MINISTER of Sports, Culture and Youth Affairs Harries 'Madze' Bulunga has come out to confess to being the father of the child reported about in the media over the weekend.

On Saturday, Emaswati woke up to the shocking news which

was to the fact that a certain married minister had impregnated a teacher.

In his move to provide clarity

on the matter concerning the child, Bulunga, in a brief statement, confirmed that he was the minister who was referred to in the media.

"I am the father of the child referred to in the article. I undertake full responsibility for my actions," Bulunga said.

He further pleaded for privacy on the matter, as there was a child involved.

"Therefore, I would like to request

the media and the public for understanding as we try to get to terms with the situation," he said.

The minister said the matter was still discussed at family level.

"This is a private matter that is being dealt with at family level, and in this regard I would like to plead for privacy as there is a child involved who needs our protection. I have always taken full responsibility for the child from the begin-

Murder suspect wants to go to school

A 19-year-old facing a murder charge claims the deceased person, Masiza Makhomba Juvy Shongwe, assaulted him with a spade on the head.

This is contained in bail application papers by Thabiso Mphumelelo Malinga of Mbelebeleni. Thabiso and his 16-year-old brother, Phiwokwakhe Elkan Malinga, are among nine people who were arrested and charged for the murder of Shongwe (51) of Nsuka, who was killed in December 4, 2019 for being suspected to have stolen a chicken.

The rest of the accused persons are Nkhosingiphile Phinda Kunene (18), Mxolisi Cyprian Kunene (16), Mlandvo Prince Gama (19), Mayibongwe Godgift Magagula (21), Sonkhe Victor Kunene (33), Mlondolozi Mholi Mamba (20) and Njabulo Solomon Vilakati (30) all from Mbelebeleni area.

According to the Malinga brothers' bail application that was moved by their lawyer at the High Court, the teenagers are first time offenders.

Also, Thabiso said he had planned to go back to school this year after dropping out last year for unnamed reasons.

The teenager said his incarceration was making it challenging for him to look for a space in school since he wanted to go back to school when they open tomorrow.

Recalling the events of the night that the 51-year-old was killed, Mphumelelo said it was during the night when he heard dogs barking

On this night, the teenager saidhis grandmother was away so as the eldest of the people who were home, he went out to check what the dogs were barking at.

While he was by the ban, incomplete structure, within his homestead, Mphumelelo said with the assistance of torchlight from his phone, he saw a human figure crouching towards the chicken shed.

At the sight of the human figure, Mphumelelo said he raised an alarm so much that his 16-year-old brother Elkan also called out for neighbours to help them.

GOVT TRACTORS BACK ON THE ROLL



FOLLOWING government's decision to grant tractor hire services to National Maize Corporation, there has been a significant increase in the efficiency of the programme.

With the rainy ploughing season in full swing, 36 per cent of the total registered hours have been serviced as of December 2019.

In December 2019, NMC issued a statement for customers regarding the challenge of fuel which affected the exercise as a result of some tractors being grounded. However, the issue has since been addressed and the tractors were back at work.

NMC Marketing and Communications Manager Nokwanda Dlamini said the matter was resolved in conjunction with relevant stakeholders and



operations had since resumed, where the soil was still suitable to be ploughed, given the harsh heatwaves being experienced throughout the season.

She mentioned that it could be noted that this disruption was not a prolonged matter at all; however, they still thought it best to alert the public about the possible hiccups, as they believe in proactive communication where service delivery is concerned.

"We thank everybody involved in resolving the matter for their prompt response, and we assure the nation that we remain committed to servicing them as efficiently as possible," she

She stated there was a significant increase in the hours paid, which has seen a 73 per cent increase.

This increase could be attributed to the confidence that farmers were gaining on the service delivery of the NMC input subsidy project as well as the increased foot print in payment points, she said.

She mentioned for the current season, there was a total of 44 708 registered hours with 30 393 registered in this quarter. Dlamini said the total number of hours serviced was 28 731 with 24 512 hours done in the in the third quarter.

She added that the total hours worked accounted for 64 per cent of the registered hours. She said approximately 77 per cent of these hours were serviced by NMC government tractors, while the remaining 23 per cent was covered by privately-owned tractors. The balance is 15 977 hours, which is 36 per cent of the total registered hours, she said.

ONE of the country's two renowned private investigators, Doctor Myeni, had earlier opened his arms and pledged to help a woman who claims to have a baby with a married minister. This was before the Minister of Sports, Culture and Youth Affairs Harries 'Madze' Bulunga revealed himself as the father of the baby yesterday.

Our sister publication yesterday carried the story of a woman, a teacher by profession, who alleges that the father of her baby is also refusing to take responsibility of the child.

Myeni initiated an interview with this publication, saying he could assist the woman to have full support from the minister.

Myeni said the minister has to come clean with his family and admit his wrong-doing.

"This is a case which needs the minister to display maturity and attend to it in a cultural way," said the private investigator.

Myeni said through his office, he could initiate talks between the parties involved for the benefit of the child.



He noted that in such cases, the defenceless, being a child born in an adulterous affair, suffers the most when the father goes all out to protect his name.

Meanwhile, Myeni condemned his counterpart, Private Investigator Hunter Shongwe for discussing private cases that involve his clients on social media.

Myeni said discussing a client's case on social media was against the ethics of private investigators

Shongwe recently got users of Facebook talking on a case of incest, where a Jericho priest was said to have impregnated his granddaughter.

The long-serving private investigator splashed details of the matter on Facebook, some of them which he said were being discussed in court.

"Shongwe is a veteran PI, his conduct is letting down the profession as people end up losing trust in us," said Myeni.

Efforts to get Shongwe's comment on Myeni's condemnation were not successful.

230 000 Emaswati to benefit from humanitarian aid

OVER 230 000 Emaswati from 14 constituencies are set to benefit from the E19 million (€1 million) in humanitarian aid towards drought relief from the European Commission.

This was revealed by the National Disaster Management Agency (NDMA) Communications Manager Wandile

He said the exact number was 232 373. This was according to the latest Vulnerability Assessment Report

Mavuso said working hand-in-hand with World Food Programme (WFP) and Eswatini Baphalali Red Cross they identified the constituencies from Hhohho, Lubombo and Shiselweni

He disclosed that in November they started drought relief interventions in some areas.

These include Mhlangatane, Lomahasha, Mpolonjeni, Gilgal, Dvokodvweni and Lubulini.

"This month we will also start the same interventions in Nkilongo, Sithobela and Siphofaneni constituencies. Other



areas we are going to look at are Somntongo, Matsanjeni, Sigwe and Hosea," he stated.

Last week, EU's Commissioner for Crisis Management Janez Lenarčič said Eswatini was among five countries from the Southern African region that will benefit from a lump sum of E433.2 million (€22.8 million) from the Commission to help address emergency food needs and support vulnerable people. Other than Eswatini, the other countries that will benefit include Lesotho, Madagascar, Zambia and Zimbabwe. The funding comes as large parts of southern Africa are currently in the grip of their harshest drought in

"Many poor households in droughtaffected areas in southern African countries are struggling to have enough food due to crop failure, reduced access to water and, in some places, unaffordable food prices in markets.

"EU humanitarian aid will help deliver food to those most in need and tackle the hunger crisis in fragile rural communities," said the Commissioner.

He said the EU humanitarian funding in Eswatini will be supporting poor households in Lubombo, Hhohho and Shiselweni regions that are most affected by food shortages in the country.

Adding, the Commissioner said Eswatini was currently facing severe food shortages, affecting over a quarter of its total population. Families will be helped with cash assistance for them to acquire the food items they need

NO RESULTS FOR OWING UNESWA STUDENTS

THE University of Eswatini has stated that owning students will not get their First Semester results.

As a result of this position, students are threatening to engage in a strike action when classes resume for the second semester.

Their first semester was characterised by a number of challenges at the institution as the tension between government and the students regarding late release of personal allowances resulted in the students engaging in a strike action.

The institution was forced to close down on two occasions as students resorted to vandalising the institution's property during their strike actions. In a statement published yesterday by the institution, the students of the university were advised that they may collect their first semester examination results today

between 11.00 am and 4.30 pm. Privately-sponsored students were also advised to clear their first semester tuition fees before their results may be released.

UNESWA SRC Secretary General Mthunzi Shabangu said they were informed by the institution that students who had not paid their caution fee of E280 and SRC fee of E150 would not have their results released.

He said what puzzled them was that the information was not released officially, but they were verbally informed by the institution, which was not the usual form of communication mode.

"There has been no official statement communicated to us and we expect to get our results," he said.

He mentioned that if the institution decided not to release their results which they worked for under duress, they would resort to the strike action in order to have their results released. He stated that they had no issue with paying the fees if they were issued with an official statement from the institution. He mentioned they did not want to feel oppressed but wanted open communication from the institution.

Kwaluseni Campus SRC Chairperson Hlompho Zwane concurred that they would not be deprived from collecting their results without an official statement from the administration.

He added that he tried on a number of occasions to contact the dean of student affairs regarding the matter to no avail.

UNESWA Registrar Dr. Salebona Simelane said he did not see any issue as it was procedure that results were not released if students owed fees. He said it was in the institution's regulations and had been the norm over the years.

Minister of Labour and Social Security Makhosi Vilakati said he would investigate if the fees were to be paid by government or the individual students. He mentioned that if the fees were to be paid by government; the ministry would engage the university on the matter to ensure that students got their

Report minors involved in accidents - MVAF

(MVAF) Corporate Communications Supervisor Dumisa Dlamini has urged the public to always make sure accidents involving young ones are reported to the Fund.

He said in many cases parents tend to not report cases involving their children, stating that this deprives the children their right to be compensated as per the laws of the land.

He urged parents to make sure that cases of children involved in an accident they are duly reported and documented with the Fund.

He was speaking at the culture competition in Mbangweni. Dlamini said with cases involving minors they do not even investigate but quickly attend to their medical needs until the child

MOTOR Vehicle Accident Fund is treated and able to carry on with their lives.

Dlamini said they would also compensate the children in accordance to the nature of their injuries.

"The only difference is that in the case of minors below seven years, we do not issue out the compensation to any one, including the biological parents of the child.

Matured

"The country's laws allow us to keep the money until the victim is matured. especially because the injuries will usually have complications in future," he

Dlamini further warned motorists to be careful when driving along places near schools as the children will be back into class tomorrow.

He said the country continues to witness cases where school children are knocked down by cars while crossing the roads.

He further explained that the Motor Vehicle Accidents Fund (MVAF) commenced operations under the fuel levy system on the January 1, 1988.

The Fund was established by an Act of Parliament under the Motor Vehicle Accidents Act No. 13 of 1991 as an instrument by which government compensates road accident victims who have suffered bodily injuries or loss of support following the death of breadwinners.

Between 1973 and 1986, compensation of road accident victims was Operated by the Insurance Industry under Third Party premiums.

2017 circulars gave SiSwati same status

THE ministry also went through several documents to inform the decision to remove English as a passing subject.

These included circulars dating back to pre-independence. "Postcolonial Africa is still hung over from practice of colonialism that include, among other things, hegemony of the English Language in government and education systems.

"There may be many reasons for that, such as the convenient use of the English language to domestically unite multi-ethnic groups and playing a neutral role where certain linguistic decisions maybe emotive," Chief Inspector of Secondary schools Martha Shongwe said. The ministry also found that in their records of 1986, the then minister of education in his policy speech had expressed a dissenting view and called for SiSwati to be made a passing subject instead of English. The minister is quoted to have said: "We are considering making SiSwati a failing subject or a pass in SiSwati a must in our examinations. The idea of English being a must or failing subject in Swaziland is a matter of controversy. Time has come for SiSwati to be accorded the bread winning status. While it makes sense to insist in the ability to read, write and speak English for students proceeding with education to university and teacher training level, it is not clear why pupils who are leaving school at Junior Certificate and below should be failed because of English.'

The minister's policy statement is said to have been made policy five years later. The Circular E21 of 1973



Chief Inspector of Secondary Schools Martha Shongwe.

states that: "If a candidate does not pass English but gets a credit in SiSwati, he or she must be considered for admission into tertiary institutions in the country in courses that do not require mastery of English Language.

Similarly, a selected circular of 2017 states that English and SiSwati should be treated equally at school levels. "All leaners should take English and Siswati as core subjects. Siswati shall be taught at all levels and be passed by all learners," reads the circular.

RESEARCH

Studies had been carried out in the country that challenges the relevance of English language as a passing subject and they point out to the inefficiencies and wastage.

"For instance, a PHD study by Dr C Dlamini challenging the relevance of English language to gifted children in Mathematics was also carried out and it supports the decision to remove English as a passing subject," the Chief Inspector of secondary schools revealed.

Why govt removed English as passing subject

THE contentious decision by government to remove English as a passing subject in schools was taken after thorough consultations, debates and research.

This is according to the ministry of education and training.

Chief Inspector of Secondary Schools Martha Shongwe stated that the ministry had for the past three years, been benchmarking, consulting, engaging in debates and doing research on the matter and it was concluded that it was best for the country to remove English as a passing/ failing subject in schools.

She stated that several stakeholders who participated in the exercise reached a consensus that it was best that English be removed as a passing subject.

"It was recommended that in light of the trends, particularly in the region, English should not be hegemonised to pass or fail pupils from Grade One to Grade 12; neither should any subjects be given such powers.

"Since English remains a prerequisite in tertiary institutions locally, regionally and internationally, programmes and centres must be established to provide extra support to pupils - particularly those who would want to pursue careers that require English post the school system,"

It was also recommended that the Education Act must be reviewed to be in line with the 2005 Constitution.

Shongwe said benchmarking was done both locally and internationally.

"Scanning through what the SADC region does in respect of same, the trend is that English language remained hegemonised in the curriculum albeit in

there was normal progression from Grade One to Form Three, but when the pupils get to Form Three, English becomes a passing/failing subject.

"Failing Form Three in Botswana means the pupil repeats the grade level or leaves formal schooling. There is normal progression from Form Four to Form Five but failure to obtain a credit pass in English language means pupils cannot gain entry into college or university, where entrance is determined by passing the English language," she

The ministry found that in Zambia, English is core and compulsory at all levels of the school system.

In Grade Seven, English is among the six subjects that have to be passed to progress to Form One. She said in Grade Nine which is equivalent to Form Two, pupils sit for high stake examinations and English Language is used as a passing/ failing subject; the same thing applies in Grade 12 and Advanced Level.

The scenario resembles what happens

"In Zimbabwe, it is normal progression from Grade one to Ordinary Level. Pupils do sit external examinations in Grade Seven and O' Level merely as a checkpoint and two channels to the career paths that are of interest to them, not to fail or pass

At O' Level, however, pupils must pass English language to qualify for entry into A Level or tertiary education," she revealed.

Shongwe added that in Namibia, it was normal progression within the school system but to gain entry into the university students must get a 'C' grade or better in

English as a second language or 'D' grade or better in English as a first language.

On the other hand, in South Africa there is normal progression within the education system from Grade One to Matric.

In all the countries where the benchmarking was done, with the exception of South Africa, English has been accorded an important status that determines the academic pathways a pupil takes.


Three of the countries Zambia, Lesotho and Eswatini have used English as a determining factor on whether or not a pupil progresses to the next grade or level Botswana allows for normal progression until Form Three, where the pupils must have passed English to progress to the upper grade-Form Four and Form Five. Zimbabwe applies normal progression

rule until pupils reach Form Five. At this level, pupils must obtain a credit to proceed to A Levels and tertiary. In all these countries, English language remains and entry requirement into university or colleges.

"An interesting observation has been made about East Africa, particularly Tanzania and Zanzibar. Post-independence Tanzania resorted to Kiswahili as a medium of instruction in the school system. This saw the emergence of international schools that used English as a medium of instruction.

Many of the elite families and those that could afford would send their children to such schools, most of them located on the island of Zanzibar.

"Countries like China, Malaysia and Singapore have a resurgent appetite in learning English lately despite earlier reluctance to do so," Shongwe added.

MINISTER of Health Lizzie Nkosi says cleaners are important in hospitals.

Speaking at the ministry's annual health sector prayer day held at Royal Swazi Spa Convention Centre, the minister was emphasising on the importance of role playing for every person.

She said it was important for every person to play their role with careful and persistent effort. The prayer was themed 'spiritual health the path to inner peace' with the theme scripture being **Philippians 4 verses 6 and 7**. "Sometimes we forget our roles. Whatever we do will bear minimum fruits unless a cleaner does their job thoroughly.

"People get better because someone makes sure that it is clean and bacteria doesn't infest. The Intensive Care Unit (ICU) at the Mbabane Government Hospital has the latest equipment, best specialists and dedicated nurses to take care of what we refer to as scrap of humanity. However, if the ICU was not thoroughly cleaned the people would not be cured," she said.

Nkosi also emphasised on the importance of cooperation and joint effort. She said her most favourite scripture was **Nehemiah 3**, because it indicated the power collaborating towards the same desired result regardless of challenges that

She advised the health sector employees not to remove their eyes from God to the challenges because that would be catastrophic. The minister also said as gatekeepers of health, it was important to note how patients were treated as it could either make or break them.

"People will remember how you treated them and how you made them feel. There is a group from Havard University in the country currently; in the three weeks they have been here they have learnt death in pregnant women was a result of ill treatment from health care workers.

"We don't have the authority over life. I am here to thank you that we are working hand in hand as a ministry. God has kept us thus far, not because we are better or clever but because of His love," she said. Meanwhile, another speaker Dr. Vusi Mashabane said the health sector could not be divorced from God because He was the initial healer.

He said God and science could not be separated. He said not one could confidently explain the healing properties; how blood clots and skin self-healed after a cut as the DNA was created by God. "Human beings are created to automatically heal, which explained why some diseases didn't even need to be attended medically because God designed the immune system to heal by itself," he said.

AME Ludzeludze's leader Zweli Thwala emphasised on compassion; he said professionals who were called had compassion.

He said it was pleasing to note that professionals under the ministry of health acknowledged God as the one before everything.

Thwala said it was easy to work with people who were called into a profession them people who joined the profession just to earn salaries.

"I am here to inject you with penicillin to last you the whole year. Every profession needs people who are called and are compassionate.

"Compassion allows a person to

shift their programmes for the sake of others. It will also interrupt your budget sometimes," he said.

The pastor also urged unity because when they did that each other's strengths and weaknesses would not be exposed.

He said working in one accord commanded and attracted the Heavens to come down and intervene. He said they will then have peace that surpassed all understanding.

"You should abide so that you float above all the challenges. Always rejoice in the Lord, pray and praise escalating issues to God," he concluded.

TOYOTA RECALLING NEARLY 700 000 VEHICLES BECAUSE OF FUEL PUMPS

TOYOTA is recalling nearly 700 000 Toyota and Lexus vehicles in the US because of issues with the fuel pumps.

Approximately 696 000 vehicles are involved in this recall.

The subject vehicles are equipped with a fuel pump which may stop operating. If this were to occur, warning lights and messages may be displayed on the instrument panel and the engine may run rough.

This can result in a vehicle stall, and the vehicle may be unable to be restarted. If a vehicle stall occurs while driving at higher speeds, this could increase the risk of a crash.

Toyota is currently investigating this issue and will be developing a remedy. When the remedy is available, there will be no cost to vehicle owners. All known owners of the affected vehicles will be notified by first class mail by mid-March.

Labour ministry finalises migration policy

THE ministry of labour and social security is currently in the process of finalising the National Labour Migration Policy (NLMP).

The policy is effective in dealing with migrant workers, inclusive of internal and cross-border migration, and it is in line with international norms and standards.

Acting Commissioner of Labour Mthunzi Shabangu said the policy provided a clear description of the patterns of labour migration that took place within, into, out of, and through the Kingdom of Eswatini.

He said the ministry had drafted the implementation plan for the NLMP. He said the NLMP was currently awaiting Cabinet approval after it was validated by relevant stakeholders in July 2019.

He mentioned the policy also addresses issues of skills retention, development and transfer, migrants' rights and labour market information system to name a few.

He said specific provisions of the policy included return and reintegration of Emaswati who have been working abroad and increased efficiency for registration of labour migrants within the Kingdom of Eswatini.

He also stated that the pol-

icy addressed issues of regulation and monitoring mechanisms of private employment agencies, protection of rights of migrant workers and their dependents, portability of social security benefits for migrant workers and their dependents.

He added the policy also addressed health concerns of migrant workers in the context of fitness to work and access to health services, establishment of mechanisms which can contribute to regional integration and international cooperation vis-à-vis labour migration and the development of coordination mechanisms to regulate labour migration and combat human trafficking as well as the establishment and maintenance of a comprehensive data management system.

First session of Supreme Court starts February 17

97 MOTORISTS ARRESTED FOR DRINK-DRIVING

A total of 97 motorists were arrested for driving while under the influence of alcohol over the past weekend.

The ever-increasing number of motorists arrested for drink-driving indicates defiance to heed to police warnings to refrain from driving after ingesting alcohol.

With the year only in its third week, 264 motorists have been arrested for driving while under the influence of alcohol around the country.

Increase

These figures indicate an increase in the number of people arrested driving while intoxicated, as there were 60 people brought to book last weekend.

In the first weekend of 2020, 107 motorists were nabbed for contravening Section 91 as read with Section 122 of the 2007 Road Traffic Act.

The act stipulates that the amount of alcohol that should be in a motorist's blood system must not exceed 0.38 mg/l. Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Superintendent Phindile Vilakati said all the 97 motorists who were arrest-



ed had more than the legalised amount of alcohol content in the blood.

A majority of the motorists have appeared before Magistrate Courts in the country. Worth noting is that the Royal Eswatini Police Service (REPS) officers are all over the country's roads ensuring that Emaswati are safe as they use the roads.

Vilakati said police do not only look for drunk drivers but also ensure that vehicles that ferry Emaswati to their destinations are road worthy to ensure safety.

The police mouthpiece condemned motorists who fight police as they carry out their duties and urged that the public cooperate with the police to minimise road accidents

Scholar (20) arrested from driving without licence

AN unlicensed 20-year-old scholar stunned the court when he revealed that he was sent to the shops by the car's drunk owner.

Bonginkhosi Simelane of Ludzeludze area was arrested on Saturday and he appeared before Magistrate Philisiwe Simelane at the Manzini Magistrate's Court yesterday on two traffic road charges.

Bonginkhosi faced a charge of driving a motor vehicle, a Toyota sedan with registration number KSD 774 DM, while he was duly unlicensed to drive any type of motor vehicle.

For the second count, the scholar was charged for driving the aforementioned vehicle without the consent of its owner, one Mthokozisi Mhlanga of Eteni.

THE quote, 'Fake it till you make it' did not help a 35-year-old man as he was arrested for driving a car with an counterfeited clearance certificate.

Nhlanhla Bandile Ngwenya of Mhlaleni appeared before Magistrate Philisiwe Simelane yesterday on four traffic charges.

He was arrested on Saturday at Mhlaleni near Ludzeludze. The second charge faced by Ngwenya was for displaying a registration number belonging to another vehicle with the intent to falsify or deceive. The registration number TSD 852 CM was displayed on a VW Polo sedan.

As if that was not enough, Ngwenya also drove this car while he was also unlicensed to drive any class of a vehicle, and also drove the sedan while it was unlicensed itself.

Bonginkhosi was adamant that Mhlanga along another person named Thulani asked him to drive the car knowing very well that he was unlicensed. "I guess Mhlanga no registration number and being unlicensed when he went to pay for its licence disc. nabbed by police officers on Sunday. When a breathalyser test was

conducted on Nxumalo, he was said to have exceeded the legal alcohol limit of 0.38 mg/l, thus recording a blood alcohol content of 0.74 mg/l. He was further slapped with three counts contravening the Road Traffic Act.

Mitigation

In his mitigation before Magistrate Zulu yesterday, Nxumalo claimed that he did not think that Simelane was severely injured as he had 'only' bumped her with his side mirrors.

"I apologise for having fled the scene after the accident happened, however I did come back to ascertain her injuries only to find that she was no longer at the scene.

"I then deduced that she may have only sustained minor injuries, as I had bumped her with only the side mirror," Nxumalo said.

Magistrate Zulu strongly condemned Nxumalo's actions, stating that if it was an animal he bumped he would have stopped his vehicle.

"If you had bumped an animal, you would have alighted from your vehicle to check the damage it had done to your car. You have absolutely no regard for human life," the judicial officer warned.

Nxumalo was then sentenced to pay a fine of E1 700 or serve 17 months in prison for driving while under the influence of alcohol. For failing to stop after the accident, he was sentenced to 15 months, with the option to pay a fine of E1

POLICE, TEACHERS' BATTLE

THE Freedom of Association Commission

of Enquiry conducted an inspection in loco on the matter between the police and teachers.

The commission, as led by Manzini Principal Magistrate David Khumalo, last Wednesday

visited the scene where the action took place.

This is the road between the Swaziland National Association of Teachers (SNAT) Centre and William Pitcher College, where a teacher Maxwell Myeni and former Manzini Police Station Commander Raphael 'Skheshekheshe' Maseko

The incident happened in August 2018 during a meeting that was convened by SNAT to deliberate on CoLA talks.

This followed government's zero per cent offer for civil servants' cost of living adjustment (CoLA), and they heard none of it.

On the same day, another teacher Willie 'Mawillies' Dlamini was rushed to the nearest hospital after he suffered a piercing gunshot wound on his left arm during the clash with the men in blue.

The inspection in loco was meant to determine whether the police were justified to use excessive force; using live rounds of ammunition to be exact, to disperse the teachers during the encounter.

This follows that the teachers blamed the police for denying them the right to convene and discuss issues that directly affected them by disturbing the teachers' meeting.

On the other hand, the police had informed the commission that they had a right to shoot on the ground to scare away the rowdy teachers who were propelled to 'finish off' the station commander, who was at loggerheads with Myeni. On the day of the incident back in 2018, when Maseko and his team arrived at the scene they alighted from their cars and headed straight in the direction of the teachers who had already stacked some stones next to them, while demanding the police officers not to come closer to them.

It is also alleged that stones were flying in the direction of the police officers while bullets were also flying the opposite direction.

The teachers started running towards the SNAT Centre gate, while others continued to pelt the police officers with stones.

As the hard to believe scuffle was still unfolding, the teacher Mawillies was seen bleeding on his left arm with some of his colleagues assisting him with cleaning the wound with water. It was clear that a bullet had pierced through his arm and first aid was administered to him before an ambulance was called to rush him to the nearest hospital.

While the incident of the teacher being shot was the talk of the fracas, one of the teachers, Maxwell Myeni, in a moment of madness, was seen wrestling with Maseko who had pointed a gun at him.

Myeni managed to wrestle Maseko to the ground before landing on top of him in a scene that appeared like he was throttling him.

However, the senior police officer eventually managed to wrestle the teacher to the side, before other police officers and teachers came forward to separate them.



EMASWATI will get an opportunity to pay their last respects for the late Dr Xolani Mkhwanazi, the Salesian old boy who grew up at Mbekelweni before going on to become one of the most respected business leaders and scientists in South Africa.

Former pupils of Salesian high school, his friends and colleagues as well as his family in Eswatini have been invited to a commemoration service of the late Chairperson of EOH, to be held at the Salesian Chapel, starting at 2pm. It will be held on Wednesday, confirmed Max Dlamini of the Salesian Past Pupils Association

(SAPPAS).

According to Dlamini, Dr Mkhwanazi's friends and relatives as well as colleagues are putting together the commemoration service, in part to allow for his Eswatini family the opportunity to

celebrate his life.

Dr Mkhwanazi passed away peacefully on 4
January 2020 at the Wits Donald Gordon Medical
Centre in Parktown Johannesburg, having been
admitted on 14 December 2019.

It is known that he battled with cancer. His funeral service was held on Saturday at the University of Zululand, followed by the burial at Esikhaleni Cemetery.

Dr X, as he was popularly known, lived in Eswatini for a long time, was the first son born to Nimrod Khukhwini Mkhwanazi, of kwaDlangezwa—KwaZulu-Natal; and Mkhohliwe Dlamini of Mbekelweni. He attended primary schools at

Mbekelweni and Kwaluseni
before proceeding to the
Salesian High School
where he completed his O' Level
in 1973.
He enrolled

at the then

University of Botswana, Lesotho and Swaziland (UBLS), taught at Salesian before going on to be a lecturer at the University.

Dr Mkhwanazi, who touched a lot of lives of those who encountered him, pursued a Bachelor of Science degree in mathematics and physics. After graduating, he was appointed as a lecturer (and later head of department) in the Physics department at the University of Botswana and Swaziland.

He was popular but demanding lecturer, who inspired and urged his students to enjoy science and to strive to be the best.

"In all his journey, he touched many people's lives positively," said Dlamini of the man who was also served as an independent non-executive director of mining company South32, as well as at the Public Investment Corporation, having held roles of deputy and acting chairperson at the latter. He was also chancellor of the Vaal University of Technology.

With significant experience in mining and metals and expertise in science, Dr Mkhwanazi was also previously the CEO of the National Energy Regulator of South Africa.

Between 2010 and 2012, Mkhwanazi was also the president of the Chamber of Mines, which is now known as the Minerals Council South Africa.

Mkhwanazi held a PhD in applied Physics from Lancaster University. He was awarded an honorary degree from Lancaster in July 2019.

He started his career as a scientist at the Atomic Energy Corporation, and also worked at the Council for Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR) before becoming CEO of the National Energy Regulator.



"These days apart from the sponsored (MTN) League, there are sponsors of knockout (KO) tournaments, some of which are to the tune of millions Emalangeni, something which never happened during our time but there used to be the Trade Fair Tournament," said Mbingo.

'TDK' told Shiselweni News that despite those challenges, the football they played was great and the players were popular, which was what made them feel great.

Ubombo Flyers, which was the first premier league team I played for, was a popular team in those years. That's where I made a name for myself before 'graduating' to play for Highlanders and later Denver Sundowns, which in those days was popular with the name 'Basop Ikapakapa' Those were the days and most of us used to be respected even when walked around," said Mbingo.

Sharing words of wisdom, Mbingo advised today's soccer players to make use of the opportunities being availed these days and also to take care of themselves. He said chances were now there to see local players plying their trade beyond the country's borders to make money.

DOMESTIC WORKER BLACKMAILS FORVIER EMPLOYER ...demands E15 000 to keep secret

A domestic worker who witnessed her former employer having sexual intercourse with a minor (17) is demanding E15 000 to keep her mouth shut.

This is the second time the domestic worker is demanding money from her former employer of Endzingeni, who is a bank manager in northern Hhohho.

In late 2017, the domestic worker and her family demanded E6 000 from the manager and he paid the money with the hope that his employee would leave him, his wife and two daughters alone.

However, three years later, the

former domestic worker who relocated to Buhleni, re-appeared with her brother at the manager's home demanding E15 000 cash. The name of the bank manager has been withheld because the matter has not been reported to the police.

Interviewed yesterday, the distraught bank manager said he was even contemplating telling his family about the incident before handing himself over to the police.

"I am living in fear because this former domestic worker keeps returning to me for more money. Initially, I paid her E6 000 and she swore to leave me and my family alone. She moved to Buhleni. However, last week she returned to my homestead with her brother and demanded more money.

"I know that the relationship I had with the minor was illegal hence I ended it. As we speak the girl is now at the University of Eswatini pursuing her studies. The domestic worker is now demanding E15 000 from me.

Scared

"Initially, I was scared of losing my job because of the incident, but now my feelings have changed," he said.

The manager added that he told the domestic worker to come back tomorrrow for the money. "I lied to the domestic worker and told her to come on Tuesday. I don't intend paying her. I want to expose her and her family," he added.

When contacted, the domestic worker denied the whole story, say-

ing that newspapers were filled with lies. "I have not done such an evil thing; I have no idea what you are talking about and even if I knew anything, I would not speak to you because newspapers are filled with lies," she said.

Meanwhile, Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Superintendent Phindile Vilakati advised the manager to hand himself to the police.

"The incident is very complicated, however, the manager should face the police and report the incident so that it can come to pass. After doing this, the manager should report the domestic worker for blackmail. However, he should have proof that she is in contact with him," she said.



Woman stabbed with beer bottle by intoxicated love rival

A woman had to relive the chilling tale of how she survived an attack by an intoxicated rival during a drinking spree.

Relaying her version of events before the court, Temalangeni Dlamini recalled that she was standing in front of the shops at kaBhelinah in the evening when an intoxicated Nolwazi Sihlongonyane approached her.

approached her.

"Nolwazi came to me visibly drunk, and she was carrying a bottle of Redds' cider in her hand. She told me that she wanted to speak to me and asked me to accompany her to a nearby bush as she wanted to respond to a call of nature. We walked down to a place below a mill, we stopped and she started assaulting me with open hands several times. I fell as I was taken by surprise by her attack," Dlamini recalled.

According to Dlamini, Nolwazi then took the bottle of Redds' and assaulted the victim with it in the head.

"I tried shielding my head with my hands, but she continued to assault me with the bottle until it broke.

"Nolwazi then took one of the broken pieces and stabbed me in my arms and hands three times. Her friends arrived, and she told them that I disrespected her. While I was being carried to an ambulance, I could still hear her hurling insults at me," a broken Dlamini said. Sihlongonyane was arrested and charged with assault with intent to cause grievous bodily harm.

The matter continues in court.

Velile Shongwe was arrested and charged with malicious damage to property. The glass door was valued at E1 500.



CHRISTIANS AND POLITICS

LAST week in this column I looked into what seems to have caused Sive Siyinqaba Sibahle Sinje Movement's latest outburst, which has been accompanied by some veneer of frustration in the country's political landscape.

Without being exhaustive, I alluded to the point that their frustrations seem to emanate from the growing number of Christians, especially from the Jesus Calls Worship Centre (JC) who are occupying prominent political positions in government.

The number of Christians in our politics has not been an accident or coincidence.

His Majesty King Mswati III, in the annual church services held at Lozitha in 2013 and 2018 emphaphized on the need to have Christians or people who feared God within our government structures.

He in fact stated that it would be best that even when we elect later in both years, we elect people who feared and know God as their Lord and Saviour.

All what His Majesty the King was saying was that it is good to confess your knowledge of God, but he needed people whose walking demonstrated that they are children of God.

This call and further definition may have been informed by his disappointments at people who claimed to have been born again, but their ways and conduct fail to project God.

So in short, the swelling number of Christians in government has not been a mistake, but a calculated move to have God-fearing people in leadership positions.

The question is; can Christians live-up to their Godly principles in the world of corrupt people who always target politicians to achieve their own selfish ends?

It is often said that politics is a dirty game and politicians tell lies with a straight face. The challenge facing our Christian brothers and sisters in leadership positions today is to prove the King that he appointed worthy people into such positions.

It would be travesty of the Christian faith if all those who have been appointed to lead can be associated with all the wrong things that trouble the world today; corruption, theft; abuse of authority (power), mismanagement of resources at their disposal and many other worst things.

In the previous government led by late former Prime Minister Dr. Barnabas Sibusiso Dlamini, his was not about members of a certain church dominating government.

He was a staunch Church of the Nazarene member, from his time his father served as the pastor.

During Dlamini's tenure as Prime Minister, we saw a lot of collaboration between governments institutions with that of the church.

Government financially supported both the education and health facilities of the church without having total control.



In fact, I would say, given another person serving as PM, the relationship between the Church of the Nazarene and government would have been crafted a bit differently for the mutual benefit of both parties.

An example of this relationship was that government continued to support the RFM Hospital financially without having a say in controlling expenditure, which has been a cause of great concern to government officials.

Prime Minister Ambrose Mandvulo Dlamini, as head of cabinet's duty would be to ensure that members from his church mainly are seen to be delivering on the King's mandate of fighting corruption, good governance and creating jobs.

EPOCA 2018 IN ACTIO

THE Ministry of Justice and Constitutional Affairs in 2018 passed the Prevention of Organised Crimes Act and unlike the Prevention of Corruption Act of 2006, it has been successful in implementing the law as more assets have been attached. In the coming days, starting today, we will be publishing some of the court orders granted by the High court under this Act.

POWER AND MISRULE: IT'S TIME TO SEPARATE TRUTH FROM LIES

IN the US, the Trump presidency and the President's January 8th statemay well see a second term.

Climate change and government inertia are catching up with Australia's denialist government as Armageddonlike scenes unfold on our screens. In Britain, Boris Johnson continues his rocky road to Brexit. And then there is South Africa.

Hope smiles from the threshold of the year to come, whispering 'it will be happier...

Alfred Lord Tennyson

You cannot help but be drawn to these two lines from Tennyson's The Foresters, especially if you're a hopeless optimist.

As we start 2020, we can only hope it will be happier than 2019 though all indications are to the contrary. The world is grappling with the complexity of inequality, but also with what seems to be an ever-increasing inability to determine what truth is, where 'alternative facts' have become part of our common lexicon.

The Trump presidency is perhaps the most graphic illustration of such a lack of commitment to truth. The chaotic nature of that presidency is built on a daily dose of falsehoods and a lack of impulse control.

There is a powerlessness borne out of self-preservation among elected representatives in the US and Trump will in all likelihood gain a second term. Climate change and government inertia are catching up with Australia's denialist government as we watch Armageddon-like scenes of burning unfold before us on our screens. In Britain, Prime Minister Boris Johnson continues his rocky road to Brexit. That Leave campaign was built almost entirely on false-

And then there is South Africa. Nothing signifies meltdown more vividly than a country being plunged

into darkness.

Load shedding occurred in early January thus putting paid to the president's promise to the country that there would be no load shedding until January 13.

Curious

It was a curious promise to make given the instability at Eskom, and was met with predictable scepticism. Deputy President David Mabuza seemed to play his hand in a typically cunning way when he said Ramaphosa had been 'misled' and called for increased 'maintenance' of power stations

Whether the comment was meant to show up Ramaphosa, show himself as the man for a crisis and then push for Minister of Public Enterprises Pravin Gordhan's resignation — or all three — we cannot be sure.

What we do know is that Mabuza was a late convert to Ramaphosa's 'cause' at the ANC's NASREC conference in 2017 and that he cannot be trusted. Known as 'The Cat', his tenure as premier in Mpumalanga was marked by controversy and criminal allegations are constantly swirling around him.

The latest iteration of load shedding took place against the backdrop of the ANC's annual birthday bash ment. The "celebrations" seemed to go on for days as the people of Kimberley watched the passing show.

Located within the Sol Plaatje municipality which suffers from the same deep degradation and high unemployment as most places in South Africa, Plaatje would have hung his head in shame at what Kimberley and indeed what the ANC has become.

As ANC members marched in, parading a large ANC birthday cake and as the top six of the party sipped bubbly, Marie Antoinette sprang so obviously to mind.

How anachronistic that each year men in military fatigues enter a stadium carrying a large cake and how shamelessly those on stage partake of the cake for all to see.

It's as if the ANC simply cannot help itself. The excess is evident everywhere even as citizens languish in squalor. But the cake ceremony symbolises the reality of a party that has lost its moorings.

Ramaphosa's speech emphasised unity within his fractured party. He declared 2020 the year of "unity, socio-economic renewal and nation building". We've certainly heard those lines before.

Matter

And so like Nero, the ANC continues to fiddle despite our Herculean challenges. No matter what Ramaphosa said, it has begun to feel as if we are in a moment of distinct political crisis. In the days that followed the party's party, the likes of Bathabile Dlamini and an array of Twitter trolls (including the disgraced Carl Niehaus) were calling for Gordhan to resign, given the state of Eskom.

If ever there was a time to separate truth from lies, it is in this political milieu. Bathabile Dlamini is the same person who nearly brought the social security agency, Sassa to its knees and was found to have lied to court, Then, Dlamini was ordered to pay 20% of the costs in the Sassa matter relating to the further extension of the invalid Cash Paymaster contract when she was minister of Social Development.

The unanimous judgment of the highest court delivered by Justice Froneman was scathing. The Constitutional Court held that:

"Some of Minister Dlamini's evidence under oath in affidavits before the court and orally in the inquiry was false. The registrar of the court must be directed to forward a copy of the inquiry report and this judgment to the director of public prosecutions to consider whether Minister Dlamini lied under oath and if so, must be prosecuted for perjury.

And so in a party where shame is in short supply, the likes of Dlamini feel confident to raise their voices and call for Eskom to be placed under Minerals and Energy Minister Gwede Mantashe's watch.

The obsession with Gordhan seems an obvious distraction. He has long been a convenient target for the corrupt cronies of former President Zuma and the ethically compromised opposition EFF.

The interests of these two noxious factions coincide when it comes to Gordhan and one can easily guess

Adding to the feeling of crisis, Eskom board chair, Jabu Mabuza resigned, apologising for the premature load shedding.

Entire

Within days the entire Nuclear Energy Corporation of SA (NECSA) board resigned, citing a lack of faith in Mantashe whom they say 'frustrated and undermined' their ability to carry out their fiduciary duties.

For those who wish to wrest the state from Ramaphosa and return us to Zuma-like years, creating a sense of crisis and chaos serves them well. Think, Donald Trump.

His constant tweeting and rambling creates so much chaos that it becomes hard to separate truth from lies. If some of the lies stick, all the better. Amid the chaos Trump creates, focusing on truth and the daily reality of governing becomes very difficult.

And so, for the ANC cadres such as Dlamini, the aim of the noise is to increase the sense of pending crisis specifically around Ramaphosa's leadership.

The aim is not ethical governance that serves the poorest of the poor. The aim is to remove Ramaphosa and to find a way back in to loot the state. It is also payback for those who lost their positions of influence in Cabinet or elsewhere in the state. The noise doubtless serves to distract Ramaphosa and place Gordhan under even greater pressure.

Complicating matters for Ramaphosa, of course, is that he is met with the perfect storm. The looting of the Zuma years left the kitty bare and the dysfunction within state-owned enterprises will be with us for years to come.

It is simply not realistic to think that a turnaround will happen overnight. The rot is too deep.

Ramaphosa has also not been clear about Eskom and how it will suddenly become functional. In Kimberley he said, "... I want to say to you, we are not going to privatise Eskom, we are going to strengthen Eskom, so that it can deliver energy as it should".

The obvious follow-up question is: 'How?' And what happened to the plan to divide Eskom into a Gaullike three parts? Jabu Mabuza's resignation can only slow whatever momentum there was.

Problem

But Eskom is not the only problem on Ramaphosa's plate. He presides over a stagnant economy forecast to grow at a miserable 0.9%, an unemployment crisis and a society whose social fabric is all but breaking.

So it is no surprise the feeling of crisis is all around even among Ramaphosa's backers.

He heads a party which is basically unfit for purpose and it is hard to see how the ANC can be the vehicle for change the country needs.

All the while, he will need to watch his back ahead of the National General

Council meeting of the ANC later in

It is not an elective conference, rather one about policy, but generally one is able to judge the president's strength of support within the party over those few days. Between now and then Ramaphosa has several opportunities to assert his authority over his Cabinet and the country, however.

As much as Ramaphosa is hemmed in by the divisions within his party, the problem for the faction within the ANC that wants to be shot of Ramaphosa is that they themselves are a motley crew, whose strategy is noise, chaos and creating a sense of crisis. Who is their leader?

DD Mabuza simply doesn't seem like a convincing option for them. Therefore, Ramaphosa should seize the only moment he now has to try to shape our political future with a sense of clarity.

As maverick Finance Minister Tito Mboweni tweeted (not an ideal mode of communication, but nevertheless) the time for "deep structural economic reforms" is now.

His tweet has a tone of desperation about it and who can blame him? Ramaphosa exhorted us all to join him in this task in his "Thuma mina!" State of the Nation address at the beginning of his term of office.

The people are all still here, waiting, though restive with a pending sense of gloom.

The goodwill is fast dissipating and the only way Ramaphosa can take on those within his party who wish to see his downfall, is to build broadbased alliances across society.

In shoring up such support within the business community and across civil society, he has a chance at building a bulwark against his corrupt cronies. His legitimacy as leader of the country derives from the people, after all.

For some reason, Ramaphosa has seemed reluctant to build these alliances and when he has, the attempts have seemed either half-hearted or he has seemed unable to commit to action.

Ramaphosa has to play the hand he has been dealt and put convincing building blocks in place to ensure that the prevailing notion of crisis is contained.

Paralysis

The paralysis within the state cannot continue, yet it is so hollowed out and drained of capacity that the rebuilding will take years. Ramaphosa's window of opportunity to provide an honest rendering of our challenges and a clear roadmap of what will be done to deal with them is narrowing.

This is aggravated by the wretched economy and increasing inequality.

He risks squandering the goodwill of broader society as he continues to feed us arcane ANC double-speak. There's been enough talk and pandering to an ANC interested only in navel-gazing about itself and decidedly uninterested in Ramaphosa's notion of unity. It's time for Ramaphosa to assert the modern statesman in him and expend his political capital with intent. DM

SA's live animal export to Eswatini at over E450 million

SOUTH Africa's live animal exports to Eswatini totalled to over E450 million between January and September 2019.

Information sourced from a South African publication, the Business Day is that according to Statistics SA, the live animal exports totalled an exact E458.9m.

Eswatini suspended animal imports from neighbouring SA for a second time in 2019 after another outbreak of foot-and-mouth disease, the kingdom's agricultural ministry said on Tuesday.

In January, the kingdom joined Botswana and Zimbabwe in suspending meat imports from SA over an outbreak of the highly con-

tagious viral disease that affects cloven-footed animals, those with divided hooves such as cows, pigs and sheep.

Sought for comment Ministry of Agriculture Communications Officer Nomvuselelo Dlamini said they were not in a position to confirm these figures.

"As a ministry we don't deal with money but only issue out permits for the animals hence the difficulty to know the monetary value," she said.

Asked on the latest update on the foot and mouth disease (FMD), Dlamini said nothing had changed regarding the ban.

"Everything is still the same as we issued in our last statement on the FMD issue," she said.

In their statement released early this month, the ministry stated that partial lifting of import restrictions on processed products of animal origin was still intact.

Dlamini stated then that the outbreak of the FMD in the Molemole district, Limpopo Province was still active and being handled.

"Our ministry is in communication with South Africa and they have specifically stated that the event is continuing. This means the risk of further spread of the disease within RSA and its introduction into Eswatini territory remains very high," she stated.

FINANCED SECTORS CREATE 322 JOBS - ID

FINANCED sectors in Eswatini have resulted in 332 jobs.

These are agriculture whereby E2.4 million was injected, resulting to 117 jobs and animal husbandry being the most popular. In service industry, E1.5 million was injected, resulting to 85 jobs, retail industry received E1 million and created 46 jobs and other industries collectively amount to an investment of E1.7m from which 84 jobs were created.

Industrial Development Company of Eswatini (IDCE) acting CEO Khetsiwe Dube believes most loan applicants are pushed into business due to the lack of employment rather than passion.



Eswatini trade surplus at E623.4 million in December 2019

IN December 2019, Eswatini recorded a trade surplus amounting to E623.4 million, which marks a 144.1 per cent increase from the E255.3 million trade surplus recorded in the previous month in line with imports declining faster than exports.

The trade surplus is the amount by which the value of a country's exports exceeds the cost of its imports.

Information sourced from the Recent Economic Development (RED) released by the Central Bank of Eswatini (CBE), month-on-month export earnings depicted a marginal decline of 1.4 per cent from E2.719 billion to E2.682 billion. An analysis of export earnings for the month under review indicates that month-on-month sugar and sugar confectionery products exported declined by 50.4 per cent from E804.0 million to E398.5 million. Miscellaneous edible products exported increased significantly by 58.7 per cent, from E1.135 billion to E1.801 billion in December 2019, while wood and wood articles declined significantly by 33.2 per cent, from E140.7 million to E94.0 million in December 2019. Textile and textile apparel products exported declined significantly by 46.6 per cent in December 2019 relative to the previous month, from E362.8 million to E193.8 million.

Meanwhile, the import bill underwent a month-on-month dip of 16.5 per cent from E2.464 billion to settle at E2.058 billion in December 2019. The significant month-on-month dip in the import bill can be largely attributed to a significant decline in vehicles imported by 58.7 per cent, from E244.6 million to E101.0 million.

It is worth noting that vehicle imports accounted for 4.9 per cent of the total import bill for December 2019. Electrical machinery and equipment accounted for 5.7 per cent of the total import bill - declined significantly on a month-on-month basis by 26.3 per cent from E160.0 million to E118.0

Nuclear reactors, boilers, machinery and mechanical appliances imported for the month of December 2019 surged by 18.9 per cent from E127.3 million to E103.3 million. This class of imports accounted for 5.0 per cent of the total import bill for the month. On the other hand, energy products remained the country's leading import for the month under review since it accounted for 18.3 per cent of total import bill, whilst increasing by 5.6 per cent on a month-on-month basis, from E356.3 million to E376.4 mil-

Don't rule out another rate cut in 2020 - economists

JOHANNESBURG - The Reserve Bank last week unexpectedly cut the repo rate by 25 basis points to 6.25 per cent, and some economists have noted that another rate cut later in the year cannot be ruled out entire-

The SA Reserve Bank's (SARB) monetary policy committee (MPC) met last week and unanimously agreed to cut the repo rate, which is the benchmark interest rate at which the SARB lends money to other banks. The cut was justified by

the moderation in the inflation outlook and an improved inflation risk profile.

The medium-term forecasts for consumer inflation were revised lower to average 4.1 per cent for 2019 (down from 4.2 per cent) and 4.7 per cent for 2020 (down from 5.1 per cent) and 4.6 per cent in 2021 (down from 4.7 per cent). Economic growth projections were also lowered – down from 0.5 per cent for 2019 to 0.4 per cent and down from 1.4 per cent for 2020 to 1.2 per cent.

Subscribe to Fin24's newsletter here "The SARB's decision to cut the policy rate came earlier than initially anticipated," Senior FNB Economist Siphamandla Mkhwanazi commented. He explained that the bank determined that domestic risk events such as the upcoming National Budget speech in February and Moody's ratings decision, as well as global risks such as US-Iran tensions, were outweighed by the lower domestic inflation and weak economic growth. The economist expects the

Reserve Bank to keep near-term interest rates "relatively steady", given the fiscal challenges of the country.



The Reserve Bank's quarterly projection model (QPM) signals two reporate cuts of 25 basis points in 2020. However, this is a "broad policy which could change in either direction" between MPC meetings, Investee economist Lara Hodes noted. Momentum Investments economists – Herman van Papendorp, Sanisha Packirisamy and Roberta Noise reiterated these views in an analysis report they authored on the latest MPC decision. "The January 2020 QPM sug-

gests one more cut of 25 basis points in the fourth quarter of 2020, following January's cut. The MPC suggested it would continue to assess data and risk changes and use the QPM as a guiding tool for future monetary policy decisions," the economists said.

"While Moody's March ratings review is likely to dissuade the committee from cutting interest rates again at the March 2020 interest rate-setting meeting, further expected downgrades to the SARB's inflation and growth forecasts prevent us from ruling out an additional cut later in the year," they added. GORDHAN A DISASTER FOR SOES - ANC NEC MEMBERS

JOHANNESBURG - Public Enterprises Minister Pravin Gordhan was the prime target for several ANC members at the party's National Executive Committee meeting on Saturday morning.

Ten vocal members wanted what they called "reflection on Gordhan's performance as minister", arguing that he was a disaster for the nation's stateowned enterprises.

Although the agenda item was initially contested by party chairperson Gwede Mantashe, the opposing faction didn't let go.

Leading the charge against Gordhan was NEC member Mosebenzi Zwane, who wanted to know why the ANC treated Finance Minister Tito Mboweni and Gordhan as 'super-ministers'.

Ramaphosa is expected to respond to the grievances against Gordhan later over the weekend.

NEC member Bongani Bongo who had accused Gordhan of choreographing his arrest, revealed that President Cyril

Ramaphosa sought to facilitate a 'unity meeting' between himself and Gordhan but the latter declined.

Gordhan was a strong Ramaphosa backer ahead of the party's elective conference in 2017. It is unlikely that Ramaphosa will act against Gordhan. The team also wanted the resolutions of the 54th national conference to be protected, this after Mboweni took to Twitter to slam the ANC's policy on the nationalisation of the South African Reserve Bank.

The EFF rejects ANC veterans' defence of Pravin Gordhan

JOHANNESBURG-The red berets accuse the minister of intentionally wanting to collapse SOEs so they could be taken over by 'the white capitalist establishment'.

The Economic Freedom Fighters (EFF) have said they reject the defence of Public Enterprises Minister Pravin Gordhan by the governing African National Congress (ANC) veterans

"The (EFF) rejects, with contempt, the lousy defence of Pravin Gordhan by the so-called struggle veterans; who have thrown out principle on the altar of self-enrichment for convenience," the red berets said in a statement on Saturday.

This after the governing party's stalwarts, veterans and its strategic dialogue group said they were appalled by the "political assault" on Gordhan.

"The so-called veterans have

reduced themselves into a defence force of Pravin Gordhan, even in the face of his spectacular incompetence in the oversight and guidance of state-owned companies," the EFF said.

The red berets accused Gordhan of bringing about 'unprecedented levels of destabilisation, chaos through incompetent interferences and banishment of African leadership' in all stateowned companies (SOCs) under the minister's portfolio.

The red berets alleged that "Gordhan's interferences" have resulted in the following:

Eskom is in a huge debt of more than R400 billion and losing the capacity to provide dependable electricity

Speaker will rule 'soon' on removal of Public Protector

CAPE TOWN - Speaker Thandi Modise is to make her decision soon on the request by the official opposition to begin the process for the removal of Public Protector Busisiwe Mkhwebane.

The DA has been pushing for the past two years to have Mkhwebane removed.

After Parliament concluded its process on the new rules to remove heads of Chapter 9 institutions, the DA made a request to Modise to start the process on Mkhwebane's removal.

Parliament's Spokesperson Moloto Mothapo said on Saturday the speaker would make a decision soon. "She is looking into the matter and will announce her decision soon," said Mothapo. However, Mothapo would not say when this would be.

The DA has said this needed to happen as soon as possible when Parliament resumes its business in the next few weeks.

It said the matter had been delayed during the drafting of the new rules, but that was now over and Parliament would need to get on with its business.

Mkhwebane has been under attack for some time from some within the ANC and opposition parties. They have also slammed her on some of the judgments

against her. But Mkhwebane has defended herself, saying she is fit for office.

The process to remove her was halted last year after she warned she would take Parliament to court because there was no process in place for this.

This forced the National Legislature to draw up its rules on removal of a head of a Chapter 9 institution.

DA interim leader John Steenhuisen has since November 2018 been trying to get Mkhwebane out of office.

In the first attempt the ANC members in the justice committee were divided and the matter fell through.

'ANC was captured before 1994'

DURBAN - General Secretary of the SA Federation of Trade Unions Zwelinzima Vavi says 'white monopoly capital captured' the ANC before 1994 and "nobody wants to talk about it".

In a television interview, Vavi claimed the pre-1994 'capture' resulted in the abandonment of the Freedom Charter and, in particular, the economic demands in it such as 'the national wealth of our country shall be restored to the people'.

"In our view, the ANC, the movement, got captured ahead of 1994 and that's the capture that nobody wants to talk about. Capture meant abandon the Freedom Charter and abandon the economic demands, in particular that which says the country's wealth shall be shared by all who work it and that the mineral wealth shall be owned by everybody.

"This also meant the abandonment of the demand that says the land shall be distributed to all those who work it. Once the capital achieved that, they grew more confident, and that's why they lobbied strongly that the first (in the democratic era) minister of Finance must be Derek Keys," said Vavi.

He claimed that when capitalists saw that Keys, who was Finance minister from 1992 to September 1994, 'was their man' to continue with the "old agenda", they became arrogant and were now beginning to call for the privatisation of state-owned enterprises, which they wanted to run, as they believed that the government was not capable of running them.

Failures

"Unfortunately, the failures of the government have meant that even the progressive solutions to the crisis get so discredited," he said. "One of the demands we have been championing as the left is for the nationalisation of the mines, but that is so hard to argue and win a discussion on among the affluent middle-class people, who will retort that 'you can't run Eskom, you have just run down the SABC - now you want mines to do the same to them.""

SISULU UNDER ATTACK OVER SHAIK, SIMELANE'S APPOINTMENTS

JOHANNESBURG - Minister of Human Settlements, Water and Sanitation Lindiwe Sisulu has come under attack from the official opposition for hiring two top officials as her special advisers.

DA deputy spokesperson on Human Settlements, Water And Sanitation Emma Powell said on Friday Sisulu needed to come clean on the appointments of former spy boss Mo Shaik and ex-National Prosecuting Authority boss Menzi Simelane in her depart-

Simelane has worked for Sisulu for several years.

She also demanded that the minister disclose their salaries.

Powell said she would apply for the Promotion of Access to Information Act (PAIA) to force Sisulu to disclose this information to her.

In her written reply, Sisulu defended the appointments in her office, saying

they were above board.

"Conditions of employment such as salaries and qualifications of staff are confidential. "Laws such as the Promotion of Access to Information Act and the Basic Conditions of Employment Act, among others, protect the confidentiality of such information.

"I, however, wish to indicate to the honourable member that posts in the ministry have been filled as outlined in the Guide for Members of the Executive, otherwise commonly referred to as the ministerial handbook," said Sisulu.

Powell said some of those appointed had questionable pasts.

Shaik recently appeared before the Zondo Commission of Inquiry into State Capture. He said members of the intelligence agency at the time had clashed with former intelligence minister Siyabonga Cwele in respect of their investigations into the Guptas. *Political Bureau*

What do the bombshell statements mean?

LONDON - Buckingham Palace has issued its latest statement concerning the crisis surrounding the Duke and Duchess of Sussex.

What does it say?

Harry and Meghan are no longer going to be working Royals, will not be carrying out royals duties and they will not use their HRH styles.

What does this mean?

The couple have effectively stepped down, not just as senior royals, but as working royals in general.

The dual role they suggested in their bombshell statement - of earning their own money and carrying out Royal duties - is not going to happen.

How will they be funded?

Buckingham Palace said they will no longer receive public funds for Royal duties, because they will not be carrying out any.

When will the changes take place?

In the spring of 2020.

Will they be financially independent?

Not completely. They will the earn their own money, but the Prince of Wales will also continue to offer private financial support to the couple.

This is expected to come from his £21 million a year Duchy of Cornwall income.

Will they still get round the clock protection officers paid for by the taxpayers?

Buckingham Palace said it does not comment on security matters.

But it added: "There are well established independent processes to determine the need for publicly funded security."

And what about Frogmore cottage?

Harry and Meghan will pay back £2.4 million in taxpayers' money spent on renovating their Berkshire home.

Will they still use it as their base when in the UK?

Yes. And they will pay rent at a commercial rate on the property.

Where will they spend most time?

They will spend the majority of their time in North America.

What about their patronages?

They will keep their Royal patronages as private patronages and associations.

But Harry will be stepping down from his military appointments.

He will no longer be Captain General of the Royal Marines, Honorary Air Force Commandant of the Royal Air Force Base Honington, and Honorary Commodorein-Chief of the Royal Naval Commands' Small Ships and Diving.

PRINCE HARRY, MEGHAN MARKLE OFFICIALLY QUIT ROYAL LIFE, DROP TITLES

LONDON - The Duke and **Duchess of Sussex will no longer** use their HRH titles and will repay millions of pounds of taxpayers' money spent refurbishing Frogmore Cottage as the price of a 'Hard Megxit' deal, it was dramatically announced last night.

Under the terms of the historic deal thrashed out at Sandringham yesterday, the pair, who will be known as Harry, Duke of Sussex and Meghan, Duchess of Sussex, will cease to be working members of the Royal Family from this spring and will not perform any official duties on behalf of the Queen effectively leaving 'The Firm' completely.

The move will see Harry drop all of his official military positions and the couple will also spend the majority of their time in North America, a source told ITV.

The shock statement was

announced by the Queen - but minutes later the couple sparked confusion when they updated their own website and signed off as 'Their Royal Highnesses'.

The announcement by Kensington Palace marks the conclusion of talks about their future after days of wrangling with senior members of the family and Royal aides to thrash out a deal.

But Harry and Meghan, who sources say intend to spend 'the majority' of their time in North America, will pay a heavy financial and emotional cost.

As well as returning the £2.4 million spent on a lavish refurbishment of Frogmore Cottage, they will pay a commercial rent - estimated at up to £360 000 a year to retain it as their British home.

Prince Charles will continue to 'offer private financial support' and, crucially, the couple will have free rein to negotiate lucrative commercial deals that experts believe could net them hundreds of millions of pounds, although they have pledged 'to uphold the values of Her Majesty'.

A number of unresolved issues remain, including whether Harry and Meghan will be required to

'I'm surprised it took Meghan this long to get Harry to ditch family'

LONDON - Piers Morgan responded to Buckingham Palace's historic announcement on Saturday that Prince Harry and Meghan Markle will be retiring from Royal life by suggesting the Queen had told them to 'sling their part-time Royal hook'.

The TV presenter, who has made no secret of his dislike for the Duchess of Sussex's behaviour since she ghosted him, tweeted his thoughts immediately after the Megxit deal was revealed.

He wrote: 'BREAKING: The Queen's told Megan/Harry to sling their part-time Royal hook.

"Well done, Your Majesty - right decision. Only surprised it took her so long to get Harry to ditch his family, the Monarchy, the mil-

itary and his country."

The enraged Good Morning Britain host continued to vent his outrage by saying: "Bottom line: Meghan/Harry wanted to have their cake and eat it, but the Queen just took the cake back to the royal kitchens."

Morgan then began replying to other Twitter users with his opinion on certain aspects of the couple's new role.

In response to ITV News's Royal Editor Chris Ship, who tweeted a quote from the former Head of the Navy on the topic of Harry stepping down, Morgan wrote: Staggering that Harry would turn his back on the military like this.

Due to Harry giving up his mil-

itary ranks, he will pass on the position of Captain General to the Royal Marines which he took on from his grandfather, Prince Philip, who had held it from 1953 to 2017.

Piers Morgan said: "Philip must be devastated."

However he took some solace in the situation and said: "On a positive note, this spells the death on arrival of Meghan and Harry's plan for a 'progressive' new Monarchy.

"So they thankfully won't be 'woking' the Windsors after all.'

As a teaser to his next MailOnline column, the TV presenter replied to a tweet from a fan which read: 'Am I the only one waiting for Piers Morgan to publish an article?!' Morgan responded ominously to say: '36 hours...'

Alastair Bruce, a commentator on the royals, told Sky News: 'I think the queen has dealt with this crisis because she has absolutely drawn the line: you can be private people, but you cannot be royal at the same time

Meanwhile, the decision by the Duke and Duchess of Sussex to walk away from the monarchy will 'avoid catastrophe', royal commentator Penny Junor said.

After days of crisis talks following Harry and Meghan's announcement that they would be stepping back as senior royals, Buckingham Palace announced the pair will stop carrying out royal duties from the spring.

Meghan 's dad launches an extraordinary TV attack on Megxit

TORONTO - The Duchess of Sussex's estranged father has spoken in depth for the first time about the Megxit crisis — and accused his daughter of 'cheapening' the Royal Family and throwing away 'every girl's dream' for money.

In a TV documentary, Thomas Markle describes Meghan and Harry's behaviour as embarrassing, saying they are 'turning into lost souls' and, in a reference to a discount American supermarket giant, adds: 'They are turning it [the Royal Family] into a Walmart with a crown on.'

He added: 'This is not the girl I raised.' Markle's intervention in the monarchy's worst crisis for a generation came as the Queen's top aides finalised a deal for the couple, who are quitting as frontline Royals and leaving Britain to seek financial independence.

He told the Channel 5 documentary: "When they got married they took on an obligation, and the obligation is to be part of the Royals and to represent the Royals. And it would be foolish for them not to.

"This is one of the greatest long-living institutions ever. They are destroying it, they are cheapening it, making it shabby... they shouldn't be doing this."

The 90-minute documentary, Thomas Markle: My Story, explores the background to what it calls his 'complicated' relationship with his daughter and their dramatic fallout in the run-up to her wedding to Prince Harry in May 2018.

In addition, it charts Meghan's formative years—she lived with Markle between the ages 11 and 18. *Daily Mail*

Canadian press reacts to 'Megxit'

TORONTO - Canada has reacted to the shock announcement the Duke and Duchess of Sussex will quit Royal life completely, with Harry expected to join Meghan and baby Archie in the North American country.

Prime Minister Justin Trudeau declined to comment on the bombshell news, but newspapers were quick to weigh in.

In an opinion piece for the Toronto Sun, Christina Blizzard wrote: "Yes, we're flattered to have you come stay. No, we don't want to pay for security."

She added: "You sense a great deal of pain and sadness in the Queen's statement. She deserved better. She tried so hard to welcome Meghan.'

Critics have said the couple are not welcome to settle in Canada, suggesting they would cost taxpayers £5million [US\$10million] and would cause a constitutional crisi

This is because no British Royal has ever settled there and the nation prides itself on not having any aristocracy, with anyone offered a peerage in the UK expected to renounce their Canadian citizenship first.

And the Globe and Mail touched on the cost of the couple, saying: "The statement also didn't clarify who will cover the cost of their security, which has been estimated at around £600 000 annually."

'Saturday's statement didn't comment on security other than to say; "There are well established independent processes to determine the need for publicly- funded security."

It added: 'The Canadian government has not said if it will cover the cost of the couple's security if they decide to live in the country.

"Prime Minister Justin Trudeau said this week that security costs were "part of the reflection that

needs to be had and there are discussions going on."

Respected broadsheet the National Post also covered the story in a news article.

It comes after a new poll in Toronto, a city Meghan lived for seven years, found her husband is, after the Queen, regarded as their favourite Windsor. But nearly three-quarters of people were opposed to paying towards the Sussexes' costs.

While support for his grandmother the Queen is 'deep, broad and strong', two thirds said the Royal family is losing or has lost its relevance and 45 per cent said Canada should not continue as a constitutional monarchy.

the work Meghan and Harry have contributed to 'the Commonwealth and beyond'. Meghan and Harry wish to pursue an independent life in Canada, another Commonwealth country.

5. "Particularly proud": The Queen pays tribute to Meghan and praises how quickly she has become part of the family. This is in light of how many feel the Queen has every right to be unhappy with the way the Duchess has behaved.

6. "My whole family's hope": Here the monarch speaks as a head of the Royal Family as a whole, putting aside her personal feelings for the greater good.

"Harry, Meghan and Archie will always be much loved members of my family. 'I recognise the challenges they have experienced as a result of intense scrutiny over the last two years and support their wish for a more independent life."

"I want to thank them all for their dedicated work across this country, the Commonwealth and beyond, and am particularly proud of how Meghan has so quickly become one of the family. "It is my whole family's hope that today's agreement allows them to start building a happy and peaceful new life."


WARRANT OF ARREST FOR MNANGAGWA

HARARE - There is a long standing warrant of arrest for ZANU PF leader, Emmerson Mnangagwa in a development bound to see him and emerging military figures outstaging each other using state tools of prosecution.

Senior government officials and multiple sources have alleged Mnangagwa has lost real control of the country to the military, and if things go according to plan, "the only person now in power is Maj Gen John Chris Mupande, whose allegiance is to Vice President Constantino Chiwenga."

The military is disintegrating in a way which might turn out calamitous, reflected in how Mnangagwa ended up 'violating' his own annual leave (December 2019 to January 2020).

But how does such a person (Gen Mupande) who is junior to the Zimbabwe Defence Forces Commander, Valerio Sibanda become more powerful. The coup to remove former President Robert Mugabe was done by the Zipra wing of the military, the January 2019 operation to save Mnangagwa was also done by ZIPRA, as narrated by Mnangagwa's inlaw

The ZIPRA element of the military comes from Mberengwa, Shurugwi and Matebeleland (Gen Sibusiso Moyo, Isaac Moyo (CIO Director General), this is the element that wanted Mugabe removed or even killed.

They are the ones who run the Korokozas (artisenal miners), the Mashurugwi militia who form a civilian army. Two soldiers caught so far raiding mines in the Concession area, were from Shurugwi. It was an oper-

ation run by the Defence Intelligence.

Mnangagwa had a warrant of arrest over the murder of his girlfriend in a flat. That docket is still there. The whole November military coup was a way to sway away the criminal charges. Sources told ZimEye, Mnangagwa knew he was going to be arrested for the murder of the girlfriend (a church member of Tudor Bismark's organisation) killed in a flat in Harare who was a discovered a week later. Malawi judges offered election petition bribes - chief justice

LILONGWE - Tens of thousands of Malawians took part in protests at alleged attempts to bribe judges overseeing a legal challenge to the re-election last year of President Peter Mutharika.

People took to the streets after the country's chief justice charged that the five judges presiding over the case had been offered kickbacks. The complaint, which was filed to the Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) on Monday, prompted a call for demonstrations in Malawi's three main cities.

Around 50,000 people gathered in the capital, Lilongwe, with smaller rallies in Blantyre and Mzuzu. They braved the rain and stood vigil outside parliament. Many wore white T-shirts printed with 'ACB name and arrest the bribers now.'

Opposition leaders say the May 21 poll, which saw Mutharika narrowly beat runner-up candidate Lazarus Chakwera, was marred by fraud. In August, they petitioned Malawi's top court to annul the results — the first time presidential election results have been legally challenged since the country gained independence from Britain in 1964.

Gift Trapence, head of a watchdog group called the Human Rights Defenders Coalition (HRDC), said his organization was pressuring ACB head Reyneck Matemba to seek 'justice.' "We met Mr Matemba yesterday and we told him that the taxpayers want the culprits exposed and arrested," Trapence, whose group organized the protests, told the rally in Lilongwe. "We told him that if they sue the ACB, we, the taxpayers, will pay. The ACB will act in a few days," Matemba told reporters, promising Malawians would not be 'let down.'

He said the body was investigating individuals named by the chief justice rather than political parties.

"This is our chance as the ACB to demonstrate to the people of Malawi that we can do better," Matemba added.

A court ruling on the election challenge is expected by the end of January. The ACB aims to complete its probe before then.

Sporadic demonstrations have broken out across Malawi since the election, with protesters demanding the ouster of the electoral commission's head over her handling of the vote. Many rallies have been met with violence by security forces.

But the demonstrations unfolded peacefully and no incidents were reported at any of the venues, according to police spokesman James Kadadzera. Mutharika has brushed off all doubts on the official results, which show he won just 159,000 votes more than Chakwera, a margin of around three percentage points. *The Observer*

MOZAMBIQUE: NYUSI ANNOUNCES NEW GOVERNMENT

MAPUTO - Mozambican President Filipe Nyusi announced his new government on Friday evening, and reappointed Carlos Agostinho do Rosario as Prime Minister.

Under the Mozambican system, the Prime Minister is not the head of the government, a position occupied by the President. He coordinates the Council of Ministers (Cabinet), and represents the government in its dealings with the country's Parliament, the Assembly of the Republic. Over the past five years, Rosario has been a steady hand on the tiller of government, and often stands in for Nyusi in the latter's absences.

Also reappointed is Adriano Maleiane, as Minister of Economy and Finance,

even though, at the age of 70, he was the oldest member of the outgoing government. Maleiane has been handling the fallout from the scandal of Mozambique's "hidden debts" - the over two billion dollars in loans obtained by three fraudulent security-related companies from the banks Credit Suisse and VTB of Russia. Maleiane's team has been negotiating with the creditors, and no doubt Nyusi wanted to ensure continuity.

Reappointed

Nyusi reappointed Max Tonela as Minister of Mineral Resources and Energy. An economist by profession, Tonela is now a key figure in the development of Mozambique's massive reserves of natural gas. During the lifespan of the new

government, the first project producing and exporting liquefied natural gas (LNG) will come on stream. This is the floating LNG unit, currently under construction in a South Korean shipyard.

At the same time, a least two onshore LNG plants are expected to be built on the Afungi Peninsula, in Palma district, in the northern province of Cabo Delgado.

Joao Machatine stays on as Minister of Public Works. Trained as a civil engineer, Machatine has a reputation for dynamism, and has been criss-crossing the country, dealing with crises such as the collapse of a bridge over the Montepuez river, which cut off the northern districts of Cabo Delgado from the rest of the country.

60 killed as Houthi attack camp

CAIRO - Iran-aligned Houthis attacked a military training camp in the Yemeni city of Marib on Saturday, killing 60 military personnel and wounding dozens others, Saudi state television said on Saturday evening. Al Ekhbariya television quoted sources as saying the attack was carried out with ballistic missiles and drones. A proxy war has been playing out in Yemen between Iran and Saudi Arabia. The Saudi-led coalition intervened in 2015 to restore the government of President Abd-Rabbu Mansour Hadi, which the Houthis ousted from power in the capital Sanaa and is now based in the southern port city of Aden.

17 linked to 'get-rich-quick' schemes arrested

JOHANNESBURG - At least 17 people have been arrested in Burundi's largest city Bujumbura over a Ponzi scheme, online publication RegionWeek reported. It quoted the spokesman for the public security and disasters management ministry, Pierre Nkurikiye, as saying a probe into the company behind the scheme, Crowd1, was underway. Crowd1 hit the headlines in Burundi recently when it launched a scheme which offered participants dividends for recruiting new investors. Nkurikiye expressed concern that Burundi nationals kept flocking to such schemes which made false "getrich-quick" promises, despite regular warnings from the government. Reuters

Kenya-Iran under great train over war

NAIROBI - In early 1978, Kenyan-Iranian relations came under great strain over the Ogaden war between Ethiopia and Somalia. Kenya suspected that Iran was actively supporting Somalia and also arming it with weapons supplied by Britain and America. While Iran and Kenya's Western allies leaned towards Somalia in the conflict, Nairobi was sympathetic to the Soviet-backed Ethiopia, mainly because of Somalia's claims to the north-eastern part of Kenya. Further annoying Kenya was a statement by the Iranian monarch, Mohammad Reza Pahlavi, that his country would not stand and watch if Somalia were invaded. *Nation.co.ke*

Woman forced in prostitution by couple

BLOEMFONTEIN - A 19-year-old suspect has been arrested in Bloemfontein for human trafficking and sexual exploitation and police are looking for two more suspects, the Directorate for Priority Crime Investigation (Hawks) in the Free State said. A 34-year-old woman travelling from Botshabelo to Johannesburg via Bloemfontein was waiting for a train in Bloemfontein at 8.40pm on January 8 when an 'African female and her Nigerian husband approached her and told her to accompany them to their flat, as they are selling jeans', Warrant Officer Lynda Steyn said in a statement. She accompanied them to the flat in Zastron Street.

HOW ROWLAND HATCHED PLOT TO BECOME KIM JONG UN'S PRIVATE BANKER

PYONGYANG - A controversial property tycoon and former business partner of Prince Andrew who has donated £6 million to the Conservative Party secretly flew to North Korea in a bid to become a private banker for the family of brutal dictator Kim Jong Un.

Millionaire financier David Rowland held talks with North Korean leaders in the capital Pyongyang about managing the personal fortunes of the rogue state's ruling family and helping the Communist regime set up companies abroad, according to documents seen by The Mail on Sunday.

It has long been believed the Kim family has stashed billions of pounds abroad in a network of secret accounts.

Experts say such accounts are used to fund their luxury lifestyle and as a way of dodging sanctions, although there is no evidence Rowland was ever aware of this.

Rowland's close links to Prince Andrew were revealed by the MoS last month. We exposed how the pair co-owned a company in a tax haven and how, in the years before the North Korean trip, the Duke of York had been using his position as Britain's trade envoy to plug a private Luxembourg-based bank for the super-

In an email seen by this newspaper, Hon promised that Rowland's trip to North Korea would be kept under the radar.

Rowland and Hon's involvement with one of the world's most repressive states is likely to horrify both senior Tories and Buckingham Palace officials. Rowland, who owns a sprawling estate in Guernsey, donated thousands to the party as recently as last year. The mysterious talks are detailed in a report posted online by David Rowland's son Jonathan, who also took part in the visit, and in a series of documents attached to an email that he sent to an MoS journalist. IRAN TO SEND BLACK BOX RECORDERS TO UKRAINE

TEHRAN - Iranian officials have said that they will send black box recorders to Ukraine for further analysis after killing 176 people when they accidentally shot down a plane.

Hassan Rezaeifer, the head of accident investigations for the civil aviation department, said it was not possible to read the jet's black boxes in Iran - but he did not elaborate further. He said that instead French, American and Canadian experts would help analyse them in the Ukrainian capital of Kyiv.

Mr Rezaeifer added that if that was unsuccessful then the black box recorders would be sent to France. Iran's Revolutionary Guard accidentally shot the plane down just two minutes after it took off from Tehran on January 8, killing all 176 people on board.

The Guard had launched ballistic missiles at American troops in Iraq just hours earlier in response to the US airstrike that killed Iran's top commander, General Qassem Soleimani. Officials say lower-level officers mistook the plane for an American cruise missile.

Iran had initially said the crash was caused by a technical problem and invited countries that lost citizens to help investigate.

But three days later, it admitted responsibility after Western leaders said there was strong evidence



the plane was hit by a surface-toair missile.

The victims included 57 Canadian citizens as well as 11 Ukrainians, 17 Swedes, four Afghans and four British citizens.

Most of those killed were Iranians. The other five nations have demanded Iran accept full responsibility and pay compensation to the victims' families.

The plane, which was a Boeing 737-800, was designed and built in America.

Its engine was designed by CFM International - a joint company between French group Safran and US group GE Aviation.

Investigators from both countries have been invited to take part in the probe.

Abortion rates fall by a fifth after Pope's visit

VATICAN CITY - The Pope reduces the number of abortions when he visits a town because his presence makes people have less unprotected sex, a study found.

Scientists, led by a team from the University of Brighton, found that couples have less unprotected sex when the Pope is in town to avoid having an abortion and breaking Catholic doctrine.

Even after the pope leaves the area, his influence remains as researchers found abortions plummeted by up to a fifth for as long as 14 months after a papal visit. While the number of abortions dropped, the birth rate remains the same. Because fewer abortions did not increase the birth rate, scientists believe the Pope's words must either increase the use of contraception to prevent pregnancy or inspire chastity.

Whenever the Pope referenced the 'unholy' procedure in his speeches, abortions fell by twice as much.

Study co-author Dr Egidio Farina, an economist at Queen's University Belfast, Northern Ireland, said: "The research finds a decrease in the number of abortions starting from the third month until the 14th month after the visit of a Pope." Daily Mail

Trump team trades sharp views on impeachment with House managers

WASHINGTON - President Donald Trump's legal team issued a fiery response ahead of opening arguments in his impeachment trial, while House Democrats laid out their case in forceful fashion, saying the president betrayed public trust with behaviour that was the 'worst nightmare' of the founding fathers.

The dueling filings previewed arguments both sides intend to make once Trump's impeachment trial begins in earnest tomorrow in the Senate. Their challenge will be to make a case that appeals to the 100 senators who will render the verdict and for an American public bracing for a presidential election in 10 months.

"President Donald J. Trump used his official powers to pressure a foreign government to interfere in a United States election for his personal political gain," the House prosecutors wrote, "and then attempted to cover up his scheme by obstructing Congress's investigation into his misconduct."

Trump's legal team, responding to the Senate's official summons for the trial, said the president 'categorically and unequivocally' denies the charges of abuse and obstruction against him.

"This is a brazen and unlawful attempt to overturn the results of the 2016 election and interfere with the 2020 election, now just months away," the president's filing states.

Stripped of legalese and structured in plain English, the documents underscored the extent to which the impeachment proceedings are a political rather than conventional legal process.

They are the first of several filings expected in coming days as senators prepare to take their seats for the rare impeachment court. AP

17 new cases of coronavirus in Wuhan

BEIJING - Seventeen more people in central China have been diagnosed with a new form of viral pneumonia that has killed two patients and placed other countries on alert as millions of Chinese travel for Lunar New Year holidays. In total, 62 cases of the novel coronavirus have been identified in the central city of Wuhan, where the virus appears to have originated. The Wuhan Municipal Health Commission reported the new cases in a statement yesterday. Nineteen of those individuals have been discharged from the hospital, while two men in their 60s - one with severe preexisting conditions - have died from the illness. Daily Mail

Commander faces up to 75 years in jail Docs proving Iran built nuclear weapon

GUANTANAMO BAY - A former commander of the U.S. Navy base at Guantanamo Bay was convicted on Friday of interfering with an investigation into the death of a civilian with whom the commander had fought and argued over his affair with the man's wife. A federal jury in Jacksonville, Florida, convicted Navy Captain John R. Nettleton on charges of obstruction of justice, concealing material facts, falsifying records and making false statements. Nettleton was removed from command shortly after civilian Christopher Tur was found floating in the waters off the base on the southeastern coast of Cuba in January 2015. AFP

TEHRAN-A never-seen-before secret Iranian government document proves the regime was trying to build a nuclear weapon as far back as 2002. It shows scientists outlining their proposals for a 'warhead', which are given the green-light by Tehran's top nuclear official. The document was seized as part of a raid by Israeli intelligence agents on a compound in Tehran in 2018, and is now being exclusively revealed to the world by MailOnline. The damning nuclear blueprint forms the centrepiece of a soon-to-be published report by the Friends of Israel Initiative (FOII), a group of foreign policy experts including several former presidents and prime ministers. 
Putin opposes idea of unlimited term

MOSCOW- Russian President Vladimir Putin has said he opposed the idea of an unlimited term in office for the country's leader, like the system that existed in the former Soviet Union. Putin's comment at a meeting with Second World War veterans in St Petersburg came days after he called for constitutional changes that could help him remain in power once his presidential term ends in 2024. When a veteran at the meeting proposed not having term limits for Russia's president. 

Arteta hopes Arsenal healing rift with fans

LONDON - Mikel Arteta believes Arsenal are finally healing their strained relationship with the club's frustrated fans.

When Arteta was appointed last month to succeed Unai Emery as Arsenal manager, the Spaniard arrived to find a club split by a damaging rift between the under-performing players and disillusioned supporters.

The root cause was years of poor results and the problem came to a head with the abuse of Gunners midfielder Granit Xhaka in a match against Crystal Palace, with the Swiss star responding by swearing at the crowd.

But former Arsenal midfielder Arteta has worked hard to repair the damage and the signs were promising in Saturday's 1-1 draw against Sheffield United.

The Gunners were pegged back as Gabriel Martinelli's opener on the stroke of halftime was cancelled out by John Fleck's late leveller, leaving Arsenal 10th in the Premier League and with just one win from their last seven games.

But, unlike the jeering and negativity which greeted the final whistle during the majority of Emery's last games at the helm, Arteta praised Arsenal's supporters for sticking with the team against the Blades.

"The fans were terrific," he told Arsenal Player. "They were right behind the team and they appreciated every action as we were pushing them.

"I'm so thankful to them because com-



pared to how it was a month ago, I think it's completely different.

"We have to keep trying to convincing them and encouraging them to keep doing it, and hopefully they can deserve and enjoy more good results."

Arsenal defender Shkodran Mustafi, another player often criticised by fans, believes it is not just in the stands where unity is flourishing again.

"I feel that we are united. I think we applaud and they are too, it stay together and the dressing room has we are united." *Team Talk*

MANCHESTER - Benjamin Mendy is adamant Manchester City can still enjoy a successful season despite their failure to defend the Premier League title.

The Pep Guardiola's side are trailing well behind Liverpool after Saturday's 2-2 draw with Crystal Palace dealt another blow to their faint hopes of catching the runaway leaders.

Hampered by injuries, City have been unable to match the consistency of their past two title-winning seasons.

Guardiola accepted last month his side could no longer catch Liverpool, but City defender Mendy knows there are still three other trophies to play for, including the Champions League, which his team have never won.

City hold a 3-1 League Cup semifinal first-leg lead against Manchester United, host Fulham in the FA Cup fourth round next weekend and are due to play Real Madrid in the Champions League last 16.

"When you start the league you try to win, to do your best and you have to say the truth, which is that Liverpool have done very, very well and are a good, strong team everybody can see that," Mendy said.

"We deal well with it. When another team is doing well you can't be upset or angry. This is the truth, no one can complain. So in our dressing room we try to focus on us.

"All the people say Man City are finished. They can say what they want, we will just keep focusing on us, play our football, win the games, to fight until the league is finished.

That provd to be the trend for the rest of the opening 45 minutes as the visitors were left frustrated on a few occasions while Berlin were happy too sit back and soak up the pressure.

However, Bayern eventually

got their breakthrough on the hour mark as Perisic's knockdown found an un-marked Muller, who volleyed home from close range.

The hosts were then awarded a penalty in the 73rd minute after Leon Goretzka was brought in down in the box. Lewandowski stepped up and slotted home his 20th league goal of

the season.

The third goal arrived three

arrived three minutes later as Goretzka turned provider to pick Thiago Alcantara who found the back of the net with a neat finish into the top corner.

There was enough time for a fourth goal as Perisic got in on the act with six minutes remaining after turning home Muller's cross to round off an emphatic victory to move up to second spot.

NANTES TO PAY HOMAGE TO SALA

RENNES - Nantes announced yesterday that they will pay tribute to their former striker Emiliano Sala at the league match against his first French club, Bordeaux, on Sunday.

The 28-year-old player was killed on January 21, 2019, when the small plane taking him to join Cardiff City crashed off the British island of Guernsey.

The Argentine had been transferred to the Welsh club, in the Premier League at the time, after three-and-half seasons at Nantes.

Sala had arrived in France as a youngster to join Bordeaux, who loaned him out to Orleans, Niort and Caen. He then moved to Nantes where he was the club's top scorer for three straight seasons.

"Emiliano was a talented player, warm and human. We all miss him," Nantes said in a statement.

In homage to the player who "dreamt of playing for the Albiceleste", Nantes will don a jersey inspired by the colours of the Argentine national shirt. Proceeds from sales will go to the two Argentine clubs where Sala played as a youngster.

A canvas featuring Sala will be laid in the centre circle as the players warmup and giant screens will display images of his best moments in yellow.

Groups of fans will spread a giant banner in the stands and sing the song with which they celebrated each of Sala's goals, before a minute of applause.

There are still unresolved issues surrounding the player's death, such as who



was responsible for the crash in which pilot David Ibottson also died, and, above all, the payment of the 17-million-euro (\$18.85 million) fee agreed for his transfer.

In September, FIFA, the governing body of world football, ordered Cardiff,

relegated last summer to the Championship, to pay the first instalment of six million euros. But the Welsh club has taken the matter to the Court of Arbitration for Sport, whose decision is not expected until June.



DJOKOVIC, WILLIAMS LEAD TENNIS OLD GUARD INTO NEW DECADE

MELBOURNE - Old stagers Novak Djokovic and Serena Williams will aim to keep the younger generation of players waiting in the wings as Grand Slam tennis enters a new decade at the Australian Open today.

After recent bushfire smog largely cleared in Melbourne, the view is all too familiar with Djokovic and Williams, who is seeking a record-equalling 24th Major title, installed as the bookies' favourites.

Top seed Rafael Nadal, 33, is celebrating becoming world number one in a third decade while Roger Federer, 38, is trying to defy the ageing process and stay ahead of his rivals with a 21st Grand Slam win.

The start of 2020 is not dissimilar to 2010, when Federer and Nadal shared the four Grand Slam titles and Williams won in Melbourne and Wimbledon.

Ten years later, the men's Big Three - who have won all but two Australian Open titles since 2004 - occupy the top three rankings, and Williams is one step away from Margaret Court's record for Grand Slam victories.

The men's dominance is stark: since Federer won his first Grand Slam title in 2003, only five Major finals have not featured one of the Swiss, Nadal or Djokovic.

Several challengers have come and gone but there is increasing



hope for the men's up-and-comers, while nine women have won Grand Slam titles since Williams, 38, claimed her 23rd in Melbourne in 2017.

While Djokovic and Nadal split last year's Grand Slams, Dominic Thiem, Daniil Medvedev and Fabio Fognini won their first Masters trophies and Stefanos Tsitsipas, 21, became the youngest ATP Finals champion in 18 years.

"They're very close. I don't think that's miles, miles away maybe as it was some years ago," Djokovic of the NextGen winning a Major title. "I think they are definitely hungry. They're challenging. They're knocking on the door."

The clash between old and new will be epitomised in the first round

today, when Venus Williams, who turns 40 this year, plays 15-year-old rising star Coco Gauff - who wasn't even born when her fellow American lifted her first Grand Slam trophies in 2000.

Japan's Naomi Osaka, 22, is defending a title for the second Grand Slam in a row after her repeat bid at last year's US Open fell flat in the fourth round.

World number one Ashleigh Barty, fresh from winning the Adelaide International on Saturday, carries Australian hopes of seeing the first home-grown women's winner since 1978.

MELBOURNE - Ashleigh Barty is relishing the pressure at her home Australian Open - but joked yesterday that she is sick of seeing pictures of herself everywhere.

The world number one is bidding to become Australia's first women's singles champion in Melbourne since Chris O'Neil

Expectations of the 23-year-old are huge and she has become the face of the year's first Grand Slam, her picture heavily featured on billboards around the city and in local newspapers.

"My face is everywhere a little bit, isn't it? I'm a bit sick of it, to be honest," the down-to-earth Barty said with a smile on the eve of the tournament.

"(But) there's no extra pressure, I don't read the papers, I don't kind of look into any more than I need to.

"I'm here with my team trying to do the best that we can.

"It's amazing to have so much support and so much love from the Australian public. I've really felt that in an exceptional way over the last 12 months. It's been incredible."

Barty begins her Australian Open title assault today against 120th-ranked Lesia Tsurenko - the Ukrainian beat her in their previous meeting, in Brisbane in 2018.

Barty has since surged to the top of women's tennis, winning her maiden Grand Slam last year at Roland Garros and carrying Australia's tennis hopes.

Her Australian Open preparations got off to a patchy start when she suffered a surprise defeat to American qualifier Jennifer Brady in Brisbane at the start of the year.

But on Saturday she triumphed against another Ukrainian, Dayana Yastremska, to win the Adelaide International - her landmark first title on home soil.

"Obviously it's the perfect preparation," Barty said. "But regardless of whether I

won the title or not last week (Saturday), I feel like I'm well prepared.

If anyone saw the documentary (done on Murray by Amazon Prime), you'll know how crazy he is with the work. He's a madman. He's going to put it in. He's going to do everything he can. I expect to see him playing for many more years, winning."

Murray felt the pelvic bruising at the Davis Cup in late November and pulled out of his Australian trip on December 27.

He currently has no tournaments scheduled after withdrawing from events in Montpellier and Rotterdam next month. *Daily Mail*







Coming to the match, Nyanga said his players were unable to deal with their opponents, long balls which caught them flat footed most of the time.


"I told the players during the break to watch out for the long balls. We were slow to deal with the danger and got punished for it," he said.

The 90 minutes could not separate the two sides and extra time was needed and it was exactly what the doctor ordered for Callies. Their towering attacker Wandile Simelane finally made good on his missed opportunities in the 91st minute. He rounded the goalkeeper after receiving a long ball from deep midfield and slotted calmly into the empty net. Wanderers did not drop their heads but their gallant efforts were too little too late as Callies shut up shop. Things went from bad to worse for Wanderers as Callies' substitute Siphesihle Nsimbini put the final nail on the coffin with five minutes left in extra time.

LONDON - Liverpool moved 16 points clear at the top of the Premier League after defeating bitter rivals Manchester United 2-0 at Anfield last night.

The Reds were unchanged from the win over Tottenham Hotspur while United, without Marcus Rashford, made three changes, with goalkeeper David De Gea, Luke Shaw and Andreas Pereira being recalled.

Liverpool had a bright start as Virgil van Dijk got the opening goal in the 14th minute with a towering header from Trent Alexander-Arnold's corner.

The hosts thought they had doubled their lead in the 26th minute after Roberto Firmino curled a stunning into the far corner, but the goal was disallowed by the Video Assistant Referee for a foul on De Gea by Van Dijk in the build-up.

United came close to finding the equaliser four minutes before the break after Aaron Wan-Bissaka delivered a delightful cross towards the far post but Pereira failed to connect with the net gaping, before de Gea denied Mane with a superb save minutes later at the othe end.

Jurgen Klopp's charges started the second stanza at a high intensity and should have doubled their lead two minutes from the break after Andrew Robertson picked out Mohamed Salah, who scuffed a side-footed shot wide of the mark.

Luck continued to evade Liverpool as a minute later Jordan Henderson charged his way through the heart of the United defence and unleashed a left footed strike that crashed against the post.

Anthony Martial had a glorious chance to level matters for Ole Gunnar Solskjaer's army on the hour-mark after a quick one-two with Pereira sent him clear, but he curled his strike over the crossbar from 10-yards out.

United needed inspiration with 16 minutes remaining and Solskjaer made a double change as forward Mason Greenwood and Juan Mata replaced Brandon Williams and Pereira, before Klopp also made a double change with Fabinho and Divock Origi replacing Mane and Firmino.

Howevr, the Reds sealed victory in stoppage time as Salah ran onto Alisson's long pass and sprinted towards goal to slot a low shot past Dea Gea to seal a 2-0 win.
