### ESWATINI'S NINE KEY CHALLENGES FOR UN

HIS Majesty King Mswati III has presented nine key focus areas needing the urgent attention of United Nations Secretariat and Member States.

He decsribed these pointers as achievable through the adoption of a multilateral approach which was in line with the theme of the session: 'Galvanising multilateral efforts for poverty eradication, quality education, climate action and inclusion'. Speaking at the 74th Session of the UN General Assesmbly on Wednesday, the King placed conflict, climate change and poverty alleviation and the exclusion of Taiwan at the top of his concerns making recommendations on the action required of the UN body as a collective.

The focus areas are as follows;

1. Stop dictating; we are all equal: The King expressed concern that there still exist threats to peace and violent conflicts plus mass atrocities in different regions of the world.

He noted that some of these conflicts and other inhumane sufferings are sponsored by those who believe they have the right to dictate and impose their ideologies on other nations of the world. He has called upon the UN to act swiftly and discourage such behaviours.


"We are all equal, irrespective of country size and economic power," he

2. Bridge the gaps, promote collective action: The Head of State noted that most contemporary challenges such as terrorism, climate change, migration, transnational organised crimes and many others, could be effectively addressed without multilateral cooperation. He recommended inclusion and participation of all Member States through cooperation, dialogue and reforming existing organs where needed.

"We therefore implore the UN General Assembly to play its role in bridging the gaps and promoting collective action."

3. Include Taiwan: His Majesty the King has observed that the United Nations' bid of leaving no one behind will remain elusive if the organisation continues to deprive other nations of the world the opportunity to play a pivotal role in the UN affairs.

"We firmly believe that Taiwan is

essential to the full implementation of the Agenda 2030 for sustainable development." He said the inclusion of Taiwan was a crucial step in realising the pledge, as stipulated in the preamble of UN General Assembly resolution 70/1 adopted on September 25, 2015.

"We call upon the UN to once again uphold the principle of universality and its multilateral efforts towards total inclusion, and to allow Taiwan to participate in relevant exertions on a dignified and equal footing.

4. Support African Continental Free Trade Area (AfCFTA): His Majesty the King said the continental free trade area initiative launched by Africa needed the full support of the UN as it would propel the continent towards achieving the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). "Likewise, with the anticipated launch of the Ae-Trade platform in the next few weeks, we are confident that these will usher a new era in the lives of our people," he said.

5. Invest more in SDGs to end poverty: Ingwenyama told the General Assembly that poverty alleviation required more investment. He said this was necessary to build strong societies and social protection systems that would ensure the inclusion of special interest groups affected by poverty.

"Whilst we have a responsibility to channel a significant proportion of national expenditures into social protection programmes, developing countries actually need financing of the SDGS to transform their economies and social fabrics," he submitted.

6. Set up regional disaster funds: His Majesty the King said UN member countries needed sound contingency plans to combat climate change. He recommended the setting up of permanent regional disaster funds to help cushion against the effects of natural disasters and set-up sub-regional humanitarian hubs that will be equipped to respond swiftly to disasters.

7. Reassess allocation of development assistance: The King said Middle-Income countries like Eswatini were facing a decline in official development assistance due this categorisation which is frustrating development and poverty reduction efforts. "To this end, we strongly advocate for reassessment of the reality on the ground when official development assistance is allocated to countries most in need."

8. Provide assistance to educators: The King said no nation can develop past its educational capacity, particularly that of its teachers and there was, therefore, a need to render the necessary assistance to countries that need help in developing the attribute of their educators

9. Multi-sectoral response for the youth: The King submitted that we are a youthful world, with more than half the global population under the age of He said this requires a comprehensive, coordinated and multi-sectoral response to encourage the labour market to absorb the growing young working class, ensure that they are appropriately trained for the needs of our markets and increase their opportunities to start their own

### His Majesty meets UN Secretary General

HIS Majesty the King and the United and country team to integrate the Sustainable Guterres held private talks on Wednesday.

This was shortly after the King had delivered the country's statement in the General Assembly debate.

The UN released yesterday that the Secretary-General commended Eswatini for its leadership in taking steps to tackle developmental challenges faced by the Kingdom. The Secretary-General and King Mswati III also discussed Eswatini's implementation of the Sustainable Development Goals.

The UN provides strong support to the kingdom through its Resident Coordinator

Nations Secretary General Antonio Development Goals (SDGs) in national planning processes. The local delegation has submitted that among the results of this support includes the poverty reduction levels, decline in the prevalence of stunting among children under five years, improved access to water and electricity in urban and rural areas and helping the country record, for the first time in 2017, zero cases of polio, disability and death from tetanus, whooping cough and measles.

However, there are concerns around underfunding which is threatening the successful implementation of the SDGs.

The kingdom is also seeking support

from the UN to establish a permanent regional disaster fund, to help cushion against the effects of natural disasters, as well as at SADC level for a sub-regional humanitarian hub equipped with emergency response equipment, tools and skilled personnel to provide expertise, advice and capacity building to Member States. The strong relationship between Eswatini and the UN has seen the kingdom offer land for the construction of the UN common premises which host a state of the art infrastructure.

Meanwhile, His Majesty also held bilateral talks with the President of the Republic of Ireland Michael Higgins.

### Eswatini emulated on Malaria Fund launch

THE launch of the Malaria Fund initiative drew applause at the UN General Assembly.

His Majesty the King informed the General Assembly that the fund was necessary to address the funding needs in the fight to eliminate

"In my capacity as the chairperson of the African Leaders Malaria Alliance (ALMA), I am delighted to announce that we launched the End Malaria Fund early this year, a public private partnership to close the funding gap and end the disease by 2022.

"We pleasantly note that following the setting up of the Malaria Fund in Eswatini, many more African countries have followed suit, and are actively launching similar funds. he said.

### SEVEN OF THE BEST ON SDGS

THE country has made significant progress in seven of the 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

One of these is the drop in the overall level of poverty from 69 per cent in 2000 to 58.9 per cent in 2017, His Majesty the King has told the United Nations. The SDGs were adopted by the United Nations on September 25, 2015 and are a universal call to action to end poverty, protect the planet and ensure that all people enjoy peace and prosperity by 2030. Addressing a high level platform on Sustainable Development Goals, His Majesty presented the following

SDG 1: Poverty reduction: the trends indicate a reduction on the overall level of poverty from 69 per cent in 2000 to 58.9 per cent in 2017. We also have social protection programmes, in the form of grants for orphaned and vulnerable children, elderly and people with disabilities.

SDG 2: Ending hunger and achieving food security: Eswatini has introduced an input subsidy programme for farmers to boost production of staple food - maize, feeding programme in schools as well as promoting irrigation and water harvesting

SDG 3: Ensuring healthy lives and promoting wellbeing for all: Life expectancy has grown to 58 years in 2017 from 37 years in mid - 2000. On HIV/AIDS, with support of development partners, we have rolled out a full programme and achieved outreach at 84.7: 87.4: 91.9 respectively on ending AIDS by 2030 as set by the UN.

SDG 4: Inclusive and equitable quality education: Eswatini introduced free primary education, access to early childhood care and development education and the literacy rate improved to 95.3 per cent for women and 91.8 per cent for men.

The country has made investments into technical and vocational education training

SDG 5: Gender equality and empowerment of women and girls: A new law has been enacted to protect women and girls in particular against domestic violence (SODV) Act.

SDG 13: Climate change: Policies are in place to address issues of disaster and adaptability to the changing environment.

SDG 17: Partnerships towards attainment of SDGs: Eswatini is working with development partners in agriculture, water and sanitation health and infrastructure.

The King said further progress in this regard was being hindered by the challenge of limited resources but steps were being taken to address it. "The kingdom is looking forward to convening a donors' conference in the near future with the main objective of resource mobilisation for the SDGs and you are all invited to come and share your expertise with us," he urged.

### MORE SUPPORT FOR FIGHT AGAINST HIV

THE positive developments in the fight against HIV/AIDS being recorded in Eswatini, has put her in good stead for continued donor support.

This is the assurance taken from a private roundtable discussion on HIV and AIDS progress in Africa, which was hosted by the George W. Bush Institute and PEPFAR (US President's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief) where His Majesty the King was a guest.

The event took place on Wednesday afternoon at the Plaza Hotel in New York. Among those present during the discussion was the former President of the USA, George W. Bush as well as philanthropist billionaire Michael Bloomberg. Bush, Bloomberg and PEPFAR pledged to continue their support to the drive of turning the tide against the health challenges facing Africa, in particular in matters involving HIV

According to the local health team attending the United Nations 74th Session General Assembly, the Kingdom of Eswatini has benefitted immensely through funding from PEPFAR that has pumped in

over US\$500 million since 2007 and the American government remains the largest supporter of this country's HIV and AIDS response.

The success realised by Eswatini from this support includes the reduction of new HIV infections by 44 per cent since 2014, with over 80 per cent of people living with HIV now on treatment, while over 90 per cent of those now virally sup-

New initiatives with the support of PEPFAR include reaching out through faith and traditional communities, an initiative that has seen Eswatini awarded \$8 million to leverage these powerful networks and structures as part of the important pillars of the HIV response.

In addition, through PEPFAR support, cervical cancer screening and the treatment of pre-cancerous lesions for women aged 25-49 living with HIV has rapidly scaled up in the country over the past few months.

The country is now on track to screen more than a quarter of all eligible women by the end of September, and all eligible women by next year.


### Warm to hot weekend expected

PUBLIC Sector Associations (PSAs) claim the violence which saw 17 of their members getting injured was a result of provocation by the Royal Eswatini Police Service (REPS).

In a press conference convened yesterday at SNAT Centre in Manzini to update the media on the latest developments on the strike, National Public Service and Allied Workers Union (NAPSAWU) President, Oscar Nkambule stated that the chaos was unfortunate as it was not the intention of civil servants to end their march on such a note.

However, he blamed the incidents on the police who allegedly mingled with the protesting civil servants.

#### Distance

It is said that the police failed to keep the 100 metre distance between them and the protestors, as per the law.

"The civil servants were infuriated by that the police mingled with them when they should not. This was intentionally done so as to portray the protestors as unruly," Nkambule said.

On this note, it was said that the police then fired rubber bullets on everyone, including people who were inside their ...come forward, lodge a complaint - police

This is said to have resulted in 17 civil servants being injured in the process. **Prodding** 

To prove that the police were deliberately prodding the civil servants, the PSAs leadership said people who were not even part of the strike were shot at.

Police's Chief Information and Communications Officer Senior Superintendent Phindile Vilakati said the PSAs should follow the law and lodge a complaint.

"We are expecting them to lodge a complaint so that their claim can be investigated.

"There is no way we can know whether what they are saying is true, until a proper investigation can be done, but it will be done once a formal complaint has been lodged with the relevant structures," she said.

### PSAs meet to discuss way forward

"WE are not backing down!"

This was asserted by the Public Sector Associations during a press conference that was held yesterday at the Swaziland National Association of Teachers (SNAT) Centre yesterday.

The PSAs leadership said after the mayhem that happened in Mbabane on Wednesday, the civil servants were not giving up on the fight.

According to SNAT President Mbongwa Dlamini, they PSAs leadership had been locked in a meeting with government's negotiating team as arbitrated by the Conciliation Mediation and Arbitration Commission (CMAC).

The meeting that was deemed fruitless by the PSAs leadership is said to have lasted for hours and it was adjourned

In the afternoon.

Dlamini said this meeting seemed like a waste of time, since government's attitude did not give them hope that an

amicable resolution would be reached.

However, he stated that they were

However, he stated that they were meant to meet again at 5pm yesterday, still with the aim of reaching a resolution with their employer pertaining to their 7.85 per cent cost of living adjustment (CoLA) demand.

Even so, Dlamini said civil servants were still to have a big meeting today with the purpose of forging a way forward. In the meeting that is scheduled to start at 10 in the morning at SNAT Centre, other members of the public who wished to participate were invited.

In addition, the SNAT president said government seemed angered by the civil servants' strike, which he said was not helping the situation because the PSAs would never back down until they got what they want.

He said they would continue protesting because they knew that money was available in the country.

"We can even show them where the money is just like we did on Wednesday," it was said.

Dlamini clarified that by participating in the strike action which he said was ongoing, civil servants were to stay away from work for as long as it took for government to eventually give in.

"People should stop blaming us for everything that is happening but should direct their suggestions to government, because it was the reason that civil servants were participating on strike action," he said.

Furthermore, Dlamini clarified on the allegations that civil servants were harassing their colleagues who were at work since the strike began.

He said they were in fact not harassing anyone but were only reminding their colleagues of their right to protest as allowed by regulations.

the woman was nowhere to be found together with the baby.

She also went with the new moth-

er's bag which had her cellphone

as well as all her child's particulars.

The baby was wrapped in a maroon or pinkish mini blanket.


She is estimated to be between 25 to 30 years.





### Grade VI pupil arrested for SODV

IN yet another case of Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence, a Grade VI pupil has been arrested for the rape of a six-year old

Charged for Contravening the Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence Act (SODVA), the pupil whose name has been deliberately withheld for ethical reasons, was arrested while attending classes on Tuesday in one of the schools in the Hhohho Region.

According to the charge sheet, the pupil (17) is charged with the crime of rape by contravening the SODVA in that upon the year 2018

to September 2019, the said accused person did wrongfully, unlawfully and with intent have sexual intercourse with a minor aged six years inside his room on numerous occasions.

Aggravating factors are that he inflicted phys-

ical and life time mental trauma to the complainant. Through his lawyer Mongi Nsibande, the pupil yesterday filed an urgent application for bail at the High Court. However the Crown represented by Ngcebo Lukhele indicated that the Crown is opposing the bail application and filed a notice of intention to oppose same. According to the pupil in his affidavit, he is a grade VI pupil who lives with his grandparents, in particular his grandfather and due to his age he has other responsibilities such as herding goats.

He submitted that on September 7, there were rumours circulating within his home area to the effect that he had allegedly raped the girl, such that some people at his parental homestead demanding answers from him, and fortunately he was not at home at the time.

He averred that on September 23 the Ebuhleni Police approached his grandfather to notify him that he (pupil) was formally charge with the offence of rape and advise that he (grandfather) brings him (pupil) to the police station.

"This rape allegation is a complete fabrication, according to the information I got from one

> of my nieces and my relative, the complainant's mother, was told by another person that she suspected me of having raped her daughter on Friday September 6. She had thought that I was with the complainant in one of the

houses at home," he submitted. He submitted that last Friday, the complainant was beaten by her mother and forced to admit that I raped her, before she was taken to a clinic for examination.

The pupil submitted that there is no evidence linking him with the alleged rape and has not been furnished with any medical report in relation with the charges preferred against him.

### Manzini Municipality owed E56m in rates

THE fiscal challenge experienced by Eswatini and the world over, has negatively impacted organisations' revenues.

The Manzini Municipal Council was not spared from this as it is owed over E56 million in rates. This was communicated to ratepayers during annual general meeting (AGM), that was held at The George Hotel yesterday.

The meeting was graced by the Mbabane City Council's Chief Executive Officer Gideon Mhlongo, Matsapha Town Clerk Lucky Sukati and the Manzini Regional Administrator Chief Gija, to mention a few. When the financial statement was presented, it was said that the Council was owed E56, 662, 447 in rates. This was an increase as compared to last year where E54, 736,958 was owed.

This trend was attributed to that some ratepayers have failed to pay presumably due to the current economic situation. Another reason that is said to have contributed to the ratepayers failing to settle their outstanding fees, was the increase in tariffs which started in the beginning of the 2018/2019 financial year. The Council's Chief Executive Officer (CEO) Lungile Dlamini, in her presentation, said there was a three per cent increase since April 1, 2018. Also, the rates debtors' trend as observed in the last five years has shown that from 2015 untill 2017, the Council was owed

between E24 million and E39 million respectively. It is said E39 665 million, E23 662 million and E24 730 million was outstanding in rates, since 2015 up until 2017

In addition, according to the report, the Council is said to have also incurred, bad debts. About E1, 914 million is said to have been written off during the 2018/19 finan-

Regarding the payment of rates, concerned citizens were reminded to utilise the available payment availed by the Council.

These include cash payment and direct deposits, debit and credit card payments, debit and stop order payments, electronic financial transfer payments and mobile money pay. In cases that a rate payer had challenges in paying his or her rates, the Council welcomed them to engage the organisation so as to arrange how they could settle the

When the rate payers were given

an opportunity to make their suggestions and/ or ask questions, one of them Trevor Simelane from Ward 5 asked that the Council to stop increasing the rates for some time, in order to allow those with outstanding fees to make means to pay.

Simelane said some ratepayers needed to be extensively engaged by the Council in order for them to remember that they had outstanding rate fees to be settled. He said some ratepayers ended up failing to pay because they opted to pay the rates yearly rather than in monthly instalments, only for them to be unable to raise the funds before the due date.

The ratepayers also suggested that the Council should consider other ways of generating income, rather a suggestion was that the Manzini city should have recreational facilities, where the public would be made to pay or even have a city hall where private functions can be held at a fee.

### Late Sikhakhane's wife wants will declared null

STORIES BY SANDILE NKAMBULE High Court

WIFE to the late businessman Alfred Sikhakhane Dlamini has run to court, where she has filed an urgent application seeking an order declaring the late businessman's last testamentary will null and void.

She is further seeking an order that the estate of the Matsapha-based businessman be distributed ab intestato (without a valid will).

Solani Florah Dlamini (born Mndzebele) one of the deceased's living spouses together with 10 of her children who are all cited as applicants in the matter have taken the executor of the deceased's estate, Manzini-based lawyer Sipho Madzinane and four of the deceased's other wives who have been cited as respondents to court as they want the deceased's will to be nullified.

The matter yesterday was brought on an urgent basis by the applicant's legal representative, Mbabane-based lawyer Thandeka Hlabangana of Hlabangana and Associates law firm.

According to the widowed Florah in her founding affidavit, the deceased's four other wives have been cited by

virtue of the fact that they have a direct deceased's children stating that the interest in the winding up of the deceased's estate, likewise, the deceased's children who are applicants in the

matter have also been cited because of having the same interest in the matter.

Meanwhile, Thembi Alloyee Cebe (born Dlamini) who has been cited as the seventh respondent in the matter, is a daughter to the deceased businessman according to Florah.

Giving a background of the matter before court, Florah submitted that her husband passed away on August 18 and was subsequently buried on August 24, 2019. She submitted that on September 3, a next of kin meeting was held at the offices of the Master of the High Court based in Manzini, whereupon the deceased's last testamentary will was read in her presence and the meeting was chaired by one Master's office official identified as a Mdluli, who introduced herself as Assistant Master of the High Court.

> The first applicant (Flora) averred that when the testamentary will was read, Mdluli indicated that anyone who had an objection should raise same within a period of seven days and that she did lodge her objection before that period lapsed, hence the present application before court.

"The present application is all about the testamentary will of the deceased, the deceased in his testamentary will contravened Section 11 and 12 of the Will's Act of 1955," Florah submitted. She informed the court that she was married to the deceased in terms of Siswati Law and Custom in February 1957 at Logoba and the said marriage took place at the deceased's parental homestead at Mhlaleni after being smeared with red ochre (libovu).

### 'Deceased wrong to give my homestead to other wife'

IN her further submissions, the applicant informed the court that the deceased (her husband) had no right to take her homestead situated at New Village and give it to any of his other wives.

This she submitted because according to the will, the deceased has given the New Village homestead to the sixth respondent Gladys Gcinaphi Dlamini (born Mbuyisa).

She submitted that in terms of the Siswati Law and Custom, one cannot take a homestead of another wife and give it to another even if she were to pass on.

"The deceased has no right to take my homestead and give it to his other wife, the sixth respondent, in terms of the Siswati Law and Custom even if I were to die, another wife cannot reside in my homestead but only my children," she submitted.

She further argued in her affidavit that the deceased cannot disown her and her homestead which is vested in her and that as stated previously, she and the deceased were given the New Village plot as compensation for the construction of the Manzini- Matsapha Highway, hence this is still her homestead.

She stated that in view of the provisions of the contravention of

the Will's Act, questionable in capacity of the testator to devolve property, he has no exclusive right over or does not own the properties and further submitted that the will cannot have provisions where certain clauses are severed, hence the will should be declared null and void and the estate distributed ab intestate.

The matter is pending before court before Judge Maseko and more papers are yet to be filed as the respondents are also expected to file their papers following the urgent application filed yesterday morning.

The deceased owned business around Matsapha and other properties which now form part of the estate.

### Wife wants Executor Madzinane removed

IN her further prayers in the urgent application, the applicant (Florah) is also seeking an order that the first respondent (lawyer Sipho Madzinane) who is the executor of the deceased's estate be removed from the position of executor.

According to the notice of motion, an order is sought that the first respondent is hereby forthwith removed as testamentary executor in the estate of the late Sikhakhane Alfred Dlamini EM 252 /19.

She is further seeking an order directing the first respondent to forfeit all benefits and or statutory reimbursement to which he is entitled to in terms of the provisions of Section 54 of the Administration of Estates Act of 1902.

In her founding affidavit, she averred that her husband, the deceased contravened sections 11 and 12 of the Wills Act in his testamentary will in that he nominated and appointed the first respondent Madzinane as executor of the estate and further appointed Madzinane's law firm, Madzinane Attorneys to duly assist him (Madzinane)

in executing his wishes as outlined in his will.

She argued that Section 11 of the Will's Act provides that 'a person who attest the execution of any will or signs in the presence and by direction of the testator, or the person is, is the spouse of such person at the time of attestation or signing of such will or any person claiming under such or his spouse shall be incapable of taking any benefit whatsoever thereafter.

Meanwhile, she added that Section 12 of the Act provides that "if any person attests the execution of any will or signs a will in the presence and by the direction of the testator under which such a person or his spouse is nominated as executor, the administrator, trustee or guardian, such nomination shall be null and void."

It was for that reason that she submitted that in essence this means that anyone who attested to the execution of the will if nominated as executor, such nomination is null and void, hence is calling for the removal of Madzinane.

She stated that Madzinane

and the law firm attested to the execution of the will of the deceased as the law firm prepared and attested the execution of the will, and has been duly appointed to assist Madzinane to execute the wishes of the deceased and further render legal services to the estate having performed the services, and will issue a statement of account.

She submitted that it is common cause that the first respondent operates and manages the second respondent alternatively that the two are one person.

"The first respondent attested to the execution of the deceased's will and as such his nomination as an executor is null and void, both the first and second respondents cannot be executors nor can they benefit from the said will," she sub-

She stressed that the contravention of the Will's Act which governs the execution of wills, specifically bars such nomination and as such the first and second respondents cannot be issued with letters of administration in view of the contravention of the Act.

### Man assaulted, stabbed by sister and nephew

A man who was assaulted by his sister and stabbed by his nephew can now rest assured that justice has been served, as the mother and son were on Thursday, convicted under the Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence (SODV) Act.

Jabu Dlamini and Sandile Sigudla pleaded guilty after they were charged with contravening the SODV Act, after they were found to have assaulted and stabbed Jabulani Dlamini, who is Jabu's brother and Sigudla's uncle.

According to their charge sheet, the mother and son committed the offence on December 26, 2018 at eNyonyane in Ezulwini.

Evidence led by Jabulani stated that on the day of the incident, Jabu assaulted him with a broom after which, Sigudla then stabbed him with a knife three times. Jabulani sustained several stab wounds due to the assault. During their sentencing before Magistrate Lenhle Zulu last Thursday, the mother son duo elected to remain silent when they were given a chance to defend their case. In its closing submissions, the prosecution stated that by electing to remain silent, the duo aligned themselves with the commission of the crime, and prayed that the court find them guilty without a reasonable

In mitigation, Jabu stated that it was not her intention to hurt her brother when she assaulted him.

"Your Worship, this incident should not have occurred in the first place. It was a mistake and I sincerely apologise to the court, and to my brother, for having assaulted him. I plead with the court to be lenient in my sentencing as I am unemployed, with five children who need to be maintained," Jabu stated.

On the other hand, Sigudla pleaded for leniency from the court as he stated that he was a very sickly man, who needed constant medical attention. Sigudla further informed the court that he was employed as a contractor, as he dropped out of school in Grade Six. After stating their mitigating factors, the court sentenced Jabu to serve 10 months in prison, with the option to pay a fine of E1 000. Sigudla was subsequently sentenced to pay a fine of E3 000 and in default of payment, serve one year.

### 'SHE WAS UNFAITHFUL EVEN BEFORE MARRIAGE

A man fully committed to his wife, was beyond heart broken, when he discovered that she had been adulterous throughout their marriage.

This was revealed by Sibusiso\*, who was granted a final decree of divorce from his wife at the Mbabane magistrate's court on Wednesday. As the plaintiff in the matter, Sibusiso was represented by attorney Vusi Thomo of Thomo and Maziya Attorneys.

While leading his evidence in his application for divorce, before she deserted her matrimonial home, Sibusiso's wife explained to him that she made a mistake by marrying him, claiming that she had been in a relationship with her lover for too long to end their relationship.

The former couple are said to have been married on May 2, 2014 at District Commissioner's offices in Nhlangano.

After the consummation of their love, the couple went on to establish their matrimonial home in Mbabane.

They are said to have lived there in marital bliss, until only seven months after they had been married, that Sibusiso discovered that his wife was having an

"My wife was a student at ECOT, where she resided during the week and would then come home on weekends. She started coming home less frequently and this was when I noticed a change in our relationship. When I confronted her about her shorter visits home, she would tell me to mind my own business," Sibusiso stated.

Sibusiso further led evidence to the effect that one day, when his wife left her phone inside the house and she left to braid her friend's hair, he decided to peruse through her phone to get to the bottom of her bizarre and distant behav-

Sibusiso claimed that, as they were of the Jehovah's Witness faith, he was obligated to report his wife's adultery. However, such intervention by the church and their families proved futile, as his wife would be seen with her lover only a week after

pledging to change her adulterous ways

"That was when she informed me that she had been in a relationship with her lover even way before we were married. She claimed to have been so in love with him, so much that she could not hear to end her affair with him," Sibusiso recalled, solemnly.

Fortunately for him, presiding Magistrate Lenhle Zulu informed Sibusiso that the court was satisfied that the evidence he led before the court constituted adultery as grounds for divorce.

#### A theft suspect was left amused after Magistrate Sifiso Vilakati revealed in court, that he used to be a smoker in his heydays.

Sanele Dlamini appeared before the court on Tuesday, where he stood accused of stealing a driller.

When Magistrate Vilakati questioned Dlamini on whether he had stolen the machinery to feed his smoking habit, Dlamini responding to the negative, saw the magistrate beckon him to examine his hands, to determine whether there were visible dagga stains on his fingers.

When the magistrate noticed a telling stain on Dlamini's fingers, he revealed

that he could never be duped by a 'closet' smoker.

"Dlamini, I used to be a smoker when I was younger so there is no way that you could ever lie to me and tell me that you do not smoke dagga.

### Result

That stain on your thumb is as a result of the 'juice' which is secreted when you have reached the remnants of the joint.

It stains your fingers and is a sign that you smoke dagga frequently. This also suggests that you stole the driller with the intention to sell it to buy dagga," the magistrate revealed.

#### Charge

According to his charge sheet, Dlamini was charged with the offence of theft, when he was found to have stolen a driller belonging to one Sibusiso Nkambule.

In his mitigation, Dlamini pleaded with the court to be lenient in his sentence when he claimed that he would change his ways and return to school, as he had dropped out when he was in Form 2.

After hearing his mitigation, the court sentenced Dlamini to serve two years in prison, with the option to pay a fine of E2 000.

Half of Dlamini's sentence was suspended for a period of a year, on condition that he was not to commit a similar offence during this time.

It would also create a platform for collaboration for drought stakeholders and scientists to work together to develop national capacity for the sustainability

of a drought monitoring and early warning system in Eswatini.

The programme would focus on building resilience to increasing frequency and

severity of droughts. NDMA Chief Executive Officer Russell Dlamini said the programme would include developing a drought monitoring and early warning

systems, as well as developing a framework that will allow a comprehensive countrywide assessment of potential climate and disaster

It would also explore the development of drought policies that focuses on risk reduction, complemented by drought mitigation or preparedness strategies and plans at various levels of government to improve coping capacity of the country and to manage drought and other related hazards and risks.

#### Workshop

Dlamini said after the workshop, there should be an inter-linkage amongst relevant sectors and stakeholders for drought early warning, preparedness and long term resilience building.

He added that the workshop would enhance national data networks and information sharing and delivery systems for improves drought preparedness and drought understanding.

Dlamini said Eswatini was prone to recurring droughts that negatively affects the national food security, water availability and power generating leading to significant human suffering and loss of livelihoods.

He said the cleanliness and tidiness of the pupils impressed him the most, adding that he found the country's flag hoisted within the premises.



### Maphungwane duo arrested for robbery

TWO men from Maphungwane have been arrested for robbery, house breaking and theft charges, which they are alleged to have committed around the

Kwanele Ndzimandze (23) and Richardo Groening (28) appeared before Acting Magistrate Cebsile Ngwenya after they were charged with three counts. Of note was that the accused persons have become regulars in the same court, as they usually appear for similar cases of robbery and house breaking. In the matter before court, the accused persons were co-charged with robbery on the first count.

They were alleged to have wrongfully and unlawfully robbed one Nomkhosi Myeni of items valued at E2 800. The accused persons were said to have hit the complainant with a crowbar on the head, before threatening to stab her with a knife if she resisted to their demand. Fearing for her life, the

### Items worth E40 000 stolen

ITEMS worth over E40 000 have been stolen at an Asian shop located at the newly-completed Lubombo Mall

The Asian businessman has been left making speculations after his newly established shop became the first one to be broken into at the mall which normally has three night-watchman on guard.

The shop was broken into at around 0057 hours on Wednesday.

Three men wearing balaclavas were seen through the closed-circuit television (CCTV) as they entered the mall. One of the men remained at the main entrance point, while the other two proceeded to the shop which is situated adjacent Boxer Stores.

Upon reaching the door, the two men off-loaded a brown bag which was carried by one of them.

A crowbar and another unidentified working tool were retrieved from the bag.

As seen on the CCTV, the two men started working on the door as they tried to force it open.

While still at it, the third man was seen coming from the main entrance, presumably to check if the door had already been open.

A few seconds later, the man returned

to the main entrance to make sure that there was anyone coming to disturb their intended mission.

The door was eventually forced open, after the men used different working tools to open it. All three men are seen entering the door and starting to loot various items. The items which were mainly electronics, were loaded into a large black bag. The men proceeded and opened all available drawers, presumably looking for money. Interestingly, the men seemed to be in no hurry as they took their time walking around the shop, choosing the best

items and loading them into the bag.

They eventually left the shop after spending over an hour inside.

Speaking during an interview, the owner of the shop, Zahoor Ahmed said the break-in appeared to be a well-planned crime, which had been specifically meant to kick him out of business.

Ahmed disclosed that before this break-in, another shop which he operates within the town centre was also broken into about three weeks ago. "I strongly believe that I am being targeted by some people out there, who are also businesspeople," he said.

Furthermore, Ahmed said he was also left with questions on how the security guards were unable to notice anything while the thugs remained inside the shop for over an hour.

According to Ahmed, the break-in was eventually noticed by a newspaper driver who had come to make a delivery at around 4.30am.

The driver is said to have called one

of the managers of the mall to report that one of the shops had its door open. Meanwhile, Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Superintendant Phindile Vilakati confirmed the break-in. Vilakati said police were investigating the matter, and there have been no arrests as yet.

# TOURISM AND JOBS: A BETTER FUTURE FOR ALL'

World Tourism Day 2019- Official message by Minister for Tourism and Environmental Affairs

### **Minister Moses Vilakati**

orld Tourism Day is commemorated each year on September 27, with celebrations led by UNWTO.

Its purpose is to foster awareness among the global community of tourism's social, cultural, political and economic value and the contribution of the sector can make in reaching the Sustainable Development Goals. In 2019, in line with UNWTO's overarching focus on skills, education and jobs throughout the year, World Tourism Day will be a celebration on the theme "Tourism and Jobs: A better future for all'.

Tourism's role in job creation is often undervalued. This is despite the fact that tourism generates 10 per cent of world jobs and is included in Sustainable Development Goal 8 for its potential to create decent work.

New policies are needed to maximise tourism's potential to create more and better jobs, especially for women and youth. New policies are also needed to reflect and incorporate ongoing advances in technology.

Policies and actions should be geared towards addressing the current mismatch between tourism skills that are taught and those that tourism employers need.

This requires a holistic approach to the future of work in tourism, with heightened cooperation between all actors, including the public and private sectors.

According to the International Labour Organisation (ILO), global unemployment remains high, reaching more than 190 million in 2018. All sectors and countries, therefore, need to create the conditions for more and better jobs. Embracing new technology can play a key role in achieving this goal.

Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises are now the major job creators in tourism. ILO research





shows that around half of tourism employees work in enterprises of fewer than 10 people, while around three-quarters work in enterprises of fewer than 50 people.

Tourism MSMEs are also an important source of innovation and economic diversification, helping to shape socioeconomic development in destination countries worldwide.

However, access to finance, prohibiting business regulations and inadequate skills are major constraints faced by all MSMEs including those operating in the tourism sector.

The tourism sector employs more women and young people than most other sectors. Women play a leading role in tourism entrepreneurship. UNWTO research shows that the global rate of women entrepreneurs in 'hotels and restaurants' (36 per cent) is comparatively higher than in all sectors combined (22 per cent).

Furthermore, tourism creates jobs in rural and remote areas, not only directly but also indirectly through the preservation and restoration of traditional activities.

Often it is one of the few viable economic sectors in these areas.

By providing opportunities for women, youth and rural communities in a variety of roles, tourism contributes to several SDG target areas surrounding empowerment of vulnerable groups and more equal and inclusive societies. More inclusion strengthens tourism's power to unite people across cultures in a celebration of diversity, increasing overall social resilience.

### THE FUTURE OF WORK

Creating and ensuring equitable employment is essential to increasing social inclusion, peace and security. The potential of every economic sector to provide decent jobs, should be utilised to its fullest.

The emergence of new technologies has led to the development of new forms of work that are rapidly changing production processes worldwide. This both provides opportunities for, and puts pressure, on existing employment, welfare and education agendas. Making the new wave of technological breakthroughs, as inclusive as possible will require considerable investment in training and skills for life and work. Everyone should have a chance to develop their full potential so as to benefit from the new technological era.

To do this we need to examine the impact of technological change on socioe-conomic growth, jobs and inequality. We also need to provide tools and skills to those who are looking for a job and to those whose jobs are at risk of automation.

On the occasion of its centenary in 2019, the ILO released 'Work for a Brighter Future: Report of the Global Commission on the future of Work'. This landmark report takes note of the forces transforming the world, technology, climate change, demography, globalisation, to call for a human-centered agenda for the future of work.

By placing people and the work they do at the centre of economic and social policy and business practice, the path towards growth, equity and sustainability consists of three pillars of action:


- Increase investment in people's capabilities
- Increase investment in the institutions of work
- Increase investment in decent and sustainable work

Tourism is a leading people-to-people sector, with growth rates outpacing world economic growth and international trade. It is one of the main global export categories and with such a high impact on human workforce, it serves as a natural ally of ILO's human-centered agenda for the future of work.

### TOURISM AND JOBS

Tourism is a major source of employment, because of its labour-intensive nature and the significant multiplier effect on employment in related sectors. It is estimated that one job in the core tourism sector creates about one-and-a-half additional or indirect jobs in the tourism-related economy. Overall tourism accounts for one in ten jobs worldwide.

The ILO estimates that 'accommodation and restaurants', together with 'private sector services', will create jobs at the fastest rate among all sectors in the economy over the next five years. Tourism has proven to be a resilient economic activity. In each of the seven years following the global economic crisis of 2010, the number of worldwide international tourist arrivals grew at



four per cent or above.

Tourism is a contributor to the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) as a target in Goals 8, 12 and 14. The sector's contribution to job creation is specifically recognised in Goal 8, target 8.9. This state: "By 2030, devise and implement policies to promote sustainable tourism that creates jobs and promotes local culture and products".

Tourism's voice at the UN level is mirrored in other global development and policy fora.

The 26th Ibero-American Summit of Heads of State and Government concluded in November 2018 with a highlevel political declaration on sustainable development in which tourism plays a key supporting role. The commitment includes UNWTO as the designated global partner and marks the first time the tourism sector has been featured in a top-level multilateral cooperation agenda. More recently, the G20 Osaka Leaders' Declaration from June 2019 singles out tourism's contribution to global economic growth and inclusive and sustainable development, "Tourism accounts for a significant share of the world's GDP and is expected to continue to be an important driver of global economic growth. We will work to maximise the sector's contribution to the creation of quality jobs and entrepreneurship, especially for women and youth in the creative industry, economic resilience and recovery; the preservation of natural resources through sustainable tourism planning and management and the achievement of inclusive and sustainable develop-

However, despite representing 10 per cent of the world's jobs, tourism's role in employment generation and entrepreneurship is often underestimated and undervalued in policy formulation and implementation.

A mismatch between available qualifications and workplace reality is one of the major factors impacting tourism employment and talent development. The gap between education and skills/knowledge needs, and the resulting shortages of labour with 'future-proof skills, continues to dent economies and harm job creation prospects. Moreover, tourism suffers from important challenges related to attracting and retaining talent and the improvement of working conditions.

### TOURISM JOBS AND THE DIGITAL REVOLUTION

Globalisation, technological progress and demographic change are trends that, together, have redefined the tourism sector and how it functions. At the heart of our now hyper-connected, hyper-informed world is a digital-led revolution in markets, as well as in the demand for skills and the characteristics of tourism jobs. Recent years have seen the emergence of digital breakthroughs, including new platform tourism services (the so-called sharing or collaborative economy), big data and geo-localisation.

MSMEs key to decent work in tourism Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises are now the major job creators in tourism. ILO research shows that around half of tourism employees work in enterprises of fewer than 10 people, while around three-quarters work in enterprises of fewer than 50 people. Tourism MSMEs are also an important source of innovation and economic diversification, helping to shape socioeconomic development in destination countries worldwide.

However, access to finance, prohibiting business regulations and inadequate skills are major constraints faced by all MSMEs including those operating in the tourism sector.

The main challenge related to MSMEs, then, is to create an enabling environment that at once improves their economic prospects, overcomes barriers to decent jobs, and ensures that MSMEs' economic activities are environmentally sustainable.

Women play a leading role in tourism entrepreneurship. UNWTO research shows that the global rate of women entrepreneurs in 'hotels and restaurants' (36 per cent) is comparatively higher than in all sectors combined (22 per cent).

Furthermore, tourism creates jobs in rural and remote areas, not only directly but also indirectly through the preservation and restoration of traditional activities. Often it is one of the few viable economic sectors in these areas.

The explicit mention of tourism in Goal 8, target 8.9 of the SDGs recognises its transformational potential on livelihoods and prosperity in rural communities, both through providing access to decent employment and through reviving traditional local industries.

By providing opportunities for women, youth and rural communities in a variety of roles, tourism contributes to several SDG target areas surrounding empowerment of vulnerable groups and more equal and inclusive societies. More inclusion strengthens tourism's power to unite people across cultures in a celebration of diversity, increasing overall social resilience.

Despite these benefits tourism provides, it must also address serious challenges surrounding employment for all of these groups globally: One is a large gender pay gap. In tourism, women are on average paid 20-25 per cent less than male workers for comparable skills. Women are often over-represented in non-standard forms of employment.

Women also suffer segregation in terms of access to education and training. Low-skilled women often find themselves in the most vulnerable jobs, at risk of poor working conditions, inequality of opportunity and treatment, violence, exploitation, stress and sexual harassment.

Temporary and part-time jobs are particularly common among women, young people, and the less-skilled who are employed in tourism. They can often lead to decent work deficits, including inadequate social security coverage, low wages and income inequality, and poor working conditions.

The tourism sector's variable demand cycle, with irregular working hours and unpredictable shifts, poses additional challenges for those (of any gender) trying to reconcile work and family responsibilities. At the same time, however, this flexibility may also provide opportunities to individuals wanting to combine a job in tourism

with another occupation.

### A POLICY FRAMEWORK FOR DECENT TOURISM JOBS FOR ALL

New policies are needed to maximise the potential of the tourism sector to create more and better jobs, while reducing the risk associated with an increasing skills mismatch.

There is a longstanding tradition of the tourism sector working in isolation from other key economic sectors. The way forward is for a more holistic approach to the future of work in tourism, with clear links to other sectors that are important for economic development.

The major ongoing changes and challenges around tourism employment require a new approach to skills development and education, policies for innovation and job creation.

#### POLICIES SHOULD:

• Encourage the progress of innovation in tourism that fosters job creation and entrepreneurship, particularly among women, youth and rural communities, through;

- Establishing tourism innovation centres, incentives and programmes to connect start-ups, leading companies, investors and governments;
- Developing research on the changing demand for skills due to the digital revolution;
- Creating initiatives that promote innovation and technological skills development in tourism;
- Bring together educational institutions, the private sector, governments and technology partners to review educational programmes and help create the skill sets needed for future work opportunities, including soft skills;
- Further bridge the gap between available qualifications and workplace skills needed, by supporting opportunities for appropriate industry experience, such as internships or scholarships, along with specialised education and training;
- Include technology stakeholders in national tourism policy coordination structures and mechanisms, in order to ensure an holistic approach that accounts for innovation and job creation;
- Include tourism as a key sector in both national and multilateral agenda for employment, education and skills creation, and overall economic development, highlighting tourism's capacity to deliver on the objectives of creating more and better job.







As you approach the end of the trail, there is a castle kopje range 30 minutes from the Resort is by far the richest in biodiversity. of the igneous intrusions. The Castle Kopjes are splendid for rock climbers.

#### **ADVENTURE CAVING**

There are a series of caves found around the resort, however



40 minutes from the venue, are caves that have traces of human habitation such as rock barricades that were constructed to shield the inhabitants from the wind and wild animals. These caves are under very big rocks and there is an ecstatic thrill when entering into these caves.

#### ADVENTURE NATURE WALK

The micro climate of Sibebe is cool and wet due to its altitude. During overcast and rainy days, wetness of the drifting clouds can be felt on the face as you move around.

Within the castle kopjes 30 minutes away from the resort, are dense forests of native and rare species. While on this jungle walk in the pristine forest the path has to be negotiated with the dense

undergrowth and climbers.

### CULTURE WALKS

Sibebe Resort is flanked by two rural communities and visitors are allowed to take walks in the villages, visit some homes and experience first-hand the Swazi way of life. Depending on the season, visitors will be given the opportunity to participate in the homestead activities such as ploughing, winnowing, weeding, fetching water and other rural activities.

### TRADITIONAL GAMES AND DANCES

You will be given the opportunity to experience traditional lobola negotiation simulation, folklores and storytelling, traditional craft exhibitions and lessons. ### BIRD TRAILS

### TREE PLANTING

#### ROCK ART SITE

Around the resort we have one rock art site which is about 25 minutes away from the Resort. This is by far the most valuable piece of archaeological evidence of the existence of Bushmen around the area.

#### HIDEOUT CAVES

There are a series of hideout caves around the Sibebe area and one of these is about 25 minutes away from the resort. The opening of this cave is not very pronounced and it can be mistaken for a single large rock. The entrance is about 1.2 metres and you will have to crawl in and as you enter the space and it opens up to a height of about 2 metres covering over 300 square meters.

### SIBEBE ROCK SHELTER

This is a verandah shaped rock feature situated 30 minutes away from the resort. It is one of the sites where archaeological excavations were made and where stone age tools were found. People in the nearby homes respect this area and it is used as a ritual site for both traditional and religious ceremonies.

### QUAD BIKE SAFARI

The ride is on the undulating to rugged and can be done by anyone who is comfortable on the quad bikes which are provided for at the resort.





### PRELIMINARY PROVISIONS

#### Short title and Commencement

1.(1) This Act may be cited as the Consumer Credit Act, 2016.

(2) This Act shall come into force on a date to be appointed by the Minister by notice in the Gazette.

#### Interpretation

2. In this Act, unless the context otherwise

'advertisement' means any written, illustrated, visual or other descriptive material, communication, representation or reference by means of which a person seeks to bring to the attention of all or part of the public the nature, properties, advantages or uses of, conditions on, or prices of-

(a) goods to be purchased or otherwise acquired;

(b) any available service; or

(c) credit to be granted;

'affordable housing' includes any housing provided in terms of a housing scheme determined by the Government, low income earner housing assistance measure or any other measure or arrangement designed to-

(a) facilitate access to credit for housing or housing delivery in the rural

community; or

(b) rehabilitate or upgrade existing housing stock, or related local authority infrastructure and services, for the benefit of low income earners and rural communities, low density populations and communities, or other persons who cannot independently provide for their own housing needs;

'agreement' includes an arrangement or understanding between or among two or more parties, which purports to establish a relationship in law between those parties;

" annual percentage rate" means the annual cost of credit prescribed as an annual rate in terms of section 39;"

'arm's length' means a transaction where each party to the transaction preserves its independent ability to bargain and the parties have acted severally and independently in forming their bargain;

'Authority' means Financial Services Regulatory Authority established under section 3 of the Financial Services Regulatory Authority Act, No. 2 of 2010;

'collection costs' means an amount that may be charged by a credit provider in respect of enforcement of monetary obligations of a consumer under a credit agreement, but does not include a default administration charge;

'company or body corporate' includes a partnership or association but does not include luholiswane or group savings scheme:

company or body corporate related to another company or body corporate' means-

(a) one of them has direct or indirect control over the whole or part of the business of the other: or

(b) a person has direct or indirect control over both of them;

'confidential information' means personal information that belongs to a person and is not generally available to or known by others;

'consumer', in respect of a credit agreement to which this Act applies, means-

(a) the party to whom goods or services are sold or otherwise acquired

under a discount transaction or hire purchase agreement;

(b) the party to whom money is paid, or credit granted, under a pawn transaction;

(c) the party to whom credit is granted under a credit facility;

(d) the mortgagor under a mortgage agree-

(e) the borrower under a secured or unsecured

(f) the guarantor under a credit guarantee; or (g) the party to whom or at whose direction money is advanced or credit granted under any other credit agreement;

"consumer credit information" means information concerning-

(a) the credit history of a person, including applications for credit, credit agreement to which the person is or has been a party, pattern of payment or default under that credit agreement, debt re-arrangement in terms of this Act, incidence of enforcement actions with respect to that credit agreement, the circumstances of termination of that credit agreement, and related matters;

the financial history of a person, including the past and current income, assets and debts of the person, and other matters within the scope of the financial means, prospects and obligations of that person, as defined in section 81(1), and related matters;

(c) the education, employment, career, professional or business history, including the circumstances of termination of any employment, career, professional or business relationship, and related matters of a person; or

(d) the identity, including the name, date of birth, identity number, marital status and family relationships, past and current addresses and other contact details, and related matters of a

'continuous service' means the supply for consideration of a utility or service, other than credit or access to credit, or the supply of such a utility or service combined with the supply of any goods that are essential for the utilisation of that utility or service by the consumer, with the intent that, so long as the agreement to supply that utility or service remains in force, the supplier will make the service continuously available to be used, accessed or drawn upon-

(a) from time to time as determined by the consumer; and

(b) with any frequency or in any amount as determined, accessed,

required, demanded or drawn upon by the consumer, subject only to any total use or cost limits set out in the agreement;

'court' means the Magistrate's Court established in terms of the Magistrate Court Act, 1938 or a Small Claims Court established in terms of the Small Claims Court Act, 2012;

'credit', when used as a noun, means-

(a) a deferral of payment of money owed to a person, or a promise to defer such a payment:

(b) a promise to advance or pay money to or at the direction of another person;

'credit agent' means a person licensed as a credit agent under section 71;

'credit agreement' means an agreement defined in section 20 of this Act;

'credit bureau' means a person licensed as a credit bureau under section 66;

CREDIT ACT 2016 'credit facility' means an agreement by a credit provider and a consumer pursuant to a credit agreement between the credit provider and the consumer to supply goods or services or grant credit to the consumer at any time the credit is needed by the consumer and either to-

CONSUMER

(i) defer the obligations of the consumer to pay any part of the cost of goods or services, or to repay to the credit provider any part of an amount granted to the consumer; or

(ii) bill the consumer periodically for any part of the cost of goods or services, or any part of an amount granted to the consumer; and

(b) charge a fee or interest payable to the credit provider in respect of the deferred amount or billed amount not paid within the time provided in the agreement.

'credit guarantee' means an agreement in terms of that agreement, a person undertakes or promises to satisfy upon demand any obligation of another consumer in terms of a credit facility or a credit transaction;

'credit insurance' means an agreement between an insurer, on one hand, and a credit provider or a consumer or both, on the other hand, in terms of which the insurer agrees to pay a benefit upon the occurrence of a specified contingency, primarily for the purpose of satisfying all or part of the liability of a consumer to the credit provider under a credit agreement as at the time that the specified contingency occurs, and includes-

(a) a credit life insurance agreement;

(b) an agreement covering loss of or damage to property; or

(c) an agreement covering-

(i) loss or theft of an access card, personal information number or similar device; or

(ii) any loss or theft of credit consequential to a loss or theft contemplated in subparagraph (i); "credit institution" means a credit provider licensed to provide credit in terms of this Act;

(c) assisting a consumer to achieve a re-arrange ment of one or more obligation under a credit agreement; and

(d) negotiating on behalf of a consumer with a credit provider on re-payment terms under a credit agreement;

SBC Ltd revenue up by 12% increases to E142m

THE SBC Limited Financial services retail group Revenue as of June 30 2019, grew by 12 per cent, increasing to E142 million from E127 million collected in June 2018.

SBC Limited is an investment holding company offering retail financial services through its subsidiaries.

According to the SBC Limited and Subsidiaries Group Results for the six months released by the Eswatini Stock Exchange (ESE), the growth was driven by the equivalent growth in the loan book, but a 0.5 per cent decline in yield in the Eswatini regions was offset by an increased contribution from the higher yielding Lesotho loan book which now comprises 29 per cent of the overall loan book compared to 23 per cent in the prior equivalent period.

The Group's financial review show that SBC increased its level of disbursements to E215m from E158 recorded in 2018.


Disbursements, net of rollovers, in Eswatini amounted to E127m from E96m in 2018, a 32 per cent increase over the equivalent prior period ("prior period") mainly due to the introduction of the high net worth individual product and the extension of the maximum loan term to 72 months.

The result was that the average gross loan book grew by 12 per cent over the average gross loan book in the equivalent period to 30 June 2018, in the prior year.

On the other hand, the review highlighted that, in Eswatini, operating costs were up only one per cent. This was in part due to a strong collections performance over the period which improved the book ageing and allowed provisioning levels to reduce. Other costs were contained within inflationary levels.

"Finance costs at E77m from E67m increased by 15 per cent over the prior period and predominately arose from interest on notes issued under the listed medium term note program and other promissory notes issued by subsidiary, Select Limited

"If one carves out the interest costs relating to the housing project, finance costs reduce to E71m, an increase of 9 per cent over the prior year which can be attributed to the aggregated impact of the loan book growth, a decline in the average cash



and related party balances and the interest rate environment which has been relatively steady," reads part of the statement.

It also showed that profit before tax declined by three per cent over the prior period to E27m from E28m in the previous year.

The overall result is that earning per share for the six months to June 2019 was unchanged from the prior year equivalent period at 20 cents. The statement of changes in equity included a E207k adjustment in the current year relating to the adoption of IFRS16: Leases.

that the seed production to the end product, is all done here in Eswatini is amazing.

Our soil is not suitable for a lot of crops as it is quite acidic and requires manure and other stabilising elements, but it turns out it is very good for potato farming as none of those elements are needed the most to purify the soil, hence when the next farming season comes I will ensure to plant potato

seeds. I am very sure that potato imports are costly to government, so it would help a great deal if we farmers produce them in the country as they will also have value and also generate income for us internally to an extent that we could end up exporting the potatoes.'

2. Nora Mhlanga (63) Maize and Rice farmer from Emvembili

"I have recently just begun the pota-

to farming, however, I am facing a lot of challenges in terms of farming ware. Government has provided us with land but my major challenge is the availability of tractors to help assist with the farming.

Today I have learnt a lot about potatoes and the process that is undergone to produce the best seeds for us as Emaswati, meaning that it will be very convenient for us as farmers to pur-

chase these seeds without the hassle of travelling longer distances, compared to when we have to travel way past the borders.

We are very grateful to Taiwan and the ministry for such an initiative.

3. Geinaphi Malinga (36) Potato Farmer at Ngwempisi

"We have recently started farming potatoes and we are a group of five. We began in March with the assistance of an extension officer, however one of us retired and there was only four of us left in the scheme.

This project is very helpful to us farmers as everyone knows that potatoes are more like a stable food in the country now.

The Republic Of China in Taiwan and the ministry of agriculture helped us a lot by providing us with information and farming equipment like trucks until harvesting time.

Today's filed tour has encouraged us to work hard and now we know that we are on the correct path to improve ourselves and the country's economy. One of the major challenges that we faced so far was that our farm manager resided far which inconvenienced a lot of things and we hope it Will be sorted.

As much as Taiwan is putting tools down in the project we are grateful for bringing it to the country and we hope that the ministry will continue assisting us as farmers".



### SAA pilots threaten first-ever strike

JOHANNESBURG - The South African Airways Pilots' Association says that a majority of its members are in favour of going on strike to force change within the struggling national flag carrier.

The association yesterday shared the results of internal survey of its members, which it said was carried out by an independent service provider.

Four out of five pilots (516 out of a total of 635) responded to the survey. Of these 90 per cent said they were in favour of 'engaging in protected industrial action to enforce a higher standard within SAA,' said SAAPA.

"It needs to be understood that the decision to embark on industrial action is not one that the pilots of SAA will take lightly. Indeed, if such a strike is embarked upon, it would be for the first time in SAA's 80-year history," Saapa said in a statement.

'The pilots of SAA and the leadership of SAAPA cannot allow SAA to continue as if it is business as usual. Our numerous engagements with the Company have not yielded outcomes that give us confidence in the future of the airline."

### **OMNIA SHARES DOWN** DESPITE RIGHTS OFFER

JOHANNESBURG - The share price of Omnia Holdings slid six per cent despite it announcing it had raised R2 billion via a rights offer, which would be used to repay its debt.

The share price dipped to a low of R25.07 at 11.45am yesterday. The heavily indebted JSE-listed diversified chemicals group said it had completed the rights offer of 100million new ordinary Omnia shares at a subscription price of R20 per rights offer share.

The rights offer was fully underwritten by a number of asset management companies whose clients were shareholders of Omnia, including Allan Gray, Coronation, Foord. Kagiso, Old Mutual and Prudential.

Omnia in June secured a R6.8bn bridge-loan, while net interest-bearing borrowings was at R4.4bn at the end of March. Debt ballooned

after the the group last year acquired international bio-pesticide, nutrients and soil conditioner manufacturer Oro Agri for US\$100million (R1.49bn). In addition, R695m was spent to construct a new nitro-phosphate plant.

The company said that the remainder of the bridge debt facility not settled via the rights offer proceeds, and which was secured through Omnia's main debt lenders, was expected to be refinanced into a debt package.

Seelan Gobalsamy, the Chief Executive of Omnia, said: "We have reached a major milestone on our way to implement the turnaround plan by stabilising Omnia's financial position. We will now continue to focus on addressing the businesses' performance and lead Omnia on its next growth phase."

KWA-ZULU-NATAL -Former services experts who, among others, KwaZulu-Natal police spokesperson Vincent Mdunge, who was jailed over a fake Matric certificate, has been granted parole, the Department of Correctional Services said on Wednesday.

"Mr Mdunge participated in relevant correctional programmes and was further assessed by our special include social workers and psychologists in order to determine his suitability for parole placement," said department spokesperson Singabakho

"The parolee will complete the remainder of the sentence in the system of community corrections, and must comply with a specific set of conditions.

He will also be subjected to supervision until the sentence expires." Mdunge's parole was approved by the correctional supervision and parole boards with effect from August 20, which means he spent two of his fiveyear sentence in jail.

As a first-time offender, he was considered to have a 'positive support system' and was placed on parole in line with Section 73 of the Correctional Services Act.

This law determines the minimum periods of sentence that must be served before consideration may be given to possible placement. "Offenders placed on parole are supervised throughout their parole period," Nxumalo

Mdunge will have to continue department programmes while on parole.

He was convicted in November 2014 of fraud and forgery for using a fake matric certificate to get his job, and to advance his career through studies at Unisa.

Mdunge was sentenced in May 2015 to five years in jail but after losing appeals in both the High Court and Supreme Court of Appeal he only went to jail in August 2017.

### Enough evidence for 45 matters against Motsoeneng

JOHANNESBURG -The Special Investigating Unit (SIU) has found sufficient evidence of financial irregularities at the SABC to initiate or join the broadcaster in civil litigation against its former chief operating officer, Hlaudi Motsoeneng.

In a briefing to the Standing Committee on Public Accounts (SCOPA), the SIU cited the awarding of a success fee to Motsoeneng, as well as appointments and salary increases awarded by him. It has also found evidence that indicated irregularities in the awarding of contracts to eight suppliers.

The SIU said the investigation had produced evidence adequate for it to initiate or join civil litigation instituted in the name of the SIU and the SABC in 10 High Court matters, to the value of just over R560 million.

"Court-ready evidence had been gathered and compiled in respect of 45 matters" according to a summary report of the meeting.

"This consisted of civil litigation that involved 10 matters, in some of which the SIU had made applications to join existing actions and applications, and the provision of evidence to the SABC to assist in defending one

civil matter. To date there had been 11 criminal referrals and 24 disciplinary referrals.

"The SIU had initiated interventions such as a special tribunal, a memorandum of agreement (with the National Prosecuting Authority (NPA), and a regular follow-up and update on referred disciplinary actions that expedited progress."

The search for the woman started late on Sunday, but the weather deteriorated on Sunday night and remained misty and rainy until Tuesday afternoon, said Raubenheimer.

The woman had been camping in the valley below Gray's Pass with two of her friends over the weekend. "On Sunday morning, they set out to climb Gray's Pass and then return

to camp. Two of the women did not go very far and turned to wait for their friend who decided to carry on to the summit of the pass," said Raubenheimer.

When she did not return, her friends sounded the alarm.

According to Raubenheimer, the woman had been spotted by another group of climbers as she was making her way down, but she never returned to her friends or camp site. KZN wildlife rangers, the SA Police Services (SAPS) and K9 Unit were all part of the search and rescue operation.

The weather only cleared on Tuesday afternoon, which enabled helicopters to join the search, and the breakthrough was made as she was spotted "in a deep, narrow gully and appeared to have fallen about 25m".



"This would end this thing (rape),"



He also accused Malema of grandstanding. "In that regard, the party finds it reprehensible for Julius Malema to use such a solemn, sombre occasion to spew political propaganda and to score cheap political mileage," Khaya-Moyo

The war veterans' wing of Zanu-PF, which played an integral part in pushing Mugabe out of power in November 2017, accused Malema of being used by elements of G40, a grouping of relatively young politicians that were aligned to Mugabe on his last days in office. ### Bouteflika's brother sentenced to 15 years

ALGIERS - An Algerian military court has sentenced the brother of former president Abdelaziz Bouteflika and three co-defendants to 15 years in prison, the state APS news agency reported on Wednesday.

Said Bouteflika, widely seen as the real power behind the presidency after his brother suffered a debilitating stroke in 2013, went on trial on Monday alongside two former intelligence chiefs and

a political party head. Their convictions are the most prominent so far in a string of prosecutions of prominent politicians and businessmen over alleged graft launched since Bouteflika was pushed out in April after two decades in power.

All four defendants were convicted of 'undermining the authority of the army' and 'conspiring' against the state in order to bring about regime change, in the run-up to the ageing president's res-

ignation in the face of mass protests earlier this year.

Prosecutors at the military court in Blida, south of Algiers, had asked for the maximum sentence of 20 years against all the defendants, defence lawyer Miloud Ibrahimi said. Former defence minister Khaled Nezzar has said that as protests mounted against the veteran leader, Said Bouteflika met with the other defendants to discuss declaring a state of emergency and firing army Chief General Ahmed Gaid Salah. ### 43 missing students still haunt Mexico on 5th anniversary

SOUTHERN MEXICO - Five years ago on Thursday, 43 students in southern Mexico who were on their way to a protest were detained by corrupt police who handed them over to drugcartel hitmen.

Then they disappeared without a trace. Halfa decade later, Mexico is still haunted by 'the 43', a case that drew international condemnation and stained the government of ex-president Enrique Pena Nieto. The investigation has been marred by allegations of official incompetence or even corruption. Misconduct especially the use of torture to extract supposed confessions - has resulted in the release of 77 detainees, including the main suspect earlier this month.

New President Andres Manuel Lopez Obrador has promised to bring the case to justice, launching a truth commission. The new prosecutor general has meanwhile announced plans to reinvestigate 'almost from scratch'.

But it is uncertain whether the world will ever know what happened to the young men from the teacher training institute in the rural village of Ayotzinapa, in the violent state of Guerrero.

"I don't think (a new investigation) will achieve a radically different result from the original," said Alejandro Hope, a security expert and former Mexican intelligence officer. "There are two facts that don't seem to be in doubt: The students were kidnapped by police and

handed over to the Guerreros Unidos cartel." What happened after that, he said, might remain a mystery forever. The students attended a college with a history of radical protest. They had a habit, among other rowdy behaviour, of commandeering buses to drive themselves to protests. Dozens of them did that on the night of September 26, 2014. traveling to the nearby city of Iguala and hijacking five buses for a march in Mexico

Democrats defy impeachment risks

NEW YORK - Democrats are embracing an impeachment investigation that could jeopardise their House majority and alienate the very sub-urban voters who have warmed to the party in recent elections and will be vital to defeat President Donald Trump next fall.

But a growing consensus is emerging among anxious Democrats: The risks are worth it.

> Democrats were emboldened by Wednesday's release of a rough transcript of Trump's July call with Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskiy, which confirmed that the Republican president repeatedly asked a foreign power to investigate his leading Democratic political rival, Joe Biden.

> > "The guy has got to be stopped," said Democratic former Virginia Governor.

Terry McAuliffe, who had previously urged Democrats to move cautiously on impeachment because the Republican-led Senate would almost certainly reject articles of impeachment.

"This is a president using presidential power to invite a foreign government to come into our country and interfere with our democracy," McAuliffe continued.

'This is too much." Democrats will face tremendous political peril over the next year, howevera fact underscored by a far more cautious approach from the Democratic governors of Minnesota, Pennsylvania and Wisconsin, who declined Wednesday to endorse House Speaker Nancy Pelosi's approach. Minnesota Gov.

Tim Walz, a former congressman, called details of Trump's phone call 'deeply troubling,' but said impeachment may not be the way to go. "It may not be politically good to do because I think at this point I, like many Minnesotans, am so sick and tired of the dysfunction in D.C.," he told reporters.

Asked when he might act, Mr Johnson said: 'I will be informing (MPs) as soon as we have assessed the meaning of the court's ruling."

Speaking on ITV's Peston show last night, Mr Johnson confirmed he was undeterred by the Supreme Court's unprecedented decision.

# Jerome Garces was 'shocking' in Boks v All Blacks

TOKYO - Former Springbok centre and Sharks coach Brendan Venter has hit out at referee Jerome Garces following his performance in Saturday's clash between the All Blacks and South

New Zealand won the match 23-13 to take control of Pool B, but Garces came in for some heavy criticism at the end of the contest for his handling of the scrums and the breakdown.

It was one of several question-

able refereeing performances seen so far at the 2019 World Cup, and it prompted World Rugby to this week to publicly acknowledge that the standard of officiating had not been up to scratch so far in the competition.

Venter, in a column for New Zealand website Stuff.co.nz, did not hold back.

Venter added that it was not a wise idea for Boks coach Rassie Erasmus to have put pressure on Garces in the media during the build-up to the match, saying that it was something that he had seldom seen work in his coaching

The Boks are next in action when they take on Namibia in Toyota on Saturday.

Another Frenchman, Matthieu Reynaud, will take charge of that match. AFP



## Banned Hodge 'not trained' on tackle protocol at RWC

TOKYO - Australia wing Reece Hodge revealed he hadn't been trained on World Rugby's new protocol for policing high tackles as he was suspended at the Rugby World Cup, an official report of his disciplinary hearing revealed on Thursday.

Hodge, banned for three games for a hit that concussed Fiji's Peceli Yato, admitted he had "no effective knowledge" of the new framework, which guides referees when they are deciding how to punish high tackles, the report said.

"The player conceded that he had no effective knowledge of WR's (World Rugby) 'Decision making framework for high tackles', had not been trained on it, was not across

it because the tackles he makes are predominantly in the waist to knees area," said the detailed report of the hearing.

It added that this statement was "of some general concern" to the three-member disciplinary panel, which met on Wednesday.

Hodge became the first player cited and banned at the Rugby World Cup in Japan following the incident in Australia's 39-21 Pool D win over Fiji on Saturday.

The new high-tackle protocol has been a major talking point in the build-up to the World Cup, with many expecting a rush of red cards as referees crack down on dangerous hits.

# Ruthless Azzurri bag another bonus-point win

TOKYO -Italy made it 14 tries in two Rugby World Cup wins and nearly 100 points scored after crushing Canada 48-7 on Thursday.

Only two missed conversions blotted a one-sided contest where Italy's forwards completely dominated. The win all but ensures Italy a 2023 World Cup-qualifying third place in Pool B unless Namibia and Canada can win twice, which means having to beat either New Zealand or South Africa

Canada next face defending champion New Zealand on Wednesday and Italy take on former champion South Africa two days later.

Italy were rusty last Sunday in beating Namibia 47-22, and eager to make

Quick tries came from No 8 Braam Steyn and lock Dean Budd, the standin captain for Sergio Parisse.

Both were converted by fly-half Tommaso Allan, who added a penalty to help Italy lead 17-0 at the interval. Flanker Sebastian Negri's converted try made it 24-0 shortly after the break.



A penalty try, one try each from winger Mattia Bellini and replacement prop Federico Zani and a late effort from impressive fullback Matteo Minozzi concluded the rout.

#### Conditions

Full-back Andrew Coe got a consolation try for Canada, which lost all four group matches at the last World Cup.

In humid conditions at Fukuoka's Hakatanomori Stadium, it was not long before Steyn bulldozed over from the scrum after great work from flanker Jake Polledri.

When the sides met four years ago at the World Cup, it was Canada racing 10-0 ahead and Italy storming back to win.

But there seemed little chance of a Canada comeback. From a ruck, scrum-half Callum Braley fed Budd and he broke a weak tackle.

# Erasmus wary of Welwitschia's 'unknown factor'

JOHANNESBURG - Namibia will play their 21st Rugby World Cup game on Saturday, but it is unlikely they will register a first win against two-time champions and one of the favourites to go all the way in Japan, the Springboks, when the teams meet in a Pool B match in the City of Toyota

The men from south west Africa have lost their last 20 outings from five previous appearances at the tournament, including last week's opening Pool B match against Italy (47-22).

The Boks also came unstuck in their opener, against New Zealand (23-13), but the gulf in class between Rassie Erasmus' team and Namibia is huge.

Erasmus though, while recognising his team will be far stronger than the Namibians,

said he didn't know too much about Phil Davies' team.

"Namibia are a little bit of an unknown factor for us," said the Bok boss yesterday.

"We studied build-up to this tournament and then a 1 s o watched them against

Rassie Erasmus.

Italy, they look like a team that just wants to play and enjoy the game and have some fun.

We will have to be clinical and force our style on them." While Erasmus and some of the Boks players know many of the Namibian players who play in the South African rugby competitions, Welwitschias forwards coach Jaco Engels also knows plenty about the Boks squad.

Engels played for the Bulls for many years and also played with and against Erasmus and his assistants Matt Proudfoot and Mzwandile Stick.

MANCHESTER - Ole Gunnar Solskjaer says Manchester United's young players need to quickly learn to kill off games after Rochdale gave them a scare in the Carabao Cup.

Sergio Romero saved the day by denying Jimmy Keohane to secure a 5-3 penalty shoot-out victory, saving United from an embarrassing third-round exit to the plucky League One side.

It was a let-off for Solskjaer's men and a further reminder of the need to make their chances count, having converted just one of their 31 shots on the night.

Sir Alex Ferguson famously said that he will do everything to, 'knock Liverpool right off their f\*\*\*\*\* perch' when the Red Devils unveiled the Scotsman as their manager in 1986.

During his 26 years, he certainly guided United to the top of English football winning 13 Premier League titles taking them to 20 titles compared to Liverpool's 18.

LONDON - Shkodran Mustafi has sent a sarcastic apology to a fan on Twitter after his performances in defence for Arsenal so far this season.


The defender hasn't played in the Premier League yet, but has started in both the Europa League and the League Cup.

There was interest from Juventus on the final day, however the transfer window slammed shut before a deal was done.



# Tsitsipas retires from Zhuhai opener

ZHUHAI - Top seed Stefanos Tsitsipas had trouble breathing and quit his opening match at the Zhuhai Championships on Thursday, after calling a medical time-out before the deciding set.

The 21-year-old Greek was the strong favourite against unseeded Adrian Mannarino of France and took the first set 6-3 in southern

after that, bending over several times on court and putting his hands on his knees.

He was far from his best, as he lost the second set 7-5, and retired soon after, looking red in the face and burying his head in his hands.

## Penalty for Verstappen, Kvyat to back of Russian GP grid

RUSSIA - Max Verstappen will have a five-place grid penalty and Daniil Kvyat will start his home Russian Formula One Grand Prix, from the back of the field on Sunday, as a result of power unit changes.

Honda said Kvyat and Toro Rosso team mate Pierre Gasly, along with Red Bull's Verstappen

and Alexander Albon would be given new engines for the race in Sochi.

With a different replacement history, Kvyat is changing all pounit elements except the battery. He will start from the back of the grid," the Japanese manufacturer said on its F1 Twitter account on

The move ensures all four cars have fresher engines for Honda's home race in Japan on Oct. 13, the next round after Russia.

Verstappen, winner of two races this season, is fourth in the championship but level on points with Ferrari's Charles Leclerc.

The pair are both 96 points behind Mercedes' five times world champion Lewis Hamilton with six races remaining. Champions Mercedes have won every Russian Grand Prix since the first in 2014.

Kvyat is the only Russian driver on the starting grid.

# Puyol turns down Barca offer

BARCELONA -Former FC Barcelona captain Carles Puyol has rejected the chance of a sensational return to the LaLiga giants.

Puyol is widely regarded as one of the finest defenders of his generation and spent his entire career at the Camp Nou, amassing 682 games for the first-team over 15 seasons.

He also captained the Blaugrana for a decade and has always been tipped for a return to the club since anouncing his retirement from football in 2014.

However, the 41-year-old has now confirmed that he's rejected a chance for an iconic homecoming with the side he lifted 18 major titles with.

"In recent weeks, several news stories about my possible incorporation at FC Barcelona as a sports director have been published
