he late former businessman Richard 'Phakama' Dlamini's only remaining sister Gogo Loziga Magagula has passed away in the midst of a long dragging dispute over the former's Estate.

The outspoken Loziga, who had always advocated for the late businessman's Estate to be winded up with all his wives and children benefitting equally, will be laid to rest at Mantshonga tomorrow morning, confirmed family member Nzinga Magagula this week.

She will be remembered for her numerous interviews with this publication, with the most recent one, two weeks back, when she declared that she wanted to take the matter of her late brother's Estate to His Majesty the King.

She wondered what was taking so long for the Estate of the late businessman to be winded up as his surviving wives and children were suffering due to the situation. She said she was ready to take the matter to His Majesty King Mswati III as an important figure that could put an end to the misery that the deceased's family was enduring.

"Ngitombula ingubo ngingene eNkhosini," she

said while stressing that she would seek audience with the King to put an end to the long dragging matter.

She further wondered who was delaying the winding up of the Estate as there was the late businessman's family that should be benefitting from it instead of living impoverished lives. She also wondered how the Executor of the Estate, Isaac Jiva Dlamini, who she says was personally chosen by the deceased for the task, was not allowed to proceed with his work.

Jiva is a cousin to the deceased and *Gogo* Loziga.

She also added that the Almighty God was above all what was happening and would solve the matter without fail through His Majesty the King.

The last verdict by Chief Justice (CJ) Bheki Maphalala ruled in favour of the appellants (Phakama's three wives) and that meant the Estate belonging to the late businessman could then be distributed and the lives of his children and wives would go on.

In an initial ruling, Judge Mumcy Dlamini

found that the deceased's first wife was married to the late businessman in terms of civil rites and that the Swazi Law and Custom marriages of the late businessman to his three other wives were bigamous.

The judge also ordered the entry records of the subsequent marriages to be expunged from the registry of Births, Marriages and Deaths. The three women filed an appeal following Judge Dlamini's ruling.

However, the Supreme Court then allowed the appeal and set aside Justice Dlamini's decision. The CJ, who sat with Judge Majahenkhaba Dlamini and Judge Jacobus Annandale, dismissed the application filed by the first wife, who died before the appeal was heard, and ordered that costs be borne by the Estate.

The CJ said the matter was abstract, hypothetical and academic and that not all interested parties were heard and joined in the proceedings. Maphalala stated that the businessman was denied the opportunity to be heard and that Sarah died before the appeal was heard.

He said it should be noted that the application

was lodged with a view to bolster the applicant's resolve to be appointed the executor of Richard's estate which was why the appointment of the executor was stayed pending finalisation of the matter.

Following the latest ruling, Loziga stated that she was ready to die for the truth and would stand by it anytime when required to do so. She said even his brother before he died told everyone who cared to listen that whatever would happen to him 'they would have Ziga ZamaSwazi to face'. She said all her siblings had now died and remained the only one alive amongst them. She said she was, therefore, the only one who could speak the truth and solve this entire impasse surrounding his brother's Estate. She recalled how together with her brother they were raised by their aunt Magamase at a Magongo homestead at Elangeni.

In the interview she also disclosed that she possessed divine powers that were bestowed on her by the Almighty God and she was not easy to defeat, especially when she was called upon to stand for the truth. She told this publication that even after she was poisoned with Dr Mathunjwa confirming it, she was spared by God in order to continue to stand for the truth where it concerned the family of her deceased brother. She stated that she later heard that the plan was to kill her so that she would not continue to speak on behalf of the deceased's family members where it concerns their rightful belongings.

She also highlighted that she did not practice witchcraft, but had a God given talent to produce concoctions (*timbita*) that heal people even with the worst of sicknesses.

Gogo Loziga had also told this publication that by fighting for the winding up of his brother's Estate, it did not mean that she wanted to benefit from it as she had reliable means of living by selling her concoctions and healing sick people.


14 months later DC won't conclude ESWACAA boss matter

Pourteen months later, a disciplinary hearing matter for suspended Eswatini Civil Aviation Authority (ESWACAA) Director Marketing and Communications Sabelo Dlamini has still not been concluded.

The case of the former manager at the aviation company is alleged to be marred by continuous delays due to postponement as legal representatives sometimes fail to convene timely to conclude the case.

The manager is still at home and waiting for any directive to



return to work or know if his services with the institution are no longer needed. Dlamini is currently suspended from work on allegations of sexual harassment.

He was suspended to allow disciplinary processes and the investigations to take effect. His suspension created a social media buzz regarding his sexual harassment allegations and several of other related alleged misdemeanours.

The manager was later on arrested for an alleged offence of sexual harassment, which is now considered a serious offence under the Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence (SODV) Act of 2018.

He appeared before Manzini Magistrate Mthokozisi Dlamini at the Matsapha Circuit

Court where he was granted E3 000 bail. The case was not concluded as

he is currently waiting for the verdict of the disciplinary hearing at his place of work.

The court records state that the alleged sexual harassment offence took place at his workplace in Matsapha, and the victim is said to have opened a case against the director at the Sigodvweni Police Station.

Public prosecutor Lando Sibandze asked the court to attach bail conditions, where the manager was warned not to be found interfering with or threatening witnesses and warned not to be found to have committed the same offence whilst out on bail. He was further warned to appear before court when required.

According to the terms of the disciplinary code, sexual harassment even for a first offender is regarded as a serious offence with dire consequences. The suspension was preceded by a failed petition by employees in which they enumerated a litany of complaints on how he was allegedly mistreating them. The petition could not see the light of day as no one wanted to 'bell the cat' in fear of unimaginable reprisals.

ESWACAA management confirmed that the disciplinary committee process had not been concluded and for a number of different reasons that cannot be shared with the media as they are internal matters.

SODV Act SEXUAL HARASSMENT

(1) A person who sexually harasses another commits an offence and shall, on conviction, be liable to pay a fine not exceeding twenty-five thousand Emalangeni or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding 10 years or to both.
(2) Sexual harassment for the purposes of this Act is committed where—

(a) a person subjects another person to an unsolicited act of physical intimacy, including but not limited to, physical contact such as patting, pinching or touching in a sexual way or unnecessary familiarity such as deliberately brushing against another;

(b) a person makes an unsolicited demand or request, whether directly or by implication, for sexual favours from the other person;

(c) a person engages in any other unwelcome conduct of a sexual nature in relation to the other person including but not limited to offensive telephone calls and indecent exposure;

(d) the person engaging in the conduct described in paragraphs (a), (b) or (c), does so-

(i) with the intention to offend, humiliate or intimidate the other person; or

(ii) in circumstances where a reasonable person would have anticipated the possibility that the other person would be offended, humiliated or intimidated by the conduct.

(3) For purposes of subsection (2) (d) (ii), the circumstances that are relevant in determining whether a reasonable person would have anticipated the possibility that the other

person would be offended, humiliated or intimidated by the conduct include –

- (a) the sex of the other person;
- (b) the age of the other person;
- (c) the race of the other person;
- (d) any impairment that the other person has;
- (e) the relationship between the other person and the person engaging in the conduct;
- (f) the nature of the place, whether private or public, and the time of the day; and
- (g) any other circumstance of the other person the court may find or deem relevant.

is Majesty King Mswati III's calls for the nation to use the vast land at their disposal to produce enough food that will sustain the country and further be exported to other countries are justified as the country continues to import huge agricultural products from outside its borders.

The country has been listed amongst top 10 countries that boosted the South African economy consuming at least E3.8 billion worth of agricultural products from that coun-

The King during his Speech from the Throne at the opening of the Second Session of the 11th Parliament last month, said one of the key mandates of government entails ensuring food security amid challenges posed by climate change, trans-boundary crop pests and animal diseases.

Rains

He sounded grateful for the good rains which have been received throughout the country and called on the nation to capitalise on this blessing to plough the fields towards food self-sufficiency.

Information gathered reflects that in 2018, the top five importers of SA agricultural products and the value of the imports were:

• The Netherlands - mostly citrus, wine, fruit juices, vegetable juices, dates, figs, pineapples, avocados and guavas, worth E12.46bn;

· The United Kingdom - primarily wine, apples, pears, quinces, strawberries, raspberries and citrus. worth E10.92bn;

· Botswana — fruit juices, cane/beet sugar, sucrose and rice, worth

 Namibia — maize, wine and cigars, worth E8.65bn; and

 Mozambique — cane/beet sugar and maize, worth E6.82bn.

Rounding out SA's top 10 agricultural export markets were China (E4.9bn), Lesotho (E4.5bn), the United States (E4.4bn), Eswatini (E3.8bn) and Malaysia (E2.1bn).

Furthermore, exports in Eswatini declined in January by 22.5 per cent to E2.078 billion over E2.682 billion in December 2019, while the import bill for the month was E1.947 billion, reflecting a month-on-month fall of 5.4 per cent.

The trade balance registered a surplus of E131.2 million, a lesser surplus than that of E623.4 million for December 2019.

Receipts from textiles and apparel increased by 19.9 per cent to E232.3 million in January, according to reports in the country.

According to the Central Bank of Eswatini (CBE), the decline was a result of contraction in both exports and imports as they were viewed cyclical around January due to slow operations during the festive season holidays.

A breakdown of imports showed 64.6 per cent of total imports came from South Africa. Import of cotton and cotton products, including fabric, increased by 37 per cent, making up 4.5 per cent of total imports in the month, according to

The King in his speech said; "We need to upscale our farming efficiencies to reach a standard that not only creates enough food for each household but produces a surplus for export outside our borders".

Economy

Government, His Majesty emphasised, must increase the presence of extension officers and ensure availability of equipment and inputs that are subsidised countrywide to farmers.

Meanwhile, SA's agricultural sector, identified by President Cyril Ramaphosa during his State of the Nation Address last week as one of the sectors with the "greatest potential for growth,"is exploring new export markets in an effort to stimulate the economy and create muchneeded jobs.

In what can be emulated in Eswatini, SA Agriculture Minister Thoko Didiza's spokesperson, Reggie Ngcobo, told the FM that SA was in negotiations for market access to export pears to China and Taiwan, table grapes to South Korea and Vietnam, avocados to Japan, India and the US, apples to Thailand, pome fruit to Mexico and citrus to the Philippines.

Agricultural Business Chamber chief economist Wandile Sihlobo explains that SA's seven per cent year-on-year growth in agricultural exports, to US\$10.6bn in 2018, was largely due to increased exports of oranges, grapes, wine, apples, wool, lemons, mandarins and pears, among other products.

Sihlobo says access to new markets is important for SA, given that the country's agricultural sector is export dependent.

"If we are to bring new entrants into farming and create jobs, that cannot happen if exports are not prioritised in the process," he tells the FM.

"SA's opening up of all these export markets is key to further expansion of the industry."

Sihlobo says the agriculture sector is experiencing "a bit of momentum" as far as exports are concerned.

Growth In part, this is thanks to the efforts of the government, says Absa Agribusiness senior agricultural economist Wessel Lemmer.

"The support from the agriculture department in getting access to those markets is commendable. It's the right thing to do because it's supporting primary agriculture, which in turn will lead to job creation and economic growth."

While the department of agriculture, forestry & fisheries says complete export data for 2019 will be available only next month, the International Trade Centre, drawing on SA Revenue Service (SARS) statistics, puts SA's top agricultural exports for the year as the following:

- · Citrus (R19.51bn);
- · Wine (R9.54bn);
- Fresh or dried grapes (R9.4bn);
- · Apples, pears and quinces (R8.05bn); and
- · Cane/beet sugar and solid, chemically pure sucrose (R7.07bn).

LISWATI DRUG ADDICT (34) TORCHED IN SA

man from Eswatini believed to be a drug addict was burnt beyond recognition by angry community members in Eziqwaqweni Reserve outside eShowe in KwaZulu-Natal, South Africa, on Tuesday.

The deceased was identified as Vincent Linda (34), an Eswatini national.

It should be noted that this incident is not connected to the recent violent xenophobic attacks on foreign nationals in that country that claimed many lives late last year.

It was reported that villagers started chasing away drug addicts on Sunday, accusing them of being responsible for robberies, house break-ins and theft in

According to the Zululand Observer, one resident, Nkosinathi Ndlela, said the area was close to town and many residents, especially those leaving work late, are constantly confronted by drugs

"Many cases of muggings are reported to the police and victims provide police with descriptions of the suspects, but no arrests have been made. People are very frustrated and angry, that's why they decided to take the law into their hands," Ndlela told the publication.

King Cetshwayo cluster police spokesperson, Captain Mbongeni Mdlalose, said a case of murder was registered at eShowe

"It is alleged that community members took the deceased to a vacant house where he was set alight."

Mdlalose said the vacant house was apparently used by criminals to share their loot after robberies and house break-

No arrests have been made yet.

RWANDA-UGANDA RELATIONS:

Talks commence at Gatuna/Katuna Border

ATUNA - At around 11:40am yesterday, President Paul Kagame, flanked by Angolan President João Lourenço and Congolese counterpart Felix Tshisekedi, the facilitators of the talks between Rwanda and Uganda arrived at Gatuna/Katuna common border between the two countries for the 4th Quadripartite Summit.

The three Heads of State joined their Ugandan counterpart Yoweri Kaguta Museveni for the talks to commence. The three presidents entered the tent five minutes after arrival as Rwanda and Uganda continue with the talks to normalise relations. The Angolan president, who is the lead facilitator of the talks arrived on Thursday evening while the Congolese President arrived vesterday morning for the talks which were held behind closed doors.

By press time, final touches on the venue, which is in the neutral land between the two countries, commonly referred to as 'no man's land' were being done in preparation for the arrival of four heads of state.

Anticipation was high on both ends, at the summit which follows the 3rd Quadripartite Summit in Luanda, Angola on February 2 and the 3rd Ad Hoc Commission meeting in Kigali

between Rwanda and Uganda on February 14. The talks were expected to last for hours and the four presidents would address a press conference after the closed door meeting during which issues that have affected relations between the two countries will be tackled. Officials from Uganda, Rwanda and Angola were seen earlier pacing up and down, preparing documents that will be signed by the heads of state, including an expected extradition treaty between Rwanda and Uganda.

Ahead of the meeting, the Minister of State for Foreign Affairs in charge

of East African Community (EAC) Amb. Olivier Nduhungirehe confirmed that the Ugandan Foreign affairs ministry informed the Rwandan government through a note verbally that the passport of Charlotte Mukankunsi, the Rwandan National Congress (RNC) Commissioner for Diplomacy, had been cancelled

A major breakthrough is expected after Uganda showed commitment to address some of the issues raised at the Ad Hoc Commission meeting which Uganda had to address by February 20, ahead of the meeting.

NEEDY COMMUNITY'S E14m HEADACHE FOR POTABLE WATER

remarkable move by an ambitious community of collectively purchasing a farm from its previous owner a few years ago and later converting it to a village they can now call home has become somewhat of a nightmare for the community of Phola in Nhlangano.

They now have to raise about E14 million, money which they do not have, to be able to bring potable water that will service a total of 643 homesteads to the area in the Shiselweni region. The amount is expected to go towards providing infrastructure in the form of water pipes to bring the much-needed clean water to the area through the Eswatini Water Services Corporation (EWSC).

In essence, this means that each homestead should come up with about E22 000 for the project to see the light of day as the actual amount needed is E13 700 000.

This community currently relies on a wetland in the area to draw dirty water that is contaminated with faeces, which renders them prone to diseases such as cholera especially, their children. According to UNICEF, a single gram of faeces contains "10 000 000 viruses", "1 000 000 bacteria" and "1 000 parasite cysts".

An alternative source of water for them is begging to draw the water from a single tap from a borehole belonging to the nearby FTM Garments' senior staff that resides in the area.

This community of Phola has been forced to run from pillar to post in a bid to bring clean water to the area, but in vain.

Government's Rural Water Supply Section cannot assist them for the mere fact that their area is classified as a Township Development. The Rural Water Supply Branch was established in 1975 to address the issue of potable water supply in rural areas as opposed to urban areas.

Similarly, Eswatini Water Services

Corporation cannot assist this community given its policy that it does not assist township development areas in such ventures, but instead the developers themselves have to provide the infrastructure first before the company takes over and connects their areas to the national water grid.

EWSC Public Affairs Manager Nomahlubi Matiwane confirmed to the Saturday Observer this week that the company does not provide water infrastructure for such communities as that of Phola. The community's water provision committee chairperson Lefinah Mndzebele in the company of her deputy Phindile Malinga confirmed the plight of their community. She disclosed that after they approached EWSC for the provision of water in the area they were instructed to enlist the services of a surveying contractor that would provide them with a map for the entire project.

"We were told that the company only takes over during the stage of connecting our pipes to the national water grid. At the time we had to collectively come up with E320 000 to pay a contractor from South Africa to perform the surveying and come up with the drawings and quotation for the entire project. Amakha Construction is the

company we enlisted and they are the ones who told us we will need E13 700 000 to finish the project," she explained.

Matiwane, on the other hand, further explained EWSC connects water in areas gazette by government if outside the urban boundary. "We also have to liaise with the Rural Water Supply to ensure that they do not direct their resources to the same area. In the case of Phola, it should be the developers that approach us with a design that we should approve and then proceed with implementing the project until we connect the area to our grid," she explained.

Recognition

The current situation renders the community without the right to clean water. One of the most important recent milestones has been the recognition in July 2010 by the United Nations General Assembly of the human right to water and sanitation. The Assembly recognised the right of every human being to have access to enough water for personal and domestic uses, meaning between 50 and 100 litres of water per person per day. The water must be safe, acceptable and affordable. The water costs should not exceed three per cent of household income. Moreover, the water source has to be within 1 000

They can still be assisted - EWSC

The community of Phola should not lose hope where it concerns eventually having clean water for their consumption as they can still explore other means of assistance.

This is advice from EWSC Public Affairs Manager Nomahlubi Matiwane, who points out that other communities like that of Phola have explored a number of these avenues before and managed to eventually get clean water. She advises this community to get in touch with their Member of Parliament (MP) as the rightful figure to seek assistance on their behalf from other government structures as well as international donors.


"Other communities have used their MPs to seek help from agencies such as Microprojects, Rural Development Fund or World Vision for the funding of their projects.

It is an open secret that most communities cannot afford to implement projects of such magnitude from their pockets hence they usually seek assistance," says Matiwane.

Comment

Mduduzi 'Small Joe' Dlamini, the area's MP under Shiselweni I Inkhundla, could not be reached for comment at the time of compiling this report.

However, Chairperson Lefinah Magagula disclosed that they are indeed in the process of enlisting the assistance of their MP. She sounded hopeful that he will be of assistance to them.

CHILD MORTALITY RIFE AT PHOLA

hild deaths resulting from the use of contaminated water is rife at Phola.

This has been the observation of the ministry of health as the community has been urged to speed up the process of obtaining potable water in the area. Unclean water and poor sanitation are a leading cause of child mortality. Childhood diarrhoea is closely associated with insufficient water supply, inadequate sanitation, water contaminated with communicable disease agents, and poor hygiene practices. Diarrhoea is estimated to cause 1.5 million child deaths per year, mostly among children under five

living in developing countries.

Lefinah Mndzebele, who leads the drive to get potable water in the area, confirmed to the Saturday Observer that the issue has been raised with them by the ministry of health. She said their children have been observed to be vulnerable to waterborne diseases such as the deadly cholera.

"Some draw the water from the wetland during late hours and sometimes realise that their water contains faeces. This is because some community members defecate next to the wetland while others wash their clothes and throw disposable nappies next to

the water source. We are just in a fix," decried Mndzebele.

According to the United Nations, contaminated water and a lack of basic sanitation are undermining efforts to end extreme poverty and disease in the world's poorest countries.

Contamination

In 2017, two billion people worldwide did not have access to basic sanitation facilities such as toilets or latrines. 673 million people still practised open defecation. According to the WHO/UNICEF Joint Monitoring Programme for Water Supply and Sanitation, at least 1.2 billion people worldwide are esti-

mated to drink water that is not protected against contamination from faeces. Even more drink water, which is delivered through a system without adequate protection against sanitary hazards.

With a number of the poorer countries surveyed struggling to provide proper sanitation services, many people living in both rural and urban regions are forced to defecate in the open - with serious health consequences.

Some 65 countries had open defecation rates above two per cent of the population, with as many as 673 million people globally forced to defecate in the open.

Seven of the 65 countries specifically indicated that they had no targets for the elimination of open defecation.

ECMU PLEADS ITS CASE

nce bitten, twice shy! Amid growing calls for the freezing of government subventions towards a total of 11 parastatals until they submit their financial statements to be audited, one of these parastatals has pleaded for leniency, stating that their failure to submit same had been due to reasons beyond their control.

The Eswatini Christian Medical University (ECMU) has disclosed that in their case, the failure to submit the financial statements has not been a question of dereliction of duty.

Acting Vice Chancellor Professor Isabel Zwane yesterday explained that the institution had been without a bursar for some time as the position has been vacant for some years, making it hard for them to submit the statements. She lamented that the mooted freezing of government subvention would have dire consequences for the university as their core business is teaching and learn-

"Eswatini Medical Christian University has the uttermost respect of parliamentary oversight with regard to holding the parastatals accountable for their actions and for ensuring that they follow policies in accordance with the laws and budget passed by Parliament of the Kingdom of Eswatini," she said.

After Auditor General (AG) Timothy Matsebula called for the freezing of the subventions, Lobamba Lomdzala Member of Parliament (MP) Marwick Khumalo, in his capacity as ministry of finance portfolio committee chairperson, joined the bandwagon in the calls.

Professor Zwane highlighted that the position of bursar at the institution has been vacant for years and filling it had been a challenge.

"An independent consultancy firm has advertised this position on our behalf



as required several times; vetting and the approval process by the appointing authority takes months and by the time it is completed, recommended applicants are no longer available; head hunting through the Swaziland Institute of Accountants failed; and getting a qualified accountant to be seconded from the government to the university has also yielded no fruit," she explained.

In fact, she said, in October 2019, the institution wrote to the AG through the principal secretary (PS) at the ministry of education and training explaining their challenges

Clarified

She clarified that a bursar must be a chartered accountant in good standing, adding that such professionals was in demand. "If the subvention were to be frozen there would be no funds to pay salaries, creditors and for the general operations of the institution. It would be impossible for the institution to continue to operate.

"The university went through a very difficult period in 2017 when its operations were suspended. Staff were not paid for two months and the university was taken to court by the Union as their livelihoods were adversely affected," she added.

The vice chancellor pleaded with the MPs to give the university a chance to put its house in order. At the present,

she said, a financial consultant is assisting the university and preparing the books of accounts for audit, paying attention to the queries raised by the auditors in their previous reports.

"We are determined to comply with the Public Enterprises (Control and Monitoring) Act 1989 and to submit the financial statements in the near future," she concluded.

Meanwhile, MP Khumalo, speaking during the House of Assembly debate of the national budget on Wednesday and during Thursday's Post Budget Seminar hosted by the Central Bank of Eswatini (CBE), further insisted that as Parliament, they would not endorse the subvention of the unaudited parastatals.

Khumalo enquired why government was turning a blind eye and continued pouring resources towards the parastatals while they failed to conform to government regulations.

Khumalo said he would soon move a motion for freezing the parastatals subvention until they submitted their audited financial statements.

He also said the people looking after government's interest in the entities were not adding any value and were only pursuing their own agendas and interests. The MP also mentioned that there were allegations of corruption in some of these parastatals and nothing was being done. He added that the parastatals were also overlooking local SMEs in favour of South African companies and awarding them procurement tenders, while the same could be done by local companies.

He said if government took the time to interrogate the parastatals' financials, there was a lot that could be discovered.

Khumalo added that government should do something about this matter as a majority of these parastatals had the potential to contribute to the country's economic growth.

FSRA denies interference claim

The Financial Services Regulatory Authority says it is not interfering in the present application filed by Pan African Assent Management (PAAM) South Africa against PAAM Eswatini.

Responding to an answering affidavit filed by the third respondent in the matter, Babhekile Matsebula who is the FSRA general manager markets development, in her replying affidavit, submitted that the fifth respondent (FSRA) is an entity established under the FSRA Act of 2010.

She stated that in the present matter, the fifth respondent received a request from the first respondent, PAAM Eswatini, requiring capital forming the basis of its licensing conditions to be paid and released from security with the fourth respondent (FNB) and paid to an entity not related to or associated with the first respon-

"This raised a sense of disquiet and concern within the fifth respondent, which prompted the Authority to

make an enquiry with the Financial Sector Conduct Authority (FSCA) in the Republic of South Africa as the regulator of the applicant, this is normal and it is done every time there is a transaction or communication appearing to be abnormal," she submitted.

She submitted that records indicated that the capital base which had been pledged as security to the fifth respondent had in fact been paid by the applicant in these proceedings.

He alleged that the third respondent was seeking to have the funds released to an entity unknown to the fifth respondent. She further submitted that the fifth respondent does not wish to be embroiled in the litigation between the main protagonists, which was the applicant, the first second and third respondents. Cited as the applicant in the matter are PAAM South Africa (Pty) Ltd while respondents are PAAM Eswatini, Aquarius Asset Manager (Pty) Ltd, Abel Sibandze, FNB, FSRA, registrar of companies and the attorney general.

'BASIS OF FSRA's LETTER TO FSCA IN SA UNCLEAR'

the third respondent, in his affidavit, submitted that the basis of the letter that was written to FSCA in South African by Matsebula is unclear.

Abel Sibandze submitted that the transfer of a licence to second respondent had nothing to do with FSCA in South Africa or any other person, but FSRA

He averred that the exodus of the present application emanated from the office of the FSRA through an email sent to Tshaka Mdiya from the FSCA after Matsebula had sent a letter to FSCA as her act remains unclear to this day. "What is clear is that FSCA had no option to Matsebula's email as first respondent's application to transfer licence at FSRA had nothing to do with FSCA or any other person. I am advised and verily believe same to be true that FSRA engaged in a clear breach of confidentiality in first respondent's business dealings with them where they shared its business information with third parties," submitted Sibandze.

This breach, according to the respondent, will be dealt with at the appropriate forum.

The submissions made by the parties will be argued at the High Court next Thursday as all the parties have filed their papers.

SHOCKER: SWITZERLAND CUTS AID TO ESWATINI

n what will come as a shocker to the financially struggling government, the government of Switzerland will cease its financial aid to Eswatini as from next year.

The new Swiss aid budget proposes more funds but for fewer countries and according to Swizzinfo.ch, Eswatini is one of those countries that will be cut off from the proposed funding.

While it intends to be more generous, the Swizz government also wants aid distribution to be more efficient following criticism of wasteful expense by the right-wing Swiss People's Party. The government wants to set aside CHF11.25 billion (\$11.43 billion) in development aid for the 2021-2024 period.

The governing Federal Council adopted its Strategy for International Cooperation on Wednesday after opening it up for public consultation. It will still have to be approved by parliament. The amount proposed is CHF140 million more than the current aid budget and will cost Swiss taxpayers less than one Swiss franc (CHF0.80) per inhabitant per day. It is expected to amount to 0.46 per cent of gross national income over the four-year period, less than the 0.5 per cent target set by the Parliament in 2011. The number of beneficiary countries will be reduced from 46 to 35. The other losers of this new phase out strategy are Bolivia, Haiti, Honduras, Cuba, Nicaragua, Lesotho, Malawi, Mongolia, Pakistan and Azerbaijan.

Priority will be given to four main zones: North Africa and the Middle East, Sub-Saharan Africa, Asia (Central, South and South-East) and Eastern Europe. Of the CHF11.252 billion proposed for the years 2021 to 2024, CHF 6.638 billion is earmarked for bilateral and multilateral development cooperation. Of the rest, CHF2.145 billion is to go to humanitarian aid, CHF1.186 billion to economic development cooperation and CHF1.025 billion to cooperation with Eastern Europe. In addition, a framework credit for peace and human security to the amount of CHF258 million will be provided.

The Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation (SDC) conducts activities in the country within the framework of its regional programme for Southern Africa.

SEX WORKERS UNITE - VOC

ex workers are encouraged to hold hands and unite.

The service providers - sex workers - have been given the thumps up for having convened a meeting last week to regulate their pricing and discuss issues affecting them in the trade.

This follows reports by this publication last weekend that sex workers' representing their respective towns from around the country met at a secret location in Ezulwini to discuss making adjustments as per their industry. The sex workers held their meeting last Monday and Tuesday.

On the agenda was the high cost of living, an item that led to a 50 per cent increase on what they normally charge their clientele per sexual

Director of Voice of our Voices (VOOV), a sex worker-led organisation from Eswatini, Lungile Khumalo, applauded the ladies of the night for having seen the light.

"In my personal view, I think sex workers nowadays understand the world even better in that they are now able to come together and discuss issues affecting them," Khumalo noted.

According to the organisation's online profile, VOOV is a sex worker-led organisation from Eswatini, which supports sex workers to advocate for their human rights and promote access to health services.

"I really like and encourage the spirit shown by the service providers because this is where



solutions to the their problems affecting them can be put to table and be addressed," she said.

Khumalo said sex workers were not the problem. "The problem is what drives these women to the trade in the first place."

She said it was high time government starts addressing some of the issues that drive women into this illicit trade, with an understanding that what the state offers was not enough in terms of addressing issues of poverty, unemployment and the economic crises, amongst other social

She went on to frown upon reports that some of the about 50 sex workers who had convened for the said meeting were arrested by the police and slapped with criminal charges for loitering

Even though Lukhele said her organsation had not received reports to that some were even arrested, she said this was a serious cause for concern.

It seemed the sex workers discussed amongst

themselves and arranged for the meeting to regulate their service charges. They came from as far as Pigg's Peak, Siteki, Lavumisa, Matsapha and Manzini. "I would like to say that as Voice of our Voices we promote health and human rights for the marginalised groups, with a focus on sex workers. We were not aware of the meeting," she pointed out. Nonetheless, she said her organisation would make a follow-up on what led to the arrests and the nature of the charges preferred against their own. "We will like to hear more about that because we want to support them and be brought into a picture of what transpired, as well as being taken through all the steps leading to them being formally charged as we know that we are all equal before the law."

Lukhele said when government deliberates on socio-economic issues sex workers need to be involved, without anyone being left behind.

"These issues need inclusive involvement when discussions take place at country level. Nasildruhma ngetinhlelo letikhona eveni nabo abafakwe," she said as she challenged government to consider sex workers as citizens of the country too.

"Tindzaba tabo atikhulunywe," she emphasised, meaning government shouldn't turn a blind eye as if sex work was none existent.

On Monday, the nation woke up to shocking headline news in one of the local dailies wherein it was reported that a Grade Four pupil, now aged 15, turned to sex work when she was 13. She is reported to have told journalists that she wanted out of the community she lived in because she was embarrassed that a majority of the men in the impoverished community had 'tasted' her.

VOOV demands answers on why girls were arrested in meeting

he non-governmental organisation advocating for the rights of sex worker is yet to get a detailed report on why sex workers were allegedly harassed and arrested during their meeting last week.

The Director of VOOV, Lungile Khumalo, commenting about the sex workers meeting which led to the arrest of three girls, said her organisation would take up the matter and find the girls who were arrested and charged.

Sex work is criminalised in the Kingdom of Eswatini, and sex workers are often arrested for loitering as per the Crime Act of 1889. However, the law is quiet about clients.

Police last week said it was unfortunate that their arrival to the sex workers meeting was viewed as a disturbance. "We have a duty to attend all gatherings, in general," was what Chief Police Information and Communications Officer

Superintendent Phindile Vilakati said last week.

The police mouthpiece said this was also to ensure even the safety of that particular meeting's attendees. She confirmed the arrest of some of the ladies and said they were charged with loitering.

They appeared in court where they were fined, money which their colleagues in the sex industry had to fork out for the sisters to be released. According to VOOV, sex workers are not given a fair hearing whenever they are arrested for loitering; they are taken to a National Court where they are made to pay fines and it is not clear how these procedures can be changed.

"What were the charges based on?" Khumalo wondered, saying they would gather evidence from the ladies that were arrested and charged while attending the meeting to address issues that affect them as women in this trade.

"Being alone at home is also difficult, what if the man comes back and we are all alone here? What makes it worse is that he was never apprehended, so he is still on the loose."

Mamba also divulged that the gaping wounds on her body were healing slowly though she still felt the pain in other parts of the body, while at the same time she has to fend for her three months old baby.

I failed my wife - Husband

aul Vilane, who is Mamba's husband, said he felt like he failed his wife.

He was hurt and angry at the same time because of what happened to his wife.

He felt helpless since there was nothing he could do to change the situation or further prevent a similar occurrence as he works far.

"I feel sad that I'm away from my family due to working far. My wife recently moved to my place and now this befalls her, I feel weak, hurt and angry as a man.

"I feel like I failed her as a husband and there is not much I can do because I have to work to provide for them," stated Vilane.

Care

The home is currently in the care of the two women who have also said they had received a few visits from concerned community members who know that Mamba is new in the area. They assured her of safety and assistance in apprehending the culprit.

ogoba elders are seething with anger over a royal stamp currently controlled by Masundvwini Royal Council members who they accuse of using it to take over large portions of land and selling it.

In particular these portions of land include royal burial grounds, sparking fears that soon skeletons will be floating in the open as excavators close in to clear the land for construction of stateof-the-art housing. However, at the centre of the controversy between Logoba and Masundywini is who has the authority over the former's affairs.

Apart from land belonging to child headed orphans and widows being taken at the insistence of the Masundvwini council, a meeting of the Logoba elders on Wednesday also insisted that at the forefront is the use of the controversial royal stamp. This is the same stamp that was the cause of a standoff between Ludzidzini Governor Lusendvo Fakudze and Manzini Regional Administrator Chief Gija. "The home of Thandi Maphalala was taken at gunpoint and all this happens while we watch. The

other was the home of Zinhle Nkambule that was taken from her and her children but she could not be helped until she died. This is because we hear that Logoba no longer runs its own affairs but Masundvwini," said Mphiwa Bhembe, Deputy Chairperson of the Logoba Umphakatsi committee.

The committee met to brief the media on the goings on at Logoba, a situation that has completely run out of control while the owner of the land, the King,

Logoba barred from reporting atrocities to King

Il attempts to seek audience have been thwarted even after the A Logoba committee members presented a beast, first at Nkhanini and secondly at Lozitha, said Masina.

He alleged that they made all possible means to seek audience with the King by working through the emissaries, emabandla but failed.

"Now we want His Majesty to know about all this because we are barred from having audience with him. We are certain that he is not aware of what his people are going through.

At the meeting with Lusendvo, he is said to have insisted that anyone who did not understand the new arrangement should return to Lusendvo for clarity. Indeed three days later, the Logoba committee went to Lusendvo in the company of then RA Chief Gcokoma where Lusendvo was asked succinctly if Logoba had indeed ceased to exist. He is said to have clarified that it was only matters that could not be handled by Logoba that were to be taken to Masundvwini, not that Logoba had been eliminated from existence. Again in

2017, added Nkambule, in the compnay of Chief Gcokoma, Ndabazabantu the late Khopho Dlamini, it was clarified further that areas under Logoba included Mhlane, Makholweni, Mhobodleni, Mahlabatsini and so on were under the jurisdiction of Logoba, tikhungelwe kuLogoba.

Matters

"However, all other matters resolved or handled by Logoba were reported to Masundvwini who took them to Ndabazabantu then Ludzidzini, as a matter of protocol and procedure.'

But now Masundvwini is taking over us and our land.

A lie is doing the rounds that Logoba ceased to exist and now some of the Logoba residents are seeing opportunities to please the Masundvwini encroach-

His sentiments were echoed by Simon Masina, a committee member, who said Logoba was a thorn in the flesh and no one but Logoba people felt the pain therefore are the only ones who can do

something about it.

"We know that stamps are for administrative work at *umphakatsi* level in order to avoid congestions at the royal palace, *Sigodlo*. You cannot expect people to be moving up and down the palace

looking for a stamp to authorise such simple things as scholarship application forms. The stamp was taken from Logoba Umphakatsi to carryout Logoba issues at the *Sigodlo* at Masundvwini, this is unheard of," said Masina.




cina Mbingo is worried that nothing is moving, especially for the youths who want to start businesses given the high rate of unemployment and those who want to proceed with tertiary education.

The residents now have no way out but to see things falling apart. This is because all other structures no longer recognise Logoba, including the regional administration offices and that of *Ndabazabantu*. So bad is the situation that even political structures such as bucopho are now paying allegiance to Masundvwini, ignoring Logoba completely. "If the stamp at Masundvwini

does not leave those premises and works from there what about that of Logoba, what happened to it, which stamp works for Logoba?" It is said even the chief's runners of Logoba (bagijimi) are now servicing Masundwini to take advantage of kickbacks instead of waiting on the uncertainty of Logoba.

man of Nkambeni is at the centre of controversy for Makholweni, the other area under Logoba, who is said to be running his own affairs after he claimed to have been given reins to run the area as chairman of some Makholweni community by one of late Maphevu Dlamini's sons, a claim vehemently contested by those close to the Maphevu family that looked after Makholweni.

"Maphevu was never a chief how then can someone claim to have been given powers to rule by Maphevu's son, this is a lie because Maphevu has his own large household," said a close family member.

Factions

However, this was a subject of some factions of Makholweni last Wednesday near Hillside Labotsibeni High School who doubt the status of the Nkambeni

man.

In the meantime, at Logoba this is another reason there are fears that ground is being swept from the Logoba Umphakatsi by those with links to Masundvwini.

Ludzidzini Governor Lusendvo Fakudze reminded Makholweni people that initially they were registered with Mbekelweni but have now been shifted to Masundvwini through the Logoba Umphakatsi.

'Logoba runs own affairs but...'

Logoba has its own semiautonomous authority that requires it to hand over its work to the Masundvwini council, failing which no other body can hear or effect their decisions without the oversight of Masundvwini.

He says he may not be privy to the abuses of authority, which could be shameful, but Ludzidzini would not hear any decision taken by Logoba without such being taken to that authority by Masundvwini. Lusendvo says this is a decision of how those areas are to be governed traditionally and that decision is a command and cannot be undone save by the author. Furthermore, he says he cannot be drawn to comment about cattle donated towards seeking audience with the King but to reaffirm that all the King's subjects are equal before his eyes and no one can be denied access to their King.

Lusendvo said at one time, Logoba was under Mbekelweni for registration and other purposes but now were reporting to Masundvwini together with KaShali, Mhobodleni and all those under Logoba. He highlighted that Mhlane used to be under Zombodze but now reports to Masundvwini.

hairman of Masundvwini council says Logoba has no authority to run its own affairs, there is no such committee as Logoba committee following a meeting held at the Mahlabatsini grounds in 2013. Samuel Mduna Phungwayo says instead there are three members from the areas of Logoba, Mhlane and Makholweni who represent these areas and sit in the Masundvwini council. These are Sipho Magagula from Makholweni, Ma-beret from Logoba and Dumisa from Mhlane, the rest

is history, no committees from those areas.

Prsent at the Mhlabatsini meeting were Lusendvo himself and Prince Masitsela, says Phungwayo. "In these areas those men do nothing, they represent no one because they don't form any committee." Unfortunately, Phungwayo went off air when we asked him about who actually appointed those men from the three areas and put them into the Masundvwini council and the criteria used whether it was the King or Lusendvo.



NEW ZEALAND TO IMPROVE EASE OF DOING BUSINESS IN ESWATINI

delegation from New Zealand was in the Kingdom to conduct a diagnostic assessment aimed at developing a package of reforms targetted at improving ease of doing business.

New Zealand is currently number one in the World Bank Ease of Doing Business Index. The delegation from New Zealand was in the country at the invitation of the ministry of commerce, industry and trade through its Investor Roadmap Unit. They arrived in the Kingdom Monday; meeting with different key stakeholders to try and determine how easy it is to start a business in Eswatini.

The delegation met with Prime Minister Ambrose Mandvulo Dlamini, Deputy Prime Minister Themba Masuku and Minister of Commerce Industry and Trade Senator Manqoba Khumalo at Cabinet offices.

Addressing the delegation, the prime minister said ease of doing business was one of government's key focus areas in the Kingdom's journey to economic transformation and development.

"Government has taken a decision in our strategic roadmap for the next five years to make Eswatini's economy private sector-led and make it an export-driven economy. We, therefore, need to create the right cli-

mate and environment for any business to find it easy to trade and do business in Eswatini," he said.

Minister Khumalo, on the other hand, said Eswatini was willing to be guided to improve the ease of doing business while also leapfrogging certain technologies and processes so that the Kingdom would become best in class in the shortest possible

"We have very aggressive plans, but obviously we need to be practical. We understand that digitalisa-

tion is a huge part of what we wish to accomplish, so hopefully what you'll be looking at is a digital solution. We are also doing a lot of homebrewed solutions at the moment and practical things around amending legislations while at the same time engaging all the different stakeholders," Khumalo said.

Mediator claims he's framed with rape of girl

community policeman who has been arrested for allegedly raping a 10-year-old girl claims he is being framed by the minor's family as he is a mediator in a dispute involving the complainant's family over a block of flats.

Calvin Kunene (45) was arrested by the Manzini police and charged with raping the minor while at Madonsa, an incident that allegedly happened in September 2019.

According to the charge sheet, the community policeman was charged with contravening the Sexual Offences And Domestic Violence Act (SODVA) in that he had sexual intercourse with the minor who by law is incapable of consenting to an act of sexual nature.

Kunene yesterday filed an urgent application for bail at the High court before Judge Cyril Maphanga.

Represented by Manzini-based attorney Bonginkosi Xaba of Xaba Attorneys

law firm, Kunene submitted that he was innocent of the charges preferred against him and averred that he would plead not guilty at trial.

He informed the court that the charges against him have been orchestrated and falsely levelled against him by the minor's mother owing to the dispute which he found himself in by virtue of the fact that he is a community policeman of the area as the Royal Kraal (umphakatsi) would use him as a mediator in the dispute.

Involvement

"I wish to aver that prior to my involvement in the dispute, I used to have a good relationship with the complainant's family. Around the year 2013 to 2016, I was having an affair with the mother to the complainant until I terminated the relationship, after discovering that she was double crossing me with another man," he submitted. He averred that after the death of one Vusi Mkhwanazi, the complainant's grandmother wanted to expropriate rental flats belonging to he (deceased) yet the deceased had children as she instructed them to go stay at their mother's parental home.

He stated that he was approached by one of the children about the matter and he advised him to report it to the Eswatini National Court for adjudication. The court referred the matter back to umphakatsi for deliberation where is it currently pending. During one of the meetings held over the matter, he was accused by the grandmother of siding with the deceased's children and requested umphakatsi to stop using him as a mediator. "Some time in 2017, I had a rumour to the effect that I was being accused of raping a minor child by the family. My informant told me that the mother to the minor said she wanted to sort me in one way or the other following my involvement in the family dispute," he alleged.

He mentioned that despite having

urther motivating his bail application, the applicant (Kunene) submitted that at one time, the complainant demanded E50 from him failing which she would report him to the police for SODV.

"I wish to aver that to my surprise, the complainant demanded E50, failing which she would report me for SODV. Upon hearing that, I called the eldest child who, however, stood at a distance when the complainant made the demand. The elder sister stated that the complainant alleged I raped her hence the E50 demand," he submitted.

He stated that since he knew that he did not commit the offence, he did not succumb to the demand, but only asked the children why they failed to report same to their parents or the police.

He averred that owing to the above, he had no doubt in his mind why he found himself in custody for an offence he claims he did not com-

He submitted further that as a person of authority in his community by virtue of being a community policeman, he would have expected the complainant's family to engage him over the matter by either reporting it to other community policemen or umphakatsi.

Kunene informed the court that he had expected the complainant's mother as his ex-lover to confront him about the matter as they used to have a good relationship. He pleaded with the court that the matter was urgent given that his liberty has been taken away from him on the basis of the alleged rape.

heard the rumour, no one approached him and asked about the matter. He said when the police arrested him on

February 14, 2020 he was not surprised following the rumour that had been doing rounds.

...GRANTED E50 000 BAIL

unene's application was successful as Judge Maphanga granted him bail fixed at E50 000.

This, after the Crown had indicated that it was not opposed to his application and the court ruled that he should pay E5 000 in cash and a sum of E45 000 shall be in a form of a surety.

As part of his bail conditions, Kunene was ordered to surrender his travel document or passport and not apply for a new one pending finalisation of the matter before court.

He was also ordered not to interfere with the Crown witnesses especially the complainant pending finalisation of the matter.

He will also report to the Manzini police periodically and shall not change his domicile pending finalisation of the

orruption, hidden favours and power to manipulate mushrooming chiefs has made way to boundary disputes in the country.


The continued disuse of the surveyor general's office where maps of the demarcated areas of the chiefdoms are kept has led to the current challenges.

Historian and author Thomas Vabula Bafana Magagula shared that the country was formed through the demarcation of chiefdoms and all the chiefdoms were mapped, marked and numbered for a reason.

Magagula said the King continues to ensure he gives direction to all emabandla, the courts and the government to act on the wrongs of the past. He said the King by signing the Southern African Development Community Protocol Against Corruption wanted to see to it that the country prospered by doing away with corruption as envisaged by the region.

"The King by signing the SADC Protocol Against Corruption and the Human Rights Charter is trying to tell emabandla, the courts and the government that the country cannot continue to be enslaved by the chieftain....also for Emabandla, the courts and the government to act

cy disputes that are created by people with ulterior motives," opined Magagula.

He further urged the courts to respect the known boundaries that are undisputed with the maps at the surveyor general's office. Magagula further alleged that the consistency in the labeling and naming of chiefdoms was well documented from way back in 1907

and even after independence it had remained marked.

He alleged that with power hungry individuals, the demarcated chiefdoms were partitioned and now altered to suit certain influential individuals who use their status to rob the country of good governance.

"There are areas that have become

Magugula was full of praises for the King on signing the important protocols, "the King continues to show that he is against corruption and is calling upon the courts to act on corruption. Anyone who has taken land that belongs to Emaswati fraudulently must come up and confess even if it was a mistake," said Magagula.

Magagula alleged that the country faced so many court cases and judgments that make one question the integrity of the courts. He said many chiefdoms had been destroyed by certain influential people pursuing selfish interests. He said there had been new areas that had mushroomed and later became chiefdoms under unclear circumstances. Chiefdoms are marked and even the farms that were returned to government when the kingdom gained independence are known at the surveyor general's office, said Magagula. Magagula further praised the King for his willingness to see the country prosper in terms of development; he said the chiefdoms were core of the Tinkhundla system of governance. He said many chieftaincy disputes that had been made by these influential people with their baseless oral history had rmade opportunists doubt the Tinkhundla government. "The King has set the tone; government must wakeup from their slumber and act towards eradicating corruption for the people of Eswatini to realise development," Magagula said.

SADC mandate is to achieve regional intergration, eradicate poverty

he overall aim of the Southern African Development Community (SADC) is to achieve regional intergration and eradicate poverty within the Southern African region.

To achieve these goals, member states need to work together harmoniously in achieving effective results on common problems and issues. In order to enable this relationship, several legal and institutional instruments have been put into place to guide and standardise the work of SADC with member states. One of these instruments is the SADC Protocols, which enshrine the aims of the community by providing codes of procedure and practise on various issues, as agreed by member states. A protocol is a legally binding document committing member states to the objectives and specific procedures within it. In

order for a protocol to enter in to force, two thirds of the member states need to ratify or sign the agreement, giving formal consent and making the document officially valid. Any member state that had not initially become party to a protocol can accede to it at a later stage.

'Serial housebreaker' arrested for attempting to kill woman

31-year-old man has been arrested for attempting to kill a woman after breaking into her house with intent to steal from her.

MTN SA content with Eswatini's Mobile Money success Services, said he believed that the South rather than compete with MoMo. MTN **By Bodwa Mbingo**

obile phone giant MTN South Africa, which recently re-launched a mobile money service with Ubank, is happy with the success enjoyed by MTN Eswatini's Mobile Money ser-

MTN is unfazed by increasing competition in that country's banking sector and hopes to replicate the success enjoyed by the product in other parts of the continent where it operates. The company - which operates in 22 markets in Africa and the Middle East - cancelled its previous mobile money service in 2016, after it failed to gain traction in a market dominated by major banks. In the same year, MTN's competitor, Vodacom, also shut down its mobile money service, M-Pesa, due to poor local demand. Vodacom had launched M-Pesa in 2010, targeting to reach 10 million local users. But only 76 000 users had signed up in 2015, as Fin24 reported. But with the roll-out of the new platform, MoMo, MTN says the time is ripe for the service, which is targeted at the unbanked or under-served segment of the market. Apart from sending and receiving money, MoMo offers users a range of financial transactions from their smartphones, such as purchasing airtime, data bundles and prepaid electricity. In an interview with Fin24, Felix Kamenga, MTN Chief Officer Mobile Financial

African market had grown over the past five years and become more receptive to online services." I am happy that there are so many different players compared to being a lone voice. It speaks to the fact that the market is ripe and receptive," said Kamenga. He says MTN's initial shot at mobile money failed, in part, because low user numbers meant the project did not make commercial sense, and there were frustrations from a regulatory perspective. Mobile money is operational in 16 countries where MTN has a presence, including Afghanistan, and the service is popular in east Africa. The company hopes to replicate the success in the local market. "Today our biggest marker is Ghana, and Swaziland (Eswatini) is a resounding success," he said. In a market dominated by well-established banking systems, it is estimated that there are still around 11 million South Africans without access to financial services, and MTN is gunning for a slice of that population, as well as those who seek alternative cash service solutions. Players like Capitec have made great inroads in the lower end of the market, while the industry has seen a major shake-up from digital innovators such as TymeBank, who are jostling for the under-served groups. It's a development likely to present a tough competition for MoMo. However, Kamenga is adamant that the new banks complement,

has set itself a target of reaching at least a million customers within the first two years. "Getting the number is important, probably the biggest measures of success, and breaking even is on the roadmap," said Kamenga. MTN will earn commission from service providers, allowing customers to pay no fees but cash transactions carry an additional cost. Although Kamenga is confident that the service. which is not exclusive to MTN subscribers, will draw sufficient interest in the market, due to what he describes as a seamless user experience and accessibility, he is aware of potential challenges in the initial phases. "It's going to make a loss for some time because of the amount of money we are pouring into it building the distribution, building the product." Users can download the MoMo app on their smartphones, through the USSD functionality, or register at an MTN store as well as agents across the country. According to Imtiaz Suliman, analyst at Sentio Capital, MTN would have a "quite a difficult time" cracking the challenging market, which has significantly evolved over the past five years. "The market structure is more competitive than before, the big four banks are well entrenched, and the market they are targeting has low disposable income," said Suliman.

He acknowledged that the company would offer a niche service in a small area.


"The Matsapha Industrial Park is almost at full capacity hence the reason government's future plan is to develop the Sidvokodvo Industrial Park.

country's competitiveness and this is expected to contribute to accelerated growth rates in the productive sectors such as manufacturing, mining, retail and services.


Government is continuing with

URGENT TURNAROUND IN TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS NEEDED

tatistics show that there is a pressing need to turnaround the rate at which traffic accidents are occurring in the country, otherwise set targets will prove elusive.

This was revealed by Senior Deputy National Commissioner Emmanuel Sula Dlamini during the official closing of a three-month Basic Traffic Policing Course held at the Police Academy last Friday. Dlamini, who was representing the national commissioner, stated that all citizens should be bothered by the figures which show that 15 fatal and 41 serious accidents have already been recorded since the beginning of the year.

The senior deputy national commissioner noted that the prevalence of traffic accidents is a threat to the 'Zero Deaths' target set for the road safety stakeholders by the minister of public works and transport. He charged traffic officers to roll up sleeves and focus their strategies towards facilitating a quick turnaround in the rate of accidents occurring around

the country's roads.

Dlamini stated that traffic operations should as far as possible, yield the desired end-result of enhancing levels of road-safety and smooth flow of traffic so that the wheels of the country's economy are

kept rolling seamlessly. He noted that this is more so because traffic officers are central in the discharge of the police mandate of ensuring optimal safety on the country's roads. He revealed that in order to achieve this, it is vital that strategies are in sync with the vehicular volume on the country's roads which has increased by over 70 per cent in the past decade, thus demanding heightened police visibility to control and direct traffic during peak hours.

The senior deputy police chief challenged traffic officers to acknowledge that they are police brand ambassadors, therefore, their behaviour should always be professional, courteous and geared towards cementing a positive police/public relations through treating clients with dignity and respect. He urged them to continue embracing the integrated policing approach and to be always vigilant of other crimes when conducting traffic operations since armed robbers, drug peddlers and other perpetrators use the road for transportation.

Dlamini also noted that a change of mindset on the part of road users is also key for a concerted effort in reducing the occurrence of traffic accidents. He appealed to road users to understand that initiatives on road safety are ultimately for their wellbeing, therefore, they should com-


ply with the rules of the road without being prodded by the police.

The senior deputy national commissioner expressed appreciation towards facilitators who contributed in the success of the basic traffic policing course which include the ministries of tourism, health, agriculture, Sincephetelo MVA Fund and Southern Star Logistics. He further congratulated the 34 graduating course participants and wished them the very best in the performance of their duties.

Speaking on behalf of the course participants, Constable Andile Matsebula expressed sincere appreciation to the office of the national commissioner for providing them with the learning opportunity. He said the course content addressed key areas and challenges that they usually encounter in the execution of their duties. He further made a pledge that they would use the knowledge obtained from the course to improve individual performance and service delivery as well as to share the skills with their colleagues.

NACTUS calls for young entrepreneurs in agriculture to try a new innovative method of producing animal feed from fruit and vegetable waste.

This was after a new machine labelled S4 drostky hammer mill was introduced and it makes the job easier.

According to the Chief Executive Officer of ENACTUS, Wonderboy Khumalo, a group of four young women trading under the name Chakaza Mvelo had already benefitted from NAMBoard who sponsored them with the machine worth E31 000.

Khumalo said this would ensure that very little products go to waste, whilst at the same time help reduce disposable waste, obtain maximum value from the value chain and ensure employment for young people.

He said composting of some waste material from the project would be used to make compost, which in turn would be used to fertilise soils, moving away from use of inorganic chemicals, which is a trend worldwide and also required by partners in the global trading space. Khumalo further stated that his organ-

Khumalo further stated that his organisation worked closely with students in ensuring that they came up with innovative business solutions to make a better world for all whilst contributing to the sustainable development goals.

He opined that students from Mbabane campus came up with a project aimed at creating value from field waste by converting it into livestock feed. He said this project would directly contribute to the food shortfall, more especially during droughts or winter where it is expensive even if available.

Beneficiaries

"This project has also created employment for the beneficiaries who happen to be former students. Some have already registered their businesses under the mentorship of ENACTUS."

"As ENACTUS, we are committed to encouraging more students to go for the full programme cycle. We also like to challenge students to join ENACTUS programme in their respective institutions. Our hands are open to institutions that still don't have the programme," said Khumalo. He then expressed his gratitude to NAMBoard for lending a hand

in empowering members of ENACTUS. He said as an organisation, they were looking forward to a healthy working relationship with NAMBoard.

Speaking on behalf of NAMBoard CEO, Thami Dlamini said as a company they had consistently partnered with ENACTUS to grow the agribusiness environment for young people, which was critical for Eswatini's future. "Recently, we handed over a driven S4 Drotsky hammer mill machine worth E31 000, which is part of an overall E50 000 sponsorship that the organisation provided in the current financial year to ENACTUS. The machine will enable the UNESWA Mbabane ENACTUS facilitated entrepreneurs to produce animal feed from fruit and vegetables waste, reducing the need to discard waste that farmers cannot handle," said Dlamini.

NAMBoard facilitates markets for farmers in and outside the country and assist farmers with production, processing, storage, to name a few. The parastatal, apart from being a government advisor on the availability and demand of scheduled products, also registers whole sale distributors, importers and exporters of scheduled products.



oday we continue to discuss safe browsing.

As we surf the internet, we leave a trail behind. This footprint can be used by malicious users like cyber criminals to attack unsuspecting users. It is against this background that everyone should be concerned about the safety of their browsing history, especially when using public computers.

All web browsers remember a list of the web pages that you have visited. You can delete this list at any time; clearing your browsing history and erasing the tracks stored on your computer, smartphone, or tablet. Each browser has its own separate history, so you will need to clear the history in multiple places if you have used more than one browser.

CLEARING BROWSER HISTORY FOR GOOGLE CHROME

PHEW! ALLOWANCES NOISE OVER, MAYBE

opefully the meeting between tertiary students and Principal Secretary Thulani Mkhaliphi will put paid to a perennial problem that has been a thorny issue to several governments for several decades now, without solution.

The promise of an end of an era to disturbances and violent clashes because of known inefficiencies cannot go unnoticed. The Wednesday meeting of bursars, members of students representative councils, education ministry officials and deans is probably the first of its kind to come out with solutions.

In the past government had often put the blame squarely on students submitting wrong data to government hence the delays in the processing of allowances. Similar blame was put on parents for the wrong data while at the same time the blame was put on the institutions for failure to provide the necessary documentation for government to start processing students allowances. Now the blame has been shared equally by all those who attended the Wednesday meeting and therefore all agreed that they now each understand clearly what role to play. This means the blame game has come to an end because each stakeholder knows exactly what is required, however, it is a wonder that it had to take this long just for each of these to know what is expected of them.

Students rioting over delayed payment of their living allowances has always been spurred by the realities that a majority would not afford even a single meal simply because of the situation back home, that of abject poverty. In some of these cases the student would have nothing to survive on while the delays in the processing of the allowances remain uncertain. Under such circumstances the student is faced with the inevitable option, to surrender to the loan sharks. Those vampires in turn take everything away from the student in the form of exponential interest, especially in an industry that is inadequately monitored. Loan sharks charge as they please all because they are able to get away with it even though there are regulators and inspectors to monitor their conduct in doing business through the regulatory authority. Most of these are backyard loan sharks with no offices but are able to loan out money and charge own interest. The hardest hit victims are tertiary education students who are fresh from high school and have not been initiated into personal finance management.

Stories from the University of Eswatini when it comes to accommodation are horrifying to say the least. Some of the girls have been made to give sexual favours just to stay a little longer in the rooms until the release of the allowances

when they must be able to pay the landlord. Other stories are that the girls have been made sex objects for crude business persons running entertainment homes around Matsapha. Here the girls are short of doing belly dancing to the amusement of bellied and baldheaded businesspersons from across the border who regularly come here for close to free sex.

The problems around delayed payment of allowances are more than meets the eye. Some students use part of the allowances to bring food to the table back at home just because of the high rate of unemployment.

Allegation

At times it is never easy to prove allegations made by students moreso when they are justifying a failed examination. In South Africa in 2018 a WITS University law student Tshiamo Modise claimed to have waited for five months into the academic year for the National Student Financial Aid Scheme (NSFAS) to pay his allowance. Last year the 19-year-old found himself forced to sleep in the toilets because of the protracted delays by NSFAS to pay his fees. "It's not easy to attend classes knowing that you have debts for studies and accommodation. This is stress because everything counts, clothes, food and accommodation.

"During exams I had to sleep in the toilets because I had to be close to the library. I survived as though I was not a human being, because sometimes I had to study with an empty stomach. I was like an animal." He said he owed E15 000 for rent and E7000 in study fees. Wits University clarified that NSFAS had paid allowances that are "payable in terms of their (NSFAS) rules"

"During exams I had to sleep in the toilets because I had to be close to the library. I survived as though I was not a human being, because sometimes I had to study with an empty stomach. I was like an animal." He said he owed E15 000 for rent and E7000 in study fees. Wits University clarified that NSFAS had paid allowances that are "payable in terms of their (NSFAS) rules".

But queen of the game is the Walter Sisulu University student who received E14.1m NSFAS payment bonanza and went on a 73 day shopping spree. When the error was discovered in early August 2017, she had squandered E818 000. Now these overpayments are not easy to manage, when it is pay back time. No one would be able to raise the money already spent all because students are generally poor and any amount of this magnitude is tempting. Once the error has been discovered the student becomes the only person in the chain to shoulder the blame. Common sense in the banking sector is that a person is punished for withdrawing money that is not theirs but the other sense tickles one to be tempted to say the fault is not entirely authored by the account holder.

The long overdue meeting between government and the students marks the end of the many fires and burning of campus infrastructure, maybe an end. But we have known this kind of engagement to be always a temporary measure. Somewhere in the not so distant future we shall hear of overpayments, delayed allowances and there would be everybody in that meeting pointing a finger at the other. Let's wait and see.

Eating to prevent, control and reverse diabetes

iabetes is on the rise, yet most cases are preventable with healthy lifestyle changes. Taking steps to prevent and control diabetes doesn't mean living in deprivation.

While eating right is important, you don't have to give up sweets entirely or resign yourself to a lifetime of bland "health food". With these tips, you can still enjoy your favourite foods and take pleasure from your meals without feeling hungry or deprived.

Taking control of diabetes

According to Harvard school for public health, whether you're trying to prevent or control diabetes, there is some good news. You can make a big difference with healthy lifestyle changes. The most important thing you can do for your health is to lose weight—but you don't have to lose all your extra pounds to start reaping the benefits. Experts say that losing just five per cent to 10 per cent of your total weight can help you lower your blood sugar considerably, as well as lower your blood pressure and cholesterol levels. It's not too late to make a positive change, even if you've already developed diabetes. The bottom line is that you have more control over your health than you think.

The importance of losing weight in the 'right' place

The biggest risk factor for developing diabetes is being overweight, but not all body fat is created equal. Your risk is higher if you tend to carry your weight around your abdomen—the so-called "spare tire"—as opposed to your hips and thighs. So why are "apple" shaped people more at risk than "pears"?

"Pears" store most of their fat close below the skin. "Apples" store their weight around their middle, much of it deep within the belly surrounding their abdominal organs and liver. This type of deep fat is closely linked to insulin resistance and diabetes. In fact, many studies show that waist size is a better predictor of diabetes risk than BMI (body mass index).

You are at an increased risk of developing diabetes if you are:


- A woman with a waist circumference of 35 inches or more;
- A man with a waist circumference of 40 inches or more;
- To measure your waist circumference, place a tape measure around your bare abdomen just above your hip bone. Be sure that the tape is snug (but does not compress your skin) and that it is parallel to the floor. Relax, exhale, and measure your waist.

The dangers of 'sugar belly'

Calories obtained from fructose (found in sugary beverages such as soda, energy and sports drinks, coffee drinks, and processed foods like doughnuts, muffins, cereal, candy and granola bars) are more likely to turn you into an "apple" by adding weight around your abdomen. Cutting back on sugary foods can mean a slimmer waistline as well as a lower risk of diabetes.

Eating right is vital if you're trying to prevent or control diabetes. While exercise is also important, what you eat has the biggest impact when it comes to weight loss. But what does

eating right for diabetes mean? You may be surprised to hear that your nutritional needs are virtually the same everyone else: no special foods or complicated diets are necessary.

A diabetes diet is simply a healthy eating plan that is high in nutrients, low in fat, and moderate in calories. It is a healthy diet for anyone! The only difference is that you need to pay more attention to some of your food choices—most notably the carbohydrates you eat.

Myth and facts about diabetes and diet

MYTH: You must avoid sugar at all costs.

Fact: The good news is that you can enjoy your favourite treats as long as you plan properly. Dessert doesn't have to be off limits, as long as it's a part of a healthy meal plan or combined with exercise.

MYTH: A high-protein diet is best.

Fact: Studies have shown that eating too much protein, especially animal protein, may actually cause insulin resistance, a key factor in diabetes. A healthy diet includes protein, carbohydrates, and fats. Our bodies need all three to function properly. The key is a balanced diet.

MYTH: You have to cut way down on carbs.

Fact: Again, the key is to eat a balanced diet. The serving size and the type of carbohydrates you eat are especially important. Focus on whole grain carbs since they are a good source of fibre and they are digested slowly, keeping blood sugar levels more even.

MYTH: You'll no longer be able to eat normally. You need special diabetic meals. Fact: The principles of healthy eating are the same—whether or not you're trying to prevent or control diabetes. Expensive diabetic foods generally offer no special benefit. You can easily eat with your family and friends if you eat in moderation.

Few diet tips are as follow:

Diabetes and diet tip 1: Choose high-fibre, slow-release carbs

Carbohydrates have a big impact on your blood sugar levels—more so than fats and pro-

teins—but you don't have to avoid them. You just need to be smart about what types of carbs you eat. In general, it's best to limit highly refined carbohydrates like white bread, pasta, and rice, as well as soda, candy, and snack foods. Focus instead on high-fibre complex carbohydrates—also known as slow-release carbs. Slow-release carbs help keep blood sugar levels even because they are digested more slowly, thus preventing your body from producing too much insulin. They also provide lasting energy and help you stay full longer.

Diabetes and diet tip 2: Be smart about sweets

Eating for diabetes doesn't mean eliminating sugar. If you have diabetes, you can still enjoy a small serving of your favourite dessert now and then. The key is moderation.

But maybe you have a sweet tooth and the thought of cutting back on sweets sounds almost as bad as cutting them out altogether. The good news is that cravings do go away and preferences change. As your eating habits become healthier, foods that you used to love may seem too rich or too sweet, and you may find yourself craving healthier options.






I'm better now," she says.






She also says people should practise sensitivity. "It's

"I became a drug addict. Those are the repercussions of having



Pop Smoke's death wasn't a robbery gone wrong it

was a targeted hit and that conclusion is supported by surveillance video.

People who have seen the surveillance footage from outside the Hollywood Hills home where Pop was killed Wednesday morning tell us you see four men approach the home at around 4:30am and sneak around back.

A couple minutes pass before three of the four walk back up the side of the home to the front. The 4th apparently walked in the backdoor but no camera was trained on it. The next time you see the man, he exits through the front door of the house.

As we reported, multiple shots were fired inside the home and they only struck Pop Smoke, who was rushed to

All these traumatising and hilarious happenings are usually caused by Maurice, Andrew's own Hormone Monster (also voiced by Kroll) who takes pleasure (literally) in abusing the poor kid. As painfully accurate as the show is, if you're lucky enough to be removed from that angst-ridden era of life, you'll probably appreciate the humor in all of it.



MARVEL'S JESSICA JONES

3 SEASONS, 39 EPISODES

As an episodic series, Jessica Jones occasionally falters in its first season. Jones is a private detective with certain special powers, but the series doesn't put her P.I. talents to much use, instead focusing on one storyline surrounding the big bad, Kilgrave (David Tennant) for the entire 13 episodes. Tennant's character, however, is the best reason to watch the series — he's captivating yet repugnant, alluring yet vile — and the themes of rape and domestic abuse resonate loudly. Unfortunately, when Kilgrave is not onscreen, the series drifts, and that's especially apparent in Season 2. Krysten Ritter's title character is too often dour and sarcastic, robbing the series of some much-needed levity. Still, it's a captivating, thematically-rich series that covers ground no other superhero series would dare to explore, and while that doesn't make it the most entertaining Marvel series, it is the bravest and most unique among the Netflix originals.



AMERICAN VANDAL

2 SEASONS, 16 EPISODES

In theory, American Vandal sounds silly and sophomoric, and it is, but it's also a genuinely brilliant, incredibly clever, smartly written satire of true-crime documentaries. It plays just like any other true crime docuseries — interviews, investigations, multiple suspects, and numerous conspiracy theories — only the crime here is not a murder. In its first season, it's a high-school student who has been accused by the school board of spray painting dicks on 27 cars, a crime that threatens his ability to graduate. It's a brilliant whodunnit that just happens to also be the best parody of 2017, and it even took home a Peabody Award. The show's follow-up season trades dick picks for explosive diarrhhea which is just as fun, if not ten times as gross.



ust under a year ago, Alice Posha fled her home in the middle of the night and then watched as it was swept away by floods.

The torrential rain came from Cyclone Idai, one of the worst storms ever to hit Africa and the fiercest on record to strike Buhera, a district in the usually arid province of Manicaland in eastern Zimbabwe.

Today, the scene in Buhera is entirely different. But the misery remains.

The 60-year-old, who was rehoused in October, is going through the motions of weeding a field of maize that has been withered by the worst drought in 35 years.

A little rain for her corn would be more than welcome.

"Seeing how the maize is wilting, we may have a very bad harvest," she said.

It is a scene that is being played out across southern Africa, where chronic lack of rain is threatening mass hunger and ruin.

Climate change is being fingered as the big culprit.

In the space of 10 months, Buhera and many districts like it have been hammered by extremes that scientists say are consistent with forecasts about climate change.

In March 2019, the arrival of Idai unleashed devastation on eastern Zimbabwe and its neighbours Mozambique and Malawi.

Over a thousand people died and the lives of millions of others were badly affected.

"Our chickens and turkeys were swept away," said Posha's sister-in-law, Josephine Ganye, who now depends on food aid.

She is among the 45 million people in southern Africa that the UN has said are threatened by famine.

Its World Food Programme (WFP) sent out a stark warning last month. "This hunger crisis is on a scale we've not seen before and the evidence shows it's going to get worse," said Lola Castro, WFP's Regional Director in Southern Africa.

For the past five years, the entire southern tip of the African continent, where average temperatures are rising twice as fast as the global mean, has suffered from a significant lack of rain.

Every farmer, big or small, has been affected as well as breeders, hoteliers and teachers.

Prayers for rain

In Zimbabwe, the drought has added to a long list of crises, from stratospheric inflation to shortages of cash, petrol, medicines, water and electricity.

For many, daily life has become a nightmare.

"Almost everybody in my area is food insecure," said 68-year-old Janson Neshava, who is a headman, or senior leader, in Buhera.

"We still do the traditional rain ceremonies, but to no avail. Even the wetlands are now dry and streams that used to flow throughout the year are

The WFP says that 60 per cent of Zimbabwe's 15 million people are currently food insecure.

According to Patience Dhinda, a local official, this figure hits 80 percent in Buhera where the grain depot, which should house the state food aid, stands empty.

A year ago, the crops in Buhera had already suffered from drought before being washed away by Idai. This year they risk being burned to a crisp by the relentless sun.

One meal a day

Around 800 kilometres (500 miles) further west, across the border in Zambia, first impressions suggest that the contrast is startling.

The grass is tall, the roads muddy and the fields of maize are a vibrant, healthy green.

In the village of Simumbwe, an hour and a half's drive south on a dusty road from Kalomo in the





southwest of the country, the rains arrived in late December.

But in the shade of the majestic trees, seated on the red earth, perched in the branches or on oxcarts, hundreds of people wait patiently for food to be distributed by an NGO, World Vision, and the WFP.

Last year, the harvest was catastrophic for the second year running with up to 70 per cent of the crops lost to the drought.

"Last year, I harvested 18 kilos (39.6 pounds) of food. In other words, nothing," said Loveness Haneumba, mother of five and a "happy" beneficiary of aid in Simumbwe.

"It is common that we eat once a day. The children ask me: 'what are we going to eat?' I answer: 'Just wait. Let me look around'."

It is a question of buying time.

For several years, the rainy season has been getting later and shorter, upsetting the traditional farming cycle. It used to be from October to May; now it is barely from December to April.

Most vulnerable

"The food we have here is not enough to cater for everyone," said Derick Mulilo, the World Vision food monitor in the yard of the school in Simumbwe. "We are focussing on the most vulnerable."

He meant people like Loveness Haneumba and her stunted children. Her six-year-old daughter looked four and her four-year-old had the appearance of a two-year-old toddler.

Lizzy Kayoba, another mother of a large family, also featured on the list of beneficiaries. She had walked five hours during the night, her youngest on her back, to arrive at dawn for the food handout.

She left with 25 kilos of maize and 7.6 kilos of beans.

"It will last me one or two weeks," she said.

The next distribution at the school is a month away. A teacher, Teddy Siafweba, said about 15 children in his class were absent that day because of hunger. In the classroom next door, about 30 were missing, nearly half of the rollcall of 70.

And those who came often have an empty stomach. Some nod off in class, said another teacher, Tryness Kayuni.

The 33-year-old watched the handout with a heavy heart. She was not one of the 862 beneficiaries. A single mother, Kayuni was not considered a priority as she had a job.

And yet she had not been paid since September. Since then she had been holding out on one meal a day.

"How do I survive?" she said. "I ask my colleagues if they can help me with some food."

Adapt to survive

Funding is desperately needed to meet the needs of the 2.3 million people in Zambia who sorely need food. The WFP has received only a third of the \$36 million required.

Desperate times are prompting desperate, and corrupt, measures.

Thieves steal food supplies and unscrupulous men promise to put women's names on the food list in exchange for unprotected sex.

That is not something that worried single mother Imelda Hicoombolwa, 49, who for the last three years has been one of a number of small farmers who gambled on agricultural diversification, opting for nutritious vegetables and using techniques adapted to climate change.

"Food is not a problem. I have it," she beamed. Before 2017, Hicoombolwa cultivated almost only maize. Today, she harvests cowpeas, which need very little water, as well as peanuts, pumpkins and sunflowers.

"I can make 18,000 kwacha (1,100 euros,

\$1,222) a year. Before, I was making 8 000 kwacha a year," she said.

"Before, the children were missing school because I could not always pay the tuition fees. Not any more."

One big change is that Hicoombolwa no longer rushes to sow from the first rains. The farmers have learned to wait. In the recent past it was a different story, according to Allan Mulando of WFP

"Once they see a drop they plant instead of waiting for the moisture to be good enough," he said.

Rain gauges have helped to change that attitude.

As part of a joint programme launched in 2015 by the UN agency and the Zambian government, 165 rain gauges were distributed to farmers in the Zambian districts most affected by the drought.

They have enabled the villagers to read the conditions and plant at the most propitious moment.

Rain man

Mulando says the rule of thumb is not to plant anything below 20 to 25 millimetres (0.8 to one inch) of rain and to choose seeds that fit the weather forecast.

If a short rainy season is expected, for instance, choose seeds that will germinate quickly.

"If I had had access to this knowledge earlier, I would be relatively rich," said Godfrey Hapaka, a farmer.

"I would have a decent car and my children would not have missed school."

Next to his modest house surrounded by flourishing maize fields, a rain gauge was planted in an enclosure, its value underlined by a brand new screen put in place to protect it.

As soon as it rains, Hapaka, 58, checks the gauge and passes on the rainfall level to his neighbours.

Sadly, the message is often ignored. Hapaka said some of them are "reluctant" to use the information.

"They follow their parents and grandparents," he said. "They are stuck in the past."

Farmers are not the only ones to follow the rainfall closely.

From the Kariba dam on the border between Zambia and Zimbabwe, Geoffrey Chambisha, director of the power station on the Zambian side, watched the water level of the lake. He was worried.

In the 14 years he had been working at the dam, he had never seen it so low.

In early 2020, the water level was 476.61 metres (1,563.68 feet) above sea level. Its lowest level, set in 1996, was 475.93m (1,561.45 feet).

In the absence of sufficient rain, the dam, the main source of electricity in Zambia and Zimbabwe, is expected to operate at only 25 per cent of its capacity in 2020.

Inevitably the two countries are enduring long power cuts, up to 20 hours a day, which is having a knock-on effect on the two economies.

The town of Livingstone, where tourists from all over the world flock to admire the Victoria Falls, has been particularly hit.

"This year has been horrendously bad," said Andrew Murrin, a Briton who runs a six-bedroom hotel. *Sowetan Live*

nlike the western and Asian communities having successful businesses that remain competitive for generations and generations, in Africa, this seems to be a different story.

Businesses normally die with their owners. We have seen situations where a family business would start and strive very well for some time, mainly as long as the owner was still alive, but as soon as he or she died or became sick, things would automatically turn out to be a down fall. The surviving family members would either be entangled in strife for power or riotously looting the entire business out of position.

The question about this could be why does this happen, and how can one avoid it from happening in the future after death or involved in a serious disability? While, the following are some of the common reasons:

Lack of succession plan

Succession planning has always been a challenge among African businesses. Only a few manage this and are safe, but the majority, it's a total failure. African business people mainly fail to have a clear succession plan from one generation to the next as a result, when the bread winner died, the entire business would come to a standstill. Families in Africa should have successful laid out succession plans where the entire family was aware of, so that in case of that anything happened such as death of the breadwinner, life and business would continue. Leaders of family business should learn to read signs of the times and leave the arena for more energetic rivals. Within every family business, no matter how prominent and successful, are the seeds of its eventual demise and destruction.

Selfishness

Most breadwinners do not like teaching their spouses and close family members the business tricks. For example, a man who was also a bread winner dies, living the surviving wife and children without the slightest idea of how the business was run. The entire family would soon lose out and suffer for the rest of their lives.

Poor induction

Unlike the Asians such as the Indians, a first born child would be trained in the family business as soon as he or she was eight years; by the time that child was of age, he would have mastered the entire flow and tricks of the business. In Africa, most parents think teaching their children their business tricks was a share waste of time, instead they would rather take their children to school to master other forms of skills and knowledge especially in the white collar profession. For example, a farmer in Africa would not wish to take his or her child to an agriculture college to become a better farmer, but he or she would prefer taking the child to do medicine. They forget that this was a sheer waste of time and reverting

Underrating their business

Thirdly, most African parents and guardians under estimate their businesses. They don't value them as compared to people from Asian and Western communities (the whites). They just take business as a form of survival and always think other professions were better off. A successful business person in Africa would wish to send his or her child to western schools to acquire knowledge and work for other businesses rather than their own.

Why African family business fails



Starting staying and dying small

Most African businesses were traditional ones, characterised with traditional, old style way of doing things; the usual buy and sell side of things. In most cases, there would be no strategic business model in place which was growth oriented. Instead, they would rather start small, operate small, and eventually die small, these are African businesses. Most Africans fear growth, hence they do and keep things small and simple. They just run businesses with the hope of flowing like water in the river, as long as there was direction of flowing; then it was fine. They forget that any successful business was dynamic in nature with new models which would not be overtaken by younger, and more vigorous, innovative organisations that would sooner or later burst onto the commercial scene.

Did you know that the famous dark Coca-Cola was first developed as medicine to cure morphine addiction and headaches? It was developed by an American Chemist, Dr John S. Pemberton on the 8th of May 1886 in Atlanta, Georgia. Now, this so called medicine has become the most celebrated refreshing drink and successful international brand that exemplifies fun and friendship!

It is therefore the responsibility of a family leader to either preempt the business idea periodically reinventing the organisation by realigning it to its core values or to stay the inevitable for as long as possible by organising for orderly transitions between generations while improving on the idea. The principle of being starting small, remaining small, and die small is in real terms against the biblical teaching of God's commission to Man as it reads in the book of Genesis 1:28 that "Be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth and subdue it, and have dominion" over all creation (Genesis 1:28).

This verse or commission does not only apply to sexual reproductively of humanity but to progressive nature of it because of the subduing which means taking over or competitive. Christian businesses must have the spirit of taking over or competitiveness if they were to survive.

Another biblical verse of business multiplication is the story told by Jesus about the talents as found in the book of Matthew 25:14-30 where the three traders were given money to invest and multiply. The first two were very successful and their master was glad with that, but the third one decided to remain small, hence he buried the money and gave it back to the master, he was very angry with him. He said, you foolish man how could you not multiply the investment, even if it was hard for you; at least you would have deposited the money in the bank for interest purposes (Reads verse 27 of Mathew chapter 25). This could also mean that keeping the money in the bank is the last thing a person should do though there was some interest being accumulated, but the best is to multiply and grow the business.

Poor business structures and systems

One key trait of successful businesses, especially those that have existed through several generations, is the existence of a clear structure and business systems that help the business to operate effectively.

Structure is essential to every well-run business because it provides order, assigns responsibilities for key activities and improves accountability. Many African businesses cannot function independently of the founder. For example, in most African businesses, were family members were also employees, the owner would not be paying them accordingly as 'workers' and not as 'family members'. Another challenge under the structuring and system that have destroyed family members is the management of cash flow. In most cases, family members would be employed including very close ones such as sons and daughters, but whenever, a challenge happened among them that was cash related, the bread winner would just withdraw the money and give the nagging child despite having a salary at the end of the month. This tendency has destroyed many businesses. It is actually lack of discipline in simplest terms. A child or family member working for a family business must get paid accordingly and live within the means, work for the business

and get paid the next pay date if a business was to survive. If it was an urgent issue, then let the owner of the business write a recommendation to the bank in assistance of the family member to borrow money against his or her salary which will be deducted at the end of the month.

Therefore, business systems in a family business are very important as they promoting having policies and procedures that govern everything from recruitment, employee conduct, finance and accounting, among others in the business, unlike the 'chaos', of running a family business on the rule of the jungle principles.

Other factors that contribute to failed African businesses include:

- Luxurious lifestyle- mixing business with
- Not being sensitive to the changes in market dynamics
- Polygamy and family disputes
- Unofficial children who claim rights after the death of the breadwinner
- Jealousy and witchcraft
- · Employing and maintaining family members in strategic positions despite business expansion. For example, making a wife an accountant who pays workers based on her emotions and attitude.
- Failure to have a board of professionals both from within the family and outside the family circles.

Conclusion

While families play a vital role in the starting and running of a family business, the owner of a business must ensure that proper systems and procedures were maintained as means of preserving the business otherwise, family members have the potential to destroy a brilliant and successful busi-

toddler is a child aged between 12 to 36 months (1-3 years). Toddler years are a time of great cognitive, emotional and social development. Other developments include language development, motor development, emotions and self-image, squatting and major learning events.

As toddlers grow day by day, their eating patterns change, majority of toddlers loose appetite and those are the years where they even lose weight because they do not eat hence they are busy with a lot of activities which form part of the development. At this stage, toddlers need close supervision when it comes to food as they may go without food for days. Food presentation is very important at this stage as they may easily lose appetite if food is not appealing to the eye.

Nutrition of toddlers

Nutrition is not only for a healthy body, but also for a mind as well as for a developing and growing child. The meal of a toddler should consist mostly of healthy foods such as lean meats, poultry, sea foods, cereals, legumes and fresh or lightly processed fruits and vegetables.

Toddlers need nutrients such proteins, for growth and development, calcium for strong bones and teeth, vitamins, and minerals.

Toddlers should be given a minimal or limited treats such as sweets and chocolates. The best way to minimise temptations is to keep junk foods out of the house.

Toddlers develop a low appetite therefore a family plays a major role in influencing toddlers to eat healthy meals. Families should come together on time for meals as they provide the opportunity for the child to adapt and learn good eating habits. Dietary habits are shaped at a tender age therefore parents need to play a major role in teaching the child good dietary practices. "Monkey sees monkey does." It is very important for parents to practice good dietary practices so that the toddler learns from them. Eating behaviours established in childhood persist, with implications such as fussiness and poor dietary variety, or high responsiveness to food cues and increased obesity risk. Although eating behaviours and child weight are difficult to modify directly, parental feeding practices are potentially a good target for interventions to prevent unhealthy eating patterns and developing excess weight in children. Parents are influenced, in turn, by their children's behaviors and characteristics. Parents of preschool children have been found to adapt their controlling feeding practices in response to their child's weight: they tend to pressure infants who are lighter and have a smaller appetite, and restrict infants with larger appetites, in particular, if they are bottle-fed.

Toddlers need to learn to drink water rather than fizzy drinks which can lead to obesity.

Points to consider when planning for toddlers

- · Consider the toddler's nutritional need; preferences and allergies
- The appearance of the food (vegetables and fruits need to be shaped such that the toddler can easily eat them)
- The skills of the cook
- Time available
- · Cost of the food
- Is the food balanced
- Make a menu Plan food in season as they are cheaper

- Plan at least one meatless meal a week Enjoy grains more often
- Avoid highly seasoned food
- Plan to use left overs
- Know what the toddlers like to eat

Problems in feeding toddlers

- Eating only certain types of foods
- Refusing to eat vegetables
- · Refusing to chew
- Taking a long time to eat and keeping food in the mouth
 - They choose their foods (some want the

same food everyday)


- Toddlers are afraid of trying new foods
- Holding some of the foods in hostage (using a chocolate as a reward for eating raw carrots, the toddler learns that the dessert must be a better way than veggies)
- Not including your child in the conversation(if toddler gets attention and feels like he or she belongs, they then develop social skills and good table manners
- Leaving the television on during feeding(toddlers need to focus on their food)

How to solve the feeding challenges

- Give the toddler the food he/ she likes for
- Take advantage of snack time, gradually introduce the eating of fruits cut appropriately for the toddler to eat and swallow without chok-
- Maintain the feeding time
- Avoid starch foods that will fill the toddler up without providing much nutrients
- Variate foods, change the methods of cooking the food
- Phase out junk and treats in the house to minimise temptation

AWS have held a number of Spay Clinics in the last seven years and a lot of the dogs had TVT. Transmissible Venereal Tumor (TVT) occurs in dogs and is a tumor of the external genitalia which rarely affects the mouth or nose. It is spread by sexual activity or social behaviour. It is also known as Sticker tumor or infectious sarcoma and is one of only three known transmissible cancers.

TVT is so successful because the tumors themselves are the infectious agents. The malignant tumor cells from one dog are transferred to another during copulation and by licking, biting and sniffing tumor affected areas.

Generally direct contact is not a highly efficient mode of disease transfer, but TVT thrives in domestic dogs where a single male can produce dozens of litters over his lifetime, allowing the tumor to affect many more females than it could in a monogamous species. *One male dog can infect 20 or more females*. The tumor does not often metastasise (spread to other parts of the body) except in puppies and immunocompromised dogs. When it spreads, it can spread from lymph nodes to the skin, brain, eye, liver, spleen, testicle and muscle.

What to watch for

- · A visible mass on the penis or vagina.
- The tumor often has a cauliflower-like appearance and ranges in size from small (5 millimetres) to a large mass (greater than 10 centimetres). The surface is often ulcerated and inflamed and bleeds easily.
- Blood dripping from the penis or vagina.
- Frequent licking of the genitalia.

In some cases the dog may not be able to pass urine because of a blockage of the urethra.

 Similar masses in the mouth or nose and nosebleeds or other nasal discharge.

Transmissible Venereal Tumor (TVT)



Diagnosis

Biopsy by a qualified veterinarian is necessary for diagnosis.

Treatment

Tumors may be removed by surgery but surgery may be difficult due to the tumor locations and tumors often recur. However, the prognosis for a complete remission with chemotherapy is excellent. Treatment is dangerous and must only be undertaken by a qualified veterinarian. If treatment is incorrectly given, the chemicals that destroy tumor cells will destroy the dog's healthy, normal cells.

Prevention

TVT is most commonly seen in tropical and subtropical climates in large populations of sexually active stray dogs. *Spay or neuter your dog* and do not allow exposure to unknown dogs. If symptoms occur after sterilising, it

simply means that the dog was infected before the operation. Treatment is straightforward and a full recovery can be expected. In their natural wild state, canids are rarely affected by this disease because their populations are more spaced and their social behaviours more regulated. It is the way we keep and breed dogs in domestication that makes them prone to this ugly, painful and sometimes terminal cancer. Don't be responsible for inflicting this horrible disease on your dogs. Sterilise all dogs by six months of age!!


eople have the right to expect the food they eat to be safe and suitable for consumption. Food borne illness and foodborne injury are at best unpleasant; at worst, they can be fatal.

But there are also other consequences. Outbreaks of food borne disease can damage a country's health image, and lead to loss of earnings, unemployment and litigation. Food spoilage is wasteful, costly and can adversely affect business and consumer confidence.

In Eswatini, as is the case in many developing countries, there has been a tremendous growth in the trade of street vended foods. This informal trade, although still illegal in our country, has continued despite local authorities employing marshals to detain traders in an effort to try and curd its growth.

This then raises a policy question of how effective it is to out-law the trade. Given the socio-

economic changes that our society has gone through, it time to reconsider such a policy stance. The better approach, in my opinion, is to allow such trade and put in place such controls as to guard against harm to the health of our people. Increase in population and urbanisation continues fuel the growth of street vending of foods. This informal trade is a source of livelihood for a large number of low income workers and the urban poor. Besides, it provides a chance of self-employment and income for a lot of the families of the traders, especially

women headed homes.

In a effort to contribute to the improvement of the safety of street vended foods the Swaziland Standards Authority (SWASA) has, in consultation with all relevant stakeholders, developed the national standard SZNS CODEXSTAN CAC/GL 22 Guidelines for design of control measures for street vended foods. This standard lays a firm foundation for ensuring food hygiene. It recommends a HACCP-based approach wherever possible to enhance food safety as described in the Recommended

International Code of Practice – General Principles of Food Hygiene. The standard is commended to Government, Municipalities, industry (Including primary producers) and consumers as it provide provisions to be considered when elaborating street food control measures. The ultimate aim is to assist relevant authorities in upgrading the operation of the street food industry to ensure that the population has wholesome, safe and nutritious foods in accessible places.

This is a very practical and easy to follow standard. It has clear provisions for location, equipment, facilities, maintenance and cleaning, waste management and sanitation. Control operation provisions include cooking and handling, serving food and handling of unsold foods. All key aspects of hygiene control systems are outlined. Of key importance, which is also provided for in the standard, is the personal health of the vendors (Food Handlers). Food handlers should be of a good health status and personal cleanliness.

SWASA provides standards-based training. Relevant authorities can engage the organisation to train them and the vendors on the requirements of the standard. In collaboration with other partners, materials can be developed to better communicate to food handlers, who are mostly semi literate, the aspects of hygiene and food safety provisions of the standard.

Putin said that the traditional definition of marriage as being between a man and a woman should be added to the Russian constitution, adding that under his leadership Russia would not adopt terms such "parent number 1" and "parent number 2."

Putin made the comments last Thursday at a meeting to discuss Russian constitutional reform. During a discussion on family values in Russia, conservative lawmaker, Olga Batalina, said that some people would like the word "family" to be defined in the constitution as a "union of a man and a woman."

"We need to clarify some things. A marriage is a union of a man and woman," Putin responded. "A family is a different thing, but the idea is right and it should be supported. We need to only think about how to formulate it and where."

Batalina also claimed that the family is under attack from attempts to introduce new terms like "parent number one" and "parent number two."

"This is not fantasy, this is reality in some countries," she said.

Putin responded: "As for 'parent #1' and 'parent #2', I have already publicly said it and I will repeat it once more: as long as I am president, we will not have parents #1 and #2, we will have 'papa' and 'mamma."

Putin says no to gay 'marriage' in Russia

Last year France passed a law requiring that schools replace the words "mother" and "father" in their documents with "parent 1" and "parent 2." In Italy in 2018, then Deputy Prime Minister, Matteo Salvini, ordered that

the words "parent 1" and "parent 2" be deleted from online government forms and replaced with "mother" and "father."

In 2013 Putin signed a bill to outlaw the promotion of homosexuality, "same-sex mar-

riage," and Gay Pride parades throughout the Russian Federation. The law imposes stiff fines or prison terms for spreading "propaganda of nontraditional sexual relations." He also supported measures to stop same-sex couples "married" overseas from adopting children in Russia.

Boy Mamabolo apologises to Malema for 'false' abuse allegations

IMPOPO - ANC MP Boy Mamabolo has apologised to Economic Freedom Fighters leader Julius Malema and his wife, Mantoa, for abuse allegations.

As the EFF was demanding that FW De Klerk leave Parliament before Ramaphosa's address, Mamabolo stood up on a point of order and said the House was being abused, in the same manner that Malema's wife was allegedly being abused. During the SONA debate on Tuesday, Mamabolo

again repeated the allegations.

Mamabolo said he raised the question to Malema because of Ramaphosa's call on MPs to expose gender-based violence.

He started getting messages from "jealous" friends called 'Friends of Mantoa' telling him about the alleged abuse since November last year.

"I was therefore actually wrong to raise the matter in public without consulting with you as my former family friends to verify these false allegations from jealous friends of Mantoa.

"I would like to take this opportunity to apologise and retract the insensitive statements that I have made in Parliament and outside regarding

gender-based violence which was allegedly happening in your household.

"I humbly request you to accept my sincere apology, I wish you a Happy Malema Family (as I've always did) jealous must never break you, stay strong my comrades (sic)."

On Thursday, Malema denied ever abusing his wife or any other woman, and vowed to resign as an MP and president of the EFF should anyone provide evidence proving otherwise.


STAY IN CHINA

OHANNESBURG - The desperate parents of students stuck in China because of the coronavirus outbreak there called for the immediate evacuation of their children during a meeting with government departments and the Free State premier in Bloemfontein on Wednesday. The government, however, insists that the Chinese authorities should be left to handle South Africans based there. The international relations and cooperation department's Director of Consular services Chris Chetty told the assembled parents that government was working with China to ensure the safety of South Africans in that country and had established a 24-hour helpline.

"There are 197 South Africans in Hubei Province and we have spoken to 122 of them, who say they are safe—apart from anxiety— and are better off in China rather than being moved to other states, since China has better medical services," he said.

Chetty said South Africa would be following the advice of the World Health Organisation (WHO), which had advised that people not be evacuated. The national health department's Deputy Director-General Dr Yogan Pillay, told parents that China's efforts in dealing with the coronavirus outbreak were commendable. "They have taken all the measures to make sure there are less chances of those from outside being affected. We are guided by WHO.

Mpianzi's family wants those guilty of wrongdoing charged

However, two hours before it was due to be released, the department postponed it, saying it would be "insensitive" to release it without the family's blessings. Levitt said the family was struggling to come to terms with Enock's death, adding they were in a bad state. *Daily Mail*

FOCUS ON LESOTHO'S PRIME MINISTER'S MURDER CHARGES

LESOTHO PM LEAVES COUNTRY AS MURDER CHARGES LOOMS

Minister Thomas Thabane has failed to appear in court to face charges of murdering his estranged wife in 2017.

An aide and Mr Thabane's son say the 80-year-old leader is receiving treatment in neighbouring South Africa.

His current wife Maesaiah Thabane has already been charged with the murder.

Mr Thabane would be the first African leader to be charged with a domestic murder while in office, in a case that has shocked the tiny mountain kingdom. He has not commented on the allegations.

He was expected in court at 09:00 local time (07:00 GMT) to face murder charges, reports the Reuters news

"He is not attending court, he has gone for a medical check up in South Africa," his personal secretary Thabo Thakalekoala told news agency AFP, adding that it was a "routine" medical

a public ceremony in 2017

Mr Thabane said on state radio on Thursday that he had served the nation "diligently" and he would retire at the end of July. "I've worked for a peaceful and stable Lesotho. Today... at my age, I have lost most of my energy," he was quoted as saying.

He did not mention the allegations against him. The ruling All Basotho Convention had given him a deadline of Thursday to resign.

The characters at the heart of Lesotho's murder drama home in the small village of ASERU-The wife of the prime minister of Lesotho

has been formally charged in court with murdering his previ-

It is the latest twist in a story that has garnered huge international interest with its mix of power and intrigue. But who are the four characters at the centre of this drama?

Maesaiah Thabane - The accused

Many years ago, she gave up a village life to go and find work in the capital, Maseru.

This is where the 42-year-old met her future husband, Prime Minister Thomas Thabane, who is nearly twice her age. Sometime after Thabane had separated from his then-wife Lipolelo Thabane in 2012, Maesaiah began living with him and took on the duties of a first lady.

In 2017, a colourfully dressed Maesaiah accompa-

nied him to his inauguration for a second term_ as prime minister. This was just two days after Lipolelo

gunned down. Two months later she became Thabane's third wife, marrying the prime minister in a Catholic ceremony held at a packed stadium in Maseru.Since then, Maesaiah has been repeatedly accused of having undue influence over the government, accusations that her husband

Lipolelo Thabane - The victim

According to a friend, she was the exact opposite of the woman accused of murdering her - a quiet and unassuming woman who played the role of a traditional housewife.

"She accommodated all the Thabane clan and family, and adopted the four children from the prime minister's first mar-

riage. One child was autistic. She raised all of them and gave them the best schooling," said the

has denied.

friend, who spoke to the BBC on condition of anonymity.

Lipolelo proved to be a fighter when Thabane filed for divorce, challenging the decision in court.

"She was prepared to accept that he had another woman, but divorce was out of the question because she did not want to lose the benefits that come with being a first lady," the friend added.

Her life ended brutally on June 14, 2017 at the age of 58. She was shot dead at close range on the side of a dirt road while returning to her

Ha'Masana on the outskirts of Maseru.

At the time of her death, she was still fighting divorce proceedings, even though she had been living apart from her husband for five years. Two years earlier, during her husband's first term in office, she had won a court battle to continue to be recognised as Lesotho's first

A court overturned an instruction Thabane gave to his officials to cancel Lipolelo's spousal benefits and instead offer them to Maesaiah, who had been living with the prime minster as if she was his wife.

Thomas Thabane - The husband

Prime Minister Thabane, 80, is known as a strategic operator but did not anticipate this scandal that may spell the end of his political career. He has also been questioned in connection with Lipolelo's murder but has made no comment on the case. In 2017, he described it as a "senseless killing".

He divorced his first wife, Yayi, before marrying Lipolelo and then Maesaiah.

Thabane is one of the continent's oldest leaders and has spent most of his working life as a politician No stranger to political rivalry,

Thabane once fled to South Africa, alleging a coup plot by the military and had to be escorted back by the police to the mountain kingdom.

Holomo Molibeli - The police-

He is Lesotho's most senior policeman, and it is his investigation that has placed the prime minister and his current wife at the centre of a murder case that could bring about their downfall.

He implicated the couple in court papers filed to stop Thabane from removing him from his post.

Court documents seen by the AFP News Agency contained a letter from Mr Molibeli

to the prime minister dated December 23, 2019.

In it he wrote: "The investigations [into

the murder] reveal that there was a telephonic communication at the scene of the crime in question... with another cell phone... The cell phone number belongs to you."

But Thabane has in turn accused Mr Molibeli of presiding over a brutal police force saying that was the reason he wanted him gone.

How did the murder take place?

ipolelo was gunned down at close range on the side of a dirt road while returning to her home in a small village on the outskirts of the capital, Maseru. She was involved in bitter divorce proceedings with Thabane when she was killed.

At the time, the prime minister was living with Maesaiah, 42, as if she were his wife.

But Lipolelo had already won a separate legal battle to be recognised as First Lady, rather than Maesaiah. Maesaiah accompanied Thabane to his inauguration, following his estranged wife's death.

Two months later she and Thabane

got married in a Catholic ceremony held at a packed stadium in Maseru.

Maesaiah posed for photographers at the prime minister's residence earlier this week

Maesaiah was charged with her rival's murder on February 5, and is out on bail of about \$67 (£52). She has also been charged with the attempted murder of a family friend Thato Sibolla, who was with Lipolelo at the time of the shooting and is expected to be a key witness in the murder case.

Maesaiah has not yet been asked to enter a plea.

If Thabane tries to flee justice, we will issue arrest warrant

ASERU - If it is established that Lesotho Prime Minister Thomas Thabane is trying to flee justice, then the police will issue an arrest warrant, the country's deputy police commissioner said yester-

The officer was speaking after Thabane failed to appear in court in connection with the killing of his first wife. Thabane was due in court at 9 a.m. (0700 GMT) over the death of Lipolelo Thabane, who was shot dead in June 2017 near her home in the capital Maseru two days before he took office. But the 80-year-old leader did not appear. Police said on Thursday that Thabane was to be charged with Lipolelo's murder.

Thabane's current wife, Maesaiah Thabane, 42, has already been charged with ordering the killing but is currently out on bail. "He has gone to South Africa to see a doctor," Thabane's son Potlako said by telephone. "He's not fled the country," he added.

Thabane's Private Secretary Thabo Thakalekoala said the prime minister would be back in Lesotho some time this weekend. Lipolelo, then 58, and Thabane were going through an acrimonious divorce at the time of her death, when an unknown assailant shot her dead in her car.

Maesaiah and Thomas Thabane, who married two months after Lipolelo's killing, have denied any involvement in her death. Reuters

Tight police presence outside Court ahead Thabane's appearance

ASERU - Lesotho police maintained a strong presence at the Maseru Magistrates Court yesterday morning where Prime Minister Tom Thabane appeared.

Thabane was expected to be charged with murder, attempted murder, and malicious damage to

His supporters were also gathered in Maseru to rally behind the embattled prime minister.

Police Spokesperson Mpiti Mopeli said: "Police are deployed around Maseru Magistrates Court where the prime minister will appear in court today." EWN

Supporters to rally around embattled Thabane at court appearance

ASERU - Supporters of Lesotho Prime Minister Tom Thabane gathered at the Maseru Magistrates Court where he was expected to appear and be charged with the murder of his estranged wife, Lipolelo.

Some of those supporters have said they are viewing the action as an affront to Thabane, who is facing calls to step down.

On Thursday, he made another statement saying that he would retire by the end of July or earlier.

Thabane is expected to appear between 8am and 9am and by that time both the courtroom and the premises are expected to be full.

However, it's now clear that Prime Minister Thabane's NEC was taken by surprise when he appeared on government's Radio Lesotho yesterday, saying he would step down by the end of July. He did say, however, that he would step down when parliamentary and party processes had been concluded.

ONDON - Queen Elizabeth II had 'grave concerns" about Kate Middleton before she joined the Royal Family, branding her work ethic "unacceptable", a book has revealed.

Amid claims that Meghan Markle and Prince Harry tried to "have their cake and eat it" when it comes to royal life, it appears the Duchess of Cambridge was also accused of a similar thing. Kate, who now has a very good relationship with the Queen, dated Prince William for nearly a decade before they finally tied the knot. It was the Queen who, according to Katie Nicholl's 2011 book 'The Making of a Royal Romance', did not want William to propose to Kate until she was employed.



Scientists have completed a coronavirus vaccine

Greffex, a Houston, Texasbased genetic engineering company, claim they've created a coronavirus vaccine.

The company told the Houston Business Journal that it had completed development of the vaccine and it is ready for animal testing and review by US regulators.

It comes after UK scientists announced they'd begun testing their shot, and researchers at the University of Texas at Austin announced they'd made compound they believe can serve as a vaccine.

Countless scientists around the world are racing to the do the same, though they're taking many different approaches. Developing a vaccine, however, is just the first step toward distributing one. Most estimates suggest that from testing and production it could take between 18 months and two years, though Greffex has not announced its timeline. Greffex said that, for the

EW YORK - Scientists at sake of safety, its scientists did not use any form of the coronavirus itself - either live or inactivated - to make its vaccine. Most vaccine contain either live attenuated virus or an inactive form of the pathogen. However, the coronavirus is so poorly understood, has spread so quickly and has killed enough people that scientists at Greffex did not want to risk exposure that could trigger the life-threatening illness known as COVID-19. Scientists at the genetic engineering company have instead built their vaccine on an adenovirus.

Adenoviruses are among the most common causes of viral respiratory infections, accounting for between two and five per cent of colds.

They're also widely used in the making of vaccines. Other companies are basing their candidate vaccines on ones previously developed during the SARS outbreak but abandoned once the virus subsided within six months.

Putin sacks prominent hardliner

MOSCOW - Russian President Vladimir Putin has fired a veteran, once close adviser Vladislav Surkov who until recently managed Moscow's relations with war-torn Ukraine. Surkov, seen as a hardliner by many in Kiev, was dismissed in a terse two-line statement on the Kremlin website. His sacking, which coincided with a flare-up in fighting in eastern Ukraine, had been rumoured for weeks. The decree was issued a week after the Kremlin said a senior Ukrainian-born Russian official, Dmitry Kozak, was now in charge of managing Moscow's relations with Ukraine, effectively sidelining Surkov.

BEIJING - The Chinese health authority said it received reports of 394 new confirmed cases of novel coronavirus infection and 114 deaths from 31 provincial-level regions and the Xinjiang Production and Construction Corps. Among the deaths, 108 were in Hubei Province and one in Hebei, Shanghai, Fujian, Shandong, Yunnan and Shaanxi, respectively, according to the National Health Commission. Another 1,277 new suspected cases were reported, said the commission. On Wednesday, 1,779 people were discharged from hospital after recovery, while the number of severe cases decreased by 113 to 11,864.





WHY WILDER IS BIGGEST **PUNCHER IN BOXING HISTORY**

ONDON-Midway through the most famous fight in ring history, the most feared puncher of heavyweight boxing's golden age landed the mightiest of all the blows thrown that steamy night in

At which point The Greatest whispered in his ear: 'That all you got, George?


This was the moment when a grizzly bear of a man who had been variously described by his victims as hitting like a sledgehammer, a runaway truck, a steam-hammer and a lightning bolt, knew the game was up.

Minutes later, Muhammad Ali knocked out George Foreman to become the heavyweight champion of the world for the second of three

Against all odds, contrary to all predictions, in defiance of all logic, Big Bad George had been Rumbled in the Jungle.

That knot of Ali's genius not only reeled in the WBC and WBA titles, but also dragged Foreman down the rankings of the heaviest hitters of all

Maybe he was still a bigger puncher than the smaller Rocky Marciano but any argument that he might be more thunderous than the immortal Joe Louis or the decapitating Jack

Ten fights in a mere three years later, Ali stirred the pot once more by pro-

heavyweight

the back of our necks merely to be in the arena as he came out to fight clad in just his black boots and shorts with white towelling over his shoulders, exuding menace.

Our much-loved Frank Bruno packed a wallop of his own but when it came to confronting Tyson a second time, he knew what to expect. On his lonely walk to the ring in Las Vegas, he crossed himself more than 20 times.

The Almighty and the referee took mercy on him within three rounds.

Another valiant Brit, Julius Francis, was flattened five times in less than four minutes. Of the final punch, this 17-and-a-half stones of fighting manhood recalled: "Mike actually lifted me off my feet with that uppercut."

Even when in decline after three years in prison and two defeats by Evander Holyfield, Tyson retained devastating one-punch power.

In the fight after he made a real meal of Holyfield's ear, he was in trouble again, losing the first four rounds against one-time world champion Francois Botha. A single, perfect right hook in the fifth dropped the bull-like South African flat on his face for several minutes.

As Tyson says of himself: "Everyone has a plan until I hit 'em in the mouth."

Not until after he took a savage beating from Lennox Lewis, who has a claim of his own to a place among the top 10 heavy-hitters, did the force finally leave him. Though not with it the many who still revere Iron Mike as the biggest puncher of all.

Now that notion is under modern challenge. Deontay Wilder has emerged from sleepy Tuscaloosa in deep Alabama to challenge all the old preconceptions with the highest KO ratio yet - 95 per cent from 41 brutal stoppages in 43 unbeaten fights. Many have come in the first round, many by one-punch devastation.

That knockout record would be even higher had Tyson Fury not risen from the canvas as miraculously as Lazarus from his death-bed after being dropped unconscious in the last round of their first collision.

It is a cautionary thought for the Gypsy King as he heads from that draw to a second helping that the only other heavyweight to take Wilder the distance, Bermaine Stiverne, was crunched in the first round of their second fight.

Not only that but in another rematch, Wilder has most recently dispatched the dangerous Luis Ortiz for the second time with one explosion of dyna-

So now, as he and Fury prepare tonight's rematch in Las Vegas, discussion rages through the blood fraternity as to whether Iron Mike and the Bronze Bomber have overtaken the legends of yore in the punching stakes and, if so, which of them is the slugger supreme.

Redeemed

This is a complex conundrum. If knockout statistics were all that counted, then Anthony Joshua with a 87 per cent ratio would rank above Dempsey and Tyson among others. Not quite yet, AJ, after just 23 fights including that shock loss, albeit redeemed since, to Andy Ruiz Jnr.

Nor do the win-loss-draw records alone validate mega-hitting power. If they did, Marciano with his unblemished 49 victories, including the stoppage of Joe 'the Brown Bomber' Louis in his last fight, would bestride this

pantheon. If only Shavers had used his powers to flatten the 11 men who beat him.

There are also such issues as the quality of opponents, the strength of each era and career longevity. As well as the ever-increasing size of heavyweights and the ongoing improvements in training, diet and sports science which are producing bigger, stronger, faster behemoths. Nor can this assessment take into account the pound-for-pound power of such fabled punchers down the divisions as Thomas Hearns, Roberto Duran, Marvin Hagler, Prince Naseem Hamed, Gennady Golovkin, Canelo Alvarez or Japanese phenomenon Naoya Inoue who is swatting flyweights for fun.

Manifestly, Tyson or Wilder would obliterate each and every one of them in a heartbeat. Which brings us to the crux of this weighty matter. David Haye, an 81 per cent knockout artist himself who stands alongside Holyfield as one of only two cruiserweight champions to win a world heavyweight title, is in no doubt who is now the mightiest of them all.

"I've sparred with Wilder," he says. "I've felt it. I know. His power is phenomenal. Even in 20-ounce gloves in the gym, he stuns everyone he spars with. He stunned me often. My haymaker is a hell of a right hand and I think I buzzed him once or twice.

ARCELONA - Lewis Hamilton is making Mercedes wait to open contract talks, though he revealed that 'freedom' will be a central demand when negotiations final-

Taking a break from testing in Barcelona, where his Silver Arrow looks ominously fast, the six-time world champion addressed life beyond his current £40milliona-year deal which expires at the end of the coming season.

"We haven't sat down yet," said Hamilton. "I know Toto (Wolff, the team principal) is keen to talk, but right now my focus is on making sure I am fit and ready for the season. The contract is not something I want to get bogged down in at this stage.

A contract extension - or a move to Ferrari - may be worth as much as £60m a year.

But almost as important to Hamilton is a repeat of the light rein he negotiated back in 2017. He is obliged to only do a small number of media duties but has autonomy to pursue outside interests, such as his Tommy Hilfiger designing.

A relaxed Hamilton, 11lb lighter at 11st 5lb after his winter train "People talk about freedom as if it is a bad thing, but it is not at all. Mercedes have allowed me to be who I want to be rather than keep me constricted and ask me to speak a certain way or dress a certain way.

"There were question marks over all the different things I do, but everyone can see the results I have had over the last two years. The flexibility helps me to be more engaged and an even better driver than I thought I could


"It is now about trying to figure out what the next five to 10-year plan is, and how the decision I make now will impact the future.

Jones, whose mother is Japanese-American, learned that his comments had caused shock and incredulity. Having become aware that it may have come across as an accusation of racism, he swiftly met the reporter and said sorry for any offence or misunderstanding. Soon after that, an RFU spokesman said: "Eddie made an off-the-cuff comment which was not intended to cause any offence. He has subsequently spoken to the journalist privately, explaining this and apologised, which was accepted."



The Commission's decision means that neither man will be able to look the other in the eye until they are across one another in the ring on Saturday night.

"In my 25 years in boxing I've never heard of an administrative body stepping in and prohibiting a face off,' Todd duBoef, president of Top Rank told ESPN. "It's the pinnacle moment before the fight. I am just shocked."

The Briton displayed his twinkle toes as he dances in front of the heavy-hitting Wilder yelling: "I am going to pop you like a balloon. I will put everything on it - you are going down.

"I got straight up twice after you hit me with your best shots. You are terrified, your little knees are knocking. When I shoved you across the ring, you flew like a featherweight. "Keep that belt warm for me, get it polished for me." Fury and Wilder meet once again following their blockbuster draw in Los Angeles in December 2018, in which Fury climbed off the canvas twice to see out 12 rounds. Daily Mail

McIlroy cards 65 to lead by two shots from Thomas, Watson

ONDON-Rory McIlroy was in control of all facets of his game as he charged into the first-round lead with a six-under-par 65 at the WGC-Mexico Championship.

McIlroy smashed his drives prodigious distances in the thin Mexico City air and complemented his long game with precise putting in earning a two-shot advantage over Americans Justin Thomas and Bubba Watson at Club de Golf Chapultepec.

"I like this place, like the golf course, and have always played well at altitude for whatever reason that is,' said the world No 1 after capping off his day by sinking a 10-foot birdie at the last. McIlroy won the World Golf Championships (WGC) tournament in Shanghai in November and victory this week would see him

complete the set of all four WGC events. The Northern Irishman has been in stellar form early in the new PGA Tour season, with a tie for fifth in Los Angeles on Sunday his worst result in four starts. Accuracy from the tee is crucial at the tree-lined Club de Golf Chapultepec but McIlroy did not hold back, hitting three drives of more than 365 yards. But it was his putting that pleased him most a week after an ill-fated experiment with a 35-inch model that was slightly longer than his usual putter.

"Once I got out there (last week), that inch difference with the putter moves your eye line and you stop seeing your lines the way you usually do," he said. "I saw the tournament through with it. It didn't work quite the way I wanted so... happy to have old faithful back in the bag and it worked well today."

Joelinton was a club-record buy from Hoffenheim in the summer but his only Premier League goal came in August.


The Brazilian has now gone 23 games without netting and is coming in for fierce criticism from supporters and observers.


RETORIA-Mamelodi Sundowns have improved in their position on the African rankings according to footballdatabase.com.

You also must consider your ability to support your child's participation.

Will you be able to get your child to all practices and games and provide any needed supplies? Being part of a sports team or programme has many benefits, but it can also be costly. Your family will need to commit money, time, and resources, such as transportation. If your budget is limited, ask the programme organisers if fees can be waived or reduced. You might also be able to borrow equipment or buy gently used uniforms.

When they're playing sport, children learn to lose. Being a good loser takes maturity and practice. Losing teaches children to bounce back from disappointment, cope with unpleasant experiences and is an important part of becoming resilient.

Playing sport helps children learn to control their emotions and channel negative feelings in a positive way. It also helps children to develop patience and understand that it can take a lot of practice to improve both their physical skills and what they do in school.

To keep your child interested and enjoying sport, make it a positive experience for them. Focus on having fun, having a go and being active, rather than winning or losing.

You can help your child develop a positive sporting attitude by praising the team's or other children's efforts, even if they don't win. Point out to your child how important it is to try and do their best.

LOCAL SENSATION

WEEKEND TRAINING RIDES

The past Saturday Newcom Wheels and Inyatsi Cycling Club did a joint circular three hour training ride which started at Lozitha to Lobamba and back. Thanks to Inyatsi for joining us. This was very common in

the past when competition was still not as rife as it is now. Most teams don't want to expose their training to the next team. We are hoping that today we will be joined by another team as we tackle the Mankayane hills all the way to Sicunusa and back. The ride will resume at Mhlabubovu.

ALTITUDE TRAINING

Technically, I would I like to touch briefly on altitude training. Recently we went to do the Barberton MTB Race and as we rose up the 10km Plus hill it became more and more difficult because the air was getting thinner and thinner. Because our training was not at that height above sea level we were struggling to process the air with less oxygen. I have seen our national team struggling when we went to compete in Lesotho long ago and again in Rwanda. As a coach it is important that when you are leading your team to a race that is at high altitude you prepare your troops for it.

You have options available firstly it is to take your athletes to train at an area with a similar altitude for



body adapting to racing at that level. Another option is simulation. You can use an altitude simulation tent or room. Another option is to use a mask which which lessens the oxygen during training.

Locally our highest points are in places like Pigg's Peak or Bulembu where we can take teams for training camps in prep for international competitions.

LOSING WEIGHT THROUGH CYCLING

Many a time I have been asked if cycling is good for weight loss and since I am not a good example for this people keep asking me why I'm not lean yet I cycle a lot. Firstly let's explain that

10 to 14 days which will lead to the cycling is a cardiovascular exercise and that means that it burns calories. If you increase distance you burn more calories and it speeds metabolism which then eats into the fat cells. I have started to ride consistently and already I have shed some kilograms. My aim is to lose at least seven kilograms by mid year and already I have a plan aligned with my goal.

The trick is not to overindulge in food. You cannot burn calories and then eat way more than your body needs.

My advice to those who wish to lose weight are as follows;

■ Be consistent and aim to do long rides on the weekend which are over three hours.

Join a club so that you commit to a group who will always encourage you when it gets tough.

■ Build mileage gradually so that you don't burn out and be unwilling to return

Make hills your friend. As a matter of fact you burn more calories when climbing than flats or downhills.

We would like to also request our supporters to open accounts with the bank that support football and to also use all services provided by the EswatiniBank.


