## ESWATINI NEEDS E2.2 BN FOR RENEWABLE ENERGY - KING

**THE Kingdom of Eswatini will need more than an estimated E2.2 billion (US\$150 million) to roll out her renewable energy's long term strategic plan.**

This would cater for only part of several other climate change initiatives that the country has embarked upon that require funding.

This was disclosed by His Majesty King Mswati III at the United Nations Climate Action Summit on Monday afternoon. Eswatini was one of a few countries selected to present on their countries' climate action programmes under the theme: 'A race we can win, a race we must win.' The King was asked to intervene on 'cutting GHG emissions now with cooling and energy efficiency.' He said the country had developed national energy strategic plans for proper and adequate development of its renewable capacity and energy efficient systems.

"By 2030, we envisage that more than 90 per cent of our population will have access to electricity through vigorous renewable energy generation systems," he said.

He told the gathering that the country had managed to increase access to electricity for the rural population by up to about 70 per cent.

"The kingdom plans to increase its renewable energy production to acceptable levels of its mix by 2030."

He said this would be coupled with an increase in efficient systems to ensure total access for all citizens. He further explained that almost 25 per cent of energy needs in Eswatini came from hydro power, which is highly impacted by climate change.

"The country wishes, therefore, to strengthen its ability to harness energy from the sun with appro-

priate support for capacity building and technology," he said.

He added that the private sector was also playing its role in emission reduction by adopting a new approach through solely using natural components that have zero global warming and no ozone depleting potential.

### Impact

His Majesty the King said for the climate change agenda to have an impact, there was a need for developed and developing countries to join hands in this endeavour.

He urged all developed countries to honour their commitments under the Paris Agreement towards the Green Climate Fund.

"We do believe that with the necessary commitments, the Green Climate Fund could emulate the successes of initiatives such as the Global Fund, that is addressing health issues- particularly HIV and AIDS," he said.

Through this fund, he noted, countries could tap into the necessary resources to successfully mitigate against climate change.

His Majesty the King highlighted that low carbon economic development pathways recognised that climate actions should not undermine national efforts to eradicate poverty and the advancement of its implementation of the 2030 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

He raised concern that globally, emissions continue to grow unabated and the growth of adaptation needs was higher than ever.

"Over the years it has gained recognition and prominence to be comprehensively implemented. At the same time, finance, technology and capacity building also need to be addressed as critical components to provide incentives for climate action by developing countries," he emphasised.

## What strike? Public oblivious

**WITH the much hyped PSAs strike action currently underway, members of the general public in Mbabane were oblivious and unmoved as of yesterday.**

A number of people interviewed said they were not aware of the strike and were not that much worried as they were normally not affected by strike actions.

An MTN Eswatini street vendor, who commented on condition of anonymity said they have heard about the strike, which was to start on Monday but were surprised as they did not see anything.

"Maybe it could be that I sit at the same spot all day, but I did not notice anything and it was a normal day today

(yesterday) and Monday," she said. She, however, noted that she would observe the situation today, but was not worried as the protestors never bothered them in previous strikes.

### Abnormal

She also mentioned that her children did not report anything abnormal that took place in their school as they went on with their usual class routines and teachers were present.

Another vendor Siphwayinkhosi Msibi also concurred and stated that there was not much out of the ordinary that was happening. He said usually they were not concerned with strike as it had nothing to do with them.

"The only problem I have observed from previous strikes is that we were normally affected in cases of violence erupting between the police and the pro-

testors, where they would vandalise stalls," he said.

Msibi mentioned that he was hoping that today the march would be as peaceful as possible because any form of violence affected their businesses greatly.

Make Ndlovu said according to her knowledge, such marches were peaceful and did not have much of an impact on them.

She said with the current strike she have not yet witnessed any issues, was business as usual since Monday.

She also stated that upon an enquiry, her children who are enrolled at Mater Dolorosa High School said the situation was normal at their school.

She, however, stated that she was worried about what would happen today and was concerned, especially about the safety of her children as they used public transport on their way to and from school.

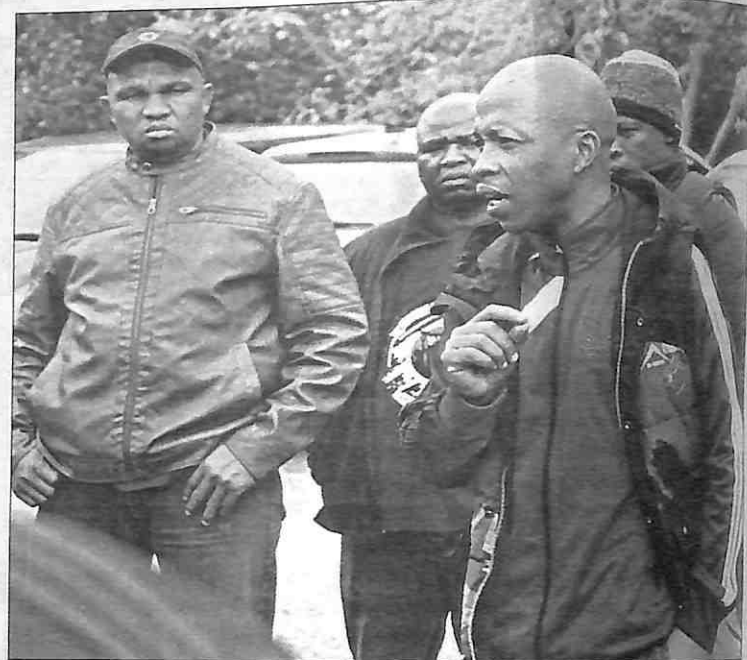
## Liquor outlets expect to make a killing

**LIQUOR outlets around the capital city are expecting to cash in on the strike.**

Interviews conducted around the outlets located in the vicinity of the CBD revealed that they usually enjoyed more profits during strikes, as protestors frequented them in the search for the much-needed fuel in the form of their favourite alcoholic beverages. An operator of an establishment located near the bus rank said for them, days like today were more profitable as a majority of protestors did not want to strike while in their sober senses, which resulted in more money for them.

Another operator said PSAs' strikes were much better compared to student strikes.

"I prefer it when the strikes are for adults, as they know what they are doing and do not bother us much unlike students who usually resort to vandalism," he said. He also stated that strikes were usually good for business and was looking forward to today's march.

## Mixed reactions with regards to strike for Mbabane schools

**WITH the ongoing Public Sector Associations (PSAs) industrial action, schools around Mbabane are seemingly unaffected.**

On Monday, PSAs embarked on what they themed an unending strike until they got what they wanted.

The strike was expected to have a massive effect on the education sector, as teachers were expected to down tools.

However, information gathered from some schools around Mbabane yesterday revealed that the strike action did not make much of an impact as most schools were operating as normal since Monday. One of the schools that was paid a visit was Ka-Boyce High School, where everything was normal within pupils in their classrooms learning and teachers were going about their daily duties.

A teacher who commented on condition of anonymity said since the begin-

ning of the strike, there have been no difficulties encountered at the school, as they went about their daily duties and classes were going on as usual.

He said with regards to today, they expected to continue as usual and in case anything happened, they would wait for communication from the school administration.

"We have been complying with signing the forms as requested by the ministry.

"If anything were to change, the school's authorities will inform us through the relevant channels," said the teacher. Ka-Boyce High Principal Lungelo Nhlengethwa said it was business as usual and lessons were continuing as expected. He mentioned that teachers at the school were not involved in the strike action and there were no interruptions to proceedings as of yesterday.

Nhlengethwa mentioned the police conducted random patrols at least twice a day since the beginning of the strike, which he commended as it guaranteed the safety of both the pupils and the teachers. St

Francis High School principal could not be reached for comment as it was stated that she had a busy schedule yesterday.

On observation, the situation also seemed normal as pupils were in their classrooms and teachers were also in attendance. The same could not be said for St Mark's High School where the Principal Zanele Zwane said the situation was far from normal, as some of the teachers were engaged in the strike. She mentioned that the teachers who were present were signing the forms and those who wished to engage in the strike were free to do so.

Zwane also confirmed that since yesterday, the police had been visiting the school conducting patrols.

"Teachers who were willing to partake in the strike were free to do so, as it was their right.

"It is safe to mention that some of the teachers have not been present, which provided a bit of a challenge as some classes could not go ahead as usual," she said.

She said with regards to today, they would assess the situation and react accordingly to it.

# PSAs THREATEN TO FORCE WORKERS TO JOIN STRIKE

**THE Public Sector Associations (PSAs) have accepted that their first day of the strike action was a flop.**

As a result the PSAs are now planning for possible ways to force workers to take part in the strike, especially for the mother of all demonstrations taking place today in the capital, Mbabane.

The civil servants stated at the High Court premises yesterday that they were disappointed on what happened on Monday because there were some workers that were at work, while others were out on strike.

TUCOSWA Deputy Secretary General Muzi Mhlanga said it was a pity because the workers who were at work would also benefit when they got the Cost of Living Adjustment (CoLA) from government.

National Public Servants and Allied Workers Union (NAPSAWU) President Oscar Nkambule also stated that civil servants were at work. Mhlanga said the problem with

Emaswati was fear. He said Emaswati feared almost anything and everything.

That, according to Mhlanga, had

to change if Emaswati wanted to achieve something. He said the people of countries such as France and Hong Kong were able to protest

against feared regimes to state their grievances, but Emaswati were afraid to face a more lenient regime. He called for change in doing things from Emaswati.

Swaziland National Association of Government Accounting Personnel (SNAGAP) Deputy President Moses Tsabedze said it was also the same case among the government accountants.

He said on Monday, he was surprised to find that his colleagues were working.

When he arrived in the office, he was told by his human resources officer that he had to fill in a certain form to show that he was present.

When he enquired about the form, Tsabedze said he was told that they had to fill up the forms, as per the instructions of Accountant General Dumisile Ngwenya.

Tsabedze said he told the human resources officer that he would not fill the form because it was illegal.

"I asked some of my colleagues if they filled the forms, they told me that they did so because they were afraid of the consequences, if they did not fill the forms," Tsabedze said.

## GOVT WARNS PSAs; DON'T DARE

**GOVERNMENT has reiterated its call for Public Sector Associations (PSAs) to respect the freedoms and dignity of fellow public servants who have chosen not to participate in the futile strike action.**

Reacting to the PSAs call to force fellow members to participate in the strike action, Government Spokesperson Percy Simelane last night said: "Civil servants, including teachers who have exercised their right of choice and continued to work will continue to enjoy protection from the state's law enforcement agents. Any attempt to infringe on their rights will be matched pound for pound by law.

"We can only hope it is not true that those who have elected to go on strike now want to impose themselves on those who have chosen to continue working.

### Dignity

"The freedom and dignity of civil servants who are not on strike must be respected. To choose is a fundamental human right," Simelane said.

On Monday, Minister of Public Service Christian Ntshangase said the strike action will not achieve anything, because government is maintaining the position that it cannot afford to offer anything beyond the three per cent once off Cost of Living Adjustment (CoLA) being put forward.

He likened the strike action to an operation where the doctors would claim the operation was successful but the patient died.

"Government is not bluffing when it says it does not have the money being demanded by the workers and it needs them to focus on the job at hand to revive the economy and then be paid what they want," the minister said.

He appealed to workers to go back to their work stations and focus on turning the economic situation around.

## TUCOSWA to inform ILO on union bashing

**THE Trade Union Congress of Swaziland (TUCOSWA) wants to inform ILO about the union bashing that is going on in Eswatini.**

ILO is the International Labour Organisation, which protects interests of workers among countries that are member states of the United Nations. TUCOSWA is preparing the document so that it is deliberated on during the International Labour Conference (ILC) in

June next year.

TUCOSWA Deputy Secretary General Muzi Mhlanga said the issue of union bashing was among many issues that they were addressing on the document. Mhlanga said the problem was that the country was institutionalising labour brokering because it was practised by big companies like Montigny Investments and other big companies in the hospitality industry. Mhlanga said labour bro-

kering firms went around telling people that there would be job losses they were closed down. The deputy secretary said it was not true that people were going to lose jobs because labour brokers did not create jobs, but they simply acted as middlemen between the employer and employee. He said there was no value that was added by the middlemen and they had to be removed because they negatively affected workers.

## SNAT, TSC case postponed to Oct 17

**THE case between Teaching Service Commission (TSC) and Swaziland National Association of Teachers (SNAT) has been postponed to October 17.**

This is the matter where SNAT is challenging the occupation of the TSC chairmanship by Simanga Mamba. SNAT argues that Mamba has been illegally occupying the position.

The decision to postpone the matter was taken yesterday by High Court Judge Nkosinathi Maseko, who was presiding over the case. Judge Maseko took the decision to postpone the case after he made an agreement to do so with Assistant Attorney General Mbuso Simelane, who represented the TSC and Senior lawyer, Lucky Howe, who represented SNAT.

The case was postponed because it was discovered that Simelane filed in a new supporting affidavit the form of a gazette that

supported the appointment of TSC Chairman Simanga Mamba. It transpired that Howe needed some time to prepare his responses in relation to the gazette. This was something that did not sit well with Simelane, who pleaded with Maseko to have the case continue because he was instructed that the case be done yesterday.

However, Judge Maseko would hear none of that and stated that what was done by Simelane was unfair as Howe needed time to respond to the gazette.

The case was attended mostly by members of SNAT and other PSAs like National Public Service and Allied Workers Union (NAPSAWU) and Swaziland Democratic Nurses Union (SWADNU).

Members of other political formations were also in attendance at the High Court.

Outside the High Court build-

ing, SNAT President Mbongwa Dlamini thanked all members of SNAT and other PSAs for attending the court case. He briefed the members of what was happening and told them that the case was postponed to October 17.

Dlamini stated that what was happening was surprising and interesting because the new documents applied in court showed how desperate the government wanted Mamba to remain at the TSC.

He said what was also surprising was that the TSC continued working as if everything was normal and allocated cases that were supposed to be tried by the commission.

Adding, it was clear that Mamba was not just kept at the TSC for nothing, but was kept for specific tasks he was supposed to carry out. He did not want to mention the tasks he was talking about.

## Students blame government, UNESWA for scholarship cuts

**UNESWA students have shown solidarity and consideration for their peers who did not make the cut in the scholarship grants.**

On Monday over 800 UNESWA students were left distraught and dejected as they received the sad news of not being granted scholarships from government although they were already enrolled at the university.

Reports were to the effect that some students even fainted as they were affected by the sad news.

The Swaziland National Union of Students (SNUS) President Mlamuli Gumedze expressed discontent regarding the situation. He said first and foremost the list was supposed to be released before lecture day one, yet it only comes on week seven. He stated the list once again left behind a number of Swazi students who were deserving to be awarded.

"The university, out of 'courtesy', registered all first years provisionally pending the release of the scholarship list. This simply means that those students who didn't make the list have to leave the university after six weeks of learning unless they pay 40 per cent of the tuition fee," he said. He said the mental torture the students have been subjected to will leave a dent that will last a lifetime. The endless call by students to give scholarship to all students has once again evidently fallen on deaf ears.

UNESWA Chief Electoral Officer Thuba Matsenjwa said as the electoral commission, they were saddened by this development. He said if there was anything they could do they would.

He said there has been irresponsibility from the university and the ministry of labour's part. "They should not have allowed the students to attend classes without issuing the list first. The reports we heard from yesterday were to the effect that some students were crying helplessly and some even fainted," he stated.

He said the students were disappointed as they had their hopes high. He mentioned they foresaw cases of depression and severe stress which could even escalate to suicides.

He stated they condemned the UNESWA for admitting 1 800 students whereas they knew that not all of them would get the scholarship.

He said they failed to do their job and exposed students to trauma as they had been attending classes with the hope of attaining the scholarship and were used to the university life yet now all their dreams have been shattered. He also said they urged the university to take responsibility and assist the students in any way they could to ensure they continued with their education.

University of Eswatini Registrar Dr. Salebona Simelane has encouraged students to keep looking for alternative funding.

He mentioned as an institution, they sympathised with the students who could not secure funding. He stated the institution and the students were aware that the resources would not be enough for all those who qualified to enrol at the institution.

He mentioned the students were informed when they were accepted that should they not be able to attain the scholarship from government, they should look for alternative sources of funds.

He also encouraged the students to not give up as they would be guaranteed enrolment upon receiving the funding at the institution.



## Judge Dlamini has pending matter against Observer

IN its heads of argument, the Swazi Observer further argued that the facts which rendered His Lordship Justice Phesheya Dlamini disqualified from sitting in the appeal are that he has a pending matter against the Swazi Observer.

The matter, according to the applicant relates to a lawsuit which His Lordship instituted against this newspaper claiming a sum of E5 million.

The newspaper defended the claim and the matter was brought for trial on June 12, 2017 and on the day of the trial the parties were called to the chambers of Judge Doris Tshabalala, who had been allocated the matter as she wanted to know if the matter would proceed.

### Trial

It was further argued that the Observer's legal representatives indicated that they were ready to proceed but those from Judge Dlamini's side indicated that they were not ready to proceed with the matter and requested a postponement, despite that they requested the hearing and were pushing the matter to go for trial.

Further, the Observer representatives, it has been argued, requested that costs should be tendered for the postponement, including costs of senior counsel and Her Ladyship

reserved her ruling on the question of costs and to date it has not been delivered as the matter was postponed to September 25 2017.

### Appeal

However, in August 2017 Judge Dlamini withdrew the action and tendered costs and it has been further argued that there is a dispute between the Observer and Judge Dlamini on the amount payable as costs and the judge's legal representatives tendered costs on a normal scale, which exclude the costs of counsel who was engaged based on set down of the matter.

"We submit that it was inappropriate for Judge Dlamini to sit in a matter involving the Swazi Observer whilst there was still an unresolved legal dispute between himself and the newspaper, His Lordship could not have been expected to be impartial in matters involving the Swazi Observer under the circumstances," argued the applicant.

Cited as authorities in the matter was a case of R v Bow Street Metropolitan Stipendiary Magistrate ex-parte, Pinochet Ugarte of 1999 where the House of Lords set aside a judgment in which one of the Judges Lord Hoffmann sat in an appeal where he indirectly had a connection with a litigant through charitable trust of that litigant.

# JUDGE PHESHEYA SHOULD HAVE RECUSED HIMSELF - OBSERVER

- Swazi Observer has filed a review appeal against Supreme Court judgment in the matter involving gospel artist Sipho Makhabane.

**SUPREME Court Judge Phesheya Dlamini should not have formed part of the bench which heard a matter between the Swazi Observer and gospel artist Sipho Makhabane since he is conflicted.**

This is an argument that has been raised by the newspaper's legal representatives in an application for review of the judgement of the Supreme Court.

The matter was yesterday before a full bench comprising Judge Robert Cloete, who was sitting with Acting Judges of the Supreme Court Judith Marry Currie, Sabelo Matsebula, Nkosinathi Manzini and Justice Mavuso.

The newspaper appeals for review on a matter in which the court made orders to the effect that the appeal by the Observer is dismissed, the cross-appeal is dismissed with costs to the appellants and the judgement of the High Court confirmed as it ruled in favour of Makhabane.

The review was brought by the Observer

legal representatives Magagula, Hlophe Attorneys in terms of Section 148 of the Constitution of the Kingdom of Eswatini conferred upon the Supreme Court review powers over its own decision. The applicant (the Observer) is seeking to review the judgment on the grounds that the hearing which resulted in the judgment being granted in favour of Makhabane was not a fair hearing as envisaged in terms of Section 21 of the Constitution. According

to the applicant in its heads of argument, this is more so because one of the judges who formed part of the panel, Justice Dlamini was conflicted and should not have sat in the appeal. The hearing according to the applicant violated the applicant's constitutionally protected right to a fair hearing as the applicant was subjected to unfair procedure, whereby a judge who was disqualified from sitting in the appeal did sit as he formed part of the panel that decided the appeal.

## PROCEEDINGS RENDERED A NULLITY

**ARGUING further in the matter, the applicant submitted that the mere fact that His Lordship sat in a matter in which he was disqualified rendered the proceedings a nullity.**

It was argued further that a litigant in the applicant's position would reasonably apprehend that Judge Dlamini would not be impartial in adjudicating the dispute as he would be expected to be biased against a newspaper that published what he considered defamatory material about him and that he is now required to pay the newspaper's legal costs.

"We submit that there is an overriding public interest that there should be confidence in the integrity of the administration of justice which is associated with the statement that it is a fundamental importance that justice, should not only be done but should manifestly and undoubtedly be seen to be done and that nothing is to be done which creates the suspicion that there has been an improper interference with the course of justice," submitted the applicant.

It was stated that the fact that Judge Dlamini sat in the hearing of an appeal when he had

an outstanding legal issue with the Observer was a denial of the applicant's right to a fair hearing, which is a constitutionally protected right which the Supreme Court has a duty to enforce.

He should not have sat in the appeal given that he had outstanding issues with the applicant, hence his sitting in the matter under the circumstances rendered the proceedings a nullity a the applicant's right to as fair hearing was denied. Judgement in the matter has been reserved by the Supreme Court to a date to be communicated to both parties.

## SNUS supports PSAs' strike

**MOTSHANE MP Robert Magongo demands that he be allowed to move a motion about Senate President Lindiwe Dlamini.**

Magongo made this demand known on Monday in the House of Assembly. He told Speaker Petros Mavimbela that he still remembered this motion and wanted to be given an opportunity to move it. "I still remember all the motions that I intend to move in the House. One of them includes MoMo Pay, where people lost their money," Magongo said.

In response, Mavimbela informed Magongo that what he did was out of order, but went on to tell him that the matter he was talking about was still being worked on by his office.

Magongo was further called to order by Gege MP Musa Kunene, in his capacity as Chief Whip in the House. Kunene said Magongo should approach the office of the speaker if he had a problem. It was not procedural to talk about such matters in the House.

In June this year, this newspaper reported about a motion that was expected to be moved in the House of Assembly, which would call upon an investigation to be launched into a competition run by an organisation known as the Bridge Foundation, which is said to belong to Senate President Lindiwe Dlamini.

Magongo, in the motion, is expected to be seconded by Gege MP Musa Kunene, the very MP that called him to order when he demanded the motion.

The two MPs wanted to call upon the House of Assembly to appoint a Parliament select committee, constituting of five MPs, to investigate and report back, within 21 days, on the circumstances surrounding a win-an-car competition run by a certain Bridge Foundation that sold raffle tickets through the Eswatini MTN Mobile Money platform.


This matter was reported in the local media back in January this year. The Bridge Foundation, which the MPs now want investigated, is said to have partnered with Kwazi Foundation.

In this arrangement, people were set to win a Ford Ranger Wildtrack, which was valued at E800 000. The name of


Senate President Lindiwe Dlamini was also reported to have featured prominently in the whole incident.

The Bridge Foundation is said to have entered into an agreement with MTN Eswatini to utilise the cellular network's mobile money (MoMo) platform to sell tickets to members of the public who would want to participate in the competition. The Bridge Foundation is said to have partnered with Kwazi Foundation to raise funds through the raffle draw, which the MPs now want to investigate.

# MTN Eswatini to reimburse customers

**MTN Eswatini will reimburse all its customers who were affected by the ongoing short-code outage.**

MTN Corporate Affairs Manager Mandla Lumphondvo said due to an unprecedented outage which predominantly affected the use of short-codes, MTN Eswatini is assessing the damage this did to customers with a view to reimburse them the different services they were trying to access with no success from Sunday into Monday

night.

The weekend was particularly affected with services accessed through short-codes \*686#, \*411# and \*101#. This means that MTN customers were unable to buy different kinds of bundles, which are a discounted offering in both data and voice services.

They were also unable to acquire the same services using MTN Mobile Money.

"The reimbursement that MTN Eswatini plans to make will be in the form of the different products and service that customers were denied during the short-code outage," he said.

Lumphondvo apologised for the inconvenience experienced by MTN's valued customers. He added that once the on-going assessment has been completed, a report will be compiled and the process to re-reimburse affected customers will start soon.

## Service

This followed after a two-day service interruption for MTN customers.

Following the service interruption, people had to pay extra to make phone calls as they could not purchase airtime. The service interruption went as far as affecting mobile money. The interruption continued from Sunday

till Monday.

Many people alleged that they were forced to purchase airtime and from that the company will be able to deduct their balances.

On Sunday, the service interruption started at around 1000 hours and it lasted for five hours.

Customers were unable to purchase data bundles, voice bundles and many other services that are provided by the short codes. The interruption affected many customers who are constant users of \*686# as many services of the network provider are found in that option. The company circulated messages

assuring its customers that technicians were working around the clock to resolve the issue. Meanwhile, Lumphondvo dismissed that the interruption was intentional. He said his company has its customers' best interests at heart and therefore would never cause any interruptions.

## Effected

The manager added that as a company, they have been greatly affected as they have lost huge revenue during the two days of service interruption.

Lumphondvo said the company was doing all they can to restore their services.

He further stated that they had brought in two international companies that specialise in telecommunications and network to assist them with restoring the short code services.

# I WAS NOT CHEERING ON PROTESTORS - MYENI

**NKILONGO Member of Parliament (MP) Timothy Myeni has vehemently denied that he cheered on protesters during the ongoing strike action on Monday in Manzini.**

Further, Myeni stated that he had nothing against the striking civil servants and wishes that they eventually got what they were fighting for once the government is financially stable. "I did not sing nor dance with the protesters," he said.

Myeni was pictured raising a clenched fist in a manner to suggest that he was allegedly supporting the marchers.

# Drunk man taps young woman's buttocks

**THE court has proposed that an inspection in loco be conducted to ascertain whether or not a 43-year-old man who is accused of tapping a young woman's buttocks in public indeed committed the offence.**

Makhosi Elliot Dlamini of Luyengo appeared before Manzini Senior Magistrate Simangele Mbatha yesterday on a charge of contravening the Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence Act of 2018.

The offence was allegedly committed on May 11, 2019 at Malkerns Shoprite situated at a location known as Sentra. When stating her side of the story, the complainant Bonakele Temlandvo Dlamini alleged that she was with a friend when she had an encounter with Dlamini.

She said when Dlamini approached her, the friend she was with had gone to the entrance of Shoprite store to meet some of her acquaintances. This was then that Dlamini

allegedly approached Bonakele and she did not pay much attention to him because she did not know him.

In a twinkling of an eye, the woman alleged that Dlamini tapped her on the buttocks twice and when she asked why he did so, his response was that he was going to beat her up. As he said this, Dlamini allegedly charged towards the young woman and she bolted.

## Report

Even so, Bonakele told the court that she was going to report him for what he did. It was also alleged that Dlamini was intoxicated when he committed the crime because he carried an alcoholic beverage bottles and staggered through the passage within the shopping complex.

While running away from Dlamini, Bonakele said she met a police officer with whom they returned to accost the accused person. Dlamini is said to have been at another store within the shopping complex at Malkerns. Luckily, the manager of the other retail store is said to have witnessed the bum-

tapping incident.

On the other hand, Dlamini denied ever touching the woman's buttocks, but claimed that he approached her because he mistook her for another woman who is his neighbour.

Dlamini said when he got to where Bonakele was he held her arm from the back, and not her buttocks as alleged. The accused person also claimed that he was in the company of two boys and the mother of his child when he approached the woman. "I approached you because I thought you were my neighbour and I needed some help with the shopping I had," he said.

In response to the allegation that he was drunk when committing the offence, Dlamini said he was not drunk but rather confused as he had lost his father.

Senior Magistrate Mbatha then postponed the matter in order to allow investigations to ascertain from the store's surveillance cameras whether Dlamini held Bonakele by her arm or he indeed tapped her buttocks. The matter was postponed to October 4, 2019.

# EEC disconnects power at Police Camp over E10m debt

**THE government's financial woes seem far from over as the Police Camp in Mbabane reportedly experienced a power outage due to huge sums of money owes to the Eswatini Electricity Company (EEC).**

This left the officers of the law in the dark recently. The Police Camp was without power for a couple of days due to the fact that government owes the Eswatini Electricity Company close to E10 million in electricity bills.

According to impeccable sources, the camp has been out of power for almost a week, as EEC was left with no choice but to disconnect the service, which left the occupants in the dark. When reached for comment, EEC's Corporate and Communications Manager Khaya Mavuso confirmed that there has been a power cut at the police camp due to government owing the utility company.

When asked how much government was owing EEC, Mavuso mentioned

that he was not able to disclose the amount due to client confidentiality.

"I cannot disclose the amount as this is information that is between the client and the company, but I can confirm that there was a power cut at the police camp," Mavuso said. Mavuso said they were working collaboratively with the Royal Eswatini Police Service in making sure that the bill is settled. He also stated that as a company, they were still hopeful that government will settle its debts and things would be back to normal at the police camp.

Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Superintendent Phindile Vilakati confirmed that power was disconnected at the police camp. She said the problem was for a couple of days and it was restored after government paid the utility company.

In light of all these, Vilakati added that the amount that is being owed to EEC is very huge, but she did not want to disclose how much exactly was being owed to the service provider. However, a source close to the matter confirmed that the figure was estimated to be about E10 million.

# 2 conned over E10 000 for UEDF jobs

**TWO job hunters saw their hopes for employment crashing down after a fraudster posing as an employment recruiter for the Umbutfo Eswatini Defence Force (UEDF) defrauded them of over E10 000.**

Masayina Lucky Metfula (50) of Kholwane has since been arrested and charged with two counts of the crime of theft by false pretences earlier this year.

## Bail

He has since been granted E5 000 bail by the court.

According to his charge sheet, Metfula was said to have approached his first victim Lindiwe Ginindza in 2018 in Mankayane, where he promised that he would assist Ginindza with obtaining employment within the UEDF, in exchange for

money amounting to E4 118, to which Ginindza paid.

Metfula was then said to have approached his next unsuspecting victim Zakhlele Dlamini in July 2019 near Siteki, under the guise that he would assist Dlamini to gain employment within the UEDF.

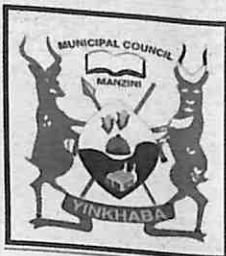
## Misrepresentation

Under this misrepresentation, Metfula was said to have obtained monies amounting to E6 045.

Through his misrepresentations, Metfula did knowing fully well that he would not assist Ginindza and Dlamini in obtaining employment, thereby committing the offence of theft by false pretences. The total amount of monies paid to Metfula under his guise as a recruiter of the UEDF was E10 163.

Metfula is set to make an appearance before the court on October 3, for the commencement of his trial.

## INVESTMENT IN GOOD CORPORATE GOVERNANCE

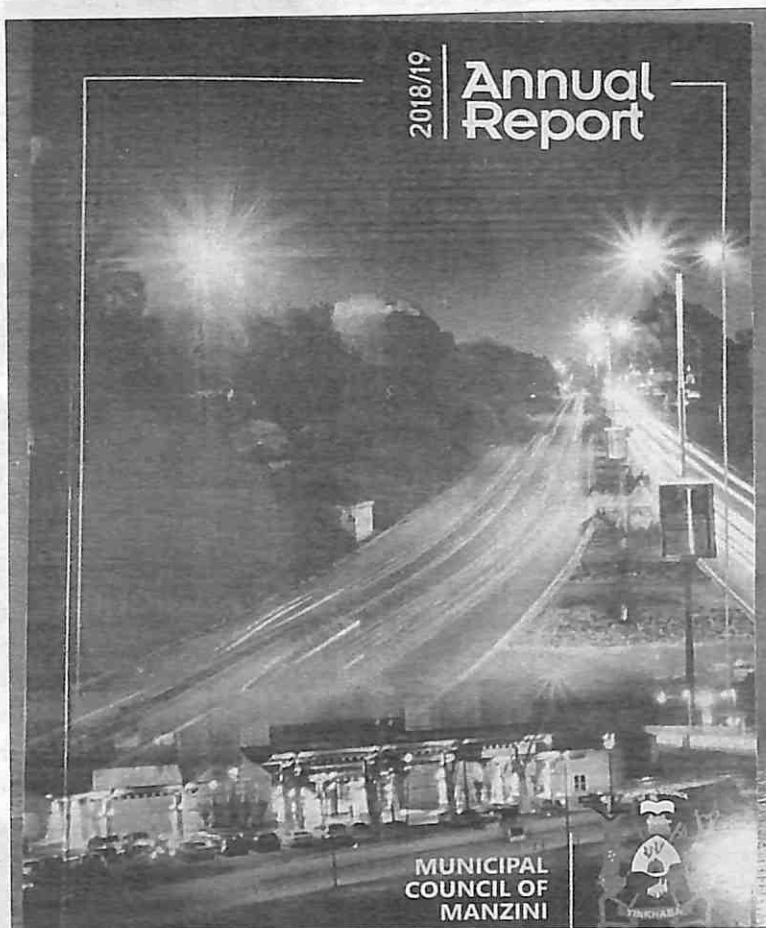
It can be reported that the Municipality managed to invest significantly in Good Corporate Governance trainings, leadership, procurement processes, risk management as well as legal compliance. The training sessions covered both Councillors and employees and the result was sustained order and stability within the organisation. It is worth-mentioning that this is an ongoing programme which seeks to empower Council personnel on best practices that can take the Municipality forward.

## PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

Through its public participation approach, the Municipality rolled-out stakeholder engagement initiatives that were aimed at ensuring the involvement of residents and stakeholders in decision-making towards increased development of the city. These platforms included the 24/7 Call Centre which provides an opportunity to collect service delivery feedback, budget consultation meetings and the Annual General Meeting. The organisation continued to disseminate developmental and service delivery information through the local mainstream media. Support platforms such as a bulk-SMS service and social media were incorporated as a means to widen the means of getting in touch with

customers, especially residents.

## QUALITY MANAGEMENT SYSTEM

In an effort to improve service delivery, the Municipality continued with the implementation of the Quality Management System (QMS).

During the 2018/2019 financial year, the Municipality was transitioning from the QMS ISO 9001:2008 to ISO 9001:2015 standard. Upon completion of the transition,

the Municipality was audited and certified to be ISO 9001:2015 compliant. The purpose of the quality management system is to support Council business processes by establishing performance standards that seek to improve service delivery in order to meet customer requirements.

## ORGANISATIONAL TURNAROUND

In an endeavour to turn the organisation around to a sustainable position, Council

continued to pursue the implementation of its Turn-Around Strategy (TAS). During the 2018/2019 financial year, the Municipality was restructured into four departments and four directors.

An organisational diagnosis was conducted wherein numerous reports were produced to inform the restructuring exercise. At the end of the financial year under review, the organisational transformation was still underway. Its overall objective is positioning of the Municipality for better service delivery and facilitation of sustainable development.

## INTEGRATED DEVELOPMENT PLANNING

The Municipality managed to facilitate commencement of the review and development of the Integrated Development Plan (IDP). It can be reported that a total 683 people were met during consultations that were rolled out within the 12 municipal wards and key stakeholder organisations. By the time of compiling this report, the IDP was still being developed. The purpose of the IDP is to guide the city's development within a five-year period.

## INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENT PLANNING

The 5-year Capital Investment Programme (CIP) came to an end during the 2018/2019 financial year and a new infrastructure plan was being developed at the time of the close of the financial year. The last set of roads infrastructure that was developed, either through rehabilitation or upgrading, as part of the 2018/19 CIP, included a number of roads in Zakhele and Ngwane Park townships.

## ROAD INFRASTRUCTURE MAINTENANCE

Due to the age of the city's roads as well as infrastructure upgrading backlog, the Municipality continued to facilitate for continuous infrastructure maintenance

throughout the city. With an increase in rainfall, as experienced during financial year 2018/19, the Municipality dedicated time and resources towards maintaining overgrowth and damaged infrastructure services; which intervention overstretched its limited resources.

## MUNICIPAL REVENUE

The Municipality's revenue base was not performing well during the 2018/2019 financial year, which situation had a negative effect on service delivery and general development of the city.

It is important for Manzini property owners to honour their rates payment obligation in order to enable the Municipality to provide quality services and facilitate development.

The Municipality's user fees/service charges continued to sit far below service costs; which compromised the quality of service delivered. However the Municipality will continue working on initiatives that seek to broaden its revenue base for sustainable development of the city.

## FOOD SAFETY AND SANITATION

A total of 170 food outlets in the city have been graded accordingly. During the 2018/2019 financial year, the Municipality managed to organise food-grading workshops as well as others that were specific to other food establishments.

The aim of the workshops was to sensitise food traders on hygienic practices and general safe handling of food that is intended for sale to members of the public. Food hygiene inspections were conducted in 556 food outlets.

Out of this number, 174 were found to be operating under unhygienic conditions and served with compliance notices. Council further conducted 500 inspections on non-food establishments wherein 292 were found to be unhygienic and served with compliance notices.

## ...MANZINI FLEA MARKET THIS SATURDAY

**THE Municipal Council of Manzini will this Saturday hold its next quarterly flea market.**

The activity will be held at the usual flea market site (Louw street, between Eswatini Bank and Bhunu Mall), starting at 8am. Those interested in selling products during the flea market are urged to come

to the Council offices tomorrow morning and register.

Registration begins at 9am and the registration fees are E250 for individual sole traders, E400 for Small and Medium Enterprises and E700 for companies and corporates. Members of the public are urged to visit the flea market site on Saturday

and support the traders. Exciting products are usually sold at reasonable prices during the flea market. Motorists are urged to bear with Council during this citizen economic empowerment exercise as the portion of the road that will be used for the flea market will be blocked from 6am until 5pm.

## Manzini property valuation still in progress

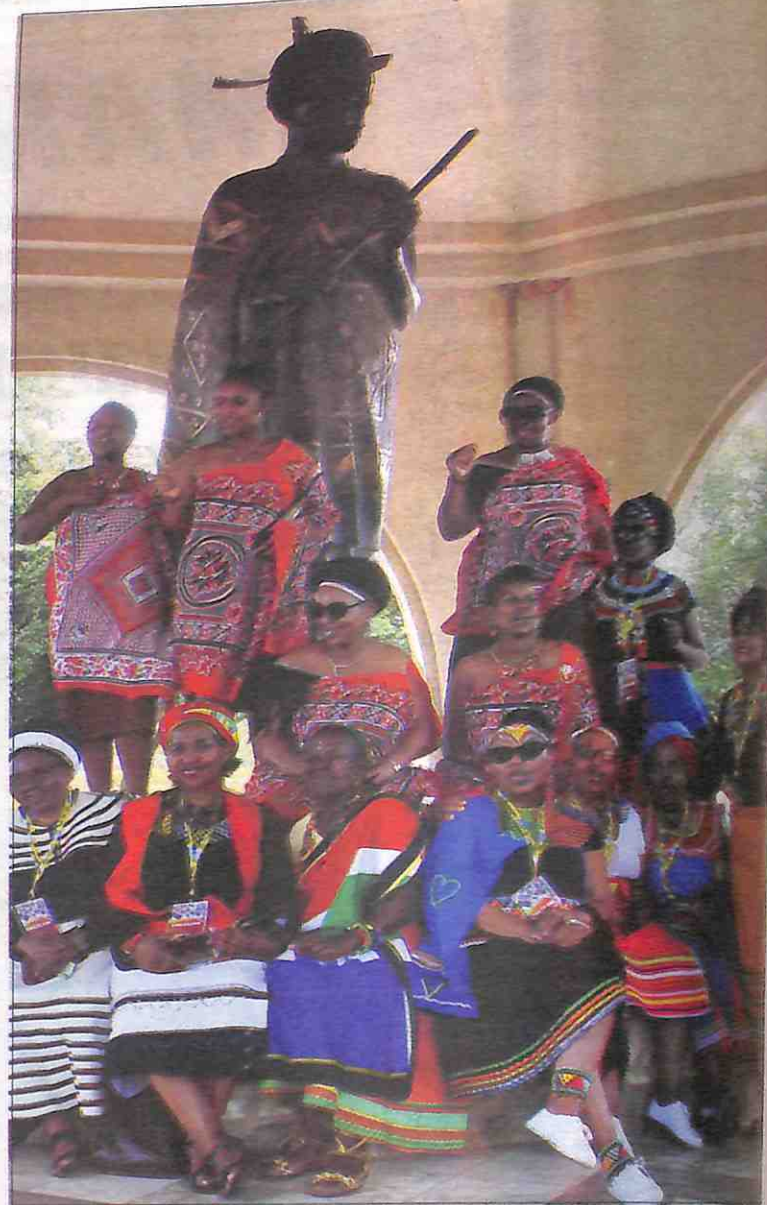

## Ramokgadi's memorial service on Friday

THE memorial of the deceased Kobe Advanced Learning Academy founder, Geoff Ramokgadi will be held on Friday at Greyhound Hall in Ezulwini, starting at 1100 hours.

The message was conveyed by Kobe Ramokgadi Advanced Learning Academy's Human Resources Manager Sabelo Dlamini yesterday. Dlamini said following the burial of Ramokgadi last Thursday in South Africa, locals will have their time to remember the deceased in a memorial service.

He explained that the reason the memorial service would be held after the funeral was because the late director belonged to the Jewish religion. According to the Jewish religion a person should be buried within 48 hours of death. However, because of the process of finalising paperwork he was buried last Thursday which was six days after his death.

The manager further stated that the memorial service will not be in the Jewish culture. Dlamini said the Jewish community had communicated that the memorial service would try to accommodate everyone who lived and shared life stories with the late.

"People will have a chance to remember him in the best way they

know how, hence the service will not be Jewish," said Dlamini.

Ramokgadi died on September 13 at around 1300 hours at the age of 66 after battling lung cancer for almost two years. He left behind his wife, three daughters and three sons.

Meanwhile, Jewish renowned photographer Jono David described him as someone who committed himself to advancing the education of local boys and girls, and his dream of building a school was conceived on the same day of the 1995 Great Kobe earthquake.

"This compassionate man named his school in the memory of the souls who perished that day — and later, he paid tribute to the victims of the Fukushima tsunami. For me, with my home in Japan, these Africa-Japan-Jewish connections were intriguing and inspiring," he said.

# Rains dampen striking ESRIC employees' spirits

WET weather put a dampener on the ongoing Eswatini Royal Insurance Company (ESRIC) strike, which saw protests subside since Monday.

Swaziland Union of Financial Institutions and Allied Workers (SUFIAW) Secretary General Jabu Shiba cleared assumptions that workers had given up on the on-going strike. She stated that employees had to be at home because of the rainy weather but the strike was still on-going.

In addition, the secretary general said at the moment they were finalising negotiations of staging a solidarity strike with the other financial institutions.

Furthermore, she highlighted that SUFIAW paid salaries of all the protesting employees. "I am pleased to announce that our members were paid their salaries, so the strike did not affect them financially," she said.

The strike by ESRIC workers is as a result of a breakdown in negotiations with the country's parastatal over a salary increase.

Following the deadlock between the Swaziland Union of Financial Institutions and Allied Workers (SUFIAW) and management the employers opted to down



tools. Shiba confirmed that the strike will not end anytime soon until the company changes its tune. She added that because ESRIC employees are not the only ones affected by the 0.0 per cent offer they have roped in other financial institutions. She mentioned that in as much they have brought other financial institutions on board in a solidarity action they will clearly scrutinise the conditions that will come with the strike.

She said workers should not down tools for nothing. "Serious results should be produced by the strike action," she said.

Despite the on-going strike some employees are working so that customers are not inconvenienced. However, services are not as smooth flowing as they should be as some employees remain on strike.

Speaking to one of the employees, who asked not be named for fear of victimi-

sation, not all the operations are moving as anticipated. He said some services which could be sorted in a day drag for some time as some work stations are empty.

In a press statement, ESRIC detailed the background to the issues leading to the strike, clearly outlining its position.

ESRIC stated that the bone of contention was that the union had the expectation of negotiating the outcomes of the review exercise which the company views as improper. The ESRIC management stated that it was their view that any sort of negotiation erodes the independence and objectivity of the exercise.

The company stated that it remained committed to resolving the dispute and making decisions that will promote the long term well-being of all its staff members and the sustainability of the business.

## Two fined E2 000 for impersonating cops

**BIZARRE** is what many may describe a case which saw two men impersonate and further 'arrest'

an unsuspecting woman.

Sabelo Mngometulu (27) and Zakhele Simelane (26) submitted a plea of guilty after they were arrested and charged with contravening the Police Service Act.

According to their charge sheet,

the 'police officers' were said to have contravened the Police Service Act when they were found to have, on September 20, 2019 near The Gables in Ezulwini, acted jointly and in the furtherance of a common purpose, when they wrongfully and

unlawfully introduced themselves as members of the Royal Eswatini Police Service to one Dumsile Malaza.

The charge sheet states that the duo, under the guise that they were officers stationed under the criminal investigation department, proceeded to arrest Malaza, thereby contravening the Act.

During their appearance before

Magistrate Lenhle Zulu on Saturday, the duo pleaded with the court to be lenient in their sentencing, as they were unemployed and were in their families.

After hearing their mitigation, the duo was sentenced to pay a fine of E2 000 and in default of payment, serve two years in prison.

## Man reprimanded for uttering explicit insults

**MAGISTRATE** Lenhle Zulu expressed her downright disgust at insults uttered by a 22-year-old man towards an elderly woman during a court session on Monday morning.

According to standard procedure during matters of *crimen injuria*, the charge sheet is read word for word by the court clerk, including vernacular insults expressed by the accused.

However, Magistrate Zulu pleaded with the court clerk to omit the expletives stated in Bongani Gama's charge sheet, expressing that the insults were disrespectful and downright disgusting.

"Gama, are these insults written as Dorah Kunene's names on her birth certificate?"

"Where did you learn such spine-chilling insults, Sunday school or pre-school?"

What would happen if you were to change your names to be those stated on the charge sheet?

It is so disheartening to see young people treat their elders in such a manner and I urge you to learn some respect for you to grow in life," the magistrate warned.

Gama was arrested and charged with assault common and *crimen injuria* when he was said to have, on Sunday at Dlangeni area, assaulted Bhekithemba Kunene with a fist on his upper cheek, and also threatened to kill him.

### Insulted

Gama was also found to have then insulted Dorah Kunene on the same day.

After finding Gama guilty on both counts, he was sentenced to pay a fine of E1 000 and in default of payment, serve 10 months in prison on the first count.

On the second count, Gama was also sentenced to serve 10 months in prison, with the option to pay a fine of an additional E1 000.

## GRASS-CUTTER ARRESTED FOR SEX WITH GIRL (17)

**A self employed grass-cutter (26) has been arrested for having sexual intercourse with a 17-year old girl.**

He was charged for contravening the Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence (SODV) Act of 2018.

Linda Makhanya of Makhlokholo area in Mbabane has filed an urgent bail application at the High Court, where he was successful as he has been granted bail fixed at E15 000.

He has however been ordered to pay E3 000 in cash and a sum of E12 000 shall be in the form of sureties.

According to the charge sheet, the 26-

year-old is charged for contravening the Act in that he wrongfully, unlawfully and with intent, had sexual intercourse with the 17-year-old girl who by law is incapable of appreciating the nature of a sexual act.

Motivating his application,

The accused told the court

that never at any stage did he have carnal connection with the complainant as alleged in the charge sheet.

He averred that he surrendered himself to the police upon hearing that he was wanted in connection with the

offence, adding that he has been cooperative with the investigating officers in the matter since his arrest.

He informed the court that he is self-employed as a grass cutter and sells firewood for a living and the little he gets, he pays for his two children's school fees and also for their maintenance, hence his continued incarceration may cause him irreparable harm.

He undertook not to interfere with the Crown witnesses and shall abide by all bail conditions the court may deem fit for him.

Makhanya submitted that in view of his personal circumstances, it is in the interest of justice that he be admitted to bail and reiterated to abide by the bail conditions.

Adding, he stated that he suffers from pneumonia and is also asthmatic and in need of constant medical attention and that the living conditions at the Correctional facility are not conducive for his health as he is meant to sleep on a mat on the ice cold floor.

## Combined efforts accelerate SDGs achievement - UN

**UNITED Nations Resident Coordinator Nathalie Ndongo-Seh has said the signing of ARINSA declaration was part of combined efforts to accelerate the achievement of SDGs.**

She was speaking at the signing of the Asset Recovery Inter-Agency Network of Southern Africa (ARINSA) Dar es Salaam Declaration strengthening asset forfeiture for development at Cabinet offices last Thursday.

Ngongo-Seh said Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) 16 which was about promoting just, peaceful and inclusive societies they committed to significantly reduce illicit financial and arms flows, strengthen the recovery and return of stolen assets and combat all forms of organised crime by 2030.

The initiative, therefore supported good governance, rule of law and accountability of Eswatini's institutions. This was a priority area for cooperation for the UN team in Eswatini having full engagement of UNODC

as a custodian of the UN Convention against corruption and the UN Convention against Transnational Organised Crime.

"UNODC took a lead in this discussion and I am delighted to be present today at the first meeting of the national Anti-Money Laundering Committee.

"I hope the committee will do its utmost to coordinate and build on the national responses to counter crime, corruption and money laundering in Eswatini.

"Let me commend in this regard the government on passing the Proceeds of Crime legislation and the establishment of the Asset Forfeiture Unit. These are important steps in strengthening anti-money laundering mechanism at the national level," Ndongo-Seh stated.

The resident coordinator hoped that the event will lay the basis for other initiatives aimed at supporting stronger and accountable government, reinvesting into law enforcement and justice sectors, as well as generating much needed resources to address the needs of victims of violence and those who are currently left behind.

## MOZA MAN RAPES LOVER'S SISTER

**A drinking spree ended with a woman being raped in her sleep by her sister's Mozambican boyfriend.**

Petros Silindza (25), originally from Mozambique but resides at Mahlanya, was taken to task by his girlfriend's sister whom he raped while she was asleep. The incident happened on August 13, 2019 at Mahlanya where \*Tema resides with her siblings.

Silindza faced two charges; one of rape by contravening the Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence (SODV) Act of 2018, and another for unlawfully remaining in Eswatini without a valid residence permit.

When telling the court how the incident unfolded, Tema said on the fateful day, her cousin arrived at Mahlanya, where she and her other siblings reside, and that the cousin brought some alcoholic beverages which they all, including Silindza, enjoyed.

When imbibing, Tema said they were relaxing in an open space. However, at around 10pm, Silindza and everyone got into the house, and the house that Silindza got into was the same as the one that his girlfriend and Tema were in.

This, according to Tema, was nothing unusual as Silindza was regarded as a brother-in-law. The two women

are said to have shared a bed with the sister's children, while Silindza slept on the sofa.

During the course of the night, Tema told the court that her sister's children with whom they shared the bed cried and that the sister had to take them out of the room.

She said her sister went to another house with the children. A short while later, Tema said when she was left alone with Silindza, she fell back into a deep slumber.

At the crack of dawn, Tema said while in her sleep, she felt some discomfort in her genital area so she woke up. To her surprise, she discovered that a male person was on top of her and that he had penetrated her and was actually raping her.

Hastily, she said she pushed him away and he fell on the floor.

While the Mozambican national was

on the floor, Tema said she charged out of the house and went to report the incident to her sister before she proceeded to the police station. When asked whether the evidence brought before court by Tema was true, Silindza conceded.

He said he was influenced by the alcohol he drank before going to bed. In his mitigation, to the first count, Silindza told the court that he was sorry for violating Tema. He pleaded for leniency and stated that he was married with one child and was employed as a builder.

Manzini Principal Magistrate David Khumalo, who presided over the matter, sentenced Silindza to 13 years imprisonment without an option of a fine for the first count, and three months behind bars for the second count with an option of E500 fine.

The sentences are to run concurrently.

# Minister opens E4.2m water project

**MINISTER** of Natural Resources and Energy Peter Bhembe revealed that the ministry has covered 62.51 per cent of Eswatini in providing clean water.

He revealed this during the official opening of Nyatsini Water Supply Project under Sigwe Constituency worth E4.2 million recently.

He said this and other similar projects were aimed at fulfilling the nation's Vision 2022 and it was also in line with Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) Six, which tackles clean accessible water and sanitation for all as an essential part of the nation and world.

"Completion of this project and other similar ones where the government works hand-in-hand with its partners continues to bring clean

water fulfilling the nation's goal of having clean water by 2022. May I appreciate those who entertained us through their acts," he said.

Bhembe appreciated government's partners World Vision Eswatini and

He noted that the ministry had worked with World Vision even in the E6 million Lushini Project under Hosea constituency which was opened in April.

"It is exciting for me to be in your presence at the official opening of this water project that will provide Nyatsini people under Sigwe constituency clean water.

In the same event, Shiselweni RA Dr. Vincent Mhlanga said he was happy to learn that the chief worked well with his subjects and they contributed to the project.

As he welcomed everyone he appreciated Sigwe MP David 'Cruiser' Ngcamphalala, who is also Minister of Tinkhundla and Rural Development, for his role in developing Shiselweni region. There was Ummiso, Sibhaca, Lutsango and poetry as entertainment.

## Borehole to supply 253 homesteads with clean water

**MINISTER** of Natural Resources and Energy Peter Bhembe disclosed that the borehole will supply water to 253 homesteads, one school, four churches and six shops.

He said it would last longer than 10 years even if the population of the people in the area can increase. He added that the pipeline equalled to 34 kilometres will supply 42 taps. He also thanked the people of Nyatsini for working with the ministry in this project since inception until its completion in 2018 and contributing E27 359. He encouraged them to use the

experience and knowledge obtained in the four years to use it in maintaining the project so that it last longer.

Bhembe alluded that as a result of the water supply project, people will now travel less distances to fetch clean water and there will be a decrease in accidents they were sometimes exposed to when fetching water.

### Excelling

It will also provide children extra time to study, thus excel in school.

"Should there be any problems regarding this don't be afraid to report

to Rural Water Nhlanguano offices. We hope that the knowledge obtained here about how to handle everything that pertains this project will be used to benefit everyone," said the minister.

The minister noted that the people from Nyatsini were hygienic as there were pit latrines in every homestead. This will decrease diseases caused by drinking unclean water.

He said many people had already started drinking the water, and its long term use will prove that the project was well built.

## World Vision applauded for development

**WATER, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH) Committee Chairperson Sibongile Masuku applauded World Vision Eswatini for its contribution to development in Nyatsini and the country at large.**

She said as much as each homestead contributed World Vision played a very pivotal role in the water project after it had been stalled due to financial constraints.

"Now our children will have balanced meals because we will be able to make small gardens. We appreciate our Chief Mbilini and MP David 'Cruiser' Ngcamphalala for their support. We plead with all the dignitaries here to pass message to the right officials to fix our roads here," she said.

Meanwhile, Esicojeni Foundation Chairperson Sandile Simelane thanked World Vision for support and putting

children first. He said World Vision approached the foundation for assistance in 2017 and they contributed E500 000 and they will continue working together.

"We also thank the

Foundation sponsors Standard Bank, MTN Eswatini, Galp and Letshego whose monies help in community projects like this one. MPs should also be on the lookout for the needs of people in their constituencies," said Simelane. Simelane wondered when the country would reach a status where food security wasn't a problem, where every homestead would be able to farm their own food for sustainability and also be able to sell.

"Where there is Esicojeni there is water, when we grew up we fetched clean water from wells (ticojeni). We also take care of children less than 18 years as mandated by the King in 2007, when we take care of them we are taking care of our future generation," elaborated the chairperson.

## Magistrate thanks cops for dagga dealer 'clean-up' at Mb. Bus rank

**A police raid at the Mbabane Bus rank proved to be a fruitful operation as three men were arrested for dealing in dagga.**

Thulani Bhembe, Themba Msibi and Thokozani Matsebula were urged to desist from selling dagga to school going children by Magistrate Lenhle Zulu, who emphasised that dagga was an illegal substance in the Kingdom.

"You are all under the ages of 35 and you are all fathers, yet you are here because you smoke and sell dagga to school going children. Our local publications report on dagga wars that are prevalent in our society now, yet you continue to buy and sell dagga to the public. You are still young and you can still make a better living by starting good, legal businesses to support your families," the magistrate emphasised.

Magistrate Zulu further urged the men to desist from selling the dagga

to school going children, as the dagga they sell is cheap enough for them to buy with their pocket money.

"The money that we give our children as pocket money is most definitely used to buy your E5 sloops as they are so affordable. What kind of fathers are you that sell and smoke dagga? I feel sorry for your children," the magistrate questioned.

Arrested and charged separately, the trio was found to have been in possession of varying amounts of dagga at the Mbabane Bus rank on September 21.

Bhembe was sentenced to pay a fine of E1 000 and in default of payment, serve 10 months in prison for being found in possession of 0.4 kg of dagga, whereas Themba Msibi was fined E1 300 and in default of payment, spend 13 months in prison for being in possession of 0.547 kilogrammes of dagga.

Matsebula, who was nabbed smoking the weed at the bus rank, was sentenced to pay E1 000 or serve 10 months in prison after he was found to have an additional 0.88kg of dagga on his person.

# Woman (26) arrested for stealing 11-month old baby

**WHILE** most women are arrested for shop-lifting and theft, a 26-year-old woman of Malutha area has been arrested for stealing an 11-month-old baby.

Nombuso Bongive Maseko of Malutha near Bhunya has been arrested by the Matsapha (Sigodweni) police for allegedly stealing the baby while at Logoba in Matsapha.

According to the charge sheet, Maseko is charged with the offence of contra-

vening Section 77 of the Child Protection and Welfare Act of 2012 in that on September 2 while at Logoba she wrongfully, unlawfully and with intent took the baby Sihlelelwe Gamedze from its mother, Fikile Ginindza without her consent and thus contravened the Act.

She has filed an urgent application for bail at the High Court as she is currently booked as His Majesty's guest at the Mawelawela Correctional facility.

According to Maseko in her founding affidavit, she was arrested by the police in connection with the offence and has been in custody since then, hence she now wants out of jail.

She submitted that she had two minor children who are solely dependent on her for survival and is the breadwinner in her family, hence her continued incarceration has a negative impact to her welfare and that of her children since there is no one taking care of them.

## Challenged

"I submit that I am a person who is physically challenged as I have a serious back-pain, my life is at risk and I do not have a spare one, I humbly submit that it is in the interest of justice that I be granted bail as exceptional circumstances do exist," she submitted.

She informed the court that she has a

clean criminal record and has no previous convictions, adding that she shall abide by all bail conditions the Court may deem fit for her.

## Innocent

She motivated her application by stating that the spirit of presumption of innocent until proven guilty should prevail, arguing that she is innocent of the charges leveled against her and shall plead not guilty at trial.

Represented by Manzini-based Lawyer Vukile Ndzimandze of Mabuza- Johnson and Associates

law firm, Maseko averred that she was cooperative with the investigating officers in the case but stated that she is not in a position to fully state her defence at the moment as she is still waiting for further particulars from the Crown.

She stated that she would suffer irreparable harm should she not be granted bail, as she would not be in a position to continue providing for her dependants and by the time the matter is at trial she would have lost all means of livelihood and the ability to maintain herself and her dependants.

# 'INVESTIGATE BULLY TEACHER'

A deputy principal at Ndabazwe High School around Lavumisa has been condemned by World Vision Eswatini for the despicable act of making fun of a needy pupil by calling her by the name of her sponsor in front of other children.

The organisation has called for an investigation to the act of the teacher by the ministry of education and training.

Our sister publication, the Observer on Saturday reported this past weekend that a 16-year-old pupil was so emotionally drained that she had to look for another school to continue with her education following a degrading experience she allegedly faced at the hands of the deputy principal.

The 16-year-old, who was doing Form II at her previous school, has this year been forced to redo this grade at another school after failing to obtain good marks last year due to what is viewed by her parent as a depressing ordeal. The Deputy Principal Zekhaya Dlamini is accused of calling her by the name of her sponsor, World Vision, in front of other pupils several times, something the pupil felt was degrading her and placed a stigma on her given her needy state as an orphaned and vulnerable child. It is alleged that this went on for some time, resulting in the matter being reported to the Shiselweni Regional Education Officer (REO) Siboniso Gumbi for action.

The teacher said it was meant to be a joke with the office of the deputy prime minister viewing it as a bad joke.

World Vision when reached on the matter if it is true said it is unfortunate that the teacher has used the situation of the child to discriminate against an innocent soul, who should otherwise be thankful to God for providing support to keep the child in class.

"We would advocate for full investigation of this teacher by the appropriate ministry to curb such behaviour in future. Thousands of children across the country in governments or church schools, are on some form of education assist - a grant, OVC grant by govern-

ment and its partners, scholarships and other means and these should be made to feel safe in schools by dealing with such teachers.

"We are discouraging such behaviour and our greatest wish is to see all children getting quality education to contribute to the socio-economic situation of the country in the near future," said World Vision Communications Coordinator Zanele Dlamini.



Dlamini said although they were not aware of any other similar cases the organisation has faced in the past pertaining to its sponsored children, but this is an unfortunate incident which they are really discouraging. She stated that child sponsorship is the backbone of World Vision's development and funding model.

She said the premise of child sponsorship is made through pulled sponsorship resources or funds and that World Vision using the resources, works and improves the environment where the child lives in.

"Improvements are in provision of clean water by drilling boreholes, constructing reticulated water schemes, constructing classroom blocks, toilets in schools and households. We further supply schools with furniture, books, provide school uniforms for vulnerable children and in some rare cases we pay school fees.

"World Vision further engages communities in other forms of development across key objectives, which include

the protection of children from diseases and infections, promoting nutrition of children, children enjoy love of God and neighbours and children are able to read and write," she disclosed.

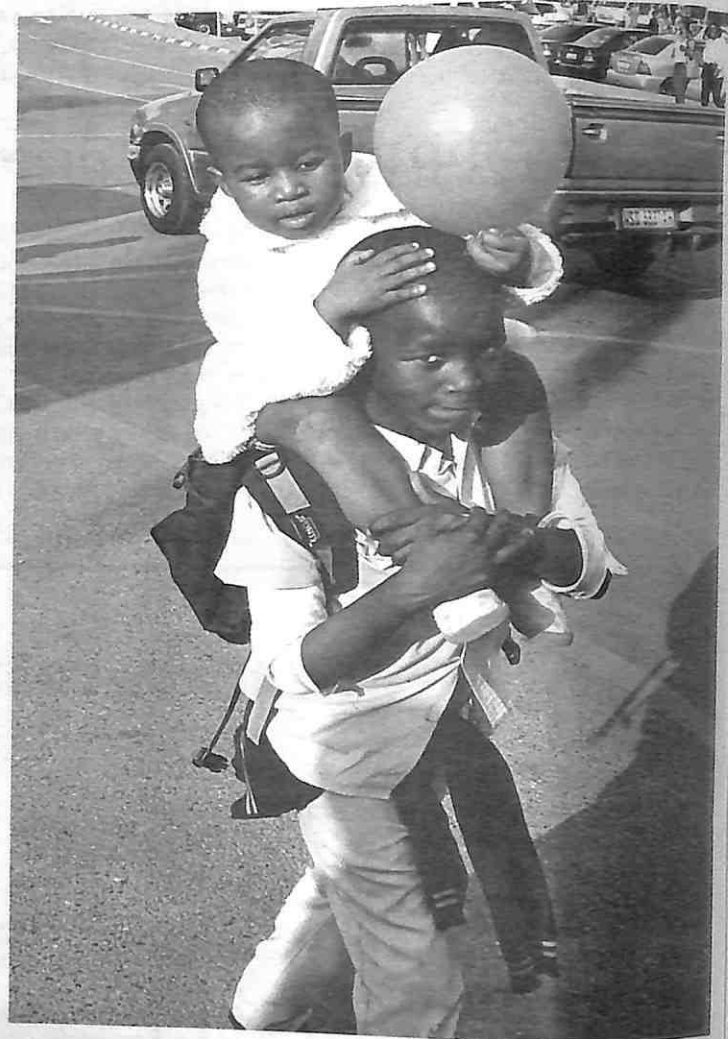
She also stated that while benefits in target communities, tend to be inclusive and cover all children in targeted areas, some 'special needs cases' like orphans and vulnerable children are given special attention as per their needs. She said their vision for every child is life in all its fullness and therefore children not able to enjoy this will need to be assisted to be like all other children in the community.

"Yes special needs support could be in school fees, uniforms, clothing, food, medical assistance, economic empowerment etc.

"Our sponsorship programme currently has access of 53 000 children with varying benefits packages that is group and communal to individual's benefits. Notable group benefits have been the construction of 25 reticulated water schemes supplying water to schools and children's homes, neighbourhood care points, clinics, educational material (computers, books, furniture), hundreds of boreholes and establishment of garden schemes at household and communal level," she stated.

The communications coordinator also revealed that same services are implemented by World Vision in the above-mentioned sponsored child's school and community in general.

## 'Baby dumper' taken for psychiatric evaluation

**THE court has ordered that a 31-year-old woman should be taken for psychiatric evaluation after she was found to have thrown her new born baby in a pit latrine.**

Phikisile Nkambule of Hhukwini area was arrested and charged with attempted murder after she was said to have thrown her new born baby in a pit latrine after giving birth.

## Charged

According to her charge sheet, Nkambule was charged with the offence of attempted murder when she was found to have, on September

14, 2019 at Hhukwini, wrongfully, unlawfully and intentionally attempted to kill her female new born baby by throwing her into a pit latrine after giving birth, thus committing the offence.

## Custody

During her appearance before Magistrate Lenhle Zulu last Wednesday, the prosecution applied for Nkambule to be remanded into custody until Friday, pending her committal to the High Court.

The prosecution further applied for Nkambule to be taken for psychiatric evaluation, to determine whether she was of sound mind to stand trial, an application which was granted by the court.

**PUPILS** around Northern Hhohho region reportedly have more money than their teachers.

This was alleged at Nkonyeni High School during a speech and prize giving day held on Friday.

Principal Ntombi Adigbo-Dlamini informed parents and invited guests that learners at the school had more money than their parents and teachers.

She said with the learners having more money than teachers, it becomes difficult for teachers to control them.

As if to prove that the learners had money, during the event a lot of money was thrown around by the

pupils. During Ummiso and Sibhaca dances, whilst parents and guests

showed their appreciation with money ranging from E10 to E50 to

the dancing groups, the pupils 'showered' the dancers with E100 notes which were mainly in South African currency.

More than 15 R100 notes were thrown around by the learners. The area's Umphakatsi Acting Chief Mpila concurred with the principal that learners in that school seem to have money.

Mpila said it was shocking to see a pupil going to work on dagga fields after school.

He wondered as to when the children get time to study.

Mpila said parents are the ones who are destroying the children's future by letting them work on dagga fields. The acting chief said parents should always pay attention to their children.

## Ministry also concerned

**THE** ministry of education and training is concerned with the dwindling academic performance in Northern Hhohho schools.

It is said this was because learners skipped classes to work in dagga fields.

This has had negative effects on the end of year results for Northern Hhohho schools as they are now trailing behind when it comes to the passing rate. This concern was raised by the Hhohho Regional Education Office through Religious Inspector Patricia Mahlobo during a speech and prize event at Nkonyeni High School.

Nkonyeni High School is located in Pigg's Peak, one of the places where dagga cultivation is rife. Mahlobo minced no words when she said it is a known fact that learners around Northern Hhohho had a tendency of skipping classes to cultivate dagga.

She reminded parents that the ministry emphasised that every child must go to school. She said teachers in schools around Hhohho have been complaining of one and the same thing. Mahlobo said teachers have been reporting that there is a period where learners abscond classes for a lengthy period and that is usually around the time when dagga is ready for harvesting "tikhatsi tekulova tiyatiwa kule region".

Mahlobo further pointed out that pupils around these schools always have cash. The inspector warned parents that allowing their children to work on dagga fields is a serious crime. She said children were protected by the Constitution and by allowing them to work in dagga fields parents could be charged with Child Labour or be charged for contravening the Child Protection Act.

## Pupils sleep during exams - Regional Inspector

A study conducted has shown that learners around Northern Hhohho region sleep during examinations.

This is because learners work at night harvesting dagga before attending classes the following day.

This was revealed by Regional Inspector Patricia Mahlobo

when speaking on behalf of the Hhohho Regional Office at Nkonyeni High School during the speech and prize day last week Friday.

The inspector said the study showed that learners do not come to class and they also sleep during exams as they work all night harvesting dagga.

Mahlobo made a plea to parents to assist teachers by not letting their children work in dagga fields.

Mahlobo said this not only destroyed the child's future, but it also takes a toll on principals as they are always stressed about the poor performance of their schools.

The school has an enrolment of 520 pupils.

It is said the majority of the drop outs were males. This high number of male learners who drop out of school was associated with the dagga dealings happening at the area.

Principal Ntombi Adigbo-Dlamini revealed that out of the 19 learners who dropped out 11

were doing Form Two. She urged the ministry of education to provide them with counselors who will instill the values of education to the learners. Despite all the challenges that the school goes through, it has been hailed as one of the schools that has achieved a great milestone.

Nkonyeni High started operating in 2008 with only 17 learners, but now has over 500 learners.

## DEMONS

Once again, ask me in Spanish, Italian or Latin, day or night and I will tell you without a stammer that this great musician is haunted by sexual demons.

And demons are like a SMALL axe that cuts BIG trees. Many, a giant, have crumbled and crushed; DOWN TO THE GROUND.

And the biggest limitation is DENIAL; from those possessed; worse; from those who idolise the stars. And that's my issue for today; seeing beyond the GLITTER OF THE STARS.

## 'ACTOR' AND 'CHARACTER'

ENTITLED

AN ACT to amend the Criminal Procedure and Evidence Act, 1938 so as to provide for the time frame for the use of previous convictions, the access to records of previous convictions and the use of records of previous convictions.

ENACTED by the King and the Parliament of Eswatini

### Short Title Commencement

1. (1) This Act may be cited as The Criminal Procedure and Evidence (Amendment) Act, 2018 and shall be read as one with the Criminal Procedure and Evidence Act, 1938, hereinafter referred to as the "Principal Act".

(2) This Act shall come into force on the date of its publication in the Gazette.

### Amendment of Section 2

2. Section 2 of the Principal Act is amended by adding in alphabetical order, the following interpretations as follows -

"child" shall have the same meaning as assigned to it in the Children's Protection and Welfare Act No.6 of 2012; and

"child offender" means a child who has been convicted by a court of law.

### Amendment of Section 287

3. Section 287 of the Principal Act is amended by adding sections 287bis, 287ter, and 287quater as follows -

*Validity of previous conviction of child offender*

287 bis. (1) A record of a previous conviction of a child offender shall not be valid after the

(2) Notwithstanding subsection (1), the record of a previous conviction of a child offender shall be disclosed and used for the purpose of -

- (a) Crime detection;
- (b) Investigation of an offence; and
- (c) Use in prosecution,

even after serving a sentence.

*Validity of a previous conviction of an adult*

287 ter. (1) A record of a previous conviction of an adult shall be valid for the period of the length of the sentence imposed by the courts as outlined in the sixth schedule.

(2) The Minister may, after consultation with Cabinet, amend the sixth schedule.

(3) Notwithstanding subsection (1), the validity of a previous conviction of an adult shall not apply for purposes of education and employment.

*Access to and use of a record of previous conviction*

287 quater. (1) A person shall not have access to or use a record of previous conviction of any person after the expiry of the valid time allocated under sections 287bis and 287ter except for use in -

- (a) Crime detection;
- (b) Investigation of an offence; or
- (c) Prosecution.

(2) A person who intends to have access to, or use of, an expired record of previous conviction for any purpose, other than the mentioned in subsection (1), shall obtain a court order for the purpose.

(3) A record of previous conviction of any person shall not be used in the consideration of education or employment.

(4) A person who contravenes sub-sections (1), (2) and (3) commits an offence and shall, on conviction, be liable to a fine not exceeding ten thousand Emalangeni or to a term of imprisonment not exceeding three years or both.

### Schedule

4. The Principal Act is amended by adding a Sixth schedule immediately after the Fifth Schedule as follows -

### Sixth Schedule

VALIDITY OF RECORD OF PREVIOUS CONVICTION AS REFERRED TO IN SECTION 287 TER

- (a) One month to twelve months valid for one year.
- (b) Two years, valid for three years;



- (c) Three years, valid for four years;
- (d) Four years, valid for five years;
- (e) Five years, valid for six years;
- (f) Six years valid for seven years;
- (g) Seven years valid for eight years;
- (h) Eight years, valid for nine years; and
- (i) Nine years and above, valid for ten years.

## THE SMALL CLAIMS COURT (AMENDMENT) BILL, 2017

### A BILL

### Entitled

An Act to amend the Small Claims Court Act, 2011 so as to assign the Judiciary with jurisdiction over the Small Claims Court in conformity with Section 139 of the Constitution of Swaziland Act, 2005 and provide for incidental matters.

Enacted by the King and the Parliament of Swaziland.

### Short title and commencement

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the Small Claims Court (Amendment) Act, 2017 and shall be read as one with the Small Claims Court Act, 2011 (hereinafter referred to as "principal Act").

(2) This Act shall come into force on the date of publication in the Government Gazette.

### Amendment of Section 1

2. Section 1 of the principal Act is amended by replacing the figure "2008" therein with the figure "2011".

### Amendment of Section 3

3. Section 3 of the principal Act is amended -  
(a) in subsection (1) by replacing the words "The Minister, after consultation with the Chief Justice" with the words "The Chief Justice, after consultation with the Minister"; and  
(b) in subsection (2) by replacing the words

"Where the minister deems it necessary and expedient, the Minister or a principal magistrate of a Region, if so authorised by the Minister and" with the words "Where the Chief Justice deems it necessary and expedient, the Chief Justice or a principal magistrate of a Region, if so authorised by".

(c) by adding a new subsection (3) after subsection (2) as follows -

"(3) The Judicial Service Commission, after consultation with the Minister in writing, may establish one or more boards or committees with duties and powers responsible for advising both the Minister and the Judicial Service Commission on the functioning of the courts".

### Amendment of Section 7

4. Section 7 of the principal Act is amended -

- (a) in subsection (2) by replacing the words "Minister or Attorney General" with the words "Chief Justice"; and
- (b) in subsection 3 by replacing the words "Attorney General" with the words "Chief Justice".

### Amendment of Section 10

5. Section 10 of the principal Act is amended -

- (a) in subsection (1) by replacing the words "the Minister in consultation with the Chief Justice" with the words "the Judicial Service Commission";
- (b) in the last sentence of subsection (4) by replacing the word "Minister" with the words "Judicial Service Commission";

(c) in subsections (5); (6) and (7) by replacing the word "minister" with the words "Judicial Service Commission";

(d) in subsection (5) delete the section and replace with the a new one as follows

"(5) A commissioner shall hold office for a period to be determined by the Judicial Service Commission".

### Amendment of Section 16

6. Section 16 of the principal Act is amended

- (a) in subsection (1) paragraph (a) by -  
(i) replacing the words "prescribed by the Minister" with the words "prescribed by the Chief Justice";
- (ii) deleting the words "the Attorney General and"; and
- (iii) replacing, in the last line, the words "Chief Justice" with the word "Minister";
- (b) in subsection (1) paragraphs (c); (d); (e); (f) and (g) by replacing the word "Minister" with the words "Chief Justice"; and
- (c) in subsection (2) by replacing the word "Minister" with the words "Chief Justice".

### Amendment of Section 17

7. Section 17 of the principal Act is amended in subparagraphs (i) and (ii) by replacing the word "Minister" with the words "Chief Justice" wherever it appears.

### Amendment of Section 26

8. Section 26 of the principal Act is amended -

(a) by deleting the heading of the section and replacing it with a new heading as follows - "Power of Minister to make Regulations and Chief Justice to make rules"

(b) in subsection (1) by replacing the phrase "The Minister may make regulations or rules regulating the following matters in respect of small claims courts -" with the phrase "The Minister may, where appropriate, make regulations for

better carrying into effect the objectives or provisions of this Act and the Chief Justice shall, in accordance with this section, make rules on -";

(c) in subsection (1) paragraph (d) by deleting the whole paragraph (d) and;

(d) in subsection (1) paragraph (e) by deleting the whole paragraph and substituting it with a new paragraph as follows -

"(d) any other matter that may be prescribed by rules for better carrying out the objectives or provisions of this Act".

(e) renumbering subsections (2), (3) and (4) and the paragraphs accordingly.

### Amendment of Section 36

9. Section 36 is amended in subsection (1) by replacing the section with a new section (1) as follows -

"(1) If a defendant upon a summons having been served on the defendant in terms of section 30 -

(a) admits liability and consents to judgement in writing; or

(b) fails to appear before the court on the trial date or on any date to which the proceedings have been postponed,

the court may, on application by the plaintiff, grant judgement for the plaintiff in so far as the plaintiff has proved the defendant's liability and the amount of the claim to the satisfaction of the court, and the court may dismiss any counterclaim by the defendant."



# 1 BILLION RISING REVOLUTION

IN our culture a child does not only belong to his/her parents but to the community as a whole.

We all become responsible for the upbringing of a child. Emotional abuse can then be defined as: "Inflicting or failing to reasonably prevent others from inflicting mental or emotional injury that damages a child's growth, development, or psychological effectiveness."

It is important to know what this form of abuse is and how we can prevent it for a better tomorrow as children are our future.

Emotional child abuse is injury which results in diminished psychological growth and development.

It involves words, actions and in consequence. Emotional abuse is the persistent emotional maltreatment of a child such as to cause severe and persistent adverse effects on the child's emotional development.

It may involve conveying to children that they are worthless or unloved, inadequate, or valued only insofar as they meet the needs of another person. Abusers constantly reject, ignore, belittle, dominate and criticize the victims.

## Development

It may feature age- or developmentally inappropriate expectations being obligatory on children.

These may include dealings that are beyond the child's developmental capability, as well as over-protection and limitation of exploration and learning, or preventing the child contributing in normal social interaction.

It may involve serious bullying causing children frequently to feel frightened or in peril, or the misuse or dishonesty of children. Emotional abuse may occur within families, corporations, health care, religious and quasi-religious settings.

Examples of emotional child abuse are verbal abuse; excessive demands on a child's performance; penalising a child for positive, normal behaviour (smiling, exploration, vocalisation, manipulation of objects); discouraging caregiver and infant attachment; penalizing a child for demonstrating signs of positive self-esteem; and penalising a child for using interpersonal skills needed for adequate performance in school and peer groups. Exposing children to family violence and unwillingness or inability to provide affection or

stimulation for the child in the course of daily care may also result in emotional abuse.

How you identify emotional abuse. Although emotional abuse can hurt as much as physical abuse, it can be harder to identify because the marks are left on the inside instead of the outside. Caregivers can also closely observe children's behaviours and personalities.

Children suffering from emotional abuse are often extremely loyal to the parent, afraid of being punished if they report abuse, or think that this type of abuse is a normal way of life.

Behavioural indicators of an emotionally abused child include inappropriate behaviour that is immature or more mature for the child's age, dramatic behaviour, aggressiveness, uncooperativeness, bedwetting and destructive or antisocial behaviour.

## Relationship

Furthermore, poor relationships with peers, lack of self-confidence, unusual fears for the child's age (fear of going home, being left alone, specific objects), or inability to react with emotion or develop an emotional bond with others are also indicators. Convincingly, any of the above behaviours may also be seen in normal children, but a change in pattern of these behaviours is a strong indicator of emotional abuse.

Who are the perpetrators? Almost any adult involved in a relationship with a child is a potential perpetrator. Parents, teachers, pastors, social workers, neighbours, lawyers, or judges may all be capable of emotional maltreatment. Common

characteristics of the abusing adult include blaming or belittling the child in public, describing the child negatively, always assuming the child is at fault, having unrealistic expectations of the child, openly admitting to disliking or hating the child, threatening the child with severe punishment, withdrawing comfort as a means of discipline, being emotionally cold and un-supportive, suffering from alcohol and drug abuse, and possessing a violent nature.

## Effects

What are the effects? The consequences of emotional child abuse can be serious and long-term. Many research studies conclude that psychopathologic symptoms are more likely to develop in emotionally abused children. These children may experience a lifelong pattern of depression, estrangement, anxiety, low self-esteem, inappropriate or troubled relationships, or a lack of empathy.

During their childhood, victims may fail to thrive or their developmental progress may be halted. Some may also become poorly adjusted emotionally and psychologically.

As teenagers, they find it difficult to trust, participate in and achieve happiness in interpersonal relationships, and resolve the complex feelings left over from their childhoods. As adults, they may have trouble recognising and appreciating the needs and feelings of their own children and emotionally abuse them as well. In short the habit of being abusive becomes a cycle.

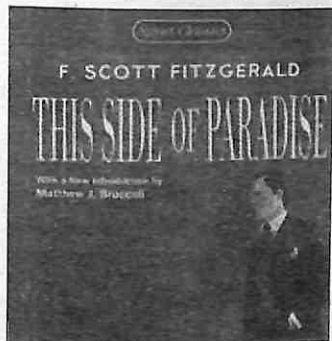
## MBABANE PUBLIC LIBRARY BOOK REVIEW

### THE CIDER HOUSE RULES - BY JOHN IRVING

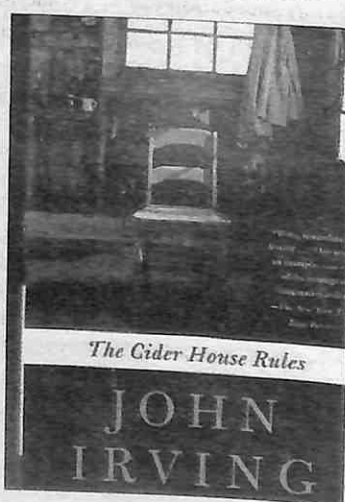
FIRST published in 1985, The Cider House Rules is set in rural Maine in the first half of the twentieth century.

## High Level Business Conference to kick-start e-Commerce launch

FOLLOWING His Majesty King Mswati III's official endorsement of the launch of the e-Commerce Platform in the Kingdom of Eswatini, preparations for the historic two-day event are already at an advanced stage.

The launch, which takes place between October 3-4, will begin with a high level Business Conference that will address key areas affecting intra-African trade; as well as how the e-Commerce Platform can be effectively used to support the African Continental Free Trade Area (AfCFTA).

The AfCFTA officially entered into force on July 7, 2019 during an African Union Extra-Ordinary Session held in Niamey, Niger. It was during the same meeting, where Eswatini was officially unveiled as hosts of the African Electronic Trade (AeTrade) Group for the Southern African region.

This project is tipped to create between 2 000 and 4 000 jobs in the next four years.

and Trade Manqoba Khumalo said a Business Conference, to be held on October 3 at Mavuso Trade and Exhibition Centre in Manzini, would set the tone for the main event scheduled for the Mandvulo Grand Hall the following day.

"The conference will include Business to Business Forums, Plenary Sessions, Panel Discussions and a high level Public Private Partnership (PPP) Dialogue.

Some of the topics to be discussed

include; Towards an integrated, digitally connected and prosperous continent, What are the priorities beyond the launch of the African Continental Free Trade Area? MSME Empowerment Training and Capacity Building in Africa as well as Innovative Financing and Logistics Services for Business.

Others will be Digital Infrastructure in Southern Africa and how ready are we and also Public Private Partnerships for e-Government and

e-Commerce Development in Africa," he said.

He added that in between the sessions there will be presentations from some of Africa's economic experts and politicians as well as Prime Minister Ambrose Mandvulo Dlamini, the Chief Executive Officer and Chairperson of AeTrade Group, Mululem Syoum, the Minister of Commerce, Industry and Trade Manqoba Khumalo and Montigny Managing Director Andrew le Roux, amongst others.

"Also expected to be in attendance are a number of the continent's former and current Heads of State, representatives of the African Union Commission, SADC Ministers of Trade, representatives of the African Development Bank and Afrexim Bank, representatives of various Regional Economic Communities (RECS), as well as private sector representatives, amongst others," he said.

The minister further stated that there would be the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between the AeTrade Group and the COMESA Business Council.

## CBE MAINTAINS DISCOUNT RATE AT 6.5 PERCENT

THE Central Bank of Eswatini (CBE) has decided to maintain the discount rate at 6.5 per cent after considering global, regional and domestic economic developments.

This was decided by the CBE during a meeting with Monetary Policy

Consultative Committee (MPCC) to consider the appropriate monetary policy stance for the upcoming two months last Friday.

This means banks will maintain their lending rates on loans dispersed to individuals and businesses until the next monetary policy meeting.

Overall, inflation remains low indicating that the growth rate of the cost

of goods and services is slow. The bank holds the view that the cost of goods and services will continue to increase at a slower pace.

According to a statement released by CBE Governor Majosi Sithole, the global economy was estimated to have grown by 3.6 per cent in 2018 and the forecast for 2019 had been revised down to 3.2 per cent (from 3.3 per cent), while the economic activity (GDP) increased by 4.2 per cent on a year-on-year basis (seasonally adjusted) in the first quarter of 2019.

The main contributing sectors were manufacturing, wholesale and retail as well as agriculture and forestry.

### Observed

He said the bank had also observed heightening uncertainty arising from trade tensions, geopolitical developments and declining business confidence, which continue to pose downside risks to the global growth outlook.

"Inflation in advanced economies remains stable and below target and global monetary policy remains largely accommodative with the US having effected cuts in both its July and September 2019 meetings.

"In South Africa, the economy grew by an annualised 3.1 per cent in the second quarter of 2019 following a contraction of the same magnitude in the previous quarter.

"GDP growth forecast remains unchanged at 0.6 per cent in 2019, while the forecast for 2020 and 2021 decreased to 1.5 per cent and 1.8 per cent from 1.8 per cent and 2.0 per

cent forecasted in July, respectively. The South African Reserve Bank (SARB) maintained its benchmark repo rate at 6.5 per cent on September 19, 2019," he said.

He noted that, on the domestic front, revised figures indicated that the economy grew by 2.4 per cent in 2018 from two per cent in 2017 and that on a quarterly basis, real GDP growth marginally increased by 0.9 per cent (quarter-on-quarter) in the first quarter of 2019 from a 7.2 per cent growth recorded in the fourth quarter of 2018.

Sithole further mentioned that the notable increase on a year-on-year basis largely benefitted from improvements in the secondary sector which expanded by 6.9 per cent (year-on-year) in the first quarter of 2019 compared to 3.8 per cent in the previous quarter.

Then governor further mentioned that the bank's quarterly inflation was forecasted to average 1.96 per cent in the third quarter, down from 2.17 per cent, before increasing to 2.04 per cent in the fourth quarter (down from 2.33 per cent).

"The average inflation forecast for 2019 has therefore been revised down from 2.87 per cent to 2.71 per cent," he said.

He stated that the bank would continue to monitor international and domestic developments that influence the movements of inflation and will act appropriately in line with its core mandate of fostering price and financial stability that is conducive to the economic development in Eswatini.

## 'Contingency plans are in place'

**JOHANNESBURG -** The SA Revenue Service says it has contingency plans in place in case a planned major strike by bank employees goes ahead on Friday.

The strike against job losses is being organised by banking union SASBO, which boasts of having 50 000 members.

The tax agency said in a statement yesterday that while it views the strike as unlikely, it is rolling out plans to make sure there is "minimal disruption to SARS services".

"In this respect, SARS will work with all role-players to avert any disruption to the country's financial system. In view of this protest action, we request patience and understanding from

taxpayers and traders." It did not say what the plans entail. Several banks have also said they have contingency plans in place to try and continue operations if the protest action proceeds.

Business Unity South Africa, on behalf of the banking sector, has lodged an urgent application to interdict the strike. The matter is to be heard in court today.

Sasbo, meanwhile, has warned South Africans to expect the banking sector to grind to a halt on Friday. "Make sure you have enough money (cash) on Thursday (tomorrow)," SASBO General Secretary Joe Kokela told Fin24 earlier in the week. "No one will be able to transact, unfortunately." *Fin24*



## SA issues \$5 billion bonds in international capital markets

**JOHANNESBURG -** South Africa has issued two new bonds worth \$5 billion (R74 billion) in international capital markets, the National Treasury announced yesterday.

In a statement National Treasury said: "The Republic of South Africa was able to successfully place US\$5 billion in bonds maturing in 2029 (10-year) and 2049 (30-year) in the international capital markets on 23 September 2019, with US\$2 billion and US\$3 billion placed in the 2029 and 2049 tranches respectively. "Due to favorable pricing and a sizeable order book,

the Republic was able to pre-fund an additional US\$1 billion over the planned US\$4 billion. Pre-funding is the early issuance of an amount planned to be issued in future years.

"This is done to take advantage of good pricing and favourable market conditions while reducing future borrowing need. The 10-year bond priced at a coupon rate and re-offer yield of 4.85 per cent which represents a spread of 313 basis points above the 10-year US Treasury benchmark bond."

The National Treasury said the 30-year bond priced at a coupon rate and

re-offer yield of 5.75 per cent which represents a spread of 358.6 basis points above the 30-year US Treasury benchmark bond. "The transaction was 2.71 oversubscribed with investor demand across Europe, North America, Asia, South America, Middle East, Africa and others," said the statement.

"In terms of investor type, demand was supported by a mixture of Fund Managers, Insurance and Pension Funds, Financial Institutions, Hedge Funds and others.

"The South African government sees the success of the transaction, believed

to be the largest ever out of sub-Saharan Africa, as an expression of investor confidence in the country's sound macro-economic policy framework and prudent fiscal management."

The National Treasury said it mandated Citi, Deutsche Bank/Nedbank (consortium), Rand Merchant Bank, and Standard Bank as Joint Bookrunners. Empowerment partners for the respective banks are: Crede Capital Partners, Rho Capital; Theza Capital; and Africa Rising Capital.

The 2019 Budget Review made provision for US\$2 billion equivalent to be raised in the international capital markets in 2019/20 to fund govern-

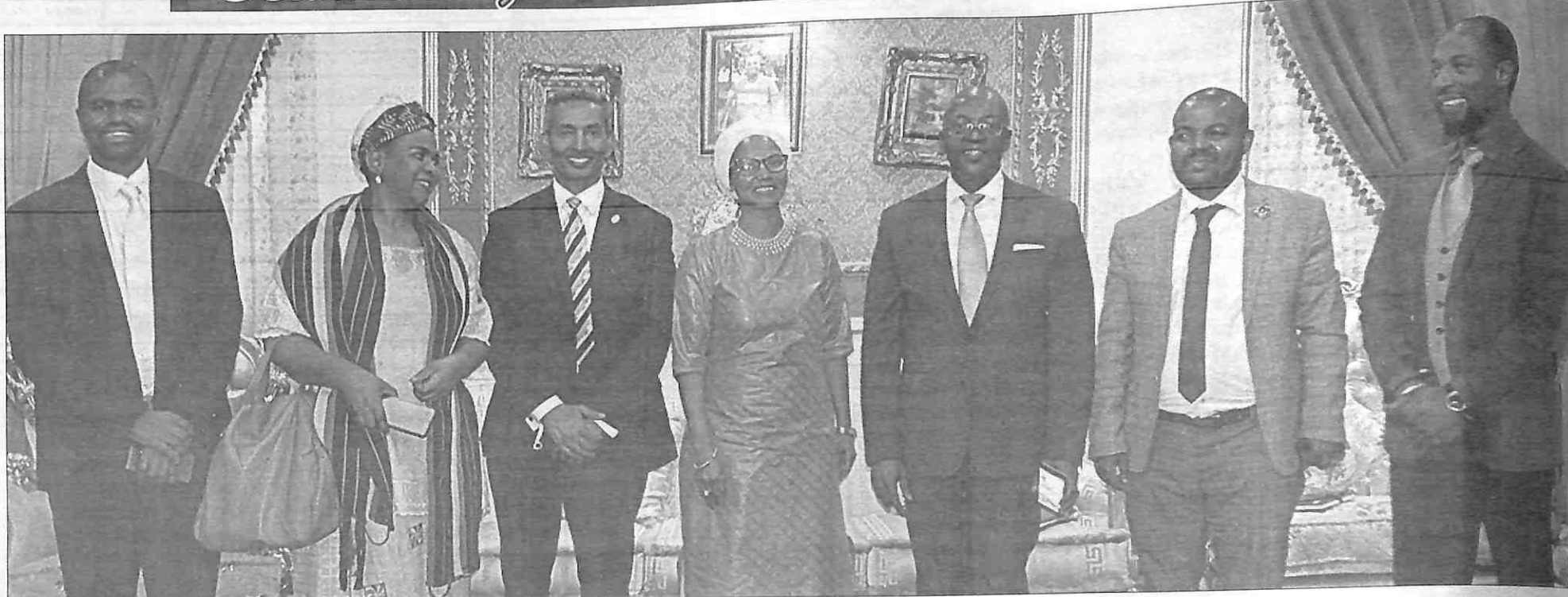

### THE Kingdom of Eswatini's defining moment has come!

This being the launch of the Africa e-Commerce Platform on our shores in the coming week. The kingdom will be piloting Africa's largest e-Commerce Platform on October 4, 2019 at Mandvulo Grand Hall. The event will be preceded by a high-level Business Conference to be held at Mavuso Trade and Exhibition Centre on October 3, 2019. This after Eswatini won the bid to host the

Africa e-Trade Group (AeTrade) for Southern Africa in Niamey, Niger, back in July.

Next week's event will surely go down in history as one of Africa's biggest events; as it will bring throngs of delegates from across the continent and beyond. Past and present Heads of State, representatives of the African Union as well as some Regional Economic Communities (RECs), SADC Ministers of Trade, representatives of African Development

Bank and Afrexim Bank as well as some of Africa's richest entrepreneurs are but some of the delegates expected to be part of this historic moment.

Locally, we have a number of experts expected to make presentations during the Business Conference; whose agenda includes various issues that hinder Intra-Africa Trade. Intra-Africa Trade remains quite low; estimated at between 15 and 18 per cent; which is a sharp contrast to the way Africa

trades with Europe. This, therefore, calls for the concerted efforts of all Africans to come together and find lasting solutions to this predicament; hence the formation of the African Continental Trade Area (AfCFTA); which came into force on July 7, 2019.

Coming back to next week's event, on September 6 this year, His Majesty King Mswati III officially commissioned the Eswatini e-Commerce Platform Steering Committee to host

a world-class event; in the presence of AeTrade Group Chief Executive Officer and Chairperson Muluaem Syoum. This was during a courtesy visit to Lozitha Palace. This marked the beginning of yet another momentous task for the E. Nathi-Dlamini led committee; whose commitment has previously been proven and tested when Eswatini bid to host the Secretariat of AfCFTA earlier in the year. Even though the bid eventually went to Ghana, the kingdom put up a gallant fight and came third; almost neck to neck with Kenya, humbling some of Africa's biggest economies. And, although we lost the AfCFTA bid, Eswatini still bagged the Africa e-Commerce bid on behalf of the Southern African region. And now, we become the first African State to launch this coveted platform.

## About the e-Commerce Platform

### THE e-Commerce Platform is an enabler of the AfCFTA.

It will provide an opportunity for entrepreneurs; particularly within the Micro Small Medium Enterprise (MSME) bracket, to tap into the African market.

Simply put, this platform will facilitate the delivery of ICT solutions for governance and trade matters, and drive efficiencies within public and private enterprises in Africa by tapping into the resources and expertise of Africa, including the African Diaspora, with a view of supporting the implementation of the Action Plan for Boosting Intra-African Trade, and thus accelerating the implementation of the AfCFTA.

It seeks to provide holistic and futuristic solutions in support of e-

commerce development in the five regions of the African Union. Ultimately, each region of the African Union will host one regional office, and all activities will be coordinated from the Head Office; which is yet to be established.

### Chance

At this point, it is not clear if Eswatini can actually bid to host the Head Office but there is no doubt that given the chance, this little kingdom will prove equal to the task. Enough about that though, the Africa e-Commerce Platform uses various technological tools and approaches; all designed to respond to the low level of development of Africa's physical ICT infrastructure.

The envisioned benefits of this initiative include, but are not limited to, the following:

1. Management of trans-boundary infrastructure to enable e-commerce in Africa (telecommunications, airports, roads, ports, railways, including high speed railways);
2. Management of trans-boundary Special Economic Zones (SEZs) for the manufacture of specific products destined for the continental market and beyond;
3. Management of trans-boundary economic corridors which are critical for the transit of goods and services across the continent, conscious of the security and collaboration mechanisms between AU Member States;
4. Trade information exchange benefit with gender and sectoral disaggregation;
5. Ability to accelerate the imple-

mentation of AfCFTA, and responding to the 2063 Agenda.

So, next week's events will surely set the wheels in motion for Africa. Eswatini should view herself blessed to have been chosen to kick-start the series of launch activities for the Africa e-Commerce Platform. What

this means is that this little Kingdom is not so little anymore but has actually ARRIVED in Africa.

As Forbes Africa Magazine rightly described Eswatini in their January edition, Eswatini is indeed Africa's newest country.

And it goes without saying that the more we play our role as a country in the African agenda, the more the rest of the world will take us with the seriousness that we deserve.

## GRETA THUNBERG SLAMS UN

● You have stolen my dreams and my childhood with your empty words

**NEW YORK** - Teenage climate activist Greta Thunberg had one question for the global leaders assembled at the United Nations: "How dare you?"

Days after telling US lawmakers "listen to the scientists," she made the same demand on an international scale. Thunberg chastised leaders for praising young activists like herself while failing to deliver on drastic actions needed to avert the worst effects of climate change, and she warned that if the world continued with business as usual, her generation would face an insurmountable catastrophe.

"This is all wrong," said Thunberg, who was visibly emotional as she spoke on a panel at a UN climate summit Monday. With tears in her eyes and her face flushed, the 16-year-old activist - who began skipping school in her native Sweden a year ago to protest inaction on climate

change - chastised the world leaders who had gathered in New York.

"I shouldn't be up here. I should be back in school on the other side of the ocean," said Thunberg, who travelled for two weeks on a solar-powered sailboat to reach the United States this month.

"Yet you all come to us young people for hope. How dare you?" Thunberg has quickly become the face of a global movement of young people demanding that their elders safeguard their planet's future. On Friday, millions of young people all over the world joined Thunberg in a climate strike that she led from New York. Thunberg continued her campaign Monday, as she and 15 other young people filed a legal complaint with the UN Committee on the Rights of the Child arguing that major countries - Argentina, Brazil, France, Germany and Turkey - have known about the risks of climate change for decades but have failed to take sufficient action to curb their emissions.

## 'MEETING WITH KIM JONG UN 'COULD HAPPEN SOON'

**UNITED NATIONS** - US President Donald Trump said Monday that a fourth summit with North Korean leader Kim Jong Un "could happen soon" amid stalled nuclear diplomacy.

Trump didn't elaborate in comments to reporters ahead of the start of UN meetings in New York, and it was not clear if concrete plans were in the works for another meeting meant to address a growing diplomatic impasse over the North's development of nuclear-armed missiles targeting the US mainland.

The stalemate comes despite past high-profile meetings between Trump and Kim.

Trump has played down a series of recent North Korean tests of short-range missiles and artillery systems that could strike US allies South Korea and Japan, which host tens of thousands of US troops. When asked as he arrived at the UN when he planned to meet with Kim Jong Un, Trump told reporters: "It could happen soon."

It could happen soon. "Trump meets later Monday with South Korean President Moon Jae-in, the driving force behind the initial diplomacy that led to the first Trump-Kim summit last year and replaced threats of war in 2017."

## NOT WORRIED AT ALL- TRUMP

**WASHINGTON** - President Donald Trump on Monday dismissed the threat of impeachment over allegations that he tried to pressure Ukraine's leader into investigating his 2020 election rival Joe Biden.

Asked if he was taking the threat from some Democrats seriously, Trump answered: "Not at all seriously." US media reports revealed that an intelligence community whistleblower had filed a report after becoming alarmed at Trump's alleged attempt to pressure Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky in a phone call.

Trump has confirmed that he discussed what he says was corruption by Biden's family during the call but denies applying pressure on Zelensky.

"We had a perfect phone call," he told reporters on arrival at the United Nations in New York. "Everybody knows it's just a

Democrat witch hunt." Trump has spent much of his first term as president fighting off allegations that he benefited from Russian-sponsored interference during his surprise 2016 win over Democratic opponent Hillary Clinton.

As the 2020 election approaches, worries are mounting over further attempts from abroad to meddle in the tense US political landscape.

Against that background, the whistleblower's reported raising of the alarm has thrown Washington into renewed turmoil. According to some reports Trump tried to pressure Zelensky to go after Biden by temporarily withholding US military aid to Ukraine.

Growing numbers of Democrats believe they should open impeachment proceedings against Trump.

## IRAN WAS BEHIND SAUDI OIL ATTACK - UK

**LONDON** - UK Prime Minister Boris Johnson said that there was "a very high degree of probability" that Iran was behind an attack on Saudi Arabia's oil facilities that wiped out half of its production.

Two major oil refineries in Saudi Arabia came under attack last week, knocking out about five per cent of the world's daily production of crude oil, equal to about five million barrels. Yemen's Houthi rebel group claimed responsibility for the attacks, though the US and Saudi Arabia have pointed a finger towards Iran. Iran has denied the claims.

Speaking to reporters flying with him to the United Nations General Assembly in New York, Johnson said his government is now "attributing responsibility

with a very high degree of probability to Iran" for the September 14 attacks.

"We think it's very likely indeed that Iran was indeed responsible, using both drones and cruise missiles," he told reporters, according to the Guardian.

"We will be working with our American friends and our European friends to construct a response that tries to de-escalate tensions in the Gulf region," he added.

Johnson stressed that he wanted to avoid escalating the situation in the region, but said Britain would respond to a call from its allies for military support.

"On what kind of action we can take, you'll have seen that the Americans are proposing to do more to help to defend Saudi Arabia, and we will be following that closely," he said.

"And clearly if we are asked, either by the Saudis or by the Americans, to have a role, then we will consider in what way we could be useful."

"We will consider in what way we could be useful, if asked, depending on what the exact plan is."

When pressed on what specific action the UK was willing to take the address the crisis, Johnson called for a unified response.

"There is certainly a case for responding together, and that's what we're going to do." Johnson's comments follow a US announcement on Friday that it would be sending in a "moderate deployment" of American troops to Saudi Arabia in response to the attack.

**INDONESIA** - At least 20 people were killed and dozens more injured as fresh unrest erupted in Indonesia's restive Papua region on Monday, with some victims burned to death in buildings set ablaze by protesters, authorities said. "Most of them died in a fire," said Papua military spokesperson Eko Daryanto. "The death toll could go up because many were trapped in burning kiosks."

### Two 6-year-olds arrested in school

**FLORIDA** - A police officer who arrested two six-year-old children in a Florida school has been suspended and the incident will be investigated, police said on Monday. The grandmother of one of the children, Kaia Rolle, said she was arrested after she threw a temper tantrum and kicked somebody. The incident has revived the debate over the role of police officers in public schools, 46 per cent of which have an officer present for at least one day a week.

**NEW YORK** - Hundreds of South Africans gathered in New York on Saturday in a show of solidarity against gender-based violence in South Africa. The silent demonstration saw about 200 South Africans from New Jersey, Maryland, California, Colorado, Washington, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania gather in the heart of New York, Times Square, for a silent demonstration. The demonstrations were organised by South African cultural exchange visitor Iman Jeneker, who said when she heard the news from South Africa, she felt numb. *News24*

### Bomb disposal officers respond

**MANCHESTER** - Bomb disposal officers carried out a controlled explosion on a suspicious package at Manchester Airport on Monday, police said, adding a man had been detained by officers at the scene. Flights were unaffected but transport to and from the airport was stopped while officers assessed the suspect package. "A cordon is in place at Manchester Airport transport interchange and people are encouraged to follow directions from officers," Greater Manchester police said in a statement. *AFP*

## Harry and Meghan join SA's fight against gender violence

**CAPE TOWN** - Prince Harry on Monday urged South African men to turn their back on toxic masculinity as his wife Meghan applauded girls for 'standing up for what's right'.

The British royal couple had launched their first official tour since becoming parents in May.

The pair joined campaigners in Cape Town fighting South Africa's stratospheric rates of violence against women on the first stage of a 10-day swing through southern Africa.

Prince Harry, Meghan and baby Archie landed by commercial flight from London before heading to Nyanga — a township crippled by gang violence and the highest murder rate in the country, and a far cry from Cape Town's image for pristine beaches and rolling vineyards.

A small excited crowd gathered to greet the royal pair as they arrived to visit Justice Desk, a human rights charity, where they surprised young girls in the middle of a self-defence class. South Africa is one of the world's most

dangerous places, particularly for women. At least 137 sexual offences are com-

mitted per day, according to official figures. In August alone, more than 50

women were killed by their spouses. President Cyril Ramaphosa has vowed to crack down on perpetrators after 'femicide' protests flared across the country this month.

Prince Harry, clad in a light-blue linen shirt and sneakers, joined Meghan, in a patterned black-and-white dress, as they hugged children and danced with them before entering the charity premises. Surprised girls yanked off their boxing gloves to hear the couple speak. "Touching on what your President said last week — no man is born to cause harm to women," said Prince Harry. "It's about redefining masculinity, it's about creating your own footprints for your children to follow in, so that you can make a positive change for the future."

Meghan, a mixed-race American who has been advocating women's rights long before marrying Harry in 2017, congratulated girls "standing up for what's right in the face of adversity". "While I'm here with my husband and as a member of the royal family, I am here as a mother, a wife, a woman of

colour and your sister," she added, prompting cheers from the crowd. Demonstrations in South Africa have been mounting over the rising toll of murders, rapes and abuse of women and girls, and a sense of impunity that surrounds it. A walk through history The couple later toured District Six museum, a memorial to the expulsion of some 60 000 non-white residents from the city centre during apartheid. The Duke and Duchess — who describes herself as 'half black and half white' — were thrust into South Africa's history and life under the apartheid regime, which classed and divided people according to their skin colour. Those defined as 'black' or 'coloured' were considered second-class citizens and only allowed in 'white-only' areas provided they had a pass. "To have the royal couple here helps to unite people and... look past the pain, especially because we're a diverse culture," Gabriela Wiener, a spokeswoman for District Six, told AFP.

Crowds lined the streets to catch a glimpse of the pair. For some in South Africa, the presence of a royal with mixed heritage could make this visit particularly special. "My mom really wanted to be here, that's why we came. Meghan is a role model to me and my sister," said Shazia Ebrahim, a 22-year-old architect student standing outside District Six. *Citizen*

## Thieves hit home of national police commissioner

**JOHANNESBURG** - Thieves have made off with two TV sets from national police commissioner Khehla Sitole's Mpumalanga home, SAPS confirmed on Monday.

Spokesperson Brigadier Vishnu Naidoo said the items were stolen by criminals who were "purely opportunistic".

The commissioner's house is under

construction and the work was near completion when the theft occurred last Saturday while the General was attending a summit in Cape Town, Naidoo said. Nothing else was stolen from the house.

News24 understands that there was no sign of forced entry onto the premises. Investigations are underway.

## Mob attacks, sets alight man accused of raping disabled teen

**JOHANNESBURG** - A 39-year-old man was attacked and set alight by a mob at the Muhovhoya village in Limpopo on Monday.

Police said yesterday they had responded to frantic calls from the area and, on arrival, made the gruesome discovery of the man's badly burnt body. The victim was certified dead on the scene. None of his attackers were present when officers arrived.

The attack was prompted by allegations that the man had raped a 17-year-old mentally disabled girl in the area. "It is alleged that the girl went to the nearby bushes to collect firewood with other women from the area when the deceased attacked her. The other women managed to get away, leaving the teenage girl behind. And that's when the deceased allegedly raped her," said police

Spokesperson, Col Moatshe Ngoepe. He said the enraged community attacked the man with various objects before he was set alight. Before the attack, the community gathered 'to discuss the matter'.

"They then started tracing the suspect until they caught him around the village and attacked him," said Ngoepe.

A case of murder was opened, the suspects involved were still unknown and there had been no arrests made, police said. A manhunt for those involved has been launched, and police have asked those with information to come forward to assist in the investigation.

Limpopo Police Commissioner Lt-Gen Nneke Ledwaba condemned the continuous acts of mob attacks and killings, which are prevalent in many parts of the province. *SowetanLive*

## 'Making sexual offenders registry public a recipe for disaster'

**JOHANNESBURG** - Following the high prevalence of violence against women and children in the month of August, the question over whether the sexual offenders registry should be open to the public has been brought to the fore.

Social movement Amandla.Mobi has petitioned Justice Minister Ronald Lamola to 'make the sex offenders list publicly accessible online and on mobile platforms that anyone can easily access'. The petition was created 18 days ago with the goal of garnering 8 000 signatures. To date, the organisation has collected 7 842 signatures.

This followed a series of protests under the hashtag #AmINext, after the tragic deaths of young women in South Africa, including Sinethemba Ndlovu, Uyinene Mrwetyana, Leighandre Jegels, Meghan Cremer and Ayakha Jiyane and her three siblings — all acts of gender-based violence, News24 reported. What is the National Register for Sexual Offenders? The National Register for Sexual Offenders (NRSO) — established through an Act of Parliament in 2007 — details a list of persons convicted of sexual offences against children and mentally disabled people.

The list is currently open to various institutions such as schools, creches, hospitals and employers in the private sector to ensure that a person who is not fit, is not hired to work with children and mentally disabled people.

## Woman apologises to Tumi Sole over defamatory allegations

**DURBAN** - A woman who accused lawyer and social media activist Tumi Sole of raping her in a Durban hotel room and giving her HIV has issued a public apology, calling her claims false and defamatory.

Tinah Mashiloane issued the apology on social media following allegations that emerged as part of the outing of alleged sex offenders on Twitter as part of the #AmINext movement following high-profile acts of violence against women in recent weeks.

"The allegations following on several other messages that I had sent to Sole in which I had been making threats against him and his family since August 1, 2019. I also created a fake account under Lerato Motsoeneng @leratoMotsoene8 and repeated these false and defamatory allegations that I made against Mr Sole," her apology read. She received a lawyer's letter on September 2, and initially denied she had been the one who posted the allegations.

## 'Bring allegations to authorities'

**JOHANNESBURG** - Allegations against ANC MP and former North West premier Supra Mahumapelo must be 'ventilated through a court of law', ANC Spokesperson Pule Mabe told broadcaster eNCA on Monday.

This after allegations emerged on Sunday that Mahumapelo was linked to the 2015 murder of North West businessman Wandile Bozwana.

Sunday World reported he and former Rustenburg mayor Matthew Wolmarans, who is also an MP, offered R10m to assassins to kill Bozwana. According to the paper, that information was contained in an affidavit filed by a gang member, who is now a state witness, in May 2016. The witness reportedly led the police to other sus-

pects in connection with the hit on Bozwana.

Mahumapelo denied the allegations, saying it was 'complete fabricated lies' made against him by some within the ANC since he assumed the role of premier, News24 reported.

"The allegations are part of a plan to destroy me in all forms of my existence by some ANC members," he said, adding he would elaborate on this claim at a later stage.

He insisted this was part of a plan to silence him from sharing his views on wrongdoings in the ANC and being an activist for the governing party. Speaking to eNCA, Mabe said: "It would be difficult to determine the fate of comrades on allegations."

## 'Keep universities safe, but don't turn them into prisons'

**JOHANNESBURG** - There is a fine line between keeping universities safe and turning them into prisons.

This is one of the major challenges that the department of higher education and training is looking to address.

According to Minister Blade Nzimande, engagement between his department and members of the Private Security Industry Regulatory Authority (PSIRA) is vital in dealing with the issue.

Nzimande was addressing the media in Durban in the wake of at least two incidents in the province - one in which a student at the University of Zululand

(UNIZULU) was stabbed and robbed at his off-campus accommodation, and another in which a student died after being stabbed in a lecture room at the Durban University of Technology (DUT). Nzimande said

he would soon engage with PSIRA regarding the roles of private security at universities. "A

lot of the security companies are not trained or have experience in crowd control, and PSIRA are concerned about this," he said.

The minister said while he understood the importance of security in ensuring the safety of students, security companies could not take over the role of police. "The minister of police has agreed that dealing with the matter of safety and security lies with the police," he said.

Nzimande began his speech by expressing his con-

cerns for Sandile Ndlovu, a first-year industrial engineering student who was attacked in a lecture hall at DUT's Steve Biko campus two weeks ago.

"I again wish to express my heartfelt condolences to his family, friends and fellow students on his passing, and further express my most serious concern about the often tragic deaths of university students on some of our campuses," he said. He urged the criminal justice system to ensure a speedy arrest and prosecution of the people responsible for Ndlovu's death.

Nzimande also addressed the acts of

violence and unrest at UNIZULU, which saw members of the community destroy the local satellite police station after Msawenkosi Nxumalo was shot and robbed at his unaccredited off-campus accommodation.

"UNIZULU students have highlighted the vulnerability of students living off campus to burglary and related violent crimes - and the dire shortage of sufficient and safe student housing on the university campus." He said after meeting with university management on Friday, he had informed them that an agreement had been met between Universities South Africa (USAf) and his department.

## ZONDO WANTS ANSWERS

**JOHANNESBURG** - Deputy Chief Justice Raymond Zondo wants answers from Minister of Police Bheki Cele and National Commissioner Khehla Sitole on the lack of urgency in declassifying documents related to alleged criminal activity at crime intelligence.

Legal representatives from Cele's office told Zondo at the state capture inquiry on Monday that they plan to apply to give his version of events in matters mentioned by Hawks official Kobus Roelofse who testified at the commission last week.

Roelofse alleged that Cele had been paid money to push through the restructuring of the crime intelligence cluster when he was the

national commissioner of police. Adv Griffiths Madonsela, for Cele, said the minister was having troubling compiling his response as he had issues with getting documents declassified.

Zondo said he was surprised that Cele was having issues as he had hoped the minister would be able to explain to the commission why documents were not being declassified with no proper reasons given. Roelofse had testified that he had tried numerous times approaching former police commissioners to declassify documents related to corruption at crime intelligence. He was investigating the looting of the

crime intelligence secret service fund.

Those who were alleged to be involved in the looting included former crime intelligence boss Richard Mdluli.

Zondo said the commission needed clear answers as to the status of declassifying documents. "Arising from Roelofse's evidence, I am very determined that the commission must get a response from the national commissioner on whether he is willing to declassify the information. And if he won't the reasons why he will not. At the face of it appears the documents that are important to solving crimes were

classified or not being declassified without proper reasons given to Roelofse," Zondo said. "I was amazed at the evidence he (Roelofse) gave, and one of the questions I asked him is if he had approached the minister of police to say that different national commissioners have no cooperated and for him to intervene. I thought that since if the national minister of police needs documents declassified it would not be a problem for him. It would be very strange to me, especially with documents that deal with possible wrongdoing, that even the minister can be bypassed in terms of some situations." *Political Bureau*

## Beneficiary list to blame for delay in military veterans

**PARLIAMENT** - Human Settlements, Water and Sanitation Minister Lindiwe Sisulu has blamed the delays in the building and allocation of housing for military veterans on the beneficiary list that posed challenges to her department.

"The finalisation and authentication of the beneficiary list by my department and the Department of Military Veterans has presented challenges for us. The completion of this process prior to the commencement of a military veterans' housing project is very vital for planning," Sisulu said.

She was responding to a parliamentary question from EFF's Laetitia Arries, who asked about delays in the building and allocation of housing for military veterans and whether there were any plans to speed up the process.

Sisulu said where her department proceeded to build and complete a project while the approved list had not been finalised, houses have been invaded by military veterans who did not qualify for these houses. She also said provincial structures of the South African Military Veterans Association in most cases disputed the beneficiary lists submitted by the Department of Military Veterans.

The minister conceded that the Military Veterans Programme has not been performing as expected. "We are extremely concerned about the slow pace of delivery to our military veterans."

Sisulu said they had on May 3 convened a National Military Veterans Dialogue to exchange views and dialogue around finding solutions to challenges encountered in the provision of housing for military veterans. "It has become evident to me that we have not moved far enough with delivery on this programme." *Political Bureau*

## ROAD SAFETY STARTS WITH CHANGING BEHAVIOUR

**JOHANNESBURG** - Transport Minister Fikile Mbalula has urged members of society to play an active role in road safety after the recent spate of fatalities on South Africa's roads.

The call comes in the wake of crashes, each with multiple fatalities, in the Western Cape, Free State, KwaZulu-Natal, Limpopo and Mpumalanga since last Thursday.

"We must all appreciate that safety on our roads is a collective responsibility we must all shoulder. Each one of us must be able to define their individual contribution to making

our roads safer for our children as well as future generations.

"This starts with changing the behaviour that places the lives of other road users at risk," said Mbalula. He said his department had taken solid steps towards curbing the fatalities, but cited road user behaviour as important in the process. "The roll-out of the Administrative Adjudication of Road Traffic Offences (AARTO) is not just about a more efficient way of adjudicating road traffic offences, but also about creating effective incentives to change road user behaviour," said Mbalula. *Times Live*

## Public works owed R76.8m in unpaid rental fees

**JOHANNESBURG** - A total of R76.8 million was currently outstanding in unpaid rental fees for properties under Public Works and Infrastructure Department's custodianship.

Public Works and Infrastructure Minister Patricia de Lille revealed this on Monday in a written response to a parliamentary question from DA's Patricia Kopane.

In her written reply, De Lille said the Pretoria region owed R37.5m, Cape Town R11.7m, Johannesburg R9m, Kimberly R6.4m, Mmabatho R3.9m, Polokwane R3.6m, Durban R1.5m, Port Elizabeth region R1.3m,

Bloemfontein R838 059, Mthatha R420 743 and Nelspruit R279 513.

She named Telkom, Lucky Star, Eastgate Airport, Houtbay Boat Yard, Troyan Foods, Afrima Import Export, Sea Freeze Fisheries, Inter Travel Shops, Fisha Wellness and Abagold as the top 10 entities renting property from her department that regularly fail to pay rental fees on time.

De Lille also said her department has developed acquisition and disposal framework in collaboration with the National Treasury with the latter appointing new officials in the Office of the Chief Procurement Officer. *Political Bureau*

## ONLY BUHARI CAN STOP PLANNED STRIKE - LABOUR

**ABUJA - Organised Labour has said only the personal intervention by President Muhammadu Buhari can stop the planned nationwide strike over consequential adjustment arising from the N30 000 new minimum wage.**

Speaking to Vanguard, Secretary to the Trade Union Side, TUS, of the Joint National Public Service Negotiating Council, JNPSNC, Alade Bashir Lawal, said organs of various public sector unions were already meeting and leaders were also reaching out to other section of Labour movement and civil society allies for support.

Lawal, who is also the Secretary-General of the Association of Senior Civil Servants of Nigeria, ASCSN, informed that mobilisation ahead of the strike had heightened and very soon the nationwide would commence.

He accused some members of the government side in the JNPSNC of working for some individuals with vested interest and personal gains, and not the government or President Buhari.

Recall that last week, Organised Labour had directed civil servants to prepare for a nationwide strike that "It has become clear that the Government Side is not serious about paying millions of workers a new national Minimum Wage and adequate consequential adjustment but prefer taking the Trade Unions for a ride. As a responsible Trade Union, the TUS has given the government enough time to come to term with workers demand but it appears

that the only language necessary for Government to act is a strike."

According to Lawal, "Before the last meeting, our position was that from levels 7 to 14 it should be 29 per cent and then, from levels 15 to 17, 24 Percent. That was our position. The government delegation position before that meeting was 10 per cent, for levels 7 to 14, and 5.5 per cent for levels 15 to 17.

"Then, we agreed that since the two sides were not shifting grounds that the government side should go and present the scenario to Mr President. It was our belief that it was possible when Mr President saw the difference between the two sides, he would be able to appreciate what Labour was saying. For us, it is Mr President that sends you (government negotiating team) on the errand, go back and report to him.

"When we reconvened, we knew there was a booby trap somewhere.

## Shortages loom as Harare shuts main water plant

**HARARE - Zimbabwe's capital shut its main water works on Monday citing shortages of foreign currency to import treatment chemicals, the deputy mayor said, potentially leaving the city dry and raising the risk of water borne diseases like cholera.**

Last year, the southern African nation suffered its worst cholera outbreak in a decade, which killed at least 26 people mainly in Harare, due to burst sewers and inadequate water supplies.

An El Nino-induced drought has reduced water levels in the country's dams, including Kariba, which supplies the biggest hydro electricity plant and hit the capacity of cities and towns to supply water to residents. Harare City Council Deputy Mayor Enock Mupamawonde told reporters that the local authority required at least 40 million Zimbabwe dollars (US\$2.7 million) a month for water chemicals but it was only collecting 15 million Zimbabwe dollars in monthly revenue. *Reuters*

## Gunmen kidnap 27 people in Nigeria

**JOHANNESBURG - Gunmen have kidnapped 27 people in Nigeria's Kaduna and Osun states, with 13 of those abducted from two villages along the Kaduna-Abuja highway on Sunday and Monday.**

A source from the affected communities said that seven people were kidnapped at Begiwa Kaso on Saturday while another six people were kidnapped in the early hours of Monday at Dutse, all in the Chikun local government area of Kaduna state, along the Kaduna-Abuja highway, the Leadership reported yesterday.

The armed gunmen, suspected of being criminals, stormed the villages before opening fire indiscriminately and then abducting the kidnap victims to an unknown destination without asking for a ransom as villagers continue to live in fear that the bandits could return.

In the other incident suspected Fulani herdsmen have also reportedly kidnapped 18 passengers, including the driver, from a bus as it drove along Otan/Imesi-Ile road in Osun.

Clashes, between the mostly Muslim nomadic Fulani herdsmen and pastoralist Christian farmers over land and water resources, have led to hundreds of deaths and many more displacements over the years. *African News Agency*

## Egyptian authorities detain award-winning human rights lawyer

**CAIRO - Authorities in Egypt detained an award-winning human rights lawyer on Sunday after she attended judicial investigations into protesters arrested during rare demonstrations against President Abdel Fattah el-Sisi.**

Mahienour el-Massry was arrested as soon as she left the state security

prosecutor's headquarters in the capital, Cairo, where she acted as the lawyer for several people detained during the demonstrations, her lawyer Tarek al-Awadi said.

Hundreds of Egyptians took to the streets in Cairo and several other cities across the country on Friday to call for Sisi's departure. According to the

Egyptian Centre for Economic and Social Rights, 365 people have since been arrested. El-Massry, a political activist and human rights defender, has been tried and jailed twice for taking part in protests. In December 2013, following the army's overthrow of president Mohamed Morsi following mass protests, she was arrest-

ed and imprisoned until September 2014 on charges of participating in a demonstration without a permit.

While in prison, el-Massry received the Ludovic Trarieux Award, an international prize given annually to a lawyer for contributions to human rights.

### Darfur students protest for third day

**JOHANNESBURG - Despite Sudan's political progress towards an interim government following months of protests which eventually ousted former president Omar Al Bashir, student protests are continuing in South Darfur over bread and fuel shortages - and the call for justice. Three days of consecutive protests in South Darfur's capital Nyala continued on Monday as the Marginalisation Force Group, a civil society organisation, called for a procession of justice to take place on Tuesday at 1pm in five major cities representing the capitals of the states of Darfur, the Middle East Monitor reported. *African News Agency***

### 'Refinery revamps set for January'

**INTERNATIONAL - Full restoration work on all three of Nigeria's state-owned refineries will begin in January, the Nigerian National Petroleum Corporation (NNPC) said in a statement on Saturday. NNPC Chief Mele Kyari said the company will do everything possible between October and December to make the projects possible. Restoring state-owned refineries in Port Harcourt, Warri and Kaduna has been a long-sought, but elusive, goal for NNPC. *Reuters***

### '2019/20 cashew nut output up 33%'

**INTERNATIONAL - Tanzania expects to raise cashew nuts production by 33.5 per cent in the year to September 2020, helped by favourable weather conditions and increased plantings, its agriculture minister said on Saturday. Output in 2019/20 (October-September) is seen reaching 300 000 tonnes, up from the 225 000 tonnes produced in the 2018/19 season. "We expect to get a bigger harvest in the coming season, with our cashew nut production likely to rise to more than 300 000 tonnes," the Minister, Japhet Hasunga, told Reuters. *Reuters***

### Malawi to get UN Award for Ncds

**LILONGWE - The United Nations is on Monday expected to give Malawi an award for the outstanding work and contribution the country is making in achieving the Non Communicable Diseases (NCDs) related Sustainable Development Goals. The country will receive the United Nations Interagency Task Force for the Prevention and Control of Non-Communicable Diseases Award through the Ministry of Health and Population. *All Africa***

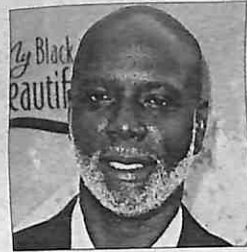

# SAMOA CLINCH BONUS-POINT WIN AGAINST RUSSIA



**KUMAGAYA - Marauding winger Ed Fidow bagged a quickfire double as Samoa beat Russia 34-9 in a bruising Rugby World Cup encounter yesterday.**

Fidow provided the spark in a tempestuous Pool A clash after the Pacific islanders were reduced to 13 men in the first half for two reckless tackles in steamy Kumagaya.

"To lose two players, go down to 13 men and we didn't lose on the score, (I'm) really proud of the effort," said Samoa coach Steve Jackson.

"We knew we would come out after half-time and the boys were still fresh. I'm just glad we got over the line."

Russia coach Lyn Jones bemoaned his team's short, four-day turnaround after his team lost 30-10 to Japan in the tournament-opener on Saturday.

"It's very disappointing. The performance wasn't what we expected. However, the short turnaround has affected us tactically and mentally," said the Welshman.

"I thought we could play the same tactics as Japan but it wasn't going to be tonight. We needed more time to prepare. It's not the physical deterioration, it was the mental. We just weren't there tonight."

Samoa, World Cup quarter-finalists in 1991 and 1995, began the game pumped up after a passionate performance of their 'siva tau' war dance.

And they went ahead after 15 minutes when a superb pass from Tim Nanai-Williams - cousin of All Black star Sonny Bill - found Alapati Leiua to crash over for the first of his brace.

But Russia fly-half Yury Kushnarev, making a record-extending 111th appearance for the Bears, kicked a pair of penalties to give the Bears a 6-5 half-time lead which should

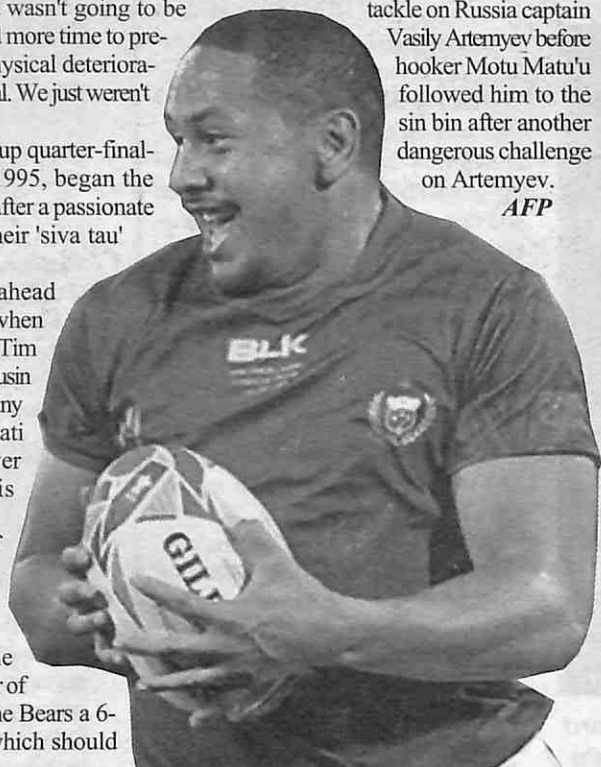
have been more after Samoa played almost 10 minutes with 13 men.

## French fume over scrum refereeing at World Cup

**PARIS - France's players are fuming over the refereeing during their last-gasp win over Argentina in their Pool C opener at the Rugby World Cup.**

'Les Bleus' won Saturday's encounter 23-21 in Tokyo thanks to a Camille Lopez drop goal 10 minutes from time but the French feel Australian referee Angus Gardner failed to sanction their opponents for engaging early in the scrum, which is forbidden under new rules.

"We worked for weeks not to engage early, and on the first three scrums they put pressure on us and the referee didn't say much," France captain and hooker Guilhem Guirado was quoted as saying by sports daily L'Equipe on Tuesday.

"We got screwed," prop Jefferson Poirot added.

France, however, have vowed to be smarter when they take on the United States in their second game on October 2.

## RECORD-BREAKER JANTJIES EPITOMISES NAMIBIA'S NEVER-SAY-DIE SPIRIT

**HIGASHI-OSAKA - After almost quitting rugby in 2011, the veteran scrum-half Eugene Jantjies becomes the first Namibian to play in four World Cups.**

In 2011, he had to give serious thoughts to the physical and financial demands of the sport in his homeland.

But on Sunday against Italy, he deservedly wrote his name into the record books of his proud nation.

By stepping on to the field in the second half and helping Namibia finish the game strongly by playing a key role in two finely crafted team tries, the 33-year-old veteran of 2007, 2011 and 2015 became the first

Namibian to appear at four World Cups.

Since making his debut against Kenya in May 2006, aged 20, Jantjies has won 68 caps and played club rugby in Romania, South Africa and currently for the Windhoek Draught Welwitschias based in the Namibian capital.

In a country with fewer than 900 registered players, the vast majority of whom have to juggle full-time jobs to pay the bills, it is an achievement that deserves special recognition.

"It's not getting easier," Jantjies said. "It's hard to go through this for four World Cups. Sometimes you want to give up. I wanted to give up in 2011 after the second one because of money issues and politics. But then I thought, I can still run, I can still play, and I just kept going."

The 33-year-old is now just one tournament behind rugby royalty Sergio Parisse, who joined Italian compatriot Mauro Bergamasco (1999-2015) and Samoa's Brain Lima (1991-2007) on five World Cups in the Azzurri's 47-22 win over Namibia on Sunday.

Jantjies credits his remarkable longevity in such an uncompromising sport to an attitude built around the words "believe, trust, laugh and unity", words he has had tattooed across his body as a daily reminder to stay focused through Namibia's many highs and lows. "It was hard when I was younger and it's still hard to play rugby at this level now but I still enjoy it," he said. "If you enjoy it, why not?"

## All Blacks prolong guessing game over RWC centres

**OITA - The All Blacks selectors have settled on their much-debated top midfield combination, but they're keeping their preference under wraps.**

After Ryan Crotty and Anton Lienert-Brown started in their blockbuster opener against South Africa, the veteran Sonny Bill Williams and rising talent Jack Goodhue can expect plenty of game time against Canada, Namibia and Italy before the quarter-finals.

Assistant coach Ian Foster believes it's good practice to mix up the midfield foursome so there is familiarity for all possible combinations.

"Do we know what our leading midfield is? Probably. We've got a good idea. I'm not going to tell you but I'm really happy with the combinations we're developing," Foster said.

"History's told us it's a physical area. We've often had to make changes in that area in the last two years. We haven't had a lot of consistency of two guys doing the role for a whole

lot of Tests in a row. Some people see that as a negative, we see that as a positive."

Settling on the centres is the last piece in the puzzle for the All Blacks' A-list backline, with the coaches seemingly happy with Aaron Smith and Richie Mo'unga as halves with Beauden Barrett as a roving fullback and the energetic George Horne and Sevu Reece on the wings.

The defending champions, who headed to the hot-springs resort city of Beppu in southern Japan on Tuesday, have a 10-day break before their next match against Canada.

But Foster said there will be no slacking off.

"The reality is we've got three more opportunities to hone our game and to get it to the point we need it to be at," he said.

"The only way we're going to progress any further is if we keep trying to meet our own expectations on a daily basis."

## War of words between Fiji, Australia at World Cup

**TOKYO - Fiji coach John McKee lashed out yesterday at Australian counterpart Michael Cheika, suggesting the Wallaby has a different idea of the 'spirit of the game' amid a row over a high tackle.**

Fiji were up 11-7 when the incident occurred, with many commentators saying the tackle had prevented a certain score and should have resulted in a penalty try for the underdogs - and a red card for Hodge.

"From our side we lost a player who was nearly the most influential player on the park at that time of the game, for the rest of the game, and because of the head injury he can't play in this game (Wednesday versus Uruguay) either," McKee told reporters yesterday.

"Maybe Michael Cheika's views of what's within the spirit of the game are slightly different to some other people, but it's not up to me to decide what exactly he meant by that comment," fumed McKee, a New Zealander.

On Monday, Cheika had accused Fiji of going behind his back in referring the tackle after the coaching staff of both teams had enjoyed a 'friendly discussion'.

"To get a referral from them in the way it was referred, that was really disappointing," said Cheika.

"I'd prefer they come up to me and get upset with me if they're really upset about it, not to talk to me in that nice sort of friendly chat and go behind your back and put it in a referral."

In a pulsating Pool D encounter, Australia eventually ran out 39-21 winners but were behind well into the second half as the Flying Fijians produced a dazzling display of attacking rugby combined with bruising hits.

# STRUGGLING MAN UTD POST RECORD REVENUES OF £627M

**MANCHESTER** - Manchester United have posted record revenues of £627.1million for the latest financial year in yet another sign of where the club's current priorities lie.

However, Chief Executive Ed Woodward insists that club is still committed to matters on the pitch and insists that winning trophies still remains the number one goal at Old Trafford.

United have endured a tough start to the season on the pitch, with defeats by Crystal Palace and West Ham in the Premier League showcasing the flaws in Ole Gunnar Solskjaer's side.

United currently lie 10 points adrift of leaders Liverpool after only six matches. The financial figures will do little to placate fan anguish over the club's current onfield woes, but Woodward has sought to assure fans that matters on the pitch are of the utmost importance.

"We remain focused on our plan of rebuilding the team and continuing to strengthen our youth system, in line with the philosophy of the club and the manager," he said in a statement on Tuesday.

## Reflected

"This is reflected in the recent addition of three exciting first team players, key player contract extensions and the talent we have coming through our Academy.

"Everyone at United is committed to delivering on our primary objective of winning trophies."

Despite a significant outlay on the likes of defenders Harry Maguire and Aaron Wan-Bissaka and winger Daniel James

over the summer, the inability to replace striker Romelu Lukaku has been scrutinised.

Woodward added in the club's quarterly investors' call: "We and our growing global fan-base demand success. Success means winning trophies. That target and that standard has never changed for Manchester United.

"The progress we've made on the busi-

ness side underpins the continued investment in the football side.

"Much of the progress made around that investment in the academy, the recruitment department and the training-ground facilities is behind the scenes and therefore isn't immediately apparent to those on the outside looking in.

"These investments, together with the commitment we've made to Ole and his coaching staff in March have given us the building blocks for success.

## Patient

"Whilst we're confident this investment will deliver results, it's important that we are patient while Ole and his team build for the future.

"We will continue to focus on the long-term strategy and won't be influenced by short-term distractions."

Regarding a potential director of football, Woodward said: "We're continually reviewing and looking at the potential to evolve our structure on the football side.

"Much of the speculation on this type of role focuses purely on recruitment - an area we've evolved in recent years.

"As already mentioned, we feel that the players we've signed this summer demonstrate that this approach is the right one."

The club, whose stock has dropped more than seven per cent this year, is also lagging behind other European clubs that have either surpassed it in terms of revenue or are quickly looking to close the gap.

## KLOPP INSPIRED TO MAKE CHARITY PLEDGE

**LONDON** - Liverpool Manager Jurgen Klopp has revealed that the emotional high of his side's Champions League triumph inspired him to join the Common Goal charity.

Klopp will join a host of star names from the world of football, including Manchester United's Juan Mata and FIFA women's player of the year Megan Rapinoe, by donating one per cent of his salary to aid the work of charities across the world.

The 52-year-old, who was crowned FIFA men's coach of the year on Monday, told the Players Tribune of difficult times he suffered early in his career as an amateur footballer, working in a warehouse while trying to support his young family.

And while he now faces the pressure of trying to deliver Liverpool's first Premier League title in 30 years, Klopp insisted he and his players have the luxury of no longer living in the 'real world'.

"We should not forget what it was like when we had real problems," said Klopp.

"This bubble we live in is not the real world. I am sorry, but anything that happens on a football pitch is not a real problem. There should be a bigger purpose to this game than revenue and trophies, no?"

"Just think what we could accomplish if we all came together and gave one per cent of what we earn to make a positive difference in the world. Maybe I am naive. Maybe I am a crazy old dreamer. *AFP*

## Two jailed over online image of Sala's post-mortem

**LONDON** - Two people were jailed on Monday for illegally accessing CCTV footage of the post-mortem of footballer Emiliano Sala, who died in a plane crash in January, and posting images online.

CCTV company Director Sherry Bray, 49, was sentenced to 14 months in prison after pleading guilty to three counts of computer misuse and perverting the course of justice.

Her employee Christopher Ashford, 62, was jailed for five months after pleading guilty to three counts of computer misuse.

Sala's plane went down in the English Channel as he flew to Cardiff on January 21, two days after the

28-year-old had completed his transfer from French side Nantes to the Welsh club.

The footballer's sister Romina Sala said in a statement that the actions were 'wicked and evil', explaining she found out about the pictures when they appeared on Instagram.

"I'll never erase those images from my head," she said.

"My brother and mother can never forget about this. It's hard for me to live with this image."

The jailed pair illegally accessed the CCTV footage of the post-mortem, which took place at a mortuary in Bournemouth, southern England, on February 7.

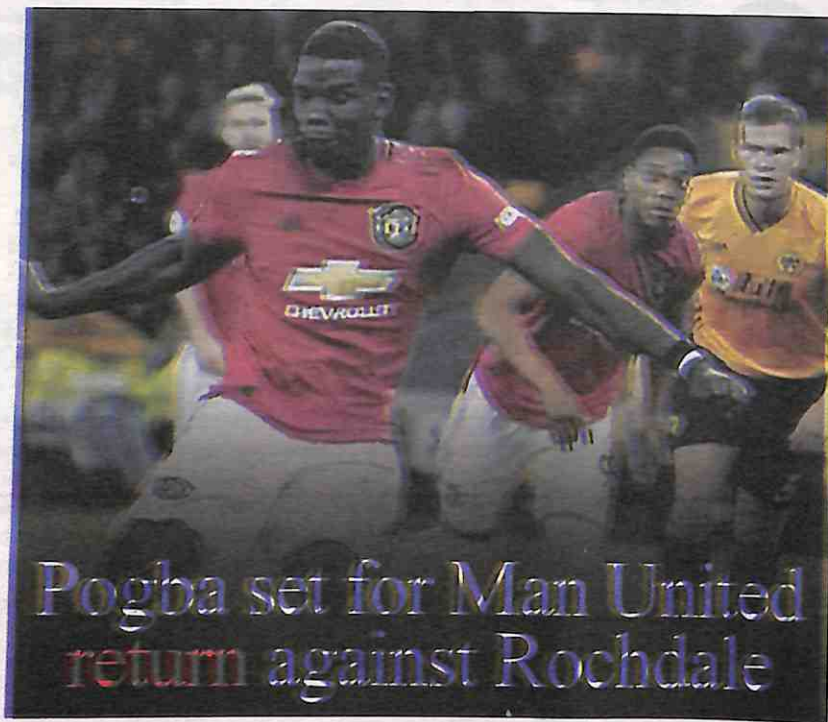

# FIFA CHIEF SAYS RACISM 'NOT ACCEPTABLE'

**MILAN** - FIFA President Gianni Infantino on Monday made a plea to "kick racism out" of Italian football, during the FIFA Best Football Awards ceremony in Milan.

"Tonight is a night to celebrate, but we should reflect a little bit," the Swiss-Italian football chief told a star-studded gathering at Milan's iconic La Scala Opera House.

"I would like to say that here in Italy

in my country, yesterday (Sunday) we witnessed again in the Italian championship an episode of racism.

"This is not acceptable any more, we have to say no to racism in society. We have to kick racism out of football and society once and for all."

Sunday's Italian league match between Atalanta and Fiorentina was halted for several minutes after racist abuse was aimed at the Tuscan side's Brazilian

player Dalbert in a game played in Parma. The problem is a recurring one throughout the peninsula.

This season Inter Milan's Belgian striker Romelu Lukaku and AC Milan's Ivorian player Franck Kessie have both been targeted by monkey calls without any sanction being taken.

Blaise Matuidi, Kalidou Koulibaly and Mose Kean were also victims last season. *Daily Mail*



## Football lawmakers consider temporary substitutions for head injuries

**LAUSANNE** - The body in charge of the laws of football is considering allowing temporary substitutions in cases of possible concussion, the International Football Association Board (IFAB) told AFP on Monday.

The IFAB confirmed that they will start with "deliberations on the assessment and management of concussions" in the game. Such temporary changes are already permitted in certain rugby matches when a player receives a head knock and needs to be assessed for

signs of more serious injury.

Allowing the player to be temporarily taken off for a period of up to 10 minutes would allow medical staff to determine if the player can return to the pitch.

An IFAB spokesperson said: "It may take some time until visible progress is made, due to the high complexity of the matter. We want to dedicate enough time and expertise to find the best solution for football."

## 'HE'S A SERIAL WINNER'

**LONDON** - Former Arsenal defender Paul Merson believes David Luiz should be named as the club's new captain.

Currently without a permanent club captain, midfielder Gaius Xhaka has been wearing the armband so far this season. But, after coming under heavy pressure from fans following a run of poor individual performances, there are calls for Xhaka to be replaced and Merson believes ex-Chelsea defender Luiz is the perfect candidate to step in.

Speaking on Sky Sports' The Debate, Merson said: "David Luiz has got to be captain, he's a serial winner. "People have a go at him because one week he'll be a 2/10 and the next a 9/10, but he's going to play every week." Naming a leadership group, instead of one traditional skipper for the season, is an approach which worries Merson. "The worrying thing for me is I heard the manager say he's going to have five captains, which tells me he has no idea what his team is."

"Unai Emery's been there a year-and-a-half, he's got to have five captains because he doesn't have

a clue what his best team is. He hasn't got a clue.

"The good teams are the ones who play virtually the same team every week, but with Arsenal you don't know who it'll be from week to week. "I'm not the greatest lover of a forward being the captain, but [Pierre-Emerick] Aubameyang's another one. Those front three should pick themselves straight away and you go from there - they'll play every week, if they're fit." Xhaka was criticised heavily on social media after his performance in Arsenal's 3-2 win against Aston Villa, with a chorus of boos ringing out at the Emirates as he was substituted in the second half. Similarly, Luiz has been lambasted for giving away penalties against Liverpool and Watford, the latter contributing to two points lost at Vicarage Road.

## Zinedine Zidane fed up as injury list grows

**MADRID** - Coach Zinedine Zidane expressed frustration about Real Madrid's growing injury list this season, after it emerged that defender Ferland Mendy will miss today's visit of Osasuna for a La Liga match.

Real have had a bumpy start to the season, with other members of the first team squad picking up more than 10 separate problems between them so far. For French full back Mendy it is the second muscle injury he has picked up since joining from Lyon in the summer.

"It annoys me a lot because I don't want my players to get injured, but it's a part of football. It doesn't worry me," Zidane told a news conference.

"Hopefully it's just one of those small things that can happen, because games at this level take a lot out of you."

"I'm annoyed that Ferland is out again because he was playing well and happy to be here. We need to have patience and let him recover."

Zidane, who has

also lost attacker Marco Asensio to a long-term knee injury, hinted there is a chance that midfielders Luka Modric and Isco could be fit, having missed the club's last four league games. Marcelo's back problem, which has seen the Brazilian miss the past week, might not be as bad as first feared either. "They're getting better. All three of them

are on the verge of joining up with the team and we'll see what we do for the game (against Osasuna)."

The Frenchman said the team staff were not to blame for the players' problems.

"All the fitness staff think about what is best for the players. I believe in the people whom I work with."

"We've shown that we know what we're doing. We worked well over pre-season and we're not the only side who has had injury issues. There are lots of factors at play." Real currently sit second in La Liga on 11 points, behind table toppers Athletic Bilbao on goal difference. Newly promoted Osasuna, who held Barcelona to a 2-2 draw last month, sit four points back in 11th.

## Mane, Shaqiri out injured

"Sadio has a knock, of course, but he looks good. With having today off and having treatment tomorrow, I think on Thursday he will be back in training again, so that looks all good."

Goalkeeper Alisson Becker and striker Divock Origi continue to remain sidelined with calf and ankle injuries, respectively, and will not be available for the match against the third-tier outfit.

"Ali is on his way back," Lijnders added.

"But as we know with a calf injuries you have to be careful, especially if you see how strong and big he is and how much weight he puts through his calves when he has to make these speed reactions."

"Divock is in the right way and has already been on the pitch, but not with the team yet so that's his next step. Hopefully that comes quickly."

Today we are looking at the diet for athletes. Diet can significantly affect performance in all sports, and a good diet is important if peak performance is to be achieved.

Nutrition is no substitute for fitness or skill, but it can help players to make the most of their abilities. Performance may be improved by dietary manipulation. Every player is different, and there is no single diet that meets the needs of all players always.

Individual needs also change across the season and players must be flexible to accommodate this.

Diet may have its biggest impact on training. A good diet can help support consistent intensive training while limiting the risks of illness or injury.

Good food choices can also promote adaptations to the training stimulus - as can lead to more improvement for the same training load.

The right diet is also important in preparing for games and in hastening recovery afterwards.

## DIET IN SPORTS

**The key nutrient requirements:**

**1. Carbohydrates** - This is the most important fuel for exercise. The players eating and drinking plan needs to provide enough carbohydrates to fuel their training programme and to optimise the recovery of muscle glycogen stores between trainings.

Actual needs are specific to the individual and must be fine-tuned to meet the specific training goals. An inadequate carbohydrate intake will lead to early fatigue. Examples of carbohydrate foods include breakfast cereals, rice, potatoes, breads, fruits and vegetables, pasta, etc.

**2. Protein** - Protein has been regarded as the key nutrient for sporting success by athletes of all eras and in all sporting codes. Protein plays a key role in the adaptations that take place in response to training.

Amino acids from building blocks for the manufacture of new tissue, including muscle and repair of old damaged tissue. They are also the



building blocks of hormones and enzymes that regulate metabolism and

other body functions. Examples of protein foods include, legumes, meat, poultry products, dairy products, cereals etc.

**3. Hydration** - Players should limit dehydration by drinking enough fluids. This includes water and sports drinks. Coaches should facilitate water breaks during trainings according to the weather and the intensity of the season. The negative effects of dehydration on high-intensity performance are greater in warmer environments so water breaks should be enough to avoid fluid deficit.

The use of commercial sports drinks with a carbohydrate content of about four - eight calories /100 ml allows carbohydrate and fluid needs to be met simultaneously in most events.

Players who sweat a lot of salt may be prone to muscle cramps and to avoid this, they should use electrolyte replenishing drinks or use the Oral

rehydration salts that come in sachets. A key strategy in staying hydrated is not to wait until you feel thirsty. Players

should avoid high caffeine energy drinks but should rely on caffeine present in tea, coffee and sports drinks.

**4. Vitamins, minerals and antioxidants** - Hard training place heavy stress on the body but good food choices can reduce their risk of harm. Adequate intakes of iron, copper, manganese, magnesium, selenium, sodium, zinc, and vitamins A, C, E, B6 and B12 are particularly important to health and performance. Antioxidant nutrients are important in helping protect the body's tissues against the stress of hard exercise.

**5. To ensure that you are eating a variety, make sure you eat a rainbow each day.** This includes: White e.g.; cauliflower, onions, banana, potatoes, pineapples, Green e.g.; broccoli, spinach, lettuce, green apples. Blue/ purple e.g.; blueberries, plums, grapes, Orange/yellow e.g.; carrots, oranges, mangoes, peaches, pumpkins, Red e.g.; tomatoes, watermelons, red peppers, red apples.

Lastly let's encourage athletes and teams to work with sports dieticians and nutritionists on individual athletes proper diet for them to perform well.

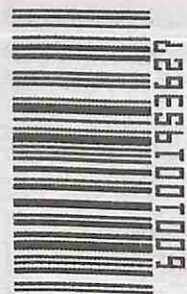
