

is Majesty King Mswati III yesterday appointed Phindile Dlamini as the new Commissioner General for His Majesty's Correctional Services.

This was during the Correctional Services Day held at Matsapha, under the theme 'Combating recidivism through community engage-

'Officers should be examplery in society'

he King has warned Correctional officers to lead a good life in soci-

He said this during his address at the Correctional Services Day.

He said officers had a duty to influence and transform lives of inmates and the general public through integrity and diligence. "Your behaviour at work and during your off-days should demonstrate the aspirations of a Correctional officer at all times. You should be a beacon of hope, and not a perpetrator," he stated.

He further encouraged the officers to continue being a shining star in the region through hard work, discipline, selfadvancement and professional competence in order to succeed in their challenging work.

He said the officers had a mandate to protect the public through enforcing the stipulated custodial sentences imposed by the judicial courts in the country and to ensure that all offenders serve their sentences.

Dlamini was promoted from the position of Commissioner of Correctional Services to that of Commissioner General, taking over from Isaiah Mzuthini Ntshangase who is now a member of Eswatini National Council Standing Committee, known as Ligogo. She is the first woman to be appointed to the position of Commissioner General.

In his speech, His Majesty acknowledged the importance of appointing women into positions of power. It is worth mentioning that even the ministry of justice and constitutional affairs is headed by a woman in the person of Pholile Shakantu.

The King first acknowledged the visitors from neighbouring countries who graced the event. He said their presence reflected the good

relations that existed between the countries. "Today we are reminded that your work borders on the emphasis of custodial and rehabilitation services. The Correctional centres should not be breeding grounds for hardened criminals, but places of self-introspection, reform, market-oriented vocational skills training and discipline," said His Majesty.

He said the programmes ensured that after rehabilitation there was smooth social reintegration of offenders back into society, ready to serve the community meaningfully. His Majesty explained that every person had the ability to change and refrain from relapsing into criminal activity and make a better life for themselves within a safer and more harmonious society.

HEALTH CRISIS: GOVT, NURSES BIG MEET

..Nurses invite MPs to assess extent of the situation in hospitals instead of minding non-issues such as encouraging women to dress gorgeously during church services

espite assertion by nurses that government action came about after, only being petitioned, a week later the health system continues to collapse with no intervention.

The Nurses Association has revealed that since their petition, government has failed to respond to their demands as well as their promise to invite them for discussions on the issues of health in the Kingdom.

This is despite the assurance by the ministry of health principal secretary Dr. Simon Zwane that he would engage nurses on the health issues.

Swaziland Nurses Association President Bheki Mamba said the situation had deteriorated further than the time of the petition as patients were now dying before their very eyes of nurses due, this time, to starvation.

He said lack of food for the patients who dearly need it for sheer survival was another addition to the shortage of medicines and poor working conditions coupled with delayed cost of living adjustments for nurses who must deal with the situation on a daily basis.

Mamba invited legislators to take interest in the issues of public health and health in general as it was now life threatening.

Petitions

Mamba further invited Members of Parliament to visit all public health facilities to better understand the situation first hand from the patients and nurses within their constituencies. He lamented that the ministry of health and the Prime Minister's office did not see it fit to respond to the petitions delivered to their offices highlighting the deplorable state of health in the country. He said such silence left them with no choice but to meet and strategise on implementing what they had planned in order to see the situation turned around.

"Up to now, we have not received any invite to discuss the situation as the PS promised when we gave him the petition. Similarly the prime ministers' office has not responded, which is a clear indication that they don't take the health situation seriously," said Mamba.

"Patients simply starve to death from lack of food. They can't take any medication without having eaten.

Struggle

He added: "Imagine an elderly person is referred to Mbabane Government Hospital for better medical treatment but there are no drugs and the person is being starved to death due to lack of food in the hospital and also without anyone bringing food for the patient".

Mamba further begged legislators to take particular interest in how health situations were struggling in the country. He said he read in the newspapers that an MP was concerned about issues of transportation of other people that are not supposed to use government transport. Mamba challenged the MPs



to be concerned about the life that is lost in the public health facilities as government continues to be silent much against a number of people no longer getting any assistance in the public health system in the country.

Last month, nurses gave government an ultimatum to solve the drugs shortage or face dire consequences, an unimaginable walk-out from all public health facilities in the four regions.

Government was given four weeks and it elapsed this week without any correspondence or invite for solution seeking talks by the ministry as promised.

Nurses sent a strong warning, promising to do all they can within their power to expose the real situation to the world; to report government's failure to address a problem of crippling drug shortages.

System

The nurses have vowed to come all out and beg the international community for assistance, including with money, just to save the health system.

They have threatened to use every platform available; funerals, weddings and any gathering to tell the masses about the lack of drugs at government hospitals because government peddles lies via state media without the voices of the people suffering at the health facilities.

They pleaded with government to declare the drugs shortage a health crisis and find a way to resolve the challenges with immediate effect.

The nurses said the ministry lied to the nation, saying it was sending drugs and supplies yet it was only sending allegedly expired nevarapine drugs for newborns and Panados.

They further claimed that there were no ARVs (antiretroviral) for scores of HIV positive patients in the country they invited the prime minister to visit all the country's health facilities to assess the situation.

The association, through their petition, further stated that not long ago the country introduced the nefarious 'test and treat' project: "We had raised that it will balloon costs of health care and compromise the supply of ARVs to all that need them, let alone the effects that might have on the metabolic system in the long run".

Nurses further alleged that the situation was so desperate that patients were now forced to buy their own medication and bring it back to nurses for assis-

Nurses made startling claims that patients were being given painkillers, while those with sugar diabetes were no longer getting assistance due to lack of supplies.

The ministry was not only confronted on the drugs and medical supplies but also that the hiring of nurses should be prioritised and the recruitment process be returned to the line ministry that better understands the dire need of nurses. The nurses claimed such technical recruitment cannot be political, demanding that the responsibility should be removed from relying on cabinet decision. Swaziland Nurses Association's Second Deputy Secretary Neliso Matsenjwa, who also read the petitions upon delivery warned that they noted that cabinet resolved not to hire or promote nurses anymore, yet the same could not be said of security forces, who are hired and promoted at a huge cost to the taxpayer.

"It's disheartening to note how cabinet is micro-managing recruitment processes, which has resulted to delayed filling of vacancies and contributed directly to the gross shortage of nurses in the country. We note that even a blocked toilet, for it to be fixed, there should be an approval by cabinet," reads the petition. The nurses association further demanded for a sound healthcare financing strategy to cushion the health are system in economically challenging times. "If this is not done in the next four weeks, we shall render the health sector unworkable".

They pleaded that government should desist from saying they are not willing to work whereas there was no medication to assist patients. Matsenjwa said they were trained professionals and all they did was guided by their professional code. She said government must make sure they had the drugs and supplies. "This we have done guided by our own professional code, in particular the principle of veracity, in that as we practice our profession we should do absolute justice when we treat our patients," added Matsenjwa.

Embattled Dvokolwako high finally opening

inally, there is light at the end of the tunnel as Dvokolwako High School parents have agreed to have the school opened. This was an outcome of a meeting held at Dvokolwako Umphakatsi as convened by Acting Chief Mahomedi Magagula. The chief had called his subjects in a bid to come out with a solution that would

see the school opening soon.

The meeting comes two weeks after the school was shut down by pupils who vandalised property to get their message across. The chaos started after there were claims that the school principal was involved in the death of several teachers and pupils. However, when the parents made their submissions before their chief, police and Hhohho District Commissioner representative, they only submitted that they were not pleased with Principal Sabelo Sibandze's rudeness towards them.

Several of the parents said they were even ready to repeat their ims in court or even before Sibandze himself. This pleased the chief because he was of the view that should in any case be the need for people to testify before any investigating team that may need to source information.

Although the parents agreed that the school should open even with Sibandze in office, the parents stated that there was still a bubbling cauldron of emotions regarding his style of governing. The parents said they were only agreeing that he should return because they were concerned about their children's future which was already in jeopardy since they had been at home for two weeks. Worth noting is that

the school was closed a day before mock examinations were to com-

Also, the parents only warmed up to the idea of Sibandze returning after they were informed that the ministry of education and training made it clear that the school could not open if Sibandze was not return-

However, although they agreed to accept Sibandze back, the parents also poured their hearts out to their chief with the hope that their grievances would be addressed. One of the parents who made a submission said in her experience with Sibandze, she was shocked to hear him refer to elderly parents as fools.

Another male parents said he had since stopped attending the school's parents' meetings because he was not pleased with the treatment he had received from Sibandze on several different occasions.

On the other hand, out of the 197 parents who had attended the meeting, only two said they did not want the school to reopen. When asked of his reasons, one of the parents

After the parent shad unanimously agreed to have Sibandze return in office, the parents Mgubane Masina said he was concerned about the principal's life. Masina said he worked closely with the pupils hence his concern.

In response to this, Hhohho DC representative Hlangabeza Shabangu implored parents to trust the ministry of education with logistics on how Sibandze will be protected while at work. He further assured the Dvokolwako residents that he would forward their decision to the ministry with the hope that means to have the school open soon would be made.



PUBLIC SECTOR ASSOCIATIONS' CoLA JUDGMENT ON MONDAY

They are calling for a 7.85 per cent CoLA provision which they feel should have been included in the national budget.

They argued that civil servants' salaries had not been adjusted for a very long time now which has eroded the buying power of the workers, amid the inflation rate that is ever increasing.

The Industrial Court had dismissed government's application to have the CoLA case postponed to March next year. Industrial Court Judge President Sifiso Nsibande found that the application for postponement was tantamount to interdicting industrial action by the public

sector associations.

The PSAs are the National Public Service and Allied Workers Union (NAPSAWU), Swaziland National Association of Teachers (SNAT), the Swaziland Democratic Nurses Union (SWADNU) and Swaziland National Association of Government Accounting Personnel (SNAGAP). The CoLA impasse between gov-


lalatini Development Cerrie Principal Glen Mazibuko yesterday issued a statement notifying parents and students that mock exams will start next week. Mazibuko in his statement announced that mock exams would resume on Tuesday at different centres following assistance from the ministry of education to ensure students write their mock exams.

The statement further stated that mock exams at the study centres start August 12 for all classes from Form One to Form Five. Mazibuko named the study centres as Elim Church in Nhlangano, Mankayane High School, New Haven Bible College, Siphofaneni High School, Lubombo Central High School, Mayiwane High School, Dwaleni High School and Ngwane Park High School.

Mazibuko said Mlalatini Development Centre students must prepare for the mock exams.

Mlalatini Development Centre (EDC) is a government institution that provides open and distance learning (ODL) programmes at junior and higher secondary education levels in Eswatini. EDC was mandated to offer first and second opportunities to the youth and adults of Eswatini who, for one reason or another, could not finish their secondary education.

Eswatini Exams Council Registrar Dr Edmund Mazibuko distanced his organisation from the mock exams, stating that such is a prerogative of the schools and has nothing to do with the Exams Council. Ministry of Education Principal Secretary Dr Sibongile Mtshali said she was not aware of the assistance given to the development study centre as she was busy with Parliament business for the ministry.

LABOUR BROKERS FIGHT BACK

usiness Eswatini is not taking the call to ban labour brokers and sub-contractors in the country lying down.

As such, the office of the Chief Executive Officer is currently engaging attorneys to consider legal action to interdict the ministry of labour against the proposed Employment

In an interview with President of Business Eswatini, Andrew Le Roux, said such a move by the Labour ministry was contrary to government's vision of creating jobs and promoting investment in the country. He spoke for labour brokers.

While labour brokerage can be simply defined as the practice of facilitating the contractual relationship between employer and employee, Le Roux said according the proposed Employment Bill of 2017, it remained unclear what really defines labour broking because with the current definition given, it appears to include even security guard companies and sub-contractors.

Le Roux said there was never meaningful consultation with all relevant stakeholders in coming up with The Employment Bill of 2017, which seeks to make these changes.

"There were a series of labour advisory board meetings where there were high level discussions on the Bill and almost all submissions made by Business Eswatini, which is the apex employer representative in the country, were disregarded," Le Roux said. He came to conclude that the Bill was a merely a product of decisions made between the Labour ministry and certain unions to propose what he is now calling the "TUCOSWA BILL".

He said as employers, Business Eswatini believes in government's vision of economic growth, something which the Bill brings about the direct opposite effect. "We look toward government and stakeholders in developing labour legislation that promotes job growth, protects employees and a country regarded as best in international labour prac-

This entire hullabaloo comes after Minister of Labour and Social Security

Makhosi Vilakati informed parliament that labour broking will be a thing of the past in three months' time. His promise to Parliament came after Members of Parliament moved and passed a motion calling for the banning of the practice in the kingdom. The motion was moved by Motshane MP Robert Magongo a few weeks ago and was seconded by Kwaluseni MP Sibusiso Mabhanisi Dlamini.

"Business Eswatini is very supportive of Government and the turnaround Strategic Roadmap with its initiatives to draw foreign direct investments and job creation. It is very unfortunate that these pronouncements by the minister were made without consultation with the private sector and without necessary information and studies to understand the impact," Le Roux reiterated, "It is also unfortunate that this Bill also contains provisions which are extremely onerous for business and negative for job creation" "There will almost certainly be significant job losses if this Bill is passed", confirmed Le Roux. Efforts to get comment from Minister of Labour and Social Security Makhosi Vilakati were unsuccessful by the time of compiling this report yesterday.

Security guards face retrenchments

"One challenge of not consulting properly on this Bill is that the definition of labour broker remains unclear. The current definition will appear to include security companies," Le Roux said.

He highlighted that the security industry in Eswatini employs between 7 000 -10 000 people and that many of these jobs will be at risk. Even the government makes extensive use of the security company services."

He concluded that parliamentarians did not act in good faith and are also not from an informed position when calling for the abolishment of labour broking.

"The necessary marked studies and impact assessment were not been done. Clearly, this is purely a political decision with significant consequences."

Subcontracting also to be banned – Business Eswatini

ot only will labour broking be banned, so will also be sub-

This is the view held by President of Business Eswatini Andrew Le Roux in an exclusive interview. "The Bill the minister refers to doesn't just ban brokers but effectively bans all subcontracting in Eswatini," Le Roux said.

"Subcontracting in Eswatini has created hundreds of Swati owned businesses and thousands of jobs. All this is now at risk."

The Business Eswatini president said the organisation has engaged its membership and there was no iota of doubt that job losses will be there should the Bill be passed.

"This Bill affects both labour broking and subcontracting. Therefore, it affects every business and industry sector in Eswatini, as well as the banks that lends them working capital and asset finance. This could run into hundreds of millions of Emalangeni

Ban on labour brokers has hidden political agenda

66 It is without doubt that the move to ban labour brokers has been politicised by people exploiting the uninformed for political gain in the fulfillment of election promises."

This was said by President of Business Eswatini Andrew Le Roux in an interview on Thursday. He said the move had a political agenda as opposed to serving the best interest of the country's labour force and busi-

He put T succinctly clear that the only conclusion Business Eswatini can come to was that the Bill purporting to ban labour brokering was "nothing more than just a TUCOSWA

TUCOSWA is an acronym for the Trade

Union Congress of Swaziland, an umbrella organisation for workers union in the country. Unfortunately, Le Roux said, some senior politicians have politicised this matter for own personal gain.

"We know that some made promises during elections and these initiatives are now in fulfillment of those promises. However, this will impact on employment and ability of Eswatini to attract investment."

"What is absolutely shocking, is that these same politicians have not created any meaningful employment themselves or even read the Bill that they are proposing", said the President of Business Eswatini, "And yet they are making political decisions that affect every business and employee in the country"



eachers who anticipate taking leave days such as maternity or sick leave encounter some problems as the operations of the TSC Commission have been halted.

This comes after the expiration of the term of office for commissioners in May 2019, with the exception of the chairman and one new member.

It states that the two active members do not form a quorum for functioning and this hinders the full operation of the TSC/Secretariat.

"This has caused a backlog in a substantial number of matters that include employment filling vacancies, sick leave, maternity leave, legal cases and other functions that need the authority of the Commission," it elaborates.

On another note, it is also revealed that the issuance of Circular No.3 of 2018 on filling of vacancies in August 2018 has proved to be a very serious challenge on the overall service delivery of the Commission. It states that situation has left schools with very low staff compliments/human resource capital in the form of teachers since teachers are continuously leaving the service due to demise, retirements and resignation among other reasons.

Skill centres to be openned soon

kills Centres will be back in full operation once the ministery of education and training select committee has finalised discussions with the Swaziland Skill Centre founders. This is contained in a quarterly report for the ministry of education. Last week, representatives of technical and vocational, education and training centres in the country marched to cabinet offices to deliver a petition containing their grievances especially how they have been locked out of school for the past 10 months.

The vocational centres have been closed since 13 September 2018, citing lack of funds as the main reason for the closure. Students were sent home and told they would be informed when to return to class. The over 500 trainees from the Swaziland Skills Centres (SSC) are now frustrated as they have still not been called back and are languishing at home. The report states that the Ministry of Education and Training had to suspend operations of the skills centres due to number of challenges encountered. It reports that the Ministry, however, lifted the suspension to allow the founder of the skills centres to continue on their own without jeopardizing the students progression.

The report reveals that this has failed as the institutions have remained not fully functioning except for Nhlangano Industrial Training Centre. It is envisaged that the skills centres will be back in full operation once the Minister of Education and Training Select Committee has finalized discussions with the Swaziland Skill Centre founders. The report says, "the Ministry is currently working with a select committee, which was constituted at Cabinet on normalizing the situation at the Swaziland Skills Centres with the view of having the skills centres back in full operation following their closure since September 2018".

Eswatini meets SA over truck driver killings

inister of Labour and Social Security Makhosi Vilakati last week met his South African counterpart on the alleged target killings of truck drivers based in the neighbouring country.

Minister Vilakati led a delegation of senior officials from the Labour ministry in the principal secretary and the commissioner of labour to Pretoria, South African, on a fact finding mission.

According to impeccable sources, the discussions between Ministry of Labour officials and the South Africa Minister of Employment and Labour were held Friday last week.

This publication understands that Minister Vilakati initiated the talks following disturbing reports that local truck drivers based in South Africa were allegedly being hunted and called emakwerekwere (foreigners) in the neighbouring country.

It is said the violence against locals had been playing itself out along the South African roads wherein trucks are burnt and workers attacked, something which has resulted in casualties and loss of life. Our sister publication, Sunday Observer, recently reported that over 100 truck drivers convened at the St. Theresa's High School Hall where they narrated to the Border Restoration Committee (BRC) threats they face while in the line of duty in that neighbouring country.

No resting in peace for late Victor Shabangu

It appears there is no resting in peace for the late former Eswatini Sport Council Chief Executive Officer Victor Shabangu as his burial Court battle has been postponed for the next

The matter had been brought before Judge John Magagula and it transpired that one of the lawyers could not proceed since she is indisposed.

This is the matter in which the late Shabangu's parents are at loggerheads over his burial since both of them want to own burial rights of the deceased.

Victor's mother Joyce Nsibandze and his father Pitoli Shabangu are in a never ending Court battle at the High since the latter took the former to Court after filing an application to stop him from burying his son.

The matter has now been postponed to November 13 since the Court no longer has dates in its diary this session which is expected to close soon.

The last time the matter was before Judge Magagula, he had stated that the court is now functus officio (can no longer hear the matter) as he handed down judgment and ruled that the deceased be buried at Moneni

One would have expected former Eswatini Sports Council Chief Executive Officer (CEO) Victor Shabangu to be resting in peace in his grave by

However, more than a year later, his body is still in the morgue.

This came after the late former CEO's mother Joyce filed an appeal application after the High Court had ordered that the deceased's father Pitoli should bury him at Moneni.

The late former sports administrator's body is still kept at Dups Funeral Home while the battle for his corpse

Ordered

Judge Magagula in the judgment challenged by Joyce ordered that Victor's body should be buried at Moneni. But Joyce filed an appeal immediately after the ruling and Pitoli made it clear that he was hurting that his son's body is being kept at the morgue instead of being buried.

He blamed Victor's mother for making unfounded allegations by stating that Ngculwini is Victor's place.

Shabangu said this is far from the truth as the deceased built the home for her and argued that Victor cannot be buried where his children are not welcome.

While Sibandze had initially successfully filed an application to stop the funeral, Victor's father also moved an application at the High Court where Judge Magagula ruled in his favour.

Pitoli, among other prayers, sought an order directing the University of Eswatini (where Victor was employed) to process all claims lodged by Nomvuyo Shabangu (nee Kunene) who is Victor's wife.

Claimed

Nomvuyo is the same woman whom Joyce claimed was not the rightful wife of the deceased as their marriage allegedly ended.

In his application, Pitoli alleged that Joyce was refusing with all the required documents to process the claim, hence a court order compelling her was necessary.

The applicant (Pitoli) further sought an order restraining and interdicting Joyce from removing Victor's body from Dups Funeral Home Crematorium, pending finalisation of the matter.

Respondents in the matter are the University of Eswatini, Joyce and Dups Home and Crematorium.

In his court application filed under a certificate of urgency, Pitoli had stated that on June 16, 2018 his son Victor collapsed and died in Manzini. He stated that the deceased resided

with him from a very young age up until he completed Form Four and when he was doing Form Five, he went to stay with Joyce.

Pitoli alleged that he did all the duties a father did for his child and paid for his education from primary to high



"Men have a responsibility to protect their women but instead what we see is the direct opposite," she said. "Women are killed senselessly by the people who should be using their strength to protect them from harm. It is a case of adults failing to exercise restraint in the

Perpetrators resort to suicide

wenty-five percent of women killers resort to committing suicide in fear of facing the wrath of justice.

"People are aware of the harsh punishment that comes with the Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence (SODV) Act and the trend that we see now is that 25 per cent of perpetrators kill themselves afterwards," SWAGAA Director Nonhlanhla Dlamini said. "Because of the stiffer sentences that come with the legislation perpetrators opt to kill themselves than to face the law." Dlamini said they were also working on promoting methods on how to prevent gender killings, adding that with all such incidents, there was always a trend of violence leading to the actual killing. "We are saying that if you are in an

heat of an argument and in a show of barbaric brutal strength they resort to violence and murder." Government agencies are expected to weigh in full support for the mass prayer march as

well as all other stakeholders. The idea is to engage this at the highest level. Dlamini said the violence was not something new and that the organisation has always been advocating for stiffer sentences. She said the march was also intended to educate people about the consequences of gender killings and the trauma of the loved ones left behind.

"That murdered woman is a mother,

daughter and or sister to someone. The anger felt by the loved one left behind is too much to contain. The emotional pain and scars last a lifetime. What will come out of the child who grows knowing how his or her mother died?"

Enacting

The country made a huge stride in enacting the Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence (SODV) Act but still, statistics suggest that gender based violence is ever on the increase.

The most predominant form of GBV experienced by women and perpetrated by men occurs within intimate partnerships. Already, the police are counting 15 cases of murder where accused persons took the lives of their intimate partners, plus five others who resorted o committing suicide after the murders. These shocking statistics show that gender-related killings are on the

Engaging men, boys in the fight against GBV key

WAGAA has embarked on awareness programmes aimed at enlightening the young minds of boys, as young as pre-school, to what it takes to be a gentleman.

Director Nonhlanhla Dlamini said these initiatives have started with boys' clubs in schools to teach future adults that violence has no place in modern society, that long gone are the days

when people lived in caves as animals and violence was a means of survival when faced with a dinosaur.

Programmes

"These programmes are called Men Involvement campaigns.

We are stretching out to teach boys that as they grow they must appreciate that beating up anyone or using foul language is wrong and unacceptable."

Dlamini said this was because violent behaviour starts rearing its ugly head when children were young and in pre-school.

Challenges

"Therefore, we want to teach the young that as they grow, they will face life's challenges that will need them to master the power of exercising restraint and self-control."

Rather have 151 divorce cases in three months than deaths

Thy is it so difficult to understand someone who has run out of love?

SWAGAA Director Nonhlanhla Dlamini wondered why men refuse to be dumped whilst they have other affairs on the side.

"I say it is much better that we deal with 151 divorces in three months, as recently reported by your publication, than to mourn deaths in the hands of lovers," she said.

She said another problem with men was that some grew up without love and find love in their partners as adults. Once they feel rejected (kwaliwa), she said, they switch to fight mode, yet a person has to accept the things that cannot be changed. "This is also where you find some demanding back all the gifts that were given out the name of love when all was rosy. That is stupid because those things were given as gifts, not borrowed. The cellphone, chocolates and cannot be taken back because they were given freely. And lovers need

to accept that even when love falls out." ing their families and or communi-

Filling up prisons no solution

arcila Rivera, an Indigenous Rights Activists from Peru rightly stated that "Filling up prisons and detention centres is not the solution. The solution is education, structural inclusion and ending poverty and marginalisation".

Although not well documented, most countries provide some psychological rehabilitation to perpeProtocol Barometer reports that the departments of correctional services in most countries in the region also offer rehabilitation and re-integration services for perpetrators of GBV.

However, some have contested this approach because they believe it encourages a culture of impunity as it ignores the need for punishment.

It says the role of men, not only as aggressors, but also as potential allies, facilitators, and activists in the fight against GBV, has become to be viewed as an indispensable element that requires specific policies and strategies. "There is also an emerging recognition of the need to involve male traditional and religious leaders. For many women around the world, community-based, customary justice mechanisms remain the only available method of redress, it is further stated.


The trial for businessman Sipho Shongwe which was expected to continue at the High Court yesterday has been stalled due to what has been termed as administrative reasons.







Khumalo registered other vehicles in the name of his father as Ligugu Transport, something that sparked resentment among other members of the Swaziland Interstate Association who felt he was now getting a larger share of the collections from the Johannesburg-Eswatini and back routes with extra vehi-

"The feeling was that I was now bringing another label with Ligugu Transport as I had been registered at Interstate only with Mahle Emantungwa Transport." At first things seemed to run smooth as he was a member of the association and only registered the new vehicles under his late father as the executor of the

However, on May 25 at an orchestrated meeting held at Interstate headquarters near Helemisi in Manzini, it transpired in the presence of the chairman that indeed Jomo was given a green light to purchase the two vehicles, a 16 and a 22 seater Mercedes Benz Sprinters. "Then all of a sudden a resolution was taken that each person shall be considered in terms of the registration of each name with the association, the member's name." More members joined the complaint against Jomo to the extent he was advised to decide on what to do with his new vehicles. But his woes are manifold, he still has two years to pay off the loan with which he acquired the vehicles. The loan approval was on the basis that they would take over routes as per arrangements with the association. "Some members suggested I should include these vehicles in my existing quota but the limit there is three vehicles." It was later suggested that

INFIGHTING STIRS WAR

irst it was the blatant disregard of a court order issued against Swaziland Interstate Association and now it is the involvement of the South African branch in a bid to squeeze out of business local member Jomo Khumalo of Mahle Emantungwa

A near nasty episode occurred at Wanderers Street Park Station in Braamfontein, Old Johannesburg on Tuesday when one of Jomo's kombis was forced to offload both cargo and passengers just when it was leaving for Eswatini after it was intercepted by the Johannesburg based members of Interstate, citing that they were working on instructions by Eswatini branch in Manzini.

The removal of Jomo's permit holding vehicles from the route has sent shiv-

ers up the spine of other members of the local kombi association who suspect they might be next given the way things are run at the association, that without any authority members' vehicles are frustrated out unless they conform to new unconventional sets of working conditions. It is also believed that the Johannesburg Interstate officials removed Jomo's vehicle from circulation on the strength of a letter issued from Eswatini but ironically, no one seems to want to own up on the origins of the said letter. Contents of the letter as engineered from the Eswatini side are to the effect that Jomo must withdraw the court order against Interstate Swaziland if he wants his vehicles to continue operating from Johannesburg. Further investigations, especially through an audio recording of a conversation between the chairman of the local association and an official in Johannesburg can reveal that the local chairman is aware of the condition that Jomo must withdraw the court order in his favour. JUDGE QINISILE'S ORDER DEFIED

igh Court Principal Judge Qinisile Mabuza's order for protection of an elderly woman, Ntsetselelo Shongwe who approached the court seeking, amongst others, an order that Khopho Dlamini and his sons be interdicted and restrained from assaulting and threatening her life and further interfering with her, has been

The elderly woman is still roaming the streets of Manzini as the defiant and disobedient Samuel Khopho Dlamini and his children decided to flee from the home on the day police and the deputy sheriff were to execute the court

Shongwe continues to suffer in silence and is even contemplating committing suicide as she is now helpless.

"I'm suffering yet the courts of the land have issued an order but Khopho is acting as law unto himself. I sometimes fail to get money to buy even a jerry can of water sold at E1.50 and even then I'm so frail I can't carry the jerry can home as the water source is far away from where I'm staying," Shongwe said.

"I have suffered too much at the hands of this man, I curse the death of my children because he is acting this way because he knows I have no one to fight for me and he is using his children to take over my parental home," said Shongwe.

Shongwe's prayers seeking an order that Dlamini and his children or any allies be interdicted, restrained from setting foot anywhere near her (Shongwe) parental homestead at Ka-Shali has not been adhered to by the defiant Khopho who has also allegedly refused

to honour orders by the Masundvwini Royal Kraal.

Shongwe still leaves in fear in the outskirts of Manzini despite High Court Principal Judge Qinisile Mabuza granting Shongwe the prayers she wished

Shongwe said she duly followed the lawyer's advice after she was told the outcome of the case had been in her favour; the case was being referred to the deputy sheriff for execution of the order. "The lawyers said the case was won and I need to raise money for paying the sheriffs to execute the court order. I was lucky to get assistance and I paid the amount but I'm stilling living in squalor here," said Shongwe.

Shongwe claims that even the sheriff and the police failed to assist her in executing the orders of the court issued in April following her's prayers for the court's protection.

Manzini Deputy Sheriff Charles Thwala said he was aware of the case, adding it was ongoing. Thwala narrated the events that led to the current state of affairs concerning the execution of the order.

"After the lawyers engaged us, we approached Khopho who was not cooperating from the onset. After failing to reach common ground, we then decided to approach his children at the home in question telling them to talk to their father that we will be carrying out the court order but when we arrived on a Monday they had vanished," said

He further narrated that on the failed

Thwala further shared that whilst the failed execution was delayed, Khopho and his children were now appealing to their lawyers for a stay of execution of the High Court order,

On the other hand, Shongwe said the lawyers informed him that they gave Khopho and children two weeks to continue with their filing if they failed to do so the order of the court would be executed. The order required the respondents, Dlamini and his children, to stop assaulting and threatening Shongwe and interfering with her personal life in whatever manner.

According to her papers that were filed before court, she was now living in fear and can no longer go home as her life is threatened.

She submitted that she was now living a

nomadic life following the threats, assaults and stabbing as she moves from one place to another seeking refuge.

She submitted that the last time she attempted to go to her parental homestead at Ka-Shali, she was assaulted and stabbed on the head by the respondents and the first respondent (Dlamini) and his children were so violent that they had no respect of the law.

"In fact they have become law unto themselves and probably this is because the first respondent is a King's Liaison Officer (Ndabazabantu) who is expected to respect the law which he administers. When I attempted to go home I was stabbed and the matter is pending at the Magistrate's Court," Shongwe submitted.

She averred that the matter was urgent because each time she attempted to go home she was threatened with violence and death threats from the first respondent and his children were issued, a situation which turned her into an orphan who wandered all over with no definite place of abode. Khopho holds an important office in the Judiciary, and he is expected to be one of those abiding by the law as he is one of the country's Liaison Officers (Ndabazabantu).

The order for eviction was originally issued in October 2016 by the Masundvwini Royal Kraal. It was further confirmed by the Ludzidzini Council sometime in 2017. Khopho and his children did not budge as they adamantly refused to allow Nontsetselelo back to the home.

They are also using tactics to dodge the issued court order issued on April 5. According to Shongwe, the family was given enough time to voluntarily vacate the homestead but instead fled when the deputy sheriff came with the police to execute the order.

KING SOBHUZA'S PRIMARY SCHOOL ROTTING AWAY

ombodze Primary School is a the first institution for natives or indigenous people to be built in Eswatini, being also where the late King Sobhuza II attended his primary school.


So, it's the most respected school but is now in shambles. Across the fence Zombodze High School towers with modern infrastructure and a credible staffing complement, something wanting on the eastern side.

The situation is so dire that teachers often fork out money to contribute towards electricity units, meaning each day children go to school to play, literally, because there is either no teaching equipment or no adequate power.

The high school teachers are now faced with the inconvenience of absorbing children with no basic education from Zombodze Primary.

It must be noted that while the school was initially built for the education of the King, it also took in several children to benefit from the generosity of royalty and also encourage the young King to learn. "We are now forced to inherit hardly ever prepared learners. To start afresh to be precise all because the primary is no learning environment at all," said a teacher.

The school logo goes "We strive for academic excellence, moral upright-

ness, to produce a disciplined and acceptable citizen."

Sobhuza II was the son of Bhunu and Lomawa Ndwandwe. He was born on the 22nd of July 1899 at Zombodze. His father named him Nkhotfotjeni (stone lizard), a name that told a story - when the baby was conceived, the father was living among stones like a lizard because war was threatening between the Boers and the indigenous Eswatini peoples.

His grandmother Gwamile/Labotsibeni named him Mona (jealousy) as there was jealousy between the Boers and the British, between whites and Swazislocals and among Eswatini royalty itself.

This newspaper caught up with one of the veterans who attended his primary education at Zombodze primary. His name is Bishop Sigubhu Zakhele Mthethwa. He is 88 years old and resides at Zombodze.

He is the biological father to Swazi Gospel Singers' lead singer Mathokoza Mthethwa. Bishop Mthethwa recounted that he was amongst the first people to enroll at Zombodze primary. 'Other prominent people who enrolled at the school are Princess Ngebeti, the late Brigadier Fonono Dvuba,

A visit to the school this week was a sorry sight as the ceilings in classrooms are in shambles.

Reporters were ushered to the headteacher's office where they immediately developed the feeling that it was one of the class rooms

He disclosed that discipline was very essential during their time, adding that they would greet adults when they met along the way, "unlike today's youth who just pass you by without

times went for days without electricity.

He said all he knew was that the Umphakatsi of the area had summoned all former pupils of the school to discuss on how they could improve the academic performance of the school.

He said it was true that the school was amongst the oldest, but it was not at a dilapidated state like it was being portrayed out there.

During our visit a straying dog was seen loitering around the premises, one would mistaken the school for an abandoned home. The headteacher did not want to entertain questions from reporters.

Even worse some of them you find proposing to one another right in front of adults, something that never happened in the yesteryears, we respected our parents," he said.

He emphasised that the newly introduced laws that were meant to protect the rights of the children are also derailing the country. He was referring to the banishment of corporal punishment at schools.

"During our time some of us had beard but we made sure we shaved before going to school, and we never argued with our teachers. Corporal punishment was there.

The country is going nowhere with this kind of approach," he stated, referring to positive discipline as opposed to corporal punishment as adopted by the ministry of education.

Electricity spark leaves 13 kids homeless

hirteen children have been left without shelter after a spark from electricity cables is alleged to have started the fire which gutted down their rondavel at a Mtsetfwa homestead in Dwaleni.

According to the Mtsetfwa family damages could amount to E10 000. A rondavel which houses thirteen children was burnt beyond recognition. Clothing, blankets and cutlery were all burnt. As a result, the family is now forced to share with their parents, the only one room flat that is left in the homestead.

Lomasontfo Buthelezi, wife to Ben Mtsetfwa, has seven children and six grand children. She is unemployed and the husband gets piece jobs which help him support his family. She is very thankful to God that when the incident happened most of her chil-

dren were at school, she was left with only the grandchildren whom she was able to save. Last week Friday was very windy for the whole afternoon. The gusty wind forced some of the electricity cables to clash and a fire spark was seen and immediately thereafter, there was huge fire which was perpetuated by the strong wind the whole Mtsetfwa homestead and neighbour's homes were covered by a huge smoke. "Immediately, we noticed that the fire from the electricity cables was going to be strong, I called my grandchildren to one of the houses and locked it. We were so scared the whole area was covered by smoke. I never anticipated that the fire could burn the rondavel," she said.

She stated that whilst inside the house with her children she heard people screaming alerting them that the rondavel had caught fire. "I rushed outside and found the rondavel on fire.

There was nothing we could do, we just watched helplessly as it was gutted down by the fire. We reported to the employees of EEC after they had been alerted that their cables had caused some damages in the area.

They promised to escalate the matter to their superiors in Mbabane. We never ended there, we also reported to the Umphakatsi through Sibondza," she explained.

Efforts were made to get a comment from Bucopho Bekhundla and Sibondza senkhundla of Mphini umphakatsi both their cell phones were not available on the MTN network.

Spokesperson for EEC Khaya Mavuso advised the Mtsetfwa family to make a formal complaint to the company, however, he was quick to state that some people end up making false claims at the company. He said the complainant have a choice to either register their complain through the call

UPROAR AS TENDERPRENEUR OCCUPIES WARDERS' QUARTERS

hen the gods are in your side everything runs smoothly even at a time when government is in a serious fiscal challenge. One lucky businessman in Eswatini, who has been working for His Majesty's Correctional Services since 2013, is using one of the big government houses for his employ-

Whilst the company is benefitting from winning tenders over the years maintaining the correctional services department, instead of getting accommodation for employees the owners decided to occupy the government

The company, known to the publication, has site offices in the goldernment house to accommodate its employ-


Civil servants are short of accommodation and three correctional services officers are sharing two bedroom houses with one occupying the sitting room as a bedroom yet a house is reserved for a businessman and his employees. Officers within the depart-

ment stated that the company employees by staying within the government premises, had breached security. Officers within the department shared their suspicions that the company employees might have had a hand in the daring escape of two prisoners from Big Bend prison given that all the security checks were always maintained. The officers alleged that they felt uneasy about this but knew that officers were trained on the importance of security of inmates.

When there are strangers in a security area, breaches are likely as inmates might be mistaken to be part of the warder village occupants working for the businessman staying on campus.

The last inmate escapees were recently gunned down by a joint operation between the police and correctional services officers.

Sources within the correctional services department at Big Bend alleged that the businessman and his employees have been contracted for maintenance within the department. "They should seek accommodation elsewhere than to occupy a government house within the quarters because



officers are accommodated separately for a number of security reasons, hence they should be moved out of the Big Bend station forthwith," said concerned officers.

They claimed that they were also concerned with the never ending tender of the company whose results are not at par with what they have been tasked with since two prisoners escaped while they were there in charge of maintenance. The continued mainte-

nance services by one company enjoying a long contract is a security risk itself as they now know the blue print of the correctional centre. "The tender should allow the company to do a certain job and leave than be resident at the station.

The department hired professional artisans that should be utilised for such maintenance services as they are conversant with security details here," said a source.

It's an abandoned government house - PRO

is Majesty's Correctional Services Public Relations Officer Gugulethu Dlamini confirmed knowledge of the contracted company but said it occupied an abandoned house which was no longer fit for use.

Dlamini said the company asked to maintain the house just to accommodate its employees so that they could be closer to the workstation anytime they are called for duty.

She said the house was no longer in use and officers were aware of the state of the building before the company occupied it.

Dlamini on the security risk fears, disagreed with the observations, saying their mission was to do maintenance work of the correctional facilities.

"Correctional officers are security specialists and well trained on that aspect.

They know that every individual is supposed to be vetted thoroughly all the time without any compromise to the security of the facility and inmates.

E800m water plant for Matsapha in the offing SILICOSIS CASE: Eswatini By Mhlonishwa Hlophe victims to tap from E5bn Tater shortage in

Matsapha will soon be a thing of the past as government will start working on an E800 million project to be concluded in 2022

EWSC Managing Director Jabulile Mashwama revealed that comprehensive analyses of the constraint of their customers had been done and a four phase approach developed to address them. This is contained in a quarterly newsletter for Eswatini Water Services Corporation.

The report states that initially, Matsapha has a water treatment plant that was constructed in the 1970s and it has been a source of clean water for the industrial town and neighbouring areas. However, over the years, the town has developed in leaps and bounds and this growth brought about an increased demand for water supply for both residential and commercial customers.

The managing director states that to address the increased demand for supply, the corporation has developed and is implementing a short to long term plan that aims at addressing constraints experienced in Matsapha.

Mashwama said," the "implementation of the varied project plan will ensure that the corporation is able to meet demand and future growth and further address customer concerns that have been shared with the corporation," she explained.

She further stated that the cor-

poration has integrated its network system to ensure that the drop in reservoir levels does not affect supply to areas like Tubungu, Police Academy, Emhlane and surrounding areas. "Secondly, to address water supply challenges in Nhlambeni, Masundvwini, Sigodvweni and Mobeni, the corporation is already manent solution by increasing storage capacity. A three mega litre reservoir will be constructed in Emathangeni in Matsapha. This tank will be a dedicated alternate supply point for our residential customers in cases where industrial water supply demand is at peak," she explained.

She further enlightened that to improve water supply in Kwaluseni, Mfabantfu, and surrounding areas, the corporation would increase supply capacity by upgrading the pumping system to the Logoba reservoir.

She also stated that to improve the general quality of services and the growing demand for water in the Matsapha-Manzini corridor and surrounding areas, the corporation is upgrading the Matsapha Water Treatment Plant to increase capacity to meet future demand.

The upgrade of the plant is ongoing and it will tie in with the larger recently approved Manzini integrated water and sanitation project to ensurre water is supplied to additional areas under the Mafutseni, Nhlambeni, Manzini South and Mtfongwaneni Constituencies," she stated.

Concluding, she said implementation of the works requires planned water supply interruptions and the corporation would ensure that the usual 48-hour notice is given to customers scheduled shutdown.

he High Court of South Africa in Johannesburg has approved a historic E5 billion settlement in the ongoing silicosis case involving thousands of mineworkers.

The South African media was yesterday abuzz with news reports on the landmark judgment.

The agreement affects workers who contracted the disease during or after being employed in gold mines from 1965.

The court found that all the parties made an effort to ensure that the settlement was reasonable, adequate and fair.

The silicosis case has been described as one of the most complex class action lawsuits to date and now it has finally come to an end with a E5 billion settlement. This means that thousands of gold miners who contracted silicosis or pulmonary tuberculosis during or after their employment from 1965 will be paid out between E70 000 and E500 000, depending on which category they fall into.

Judge Leoni Windell said the terms of the settlement agreement demonstrated that they succeeded in their efforts.

Justice Windell found that "all the parties made an effort to ensure that the settle ment agreement is reasonable, adequate and fair.

"The terms of the settlement agreement demonstrate that they succeeded in their efforts," the judgment read.

Parties made submissions in May asking the court to approve the settlement agreement and to issue instructions on the clauses it is not happy with. The legal process involving gold miners affected by lung diseases has stretched over several years and has been described as one of the "most complex multi-party class action settlements ever concluded" by parties.

The agreement, on behalf of thousands of mineworkers and their dependants, affects people who contracted silicosis or pulmonary tuberculosis during or after being employed as gold

miners from March 1965. The six mining companies paying out the collective R5-billion formed the Occupational Lung Disease (OLD) Working Group, which represented African Rainbow Minerals, Anglo American SA, Anglo Gold Ashanti, Gold Fields, Harmony and Sibanye Stillwater.

The mining companies admit that in the past they failed to take necessary precautions to protect their employees from the silica dust that rises from the gold mines.

Miners and the dependants of deceased miners were represented by various lawyers, including Richard Spoor and the Legal Resources Centre. In May, lawyers representing the miners joined forces with mining groups in a bid to get the court to approve the settlement.

Since the discovery of minerals in South Africa in the 1860s, Swaziland has been a labour-exporting partner for South African mining companies with most miners coming from the Lubombo region.

Four categories of claims

In a historic judgement in May 2016, the case was certified as a class-action suit by the high court. In December 2018, the court declared four classes of claimants;

 people who contracted silicosis or were exposed to silica dust.

 the dependants of deceased miners who fell ill with silicosis,

people suffering from tuberculosis, and

the dependants of deceased miners who con-

tracted tuberculosis. The claimants will be paid out between R70 000 and R500 000, depending on which of the four categories they fall into.

The benefits will be paid through the Tshiamiso Trust, set up specifically for this purpose. It will receive R845 million to identify and locate eligible mineworkers and dependents, and will assess, process and pay their claims.

STEEL&WIRE NAME CHANGE CONFUSES EMPLOYEES

teel and Wire rebranding or change of name to Macsteel is troubling employees of the company as their years of service to the former company might be forgotten and subsequently their benefits for-

The employees stated that their issue had dragged for very long owing to the interpretation of laws governing labour practices in the country when a company is taken over by another.

However, the company is alleged to have told employees the company was not sold but rebranded. Employees alleged that what was happening at the factory shop was not what was said by the current employer.

They further alleged that many of the senior personnel were no longer in the factory but there was new management.

Disgruntled employees alleged that their plea for compensation for the years working for Steel and Wire is not being adequately addressed by both new management and government labour inspectors.

To add salt to injury is that, the workers allege, labour inspectors when called to address concerns of workers simply sit at round tables with management with no worker representative and at the end of the private meetings they walk away, leaving workers dejected.

According to the employees, some of them worked for Steel and Wire for over three decades but when the takeover

simply told nothing had changed in ownership and they were not affected by the change of name.

Secret

However the employees, meeting informally at a secret spot where they would rather the employer did not know, alleged that a lot had changed in the company with the management or name changes occurred, they were bringing in new faces and those con-

sidered to have a heart in the Steel and Wire era being sidelined. They further confided their fears that it would seem to them Macsteel management was systematically phasing out all old employees of Steel and Wire.

They felt they deserve a better explanation regarding their status at Macsteel than just rebranding because indication on the ground paints a different

picture. The main issue at the top of their concerns is compensation after the so called rebranding and also advice from the commissioner of labour on their true status given the developments. Each time the issue of compensation is taken further they are confronted with the clarification that it is no longer Steel and Wire.

Recent changes have also confirmed

the employees' suspicions after the alleged redeployment of managers without offices and all they do is menial work such as inspecting vehicles and if there is no movement, they loiter around the premises, yawning the day away.

The usage of derogatory language among staff is another thorny issue. Allegations are abound that shop stewards are often referred to as uneducated, if they were they would have realized that the company had changed its name.

Macsteel Human Resources Manager Ntokazi Sihlongonyane said she was not authorised to talk about issues of Macsteel referring all inquiries to the director. However, when pressed to respond to allegations leveled against her office she disputed all the allegations, saying there was no formal complaint before her in her office. She said she never encountered a situation whereby workers were told they were uneducated when they wanted their issues addressed.

"Employees are aware of the laid down internal channels to address any grievances

me we have no disciplinary hearing on that matter and there is currently no unresolved issue warranting them to even being called by any person from management that they are uneducated," said Sihlongonyane.

The workers had accused her of taking sides and not processing their concerns, citing in particular her alleged attitude.

Another challenge is the introduction of time limit for all delivery trucks to be returned to the factory, forcing drivers to speed and risk causing accidents. MacSteel is said to currently employ over 4 000 people in Southern Africa and has developed to be Africa's leading manufacturer, merchandiser and distributor of steel and value added steel products.

4Him impounds 100 dung spilling cows

t least 100 livestock found loitering around Mahwalala Zone 4 have been impounded by 4Him Security personnel.

The security company is hired by the Mbabane Municipal Council to bring peace, order within the city and its outskirts.

Sources around Hilltop and Lomkiri confirmed that since last week the 4Him Security personnel had been busy impounding stray livestock around the neighborhood and surrounding areas. They said this would help bring order in the neighborhood. "One would bet we were now competing with livestock in the roads and at our yards," one resident who preferred anonymity said. She also said the livestock manure was

dirtying the roads. Municipal Council Spokesperson Lucky Tsabedze confirmed that they had impounded livestock around Lomkiri and Hilltop, saying they are continuing with the exercise till they see that the number of animals in the streets have decreased.

"Our focus is in all the townships and their outskirts of the city; we will be very strict with livestock found loitering within urban boundary," he said. A



couple of weeks ago this publication reported that residents of Lomkiri Township registered their complains with the municipal council about being terrorised by unrestrained livestock. Lomkiri is found at Zone 4, which is about five kilometers outside the Mbabane city centre, alongside the Mhlambanyatsi

The residents alleged that at times they were woken up by the noise of the livestock as early as 3am. When asked if they reported their grievances to the council they responded to the affirmative, saying the council would move the animals from the road but would defiantly return in doubled numbers just the following week.

Residents of the township could not hide their excitement about the impounding of the livestock, "The council is doing a wonderful job, and I think they should monitor the situation now that they have started impounding the livestock. You may find them back again next week, I think they should increase the fines," one resident was quoted say-

They thanked this publication for reporting about the story, hence, the municipal council hastily responded to the mat-

It is alleged that some of the livestock would come as far as Mahwalala, down to Hilltop and Lomkiri. The livestock were not only a threat to the residents of the township also to motorists and students at Christian University. One student said, "I so much fear a cow and it disturbs me to find one in the middle of the road while on my way to class, at times I am forced to wait for others so that we can walk as a group," she was quoted saying.

Again this newspaper failed to ascertain the rightful owners of the livestock as nobody had come forward to claim them by the time this report was put together.

LACK OF TRANSPORT, FUEL HINDERS HEALTH OUTREACH

hortage of transport and fuel has been a hindrance in providing quality health services in some health institutions situated in the four regions of the country.

This is contained in the quarterly report for the ministry of health. This has resulted in inconsistency in conducting outreach visits due to lack of transport and fuel. Also, the delay in fixing of mechanical faults when vehicles break down.

The Shiselweni region seems to be the only region hit hard by the shortage of vehicles, as it is reported that the regional Health office has only one vehicle to carry out all regional, national and routine activities. These challenges could be attributed to the difficulties faced by the Central Transport Administration (CTA), whose mandate is to purchase, maintain and provide fuel for government

Also, the department's mandate is to dispose of government vehicles. Currently, the Ministry of finance has stopped pumping money to CTA for purchases not budgeted for. The decision to halt the pumping in of extra money into the public enter-

prise comes after damning findings by the Attorney General Timothy Matsebula. When carrying out an audit, the AG found that the CTA was operating without a budget; something Matsebula said was against a particular financial and accounting instruction.

Other challenges faced by the different health institutions countrywide include shortage of staff, drugs and equipment such as BP cuffs, sterilizers, Cervical Cancer Screening equipment. Also affected by the shortage of transport was the Eswatini National Blood Transfusion Services (ENBTS), hence, they could not get enough blood.

According to the report, the reason for that was the unavailability of adequate funds, which affected them as they could not buy material needed among which were, refreshments, hence they had to cancel the appointments they had made.

The mobile blood collection vehicle also had mechanical faults resulting in cancellation of some scheduled appointments for donation. Fuel rationing was also mentioned as part of the challenges, to which they said they could not reach all the places they were supposed to go to.



he sounds of sweet nothings come to an abrupt stop after a shot is fired with the bullet piercing through the woman's white matter before ricocheting against the wall.

The commotion is followed by a deafening silence but soon thereafter it is screams from the children who had just witnessed a murder of a parent at that very tender age.

This could only be an intro into a story of trigger happy Maswati Simelane, who on Sunday shot the mother of his own son, or so it is alleged, just to take possession of their matrimonial home.

It is surprising that researchers have discovered that in very few cases, the man kills his family and turns the weapon on himself but the most common cases are a result of prior domestic violence. Certainly we are not privy as to how the Simelanes faired but no doubt there already were symptoms that something nasty could result even though not likely that fatality was to be predicted. Now this calls for very drastic moves to be taken to protect the family from brewing anger. The scars caused by the murder incident will never clear from the minds of the witnesses, the violence has planted seeds of-not-so palatable a fruit unless they all undergo counselling and post traumatic therapy.

Police

Experts say access to dangerous weapons, in particular a gun is a significant risk factor, as are threats with a weapon, a stepchild in the home or estrangement. However, a past criminal history is not a reliable or significant predictor in murder-suicide. In the aftermath of a family murder followed by a suicide, communities, police, researchers and others search for explanations. In difficult financial times, it may be natural to look for economic influences, especially when the killer has recently lost a job or has enormous financial problems. Researcher Campbell found that unemployment was a significant risk factor for murdersuicide but only when combined with a history of domestic violence. In other words, it was not a risk factor in and of itself but was something that tipped the scale following previous abuse.

Adams, author of Why Do They Kill? Men Who Murder Their Intimate Partners, offered his perspective based on years of research and experience working with domestic violence cases. His comments focused mostly on guns and jealousy in these violent crimes. When we consider prevention, guns are essentially the 'low-hanging fruit,' (Men Who Murder Their Families: What the Research Tells Us by Bernie Auchter).

There was a time of high incidences of men killing their spouses but a few decades ago this

extended to the boys with the toys – the law enforcing agents. We still have fresh memories of how a woman was killed by her husband cop while inside their Nhlambeni home. She was believed to have been committing adultery with a very influential person who happened to be also in the bedroom when it was only the woman to bear the brunt of the anger of the jilted cop. After the story died down from the media houses, it was the last we heard of it or whether justice took its course. **Property**

Maswati is reported to have deserted his wife five years ago only to return to murder her all because of a house he wants to dispose of and she was refusing to let it go.

SKIPPING MEALS

ccording to Diabetic Living in America, Skipping meals could potentially push your blood glucose higher.

When you don't eat for several hours because of sleep or other reasons, your body fuels itself on glucose released from the liver. For many people with type 2-diabetes (PWDs type 2), the liver doesn't properly sense that the blood has ample glucose already, so it continues to pour out more. Eating something with a little carbohydrate signals the liver to stop sending glucose into the bloodstream and can tamp down high numbers.

Skipping meals can also lead to overeating, which can cause an increase in weight. And if you take certain diabetes medications that stimulate the body's own insulin such as common sulfonylureas, or you take insulin with injections or a pump, you risk having your blood glucose drop too low when you skip or delay meals.

GOING LOW@CARB

Low-carb diets 'are not balanced and deprive the body of needed fiber, vitamins, and minerals' says Constance Brown-Riggs, M.S.Ed, R.D., CDE, CDN, author of The African American Guide to Living Well with Diabetes

EATING PASTA AL DENTE

It is best to eat your spaghetti al dente, says David J. A. Jenkins, M.D., Ph.D., D.Sc., Canada research chair in nutrition and metabolism at the University of Toronto and St Michael's Hospital. Overcooked pasta and other starches become soft, lose their form, and give up their glucose more readily, likely giving you a bigger rise in blood glucose, he says.

"The real problem with pasta is that it's so palatable," and you may eat more than you intend, says Jenkins. A cupful of pasta provides as many calories and carb grams as three slices of bread, and the pasta goes down faster. Jenkins' advice: Cook starchy foods adequately, but avoid overcooking. Most important, control portions and count the calories and carb grammes.

ADDING DIABETES SHAKES AND BARS TO MEALS

Shakes or bars made specifically for people with diabetes can help you control blood glucose levels when you're on the go, says Brown-Riggs. But if you fall into the trap of eating them in addition to your usual meals or snacks, both your weight and your blood glucose could climb. You have to swap them for other foods, or your calorie and carbohydrate intake will likely be too high.

SPRINKLING CINNAMON

A study reported in Diabetes Care in 2003 suggested that cinnamon might lower blood glucose, triglyceride, and cholesterol levels for people with type 2 diabetes. Enjoy this sweet, fragrant spice anyway to delight your taste buds without adding calories or sodium. Cinnamon brings out the natural sweetness of tomatoes in a sauce and adds an interesting complexity to beef and poultry. Sprinkle it on oatmeal, yogurt, and fruit to add sweetness without adding sugar.

DRINKING ALCOHOL

Alcohol may lower blood glucose, but it can do so erratically and, therefore, isn't consid-

DRINKING EXCESSIVE WATER

It's a smart idea to drink plenty of calorie-free beverages, especially water, when your blood glucose is elevated. Because high blood glucose can cause excessive urination, drinking plenty of water helps prevent dehydration, says Constance Brown-Riggs, M.S.Ed., R.D., CDE, CDN. It won't, however, lower high blood glucose levels, she says.

SPLASHING A LITTLE VINEGAR

Can a spoonful of vinegar help the blood sugar go down? Yes, says Carol S. Johnston, Ph.D., R.D., professor and director of the nutrition program at Arizona State University's College of Nursing and Health Innovation. Consuming 1-2 tablespoons of vinegar before a meal may slow the rise of "the postmeal surge in blood glucose by as much as 40 percent," she says. But that's still not a license to go carb crazy.

Vinegar may inhibit starch digestion and hold food in the stomach a little longer, Johnston says. By delaying emptying of the stomach, vinegar may help to blunt the rise of blood glucose in response to eating. The problem is the vinegar itself. It just isn't fun to drink a couple tablespoons before a meal. Take advantage of vinegar's benefits by splashing some on a salad and adding it to cooked vegetables.

Use caution if you adjust insulin based on your carbohydrate intake; reports have shown a higher frequency of hypoglycemic episodes in individuals with type 1 diabetes ingesting vinegar, says Johnston.

DOUBLING UP ON DIABETES MEDICINES

Is twice as much medicine twice as good at lowering your blood sugar? This is dangerous because you risk your blood glucose dropping critically low when taking blood glucose lowering medication. If your blood glucose consistently runs high, work with your health care provider to adjust your medications and develop an individualized meal plan. If it's high because of simply eating too much, learn from your mistake and move on. You should not adjust your medications without first discussing it with a member of your health care team.

EXERCISING INSTEAD OF SLEEPING

Too little sleep or poor sleep can disrupt your hormones, leading to increased appetite, higher blood glucose, and a thicker waistline. In fact, researchers from the Netherlands found that a single night of sleep deprivation can decrease insulin sensitivity by almost 25 percent

SLEEPING INSTEAD OF EXERCISING

"If you're giving up exercise for sleep, on the other hand," says Jennifer Hyman M.S., R.D., CDE, registered dietitian and diabetes educator in Rockville Centre, New York, "chances are you are not active enough during the day." It becomes a vicious cycle, because inactivity can reduce the quality of sleep, and poor sleep leaves you too lethargic to exercise.

Sneak in at least a few minutes of daily exercise by walking on your lunch break and taking the stairs instead of the elevator, says Hyman.

TAKING SUPPLEMENTS

According to the Natural Medicines Comprehensive Database, taking guar gum with meals might lower blood glucose after the meal. Its high fiber content may help reduce cholesterol levels as well, but also may cause stomach upset. Guar gum might also reduce the absorption of penicillin and other medications.



Scandal! actress tackles mental health stigma

Nomvelo Makhanya has spoken out for the first time about her admission to a psychiatric hospital three years ago as a result of living with mental illness.

Renowned for her role as vixen Lindiwe Ngema on e.tv soapie Scandal!, she was diagnosed with depression, bipolar and anxiety at age 20 in 2016.

The 23-year-old actress poured her heart out to Sowetan about how it took some time for her before she could speak about living with mental disorder because of stigma.

"I was living with it for a long time, but I was unaware. I would go through these emotions, but I didn't understand why. Until I started seeing a psychologist," said Makhanya.

"Right now days are not the same.

Some days are great and some days are bad. I have learnt more about it.

"So I understand that when I feel a certain way, it's not going to last forever. I think I'm in a good space mentally." Learning to function in her everyday life after she was discharged from hospital was extremely difficult for Makhanya.

She was put on different kinds of medication to help her cope, includ-

ing antidepressants, Xanax, mood stabilisers and sleeping pills.

She gradually stopped taking the medication since it started to negatively affect her work.

"It didn't happen overnight. I remember when I got discharged and returned to work it was difficult. I felt like I was breaking down and needed to find my pills."

esearch by the World Economic Forum estimates that 65 per cent of children entering primary school will find themselves in occupations that today do not exist. Isn't it scary?

Nowadays, soft skills are more valuable than hard skills for one reason: everything changes so fast, that your ability to adapt to changing circumstances continuously learn new trends, think systematically and be proactive - these are the skills that are normally valued the most

At the same time, 90 per cent of organisations currently have an IT skills shortage, while 75 per cent of educators and students feel there is a gap in their ability to meet the skills needs of the IT workforce. To prepare the talent needed for the digital economy, education must adapt as fast as the demand for IT skills is growing and evolving.

Technology has greatly expanded access to education and gave enormous opportunities for teenagers starting their own start-ups before even they turn 18. Just by knowing how to code, they can programme their website and start doing their business. Moreover, now all information that you need is available online and you have online forums, where you can actually ask advice of the professionals, get access to the case studies and start self-educa-

In medieval times, books were rare and only an elite few had access to educational opportunities. People had to travel to centres of learning to get an education. Today, massive amounts of information are available at one's fingertips through the internet. Opportunities for communication and collaboration have also been expanded by technology. The walls of the classrooms are no longer a barrier as technology enables new ways of learning, communicating, and working collaboratively. Now, students can learn about the Arctic by following the expedition of a team of scientists in the region, read scientists' blog posting, view photos, e-mail questions to the scientists, and even talk live with the scientists via a videoconference. Students can collaborate on group projects using technology-based tools such as Google docs, trello, etc.

In the traditional classroom, the teacher is the primary source of information, and the learners passively receive it. This model of the teacher has been in education for a long time, and it is still very much in evidence today. However, because of the access to information and educational opportunity that technology has enabled, in many classrooms today we see the teacher's role shifting to the 'guide on the side' as students take more responsibility for their own learning using technology to gather relevant information. Schools and universities across the country are beginning to redesign learning spaces to enable this new model of education, foster more interaction and small group work, and use technology as an enabler.

The future of technology in education is helping teachers to expand beyond linear, textbased learning and to engage students who learn best in other ways. Its role in schools has evolved from a contained computer class into a versatile learning tool that could change how we demonstrate concepts, assign projects and assess progress. Also, the future of technology in education is to improve communication. In regions that were difficult to reach such as places in sub-Saharan Africa are now starting to be accessible through eLearning. Tutors can lecture learners over long distances and scholars can achieve their academic papers through eLearning. Also, students that feel like studying from home can now do it. Advancement of information technology in education has

Ipads and computers - Technology helps students be more responsible. Owning their own device or borrowing the school's devices gives students the opportunity to improve their decision-making skills as well as taking ownership of a valuable and often times expensive

Better Simulations and Models - Digital simulations and models can help teachers explain concepts that are too big or too small or process that happen too quickly or too slowly to demonstrate in a physical classroom.

Global Learning - At sites like Glovico.org, students can set up language lessons with a native speaker who lives in another country and attend the lessons via Skype, hangouts, etc. Learning from a native speaker, learning through social interaction, and being exposed to another culture's perspective are all incredible educational advantages. Also, podcasts are another popular learning method, with hundreds of free educational programs now avail-

More efficient assessment - Teachers can collect real-time assessment data from their students. When the teacher gives out an assignment, she or he can watch how far along students are, how much time each one spends on each question, and whether their answers are correct. With this information, a teacher can decide what concepts students are struggling with and can pull up examples of students' work on a projector for discussion.

E-books - A digital textbook is a PDF on a tablet that students can carry around and now there is no need to carry five textbooks anymore. It's all digital. What used to take hours

in the library to find, now students find instantaneously.

Epistemic Games - Commercial game-like simulations that put students in roles like city planner, journalist, or engineer and ask them to solve real-world problems. In one game, students are high-powered negotiators who need to decide the fate of a real medical controversy. In another, they must become graphical artists in order to create an exhibit of mathematical art in a particular style, etc. Creative professionals learn innovative thinking through training that is very different from traditional academic classrooms because innovative thinking means more than just knowing the right answers on a test. It also means having realworld skills, high standards and professional values, and a particular way of thinking about problems and justifying solutions. Epistemic games are about learning these fundamental ways of thinking for the digital age using tech-

The future of technology in education is helping teachers to expand beyond linear, text-based learning and to engage students who learn best in other ways. Its role in schools has evolved from a contained computer class into a versatile learning tool that could change how we demonstrate concepts, assign projects and assess progress.



The sweet potato (Ipomoea batatas) is an underground tuber. It's rich in an antioxidant called beta carotene, which is very effective at raising blood levels of vitamin A, particularly in children.

Sweet potatoes are nutritious, high in fiber, very filling and delicious. They can be eaten boiled, baked, steamed, or fried. Sweet potatoes are usually orange but also found in other colors, such as white, red, pink, violet, yellow, and purple. In some parts of the world, sweet potatoes are called yams. However, this is a misnomer since yams are a different species.

DIFFERENT VARIETIES OF SWEET POTATO Orange sweet potatoes

Orange sweet potatoes are the most common type found in supermarkets in overseas counries like the United States. They are reddishbrown on the outside and orange on the inside. When compared to regular white potatoes, orange sweet potatoes have higher fiber content. This gives them a lower GI and makes them a healthier option for people with diabetes. Some studies indicate that boiled orange sweet potatoes have a lower GI value compared to baking or roasting them.

Purple sweet potatoes

Purple sweet potatoes are lavender-colored on the inside and outside. They are sometimes marketed under the names Stokes Purple and Okinawan potatoes. Purple sweet potatoes have a lower GI than orange sweet potatoes. In addition to nutrients, purple sweet potatoes also contain anthocyanins.

Anthocyanins are a polyphenolic compound that may reverse or prevent obesity and type 2 diabetes risk by improving insulin resistance.

Japanese sweet potatoes

Japanese sweet potatoes (Satsuma Imo) are sometimes referred to as white sweet potatoes, even though they're purple on the outside and vellow on the inside. This strain of sweet potato contains caiapo. A study found that caiapo extract was able to significantly reduce fasting and two-hour blood glucose levels in subjects when compared with placebo. Caiapo was also shown to reduce cholesterol.

Nutrition facts of Sweet Potatoes Carbohydrates

A medium-sized sweet potato (boiled without the skin) contains 27 grammes of carbohydrates. The main components are starches, which make up 53 per cent of the carbohydrate content. Simple sugars, such as glucose, fructose, sucrose, and maltose, comprise 32 per cent of the carb content. Sweet potatoes have a medium to high glycemic index (GI), varying from 44-96. The GI is a measure of how fast your blood sugar levels rise after a meal. Given the relatively high GI of sweet potatoes, large amounts in a single meal may be unsuitable for people with type 2 diabetes. It is important to note that boiling seems to be associated with lower GI values compared to baking, frying, or

roasting.

Starches are often split into three categories based on how well they're digested. The starch proportions in sweet potatoes are as follows.

• Rapidly digested starch (80 per cent). This starch is quickly broken down and absorbed, increasing the GI value.

• Slowly digested starch (9 per cent). This type breaks down more slowly and causes a smaller rise in blood sugar lev-

*Resistant starch (11 per cent). This one escapes digestion and acts like fiber, feeding your friendly gut bacteria. The amount of resistant starch may increase slightly by cooling the sweet potatoes after cooking.

Cooked sweet potatoes are relatively high in

(15-23 per cent) in the form of pectin, and insol-

uble (77-85 per cent) in the form of cellulose,

hemicellulose, and lignin. Soluble fibers, such as pectin, may increase fullness, decrease food intake, and reduce blood sugar spikes by slowing your digestion of sugars and starches. A high intake of insoluble fibers has been associated with health benefits, such as a reduced risk of diabetes and improved gut health.

Sweet Potatoes are a poor source of protein; a medium-sized sweet potato holds two grammes of protein. Despite being relatively low in protein, sweet potatoes are an important source of this macro-nutrient in many developing coun-

Vitamins and minerals

Sweet potatoes are an excellent source of beta carotene, vitamin C, and potassium. The most abundant vitamins and minerals in this veg-

Pro-vitamin A. Sweet potatoes are rich in beta carotene, which your body can convert into vitamin A. Just 100 grammes of this vegetable provides the recommended daily amount of this vitamin.

Vitamin C. This antioxidant may decrease the duration of the common cold and improve skin

Potassium. Important for blood pressure control, this mineral may decrease your risk of heart disease

Manganese. This trace mineral is important for growth, development, and metabolism. Vitamin B6. This vitamin plays an important

role in the conversion of food into energy. Vitamin B5. Also known as pantothenic acid, this vitamin is found to some extent in nearly

Vitamin E. This powerful fat-soluble antioxidant may help protect your body against oxidative damage.

Like other whole plant foods, sweet potatoes contain a number of plant compounds that may affect your health. These include

Beta carotene. An antioxidant carotenoid that your body converts into vitamin A. Adding fat to the meal can increase your absorption of this compound.

Chlorogenic acid. This compound is the most abundant polyphenol antioxidant in sweet pota-

Notably, the antioxidant activity of sweet potatoes increases with the colour intensity of their flesh. Deep-hued varieties, such as purple, deep orange and red sweet potatoes, score the high-

The absorption of vitamin C and some antioxidants increases in sweet potatoes after cooking, while levels of other plant compounds may decrease slightly.

Sweet potatoes compared to regular potatoes Many people substitute regular potatoes for sweet potatoes, believing sweet potatoes to be the healthier choice. The two species contain similar amounts of water, carbs, fat, and protein. Notably, sweet potatoes sometimes have a lower GI and boast higher amounts of both sugar and fiber. Both are good sources of vitamin C and potassium, but sweet potatoes also provide excellent amounts of beta carotene, which your body can transform into vitamin A. Regular potatoes may be more filling but may also harbor glycoalkaloids, compounds that can be harmful in large amounts. Health benefits of sweet potatoes

1. Prevention of vitamin A deficiency

As vitamin A plays an important role in your body, deficiency in this essential nutrient is a major public health issue in many developing

Deficiency can cause both temporary and permanent damage to your eyes and even lead to blindness. It can also suppress immune function and increase mortality, especially among children and pregnant and lactating women. Sweet potatoes are an excellent source of highly absorbable beta carotene, which your body can convert into vitamin A. The intensity of the yellow or orange color of the sweet potato is directly linked to its beta carotene content. Orange sweet potatoes have been shown to increase blood levels of vitamin A more than other beta carotene sources, as they contain a highly absorbable variety of this nutrient. This makes eating sweet potatoes an excellent strategy against vitamin A deficiency in developing

2. Improved blood sugar regulation

Imbalance in blood sugar levels and insulin secretion are the main characteris-

tics of type 2 diabetes. Caiapo, a type of sweet potato with white skin and flesh, may improve symptoms in people with type 2 diabetes. This sweet potato may not only decrease

fasting blood glucose and LDL (bad) cholesterol levels but also increase insulin sensitivity.

3. Reduced oxidative damage and cancer risk

Oxidative damage to cells is often associated with increased risk of cancer, which occurs when cells divide uncontrollably. Diets rich in antioxidants, such as carotenoids, are associated with a lower risk of stomach, kidney, and breast cancers.

Studies indicate that sweet potatoes' potent antioxidants may reduce the risk of cancer. Purple potatoes have the highest antioxidant

Potential downsides

Sweet potatoes are well tolerated by most people. However, they are considered fairly high in substances called oxalates, which may increase your risk of kidney stones. Individuals who are prone to getting kidney stones may want to limit their sweet potato intake.

Sweet potatoes are underground tubers that are excellent sources of beta carotene, as well as many other vitamins, minerals, and plant compounds. This root vegetable may have several health benefits, such as improved blood sugar regulation and vitamin A levels. Overall, sweet potatoes are nutritious, cheap, and easy to incorporate into your diet.

SWEET POTATO CHIPS

Ingredients 4 small sweet potatoes, peeled Cooking spray /cooking oil to grease Salt (to taste)

Freshly ground pepper (to taste)

Preheat oven to 260°C

 Cut sweet potatoes lengthwise into wedges about 1.5 cm thick.

2. Lay in a single layer on a nor -stick baking sheet (you could also put down a layer of aluminum foil). Lightly coat with cooking spray or cooking oil.

3. Bake for 30 minutes, turning wedges once or twice during baking period, until potatoes are crisped and tender.

4. Serve immediately.

he debate over the history and evolution of the domestic dog ended with the tool of DNA testing.

It is now clear that all domestic dogs are descended from Canis lupus - the European grey wolf. They are still so closely related that they can interbreed, producing fully viable offspring (called wolfdogs) and in 1993 domestic dogs were reclassified from Canis familiaris to Canis lupus.

The remains of dogs dating back 10-15 000 years give a rough time estimate but we can only guess at how dogs were domesticated. Wolves and man were both hunters and hunted in packs and our paths would have regularly crossed. Perhaps a human hunting party found a very young wolf cub and decided to keep it. No doubt this happened in many different groups of hunters over thousands of years. A semi-tamed wolf would probably have had considerable value to a hunter gatherer group, providing superior hunting senses, as well as a defensive warning system.

Dog breeds would have evolved automatically. Wolves that were aggressive to the group or of little use would have been killed. Only wolves with desirable traits would have been left to breed. Eventually the traits of each group of tame wolves - size, colouring, senses and even the length of its coat or swimming ability - would reflect the needs of the group of humans it lived with. Puppies would have been swapped and traded between groups based on the inbred traits they now possessed.

Understanding the changing requirements of man through our history explains the hundreds of different dog breeds and the Groups, Classifications and Standards applied to dog breeds over time.

Sight hounds: for example whippets and greyhounds, have good vision and specialize in hunting quarry by sight rather than by scent.

THE HISTORY AND EVOLUTION OF DOGS



Their lean muscular body, deep chest and long powerful legs are essential assets when following fast and agile prey.

Scent hounds: for example bloodhounds, specialise in following a scent trail. They do not need to keep their quarry in sight and are built for endurance. They can follow a scent for long distances and even across running water. They have large noses which have deep, open nostrils and their lips are loose and moist, designed to pick up scent particles.

Hound dogs: were bred to chase (or hound) a quarry by sight or smell, or a combination of both senses.

Working dogs: were developed as big, strong

dogs to perform a wide variety of tasks, such as herding, droving, pulling, hauling, herding, hunting, rescuing and guarding.

Sporting dogs: for example retrievers, pointers and setters, hunt by air scent, as opposed to ground scent. Retrievers find and return killed game to the hunter. Some retrievers are especially equipped with a water-repellent coat and webbed feet, for retrieving downed waterfowl. Pointers stand in front of their quarry, with their nose and body rigidly still, thus pointing to its location. Setters were trained to set, or crouch, in front of game preventing its escape. The hunter would make the capture with a net. As man's hunting methods devel-

oped away from primitive tools and nets, sporting dogs became gundogs.

Terrier dogs: were developed to hunt and kill vermin including rats, mice and other predatory animals such as foxes that raided a farmer's produce and livestock. The nature of these tasks required an energetic, tenacious, brave and determined dog.

Non-sporting dogs: this includes a wide variety of breeds developed as times, fashions and societies changed.

Toy dogs: also known as Teacup dogs, a name which describes these tiny breeds, were initially status symbols owned by the wealthy with little apparent purpose.

his month's articles have been dedicated to looking at Occupational Health and Safety from various aspects. We looked at the management systems itself, and even looked at how it can apply in an office environment.

This week's article will look at the requirements needed for in order to pursue a career in the OHSAS field.

Occupational health and safety experts are concerned with the identification, prevention and control of health and safety hazards related to work and the work environment, as well as their prevention and control. They promote health and safety within organisations by developing safer, healthier and more efficient ways

of working.

If you pursue a career in this field, you might design programs to control, eliminate or prevent health problems caused by chemical, physical or biological agents. You might advise organisations about using more ergonomically

designed equipment or furniture. You might conduct occupational safety inspections or evaluate how well employers adhere to laws, regulations or policies designed to protect their workers' health and safety.

What are the educational requirements for a career in OHSAS?

Individuals interested in occupational health and safety will typically need a bachelor's degree as a foundation. Coursework includes safety and health standards, health hazard identification, industrial hygiene, occupational safety and hazardous materials and waste management. Students can also pursue related bachelor's degrees in chemistry, engineering or biology. Various short courses in occupational risk management, hazard identification and risk assessment can add to your credentials and expertise in the field.

A significant amount of on-the-job training is needed to learn the inspection procedures and applicable laws of various work environments. Since occupational health and safety specialists can work in numerous settings, the training they receive will be specific to the environment that they work in. For example, a specialist who works in a manufacturing facility will likely require different training from a specialist who works in an office environment. Training typically occurs under the supervision of an experienced professional and may take up to one year to complete.

Duties of an occupational health and safety specialist would generally include the following:

- inspect workplaces to ensure equipment, materials, and production processes do not present a safety and health hazard
- investigate health and safety related com-
- enforce health and safety laws and regulations
- review and make decisions regarding situations where a worker has refused to work on the grounds that danger exists, or the work will cause danger to the worker
- provide advice regarding the development of safe and healthy practices
- encourage managers, supervisors and employees to participate in occupational health and safety programs
- Investigate workplace fatalities, serious injuries and near misses.

These duties require occupational health and safety specialists to have a thorough understanding of legislation relating to safety standards and the ability to advise corrective action and facilitate change to improve the health and safety culture of workplaces. Health and safety officers also must keep informed about changes in technology.

Working Conditions

Health and safety specialists usually are

responsible for a territory or specific industrial process. Considerable travel may be required. Working hours depend on the types of workplaces they inspect. Overtime may be required, particularly after an incident or a hazardous situation has been identified.

Health and safety officers spend most of their time in the field where they may be exposed to potentially dangerous situations. They routinely are required to enter confined spaces, climb ladders and work in dusty conditions. The rest of their time is spent in offices located at central or regional headquarters.

Personal characteristics organizations look for in an occupational health and safety specialists generally include:

- good communication skills, both in writing and in person
- mediation and conflict resolution skills,
- the ability to manage multiple projects,
 the ability to remain open-minded and objective,
- ogood health and physical fitness,
- Good interpersonal skills.

The job title for OHSAS employees vary and organizations choose to name it differently. OHSAS employees can be referred to as an inspector, occupational hazards specialist, occupational health and safety specialist, safety officer. An individual in the OHSAS field should enjoy having clear rules and organized methods for their work, analyzing information, and acting as an advocate for workers.

Burned newborn found buried in Randfontein, mother arrested

OHANNESBURG - The Bekkersdal Police have arrested a young mother, aged 20, for burying her newborn at a cemetery in Mohlakeng, reports Randfontein Herald.

Police say the body was found burned.

The mother's friend, who is said to have helped delivered the baby, was also arrested, and both will be charged with murder.

Sergeant Linkie Lefakane, the Bekkersdal police spokesperson, said the arrests were made on Wednesday afternoon in Bekkersdal. "It is alleged the friend was cleaning the house when she discovered bloodied clothes and what looked like afterbirth remains. She alerted the elders in the yard and the police were called. A preliminary investigation was conducted, which led them to the mother who then took the police to her grandmother's grave where she had buried the baby. "The friend was also arrested after the police discovered she assisted the mother with delivering the baby. They will be both charged with mur-

Colonel Tinus Swart, the Bekkersdal Police station commander, commended the members for swiftly responding to this incident and ensuring that the perpetrators were apprehended shortly after it was reported. He said illegal termination of a pregnancy is unlawful and punishable by law. "Young women must make use of government institutions that offer free terminations and counselling or those that deal with adoptions instead of resorting to illegal or backdoor terminations (abortions)," he concluded. PANGA - WIELDING MEN RAPE 2 PUPILS

IMPOPO - The two pupils who were raped on their way home from school by unknown panga-wielding men fear going back

The mother of one of the survivors in Limpopo told SowetanLIVE her 16-year-old daughter was struggling to sleep and could barely eat.

Three pupils from Tshimbupfe Secondary School in Hanani village were on Tuesday attacked and two of them raped in the bushes, while on their way from a school in Thondoni village, 4km away.

"She is now fearing going back to school because she is still going to use the same road to and from school.

"My poor daughter is no longer the same after the horrible incident. She was always active and energetic but all that has disappeared."

The mother said her daughter told

her that she was walking with her two friends when they were attacked.

"My daughter said they were followed by a man in the middle of their trip who kept on speaking on the phone. She said when they started to suspect that they were being followed, they increased their pace and so did the man too.

"Immediately, when they wanted to run, another man came from the bushes and threatened to chop them with a panga." The mother said the suspects ordered the three pupils into a secluded area where two were repeatedly raped. "She said they were ordered to undress and open their legs before the men took turns raping them.

"They were told that they must not say anything to anybody if they wanted to live." The mother said she wants the police to arrest the two men and send them to jail. Sowetanlive

KZN govt allocates R66m budget for Zulu monarch

URBAN - KwaZulu-Natal Premier Sihle Zikalala confirmed on Thursday that King Goodwill Zwelithini's budget for the 2019/2020 financial year will be to the tune of just over R66m.

The official figure of R66 719 000 for the royal household was announced by Zikalala during his budget policy speech in the KZN provincial legislature.

"The Zulu king serves as a symbol of unity and continues to be a custodian of Zulu culture," he said.

Reacting to the allocation, opposition

parties in the legislature had differing views. The IFP welcomed the allocation, emphasising the importance of the royal household.

"More money should be injected into the royal household and traditional structures to support them," IFP MPL Velenkosini Hlabisa told IOL.

"We have allocated R66m to his majesty

150 PEOPLE DROWN OFF LIBYAN COAST

IBYA - Approximately 150 refugees have perished off the Libyan coast, after the boat they were in was shipwrecked as they tried to sail to Europe from al Khoms, 120 km east of Tripoli.

The United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) reported that at least another 150 who were rescued by fishermen and the coastguard have been brought back to Libya in what it described as "the worse Mediterranean tragedy" so far this year.

However, the waters off the North African country are extremely dangerous, and thousands of refugees have died at sea after their un-seaworthy boats sailed by human traffickers capsized.

Humanitarian organisations operating rescue boats have reached a standoff with the Libyan coast guard and several European governments, specifically the Italians – who are trying to stem the flow of illegal refugees

to their countries.

They do this by having them returned to Libya or prevented from leaving in the first place – and have declared the rescue operations illegal and have arrested some of the rescue personnel.

This forced some of the organisations to stop their operations towards the end of last year.

However, several have defiantly announced they are returning to the Mediterranean at the end of July to continue their rescues.

MOZA THREATENS ZIM WITH SANCTIONS

APUTO - Mozambique has threatened Zimbabwe with sanctions, after repeatedly warning Harare against imposing trade sanctions on a variety of goods exported from Maputo including alcohol, according to a report in the Zimbabwe media.

Pindula News reported that Mozambique's Minister of Trade and Commerce, Rajendra De Sousa allegedly told Zimbabwe President Emmerson Mnangagwa that the ban could be met with retaliation.

Business

During a business seminar in Maputo, De Sousa told Mozambican industrialists that Zimbabwe had placed bottlenecks for trade between the neighbours in clear violation of the SADC Free Trade Protocol agreement.

The minister said that he told Mnangagwa that Mozambique could also close its border with

Zimbabwe for three days which would complicate life for Harare.

A similar incident took place in 2017 with Malawi, after it too had banned several products being imported from Mozambique.

Mozambique closed its border with Malawi for several hours, after which numerous telephone calls were made and delegations sent to Maputo to resolve the impasse.

"Mozambique has this weapon, which is our geographical location. If they stick to the strategy of not using the law and using mechanisms, we will do the same," De Sousa warned.

Tunisia's first democratically elected president dies at 92

cally elected president, died on Thursday at a military hospital in the capital Tunis, after being admitted the night before.

The 92-year-old took office almost five years ago.

Essebsi died at 10:25 am (0925 GMT) on Thursday, the presidency said in a statement.

Hours later, parliamentary Speaker Mohamed Ennaceur was sworn-in as interim president. The 2014 constitution states that the Parliament head can take office for a maximum period of 90 days.

Ennaceur, 85, took the oath of office in the Parliament's premises in Tunis due to the absence of a Constitutional Court, which would have been tasked with declaring the presidency vacant so that an interim president can take over. The interim president in an evening speech vowed to adhere to the constitution and called for unity among the Tunisians. Late Thursday, the Independent Electoral Commission announced that Tunisia will hold

new presidential elections on September 15.

The President of the commission, Nabil Bafoun, said "the change in the date of the elections comes with the aim of adhering to the provisions of the constitution and respecting the deadlines..." The presidential vote was originally scheduled for November 17. A funeral for Essebsi will be held today, Tunisian Foreign Minister Khamis al-Jahnawi told the state news agency TAP. Late last month, Essebsi was hos-

pitalised for four days due to a severe illness. Since then, he has made few appearances in public.

He recently signed a decree to kick-off procedures for legislative and presidential elections scheduled for later this year. He looked firal in his last appearance on Monday when he met with Defence Minister Abdelkarim Zbidi. The president's death comes as Tunisia marked Republic Day on Thursday, the 62nd anniversary of the abolition of the monarchy. **DPA**

The exemption which the central bank hopes will unlock \$1.3 billion held in banks by exporting companies, individuals and international organisations, is the latest unexpected policy change by the government. Hyena mauls family in South Sudan

KHARTOUM - A South Sudanese family is still dealing with the trauma of losing three family members to a hyena attack, which happened as they slept outside their home in Pathai Payam in Bieh State, territory controlled by the South Sudanese opposition, in the middle of the night. Radio Tamazuj reported on Thursday that last week's attack also left three other people injured when they were mauled by the animal. The injured were admitted to Pieri Health Centre while local youths managed to track down the hyena and kill it. Hyena attacks on people in southern Sudan increased during the Second Sudanese Civil War, when human corpses were readily available to them. African News Agency

Sudan arrests top general, officers

SUDAN - Sudan's military said on Wednesday it had arrested a top general and several others over a foiled coup attempt announced earlier this month. "At the top of the participants is General Hashim Abdel Mottalib, the head of joint chiefs of staff, and a number of officers from the National Intelligence and Security Service," the military said in a statement.

"Leaders from Islamic movements and the National Congress Party of ousted leader Omar al-Bashir were also arrested," the military said in a statement. On July 11, the military announced it had foiled a coup attempt without specifying when it took place.

Zim can't afford to drown their sorrows

HARARE - Zimbabweans can no longer afford to drown their sorrows in beer as the product is now priced beyond their reach, the country's biggest alcohol brewer Delta said on Wednesday. Delta, which has AB Inbev as its major shareholder, said beer volumes for the three months to June were down 57%, with high prices the biggest deterrent. This should come as no surprise, with Zimbabwe's inflation for the three months under review jumping from 75.86% in April to 175.66% in June. National average wages and salaries have largely remained stagnant. Buying power has been eroded as the exchange rate between the US dollar and Zimbabwe's new currency - the real-time gross settlement dollar - depreciated from around 1:2.5 to the dollar to 1:9 currently. US FEDERAL GOVT TO EXECUTE INMATES FOR FIRST TIME SINCE 2003

EW YORK - The United States Justice Department on Thursday reinstated a two-decade long dormant policy allowing the federal government's use of capital punishment and immediately scheduled the executions for five death row federal inmates.

"Congress has expressly authorised the death penalty through legislation adopted by the people's representatives in both houses of Congress and signed by the president," Attorney General William Barr said in a statement.

"The Justice Department upholds the rule of law - and we owe it to the victims and their families to carry forward the sentence imposed by our justice system."

US President Donald Trump has called for increasing the use of the death penalty for drug traffickers and mass shooters, a request the Justice Department has since laid the groundwork to carry out.

Early on in the administration, former Attorney General Jeff Sessions ordered the Federal Bureau of Prisons to examine what steps might be required to resume the use of the death penalty, a Justice Department official said.

In March 2018, Sessions also called on federal prosecutors to seek the death penalty when bringing cases against drug dealers and traffickers as part of a strategy to help combat



the opioid crisis. Most recently in May, the department's Office of Legal Counsel took steps to make it easier for states to carry out executions by declaring that the Food and Drug Administration lacked the power to regulate lethal injection drugs.

Decision

That decision will make it easier for states to import such drugs after many pharmaceutical companies cut off supplies.

There are currently 62 federal inmates on death row, including Dzhokhar Tsarnaev, who planted a deadly bomb at the Boston Marathon in 2013. The Justice Department said it has scheduled executions for five federal inmates who have been convicted of murders and sex crimes, with more planned in the future.

All five will be executed by lethal injection using a single drug - phenobarbital.

According to US media, however, analysts say it is unclear if a protocol will be in place in time for executions to take place by the end of the year. Analysts also expect opposition to any protocol put in

The inmates included on the initial list of scheduled executions include, Daniel Lewis Lee, a white supremacist who was convicted in

Arkansas for murdering a family of three, including an 8-year-old

Another is Lezmond Mitchell, who was found guilty by a jury in Arizona of stabbing a 63-year-old grandmother and forcing her young granddaughter to sit next to her lifeless body on a car journey before slitting the girl's throat.

The other three inmates who will be executed are Wesley Ira Purkey, who raped and murdered a teenaged girl, Alfred Bourgeois, who sexually molested and killed his young daughter, and Dustin Lee Honken, who shot and killed five people.

Four dead in Los Angeles shooting spree

OS ANGELES - Four people were shot dead and two wounded on Thursday in a shooting spree that spread across Los Angeles neighbourhoods and touched off a 12hour manhunt before police tackled and arrested an armed suspect.

A Los Angeles police spokesman identified the suspect as Gerry Zaragoza, 26, and said he was held on pending murder charges in the shooting deaths of his father and brother, and the wounding of his mother with a gun shot. The spokesman did not identify the victims.

The shooting spree started at an apartment the suspect shared with his parents at about 2 a.m. on Thursday in LA's Canoga Park, police said.

Police said the suspect also allegedly shot and killed a woman he knew at a gas station in North Hollywood about 45 minutes later, but did not characterize their relationship.

Some media referred to her as a former girlfriend, others as an acquaintance.

At the same time, he allegedly shot and wounded a gas station clerk. The man was shot five times and was in critical condition, the Los Angeles Times and other media reported.

Later, at about 7:45 a.m., police said Zaragoza allegedly shot a gardener he tried to rob at an ATM machine. And at about 1 p.m. he allegedly shot and killed a man on a bus in the Van Nuys neighborhood, police said.

Media reports say he did not know the man on the bus and that the shooting appeared to be random. The Los Angeles Times reported that Zaragoza was arrested in Canoga Park after being tackled by plain clothes officers about 2:30 p.m. Police used a taser to subdue him. An LAPD spokesman had no information on any bond set for Zaragoza, but said he remained in police custody early yesterday. Reuters

Boris Johnson accused of being 'combative' after call to renegotiate Brexit

officials accused new British Prime Minister Boris Johnson of taking a "combative" approach after he demanded in his first speech to parliament that Brussels renegotiate Brexit or face the prospect of Britain leaving without a deal.

The European Union's chief Brexit negotiator Michel Barnier on Thursday urged the bloc's 27 remaining member states to "remain calm, stick to our prin-

ONDON/BRUSSELS - EU ciples and guidelines and show solidarity and unity."

The bloc will not heed Johnson's call to drop the Irish backstop clause in order to save the withdrawal deal, Barnier wrote in a letter to EU leaders seen by

Barnier said Johnson's statement was "rather combative," adding that he remains "available throughout the summer for talks" with Britain.

Johnson earlier Thursday urged EU

leaders to "rethink their current refusal" to renegotiate Britain's EU withdrawal agreement.

"We are ready to negotiate, in good faith, an alternative [Brexit deal]," Johnson told British lawmakers. "We will throw ourselves into these negotiations with the greatest energy and determination." If the EU does not renegotiate, "we will have to leave without an agreement," he said, adding that he has asked his new ministers to make prepa-

rations for a no-deal Brexit their "top priority." The president of the European Commission, Jean-Claude Juncker, discussed the withdrawal agreement with Johnson by phone later Thursday, according to a spokeswoman.

"President Juncker listened to what ... Prime Minister Johnson had to say, reiterating the EU's position that the withdrawal agreement is the best and only agreement possible," she told dpa.

The death of Armstrong, a \$6 million secret London teens charged after attack on lesbians Notre-Dame cathedral site, schools shut

NEW YORK - When Neil Armstrong died in 2012, it was officially put down to complications arising from heart surgery.

But seven years on, more murky circumstances have come to light. The New York Times said Tuesday it had received by mail 93 pages of documents revealing a dispute between the family of the most famous astronaut in history and the small Ohio hospital where he was treated and

The Cincinnati Enquirer also received the documents, which were sent anonymously. According to the newspapers, the family had threatened to publicly accuse the hospital of medical malpractice.

LONDON - British police on Thursday charged four teenage boys over an alleged homophobic attack on a lesbian couple who refused to kiss in front of them on a London night bus. Melania Geymonat, 28, said she and her girlfriend Chris were robbed and left covered in blood after the incident in the trendy Camden Town area on May 30. The four boys, aged between 15 and 17, were all charged with committing "an aggravated hate crime", London's Metropolitan Police said in a statement. Some of the group also face other charges including theft, handling stolen goods, and possession of cannabis, the force added. They are all set to appear in a London youth court on August 21. AFP

PARIS - Work to shore up the fire-ravaged Notre-Dame cathedral in Paris was halted on Thursday to stop workers being exposed to hazardous levels of lead hours after two nearby schools were also closed because of contamination fears.

Environmental groups warned soon after the disaster in April that hundreds of tonnes of lead in the historic church's roof had gone up in flames, endangering the health of people who live and work nearby.

Last week authorities insisted that lead contamination from the blaze posed no danger following a media report alleging that they had covered up pollution levels in local schools.

N Korea fires short-range missiles

SEOUL - North Korea fired two short-range missiles into the sea on Thursday, complicating efforts to resume stalled nuclear talks with Washington and signalling its anger over planned US-South Korea joint military exercises. It was Pyongyang's first missile test since an impromptu meeting between US President Donald Trump and North Korean leader Kim Jong Un last month that produced an agreement to resume a working-level denuclearisation dialogue. But those talks have vet to begin. And North Korea warned recently they could be derailed by Washington and Seoul's refusal to scrap military exercises scheduled for next month.





ONDON - Arsenal stars Mesut Ozil and Sead Kolasinac were chased for a mile by knife-wielding motorbike riders in an attempted daylight car-jacking in north London on Thursday

Ozil, a £350 000-a-week midfielder, was ambushed by the robbers as he drove his black Mercedes G-Class through leafy Childs Hill at around 5pm on Thursday.

But as the thugs surrounded the 4x4. Ozil's Arsenal teammate and childhood friend, Sead 'The Tank' Kolasinac, leapt out and bravely took them on.

CCTV footage form the scene shows Kolasinac swinging punches at the attackers and standing his ground against them despite being threatened with a knife. The attackers' motorbike pulls away as the footage cuts.

But rather than that being the end of

the drama, the players were then chased through the mansion-lined streets of north London in Ozil's 4x4 in a highspeed chase that lasted for more than a mile.

The childhood friends sped towards a Turkish restaurant on Golders Green Road where they are known, and staff raced to their aid as they abandoned the Mercedes 4x4 in the road.

Witnesses said 30-year-old Ozil looked 'terrified,' as the waiters and chefs rushed to defend their friend.

One witness told MailOnline: "I saw Ozil being chased up my High Street by boys armed with knives."

CCTV footage captured before the chase began shows burly 6ft Bosnian Kolasinac squaring up to and rushing at a robber whose face is obscured by a crash helmet.

The 26-year-old darts toward the front

end of the Mercedes to face off an attacker as he makes sure the front passenger door is protected.

The fullback then turns to the rear of the vehicle to steam towards an oncoming assailant who appears to be wielding a blade while wearing a motorbike

At this point Ozil is able to drive forward in the £100 000 SUV as Kolasinac swings his bare-fists at the thug.

Off camera, Kolasinac was able to rejoin Ozil in the car and they sped away together, pursued by the raiders.

Waiters and chefs from Turkish Restaurant Likya rushed to the aid of the football stars when they arrived forcing the riders to flee empty handed.

Neither of the Premier League players from the north London club were harmed during the incident.

Angry Sakho sues WADA for £13 million over 'gaffe'

ONDON - Mamadou Sakho is suing the World Anti-Doping Agency for £13million, accusing them of a drug-test error that effectively ended his Liverpool career.

The central defender, now at Crystal Palace, was banned in April 2016 following a positive test for a fatburning substance after a Europa League match against Manchester United.

The provisional 30-day suspension meant the France international missed Liverpool's Europa League final loss to Sevilla and, at London's High Court on Thursday, Sakho claimed the ruling cost him a place at Euro 2016 in his homeland.

The court heard that Sakho tested positive for higenamine in March 2016.

However, he was eventually cleared by UEFA after they ruled the substance was not on the banned list.

As a result, Sakho is suing for £13m, claiming his earnings and the worth of his personal brand have been reduced due to his move away from Liverpool.

WADA deny responsibility for his transfer from Liverpool, which they say was caused by disciplinary issues and a personality clash with Manager Jurgen Klopp.

Sakho's barrister Stuart Ritchie told the court: "Although (Crystal Palace) is a distinguished Premier League club, it does not have the worldwide reputation or brand recognition of Liverpool with the value which this brings to a player, and his associated image rights. Only recently has he been re-selected to play for the French national team.'

The laboratory wrote to WADA, which maintains the list of substances prohibited in world sports, and was told the substance was on the banned

But the list did not specifically name higenamine and UEFA found it was not proven that it was on the banned list, clearing and 'vindicating' Sakho in July 2016, according his QC. The 29-year-old argues the impact on his career was made worse when WADA stood by their claims in 'defamatory' emails to journalists in 2016 and 2017, said Ritchie.



ANCHESTER -Former England striker Darren Bent has announced his retirement from football at the age of 35.

Bent, who has not had a club since his release by Derby at the end of the 2017/18 campaign, revealed his decision to hang up his boots during an interview on talkSPORT on Thursday afternoon.

He represented England 13 times, netting four goals, and scored 106 Premier League goals in 276 appearances.

Bent started his career at Ipswich and also had permanent spells at Charlton, Tottenham, Sunderland, Aston Villa - who paid a club-record £18million to sign him - and Derby during a 17-year playing career.

Bent was part of one of the most memorable moments in Premier League history in 2009.





Whyte survived a ninth-round knockdown to claim victory over the Colombian on points at the O2 Arena in London.

In a statement posted on Twitter, Whyte insisted that he won the fight fair and square.

He said: "I am so disappointed with the rubbish that has been said about me over the last few days.

"I have lawyers dealing with it and I have been told that I can't talk about it for good legal reasons. I was cleared to fight and I won that fight fair and square."

The 31-year-old has served a previous doping ban from 2012 for unknowingly taking an illegal supplement, and he could now be suspended for eight years if he is found guilty of a second offence.

Sportsmail revealed on Thursday that Whyte underwent a hearing in front of a doping panel just before his clash with Rivas.

Legal

It is understood that the 31-yearold and his legal representatives made their case to the independent National Anti-Doping Panel on Saturday morning.

The tests are believed to have been administered by the British agency UKAD on July 17.

The results were reported to Whyte's Matchroom promoters and the British Boxing Board of Control. The latter allowed the fight to go ahead according to legal protocol, pending B sample tests and appeals.

Should Whyte's B sample come back negative, he would be cleared of any wrongdoing.

Speaking to iFL TV, Whyte's promoter Eddie Hearn said: "Before this bout this situation was dealt



The step up to the top-tier Jupiler Pro League is welcome, though, for one of South Africa's best attacking talents currently.



Japan recycled nearly 80 000 tons of cellphones to make medals

OKYO - The 2020 Olympic and to extract their precious metals, however. Of for another year, but Japan hasn't wasted any time in getting the medals ready.

Tokyo 2020 is making the the gold, silver, and bronze medals entirely from 78 985 tons of recycled electronics, including 6.21 million recycled cellphones, according to the Tokyo 2020 Medal Project.

It turns out that gadgets contain everything that's needed to make the medals. Tokyo 2020 didn't say if the ribbons were also made from the old electronics, but perhaps the recycled plastic could make for good ribbon material? I wouldn't start tearing apart electronics

Paralympic games in Tokyo don't start the nearly 80 000 tons of recycled gadgets, only 32 kilograms of gold, 3 500 kilograms of silver, and 2 200 kilograms of bronze (copper and zinc in this case) were extracted, according to Tokyo 2020.

Collected

The Tokyo 2020 Medal Project - including Japanese mobile carrier NTT Docomo, which collected the cellphones - started collections between April 2017 and March 2019. In those two years, the project amassed enough relevant metal for approximately 5 000 Olympic and Paralympic medals.


