RELATIVES, HAWKERS VENT THEIR ANGER ON JOMO'S SUSPECT KILLI

• HMCS Rapid Response Unit had to swiftly whisk him away after court appearance

Bail application postponed to March 9

THERE was drama at the High Court during the appearance of one of the suspects in the murder of businessman Jomo Khumalo as relatives to the deceased and hawkers vented their anger on the suspect.

This was during the appearance of businessman Maxwell Nkambule who is accused of having a hand in the murder of Khumalo.

Nkambule appeared at the High Court for his bail application which is before Judge Sipho Nkosi.

However, the matter could not take off as it was postponed to Monday as Judge Nkosinathi Maseko who was standing in for Nkosi indicated.

Escorts

Immediately after the postponement, His Majesty's Correctional Services (HMCS) officers who were escorted by the HMCS Rapid Response Unit (RRU) cleared the way in the rather small Court E in preparation to take Nkambule back to the correctional facility.

Indeed Nkambule was escorted out with members of the RRU closely following the other officers leading Nkambule to the vehicles transporting him.

However, upon seeing he was being whisked away, the relatives, friends and hawkers who had packed the court, immediately followed suit but the HMCS escorts used the security exit point to take him to the vehicles instead of the usual main entrance.

Loved ones

It was then that the visibly angry group comprising mostly women, went down the steps and awaited Nkambule's motorcade to exit from behind the court holding cells, while shouting and castigating him for allegedly killing Khumalo.

One woman clad in an orange jacket appeared to be the most vocal as she and four other women approached the vehicle carrying Nkambule pointing fingers and shouting at him while the

RRU closely ran alongside the motorcade before it eventually exited the main gate of the High Court. Of note was that some of the women were clad in red golf T-shirts inscribed 'Mahle Emantungwa' and vowed that they will attend the bail application even next week.

Anger

During their first remand appearance at the Manzini Magistrate's Court in December last year, Nkambule and his co-accused Senzo Sithole were saved from what could have been a worse situation as hawkers who had crammed the court bayed for their blood.

Since his appearance for the bail application, Nkambule's security detail has been beefed up. Nkambule is the man who together with Sithole stand accused of killing Khumalo in December.

Nkambule has filed an urgent application for bail. The state is opposing his application and one of the reasons cited in its opposing papers is that of public anger as some people are baying for his

Pitoli to foot Victor's E500 000 burial bill

DECEASED former Swaziland National Sports Council (SNSC) CEO Victor Shabangu's father will foot the over E500 000 mortuary bill.

This was confirmed by Pitoli Shabangu, who is also Moneni Chiefdom's umgijimi, when asked about the way forward now that the court has issued an order in his favour.

This follows that the Supreme Court directed that the late Victor's body be laid to rest at Moneni within two weeks on Tuesday.

The ex-SNSC, now Sport and Recreation Council chief executive officer's body has been at Dups Funeral Home's mortuary for 19 months. Victor collapsed and died in June 2018 after complaining of chest pains. He succumbed to death in full view of the public as he was at a garage in Manzini where he was getting his car tyre fixed.

His initial burial arrangements by the Shabangu family of Moneni were thwarted by a dispute between his parents who fought over his body. The funeral was stopped after Victor's mother took Pitoli to court where she was seeking an order interdicting him from burying the deceased at Moneni. The deceased's mother, Joyce Sibandze, wanted Victor's body to be buried at Ngculwini.

Her reason for this was that the expectation of the community, fairness, reasonable and the dictates of Swazi Law and Custom stipulated that once a man had built his own homestead, he should be buried there.

Since Victor had khontaed and built his homestead at Ngculwini under Chief Mgebiseni in the year 2005, Sibandze felt it was important that he be buried there.

For wanting to bury him at Moneni, the mother felt that Pitoli was failing to honour his late son's wishes. So she sought the court's intervention. After the court's ruling, Pitoli said he was elated that the truth on which the court based its judgment finally prevailed.

He emphasised that he never owed the Sibandze family anything and he maintained his son ever since he was born.

When responding to a question of who was responsible for footing the mortuary bill, Pitoli said since he was given two weeks to bury Victor, he would make means to raise the money. In this regard, he said the Shabangu family was still to meet to discuss funeral logistics, including the finances to settle the morgue expenses.

However, after the funeral, Pitoli said he would take the legal route in getting the money paid back by Sibandze who was the one who stalled Victor's burial.

...JOMO'S HAWKER CUSTOMERS WANT JUSTICE

HAWKERS stood in solidarity following a bail application by one of the suspects in Jomo Khumalo's murder and vowed they will not stop coming to the High Court until justice was served.

Skhulile Khumalo, who is a sister to Jomo, said they were still hurt with the loss of their brother and mostly a friend. She said since Jomo's death, his business was at a standstill and they fear that this would affect the children and the family at large. "His business is under threat because the Interstate Association has not revealed the verdict in the case he has been pursuing with them, which played a part in his death. The kombis are still not operational and this means there is no income being generated," said Skhulile. Another hawker said travelling to South Africa was a challange for them since Jomo's death as they no longer feel safe. "We are heartbroken. That man did not pick and choose people. We were all his favourite customers. Now we are having a hard time travelling for business that side because we are no longer safe," sobbed Tematsemba Khwesa. The women spoke in one voice that govemment should intervene and help them regarding the cross-border travel. The coodinator of the hawkers, Makhosazane Dlamini, who has been attending every hearing, said they want to see justice served.

She said Jomo was abused and bullied every time he transported them.

"He was a good man. He did everything right and made us feel comfortable when transporting us. Now our businesses are suffering too because we no longer buy stuff to sell that side as often as possible because things have changed. We no longer have the one person who made things easy for us," explained Kheswa. Jomo's mother-inlaw, Siphelele Magagula, said for them everything was taken away and they do not know what to do as a family.

She praised the late Khumalo as a hero for both families as he worked hard to provide for them. "It has been hard for us as a family to come to terms with his death. Even months later we are still in shock and feel like he will walk through the door and greet us," Magagula said. She also stated that Jomo's children, who witnessed the shooting, are still having a hard time such that they have stopped going to school. "The kids are still failing to come to terms with his death. It worries us as they will grow up with a lot of anger and hurt," Magagula

She disclosed that they have taken them for counselling and trauma therapy but so far the results are not posi-

Nazarene wants principals

AS the country continues to reel from the high unemployment rate, the Church of the Nazarene's schools management has invited qualified members of its church to fill eight vacancies for head teachers and deputy head teach-

The vacancies were announced by the Schools' Manager Fanyana Mabundza.

Three of the vacancies for head teachers are at Manzini Nazarene High, Beaufort Nazarene Primary and Mphandla Nazarene Primary.

On the other hand, the schools' management sought applications from five deputies candidates to fill positions at Mliba Nazarene, Mafutseni Nazarene, Manzini Nazarene, Manzana Nazarene and Peak Nazarene Primary Schools.

According to Mabundza, applicants should only be full members, or associate members of the Church of the Nazarene.

Qualifications

Head teachers with three years of experience in headship were invited to apply for the abovementioned and should further be degree holders with a teaching certificate or diploma.

On the other hand, aspiring candidates for the positions of deputy head teacher should have at least 10 years' experience as having held a position of deputy head teacher.

Mabundza further stated that the closing date for candidates would be on March 14.

GOVERNMENT has approved the renewal of 2 000 teachers' contracts.

Teaching Services Commission Chairman Simanga Mamba announced this yesterday morning.

The chairman thanked Cabinet for considering the ministry's request on the contract renewal.

He said since the implementation

of Circular No.3 of 2018 which froze all hiring and promotion of civil servants, all requirements for filling of positions must be approved by Cab-

Contracts

He stated that three weeks ago they began the process of requesting Cabinet for the engagement of the teach-

They were confident that some of the teachers were already in their respective workstations and those who were not there were on their way.

2000 CONTRACT TEACHERS ENGAGED

The chairman said this year; the renewed contracts would be for a two--year period so that the teachers would be at their workstations for more time while they were looking for a more efficient and effective way forward.

Issues

Regarding the future of the teachers, Mamba said the issue could be described in a number of ways. He said when government constructed a

school; there were a number of posts submitted by the ministry of education and training to the ministry of public service.

He said in some of the schools, there were still vacant posts and as a commission they were working on ensuring that all the posts were filled so that teachers would be hired on a permanent bases.

He said when government imple-

mented the free primary education programme, there were more pupils compared to the hired teachers and a majority of them were not fully qualified. "This was when the engagement of contract teachers began as they were not qualified and there were no declared posts," he said.

A decision on the fate of the 2020 MTN Bushfire festival will be taken tomorrow.

This is where the organisers and the ministry of health will discuss how they will handle the spread of the coronavirus, otherwise known as COVID -19.

Depending on the magnitude of the virus in the continent and around the world, a decision may be taken to either cancel this year's Festival altogether or postpone it to a later date.

The 2020 MTN Bushfire Festival is set to take place from May 29 to 31.

The festival is not the only international event threatened by the outbreak of the coronavirus as discussions are ongoing regarding the 2020 Olympic Games to be held in Japan in August. The Olympic Committee is looking into the matter.

Governments across the world have taken drastic steps to regulate movement of people, in particular in countries where the

virus has been discovered. **Sports**

Many other noteworthy events, from conferences to festivals to sporting events, have been cancelled or postponed because of the coronavirus, including Facebook's Annual F8 Conference and the World Athletics Indoor Championships.

Eswatini Judo Federation has decided to pull out of the 2020 African Judo Cadets Championship scheduled for Dakar, Senegal, later this

Senegal is one of the three African countries where the coronavirus has been detected. MTN Bushfire Festival is one of the country's

international

events.

Following that the world has not found a cure for the virus that has killed over 3000 people to date, the ministry of health as well as the MTN Bushfire team is in serious conversations about the fate of the event this year.

Minister of Health Lizzie Nkosi said as a ministry they were mandated to ensure the health of the nation.

However, the minister did not come out clear on whether the event would be cancelled or postponed.

Risk

Nkosi said their interest in meeting with the organisers is to ensure the lives of Emaswati are not at risk.

She said many countries with confirmed cases of coronavirus have cancelled international events. The minister said the more cases being confirmed in Africa, the more cautious the ministry and stakeholders need to be.

Meanwhile, MTN Bushfire Director Jiggs Thorne said he was not in a position to formulate any communication at the time he

was contacted.

He confirmed the team's meetings with the ministry of health. "Official communication about the matter will be on Friday," he said.

QUARANTINE CENTRES UNDERWAY

THE ministry of health is looking into converting one of the country's biggest hospitals into a coronavirus quarantine centre.

The ministry of health is likely to turn the National Multi-drug-resistant Tuberculosis Centre to a coronavirus quarantine centre. It is located outside Manzini at Moneni.

This is one of the hospitals in the list of helth facilities the ministry is looking into formulating quarantine or isolation centres. Health Minister Lizzie Nkosi said the ministry has a lot of work to do before converting the hospital to the quarantine centre.

Infection

The minister said this was because currently the hospital has MDR TB patients who need to be kept somewhere if the centre is completely identified.

Nkosi added thatthey had identified a confirmed isolation hospital which can be immediately used as a place to isolate people who are infected with coronavirus.

"Lubombo Central Hospital is ready to accept patients," she said.

The minister added that her ministry is working hard to ensure that Emaswati do not become prey of the pandemic.

Last week Friday the ministry announced that it needs E27 million to be in a good position to deal with any coronavirus threat in the country. The ministry further revealed that there were health workers who shown interest to be trained to work at the coronavirus facility. Four doctors and 18 nurses

were said to have shown interest.

At the moment the minister said Eswatini activated its emergency preparedness and response team for coordination and response planning soon after the pronouncement of the outbreak of the corona virus infection in Asia.

She added that rapid response teams have been trained as trainers from the four regions and NICD in RSA identified as a regional laboratory for testing and confirmation of any suspected cases.

"Risk communication and counselling has been integrated into entry screening of travellers from China to ensure they comply with the 14-day follow-up after arrival," she said.

Travellers

Nkosi said screening has been instituted at nine entry ports to identify travellers that have been to China in the past 14 days. Moreover, Nkosi said a national COVID-19 treatment centre has been designated to manage confirmed cases. The case management and ambulance teams have undergone a quick orientation on COVID-19 infection prevention and control and provision of supportive care for patients with severe respiratory illness.

Nkosi said personal protective equipment is available for managing suspect COVID -19 cases. Quantification of additional medical kits; supplies and supplies for optimal COVID-19 preparedness has been finalised.

Two ambulances have been set aside for transporting cases, the minister stated.

POLICE SEIZE E550 000 CASH IN RAID

A routine police raid in Nhlangano resulted in over E500 000 cash being discovered in two houses at the Lidlelantfongeni flats,

This discovery confirms long held beliefs that Asian businesspeople don't bank their money with local financial institutions, which concerns the Central Bank of Eswatini.

In one of the houses, police are reported to have discovered a bag in a wardrobe stashed with a sum of E496 200 whilst in another room, they discovered money amounting to E70 000.

The raid was conducted in the early hours of yesterday where most of the Asians doing business in the region reside.

The Lidlelantfongeni flats is where a fight

involving Pakistanis ensued late last year resulting in one of them being killed.

A battalion of police officers arrived at around 4am unannounced and conducted house to house searches.

Residents were woken up by hard police knocks on their doors who demanded to conduct the search for illegal items.

With some of the occupants not even sure what was happening, they panicked at first thinking they were under attack and were only convinced when the police officers introduced themselves and explaining the purpose of the 'surprise' visit.

"They (occupants) were advised to open the doors as these were police officers doing their work. Others were reluctant and decided to remain silent inside. Others pretended like they were not inside and kept quiet but the police kept knocking and further advising them of the

danger of not allowing them inside," said one of the sources. The raids also helped in discovering some individuals who were in the country without proper documentation and this led to their arrest. "One of the Asians was fished out under the bed as he had no relevant papers and he was arrested there and there," said a source.

Chief Police Information and Communications

Officer Superrintendent Phindile Vilakati confirmed the incident. "It's true and in one of the houses, almost E500 000 was found in a bag and in another house at the same residence a sum of over E70 000 was also found. It's against the law to keep such huge amounts of money or hiding it in the house. You declare money and we also have banks where the money can be kept," said Supt. Vilakati.

Charamba was responding to a Twitter question whether Mzembi was still bedridden as claimed by his lawyer Job Sikhala.

Charamba's response was taken up by media reports in Zimbabwe and by the end of yesterday reports were already circulating that

Charamba who uses the name @Jamwanda2 said the former tourism minister, who now leads a new political outfit, and Gandawa had asked for asylum in Eswatini. "No, he alongside Gandawa has just asked for asylum in Eswatini," Chambara was reported as having

commented.


The Zimbabwean publication went on to report that Mzembi and other former G40 leaders, including Saviour Kasukuwere, Patrick Zhuwao are in self-imposed exile in South Africa while Jonathan Moyo is holed in Kenya.

They were reported as having been forced out of the country after a military coup that displaced the late former president Robert Mugabe

from power. Earlier this year, Zim News reported that after taking farms from Grace Mugabe, Bona Mugabe

Saviour Kasukuwere, Patrick Zhuwao and Jonathan Moyo, Perence Shiri was targeting former minister Mzembi and Gandawa. This led to Gandawa stating that he no longer felt safe in Zimbabwe, hence the self-imposed exile. MAN REDUCES COP INTO PUNCHING BAG

A 30-year-old man landed in the accused's dock after he turned a uniformed police officer into a punching bag while in the line of duty.

Fanelo Dlamini of Logoba appeared before Magistrate Mthokozisi Dlamini at the Matsapha Circuit Court yesterday on four charges of contravening the Sexual Offences and Domestic Assault, common assault and resisting arrest.

These offences were committed on February 6 at Logoba.

Fanelo assaulted the police officer when confronted about some offences related to the SODV Act No. 15 of 2018. Fanelo had been taken to task by Nomfundo Simelane whom he allegedly forcefully caressed all over the body and further kissed on the mouth without her consent. His charge sheet states that by doing this, Fanelo inspired a belief of sexual violation on Nomfundo.

This was not all as when Nomfundo protested about being touched and kissed, Fanelo allegedly intention-

ally strangulated her, hence the common assault charge. After the woman had reported the matter to the Sigodvweni police, they promptly acted on it.

Two officers found Fanelo at Logoba and they informed him about the cause of their visit. The 30-year-old man did not take kindly to the officer's confrontation, so he ended up punching the police officer, Constable Hlophe with fists several times in the face.

Attacked

Noticing that his partner was being attacked, the other officer identified as Constable Dlamini ran to Hlophe's rescue and further attempted to arrest him.

The two officers' efforts were futile as Fanelo allegedly resisted arrest. In court, Fanelo pleaded guilty to the charges of assaulting a police officer and further resisting arrest. However, he pleaded not guilty to the charges of caressing and kissing Nomfundo without her consent, and further strangulating her. Magistrate Dlamini deferred the matter until April.

Fanelo was remanded in custody until then.

MTN employee arrested for E36 000 theft

AN employee of the Mobile Telephone Network (MTN) Eswatini has landed himself in jail for allegedly stealing from his employer a sum of E36 000.

Mxolisi Maxwell Nxumalo, who is attached to the Pigg's Peak branch of the mobile telephone company, has been charged with theft and according to what is reflected in the charge sheet, Nxumalo (37) committed the offence last Friday in Pigg's Peak.

The charge sheet states that the accused person wrongfully and with intent stole money in cash amounting to E36 270, the property which was in the lawful possession of Sibusiso Mkhonta.

Following his arrest by the Pigg's Peak police, Nxumalo was arraigned at the Magistrate's Court on Tuesday before Magistrate Sibonelo Dlamini, who granted him bail fixed at E18 000.

However, feeling the amount is rather too steep for him, Nxumalo yesterday filed an urgent applicant for variation of his bail at the High Court.

He appeared before Judge Ticheme Dlamini where he, through his lawyer Sabelo 'Chicken' Dlamini, applied that his bail amount be reduced from E18 000 to an affordable amount upon such terms and conditions the High Court may deem fit to impose.

According to Nxumalo in his founding affidavit, he is Liswati of Nsangwini area in the Hhohho

region and on February 28, he was arrested by the police who subsequently charged him for the offence of theft of the said money from his employer.

He submitted that he was granted the E18 000 bail by the Magistrate's Court but cannot raise the amount since he cannot afford same.

"The matter is urgent by the virtue of the fact that I am employed by MTN Pigg's peak branch on a permanent basis, hence my continued incarceration will not only be detrimental to my job but also to the well-being of my entire family since I am the breadwinner with a wife and four minor children," he submitted.

Interest

He stated that the interest of justice clearly favours that he be afforded the relief he sought, in particular because there is no prejudice to be suffered by anyone as he had been advised that the police have already completed their investigations.

Since the variation application was not opposed by the crown represented by crown counsel Khumbulani Mngometulu, Nxumalo's bail was varied. The court ordered that it would not interfere with the E18 000 bail amount.

However, he will now pay E4 000 in cash and E14 000 shall be in a form of a surety.

By the time this report was compiled yesterday afternoon, his relatives were facilitating to deposit his bail with the Treasury Department as they had obtained the relevant papers.

Church member steals

Mangaliso Phiri (27) of Ludzeludze appeared before Magistrate Mthokozisi Dlamini at the Matsapha Circuit Court on a theft charge.

Mangaliso was arrested on Monday by the Matsapha police even though the crime was committed in March 2019

His charge sheet states that Mangaliso stole the two Sansui speakers from

God's Amazing Church situated at Ludzeludze.

The items were in the lawful possession of Nomvuyo Patricia Shongwe. Information brought before court was to the effect that some church members wanted to use the speakers when they discovered that they were missing.

Enquired

Since they were kept in the house that Mangaliso used, they enquired about the speakers' whereabouts. To their shock, Mangaliso, a church member who had been tasked with looking after the church property, denied knowledge of the property's whereabouts.

Shongwe said the church then conducted its own investigation which unearthed that Mangaliso had sold the speakers to two different people who also happened to be neighbours with the church structure.

After learning that the church was aware that he had stolen the items, Mangaliso reportedly admitted to having committed the crime.

When phone numbers for these buyers were requested, Mangaliso gave the church committee ones that did not exist. It was at this point that the church committee requested that he returned the speakers.

Boy finds man kissing uncle's wife, kills him

BEING angered by finding another man planting a deep kiss on his uncle's wife at a funeral has landed a 19-yearold man behind bars.

Menzi Simon Magagula of Gunwane area in the Hhohho region under Chief Ngangaza has been charged with the murder of Mlangeni Dlamini (24) of the same area.

It is stated that the accused person is charged with the offence of murder in that on January 20 at or near Mshingishini he did wrongfully and with intent kill Mlangeni Dlamini of Gunwane and did thereby commit the crime of murder.

He was granted E15 000 bail and ordered to pay E4 000 cash and E11 000 shall be in a form of a surety.

Giving a background to the matter when motivating his bail application, Magagula told the court that it was after he had an argument with the deceased after finding him intimately kissing his (Magagula's) uncle's (babe lomncane's) wife.

"I was arrested by the police and subsequently charged with murder after surrendering myself. This was after I had an argument with the deceased whom I found kissing my uncle's wife behind the house at a funeral. The deceased slapped me after I had confronted him," he submitted.

He informed the court that following the slapping, he took out a knife and planted it on the deceased's stomach. He immediately went back home and told his elders who subsequently took him to the police station after hearing that the deceased later succumbed to death.

He stated that he will abide by all bail conditions and will not endanger the safe-ty of members of the public and will not conceal evidence. He averred that he was a young man who was still under the custody of his parents and desired to further his studies, hence his continued incarceration would be detrimental to his future as he has a young life.

Woman found with 25 live rounds of ammunition

I was digging truth on my stolen items - TV man

THE Eswatini Television Authority (ETA) employee arrested for attempted murder after torturing a suspect claims he was merely digging the truth on his stolen items at his home at Mashobeni.

Phephisa Zwane (45), who has been charged with four others, alleges he decided to threaten his nephew that he (Zwane) would tie him to the back of his car and drag him on the ground but when he did so, his nephew quickly came out with the truth on his missing items.

This is contained in his affidavit at the High Court, where he together with the four others, filed an urgent application for bail before Judge Ticheme Dlamini.

Zwane has been charged together with Mduduzi Lukhele (45), Jabulani Mamba (27), Khulekani Mabuza (32) and Satiso Mabuza (28), all of Mashobeni in the Shiselweni region. They are facing three counts according to the charge sheet. In the first count, they are charged with attempted murder in that upon or about February 21 at or near Mashobeni the accused persons either each or all of them acting jointly in furtherance of a common purpose did unlawfully and intentionally attempt to kill Sibahle Matsebula by tying him with a trope on the neck and further strangulated him.

Charged

On the second count, they are charged with the same offence in that they attempt to kill Melusi Shongwe by tying him with a rope on the neck and further dragged him with a car On the last count, they are charged with the same offence in that they tried to kill Lwazi Hlophe by drowning him and further kicked him several times.

Pleading with the court in his affidavit, Zwane submitted that he had entrusted his nephew (Matsebula) with seeing to it that his house was well kept and always had its lights on during the night when he was away at

He tied nephew with rope on back of his car with intent to drag him and further strangulated another accused of having stolen items

work. He submitted that he noticed that some of his household items, including appliances, were missing without the doors having been tempered.

He confronted his nephew about same, who denied knowledge of the missing items.

"Seeing he was unwilling to talk, I decided to threaten him that I would drag him with my vehicle and to that end I tied him to the back of the car on the ground and revved the car.

He quickly came out with the truth and mentioned the name of Sibahle Matsebula (first complainant)," he submitted.

Zwane revealed in his affidavit that they proceeded to fetch Matsebula whom he strangulated with a rope until he told them that his brother Malangeni was in possession of the items they were looking for. He averred that they went to the said Mlangeni who in turn gave them information which resulted in the recovery of the missing items which included a plasma TV set, home theatre and speakers.

Items

He mentioned that he had already reported the stolen items at Gege Police Station and he decided not to proceed with the criminal charges since he had recovered his stolen items.

"I was taken aback when I was arrested and charged with the attempted murder of my nephew and Sibahle Matsebula. I have good prospects of success at trial as I never attempted to kill the complainants. I admit that my conduct was unlawful, however, the frustration was unbearable," he submitted. Represented by Nhlangano based attorney Melusi Simelane of Piliso, Simelane and Partners law firm. Zwane and the four were granted bail fixed at E15 000 each. The court ordered that each was to pay E5 000 in cash and E10 000 as surety.


CLASSES came to a halt at Eswatini Medical Christian University (EMCU) as staff picketed over absence of a salary structure.

While students remained calm during the picket, some of them were seemingly interested in joining their lecturers and the support staff as they staged a picket yesterday afternoon.

Tables turned when students who were normally associated with staging class boycotts continued enjoying their lunch hour while their lecturers expressed their grievance over the institution's failure to adopt a clear salary structure.

The picket was joined by the National Workers Union of Swaziland Higher Institutions (NAWUSHI) executive led by the union's President Samuel Shongwe and Acting Secretary General Lee Madzinane.

The institution's staff said they had had enough as they were tired of waiting for the adoption of the salary struc-



by government as it had not been implemented since the institution opened in August 2013.

Meanwhile, Madzinane said the reason they opted for the picket was due to the long dragging issue of the salary structure.

He mentioned last year, the institution engaged the services of a consultant to formulate the salary structure

and furnish them with a report

He said the salary structure was supposed to be implemented at the beginning of the current financial year last April but it had dragged until they decided to picket. He said as a union representing the employees, they negotiated with the institution's management but disagreed on certain issues.

"We decided not to fight the management and agreed to the structure as it was prsented and resolved to use it as a base," he said.

Moreover, he said after the implementation of the salary structure, they would then engage the university in negotiations for a salary review so that the staff pay would be aligned other institutions in the country such as the University of Eswatini.

He said the current situation was not conducive as lecturers were not paid the same salary. He said some lecturers were paid more than others. "Some lecturers are paid in the region of E20

He also thanked all the staff members who availed themselves for the picket as well as the union executive. "We are tired of waiting for this and from this day on we will continue to fight for our rights," he said.

He further requested full attendance from the staff on future pickets and commitment to the cause.



National Social Security Policy completed, pending approval

THE ministry of labour and social security has recently completed and validated a National Social Security Policy (NSSP), which is currently pending approval from Cabinet.

Following concerns from members of Parliament regarding the state of social security in the country, the ministry of labour and social security has assured the legislators that they are one step ahead in addressing the matter.

This was revealed during the House of Assembly portfolio committee debate of the ministry's annual performance report last week.

Lobamba Marwick Khumalo requested the ministry to clarify where the country was in terms of social security measures and why the component of social security was not visible in the ministry.

"Do we have any legal framework in the pipeline or we are just inclined to social welfare issues as a country?" enquired the MP.

Minister Makhosi Vilakati said as indicated in the 2019 /2020 annual performance report, the ministry had just completed and validated a National Social Security Policy (NSSP).

He stated that the document had been referred to the tripartite consultation and advisory structure, being the Labour Advisory Board

(LAB), for revalidation and would be submitted to cabinet for consideration and approval.

Further, Vilakati said the NSSP mapped a way forward to the establishment of four main social security funds that the ministry was currently tasked to establish. These are the Workmen Compensation Insurance Fund, Unemployment Fund, National Health Insurance Fund and National Pension Fund.

"Other fund, which include shortterm cash benefits such as sickness, maternity benefits plus the improvement of survivors and invalidity cover will be implemented progressively with a view to establish, over time, a comprehensive and inclusive social security framework for the Kingdom of Eswatini," said the minister.

The MPs also enquired if the ministry had specific action plan with measurable time bound milestones for the execution of an integrated social security system that would address the vulnerabilities of the workforce to enable them to effectively contribute to economic growth.

They also enquired if the ministry's work plan on this aspect was aligned to the key performance indicators of the Eswatini Strategic Road Map (2019-2023), which established the objective for inclusive growth, through promotion of an effective social safety net and not leaving any Liswati behind.

The minister said the NSSP had recently been developed as a strategic approach towards improving programmes aimed at poverty alleviation. He said the work plan for the exercise for 2020/2021 financial year was focused on aspects such as development of an implementation plan with financial projections for the social security benefits as outlined in the NSSP.

"This will prioritise the introduction of periodic long-term benefit payments for employment related injuries and occupational diseases," he said.

Vilakati also said the NSSP would also develop an umbrella legal fiamework on social security that would describe governance and administration methods including common principles to social protection system as a whole such as non-discrimination and equality of treatment on the basis of gender, age, ethnicity, race or origin.

He added that the NSSP would also undertake a feasibility study to inform the establishment of a National Social Security Agency (NSSA), which would be a distinct juristic entity with financial and administrative independence to implement and run the comprehensive set of social security benefits

McAlpine residents want mobile police post

FOLLOWING a spate of robberies and attacks at McAlpine, a suburb in Nhlangano, the residents want police to conduct regular patrols in the area.

The suburb has become a hunting ground for criminals who come armed to rob the residents. Most of those targeted in the robberies are businessmen of Asian origin.

The latest attack is of a well-known businessman, Elias Patel, who was shot last Thursday.

"It is not safe to reside at McAlpine. Dangerous criminals do as they please and the fact that the suburb is a walking distance from the police camp does not scare the thugs.

It is high time the police intervened and found a long lasting solution to the problem. No one is safe and what is unfortunate is that it is the businesspeople living in this part of the town who are targeted," said one of the businesspeople residing at McAlpine.

The residents called upon the police to intensify patrols in the area. Patel, who is the owner of Shak's Cellular and Sound, was almost killed while driving to his residence in the company of his wife last Thursday evening.

He was just a few metres away from his residence when gunmen opened fire. One of the bullets riddled his jaw and got lodge in his neck.

He was rushed to hospital and the bullet was successfully extracted.

He has since been discharged after the successful operation.

Ex-lover 'coached' child to say I raped her - Dad

A father, who has since been convicted of the rape of his five-yearold daughter, has accused the mother of the child of 'coaching' the minor to testify against him.

Bongani* blatantly denied that he ever committed any sexual act on his daughter, stating that the allegations levelled against him were as a result of his separation from the mother. "Her mother has always accused me of assaulting our daughter with open hands, and this is just another ploy that she has cooked up with her neighbour. She is purely using the child as a pawn to ruin my life," Bongani stated.

According to the minor, her father forcefully grabbed her from her mother's place of residence on the day of the incident.

She stated that when they arrived at her father's flat, he bathed her and put her to bed.

She proceeded to tell the court that her father raped her, which was expressed by the word 'kusoma', a term normally used by children her age to describe an act of sexual intercourse. With the use of dolls, Bongani's

daughter demonstrated before the court how her father sexually assaulted her.

She demonstrated the act using male and female dolls as she showed the court what adults would perceive as 'sexual movements' associated with sexual intercourse. The minor further testified that when her father was finished, he bathed her again and left her in the house for an unspecified period of time. When he returned, the minor recalled that he made her take some tablets, which he never explained their use.

When cross-examining his daughter, Bongani questioned the minor whether she had been coached by her mother to leve the rape allegations against him. However, the minor maintained that he did in fact, rape her on several occasions.

In its judgement, the court addressed the issue of Bongani's argument that his daughter was schooled by her mother and her neighbour to state that she was raped by her father.

The court questioned what the neighbour would benefit from doing so save for only being concerned about the child's safety around her father.

The matter is pending before the High Court of Eswatini for sentencing.

Domestic fight ends tragically as man killed by own brother

A domestic fight between two siblings ended tragically at Mandlangempisi when one brother accidentally killed the other by hitting him with a brick in the head.

Machawe Samuel Shongwe (27) has since been arrested and charged with the murder of his brother Nhlanhla Slova Shongwe, an incident that happened on January 12 2020.

Nhlanhla sustained serious injuries and succumbed to death on February 5 while admitted at the Mbabane Government Hospital.

Following his arrest, Machawe yesterday filed an urgent application for bail at the High Court. He informed the court, through his affidavit, that he had no intention to kill his brother. He claimed to have been merely defending himself from his violent brother who was armed with a knife during the altercation.

Represented by lawyer Nhlanhla Ginindza of NE Ginindza Attorneys law firm, Machawe was granted bail by the High Court fixed at E15 000. However, Justice Ticheme Dlamini ordered that he pays a sum of E4 000 in cash and E11 000 shall be in form of sureties.


The altercation, according to Machawe, ballooned to such an extent that a fierce fight ensued. He said the deceased was the aggressor as he tried to reach for his knife during the fight. Since he knew his brother as a violent person who had a history of stabblings, Machawe said

he reached for a concrete brick next to him and hit his brother in the head.

"In an endeavour to defend myself since I reasonably believed my brother was going to stab me owing to his history of stabbings, I used a brick to hit him. Sadly and unfortunately, my brother sustained serious injuries in the process and was rushed to Dvokolwako health centre before being transferred to Mbabane Government Hospital, where he died," he submitted.

He averred that upon realising that he had injured his brother, he surrendered himself to the Mliba police. He was subsequently arrested and charged with attempted murder.


He added that he got to learn while in custody at the Pigg's Peak correctional facility that his brother succumbed to the injuries inflicted on him.

Man held for stealing E18 000 worth items

A man from Mahleke area appeared before the Magistrate's Court for allegedly committing two counts of house breaking and theft, totalling

Siyabonga Dlamini (20) allegedly committed both counts in his home area.

On the first count, the accused person reportedly wrongfully and unlawfully broke into a house of Thandolwethu Maziya and stole items valued at E2 400.

The items mainly included clothing. On the second count, the accused allegedly broke into the same house and stole items valued at E15 800. When the charges were read to him, Dlamini pleaded guilty to both counts.

The crown elected to call witnesses to prove commission of the offences. The complainant told the court that the accused person gained entry into his house through a window while he was away.

He stated that the break-in occurred two times within a space of a month. Most of the stolen items were recovered through the assistance of community

When mitigating, Dlamini asked the court to be lenient when passing sentence. He stated that he was unemployed and struggled to make ends meet.

However, the crown presented records of previous conviction against the accused. The court was informed that Dlamini was once convicted on a similar charge of house breaking. He was also found guilty on the matter before court.

Acting Magistrate Lungile Shongwe noted that cases of house breaking and theft were prevalent in the region. She subsequently sentenced the accused person to 10 months custodial sentence on

'SUSPENDING CIVIL SERVANTS WITH PAY COSTLY

SUSPENDING civil servants with pay is contributing to government's fiscal challenges.

This was the unanimous view of legislators when making comments about the ministry of public service's annual performance report.

This happened on Monday when Minister Christian Ntshangase was delivering the ministry's report before the House of Assembly portfolio committee. This was raised by the MPs after learning that only five out of 45 CMAC cases were resolved in the 2019/20 financial year.

CMAC is the Conciliation, Mediation and Arbitration Commission.

Mntfogwaneni Member of Parliament Roy Fanourakis asked Minister Ntshangase why it took the Civil Service Commission (CSC) long to resolve CMAC cases. The legislator wondered why some of these cases were not taken to court.

As if to answer MP Fanourakis' question, Maseyisini MP Mduduzi 'Small Joe' Dlamini opined that a lot of civil servants who had been found engaged in unlawful activities were suspended

He said when these employees' matters take forever to be resolved, it heavily impacted on government's coffers in that they are paid while not at work, plus the people hired to replace them are also paid by the same government.

Adding, Dlamini said the money being paid to the suspended civil servants

could be redirected elsewhere but this cannot be done if the matters are not resolved fast enough.

MP Lutfo Dlamini further stated that while the suspended workers are away, they also benefitted when the rest of public servants received increments yet they still have to answer for their transgressions.

In response to the MPs questions, Minister Ntshangase conceded that this was a burden to government judging from the hefty amount paid out to these workers. Ntshangase mentioned, however, that the CSC could not discipline and met out judgement on cases of criminal activity because they end up at the courts of law.

Once a matter has been taken to court, Ntshangase said the CSC is not allowed to intervene. With the involvement of cluded by the courts not the CSC

the police who need to conduct investigations before a matter could proceed for trial in court, Ntshangase said the CSC's hands were tied.

On the contrary, he mentioned that with the Public Service Bill shelved for too long, his ministry could be able to hastily conclude cases of employees who have been found on the wrong side of the law whether or not a matter is pending in court.

He happily announced that the ministry started working on the Bill as of November 4, 2019. Even so, his ministry was advised that the law could only be effected on cases that will emerge after the Bill has been passed into an

Agriculture minister launches Sandleni Farmers Association

MINISTER of Agriculture Jabulani Mabuza launched the Sandleni Farmers Association in collaboration with Sandleni Inkhundla.

Mabuza said the main purpose of visiting the area was to attend to their challenges as per the Strategic Roadmap of the country. He stated that agriculture is the simplest way of getting employment and earning a living so that they assist the country in economic growth and fighting unemployment.

"Under Home Economics section in the ministry there is a strategy of home improvement, whereby extension farmers workshop people about eating healthy food, having at least seven by seven metres yard garden and fruit trees to eradicate poverty," he said.

Mabuza added that one of the mandates of his ministry is to maximise production in the agriculture sector. He said he was confident that through the formation of associations like the Sandleni Farmers Association, this would ensure the country's vision of 2022 is realised.

Strategy

He mentioned that due to climate change, the ministry emphasises on reusing water as it has become a challenge to most farmers.

Therefore, water conservation is useful to every home. "Under the five-year strategy of the country the ministry agriculture was selected as one main ministry to help Swazi people. In the roadmap, there is construction of a dam called Mkhondvo Ngwavuma that will benefit Shiselweni region and Sandleni Inkhundla will be part of the beneficiaries," he added.

Mabuza highlighted that the dam would be divided into three parts, one at Mkhondvo, another at Mpakeni and the other at Themba. It will then have canals so that everyone benefits from the water.

He further mentioned that there will be construction of small and medium dams through the Eswatini Water and Agricultural Development Enterprise (ESWADE).

The minister stated that extension officers of the ministry were out on field visits to train farmers on livestock farming and increasing production, thus the community is urged to work with them. Sandleni residents were also encouraged to capitalise in the goat production because there is a huge market for it.

He said commercialising goats would close the big gap in econom-

ic growth and unemployment.

Mabuza said a processing plant at Matsapha is under construction and it will have a carrying capacity of 120 million litres of milk.

Youth are encouraged to attend training hosted by Eswatini Dairy Board, National Agricultural Marketing Board (NAMBoard), ESWADE, and National Maize Corporation (NMC).

The Swazi nation has a shortage of 140 metric tones as it currently produces 80 metric tones in maize which makes Eswatini import on a large scale outside the country.

Sandleni Member of Parliament Noah Gama, speaking on behalf of the inkhundla, said some of the duties of the association include working on market-led projects where the association would look for markets, training of Sandleni farmers through extension officers, look for funding like the use of farmers' bank to assist Sandleni farmers and organise local shows for the area.

Gama said the association consists of seven members from different chiefdoms at Sandleni. He encouraged the youth to venture into agriculture.

A woman who left her child with her father received several beatings, after he claimed that he had had enough of looking after their child.

Siphiwe Kunene left their child with Sipho, who claimed that it was not the first time she had done so.

"We have our issues as a couple; but my anger got the better of me when she decided to abandon our child with me. She knows that I am stressed out, as I was recently suspended from work for some reasons known to me. I believe that she took advantage of my situation, and decided to leave the child with me to spite me," Kunene claimed. He has since been arrested and charged with contravening the Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence Act, after he assaulted his wife with open hands and fists all over her body. Kunene committed the offence last month at their rented home in Nkoyoyo.

When his charges were read before Senior Magistrate Nonhlanhla Dlamini, Kunene disputed that he assaulted his wife all over her body.

While making a fist, Kunene demonstrated to the court that he only assaulted her on her shoulders.

"I first pushed her away from me and then proceeded to assault her on her shoulders.

I am disputing that I assaulted her all over her body as the charge sheet states," he demonstrated. However, the judicial officer asked him numerous times whether he was entering a plea of guilty or not guilty by his demonstrations.

"You are holding a fist and showing us that you assaulted her on her shoulders.

What are you trying to show us because you are admitting that you did assault her, with a fist? Please enter your plea so that court proceedings can commence," the judicial officer stated. After entering his plea of guilty Kunene was sentenced to serve two years in prison, with the option to pay a fine of E2 000. Half of his sentence was suspended for a period of two years.

Almost 2000 social welfare cases reported last year

OUT of 1 971 reported cases at the department of Social Welfare, 542 counselling cases are still pending due to lack of social workers.

This is according to the annual performance report of the deputy prime minister's office.

In the 2019/20 report, it is mentioned that the department of social welfare has been responsive to the growing demand to provide counselling services to clients who have suffered some form of trauma as well as marital problems.

A total of 1971 of cases were reported during the April - December period,

reflecting the highest demand for counselling services throughout the coun-

The department concluded 72.5 per cent of the cases.

The unconcluded cases were attributed to a number of reasons some outside the control of the department.

CHILDREN IN CON-FLICT WITH THE LAW

A lot of children after facing challenges and not having a proper family setting tend to involved themselves in activities that land them in trouble.

In a detailed report it has been gathered that a lot of these children are involved in crimes which include pick pocketing, robbery and break-in.

According to the report, children in conflict with the law comprise of all persons less than 18 years regardless of gender, race and physical ability.

27 per cent cases of children reported involved pre-teenagers.

Revealed

Shiselweni region recorded the highest number of child offenders, ranking high with pick-pocketing of pedestrians and break-in.

The report revealed that males were the highest offenders with a majority of these offenders falling in the age group 13 to 18 years.

The high incidence records reflect a demand for research on drivers of child offending as to ensure informed intervention programmes.

Over E56 million fuel, oil levy collected in three months

THE ministry of natural resources and energy collected over E56 millions in fuel levy over the past three

An annual performance report from the ministry shows that by the end of the financial year, the ministry should collect E74 million of fuel and oil levy.

From October 2019 to December 31, 2019 the ministry collected E56 552 430 of the levy. The figure collected is a million over the projected E55.5 mil-

Notably, the levy has increased in the previous quarter following the E0.85 fuel levy that was implemented by the ministry at the beginning of November, 2019. The ministry is targeting to collect E75 052 430 million in the current financial quarter ending March 31, 2020.

The ministry further collected E13 301 172 million in the deeds office yet it (ministry) had projected E12 million.

Still under the department of deeds registry, the ministry made over E58 000 office and search fees.

The ministry also made a noticeable amount under mining as it collected E269 450.

Previous

This amount is higher than the projected E150 000 of the previous quarter. During the third quarter, the ministry collected E70 243 296 of revenue.

This amount is E3 million more than the projected revenue of E67 763 250

Due to the pattern of the amount of money collected by each department at ministry, by the end of March 2020 the ministry estimates its revenue to be E92 962 619.

Meanwhile, the ministry was not able to utilise a lot of its budget as it was not

released according to the budget.

The ministry was allocated E99 089 527 for the recurrent expenditure. This includes CTA charges, personal costs, communication, consumables material supply and grants.

However, only E70 076 118 was released and the ministry only utilised E63 029 792 thus serving 10 per cent, which is E7 046 226.

The ministry incurred 30 per cent over expenditures on CTA charges. The report states that this is due to high costs in maintenance and repairs and other CTA associated costs.

About E12 122 678 was budgeted for CTA charges, but only E4 823 981 was

An amount of E6 266 981 was spent, which translates to E1 443 000 over expenditure.

The ministry was not allocated any budget for durable material and equipment yet E60 000 was released.

Govt largest contributor of health current expenditures

GOVERNMENT contributes the largest share of the current health expenditure.

This was revealed during a meeting between the ministry of health and its portfolio committee.

Government contributes 47 per cent to the country's health. The second highest contributors are donors, who contribute 30.1 per cent while corporations, including insurance, contribute at least 10.7 per cent.

Meanwhile, the ministry of health portfolio committee applauded the 2020/2021 budget allocated to the ministry.

Chairperson of the Portfolio Committee Isaac Magagula said they were pleased with the categorisation and ranking of the ministry of health.

During the 2020/2021 budget speech, the ministry was allocated E2.3 billion, which is 10.5 percent of the national budget.

Magagula applauded the ministry for being one of the highest ranking ministries in the country. He said it demonstrated that government was aware of the crucial role played by the ministry of health in the country.

"Productive people are healthy people," he said.

Magagula said healthy people would come up with productive ideas that would grow the country economically. He then pleaded with the ministry to use the budget wisely and responsibly.

The chairperson acknowledged that the ministry of health was facing a lot of challenges, saying the portfolio committee would

Let's make our cities and communities inclusive, safe, resilient and sustainable

HALF of the world is 3.5 billion people, live in cities today and five billion are projected to live in cities by 2030.

These figures make it imperative that efficient urban planning and management practices are in place to deal with the challenges brought about by urbanisation.

Sustainable development cannot be achieved without significantly transforming the way we build and manage our urban spaces.

The rapid growth of cities, a result of increasing populations and migration, has led to a boom in mega-cities, especially in the developing world, making slums a more significant feature of urban life.

Ensuring sustainable cities means creating career and business opportunities, safe and affordable housing, and building resilient societies and economies. It involves investment in public transport, creating green public spaces, and improving urban planning in inclusive ways.

Urban areas are impacted by all the SDGs, and many are at the forefront of finding sustainable solutions.

In Africa, the urban population currently stands at 472 million, with this figure set to more than double by 2040, reaching one billion.

Africa's population is growing and urbanising at a high rate, bringing increasing demands on services and infrastructure within cities. Two-thirds of the urban space that the continent needs by 2050 does not exist today.

One hundred of the continent's cities have more than one million inhabitants. Ten cities have five million, and Lagos, Africa's largest urban space, has 23 million. These mega-cities challenge our knowledge about urban populations through their population numbers, diversity and roles in terms of movement of people, ideas, goods, wealth and cultures

The World Bank estimates that the urban infrastructure needs of Africa cost USD 90 billion (E1.38 trillion) annually. Some four million homes would need to be built each year to keep up with the explosion in urban growth.

In Eswatini, urban population is 21 per cent in comparison with the rural population at 79 per cent, with a growing trend towards urbanisation. A total of 14 cities and towns are under urban local government, including: Mbabane, Manzini, Nhlangano, Siteki, Pigg's Peak, Matsapha, Ezulwini, Mankayane, Hlatikulu, Ngwenya, Vuvulane, LavumisaMalkerns and Buhleni and three areas are declared controlled, namely; Magindaneni, Mhobodleni and Sikhuphe.

Magindanent, Mhobodleni and Sikhtquie. In Eswatini, 60 per cent of the peri-urban residents live in informal communities and sub-standard housing on un-surveyed land without any legal

Less than 50 per cent of this population has access to a safe water supply, and fewer than 20 per cent have access to formal sanitation. The Ministry of Housing and Urban Development is commended in its efforts, despite cashflow challenges, to implement the urban development project in line with His Majesty's Vision 2022 of a first-world status.

Attention must also be paid to the environmental and social costs of urbanisation. Development therefore needs to be organised to ensure the prevention of pollution, ascities are the source of

In 2015, world leaders adopted the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and its 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). The 17 SDGs call for action by all countries to promote prosperity while maintaining peace, protecting the planet, the people and building partnerships. With only 10 years remaining to achieve these goals, countries are accelerating steps towards ending poverty, fighting inequalities, tackling climate change and ensuring that no one is left behind. Every month, the United Nations places one of the 17 SDGs under the spotlight, highlighting its purpose, targets and criticality in advancing Agenda 2030. This month's focus is SDG 11: Sustainable Cities and Communities.

70 per cent of greenhouse gas emissions, the undermining of the social-mix of city centres and creation of slums.

The discussion on sustainable cities should therefore focus on: (a) Essential services such as security, resources, renewable and efficient energy, and risk management; (b) Mobility in cities such as transport infrastructure and access; (c) Cityliving such as housing, healthcare, education, culture, sport, leisure, civil society and vulnerable populations; (d) Feeding cities and sustainable consumption, including agriculture, shops, restaurants and catering, packaging, recycling and local production; (e) Connectivity in cities such as innovation, digital technologies and data management;(f) Urban-design including architecture, construction, green spaces, urban art, sustainable tourism and heritage conservation; (g) Financing and structuring projects including donors and foundations, banks, investment funds, financial and technical support, project management, and decentralised cooperation.

Last week, the European Investment Bank (EIB) and UN-Habitat; the United Nations Human Settlements Programme, hosted the Africa Day 2020 Conference in Dakar, Senegal, with a focus on "Cities for People". This year's conference is dedicated to sustainable urbanisation on the African continent, looking at the rapid growth of African cities and towns. UN-Habitatis mandated by the UN General Assembly to promote socially and environmentally-sustainable towns and cities with the goal of providing adequate shelter for all

As our towns and cities grow at unprecedented rates, sustainable urbanisation is one of the most pressing challenges facing the global community in the 21st century.

Cities are the hub for much national production and consumption: economic and social processes generate wealth and opportunity. However, they create disease, crime, pollution and poverty. In many cities, especially in developing countries, slum dwellers number more than 50 per cent of the population and have little or no access to shelter, water, and sanitation.

In Eswatini, urban local governments are implementing various initiatives to respond to the challenges of towns and cities. Notably, the country's initiatives, such as the Alliance of Mayor's Initiative for Community Action on AIDS at the Local Level(AMICAALL),have played a significant role in responding to the HIV and AIDS pandemic. The AMICAALL programme

has assisted all towns and cities to establish locally-based responses to HIV and AIDS. Activities include:condom distribution, home-based care, prevention of mother-to-child transmission, Anti-Retroviral Therapy (in Manzini and Mbabane), care for orphans and vulnerable children, food security, workplace HIV and AIDS programming and behaviour change communication which is delivered through youth peer education, reaching out to men and communities.

Recently, the Commonwealth Local Government Forum (CLGF), Gender Links(GL), the Ministry of Housing and Urban Development (MHUD) and the Eswatini Local Government Association (ELGA), have partnered to implement; "Connecting the Dots: Local Actions for Women - Political and Economic Empowerment". This project, implemented in four southern-African countries, including Lesotho, Zambia and Zimbabwe, with funding from the UK Department for International Development (DFID), seeks to strengthen the political and economic empowerment of women and girls in southern Africa through online networks linked to Centres of Excellence for Gender in Local Government. It seeks to increase participation of women of all ages in local government.

On March 19, 2020, the United Nations Eswatini will support the Ministry of Housing and Urban Development to host the Mayors& Municipal Managers' Dialogue on the SDGs: an opportunity to discuss strategies on the development and management of sustainable cities, towns and communities and the overall implementation of the SDGs. The event will be hosted by the Ezulwini Municipality and we look forward to further engaging and partnering with the government, cities and towns of Eswatini.

WHAT THE LAW S. Utsini umtsetfo

Citation and commencement

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Electronic Communications (Universal Service and Access) Regulations 2016.

(2) These Regulations shall come into force on the date of publication in the Government Gazette

2. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires –

"Act" means the Electronic Communications Act No. 9 of 2013;

"Annual Turnover" means total revenue generated from licensed activities per annum, less service provider discounts, interconnection and facilities leasing charges and government grants and subsidies, based on audited financial statements, or, if the licensee is not required by law to audit its financial statements, on the annual financial statements signed and sworn by the accounting officer of the licensee;

"Applicable Interest Rate" means the interest rate set by the Monetary Policy Consultative Committee of the Central Bank of Swaziland;

"Automated location identity" means any location information processed in an electronic

communications network indicating the geographical position of the subscriber equipment;

"Caller line identity (CLI)" means a facility by which the subscriber number of a caller is displayed on the called party prior to the call being established and is a form of automatic number identity;

"Cost analysis" means an economic evaluation of the component parts of a whole and their relation by using budgeting and accounting practices to determine the true cost and may include a cost-benefit analysis;

"Designated licensee" means a licensee that has been designated in terms of Section 31 of the Act.

"Emergency Centre" means a centre that facilitates the carrying of emergency communications to emergency organisations;

"Higher Education Institutions" means any institution established by or under any law in terms of the Education Act No. 9 of 1981, as amended from time to time;

"Internet Service" means a service that links the user to a collection of interconnected web pages that are transferred using Hypertext Transfer Protocol (http), and is collectively known as the World Wide Web (www);

"Internet Service Provider (ISP)" means an entity that provides access to, or a presence on, the Internet in terms of an electronic communications network or service licence;

"Licensed Activity" means any service provided pursuant to a licence issued in terms of the Act;

"Market Gap Analysis" is the process of identifying and evaluating requirements of a geographic area, market segment or target population and possible solutions to meet these requirements, and includes the identification of the True Access Gap and the Smart Subsidy Zone;

"Regulatory impact assessment (RIA)" means a system approach to critically assessing the positive and negative effects of proposed and existing regulations and non-regulatory alternatives;

"Relevant licensee" means any type of category of licence that is required to comply with a relevant provision of the Act or these regulations as may become applicable to a licence type or category from time to time;

"School" means all primary, secondary or high schools as defined in the Education Act No. 9 of 1981, as amended from time to time;

"Sim card" means subscriber identity module, which is a smart card that gives a cellphone its number and customer identity and stores data for Global System for Mobile communications

ELECTRONIC OMMUNICATIONS (THE UNIVERSAL SERVICE, ACCESS) REGULATIONS, 2016

(GSM) cellular telephone subscribers. Such data includes user identity, location and phone number, network authorisation data, personal security keys, contact lists and stored test messages. Security features include authentication and encryption to protect data;

"Sim-lock" means the inability of a subscriber to use the Sim card of another electronic communications network licensee or electronic communications service licensee on the subscriber's equipment;

"Smart-subsidy zone" means certain rural or high cost areas, and low-income population groups, or other segments of the market that will not be reached for the provision of communications by the market alone, even if it is an efficient market, within a reasonable time; there are areas and groups which have commercial potential but may need a once-off subsidy to mitigate commercial risks, making the area more attractive to commercial operators;

"Soft-lock" means the inability of a subscriber to use the billed or paid services of the electronic communications network licensee or electronic communications service licensee on the subscriber's equipment;

"Special Tariff" means the discounted rate determined by the Commission that shall be offered by licensees to all requesting schools, higher education institutions, government hospitals and public health facilities by licensees providing internet access;

"Public Health Facility" means a public health care facility established or deemed to be established in terms of the Public Health Act No. 5 of 1969:

"Government Hospital" means a hospital established or deemed to be established in terms of the Public Health Act No 5 of 1969, as amended from time to time;

"Status quo analysis" means the current state of the Information Communication Technology (ICT) industry in a particular area including universal access and universal service provision;

"True Access Gap area or zone" means the extent of public access to electronic communications, at affordable prices, determined by following the process set out in these regulations;

"Universal Access" means the extent of public access to electronic communications at affordable prices determined by following the process set out in these regulations;

"Universal Access Fund" means the universal access fund established in terms of Regulation 4.

Power Functions of the Commission

3. (1) The Commission shall pursuant to the Act and these regulations promote the objectives of universal service and access by monitoring and enforcing compliance with specific annual obligations, Licence Conditions and objectives of the Commission by all persons who are subject to the Act and these regulations.

(2) In applying and implementing these regulations, the Commission shall –

(a) designate universal service providers with obligations to provide universal services;

(b) monitor and enforce compliance with and the carrying out of universal service plans by the universal service providers; and (c) monitor and enforce a mechanism for the assessment, collection and recovery of the universal service levy.

PART II UNIVERSAL ACCESS FUND

Establishment of the Universal Access Fund

4. (1) The Commission shall operate a separate and dedicated account approved by the Board, with an authorised bank in Eswatini, in which all monies received in terms of the Act and these regulations or allocated otherwise for the provision of universal services shall be deposited.

(2) All payments to be made and provided for in terms of the Act and these regulations are to be made from this account.

Responsibilities of the Chief Financial Officer

5. The Chief Financial Officer of the Commission shall be responsible for the accounting of monies received and payments made from the Universal Access Fund, and shall keep or cause proper accounts and records of account to be kept as are necessary to represent fairly the state of affairs of the Universal Access Fund.

Universal Access Fund Contributions

6.(1) Every provider of public electronic communications services shall contribute annually to the universal access fund, such amount, as determined by the Commission, based on the estimated cost of achieving universal service targets, which amount may not exceed two per cent (2per cent) of the relevant licensee's Annual Turnover.

(2) Payments in respect of contributions to the universal access fund shall be –

(a) due annually on or before the due date, which is six (6) months after the licensee's financial year end;

(b) paid by way of an electronic transfer or via a direct deposit into the account operated in terms of Regulation 4(1);

(c) based on the audited financial statement of the licensee or financial statements signed and swom to by the accounting officer of the licensee where the licensee is not legally obliged to provide audited financial statements.

(3) The Commission may charge interest for every day that the licensee is in arrears in respect of contributions to the Universal Access Fund, based on the applicable interest rate.

(4) A person who contravenes the provisions of this regulation commits an offence and shall on conviction be liable to a fine not exceed five hundred thousand Emalangeni (E500 000).

ON THE FACE OF IT:

"YOU'RE stupid." "Nobody else would ever want you", "and you'll never be good enough to do that"

These are some of the words that women who are subjected to emotional abuse receive on a daily basis. Unfortunately, women seldom take their abuse seriously, and may dismiss it as normal domestic conflict yet the effects can be very devastating

Thousands of women are emotionally abused on a day to day basis.

Slowly, systematically, their self-confidence is whittled away, their self-esteem is eroded, and their perception of themselves is distorted, and sadly they don't even know its happening. Emotional abuse can be defined as any non-physical behaviour that is designed to control, intimidate, subjugate, demean, punish, or isolate another person through the use of degradation, humiliation, or fear. The behaviour ranges from verbal abuse (belittling, berating, constant criticism) to more subtle tactics like intimidation, manipulation, and refusal to be pleased.

Such abuse is used as a way to maintain power and control over someone. It can feel as destructive and damaging as physical abuse, and can severely impact your mental health. Emotional abuse is a lot more confusing to victims, as it typically is found in behaviours that can initially be perceived as caring.

The primary effects of emotional abuse on the victim are depression, lack of motivation, confusion, difficulty concentrating or making decisions, low self-esteem, feelings of failure or worthlessness, feelings of hopelessness, self-blame, and self-destructiveness to name a few. This form of abuse is like brainwashing in that it wears away the victim's self-confidence, sense of self-worth, trust in his or her perceptions, and self-concept. Eventually, the recipient loses all sense of self and all remnants of personal value

Abused partners tend either to take on the criticism and rejection of their partner or to be in constant turmoil, wondering things like: Am I as bad as she makes me out to be, or is she just impossible to please? Should I stay in this relationship, or should I go? If I'm as incompetent as he says I am, maybe I can't make it on my own. Maybe no one will ever love me again. Ultimately, given

enough time, most victims of emotional abuse come not only to blame themselves for all the problems in the relationship but also to believe that they are inadequate, contemptuous, and even unlov-

Emotional abuse is considered by many to be the most painful form of violence and the most detrimental to self-esteem. Emotional abuse cuts to the very core of a person, creating scars that may be longer lasting than physical ones. With emotional abuse, the insults, insinuations, criticism, and accusations slowly eat away at the victim's self-esteem until he or she is incapable of judging a situation realistically.

You may begin to believe that there is something wrong with you or even fear that you are losing your mind. You become so beaten down emotionally that you blame yourself for the abuse. Emotional abuse poisons a relationship and infuses it with hostility, contempt, and hatred. No matter how much a couple once loved each other, once emotional abuse becomes a consistent aspect of the relationship, that love is overshadowed by fear, anger, guilt, and shame.

The nature of emotional abuse makes it hard to tell if you being abused. You can use the following pointers to determine if you in an emotionally abusive relationship. Do you feel as if your partner treats you like a child?

Does he constantly correct you or chastise you because your behaviour is "inappropriate"?,

Does your partner make a point of reminding you that you are less educated or that you make less money or that you aren't as attractive as she is?

Does your partner routinely ridicule, dismiss, or disregard your opinions, thoughts, suggestions, and feelings?, Does your partner constantly belittle your accomplishments, your aspirations, or your plans for the future?

Do you find yourself "walking on eggshells"? Do you spend a lot of time monitoring your behaviour and/or watching for your partner's bad moods before bringing up a subject?

Does your partner frequently threaten to end the relationship if you don't do things her way? If you answered half or more of these questions with a yes, you are definitely being emotionally abused. But a yes answer to even a few of the above questions can also indicate emotional abuse. More than anything else, what characterises an emotionally abusive relationship is a consistent pattern of hurtful, humiliating, and condescending behavior. Emotional abuse is a quiet killer, hence it is very important to take note of it before it destroys your

Private jets out of town and luxury hideouts: How the rich are preparing for coronavirus

ONE investor may fly to Idaho with or without family. A doctor in a Colorado ski town is soothing wealthy clients who want a cure. And one New Yorker called up the hospital with his name on it.

Like everyone across the US, the rich are bracing for a deadly coronavirus outbreak. Ken Langone, the co-founder of Home Depot Inc., watched President Donald Trump's press conference and wondered if the media was overplaying the risk - but he also made two well-placed phone calls from his winter outpost in North Palm Beach. One was to a top executive of NYU Langone Health, and the other was to a top scientist there. Both were reassuring.

"What I've been told by people who are smarter than me in disease is, "As of right now it's a bad flu," said Langone, an 84-year-old who loves capitalism so much that he wrote a book called "I Love Capitalism!" He plans to come back to New York this month for an appointment. If he happens to feel sick, he will go to NYU Langone, and said he'd expect no special treatment. Some billionaires, bankers and other members

of the U.S. elite are calm, others are getting anxious and everyone is washing their hands. But the rich can afford to prepare for a pandemic with perquisites, like private plane rides out of town, calls with world-leading experts and access to luxurious medical care.

"It's been a full-on war-room situation over here," said Jordan Shlain, an internist and managing partner of Private Medical, a high-end concierge service. The company is procuring hundreds of full-body coverings for work that includes visits in San Francisco, Silicon Valley, Los Angeles and New York.

"We have to beg, borrow or steal. Well, not steal - beg, borrow and pay."

Tim Kruse, a doctor who makes house calls in Aspen, Colorado, said "the wealthy aren't going to necessarily have access to things that the common person is not going to have access to." But that hasn't stopped them from asking if they can get their hands on a coronavirus vaccine. "The answer is no. They just want to know."

YERF loans disbursed, collected through MTN MoMo

THE Youth Enterprise Revolving Fund (YERF) now uses MTN Mobile Money to disburse loans to young people who have successfully secured them from the Fund.

This development started last month, February 2020.

YERF has an agreement with MTN Eswatini to set up a collections account. Through this MTN Mobile Money account, it will now be easy for their clients to repay their loans in the comfort of their homes or businesses.

Speaking in an interview, YERF Chief Executive Officer, Bhekizwe Maziya confirmed that the inflow of repayments and disbursement of funds to budding entrepreneurs

was now transferred through MTN MoMo. He said this was done to improve efficiencies in the collection and disbursement of funds.

"In the past, some of our clients defaulted in their loan repayment and from our investigations; we discovered that as much as some of them did have the instalment to repay their business loans, they did not have bus fare for them to take a bus to town where they could deposit money into a banking account.

"As a result, they would end up not paying on time, or not paying at all," he said.

Maziya acknowledged that since it was still too early to say how this new development is being received, it had the potential to make massive improvements in the process of disbursing loans and collecting

re-payments from their clients.

He also explained that through MTN MoMo they could monitor transactions to ensure that loans from them are used for what they were requested.

Meanwhile MTN Eswatini Corporate Affairs Manager Mandla Luphondvo said the adoption of MTN MoMo by the Fund for disbursements and re-payments was an endorsement of the credibility, safety and convenience of the platform Mobile Money.

"MTN believes the direction taken by YERF to use this platform is tangible assurance to about 700, 000 MoMo subscribers that they made the right call to be part of it. Our customers can still expect more convenience, products and services as MTN walks with Emaswati towards digitalising the kingdom, "he said.

On another note, Maziya indicated that while MTN availed E100, 000 to young people through MTN-YERF Khula Natsi Fund, launched during MTN's 21 Days of Y'ello Care, only E52 000 has been disbursed to the winning loan appli-

"Seeing that we still have E48 000 that has not been accessed, instead of issuing fresh invitations to the public, which would have been expensive, we have agreed with MTN to follow-up young people whose business loan applications were not successful.

"We are aware of the shortfalls of their loan applications. And, some of the factors which led to the rejection of their loan applications can be addressed," explained

Dangote pledges N200m towards coronavirus in Nigeria

JOHANNESBURG-The Aliko Dangote Foundation has pledged N200 million (about US\$548 000) to support the Nigerian government's efforts towards curbing the spread of COVID-19, a disease from the new coronavirus first detected in China.

The foundation's intervention is considered the largest single donation by a corporate organisation in the country since Nigeria recorded its first case of the disease last month.

ADF Managing Director and CEO Zouera Youssoufou said the foundation had earmarked N124 million to support facilities in preventing, assessing and responding to health events at Nigerian points of entry. The foundation would also provide facilities worth N36 million to support the government's surveillance and epidemiology efforts.

The ADF is the philanthropic endeavour of Nigerian billionaire businessman Aliko Dangota, the richest man in Africa.

Nigerian President Muhammadu

Buhari has previously lauded Dangote for his contributions towards fighting Ebola and polio in Nigeria.

Closer to home, The South African National Defence Force (SANDF) says it will be part of a multi-disciplinary team instructed by President Cyril Ramaphosa to repatriate citizens from the COVID-19 hit city of Wuhan in China.

The department of defence said on Tuesday approximately 151 South African citizens would be repatriated, at the request of their

"Once all the logistics have been confirmed by the planners, who are busy with the planning of the operation, the repatriation process will then commence," it said in a statement.

"The repatriation planning process is currently at an advanced stage and takes into consideration everything related to the logistics for the operation."

Nedbank wipes off R2bn market cap after profits

DURBAN - Nedbank wiped nearly R2 billion off its market cap in early trade on Tuesday before recovering to just under half-a-billion after it reported that recession-like pressures in South Africa had pushed its profits down 7.3 per cent to R12.5 billion during the year to December.

Nedbank said its earnings took a knock on impairment charges and the country's stagnant economy, which forced households to withhold finances and curtail credit demand.

Nedbank Chief Executive Mike Brown said South Africa's estimated economic growth of 0.3 per cent in 2019 was much slower than initially expected due to the



severity of frequent power outages, the unsustainable fiscal trajectory and ongoing policy uncertainty combined with a deteriorating global outlook.

"Under these difficult domestic conditions, company profits and household finances deteriorated during the year," Brown said. Business Report

Nigeria tops SA as the continent's biggest economy

JOHANNESBURG - As if a recession wasn't enough bad news for South Africa, it's now confirmed as the continent's second-largest economy.

The answer to the question of whether South Africa or Nigeria, the two countries that account for almost half of sub-Saharan Africa's gross domestic product, is the biggest economy on the continent has long depended on which exchange rate you use for the

West African nation.

But now both the official naira rate of 306 per dollar and the weaker market exchange rate of around 360 that almost all investors use put Nigeria

Nigeria's economic growth beat forecasts in the fourth quarter, helping its economy to expand the most in four years in 2019 as oil output increased and the central bank took steps to boost credit growth. GDP in the West African

country stood at \$476 billion or \$402 billion, depending on the rate used.

It slumped into a second recession in consecutive years, contracting more than projected in the fourth quarter as power cuts weighed on output and business confidence. For the full year, expansion was 0.2 per cent, the least since the global financial crisis, and even less than the central bank and government estimated.

Trump holds phone call with Taliban leader

WASHINGTON - US President Donald Trump spoke by phone call with the leader of the Taliban, he said on Tuesday, just days after Washington signed a historic deal with the militants.

Trump, speaking to reporters at the White House, said he had "a very good talk with the leader of the Taliban," without naming him.

The 35-minute call, which the Taliban said took place around Tuesday afternoon, came a day after the group ended a partial truce and threw into doubt peace talks between Kabul and the Taliban which are due to begin on March 10, according to a US-Taliban agreement signed on Saturday.

A transcript of the phone call released by the Taliban quoted fighter-turned-negotiator Mullah Baradar urging Trump to "take determined actions in regards to the withdrawal of foreign forces from Afghanistan".

Under the terms of the US-Taliban agreement, foreign forces will quit Afghanistan within 14 months, subject to Taliban security guarantees and a pledge by the insurgents to hold talks with Kabul.

But a dispute over a prisoner swap has raised questions about whether the negotiations between Kabul and the Taliban will go ahead. AFP

KENYAN GOVT BANS FIRMS FROM EXPORTING FACE MASKS

JOHANNESBURG - The Kenya government has announced a ban on the export of face masks, aiming to ensure that the country was well-prepared for coronavirus that has infected about 90 000 people across 58 countries.

The ban comes after President Uhuru Kenyatta gave an executive order to set up a National Emergency Response Committee which would guide Kenya's preparedness for the coronavirus, according to the Soko Directory.

The Citizen on Monday reported that Kenya Medical Supplies Authority (Kemsa) Chief Executive Officer Jonah Manjari said that the government had banned local manufacturers and distributors from exporting N95 AND three-ply surgical masks to ensure that the country had enough stock as part of its emergency plan.

The demand for face masks and gloves has skyrocketed since the coronavirus started to spread like a wildfire across the world, according to the publication.

Manjari revealed that the government also placed orders for emergency materials and medicines that would be required in the wake of a coronavirus outbreak.

The Soko Directory reported that Chinese customers were now ordering face masks for export from Kenya and other African countries, that has led to the stock for face masks and other protective clothing to decline and to curb the low supply in China.



Togo Court confirms president's election triumph

TOGO - Togo's constitutional court on Tuesday rejected opposition claims of electoral fraud and declared Faure Gnassingbe the winner with more than 70 per cent of the February vote and president for a fourth term.

In the final tally, the incumbent garnered 70.78 per cent of the ballots while opposition leader and former prime minister Agbeyome Kodjo took 19.46 per cent, the court said.

"Having obtained the absolute majority of votes in the first round of the ballot, Mr Faure Gnassingbe has to be declared elected president of the republic," announced Aboudou Assouma, President of the court.

A petition filed by Kodjo, who heads the Movement of Patriots for Democracy and Development, was annulled by the court which found it "lacked evidence likely to support the allegations".

"I dispute with all my strength these results," said Kodjo, who had declared himself the winner before provisional results were released.

Court sentences 21-year-old man to death for robbery

ABUJA- A 21-year-old Nigerian man has been sentenced to death for armed robbery by a High Court sitting in Ado-Ekiti.

The Guardian Nigeria reported on Monday that Isa Abdulkareem was to be hanged for robbing two people of money and cellphones.

While handing down the sentence, it was reported that Justice Oluwatoyin Abodu said, "I found the defendant guilty and he is sentenced to death by hanging. May the Lord have mercy on his soul"

The publication said that the prosecutor, Gbemiga Adaramola, told the court that Abdulkareem was armed with a gun and cutlass when he robbed his



victims. According to the report, he robbed one person of more than R3 100 and the other one a little over R4 700.

"The robbery operation took place at Oke-Ureje, along Igirigiri Road, Ado Ekiti. The defendant was arrested by the community members during a combined vigilante exercise. On interrogation, he confessed to committing the crime and took security agents to their hideout where they met gang members and kept their weapons," the prosecutor was quoted saying. "Exhibits recovered at the hideout include four dane guns and toy guns, locally-made pistols, four Nokia phones, four techno phones, masks, cutlasses, charms, an axe, victim's wife headgear used to wrap the money, expended cartridges, knives, pellets, cash sum of R 428.48 among others." TENNESSEE - Tornadoes ripped through Tennessee early on Tuesday, claiming at least 23 lives as they destroyed buildings and toppled power lines, hours before the southern US state voted in Super Tuesday primaries.

Devastation could be seen across the rubblestrewn state capital Nashville, where a tornado touched down shortly after midnight.

Residents described running for their lives as their homes came down around them, with the authorities reporting that tens of thousands were without power. AFP

Ramaphosa 'shocked' to find journalists in Tuynhuys

JOHANNESBURG - "I am shocked!" President Cyril Ramaphosa said in mock surprise as he entered a room filled with some of his staunchest critics - journalists - on Tuesday.

The journalists laughed as he used the oft-derided phrase of his.

The journalists had been waiting on the president for a few minutes in a briefing room in Tuynhuys the grand old Cape Dutch manor next to Parliament which serves as the president's Cape Town office for an engagement organised by the Presidency and the South African National Editors' Forum (SANEF), to which members of the Parliamentary Press Gallery were also invited.

While the president expressed his mock shock, it was, in fact, the assembled journalists who should have been surprised because an onthe-record engagement with Ramaphosa is a very rare occur-

As is the practice when journalists are invited to Tuynhuys, they

had to be there an hour before the scheduled start, on Tuesday this meant at 13:00. After hanging about in a waiting room close to the entrance - not the fancy entrance behind the gates - the journalists were ushered to a boardroom.

After sitting there for a few minutes, they were welcomed by presidential spokesperson Khusela Diko, and then shown to another room, where a lunch was served.

From there, it was on to the briefing room. Usually, the room would have rows of chairs, but on this occasion the chairs were behind round tables, with two chairs and a podium on the low stage.

Ramaphosa took his seat on one of the chairs, smiling. Dressed in his usual garb of a suit, dress shirt and tie, he appeared relaxed.

"I am shocked!" he joked again, when acting SANEF Chairperson Katy Katopodis said that Diko contacted SANEF about the engagement days after the media organisation resolved to request such a meeting.

Ramaphosa started off by saying that journalists played a "significant role in exposing state capture and corruption" and said the media had an important role to play as a "bulwark against abuses of power".

He said the media had also been affected by the weak economy.

As he spoke about the economy with a serious expression, he said the fact that South Africa was in a technical recession didn't come as a "shock or surprise," because the signs were there. News24

Traditional healers jailed for scam

JOHANNESBURG - Three traditional healers were sentenced to an accumulative 13 years in jail by the East London Regional Court for fraud and theft after they scammed a 63-year-old former teacher out of her pension money.

According to police spokesperson Captain Anelisa Ngcakani, the three Ungandan nationals - Jimmy Peter Sellwuju, 27. Mohamed Wamubirigue, 57, and Brian Kibirigue, 32 - executed their scam from January to August 2017, which entailed convincing the teacher from Lusikisiki to resign from her job and hand over her pension to them for a "spiritual cleansing" that would lead to her ancestors multiplying

"With the guidance of Wamubirigue, the 63-year-old then participated in a series of spiritual rituals which resulted in her resigning from work as she believed that her ancestors would multiply her pension to millions of rands.

She then handed over R1.6 million of her pension money to the men who then fled with the cash to Port Elizabeth.

"Knowing that the pensioner still had more cash in her account, she was instructed to withdraw the remaining R90 000." News 24

Agony for crash victims' families

EASTERN CAPE - The families of the victims of Monday's horror bus crash that claimed 29 lives and left 68 people injured near Centane, Eastern Cape, on Tuesday began the agonising process of identifying their loved ones at Butterworth Forensic Mortuary.

MEC for transport Weziwe Tikana-Gxothiwe said the postmortems were expected to start on Tuesday and that Africa Best (AB350) Bus Company had provided free transport to take family members from Cebhe village in Centane to Butterworth

Transport Minister Fikile Mbalula placed the death toll at 29, with around 60 people injured. Mbalula said it was believed that the bus driver lost control of the vehicle, but further investigations into the cause of the crash were still being conducted.

He visited those who were still in hospital and also addressed concerned comi nity members, promising harsher punishment for those operating unroadworthy public transport vehicles.

Survivors including Bukelwa Nkonki, 33, and Vulindlela Malambisa, 53, who miraculously escaped the crash almost unhurt, told Sowetan's sister publication Dispatch Live that the bus was speeding and had been overloaded.

The AB350 65-seater rolled numerous times, uprooting trees, for almost 400m down an embankment at Kats Pass at Mahlathimane, Nxoxha village.

Constantly changing DGs has weakened the state – Ramaphosa

JOHANNESBURG - President Cyril Ramaphosa says that, for the sake of strengthening good governance, he is in favour of the idea that directors general (DGs) serve longer terms in state departments than the prescribed fiveyear contract terms currently in place.

Ramaphosa made the comments during a meeting with the media and the South African National Editors' Forum at Tuynhuys in Cape Town on Tuesday.

The president said he believed

DGs needed to serve longer terms. "As a minister came into office,

they felt that: 'I didn't like this DG,' and then they were changed and another [came] in," said Ramaphosa.

"Part of the weakening of the state came about when DGs were changed."

The president said the five-year contracts were seen as a way to usher the country's apartheid-era civil service out of the government of national unity and sunset claus-

"The problem is, we let the pendulum swing too much the other

way, to a point where we started losing what strengthens the state, of having a professional - if you like - cohort of civil servants, who know their task is to serve the people of South Africa," said the pres-

Currently, directors general lose focus of their mandate mid-term as they start to "prepare" to leave their posts and find other jobs, Ramaphosa added.

"You start looking elsewhere because you are not so sure [the new] minister looks at you with

favour every morning, a smile and so forth. You think I should start preparing to get out of here and you defocus," he said.

The issue has been something Ramaphosa has attempted to address in the past. Several reports following the 2019 elections suggested he was considering having administrative heads of departments report directly to him and taking away ministers' power to appoint their preferred DGs.

DEPLOYED TROOPS ENGAGING IN SEX ACTS BLIGHTS SANDF

PRETORIA - The wave of sexual misconduct and abuse claims against deployed troops is a thorn in the side of the SANDF.

This was highlighted during the seventh Accountability Colloquium conference in the capital city attended by 80 delegates from 30 African nations.

South Africa co-hosted the Accountability Colloquium conference with the United States of America Africa Command members, a specialised conference on military operations for African military commanders, chiefs of staff and legal advisers throughout the continent.

The annual conference discusses legal issues and the importance of operational commanders seeking advice from their legal advisers to ensure adherence to the rule of law.

Adjutant-General of the SANDF Major-General Eric Mnisi said sexual misconduct by deployed troops, especially in the DRC, had become a huge embar-



rassment for the humanitarian sector. "One of the challenges we are facing is sexual exploitation and abuse.

This is not necessarily rape, but basically troops having consensual sexual relations with the locals, like in the case of the DRC," he said.

"That is forbidden by the UN, but unfortunately our colleagues fall in love with the locals and this compromises the mission at hand."

Softened

Mnisi said this was of great concern because not only were soldiers sidetracked from and softened in their approach to their mission, but they also left children in those countries.

"Who is going to maintain them? We are dealing with paternity issues to make sure children that we leave behind in deployment areas are well looked after, just like those we have here at home."

Deputy legal counsel to the United States Africa Command Mark Maxwell said this was what the three-day conference sought to bring forth.


JOHANNESBURG - Mpumalanga police yesterday condemned the torching of a church and the damage to property of a

While they were busy trying to extinguish the blaze, the pastor received a call informing him that his church had also been set alight, he said.

Hlathi said police found a message addressed to the pastor on the wall of the church.

"The writing, among other things, accused

SEX WORKERS WHO DIED IN 2018, 2019 WERE MURDERED

JOHANNESBURG -Nearly half of the 101 sex workers who died in SA in 2018 and 2019, were murdered.

This figure was revealed in a report released by the Sex Workers Education & Advocacy Taskforce (SWEAT) to mark International Sex Worker Rights Day on Tuesday.

The report stated that nearly half of the deaths were probably attributable to murder.

ably attributable to murder. From 2014 to 2017, SWEAT received reports that 118 sex workers had died. More than half of these deaths (55 per cent) were as a result of murder. SWEAT said the report revealed high levels and particularly brutal forms of violence levelled against sex workers in South Africa.

The organisation said it had arrived at the figure of 101 deaths after consulting with Sisonke and its other partners. Three of the victims were identified as "transwom-xn", while the rest were female. SWEAT said the women's

average age was 36 years,

"While information about the circumstances of the deaths and about the people who had lost their lives were limited, the research team could ascertain that almost half (48.5 per cent) of the deaths were due to non-natural causes. "While this information cannot be directly compared to a national sample of deaths, it is useful to note that natural deaths in the general population significantly outnumbers non-natural ones." 
the true meaning and significance of anointing. "Many individuals have a lot to say on the use of oil in the church, I want to





Lampard has given youth a chance this season with Mason Mount, a regular starter, also impressive against Liverpool.

The diminutive Gilmour really caught the eye though with his incisive passing, tackling and fearlessness on the ball.

Lampard could hardly contain the smile when asked about the player snapped up from the Rangers academy.

Performance

"What an incredible performance for a young player," Lampard told the BBC. "He was a calm head in that first five or 10 minutes. He's a throwback of a midfielder.

"Can you put your foot in? Yes. Can you make angles to play the passes? Yes. He's only slight in stature but he's huge in personality. He deserves people to talk about him after a performance like that."

Goals by Willian in the 13th minute, courtesy of a ghastly mistake by Liverpool keeper Adrian, and Ross Barkley in the 64th minute, made it a great night for the eight-time Cup winners.

They were indebted to recalled goalkeeper Kepa Arrizabalaga to keep them ahead though as the Spaniard, dropped in January, made three saves in quick succession from Sadio Mane, Divock Origi and Liverpool teenager Curtis Jones.

Klopp blames FA Cup ball

"Fabinho was surprised by the pass. We wanted to play like this but we lose that ball and they finish it off."

The defeat is Liverpool's third in their last four games after going down to Atletico Madrid and Watford.

Goss, Doutie get lengthy bans for abusing official





MBAPPE, NEYMAR CLASH WITH PSG

PARIS - Superstar duo Kylian Mbappe and Neymar have reportedly clashed with Paris Saint-Germain's leadership, casting further doubt over their futures at the club amid speculation linking them with Real Madrid and FC Barcelona, respectively.

The two forwards reportedly have the same issue at PSG, with the French club seemingly not prepared to release them for the 2020 Olympic Games.

According to L'Equipe, Les Parisiens have sent a letter to the French Football Federation stating their opposition to Mbappe being called up for the Olympics, while Neymar is expected to get similar treatment.

Both players, though, are keen to take part in the tournament in Japan, where they could be drawn against South Africa's U23 national team.

The Olympics is not considered an official FIFA tournament, which allows clubs to oppose the release of their players.

The main issue stems from the fact that both Mbappe and Neymar seemingly want to play in two international tournaments in the off-season after the 2019/20 club campaign ends.

In Mbappe's case, that would be the 2020 UEFA European Championship plus the Olympics,



while Neymar wants to take part in the 2020 Copa America as well as the tournament in Tokyo.

This is the latest in what is becoming an increasingly strained rela-

tionship between Mbappe and PSG, with some of the club's fans getting more and more frustrated with the 21-year-old's antics of late.

Real and Barca are said to be watch-

ing the situation from afar, and are reportedly prepared to offer PSG's two superstars an escape route.

Middendorp explains why Frosler had to be in the starting XI

JOHANNESBURG - Kaizer Chiefs coach Ernst Middendorp has explained why he played normal right-back Reeve Frosler at leftback in Saturday's 1-0 Absa Premiership Soweto derby win against Orlando Pirates at FNB Stadium.

Middendorp said he needed the defensive abilities of Kgotso Moleko on the right side of defence because Pirates' left side is far stronger in attack.

But the coach said he could not discard Frosler from his XI, who Middendorp considers a key component of his gameplan on defence and attack.

"If you watched Orlando Pirates' games – it doesn't matter if they were playing Black Leopards or Sundowns; and I followed them, going to the stadium – then you see 80 percent of their forward movement comes from the inverted positioning, Gabadinho Mhango to this [left attacking] side, Thembinkosi Lorch from this side," Middendorp said.

"And for me it was very crucial to have a player with a heart, being robust, on a defensive level [on the right], which Kgotso Moleko did.

"So now, I have a problem at the next stage. An outstanding player like Reeve Frosler, I can't leave him out.

"He is able to contribute not just with the defence but to the forward movement. It was a big question for us. We found the solution to

play him there [on the left].

"The right fullback we needed the defensive part, and the left more attacking, overlapping and so on. And I'm very happy at how it worked."

Questions will be asked about what this decision conveys to Siphosakhe Ntiya-Ntiya, the good attacking left-back who was on the bench for Chiefs on Saturday.

In the end, Middendorp made a call on who served his gameplan best, and the match result would appear to indicate that, as with the brave decision to persist with manof-the-match Daniel Akpeyi in goal, the coach got it right.

Moleko played more as right centreback than right-back, so defensive was he. Consequently right midfielder Kearyn Baccus operated more as a wing-back.

An effective 3-5-2 formation squeezed dangerous Bucs in midfield. Moleko did his job roughing up Pirates' left side of attack, and Frosler was dangerous on the overlap on Chiefs' left.

Coronavirus will not derail **Euro plans**


ZURICH - UEFA President Aleksander Ceferin said he was confident European football's governing body could deal with any worst-case scenario in relation to the upcoming Euro 2020 as the continent battles to contain the spread of the coronavirus.

COVID-19 has been detected in 76 countries worldwide, killing over 3 000 people with Italy the worst-hit nation in Europe.

The Italian capital Rome is one of 12 venues across the continent set to host matches at the European Championship in June and July.

A long list of sports events around the world have been cancelled or postponed in recent days to avoid spreading the virus, including games in Italy's Serie A. The top two divisions of Swiss football have been postponed until the end of March.

"You don't know how many concerns we have when we organise a big competition," Ceferin said at a press conference after the UEFA Congress in Amsterdam. "We have security concerns, we have political instability concerns, and one of the concerns is also the virus, and we are dealing with it and we are confident we can deal with it." This week marks 100 days until the start of the 24-team European Championship, and Ceferin called on organisers to "not just think about dark scenarios, there will be time for that later." AFP





to confirm their participa-


tion within the next fortnight. Eswatini will field legends who have played for the national team.
