SUPREME COURT BLASTS PEOPLE SETTLING DISPUTES THROUGH THE DEAD

• Supreme Court Judge Phesheya Dlamini says court has observed with serious concern cases of people settling monetary, chieftaincy disputes using the dead, says court cannot be party to this

• He was making reference to present appeal application in the late Victor Shabangu burial dispute which has seen the deceased spending two years in morgue

THE Supreme Court has raised serious concerns about Emaswati who use the dead in settling their scores, resulting in the deceased persons not resting in peace in the process.

Supreme Court (SC) Judge Phesheya Dlamini yesterday said it was disheartening to note that people used bodies of their dead relatives in fighting over monetary, land and chieftaincy disputes in the kingdom.

Judge Dlamini was making reference to the present appeal application in the burial dispute for the late University of Eswatini employee and former sport administrator Victor Shabangu, which was before the Supreme Court in its first day of its first session for the 2020 legal calendar year yesterday.

SC Judge Dlamini also cited a case of another dead body that was made to languish at the mortuary for about five years without burial, although he did not mention names, one of the cases was that of the late Chief Mzikayise of Mkhwakhweni, whose remains remained at the mortuary for five years following a chieftaincy dispute in that area.

ng a chieftaincy dispute in that area. Shabangu's remains have been lan-

guishing at the Dups Funeral Home for two years now as his father, mother and his wife are embroiled in a dispute to bury him.

"The deceased should have been resting in peace by now, but seemingly, his body is being used to fight monetary issues, for a year and a half, the deceased's body has been kept in the mortuary, as a country we are known as Christians, however, the way things are happening leaves a lot to be desired. This matter is of utmost urgency as it should be dealt with a sense to finalise it," SC Judge Dlamini said.

The judge further stated that the court cannot be party to people who use the dead in settling their scores, hence it will not allow such to happen, dismissing an application filed by the appellant to have the matter postponed.

The late Victor's father, Pitoli Shabangu wants him buried at his home in Moneni, his mother Joyce Nsibandze wants him buried at her home in Ngculwini, while his wife also wants to be accorded burial rights. The wife, Xolile Ntombikayise Zwane, has since filed an appeal against a decision of the High Court in its judgment handed down on November 29 2019. The High Court as per Judge John Magagula pronounced itself ordering that the deceased's father Pitoli should be the one burying the deceased, hence the present appeal application before court.

Cited as the appellant in the matter is Zwane while Pitoli, Nomvuyo Kunene (deceased's second wife), Dups Funeral Home, the National Commissioner of Police, the Attorney General and Joyce Nsibandze have been cited as the respondents in the appeal. The appellant is represented by lawyer Thabiso Mavuso, while the respondent is represented by lawyer Thandeka Hlabangana.

Landlord (51) on trial for 'raping' tenant (29)

A woman who trusted that her landlord had her best interests at heart had her dignity violated, after he allegedly assaulted and raped her.

According to Primrose*, she was relaxing at one of her male friend's house in her compound when Mthunzi 'Portable' Dlamini arrived.

"Portable' requested me to accompany him to a Ndwandwe woman's home, where he had left his cellphone charging. It was around 8pm when he made his request, although I was apprehensive at first, my friend convinced me to go with him, stating that I was safer because 'Portable' was my landlord. We left for the Ndwandwe homestead and along the way, 'Portable' asked us to go back to the compound as it was already late in the evening," Primrose submitted. To her surprise, 'Portable' suggested that they take a different route to the one they had used when walking towards the Ndwandwe homestead. That was when she noticed that 'Portable' was in the possession of a candle and a sharp object.

Assault

"When I asked him why we were using another route, he said we must use the one leading towards the royal kraal. As we walked, he assaulted me with open hands. When I asked why he was assaulting me, he started hurling profane insults towards me. That was when he forced himself on to me, and raped me," she recalled.

After he was done, Primrose recalled that he continued to assault her by strangulating her and dragging her towards an abandoned house. "He stopped in his tracks when a man, accompanied by a woman responded to my screams. When the man asked him why he was dragging me while I was clearly refusing to go with him, 'Portable'

let me go and ran away. That was when the couple took me to the police station to report the matter," she stated.

After she recorded a statement at the police station, 'Portable' was apprehended and charged with the offence of rape.

During the continuation of trial before Principal Magistrate Fikile Nhlabatsi, 'Portable' disputed that he was the man that Primrose spoke of, after Thembekile Ndwandwe testified that she came to her home with a piece of 'Portable's tongue.

Witness

"She knocked at my door and after I invited her in, she entered carrying something concealed in her palm. When I asked to take a look at it, she showed me a small piece of appendage that I later learnt was a piece of tongue. I was taken aback and before I could comment, Primrose was out of the door and headed to the police station," Ndwandwe submitted.

Ndwandwe further submitted that 'Portable' and Primrose arrived at her home prior to her sole arrival, to collect 'Portable's cellphone.

However in his cross examination, 'Portable' disputed that Primrose had a piece of his tongue, stating that his tongue was still intact. "I believe that Ndwandwe and Primrose colluded to make up stories about me, and I do not even understand why. My tongue is intact and has never been bitten off, so I do not know of any tongue of mine in Primrose's possession. Also, Ndwandwe stated that the incident occurred in January 2019, whereas Primrose stated that it occurred in July 2019. There are a lot of lies being told before the court," 'Portable' stated.

The matter pending before Principal Magistrate Nhlabatsi continues as the prosecution is set to parade its third witness.

*Name of the victim and the place where it happened has been withheld to protect the victim of rape.

MORTUARY FEES HAVE ESCALATED TO ABOUT E366 000

FOLLOWING the continued stay of the deceased in the mortuary, mortuary fees have escalated to about E366 000.

This is if calculations of E500 per day for mortuary fees is anything to go by as the deceased has spent about two years in the morgue.

Papers

According to papers filed before court, the morgue charges E500 per day to have the deceased's body kept there.

The late Shabangu died two years ago after succumbing to an illness while

under the employ of the University of Eswatini (UNESWA).

For a body to be kept in the morgue, each day counts, although some mortuaries do not charge mortuary fees when one has purchased the casket or coffin from them

Auditor General unpacks govt's E3 billion arrears

GOVERNMENT ministries and departments have over E3 billion of undisclosed or unreported arrears.

This was revealed by Auditor General Timothy Matsebula yesterday during a media briefing held at The Hilton Garden Hotel.

He said unreported or undisclosed arrears amounting to E3 194 134 221.91 have not been disclosed or reported in the detailed statement of liabilities.

This was contained in the consolidated financial statements of the government of the Kingdom of Eswatini for the year ended March 31, 2019.

The AG said it was observed that ministries and departments submitted payments for processing to the treasury department during the financial year under review, which were subsequently not processed due to cashflow chal-

lenges.

As a result, arrears for the financial year ended March 31, 2019 amounted to E1 810 458 400.06 while the previous financial year arrears amounted to E430 504 704.82. He stated that an increase of E1 379 953 695.24, amounting to 321 per cent in the arrears was noted. In addition to the arrears, was unpaid invoices held by the ministries and departments, amounting to E1 383 675 821.85. Matsebula said the non-disclosure of the arrears had understated total liabilities in the financial statements.

"I recommended that the treasury department should develop a system that will enforce all controlling officers to report monthly all unpaid invoices and arrears at the end of the financial year, March 31, to the accountant general and principal secretary of the ministry of finance," he said.

He added that the accountant general should ensure that all government

arrears were disclosed in the financial statements. In his response through a memorandum referenced 022/001/AR, dated October 25, 2019, the controlling officer stated that the reporting framework was on cash basis; therefore the arrears were disclosed as notes in the detailed statement of liabilities.

He said unreconciled government accounts, tended to give an erroneous picture of government's cash flow position. SEE MORE ON PAGE 20

CORONAVIRUS SUSPECT CLEAR

LISWATI suspected of coronavirus case has been cleared.

Director of Health Services Dr Vusi Magagula yesterday announced that the test results of the coronavirus suspect were negative for Covid-

The director stated that the patient was recovering and responding well to treatment.

"The experience has assisted us in shaping up the country's preparedness and response plan, as the ministry ensures that Emaswati are safe from the global health threat," he said.

Dr. Magagula, on behalf of the ministry of health, emphasised that the case at hand was a suspect case and was confirmed by World Health Organisation experts. He stated that the suspect was free from coronavirus as per the lab analysis in the Republic of South Africa.

He added that there was no other case at the moment in the country. "Preparedness and responses are strengthened at all levels and the ministry remains vigilant

at health facilities and ports of entry," he said. Magagula further urged the public not to stigmatise people based on their race or history of travel, but to be vigilant and practise the following;

Reduce your risk of coronavirus infection



Frequently clean hands by using alcohol-based hand rub or soap and water

When coughing and sneezing cover mouth and nose with flexed elbow or tissue - throw tissue away immediately and wash hands



- Cover nose and mouth when coughing or sneezing
- Wash hands regularly with soap and water, Open widows in buses and venues where people congregate
- Cooperate with screening at ports of entry and heath facilities

He said the ministry of health continues to support with resources and appreciates the support from Health partners in all interventions and activities regarding coronavirus infections.

Minister of Health Lizzy Nkosi, in a press statement, noted and expressed her concern over irresponsible and grossly misleading rumours which circulated on social media platforms following their announcement of the reported suspected case.

Nkosi said one such deceptive rumour claimed that a certain Chinese female has been confirmed to have the coronavirus and was in an isolation ward at Good Shepherd Hospital in Siteki.

Individuals

The minister clarified that, through its established structures, it is closely monitoring one suspected case of coronavirus in the country. The minister humbly requested individuals and social media groups to refrain from spreading fake rumours on such sensitive health matters.

She stated that such behaviour dangerously causes unnecessary alarm and undermines the efforts of the ministry to effectively manage

the situation at hand."

Nkosi said the nation would receive authentic information through the established chan-

"If you have fever, cough and difficulty breathing or flu-like symptoms and a history of travel seek medical attention," she said.

She urged health workers to screen all patients and take a detailed history of anyone coming with flu-like symptoms.

Meanwhile, 14 passengers, who were believed to be well before they were evacuated from a cruise ship in Japan yesterday were found to be infected before boarding a charter plane to the United States.

The passengers were among more than 300 Americans aboard a cruise ship that has been quarantined in Yokohama for more than 10

The death toll from the coronavirus outbreak in mainland China reached 1770 as of the end of Sunday, up by 105 from the previous day, according to the country's National Health Commission.

At least 100 of the new deaths were from the province of Hubei, the epicentre of the epidemic, the commission said yesterday.

Across the country, there were 2 048 new confirmed infections about 1 933 from Hubei alone, pushing the total to 70 548.

OVER E10 MILLION DEBTS NOT RECOVERED FOR FOUR YEARS

AUDITOR General Timothy Matsebula has revealed that close to E11 million has not been recovered for a period of four years.

An audit of consolidated statement of outstanding revenue has indicated that irrecoverable debts of E10 900 813.19 from the financial year ended March 31, 2016 have been outstanding for a period of over four years without being recovered by the ministries and departments.

This was contained in the report of the auditor general on the consolidated government

The ministries and departments with the outstanding debts include the ministry of commerce industry and trade, ministry of health, ministry of agriculture, ministry of enterprise and employment, the treasury department, His Majesty's Correctional Services as well as the regional revenue offices for the Manzini, Mbabane, Pigg's Peak as well as Siteki.

The AG said the responsible ministries and departments were not prioritising the recovery of the outstanding revenue, adding that he was not aware of any action undertaken towards recovering the debts that have been outstanding over a period of four years.

"The outstanding revenue should be recovered promptly and should not be written off until all efforts and possible measures have been exhausted," he said.

He said the controlling officer stated that the

E127m capital expenditure not captured in government system

CAPITAL expenditure does not show a true picture as foreign capital expenditure was erroneously classified as local expenditure.

The auditor general's report revealed that foreign capital expenditure amounting to E19 176 179.99 was erroneously classified as local capital expenditure in the statement of receipts and payments and statement of surplus and deficit.

Auditor General Timothy Matsebula said the expenditure consisted of strategic reserve fuel depot amounting to E18 093 527.29 as well as fuel marking and quality assurance amounting to E1 082 652.70.

Suppliers

He said furthermore, a payment amounting to E635 366 53 for strategic reserve fuel depot was erroneously captured as procurement of ambu-

"This error resulted in an overstatement of local capital expenditure and consolidated fund

deficit by the same figure," he said. He added that undisclosed capital expenditure of E127 552 344.40 were not captured into the government accounting system, and was neither accounted for by the accountant general. He stated these expenditures were omitted, as such the statement of capital expenditure did not show a true picture of all funds received from donors or financial institutions, and disbursements made directly to suppliers of goods or services.

Unauthorised over expenditure is a concern – AG

AUDITOR General Timothy Matsebula voiced a concern over unauthorised over expenditure as it has become a norm for ministries and departments.

He said in the financial year ended March 31, 2019, there was an unauthorised over expenditure of E861 017 063.57.

He stated it was now a norm for ministries, departments and agencies to spend beyond the appropriated budget by Parliament and on activities that have no budget provision, and to incur expenditure without seeking approval from the relevant authorities.

He added there was an unauthorised over expenditure of E844 660 883.23 incurred in excess of the recurrent expenditure budget released of E15 284 926 429.00; and the capital expenditure vote incurred an unauthorised over expenditure amounting to E16 356 180.34, in excess of the capital expenditure budget released of E2 207 497 331.00.

He said a worse scenario was incurring unauthorised expenditure of E31 874 395.35, which was spent without following any budget line in the estimates book.

He mentioned that non-compliance with laws and regulations and lack of adherence to budgetary requirements and spending authorities s concerning. "For instance, no budget appro priation for CTA trading operations continued to be funded directly from the government general bank account without a budget limit or restriction," he said.

He added that over the years, there has been no budget appropriation for the CTA operations, and public funds were spent without following the formal budgetary requirements and spending authorities.

As a result, in the financial year ended March 31, 2019, an amount of E602 196 943.46 was spent by the CTA without a distinctly approved budget appropriated by Parliament in the budget estimates book.

This contravened Financial and Accounting Instruction Number 0101, he said.



Lozitha High pupils report principal to Human Rights

ALLEGED insults and being told to go home without knowing when to return to school has become a norm for Lozitha High School pupils.

This was information that was forwarded to the Human Rights Commission by some pupils, who felt they had nowhere to turn to regarding the alleged treatment by their Principal Mandla Mathabela.

The pupils reported this to the commission yesterday morning after they were shown the gate for the third time in less than two weeks.

Information sourced from parties privy with details to the matter was to the effect that the pupils were told to go home after they forgot to bring to school their receipts to prove that they had paid school fees.

Since he had been sending those who had not paid and those who did not produce proof of payment back home, the pupils are said to have waited outside their classrooms after assembly.

They reportedly wanted to inform their principal that they had forgotten their receipts and that they would bring them the following day (last Wednesday).

Instead, Mathabela allegedly ordered the pupils out of the school premises. Their delay to exit the school grounds did not soften the principal's heart, as he allegedly

instructed them to leave and they complied though they loitered outside the school premises for a while. After some time, the principal is said to have left the school in his car and found the pupils hanging around Lozitha bus stop.

"He stopped a kombi that was headed for Manzini and told us to board it and go home. One of us did not have money so he did not board the kombi," some of the pupils said. The one scholar who did not board the kombi is said to live at Ludzeludze and he usually walks to and from school every day.

When he told the principal that he did not have money, Mathabela's response was that he should do as he says and that his colleagues would pay for him.

Knowing that his peers did not have extra cash to pay for him, the pupil walked away from the bus station and headed home. His actions were deemed by the principal as insolent, so he allegedly uttered the words, "ngalobudvomu bakho ngeke uphindze ubuye laskolweni."

Out of fear, the pupil reportedly did not go to school last Wednesday but went there on Thursday with the hope to apologise to the principal so that he could return to class. In the morning while Mathabela was in his car at the school, the scholar is said to have gone to him and asked for forgiveness. Surprisingly, Mathabela's response dampened

the scholar's efforts.

These pupils are not the only ones affected by the principal's iron-fist like way of running the school, as others claimed that being late for school was a serious offence.

They claimed that since the school starts at 7:30am, when one is five minutes late, they are sent home for the day. "Utocolisa kanyoko!" the principal allegedly responded.

Further, the pupil was shown the gate.

Yesterday, the same pupil is said to have taken his chances and went to class but he was yet again ordered to leave the school together with a colleague. It was for this reason that concerned parties involved the Human Rights Commission on the matter, as the pupils were found loitering outside the school premises. Parents of the pupils confirmed that their children had been told to go home though they had paid school fees.

When sought for comment, the Principal Mandla Mathabela referred questions to the Human Rights Commission as he had met a team regarding the matter.

"Sesicedzile ngalendzaba nebaka Human Rights Commission. Call them," he said.

Mathabela is not new to controversy involving scholars, as in November 2017 he was arrested and charged for beating an 18year-old female pupil with a black pipe. The scholar sustained severe injuries on the buttocks and hand after she was assaulted by the principal.

The pupil was told to go home to cut her hair as per the school

regulations. The injuries were severe so much that she had to be taken to hospital by her parents. At the time she was told to go, she was supposed to write an Agriculture test on the same day, so she saw it fit to approach her teacher and make arrangements to write the test the following day.

After the arrangement was made, she was requested by the same teacher to go and rinse her lunch tin and while rushing to rinse the lunch tin, she met up with Mathabela, who asked her why she was not heeding his orders to go and have her hair cut.

The pupil tried to explain to him that she had been sent by the teacher to whom she had gone to make an arrangement regarding her test.

The scholar was called to an office where she was allegedly severely assaulted on the buttocks with the black pipe.

While trying to block the pipe with her hand, she got injured on her right hand as well.

It's a sign of lack of communication - Human Rights

WHEN sought for comment on the matter, the Chairperson of Eswatini Human Rights Commission Sabelo Masuku confirmed that his office received a complaint against Mathabela and that a team went to the school yesterday.

He said preliminary findings by the Commission's team included that the pupils had been sent home after being suspend-

He said the principal informed the team that some of these pupils would fail to bring back their parents as per his instruction. More often than not, the pupils are said to sneak into class without informing their parents about their suspensions at the school.

Frustration

When quizzed about the vulgar language alleged to have been used by the principal, the chairman said this and everything else were signs of frustration and the lack of communication between the school administration, parents and pupils.

To find lasting solutions, Masuku said the parents were to be engaged on the matter in order to get the whole picture of what was happening at the school.

Encouraged

In cases where parents and pupils felt illtreated in the hands of the school administration, Masuku said the school committee should be able to call the latter to

Nonetheless, the chairperson encouraged parents to work well with the school administration for the benefit of the children, who when all went sideways, the pupils suffered the most.

THE ministry of health is probing the matter where orderlies of the National Psychiatric Referral Hospital reportedly released patients.

This was confirmed by the Director of Health Services Dr. Vusi Magagula, who said the ministry had set up a commission of enquiry to ascertain what exactly happened that led to the release of the over 40 patients from the insti-

However, Magagula said there was nothing much to say about the ministry's undertaking as the process was still underway.

This follows an incident that happened last Monday, where employees picketed at the institution over lack of medicine and a dysfunctional drainage system that resulted in the flooding of toilets in patients' wards. At the time, the employees vowed to down tools until either the administration or the ministry of health addressed the matter.

Concerns brought forward by the employees included that the spillage had the potential to graduate to cause an outbreak of diseases among the habitats of the institution since the patients no longer had a proper place to relieve themselves.

Instead, it was claimed that patients had suggested using a forest situated just behind the buildings of the hospital as a toilet, meanwhile the administration was engaged in rectifying the situation

Last Monday, while some representatives of the employees were locked in a meeting with the hospital's administration, quite a number of patients were seen roaming the hallways, while others were seen leaving the hospital with their belongings.

Stated

The security personnel at the exit point did not stop them.

In an interview that was conducted at the time, the Secretary for NAPSAWU shop stewards Bongiwe Dlamini, on behalf of the employees, stated that it was a resolution taken by all the workers to let the patients out of their wards so as to free them from the bondage of being locked in stinking rooms with human waste splashed all over the floors.

At the time, Dlamini conceded that letting the mentally challenged patients out into the outside world was not the best thing to do considering the danger they posed to the public.

Even so, she said this was the best

decision by the employees, given that locking the patients in was equally dangerous to their (employees and patients)

Releasing the hospital's clients was also seen as a push factor that would prompt the relevant stakeholders to act in addressing the issue.

Indeed, the ministry of health went down to the scene to assess the situation, and the drainage system was sorted.

On the flip side, when Dlamini was quizzed if she was aware of the probe, she responded to the affirmative and said the hospital's management had been contacted by the ministry in this

The secretary was quick to mention that on the day, the patients actually forced their way out of the wards.

"Some employees were picketing while others were locked in a meeting with the administration until it was tea time for the patients. When they saw their food on the other side of the iron bars, they vandalised them and managed to get out and scrambled for the food,' Dlamini stated.

She did not deny that the employees' intention was to eventually release the patients, but this did not happen as they were already out.

LGBTQIs petition ministry of justice

THE LGBTQIs community in the country has launched a petition directed to the ministry of justice and constitutional affairs to decriminalise same sex relationships.

The campaign, which is aimed at persuading people to sign an online petition, was started by All Out, a global movement for love and equality.

LGBTQI stands for Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer or Questioning, and Intersex. Supporting the petition was Eswatini Sexual and Gender Minorities, a non-governmental organisation that seeks to advocate for LGBTQI

According to All Out, LGBTOI citizens experience multi-sectoral discrimination. It states that the health sector, Judiciary bodies and legislators, law enforcement officials, are all ill-equipped to respond to the needs of the LGBTQI citizens, and are complicit in discrimination.

"This discrimination is propelled by the common law offence of sodomy. We refer to the offences of sodomy and unnatural sexual offences collectively the Common

Law Offences," part of the petition reads.

According to the petition, which by yesterday had received over 20 signatures, the crime of sodomy criminalises same-sex acts in Eswatini.

"Those suspected of the offence are liable to arrest without a warrant. Though not applied in recent history, the law is used to deny human rights and related services to LGBTQI people in Eswatini," the petition states.

The on-going criminalisation of LGBTIQ community, according All Out fuels the prejudice, stigma, discrimination and violation that LGBTQIs regularly experi-

Statistics presented in the petition state that in a 2019 study over 30 per cent of LGBTIQ persons reported having been denied healthcare services, 50 per cent said they were survivors of sexual violence and 26 per cent said they had attempted to take their own life.

This out-dated common law offence, according to All Out hangs like a sword above the heads of LGBTIQ people who live in fear of arrest. "Help us bring this important matter to light by signing this petition, urging the government to repeal the common law offence of sodomy" the petition reads.

TAIWAN HELPS UNESWA SELF-GENERATE E150 000 ELECTRICITY

THE Republic of China (Taiwan) has once again proved to be a good friend to the Kingdom of Eswatini, as the a 82.56 KW solar PV power plant that was donated to the University of Eswatini (UNESWA) has produced electricity worth E147 000 since the plant was commissioned.

This is according to the UNESWA's official Twitter account, whereby the university expressed its gratitude to Taiwan.

"The Centre for Sustainable Energy Research has 82.56 KW solar PV power plant that was donated by the Republic of China on Taiwan in 2019.

UNESWA generates 500KW hours of power daily and has produced electricity worth E147 000 since the plant was commissioned," reads the post.

Meanwhile, the ministry of natural resources, in their 2019 – 2023 strategic plan, notes the issues towards achieving 90% access to electricity in the country and further mentions the need to facilitate the contribution of renewable energy by 80 MW in the electricity supply mix.

"90% access to electricity and energy security is one of the flagship priorities that should be achieved by the country.

However, these targets have to be supported by organisational efficiency which includes staff retention, a supportive working environment and sound performance management system.

Effectively

"To effectively and efficiently manage the national energy resources and to work towards affordable and sustainable energy provision for all the people of the Kingdom of Eswatini, whilst ensuring the international competitiveness of the energy sector as a whole, the ministry looks to facilitate the contribution of renewable energy by 80MW in the electricity supply mix, facilitate the completion of the feasibility study and funding models for the 300 MW thermal power plant, establish strategic fuel storage facility for the country for up to 90 days reserves and increase electricity access for households from 78% in 2018 to 85% by 2023," reads the report.

UNESWA Register Dr Salebona Simelane could not be reached for comment when called several times yesterday as his phone rang unanswered.

Three-year increase of public debt

THE auditor general's report for the year ended March 31, 2019 has indicated a yearly increase of public debt.

Last Friday, the minister of finance announced that the national debt was at E19.2 billion, which is an increase from the previous financial year which was around E18 billion.

The statement of public debt shows that the total public debt stood at E18 014 184 070.58, which was 27 per cent of the gross Domestic product (GDP) thus showing a significant increase in the total.

Auditor General Timothy Matsebula in the report stated that a public debt of E5.6 billion (45 per cent) from the previous financial year's E12.5 billion was noted.

The increase in public debt was

attributed to an increase of 37 per cent in domestic debt from E7.7 billion in the fiscal year 2018 to E10.5 billion in 2019.

"A significant increase in external public debt of 57 per cent from E4.8 billion in the preceding financial year to E7.5 billion in 2019," he said.

Matsebula said according to the Bretton Woods Institutions, the International Monetary Fund and the World Bank, public debt should not exceed 35 per cent of the GDP.

Debt

Even though the public debt levels are still below the threshold of the gross domestic product, the rapid increase is alarming, the auditor general stated.

"Since revenue collections continue to decline and public expenditure continues to escalate, it is likely that government's gearing level may increase beyond the acceptable threshold," he explained.

Public Debt Management Strategy needed


AUDITOR General Timothy Matsebula stated that public debt strategic management was critical in a country's capacity to finance its policy objectives and service delivery that adds value to the lives of the citizens.

In his report, Matsebula said he observed that there was no officially endorsed debt management strategy but a draft strategy was being developed.

He added that the reduction in the total government revenue may inevitably compel the Government of Eswatini to continue increasing its public debt.

However, he stated that a well-informed public debt management strategy was required at the earliest time possible as large adjustments to the country's borrowing levels from 27 per cent to 35per cent of the GDP may threaten the country's economic stability.

Matsebula added that the country continued to face a challenging economic environment due to rising government spending and low revenue from the Southern African Customs Union (SACU). Further, he stressed on rising of government spending and reduction of revenue have increased public debt and contributed to large domes-



tic arrears. Reserves have also declined, although remain broadly adequate, and real GDP growth has been slow.

"Despite all these, the current debt situation has not yet reached the threshold of 35%, however, careful consideration should be given to debt service ratios to avoid breach of their respective thresholds," he said.

Furthermore, the auditor general said observations on unreported arrears amounting to E3 194134221.91 and unreconciled Government accounts. He said this tends to give an erroneous picture of Government's cash flow position. Hence it indicates that a debt management strategy that is not

informed by accurate government accounts is likely to be inconsistent with the real cash flow position and the country's ability to make debt repayments in the foreseeable future.

"The unreported arrears conceal the accounts payable within one fiscal period and tend to increase domestic debt levels. On another note, the decreasing trend in domestic debts may, in the long run, discourage local companies from trading with the government, due to the history of delays in payment of debts to local companies,"

PATIENTS STRUGGLE AS NURSES CONTINUE STRIKE AT GOVT HOSPITAL

PATIENTS are experiencing serious difficulties at Mbabane Government Hospital as nurses continue with their strike action.

Some nurses at the government hospital have downed tools over lack of security and other services at the hospital.

The hardships that patients go through at the hospital were evident yesterday as some waited in vain to get assistance from nurses.

Nurses claim that they were promised that the issue was being dealt with by the ministry of health, but there was nothing forthcoming from the

The Swaziland Nurses Association (SNA) said nothing has been communicated to them with regards to the negotiations between government and the company that is expected to provide security at the hospi-

SNA President Bheki Mamba said what he gathered was that the ministry was in negotiations to have the same company offer security at the hospital while government was still trying to facilitate payments.

He said another alternative was to have police officers man the hospital while the security company was still in talks with government.

Further, Mamba said he was informed that this would be sorted in a matter of two days.

He said but up to yesterday, there was nothing from government showing that the situation had been handled.

Last Thursday nurses downed tools at the government hospital after a meeting with the administration over their safety. The nurses vowed to resume duties once their demands were met.

DRRUPTION GETTING WORSE IN ESWATINI

THE issue of corruption in Eswatini seems to be getting worse every year as the Corruption Perceptions (CPI) Index 2019 ranks the country 113th out of 180 countries, which is a regression of 25 places from the previous year.

The CPI is an index published annually by Transparency International since 1995, and offers an annual snapshot of the relative degree of corruption by ranking countries and territories from all over the globe. Ranks

The index ranks 180 countries and territories by their perceived levels

of public sector corruption. As Transparency International's flagship research product, the index has become the leading global indicator of public sector corruption.

Draws

The 2019 CPI draws on 13 surveys and expert assessments to measure public sector corruption in 180 countries and territories, giving each a score from zero (highly corrupt) to 100 (very clean).

Eswatini has been regressing for the past four years in the index, and this year is no different with the country backsliding by 25 places from 2018's standing, which was position 85.

Meanwhile, in the ministry of justice and constitutional affairs' Eswatini justice sector strategy and action plan - 2019 - 2023, the ministry notes that the index has an impact on investments.

The ministry assured the public of preventing corruption in government systems and improved professional service delivery in all aspects.

Impacts

"This index impacts on foreign direct investment. Locally, the country has recorded high perceptions of corruption and high corruption tolerance levels.

"The justice sector is, therefore, mindful of its obligation in building a capable state, building safer communities, ensuring social protection, promoting accountability and fighting corruption which are key in reviving the country's economy," reads the report.

On the other hand, His Majesty King Mswati III has also alluded to the struggle to combat corruption in the country during the Speech from the Throne.

"Let us give credence to the sentiments expressed by the nation at the sibaya, where all acts of corruption and malpractice were strongly castigated.

"If we are to make a meaningful turn around to our economy, we need to fight, control and eliminate all forms of corruption with punitive measures to protect our resources and restore financial stability," said His Majesty.

Man held for stealing E40 000 items in break-ins

A man of KaMkhweli appeared before the magistrate's court for three charges of house breaking and theft totalling to over E40 000.

Mkhosi Matsenjwa (36) is alleged to have been on the run since last year and only got arrested early this month. Amongst his charges, the accused person is alleged to have wrongfully and unlawfully broken into a house of Fezile Mkhonta and stole items valued at E15 810.

The items included electronic gadgets and jewellery. On the second count, the accused person is said to have broken into a house of Mthokozisi Dlamini and proceeded to steal items valued at E17 100.

A few days later, the accused allegedly broke into a house of Muzi Sibandze and stole items valued at E915. All three breakins are said to have been committed in the month of October last year.

During his appearance before acting Magistrate Lungile Shongwe, the accused person was informed of his right to legal representation, to which he elected to conduct his own

When asked on how he intends to plead to the charges, the accused person stated that he would be pleading not guilty.

The Crown, therefore, filed an application to have the accused person remanded into custody pending setting of a trial date.

The matter returns to court next Monday. Meanwhile, in another matter, Simanga Mndzebele (31) faced a charge of assault with intent to cause grievous bodily harm. He is said to have wrongfully and unlawfully assaulted Collin Dlamini by stabbing him with a sharp object in the shoulder. The accused person indicated that he would be pleading guilty to the charge.

Due to the seriousness of the injuries sustained by the complainant, the Crown elected to call witnesses to prove commission of the offence. The matter was postponed to a later date pending commencement of trial.

Govt allocates E4 million for defunct Eswatini Skills Centres

GOVERNMENT is expected to spend about E4 million on the now defunct Eswatini Skills Centres.

The skills centres, which include Siteki Industrial Training Centre (SITC), Nhiangano Agricultural Skills Training (NASTIC) and Manzini Industrial Training Centre (MITC) were closed in 2018 after government had a disagreement with the directors of the skills centres over the use of subventions.

This led to government closing the institutions and sending the learners packing. Some students tried protesting against the move, but were told by government that they were on their own. Students who were enrolled at these skill centres are still at home. Some, it has been reported, have even opted to find piece jobs while waiting for the institutions to re-open. Some have applied to other institutions operating in the country.

However, government estimates for the years from April 1, 2020 to March 31, 2023 indicate that for the financial year 2020/21, the skills centres will be allocated E3 972 668.

Getting a larger share of the money is the Manzini Industrial Training Centre (MITC), which has been allocated E2 388 369. Nhlangano Agricultural Skills Training Centre is expected to receive a sum of E1 034 088 while Siteki Industrial Training Centre will get E550 211.

The Swaziland Skills Centres ceased operations after government refused to release subventions. This was after investigations by the Public Accounts Committee (PAC) which suggested that government should stop issuing subventions to the skills centres until certain conditions were met by the skill centres.

The directors of the skills centres indicated that the company had run out of funds following government's decision to withhold subventions and as a result, they were forced to liquidate the company and sell its assets.

Chrisilda Transport directors promise to pay owed workers

DIRECTORS of Chrisilda Transport are in a move to pay workers what is due to them in terms of their terminal benefits.

This was revealed by the company's attorney yesterday at the Industrial Court. Chrisilda Transport directors were taken to court by aggrieved former employees who felt that the company was in contempt of court after failing to pay them terminal benefits.

The company's directors were further accused of having disposed of a truck which was under judicial attachment to secure funds for the owed workers. The workers, who are represented by Human Rights Lawyer Thulani Maseko, appeared at the Industrial Court

Chrisilda, through its attorneys, argued before court that the truck in question has not been disposed of but is parked at Swaziland Milling.

The court was informed that the workers had already seen the truck. Maseko, who is representing SWATCAWU, informed the court that what he gathered is that workers went to inspect the truck, but they found that it was not the same truck that is subject before court.

He applied that the workers be given a chance to inspect the chassis number of the truck.

The matter was postponed to another date.

The court was informed that Chrisilda is actually on a move to pay the workers what is due to them.

Information relayed to the court was to the effect that the company has already prepared a schedule of payment for the workers and papers have been submitted to the commissioner of labour.

According to SWACTAWU, Chrisilda Transport closed shop in November 2019 and failed to pay terminal benefits to its workers and further disposed of an asset under judicial attachment to secure pay-

ment of same.

In the present application before court, SWATCAWU wants directors of Chrisilda Transport to be jailed for 30 days and and further pay their former workers terminal benefits.





Teenager charged for violating SODV Act

THE dictates of the SODV Act about abusing this legislation do not seem to sink in to many as yet another female has been charged for contravening the Act after lying about being violated by her boyfriend.

* Thembi (15) of Ngculwini was arrested and charged for contravening Section 120(b) of the Sexual Offences and Domestic violence Act15 of 2018.

Her charge sheet stated that she unlawfully, intentionally and wilfully made a false statement to the police about having had sexual intercourse with one Luyanda Magagula (22), who is her boyfriend. This happened last Thursday at the Mafutseni Police Station.

This follows that Thembi had disappeared from home on Sunday February 9, 2020 and only returned home the following day after her 65-year-old grandmother had reported her missing.

In her statement recorded with the police on the Monday morning, Thembi stated that she had left her parental home with her two friends

She reportedly had gone to the shops at Ngculwini and bought some items which she brought home before returning back to the bus station.

While she and the two other girls were on their way, she claimed to have met a man known to them, who suggested that they all go to a local bar.

The three girls agreed and while at the bar, the man bought them alcoholic drinks.

Enjoyed

Thembi said she noticed that her boyfriend Luyanda was also at the bar with his friends and they all enjoyed their drinks.

They reportedly went to the bar at around 11am and they drank until 9:30pm.

Since it was too late for Thembi to go home alone, she claimed that Luyanda suggested that she spent us the night at his homestead and she agreed.

During the course of the night, the teenager claimed to have had sexual intercourse with her boyfriend several times.

This, according to the statement provided by Thembi, was not the first time she and Luyanda had engaged in bedroom aerobics though it was the first time she spent a night at his homestead.

The two are said to have started dating in December 2019 and during the same month, they slept together.

After Thembi had given this statement to the police, Luyanda was arrested last Wednesday for allegedly having sexual intercourse with a 15-year-old and thus contravened the Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence Act of

Falsified

Upon learning about her boyfriend's arrest, Thembi went to the Mafutseni Police Station to report that she had falsified her previous statement about having been with Luyanda on the night she spent away from home. She claimed to have been somewhere else with some people, and not Luyanda.

After this revelation, Luyanda was released from custody though the charge for having had other sexual encounters with a minor still stands.

Thembi, on the other hand, made her first court appearance before Magistrate Justice Mzizi last Friday, where she pleaded guilty to the charge levelled against her.

She is set to return to court for trial in March

She was released to the custody of her grandmother.

E3m FORDISABILITY UNUTILISED ...as money was allocated for assistance of the disable budget

THE deputy prime minister's office did not utilise E3 million for assistance of the disabled.

Auditor General Timothy Matsebula, in his report, stated that there was non-utilisation of capital project funds amounting to E1 500 000 that were appropriated by Parliament.

The money was allocated for assistance of the disable budget. The entire released budget was not utilised, resulting in non-utilisation of 100 per cent in the project as there was no implementation as approved.

The project was on its continuation phase. Worth noting is that the pro-

ject incurred an under expenditure even in the two previous financial years ended March 31, 2017 and 2018, E849 016.18 and E677, 470.87 (67 per cent) respectively.

"I am, therefore, concerned that the project is being allocated more funds that are not eventually utilised for the intended purpose of adding value to the lives of disabled citizens," he said.

Matsebula mentioned in the report that the non-utilisation of the project funds may have a negative impact on the economic growth hence delaying improvement of the lives of the targeted citizens. The stalled projects may become expensive to complete, he added.

He explained that when he questioned the non-utilisation of the funds there was no response. Matsebula stated that the DPM's office has contravened the Financial and Accounting Instruction 0315 (ii), which requires that the controlling officer should respond promptly to audit queries

An audit of the detailed statement of recurrent expenditure for the financial year ended March 31, 2019 was conducted and the findings were communicated to the principal secretary through a memorandum referenced D21 Vol. II/40, dated September 23, 2019 Matsebula said.

"The controlling officer did not respond to my audit findings; hence, they remain reportable," he said.

Meanwhile, the ministry of natural resources recorded an under expenditure because of uncompleted pro-

iacts

"I noted that there was an under expenditure on two capital projects amounting to E18 824 645.72. The under expenditure on Strategic Fuel Reserve Depot project was E16 271 106.18, and E2 553 539.54 on Rehabilitation of DWA Laboratory," he said.

The ministry, in responce, cited that, according to their records the reported under expenditure did not occur, with regard to Project F02686 – Strategic Fuel Reserve Depot.

The ministry stated that the total expenditure under the above-mentioned project was E34 509 242.65 instead of the reported E18, 728,893.82, recording a variance of E490 757.35 instead of the reported E16 271 106.18.

Traffic offender without driver's licence runs away

A traffic offender gave police a hard time when she ran away after she was found to be driving a vehicle without a driver's licence.

Xolile Fortunate Maseko (21) from Oshoek was nabbed by the police while at Msunduza and she was driving a motor vehicle registered TSD 122 CM without a driver's licence thus contravening the Road Traffic Act of 2007.

On the second count, Maseko was charged with the offence of overloading as she exceeded the lawful carrying capacity by two passengers thus contravening the Road Transportation Act of 2007.

"Next, I sentence you to seven months in a correctional facility if you fail to pay the El 500 fine for causing the accident."

"Furthermore, I sentence you to five months in a correctional facility if you fail to pay the El 000 fine for giving police the wrong name. "However, I will acquit you for driving without a driver's licence as the licence was inside your back pocket as you showed this court," he said.

SOME PSYCHIATRIC PATIENTS STILL UNACCOUNTED FOR

AFTER being released a week ago due to the strike action by nurses, a number of the psychiatric hospital patients have still not been accounted for.

According to Director of Health Services Dr. Vusi Magagula, there were still a number of patients who were had still not returned to the National Psychiatric Referral Hospital, after they were released last week. "We have received some psychiatric patients, who were able to return to the hospital after it was announced that the issues raised by nurses were resolved. "We were able to treat those with acute mental illnesses, with some of those being discharged after treat-

ment. However, we do not have an exact number of patients who have still not returned to the hospital for treatment," Magagula explained.

Magagula added that the social media messages which stated that the ministry was seeking for relatives to return over 100 mental patients were misleading.

"Although some of the patients have not yet returned to the hospital, we are confident that they will do so. Social media chain messages have stated that there are over 100 patients still unaccounted for, however, the number of patients released did not even amount to that. The messages have been misleading in the number of patients still out there," he added. Magagula commented that the only authority in issuing such notices were the Health Minister Lizzie Nkosi, the principal secre-

tary and himself.

"It is worth mentioning that the patients who were released were those with acute mental illnesses, and as such do not pose a danger to society. We just need them to return to the referral hospital in order to be treated and discharged, accordingly. This is while we look into resolving the impending issues raised by the nurses last week," he added.

According to a social media message seen circulating over the weekend, relatives of a majority of patients were requested to assist in their return.

"The patients (close to 100 of them) have now been on the loose for six days, after having left the centre on February 10, 2020. This, while nurses embarked on a protest action over the shortage of medication and faulty ablution facilities." the statement read.

We will resolve issues raised by nurses - Dr. Magagula

DR. Vusi Magagula has stated that some of the issues raised by nurses during their protest action last week have been addressed and resolved by the ministry.

Previous media reports by this publication reported that the National Psychiatric Referral Hospital patients were let loose due to a sewer flooding in the institution's wards.

The patients were 'released' by the referral hospital's employees after the workers felt it was the only option to prevent the outbreak of diseases among the patients.

Some of the issues raised by the employees included that besides the sewer

spillage, overcrowding was another factor that was most likely to contribute to

diseases outbreak, especially in the conditions that the wards are in.

According to sources, there has been a recurring challenge of the dysfunctional drainage system that resulted in the flooding of toilets.

The waste apparently spilled over into the floors at the wards where the patients are housed.

"There are obviously some issues which we were able to resolve timeously, however there are those that cannot be resolved overnight.

The ministry is looking into making sure that the nurses' concerns are heard and resolved, in order for the hospital to operate efficiently," Magagula added.

Thanks but no thanks to paltry RDF increase - MPs

MEMBERS of Parliament (MPs) are not impressed with the increase in the Regional Development Fund (RDF) as they say funds are never availed to them.

This was mentioned by MPs after Minister of Finance Neal Rijkenberg announced that the RDF budget would increase by E67 million from E110 to E177 million during the budget speech presentation last Friday.

Maphalaleni MP Mabulala Maseko said the budget speech was only a piece of paper with no practicality. "The budget speech is just a piece of paper lamenting on government's aspirations for the coming financial year," he said.

He said as MPs, they only wished that the funds were made available on time so that they could focus on their main deliverable being rural development. He mentioned that if the funds were available, it would go a long way in developing the country and pro-

vide a platform to move away from the current crisis.

Gilgal Member of Parliament Kenneth Sandla Fakudze echoed his colleague's sentiments and stated that he was not impressed with the increased budget as the funds were never available, resulting in the stalling of development projects at Tinkhundla level.

He added that they were still waiting for the current financial year's funds as they had still not received them. "Every year we are promised funds but this is only on paper as the funds are never available," he said.

He added that as the current financial year was nearing its end, they had over a period of time been promised the funds would be released yet they were still not made available. Fakudze added that this resulted in a number of development projects being stalled.

Further, Fakudze said last year's budget speech focused on improving the lives of the poor but in the end, the situation was made worse with the introduction of a number of levies that dug deeper into the already empty pockets of the ordinary Liswati.

Health minister happy with lion's share

MINISTER of Health Lizzy Nkosi said as Cabinet, they extensively deliberated on the budget and were well aware that they would not receive what they requested due to the country's financial constraints.

"We are grateful that government continued to invest in social development. We are happy that in the health and education sector, government allocated the lion's share," she said. She said it was encouraging that there was more focus placed on human capital development in terms of education and the health of the people. She mentioned that as a health sector, they were happy with the improved budget as it was increased from E3.4 billion to E3.5 billion, indicating an increase of E100 million. She indicated that this would go a long way in addressing the prevailing issue of drug shortages.

"We are confident that the situation will be managed better as

systems have been put in place to address the matter," she said. Nkosi mentioned that moving forward; the stocking of drugs such as ARVs and infant vaccines would be done on time. She added that once all the suppliers were paid, it would be easier to ensure that drug orders were processed in time.

Magistrate calls for arrest of dad who abandoned teens

Manzini Senior Magistrate Simangele Mbatha has called for the arrest of a father who abandoned his two teenage sons.

The magistrate made this undertaking after a hearing one of the Grade Seven pupil's matter.

*Sipho (17) was before Magistrate Mbatha on two counts of housebreaking with intent to steal and theft. The offences were committed on January 27 and February 6, 2020 at Sibovu and Mahlangatsha areas respectively. In the January incident, Sipho allegedly broke into a house and stole E500 worth of creative speakers and a sub-woofer belonging to one Mhleleli Simelane. These were later sold at E100.

In the recent incident that happened on February 6, 2020, the teenage boy is alleged to have once again entered into Simelane's house through the window and stole a Samsung cellphone valued at E1 000 including E140 in cash.

Simelane is said to have returned from work in the evening of the said date and discovered that his house had been bro-

ken into, and that the intruder had gained entry through a window. When he got into the house, Simelane reportedly found his property missing. The stolen cellphone is said to have had a sim card inserted in it when it was stolen by Sipho.

Other witnesses in the matter included a technician who alleged that Sipho and another teen visited his shop and requested that a password be removed from a cellphone of similar model as the one that was stolen from Simelane, which they claimed they had bought.

Suggested

The technician said he suggested that the primary pupils bartered the phone with another since they had no money to pay for the services. The two boys are said to have agreed to this suggestion.

It was also brought before court that Sipho and his younger brother lived alone at Sibovu as their grandmother passed away, while their father had disappeared since December 2019.

The father is said to have left home for Hhelehhele where he said he had found a job. Before, Sipho and his 16-year-old brother lived with their 20-year-old sister, who later left them for an ancestral initiation school. The teens' mother passed

away in 2016 while their grandmother died in 2017.

When Magistrate Mbatha learnt that the teen's father was alive and well, she called for him to be arrested and charged for abandoning the minors who had turned to criminal activities to make ends meet.

She said this was irresponsible of the father, especially because he was alive and well and had the means to maintain his children. Sipho's aunt said she could not take in the children because she feared that the home would be targeted by thieves when no one was there to look after the property. "The lives of the children are far more important than material things that can be replaced. Social services need to look into the matter and force you to look after the children if need be," said the magistrate. She added that it was wrong for families to neglect children and expect government to look after them when they were also able to take care of them.

"It's a waste of government resources when there are deserving children to be cared for by the state," Mbatha added.

She remanded Sipho into custody pending sentencing on February 20, 2020 where the father is also expected to appear before the court.

Speaker worried budget silent on youth

HOUSE of Assembly Speaker Petros Mavimbela is concerned that the budget did not address youth empowerment.

He said he was encouraged by the overall budget as it touched on a number of important sectors. He, however mentioned he was still to look at the budget closely.

"I noticed that the minister's budget speech indicated a lot of improvements in most of the budget allocations such as infrastructure, social development, education, health as they were still prioritised," said Mavimbela. He added that as Parliament, while playing their role of an oversight, they would monitor if the budget held water or it was all talk with no action. He, however stated that he was concerned that the minister did not mention anything regarding youth empowerment as they formed a major-

ity of the population.

Mavimbela also stated that there was nothing mentioned on job creation as well as exercises that would be put in place for women empowerment.



TAIWANDSE TEXTILE FACTORY RAINS 2000 FOR I

JS Clothing PTY (LTD), a Taiwanese textile factory is currently undertaking an exercise to equip workers and non-workers with sewing skills at no charge.

JS Clothing is the sole textile factory in Siteki with a workforce of about 450 workers. According to General Manager Simon Lin, the factory's goal is to improve the lives of locals as well as to make profits. He explained that the company had adopted the machinist training programme from Taiwan Textile Industry and aimed to train 2 000 machinists by the end of this year.

The GM said the company had joined hands with government in the fight against unemployment and poverty by equipping the public with industrial skills. He noted that this was one way of growing the workforce in the textile industry. Furthermore, Lin disclosed that the company hoped to expand its workforce to at least 1 000 before the

end of the year. Having looked at the level of unemployment, Lin said the administration of the factory resolved to provide the training for workers and non-workers.

The aim is to equip the general public with industrial skills, which they can use as they look for employment elsewhere.

"Our target is to equip at least 2 000 people with sewing skills by the end of this year," said Lin.

Lin explained that the administration basically took in individuals who had come to look for employment and put them through the training. The training is in different levels, through which the eventually successful individuals stand a chance to be employed by the company. Lin said some of those who were taken in for the training early last month had already been employed under the sewing department. "Basically, we train every machinist that gets to be

employed here because thereare specific level of knowledge that is required for the company to be productive," said the general manager.

Lin said, however, some of those who had been trained and became successful in the process elected to go and seek employment elsewhere, as they did not compel the trainees to work for the company after completing the course.

Acknowledged

He acknowledged that the company currently had a limited workforce capacity, hence it allowed those who hadbeen trained to go and look for employment elsewhere with the acquired skills.

"We have already trained over 100 individuals since January, and some of them are already working in other companies around the country," he said.

RA tours government departments in Siteki

LUBOMBO Regional Administrator Themba Msibi visited a number of government departments around Siteki to assess their plans for the year on Friday.

Siteki is regarded as an administrative town for the region. One of the departments visited by Msibi and his delegation was the National Library.

AT a time when students in various tertiary institutions across the country are reportedly engaged in random class boycotts, students at Good Shepherd College of Nursing have been warned and advised to ensure that the legacy of Florence Nightingale is preserved.

A total of 79 students on Friday underwent the capping and stripping ceremony, where they made the Florence Nightingale pledge.

Nightingale is the first health practitioner who was popularly known as the 'Lady with the Lamp' during her time in practice. She used simple effective nursing interventions, whereby she provided a clean environment, clean medical equipment and clean water for soldiers who were engaged in the Crimean War in the 1800.

Speaking during the ceremony, Principal of the college, Sotah Mahanya highlighted that the college adopted a theme for the year which says; "Pledging into 200 years of continuous dedication and selflessness delivery of quality nursing care".

He said the theme was guided by that of the World Health Organization which says; "Year of the nurse and midwife"

Mahanya told the students to acknowledge that there was a new horizon, moral equilibrium and recognition of the immense responsibility and accountability required as they embarked on the journey of health workers.

Justice Ministry to restore public confidence

THE ministry of justice and constitutional affairs has observed that there's a need to restore public confidence in the entire justice delivery chain.

This is according to the Eswatini Justice Sector strategy and action plan 2019 -2023

The strategy firstly highlights the fact that there is a concern on the justice system's efficiency. It further explains that the concerns can be catastrophic.

"Nationally, there is documented evidence that members of the public have complained regarding the delivery of justice in the country pertaining to all stakeholders in the justice value chain. Assessments and surveys undertaken have shown the gaps and need to strengthen efforts to ensure a more efficient justice system

"Although there is currently no scientific study on the public's confidence in the justice system in the country, inference can be made from the ever increasing backlog of cases that there is a decline in public confidence in the justice system.


"This state of affairs, if not addressed, can lead to communities taking the law into their own hands," reads the strategy.

The action plan further notes that whilst the ministry has attempted means to solve the issue of the major backlog of cases, it has failed to triumph the battle, especially with the lack of an automated case management system as well as the absence of a special commercial bench for corruption cases.

"There is a major backlog of cases pending in the court system, and there have been case backlog reduction interventions which attempted to provide additional judicial officers and support staff.

"However, due to the absence of a specialised commercial court/commercial bench, there is still a backlog of commercial and corruption cases. The lack of an automated case management system, which will allow most of the steps to be done electronically, is adding to these challenges.

"Case tracking and scheduling solutions are efficient and effective in case flow management and are of critical importance for the administration of justice," reads the strategic plan.



Minister promises enabling environment for investors

MINISTER of Justice and Constitutional Affairs Pholile Shakantu says the justice sector will ensure that the country's legislation provides an enabling environment for investment.

The minister said this in the Eswatini Justice Sector strategy and action plan 2019 - 2023.

The strategy is drawn from the Government Strategic Road Map 2019-2023 and other key national documents, and seeks to contribute immensely towards the attainment of the outcomes of the roadmap and national goals, especially Vision 2022.

The strategy highlights the justice sector contribution to the five key priority areas of the strategic roadmap on improving the ease of doing business; fiscal consolidation and arrears management; infrastructure, investment and innovation; culture of excellence as well as social safety nets.

"In a nutshell, the justice sector will ensure that the country's legislation provides an enabling environment for investment, peace, stability and prosperity through enhancing the legal and policy framework, reducing the backlog in the court system, implementing action of the constitution and new legislation, enhancing access to justice and modernising justice system, providing humane rights-based approach to treatment of offenders as well as providing professional and effective services to the public," reads the strategic plan's foreword by the minister.

Plan

The ministry's plan is also in line with national, regional and international development goals and legal instruments.

"The strategy also aims to contribute to the International Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) which seeks to ensure peace, justice and strong institutions. It further highlights the justice sector key strategies that will provide a turning point in the provision of justice services in the country and the promotion of the rights of the people of Eswatini.

"I implore all justice stakeholders to embrace and take full ownership of the implementation of this plan in order to realise the set targets," said the minister.

Lack of human rights knowledge in Eswatini

THE ministry of justice and constitutional affairs has signalled that there seems to be a lack of knowledge on human rights in the country.

This is according to the Eswatini Justice Sector strategy and action plan 2019 -2023.

"The human rights baseline survey indicated lack of knowledge of human rights, both at duty bearer level and at rights holders' level.

"This coupled with the minimal capacity within the commission has been said to be an impediment to the holistic protection of human rights in the country," reads the action plan.

Another flagged crime in the action plan is corruption, which tends to have an effect on investments in the country.

"According to Transparency

International's Corruption Perception Index 2018, the country ranked 85 out of 180 countries, showing a regression from the ranking of 69 in the previous year. This index impacts on foreign direct investment.

"As old as he was, I can safely say mkhu-

lu was not sick nor was he taking any form of medication. Therefore, we are still shocked as to what could have led to his death," he said.

The relative mentioned that the day before he met his death, the old man went to one of the drinking spots in the area as a norm, and came back later that night.

The next morning he fetched bath water

outside.

It was further stated he looked healthy as always. It was mentioned that as the family was doing chores around the home, they heard one of his grandchildren screaming for help.

"When we rushed to see what was happening, we found *mkhulu* on the floor, with blood oozing from a gash in the head," the source stated.

He said apparently when the old man collapsed, hit his head on the table and died on the spot.

The source said it is suspected that the elderly drank poisoned buganu at the drinking spot, adding that the deceased was a community clown who was loved in the area.

Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Superintendent Phindile Vilakati confirmed the old man's death.

Vilakati said they were still investigating the cause of his death.

Woman claims self-defence after assaulting in-law

A woman caught up in a feud within her husband's family is fighting for her innocence after she allegedly assaulted herin-

Sindi Ndzimandze maintained that she was acting in self-defence, when her brother-in-law Bhekisisa Dvuba attacked her.

"He found me speaking with Maziya and he asked me what were we talking about. I told him that he had no business asking me that, and that was when he assaulted me first. I pushed him, only for him to punch me in the mouth," Ndzimandze submitted. Ndzimandze was arrested and charged for contravening two counts of the Sexual Offenses and Domestic Violence Act of 2018. She is said to have assaulted Bhekisisa with fists and kicks all over his body. She is alleged to have proceeded to insult

Khelinah Dvuba, her grandmoth-

Ndzimandze added that her husband's family was marred by conflict as both her grandmother-inlaw and brother-in-law colluded with other family members in creating stories to get her arrested.

"As we stand here today, the matter between gogo Khelinah and I is with the royal kraal as it is still unresolved. I was meant to bring a witness to testify in my defence; however, Bhekisisa threatened to kill her if she were to meddle in our family business. I am left to face all of this all by myself," she added.

This was revealed by Ndzimandze during submissions before Principal Magistrate Fikile Nhlabatsi.

Evidence led by Bhekisisa during Ndzimandze's trial suggested that he was pushed by Ndzimandze after which he admitted to have reacted by punching her in the nose.

Judgement is pending and will be delivered tomorrow.


If a leader tends to evade change, that leader would always find himself reacting to situations endlessly.

sex for a long time. He broke down, They apologised. Even the bishop's wife said she knew what was going on and apologised on the bishop's behalf."


Daily Sun has a recording of a conversation between the husband and a friend he confided in.

CONTRACTUAL FORMATION

10. (1) A supplier engaged in electronic commerce shall provide a consumer with a clear and complete text of the terms and conditions of the contract in a manner that enables consumers to make fully informed decision whether or not to enter into the transaction.

(2) Information concerning the terms and conditions of a contract shall be clearly identified and distinguished from advertising and marketing material.

(3) Information shall be clear, accurate, easily accessible and provided in a manner that gives consumers an adequate opportunity for review before entering into the transaction.

(4) A supplier shall provide all information online which they are required to provide offline either by law or by any relevant code of practice to which they subscribe.

(5) Where there is a legislative or other mandatory regime for the disclosure of contractual information, compliance with that regime is sufficient to meet the obligation of these Regulations in relation to the disclosure of that information. (6) The manner of providing this information shall allow the consumer to retain a copy of the

information. (7) All information that refers to costs shall indicate the Swazi currency (lilangeni).

INFORMATION ON TRANSACTIONS

11. Where applicable and appropriate given the nature of the transaction, the information relating to a particular transaction shall include -(a) the functionality, including applicable technical protection measures, of digital content;

(b) any relevant compatibility of digital content with hardware and software that the supplier is aware of or can reasonably be expected to have been aware of;

(c) mandatory safety and health care warnings that a consumer would get at the offline point

(d) as far as the calculation of the costs payable is concerned either

(i) an itemisation of all costs collected by suppliers, or

(ii) where the total cost of a transaction cannot be ascertained in advance, a statement that a total cost cannot be provided and a description of the method that will be used to calculate it, including any recurrent costs and the methods used to calculate them:

(e) notice of the existence of other costs to the consumer that are not collected by suppliers, this may include delivery, postage, handling and insurance and, where it would be reasonably known to suppliers, including taxes and other

(f) in the case of a contract of indeterminate duration or a contract containing a subscription, the total costs per billing period or (where such contracts are charged at a fixed rate) the total month costs;

(g) notice ongoing costs, fees and charges and methods of notification for changes of those costs, fees and charges;

(h) if limited, the period for which the offer is

(i) any restrictions, limitations or conditions of the contract, such as geographic limitations or parental or guardian approval requirement for

(j) the terms of delivery;

(k) conditions related to termination, return, exchange, cancellation and refunds;

(1) details of any applicable cooling-off period or right of withdrawal, including the conditions, time limit and procedure for exercising that right; (m) the circumstances under which the consumer loses the right to cancel;

(n) any conditions related to contract renewal or extension;

(o) details of any explicit warranty provisions offered by the manufacturer, supplier, or busi-

(p) details of any after-sales service provided;

(q) details of how to access complaints and dispute procedures referred to in regulations 17-

(3) where applicable, that the consumer will have to bear the cost of returning the goods in case of cancellation, and if the goods, by their nature, cannot normally be returned by post, the cost of returning the goods.

CONCLUSION OF CONTRACT

12. (1) A supplier shall implement mechanisms that allow an opportunity for the consumer to-(a) review and accept or reject the terms and conditions of the contract:

(b) identify precisely the product or service consumers intend to purchase or avail;

(c) identify and correct any errors or modify the order, and (d) retain a record of any purchase or order, transaction confirmation, acceptance of any offer they make.

(2) A supplier shall promptly send the consumer a confirmation that the contract has been concluded on a durable medium.

(3) The confirmation shall include all the information referred to in regulation 11, unless the supplier has already provided that information to the consumer on a durable medium prior to the conclusion of the distance contract.

(4) If the contract is for the supply of digital content and the consumer has given the consent and acknowledgement referred to in regulation 13, the confirmation shall include confirmation of the consent and acknowledgement.

(5) Subject to regulation 13, the confirmation shall be provided within a reasonable time after the conclusion of the contract, but in any event

(a) not later than the time of delivery of any goods supplied under the contract, and

(b) before performance begins of any service supplied under the contract.

(6) For the purpose of sub-regulation (5), the confirmation is treated as provided as soon as the supplier has sent it or done what is necessary to make it available to the consumer.

SUPPLY OF DIGITAL CONTENT IN THE COOLING-OFF PERIOD

13. (1) A consumer is entitled to cancel without any reason and without penalty any transaction and any related credit agreement for the electronic supply of digital content within seven days after the date of conclusion of the contract. (2) Under a contract for the electronic supply of digital content, the supplier shall not begin the supply of the digital content before the end of the cooling-off period unless -

(a) the consumer has given express consent to the supply of the digital content; and

(b) the consumer has acknowledged that the right to cancel the contract under sub-regulation (1) will be lost.

(3) The consumer ceases to have the right to cancel such a contract if the consumer has given the consent and acknowledgement required by sub-regulation (2), and the electronic delivery of the digital content has begun before the end of the cooling-off period.

(4) The consumer bears no cost for supply of the digital content, in full or in part, in the cooling-off period, if -

(a) the consumer has not given prior express consent as required by sub-regulation 2(a); or (b) the consumer has not given acknowledgement as required by sub-regulation 2(b); or (c) the supplier failed to provide confirmation as required by regulation 12(4).

WHEN delivering his second budget speech last week, it had been anticipated that the Minister of Finance Neal Rijkenberg might have offered a few creative ideas on the proposed direction of travel to address the current fiscal challenges.

To include an increasing burden of debt, which currently stands at 28.12 per cent of GDP. It had also been hoped that, the minister would have acknowledged more the recent timely reminder from both the World Bank and the International Monetary Fund (IMF) with regard to the recommended benchmark for a manageable burden of debt.

With receipts from the Southern African Customs Union (SACU) being optimistically projected at E8.34 billion for the 2020/21 financial year, it is difficult to see how the minister is going to balance the books on the increased national budget allocation of E24.1 billion.

A budget speech that was met with total disinterest by a disconnected Legislature and which included the curious decision to recruit an additional 600 members to the security forces to further inflate the civil service wage bill, when there is currently a freeze on public sector recruitment?

To the best of the writer's knowledge, the kingdom has never been at war since gaining independence. Two of the key recommendations put forward by the IMF team following its last visit to the kingdom to conduct Article IV consultations included; 1) the urgent need for visible policy action to reduce the fiscal deficit and to stabilise public debt which presently stands at E19.2 billion and; 2) the need to see more efficient public spending on capital projects that are not going to offer an early return on investment.

Additional

The additional loan for the construction of the International Conference Centre and Five Star Hotel (ICCFISH) is a major contributor to the current level of public spending and public debt because of the continuing escalation in the cost of this capital intensive project.

A further Loan Bill to borrow over E1.2 billion from the Export-Import Bank of the Republic of China (Taiwan), to continue to finance the infra-structure project was tabled in the Minister of Finance's absence under a certificate of urgency in the first session of the 11th Parliament.

A loan which is still to be secured due to the government's continuing inability to find an operator.

The MPs who at the time expressed their vocal opposition to the loan bill, because there is little possibility of an early return on investment now that the Kingdom of Eswatini will not be hosting the Africa Continental Free

To which the writer would respectfully add that the Commissioner General needs to address the latest unwelcome issues of tax revenue 'leakage' due to the continuing corruption within the


In addition to the employee fraud within the Category A parastatal, which made front page news late last year and which is conservatively estimated to have cost in excess of E2 mil-

Not only is it clear that a number of tax officers were involved in the elaborate tax fraud but, it also equally clear that the internal audit control systems put in place by the SRA's Internal Affairs Division are not sufficiently

The need to now train new tax officers will probably only further delay the collection of the outstanding tax revenue due during the current tax

Acknowledged

As Prime Minister Ambrose Mandvulo Dlamini acknowledged, when filing his own tax return for the year-ending 30th June 2019 through the SRA's



Eswatini Revenue Authority Commissioner General Dumisani Msilela.

e-tax online platform, the level of compliance for the filing of income tax returns was only running at 46.7 per

This might suggest a continuing lack of sufficiently robust processes and internal audit procedures in place within the SRA, to identify those officers still intent on committing fraud.

As evidenced by tax officers now colluding to assist certain individuals to obtain loans from certain financial institutions, by advising that the loan applicant worked for the SRA.

In effect, fraudulently using the SRA as security for the loans.

And now, in yet a further incident of employee corruption within the SRA, the Asian importers of used foreign cars exposed for fraudulently seeking to evade the tax due on imported cars amounting to millions of Emalangeni, through a sophisticated syndicated collusion with yet more 'rotten potatoes" within the ranks of the SRA.

Yet more examples of the state capture of corruption, which may be addressed (in part) by the Minister of Finance's decision to allocate a special budget of E8 million to undertake independent forensic audits for some selected capital projects to include thecontroversial Nhlangano/Sicunusa road project.

Because it may support the Auditor General, Timothy Matsebula's conclusions that before the contract was terminated, there were a number of 'irregularities' noted and therefore the possibility of corruption in the public procurement process at the highest level of government.

What also needs to be remembered is that some, if not all of those Asians involved in the latest import car fraud, are Bangladeshi nationals.

In December last year, Bangladeshi residents of the Lidlelantfongeni flats in Nhlangano witnessed the murder of one of their own, with the two knife carrying co-accused being fellow countrymen.

Violence is not the way to integrate into a different culture or to endear vourself to the Royal Eswatini Police Service (REPS). Other unwelcome criminal incidents include an Asian national appearing in court, after offering an honest customs officer a bribe of E7 000 when he attempted to enter into the Kingdom with undeclared cellphones and accessories to the value of E47 885.

And now the recent arrest of the six Chinese foreign nationals as part of an illegal gambling machine syndi-

The representatives of both the Bangladeshi Awami League of Eswatini and the Bangladeshi Jubo League of Eswatini were very quick to engage with the press to condemn the murder of one of their own.

But not as quick to now engage with the REPS to apprehend those within their community intent on committing the latest fraud, which seems to be almost viewed as acceptable behaviour by their elders.

The law has (again) been broken by Bangladeshi and justice must now be seen to be done, because no foreign national is above the law.

Perhaps the most telling press comment made by the representatives from the local Bangladeshi community was that; "We want Eswatini peaceful as it was so that future generations of our community can come to invest in this country".

The writer would suggest that, the real end goal is not to invest to provide much needed jobs for Emaswati, but to hand on the business to "future generations" purely for their own selfish motives.

The privilege for "future generations" of foreign nationals to live and work in the kingdom should never be assumed nor abused.

That privilege can easily be taken away too, in the event of the continuing civil unrest within the community and the continuing fraudulent criminal activities.

Being allowed to invest in a business in another country is a privilege and not a God given right, but it also comes with certain moral responsibilities too.

Fraudulent

The recent fraudulent activities may have now provided an opportunity for the Bangladeshi community, through the two Leagues of Eswatini to openly engage more and to assist, rather than to obstruct the country's law enforcing agencies in dealing with the most recent incidents of fraud.

But also to look to engage more with the indigenous Swazi population, instead of continuing to live in secretive seclusion and to view the indigenous population as little more than a cheap form of easily dispensable labour.

Perhaps, it is now time to reflect on the unhealthy relationship which presently exists and which may have contributed to the increasing number of armed robberies on Asian owned businesses.

And to explore ways in which the most recent unwelcome events can be used as a catalyst for positive change.

PUBLIC DEBT INCREASES BY 45%, NOW AT OVER E18BN

STORIES BY CONDILE NTIWANE

THE total Public Debt increased by a massive 45 per cent to land at over E18 billion during the fiscal year ending 31 March 2019.

The statement of Public Debt shows that the total public debt stood at an exact E18 014 184 070.58, which is 27 percent of the Gross Domestic Product (GDP),

This was revealed by Auditor General (AG) Timothy Matsebula during a press briefing held at the Hilton Garden Hotel yesterday.

He stated that the significant increase in the total Public Debt of E5.6 billion from the previous financial year's E12.5 billion was noted.

The said the increase in public debt was attributed to an increase of 37 per cent in Domestic Debt from E7.7 billion in the fiscal year 2018 to E10.5 billion in 2019, and a significant increase in External Public Debt of 57 per cent from E4.8 billion in the preceding financial year to E7.5 billion in 2019.


The Auditor General said the rising of government spending and reduction of revenue had increased public debt and also contributed to large domestic arrears.

"According to the Bretton Woods Institutions, the International Monetary Fund and the

World Bank, public debt should not exceed 35 per cent of the GDP.

Even though the public debt levels are still

Product, the rapid increase is alarming. Since revenue collections continue to decline and public expenditure continues to escalate, it is likely that the Government's gearing level may increase beyond the acceptable threshold.

Challenges

He added that one of the major challenges was that there was no official Debt Management Strategy endorsed in the country.

He however, noted that a draft strategy was being developed.

He added that both domestic and SACU revenue collections for the year showed a decline of E1 738 801 390.97 which is 10 percent below last year's overall revenue collections," he said.

Undisclosed invoices take govt arrears to over E3

DESPITE efforts by government to pay suppliers and service providers, undisclosed invoices by ministries have taken the debt to over E3 billion.

Auditor General Timothy Matsebula stated during a press briefing yesterday that there were arrears amounting to E3 194 134 221.91 that had not been disclosed (reported) in the Detailed Statement of Liabilities.

"It was observed that ministries and departments submitted payments for processing to the Treasury Department during the financial year under review, which were subsequently not processed due to cash flow challenges.

"As a result, arrears for the financial year ended 31st March 2019 amounted to E1 810 458 400.06 while the previous financial year arrears amounted to E430 504 704.82.

"This shows an increase of E1, 379 953 695.24, about 321 percent in the arrears was noted. In addition to these

arrears were unpaid invoices held by the ministries and departments, amounting to E1 383 675 821.85 totalling the arrears to the over E3.1 billion. Matsebula added that the non-disclosure of the arrears had understated total liabilities in the Financial Statements.

He further mentioned that the unreconciled government accounts tend to give an erroneous picture of Government's cash flow position.

"I recommended that the Treasury Department should develop a system that will enforce all Controlling Officers to report monthly all unpaid invoices and arrears at the end of the financial year, 31st March, to the Accountant General and Principal Secretary of the Ministry of Finance. The Accountant General should ensure that all Government arrears are disclosed in the Financial Statements. "In his response through a memorandum, the Controlling Officer stated that the reporting framework was on cash basis, therefore the arrears are disclosed as notes in the Detailed Statement of Liabilities,"

Poor financial performance attributed to decline in dividends

FIPOLICY STEP IN THE RIGHT DIRECTION FOR SME DEVELOPMENT

According to the January Consumer Price Index (CPI) report released by the Central Statistical Office, the annual rate of inflation is 0.7 index points higher than the corresponding annual rate of 2.0 per cent observed in December 2019.

the CPI in January 2020 compared with that of December 2019 is 0.6 per cent.

The higher headline inflation was due to increasing annual rates of change reflected in January in the price indices for transport, which increased from 1.8 per cent in December 2019 to 6.4 per cent in January 2020.

Transport services, such as passenger transport by road and air; as well as operation of personal transport equipment (fuels and lubricants) mainly contributed to the increase in this category. Food



Food, such as sugar, jam, honey, chocolate and confectionery; and meat mainly contributed to the increased index.

Lastly, the increasing rates were slightly counteracted by decreasing rates of growth in the price indices for clothing and footwear which decreased from 2.1 per cent in December 2019 to 0.4 per cent in January 2020. Footwear (such as shoes) and clothing (such as garments) contributed to the lower index in this category.

Fuel with lower sulphur for shipping available at major ports

CAPE TOWN - The enforcement of an International Maritime Organisation (IMO) ruling that fuel oil for ships should have a sulphur limit of 0.5per cent, versus 3.5 previously, from January 1, has not disrupted shipping and the cleaner fuels are available at major ports.

South African Maritime Safety Authority Technical Spokesperson Captain Saroor Ali said there had been no disruptions.


The ports notified the vessels before berthing about their fuel requirements, specifications and if they had scrubbers on board - a scrubber allows the vessel to continue using the less cleaner fuel with a 0.35 per cent limit and not a single vessel had been found to be non-compliant with the changes, he said.

Management of a Retirement Fund

THE Retirement Funds Act, 2005 states the composition of a management board of retirement funds, its duties and the fiduciary responsibilities of the management board. This below is an excerpt of section 8 to 14 of the Retirement Funds Act, 2005.

Management Board of a retirement fund

8. (1) Every retirement fund shall have a controlling body which shall be responsible for controlling the business of the retirement fund and which shall be referred to as "the management board".

(2) The management board shall consist of at least four persons, who shall be referred to as "trustees", and of whom at least 50 per cent shall be elected by the members and the balance shall be appointed by the employer: Provided that, on application from a fund, and on the receipt of adequate information to his satisfaction, the Registrar may:

(a) grant a fund permission to have a management board consisting of less than four persons if this number is impractical or unreasonably expensive, provided that, the members' right to elect at least 50 per cent of the trustees shall not be affected.

(b) exempt a fund from the requirement that the members may elect at least 50 per cent of the trustees if(i) the members of the fund are

persons who are employees of more than three different employers who are not subsidiaries of the same holding company; or

(ii) the fund is a retirement annuity fund.

(3) The rules of the fund shall state the constitution of the management board, the procedure for election of the trustees, the procedures at meetings, voting rights of members of the management board, the breaking of deadlocks and the powers of the management board.

(4) The management board shall be headed by a chairman who shall be elected by the trustees from amongst themselves.

(5) Any decision of the management board shall be carried in a resolution which shall be minuted and each resolution shall be signed by a majority of the trustees- Provided that the chairman of the management board shall sign each resolution.

Duties of the management board

9. The management board shall ensure that:

(a) records of the operations of the retirement fund that completely and correctly reflect the operations of the fund are kept;

(b) all minutes of meetings are maintained in such a manner that the resolutions of the management board are correctly reflected; (c) the minutes of the management board meetings are kept in a bound book, such that it will not be possible to remove or replace pages of the minute book, or to insert pages into the minute book;

(d) members of the fund are informed of their benefits and rights;

(e) contributions are timeously paid to the retirement fund;

(f) the rules and operations of the fund are not in violation of this Act; and

(g) the fund is managed in accordance with its registered rules.

Fiduciary responsibilities of the management board

10. The management board shall ensure that the interest of members is protected at

all times by:

(a) acting with care, diligence and good faith;

(b) avoiding conflict of interest; and

(c) acting impartially.

Principal Officer of a retirement fund

11. (1) Every registered retirement fund shall have a principal officer who shall be a Swazi citizen resident in Swaziland.

(2) The principal officer shall be appointed by the management board of the retirement fund.

(3) If for any reason the Principal

Officer is unable to fulfil any duty imposed on him by this Act, the management board may appoint another principal officer within 30 days of the principal officer becoming unable to perform his aforementioned duties.

(4) The name of the principal officer shall be advised in writing to the Registrar on registration, and, a change of principal officer shall be advised in writing to the Registrar within 30 days of the change being effected.

Duties of the principal officer

12. The principal officer shall be responsible for:

 (a) receiving and processing all communication made to the retirement fund;

(b) ensuring that all decisions of the management board are implemented:

(c) ensuring that all returns required in terms of this Act are submitted timeously; and

(d) all other administrative functions required in terms of the rules of fund and applicable legislation.

Rules of a retirement fund

13. (1) The business of a retirement fund shall be governed by a set of rules which shall comply with the prescribed requirements in terms of the Regulations.

(2) No rules shall be of any force

unless those rules have been approved, and endorsed by the Registrar after consultation with the Minister.

(3) Subject to the provisions of this Act, the rules of a retirement fund shall be binding on the fund and its members, employer and officers and any person who has a claim on the fund.

(4) Every member of a retirement fund shall be entitled on request to inspect a copy of the rules of the fund.

(5) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsections (2) and (3), if the rules of the retirement fund are found to be in conflict with the provisions of this Act on any aspect, then the provisions of this Act shall apply.

Amendment of rules

14. (1) A retirement fund may alter or rescind or make any addition to its rules provided that no such alteration, rescission or addition shall affect the rights of any creditor of the fund other than as a member.

(2) All proposed amendments shall be submitted to the Registrar for approval within 60 days of the management board's resolution approving the amendment.

(3) Any amendment to the rules which affect the financial condition of the fund shall be accompanied by a valuator's certificate certifying that the amendment will not render the fund financially unsound.

(4) If the Registrar is satisfied that the amendment is not against the members' or employers interest, and not inconsistent with this Act, he shall register the amendment and he shall return an endorsed copy of the amendment to the fund.

(5) The resolution of the management board must state clearly the date on which the amendment will come into force and also the reason for the amendment and the Registrar shall not register any amendment which does not state the aforementioned date and reason.

(6) A fund may at any time consolidate its rules which shall take effect from a date decided by the management board: Provided that the Registrar is satisfied that the date will not prejudice the members' interest.

THENEW VORTEX FOR ISLAMIC EXTREMISM

MAPUTO - Mozambican President Filipe Nyusi was noticeably absent from the AU Summit as he urgently travelled to Cabo Delgado in the north of his country to address the rapidly deteriorating security situation.

The AU Peace and Security Council also highlighted the urgency with commissioner Smail Chergui saying the AU must provide equipment and training to assist the Mozambican government in addressing the militant threat.

Cabo Delgado has been the site of beheadings and kidnappings of villagers, as well as villages being burnt to the ground. The increasing attacks on civilians are by an Islamist extremist group which calls itself al-Shabaab (or "youth" in Arabic). The group is

not an offshoot of Somalia's al-Shabaab, but has links to them.

To date the group has launched about 370 attacks since its first attack

on a police station in October 2017. There have been 909 recorded deaths, although this number is predicted to climb exponentially. Human Rights Watch has called on the Southern African Development Community to urgently act against the insurgency that poses a risk to the whole region.

Few understand what is really happening in this impoverished corner of Mozambique, bordering Tanzania. But the combination of Wahhabi and Salafist influence from the Gulf and extremist Sheikhs from Tanzania and Kenya have brought a brand of extremism to northern Mozambique that has been germinating since 2015.

The Institute for Social and Economic Studies at the Eduardo Mondlane University of Mozambique produced an important study in September about the emergence of al-Shabaab, and is based on extensive on-the-ground interviews in northern Mozambique. *Independent Media*

Locust invasion set to leave East Africa on verge of famine

KENYA - East Africa is facing a widespread famine if plagues of locusts devouring crops in the region cannot be brought under control, the UN has warned.

Ethiopia, Somalia, Kenya, Tanzania, Uganda, Eritrea and Djibouti - with a combined population of 276 million - could all run short of food.

The locusts are already thought to number more than a billion and their population could increase by 500 times in the next four months if nothing is done. David Beasley, director of the UN's World Food Programme, has called for \$76 million (£53m) to pay for pesticides and planes to spray the swarms.

He also warned that the countries being affected do not have the resources to combat the insects alone.

Beasley also warned that some 13 million people will need food supplies if the plague goes unchecked, at an estimated cost of \$1billion. The locust invasion is the worst infestation in Kenya for 70 years and the worst in Somalia and Ethiopia for 25 years.

Kenya has begun spraying the swarms with pesticides, Uganda is sending the military to spray the insects, while Somalia has declared a state of emergency. It is thought the locust swarm began in war-ravaged Yemen three months ago, before moving to Ethiopia and Somalia in December.

By the end of the month they had reached Kenya, then crossed into Uganda in recent weeks. Desert locusts are typically solitary creatures, but can form into huge swarms under the right conditions. It is thought that heavy rainfall, which causes the population to boom, followed by a drought which forces the creatures into a smaller area is to blame. As the group is forced together the locusts' bodies flood with a hormone called serotonin, which produces the swarming behaviour. The change is so dramatic, that for decades scientists thought the solitary locusts and swarming variety were actually two different species, until it was disproved.

The swarm then moves away from its traditional territory in search of more food, and will keep going until the numbers fall back to sustainable levels, or the food runs out. *Daily Mail*

14 children die in Cameroon massacre

NTUMBO - A massacre in an anglophone region of Cameroon left up to 22 villagers dead including 14 children, the UN said, with an opposition party blaming the killings on the army.

Armed men carried out the bloodshed on Friday in the village of Ntumbo in the Northwest region, James Nunan, a local official of humanitarian coordination agency OCHA, told AFP.

"Up to 22 civilians were killed, including a pregnant woman and several children," Nunan said, adding that 14 children under age 18-including nine under age five - were among the dead. Eleven of the children were girls, said Nunan, head of OCHA's office for the Northwest and Southwest regions, which are home to the West African country's large English-speaking minority.

Separatists in the regions have been

fighting the central government for three years.

The Movement for the Rebirth of Cameroon, one of the country's two main opposition parties, issued a statement saying: "The dictatorial regime (and) the supreme head of the security and defence forces are chiefly responsible for these crimes."

A key figure in the separatist movement, lawyer Agbor Mballa, in a Facebook post also accused "state defence forces" of carrying out the killings. The three-year conflict between anglophone forces seeking to break away from French-speaking Cameroon has claimed more than 3 000 lives and forced more than 700 000 people to flee their homes. Friday's killings followed elections on February 9 that were marred by violence in the regions blamed both on separatists and security forces. *AFP*

Acid attack survivors seek justice

UGANDA - Ugandan university student Linette Kirungi was on her way to class when she heard footsteps behind her. The next thing she felt was liquid on her face — then burning agony. She had just turned down a marriage proposal from her ex-boyfriend. He responded by throwing acid. "I screamed and fell down," the 27-year-old told AFP. "The pain was too much. The skin was peeling off." Acid is cheap and easy to find. Some just use acid for car batteries. It melts the flesh, sometimes to the bone. That attack was in 2012. Today, Kirungi works to support survivors of acid attacks in Uganda — and close a legal loophole that allows attackers to easily evade justice. AFP

Secretary wraps up visit to Senegal

DAKAR - Secretary of State Mike Pompeo wrapped up a visit to Senegal on Sunday, where he discussed the US role in security issues in Africa. This visit came as the US Defense Department is conducting a global force review and has indicated there likely will be a reduction, but not a complete withdrawal, of US forces from Africa.

The next stop on Pompeo's trip is Luanda, Angola before he moves on to Addis Ababa, Ethiopia. Pompeo will also visit Saudi Arabia and Oman before returning to Washington after his nine-day trip.

Enoch Mpianzi fifth child to die at Nyati School camps

JOHANNESBURG - Enoch Mpianzi, the 13-year-old Parktown Boys' High School Grade 8 pupil, who drowned at the Nyati Bush and River Break lodge during an orientation camp, was the fifth child to die at the notorious lodge since 1999, Sunday Times report-

Mpianzi disappeared when a makeshift raft he and other boys were on overturned on the Crocodile River on January 15.

His body was found two days later after other pupils allegedly repeatedly warned camp facilitators that Mpianzi had last been seen struggling in the water and that he had gone missing, but were ignored.

According to Sunday Times, Grade 8 Northview High School pupil Portia Sowela, 14, drowned in the river while on a sports camp in 1999. Like Mpianzi, she was swept away by river currents during a water activity. And similarly, no one reportedly realised she was missing and her body was only found the following day.

Mellony Sias, 18, from Adamantia High School in Kimberley, drowned in the river at Nyati during a camp of his school's hockey team, EWN reported. His drowning was confirmed by the school as well as someone who was involved in a search-and-rescue mission that tried

to locate Sias at the time.

Sunday Times further revealed that Grade 10 Malvern High School pupil Thuso Moalusi, 17, drowned in the lodge's dam, not the river.

Provincial Police Spokesperson Colonel Adele Myburgh told that publication that Moalusi had drowned in 2002 "while taking part in an obstacle course at the dam during the Nyati marathon activity".

Lastly, Grade 6 Welgedag Primary School pupil Tumi Mokowane, 12, reportedly drowned in the lodge swimming pool in September 2009. Like Mpianzi, he was missing for hours before the alarm was raised about his disappearance.


Myburgh told Sunday Times that no one was found liable following inquests into the deaths.

Roodepoot crèche owner, 62, in court for explicit child porn

JOHANNESBURG-A 62-year-old married man, who is also the owner of a crèche in Roodepoort was expected to appear in court yesterday after he was allegedly found in possession of explicit child pornography.

The pensioner is part of a group of five people who were arrested in the past few days in an operation called 'Moonlight'. where several personal computers, hard drives, flash drives, tablets and cellphones which contain explicit child pornography were seized.

The ages of the children in the materials are believed to be ranging between

The operation was conducted by members from National and Gauteng SECI in collaboration with the United States of America's Department of Homeland Security officers, National Crime Intelligence Cyber Crime Unit and Gauteng Forensic Social Work Services.

Police's Colonel Brenda Muridili said although the man owns the crèche, it



was managed by his wife.

Another man, who is 34-years old, was also expected to appear at the Kempton Park Magistrate's Court to face the same charge of being in possession of child pornography.

Muridili said five years ago the man was sentenced to five years for the rape and sexual assault of five boys aged between 14 and 16.

However, Muridili said, the man received a five year suspended sentence that was to end on March 15, 2020.

"Although he has not been arrested for a similar charge he was convicted and sentenced of five years ago, child

pornography is along similar lines and there might be a process to reinstate those charges," Muridili said.

Other people who were arrested include a 30-year-old Rietfontein, Pretoria man who lives with his parents.

He appeared in the Pretoria Magistrate's Court where he was granted R5 000 bail. His case was postponed to March

The second man aged 42, was also arrested in Claremont, Pretoria.

Muridili said the man was married with three children. He appeared in court last week and his case was postponed to February 28.

On Thursday, a 42-year-old man was arrested in Daspoort, Pretoria. The man, who also lives with his parents had already appeared in court and he will appear again on 8 April 2020.

Muridili said a search warrant was executed in Garsfontein, Pretoria for a man who had been on the police's radar for some time. The Star

Zindzi Mandela 'heartbroken' about ANC's 'defence' of FW de Klerk

JOHANNESBURG - SA's Ambassador to Denmark, Zindzi Mandela has condemned the ANC for 'defending' former apartheid president FW de Klerk, saying she is 'heartbroken'.

"As a loyal and dedicated member of the ANC, I am heartbroken this happened to my mother (Winnie Madikizela-Mandela) and many others under de Klerk's watch," she said on Twitter at the weekend, referring to treatment they received. She also questioned what the ANC stood for.

"According to his interview, he justified this, therefore saying that HEARTBREAK: SA's my mother and others deserved this aggression. What do we stand for?" she wrote.

Mandela's tweet comes after De Klerk's recent interview on SABC, in which he said he did not agree with the UN's declaration that apartheid was a crime against humanity. "I don't fully agree with that. I'm not justifying apartheid in any way ... I apologised for that, profusely apologise for that, but there's a difference between calling something a crime. Genocide is a crime, apartheid cannot be, that's why I'm saying this. "It cannot be compared

with genocide. There was never a genocide under apartheid. Many people died, but more people died because of black on black violence than because of apartheid," he said.

JOHANNESBURG - Former president Thabo Mbeki has undertaken to send apartheid's last president, FW de Klerk, the UN convention declaring apartheid a crime against humanity.

"We were sitting next to each other in Parliament, I asked him about that (De Klerk's comments that apartheid was not a crime against humanity).

"What transpires, is that he actually did not know that there is a convention declaring apartheid a crime against humanity," Mbeki said.

He was speaking on the sidelines of the KwaZulu-Natal ANC provincial executive committee (PEC) political school which he addressed.

On Sunday, the Desmond and Leah Tutu Foundation called on the De Klerk Foundation to withdraw a statement on Friday that apartheid was not a crime against humanity.

This after the EFF disrupted the state of the nation address on Thursday evening, demanding that De Klerk be kicked out.

In 1966, the UN General Assembly labelled apartheid a crime against human-

ity. The Apartheid Convention was the ultimate step in the condemnation of apartheid.

"He said to me he had been asked a question, and he had said apartheid was reprehensible, he apologised for the bad things that had happened but he was making a very narrow comment," said Mbeki, recalling his conversation with

De Klerk.

"He did not know that there is a legal document in international law which says apartheid was a crime against humanity. I want to send him the convention, so that he knows that there is an international convention which says apartheid is a crime against humanity. That is how we discussed it," he said. The UN has said apartheid was

a crime against humanity because it met two key elements — it was both "widespread" and "systematic". President Cyril

President Cyril Ramaphosa could not begin his state of the nation address on Thursday evening, as the EFF asked that De Klerk be removed from the National Assembly chamber's public gallery.

However, De Klerk has remained adamant, saying through his foundation that the notion that apartheid was a crime against humanity had merely been "Soviet agitprop" — propaganda meant to agi-

"Those are the people who have to go to jail for having killed our people (in) daylight," he said. He said Ramaphosa and other leaders had to be also subjected to orange overalls if Zuma was facing jail time.

R200k reward offered for recovery of R4m Lamborghini

JOHANNESBURG - The owner of a Lamborghini Urus that was stolen in Bedfordview, Johannesburg, has offered a reward of R200 000 for information leading to its recovery.

The luxury vehicle, with an estimated cost of R4m, disappeared on February 4, according to private investigator Amon Koen of NoJack Vehicle Tracking — a company that specialises in the retrieval of hijacked and stolen vehicles. The white vehicle has the registration plate JD89ZJ GP and engine number DHU000986. Koen said there had been an increase in the theft of high-end vehicles and alluded to a scam. "There is definitely a spike, we have two verified cases of high-end vehicles being taken around last week. There is a very sophisticated scam that these people use to lure the owners. They are very strategic and in many cases work with the dealership," he told SowetanLIVE's sister publication TimesLIVE. Koen said the perpetrators normally phoned the owners of the vehicles and alerted them to a problem with their vehicles. In some cases they would go to their homes or the vehicles would be hijacked.

In this case, the owner, who does not want to be identified, received a call from someone claiming to be from a dealership, saying there was a problem with his ear and that a person from the "dealership" would come to his house to assess the problem. Someone arrived at his home and the owner gave his car keys to the person whom he believed to be from the dealership.

JOHANNESBURG - A Middle East operation of Pakistan's largest bank displayed 'significant irregularities' in dealings with politically exposed clients and screening some transactions, according to an inspection by the South Asian nation's central bank that took place more than a year after the lender was shut out of the U.S. financial system.

The findings are contained in a State Bank of Pakistan report, finalised in the first half of 2019, on Habib Bank Ltd.'s operations in the United Arab Emirates. The inspection was conducted after the Financial Action Task Force, a global watchdog for illicit financial activities, put Pakistan on its monitoring list.

JOHANNESBURG - A traffic police firearm instructor is to appear at the Pretoria Magistrate's Court on Monday on drunk driving charges.

According to Road Traffic Management Corporation (RTMC) spokesperson Simon Zwane, the 45-year-old instructor from Boekenhoutkloof Traffic Training College was arrested by members of the RTMC's nation-

al traffic anti-corruption unit and Gauteng traffic police on Friday. The anti-corruption unit was alerted by concerned members of the public who saw the instructor allegedly drinking at a liquor outlet in Pretoria West. He was bust when he drove away after spending approximately four hours at the watering hole. The instructor was driving in an unmarked RTMC

vehicle with a portable blue light when he was apprehended. He was also found to be in possession of his official firearm and wearing an RTMC uniform. The alcohol screening indicated that he was above the permitted alcohol limit for driving. He was then taken to a district surgeon at Steve Biko Academic Hospital where confirmatory blood samples were taken.

"The RTMC welcomes the arrest as it proves that no one is above the law. It is an embarrassment that a person in this position of responsibility allegedly failed to respect the law," Zwane said. CHINA WILL START DESTROYING CASH

HONG KONG - China's central bank in Guangzhou announced it will destroy cash collected by hospitals, buses and markets in coronavirus-afflicted areas to curb the outbreak's contagion, financial news outlet Caixin reported Saturday.

The People's Bank of China ordered all paper currency with high exposure to the outbreak withdraw cash for either destruction or disinfection, according to Caixin. Commercial banks were told to place banknotes from infected areas aside, clean them, and hand them to the central bank.

The coronavirus continues to spread around the world and most heavily hit China's population. The outbreak is responsible for 1 670 deaths with nearly 70 000 infected as of Sunday afternoon. Coronavirus has already prompted economists to lower their expectations for global growth, and major corporations have warned that the drag on global supply chains will likely hit quarterly results.

The People's Bank of China will use high temperatures or ultraviolet light to disinfect bills and store the cash for more than 14 days before placing it ...with high exposure to the coronavirus

back into circulation. Central banks around the world frequently destroy old notes to balance out the supply with new cash. The practice doesn't affect the money supply, though the coronavirus-related action is separate from such regular measures. An unnamed deputy chief at a large bank in Guangzhou told Caixin that, while customers will be asked where their deposited cash is from, "it would be difficult for such a measure to be completely effective."

The central bank's deputy governor, Fan Yifei, said on Saturday that 600 billion yuan (R1.2 trillion) has been injected into China's financial system since January 17, according to the South China Morning Post. About 4 billion yuan had been sent to Wuhan, where the outbreak originated, before the Lunar New Year holiday on January 25. Business Insider

While China deploys stern communist slogans in its battle against a deadly new coronavirus, democratic Taiwan has embraced cuddly mascots and humour to ease public anxiety and educate on best practices.

The health ministry has deployed a cartoon 'spokesdog' - a Shiba Inu called Zongchai - that has proved a hit with hashtags of his name going viral and posts shared hundreds of thousands of times.

Recent contributions have included advice on hygiene and quarantine regulations as well as reminding people to use face masks judiciously given the ongoing shortages since the new virus exploded in China.

"Leave face masks for the people who need them, frequently wash your hands with soap, reduce touching your eyes, nose and mouth with your hands," read one update.

In a Valentine's Day message, Zongchai offered practical advice for dating during an outbreak, from regular hand washing to staying sober and practising safe sex.

The post ended with a question: "What if I am single?" to which the pup quipped: "Stay home then!"

He said he remembered walking up to him and saying, 'Good morning, your Highness.'

The claims cast further doubt on the Prince's judgment in remaining friends with Epstein even after the billionaire admitted procuring an underage girl for prostitution in a controversial 2007 plea deal. An American woman, Virginia Roberts, has accused Epstein of 'forcing' her to have sex with Andrew on three occasions, the first in London in 2001 when she was 17 and the following year in New York and during an orgy at the financier's island home.

Pyotr Pavlensky's girlfriend was arrested on Saturday evening on charges of invasion of privacy and publishing images of a sexual nature without consent, the Paris prosecutor's office said. Her arrest stemmed from the release by Pavlensky, a protest artist best known before now for nailing his scrotum to Red Square in Moscow, of a video of a man masturbating accompanied by screengrabs of racy text messages sent to a woman. 

Mpanza stated that the movie was being shot in secret locations around Eswatini and neighbouring South Africa.


He said details around the movie would be shared on all their media platforms in due course.






of healing, thought-provoking and hope.

3 memorial services for Joseph Shabalala

CAPE TOWN - Three memorial services have been scheduled for Ladysmith, Durban and Johannesburg to remember and celebrate the life of isicathamiya icon Joseph Shabalala.

The first service will take place today in the Ladysmith Indoor Sports Centre, from 11am. The next one will be in Durban's Playhouse on tomorrow, at 1pm. The Johannesburg memorial will take on February 20 in the Standard Bank Arena at Ellis Park, from 1pm.

Shabalala died aged 78 last Tuesday at Life Eugene Marais Hospital in Pretoria after a long illness. He was in in and out of hospitals for most of the year in 2019, six years since he announced his retirement from performing with Ladysmith Black Mambazo.

Towards the end of the year, his health became critical that Shabalala was airlifted from Ladysmith in KwaZulu-Natal to

Pretoria in Gauteng. The legend's official funeral service will take place in his Ladysmith hometown, at AG Magubane Stadium in Steadville township Saturday.

Mshegu, Shabalala's clan name by which he was also known, was the founder of the five-time Grammy Award winning Black Mambazo, and has been hailed as a music genius by the industry.

Mambazo, as the group is affectionatelly known, is a well-decorated Isicathamiya (a type of a capella music deeply rooted in Zulu culture) group that has also since become a beacon of hope and pride of the African continent.

The group's manager Xolani Majozi said all memorial services will be open to the public. Shabalala is survived by his wife Thoko Shabalala and children Nkosinathi, Msizi, Thulani, Sbongiseni, Thami and Cindy.







"My heart absolutely sank into my shoes, I was extremely disappointed," Michaela said while a teary-eyed Amor believed she tried





Hosts come from behind to stun Conte's side

MILAN - Lazio mounted a superb second-half comeback at the Olympic Stadium to beat Inter Milan 2-1 and move above Antonio Conte's side into second place in Serie A on Sunday.

The visitors drew first blood when Ashley Young fired home his first Inter goal on the brink of halftime.

But Lazio drew level through a Ciro

Immobile penalty early in the second half, before Sergej Milinkovic-Savic found space in a crowded box to curl in the winner on the 69th minute.

The victory moved Lazio into second on 56 points, one behind leaders Juventus and two ahead of Inter in third.

The result also saw the Roman club extend their club record unbeaten run in Serie A to 19 games as they ended Inter's own sequence of 16 games without a league defeat.

"We played a great game tonight," Lazio coach Simone Inzaghi told Sky Sport Italia.

"In the first half we were so convinced we would win that we allowed a few avoidable Inter counter-attacks.

"At half-time, I said that if we continued to play like that with a little more quality in the final ball, we could turn this around and win the game."

Lazio came agonisingly close to the lead after just nine minutes when Milinkovic-Savic's long-range shot cannoned back off the crossbar.

But it was Inter who broke the dead-

lock a minute before the interval, when Thomas Strakosha parried an Antonio Candreva shot into the path of Young, who fired a volley off the ground and into the roof of the net.

The hosts mustered a rapid response in the second half when Immobile was bundled over from behind by former Lazio defender Stefan De Vrij, and the Italy striker dispatched the resulting penalty to take his tally for the season to 26 league goals.

PLAYER WALKS OFF THE PITCH AFTER RACIAL ABUSE

PORTO - Porto's Mali international striker Moussa Marega walked off the pitch in disgust after being subjected to a torrent of monkey chants in a stormy Portuguese league game at Vitoria Guimaeres on Sunday.

The 28-year-old had scored a 60thminute winner for Porto against his former club which sparked the home fans to aim even more vitriol at the Franceborn player which had started as early as the pre-match warm-up.

In the 71st minute, Marega signalled to the bench that he was walking off in protest even though team-mates, Porto coach Sergio Conceicao and Vitoria players tried to get him to stay on the

As he walked off, an angry and upset Marega gave a thumbs-down signal with both gloved hands to the home

He had already been given a yellow card for his goal celebration.

Marega played for Vitoria Guimaeres from 2016-2017 on loan from Porto, scoring 13 goals in 25 games.

Marega later wrote on Instagram after the game, which Porto won 2-1, that his tormentors were "idiots who come

to the stadium just to make racist chants."

"And I also thank the referees for not protecting me and for giving me a yellow card because I am defending my skin

"I hope I will never see you again on a football field. You are a disgrace."

Conceicao blasted the home fans before posting a photo of his player on social media with the message: "We are all Moussa."

"We are completely indignant at what happened," he added.

"We know the passion that exists at Vitoria and I think that most fans do not recognise themselves in the attitude of other people who insulted Moussa.

"We are a family, regardless of nationality, skin or hair colour.

We are all human, we deserve respect. What has happened here is lamentable."

Vitoria Guimaraes or the Portuguese football federation were yet to comment on the inci-

Sporting Lisbon, one of Porto's bitterest rivals, issued a statement supporting Marega and "repudiating any act of racism or social prejudice".

Neymar was rested, along with Kylian Mbappe, for PSG's remarkable 4-4 draw at Amiens in Ligue 1 on Saturday.

"He will be in Dortmund, I'm sure of it, but without being in the best shape he was in two weeks ago," Tuchel said before the Amiens game.

"But he will help us. I am sure and convinced of that."

PSG are yet to reach the Champions League semi-finals since being bought by their Qatari owners in 2011, with their run to the last four in 1994-95 still the closest they have come to lifting the European Cup. *AFP*

Klopp glad to see Mane back

LIVERPOOL - Liverpool Manager Jurgen Klopp says Sadio Mane's goal-scoring return to action came at just the right time as the Reds prepare for Atletico Madrid.

Senegal attacker Mane climbed off the bench to prod home the only goal of the game and seal Liverpool's 17th straight Premier League win in a scrappy affair at Carrow Road.

The wind and rain of Storm Dennis spoiled any chance of attractive football, and the Reds rode their luck en route to yet another league win. Boss Klopp's men are now just one win away from matching Manchester City's Premier League record run of 18 consecutive victories.

The Reds will now make the trip to Atletico Madrid for today's Champions League last 16 first-leg clash, with Klopp tipping Mane to be ready to star again in Spain.

HAALAND GOES HEAD-TO-HEAD WITH MBAPPE

DORTMUND - At just 21, Kylian Mbappe is already a World Cup winner while at only 19, Erling Braut Haaland has emerged as a rising fast-star this season.

As Cristiano Ronaldo and Lionel Messi approach the end of their careers, could Mbappe and Haaland be the next duo to dominate football?

AFP Sport looks at the star forwards who meet when Haaland's Borussia Dortmund host Mbappe's Paris Saint-Germain in today's Champions League last 16, first leg, tie.

Erling Braut Haaland

Haaland had barely arrived last month in Dortmund when the records started tumbling.

He justified the 20 million euros (US\$22 million) Dortmund paid Salzburg by becoming the first player to score a hat-trick on his Bundesliga debut.

Having scored 28 goals in 22 games for Salzburg, including eight in this season's Champions League group stage, Haaland picked up in Germany where he left off in Austria.

He made his debut coming off the bench with his new team 3-1 down at Augsburg in mid January. His clin-



ical finishing produced three goals in 20 minutes to seal a 5-3 victory.

The teenager was praised by Dortmund's sporting director Michael Zorc, yet calmly replied: "You signed me to score goals".

Another two followed in a 5-1 rout of Cologne, then Haaland grabbed two more goals when Union Berlin were crushed 5-0.

He claimed his eighth goal in four games in Dortmund's German Cup defeat at Werder Bremen.

The second youngest player to score in a World Cup final after Pele, Mbappe hit double figures for Champions League goals before he had even turned 19.

By that time he had already become the second most expensive player in football history when PSG signed him from Monaco for a total reported fee of 180 million euros (US\$215 million).

Mbappe has been to Dortmund's Signal Iduna Park before. He scored twice when Monaco drew 3-3 there in the 2017 Champions League quarter-finals, a match postponed by 24 hours after a bomb attack on the Dortmund team bus.

He scored another in the return leg as Monaco advanced to the last four. At that time, he was the teenage sensation.

Now, he is a World Cup winner and is PSG's top scorer this season with 24 goals.

Atletico seek old habits to upset Liverpool, the odds

MADRID - Atletico Madrid might once have relished the challenge of resisting an opponent like Liverpool, but reaching the Champions League's quarter-finals will require a performance not yet seen from them this season.

Diego Simeone's side are no longer the same Atletico famed for their inch-perfect defence, relentless work ethic and a knack for grinding down even the most assured, attacking teams.

Instead, they are 12 points adrift of leaders Real Madrid in La Liga and last week sat sixth, a reflection of a deflating few months during which their old identity has blurred and their esteemed coach been questioned.

When it was pointed out to Simeone on Friday that both of Valencia's goals in their 2-2 draw at Mestalla had come from set-pieces, he said: "We don't have the same characteristics now. Just like we attack differently, we also defend differently."

Out of the title race before March and knocked out of the Copa del Rey before the last 16, many in Spain believe Atletico's season is in tatters, with the assumption they will soon depart the Champions

League too.

The debate has

inevitably turned to Simeone and whether he remains the man to better those high standards he himself has set. "In the eight years I've been had patience, energy and confidence in what I believe. We can win or lose but I am convinced of what I want because I know my players."

The BNP Paribas World Team Cup is often referred to as the Davis and Fed Cups of wheelchair tennis. The initial event took place in California in 1985 involving six men's teams. The women's competition began the following year, with quad and junior events introduced in 1998 and 2000 respectively.

Munich air crash hero, goalkeeping great Gregg dies

MANCHESTER - Harry Gregg hailed as a hero for saving lives in the air crash which killed eight of Manchester United's 'Busby Babes' in Munich - has died at the age of 87.

Gregg, who was United's goalkeeper, rescued a mother and her baby daughter, team-mates Bobby Charlton and Jackie Blanchflower and manager Matt Busby from the wreckage of the plane on 6 February, 1958.

He was back playing for Manchester United just 13 days later against Sheffield Wednesday.

Gregg became the world's most expensive goalkeeper when he joined United in December 1957 for £23 500 and went on to be voted the best at the following year's World Cup in Sweden.

He was capped 25 times by Northern Ireland and played 247 times for United from 1957-66.

"It is with great sorrow that we inform of the death of Manchester United and Northern Ireland legend Harry Gregg, OBE," the Harry Gregg Foundation announced on its Facebook page yesterday.

"Harry passed away peacefully in hospital surrounded by his loving family. The Gregg family would like to thank the medical staff at Causeway Hospital for their wonderful dedication to Harry over his last few weeks.

"To everyone who has called, visited or sent well-wishes we thank you for the love and respect shown to Harry and the family."

United posted a tribute on their website. "It is with deepest sadness that we have learned of the passing of former player Harry Gregg OBE," said the club.

"The thoughts and prayers of everyone at the club go out to Harry's family and friends."

They should just bring back Simanga Nhleko and move on.

I think the PLE still has a chance to resolve this issue without attracting too much unnecessary costs.

PLE Chairman Peter 'Touch' Magagula should take the initiative and resolve this matter because if they lose it, all fingers will point at him. 





'Buffs' charged, face E110 000 fine

Buffaloes were yesterday served with charges based on the tournament's rules and regulations after their players threatened to assault the referee during their match against Green Mamba, PLE Chief Operations Officer (COO) Pat Vilakati yesterday confirmed charging Young Buffaloes.

He stated that the army side has been in charged in accordance with article 103(d) and (f) of the Ingwenyama MVA Cup 2018/19 rules and regulations.

"The team has been charged following their misconduct during the Ingwenyama Cup quarter-finals match against Green Mamba at Somhlolo National Stadium," he said.

The team was slapped with five counts under the section which stipulates unsporting behaviour and mis-

conduct. According to article (d), club (s) that assault a referee is made to fine E10 000 and a maximum fine of E100 000.

In addition, the offending club shall be ordered to compensate the victim for any financial loss incurred due to the assault while article (f) says failure by clubs to control their officials or players or fans shall be charged a minimum fine of E3 000 and a maximum fine of E10 000 by the DC.

The team will now appear before

the National Football Association of Eswatini Disciplinary Committee today at Sigwaca House.

"I heard about the charges but unfortunately the papers are not with me. I will be in a better position to give a proper comment once I see the charges. Someone else received the charges on behalf of the team."

SOCCER-THE Premier League of Eswatini has disputed former PLE Chief Executive Officer Simanga Nhleko's notice of application filed in the Industrial Court.

According to an answering affidavit filed by PLE Chairman Peter Magagula through V.Z Dlamini Attorneys, the matter is fraught with material disputes of facts.

"I further submit that to prove that facts were foreseeable in the matter, the Applicant reported a dispute for a breach of contract to CMAC sometime in September or October 2019.

CMAC then issued a certificate of unresolved dispute on or about

November 4, 2019.

The Applicant subsequently instituted motion proceedings on or about of employment. December 13, 2019 based on the same cause of action and seeking the same relief he sought at CMAC.

He, however, failed to either annex the certificate of unresolved dispute or disclose this fact," reads part of the affidavit. The Respondent also denied that the honourable court has jurisdiction to hear and determine the matter by virtue of the apparent dispute of fact.

"The Respondent wishes to adduce oral evidence to prove that the Offer

of Employment was conditional upon party's endorsement of the contract

I humbly submit that the offer of employment alone is not consistent with all the essentials of an employment contracts, it does not define all the terms on which agreement was sought," reads the affidavit.

Moreover, there is a dispute regarding the terms that were offered to the applicant.

For instance, the Applicant alleges that he was offered gratuity and an institutional car, but the Respondent denies that such benefits were offered.

Such terms do not appear in the Offer of Employment. In the premises, oral evidence has to be led to afford the parties an opportunity to test the credibility of each case and in particular to prove the terms for which the Applicant worked in twelve (12) month period.

I admit that I approached the Applicant and notified him about the available position of the Chief Executive Officer in the organisation, the rest of allegations are unknown to me."

The PLE admitted that the Applicant was offered a basic salary of E25 000 per month, communication allowance in the sum of E750, housing allowance of E1 000 plus travelling allowance in the sum of E1 500 to be drawn as fuel.
