





JUDGE ABANDE IS NOT TELLING THE TRUTH – SHOT VICTIM

t seems only the court can help determine what really transpired on the day Sithembiso Mngometulu (27) of Hhelehhele was allegedly shot by Industrial Court Judge Abande Dlamini at Kai Kai two weeks ago.

This is especially because there are conflicting versions of the incident. Mngometulu and his friends have presented a different account from that presented by the judge and his acquaintances to the police.

Following the report on the judge's statement recorded with the police, which suggests that the judge was being attacked with a beer bottle, Mngometulu has come out to dispute the statement, saying some of its content was incor-

Mngometulu said it was not true that he attacked the Judge, he was carrying a weapon, and that the judge warned him before shooting at him. Instead, Mngometulu alleges that the judge assaulted him for asking who had assaulted his

Mngometulu added that the judge gave a different account of the incident when he visited him in hospital as he never mentioned the selfdefence version, rather simply apologised and owned to the incident, saying it was a mistake.

According to him, the judge offered two cows as an attempt to smoke the peace pipe.

"To me he said sorry brother it was a mistake," revealed Mngomezulu this past week.

Fighting

He told this newspaper that he was from town going to pick up his friend at Kai Kai not knowing that he would end up being shot at.

"When I got at the bar, I gathered that some of the people had been fighting my friend," he narrated. "I started enquiring who had assaulted him, then I gathered that these were local people who are known to me thus there was no reason to fight them."

He said to make things worse one of them is his relative. "So I approached him asking him who and why they beat up their own," he con-

However, before he could get a response the Judge allegedly assaulted him, 'with fists and I

He alleged that the judge and his companions continued to assault him with kicks and fists until he started bleeding and some patrons intervened and held back the Judge.

Mngometulu said the second question he asked

LEG MAY BE AMPUTATE

ithembiso Mngometulu has said that doctors have informed him that he may have his leg amputated should the metal implant procedure fail.

In an interview with this newspaper, Mngometulu revealed that after he was discharged from the Raleigh Fitkin Memorial (RFM) Hospital, he was transferred to the Mbabane Government Hospital where he would know his fate.

"For now, they had to put on the plaster of Paris and it was supposed to begin from my waist but for me to be able to urinate they put it at a lower position. They said I had serious fractures which will require metal implantations or I may have it amputated," he said.

Mngometulu stated that this incident would affect his entire life and that of his family as he would no longer be able to fend for them as he was a traditional healer who lived by going to the mountains to dig roots for his business.

He said it was unfair that the judge offered E5 000 or two cows for such a damage that he had caused, stating that this would not even cater for his medical expenses that he was yet to incur.

"This is not an apology nor compensation but bribery. To me he said sorry brother it was a mistake. I have a family who was expecting him, but it never crossed his mind to go to it and apologise there, seeing I was still angry at him," lamented Mngometulu.

the Judge resulted in him being shot as locals warned the judge telling him that he was an exconvict and could be dangerous should he decide to retaliate.

"I then crawled and fetched my hat from the ground while the other patrons held him and questioned him on why he was assaulting me. Someone among the locals said to him what are you doing to this person, do you know that he is dangerous if he fights back you will be in trou-

"He shot at me for that warning, yet I was unarmed. He then shot me, and I fell, and he came to me and continued to assault me until was rescued by the patrons and he sped off," he

Mngometulu said at no point did he attack the judge with a bottle nor did the judge warn him before shooting at him and thus concluded that the Judge was not being truthful.

The withdrawal and suspension of the Finance Circular No.3 of 2019 should not have come as a surprise.

According to Sunday Observer sources, long before the circular was subject for debate in Parliament, it had not enjoyed the support and enthusiasm of those within the corridors of power, including Cabinet.

As a result, sources have said they were not surprised at the turn of events, when Parliament was informed of its suspension.

It has now been officially rejected by both parliamentarians and Cabinet.

On Monday, the finance minister announced to the House that the new circular was suspended until further notice but failed to tell the legislators the reason why it has been suspended.

A source close to the matter stated that there were several reasons why the circular by the Phil Mnisi-led Royal Commission was withdrawn.

The Sunday Observer understands that the withdrawal of the politicians constituency allowances did not sit well with appointed Members of Parliament, who felt that this was unfavourable to them as it gave them less than their elected col-

Rejected

Furthermore, the elected politicians also felt Circular No. 2 of 2013, though it has not been reviewed for the past five years gave them a better salary than the new circular. These sentiments are said to have been shared by the Cabinet ministers who rejected it.

Sources close to the matter stated that the politicians came up with different views on how to resolve the challenge. Some are believed to have opted to go to seek audience with the King, while others opted to approach the court as they felt it

Both options are said to have been the reason the circular ended up being withdrawn. "The authorities felt that the circular needed to be reviewed to improve the salaries of the politi cians as it became eminent that the salaries were lower than those in circular No.2 especially for the prime minister," said a source close to the matter.

According to the source also the threat to take the matter to court contributed to the suspen sion of the Circular which was expected to the effected next month.

Members of Parliament were already express ing their unhappiness with Finance Circular No. of 2019. Responding to the politicians Ministri of Finance Neal Rijkenberg told the parliament tarians that the circular was suspended and would no longer be effected rather Circular No. 2 was going to remain until further notice.

This was accepted well by the parliamentarian who had started arguing if the decrease in the salaries was related to the fact that unlike unionse employees they were not able to engage the employees er on their pay which they said was against the Employment Act.

STRIKE GOES AHEAD AS PLANNED — PSAS

he strike action by government employees that is scheduled for tomorrow until Wednesday is still on, this was confirmed by the Public Sector Associations yesterday evening, saying nothing has changed.

The PSAs said the strike will continue as planned and will members go to seek responses from the ministries where they had submitted their petitions.

This comes after government failed to stop them through offering a three per cent CoLA once-off offer on the table during negotiations on Thursday afternoon.

Despite

This follows that civil servants crammed the SNAT Centre in Manzini on Friday and resolved to go ahead of the strike action, despite the work no pay rule evoked by government. Swaziland National Association of Teachers (SNAT) Secretary General Sikelela Dlamini said they expected no classes on the days of the strike, as they expected all teachers to participate whether they were members of SNAT or not.

"We do not expect any school to proceed with classes during the strike action as we expect everyone to part take in the strike action, as the objectives of the cause of the strike action will benefit all teachers. We do not expect schools to be operating and we do not expect learner to go to school either," he said.

Intimidated

Singing in the same tune was NAPSAW Secretary General, who assured their members that the strike was on going, as schedule, saying they should not be intimidated by what senior government officials are announcing about the strike as it is legal and the forms issued to heads of departments were for the SNAT expects no classes in schools

purpose of intimidating them.

Police Information and Communications Officer Superintendent Phindile Vilakati said people should not panic as the police will be pursuing their mandate as usual.

"We will be carrying on with our mandate of ensuring peace and order protecting citizens and property, no matter what the situation may be," she said.

Minister of Education and Training Lady

Howard Mabuza said schools will not be disturbed and pupils and teachers are expected at school, as those who will not join the strike will carry on with their duties and will be protected.

Emphasised

She said no one had the right to say there will be no classes, except the ministry and emphasised that those who will not show up to work they will be faced with the no work no pay rule.

Similar sentiments were shared by the ministry of public works Communications Officer Hlobsile Vilakati who said government implore PSAs to exercise respect in the event the strike

'Duty attendance registers have been distributed to controlling officers to monitor the presence of workers. Absent workers will experience the no work no pay principle," she said.

Govt looks to notches for defence in CoLA battle

few days into the protest action by the Public Sector Associations strike (PSAs), government has attempted to justify failure to give the civil servants the cost of living adjustment in the past three years, by using the notching system as a defence.

Government has claimed that civil servants have been receiving percentage increase in salaries over and above the current CPI and are, on average, better off than they were a year ago.

This notching system, government says, is pegged at 3 per cent per annum which it says has been cushioning civil servants.

The Prime Minister Ambrose Mandvulo Dlamini while in parliament this week is said to have stated that the notching was easing the pressure on civil servants on prices of commodities.

This was also confirmed by a high-profile tion on purchasing power.

source within government who said in essence this translated to percentage increase in salaries over and above the current CPI.

Furthermore, government has alleged that the current financial crisis resulted from the high salaries paid in 2017.

Misguided

This has been disputed by the public sector associations saying government was misguided.

The business dictionary (www.businessdictionary.com) defines the Consumer Price Index (CPI) as a measure of changes in the purchasing-power of a currency and the rate

The consumer price index expresses the current prices of a basket of goods and services in terms of the prices during the same period in a previous year, to show effect of infla-

A reliable source within government has revealed that civil servants who are notching were cushioned at an average of three per cent annually.

Claiming

"Interestingly if we consider the current year where CPI is two per cent and the notching is three per cent, then one can come to the conclusion that the people that are going on strike on Monday, on average, have actually received one per cent increase in salaries over and above the current CPI and are actually, on average, better off than they were a year ago, even though they are claiming the opposite," said the source close to the matter.

The inflation is calculated based on the monthly CPI over a year.

The source said civil servants who are notching obtain a natural increase in salaries.

"What the man on the street does not under-

stand is that in government there is a natural increase in salaries for civil servants called notching that is applicable for several years, once a fresh post or a promotion takes place. Not all people get the benefit of notching every year but the average impact on the wage bill

last three years," the source revealed. According to the source, if one takes this fact into consideration, then one needs to understand that this does assist civil servants to cushion the impact of the annual increase in the cost of goods (CPI).

On another note the source revealed that the current financial crisis faced by the country largely resulted from the high wage bill of

"We are in the third year that the Government has not awarded any CoLA increase due to the cash flow challenges, that were mainly caused by the high increase in civil servant salaries in 2017," added the source.

GOVERNMEN'I MISGU

The Public Sector Associations say government is misguided and simply intends to portray them as being unreasonable to the public by continuing to demand the CoLA.

Swaziland National Association of Teachers (SNAT) Secretary General Sikelela Dlamini said it was wrong for government to assume that the notching applied to every civil servant, as this was not the case and the notches were different among the departments.

He said if anything majority of the civil servants were not notching because when the salary review was done, they were moved to the corresponding notch, which was not in favour of those who had reached the ceiling. On the second account Dlamini said the two were not the same and their calculations were different as well as their applica-

"We have heard from the electronic media where we are not given a platform save for the private station that government considers notching as cushioning us. Government is misguided as about 96 per cent of the civil servants have reached the ceiling, thus they are no longer notching except the police, correctional services and the soldiers. I last notched in 2013 for instance," he said.

Dlamini also said government was incorrect in suggesting that the wage bill of 2017 was responsible for the economic crisis saying this was unfounded.

"There was an exercise which sought to uproot ghost employees which we appreciated but the report was never released.

Untouchable


"This brewed the speculation that certain people were paid through the public purse illegally by private individuals who are untouchable. Some are said to be working for government in certain departments, yet they are untraceable, let alone those who earn double pay for different jobs when they do not report to duty," he said.

Similar sentiments were shared


by National Public Service and Allied Workers Union (NAPSAWU), Secretary General, who said it was wrong for government to calculate the CPI on annual bases, when it should be calculated on an annual basis. He said the inflation was higher than the average CPI that government referred to in the beginning of this financial year and the previous years and thus government was behind with 19.3 per cent due to the civil servants.

He made an example of the time of the budget speech where the inflation was higher than the CPI.

is Majesty King Mswati III left the country early yesterday morning for United States, New York to attend the 74th UN General Assembly.

The King in the company of Inkhosikati LaNtentesa, Emazinyanye, Cabinet ministers and other dignitaries jetted out of the country through the King Mswati III International Airport at 5am where hundreds of Emaswati, members of the Royal family, the prime minister and his Cabinet bid him farewell. Emakhosikati, Chiefs and members of the different Royal councils were also present to see the King off.

The King will be joining other heads of state from 192 states to discuss and work together on a wide array of international issues covered by the Charter of the United Nations, such as development, peace and security and international law.

Primarily, the UN was set up to promote peace and stability amongst mankind and develop nations socially and economically, to mention but a few. Every year in September, all the members meet in this unique forum at the UN Headquarters in New York for the General Assembly session. Sitting arrangements in the General Assembly Hall change for each session. During the 74th Session (2019-2020), Ghana will occupy the first seat in the Hall, including in the Main Committees (followed by all the other countries, in English alphabetical order).

Among other items in this year's agenda is the climate change summit to be held tomorrow, where UN Secretary-General António Guterres is calling on all leaders to come with concrete, realistic plans to enhance their nationally determined contributions by 2020, in line with reducing greenhouse gas emissions by 45 per cent over the next decade, and to net zero emissions by 2050.

Review

On the same day, the UN High-Level Meeting (UN HLM) on Universal Health Coverage will take place during the United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) highlevel week.

On 24 and 25 September 2019, Heads of State and Government will gather at the United Nations Headquarters in New York to follow up and comprehensively review progress in the implementation of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and the 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). The event is the first UN summit on the SDGs since the adoption of the 2030 Agenda in September 2015.

Despite progress since the adoption of the Addis Ababa Agenda, growing uncertainties and risks threaten development progress and sustainable finance prospects, hence on Thursday the General Assembly will convene its first High-level Dialogue on Financing for Development since the adoption of the Addis Ababa Action Agenda.



WHY EXECUTOR DISPUTES MARRIAGE IN VICTOR ESTATE

Xecutor of the Estate late Victor Gamedze questions the affidavits brought before Court by Catholic Priest Father Jochonia Thayela Mahazule and Lloyd Maziya, in support that Princess Lungile and Gamedze were validly married in community of property.

The Executor Derrick Jele argues that both affidavits are deficient in material aspect.

Father Mahazule in his affidavit states that on 6 August 1994, he solemnised the wedding of Lungile Hotencia Dlamini and the late Victor Mfana Gamedze at Mater Dolorosa Catholic Church in Mbabane.

Lloyd Maziya states that he was the best man at the wedding.

He attests that Princess Lungile contributed a lot financially to the success of the late Victor Gamedze.

Jele first acknowledges receipt of the objection from Princess Lungile, he says; "I am in recept of the objection filed by Khumalo Attorneys on behalf of the Objector, wherein they object to the liquidation and distribution account filed in respect of the estate of the late Victor Mfana Gamedze."

Jele argues that the affidavit of father Mahazule does not advance the proposition any further.

He asserts that the affidavit lacks crucial detail.

He says the priest does not state that he is a marriage officer in accordance with the provisions of Section 16 of the Marriage Act nor does he state that the deceased and the objector completed a marriage register in accordance with the provisions of Section 25 of the Births, Marriages and Deaths Registration Act of 1983.

"Once again there is no explanation advanced why Father Mahazule cannot process a late registration of the marriage," said the executor.

Deficient

On the part of the best man Lloyd Maziya, he averred that his affidavit is also deficient in material aspect.

"Quite importantly, Mr Maziya does not state he signed the marriage register as a witness as is required by terms of Section 25 (1) of the Births, Marriages and Deaths Registration

Jele states that it is that regard that he fails to find any legal basis upon which he should reach such conclusion and ignore the fact that there was a valid, lawful and acknowledged marriage in terms of Swazi Law and Custom.

He affirms that it is widely accepted that with the passage of time, and modernisation, some traditional Swazi Law and Custom principles pertaining to the institution of marriage have evolved.

Existence

He says not withstanding such evolution, the fundamental principles pertaining to marriages in terms of Swazi Law and Custom still obtain.

"I am therefore not persuaded that I should ignore the existence of the Swazi Law and Custom Marriage and its derivative consequences when dealing with the distribution of the deceased's estate.

The proposition that I should consider the surrounding facts cannot

be correct, as there is no conflict of laws in the present matter.

I would be persuaded to consider this argument, if we were dealing with two marriage regimes," he said.

He further reveals that on a conspectus of the distribution of all proceeds flowing from the demise of Mr Victor Gamedze; "It is a fact that there are additional amounts that were paid to the Objector as a consequence of the demise of her husband these amounts do not form part of the estate but were paid by insurance companies to the Objector to my knowledge amounting to E5 500 000.

The Objector received these amounts apart from what I have awarded to her in the account."

Concluding, he states that it is in his view that the Objector has therefore received a generous reasonable provision from both the Estate and other sources.


Dlamini, who was speaking to pupils at Ekudvwaleni High School also said that as a young boy he used to fetch water from the river for his mother before going to school.

Central Bank still working on 'mortgage funding processes'

roperty owners will have to wait a bit longer before the official release of the report on the mortgage loan and mortgage based funding processes.

The report will contain findings on the probe the bank has been undertaking in the past couple of months on mortgage loan processes. CBE intends to uncover any irregularities in the mortgage based funding processes including investigation of allegations of irregular practices by key stakeholders in the mortgage sector, with respect to repossession of consumer properties

This was revealed in an interview with Central Bank of Eswatini CBE's Senior Communications officer Lindokuhle Sithole. The bank released a statement whereby it requested members of the public with information or evidence concerning

any misconduct or malpractice in the mortgages sector by any bank to provide that information or evidence and the deadline of submissions was August 29.

Sithole first appreciated ESWATIN the responses they received from members of the public. She assured them that they are doing everything in their power to have the report submitted to the public with its findings. "However, it will have to be endorsed by the governor first.'

She stated that the bank has already engaged the services of Ombudsman, who is tasked with visiting the banks to ascertain the truthfulness or falseness of the complaints brought to them and try to rectify all irregularities encountered.

She opined that in terms of Section, 52 of the Central Bank Order, CBE established an Ombudsman for financial institutions that are licensed

She said the Ombudsman offers fair, independent and easily accessible dispute resolution for consumers who are unable to resolve complaints with their banks.

She stated that the reason they engaged the public concerning the misconduct in the mortgages sector is because they are keen to hear

"Section 4 of the CBE Order charges the Central Bank with the responsibility to supervise banks, and other financial institutions to the end of promoting a sound financial structure," she said.

Elaborating, she said in its regulatory process, the CBE issues guidelines, circulars and legal notices as regulatory tools, all of which flow from provisions of the Financial Institutions Act, 2005.

She further shared that the CBE has issued quite a number of regulations over the years. She said most of the regulations are internal operations, whereas others are bank spe-

SA Court declares 'RICA

The constitutionality of the SIM card registration exercise called VELA has been brought into question following a South Africa High Court ruling made on Monday which declared some clauses of the Act like it unlawful and invalid.

Judge Roland Sutherland issued a judgment in favour of the AmaBhungane Centre for Investigative Journalism, which challenged the constitutionality and validity of parts of the Regulation of Interception of Communications and Provision of Communication-Related Information Act (RICA), to reduce the state's one-sided powers to spy on cit-

RICA is believed to be similar to the on-going VELA SIM card registration, which is currently at an advanced stage in the country with its deadline having been shifted several times to allow those who had not yet register to do so.

The local SIM card registration is provided for in the Swaziland Communications Commission (Subscriber Registration) Regulations, 2016.

The clause in question in the local context is that on data protection and confidentiality which states that the service provider will, on its electronic communication system, record, store and on request, provide subscriber' communication data to an authorised Security Agency within 12 hours.

Security Agency according to the regulations refers to the Royal Eswatini Police Services, the Umbutfo Eswatini Defence Force, Correctional Services and National Fire Emergency Services.

"A licensee shall, on its electronic communication system, record and store: personal information, every MSISDNnumber used with every IMEI-number and IMEI-number used with every

MSISDN-number, which shall, on request, be provided to an authorised Security Agency within 12 hours," reads the contentious clause in part.

The regulations further state that the licensee shall take precaution with the subscribers' data by not disclosing it to a third party except when requested by an authorised security agency.

"A licensee shall take all reasonable precautions to preserve the integrity and prevent any corruption, loss or unauthorised disclosure of Subscriber Information retained and shall take steps to restrict unauthorised use of the Subscriber Information by its employees who may be involved in capture and or processing of such Subscriber Information.

"A licensee shall not transfer subscriber information outside the Kingdom of Eswatini, except on instruction by an authorised Security Agency," further reads the regulations

On the other hand, the recent judge-

ment in the neighbouring country brings an element of notifying the subscriber whose information is transferred as the High Court ruled that the state's ability to spy on people's communication without informing them is unconstitutional and its ability to conduct bulk surveillance on South African citizens is unlawful and invalid.

The judgment stems from an application brought by media group amaBhungane, who had challenged the constitutionality of the Act after it learned that one of its investigative journalists, Sam Sole, had been the target of State surveillance under RICA, while investigating the decision by the National Prosecuting Authority to drop corruption charges against former President Jacob Zuma.

The amaBhungane had argued that RICA lacked the necessary safeguards to protect the public's right to privacy and felt it necessary that some of its sections should be declared unlawful.

Agonising wait for a lawyer for Mangwaneni folks

ailure to raise the required money for an attorney has compelled Mangwaneni residents to wait a bit longer before their case is brought back

Mangwaneni, Manzana and eSitibeni residents are in need of an attorney to help them pursue their case in court.

This comes after they were moved from their homes and some left uncompensated during the construction of the MR3 road, which connects the Mbabane-Ngwenya highway.

The attorney agreed to help the residents at a fee of E15 000, but proceeded to accept E7 000, meanwhile they raise the balance. Members of the Project Affected People in the construction of the bypass road, disclosed that so far they have managed to raise E2 800.

Initially, the High Court of Eswatini had ruled that they should be compensated, however, some families are still battling for their compensation. It is reported that over 10 families are without houses, whereas others received their

The case was scheduled to be back in court on September 13, however, due to failure to raise the required money, they

will now have to wait for their attorney to give them an alternative date for their next appearance in court.

A representative of the Project Affected People Gideon Gwebu revealed that about 10 families have come forward to state that they are still homeless. He said the figure could increase.

"The High Court made a ruling in 2007 that the families should be compensated, however, some were compensated and some were left out. Hence, we have engaged the Commission on Human Rights to assist. They have agreed to work closely with our attorney in seeing to it that we eventually get compensated," said Gwebu.

Gwebu encouraged the affected residents not to fear being victimised, as they are fighting for their rights. He disclosed that some residents who were part of the relocation had passed on, whereas some are sickly because of depression and stroke caused by the delay in resolving the issue.

Another member of the committee Sibusiso Fakudze revealed that the compensation policy at their possession states that the displaced persons were supposed to be compensated before the resettlement commenced.

"The compensation policy further states that mechanisms will be instituted from time to time with the affected community in line with the base line survey conducted which clearly show what the residents have to be compensated for, and these residents will be identified by any means suitable," he said.

He opined that they worked with a resettlement committee which was tasked to appoint a valuer, either from government or the private sector. "Who valued all immovable assets for compensation."

He said after the evaluations each resident signed the valuation certificate with the valuer, the valuation certificates were submitted to the resettlement committee for compensation.

This newspaper got a hold of a document which outlined all the procedures that were supposed to be followed during the resettlement process.

According to the project affected people, government was supposed to work according to the laid down procedures of the document. They stated that it is the same document that was used to solicit funds for the resettlement project.

The document states that whenever 10 or more households in a specific project area affected by resettlement (large scale resettlement), a resettlement plan shall be developed which outlines all resettlement planning and relocation.

The Judgment said the act failed to adequately prescribe the procedure for notifying a person whose information has been intercepted. Sutherland added that the Act was not clear in situations where the subject of surveillance is either a practising lawyer or a journalist.

He suspended the invalidity of the act for two years to allow Parliament to bring the legislation in line with the Constitution.

The Eswatini Communications Commission (ESCCOM) could not be drawn to comment on the ruling and its impact in Eswatini, as the Commission requested time to get the facts on the case and the judgment before responding to our questionnaire.

he Minister of Justice and Constitutional Affairs Pholile Dlamini-Shakantu stated that she had not been privy to the judgement and the articles of the RICA that were declared unlawful by the court, thus could not comment on them but could give insight on the laws of privacy in

'Concerning the laws of privacy in general, I can say that data or information protection is an integral part of safeguarding a person's right to privacy. Our laws and common law provide for the legal protection of a person where his or her personal information is being collected, stored, used or communicated by another person or institution. Article 14 of our constitution provides for the protection of the privacy of the home and other property rights of the individual. The right to privacy is in itself not absolute and must in other cases bow down to competing matters of national security and safety," she said.

The minister said where the collection of personal information is allowed by law, it must be done with integrity and for the purpose intended. A sensitive balance is required when dealing with individual interests and legitimate concerns of the state mostly in crime prevention and investigation.

CANGO – Educate Emaswati on the VELA and privacy laws

The Coordinating Assembly of Non-Governmental Organisations (CANGO) has appealed to government to educate the public on the Swaziland Communications Commission (Subscriber Registration) Regulations, 2016 and their rights to privacy.

CANGO Communications Officer Nkosingiphile Myeni said they have had members of the public questioning the constitutionality of the law governing VELA following the judgement of on RICA.

"We would like to appeal to government too and stakeholders to educate people on these laws in the same way people are educated on SODV Act. Some of the questions that have been posed are how long do the police keep people suspected to be involved in crime under surveillance? And under which circumstances are the security agencies allowed to retrieved data from ones phone," he said.

The document states that a compensation determination committee was established at the commencement of the resettlement-planning phase to determine and negotiate compensation norms and rates for non-beneficiary affected homesteads, prepare compensation guidelines and norms for beneficiary affected homesteads.

Residents who had their fruit trees and crops removed are to be compensated, the document outlines that; "Construction of the bypass road will be planned to allow for the harvesting of crops before land is acquired. Where crops cannot be harvested or the destruction of crops is unavoidable, cash compensation will be paid, based on rates that will be determined by an independent property valuer. Compensation will also be paid for the loss of future production from fruit trees (excluding

indigenous fruit trees). Compensation rates will be supplied by an independent property valuer," states the document.

Ministry of works Communications Officer Mayibongwe Dlamini asked not to comment on the matter as it is still before the court.

Did senior officer kill himself over compensation?

senior officer in the ministry of public works and transport committed suicide after he was suspected to have not acted in good faith during the compensation of families that were affected by the Mbabane-Ngwenya Highway. The incident occurred in April 2009.

Reliable sources at the Ministry of works disclosed that some people who were tasked with the compensation process have retired whereas one of them allegedly committed suicide after suspicions that he had not acted in good faith during the compensation process.

An employee at the ministry said the matter of Mangwaneni residents has been dragging for some time now, and some of the people who were tasked in doing the job have retired and some are dead.

It is alleged that the deceased employee held the position of a Chief Project Engineer.

"He drank weevil tablets, after he was summoned by the then minister of works, to give a detailed report on the compensations after several complaints from the people who were affected by the multi-million Emalangeni project.

'After his meeting with the minister he looked a worried man. He did not confide what was troubling him or what the minister said to him," said a source in the ministry, who preferred to remain anonymous.

It is worth mentioning that one of the local dailies also published a story of the ministry of works employee who committed suicide by drinking weevil tablets, after he was questioned about the irregularities in the compensation



Noxolo Mdluli's ghost won't go away

lmost 23 years since a then 12-year-old girl was killed by a stray bullet, Noxolo Mdluli's ghost is coming back to haunt the man who was at the centre of the protest march that led to her death.

Jan Sithole has refuted claims that he offered to compensate Noxolo's family after the teenager was hit by a straying bullet during a protest march by the now defunct Swaziland Federation of Trade Unions (SFTU) at ka-Khoza in Manzini. The question arising now, is could Sithole have promised the family of the deceased compensation after her death?

The deceased was shot when police were dispersing a crowd that was engaged in a protest march on January 22, 1996.

Noxolo's aunt Jabulile Mdluli has opened up the wounds of two decades ago, stating that as a family they are still expecting feedback from Sithole concerning the compensation he allegedly promised the Mdluli family.

(Mr) Sithole was a regular visitor at home ka-Khoza. He would come and engage in meetings with my brother (Noxolo's father). He together with other men whom we were told were also from SFTU promised my brother compensation on what had befallen him. They further urged him not to take compensation from the police," she explained.

She asserted that after the tragedy they were constantly visited by police, and she alleged that they promised to compensate them. However, the SFTU members strongly warned her brother against taking the money. She alluded that SFI'U members then distanced themselves from her brother after he constantly asked them to compensate him as they had promised. She said he kept asking them till he met his death.

She said before he met his death (Noxolo's father), he was not a happy man since nobody from SFTU came forth with new developments on what was happening. She disclosed that they were puzzled as a family to learn in the news that Sithole was now a member of Parliament, working for the same government he spoke negatively about.

"I plead with Sithole to keep his promises. We are still expecting the assistance they promised to render even if it's not in the form of cash, we would appreciate it, as we are now struggling as a family," said Jabulile.

She added that she was now taking care of Noxolo's siblings, some of whom could not finish school after their father passed on.

Refuted

However, Sithole refuted the claims of responsibility over the young girl's tragic death.

"On the issue of Noxolo Mdluli, may her soul rest in peace, the innocent girl who was shot by the police stray bullet in 1996, SFTU then stood by the family even when government and the traditional structures then harassed the family for allowing SFTU to play a role in the funeral instead of government doing it and deny any harassment at the time," he narrated.

He said it was not true that SFTU committed to compensate the family, saying that compensation in all situations can only come from the perpetrator and not from the sympathiser.

He mentioned that he still had knowledge of the events and in life no compensation that can come from the victim of the same process.

He said SFTU was the target of the dispersal using live rounds of ammunication, "even today we remember Noxolo as a heroin who deserves to be remembered even in the future," he stat-



Xenophobia denialists should be held culpable

OHANNESBURG - By insisting that the recent violence was 'just crime' and blaming migrants for our ill, politicians and commentators spread the hate that sparks pogroms.

After two weeks of xenophobic violence in which 12 people were killed, the South African government and much of the political elite have again denied that the violence was xenophobic, maintaining a stance employed after the worst outbreak of xenophobic violence in May 2008.

Denied

Former president Thabo Mbeki infamously denied that the violence then was xenophobic, insisting it was 'naked criminal activity'. More than 60 people were killed in what many described at the time as 'pogroms'. But Mbeki,

who has a sorry history of denialism, said: "What happened during those days was not inspired by possessed nationalism, or extreme chauvinism, resulting in our communities violently expressing the hitherto unknown sentiments of mass and mindless hatred of foreigners - xenophobia." Xenowatch, which monitors xenophobic attacks in South Africa, has collected data on

more than 300 xenophobic murders since 2006, but cautioned that the numbers were likely much higher because of under-reporting.

Outbreak

Following the latest outbreak of xenophobic violence in the first two weeks of September 2019, ministers and other politicians toed the same line - the violence wasn't xenophobic but mere

criminality. This despite copious evidence that the people organising and carrying out the violence have explicitly presented their actions in xenophobic terms.

Minister of Defence and Military Veterans Nosiviwe Mapisa-Nqakula insisted the violence wasn't xenophobic after she briefed the justice and security cluster ministers in Parliament following the 12 murders. "South Africa is not a xenophobic country," she insisted. Citizen

EFF threaten court action on Parliament committee

OHANNESBURG - The Economic Freedom Fighters (EFF), through its lawyers, have written to the speaker of Parliament for a second time requesting that a joint standing committee on intelligence be established.

In the letter, penned by the party's lawyers, the EFF claims that should Parliament fail to do so by September 27, they 'will have no alternative but to approach the High Court of South Africa for a relevant order compelling Parliament to constitute same and seek punitive costs against the Speaker.'

Development

The party said that this was in light of 'developments in the country involving our intelligence divisions and services', including the xenophobic attacks, the South African National Defence Force (SANDF) deployment to the Cape Flats, as well as the Public Protector's South African Revenue Service report.

The EFF further cited constitutional obligations placed on Parliament to hold the executive accountable.

"Section 55(2) of the Constitution clearly states that, 'in exercising its legislative power, the National Assembly must provide for mechanisms a) to ensure that all the executive organs of state in the national sphere of government are accountable to it, and b) to maintain oversight of any organ of the state." They add, "The establishment of a Parliamentary Joint Standing Committee on Intellience (JSCI) is one such important mechanism to hold the state and its intelligence divisions accountable.

Parliament pondering rules on removal of Public Protector

OHANNESBURG - Political parties are proposing that an independent panel should consider prima facie evidence on whether a public protector is fit to hold office.

This would also apply to heads of other Chapter 9 institutions, including the Auditor-General. Parliament's currently considering rules for dealing with the removal of heads of democracy-building institutions. It comes in light of calls from the DA for Busisiwe Mkhwebane to be removed as Public Protector.

Believes

The DA believes Busisiwe Mkhwebane is not fit to hold the office of Public Protector. But Parliament has no rules in place to deal with a process for removal.

Political parties appear to be in agreement that the Speaker should appoint an independent panel to consider any evidence.

"This is important because before any deliberations starts in the house, before any reflection on the office bearer, this independent panel must say there's a prima facie case to answer, so you then remove frivolous cases brought against heads of chapter 9 institutions," said DA Chief Whip John Steenhuisen.

Based on the panel's findings, the ANC says Parliament is well placed to take the matter

"As Parliament we are empowered to do our work. We are well equipped to deal with inquiries, so that is why a committee of Parliament will be the right mechanism to deal with this matter with the necessary support," said Deputy ANC Chief Whip Doris Dlakude.

Although the committee was at pains to point

out that it wasn't formulating these rules to deal with a specific individual, the IFP wanted to set the record straight on a potential point of conflict.

Parliament's legal services will now draft definitions for what constitutes misconduct, incapacity and incompetence, before the matter is considered again. eNCA

lamaphosa apologised to Zim because he 'felt their pain

OHANNESBURG - President Cyril Ramaphosa has revealed that he recently felt hurt when he was booed at the late Zimbabwean former president's memorial service in Harare.

The incident occurred last weekend in the presence of a number of his African counterparts as he started his speech in a stadium packed with about 40 000 mourners.

Expressed

"They all collectively expressed their unhappiness about my presence there,"

The president told thousands of ANC supporters who packed the Pietermaritzburg City Hall on Friday for his memorial lecture on Mugabe that he understood that the anger of the Zimbabweans was caused by attacks on foreign nationals in South

"They were expressing it because of what some of their own nationals, our own brothers and sisters from Zimbabwe

Ramaphosa said while other South Africans supported his apology, others condemned him for that.

'Mahlobo, Abrahams abused powers in Zuma poisoning case'

OHANNESBURG - Former Zuma had been poisoned and then state security minister David Mahlobo and ex-National Prosecution Authority (NPA) head Shaun Abrahams have been dragged into the drawn-out tensions between marital home in Nkandla, and spent former president Jacob Zuma and his estranged wife, Nompumelelo Ntuli-Zuma.

For years, Ntuli-Zuma was accused of poisoning her husband with the help of foreign intelligence agen-

But the NPA has declined to prosecute, saying there was no evidence of any poisoning.

The former first lady's lawyers have now pointed fingers at Mahlobo and Abrahams, accusing them of abusing their positions in the matter. It was the former state security minister who confirmed that

received treatment in Russia.

Ntuli-Zuma was labelled the prime suspect.

She was swiftly taken out of her at least four years with the allegations hanging over her head.

Her lawyer Ulrich Roux said there was no shred of evidence to suggest the former president was poisoned - least of all by his client.

"The entire charge was, in my view, politically fueled trumped up charge and one can only point a finger at the head of the NPA at the time as well as the minister of state security. It's an absolute abuse of their position."

Roux said Ntuli-Zuma may sue the state for damages.




Models must research an agency before signing, in order to ensure that the agency has a good reputation in the modelling industry. For information on agencies, models should contact a local consumer affairs organisa-

Some freelance models do not sign with agencies. Instead, they market themselves to potential clients and apply for modelling jobs directly. However, because most clients prefer to work with agents, it is difficult for new models to pursue a freelance

Models must put together and maintain up-to-date portfolios and composite cards. A portfolio is a collection of a model's previous work. A composite card contains the best photographs from a model's portfolio, along with his or her body measurements. Both portfolios and composite cards are typically taken to all casting calls and client auditions. Because advertisers often need to target specific segments of the population, models may specialise in a certain area. For example, petite and plus-size fashions are modeled by women whose sizes are respectively smaller and larger than that worn by the typical model.

Models with disability may be used to



model fashions or products for consumers with disabilities. 'Parts' models have a body part, such as a hand or foot, particularly well-suited to model products such as nail polish or

Models appear in different types of media to promote a product or service. Models advertise products and merchandise in magazine or newspaper advertisements, department store catalogs, or television commercials. Increasingly, models are appearing in online ads or on retail websites. Models also pose for sketch artists, painters, and sculptors.

Models often participate in photo shoots and pose for photographers to show off the features of clothing and other products. Models change their posture and facial expressions to capture the look the client wants. The photographer usually takes many pictures of the model in different poses and expressions during the photo

Models also display clothes and merchandise live in different situations. At fashion shows, models stand, turn, and walk to show off clothing to an audience of photographers, journalists, designers, and garment buyers. Other clients may require models to interact directly with customers. In retail establishments and department stores, models display clothing directly to shoppers and describe the fea-



tures and prices of the merchandise. At trade shows or conventions, models show off a business' products and provide information to consumers. These models may work alongside demonstrators and product promoters to help advertise and sell merchandise.

Models often prepare for photo shoots or fashion shows by having their hair and makeup done by professionals in those industries. The hairstylists and makeup artists may touch up the model's hair and makeup and change the model's look throughout the event. However, models are sometimes responsible for applying their own makeup and bringing their own clothing.

BECOMING A MODEL: EASY STEPS

lot of people want to be models because it looks glamorous and lucrative, I mean just pose and get money,

Well it is not that easy, being a model is a discipline. There are certain things one needs to learn and understand in order to become a model, especially if you want to get paid for it. In all honesty, not everyone can become a model, yes some people learn how to become a model while some people are just born with it, but learning to become a model is possible. The modelling industry is extremely competitive and it is filled with rejection, but successful models spend their time doing something that they love. Knowing what to expect when entering the world of modelling can help prepare you to become a model. According to my research these are the things one should do to

1. Mastering the basics of mod-

become a model.

Be healthy inside. Eat and drink healthy foods and get plenty of exercise. Having a healthy body will help you look your best.

Fitness is important. Consider working with a trainer who works specifically with models. Tell him about your modelling goals and how you want to look, and ask for a tailored exercise regimen that will support those goals.

Eat right. Contrary to what some people tell you, you should eat healthy foods, as well as healthy amounts of food. Veggies, fruit, whole grains, healthy fats, and proteins should make up the basics of your diet. Sugars, starches, empty carbohydrates, and unhealthy fats should be avoided as much as pos-

Be sure to drink a lot of water. Avoid sodas (even diet sodas) and minimise your alcohol intake.

2. Maintain your appearance.

Take care to make yourself look healthy and well-groomed. What you wear and how you carry yourself are important as well, but you should have a routine that supports the health of your skin and hair. Focus on keeping your skin clear and glowing. Wash your face in the morning and at night, exfoliate once a week, and remember to wash your makeup off before you go to sleep.

Keep your hair shiny and healthy. Some agencies and managers prefer the 'natural greasy look,' so it may be okay if you prefer to minimally shower.

3. Match your modelling goals to your body type

Technically, anybody can be a model. However, if you don't meet certain requirements, the work available to you will be incredibly limited or you may have to compensate in other areas (reliability, technique,)

A plus-sized model: If your body is full and curvaceous, you may be able to be a plus size model.

on the catwalk are at least 5'8 and commonly small-breasted. Men are mostly between 5'11 and 6'2. A print model: Most editorial female models are at least 5'7, but a beautiful face with great personality are the most important features for print models.

An underwear model: For women, this requires large breasts but small hips. For men, this requires broad shoulders but slim waists.

An alternative model: Some agencies hire alternative models: models who do not conform to the industry "standards" of beauty, height, and weight. Additionally, having a specific passion or cause that you're working towards can help open doors that may be closed due based on a body feature that does not "fit industry standards". Other types of modelling: If you don't fit any of the face or body descriptions, perhaps you can be a foot, hair, or hand

4. Consider situational model-

If you do not think the runway or magazines are the place for you, look into other types of modeling. Companies use models for special events or to promote specific products. There are fewer restrictions on body type and more emphasis on personality for these modeling jobs.

A promotional model: Some companies want their customer base to interact directly with models who are generally attractive with likable personalities to promote their brand.

You may see these models in grocery stores, events, or clubs promoting things like food, liquor, or new products.

A spokes model: Spokes models are hired to be consistently associated with a specific brand. Contrary to popular thought, spokes models don't always have to verbally promote the brand.

A trade show model: This type of model is hired by companies or brands to advertise to attendees at a trade show tent or booth. These models are typically not employed by the company but hired as 'freelance' models for the

5. Consider your 'look'


The look that you communicate can be made up of both your body type and your style. Know what you're equipped with, but also try to pull off other looks.

6. Do not be shy.

You will have to promote yourself and look for opportunities to step up and prove your abilities. Standing back and being "polite" will not get you where you are going. Be yourself, let your personality shine, and have a confident attitude. If you don't feel confident, fake it; modeling often requires acting skill as well!

he beautiful Sakhile Simelane who is a model in the kingdom thinks her love for fashion is what steered her towards modeling.

"I just enjoyed dressing up and taking "cool" pictures, and then that naturally transitioned into my love for modeling," she said.

When it comes to mod-

eling agencies, she wouldn't know much because she has never been signed with one really. She has been managing herself since she began about 3-4 years ago.

She is however in the works of scouting (internationally) for any agency that she thinks would represent her the way that she sees fit. Sakhile discovered that she might have a modeling talent in 2016 to be precise. She used to get a lot of positive feedback from the general public about the pictures she would publish on her social media profiles. Initially though, she never appreciated being labeled as a model because of certain stereotypical assumptions and that she wasn't really sure if it really was her passion or it was just a phase. As time went on she

however embraced the title and made sure to represent it in a way that she wants to be addressed irrespective of any stereotypes people might have.

And with the

amount of time

and effort she puts in it, it sunk in that modeling really is what she passionate about, and she does believe that she has the talent.

"My proudest moments come after every photo shoot I have. When it comes to my work, I (together with the photographer) usually try to make sure that the latest shoot should be better than the last one we had, so I think Everytime I get the results, I do see the growth and that's what makes me happy and proud, 'Simelane mentioned.

She has been a model for about 3-4 years, but to be precise, three years. This is because four years ago, She had not really accepted the 'model' title because of reasons she has already stated, but 3 years ago (2016) was when she truly embraced her passion and didn't flinch. Every time she was being called a model.

Simelane's journey as a model has been bumpy, according to her. There are so many resources that she needs that she hasn't acquired yet. Also, it's extremely difficult to score a modeling gig in Eswatini because of reasons that are a topic for another day. She strongly believes that for as long as one puts in effort and hard work in a particular course, there definitely will be results at the end of the day depending on how hard one pushes. The harder she pushes, the more intense the effect will be. She says this bumpy road is her season of acquiring lessons and some thick skin in the industry.

Sakhile thinks the modeling industry in the country doesn't even exist to be quite honest. If it exists, it's extremely weak. She also thinks that modeling has been confined into one small category, which is pageant modeling (e.g. Miss Eswatini, Miss Tourism and more) in Eswatini. According to her observations however, this may be a result of the fact that it's kind of relatively new in the country. Eswatini is more familiar with pegeants than it is with fashion modeling, so there's still a lot of awareness and

proposing that needs to be done in order for us to finally have an actual modeling industry. She added that there's an awareness that needs to be spread about it to educate the country (especially the youth) about the fashion and modeling industry as well as some careers that it may entail. Another issue is that she thinks actual models should be hired for modeling jobs, but the reality in Eswatini is that the issue of convenience is at the forefront.

For instance, if a certain company wants to market it's product and they need a face for it, it's easier and more convenient for them to pick out anyone from their list of employees (or anyone they know who isn't necessarily a model) to do the job. This then results to models never getting gigs and staying jobless. At this point and rate, she is not even sure about what can be done or if anything can even be done, it's just a sad reality. Sakhile thinks what holding the country back in most cases the attitudes that people have. She does not know how many times she has had to write down proposals and presentations about ideas that she thought the country would jump at, but attitudes are just there, stagnant and stationary, especially our elders.

It's harder for them to understand and relate to some things because they already have certain attitudes and their own truths, myths and misconceptions about certain

things, and it's even more difficult to change someone's mindset, especially if they're older. So until our attitudes change, she believes nothing will in terms of the modeling industry.

"Sakhile Simelane behind the scenes is a basic girl who loves clothes and style. I am generally nice to people even though I don't seem welcoming. I am a goofball when I'm with my friends or just people I'm comfortable around," she shared.

A formality in the form of a contract should be provided so you abide by it and it should also give you leverage on the agent you are working with.

Msibi added that modelling is a profession which he approaches professionally.


Sphamandla behind the scenes is how he conducts himselfs otherwise in everything that he does he stays true to himself.

You should shoot them in nice natural light (but not direct sunlight) without a lot of distraction in the photos. These are meant for agencies to get a look at you in a raw state.

Consider a head shot, a body shot, and profile shots.

The most important thing to communicate in a portfolio is that you are able to present a range of "characters" and looks.

Take your measurements and know your stats. This information can help modeling agencies place you. Knowing the information off the top of your head will help you seem professional when you are speaking with an agency

or potential client.

The most basic measurements to know are your height, weight, and shoe size.


You should also know your clothing measurements such as dress size, hip, waist, chest/bust, etc.

agency. Almost every major city has multiple modeling agencies, and almost every agency has "opencalls" where they look for new talent.

Bring your photographs and/or portfolio.

Be sure to have your (accurate) measurements as well.

You may be asked to walk or pose for a headshot or other photos during an open call interview.

If an agency rejects you, don't get disheartened; often an agency is looking for a diverse set of models, so you may just not fit their model lineup right now.

5. Be wary of scams.

Try to research the reputation of a modeling agency prior to an open call or interview. Too many people don't know about the business and end up getting conned.

The agency will charge you a commission when you model, but shouldn't get much up front. If they ask for hundreds of dollars from you before you do any work, walk away.



ong before Mandvulo Dlamini could stride through the crowd at Sibaya to be crowned the country's prime minister, there was a collective understanding that the country was headed for tough times, as well as that we needed a breath of fresh air.

There was also a collective understanding that the economy had contracted, and that there needed some very strong decisions to be taken going forward.

Many who answered the summons to Sibaya and who took part in the somewhat pleasing surprise by Ingwenyama to deliberate on the next move and candidate ideal for the challenge that lay ahead, were adamant that there was a need to be brave in the appointment of a new prime minister - a candidate many would have wanted to be younger and energetic to turn the tide around.

Open secret

It is, therefore an open secret that the country has been on this downward turn for a while. In fact, I seem to recall the former Prime Minister Barnabas Dlamini saying that he feared for the next prime minister, when talking about the state of the economy.

But Mandvulo was viewed as a perfect fit for the job at hand; a young man passionate and hungry for success, and not to disappoint the Nation. A young man who would be eager

to make the right and difficult call that His Majesty the King warned would need to be made.

Although not voted into the position, Mandvulo was easily a people's choice, a product of the consensus that this country prides itself for, and admirable in the manner in which he himself presented his ideas to the public.

Since then, Mandvulo has had to hit the ground running in an attempt to demonstrate that not only is he the man for the job, but he is also one with a big dream for this coun-

But the job is not easy, and he does not have the luxury of time to achieve the things he desires for this country. There are a lot of challenges that he has to overcome, the first one being the buy-in to his overall vision for turning the dire economy around.

But, in order for this message to be believable, government cannot then be seen to be less concerned with its spending in other areas. For instance, the handling of the finance circular No.3 of 2019 leaves a lot to be desired, if not a bitter taste to the mouth for those demanding the cost of living adjustment.

While this is a very pragmatic statement, we tend to forget that the Church as the voice of God must speak prophetic word to the political leadership on this land, who makes decisions on our behalf that has lasting impact on the economy.

When the national economic foundations are shaken, it takes a bold church leadership to make meaningful interventions and give a sense of direction and godly counsel. The Church leadership must arise with solutions, and begin to assist the political leadership find solutions. At the heart of the Christian response to such emerging crises, there is no beating around the bush. What is God saying to our nation facing the economic down turn? We are having disgruntled civil servants and they have had no adjustment to their salaries for so long.

We cannot afford to act like all is well when people are on the streets. Oh by the way, it is the only alternative to get attention by the way. So

he demise of President Mugabe manifests conflicted opinions within international leadership and governance

Indeed, Mugabe was not a perfect leader but successfully led liberation struggle of his country, thus, a liberation icon within political and economic villain insightful lessons. Mugabe was born in 1924 in a country called Rhodesia, founded by mercenaries and missionaries, structured within Rhodes Company. This company expropriated land and minerals, dispossessing and enslaving peoples of Zimbabwe, through military and religious manipulation and deception. The treaties and concessions humiliated and dehumanised indigenous people resulting in their enslavement and poverty in the name of colonialism and religion.

Historically, Ndebele-Shona Chimurenga of 1890's struggle for resistance spread throughout Matebeleland and Mashonaland, many whites and blacks were killed. This spiritual warfare led by Svikiros prophets, who told the Ndebele and Shona that white men had brought suffering characterised in history books, as forced labour, hut tax and flogging including natural disasters of locus, pests and drought. These indigenous prophets convinced Africans that the Shona God, Mwari, Mlimo in Ndebele, moved by suffering of his people, had decreed that white men were to be driven out of the country. Moreover, Africans had nothing to fear because Mwari

was on their side and would run the white man's bullets into harmless water.

African Liberation Icon

This historical context resonates with my reflections on how President Mugabe was a formidable African liberation icon, rooted within the Svikiro approach towards liberation. Mr. Robert Gabriel Mugabe, a teacher when his people asked him to use his western education and religion in leading their liberation.

This history recreates itself within the African continent, classic example Malawians requested President Kamuzu Banda a medical doctor to lead their struggle for independence.

Both leaders became formidable leaders who experienced extreme difficulty in balancing and synchronising their leadership with will the of the people.

The Svikiro approach seems to overcome their leadership, behaving as messengers whose mandate was similar to those of indigenous prophets. With similar eventuality, labelled as dictators who became life presidents at the peril of people whom had requested their leadership.

President Mugabe liberated Africa, as the circumstance that created Rhodesia, became a leading icon and example of unapologetically reclaiming the rightful position of Zimbabwe. The land that was dispossessed was his priority, he challenged colonialism until the point when liberation of Zimbabwe was achieved. Mugabe paid a



major price, his imprisonment and all its consequences in my view created a bitter and angry man within him. Evidently, vigilant in post liberation, manifesting in soul inflicted with internal scars from the liberation struggle.

Moreover, African leaders put him on a pedestal as a Pan-African icon, when he spoke they clapped hands and gave him standing novation. He became their anchor of pains they were harboring within them in post liberation, land and minerals expropriated being demanded and called upon by President Robert Gabriel Mugabe.

This African liberation icon, used his western education and religion to recreate Africa's intel-

lectual human capital.

Improving and enhancing the education of his people, today Zimbabweans are known as international human capital with tremendous potential to transform any country. This post liberation education stands as celebrated African resource, like the Svikiros of the 1800s, dynamites with extreme potential.

However, President Mugabe failed in creating an enabling, viable and sustainable environment for the Zimbabwean human capital to strive within their own motherland. Such that they are spread globally, whilst their country experiences political and economic crises, which they are highly competent and capable in resolving. This in my view typifies the anger and bitterness President Mugabe harboured within, subsequently transferred onto the people he liberated.

Political and Economic Villains

The mercenaries and missionaries manifested a villain political and economic base in Rhodesia, which earned its place as the bread basket of Africa, left landlessness and poverty, in faces of Africans in Zimbabwe.

The methods and institution of European domination recorded in UNESCO General African books, vary. Portuguese, Belgian, French, German, Dutch and British experiences were not uniformly crafted but their public policies were all for European interest and gains. Which as a researcher have contextualised as exclusive and undemoc-

before they are demonised and called names, what other platform is available for the masses except to match and make their voices heard. The groundswell anger and frustration as demonstrated is understandable, and what else could civil servants do in trying times such as these, if no one is prepared to listen.

What is CoLA?

A cost-of-living adjustment is made to Social Security and Supplemental Security Income to counteract the effects of inflation. Cost-ofliving adjustments (CoLAs) are typically equal to the percentage increase in the consumer price index for urban wage earners and clerical workers (CPI-W) for a specific period. So ordinarily it is very pathetic that a country can fil dismally to adjust salaries when the cost of living and commodities has continued to skyrocket in the mar-

A sane leader can attest to the fact that something is seriously wrong and that our public servants have not had theirs adjusted for so long. Even a fool can tell something is definitely wrong somewhere and someone has to take the blame or holding the nation in such a state. We tend to forget that our people live in the same world and are hard hit by the economic hardships just like any other person. Why punish the civil servants as if they have their own special shops elsewhere? These are human beings and they too are immensely affected by economic challenges.

State of the Economy

There is no doubt that the state of the Kingdom's economy has been a big concern for the last 3 to 4 years in running. Domestic arrears negatively affected private sector business as a majority of these rely on government payments such as construction activities. Reality is that there has been a freeze on civil service wages, election related expenditure led to slight recovery of wholesale and retail trade sector and supported modest consumption spending.

This has immensely affected the civil service workforce. During the second half of 2018, the government instituted fiscal consolidation measures leading to marginal decline of the budget deficit. Suspension of most capital projects, a civil service wage freeze in 2018, and other fiscal consolidation measures introduced on November

22, 2018 facilitated this marginal decline. Despite these efforts, the government continued to finance fiscal deficit through accumulation of domestic arrears and partly by international reserves. Public debt increased by more than three percentage points of gross domestic product (GDP) yearon-year, reaching 23.8 per cent of GDP in December 2018. Gross official reserves dropped to the lowest level in five years, reaching 2.8 months of import cover in December 2018 (below the threemonth international benchmark).

But is Eswatini Broke?

Seeing Public Servants unions on the streets this past week is indicative of a crises unfolding. It is understandable if one considers that their packages have not been adjusted for so long yet the inflation keep souring. One would have loved to see the government showing signs that it is indeed broke and struggling. The government executives have continued to travel in first class and they get the perks associated with transit allowances. It is therefore not acceptable that on one hand there are claims of struggles financially when some people are still having a great time and are enjoying themselves.

Presently the controllers in the government machinery are not living what they claim, hence it becomes very hard to convince the ordinary civil servant otherwise. There is every reason to believe that the country is ok and still meeting its own loans' commitments and obligations. We therefore are in a tight corner convincing the ordinary person on the street. It is perhaps time that there is national dialogue to find each other because currently we seem to be miles apart and this is not healthy in maintaining national peace and stability by the way.

Do civil servants have an alternative?

I wish there was another way to deal with this challenge, but from where one sits they have no other alternative but to go for these marches.

In a democratic country, civil servant are only availed such opportunity to make their voices

It certainly does not sit well with me that your work force can have no CoLA for three years and you still expect quality services. The country is in crises and the sooner we seek for solutions the

ratic systems of domination for the purpose and imposition of colonialism.

Thus, European villains charted political and economic based rooted in greed, materialism and corruption as mercenaries and missionaries collaborated in land dispossession, labour and mineral exploitation.

This was President Mugabe's context, he anchored through his indigenisation policy after the Lancaster Agreement was not upheld by the British. Mugabe's land grab that rocked the world which the majority negated as a political and economic villain, in my view President Robert learnt from the best.

He used their villain approach emanating from how Zimbabwean land, labour and mineral expropriation was orchestrated through political and economic villains, led by Rhodes Company, mercenaries and missionaries. President Mugabe sent his own political and economic villains, unfortunately this did not manifest in political and economic empowerment of the Zimbabwean people he was leading.

The indigenisation policy enriched a few, whether there was formal criterion or not, the consequences are such that this enrichment was within political party lines.

Unfortunately, this occurred in post Matebeleland massacre, which left the majority believing land grab was personal enrichment to his mercenaries and missionaries of the indigenisation policy. A lamentable moment that manifested in political and economic crises, hence, Zimbabwe has been whipped through sanctions.

This indigenisation policy, symbolising throwing the kingdom into the sky for those with spears to grab as much land as possible. It is unfortunate as political and economic villains can never act in the interest of dignity of the indigenous people. Land grabs did not dignify the people as land still remains in the hands of a few, the majority remains in dire position asking themselves what

was the purpose of the liberation struggle. In the meantime, they are Africa's intellectual capital without dignity within their land, as political and economic villains changed skin colour now justified in the name of liberation struggle.

Conclusion

In conclusion, personally, I enjoyed President Robert Gabriel Mugabe's rebellious moments as they feed the rebel within me, particularly when calling out western powers. As a scholar of African leadership, President Mugabe successfully resisted the negation of African people by colonialism and western powers. However, he successfully negated African people when he became like the political and economic villains, he detest embedded within colonialism and western powers. Thus, Mugabe has intriguing and insightful lesson for many African leaders on how anger and bitterness inflicts people they are leading.

During my research on African leadership, learnt of many icons within the Zimbabwe liberation struggle. Advocate Chitepo an outstanding example, killed in Zambia, would have been an intriguing voice of reason and wisdom in post liberation. It is unfortunate many liberation struggle leaders were lost during Chimurenga, resulting in wisdom void extremely and importantly required during post-liberation.

My other regret as an indigenous knowledge researcher, on the Mugabe legacy was labeling the land grab, an indigenisation policy. As it vilifies indigenous contexts to be perceived as moments of anger and bitterness, and yet redress of land and mineral expropriation is critical towards the Africa we want.

Thus, today I learnt through African liberation icons not to foster an agenda based on anger, but to drive the integration of indigenous knowledge and modernity. I am grateful to the schooling by King Sobhuza II on choosing from both worlds, creating balance for peace and stability.



PHYSIOTHERAPY AND CHRONIC PAIN

ain is a subjective unpleasant sensory and emotional experience with actual or potential tissue damage, or described in terms of such damage.

Many people report pain in the absence of tissue damage or any likely pathophysiological cause and usually this happens for psychological reasons. Pain is the primary reason people seek help from healthcare providers. Access to pain management is now considered a fundamental human right.

There are many areas of pain practice, but this article will provide an insight into acute and chronic pain, focusing more on chronic pain, which is the theme of this year's World Physiotherapy

Acute pain is the initial pain associated with an injury or pathology, that has the purpose to elicit a response. It serves as a warning system to protect an organism from tissue damage. Treatment of the underlying injury or pathol-

y relieves the pain. in many cases, pain will persist either contin-· ly or episodically, after tissue healing has urred. This pain is called chronic pain and efined as persistent pain continuing beyond weeks, despite medication or treatment, or er healing is complete. In cases of it continug after an injury or pathology, it is pain that as outlived its usefulness as it does not serve y useful biological function.

Sometimes chronic pain has no identified cause as it may come on without any history of actual or potential tissue damage. Chronic pain is considered a pathology rather than a symptom of an injury or pathology. It can affect a specific body area (e.g. low back pain) or be widespread (e.g. fibromyalgia).


Chronic pain is a complex condition with physical, social and psychological components, which can lead to disability, loss of independence and poor quality of life.

For most patients, what is important about the persistence of pain is not the time they have been in pain, but rather the loss of function, productivity losses, loss of mental health, and loss of hope. However, researches have proved that in cases of chronic pain, pain and disability are not equivalent. Chronic pain management is a major personal, societal and economic burden.

It isn't possible to tell in advance whose pain will become chronic, however, there are documented risk factors that predispose an individual to the development of chronic pain.

Not all risk factors can be changed, however early optimal management of an episode of acute pain in individuals with one or more of the risk factors is important to prevent or manage the development of chronic pain.

Some of the documented risk factors for development of chronic pain



- an existing chronic pain condition or a previous history of chronic pain
- tissue injury by accident or surgery
- history of psycho-social stressful events
- lifestyle factors including lack of physical activity, unhealthy diet, overweight
- depressed mood, tendency to anxieties and wor-
- olow self-efficacy, catastrophic thinking perceived injustice, disability beliefs
- occupational factors
- medico-legal issues
- opioid-induced hyperalgesia
- increasing age, female gender and other genetic predispositions

Geographical and cultural background Chronic pain after surgery is the most com-

mon. The risk of developing chronic pain after any surgical operation is 10per cent, the risk being higher in individuals with two or more other risk factors. People are more likely to develop chronic pain during or after times of stress or unhappiness. A depressed mental state easily leads to loss of energy, fatigue, less physical vigor and less motivation for physical exercises which all can contribute to the development of chronic pain or can also result from suffering from chronic pain. When a pain episode co-occurs with anxiety - including catastrophising thoughts, fear, low self-efficacy and avoidance of movements, the pain episode is likely to develop into chronic pain. The nerve network associated with chronic pain is also linked to those parts of the brain concerned with emotions. So, pain can affect our emotions, and our emotions can affect our pain

The role of Physiotherapy in chronic pain management

If your pain persists and becomes chronic then the emphasis might shift more to managing the condition and minimizing its impact on your life (improve quality of life), rather than necessarily finding a cure. Your Physiotherapist will help you take control of your pain by developing skills needed to manage your chronic pain condition, increase your activity and improve your quality of life

Your Physiotherapist is part of a multidisciplinary team that is required to adequately treat pain. In cases of acute pain, the level of pain

experienced is often a poor measure of injury or tissue damage. Even if an activity is painful, it is not an accurate sign of doing harm.

- Relax relaxing is hard when you have pain, finding something which relaxes you will re the stress of pain.
- Regular exercise even a small amount will make you feel better and ease your pain, it will also keep your muscles and joints strong, any type of movement is exercise, do only what you enjoy and what suits you.
- Walking you might start off with walking up and down your path or walking to the end of the street before progressing to longer walks
- Enjoyment doing things you enjoy boosts your own natural painkillers, think about what you enjoyed before the pain and introduce it back into your routine.

INSPIRING WOMEN, **GIRLS IN STEM**

n the science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) fields, women are often massively underrepresented.

However, that does not mean they are not making some of the most important and inspiring contributions out there.

My name is Bongekile Matsenjwa, the Co-Director of Women In Engineering (WomEng), an organisation that is passionate about raising the next generation of female engineers and female STEM professtionals.

I am an Integrated Lean Six-Sigma Engineer (IL6S Engineer) at Mondelez International (Eswatini) and I am responsible for continuous improvement of processes in industry through innovations while ensuring zero loss-

I am a chemical engineer and an engineering manager by qualification and have been in the exciting world of engineering for some few years now. However, women in engineering in Eswatini make up less than 10 per cent of all the engineers in the country.

This is something I work tirelessly to change. Why because I believe that engineering across the world needs a female perspective because engineering will only get better with a female voice. A gender balance within the engineering industry will ensure that engineering caters the needs of all people.

To me, engineering is not just a technical industry but one that serves the community by providing products and services and improving people's lives. Research shows that due to increasing innovations the most sought-after careers in 2020 will be STEM related.

The STEM industry is crucial towards delivering forward-looking solutions to some of the challenges in society and plays a prominent role in economic growth, job creation and poverty alleviation. Which is why I encourage women to embrace the fact that each one

has a purpose to fulfil in life and should use their talents to find and achieve it.

Women are breaking stereotypes, they are leading in their industries and are changing the world for the better. Women now have a voice which the world cannot help but listen to. But I was driven by her passion and love for science and maths and I decided to take on the road less travelled. I took the courage to pursue chemical engineering at university and it is now a career I enjoy.


I definitely would like to see more females in this industry, who will be responsible for developing ground breaking innovations that will lead Eswatini closer to being the first world country that we are striving towards.

HOW TO GET HIGH QUALITY GRAIN ON FARM

e are in the thick of the harvesting season and local farmers are busy harvesting, storing and preparing to sell maize to markets like the National Maize Corporation (NMC). Several farmers have begun selling maize to NMC, whilst others have encountered problems on the ground, hence the inspiration for today's article.

Sourced from a training manual prepared on behalf of United Nations World Food Programme by Prof Rick Hodges and Dr Tanya Stathers Food and Markets Department, Natural Resources Institute, UK, the simplistic ideas in this article are the perfect solutions for some of the everyday problems encountered by farmers on a daily basis. We hope the article will be to your pleasure and satisfaction.

The National Maize Corporation's Farmer Development Division is always ready to provide technical assistance to grain farmers, if you'll let me walk this journey with you. Enjoy.

"If farmers have a market that offers better prices for better quality grain, then producing high quality grain on-farm allows farmers to add value to their work and so raises their incomes. To produce this high quality grain, it is essential to do on-farm postharvest handling in a proper and timely manner.

Care taken at this stage is far more cost effective than attempting to upgrade quality later in the postharvest chain, for instance at a maize collection point. In these places grain may have to be cleaned at the expense of the farmer and large amounts of grain may be lost in the process.

This is why farmers selling low quality grain receive a low financial reward.

Opportunities to raise incomes from the sale of high quality grain are most easily achieved through collective marketing by Farmer Groups, Farmer Cooperatives and/or Farmer Associations. For this reason, knowing how to form strong and effective groups with good business skills is essential.

GOOD QUALITY GRAIN FOR BETTER MARKETS

Prepare yourself before harvesting: a) Planning ahead is essential. Make sure you have all the necessary equipment, know where the drying and shelling will be done and how the grain will be stored. Mend all holes

in sacks and make sure stores are in good repair b) Good hygiene is essential, if you will put your grain into sacks then make sure they are cleaned in advance. If you are using a store then make sure the residues of the previous harvest are removed.

Harvest the grain on time:

a) Harvest on time, when the crop is mature, some cobs start to droop b) Harvest mature cereals or beans on a sunny day and place

on a mat, tarpaulin or in sacks. c) If rain delays the maize harvest, then prevent water from

entering the cobs by turning the cobs down.
d) As soon as possible, transport crops from field to the

homestead for further drying.

Dry the grain:

a) Dry cereals or beans on mats, tarpaulins or racks so they are not in contact with the ground and make sure farm animals are kept away, or use a maize drying crib for protected drying.
b) Don't let drying grain get wet, cover with a tarpaulin if it

c) Dry grain until it is sufficiently dry, for example cereal grains 13.5 per cent, beans 12per cent and maize 12.5 per cent

Shell/thresh the grain:

a) Use hands to shell beans or dehusk maize cobs. If any maize or beans are damaged then consume them, feed to animals or if unfit for consumption then destroy them, do not place in storage

b) Shell maize cobs by hand or with a mechanical sheller to reduce damage to grain. Don't beat with sticks.

c) Dry grain further if it is above the required moisture content.

Clean the grain:

a) Win now grain or use a sieve to remove chaff and foreign matter, and broken grain. Be careful to remove insect damaged grain, mouldy grain and chaff and dispose of it

Ensure good storage at home:

a) Put grain in sacks and sew them shut. In the house, store sacks on pallets of sticks or stones, away from walls. Check regularly for any problems. b) To store grain in bulk, place in a silo or other container and

follow instructions to prevent insect attack.

When the time comes, carefully transport maize to official maize buyers.

It takes Eswatini

The saddest thing to note is how people think once a sexual violence matter has been talked about, it can be swept under the carpet and be forgotten.

They think once a perpetrator has been talked to and he has asked for forgiveness, the criminality of his actions can be erased.

This is not the case.

The Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence Act of 2018 does not make allowance for community structures to decide on what to do in the event accusations against an alleged sexual offender become known.

The Act does not make provision for sexual offences to be 'tried' by any structure simply because they occurred within a certain area or chiefdom jurisdiction.

Instead, it makes it succinctly clear that all cases HAVE to be reported to the nearest police station.

Sexual violence which occurs within the church, work or even indlunkhulu do not give rise to the authorities of such places to play judge over them. As such, when a child is sexually violated by an uncle within the home, it is a criminal offence to sit and discuss how the 'matter' will be dealt with at the expense of reporting it to the police. All the people who partake in such a discussion should be arrested and charged along with the perpetrator.

Church leaders, in the same regard, are not allowed to counsel their congregants into accepting and forgiving their rapists and sexual assaulters while encouraging them not to involve the police. They are instead supposed to advise their congregants to report to the police and ensure that this occurs while offering the support and counselling from the church to the victims and ensuring that the perpetrator realises the wrong they have done.

At chiefdom level, there should be no committee set up to fine perpetrators of sexual violence unless these run parallel to a court process and are aimed at enforcing the protection of community members. Fining paedophiles for

rape is not acceptable and should be avoided at all costs. Even in the work place, the human resource department has no capacity to try criminal cases as sexual harassment is a crime denounced by the SODV Act. Just as it should occur within the community chiefdom level, sexual harassment, which occurs within the workplace has to be reported to the police since the Human Resource department is secondary and their outlook bears no bearing on the resultant court case, in the event criminality indeed occurred.

It is therefore very disheartening to note how families and friends of perpetrators are quick to stand up and find them not guilty to the extent of voicing their opinions, invaliding a survivor's harrowing experience. Everyone has various different facets which they choose to show people at any time.

Criminals

Some of the worst criminals are very loving to their own families, in the same manner that most rapists and gender-based violence perpetrators show a kind and compassionate face to the outside world.

The only time that a complainant's allegations can be invalidated is after thorough and unbiased investigations, then opinions on the matter can hold water. In the absence of this first step, invalidating a sexual violence victim's experience is tantamount to continuing the sexual abuse. It is in this regard that the family of the Inyanga who committed suicide after being

accused of having not only raped, but also impregnating a child years ago, should only base their misgivings on the law process. Invalidating the survivor's allegations that the Inyanga impregnated her without allowing the police to investigate in full is accusing the now young woman of having a hand in driving the old man to suicide. Their pain is understandable after such a loss, however they should recall that there is a young child involved who has, most probably, over the years been asking about his father's identity causing the mother to relive her horrid experience at each turn.

By throwing doubt over her experience, they are in fact accusing her of lying while vehemently defending their deceased brother of a worse crime.

In the same vein, It Takes Eswatini to End Sexual Violence Against Children, would like to take this time to commend the anonymous whistle-blowers who did not stand by and go about their day-to-day duties while a child was being sexually violated by a teacher.

Nearly two weeks ago, a member of the community took the initiative and called the police after noting how a 15-year-old pupil was suspiciously visiting a male teacher. Taking matters into his or hands called for this concerned member of the community to realise that nothing good could come from such a private visit and the perpetrating teacher was arrested. It is such action by community members, which will curb violation of children which has over the years happened with impunity.

It calls for community members to be vigilant and not allow perpetrators to go about their destruction comfortably. We also commend the police who took prompt action and caught the paedophile It is now up to the Directorate of Public Prosecutions to ensure that such perpetrators get convicted for the damage they do to the nation.

It takes all of us.



ONDON - The EU appeared to try and scupper Boris Johnson's efforts to secure a Brexit deal last night by leaking a memo slamming his latest proposals for the Irish backstop.

However within hours of the news breaking, the UK government hit back insisting the ideas are 'serious and workable' and that leaks from Brussels 'are par for the course.

President Jean-Claude Juncker earlier confirmed to Sky News' Sophy Ridge that he had been sent documents by the Prime Minister outlining ideas for a new deal.

Document

However, documents obtained by Sky suggested the EU believes the proposals did not offer legally operational solutions' to the backstop issue and 'fall short of satisfying all the objectives'

The memo - shared with the EU 27 - added that the draft failed to:

Avoid a hard border on the island of Ireland

Protect the all-island economy and north-south cooperation

Preserve the integrity of the single market and Ireland's place

European penpushers were also said to have described

the proposals as a "backward step", reports the Telegraph.

However, a government source told Sky: "The ideas that we've put forward to avoid a hard border are serious and workable.

"As for the Commission, two months ago they said we couldn't reopen the withdrawal agreement and there was absolutely no alternative to the backstop. Now we are having detailed dis-

watch by them. What we're focused on is actually getting a deal in the room. We trust they'll do the same.'

While the documents are not legally operable, the government has said it wants to use them to develop talks.

They included a list of options the Government thinks it is worth discussing, including papers on food standards, manufactured goods and customs.

Trump slams claims he pressured Ukraine to probe Joe Biden's son a former comedian who assumed office in May.

ASHINGTON - US President Donald Trump has denied a whistle-blower's claim of wrongdoing in a call with a foreign leader, amid reports he pressured Ukraine's president to investigate the son of Democratic political rival Joe Biden, who demanded the transcript of the call released immediately.

The whistle-blower's complaint has triggered a tense showdown between the US Congress, whose Democratic leaders are demanding the review of the complaint, and the executive branch which has barred them from doing so.

It has also raised concerns Trump sought to strong-arm Ukraine into providing damaging information on the president's possible 2020 challenger, which would represent dangerous foreign meddling in the US election similar to the interference blamed on Russia in 2016, when Trump defeated Democratic rival Hillary Clinton.

According to a report by The Washington Post, which cited two unnamed former US officials, the complaint stemmed from Trump's communications with Ukraine, and a "promise" allegedly made by the president.

Suspicions have focused on a July 25 call between Trump and Ukraine's President Volodymyr Zelensky,

Trump's Democratic opponents have been prob-

ing that call in connection with allegations Trump and his personal lawyer Rudy Giuliani tried to pressure the Ukrainian administration.

The Wall Street Journal meanwhile reported that Trump pressed Zelensky about eight times on the call to investigate possible corruption involving Biden's son Hunter, who worked with a Ukrainian natural gas company. Trump on Friday defended himself, angrily declaring that the "ridiculous" story came from a "partisan whistle-blower", even though he did not know the person's identity.

Trump insisted he had a "totally appropriate" conversation, without detailing with whom, or what was said. When asked by reporters whether he discussed the Bidens with Zelensky, Trump replied: "It doesn't matter what I discuss.

He did not deny having done so, but instead urged media to "look into" Biden's involvement in Ukraine, and his videotaped comments last year in which the ex-US vice president said the former President Barack Obama's administration would freeze \$1bn in US loan guarantees, unless Kiev did not fire its top prosecutor.

US is sending troops to Saudi Arabia

IYADH - The United States will send additional troops to Saudi Arabia and the United Arab Emirates to beef up security, following last weekend's attack on oil fields in Saudi Arabia.In a Friday evening press conference, Defence Secretary Mark Esper and Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff Gen. Joseph Dunford announced that "all indications are that Iran was responsible for the attacks.

They explained that the US is responding with a 'moderate deployment' of additional forces .Dunford said that it was 'fair to say' this deployment would not involve thousands of troops.

"We haven't decided on specific units," the general told reporters. He explained that the US is providing capabilities to enhance air and missile defense.

Last Saturday, Saudi oil facilities were struck by drones and missiles in an attack that the US has blamed on Iran, a country that has also been blamed in recent months for mining oil tankers, pirating vessels, and shooting d o w

unmanned aircraft, among other hostile behav-

"Iran has increased its military activity through direct attacks and support to its proxies in the region," the secretary said Friday evening. The US has already ratcheted up sanctions against Iran, but now the US is strengthening its military pos-

Increase

The lastest troop increase follows the significant deployment this summer of strategic military assets to deter troubling Iranian behavior. Among the assets sent to the region were a carrier strike group, bomber and fighter squadrons, air defense systems, and ground troops.

While this past summer was characterised by a series of crises, one of which near-

ly brought the US and Iran into armed conflict, tensions have not been running as hot in recent weeks.

'US sanctions target Iranians access to food, medicine'

UBAI - Iran's foreign minister yesterday denounced renewed US sanctions against its central bank as an attempt to deny ordinary Iranians access to food and medicine, and said the move was a sign of US desperation. The United States on Friday imposed a new round of sanctions on Iran, some aimed at its central bank and sovereign wealth fund, following attacks on oil facilities in Saudi Arabia that Riyadh and US officials have blamed on Iran.

Iran denies involvement in the attacks, which initially halved oil output from Saudi Arabia. Responsibility was claimed by Yemen's Houthi movement, an Iranian-aligned group fighting a Saudi-led alliance in Yemen's civil war.

This is a sign of US desperation ... When they repeatedly sanction the same institution, this means their attempt at bringing the Iranian nation to its

knees under 'maximum pressure' has failed," Foreign Minister Mohammad Javad Zarif told reporters in remarks shown on state television.

Blocking

"But this is dangerous and unacceptable as an attempt at blocking ... the Iranian people's access to food and medicine," Zarif said, speaking after arriving in New York for the annual U.N. General Assembly next week.

Meanwhile, there were reports on social media that a number of Iranian servers and websites including those of some petrochemical firms were under a cyber-attack. There was no immediate official comment, and the websites of the main state oil company NIOC appeared to be functioning normally. Residents said their internet access was not affected.

Moscow frees actor convicted in protests

MOSCOW - Pavel Ustinov, a 23-year-old actor, will be freed - at least temporarily - after his conviction over an opposition protest sparked public outcry, a Moscow court ruled. Ustinov was convicted on Monday of dislocating a security officer's shoulder during his arrest at an August 3 rally in Moscow where demonstrators demanded free and fair elections. He denied the charges, and the conviction sparked a major solidarity campaign, with hundreds of supporters, from film stars to teachers to priests, staging further protests against President Vladimir Putin's administration. Ustinov's family thanked all those who helped win her son's release on Friday."This is a victory of all of us," his mother, Tatyana Ustinova, told reporters. "I think we will win." Reuters

'Brexit stance behind effort to oust me'

LONDON - The deputy leader of Britain's main opposition Labour Party said yesterday that his stance on Brexit, where he backs a second referendum before a parliamentary election, unlike leader Jeremy Corbyn, is behind efforts by some in the party to remove him. At a meeting of Labour's National Executive Committee on Friday, Jon Lansman, the founder of the left-wing grassroots movement Momentum, proposed a motion to abolish the post of deputy leader, citing disloyalty over Brexit, according to two party officials.

The chair ruled that the motion should be thrown out and members then voted 17 to 10 to overturn that decision, just short of the two-thirds majority they needed, the officials said.

Iran to destroy country attacks Islamic Republic

TEHRAN - The commander of Iran's Revolutionary Guards has warned that any country that attacks the Islamic republic will see its territory turn into the conflict's 'main battlefield'. Guards commander Hossein Salami told a news conference in Tehran: "Whoever wants their land to become the main battlefield, go ahead." We will never allow any war to encroach upon Iran's territory. We hope that they don't make a strategic mistake as they have before, Salami said, before listing past US military 'adventures' against Iran. Salami was speaking at Tehran's Islamic Revolution and Holy Defence museum during the unveiling of an exhibition of what Iran says are US and other drones captured in its territory.

Non-marital sex ban delayed by president

JAKARTA - Indonesian President Joko Widodo on Friday called for a delay in passing a new law that would outlaw gay and pre-marital sex after the controversial plan sparked a public outcry.

The proposed criminal code overhaul should get a closer look given the backlash, Widodo said, as he asked that Parliament scrap a planned vote on the revisions before its session ends next week.

The mooted changes could affect millions in the world's biggest Muslim majority country, including gay and heterosexual couples who might face jail for having sex outside wedlock, or having an affair.

On Friday, the Australian embassy in Jakarta issued a fresh travel advisory for Indonesia, warning that the legislation could put unmarried foreign tourists in the crosshairs. Daily Mail

Thousands take to Egypt's streets demanding resignation of Presiden

AIRO - Thousands of prodemocracy protesters marched in cities across Egypt on Friday, demanding the resignation of President Abdel Fattah el-Sisi.

Videos posted on social media showed demonstrators chanting "rise up, fear not, Sisi must go" and "the people demand the regime's fall" late on Friday.

Protests were reported in the capital Cairo, the second-biggest city of Alexandria and Suez.

Officers in civilian uniforms confronted the demonstrators who tried approaching Cairo's Tahrir Square, where mass protests started in 2011 which toppled Hosni Mubarak.

Al Jazeera is banned from reporting from inside Egypt, but there were several reports of arrests made in the capital, and tear gas being used on demon-

The demonstrations came after selfexiled Egyptian businessman and actor Mohamed Ali accused President el-Sisi of corruption and called on people to were gaining momentum, Ali encourtake to the streets and demand the leader be removed. El-Sisi has dismissed the allegations as "lies"

"If el-Sisi does not announce his resignation by Thursday, then the Egyptian people will come out to the squares on Friday in protest," Ali said in a video posted on Posting



ZIM'S 'WITCH-HUNT' **AGAINST OPPONENTS**

ARARE - On September 8, Zimbabwean union activist Dr Peter Magombeyi claimed he was receiving "death threats". Six days later he disappeared. His last WhatsApp message said: "I have been kidnapped by three men." Magombeyi was found on Thursday night, 30km from the capital Harare.

He was alive and deeply traumatised. Around 50 political opponents and unionists have been abducted in Zimbabwe this year. According to Amnesty International, they are victims of a "systematic and brutal crackdown on human rights" by the

Hundreds of medics took to the streets this week to demand the authorities investigate Magombeyi's disappearance.

"No Peter, no work," chanted the crowds. They accused security forces of kidnapping their colleague for heading the Zimbabwe Hospital Doctors Association (ZHDA).

The pressure paid off.

Magombeyi appeared "disoriented", said a ZHDA member after he was found, adding that the 26-year old would be examined to determine whether he had been tortured.

Statement

Since Zimbabwean President Emmerson Mnangagwa came to power in 2017, the regime has "resorted to the same brutal tactics" used by his predecessor Robert Mugabe to "clampdown on human rights," said Amnesty in a statement last month.

Magombeyi had launched a strike earlier this month to demand their salaries be pegged to the US dollar in the face of spiralling living costs.

'I live in the trenches'

Within a year, the value of their pay had fallen 15-fold due to hyperinflation and the collapse of the local currency.

"I live in the trenches," Magombeyi told AFP during an interview before he went missing.

Thousands protest in Algiers despite tight security

LGIERS - Thousands of protesters took to the streets of the Algerian capital on Friday in defiance of a heavy security presence to demand the ouster of the country's army

Demonstrators gathered near the capital's main post office square, the epicentre of Algeria's protest movement that forced longtime president Abdelaziz Bouteflika to step down in April, this time calling for the ouster of General Ahmed

"The people want the fall of Gaid Salah," the strongman in post-Bouteflika Algeria, they chanted. "Take us all to prison, the people will not stop."

Friday's protest marked Algeria's 31st consecutive week of rallies, but protesters faced a heavy deployment of security forces in the city centre and along its main avenues. Salah on Wednesday ordered police to block protesters from outside Algiers entering the capital to boost numbers at the anti-regime rallies.

The tougher line on protests came just

Central bank tightens rules for currency exchanges

HARARE - Zimbabwe's central bank has tightened the rules governing the trade of foreign currency by money exchange offices with immediate effect. The rates offered by exchange offices must be 7 per cent above or below the interbank mid-rate, the central bank said in an emailed statement. Failure to comply would result in either heavy financial penalties or license revocation, it said. The Southern African nation has 200 licensed exchange outlets. Since a parity peg to the US dollar was dropped in February, the local currency has slumped to 14.43 to the dollar, making it the world's worst performer. It's even weaker on the parallel market at 20.3 versus the US currency.

The All Blacks showed renewed vigour and troubled the Boks with their expansive game, scoring two quickfire tries via winger George Bridge and lock Scott Barrett.

Suddenly, the scoreline read 17-3 in New Zealand's favour and it looked a long way back for South Africa.

But the Springboks slowly regained their composure and fought back gallantly in the second half.

In the 47th minute, flank Pieter-Steh du Toit barged over next to the posts after a concerted period of attack to reduce the deficit to seven points.


But Fury's win was in doubt from the third round after his vision was hampered following a hefty blow to his right eye with the Brit star sharing before and after pics of the gash. He was rushed to hospital after his fight - with his own dad fearing for his future, despite the boxer's insistence he will face Wilder again. It is believed a deal has already been agreed for Fury to rematch Wilder in February after their controversial draw in December last year.

TAKE THE TIME TO HEAL

Despite being knocked down twice, including a brutal one on the 12th round, many believed Fury should have got the decision from the judges and not the draw that was given.

Now Ward, speaking on the Max On Boxing YouTube channel, has suggested that the fight should be pushed back to ensure the 47-stitch gash above his right eye heals. On the rematch, 35-year-old Ward said: "Both guys feel like they got jobbed in the first fight.

Wilder feels like it wasn't a draw. Fury

feels like he eked it out. We don't want that kind of conversation after the rematch.

EYE COULD BE EVEN STRONGER

"Give the eye time to heal. Take a couple of extra months so we can give the fans, and the media what they want to see in the rematch."

He added: "It's never going to be the same, but it's going to be better.

"The scar tissue will have formed, and he won't have the softness and the redness around his eye that he would have if he tried to come back too soon, because we don't want any excuses." *AFP*

Liverpool paid settlement to City over scouting hack

ONDON - Liverpool paid Manchester City a £1 million settlement after their Premier League rivals complained their scouting system had been hacked, according to reports on Saturday.

The Times claimed the confidential agreement took place in September 2013 after City employed computer-espionage experts to see if the system had been spied on.

City were said to have alleged their login was used on the Scout7 system on a number of occasions by several Liverpool employ-

The settlement came a year after three former City scouts moved to Liverpool.

Two of them were alleged by City to have been involved in accessing their database on the Scout7 system, on hundreds of occasions over an eight-month period. The Premier League were reported to be unaware of the settlement at the time.

Zidane unfazed by Mourinho talk

ADRID - Real Madrid coach Zinedine Zidane says he is paying no attention to heavy criticism aimed at him after the 3-0 defeat by Paris St Germain in the Champions League and is not bothered that Spanish media continue to link Jose Mourinho with his job.

Real were up against an understrength PSG side on Wednesday missing Neymar, Edinson Cavani and Kylian Mbappe but produced a pitiful display, failing to register a shot on target in a Champions League game for the first time in 16 years.

"I'm not interested in what is said outside the club, the day I pay attention to what's in the press is the day I leave," Zidane told a news conference on Saturday ahead of Real's visit to early La Liga leaders Sevilla on Sunday.

"I feel in a strong position and I never give up. I will keep trying until the last minute and as long as the club will give me the chance to continue. I don't feel questioned at all."

Spanish media have reported that Real president Florentino Perez would be keen to recruit former coach Mourinho, who is currently without a club, should Zidane be relieved of his duties.

"I'm not bothered by the Mourinho speculation," added the French coach, who led Real to three consecutive Champions League titles before resigning in 2018, but has only won seven out of 16 games since returning to the club in March.

"This is how the situation is, and whenever the team has a bad result the impression is that everything needs to change. It's difficult but it's the reality.'

Real have taken eight points from four La Liga games while Sevilla top the standings with 10 after making a flying start under coach Julen Lopegetui, who was named as Zidane's successor at Real last year but was sacked in October.

In-form Leclerc pips Hamilton for 3rd straight F1 pole

¬ INGAPORE − Ferrari's Charles Leclerc stormed to his third straight Formula One pole position at the Singapore Grand Prix on Saturday and now aims to win again as he did in Belgium and Italy.

Leclerc posted 1 minute 36.217 seconds on the floodlit 5.063-kilometre Yas Marina street course to rank first on the grid for the fifth time this year. World champion Lewis Hamilton of Mercedes qualified 0.191 seconds behind, and Sebastian Vettel was third in the other Ferrari, 0.220 seconds off his team-mate Leclerc.

Saturday's session was smoother than that in Monza a fortnight ago, where many drivers failed to cross the line in time for a final flying lap.

Ferrari's pole and Vettel's third place came as a surprise as the team were expected to struggle on a course which didn't really favour them.

"We came here knowing it would be a difficult track for us," Leclerc said "It was a very good lap, there were some moments when I thought I had lost the car."The Monegasque also praised his team after his car had gearbox problems in the first practice session on

"The team has done an amazing job and I'm extremely happy to be on pole. We had a very tough Friday, yester-



day was not my day, but I worked hard ahead of team-mate Valtteri Bottas in the car and it paid off today," he after 14 of 21 season races as he is firmsaid.

Hamilton, a four-time winner in Singapore, admitted: "I don't know where Ferrari picked up their pace because this is not known to be one of their tracks, but they did a great job.

AGUERO TOPS ROONEY IN EPL GOALSCORING CHARTS

ANCHESTER - Sergio Aguero has broken a record jointly held by Wayne Rooney to become the first man to score in each of the opening six games of a Premier League season, for Manchester City.

The Argentine was on song against Watford as he finished from the penalty spot seven minutes in to double his side's lead against the Hornets at the Etihad Stadium on Saturday.

Aguero, the all-time highest scorer for Pep Guardiola's side, converted after Riyad Mahrez was fouled by Ben Foster, to make it six consecutive top-flight appearances this season where he has found the back of the net.

It represented his second penalty of the year too, following a similar effort in City's opening game of the season against West Ham, in which the 31-year-old added some further gloss

to a 5-0 scoreline. Since then, he has scored against Tottenham, Bournemouth, Brighton and Norwich, nabbing a brace against both the Cherries and the Seagulls. However, in two instances, against Spurs and the Canaries, he was unable to salvage dropped points for

the champions. Aguero's finish against the Hornets means that he takes the previous crown from both former Manchester United forward Rooney and Arsenal's Jose Anto-

Both men previously scored in the opening five games of a Premier League season, with former England captain Rooney finding the net in victories against West Bromwich Albion, Tottenham, Arsenal, Bolton Wanderers and Chelsea in 2011, before he saw his run curtailed by a hamstring injury that ruled him out of a draw with Stoke City.

Former Real Madrid star Reyes, who was a member of the Gunners' much-vaunted Invincibles, got himself on the scoresheet five times on the

trot in 2004, against Everton, Middlesbrough, Blackburn Rovers, Norwich and Fulham, before drawing a blank in a 2-2 encounter with Bolton.

With both enjoying perfect records in their five opening wins, Aguero cannot lay claim to having enjoyed such similar results, but his major haul nonetheless elevates him beyond excellent company once

Both Rooney and Reyes went on to enjoy the most prolific goalscoring seasons of their careers.




