PUT PHATHAPHATHA BEHIND

omen want Pigg's Peak Principal Magistrate Phathaphatha Mdluli, who is accused of bashing his wife Nelisiwe behind bars.

To show the seriousness of the matter, about 20 women stormed the Royal Eswatini Police Service (REPS) Headquarters to 'assist' police with investigations which might lead to the arrest of Mdluli.

Principal Magistrate Mdluli was reported to the police to have allegedly assaulted his wife.

Both were reported to have recorded statements with police regarding the assault issue.

Leading the women who went to the police headquarters was Women and Law in Southern Africa (WLSA) National Director Xolani Hlatjwako. They arrived at the police headquarters at around 2pm yesterday and had media briefing behind the headquarters before proceeding to the reception area. However, they were not attended to as there was no officer on duty.

Audience

After a while, Senior Deputy National Commissioner Sula Dlamini walked in. Dlamini inquired from the women why there were at the police centre. Hlatjwako informed him that the women wanted an audience with the National Commissioner William Dlamini regarding Mdluli's case.

They were armed with our sister paper's front page copies. Dlamini made some few calls inquiring from relevant police officers if they were aware of the visit by the women.

He was later joined by Assistant

Commissioner Charles Magagula, who was in the building and were later joined by another officer.

Making her remarks, Hlatjwako mentioned that the country's women were shocked to read scary headlines that a senior magistrate had allegedly badly assaulted his wife. She stated that some of the women were not from WLSA but were concerned by the headlines.

Disbelief

"We read in the newspapers that the senior magistrate has not been arrested and it stated in the articles that police investigations were underway. We thought since the country has passed the Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence Act, which aims to protect people from abuse, it would be fit that we come to assist police in whatever way," she said.

Hlatshwako added; "Maybe there is something not adding up in the investigations, we are in disbelief that a senior magistrate who is a custodian of the law has violated the same law he is supposed to protect as a Judiciary

She emphasised that women were at the police centre to assist police not to intrude. She said women frowned upon the senior magistrate's alleged

The national director explained that the law should take its course as it was unaccepted that Mdluli was not behind bars. She mentioned that Mdluli should be arrested despite that his wife had not pressed charges against the law keeper.

Dignity

Meanwhile, another woman added that their main intention was to preserve the dignity of the rule of law in the country.

We are acting as actors not people who are being acted upon. We were there when the SODV Act was being pushed, so it could be an Act. We want a fear free society where criminals would be the ones who are scared. We asked that if there is anywhere you want to send us in order to see Mdluli behind bars, we are here, please send us," she narrated.

In response, Dlamini thanked the women for showing interest in assisting the police in the matter. He assured them that police were working on the matter, adding that they should not worry about a thing.

"I have gathered that the matter was reported to the police but I am yet to make follow ups on how far it has been dealt with. Police will deal with the matter the best way they know how such cases should be handled," Dlamini

He hoped that once the case had been concluded, the women wouldbe made aware. However, the women promised that should Mdluli not be arrested by tomorrow, they would again storm the police headquarters They emphasised that in the past they staged similar moves to the NATCOM but such cases were not dealt with.

"Can we be told convincingly timebound actions rather than saying it is going to happen? We were once here where we talked about a university student who was raped but until today we have not been given feedback," one woman said.

To those assertions, Dlamini promised the women that they would deal with the matter. He continued to add that they might find that there would be no need for them (women) to come to the police control centre tomorrow.

Pharmacist reported to ACC for E2m ARVs purchase

he Good Shepherd Mission Hospital medical officer, who resigned early this week has been reported to the Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) for the unauthorised purchase of drugs amounting to over E3.5 million.

The pharmacist was initially suspended by the hospital after being alleged to have been involved in misconduct of dispensing regulated drugs (Phethedine) to patients without a doctor's pre-

Phethedine is widely and routinely prescribed for moderate-to-severe pain in medical and surgical patients and is regulated.

According to the ministry of health, the drug is highly controlled and monitored internationally. Deputy Director Health Services Dr Velephi Okello said the ministry was aware of the investigation on the discrepancies of the supply of the drug at Good Shepherd Hospital as these were discovered by the pharmaceutical department and was reported to the police for further investigation.

Indicated

Sources close to the matter have revealed that the officer has since been reported to the ACC after investigations by the hospital indicated that he was also implicated in the purchase of drugs worth about E3.5 million without the approval of the

These drugs are ARVs worth over E2.5 million and pain killers worth E1 million. He has disputed the allegations, saying he would not have procured the said drugs as they were received freely from government.

"ARVs, TB and Malaria medications are supplied freely by government, why would I purchase them?"

He also disputed having purchased pain killers worth the said amount without the approval of the Board as alleged

The pharmacist is said to have resigned while he was expected to appear for his disciplinary hearing tomorrow.

The hospital administration confirmed that he was no longer employed by the mission through a notice issued on Wednesday.

The officer told this newspaper that he resigned because he was no longer happy at work and disputed that his resignation was related to the disciplinary hearing pertaining the dispensing of the regulated drugs.

Investigation

The purchase of the medicine is said to have been noted in the audited financial statements, which called for an investigation as some were not accounted for. According to sources close to the matter, the officer had initially been suspended with full pay following an investigation by the police.

"This followed that someone was found with these drugs and upon investigation, it was established that these drugs were sourced from the Good Shepherd Hospital.

He was supposed to appear before the disciplinary committee, but he requested that his time be extended and on Monday he resigned yet he was scheduled for the hearing on Wednesday," revealed

The medical officer, on the other hand said he had never seen the person who was found with the

The sources also revealed that this did not stop the hospital from further investigating the matter as it also uncovered that the pharmacist assisted the company that supplied the drugs to the hospital, even though it did not have the licence to do

"The investigation indicated that the procurement procedures were flouted, not only in the suppliers of the medicines but other departments, including the kitchen, we suspect that is one of the reasons the finance officer's contract was not renewed. The pharmacist's relationship with the company that supplied the hospital was also questionable as he allegedly worked there before, "the sources further revealed.

The officer also disputed these allegations, say ing he had never worked at the company that sup plied the hospital.

"I worked for over 12 years in the hospital and the company you are referring to is two years old. you can do the math I never worked for that company," he added.

Good Shepherd Mission Hospital CEO Muzi Dlamini confirmed that the hospital was requested ed by the police to assist them in their investigations while the pharmacist was suspended.

We learnt from the police that the regulated drugs which are schedule 6 and should be admit istered with a doctor's prescription were indeed dispense. dispensed from our hospital and this is a serious offence as these drugs are also monitored by international bodies," he said.

The CEO further confirmed that the matter had been hand been handed to the police fraudunit, as well as the ACC for further investigation.

Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Superintendent Phindile Vilakati confirmed the matter, saying the police were still doing more investigate. investigations.

The matter was reported to the police and we estill in are still investigating the allegations. A man was found with found with the drugs and investigations led the Police to the hospital," she said.

PAC TELLS PS TO REDEPLOY KNOWLEDGE NGWENYA

he Public Accounts
Committee (PAC) has
instructed the Ministry
of Education and Training
Principal Secretary Bertram
Stewart to redeploy Senior Career
Guidance Officer Knowledge
Ngwenya as he does not qualify for the position he was promoted to.

The PS was further fined E400 for allowing this anomaly to occur, on the other hand the PAC in June ordered Ngwenya to refund government E524 000 for executing duties for a non-existent post.

existent post.

"The controlling officer is urged to engage the Civil Service Commission on the possible redeployment of the officer to a field he is more relevant in since he does not qualify to hold the position he was promoted to," reads part of the recommendation made by the PAC.

The PAC also said the min-

istry of public service should engage all government ministries and departments as well as the CSC to ensure that officers recommended for process recommended for process recommended for process recommended for processary qualifications to the necessary qualifications to avoid a situation similar to that of the ministry of education where an officer was promotwhere an officer was promoted to a technical position that ed to a technical position that he is neither qualified for nor

have any experience in. This comes after the Auditor General reported that an Assistant Administrative Clerk was promoted to the post of assistant career guidance officer without the relevant qualifications.

The post required that the incumbent should be possess a bachelor's degree in social sciences or humanities or a knowledge in Information Communications Technology, but the officer did not have any of these qualifications. Instead he only had an O'Level Certificate with poor grades.

Paid

"The same officer, was promoted in August 2014 did not report to his new duty station, which was in Nhlangano. Instead he continued working in the Ministry's Head-quarters in Mbabane and did not render the service he was paid for. As a result, at the time of the audit, he had been paid a sum of E524 352.38, over a period of 43 months, without rendering the service," further reads the report.

On the other hand, the principal secretary concurred with the Auditor General's findings and submitted that Ngwenya appealed his deployment to Nhlangano claiming that his life was in danger in the Shiselweni region since he had supposedly unearthed a lot of rot com-

mitted by teachers in that region which led to some of them facing disciplinary cases at the Teaching Service Commission and criminal cases, hence he had made enemies with them.

"The officer himself appeared before the honourable committee and reiterated what the controlling officer said. He further stated that he was given a verbal instruction by the then principal secretary to assist the office of the under secretary – schools manager with investigating cases of misconduct by teachers.

"The schools manager informed the PAC that the ministry had been unsuccessful in trying to re-designate the post of assistant career guidance officer occupied by the officer so that he could continue with his duties in Mbabane.

Interviews

Regarding the officer being promoted to a post he was not qualified for; it was submitted that the officer did not apply for the post and never underwent any interviews. Instead, he was formally recommended for promotion by the former Principal Secretary.

"A letter signed by the former Principal Secretary where he was recommending the officer to the Civil Service Commission was produced as evidence," further reads the report.

High profile cases erode faith in justice - Law Society

aw Society of Swaziland is of the view that a delay in dealing with the rape of the university student, Judge Abande Dlamini's alleged shooting at Kai-Kai and Pigg's Peak Principal Magistrate Phathaphatha Mdluli would have dire consequences for the justice system of the country.

Charges have not been preferred against these high profile individuals.

The Society's Secretary General (SG) and Human Rights lawyer Thulani Maseko was reacting to reports that Mdluli is accused of assaulting his wife.

He said the allegations made against Magistrate Mdluli were a cause for serious concern. He continued to state since the enacting of the SODV Act men have been appearing in court in relation to women abuse cases.

"So it is very sad that those who stand in judgement against others should now be the ones who are said to be violating the rights of their spouses. What it really says is that maybe something is not right within the

judiciary in terms of upholding the code of conduct and ethics by members of the judiciary," he explained.

Maseko added that the recent incidents say a lot about the behaviour and conduct of the country's Judiciary.

"The unintended result is that it is going to undermine faith in our courts. That is the disturbing part of it when officers of the law are the ones who are now undermining the law.

Powerful

"Faith in the Judiciary system would be lost by most members of the public and we record that something must be done to ensure that those who are sitting in powerful positions and undermine the law must face the consequences," Maseko elaborated.

Maseko said it was disturbing that there was no progress in Judge Abande Dlamini. He said there were two processes in dealing with such cases – criminal and professional. Professionally, judges are supposed to be disciplined by the Judiciary Services Commission

through impeachment; however, Maseko stated that the Director of Public Prosecutions (DPP) can also act on the criminal process.

"The problem with this type of cases of prominent or people who are connected to people in higher places is that they are not treated the same way as ordinary citizens.

"That is why I am saying at the end of day people are going to lose faith in institutions that are supposed to ensure that the law is abided equally," he said.

He said the police, prosecution and the judiciary were three critical institutions that should ensure that people do not undermine the law.

The SG mentioned that should the law be perceived as bias, people are going to lose faith in them.

He said the cases of the rape prince; Judge Dlamini as well as Principal Magistrate Mdluli were classical examples that indicate that the law is not being applied equally to citizens in the country. He said such was very unfair.

Teacher brutally killed, husband on the run

n another serious case of domestic violence, a teacher who had a long strained relationship with her husband has been discovered lying in a pool of blood in her bath-

Nokuthula Vangile Dlamini had a deep wound on the forehead, with her brains splattered across her face. There was blood all over her house.

She was married to popular kombi operator Vusi Dlamini, who is now on the loose, and a person of interest.

Police have appealed to Dlamini to surrender himself to enable them to conduct their investigations. It is unclear if Nokuthula was stabbed or shot with a firearm given the nature of the deadly wound.

Dlamini who to many is popularly known as '3rand', operates a kombi business under the style Caterpillar Transport which services Nhlangano/Makhonza route.

The body of the deceased was found in her bathroom on Friday – bloodied all over. According to well-placed sources, there appears to have been a scuffle the night before, although it is unclear what the fight was about.

The two were reportedly alone in the house the night before.

Nokuthula was a teacher at Othandweni Primary School under Zombodze Emuva constituency. Her colleagues, including Principal Dumisile Shabangu last saw her alive at school on Thursday. The couple had a home at Davies, which is an area under Engwenyameni Umphakatsi close to Zombodze Emuva.

Claims are that Nokuthula and her husband had a long history of their domestic problems such that they ended up in separation with the woman building her own home in the same area, although at times she found herself at her matrimonial home.

Family members alleged that when the couple would engage in misunderstanding, she would leave to the home she built close by.

It is also understood that the families of the two were at times engaged to assist the two to talk things out.

On this fateful day, it is said the two had a

misunderstanding which led to a scuffle inside the house and the husband was allegedly infuriated and reached for the object that allegedly killed her.

It is alleged that Nokuthula's body was dragged to the bathroom, allegedly by her husband who then locked the house and left.

Sources said he then called his children and advised them to go to the police station to alert them that he had accidentally killed his wife.

"He called one of their children and instructed them that they should go to the police and alert them of what he did to their mother," said a well-placed source.

According to the source, he directed them where he had kept the keys to the house.

"The children did as ordered and when police arrived, the house was opened and in the bathroom, there was the body of the deceased and everyone was shocked. The suspect was nowhere to be found and has been on the run since the day he committed the crime," said a source.

Police mouthpiece Supt Phindile Vilakati confirmed the incident and further appealed to the public to assist in the apprehension of the suspect.

"He is also advised to surrender himself as being on the run won't help him," said Supt Vilakati.

MOVEMENT MUST BE RELEVANT, CREDIBLE, KING URGES LEADERS

AKU, AZERBAIJAN - His Majesty the King has emphasised the need for the Non-Aligned Movement to remain relevant and credible.

Speaking at the 18th Summit of Heads of State and Government of the Non-Aligned Movement, His Majesty King Mswati III said since existence in 1959, the persistent global challenges that the movement was established to overcome require introspection and honest self-evaluation.

The primary objectives of the Non-Aligned Movement include the support of self-determination, national independence and the sovereignty and territorial integrity of States, among others.

"Over 60 years later our countries are still confronted by several natural and man-made critical issues that affect our nations and peoples. Our movement has always advocated for a world of peace, justice, respect, fraternal friendship, solidarity, cooperation and development for all," he

Some developing countries and several members of the movement, he noted, bear more predominantly the price and the consequences of violations of international law, foreign domination, armed conflicts, illicit financial flows and unfair trade prac-

The King said multilateralism provides the motivation to address global issues of concern such as poverty, hunger, climate action, migration, transnational crimes and the fight against global terrorism and violent extremism, to mention but a few.

He said the theme of the summit; 'Promoting international peace and security for sustainable development,' reaffirmed the collective desire to establish a peaceful and prosperous

"We also want just and equitable societies in which poverty is eradi-



cated, inequalities are reduced, the of countries, leading to increased environment is protected, health for all is guaranteed, education and decent work are provided to the populace of

the world," he emphasised. His Majesty the King assured the Summit that the kingdom would continue to promote and defend an international rules-based system and condemn unilateral coercive measures taken against countries of the movement and threatening the dignity of the people.

He highlighted that such actions were issued in violation of the Charter of the United Nations and International Law, particularly the principles of non-intervention, self-determination and independence of States.

"Each member State has full sovereignty over its wealth, natural resources and economic activity, political determinations and must be allowed to exercise those rights freely," he said.

The King also noted how the global financial and economic crises continued to adversely impact on the economic growth and the development poverty.

Worsening the situation, he said, was the continued unequal terms of trade, reduction in foreign aid and assistance, unilateral coercive measures imposed by a few countries, and the re-emergence of extreme nation-

"In reality, globalisation and trade liberalisation have accrued uneven benefits among member States. Many people still feel left behind.

"In fact, several developing countries, such as Eswatini, have become more vulnerable to the shocks of financial and economic crises, climate change, food shortages, and energy challenges," he said.

· A reassessment of the reality of the challenges faced by individual countries when official development support is considered. Trade must contribute to poverty reduction and foster growth.

Increased aid towards trade and

capacity building in order to strengthen the participation of developing countries in the global value chain and promote regional economic integration and interconnectivity.

 Recommitting to working together as the only avenue that guarantees peace and development for all our countries.

 Acceleration of efforts towards the full implementation of the 2030 Agenda for sustainable development, leaving no one behind.

· Developed countries to support the provision of financing, transfer of appropriate technology and capacity-building to members of the move-

He commended the efforts of the international community to counter and eradicate the spread of various pandemics like Ebola, HIV and AIDS, TB and malaria, including initiatives for confronting the aftermath of natural disasters around the world.

He said the Kingdom of Eswatini was desirous of a return to unity and conformity with international law and build the Africa we want, grow our economy through new technologies and innovative initiatives, and improve intra-Africa trade as well as trade with the rest of the world.

ABOUT THE NON-ALIGNED MOVEMENT


The Heydar Aliyev Foundation was established in memory of former leader and father of current president Heydar Aliyev, who helped the country build an independent state.

LIQUIDATION RAISES MORE QUESTIONS 'THAN MO

¬he liquidation of Matata Retail (Proprietary) Limited based on insolvency has raised some furore among concerned members of the public, including business people and individual legislators and legal prac-

"Liquidations are too easily accessible and destructive to the general economy just the number of job losses and the loss of revenue are delimitating. We need to consider mandatory business rescue before final liquidation," said another lawyer. Similarly, a legislator who respond ed to the liquidation of Matata said he was not convinced that the compan was insolvent.

Don't give Judge Abande his gun – victim

ithembiso Mngometulu claims his life would be exposed to danger should Industrial Court Judge Abande Dlamini be granted his pistol by the High Court of Eswatini.

This comes after Judge Abande filed an urgent application at the High Court to have his pistol released

Mngometulu is the young man who was shot allegedly by Industrial Court Judge Abande at Kai-Kai motel a couple of months ago. He was speaking from his hospital bed at Mbabane Government Hospital yesterday, where he is still waiting to be referred to theatre so that he can undergo a metal implant procedure.

He stated that releasing the pistol to Judge Dlamini would be tantamount to giving him (Judge Abande) the leeway to finish him off. He asserted that he still feels unsafe as anything can happen while still at the hospital. Mngometulu has already spent two months at Mbabane Government Hospital.

"I don't understand why he wants the gun back. I plead with the courts not to release the gun to that gentleman. Because I don't know what he intends to do with it, if he feels threatened he should seek protection from the police, as a judge I don't think they (police) will have a problem in protecting him," he

Mngometulu stated that after hearing about the judge's inten-



The directors averred that Matata Retail (Proprietary) was operating a franchise of the Spar Group Limited, however, Spar, through a court order obtained on April 26, 2018, took over all the shops of the company and consequently since then it had not traded. "Due to the above, the company has not been able to pay its creditors and to the extent that one of the creditors. Viva Beverages, obtained a court order and executed a writ which Matata Retail could not satisfy," alleged Hans. The directors claimed that considering the above, to continue trading would be unlawful and contrary to the provisions of the

Steffen alleged that to continue trading would be permitting the company to increase its debts and liabilities, which it could not meet since it had ceased to conduct business. The company submitted that it was unable to pay its debts and should be wound up in terms of the provision of the Companies Act, 2009 to enable the liquidator not only to take charge of the company but also administer and realise its assets under the machinery of winding up for the benefit of the


On the other hand, the PSAs are expected to table 19.9 per cent CoLA demand in the on-going negotiations with government. The 19.9 per cent is a sum of 7.85 per cent demand of the financial year 2017/18, 6.55 per cent which was tabled by the unions during the 2018/19 fiscal year and an estimated 5.5 per cent for the current financial year.

However, they had not yet tabled this financial year's demand but they had mentioned before that it would be not less than the 5.5 per cent, which is last year's average inflation rate. However, according to the ministry of finance second Quarter performance report for the financial year 2019/2020, the Standing Committee on Public Enterprises (SCOPE) did not approve their CoLA as well as salary review recommendations.

As reported by the Sunday Observer last week, government through SCOPE has in the second quarter approved the CoLA and salary review recommendations of five Category A Public Enterprises (EP) in the second quarter.

SCOPE approved CoLA for the Eswatini Water Services Corporation (EWSC) Public Service Pension Fund (PSPF) Eswatini Electricity Company (EEC) and Eswatini Development Finance Corporation (FINCORP). It also approved the request for the Eswatini Revenue Authority (SRA) implementation of the salary benchmarking recommendations.

Furthermore, the SCOPE approved the Eswatini Water Services Corporation salary review report and the recommendations.

"We have made an application with the Human Settlement Authority and as of next week we may get title deeds," he added. Steffens is optimistic that the nearby LUSIP projects will bring about the needed economic activity in the town.

Matata, the town, is home to the business known as Matata Group of Companies. The businesses include supermarkets, retail stores, farm machinery outlets, abattoirs, cattle ranches, a butchery, sugar farms, and maize plantations.

CHURCH ACCEPTS E31m OFFER FROM BUILD IT

n a rather bizarre instance, Build It Hardware offered a place of worship worth E31 million in their quest to expand their shop stationed near the Mbabane police sta-


outh African actress Ayanda Mbuli debuted on Mzansi Magic soapie The Queen on Friday where she plays a Swati character 'Cynthia'.

Govt audits ineffective as 11 auditors leave

nding corruption and fraud seems to be a farfetched dream in the country, as auditing government ministries has become cumbersome and ineffective for the remaining internal auditors within the ministry of finance as there is an exodus of officers who are not replaced.

The ineffective auditing of government ministries, marred with the poor documentation and record keeping in most ministries is envisaged to increase opportunities for fraud, corruption and non-accountability.

The ministry of finance notes that there is a growing limitation of audit effectiveness with a delayed completion of audits due to several factors, one being that the internal audit department is understaffed.

The internal audit office provides independent analysis, appraisal of public entities systems of control and makes recommendations on the adequacy of internal controls, risk management and governance process in delivering each entity's objective.

The department also reviews means of safeguarding government assets and delivers independent assessment of the reliability and integrity of financial regulatory and operational information and control effectiveness to government. However, the department is struggling to meet its mandate due to the shortage of human resources, among other challenges.

"None replacement of technical staff migrating to the private sector have negative effects of reducing audit coverage in various government ministries. One officer resigned this quarter in addition to the first quarter resignations, increasing the vacant posts to 11," reports the ministry.

This was also alluded to by the Communications Officer Setsabile Dlamini, who said the high turnover was mainly due to employees moving to corporate organisations in the private sector.

Apart from being understaffed, the internal audit department is also faced with the challenge of other resources, such as the non-availability of fuel. This has interrupted audits and resulted in delays in the completion of audits, hence most of the audits are work in progress status.

Ministry

As per the ministry, 17 of the audits within the different ministries and government departments are still pending with only two completed in the second quarter. These are mainly audits of arrears, while the other assignments which are also pending include closing stock and fleet inventory management.

Some of the affected ministries are: tourism, housing, health, labour and social security, education economic planning works and the ministry of sports culture and youth affairs. Government departments with audits which are work-in-progress include the geology, anticorruption, fire, central administration and micro-projects. The department is also faced with the challenge of poor documentation of records related to procurements and payment of goods and services in most government ministries and departments.

Responding to what the ministry is doing to address these challenges, the communications officer stated that heads of accounting departments were constantly sensitised on the adherence to proper record keeping.

"The ministry through the internal audit department has facilitated sensitisation of Heads of Accounting sections and other levels on risk management, that includes the importance of record keeping and how it affects the public sector as a whole. Further, the ministry in the Public Budget Committee meetings sensitise Controlling Officers and Heads of Accounting sections on such issues," she said. Dlamini did not state what the ministry was doing to address the shortage of the technical staff that migrated for greener pastures.

The department, on the other hand states that these challenges contribute to the delays in systems evaluation and risk management for improvement purposes. The department also notes that the challenges also expose government to impaired achievement of objectives and increase opportunities for fraud, corruption, and non-accountability and irresponsible use of pub-

Vilakati last week mentioned that the Nosipho referred to was not the same as her assistant.

Dlamini also accused Superintendent Vilakati of protecting Mnguni because they were colleagues. The family member wondered how an institution like the police could protect wrongdoers, especially because it frowned upon fraudsters.

Records

To the latest developments, DPICO Mnguni politely declined to comment on the matter without giving reasons behind her decision.

Meanwhile, Superintendent Vilakati when informed that the Mohales family has accused her of dishonest, she acknowledged that the names of the particulars were similar. However, she said that did not guarantee that it was her

She continued to state that records of the case referred to were out-dated. She said most of government institutions keep records for five years. She mentioned that another factor was that the police headquarters moved to

"However, that doesn't stop an aggrieved person to re-open a case if they feel it was not well handled," she said.

Superintendent Vilakati continued to state that nothing could stop police from getting information on a case. She said by re-opening the case it would help to put to rest the speculations.

She urged Dlamini to engage the police on the issue; she assured that police would work on the matter regardless of who was involved. She requested the aggrieved individuals to visit the police headquarters.

Mohale's elder brother, who shares a mother with her, has come out to state that Mnguni was being economical with the truth by saying none of her names had a Y.

Claims

To substantiate his claims, Dlamini produced a Swazi Observer article on police promotions, which was published on April 10, 2018. In the article which is found on press reader, the DPICO was addressed as Siphofaneni Police Station Assistant Inspector Nosipho Y Mnguni from the Operational Support Services Unit (OSSU) (Scuba Divers). She was being promoted from Sergeant or Assistant Inspector to her current rank.

He added that even police were also aware that DPICO's other name starts with a Y, so they should stop protecting her.

As if that was not enough, Dlamini said he acted as Mohale's guardian during the period when the matter was being heard. He firmly stated that the he met Mnguni once or twice during a court appearance back then, so he confirmed that the Nosipho he met was the DPICO. He added that the matter was heard at the Mbabane Magistrate's Court; however, he said the matter 'disappeared' without being finalised.

"When the certificate was forged, Ntombikhona was staying with me at Ngwenya Village, as I was already employed.

It was later discovered that the person who let her (Ntombikhona) down was her friend called Nosipho Mnguni. I didn't know her (Nosipho) at the time but I met her while attending to the court case," he narrated.

Dlamini added that it would be a struggle to get fact on the matter should one take as a matter of facts the things said by Mnguni.

"I was also disappointed by the comment of PICO, she talked like the matter had been concluded or they had verified that Mnguni was not the one accused of forging the certificate," he elaborated.

Dlamini also mentioned that he consulted with his sister regarding the article, he stated that what was disturbing was reading articles about Mnguni denying being the accused person. Furthermore, Dlamini said Mnguni should own up to the past, adding that she made a mistake and probably she was a changed per-

"It is unfortunatethat she was still economical with the truth knowing that the story was going to be read by members of the public.

@We can't question the justice system but waited that the case would be finalised. We all have the desire to know what happened to the case. I felt it was necessary that we set the record straight, it is luck that I am still alive, plus I was present when everything happened," he mentioned.

Extent

Dlamini stated that he would not keep quiet while police were trying to finalise the case without it being concluded it court.

When asked to share why the case matter was being brought back to life now, Dlamini suspected that the two might have met some where and ruffled each other's feathers. Without being precise, Dlamini said when one had wronged somebody to an extent that their whole career was affected, one has to at least apologise.

He continued to add that the person accused of messing the other person's life should not be unking the other person's life should not be unkind towards the victims.

Dlamini also stated that the fact that the two were close, one should then wonder why the two were no longer friends.

Ministry's over E100m system tender mess

red flag has been raised over the design, installation and maintenance of an integrated system for the ministry of home affairs, which is expected to cost tax-payers over E100 million.

The integrated system is anticipated to fully replace all of the ministry's current systems. The replacement of the system is scheduled to be gradually in phases, starting with the highest priority system to ensure close to normal

The project would be divided into four phases with the complete project implementation period expected to be 20 months from the date of receipt of the advance payment.

The Sunday Observer understands that the company which is tipped to do the above mentioned job is Pangea Ltd from Israel. Information gathered by the publication suggests that the ministry of home affairs, led by Princess Lindiwe has presented the company's proposal to the ministry's heads of department (HODs) and Cabinet. However, sources claimed that it was 'rejected' at first as it did not contain costs. However, the publication was informed that a few days later Pangea Ltd furnished the ministry with estimated costs for the project.

"After getting the figures, the ministry submitted them to the ministry of finance, so payments where necessary could be processed without the proposal going via Cabinet to be scrutinised," a source asserted.

The individual mentioned that the job was never opened for tendering; instead, it was allegedly awarded to Pangea Ltd after submitting a proposal around August this year.

An individual said what was amiss was that after this year's King's birthday; the minister together with her personal assistant went to a 'vacation' trip to Israel. Therefore, the trip to Israel has been strongly linked to Pangea Ltd.

Furthermore, the source continued to add that making things worse was the fact that the previous government was in talks with a South African-based company, which was to provide same service for the ministry. There is a feeling that the project has been put up for a tendering process so the South African company could also be able to present its proposal.

Despite design, planning, development, procurement, deployment and maintenance of the software, Pangea Ltd would also maintain hardware at the premises of the end-user in the min-

The project is expected to include implementation of systems and modules: The systems are inclusive of passport Issuing, border control, visa Issuing, ID card issuing, resident card issuing as well as civil registration (birth, death, marriage and divorce registration sys-

Meanwhile service modules includes management, block list, payment, SMS e-mail, inventory, biometric registration as well as AFIS identity, report, web portal, help desk and mobile registration kit module (optional).

Approval

This phase is expected to last for duration of nine months (including system analysis and development stages). This phase's duration would depend on the ministry's timely approval of Pangea Ltd system design, which should preferably take place promptly following submission of the system design and document.

Meanwhile, phase two of the project is allegedly expected to be completed within six months after it has been started. This would include ID card issuing system, resident card issuing system, block list module, SMS e-Mail module as well as mobile registration kit module (optional).

"Phase three is expected to last for five months and this would include system analysis and development stages," an individual said.

The source added that this exercise would include upgrade to e-passport issuing system, report module, web portal module, help desk as well as border control system.

Further, phase four of the project which is somehow optional is expected to last for at least two months. This would encompass of the upgrade to e-ID card and Resident e-card Issuing

Of note, regularly, government has been hit by malfunction machines, systems as well as passports shortages which resulted in unavailability of services obtained from the ministry of home affairs.

Govt struggles to put matter into perspective

overnment has failed to give clarity regarding the irregularities in the man-ner in which the ministry of home affairs is handling the design, installation and maintenance of an integrated system tender.

Principal Secretary (PS) Nhlanhla Nxumalo on Friday failed to respond to questions referred to him. Instead, without stating which part of the information was incorrect, the PS said data the publication was in possession of was inaccurate and could easily mislead the pub-

"The issue is being dealt with by the appropriate government structures and or processes with the view to formulate the accurate position that can be submitted to Cabinet for positive consideration," he explained without coming out clean on which part of the issue was being dealt with.

Implementation

The PS continued to add that once Cabinet gives its approval for implementation, he shall deem it appropriate to share such information with the media so that the public may be informed accordingly.

The PS's response came after the Ministry of Home Affairs Communications Officer Mlandvo Dlamini last Friday referred the questionnaire to minister Princess Lindiwe. The mouthpiece was away as she was on an official trip in Geneva. She returned in the country Saturday afternoon and was part of a delegation which left with His Majesty King Mswati III.

Meanwhile, on Friday, the minister stated that she was currently out of the country on a Royal assignment but said she has gone through the questions. She concluded that her Principal Secretary (PS) Nhlanhla Nxumalo would be in better position to respond.

"I have gone through your questionnaire and came to the conclusion that it has been misdirected. May I refer you to the Constitution of the Kingdom of Eswatini in particular Sections 75 and 76," responded the minister. Continued

Minister Princess Lindiwe continued to add that she deals with policy formulation and give strategic direction to the ministry. Therefore, she stated that the PS, on the other hand deals with the general administration of the min-

"It is for this reason that he is referred to as Controlling Officer or the Administrative head of the ministry. It is him who sits on issues of tenders and is also answerable to the PAC," the minister said.

On the other hand, Government spokesperson Percy Simelane said the matter was an operational one at ministerial level. Therefore, he believed that it does not necessarily call for a government position.

"Administration at home affairs is best positioned to share what they are up to with the upgrades in question and how they are handling the build-up in terms of framework," Simelane said while emphasising that the matter was too ministerial.



Debate on prostitution legality status intensifies

s sex work (prostitution) in Eswatini legal or not now that the Sexual Offenses and Domestic Violence (SODV) Act is in place?

This is the question that government is expected to respond to this week following that several legal experts have given different opinions in the past two weeks.

The Deputy Prime Minister Themba Masuku who is the custodian of the SODV Act has stated that he had in the past week been engaging with legal experts to ascertain the correct interpretation of the Act and other laws related to the matter. Masuku promised that his team would meet and pronounce government's position on whether sex work is illegal or not.

On the other hand, Ministry of Justice and Constitutional Affairs Principal Secretary Lorraine Hlophe admitted that the SODV Act protects sex workers but maintained that other laws criminalised prostitution. "I confirm that prostitution remains an offence in terms of our laws. The SODV Act protects all women against sexual abuse," she said without citing the specific laws that criminalise sex work.

Section 196(2) of the SODV Act says where there is any inconsistency between the provisions of the Act and any other law, other than the Constitution, the SODV Act is the law which must be applied.

Probed on the supremacy clause of the SODV Act, Hlophe said there was need for thorough investigation of the law before an informed position can be pronounced.

Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Superintendent Phindile Vilakati said she was not well vest on the matter and referred questions to the

director of public prosecutions.

Director of Public Prosecutions Phila Dlamini said it was difficult to state whether the position of the civic groups was the correct interpretation or not without an in-depth investigation of the SODVAct and the Crimes Act. He then stated that his office would require some time to interrogate the two pieces of legislation before it would come to an informed conclusion.

Exploitation

This follows that last week, COSPE and FSEJ and 35 local organisations concluded that sex work is legal if it involves consenting adults and does not involve exploitation by third parties. This is contained in the Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence (SODV) Act booklet which they had developed under the Rights for All project supported by the European Union. The 47-page booklet summarises the SODV Act from a human rights-based framework. COSPE Eswatini Advocacy and Lobbying Coordinator Mbali Dludlu

when called yesterday stated that from the human rights point of view they still maintained their position as stated in the booklet. "Abolitionist laws criminalise the activities of those seen as abusing, exploiting or coercing sex workers, pimps and procurers. The sale of sex by a sex worker herself is not a crime. Abolitionism is the oldest legal approach to sex work and has been incorporated into the Penal Codes of most former British colonies. South Africa is an exception to the general rule since it criminalises the selling and buying of sex," reads part of the summary on sex work.

The civic groups note that while the SODV Act does not criminalise sex workers or clients, it does create some offences relating to sex work. They point out that the Act aims to protect people from being forced into sex work, and to prevent sex workers from being exploited.

"The Act focuses on third parties who seek to benefit from the exchange

Several sex workers contacted by this publication expressed their joy when they learnt that the SODV Act did not criminalise sex work rather protected them.

One of the leaders of sex workers who conducts her business in Manzini, Gcinile* stated that most of the sex workers were not aware that sex work is legal in the country and thus they conducted their business in fear. She said she was happy to learn that the laws of the country including the SODV Act did not criminalise sex work.

"If it is true that sex work is legal and the SODV Act protects us then we are free, I'm over the moon, Elethu!! This means we are free from the police, we now must challenge the City Councils and the Crimes Act," she said. Gcinile stated the police when arresting them cite that the municipal councils or the owners of the building near which they conduct their busi-

nesses complain of their work as being illegal. She narrated how they had been ill-treated by police while they were on duty on the streets of Manzini relating the incident which saw 16 of her co-workers being arrested and charged with contravening the Crimes Act.

Gcinile said they were saved by their lawyer and the magistrate who cautioned the police against arresting them without substantial evidence that their loitering at night was for the purposes of prostitution.

Another sex worker who spoke on the condition of anonymity said there was need for the review of the Crimes Act considering that there were retail outlets which were now operating 24 hours including restaurants and bars which meant that people can be on the street day and night conducting their respective duties including sex workers.

of sexual acts between a sex worker and client and criminalises: commercial sexual exploitation; procuring prostitution, benefitting from prostitution or living off the earnings of prostitution," further reads the summary on sex work.

WHAT IS ILLEGAL?
Commercial sexual exploitation
Section 13 of SODV Act

It is an offence to, in exchange for money or other reward, coerce or induce a person (B) to engage in sexual acts with another person (C). In this case, the accused person (A) earns a benefit from arranging sexual acts between the victim (B) and another person (C).

It is also an offence to promote commercial sexual exploitation (Section 14).

PROCURING PROSTITUTION SECTION 15 OF SODV ACT

It is an offence to procure a person to become a sex worker.

This refers to a person who deliberately identifies persons, often based on their vulnerability, to encourage or manipulate them into becoming sex workers.

BENEFITTING FROM PROSTITUTION

Section 16 of SODV Act

Where the accused person (A) did not arrange the sexual acts between two persons, or procure sex workers, but still financially benefitted from it, A is guilty of benefitting from prostitution.

Living off the earnings of prosti-

Section 17 of SODV Act

Where the accused person (A) earns a living from controlling the work of a sex worker, A is guilty of living from the earnings of prostitution.

KEEPING A BROTHEL

Sections 18-22 of SODV Act

It is an offence to own, control or manage a brothel. Persons found in the brothel can be arrested because they are "deemed to keep a brothel", unless they disclose their identity and the identity of the owner or manager.

Kombi owned by police unroadworthy

The ministry of public works and Transport has warned drivers and passengers travelling in unroadworthy cars that they would need to find alternative transport should their vehicles be impounded.

Ministry of public works and Transport communications officer Mayibongwe Dlamini said the ministry's traffic law enforcement officers have suspended motor vehicles and impounded other unroadworthy kombis over the years

This comes after the ministry was made aware by the public that there is a public transport vehicle belonging to a police officer which is unroadworthy.

The kombis' operating route is Mbabane, Manzana, Makholokholo and Sitibeni was reported.

The kombi apparently has various violations, ranging from defective parts of a door that does not fully close which sometimes opens up when the kombi is moving.

The kombi is pushed in order for its engine to start, the engine apparently emits smoke that affects the passengers, the chairs are in a bad condition such that there have put boards to help support the chairs. The seatbelt cannot be used by passengers as it is used to support the door.

The kombi has been reported to not have been operating for a few days this past week following public outcry for it to be fixed but was seen operating again yesterday.

Dlamini said such vehicles are discontinued or suspended for being unroadworthy and they may not be operated on public roads until all the identified defects have been fixed.

The act of discontinuing a motor vehicle involves the removal and destruction of its licence disc or roadworthy certificate disc and issuing a notice directing that the motor vehicle shall not be operated on a public road. The notice stipulates conditions under which such a vehicle may be operated on a public road.

The ministry's officers are sometimes on the ground to check for cars that are faulty.

He said that from the time the car is registered it is taken to the testing centre in Matsapha where the car undergoes a process of being thoroughly checked if it is road worthy and then allowed on the road.

"For a motor vehicle to be condemned road worthy, it must comply with the

manufactures standards, which means everything from indicators to seat belts, should work," said Dlamini.

When the kombi driver who goes by the name Cetu was reached for comment he was not so pleased to be questioned as he spoke on top of his voice ordering the reporter to tell him and bring him the people that have complained about the kombi.

When further questioned the owner of the car Cetu said the reporter had no business asking those questions and cut the call.

One reliable source revealed that police officers never stop the kombi is never stopped.

To this, the Chief Police Information and Communications Officer (PICO) Superintendent Phindile Vilakati said the public should report the matter to the Department of Traffic.

Govt, MPs in maize meal import ban tug of war

xactly a year after government suspended all mealie meal imports, members of Parliament and the ministry of agriculture have had lengthy discussions but have failed to agree on lifting the ban.

Government insists legislators and their communities continue to request the ministry to lift the ban.

The import ban was issued by government through the National Agricultural Marketing Board (NAMBoard) in October last year and has hit hard on the drought-stricken communities especially those near the border gates.

These communities have from time immemorial been reliant on imported mealie meal from South Africa. The ban meant that only locally produced mealie meal will be sold in the country.

The resolution to suspend these imports, according to NAMBoard CEO Siphephiso Dlamini, was reached during a stakeholders meeting that was held on September 18. This meeting he said was attended by millers, maize suppliers, government agencies and consumers.

The CEO added that in that meeting

all stakeholders unanimously agreed that the National Maize Corporation had improved its maize distribution in the country's outskirts, including rural areas as 12 distribution centres were opened at the time.

This ban lasted until December when NAMBoard partially lifted the ban.

This meant that a returning resident could only purchase not more than 20kg of mealie meal.

This did not go down well with the residents near the border posts as the quota they were given does not last them and their families.

The residents want government to allow them to continue purchasing mealie meal from South Africa in the same quantities they did before the ban as they say the current ration is not enough for the extended families rather would only be sufficient for nuclear families.

Members of Parliament from the poverty and drought-stricken constituencies located near the border posts have been engaging the ministry of agriculture and NAMBoard since February but the talks have not yielded any fruit.

Matsanjeni Member of Parliament Bomber Mamba said since the beginning of the year they have been engaging the ministry and the parastatal, but the ministry has not been able to lift the ban. Other communities that are affected by the ban include Sigwe, Lubulini Somntongo and Lavumisa.

"We have had talks with NAMBoard and the Ministry of Agriculture, but these talks have been in vain," he said.

Ministry of Agriculture Principal Secretary Bongani Masuku said they were still on the table with the legislators on the matter and he was aware the challenge and continuously engaging them. He said the delay in lifting of the ban was related to the economic status of the country which the ministry was seeking to contribute in its improvement. "We are aware of the challenge, we are concerned and engaging the Members of Parliament on the matter. We know that every year the people in those constituencies are unable to grow maize as they do not receive good rains and thus, they are forced to purchase maize and mealie meal. However, we are also concerned on the impact of lifting the ban to the economy which means we are caught between a rock and hard place as we must balance between the two," he said. Masuku said the ministry has also tried to alleviate the situation by engaging the National Maize Corporation (NMC) to set up mills near these communities and reduce the prices of mealie meal for it to be affordable to the residents. On the other hand the legislators said the prices of the mealie meal were still higher locally than those of the neighbouring country hence the

rought, hunger and poverty may claim lives of the people of Matsanjeni South, this was revealed by Matsanjeni Member of Parliament Bomber Mamba.

Matsanjeni is near Lavumisa Border Post.

Mamba disclosed the calamitous situation faced by his community while requesting for food aid from members of the public and the business community.

The legislator stated that the hunger forced four elderly women from his area to walk over four kilometres to his homestead to beg for maize meal.

"Last week I saved four of the elderly women who had walked four kilometres to my place and had gone two consecutive days without a meal.

We have a maize meal crisis at Matsanjeni in Lavumisa following closure of mealie meal importing from Pongola through Nsalitje Boarder by government.

The situation is horrible in the community," he said. Mamba stated that the situation was drought and poverty related as the people did not harvest anything due to drought yet they still ploughed like everybody



here could be similarities in the way Eswatini and Rwanda ended up setting up their International Convention Centres. Both countries' main rationale behind the construction of the centres was to host the African Union Summit (AU), fortunately for Rwanda it ended up hosting the summit, whereas it is a different story for Eswatini.

Initially, it was stated that once open, the ICC & FISH was set to host many illustrious events, including the 2020 African Union (AU) Summit, where His Majesty King Mswati III expected Heads of State from all over the continent to grace the occasion.

However, Eswatini's goal to set up the international convention centre has ignited a lot of talk and debate and continues to hog headlines in both local and international media. Some quarters state that it would be a white elephant, whereas some believe maintaining the structure would be too costly for the country.

Eswatini (Swaziland) is known around the world for the magnificent traditional festivals that it hosts. Leading amongst these are the Umhlanga (Reed Dance) held in August to September, the Incwala held in December to January and the Marula Festival in February-March.

These are living cultural events that bring lots of tourists and such a facility (ICC & FISH) is a must have, in order for tourists to have sufficient space for accommodation.

Alongside the traditional events, there is a growing number of modern events gaining international recognition. One that leads the way and has gained an excellent international reputation is the MTN BUSHFIRE Festival - a performing arts festival held every May.

For centuries Africa, has been seen as 'the dark continent' and while it cannot be denied that in some of the 54 countries on the continent, there are still major problems, there is another truth about the continent. According to the World Bank, by 2025 most African countries will reach 'middle-income' status if current growth rates contin-

Outstripping both Europe and America, in 2019 Africa's growth rate was expected to accelerate to four per cent.

Specifically, looking at the industry, it is being predicted that demand for meetings and events on the continent will rise somewhere between five per cent and 10 per cent in 2019.

This development and growth has not occurred spontaneously, with many countries preparing and working hard to achieve it - and looking at some of Africa's best conferencing and events venues, this is clear.

Eswatini International Convention Centre and Five Star Hotel:

Eswatini's prestigious International Convention Centre and Five Star Hotel (ICC& FISH) project is near completion down at the Ezulwini Valley, already, the building has started attracting recognition from tourists and potential

The ICC & FISH building consists of the construction of a single building, with an approximate floor area of 40 000m2, that will house a 1 800-seat theatre, an exhibition centre, conferencing chambers, a restaurant and a multi-purpose hall across its two basements, a ground floor and a first floor.

Initially, the project was set to run for three years, from its commencement date 15 October 2015 through to the targeted completion date 15 October 2018. However, the date has now been extended to 2020. Once open, the ICC is set to host many illustrious events; at first it was targeted to host the 2020 African Union (AU) summit.

The Kigali Convention Centre in Rwanda

The landmark Kigali Convention Centre (KCC) is the first and largest Convention Centre in the region, and the leading destination for events in

Its unique design integrates all the facilities and functional technology with a clear reference to the culture and traditions of Africa.

The KCC is the number one event venue in Kigali and throughout Rwanda, offering a premium environment for regional and international conventions, exhibitions, festivals, meetings and other events.

In 2007, three Rwandan corporate investors pooled resources to build the real estate complex. They formed a company called Ultimate Concept Limited, to develop and own the cen-

The centre has four major components: A 5-star hotel, Radisson Blue Hotel Kigali, with 292 rooms on six floors, conference centre with seating capacity of 2 600, it also has Kigali Information Technology Park, with 32 200 square meters of rentable office and retail space, and a museum on the bottom floor of the IT office park. Construction began in 2009 and was completed in 2016.

Namibia International **Convention Centre**

The Government of Namibia has acquired 20 hectares of land suitable for the development of an International Convention Centre in Windhoek, near the Windhoek Country Club Resort.

The project involves the development, operation, maintenance, marketing, and transfer, adjoining a convention centre in the capital.

The returns on investment are highly dependent on the number of days the facility is hired for conferences, conventions, exhibitions and other events. The idea of developing a Convention Centre of international standard was strengthened by the need to reposition Namibia competitively in the highly- dynamic global environment, by creating a niche for the meetings, incentives, conferences and events (MICE) sector. Windhoek is one of Africa's most modern, safest and cleanest cities.

Namibia is strategically located and possesses numerous attractions, attractive for international and regional events. In addition to direct flights to and from numerous destinations (or via Johannesburg), the proximity to South




Durban International **Convention Centre (South Africa)**


If you have a friend with depression you need to put pride aside and double text and check on them. If they cancel plans and shit

MBEKI SAID HE UNDERSTOOD MAIMANE'S RESIGNATION

OHANNESBURG - Former president Thabo Mbeki has weighed in on recent developments in the DA, calling them concerning.


Mbeki said he understood Mmusi Maimane's resignation, in particular, to be linked to racism.

"In this context, I wish to emphasise that, consistent with our Constitution, all our registered political formations have an absolute obligation, practically, to contribute to the national effort to make ours a nonracial country.

"It would be a matter of the greatest concern if it were, in fact, true that our country's official opposition, the DA, is going through a leadership crisis because of a hegemonic ascendance of a racist tendency which seeks to assert policies to that end, thus to sustain colonial and apartheid social relations," said Mbeki.

Former DA leader Maimane and former federal chairperson Athol Trollip resigned on Wednesday, after Johannesburg mayor Herman Mashaba stepped down on Monday.

The resignations come in the wake of former DA leader and Western

Cape premier Helen Zille being elected federal council chair of the party today.

On Thursday, Maimane also announced that he had resigned from the DA and Parliament. Mbeki said SA would gain nothing from any negative movement, in any of the country's political parties, towards policies based on racism.

"The DA has an imperative obligation to reassure the nation, practically, unequivocally and transparently, that it is conducting and will conduct itself in terms of all its internal and public policies and programmes, in a manner which truly helps to transform SA into a nonracial country.

Public Protector officials axed

...'because of FSCA investigation' and 'to settle scores'

OHANNESBURG - The Public Protector's suspension of four high-ranking officials and its axing of CEO Basani Baloyi was seemingly over a Financial Services Conduct Authority (FSCA) report that is being taken on judicial review.

Even though Public Protector Busisiwe Mkhwebane told the SABC that three of the officials were suspended for sabotaging investigations, former senior investigator for quality assurance, Isaac Matlawe told News24 that they were targeted for other reasons.

Matlawe said Sekele and Mogaladi were being punished for being close to former Public Protector Lawrence Mushwana.

"Mkhwebane is hell bent on set-

tling scores from the Mushwana era. She has an axe to grind against senior managers from the Mushwana era," he said. The dismissals also concerned the FSCA report - now on review in the Gauteng High Court in Pretoria - sources who have direct knowledge of the events told News24. One source did not know of a disciplinary hearing before the dismissal. The FSCA investigation involves a complaint by EFF leader Julius Malema against the FSCA's former director, Dube Tshidi.

Mkhwebane found that Tshidi misled Parliament and used his position to protect a compromised curator. She instructed the FSCA to take corrective action against

him. News24

John Steenhuisen, Zwakele Mncwango in running to lead DA

APE TOWN - Former DA chief whip John Steenhuisen **4** and KwaZulu-Natal provincial leader Zwakele Mncwango have emerged as frontrunners to replace Mmusi Maimane.

DA Federal Council Chairperson Helen Zille said the interim leader of the party would be elected next month and the special federal council would also elect the interim chairperson.

Maimane resigned this week following a bruising meeting of the federal council. Athol Trollip, who served as chairperson, also quit.

Steenhuisen told the media this week he had been approached about the position of leader.

Steenhuisen made the comments after he resigned as chief whip in Parliament. His deputy, Jacques Julius, is acting chief whip.

The term of the leader of the DA is linked to that of the chief whip.

Mncwango said he was consulting with colleagues to help him decide whether or not to run for the position that was left vacant by Maimane.

DA leader in Limpopo Jacques Smalle said the party's federal council would sit on November 17 to elect someone to temporarily lead until the next national conference in April next year. News24

THE DA'S TROUBLES ARE DUE TO POOR ELECTIONS PERFORMANCE

APE TOWN - It has been a devastating week for the DA.

So devastating, that the party had little constitutional precedence to guide it through the simultaneous resignations of both its leader, Mmusi Maimane, and chairperson of the party, Atholl Trollip following the dramatic resignation of Herman Mashaba, the mayor of Johannesburg.

Much has been written about the causes of the DA's troubles: weak and indecisive leadership; the Patricia de Lille spat; a messy water crisis in Cape Town; policy confusion; an undisciplined party running amok on Twitter are but a few. Fundamentally, the DA's leadership troubles are a direct result of a poor poll result in May and the continuing voter erosion suffered

at the hands of the Freedom Front and to some degree, the ANC as well.

There should be little surprise that when a party does poorly at the polls it looks inwards, often with damaging consequences. When the party was winning (as the DA was for much of the past decade), everyone wanted to be part of it and it sucked them in gladly. There has been much reference this week to the suggestions that racism has played a part in the DA's internal meltdown. The argument suggests that a deliberate plot by white members in the party to undermine the transformation project is at the root cause of the resignations and resultant recriminations.

It is true that race has played a part in the DA's decline. But, simply ascribing this to a pre-mediated and orchestrated plot to undermine emerging black leadership is an argument that fails to address much bigger macropolitical trends at play. If truth be told - and race aside - the DA's downward spiral had three distinct threads to it.

First, the party rode the crest of the wave over the past decade on the back of the negative effects of the Jacob Zuma years. The 2016 local government election result saw the DA score, not necessarily due to massive voter shifts, but due to large-scale ANC poll stay-aways. News24

FORMER ACTING CEO KOKO BACKS SHIVAMBU

OHANNESBURG - An opinion piece on what the Economic Freedom Fighters (EFF) proposes as a five-point plan to save struggling energy utility Eskom by the party's Deputy President Floyd Shivambu has earned the backing of former acting Eskom CEO Matshela Koko. According to Shivambu, the EFF's plan is as follows:

"Eskom should standardise all coal prices and only pay the prices determined by the National Energy Regulator of South Africa (NERSA)

"Eskom should fundamentally review all power purchase agreements (PPAs) with independent power producers (IPPs) with the aim of exiting these nonsensical contracts.

"The government should assemble a highly skilled panel of engineers from all over the world to investigate the delays in the completion of the two major power stations, Kusile and Medupi.

"The government should issue requests for proposals from private developers of nuclear power stations, which should necessarily use a build, operate and transfer model to illustrate how they will use their own money to construct nuclear stations, operate them for a period not exceeding 25 vears, transfer skills and thereafter hand over to the state.

"The government should massively invest in renewable energy projects.

The full column can be on IOL. Koko took to Twitter following the column to express his approval.

"I agree that the proposed recovery plan by the [EFF] to [save Eskom] is rational and sensible," he tweeted. "It actually makes a good read," he added.

Koko has made it clear that he does not support what is currently going

on at his former employer, particu larly President Cyril Ramaphosa and Minister of Public Enterprises Pravin Gordhan's efforts to save Eskom

At a media briefing in December, 2018, Gordhan requested managers who were no longer employed at the energy utility to refrain from commenting on developments at the energy provider, in what was almost certainly a reference to Koko, who has been outspoken in his criticism of Eskom and government's plans to save it on social media since leaving

the state-owned-enterprise. Citizen

Winning South African Dance Music Award's best producer for 2019 means your hard work is greatly appreciated. What does this award mean for you?

WITH Mbongeni Mbingo

The least said about this little publicity stunt that this man from Dvokodyweni and his Member of Parliament have played on the entire nation the better.

It is clear even to a child what this truly is – nothing but a poor attempt to score political points at the expense of the right-thinking members of the public.

This despicable sham of a petition should never have seen the inside of the august House, and that it did leaves me perplexed, to say the least. It leaves me to wonder if this was orchestrated to achieve some other political agenda we are yet to see, or if the House of Assembly was hoodwinked by both the MP and his friend.

The truth will come out I am sure, but for now we can only pray that parliamentarians wake up from the hypnosis that the Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence (SODV) Act 2018 is a law meant to deal with men. I can safely conclude that that is how this thing happened right under their noses, and they played into it because deep down they share the same views as Simanga Lukhele. The idea that Parliament would be petitioned on a law that it passed is bemusing, never mind the manner it was tabled. Lukhele conspired with his Member of Parliament, Mduduzi Magagula to have this petition tabled in Parliament. They concocted their plan that this would work if it was tabled and the House was forced to debate it.

This is a plan intended to derail all of the good work that has gone into the Act, which took years to be passed into law. I must hasten to say of course that I would not want to be understood to be saying that the SODV Act is perfect, or that it does not have its issues - particularly with misinterpretation. However, it is our law now. The ship sailed when the Bill was passed into law and His Majesty the King assented to it. The logical thing to do now is to seek to bring this mater before courts. Yet, to the little I understand of the sham by the two people of Dvokodvweni, that is not even what they want. What they want is for consultations. What they claimed they were looking for was to open the debate once more. I am gobsmacked. Open the debate for what, I asked myself?

Yet, Parliament, in all its wisdom, entertained this nonsensical petition – for a good solid week, wasting tax-payers' money in sitting allowances. I have a good mind to suggest that the MP from Dvokodvweni should not be paid his sitting allowances for these three sittings, for he does not deserve them.

OH THE ABSURDITY



Instead, Lukhele should pay him – him and their funders, because it is clear to me that this was a political agenda whose outcome we will know some other day.

We must dismiss the claim that Lukhele acts on behalf of the public, nor too that he acts on behalf of the people of Dvokodvweni. In fact, this matter once more exposes this issue of a right to recall a Member of Parliament – in addition to the criticism that MPs do not consult with their constituencies, yet they are known to claim that they represent the people.

Representation

Even if we are a direct representation in terms of the system of governance, it does not mean that there is no constituency that the legislator represents. There is an Inkhundla whose people should be engaged before an MP claims to know what the people want.

I want to know if Lukhele and the MP sat at an Inkhundla meeting and there was a resolution that Parliament should be petitioned against the SODV Act. I want to know the basis for that meeting, in addition to the reason for it to be called.

Incidentally, Lukhele claims to have been concerned by the story of a man whose ex-girlfriend reported him to the police, who swiftly arrested him. Because of this incident – among thousands we have had by the way, many of which have been widely reported, Lukhele thought this was one incident too many. He then conspired with his MP to take a petition to Parliament.

Well, I guess they deserve each other. But, the MP must be ques-

tioned on his role as a representative of the constituency of Dvokodvweni, especially in relation to the women of that area who have suffered in silence because men cannot be held accountable. Are those women who have been sexually assaulted not part of his constituency? Are the little girls who have been raped and abused in the hands of abusive men and fathers not part of his constituency? Who speaks for them when a man can lead you as an MP to turn his back against so many women who have suffered terribly over the years?

I dare say that this MP does not deserve the title one bit. Instead, if the people of Dvokodvweni know what he has done to them, they would vote him out and then he would continue which his charade with his friend.

Perfect

I am compelled of course to address this myth that the SODV Act is targeted at men, as claimed by Lukhele and his colleague. Of course this law is not perfect, but how much it is not may also vary from individual to individual. What is true is that the majority of cases are reported against men, because as the Women and the Law Eswatini Chapter has rightly pointed out, a majority of men are perpetrators of gender-based violence.

However, we must question what kind of society Lukhele wants to live in; a society of emotionally damaged people who have suffered domestic violence and sexual assault, with men who have got away with the horrific things they get up to against their own children, sisters, wives and soci-

etv?

What Lukhele wants; a society of men who puff their chests at getting away with harassment and forcing themselves on our women just because they are men?

Anyway, he must not answer that. I am sure it was deliberated at their meeting in Dvokodvweni when they hatched the plan to derail this beautiful country of ours from the cause of ensuring that this country is a just society. What I find difficult to deal with however, is how parliamentarians look at themselves in the mirror after this – and if at all they are worthy of the tag themselves.

How did they not dismiss this and order MP Magagula to advise his friend to take his case to the ministry of justice, or the courts?

How do they allow a petition *nje* in the first place? How do they allow themselves to be misled into this, even to the point of concluding that we need a report after 60 days. What report?

I am certain there are many laws that need to be reformed that are pending before the House. Instead of wasting time on a new law that is just a year old, MPs would do best to get themselves acquainted with those, before they turn around and bring in petitions once those are passed too. As for the SODV Act, it may very well be that MPs are themselves as aggrieved as Simanga Lukhele. MP Magagula's conduct tells the story of a legislator who cannot defend the Act, and his colleagues have just demonstrated as much.

Perhaps, it is not Lukhele we should be concerned with; it is the august House itself.

Yet, for this country we seem to want to rely so much on others to do the marketing for us. For a while now, we have known that the Bushfire Festival places this country on the world map. But, do we tap into that? Does the Bushfire festival, or the others, get the government exposure? When our artist Sands was riding the crest of the wave with his 'Tigi' and was in every music challenge internationally, did we maximise on this? Have we ever considered to place a clip on the likes of CNN, for instance, marketing the beauty of this country? Are our cultural events on the world's international media? These are no brainers. But, we all know the responses too.

Eswatini has a unique selling point, yet it appears that we actually do not even realise this.

Perhaps, this rating by Planet Lonely is the Launchpad we have needed to take ourselves seriously. The rating, which presents us as a country that rewards visitors with wildlife, mountain views, valleys of pineapples and unmatched crafts would be a waste if we did not make use of it.

What we should do is to start spreading the word, and tourism, domestically. All of us need to sell this story to not just tourists, but to ourselves, for we should know what it is that we are selling to the world. If all of us embrace tourism and ride on the back of this rating, Eswatini can become the best tourist destination in the world – and for once, we will be making headlines for all the right reasons. We need to start singing that 'Visit Eswatini' song,


ne hopes those behind the so-called petition to re-open the debated Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence (SODV) Act 2018 enacted Bill have clean hearts and motives.

Emaswati who tirelessly labour for gender equality are extremely disappointed that after such hard labour, attempting to ensure we have a better law enacted, where our women are given due respect and accorded human dignity, we find ourselves playing marble games, where the august House allows such debates that lower women dignity in particular. We certainly are not impressed about the postpostement or deferment whatsoever of the debate. There is just no justification for allowing this SODV Act to be debated again in this fashion after so much progress. Having taken over a decade for the civil society and women's rights organisations, in particular to have this matter resolved and endorsed through a form of a legislation that better protects people from domestic and sexual violence in the Kingdom of Eswatini.

Unless you have no emotions and feelings, the high rate of Gender-Based Violence (GBV) in Eswatini, calls for a humane approach and greater sensitivity, as nearly half of Emaswati women continue experiencing sexual violence and exploitation one way or the other. Approximately one in four females in Eswatini experienced physical violence as a child, with almost 18.8 per cent of youth aged between 18-24 years having been coerced into sexual inter-

course before they turned 18, now this calls for action not mere sympathy, hey. How can we allow these emotional and mind games? *Buphi nje buntfu neluvelo nebakitsi lana?*

WOMENS LIVES TAKEN CHEAPLY

Sometime one sits and wonder if we value women's lives and protection in this kingdom. Emaswati should begin to value women as full people deserving respect and human dignity. There is just no justification whatsoever, to allow people to gamble with the lives of our sisters in particular. No sane person should dare entertain people whose agenda seems to be clouded with controversy and basically treating our sisters as second grade cit-

izen. Let us show a high level of respect and ensure that our sister's lives matter. Not one single woman should feel vulnerable and exposed in a country that claims to be a constitutional democratic kingdom.

WOMEN ARE FULL CITIZENS

Every time we debate issues and one has a feeling that that there is a section of Emaswati who think women are second grade citizens. Why there seems to be that unfortunate feeling that they must beg for attention and approval of men for things that constitutionally and legally are entitled to as citizens of this kingdom. They should not be made to feel like they owe any other Liswati to enjoy fundamental freedoms and constitutional provisions that promote equality and respect. They are citizens of this great nation and have contributed so much to what Eswatini has become.

Those who are quite knowledgeable of the country's development, must be concerned that there are people who still feel like they control the advancement and gender equality progress. This has to stop as we begin to respect women as full citizens deserving human dignity and respect.

HOW DID WE GET BACK HERE?

When you engage the law enforcing agents, and the reports that police are generating yearly, one cannot run away from the reality that we are dealing with a national crisis of greater proportion, and it it just hurt so deeply to see that we still have citizens playing games and dice with women's lives here.

There is so much increase in domestic violence cases over the years, which if we were a humane society, we should have acted long time ago. Going back to 2009, when the SODV Bill was

ndigenous people's day was internationally commemorated on October 14th 2019, the theme was 'We are fighting alongside to end racism, colonialism and oppression.'

Thus requiring the acknowledgement of the brutal history of colonisation of indigenous peoples and recognise that they continue to face modern day colonialisation, land theft, plundering of resources and destruction of communities. This reminded me of tagging along with a friend in Canada who was visiting Native Reserve for research, at that time I was not connected to my old soul. Such that I saw them as victims, and I did not realise that I was part of indigenous peoples who were systemically negated by colonialism.

My current research on indigenous people's dignity, has been enriched by indigenous knowledge of indigenous people such that, I commemorate indigenous peoples day. As an indigenous person born in Africa, who missed the opportunity to learn from the source during my visit to Native Reserves, I was blind and disconnected to my soul, too blind to see the God within all those

souls filled with negative emotions, all I saw was their alcoholism yet they were numbing their pain. In retrospect, their indigenous knowledge has enriched my scholarly works, when reading their researched books, these brought clarity into my research contextualised as indigenous people's dignity. Reading indigenous peoples' books from North America and Australia specifically has affirmed my scholarly argument on how indigenous governance systems were rooted within indigenous people's dignity.

INDIGENOUS KNOWLEDGE

The indigenous knowledge from indigen people was systemically negated through Western education and religion, this being a global phenomenon. This structural violence remains as the most brutal history of colonisation, evidently a strategic entry point for land and mineral capture. When people's indigenous knowledge is destroyed, they become vulnerable and open to manipulation and exploitation. Evidently, this was the success story of colonialism, which has left indigenous people conflicted and living problematic lifestyles. It was this understanding and world view that enriched my research as indigenous people have embarked on the journey to bringing their power back through knowledge. In North America, proximity to the academy was evident in their writ-

souls filled with negative emotions, all I saw was their alcoholism yet they were numbing their emically researched and articulated.

Indigenous people's knowledge is based on an imagined or remembered experience, this is understood as absence, not a void, creating opportunity to reimagine knowledge emerging. This insightful lesson immersed my research of indigenous people's dignity with the ability for knowledge to emerge. Thus enabling indigenous knowledge to surface from mythology, as indigenous peoples' mythologies were brutalised and yet they were presenting an opportunity for knowledge creation. There is no knowledge void within indigenous knowledge, as indigenous people understood how the universe works, its movement and its occurrences. This knowledge preserved within indigenous knowledges, predominately coded and conveyed through mythologies, through words, dance, songs and musical instruments.

This indigenous thought process was brutalised by colonialism, and yet mythologies created stories that preserved knowledges. Thus, in acknowledging the brutality of colonialism endured by indigenous people, let us reflect on our mythologies that suffered structural violence. Today, we lack the spirit of inquiry that was embedded within our indigenous knowledge, as Western science refused to venture into this knowledge paradigm. Therefore, how can

we hope to innovate when the core of our innovative thought process was brutalizes, yet this offered a non-dogmatic openness embedded within indigenous knowledge. Today we have been educated in dogmatic thought processes evidence of the structural violence embedded within colonialism. We defend and protect this dogmatic thought processing and yet our indigenous context is non-dogmatic openness, which offers indigenous knowledge new inspiration.

INDIGENOUS LANGUAGE, DANCE AND MUSIC

Indigenous knowledge is embedded within language, dance and music, which colonisation brutally suppressed and in the name of religion we all continue to brutalise. How can we innovate when we continue to suppress our inner visions that are embedded within indigenous languages, dances and music? As these three indigenous contexts are critical in merging the external and internal for innovation process to be evoked within our souls. This is the core of indigenous people which has been brutalized through structural violence, such that we continue to follow and not lead in innovation. Thus, let us reflect on what indigenous knowledge means in the 21st Century in the context of expanding knowledge scope enabling innovation to emerge.

Indigenous languages, dances and music are

first introduced to Parliament, we should even be more ashamed that it has taken us almost 10 years for this to go through finally. After the initial process was debated and went through in 2012, the SODV Bill of 2009 did not receive Royal Assent, which is required as the final step for any bill to be enacted into law in Eswatini, before Parliament was dissolved for the general elections in 2013.

This was again re-introduced following the appointment of a new government which had to be re-introduced to the SODV Bill and the procedure of enacting the bill into law had to start all over again in 2015. Finally, the SODV Bill received Royal Assent. It was then passed into law and now known as the Sexual Offences & Domestic Violent Act. We were so happy, that finally much progress made. One prays that whatever is going on in the minds of those wanting to open the debate again it is for good intentions and nation building. Now to then hear some Emaswati wanting to take us back to have this Actre-opened for debate and engagement, when we thought much progress has been made - what a discouraging development and setback.

THE ROLE OF GENDER CONSORTIUM

We should appreciate the work done by the Gender Consortium, who had tirelessly lobbied the government to have the Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence Bill enacted which dates back to 2001. We highly appreciated that over this long time many participated engaging Parliamentarians, Senators, international institutions, lawmakers, magistrates, non-profit organisations, traditional leaders, local community members and survivors of gender-based violence and sexual abuse to champion this cause.

All were trying their level best to get the country move forward, but then to have some crazy people drag this in the mud, and call for it to be re-opened for debate, it certainly destroys all such the good intentions.

These previous legal instruments failed to meet the international and human rights standards demanded today in a modern society. For example, the definition of rape within this legal framework was only described as a male perpetrator and female victim.

There was no definition of rape that included a male perpetrator and a male victim or a female

perpetrator and a male victim. As such, these types of sexual assault would be considered cases of 'indecent assault' rather than rape in the previous legal system. This weak legal system, instead of safeguarding the most vulnerable, fostered a culture of violence and immunity within Eswatini, whereby perpetrators were often never convicted of their crimes. Whereas Section 50 of the SODV Act stipulates that the court is not to draw any inference from any delay in reporting or from previous inconsistent statements.

WHAT IS CONTAINED IN SODY ACT

The SODV Act makes the act of rape gender neutral, whereas the previous laws narrowly defined rape as a forced sexual act of a male perpetrator and female victim. Now to think of it, all other forms of rape were considered 'indecent assault' if there was some form of delayed reportage of the same. We were celebrating the progress that so much progress was being made, we are now back to square-one, what a shame. The SODV Act attempted to criminalise marital rape and other domestic violence offences. When one reflects deeply, we certainly have allowed these serious issues to become yet another game and it defeats the advocacy initiatives and the great strides. We dealing with full human beings deserving respect and human dignity here. No one person should be allowed to call shots and treat women as second class citizens.

RESPECT WOMEN PLEASE

The nation deserves better and how one wishes more respect shown to such national development efforts meant to uplift and show respect to women. What is unfolding in the august House presently is not progress at all. While there is nothing wrong in engaging more the Act with the view of learning and adding more knowledge by members of Parliament, one has a gut feeling, there are sinister ulterior motives behind this petition. Come to think of it, where was this member when the debate on the bill was being held, when it was still a bill? Lest we forget, Emaswati women play a great role in the national development agenda and deserve much more respect. Those who continue to play dice and treat issues affecting women cheaply must be exposed. Show respect for women -Watsintsa bafati watsintsa imbokodvo!

the basis for transformation and change, as whatever is sung, danced to through music is

In retrospect, we affirm Western thoughts and culture embedded in the language, dance and music that we have accepted as dominant culture. Most importantly, we affirm negative messages that have been recorded as popular culture, as we are brutalising our own environment. As the popular music, lyrics and dance is not only vulgar but manifest in the endemic negative behaviour that have become present day cultural mantras. Indigenous people with all their spiritual gifts of language, dance to music using them to perpetuate sexual violence and domestic abuse, brutalising all communities of indigenous people.

In chaos theory the butterfly effect is embedded within the indigenous languages, dances and music of indigenous people. As mantras and music rooted in language, and dance have always been the catalyst for change and transformation.

Hence, there is a dance with lyrics and music for everything within indigenous peoples communities, sun dance, moon dance, rain dance, corn dance and death dance. The list is endless as indigenous people create within time and space, for knowledge to evolve, with lyrics revealing the time and space in which that dance was preserved. This self-organising and creativity within indigenous people was brutalised, and we the educated and religious elite are continuing to brutalise it. As we are products of structural violence of colonialising but we have no right to deny the future generation the opportunity to develop the inner vision towards innovation.

CONCLUSION

In conclusion, I watch as the moon fades in anticipation of Incwala where I participate in the butterfly effect using indigenous language, dance and music. Incwala creates opportunity to sing the lyrics of my indigenous language, kuyeyeza, dance towards the rain dance, whilst evoking my innovative thoughts. As I affirm my being part of the global indigenous people, who acknowledges that structural violence occurred and continues to occur. This becomes my motivation for research in indigenous knowledge towards the establishment of an indigenous knowledge hub to provide opportunity for the future generation. Thus, creating academic and community engagement spaces for indigenous knowledge to crack open the dogmatic thought processes with non-dogmatic thoughts for new knowledge dimensions to emerge. One outstanding aspect to my healing paradigm as a member of indigenous people globally is using my voice and hands in playing instruments. Indigenous opera, is my gift from God and playing instruments from my soul is part of my healing paradigm that I will use when I am ready. When God blesses with healing gifts He gives all, my hands have been writing as part of healing, and they will soon play instruments as part of healing with my voice. In essence, indigenous people must rise to heal their children and the children of colonizers, as they need to heal. Music becomes the unifying and healing paradigm that brings God the Supreme Being into the room for all brutality and structural violence to reconcile. Indigenous people are healers in all aspects, and it's an honour to contribute this article towards all healing from brutality and structural violence.



WHY DOES NMC REFUSE TO ACCEPT MAIZE WITH A HIGH MOISTURE CONTENT?

ne of the most critical physiological factors in successful grain storage is the moisture content of the crop.

High moisture content leads to storage problems because it encourages fungal and attracts insects; respiration and germination. However, moisture content in the growing crop is naturally high and only starts to decrease as the crop reaches maturity and the grains are drying and getting ready to be harvested. In their natural state, the seeds would have a period of dormancy and then germinate either when re-wetted by rain or as a result of naturally adequate moisture content.

ANSWERS TO FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT MAIZE HARVESTING



Another major factor influencing grain spoilage is temperature. Grains are biologically active and respire during storage. One of the products of respiration is heat, and reducing the temperature of the crop can help diminish the rate of respiration, thereby lengthening the storage life by lessening the possibility of germination. Another major temperature effect is on the activity of insects and fungal problems. With lower temperatures, the metabolic rate of insects and fungi decreases and consequently so does the activity causing grain spoilage. A damp or warm spot in grain will increase the rate of respiration. In addition to heat, another product of respiration is moisture. The heat and moisture from such a 'hot spot' can spread by convection, encouraging moulds and bacteria, which in turn respire and give off more heat and moisture. It's therefore becomes a

self-generating process. Insects activity also increases with a rise in temperature.

If grain moisture content is too high, even the best aeration equipment and monitoring management will not keep the grain from spoiling, it only delays the inevitable.

How Do I Adequately Prepare FOR HARVESTING?

Currently, most of the maize grown in Swaziland is harvested by hand. Considering the need for a farmer to keep the cobs clean, to dry the cob immediately and avoid infestation of the harvested cobs, a farmer makes the following preparations:

- Make sure the drying place or equipment is clean and disinfected, ready to receive the cobs.
- Remove old grain and dirt from anything that will come in contact with the good or new grain. This includes harvesting tools, carts,

wheel barrows, bags and baskets, etc.

• Where possible, furnigate them to kill insects or their eggs. This is done in order to avoid infection of new grain by insects and their eggs.

Organize enough labour to reap and carry the cobs to the drying place timeously

The National Maize Corporation also offers the services of a combine harvester. However, it is currently best suited to large sized fields.

WHAT HAPPENS AFTER HARVESTING?

After harvesting, the greatest enemy of grain is moisture. Wet grains attract insects and mould. Therefore, the grain must be dried as soon as possible after harvesting. Drying is the systematic reduction of crop moisture down to safe levels for storage, usually 12 per cent-14 per cent moisture content. It is one of the key post harvest operations since all down-stream operations depend on it

This is particularly so in some regions of Uganda where humidity and rainfall remain high during the harvesting season resulting in delayed harvest which also constrain the actual drying of the grain.

Drying permits the escape of moisture from grain moisture to an acceptable level, which can sustain very low metabolism.

The enzyme activities and grain tissue respiration is reduced to a very low level, thus inhibiting sprout-

ing/germination. During drying, the dry air rapidly takes moisture away from the grain, especially if the air is moving and has got low humidity. Grain can be dried in a crib before shelling and on tarpaulins after it has been shelled.

How Can I Efficiently Store My Grain Before Selling to NMC?

A good storage structure should:

• Provide protection from common storage loss agents such as insect pests, rodents, moulds, birds,

● Maintain an even, cool and dry storage environment. The maize should be placed on pellets above the floor to avoid cold conditions that may lead to moulds

• Should not allow re-wetting of grain by either moisture migration or rain.

• Offer reasonable protection from thieves.

 Be simple and inexpensive to construct using, where possible, locally available materials and skills.

Be easy to clean and repair.

• Grain should be protected from rodents

The National Maize Corporation also offers storage facilities to large scale farmers and/or farmer groups at a very reasonable rate.

We hope we have been able to adequately respond to burning questions one might have with regards to the harvest period.

s Emaswati, we have over the years failed to prevent sexual violence and in process left thousands of victims turned survivors to deal with the consequences on a daily basis.

Not only do we have survivors who struggle to come to terms with what happened to them; there unfortunately also exists children born out of these sexual violence situations and they have to live with the negative effects that come from the circumstances leading to their conception.


The fact that one in three women has been sexually abused is one-too-many. It means possibly about 200 000 women, which when quantified using that about half the population comprises the fairer sex, have had an encounter with sexual violence in their lifetime.

This means about 20 per cent of the population has to deal with the after effects of having been violated in their lifetime. In as much as the country has safe spaces for those who need to be accommodated due to prevailing threats in their families and offers counselling services, not every survivor gets to be assisted as some suffer in silence.

If a survivor support system, which is the family and community, cannot offer them

support, where are they expected to be comforted? Often; the only time their plight is spoken of is immediately after the ordeal. Thereafter, no one cares if they have healed of their emotional scars or how they are coping and are expected to deal with the nightmare memories on their own. It becomes their cross to bear.

CHILDREN

What then becomes of the children birthed

after rape? Most often, children who result from rape situations are never told about their conception and are carted off to live away from their mothers.

Because of the insistence of Emaswati to quick-

ly forget about sexual violence, the children are left with so many unanswered questions pertaining why they grew up with only one parent, why they were not loved as other children, why their identity remains obscured no matter how good they try to be and why they experience unfathomable hardships.

A young man might question why his mother never seemed to care for him over the years. The fact that his mother gave birth to him at the age of 14 whereas his father was an adult never registers as something which should be questioned for what it really is.

That he was conceived through sexual violence and was given up to be raised by his paternal family simply because her family could not bear the effects of the violent encounter is never admitted and he grows up feeling not loved by the mother who birthed him.

When eventually the mother makes peace with her situation and reaches out, instead of finding a child ready to love her, she will most likely be met by hostility fostered by the perception that she actually abandoned him, as nothing was never said about the circumstances of his conception.

There is never any support for both mother and child to help them get through the ordeal so that they can salvage their relationship as they could soberly wish to do were they assisted to heal and reach an understanding of sorts.

Develop

Due to the negative stories the child grows up with about his mother, he might even develop an aversion for females to the point where he turns out to be abusive later in life.

In a situation where a mother in an abusive situation gets to know that her own daughter is being sexually violated by her partner, without proper structures in place where she will be supported and assisted to recognise abuse for what it really is, she will most likely start victim-shaming.

It is common for the mother to then view the sexually violated child as a threat to her relationship with her partner instead of embracing the child and protecting her.

It is unfortunate that the child might resort to start acting out and as a defence mechanism become defiant and the mother may also look at this as deliberate petulance directed at her as could possibly be done by an equal.

Without support for the mother to identify that she too was emotionally and physically abused by her partner, whatever the child does can be viewed as a deliberate attempt to peeve her and agitate her at every turn.

On the other hand, a child who starts acting up after being raped and initiating sexual encounters might be looked at as promiscuous by choice, whereas these are the effects of the initial violence encounter which she or he can never process and defeatedly accepts that sex should be his/her power tool.

Instead of recognising that the child is actually displaying signs of having been traumatised, the community and parents, who consciously choose to quickly forget the child's sordid ordeal, soon label this child with the most disturbing name.

The community and family are usually more willing to recognise the child as delinquent but shy away from speaking out against his/her violent sexual encounter.

The failure to embrace and restore the dignity of sexually violated men, women and children will set the country back as survivors will become victims for life if and when we don't prioritise helping them deal with issues and effects of sexual violence. Don't count yourself out we all have a role to play!

TRUMP IMPEACHMENT INQUIRY

ligence officer's whistleblower report alleges the US president pressured Ukraine to help his 2020 election campaign.

The impeachment inquiry of US President Donald Trump gained momentum this week as a top US diplomat in Ukraine linked the president to a pressure campaign aimed at forcing President Volodymyr Zelenskyy to investigate the 2016 and 2020 US elections.

Tensions escalated between House Democrats leading the inquiry and Republicans trying to defend Trump. Republicans attempted and failed to censure Representative Adam Schiff, who is leading the Democratic impeachment inquiry.

"What the Republicans fear most is the truth," House Speaker Nancy Pelosi said in a statement on Monday as the House defeated the Republican censure motion by a vote of 218-185.

"The president betrayed the oath of office, our national security and the integrity of our elections, and the GOP has not even tried to deny the facts," she said.

Meanwhile, Democrats were handed a victory on Friday as a federal judge ruled the Department of Justice must hand over grand jury evidence from the investigation of former Special Counsel Robert Mueller.

Since September 24, the Democrat-

led House has been pursuing the impeachment inquiry. It was sparked by a US intelligence officer's whistleblower report that alleged Trump and his personal lawyer, Rudy Giuliani, pressured Ukraine to help his 2020 election campaign.

Here are six things that happened this week related to the inquiry.

1. Diplomat links Trump to pressure campaign

William Taylor, a top US diplomat in Kyiv, stunned House members by telling impeachment investigators that Trump directed that military aid to Ukraine be contingent on the country publicly announcing investigations of the president's Democratic

In a 15-page statement delivered behind closed doors on Tuesday, Taylor chronicled an "irregular" effort led by Giuliani to force Zelesnkyy to open investigations into former Vice President Joe Biden and the role of his son, Hunter, on the board of gas company Burisma.

Trump also wanted Ukrainian officials to open an investigation into unsubstantiated claims of Ukranian, not Russian, cyber-interference in the 2016 US presidential election, according to Taylor's statement which was provided to US media. AP

Over a million protesters demand Chile president's resignation

ANTIAGO - More than one million people took to the streets in Chile Friday for the largest protests in a week of deadly demonstrations demanding economic reforms and the resignation of President Sebastian Pinera.

The leader told the thronging masses that he had "heard the message" in a post on Twitter, characterising the protests in a positive light and as a means towards change.

Demonstrators carrying indigenous and national flags sang popular resistance songs from the 1973-90 Augusto Pinochet dictatorship era as the country, usually seen as one of the most stable in Latin America, grapples with its worst violence in decades.

Dream

Santiago's Governor Karla Rubilar described it as "a historic day" on Twitter, praising "a peaceful march... representing the dream of a new Chile." Rubilar said more than a million were demonstrating around the country, while Santiago's town hall put the number of people marching in the capital at 820 000, citing police figures.

For the past week, Chileans' pentup anger has spilled over in the form of protests against a socio-economic structure that many feel has left them by the wayside, with low wages and pensions, costly health care and education, and a big gap between rich and poor.

Pinera, a conservative billionaire, wrote on Twitter that "the massive. happy and peaceful march today. where Chileans demanded a more just and supportive Chile, opens great paths for the future and hope."

"We have all heard the message. We have all changed. With unity and help from God, we will travel the road towards a Chile that is better for all," he said.

Pinera apologised earlier in the week for failing to anticipate the outbreak of social unrest and announced a raft of measures designed to placate people, such as increases in minimum pensions and wages.

He also announced a plan to end a deeply unpopular state of emergency and to lift a nighttime curfew, although both of those are now into their seventh day.

On Friday he called on legislators to "urgently approve these projects rather than arguing and debating so much."

Francisco Anguitar, a 38-year-old artificial intelligence developer attending the demonstrations, told AFP the protests would probably "be the biggest ever. We're asking for justice, honesty, ethical government."

"It's not that we want socialism or communism: We want fewer private enterprises, more state," he said.

LEBANON PROTESTERS DIG IN AFTER NASRALLAH'S SPEECH

EBANON - Demonstrators in the Lebanese capital say their demands are "clear" and they will keep protesting until the government falls, disregarding a speech by Hezbollah's leader who warned that the protest movement risked pushing Lebanon into "chaos" and "God forbid" civil war. In a televised address on Friday, Hassan Nasrallah said a government resignation would create a power vacuum which could lead the country into civil unrest "similar to what's happening in the region".

"Under the current monetary and economic situation and the fragile political climate and all the targeting that is happening internationally and regionally, void will lead to chaos, void will lead to destruction," Nasrallah warned, conjuring fears of Lebanon's 15-year civil war that came to an end in 1990.

"We do not accept the fall of the presidency nor do we accept the government's resignation and we do not accept, amid these conditions, holding early parliamentary elections." Aljazeera

Vietnamese families fear relatives among Essex lorry dead

ONDON - British police arrested on Friday a fourth person in connection with the deaths of 39 people found in the back of a truck near London, amid signs that some of the dead may be Vietnamese.

As forensic experts began the process of identifying the victims, at least two Vietnamese families said they feared their relatives were among the victims.

A 26-year-old Vietnamese woman Pham Thi Tra My sent a text message to her mother saying she could not breathe at about the time the truck container was en route from

Belgium to the United Kingdom. "I'm sorry Mom. My path to abroad

doesn't succeed. Mom, I love you so much! I'm dying because I can't breathe," she said in the message, according to her brother Pham Manh Cuong. Human Rights Space, a civic network based in Vietnam, said Tra My had gone to China and was planning to reach England via France.

Another Vietnamese man, Nguyen Dinh Gia, said his son told him two weeks ago he planned to travel to Britain from France, where he had been living illegally since 2018.

His 20-year-old son Nguyen Dinh

Luong said he would pay 11 000 pounds (\$14 000) for the journey.

But Gia got a call several days ago from a Vietnamese man saying, "please have some sympathy, something unexpected happened", he told AFP news agency.

"I fell to the ground when I heard that," Gia said. "It seemed that he was in the truck with the accident, all of them dead." He has asked Vietnamese officials to help identify his son, who was believed to be looking for work in a nail salon in the UK.

Court bans publishing police details

HONG KONG - A Hong Kong court has banned people from publishing a wide range of personal details about police officers and their families, including photos, in a bid to halt "doxxing" by pro-democracy protesters.

The temporary injunction, uploaded on government websites overnight, was criticised by some yesterday for its broad wording and for further shielding the identity of officers as they clash with protesters.

The semi-autonomous Chinese city has been battered by nearly five months of seething prodemocracy rallies in which police and protesters have fought increasingly violent battles.

Rinkevics sees Brexit extension

LONDON - European Union leaders are willing to delay Brexit past the October 31 deadline, but have not agreed on how long the extension should be, Latvia's Foreign Minister, Edgars Rinkevics, said yesterday.

"There has been unanimous agreement that we need to extend the Brexit discussion. There is a big discussion of what is the best deadline, and I wouldn't make drama out of it," Rinkevics told the BBC in a radio interview.

Rinkevics added that he expected EU ambassadors to decide on Monday or Tuesday, and did not see any need for an emergency EU summit to discuss the issue.

Crunch time for married priests


VATICAN CITY - Catholic bishops gathered at a special Vatican assembly to vote yesterday on whether to recommend Pope Francis to open the priesthood to married men or create female deacons, issues that are taboo for traditionalists. The ballot comes at the close of a three-week "synod" on the Pan-Amazonian region which highlighted the challenges facing the region, from the destruction of the rainforest to the exploitation of indigenous peoples and a scarcity in priests. The pontiff is expected in the coming months to address the issues raised with a document which could have repercussions not only for the vast, isolated territory, but the whole of the Roman Catholic Church.

Thousands of Zimbabweans rallied on Friday in support of President Emmerson Mnangagwa's call on the US and the EU to lift sanctions on Zimbabwean leaders.

US SANCTIONS ZIMBABWE'S **OWEN NCUBE OVER**

SA - The United States has imposed sanctions on Zimbabwe's state security minister over what it says is credible information of his involvement in 'gross violations of human rights'.

The State Department said on Friday it would deny entry into the US to Owen Ncube.

"We are deeply troubled by the Zimbabwean government's use of statesanctioned violence against peaceful protestors, and civil society, as well as against labour leaders and members of the opposition leaders in Zimbabwe,"

Secretary of State Mike Pompeo said in a statement.

"We urge the government to stop the violence, investigate and hold accountable officials responsible for human rights violations and abuses in Zimbabwe," he said. Zimbabwe has seen numerous anti-government protests this year, mostly brought about by the failing economy which has rendered nearly five million citizens dependent on aid.

There have been a number of reports of torture and abductions as authorities try to crack down on such insurgence. The United Nations special rap-

porteur on the rights to freedom of peaceful assembly and association expressed concern about 'excessive military force' in Zimbabwe, in a report released late in September.

Last month, doctors took to the streets after Peter Magombeyi, their union leader and one of the organisers of an effort to demand higher wages for state doctors, went missing.

Ncube said at the time that Magombeyi's case was being treated as a disappearance, not an abduction, as his colleagues have alleged.

Botswana's governing party wins tight election

ABORONE - The Botswana Democratic Party, which has governed the country since independence in 1966, has retained power in one of the most competitive elections in the country's 53-year post-independence history.

It retained its parliamentary majority, winning at least 29 of the 57 contestable seats in the National Assembly.

Botswana has a first-past-thepost electoral system in which a simple majority is required to win government. The southern African nation has a population of 2,2 million, of whom 900 000 were registered to vote.

The Botswana Democratic Party was uniquely vulnerable in this election. The party faced a surging opposition as well as the fact that it had been weakened by an internal split between former President Ian Khama (66) and the newly-elected President Mokgweetsi Masisi (58).

Khama handed the presidency and party leadership to his then vice president Masisi in April 2018, planning on a smooth succession of leadership.

But, the relationship turned sour the following month when Masisi fired the intelligence agency chief Isaac Kgosi, an ally of Khama. A year later, Masisi overturned Khama's ban on hunting elephants.

Khama subsequently quit the Botswana Democratic Party and endorsed the opposition, a manoeuvre that risked cleaving votes from the ruling party's heartland in the Central District where Khama is leader of the Bamangwato chieftainship. Khama is the son of Sir Seretse Khama, the first President of an independent Botswana. His father led the country from 1966

Two major factors affected the outcome of the poll. The first was the crippling divisions in the ranks of the opposition parties. The second was that the ruling party clung to power through, among other things, Masisi's direct appeal to populism.

This included promising the military, police, and prison workers salary increases and ambitiously pledging to deliver new jobs by building electric cars in Botswana. The party also benefited from the use of state media. News24

'AGREE' TO RESUME TALKS ON MASSIVE NILE DAM EGYPT, ETHIOPIA

AIRO - Egypt and Ethiopia's leaders have agreed to restart the work of a committee aimed at brokering an agreement on the operating terms of a giant hydropower dam, an Egyptian presidency spokesman

The apparent breakthrough on

Thursday was announced after a meeting between Egyptian President Abdel Fattah el-Sisi and Ethiopian Prime Minister Abiy Ahmed on the sidelines of a Russia-Africa Summit in the Black Sea resort of Sochi. It came after a longrunning diplomatic spat between Cairo and Addis Ababa over the Grand

Ethiopian Renaissance Dam (GERD) on Ethiopia's Blue Nile escalated in recent days, with bellicose rhetoric prompting a mediation offer from the United States.

The Egyptian foreign ministry on Wednesday said Cairo had accepted Washington's overture for a meeting of foreign ministers from Egypt, Ethiopia and Sudan, the third nation affected by GERD, on the US \$5bn infrastructure project. It did not state a date for the talks, or if the other nations had agreed to attend. But in his statement on Thursday, el-Sisi's spokesman made no mention of a mediator but said the

technical committee would resume its work 'in a more open and positive manner, in order to reach a final vision on the rules for filling and operating the dam'. Ethiopia's Ministry of Foreign Affairs meanwhile confirmed el-Sisi and Abiy had held 'discussions' over the project in a post on Twitter. AP

NAIROBI - Uganda has sought to reassure sexual minorities that they are safe, saying it has no plans to introduce the death penalty for gay sex after reports of rising homophobic

LGBT+ rights campaigners in Uganda have expressed concerns about a spate of attacks after a minister said earlier this month that the government planned to reintroduce a bill colloquially known as 'Kill the Gays'.

In a statement on Thursday, President Yoweri Museveni's office denied that and said attacks on LGBT+ people should be reported to police for investigation so that perpetrators could be brought to book'. Reuters

Almost one million people affected by floods in Sudan

JUBA - Rains are likely to continue for another four to six weeks and put more people at risk. Nearly one million people in South Sudan have been affected by heavy flooding, according to the United Nations. Severe floods have devastated large areas of the country since July, submerging entire communities and forced hundreds of thousands from their homes, the UN Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA) said in a statement on Friday. It added that an estimated 908 000 people were affected, including internally displaced people, refugees and their host communities in a country already hit by years of ruinous civil war that caused mass displacement and wrecked its economy.

Mashaba shares CoJ and JMPD slide dividing crime up into African nationalities

HARARE - Zimbabwe's President Emmerson Mnangagwa on Friday described Western sanctions as a 'cancer' sapping the economy, and his supporters denounced the measures during marches held around the country. In Harare, many stayed away from the demonstrations, saying they were a distraction from the president's mishandling of the economy, which is plagued by 18-hour daily power cuts and shortages of foreign exchange, fuel and medicines.Mnangagwa has so far failed to unify the country since taking over from the late Robert Mugabe, who was ousted in a coup in Citizen



OKOHAMA - England have on by the huge Kiwi contingent - but champions New Zealand were always made it to the Rugby World Cup final after beating the reigning champions New Zealand in a thrilling 19-7 match.

Tens of thousands of rugby supporters descended on Japan's Yokohama as the two pre-tournament favourites met for the World Cup semi final.

Cheering supporters clutching pints littered the city's streets before taking their places in the stands of the 72 000seat International Stadium.

There were crusaders and knights pitted against giant kiwis and Maori warriors, all hoping to watch their side progress to the final which will also be held in Yokohama.

As always, the All Blacks put on a passionate Haka - which was roared

the Englishmen stood defiant in an unusual reverse v-shape and accepted the challenge. Britons in the rafters also tried to drown out the wails of the All Black 15, with a stirring rendition of Swing Low Sweet Chariot.

Manu Tuilagi got England off to a storming start as he finished off relentless forward pressure from close range to make it 5-0 in the first two minutes.

It was the quickest try the All Blacks have conceded in rugby World Cup history, with captain Owen Farrell increasing the lead to 7-0 with his conversion.

George Ford added to the score with a penalty just before half time, leaving the score at 10-0, then another after the break to make it 13-0. Defending going to be a tough test for Eddie Jones' men, but the coach seemed confident as he urged his team to 'make the script.

The All Blacks and England have battled it out three times before in world cups, with the Kiwis winning every match.

New Zealand, which has not lost a World Cup game since a quarter final defeat to France in 2007, is aiming for an unprecedented third consecutive title and takes a six-game winning streak against England. No other team has won two World Cups in a row.

England is aiming to reach the final for the first time since 2007, when it lost to South Africa.

Standing in their path is a Wales team that briefly held the No. 1 world ranking this year and is aiming for its own piece of history by reaching the final for the first time.

"We know we're facing a tough opposition but all we can do is focus on what we do best and what got us here," said Kolisi. Daily Mail

ADRID - Zinedine Zidane is reportedly ready to pull out all the stops to sign Paul Pogba and may offer £85 million plus Gareth Bale to do so, according to Eldesmarque.

Zidane has been looking to offload the Welshman since taking the job, and has been desperate to sign Pogba.

Real Madrid were unable to meet United's hefty £180 million valuation of the Frenchman over the summer, especially after signing Eden Hazard from Chelsea in a deal that could rise to over £150 million. but did not recover in time. Further adding to recent transfer speculation, Pogba was seen meeting with Zidane while in Dubai.

Over the past few months, Pogba has made little secret of his desire to play for Madrid, admitting several times that Zidane was his role model as a youngster.

Bale has secured a full-time spot in the Real Madrid starting team but has only managed to score two goals so far this season, adding to Zidane's frus-

Bale nearly departed Real Madrid for China over the summer but the move was blocked by club president Florentino

Mbappe is Messi, Ronaldo's natural successor

ARIS - Kylian Mbappe is the heir to Lionel Messi and Cristiano Ronaldo's Ballon d'Or throne, according to Marseille boss Andre Villas-Boas.

The Paris Saint-Germain star came fourth in last year's competition following a starring role in France's World Cup win, and the 20-year-old is on the 30-man shortlist for the next edition. Villas-Boas is looking for a way to contain Mbappe as his Marseille side travel to Paris in a Ligue 1 glamour tie on Sunday evening, but the former Chelsea and Tottenham boss wasn't sounding overly optimistic about his side's chances."He is the natural successor of Lionel Messi and Cristiano Ronaldo for the Ballon d'Or," he said of Mbappe.

"The squad PSG have is incredible, it's also well put together this year. (Mauro) Icardi has adapted well.

"With the injuries to (Thomas) Meunier and (Ander) Herrera, I do not know what (Thomas) Tuchel is going to do. He also has (Angel) Di Maria, who is in incredible form.

"The difference between the two teams is gigantic, but we aren't going to Paris to be part of a PSG party. We are going to try and win the game. You have to sweat for the badge but it is also important to finish the match without any injuries or sus-

pensions." While Mbappe's continued rise suggests a Ballon d'Or is a question of when rather than if, he would have to win it this year to match the record of the Brazilian Ronaldo, who first

won the then-FIFA World Player of the Year award aged 20, back in 1996. Mbappe will turn 21 in mid-December, with the winner announced earlier in the month.

Mbappe has started this season in good form, with six goals and four assists in eight appearances for PSG in all competitions. After notching 39 and 17 respectively in 43 games last year, he will likely pick up some votes this year again - but the feeling persists that he would have to move to a more competitive league if he is to scoop the game's biggest individual prize.

Messi and Virgil van Dijk are among the favourites for this year's award, with Messi beating the Liverpool defender to FIFA's The Best award in September.

In 2018, Real Madrid midfielder Luka Modric became the first man other than Messi and Ronaldo to win the award in over a decade.

Time running out for Emery to show progress at Arsenal

ONDON - Arsenal fans would be forgiven for having flashbacks as the Gunners needed two late Nicolas Pepe free-kicks to see off Vitoria Guimaraes in the Europa League on Thursday.

Empty seats at the Emirates, grumbles from those who were there and calls for the manager to go, it was very reminiscent of the final years of Arsene Wenger's tenure before the Frenchman finally stepped aside in 2018. Unai Emery was the man chosen to succeed Wenger as the first new Arsenal manager since 1996, but the club could

be looking at another appointment soon with the Spaniard showing little sign of having improved the club's fortunes over the past 17 months.

Emery's first season ended in disappointment.

Arsenal blew two chances for a return to the Champions League, winning just one of their last five games to finish fifth in the Premier League and then losing the Europa League final 4-1 to Chelsea.

Often derided by fans for a lack of investment, the club's American owner Stan Kroenke backed Emery with a

surprising splurge in the summer transfer market. Pepe was signed for a club record £72 million fee from Lille, Kieran Tierney and David Luiz brought in to improve a faulty defence and Spanish international midfielder Dani Ceballos loaned from Real Madrid. Yet, a 1-0 defeat at newlypromoted Sheffield United on Monday had all the bad hallmarks of Wenger's final days as Arsenal were blunt in attack despite dominating possession and undone at a set-piece for Lys Mousset's winner.

"We have to fight for it. There are no guarantees. It's allowed for everybody else to dream, but somebody has to work. "Klopp and Liverpool are rightly proud of their efforts from 2018-19, but there is a determination within a star-studded group to ensure that focus remains locked on the future and not stuck in the past.

"It's a nice memory, was wonderful and was great, but it's history," added Klopp on a sixth European Cup success for the Reds.

You have to go back to April 20, when they won 2-1 at relegation-bound Huddersfield Town, to find the last

time they experienced the sweet taste of victory in a Premier League match.

For the Vicarage Road regulars it's April 2 for a last home league success, a 4-1 win over another side destined for the drop in Fulham.

Now the dark clouds of relegation hang heavy over Watford and the omens get gloomier by the week. They have gone 10 matches at the start of this Premier League season without anything in the win column.

The last time this happened, at the beginning of their 2006-07 season, they ended up 20th and last, some 10 points adrift of safety. One small consolation is that they at least won game 11, so watch out Chelsea next week. Watford's winless state is almost unique in English football. You have to delve down to Corinthian Casuals of the Isthmian League Premier Division - the seventh level of the pyramid - to find another team without a league win so far. It's that grim.

This was another contest Watford controlled for long periods without being able to make it count.

Bournemouth keeper Aaron Ramsdale was required to make a couple of important interventions but Watford were also left grateful to their stopper, Ben Foster, for crucial saves to thwart Philip Billing, Diego Rico, Arnaut Danjuma and Ryan Fraser.

There has been some evidence that Watford are making baby-step progress under their returning manager Quique Sanchez Flores, borne out by their recent draws with Sheffield United and Tottenham.

While they set up in a surprisingly conservative 5-3-2 formation against the Blades in their last home fixture, strangling their creativity, they were full of purpose and aggression in the opening moments here.

Inside the first minute, Gerard Deulofeu's angled drive skidded off the soggy surface and Aaron Ramsdale, who committed his long-term future to Bournemouth this week. parried it out.

The ball couldn't have fallen more perfectly for Abdoulaye Doucoure, only 12 yards out, but he got it all wrong and skied his effort into the stand.

Watford continued to pour forward and forced a corner that Deulofeu whipped in wickedly and saw the ball bounce off the near post. Craig Dawson's follow-up was blocked by the alert Steve Cook.

But the hosts quickly ran out of steam, their momentum stalling when Tom Cleverley was forced off injured, and once Bournemouth settled there was plenty of space to exploit.

Not only did the Cherries expose Watford's three-man defence down the flanks but they made them look vulnerable from set-pieces too.Cook peeled away from Christian Kabasele far too easily to meet Fraser's corner and thundered a header against the crossbar. It was Foster who was far the busier of the two keepers from then on, making three significant saves before half-time.





Moneni held out for the all-important win which sees them stay in the top half of the table as the first round nears completion.





Pulisic makes his mark in the EPL with hat-trick

ONDON - Christian Pulisic announced himself proper-Aly into English football with a devastating hat-trick as Chelsea recorded a seventh victory in a row.

Pulisic, who has been a slow burner following his move from Borussia Dortmund, was granted his first Premier League start since August following a couple of encouraging cameos as substitute.

And the 21-year-old American took full advantage with his first goals for the club, the perfect treble of right foot, left foot and head-

It was the first hat-trick of the youngster's career and those travelling fans you chanted U-S-A U-S-A didn't give a second thought to last year's hero Eden Hazard, now at Real Madrid and the player Pulisic was brought in to replace.



Willian added a fourth goal for the visitors who moved up to fourth place as a result.

And while Burnley were unsually generous in defence, Sean Dyche's side did give a good account of themselves during periods of the

game and tested Blues goalkeeper Kepa Arrizabalaga before deservedly grabbing two consolation goals in the closing stages.

Sean Dyche celebrates seven years at Turf Moor next week but for his anniversary game he had to to without striker Chris Wood sidelined with a hamstring injury.

Chelsea hadn't lost at Turf Moor since 1983 when their team included David Speedie and Peter Rhoades-Brown.

For the class of 2019, Frank

Lampard stuck with the homegrown kids who had beaten Ajax in midweek with the exception of Callum Hudson-Odoi, who was relegated to the bench with £58million winger Christian Pulisic drafted in for his first Premier League start since August. Chelsea started brightly with the away section in good voice singing their manager's name.

Willian, based wide on the right of a 4-2-3-1, shot over when well-placed on the edge of the box and Kurt Zouma survived a painful fall into the advertising hoarding. Once he returned to the pitch, he flattened Ashley Barnes with an aerial challenge much to the amusement of the Chelsea fans, who well remember the Burnley forward once dishing out the rough stuff to Nemanja Matic during an infamous game at Stamford Bridge.

After a slow start, Pulisic gave a glimpse of his pace and balance with a sweeping run from the lefft.

His pass to Mason Mount was an invitation to the youngster but he delayed too long and when his shot was finally delivered, Ben Mee had shuffled across to block.

Daily Mail
