned.

These contextualise the many projects that we continue to initiate and support across health, education, commerce, the economy, cultural development and social cohesion, public works and others," he added.

Responsibility

Dlamini said government, being a representative of the people's wishes and a conduit for converting those wishes and needs into sustainable development, carries the responsibility to set up a conducive environment for converging innovative

"It also carries the huge responsibility to rally all of us, as institutions and the general society to contribute to the achievement of the public good and it is important to emphasise that government alone cannot deliver on the complex and consistently shifting ambitions of the nation," he said He noted that real and sustainable development could only be achieved by utilising all natural, capital and human resources productively, while at the same time empowering, in particular, the population to dream and be able to achieve their dreams. "We need to redeem our economy, to ensure that it drives growth and development and it is important to emphasise that government alone cannot deliver on the complex and consistently shifting ambitions of the nation. "Our biggest and immediate responsibility is to consistently stimulate the economy, so that it creates sustainable employment for our people, create sustainable opportunities for our small and medium entrepreneurs and by extension, sustain livelihoods for those who are outside of the economic net," he said.

Suspect sheds tears of joy after a year in jail

TEARS of joy streamed down the face of a young man upon the pronouncement of an acquittal and discharge after he had spent slightly a year behind bars.

Mfanimpela Khoza (24) was arrested in 2017 and charged with contravening Section 12(1) of the Peoples Trafficking and Peoples Smuggling (Prohibition) Act 7 of 2009. According to the charge sheet, he was alleged to have wrongfully and unlawfully recruited a Swazi woman into South Africa and harboured her for purposes of exploitation. He was alleged to have used means of abduction, force, coercing, threat and her vulnerability as a trafficked person by causing her to have sexual intercourse with him, and thus committed the offence.

The accused person has been pleading not guilty to the charge.

In an attempt to prove commission of the offence, the Crown which was represented by Patrick Mkhatshwa, paraded eight witnesses before the court.

The complainant told the court that the accused person grabbed and took her to the neighbouring country in February 2018. She claimed that she was on her way from church when the accused forcefully took

In her evidence, she added that the accused repeatedly had sexual intercourse with her without her consent while they resided at

She said she was eventually rescued by her father who came to collect her after

However, most of the complainant's evidence seemed to be self-contradictory as she would give different answers when responding to similar questions posed to her by the accused person and the prosecution. Some of the witnesses also gave different versions of the story before court.

When the matter returned to court for judgement yesterday, the accused persons pointed out these elements, arguing that the complainant was fabricating evidence against him. He told the court that the complainant's 'visit' to the neighbouring country was consensual, as they were actually lovers at the time. The accused person said the complainant fabricated the evidence after learning that her parents were against their relationship. Having studied the presentation made before the court, Principal Magistrate Dumisani Magagula noted that the matter lacked essential elements which could qualify the commission of an offence. Therefore, the accused person was found not guilty by the court. He was effectively acquitted and discharged.

There will also be touring of information stalls displayed by different health programmes.


A testimonial by a child TB expert client as well as a key note address by the Minister of Health, Senator Lizzy Nkosi, said Hlophe.

Public transporters threaten fare hikes

PUBLIC transport operators are threatening to hike bus fares if government decides to increase the price of fuel by E1.20 per litre.

Speaking during a press conference yesterday, Swaziland Commercial Amadoda Road and Transport Association (SCARTA) Chairperson Duma Msibi said they wanted to know as to where the added E1.20 would be used by government.

They said if it was not used for improving the country's roads, then as transport operators they were totally against it and would increase the fares in retaliation

Msibi said as transport operators, they met after the budget speech because they were not happy with it.

He said they understood that the minister of finance was trying to improve the economic status of the country through taxes and increasing levies. Msibi said they were of the view that the minister should have informed the nation what had resulted to the economy reaching this stage.

He said because if the cause was not identified then trying to fight for economic recovery will be pointless.

"Every responsible citizen needs to

know what collapsed the economy," Msibi stated. He added that if the proposed E1.20 was anything to go by, then there should be an independent body to monitor it and make sure it is used in the country's roads.

Msibi said the situation was so bad in such a way that in some roads, vehicles had to use one lane and give each other space by taking turns using that lane.

Msibi said as transport operators, they should have a say on the proposed E1.20. He opined that what made things worse was that as important stakeholders they were never consulted about the fees, but they only got to learn about this through the media.

The transport operators, during the press conference, revealed that they were no longer making any money because the little they made was taken by traffic officers through fines.

Recorver

"If E1.20 is implemented we have to recover it and there is only one way we can do that through raising bus fares by the very same margin which government has used," Msibi stated. The transport operators said it was very unfor-

tunate that government passed the budget speech without recommendations from transport operators who are crucial role players in the economy of the country.

They emphasised that there was not even one single member of Parliament who could stand up and attest that he engaged his people at the different tinkhundla on the proposed E1.20 fuel increase.

They said it would seem like the tinkhundla centres were no longer serving the purpose which they were designed for in the first place.

Pity

Furthermore, they said it was a pity that government wanted roadworthy vehicles while the roads were in a very bad state and not worthy to be used by vehicles.

The transport operators said they wanted to engage government on this issue and advise on how they could tackle the situation in order to get the country back on its feet.

The aggrieved transport owners said if government refused to meet them and effect the hike, then they will have no choice but to increase transport fares.

They said they would call the media the day they decided to raise fares and inform the public since it seemed that was the only way communication was done these days. Swaziland Local Transport Association Chairman Mandla Dlamini said as public transport operators, they learned through the media that government was plan-

ning to offer transport services to civil servants.

He said they should have been consulted because civil servants were their main customers and without them they would suffer.

He said if the E1.20 was given the go ahead over and above this, then it would be a major loss for business.

Talks

Operators said if government wanted them out of business, then it should engage them in talks on how it (government) could buy them

Dlamini, on the other hand, said now that Easter holidays were around the corner, traffic police would be out in full force stopping public transport and issuing fines.

He said it seemed government had turned the public transport industry into a cash cow and was now milking it dry.

Dlamini said it was a pity that they were paying for permits and a lot of other documents at the public works and transport ministry but were not getting the service they deserved from the ministry.

He said everytime they visited the ministry, they were told that the machines were down or there was no paper, among many other excuses. The transport operators said because of this situation, even banks were refusing to extend vehicle loans to them because it seemed the transport industry was no longer stable.

Woe unto those who chop indigenous trees

MINISTER of Tourism and Environmental Affairs Moses Vilakati has warned the nation against the cutting of indigenous trees to use as firewood, saying such can result in arrest and prosecution.

The minister was speaking at Fonteyn High School during the commemoration of the International Day of Forests yesterday.

The ministry decided to commemorate the day at a school in-line with this year's theme, which is 'Forests and Education'.

Fonteyn High School was selected as the right school to host the event, where the minister donated 560 trees and further did a symbolic planting of the tree at the school.

The trees donated by the ministry include 350 ornamentals, 200 hedge, five shade trees and five indigenous fruit trees. Vilakati said government noted with concern that people continued to 'harvest' trees and sell them for financial gain. He said such a practice was illegal and people must stop it immediately. "People must refrain from cutting indigenous trees for sale as firewood, as that may result in them being arrested and prosecuted.

"Such a habit also waters down the government efforts of making Eswatini to be green, clean and a beautiful place for tourists. Traditional leaders are urged to work with the ministry in bringing to an end the habit of cutting trees," he said

The minister said there was a need to establish natural resource management

committees as part of community development committees to help the ministry bring down the habit of tree cutting by the communities.

The minister also warned the public against starting unnecessary fires which usually get out of control, especially now that the dry season was approaching.

He said such fires eventually led to damage, which may result in loss of life and property.

"Communities with homesteads around plantations owned by private forest companies are also encouraged to work together with the companies and assist to prevent occurrence of destructive forest fires, which might result in massive job losses and decline of the economy," the minister pleaded.

The minister also highlighted that forests were very important to human beings in many ways, forests play a big role in regulating micro-climates of par-

ticular areas whilst ensuring there is a good balance on the levels of oxygen and carbon dioxide in the atmosphere. "Forests also provide livelihoods to more than 1.7 billion people throughout the world and more than 13 million of those are employed in the forest sector worldwide. Meanwhile, school Principal Alice Nzima said they were excited that the ministry chose their school to host the forest day.

Man sentenced to 28 years for trafficking SA girl

FOR the first time at the Siteki Magistrate's Court, a man has been convicted for trafficking a South African girl into Eswatini for the purpose of exploitation.

The country has had a countable number of human trafficking cases going for trial in local courts, with only a few having been proven.

According to court records, the case of Machawe Pius Dlamini (31) of Nceka has been the first one to have been successfully proven by the prosecution at the Siteki Magistrate's Court. Dlamini was arrested in 2017, upon which he was slapped with two counts relating to human trafficking.

On the first count, he was charged with contravening section 12(1) as read with Section 13 of the People Trafficking and People Smuggling (Prohibition) Act 7 of 2009.

He was alleged to have unlawfully recruited and transported a South African minor girl from her native country to Eswatini by means of deception and harboured her at his parental home at Nceka.

A similar Act was preferred on the second count, in that, the accused person unlawfully arranged and assisted the said girl to enter into the country illegally, in order to obtain material benefit. The accused was said to have intended to subject the minor girl to exploitation.

The matter dragged for almost two years before Principal Magistrate Dumisani Magagula as the prosecution paraded a number of witnesses in an effort to prove its commission. The accused person has been pleading not guilty on both counts.

During presentation of evidence, the girl told the court that she first came to know the accused person through Facebook, a social media platform.

The girl said she then divulged some information to the accused person as their friendship grew to a level where she thought she could trust him.

The said information was to the effect that she was looking for her father who is said to be residing in Eswatini. The accused is said to have used this information to lure the girl into the country, promising to assist her in finding her father.


However when the girl eventually arrived in the country, the accused person changed the subject and wanted nothing to do with the girl's father. Instead, he is said to have introduced the girl to his family as his lover.

The girl told the court that she had to endure a series of sexual harassment in the hands of the accused person throughout her stay with his family. She alleged to have stayed at the said homestead for about three months before police came to her rescue after the matter was reported by a concerned neighbour.

When making judgement, the principal magistrate noted that the Crown, which was represented by Prosecutor Melusi Lukhele managed to prove all the elements of human trafficking.

Magagula said the court came to the realisation that indeed, the purpose of bringing the girl into the country was to exploit her. For these reasons, the accused person was found guilty on both counts. He was sentenced to 18 years on the first count, and 10 years in a correctional facility for the second count.


The sentences were ordered to run separately, and without an option of a fine. Effectively, the accused person will spend 28 years behind bars.

The appointment was by consent by parties, the New Gilgal leader and Antioch leader, who through their lawyers indicated that their preferred arbitrator is the former minister.

The New Gilgal Church in Zion is represented by lawyer Osborne Nzima, while the Antioch is represented by Haiso Magagula.

After hearing both parties in argu-

The holy war began when the church and its leaders took its evangelist to court seeking an order that the latter (evangelist) be stopped from coming anywhere near thehouse of God and conduct services there.

The church and its leader, Luke Mamba, last year obtained an interim order interdicting the evangelist Mfanfikile Elmon Fakudze from preaching the word of God following an ex-parte application filed at the High Court.

According to the second applicant (Mamba), the respondent (Fakudze) at one time had a conflict with the local preacher Thandokuhle Tsabedze attached to the church as he is alleged to

What Gideon is expected to do

As per the appointment by the High Court, Judge Dlamini ordered that the arbitrator (Gideon) is to have a sitting with both parties present.

Jericho pastor assaults wife, blames demons

A 30-year-old woman survived to tell a horrifying account of how she suffered violent attacks at the hands of her supposedly loving husband, all in the name of casting out

Dumsani Simelane of Sibuyeni is said to have assaulted his wife, Khanyisile Shabangu by banging her head against the wall.

Questioned by the court why he banged his loved one's head, he said his hand slipped, while he was praying for her, as he laid his hands on her head.

"Nkosi yeNkantolo, sandla sami sivele saphunyuka nje. Inhloso yami bekumthandazela umkami," said Simelane.

According to Simelane, Shabangu would have countless manic episodes, where she would randomly lash out at her family members in a raging fit, causing them to fear for their lives.

"Your Worship, as a pastor of the Jericho church, I took it upon myself to diagnose her, and I concluded that her outbursts were as a result of being possessed by demons. I then decided that the only way we were going to continue living peacefully as a family, was if I cast the demons out of her and as I held her head while praying, my hands slipped and her head banged against the wall," Shabangu said.

According to the victim's written statement, she would visit the police station countless times to report the pastor for assaulting her, and when asked, the pastor claimed that it was in fact he, who would report her for her violent episodes because he had had enough of the unrest caused by her behaviour in his home.

During mitigation, Simelane pleaded with the court to allow him to return home and resolve the issue with his wife, as they had young children together. He also cited health issues, which he claimed regular medical attention was required as he was sickly due to his age.

Appearing before Mbabane Principal Magistrate Fikile Nhlabatsi, Simelane pleaded guilty to the charge. Simelane was convicted and found guilty of assault, and was sentenced to two years imprisonment, with an option to pay a fine of E4 000.



Message of the WHO Regional Director for Africa for World TB Day 2019

"It's Time to End TB in Children"

The theme of this year's celebration of World TB Day, "It's Time", is an opportunity to reflect on the advances that have been made in recent years but also on what remains to be done to end the scourge of TB in our Region and around

In my message on World TB Day last year, I called on governments and civil society leaders at all levels to take leadership in combating the TB epidemic in our region. Following the high-level gathering of world leaders, policymakers and civil society organizations at the UN High-level meeting on TB in September 2018, all stakeholders are now aware that an urgent global response is needed to a global epidemic. In the African region, TB is a major challenge to development, causes untold human suffering, and threatens the achievement of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.

The 2018 WHO Global Report indicates that the disease burden caused by TB is falling globally, in all WHO regions. and in most countries, but not fast enough to reach the first milestones of the End TB Strategy in 2020. In the WHO African Region, declining cases of TB cases (4% per year) placed it second among all WHO regions over the period between 2013 and 2017. Also, particularly impressive reductions (4-8% per year) have occurred in southern Africa (e.g. Eswatini, Lesotho, Namibia, South Africa, Zambia and Zimbabwe), following a peak in the HIV epidemic and the expansion of TB and HIV prevention and care.

To sustain these advances, current levels of investment by national governments towards TB care and prevention must be increased as they currently fall far short of levels required to end the epidemic by the end date of the Sustainable Development Goals. Likewise, efforts must be made to identify and remove the challenges that are slowing down progress, as well as adopt and roll out the most cost-effective policy options and interventions. Core TB control services should be funded from domestic resources, and universal health coverage introduced to ensure quality assured preventative, diagnostic, treatment and care services.

Building on the successes of the recent past and fulfilling the

commitments made by our political leaders, national governments need to adopt policy and programmatic actions to foster a multisectoral response to end the epidemic. Within the broader context of a revitalized Primary Health Care system, these measures should include initiatives to look for and effectively treat all existing

Regional Director, WHO Regional Office for Africa cases, and scaling up preventive treatment for high-risk populations, especially people living with HIV and child contacts of known TB cases.

To end the epidemic by 2030, we also need to ensure universal access to the WHO recommended rapid molecular tests as first-line tests for diagnosis for all presumptive TB cases, as well as to adopt the new WHO recommended drugs and drug combinations for treating drug-resistant TB.

Civil society organizations and community systems need to be strengthened to provide diagnostic support and care where patients live and work, as well as facilitate access to needed services, and to assist governments in scaling up

TB is at long last gaining a higher profile on the global political agenda, this should create more momentum to reach the targets we have set for 2020 and beyond; we look to our international partners for continued technical and financial support in the fight against TB and related conditions.

As Regional Director of WHO in the African Region, I re-affirm the commitment of my office and that of all my technical staff across the region to work with governments, other partners and communities to support the above actions towards ending the TB epidemic by 2030, if not earlier. It's Time to end this suffering and bring hope to TB patients and their families.

'We will ensure that country never runs out of water'

MINISTER of Natural Resources Peter Bhembe worked in the water industry for well over two decades, since 1995 to be specific.

He was the head honcho at the Eswatini Water and Services Corporation (EWSC) before joining politics after being appointed by His Majesty King Mswati III in the new government.

He has also served as a member of the South African Institute of Electrical Engineers (SAIEE) and the International Water Association (IWA) as well as the IWA Strategic Council.


With so much knowledge and skill on the industry, we took some time to get his view on water in the country. Firstly, we quizzed the minister on how this year's theme of International Water Day was being interpreted by the country. "I think this year's theme which is 'Leaving no one behind' speaks to how EWSC and government as a whole is working at the moment. The world is looking at ensuring that everyone gets access to clean water because water is life, and water is at the core of nearly all industries, so we need to make sure that we get clean water. Clean water saves us from getting so many illnesses, so this statement is widespread and can be interpreted from all different spheres," he said.

When asked on the importance of recycling water, the minister made it known that it was much cheaper to at-least try and save water by using it sparingly other than recycling methods. "Luckily enough for me, I have served in the water board in SADC as Chairman and have learnt that for some countries it makes sense to recycle, but not us as Eswatini. For a country like Namibia, for example, they recycle because they have no running rivers, but for us, it would be more costly to recycle. We are blessed with rivers and hence, we are doing just fine. It's now a matter of preaching the message of saving water," said Bhembe.

The minister further revealed that 95 per cent of Emaswati were covered in terms of clean water. "When you weigh us against our counterparts from the region, we are much more ahead than them. 95 per cent of the Emaswati population access clean water and this is something we have to be proud of," said the minister. The last time the country experienced water rationing was during the tumultuous El Nino times, where Bhembe was still heading EWSC. When asked on what measures the company and government had taken in ensuring that such a situation does not occur again, Bhembe simply said the answer to that problem was building more dams.

"What the drought exposed us to at the time is that we don't have enough storage for our water, hence the plans to have more dams. When you take a look at this year's budget speech, government is working on the construction of another dam to cater for Mbabane – Manzini, as well as a couple down south to cater for the southerners. If the drought hits again, we should have stored enough water to make it a point that we do not suffer, even if the drought goes on for a whole two years," he concluded.



Other topics will be water sector financing, legislation, co-ordination, institutional and policy, as well as monitoring and evaluation.

MARGINALISED groups such as women, children, refugees, indigenous peoples, disabled people and many others are often overlooked, and sometimes face discrimination, as they try to access and manage the safe water they need.

These groups are left behind without safe water for many different reasons. Some of the 'grounds for discrimination' that cause certain people to be particularly disadvantaged when it comes to accessing water are namely; Sex and gender, race, ethnicity, religion, birth, caste, language, nationality, disability, age, health status, as well as social status.

To 'leave no one behind' means focusing our efforts towards including people who have been marginalised or ignored. Water services must meet the needs of marginalised groups and their voices must be heard in decision-making processes. Regulatory and legal frameworks must recognise the right to water for all people, and sufficient funding must be fairly and effectively targeted at those who need it the most.

What needs to be done and why?


Water kiosks

In a bid to get water to the rural parts of the country, the country initiated the 'Support to Water And Sanitation Swaziland' (SWASS) project.

Funded by the European Union to a tune of £15 500 000 (£250 million), the aim of the project is to provide safe drinking water and sanitation to an additional £61 000 people in the poor and dry south-eastern areas of Eswatini.

The existing network of water was expanded as twenty water selling points (water kiosks) were built, each with a toilet and sink next to them.

The project is implemented by Eswatini Water Services Corporation (EWSC) and World Vision Swaziland, together with the Government of Eswatini. The project was made possible thanks



to the 'Upgrading of Potable Water Supply in Siphofaneni, Somntongo

and Matsanjeni – Swaziland' (SISO-MA Water) programme. With the water

kiosk project, 20 communities benefit, where people can buy clean and affordable water.

RESULTS OF THE WATER KIOSK PROJECT

- Access to drinking water is improved and made sustainable.
- Expansion and upgrading of the water network and treatment plants.
- Basic sanitation at household and community level is improved: sanitation facilities (sink and latrine) were built next to each kiosk.
- Training and sensitization at community level about sanitation, hygiene and waste management.
- Individual training on behavior about sanitation and hygiene.
- Risk of diarrhoea is much lower. Diarrhoea was very common among children and adults using dirty water from unprotected boreholes.

Before I started working at the kiosk, I was selling herbal products and braiding people's hair. I had to travel far to work and I was always tired. Now I'm far less stressed. I really love my job. Most of all, l feel like I fulfill an important social role: I provide clean water to many people from the community. I am very grateful to the European Union and to EWSC (Eswatini Water Services Corporation) for this job. Before I opened this kiosk, they gave me training of three days. I learned how to work with people and how to work with water. The training also gave me a lot of courage and confidence! I feel like this programme has given me a new direction in life.

When interviewed on this year's World

Water Day, Minister Mashwama said there was an urgent need for the people of Eswatini to start adopting methods that limit water usage.

"Our country has had serious drought issues over the years and they have left devastating socio-economic effects on the population. To try and curb this phenomenon from ever affecting us again, we need to save the little water

that we are able to store. This is therefore a call to the nation to try and adopt their lifestyles, and get into habits that will save water," said Mashwama.

Potential

Mashwama made it known that the country hasn't been able to develop its river basins to their full potential, hence the water scarcity. "The average rainfall in Eswatini is 788 millimetres per

annum, ranging from as low as 500 millimetres in the dry Lowveld region to 1 500 millimetres in the wet and cooler Highveld.

Now, this high variability of rainfall means water availability is low and has to be enhanced through measures such as the construction of dams and other water harvesting initiatives, which is very costly," she said.

1. Shower Bucket - Instead of letting the water pour down the drain, stick a bucket under the faucet while you wait for your shower water to heat up. You can use the water for flushing the toilet or watering your plants.


- 2. Turn off the tap while brushing your teeth Water comes out of the average faucet at 2.5 gallons per minute. Don't let all that water go down the drain while you brush! Turn off the faucet after you wet your brush, and leave it off until it's time to rinse.
- 3. Turn off the tap while washing your hands Do you need the water to run while you're scrubbing your hands? Save a few gallons of water and turn the faucet off after you wet your hands until you need to rinse.
- 4. If it's yellow, let it mellow This tip might not be for everyone, but the toilet is one of the most waterintensive fixtures in the house. Do you need to flush every time?
- 5. Fix your leaks. Whether you decide to do it yourself or hire a plumber, fixing leaky faucets can mean big water savings.
- 6. Re-use your pasta cooking liquid Instead of dumping that water down the drain, try draining your pasta water into a large pot. Once it cools, you can use it to water your plants. Just make sure you wait, because if you dump that boiling water on your plants, you might harm them.
- 7. Head to the car wash If you feel compelled to wash your car, take it to a car wash that recycles the water, rather than washing at home with the hose.
- 8. Cut your showers short Older shower heads can use as much as five gallons of water per minute. Speed things up in the shower for some serious water sav-
- 9. Choose efficient fixtures Ventilating your faucets, investing in a low-flow toilet, choosing efficient shower heads, and opting for a Water Sense rated dishwasher and washing machine can add up to big water
- 10. Shrink your lawn The best way is to lose the lawn completely and go for an xeriscaped landscape that incorporates water wise ground cover, succulents, and other plants that thrive in drought conditions.
- 11. Don't run the dishwasher or washing machine until it's full. - Those half-loads add up to gallons and gallons of wasted water.
- 12. Keep an eye on your bill to spot leaks If your water bill spikes suddenly, there's a good chance that a leak is the culprit. Call in a plumber to check your lines to save water and cash!
- 13. Install a rain barrel. Rainwater harvesting is a great way to keep your plants hydrated without turning on the hose or sprinkler.
- 14. Flush with less Older toilets use a lot of water. You can reduce your usage by sinking a half gallon jug of water in the toilet tank. Do NOT use a brick, because it will break down and the sediment can damage your
- 15. Water outdoor plants in the early morning -You'll need less water, since cooler morning temperatures mean losing less water to evaporation. It's not a great idea to water in the evenings, since this can promote mold growth.
- 16. Hand-washing a lot of dishes? Fill up your sink with water, instead of letting it run the whole time that you're scrubbing.



n as much as the world has developed in so many ways, billions of people are still living without safe water.

Marginalized groups comprising women, children, refugees, indigenous peoples, disabled people and many others are often overlooked, and sometimes face discrimination, as they try to access and manage the safe water they need. It is therefore important to advocate for the inclusion of all stakeholders in the planning and implementation of water development interventions.

Serious investments and interventions have been committed by the Eswatini Water and Agricultural Development Enterprise (ESWADE) to the development of water infrastructure and addressing water related problems but the subsequent benefits have not matched what was initially anticipated. Such occurrences are a result of inadequate inclusion of the relevant stakeholders concerned. The sustainability of water development interventions is hugely dependent on the

inclusion of the local people at all levels in envisioning, planning, design and implementation of initiatives to address water related problems. Sustainable development involves conducting economic development without depletion of natural resources and with consideration of the needs of future generations. In essence "Leaving No One Behind" involves considering the current water needs for everyone including the needs of future generations.

The theme for the 2019 World Water Day is an adaptation of the central promise of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development. This year's theme emphasizes that as sustainable development progresses, everyone must benefit. Sustainable Development Goal 6 (SDG 6) includes a target to ensure availability and sustainable management of water for all by 2030. Synonymously, this means leaving no one behind

According to UNDP (2019), 1.8 billion people globally use a source of drinking water that is

fecally contaminated. This figure is a clear highlight that we still have many people left behind in terms of the provision of access to adequate and equitable sanitation and hygiene for all and eradication of open defecation as stated under SDG 6. The government of Eswatini has invested a significant amount of money in developing water and sanitation related initiatives. However, some rural communities still suffer water scarcity which also expose them to water borne diseases. Regulatory and legal frameworks must recognise the right to water for all people, and sufficient funding must be fairly and effectively targeted to those who need it the most. To 'leave no one behind', we must focus our efforts towards including people who have been marginalized. Water services must meet the needs of marginalized groups and their voices must be heard in decision-making processes.

interventions that seek to address water development problems in the country. A substantial contribution towards achievement of sustainable development goal number 6 has been made through availability and sustainable management of water and sanitation for all in the provision of potable water supply to rural communities. ESWADE's LUSIPI & II projects acknowledge that every homestead in the project development area should be provided with potable water. In achievement or contribution towards this year's theme, a total of six community potable water supply schemes have been constructed in the LUSIPI project covering a population of 25,654 people.

The LUSIP II plans to provide a total of six (6) similar potable water supply schemes to benefit 15,925 people with two schemes having already been completed and covering three communities in the Ngcamphalala chiefdom. The OPEC Fund for International Development (OFID) which is people-centred and focusing on projects that meet basic needs such as food, energy, clean water and sanitation, healthcare and education, has played a huge role in ensuring that potable water is available for all in the LUSIP Project


Development Areas by financing most of these schemes. The LUSIP II will strive to get more of such funding to ensure that the other Chiefdoms are also provided with potable water.

Such initiatives involve bulk water infrastructure development projects such as the LUSIP I at Siphofaneni and the LUSIP II extension. These projects form a significant part of the water development projects in the country and it has yielded an enormous positive impact in the livelihoods of the benefiting population most of which was living below the poverty line.


The Smallholder Market-Led Project (SMLP) is also implementing rainwater harvesting initiatives at farm and household level across 37 chiefdoms in the country. This initiative is aimed at improving water availability to meet household water needs and is targeted at households in the rural areas where acute water scarcity is experienced. To date a total of 850 households from Qomintaba, Lulakeni and Nkonjwa Chiefdoms have benefited from this initiative. This is an ongoing project and other Chiefdoms that are yet to receive this form of assistance are Lulakeni and Luhlanyeni.

ESWADE through SMLP addresses the problem of water scarcity by promoting microscale (household level) and macroscale (basin level) rainwater harvesting through the construction of ferrocement tanks for storing domestic water and earth dams to support crop production. The ESWADE development model is accurately in line with this year's theme of the World Water Day in the sense that all ESWADE project initiatives are based on the Chiefdom Development Plan (CDP) which is developed by the people. ESWADE's approach to water development is designed to be people driven, the people are at the forefront of their development hence ensuring sustainability and "leaving no one behind".




Community members from Nzameya Chiefdom constructing a ferro cement tank at household level



THE PRISON SYSTEM, WHICH ALLOWS FOR CONVICTS TO SERVE LESSER SENTENCES

SERIES - PART 6

Many people have been questioning why convicts are always released earlier that them term of their sentence expires.

The prison system and its laws allows this in the following manner:

1. A year in the prison system consists of 8 months instead of the normal calendar month that we know. For example, where any person is sentenced to 12 years in prison, they will serve 8 years in prison, effectively serving 3/4 of the sentence.

2. Commuting of sentences - the Prerogative of Mercy Committee is tasked assessing convict' behaviour and may commute or "write off" a portion of their sentence on account of good behaviour of the convict. The normal portion commuted from the sentence is 1/3. If the example taken above is applied here, then a convict will serve 2/3 of his 8-year sentence, meaning that they will serve +/- 6 years, which would be almost 1/2 of the original sentence given by the

In addition, for convicts sentenced to the death penalty, the commuting of their sentence would change it to life imprisonment. Within the context of the constitution and the prion system, life imprisonment is 25 years under normal circumstances.

3. Royal pardon - the King normally grants royal pardons national during celebrations such as the King's Birthday or Independence Day. The pardon could be carried out in the form of commuting of sentences or remission or complete pardon (cancellation of sentences).

All these factors combined result in convicts at times serving less than half their sentences and being released earlier than the public would

All these factors combined result in convicts at times serving less than half their sentences and being released earlier than the public would expect

given the opportunity to reform and redeem themselves, the early release system does more harm than good:

1. It results in the public losing faith in the justice system because they perceive that convicts do not receive the punishment they deserve for committing serious offences.

2. Convicts do not have enough time within which to reform and change their attitudes, resulting in them repeating the offence for which they had been convicted.

3. Victims of offences are traumatised by early release of convicts, and live in constant fearthat they will be violated again.

There is a need to reform the prison system such that convicts guilty of serious offences are not beneficiaries of the early release system regardless of good behaviour.

It is essential that sentences are served fully to ensure justice for victims, and to serve as a deterrent for would-be offenders.

This is particularly important for victims of sexual and gender-based violence who stand to be beneficiaries of the newly enacted Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence Act, which provides for harsher sentences and heavier fines.

In order for the law to be effective, the sentences should be served fully to ensure that "justice is not only done, but also seen to be done".

The Catholic Faith Part II

LENT: A time to follow the example of Jesus Christ

THE Gospel of the first Sunday of Lent takes us with Jesus in the desert, the place of the encounter and of the intimacy with God, but also the place of the supreme fight with the tempter.

The aim of these forty days is that the Church, following the example of Jesus Christ, who went into the desert to fast for days, makes us live the same period of time to prepare us to "celebrate the event of the Cross and Resurrection – in which the love of God redeemed the world and shone its light upon history" (Benedict XVI, Message for Lent 2013).

The purpose of Lent is not for mortification. It is for the encounter with Christ at Easter. For this walk toward the Crucified and Resurrected, it is necessary to purify our eyes, our heart, and our mind, to look, love and understand others and ourselves as God does.

In this exodus toward God's land, prayer, "that is the effusion of our heart in the one of God" (Father Pius of Pietralcina), is necessary. "It is necessary for us to pray because prayer gives us a pure Heart and a pure heart knows how to love" (Mother Theresa of Calcutta).

A pure heart has pure eyes to see God. If it is useful to know the purpose of the number of forty days, it is good also to know that its origin is not in the Gospel, but in the Old Testament.


In Genesis, we read that because of the flood, the wise man Noah spent forty days in the arc with his family and the animals that God had told him to carry along.

He waited another forty days after the flood before coming ashore (Genesis 7:4.12; 8, 6). The book of Exodus tells us about Moses who remained forty days and forty nights on Mount Sinai with God and received the Law. During all this time he fasted (Es 24, 18).

Also, Deuteronomy tells us that the walk of the Jewish people from Egypt to the Promised Land lasted forty years and it was a privileged time in which the elected people have experimented

God's fidelity. "Remember how for these forty years the LORD, your God, has directed all your journeying in the wilderness...The clothing did not fall from you in tatters, nor did your feet swell these forty years," said Moses at the end of these forty years of the desert (Dt8:2.4).

Forty were the years of peace for Israel under the rule of the Judges.



(Judges 3:11.30). Unfortunately, after this period, the lack of the memory of God's gifts and of the application of the Law took over. Forty days were needed for the prophet Elijah to reach mount Oreb where he met with God (1 King 19, 8).

Forty days were requested by Jonah from the citizens of Nineveh to do penance and they were forgiven by God. (Jonah 3, 4) Forty are the years of the kingdoms of Saul (Acts 13, 21), of David (2 Sam 5:4-5) and of Solomon (1 Kings 11, 41) the first three kings of Israel.

The purpose of Lent is not for mortification. It is for the encounter with Christ at Easter.

In the New Testament, we read that forty days after his birth Jesus was taken to the Temple and Simon, at the end of his life, could meet the Son of God, at the beginning of his life among

Forty were the days that Jesus spent fasting in the desert where he went under the guidance of the Spirit (Luke 4:1-13).

While praying Jesus fed himself with God's Word using it as a weapon to win evil. After these 40 days, the Redeemer started his public life.

Forty were the days during which the resurrected Jesus instructed his disciples before 'finishing' his human adventure, going to Heaven and sending the Holy Spirit to continue it with us and in us. (Acts 1.3)

In conclusion, 40 is the symbolic number with which the Bible shows us the most important moments of the experience of the faith of the people of God. This number doesn't represent a chronological time but a necessary time to see God's work. It is a time to make up our minds and take responsibility without postponing it.

FORGIVENESS

Scripture reading: Matthew 6:14-

Lack of forgiveness blocks access to the kingdom of God and miracle

"For if you forgive men when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. But if you do not forgive men their sins, your Father will not forgive your sins (Matthew 6:14-15).

There are factors that cause unforgiveness; betrayal, bitterness, arrogance, pride, rebellion and lack of reasoning.

Unforgiveness is a cancer that feeds at you instead of the person you resent and is also a device used by the enemy to keep and cage you in pain. It can even kill you!

The first person you probably have not forgiven is yourself. More people have a lack of forgiveness towards themselves than towards anybody else. They are unwilling to forgive themselves and to recognise that God says, "As far as the east is from the west, so far has He removed our transgressions from us." (Psalm 103:12).

If you are a believer, He has already cleansed your conscience from dead works so that you might serve Him, the living God.

It doesn't matter the kind of sin you might have committed but God cleanses us in order to not leave us with the guilt of past sin that should be dead, buried, and forgotten.

Obviously, we cannot have continuing sin in our lives and expect forgiveness. We have to be free from ongoing conscious sin and rebellion against God. But if we are walking in the light, and walking in forgiveness, then the blood of Jesus Christ is continuously cleansing us from all sin.

The second person we must 'forgive', if we have bitterness, is God Himself. There are people who blame God because a child died, a spouse left them, they have been sick, or are generally struggling in life.

Consciously or unconsciously they think all these things are God's fault. There is deep-seated resentment; yet you cannot be resentful toward God and experience miracles.

You must rid yourself of any bitterness toward Him. That may take some soulsearching by asking yourself if you areblaming God for your situation.

The third person you may have to forgive is a member of your family or friends. You must get rid of resentment, especially toward those closest to you. All must be forgiven when resentments have built up in family situations.

All lack of forgiveness must be eliminated. This is clearly demonstrated in 2 Samuel 13. The Bible says; Absalom's sister, who was also called Tamar, was raped by Amnon, who was their half-brother.

Amnon was also David's eldest son. After the rape, Absalom waited two years, and then avenged Tamar by sending his servants to murder a drunken Amnon at a feast, to which Absalom had invited all the king's sons.

Absalom resented his father David for not giving his sister Tamar justice.

In fact, he became so bitter that he wanted to avenge Tamar's rape ordeal that might as well have resulted in him even killing their father David.

He went as far as rebelling against David by having sexual escapades with his father's concubines. Why didn't David punish Amnon for his sin against Tamar?

One likely reason was that Amnon was also David's son and that David had been guilty of sexual sin himself (in the case of Bathsheba) - therefore, in the case of Amnon and Tamar, he felt inadequate to judge.

Another possible reason might be that that there was no witness to the crime. Amnon's friend Jonadab had carefully orchestrated the crime to avoid the possibility of witnesses; therefore, there was no way to prove the crime.

Regardless of the reason, Absalom took matters into his own hands. He avenged Tamar by killing their halfbrother Amnon, though it resulted in many problems for himself.

Absalom lived away from his family for three years after the murder and then lived for an additional period in Jerusalem before seeing his father's

Absalom would also later seek to usurp his father's throne, resulting in his own death.

He died without being king whereupon David cried for him and wished rather it were him than his son Absalom, all because of bitterness.

The tragic story of Amnon and Tamar highlights some of the problems associated with sexual sin and its aftermath.

No one should experience the treatment Tamar endured, and it is important to respond to such situations with integrity and justice. David neglected justice. and Absalom implemented his own standards, creating additional problems in the process.

Finally, there has to be forgiveness for anybody else who has ever done anything against you. It may be that your resentment is justified.

The person may have done a very terrible thing to you. You may have every right to hold a grudge against him/her. But if you want to see miracles in your life, it is imperative that you

Forgive them to the point where you actually feel yourself cleansed of bitterness and are actually praying for them.

If you do not, the lack of forgiveness will make it impossible for God to forgive you. Every miracle depends entirely on your relationship and loves for God the Father, so you can be able to pass it on to others. That relationship is built strictly on the strength of His forgiveness of your sin.

Forgiveness is the key and it is lack of such that most often comes between people and God. Go through all lengths and humble yourself to forgive that somebody. Forgive that baby daddy, colleague, friend, sister or fellow brethren. Let love lead. Remember, forgiveness is a positive choice that changes you!

VAT, FUEL TAX ESSENTIAL -FINANCE MINISTER NEAL

MINISTER of Finance Neal Rijkenberg says without Value Added Tax (VAT) Eswatini can forget about renewable energy sources in the country.

The minister was reacting to a submission made by Economic Association of Swaziland's (ECAS) Professor Mike Matsebula during the Post Budget Seminar hosted by the Central Bank of Eswatini (CBE) at the Royal Swazi Sun yesterday.

Matsebula stated during the seminar that the VAT tax would fall hard on the lower income earners and also promote inflation.


He implored government to work together with other stakeholders to find other measurers for the level of electricity purchases.

"We need to find other funds available to purchase renewable energy sources as this would ease the burdens that come with VAT on electricity. Maybe government can have a discussion with the local office of the European Union to see how they can assist the country in this regard," he said.

He also touched on the issue of fuel tax, in that it would create a negative impact and also see a regress in the economy.

"I have no problems with the other levies, such as sin tax and all but I have reservations with the fuel tax. I believe it will give some resistance, especially considering the issue with the Cost of living adjustments (CoLA). Imposing this tax will just be a toxic mixture and gov-

ernment should consider," Matsebula said.


The minister explained that a majority of the VAT went to coffers of the Eswatini Electricity Company (ECC) and not government.

He said this was mainly used to cushion the increasing electricity percentages from Eskom.

"VAT does not have a negative impact on

inflation and has a zero tolerance of the cost of goods. VAT also opens renewable sources doors for investors and as Cabinet we are working around the clock to find a balance.

"On fuel, they may be an impact on inflation, but as government we need to find ways on how to make this easy on the tax payer," he added.

Private Sector commends minister on VAT, CoLA freeze

While taxpayers feel they have been hit hard by the budget presented by the ministry of finance, Business Eswatini has commended Minister Neal Rijkenberg for, amongst other things, VAT on electricity and freezing the Cost of Living Adjustment (CoLA for civil servant.

Making his remarks during the post budget seminar hosted by the Central Bank of Eswatini at the Royal Swazi, Ezulwini yesterday, Business eswatini President also Montigny Group CEO Andrew le Roux, who spoke on behalf of the private sector, commended the spreading of the tax burden to include the shadow economy, which will be made possible by the introduction of the consumption tax, the ease of doing business index, as well as the reduction of the regulation and labour law reform and also the tax appeal tribunal and tax reform.

The CEO said they had learnt from the budget speech presented by the minister that there was a realisation of the economic crisis and a firm grasp on the economic realities at hand that there is need for fiscal consolidation and the need to do things differently. He stated that this recovery could only be a private sectorled recovery and that government needed to get smaller to allow for the fiscal space that the private sector needs to

grow. "We have seen that there is a strategy; the first and most important step of which is to restore confidence with our lenders, our private sector and with our financial institutions. With the fully-funded budget being the first step, I believe that this has been achieved," he said. He, however, noted that the budget was still lacking in that it is long on some promises and short on specifics.

He cited the Corruption Perception Index as one of those promises by government. "Every person in this room knows of a story involving corruption. Yet, nobody has gone to jail and we are not allocating the resources to this scourge to show that we are serious about it.

Adjustments

"There is more corruption, and more people think it is ok to be corrupt. Justice needs to be seen to be done.

"On the issue of CoLA, while it may be fiscally prudent to freeze cost-of-living adjustments, this will not solve the problem. We do not believe that Eswatini is going to be able to 'trade its way' out of this. The budget refers to Civil Service commitments of about E8 billion per annum, but once allowances, pensions, public enterprises and the like are included, this amount balloons to E 11.5 billion, or about 2/3 of our total revenue. This is simply not sustainable, and increased taxes are not going to fix this," he said.

The CEO highlighted on the issue of reduced corporate tax that business looks

for certainty, hence the need to know what the significant tax reductions are in order to best allocate their capital and resources. He added that tax reforms alone were not enough to attract investors.

"Attracting FDI and growing the economy: At this forum 12 months ago, we commended government for passing the SEZ Bill. A year later, how many investors do we have? 10? 5? 0? We have a raft of policy decisions and adjustments to make before Eswatini becomes the investment destination of choice in the region.

"As Emaswati, we know that Eswatini is a great place to do business (eg Montigny), but every indication is that for a foreign business, for fresh money and investment, we are closed for business. Our regulatory environment has reached the realms of the ridiculous, our processes for starting and running businesses, or even just opening a bank account has not improved: what takes two hours in Mauritius takes 30 days in Swaziland," he said. As a result, the taxpayer, investor and the consumer continue to pay for this, through stealth taxes, a lack of regionally competitive investment packages and incentives, and a lack of service delivery. I have the privilege of engaging with multiple development partners and agencies - I can give this audience the assurance that there is faith in this team, confidence in this budget and optimism for the future. And we look forward to the specifics," said.

Establish factoring services for MSMEs growth - FESBC

FESBC Vice President Hezekiel Mabuza says it is time local banks and non-bank financial services establish 'Factoring' services to assist Micro Small and Medium Enterprises (MSME) in the country.

He said during the post budget seminar hosted by the Central Bank of Eswatini (CBE) yesterday that this was one of the recommendations by FESBC that, if well implemented, would help free up credit and capital to the MSME sector in the country. "Most MSMEs are finding it difficult in maintaining a good cash flow position to meet their operational needs and financial obligations in respect of servicing their loans as expected. Factoring, as is well-known, will help MSMEs breath in some air of relief when it comes to the management of their account receivable because it has numerous benefits, some of which include tapping into unlimited cash. As sales increase, more money becomes immediately available.

"Moreover factoring is an easy process to setup in that accountable receivable financing does not require the mountain of documents generally needed to secure bank loans," he said.

Mabuza further mentioned that as FESBC, they would like to


promulgate for the reform of the Credit Reporting Act.

"It should be taken on board however that, the Kingdom of Eswatini has signed into law the Act in 2007 to facilitate the activities of reference bureau, but has just about three reference bureaus that are finding it absolutely difficult in getting the cooperation of the various banks to chare their credit information on consumers," he said. He added that they appreciate the generous support of E5.5 million from government towards the development of the SME sector in Eswatini.

"Our prayer is for the successful estimated E9.6 million projected for the end of the fiscal year 2019 to be strategically utilised," he said.

He, however, noted that their prayers for the SME community remain unanswered and that the fundamental questions from FESBC included, amongst other issues, a modification and reform of the available SME legislation, Paliamentary Acts, government and support framework provided to SMEs in the Kingdom.

"Just to give an example on this, by increasing the estimated SME budget by 100 per cent from E10 million to E20 million annually to achieve sustainable growth," Mabuza said.

Recently, Finance Minister Moeketsi Majoro proposed the tax increment when he presented his budget speech in Parliament.



MMB's Country Managing Director in Lesotho, Sesupo Wagamang, MMB remains a significant contributor to the economy through taxes and the employment opportunities it offers, as one of the county's largest employers. "It is however, concerned by the impending negative impact a levy of this nature will have on its business and the liquor industry as a whole," he said, adding that there are a number of implications associated with the introduction of this levy, many of which will put our business in an unfavourable position.

"The most important of which is the likelihood of consumers switching to informal alcohol and the increased opportunities for smuggling, which is contrary to the government's goal with this levy."

Presenting his budget speech, Minister Majoro said the government's revenues for the 2019/20 financial year are expected to rise by 3.4 per cent of the Gross Domestic Product (GDP) to reach 46 per cent of the GDP. African Daily Voice

Botswana's economy grows by 3.4 per cent

GABORONE - Botswana's economy has grown by 3.4 per cent, eTurbo News reported.


According to the World Travel & Tourism Council's (WTTC) annual review of the economic impact and social importance of the sector, the research compared the sector across 185 countries.

The findings showed that last year, Botswana's Travel and Tourism sector grew at 3.4 pervcent which is above the Sub-Saharan African average of 3.3 per cent; and it contributed US\$2.52 billion to the country's economy - this represents 13.4 per cent of all economic impact in the country, and nearly one in every seven dollars in the economy.

The research also found that the sector in the country supported 84 000 jobs which is 8.9 percent of the county's total employment; it was primarily driven by leisure travellers, with 96 per cent of the Travel & Tourism spending in the economy that was generated by leisure visitors and just four percent from business travelers; and it weighted towards international travel which amount to 73 per cent of spending which came from international travelers and 27 per cent from domestic trav-

MAY'S DIVISIVE BREXITSTANCE

LONDON - Theresa May's attendance at the EU summit in Brussels yesterday was supposed to be the final appearance of a British Prime Minister in the European club before Brexit took place next week.

But after months of wrangling with lawmakers, resulting in a failure to get her deal approved by Parliament, May will instead ask her fellow EU leaders for three more months to get Brexit completed. It is a situation that should have left May, the prime minister who took the job claim-

ing only she could provide the fortitude and resilience to see Brexit through, feeling humbled and contrite. And yet on Wednesday night she delivered an extraordinary statement in which she tried to shake off blame for the collapse in her

Brexit plans -- and pin responsibility on British lawmakers.

Appealing directly to the British public through a televised statement from Downing Street, May said she was on the side of the people versus Parliament.

"You, the public, have had enough. Tired

You are tired of the infighting, tired of the political games and the arcane procedural rows, tired of MPs talking about nothing else but Brexit when you have real concerns about our children's schools, our national health service, knife crime," she said.

"You want this stage of the Brexit process to be over and done with ... So far Parliament has done everything possible to avoid making a choice ...

You just want us to get on with it and that is what I am determined to do."

May's decision to create a dividing line between the people and Parliament -- at a time when lawmakers have faced death threats and abuse over Brexit -- enraged politicians on all sides on Wednesday, and justifiably so. From someone whose authority is already weakened by her failure to seal the Brexit deal, these comments could be her undoing.

For a start, they have already, apparently, cost her deal yet more votes in the House of Commons, when she has been trying to reverse a three-figure defeat.

Opposition

Lisa Nandy, an opposition Labour lawmaker who was understood to have been on the verge of backing May's deal, tweeted: "The prime minister's statement was disgraceful. Pitting Parliament against the people in the current environment is dangerous and reckless ... she's attacking the MPs whose votes she needs. It will have cost her support."

Nandy later said on ITV's Peston show: "There's absolutely no chance she is going to win over MPs in sufficient numbers after that statement. It was an attack on liberal democracy itself. ... I will not support a government that takes such a reckless approach." Reuters

Taiwan president to visit Hawaii amid China pressure

TAIPEI - Taiwan President Tsai Ing-wen will visit Hawaii next week on a tour of diplomatic allies in the Pacific, official media said yesterday a move likely to anger China, which claims the self-ruled island as its own amid tension across the strait.

China regards Taiwan as its sacred territory and regularly calls it the most sensitive and important issue in ties with the United States, complaining to Washington about transit stops by Taiwan presidents.

Tsai will transit Hawaii next

Wednesday on her way home from an eight-day visit to three diplomatic allies, the official Central News Agency said.

Taiwan, which China deems ineligible for state-to-state relations, has formal ties with 17 countries, almost all small nations in Central America and the Pacific.

The island battles to keep its allies from switching their allegiance to China, which last year persuaded Burkina Faso, the Dominican Republic and El Salvador to forge relations with Beijing. Reuters

Criticising Britain, Germany, Trump tears up diplomatic rules

WASHINGTON - President Donald Trump is once again tearing up the diplomatic norm of treading lightly in allies' domestic politics, with his team attacking Britain's beleaguered leader over Brexit and irritating Germany.

Trump, who has slaughtered so many sacred cows in US politics, has shown no compunction over lambasting Prime Minister Theresa May's handling of Britain's most sensitive issue, even as she sought to build a warm relationship with him.

With Britain mired in crisis ahead of its scheduled March 29 departure from the European Union, Trump said that May "didn't listen" to his negotiating suggestions and that he was "surprised to see how badly it has all gone."

His son, Donald Trump Jr., went further in a biting op-ed in the eurosceptic Daily Telegraph newspaper, saying that "democracy in the UK is all but dead."

Ambition

The 41-year-old, seen as harboring future political ambitions, deplored that May "ignored advice from my father" and wrote: "Now, the clock has virtually run out and almost all is lost -- exactly as the European elites were hoping."

National security advisor John Bolton, who advocated Brexit before taking a job at the White House, was more diplomatic during an appearance on Sky News but said that Trump sought a resolution that "allows the United States and Britain to come to trade deals again." Reuters

Karadzic sentence for war crimes increased to life

THE HAGUE - Former Bosnian Serb leader Radovan Karadzic will spend the rest of his life in jail for the "sheer scale and systematic cruelty" of his crimes in the war that tore his country apart a quarter of a century ago, UN judges said on Wednesday.

Grim-faced and silent, the 73-year-old stood in the dock as judges in The Hague said they had upheld his 2016 convictions for genocide in the Srebrenica massacre and war crimes throughout the 1990s.

In one of the last remaining cases from the break-up of Yugoslavia, the tribunal also increased his original 40-year sentence, saying it was too light for his role in the worst bloodshed in Europe since World War II.

Bereaved family members stood up as one and applauded and cheered in the public gallery of the court after the verdict, which is final.

Judges at the original trial "underestimated the extreme gravity of Karadzic's responsibility for the most grave crimes committed during the period of conflict, noted for their sheer scale and systematic cruelty," head Judge Vagn Joensen said.

"Karadzic's contention that he was a psychiatrist and poet with no military training ignores his extensive authority over Bosnian military forces."

The panel of appeals judges therefore "imposes a sentence of life imprisonment,"

he said.

Relatives of victims had called for a life sentence for the man who, along with his military right-hand man Ratko Mladic and late Serbian leader Slobodan Milosevic, was one of the main architects of the carnage in the Balkans.

"My soul now is satisfied," Emma Cekic, 62, whose husband Salih and many cousins were killed near Sarajevo, told reporters outside the court.

Around 100 000 people died and 2.2 million others left homeless in the threeyear war, during which prosecutors said Karadzic wanted to "permanently remove Muslims and Croats" from territory claimed by Bosnian Serbs. AP

PM Abe may meet Trump in April

TOKYO - Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe may meet President Donald Trump in the United States in late April for talks on North Korea and Japan-US trade, two government officials and

Japanese media said yesterday. The meeting was requested by the Japanese side and arrangements were being made for the end of April, the Asahi Shimbun daily said, without giving a specific date. Two government officials familiar with the matter told Reuters that planning for Abe's visit was underway. A foreign ministry spokesman said an overseas trip by Abe had not been decided. Reuters

Sanctions workarounds failing to soften impact

PYONGYANG - North Korea's illicit and highly sophisticated efforts to circumvent UN sanctions may have sought to cushion their impact, but they offer no long-term solution to the fallout of tightened economic isolation, analysts say. Sanctions relief was top of leader Kim Jong Un's agenda for his Hanoi summit with US President Donald Trump last month, but the meeting broke up without a statement or even a lunch as the two sides disagreed over walking back Pyongyang's nuclear weapons programme in exchange for relaxation. The North publishes virtually no economic statistics of its own. AFP

Investigators to hold news conference on Air crash

JAKARTA - Indonesian investigators said yesterday that information from

the cockpit voice recorder of a Lion Air jet that crashed in October was leaked to the media and they would hold a news conference at 0830 GMT. The investigation into the crash of a Boeing 737 MAX aircraft that killed all 189 on board has

become more urgent after a second deadly accident in Ethiopia. Reuters

Nicaragua agrees to free opposition prisoners

MANAGUA - The Nicaraguan government has agreed to release all opposition prisoners within 90 days in a bid to restart stalled peace talks. Mediators said the government would free more than 700 people detained since anti-government rallies began last April. A crackdown on the protests has left more than 300 people dead. The agreement also called for sanctions imposed on Nicaragua by the US and EU to be lifted. Luis Angel Rosadilla, a special envoy from the Organisation of American States (OAS), told a news conference that President Daniel Ortega's government had agreed to release "all the people detained in the context of the protests." AFP

Ramaphosa signs proclamation

PRETORIA - President Cyril Ramaphosa has signed a proclamation that officially establishes the 'new Scorpions'- a new investigating directorate to be based at the office of the National Director of Public Prosecutions (NDPP) - which will investigate highprofile cases including state capture.

Ramaphosa announced the introduction of the directorate during his state of the nation address and it was then dubbed the 'new Scorpions'.

Ramaphosa's spokesperson Khusela Diko said in a statement on Wednesday that it was a move by the president to intensify 'government's campaign against corruption and state capture'.

Focus

Announcing the plan for the new directorate in February, Ramaphosa said it would focus on evidence that had emerged from the Zondo commission and other inquiries. "The directorate will bring together a range of investigatory and prosecutorial capacity from within government and in the private sector under an investigating director reporting to the NDPP," he said at the time. Diko said

the new directorate would investigate common-law offences including fraud, forgery, uttering, theft and any offence involving dishonesty.

It would also investigate statutory offences such as the contravention of acts relating to finance, intelligence, organised crime, combating of corrupt activities, municipal and public finance management acts. Aside from allegations from the Zondo Commission, Diko said the directorate would also probe unlawful activities relating to the Nugent commission of inquiry into tax administration and governance and also the Mpati commission which is probing allegations of impropriety.

PRETORIA - President Cyril Ramaphosa yesterday morning uploaded an initially strange-looking image to his official Twitter account, which led many to believe it had been hacked.

Every single word from what looked like an ANC message appeared to be censored.

However, minutes later, a second tweet made it clear the first one was intentional, and was possibly intended as a reminder of how the letters of detained or imprisoned struggle fighters had been censored during apartheid.

The ANC president was playing this

apparent game with his followers in celebration of Human Rights Day, which takes place on the same day as the Sharpeville Massacre of 1960, an event that began to turn world opinion against the apartheid government.

Responses

Ramaphosa asked: "What are human rights?" but much of the responses suggested people are currently more interested in having uninterrupted electricity supply and other services, which a few told him the ruling ANC has been struggling to give them.

As the morning continued, the message from the president became clearer, as the blanked-out words appeared.

The full message turned out to be a quote from late singer Miriam Makeba, whose freedoms were curtailed under apartheid.

Ramaphosa said the country now had freedom, and that was why he would be voting for the ANC.

However, not all his followers were equally convinced, especially after Ramaphosa got himself stuck on a government-run train for four hours on Monday. One user said: "Now the entire South Africa has their freedom of movement denied by the ANC and Eskom."

Mkhwebane warns Letsatsi-Duba of jail time if she fails to declassify document

JOHANNESBURG - Public Protector Busisiwe Mkhwebane has warned State Security Minister Dipuo Letsatsi-Duba that she faces jail time if she continues to refuse to declassify a document she needs for her investigation into Public Enterprises Minister Pravin Gordhan.

On Wednesday, Mkhwebane laid a criminal complaint against the minister over what she calls an interference with the functioning of her office. Last week, it was reported that the minister also laid a criminal complaint against Mkhwebane, accusing her of stealing

information and violating the country's security laws.

The State Security Minister suggested that the Public Protector doesn't understand the law, while Mkhwebane herself said the minister is breaking that law.

Mkhwebane's spokespersons Oupa Segwale said: "The minister has failed to avail to the Public Protector a declassified document which the Public Protector requires in connection with an investigation into allegations of a breach of the executive ethics code by Pravin Gordhan." EWN

Court bid by disgruntled ANC KZN members thrown out of court

JOHANNESBURG - Two separate applications by disgruntled KwaZulu-Natal ANC members to force the holding of a regional elective conference have been dismissed with costs by the Pietermaritzburg High Court.

Two groups of members of the ANC's Moses Mabhida region - who claim to represent 77 branches which includes Pietermaritzburg, Richmond, Mooi River and Camperdown - went to court in October last year and in January this year, respectively, in a bid to compel the ruling party to hold neir elective conference.

The branch members were seeking an order declaring that the decision taken between September 28 to 30 last year and communicated by the ANC's national executive committee (NEC) on October 3 prohibiting the Moses Mabhida region from proceeding to hold its elective conference, unlawful and invalid.

Wanted

They also wanted the court to declare that the Moses Mabhida region was entitled and authorised to hold its regional conference last year on a date that would be ordered by the court and that the ANC NEC and KZN ANC provincial executive committee (PEC) be ordered and directed to take all "reasonable and necessary" steps to organise the sitting of the elective conference.

JOHANNESBURG - The electoral commission has had to activate an expensive contingency plan to ensure voting stations have electricity on voting day due to load-shedding.

The commission said on Wednesday that the indefinite rotational power cuts were a concern for the electoral process.

Chief electoral officer Sy Mamabolo said ensuring all voting stations have electricity is 'not an easy issue' and is expensive. Mamabolo said the electoral commission has had engagements with Eskom, which announced on Tuesday that daily power cuts lasting as long as four hours were expected to continue for the next six months.

"We are going into a second-tier contingency plan to ensure that counting especially -because counting happens at night - is not disrupted if there isn't energy sup-



BEIRA - At least 167 people were saved and reunited with their families on Tuesday following a successful rescue operation by members of the SA Air Force (SAAF) and IPSS Medical Rescue in flood-ravaged Beira in Mozambique.

This follows a trail of destruction left by Cyclone Idai last week, which displaced thousands of people after their homes were completely demolished or flooded.

The county's fourth-largest city, Beira is believed to be one of the worst affected, with Idai having completely cut off electricity supply and cellphone networks, and left water supply intermittent. IPSS Medical Rescue's Paul Herbst has been posting updates of their rescue operations.

"As more international rescue teams and resources continue to arrive in the region, rescue efforts are expanding and the impact being made is significant. This will also allow for some of the 'first-boots' on the ground to start to ure significantly lower than a projection by President Filipe Nyusi who told state media earlier this week, that it could rise

Three thousand people have so far been variously rescued, most of them from atop building and trees where they were

seeking refuge following the heavy winds and floods that came with the cyclone.

Meanwhile, it is estimated that 15 000 people are currently stranded as varied efforts are continuing to rescue them especially in the battered city of Beira the hardest hit. Africa News

Zim gives public workers 29% raise, averts strike

HARARE - Zimbabwe's public workers have accepted a 29 per cent salary hike for the lowest paid employees, which the government says will cushion them against double-digit inflation, unions said yesteday and likely averting a strike in the interim.

Civil servants in the southern African nation twice rejected a lower government wage offer in January but had been divided over a strike, which led to teachers briefly walking out of their jobs.

Zimbabwe is gripped by a severe US dollar crunch, causing shortages of fuel, food and medicine and dashing hopes among citizens that the economy will quickly recover after years of sputtering under Robert Mugabe, who was removed after a coup in 2017.

An agreement signed by the government and the top public workers'

union Apex Council said "a cost of living adjustment of \$400 million (£303 million) will be effected across the board for all members of the public service with effect from 1 April."

That means the lowest paid worker will now earn a monthly gross salary of \$570 from \$441, said an official from Apex

> Council, which represents 16 public sector unions. Zimbabwe's central bank last

month ditched a discredited 1:1 dollar peg for its surrogate bond notes and electronic dollars and merged them into a lower-value transitional currency called the

RTGS dollar. Public workers would also be able to import vehicles without paying import duty and the government will provide buses to transport the workers, the agreement said. Africa Daily Voice

VATICAN CITY - Pope Francis expressed his pain on Wednesday at the devastation wrought by Cyclone Idai in southern Africa and called for "comfort and support" for victims of the disaster. "Great floods have sown grief and devastation in various regions of Mozambique, Zimbabwe, and Malawi," he said, addressing thousands of the faithful in Saint Peter's Square. "To those dear people I express my pain and my closeness," he added.

"I entrust the many victims and their families to the mercy of God and I implore comfort and support for those affected by this calamity."

CAR reaches deal on new govt - AU

BANGUI - The government of the Central African Republic (CAR) and armed groups that had joined it in a peace deal have reached an agreement to form an "inclusive government," the African Union said on Wednesday. "The Central African authorities and the 14 armed groups (that) signed the peace accord negotiated in early February in Khartoum agreed to an 'inclusive government' in Addis Ababa," the AU said. The deal is the eighth attempt to bring peace to the conflict-wracked, impoverished state since 2012. It was signed in the CAR capital Bangui on February 6 after negotiations in Sudan.

Civilian deaths mount as US drone strikes

MOGADISHU - US forces have "dramatically increased" the number of air strikes in Somalia with several civilians killed by the powerful missiles, Amnesty International said on Wednesday, reports denied by the military. Amnesty calculates that there have been more than 100 strikes by US drones and manned aircraft in the past two years, more than the number of US airstrikes in Yemen and Libya combined during the same period. Researchers who investigated five airstrikes in detail reported that at least 14 civilians had been killed - raising fears the total dead in the scores of attacks may be far higher. AFP

LONDON - Wayne Rooney is hoping to see Chelsea starlet Callum Hudson-Odoi handed a senior England debut after being drafted into the squad for the first time.

Goal revealed in January that German giants Bayern Munich were prepared to pay £35 million (US\$45m) for Hudson-Odoi's potential, and exit talk remains as the youngster has not committed to fresh terms. Competitive minutes are of greater importance to him at present than a new contract, with it possible that his learn-

ing curve could include England outings against the Czech Republic and Montenegro in Euro 2020 qualifying.

Former captain Rooney is looking for Hudson-Odoi to be involved over the coming days, telling Sky Sports of the latest exciting talent to join the likes of Jadon Sancho and Declan Rice in the Three Lions squad: "To be honest I haven't seen that much of him play, which is a

shame because from what everyone says he is a huge talent.

"He doesn't seem to be getting a lot of game time at Chelsea at the minute so hopefully with his call-up to the national squad he'll get some game time and there will be a chance to see him.

"It's great to see young players getting the opportunity to play for England and certainly over the last year or so, they've taken that chance."

Hudson-Odoi has taken in 19 appearances for Chelsea this season, scoring five goals. He has said of his selection by Southgate, having initially linked up with the U21 squad: "It's been a crazy experience but I'm delighted. I thought the manager was joking.

"I was shocked and then when I heard that I actually had to go over, I couldn't believe it. I was delighted. It's a dream come true. Now I've got to work hard, enjoy every moment and keep working to just hopefully make an impact when I get the opportunity."






