EEC EMPLOYEES TO BE PAID BONUSES THIS WEEK

ESWATINI Electricity Company (EEC) employees will be smiling all the way to the bank this week as they will be paid their performance bonuses.

This is contained in a communiqué dated February 24, 2020 sent by the company's General Manager for Corporate Services Noncedo Mamba to all staff members.

The memo stated that following another com-

muniqué issued by EEC's management to employees in November 2019 regarding the performance bonus for 2018/19 financial year, the management resolved to grant the employees same. The communiqué further stated that all eligible employees will be paid by Friday this week, as all due processes are already underway.

Currently, EEC has 793 employees.

However, the bad news conveyed by the same message was that employees who are members of the Swaziland Electricity Supply Maintenance and Allied Workers Union (SES- MAWU) will not be paid a dime since they had participated in a strike action that was deemed unlawful by the High Court.

The court issued an order directing the union's members to desist from participating in the unlawful strike action and return to work. Some of these heeded the order while others continued nonetheless. The push factor that led the employees to downing their tools and striking was that for two years they had been waiting for adjustments in their salaries as was promised through the call for the aligning of their salaries. Led by SESMAWU, which represents those

who are unionised, the employees had been calling for the effecting of their salary alignment, something which was prescribed by Circular No. 3 of 2016.

When sought for comment on the matter, EEC's Head of Marketing and Corporate Communications Khaya Mavuso declined to comment on the matter, citing that it was between the employer and employees.

Similarly, SESMAWU's Secretary General Maureen Nkambule could not be reached for comment as her phone was unavailable on the network.

'FREEZE NHLANGANO-SICUNUSA ROAD BUDGET'

This was after the Minister of Public Works and Transport Chief Ndlaluhlaza Ndwandwe in his preamble of the annual performance report had also raised concern on the state of unfinished roads across the country.

"The ministry is concerned about the state of

MPs Robert Magongo, Musa Ngcobo and Mabulala Maseko seconded each other that the budget for the road be frozen pending finalisation of the audit.

MPs threaten to cut works' budget over E1 billion civil aviation allocation

ON the other hand, the MPs threatened to cut the budget for the ministry of public works and transport after discovering that almost half of the ministry's budget goes to civil avi-

The lawmakers have given the minister of works and public transport 48 hours to give an explanation justifying why the civil aviation receives an allocation which is almost half of the ministry's budget, leaving other departments to share the remainder.

First to raise a concern was Lobamba Lomdzala Member of Parliament Marwick Khumalo who pointed out that the total allocation that goes to the civil aviation amounted to close a billion when the ministry had a budget of E2.4 billion.

"This ministry is all about or exists for the civil aviation, when you look at the book of estimates

on page 169, the civil aviation gets E459 059 139. Again on page 170 you will notice under head 53 that the civil aviation authority will get E135 million while the subvention to the Royal Swazi Airways amounts to E322 560 000, almost E1 billion goes to the civil aviation alone yet we do not have aircrafts but only one. If you can only share E100 million of that amount and use it to fix the roads and the plants it can have meaningful results in the communities," he said.

MP Khumalo said the budget for the ministry was skewed and needed to be reviewed or the minister had to justify it.

Similarly, Motshane MP Robert Magongo who chairs the committee said they may be forced to cut the civil aviation budget if the ministry did not give convincing responses.

Magongo wanted to know how many Emaswati

were employed by the civil aviation to justify the allocation.

The legislators then gave the ministry two days to come with responses to the questions that were posed by the politicians.

MPs concerned Buganu ceremony being ridiculed on social media

MTSAMBAMA MP Simosonkhe Shongwe has urged the ministry of home affairs to protect the image of the Buganu Festival, which was being ridiculed on social media.

The MP made this request during the House of Assembly portfolio committee debate of the ministry of home affairs annual budget performance yesterday. Shongwe said it was concerning that such a significant cultural event was being urned into a joke on social media as people posted discriminatory pictures and videos of individuals in compromising situations.

He said this was not good for the image of the country and the ministry should consider invoking a law that would guard against such bad publicity for the cultural event.

Lobamba Lomdzala MP Marwick Khumalo said the brew was the country's refreshment of choice and was pivotal in bringing people together.

However, he echoed Shongwe's sentiments in that the event was being treated as a joke and the ministry needed to do something about the social media comments as it was a cause for concern.

He also advised the public to respect the event and refrain from unbecoming behaviour.

STOP CHURCHES SELLING' PRAYERS - MPs

MEMBERS of Parliament have expressed displeasure with the growing trend of churches seemingly selling breakthroughs and blessings in the name of God.

As the custodian ministry for religious activities, the ministry of home affairs has been tasked with addressing the issue, as these churches have been accused of taking advantage of vulnerable Emaswati.

This was revealed yesterday during the debate in the House of Assembly for the ministry of home affairs' annual budget performance report.

Business

While making his submissions, Ndzingeni MP Lutfo Dlamini reminded Minister Princess Lindiwe of her pledge made to His Majesty the King that if she was given the chance to be the minister of home affairs, she promised to sort out the issue of churches being run as busi-

"Since you have been in office for some time, are you happy about what is going on in most of the churches around the country, which are being run as private businesses," enquired Dlamini.

He said there were a number of questionable things happening in the churches around the country.

He said there was something wrong with the manner in which churches were being run, and he was concerned that it was no longer according to the Bible.

The MP said a number of these churches were taking advantage of the country's citizens, as there was a high prevalence of unemployment and promised them breakthroughs, as well as pro-

"Nowadays' churches freely adver-

tise and state that if people wanted to have breakthroughs and find employment as well as promotions, they should come to them. I seriously do not think this is according to the Bible," he said.

He further stated a that new breed of men of God were seemingly in business as they were collecting considerable amounts of money through offerings and pledges with the promise of securing employment for members.

Promise

MP Dlamini also stated that there was a serious concern of money laundering taking place in these churches, as they were not taxed nor audited.

He added that Emaswati as a nation were becoming gullible since a majority of them were desperate as they were unemployed. He said when such churches call them, they would come running to them. Dlamini said there was also a concern regarding where members of the public were supposed to report these churches after they have offered their hard earned money and did not get what they were promised.

Manzini North MP Macford Nsibandze seconded Dlamini and said of late. Christianity was the most confused religion. He said there was a need to protect the religion as history indicated that people died for this religion and now it was being made to look like a joke.

"This religion has come a long way and there were a lot of bad periods where people were killed for their beliefs," he said.

He stated that nowadays there were a lot of born again thugs, who were using the Word of God for their own gain, as any lazy person with a suit could now open a church. He also requested the minister to address the matter as things were now getting out of hand.

The Ndzingeni MP requested the minister to embark on a background check of all the churches in the country to determine which churches were still true to the Word of God, so that the public would be aware of which churches they needed to avoid.

He also requested the minister to provide Parliament with a detailed report of the right churches which still preached the true Word of God, as well as the private businesses posing as houses of God and allegedly involved in defrauding the nation and promoting money laundering.

Speed up 24-hour border operation - MPs

MEMBERS of Parliament have requested the ministry of home affairs to speed up negotiations for the 24-hour operation of the Ngwenya Border Gate.

The legislators have requested the ministry of home affairs to provide them with an update regarding the meeting they had with South Department of Home Affairs regarding the 24-hour border operation. They also requested the minister to consider requesting for opening the border at 5am, while in the process of the negotiations.

MP Prince Mfanawemakhosi enquired what the delay in the negotiations was as the border gate was the busiest port of entry in the country, and the need for its 24-hour operation was important.

In her response, the Minister of Home Affairs Princess Lindiwe said the delay was not caused by them as a ministry. She said following the negotiations, both countries decided to select a committee comprising members from both countries.

She, however mentioned that the South African government decided to establish 10, one-stop border gates and the Ngwenya border gate was included in the list, which has resulted in the delay in effecting the 24 hour operation.

He however said the two countries were currently in the process of negotiating for opening the border gate at 6am, while waiting for the finalisation of the one-stop border gate which would also result in the 24 hour operation of the bor-

On another matter, MP Nokuthula Dlamini requested the ministry to finalise the settlement of overtime claims owed to the immigration staff which was long overdue.

She also requested the ministry to consider reviewing the immigration staff's salaries, as they worked even on the weekends yet they were at the same scale as other employees.

She also said the ministry needed to finalise the payment of overtime hours dating back to 2010 for truck drivers who worked during national events.

"There was also a need to consider the rotation of staff so that the immigration personnel would also enjoy the benefits of not working during holidays and on weekends," she said. She added that the immigration staff was working under duress, as they have not been provided with uniforms for a considerable period.

In her responses, the minister said as a ministry they were not happy about the non-payment of the emplyees overtime. She stated that they included the invoice for settling salary arrears in the ongoing process under the ministry of health to settle all government arrears and they were hopeful that once the process was complete, they would settle the owed overtime claims for the ministry's staff.

Former Egyptian President Mubarak dies aged 91

CAIRO - Former Egyptian President Hosni Mubarak - ousted by the military in 2011 - has died in Cairo at the age of 91.

Mubarak spent three decades in office before a popular uprising swept Egypt.

He was found guilty of complicity in the killing of protesters during the revolution. That conviction was overturned and was freed in March 2017.

His death was confirmed by Egyptian state news yesterday. Earlier in the day, the Al-Watan website reported that he died at a military hospital.

Mubarak underwent surgery in late January and was photographed with his grandson as he recovered.

On Saturday, however, Mubarak's son, Alaa said the former president remained in intensive care.

Born in 1928, Mubarak entered the air force as a teenager and went on to play a key role in the 1973 Arab-Israeli

He became president less than a decade later, following the assassination of President Anwar Sadat, and played a

key role in the Israel-Palestinian peace

But despite the billions of dollars in military aid Egypt received during his time in office, unemployment, poverty and corruption continued to grow.

Discontent boiled over in January 2011, after similar protests in Tunisia led to the overthrow of the president there. Mubarak was forced to step down 18 days later.

Just over a year after Mubarak's overthrow, Mohamed Morsi, an Islamist politician, won Egypt's first democratic presidential election.

The new president lasted less than a year in office. Amid mass protests, he was ousted in a military coup led by General Abdel Fattah al-Sisi.

Gen. al-Sisi went on to win two presidential elections. Morsi died in prison

In 2012, Mubarak was sentenced to life imprisonment over the deaths of some of the 900 protesters who were killed by security forces during the uprising a year earlier.

Both he and his two sons were also convicted of corruption.

But the more serious charges against Mubarak were later overturned and he was released in 2017.

Need to establish a critical skills assessment board - MP Nsibandze

THE ministry of home affairs has been urged to establish a critical skills assessment board to reserve local job opportunities for qualifying Emaswati.

Manzini North MP Macford Nsibandze has noted that there was a serious issue of qualified local young people, who were struggling to find employment, while positions such as teachers and psychotherapists were occupied by foreign nationals.

This was during the debate of the annual budget performance report of the ministry of home affairs by the House of Assembly portfolio committee yesterday.

The MP revealed that it was not easy for Emaswati to secure employment in other neighbouring countries, for instance South Africa, where there was a need for an aspiring job applicant to have a unique skill that was in short supply in that

He said it was not easy for locals to attain jobs such as bricklaying, teaching as they were reserved for qualifying locals, yet in the kingdom these jobs were mainly occupied by foreign individuals, especially in private schools.

"It was okay in the past when we did not have qualified personnel but not now where there are qualified personnel that should be prioritised for the available jobs," he said. He also stated that the local youth had the skills to combat unemployment, and urged the ministry to prioritise the establishment of the board to protect the available jobs for the locals.

SIX days past their pay-day the Raleigh Fitkin Memorial (RFM) Hospital staff have not received their salaries.

The issue of unpaid salaries has left the employees fuming after they were told that their salaries would be delayed. This matter is not new to the health institution as it has occurred in the past, with employees getting paid way after payday. Initially, this was attributed to problems at the hospital.

According to Chairperson of a tripartite, which includes the Swaziland Health Institutions and Allied Workers Union (SHIAWU) Geina Tsela, the employees had still not received their salary payment as of yesterday.

Tsela added that days later manage-

ment issued a memorandum summoning all heads of department to a meeting to address the matter.

He mentioned that they were told that the institution not have any money as all accounts had been frozen due to being-highly in debt.

He went on to mention that it did not seem like they were going to reach an amicable agreement with management when it came to the issue. He said the problem was that the management was not transparent with the staff members and failed to communicate such matters on time.

He said instead they waited until after payday before trying to address it.

"We are now used to the way they operate as they then flood us with memorandums hoping that we would comply with what they want to say to us," he said He said no explanation what-

soever was offered to them. He said as a union, they wanted to know what the reasons behind delaying employees salaries were.

Worth noting is that when RFM Chief Executive Officer Ben Simelane was called for comment but he said he would have a word with the employees.

He promised that the salaries would be paid with immediate effect.

The publication further called Director of Health Services Dr. Vusi Magagula, who stated that they were aware of the problems taking place at RFM

"The problem is that the subvention that the institution receives from government is not enough to sustain all its problems," he said.

Magagula added that the problem would be sorted in no time, as they were currently working towards addressing

SA man found dead by roadside

A South African man was found dead by the side of the road at Mafutseni.

He was found by a passer-by next to the road currently under construction between Mafutseni Police Station and Total Filling Station last Thursday.

Information gathered was to the effect that when found, the man was found lying on the ground facing up with his head on a rock as if to cushion it.

He reportedly had no wounds or bruises to show whether he was assaulted, strangled or stabbed, save for some blood that was coming out of his mouth.

Since none of the people who were at the scene seemed to recognise him, the identity of the man was unveiled by the Mafutseni police who searched his pockets and found a South African driver's licence bearing the man's name. Five days later, the man's family followed leads of his disappearance and they ended up in Eswatini, where they were informed that he had been found dead. Sources claimed that the family was expected to report to the Mafutseni Police Station yesterday afternoon. It was further disclosed that a post-mortem to determine the cause, mode and manner of death or to evaluate any disease will be conducted before the end of this week. When sought for comment, Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Superintendent Phindile Vilakati confirmed the discovery of the South African man's body. She also mentioned that the man's family was located and informed about the matter.

Man killed, dumped in forest

A body of an unknown man was found dumped in a forest at Nhlambeni area.

The body, which was already in a decomposing state, was discovered by residents passing by the place where it had been dumped.

One of the residents said judging by the state of the body, it was evident that it had been there for a number of days.

According to the residents of the area, the face of the man is not familiar to them, thus giving credence to speculation that he was not from the area. The deceased wore brown pants and was found without shoes and a top. Residents said the body was placed in an open space on purpose for it to be found by passersby. The body looked to have bruises all over which suggests that he was beaten before meeting his death. Chief Police Information and

Communications Officer Superintendent Phindile Vilakati confirmed the matter, saying there was not much information they had at the moment regarding the identity of the deceased.

Vilakati said the deceased did not have any form of identification on him; hence it was difficult to know who he was, his age and where he came from.

"There was nothing that gave us any lead like an identification document that can help us," she said.

She mentioned that the police were still investigating the matter and were hoping to get leads soon.

ESWATINI Mobile users should be wary of a fake online competition which pops up on the user's device and as per the requirements asks for the user's information, including their bank details.

The bogus online competition popsup on any Eswatini Mobile user's device whilst they are surfing the

It further urges the user to answer all the questions in four minutes and 49 seconds and then give their banking details to claim their lucky gift.

A couple of users reacted on the issue yesterday afternoon, with many of them expressing their rage at the mobile communications company for 'owing' them their smartphones, such as Samsung Galaxy S10, Apple Iphone XS or Samsung Galaxy S9.

"I don't believe Eswatini Mobile would play us like this. I really thought I had won myself a Samsung Galaxy

S10, but I guess it's an early April Fool's," said one user. Some users, on the other hand, said they noted that something was off with the competition the moment it requested for bank details as the final step to claiming the lucrative smartphone.

"I immediately smelt a rat the moment it told me about paying 1\$ to claim my Apple XS which I won by being 'randomly' chosen by Eswatini Mobile.

People should honestly beware of such by now. I just didn't think this type of crime was to such levels in our country," said another user.

When contacted, Eswatini Mobile Corporate Communications Manager Nosipho Shongwe said the company received complaints from the public and made it clear that the competition was bogus and warned users not to fall prey. "We have been receiving complaints since last week from the public about these pop-ups and we warn our customers to not even fall for it. It is fake; and we plead with Eswatini Mobile customers to not give off their information. The last competition we ran was through SMS and it is done," she said.

SON (20) BURNS FAMILY HOME 'AFTER HEARING VOICES'

A family of seven is homeless after their two-bedroom house was burnt to ashes on Saturday morning.

The unfortunate incident that left the Sikhondze family with nothing occurred around 8am. Fikelephi Sikhondze said she was in Durban when her family home was burnt by her 20-year-old son. At the time, the 20-year-old was alone at home.

The young man used petrol and matches to burn the house.

When asked by the family why he burnt the house, he told them that he was following an instruction from voices. The young man used five litres petrol that his mother had purchased to cut grass. He took the petrol and sprinkled it inside the house and on all furniture. He then lit up the whole house and left the homestead. Nothing was saved from the house because by the time the neighbours noticed, the fire had burnt everything. The damage is estimated to be over E200 000. Narrating the incident, Sikhondze's son Sinethemba Dladla said last Friday morning he heard strong voices telling him to burn the family house. At first the young man said he saw three people who want-

ed to kill him.

everywhere he went.

The last straw was when the voices came through a dressing table mirror. The young man according to her mother, who was also narrating the story, broke the mirror which her son said it happened after seeing images of three men who wanted to kill him.

On Saturday morning, the day of the incident, Sikhondze said her brother came home to fetch her five-yearold son along with her other two sons. However, the 20-year-old refused to go with his uncle. "He said there were voices that told him that his uncle wanted to kill him," she said.

After his uncle left, the son threw He said the voices followed him some shoes in a toilet. He said the voices told him that the people who wanted him dead would use the shoes to get to him. After he threw the shoes into the toilet, the young man said the voices told him to burn the family home. Sikhondze said her son proceeded to burn the house. She said amongst the items destroyed included food, clothes and furniture and identity documents. "Currently, we are staying with our neighbours since we cannot use the house," she said.

> The young man that burnt the house was also at home and he stated that after burning the house he did not hear any voices since then.

FAMILY PLEADS FOR HELP

FOLLOWING the fire incident, the Sikhondze family is pleading for assistance from the public.

The family was found at Mahebedla in Mbuluzi. Fikelephi Sikhondze urged the public to assist them since they do not have a home, food and clothes. Sikhondze said she would appreciate if they could also be assisted with building material. This is because they would be unable to rebuild the walls as they are badly damaged, along with the roofing. She also pleaded for clothes as everything inside was burnt to ashes. Members of the family include 41-year-old Fikelephi, her two brothers and her three sons aged 20, 18 and five. She also pleaded with the public to as her son. She said she does not feel safe at home anymore following the incident. She fears for everyone, including her son. She asked anyone who might have knowledge of the illness that engulfed her son to assist him. Sikhondze said she had suspected in the past that her son had mental challenges but after Saturday she realised that he needed help. "The only problem I have is that I do not know where to seek help for my son, she said. She added that her son also smokes dagga, which might be a major contributor to the mental episodes.

Property valuation:

COUNCIL EXTENDS OBJECTIONS DEADLINE

THE Municipal Council of Manzini has extended the deadline for viewing of the draft general Valuation Roll and lodging of objections (if any) to Friday 13th March 2020.

The initial deadline was last Thursday (20th February 2020). Being a municipality that cares for its stakeholders, council decided to shift the deadline in order to give property owners more time to inspect the draft Valuation Roll before having it endorsed by her parent ministry, the ministry of housing and urban development. Once endorsed, it will be impossible (as per the Rating Act, 1995) to carry-out any alterations. Council would like to state that, due to reasons beyond her control, delays were experienced in posting the valuation notices in the post office hence some property owners did not find them when they went there to access them. Property owners are informed that the glitches have been rectified and all valuation

notices are now accessible at the post office. Those who have changed their postal addresses but forgot to update their account details with council are advised to approach council's Finance Department as soon as possible and shall be duly

assisted. In terms of the Rating Act, 1995, Council is required to carry-out a valuation of all properties within the urban area every five years. This is referred to as a general valuation and, since property value appreciates, the purpose

is to assess the current value of the properties in order to examine whether or not the city is growing in value terms. It also helps during determination of property taxes (rates) payable by property owners.

...Why it's important that you view the valuation roll

The following are some of the reasons it is important for property owners to get hold of their valuation notices...

- It helps the property owner ascertain accuracy of their details such as name, contact details and location of the property.
- It helps ascertain that sub-divisions effected on the property (if any) have been correctly captured by the Valuers and are accurate on the Valuation Roll.
- It also helps ascertain that the zoning (for example, residential, commercial, semi-commercial) of the property is accurate.

This helps avoid instances whereby a residential property is charged rates at commercial scale or vice-versa.

 It gives the property owner an opportunity to object to the new valuation in the event that they feel it is overvalued or under-valued. An objection form is attached to the valuation notice and must be returned to Council on or before the 13th March 2020. After the deadline has passed, Council compiles a list of all objections and requests the Minister of Housing and Urban Development to set up a Valuation Court for final determination of all the cases. The objecting property owner is invited to present their case before the Valuation Court before a ruling is made.

end at 5pm.

Those interested in selling items of any kind (but not illegal ones) are invited to register with council tomorrow morning at 9am.

Urged

Approximately 100 stalls are available at a fee of E250 for sole traders, E400 for Small and Medium Enterprises and E700 for corporates/companies.

Members of the public are also urged to attend the flea market and spoil themselves to a variety of reasonably priced yet exciting items that will be on display.

Council further pleads with motorists to use alternative routes to their destinations as the portion of Louw Street between Ngwane and Nkoseluhlaza streets will be closed to traffic.

DID YOU KNOW?

■ STREET VENDING WITHOUT COUNCIL'S PERMIT IS A CRIME

Regulated street vending is allowed within the urban area, but it is strictly restricted to the designated areas. A vendor must have a valid trading permit obtainable from council and should only conduct trade at the place permitted to conduct business. Trading outside the allocated area is a violation of council's regulations. The vendor must only sell the goods/wares specified when applying for the perto relocate from one vending site to another without Council's permission.

■ DON'T ALLOW YOUR PET TO ROAM THE STREETS

No person shall keep an animal which is a nuisance or annoyance to other residents within the neighbourhood. If an animal becomes a nuisance to other residents and members of the public, its owner shall have to voluntarily remove it from their

property or council shall be forced to remove it. These may include dogs, cats and other domestic animals.

■ MANZINI CITY ANO-GO-AREA FOR CATTLE

No person shall cause any animal to graze within the urban boundary unless they have been permitted by council.

Animals are also not to be allowed to roam the streets. Any cow, goat or donkey found roaming the city streets (even in the neighbourhoods) will be impounded in the municipal pound and released upon payment of a hefty release fee.

■ YOU WILL BE FINED E50 FOR LITTERING

No person shall deposit any litter or refuse anywhere except at areas designated by Council. A person caught dumping litter at any other place other than a receptacle (garbage bin) shall be fined E50. Failure to pay will result in prosecution. Please deposit litter inside a receptacle NOT near it.

241 caught abusing govt cars, trucks abused daily

GOVERNMENT Vehicle Inspectorate (Anti-Abuse Unit) nabbed 241 civil servants abusing government vehicles last year and collected a paltry E70 030 as fines for misuse.

Government trucks, on the other hand, have become a headache for the Anti-Abuse Unit as they are reportedly abused daily while the state continues to buy trucks even though there is little construction works by government.

The unit believes more civil servants could have been caught for abuse had it not been understaffed or if government had developed a control system for car rentals. It also cites the Road Traffic Act of 2007 as being a stumbling block as it does not give police powers to monitor or curb misuse of government vehicles.

The unit only has four vehicle inspectors, one deployed in each region and four assistant vehicle inspectors deployed in three regions while Shiselweni region has no assistant inspector which means only the inspector is responsible for the entire region.

This is according to the ministry of public works and transport's 2019/2020 annual performance report that has been submitted to Parliament.

While government continues to procure vehicles, the unit believes that government fleet is quite large, much against government transport requirement and thus keeping the extra vehicles results in financial

The unit recommends that government should conduct a fleet survey to enhance the allocation of plant and vehicles to the different ministries.

Losses

"The longer government continues to keep the vehicles more than needed, the more financial losses will be incurred," reads the report. The lack of controls and close supervision of the rented vehicles continues increasing financial losses to government.

"The big challenge that the unit reports is that it is facing difficulties in monitoring the use of rented vehicles as information on these vehicles is not shared for identification purposes.

"It is critical that rented vehicles be monitored because they are paid for by government and also draw fuel from the government bowsers. The issue of government trucks is a headache to the Anti-Abuse Unit as it has been mentioned. Not a day passes by without inspectors having to impound a government truck. It is not unusual to see even ministries which have no construction mandate allocated tipper trucks," further reads the report.

The unit also observed that there is an increase in the abuse of vehicles for sporting activities, which the unit feels can only be solved by government.

In an effort to improve the effectiveness and efficiency of the Anti-Abuse Unit, it has embarked in four initiatives. These include: cooperation with the police, merging the Anti-Abuse Unit with the transportation department inspectorate division, data management and outreach campaigns.

The engagement between the ministry and the police is work in progress.

DPM TOLD TO ALLEVIATE UNEMPLOYMENT, POVE

NDZINGENI Member of Parliament Lutfo Dlamini has told Deputy Prime Minister Themba Masuku to forget about carrying out studies.

He felt that the money intended for studies could be used to create employment opportunities and alleviate poverty.

This was after the DPM revealed in his preamble that his office had concluded the vulnerability assessment and analysis which projected that 232 000 people will be food insecure this year.

He said a study on the root causes of violence was launched during the year 2019, which aimed at profiling perpetrators of violence and victims with the aim of providing possible solutions.

The Ndzingeni legislator, on the other hand, opined that the main causes of violence were frustration and poverty which could be addressed by even distribution of wealth or resources such that it

reached the people along the streets or rural areas.

"Forget about studies; violence is perpetrated by the high unemployment rate and poverty in the country. People are hungry and frustrated, hence they are violent; address these two and you will see the difference.

The money for these studies could be used in creating opportunities of employment. Our major concern is how is the E24 billion failing to improve the lives of such a small population, this money should reach the ordinary Liswati," said

On another note, the MP advised the DPM to switch the payment of the elderly grants to Mobile Money platforms which he said would be better than the current method.

He cited that remote communities did not have offices yet when the money was sent through Mobile Money, it would be affordable and convenient.

He also said service providers had promised free gadgets for the elderly people should government decide to use Mobile Money plat-

SODVA implementation leads to male suicides - 'Gawuzela'

SIPHOFANENI Member of Parliament Mduduzi 'Gawuzela' Simelane has opined that the implementation of the SODV Act has a negative effect in society as it leads to depression and suicide by men.

Simelane said the Act was also used by married women to deprive their husbands conjugal rights and called for more education and provision of counselling of people to accept effective use of the law.

"There is misuse of this Act and thus its implementation is having

a very negative impact on the ground. I hereby urge your office to be a bit more vigilant in trying to penetrate the minds of Emaswati. It is like we are infusing another culture upon the Swazi culture, there are no more conflict resolutions using dialogue but people rush to invoke the SODV Act," he argued.

Frustrated


Simelane said at times married women deprive their husbands conjugal rights and men will be frustrated because they are afraid to persuade them due to fear of being charged with the SODVA.

He said the Act appeared to be harsh even on the very people it is supposed to protect.

He said there was need for the psychological preparation of the citizens on the Act.

He made an example of a man from his community who he believes committed suicide after he was charged with the SODV Act.

The next time his wife angered him, he decided to take his life allegedly because arguing with his wife would have resulted in him being charged again.

Eswatini has adopted most disaster management agendas

ESWATINI has adopted most of the noted agendas outlined at the disaster risk management meeting held in Tanzania last week.

This was revealed by National Disaster Management Agency Chief Executive Officer Russell Dlamini, who spoke on behalf of the deputy prime minister.

"While there, we came to the realisation that Eswatini has adopted a lot of the decisions that have been taken; some of which we are way ahead and the other countries will learn from us," said Dlamini.

The meeting was for committee ministers responsible for disaster risk management from the Southern African Development Community (SADC).

It was attended by 13 SADC member states, including Eswatini.

Dlamini stated that the meeting was held in view of the unprecedented number of disasters that the region continues to face, which include drought, cyclones, floods that have led to loss of lives, livelihoods, damage to property and destruction of infrastructure across the region.

He said one of the adopted frame-

works mentioned in the meeting was to consider and approve the draft regional resilience framework 2020-2030, to enhance the capability of the SADC Climate Services Centre to undertake highly downscaled climate projections to effectively contribute in the planning of regional adaption and mitigation measures.

According to Dlamini, ministers discussed ways of improving the necessary technical and financing capacities when member states faced droughts and floods such that people are resilient to disasters.

"We are now referring to everything as disaster risk management and the committee too has changed from disaster management to disaster risk committee of ministers responsible for disaster risk management," he said.

Some countries were asked to pledge to support the management the humanitarian team at regional level, something which the country is yet to also look into.

He further mentioned that they spoke about review of disaster preparedness and response strategy and fund, which means the SADC states have been asked to review these such that they are aligned with the Sendai Framework as approved by the UN General Assembly in 2015.

"We try to follow through with the

stated frameworks as NDMA but they also asked that economic and planning and other ministries be involved in projects and that countries develop an adaptation plan," said the CEO.

He stated that all countries were asked to develop an adaptation plan for climate change which the country had already started working on under the ministry of tourism and environmental affairs.

Green Climate Fund (GCF) is where countries around the world were given the chance to get funding to mitigate and reduce the emissions and contributors to global warming.

"Climate change contributors a lot to the disasters. SADC is interested in becoming an accredited entity which means SADC can ask GCF for funds. However, member states need to write a letter for no objection and NDMA was happy to hear that. Unfortunately, the country had not written that letter but the DPM promised to follow up on that and allow the country to access funds under SADC," said Dlamini.

The objective of the meeting was to lessen diversion of budgets planned for implementation of development projects to funding programmes in areas devastated by droughts or floods.

It also gave a platform for learning how the Comoros, Malawi, Mozambique and Zimbabwe coped after they were hit by Idai and Kenneth Cyclones in 2019 that left the countries in devastation.

Southern Africa at risk

AFTER taking a look into the disasters affecting the world, it was concluded that disasters will intensify and hit the region barder.

National Disaster Management Agency Chief Executive Officer Russell Dlamini stated that countries were asked to build resilience from the disasters. This includes forging a different way of living such that people build strong houses that will be less affected during disasters.

The agricultural sector was also asked to be ready to accept that rainfall patterns have changed and it will not rain as much as it did before. The states were asked to do more research on how they can protect themselves through this, which involves risk transfer.

"This means if there is a way countries can take insurance as another way to prevent the country from being hard hit by disasters. SADC will do that study and give opinions and advice to countries on what can be done better," said Dlamini.

Coronavirus update:

- Still at the meeting, ministers were also invited to note that on the 31st of December 2019, a new coronavirus outbreak was reported in Mainland China.
- Ministers were further invited to note that although confirmed cases of the new coronavirus have not been reported in the SADC region a preparedness assessment done early February by the World Health Organisation, member states revealed that most of them were not fully prepared for an eventual outbreak.
- It was agreed that more efforts need to be done to reach the required level of preparedness sufficient to control an outbreak of this magnitude.

Man charged with attempted murder for cracking father's skull

POLICE have arrested and charged the man who hacked his father with an axe over boiled chicken at Mkhuzweni.

The arrest took place last Monday at their homestead near Buhleni.

The name of the arrested individual will not be revealed due to the fact that police are still investigating the matter.

Speaking to this publication sources said the accused was hiding at a nearby relative's homestead.

"Police have managed to locate and arrest the individual, who was found at a relative's homestead. The young man committed the violent attack on his father, while being intoxicated on Sunday evening.

"Police believe that the young man attacked his father because the senior allowed his wife to slaughter and boil a free range chicken, which allegedly belonged to the accused. "After committing the attack, the accused then escaped to a nearby relative's homestead. Once at the homestead, the accused called his siblings to enquire about his father's condition and he was told that their father was hospitalised," said a source.

Afterwards, he tried to visit his father in hospital before handing himself to the police. However, before the accused could visit the Pigg's Peak Government hospital, he was arrested.

During his arrest, the accused kept asking about his father's health and he was informed by police that his father was recuperating at the Mbabane Government Hospital," added the source.

Chief Police Information and Communications Officer (CPICO) Superintendent Phindile Vilakati confirmed the arrest.

Man (27) held for murder at Somnjalose

A 27-year-old man has been arrested and charged with murder, an offence said to have occurred at Somnjalose over the weekend.

Sanele Shongwe was arrested in connection with the murder of Sabelo Dlamini, who was said to have been stabbed with a sharp object in his shoulder and ribs. The numerous stab wounds resulted in Dlamini's demise.

Shongwe has since appeared before the Magistrate's Court, where he was remanded into custody pending his committal to the High Court of Eswatini.

According to court records, Shongwe was charged with murder, when he allegedly stabbed Dlamini with a sharp object, twice in his shoulder and ribs.

Appearing before Acting Magistrate Simo Simelane, Shongwe was advised to, if he so wished, to move his bail application at the High Court, as the offense he was charged with carried a capital penalty. Shongwe was further remanded into custody until March 6, 2020 pending his committal to the High Court.

VOLUME CRIME INCREASES BY 9.9%

ROYAL Eswatini Police Service (REPS) records have indicated an increase in the volume of crime in the country last year.

This is according to the REPS annual performance report on recurrent and capital expenditure and other allied police administrative and operational activities for the period from April 1, 2019 to January 31, 2020.

The report the period under review, reflected that volume crime was on an upward trend when compared to the same period in the previous year. Volume crime for the previ-

ous parallel period stood at 39 625 versus 43 544 for the current year reflecting an increase of 9.9 per cent.

The increase in volume crime was attributed to activities of police proactiveness, which were characterised by targeted raids and swoops resulting in the arrest of offenders for crimes such as trading without licence, the contravention of immigration laws, drug trafficking and dealing as well as trafficking in firearms and ammunition.

Review

During the period under review, a total of 2 324 cases under this category were recorded with contravention of the Immigration Act on the lead by 23.4 per cent followed by drug trafficking and dealing at 12 per cent. Suffice to note that the arrests linked to these crimes were critical to the reduction of violent crimes such as murder, armed robberies and rapes.

The police also reported that the drug trafficking and dealings remained a perennial problem in the country, especially the cannabis effect which now manifested in what was referred to as drug wars and has been a source of violent crime in the dagga infested areas.

During the period under review, there were five murder cases related to drug wars.

The report further indicated that there have also been incidents of attempted murder, arson and robberies under this category and 2 702 suspects were arrested for the aforementioned cases.

Out of the suspects, 2 257 were males and 445 were females. 147 suspects were foreign nationals from South Africa, Mozambeque, Botswana, Lesotho, Nigeria, Zimbabwe and Tanzania.

Stated

The REPS also stated that the issue of dagga was a challenge in that the youth including those of school going age were involved either as growers, traffickers or dealers as well as users of the drug.

The police advised that young people should be shielded from such shenanigans as they were the embodiment of the country's future.

Tourism minister impressed with Montigny

"We want the culture of planting trees to be taken to the communities because there most of the places are now suffering from soil erosion. People need to understand the importance of trees nowadays as they have multiple benefits to the environment and to the economy," Vilakati said.

He said modern forestry generally embraced a broad range of concerns, in what was known as multiple-use management, including the provision of timber, fuel wood, wildlife habitat, natural water quality management, recreation, landscape and community protection,

employment, biodiversity management, watershed management, erosion control and preserving forests as sinks for atmospheric carbon dioxide.

Vilakati said he was worried by the number of students that enrol in these institutions who find themselves without proper training after graduating.

The minister said he believed the institutions provided the finest students in the mechanical engineering fields and attaching more students would really help the company to save costs in the near future when servicing and fixing the machines that are used for harvesting the trees at Montigny. "I'm really worried about the money that the company sends out of the country when trying to fix

the machinery while we have students from ECOT and Gwamile Voctim who have the necessary skills to do that," he said.

Meanwhile, Steenkamp said they would really appreciate if the minister could create the linkages between the company and the two institutions so that they could train them about the machinery that they use. Steenkamp said as Contracted company, they were very passionate about training and capacitating their employees because they believed in them.

He said sometimes they had to wait

for many days for the machinery to be fixed when they developed mechanical faults because they had to wait for specialists from South Africa.

"We are affected in our operations while we are waiting for the specialists from South Africa as we have to stop working for a number of days," he said.

Steenkamp pointed out that as the first company to have a fully mechanised operations, they had employed over 400 people and most of them were Emaswati. He said they invest ed more in training their staff so they can adapt well to the working environment and to the changing land-scape of the forestry industry.

MPs WANT PIGG'S PEAK HOTEL LEASED TO PRIVATE SECTOR

MEMBERS of Parliament have urged government to hand over the Pigg's Peak Hotel and Casino to the private sector.

Ndzingeni MP Lutfo Dlamini advised the ministry of tourism and environmental affairs to seriously consider handing over the management of the establishment to business people who had experience in the industry as government was making a loss in running the hotel.

This was during the debate of the ministry's annual performance report. In the ministry's annual report, the minister indicated that the average occupancy rate at the end of December 2019 stood at 29.02 per cent, which indicated a decrease of 12.46 per cent, from the 2018/2019 average occupancy rate of 41.48 per cent.

The minister also indicated that during the period under review, the hotel's business made a loss of E586 489, which indicated a declining trend from the E125 825 profits made the previous year.


The minister also reported that the casino business incurred a loss of E155 689 which indicated a decrease when compared to the loss of E460 383.33 incurred last year.

Stated

The minister also stated that overall, the establishment continued to make efforts to perform well however the financial performance of the hotel was still not good.

"The overall net loss increased by 39 per cent from E451 111 in 2018/2019 to E742145 incurred this current financial year. The major contributing factor to the increase in losses was due to the decrease in the occupancy rate," he said.

MP Lutfo said it was concerning that the establishment has been run-



ning at a loss. He said the establishment was a business and should be run as such.

"We need to trust that local people are capable of operating such businesses instead of depending on individuals from outside the country," he said.

Lobamba Lomdzala MP Marwick Khumalo echoed Dlamini's sentiments and said businesses had to be run by the private sector. "Government has no business in running businesses," he said.

Teacher arrested after killing two pedestrians

THE cunning ways of a teacher did not save him from the law as he was arrested and charged with two counts of culpable homicide.

Sibusiso Goodwill Dlamini, a teacher at Mkhondvo Primary, was charged with the two offences after he tried to play a Good Samaritan who had taken an injured man to hospital.

Sibusiso rushed one Celumusa Themba Nxumalo of Mankayane to hospital after he knocked him and a friend Joshua Nhlanhla Mayisela on Saturday evening at Mabovini, Mankayane.

Information from reliable sources was to the effect that Nxumalo and Mayisela were from watching a soccer match at Sondelani Bar at around 6pm when they were involved in the accident.

Knocked

It is alleged that when the teacher knocked the two men, Mayisela died on the spot, and in an effort to conceal what had happened, Sibusiso dragged him off the road and hid his body in a ditch close by.

Thereafter, he tried to save Nxumalo's life by rushing him to Mankayane Government Hospital. However, he is alleged to have concealed that he was

the one who knocked him with his car. Instead, the teacher allegedly told health practitioners that he found Nxumalo already injured while near a church known as AEC.

This, according to well-placed sources, is too far from the actual accident scene. Unfortunately, Nxumalo later died while undergoing medical treatment in hos-

Things are said to have taken a twist when some friends who were watching soccer with the two men at the bar got wind of the news that Nxumalo was in hospital. They reportedly wondered where Mayisela was because he had left with Nxumalo the previous evening.

The friends then involved the police body was discovered, meaning he did in the matter.

Since news travel fast, other acquaintances from the area reportedly came forward with information that they had thought was trivial.

One of them stated that he saws flipflops similar to the ones worn by Mayisela the previous day.

When a party went to where the resident had seen the flops, they found it to be true. It was then that they searched the area until they found Mayisela's body in a ditch.

Questioned

When the teacher was questioned about Mayisela's death, he allegedly denied knowledge of the subject matter. He allegedly maintained that he had found Nxumalo far from where Mayisela's not even see Mayisela on the said day

However, his cunning ways did not save him as an investigation by the police yielded that he was connected to the matter as other residents had seen him driving his car in the area close to where the accident had happened.

His state of sobriety during the time of the accident could not be ascertained as he had not reported the misfortune to the police.

Sibusiso had appeared before Senior Magistrate Simangele Mbatha at the Manzini Magistrate's Court on Monday. Sibusiso was remanded in custody until February 28, 2020 where his matter will be heard at the Mankayane Circuit Court.

He was, nonetheless, admitted to E5 000 bail.





The aforementioned tap buckets were clear and possessed sanitary taps which were equipped with a built-in sieve and clear lid.


However, after the first leg of the festival, he reverted to his source of living by re-focusing on his popular steam buck-

I would convert the buckets by cutting out a hole at the bottom before threading in a non-exposed kettle heat element which I attached to the bottom of each bucket. This allowed customers to plug the element into the wall socket and steam safely using the buckets not the kettle. Initially, there were a few problems with the quality but over the months the quality improved as I now spend a few hours every evening assembling the buckets before selling them," he added.

Meanwhile, Precious Tsabedze at Buy Cash Hardware confirmed that Jay and Sons' buckets were sold at their shop in Pigg's Peak.


Manager Muzi Nene said that the eatery also serves hamburgers and

RESIDENTS under Maseyisini Inkhundla are afraid that the frequent disasters in the area are caused by the seven headed snake known as *Inyoka makhandakhanda*.

Some of the residents suspect that the monster was responsible for the destruction homesteads.

Last Thursday afternoon, several families had their homes left roofless after strong winds accompanied by hailstorm blew away the roofing in a number of homesteads. Some residents, it is said now want something done to remove or destroy a nearby dam, which they say could be the source of trouble.

"Some of the people think the seven headed monster is provoked, hence the reaction in this fashion. We are now living in fear as each time the weather changes, we have to be ready to get tormented by the creature believed to be staying in the dam. We also don't know who will not have roofing by the end of the storm," said Mfene Dlamini, one of the residents.

Demolished

Other residents are even considering approaching the relevant authorities to have the dam demolished or emptied as its presence has become a threat.

Maseyisini Indvuna Yenkhundla Sisho Khumalo said he also heard that other residents were not happy with the dam, as they felt it was where the monster was staying, "We are not sure what causes the disaster but people have now started speculating. They feel we are cursed as a constituency, and others feel there is a monster in the dam somewhere, hence such incidents have become the order of the day.

It is indeed worrying as to why this is happening here and why us. We are the only constituency experiencing this in a short space of time," said Khumalo.

Last week's recent storm devastation was the second in two weeks, which has prompted residents to speculate on the real cause of the natural disasters, especially targeting the Maseyisini Inkhundla.

The previous storm saw schools and a clinic damaged, with roofing blown away.

Police want govt to regulate insecticides

SOME police officers have urged government to regulate the sale of a popular insecticide which is responsible for the escalation of suicides committed by the youth in the Northern Hhohho region.

This comes after three female minors committed suicides in the last five weeks around Pigg's Peak, Timphisini and Buhleni respectively. Each of the aforementioned suicides involved female minors, who all consumed a very potent insecticide that is easy to purchase in Eswatini.

For ethical reasons, the name of the insecticide will not be named. Speaking to this publication, the police officers who preferred to remain anonymous said government can regulate the sale of insecticides. "Over the last few weeks, we have seen an increase in the number of suicides being committed by the youth. This trend is growing rapidly and it will be wrong for us to ignore the situation. One thing

we have noticed is all the suicides have a common denominator and this is a certain that it is easy to purchase insecticide that is being used by farmers. It is no secret that Northern Hhohho has an abundance of farmers, both legal and illegal," they said. The police added that they believe if government can intervene, then the situation can be mitigated. "We firmly believe that the suicides can be reduced if Government regulates the sale of this popular insecticide. This can be done by telling shops to screen the farmer before handing him/her a bag of the insecticide. Also it is important to mention that other insecticides like weevil tablets are still being sold in large numbers to members of the public. This practise is wrong as it places these potent chemicals in the hands of the youth," they added. Meanwhile, Chief Police Information and Communications Officer (CPICO) Superintendant Phindile Vilakati said the police were aware about the suicides and were working with the office of the Deputy Prime Minister (DPMO) to mitigate the situation.

Man stabs friend after church

SITHEMBISO Matfonsi was denied bail after he allegedly stabbed Sibusiso Dlamini in the lung with an Okapi knife at Mpofu after church on Sunday.

The cause of the stabbing is believed to be dagga. Speaking to this publication, sources said both men were close friends before the incident.

"Both men were close friends at Mpofu, however it seems an altercation allegedly involving dagga occurred. Information we have suggests that Dlamini was the individual who was wielding the Okapi only to be assaulted by Matfonsi with fists. The punches caused Dlamini to drop the knife.

Matfonsi then picked up the same knife and stabbed Dlamini once under the rib cage through the lower lung," said a source.

The sources added that Matfonsi fled the scene while a bystander phoned the Emergency Medical Services (EMS) to rush the injured Dlamini to the Mkhuzweni Health Centre.

"Dlamini is lucky to be alive and he was rushed to Mkhuzweni for treatment, meanwhile police managed to arrest Matfonsi a few hours later," added the source. Appearing inside the Pigg's Peak Magistrates Court on Monday, Matfonsi asked to be admitted to bail, however his request was turned down by Pigg's Peak Magistrate Sakhele Hlophe, who said the court needed to know the condition of the victim Dlamini first.

Man obstructs justice as cop arrests wife

A man was arrested for obstruction of justice when he became aggressive against a police officer, who was exfecting arrest on his wife.

Musa Masina was a passenger in a vehicle driven by his wife, when a police officer ordered for them to stop.

"The police officer stated that he was going to arrest my wife for undisclosed reasons, and he started using disrespectful words to talk to my wife.

"I could no longer handle it, so I decided to defend my wife's honour. Unfortunately, that meant I had to become aggressive, however I did not lay hands on the police officer.

"Instead, when I called 999 for assistance, I was advised to approach the police station in order to lay charges against the officer," Masina said.

Masina recalled that when he arrived at the police station, he discovered that the police officer had called ahead and had instructed the officers at the police station to apprehend him for obstruct-

ing the hands of justice.
"Instead, the police officer was the

one who insulted me, along with my wife, to the extent that he put his hands on me and grabbed my clothing in an aggressive manner. I would not have resorted to violence if the police officer had not conducted himself in such an aggressive manner," he stated.

Acting Magistrate Simo Simelane warned police officers against being disrespectful when interacting with clients, as they were human beings at the end of the day.

Respectful

"Police officers need to be respectful as well. Behind their uniforms, they are humans, and all humans have the right to the preservation of their integrity. "In as much as this incident appeared to have been out of hand, you had no business obstructing justice, even if it was your wife. I urge all police officers to conduct themselves in a respectful manner, when going about their business," the judicial officer warned.

After hearing his mitigation, the court sentenced Masina to serve eight months in prison, with the option to pay a fine of E1 000. Half of his sentence was suspended for a period of one year; on condition he was not to commit a similar offence during this time.

Man charged with SODV after fondling woman's breasts

A man of Moyeni is facing the wrath of the Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence Act of 2018 after he allegedly fondled a woman's breasts without her consent.

Obrie Ndlangamandla (27) appeared before Acting Magistrate Lungile Shongwe, where he faced a charge of contravening section 5 of the said act.

According to the charge sheet, the accused person did wrongfully and unlawfully commit a sexual violation upon a 19-year-old woman by fondling her breasts without her consent. He is alleged to have further strangled the woman.

During his appearance before the court, the accused person was informed of his right to legal representation, and he elected to conduct his own

defence.

He was, however not asked to plead to the charge as the Crown filed for postponement of the matter. The matter is expected back in court on Friday for setting before Principal Magistrate Dumisani Magagula.

Meanwhile, on another matter, Colani Maziya also faced a similar charge of contravening section 3 of the SODV act.

He was said to have committed an unlawful sexual act upon a woman aged in her late 20s.






Excited; from Accra, I called Times Sports Editor, Lwazi Dlamini and informed him that I was bringing the whole Ghana soccer national team to the country.

USAIN BOLT

I was in Korea for the World Tourism Conference in 2011 where I made an impressive presentation. Strategically, just like in London, I was the first to take the floor.

SA was going to fund the project as they were partners. They always funded me anyway. But we were warned that IT WAS EASY TO MEET THE PRESIDENT IN JAMAICA THAN USAIN BOLT!

QUICK

My friend minister quickly called the minister of sports to make arrangements. He told us Bolt was always in America and his programme was full for the year.

But promised he would put word for us. To SA, Bolt was more important in that he would profile them as a sporting nation that had successfully hosted the World Cup.

ITINERARY

As we discussed the itinerary something came into my mind like a flash! Why not use the opportunity to bolster cultural heritage?

It was all systems go and we couldn't wait and Mozambique had shown interest. More than Bolt, the Mozambican minister saw an opportunity to bring top musicians from Jamaica as Mozambique had a huge Reggae following.

The ability to stay resilient is now a critical new competency for leaders. Resiliency is important for any leader that needs to be effective.

As the environment changes daily, stress and difficulty affects productivity. It is a given that leaders know that one cannot eliminate all the stress or erase the difficulties that arise from the many demands posed by the business environment, hence there is a need to cultivate leadership resiliency.

Resiliency is the ability to bounce back from setbacks and challenges. Leaders who are resilient view challenges as part of living and not paralysing events. They are more effective in maintaining perspective. They do not drift into catastrophic thinking in times of crisis.

BEING A RESILIENT LEADER

A resilient leader is a person who sees set-backs as temporary. He maintains a positive attitude and a strong sense of opportunity during periods of turbulence. When faced with ambiguity, a resilient leader finds ways to move forward and avoids getting stuck.

Many studies have indicated the importance of resilience as both an individual and leadership

Developing and demonstrating resiliency Folkman J (2018) shares insight in developing

resiliency. He asserts that the demand for developing resiliency on business leaders is a must for all 21st century leaders. To develop resilience, leaders need to:

 Communicate powerfully: Some individuals will often act individually and not inform

others about what they are trying to do. When driving down the freeway, we always appreciate it when people signal before they change

Signalling lets others know your intentions. The most resilient leaders are effective at communicating their intentions to others. They were willing to help others understand a new strategy or direction. Effective communication helps others understand changes, expectations and new directions.

Receiving feedback: Resilient leaders are open to feedback and often ask others for feedback. Once feedback is given they also demonstrate a real effort to improve. They have a strong desire to continuously improve their skills and abilities.

Though the trend of improving work well with the younger generation but many people become less coachable as they age. The most resilient leaders, however, continue to ask for feedback throughout their careers.

Build positive trusting relationships: Resilient leadership occurs when people can bring others along. By building trust and being open to differences, these leaders are able to create strong teams by building positive rela-

An individual may be willing to make a dramatic change, but it requires positive relationships to get others to support change.

 Bold risk taking: Resilient individuals are willing to take bold risks and try new ideas. It is easy for most individuals to be stuck in a rut in which they continue to conduct work in the same way from year to year.

That approaches works well until the world changes, requiring organisations to change or die. Resilient leaders are not afraid to take risks and make bold changes.

→ Develop others: The most resilient leaders were not only interested in their own development but they are concerned about the development of others. Resiliency is needed when we encounter failure.

Developing others helps everyone to learn from their mistakes. We continue to find that leaders who want feedback for themselves are more likely to give productive feedback and coaching to others, because they want honest feedback as well.

 Champion change: Resilient leaders are willing to change and able to provide the leadership to ensure that the organisation will also change. Change takes courage and requires a vision about where the organisation is going. Resilient leaders embrace change and also encourage others to change.

 Are decisive: Making decisions is always difficult because no person has all the data or understands all eventualities. But organisations cannot move forward until a decision gets made. The most resilient leaders are effective at making decisions and moving forward. If they make the wrong decision, they are quick to make a different decision and move in another direction. The proverb by Cato "Swift and resolute action leads to success; self-doubt is a prelude to disaster" fits well here.

OPEN LETTER TO BHEKI CELE, RICA VICTIM

AS minister of police, today you are in the Constitutional Court seeking to block a major reform to the state's spying powers - the case of amaBhungane vs the spies, which will determine the constitutionality of South Africa's main surveillance law, RICA.

You know the back story.

The state's spying powers are meant to be tightly regulated and only used to combat the most serious crimes and threats to national security - but these spying powers have been turned to all kinds of corrupt purposes: To spy on journalists, whistle blowers,



political operatives, government watchdogs, and others.

Getting proof was always the problem. That changed a few years ago when evidence came to light that

government spies had secretly listened in on the private calls and messages of a journalist named Sam Sole.

They used the law called RICA, but Sam was not suspected of any of the grand crimes that such spying powers are meant to be reserved for; the only danger he posed was to a few individuals who wanted to keep their corrupt dealings off the front pages.

So last year, a judge in the High Court heard all this evidence and decided that there was a problem with RICA. The judge agreed with amaBhungane and advocacy groups

that a law that would enable such an abuse must be at odds with the constitutional rights to privacy, freedom of expression (and of the media), and an open and just democracy.

And that is why, in September 2019, the High Court of Gauteng struck down key parts of RICA as being unconstitutional, ordering a swath of reforms to boost transparency and oversight over these spying powers, and to limit how they can be used in the future.



1 BILLION RISING REVOLUTION

WOMEN are under-represented in decision-making positions world-wide.

However, gender equality and diversity are recognised to have beneficial effects on organisations, institutions and the overall economy.

This article provides evidence that removing the glass ceiling – the invisible barriers which prevent women from reaching upper-level positions – may produce not only more equality but also substantial efficiency

According to the World Economic Forum in 2016, only 59 per cent of the gender gap in economic opportunities has been closed around the world. At the current rate of change, it will take another 170 years to close

Policies to accelerate the process towards economic gender equality and to promote women's empowerment are at the centre of the debate in many countries around the world.

Gender equality is a top priority, not only because equality between men and women is itself an important development goal, but also because women economic participation is 'a part of the growth and stability equation'.

As women represent over half of the population, and have talent, human capital and productivity equal to men, the global economy would benefit from boosting women's participation in the labour force.

The absence of women from positions of leadership is at odds with the strategy of exploiting talent to promote business and performance.

WOMEN'S PARTICIPATION IN DECISION-MAKING

In developing countries like Eswatini, gender equality and development are intertwined: more gender equality creates the conditions to boost economic development and contributes to economic growth, while more development leads to more gender equality.

In developed countries, women are typically more educated than men, they represent a crucial positive value for the economy and they contribute substantially to economic growth.

More women in the labour market translates into a substantial increase in GDP. Moreover, a virtuous circle may begin when more women work: the demand for services causes consumption to increase, leading to the creation of more jobs, for both men and women.

Finally, women's participation in the labour market may play a positive role with regard to fertility and household well-being.

When we move from labour market participation to women's representation in decision-making positions, the gender gaps are worsened. Even in countries in which women participate in the labour market in high numbers, only a minority make it to the highest positions.

However, the beneficial effects of gender equality and diversity are even clearer when we concentrate on decision-making positions.

Much of the past literature has concentrated on the benefits of diversity:

having both men and women involved in decision-making broadens the perspectives, increases creativity and innovation, diversifies the pool of talents and competences, reduces conflicts, improves the process of decision-making, and may better represent the firm's various shareholders. Moreover, a better corporate image emerges when the leadership is gender balanced.



The female leadership style also contributes to the benefits of diver-

women are better able to deal with difficult personal relationships, they pay closer attention to people's needs, they are inclined towards the prevention and solution of conflicts, they more readily share views with other people and make efforts to reach agreements, and they monitor and give feedback more intensively.

There are efficiency gains from removing gender gaps and promoting gender equality in decision-making positions.

Promoting

First, promoting women into top positions would represent a dramatic change to the status quo dominated by male representatives. As competent and talented women are abundant, this change would produce a better selection process, yielding positive effects on the quality of representatives.

Evidence of this mechanism will be provided below, both in the context of business and politics. Second, women contribute to better outcomes and improved performance of institutions and organisations. The relationship between gender and economic performance is a controversial one, and inconclusive. Causal studies will be discussed below which show that including women in decision-making is associated with better economic performance. Third, women in decision-making positions may contribute to the definition of a new agenda for the organisation, including items which are typically neglected by men.

For companies this can include a shift towards less risky decisions, or towards sustainability and environmental policies with longer time horizons. For policy-makers this can mean more investment in education and social needs.

Gender equality in decision-making has positive economic consequences. Not only is diversity beneficial in itself, but when women are highly qualified, more responsible and less corruptible than men, this causes efficiency gains to emerge.

The result is higher quality institutions and organisations, a positive effect on economic outcomes and performance, and a new policy agenda. COMPANY IDENTITY NUMBERS FOR ALL TRANSACTIONS

COMPANIES will now use identity numbers for all their transactions

The ministry of commerce, industry and trade, through the Registrar of Companies department has introduced Company Identity Numbers (CIN) that will be used for all company transactions.

This will be with effected from Monday.

Registrar of Companies Msebe Malinga said the use of CINs was in line with the use of the electronic company registration services namely registration, file updates and

company annual statutory returns. "With the introduction of the online services, a company identity number can be used to unique-

ly identify all companies and businesses legally registered in the country. It is compatible with all systems, where company transaction services are made," he said.

He further urged owners, members and subscribers of companies registered in Eswatini under the Swaziland Companies Act No.8 2009 to familiarise themselves with their company identity numbers.

"Stakeholders and all relevant institutions are also advised to use the CIN for transacting instead of the R7/reference number that they have been using,' he said.

He added that the R7/ number was an internal code used for filing purposes and should not be

used as it does not uniquely identify a company or business and cannot be validated in all other systems.

ABOUT A CIN

A company identity number is an automated unique number allocated to all registered companies at registration. It is a 15digit number made up of characters which include;

- Date of incorporation (year, month and day)
- Type of company
- System generated number
- Digit that validates the number as a unique identifier

TOTAL REVENUE FOR 2019/20 PROJECTED AT E17.3 BILLION

TOTAL revenue collection in the fiscal year 2019/20 is projected at E17.36 billion, which indicates a less than one per cent under collection compared to the annual budget.

Collection in the year under review is expected to improve, compared to the 2018/19, by 14 per cent, which is due partly to a full impact of the one percent of Value Added Tax (VAT) and introduction of a motor vehicle both implemented in August and being experienced in 2019/20.

According to ministry of finance annual performance report for the financial year 2019/20, which has been tabled in Parliament, the positive revenue performance expected in the financial year is also due to the implementation of the alcohol and Tobacco Levy Act 2019 and Finance Act 2019 legislations which, though implemented in the third and fourth quarter, are expected to have a positive impact on revenue collection.

An increase of eight percent in SACU revenue has also contributed to the increase in total revenue compared to the fiscal year 2018/19.

According to the report the Fiscal and Monetary Department in the ministry is targeting two performance areas in which to carry out its mandate effectively, efficiently towards meeting the National Vision 2022.

The two areas are Revenue Efficiency and Sustainability and Regional Economic Integration



Initiatives that are supportive of Economic growth.

The report also highlighted that collection from income taxes was expected to amount E5.7 billion, which is 99 per cent collection of the annual budget of E5.74 billion.

The collection reflects a nine percent increase compared to the fiscal year 2018/19.

Performance

The improved performance is mainly attributed to a E1.5 percent increase in corporate taxes and eight percent increase in individual taxes.

"This is a result of an increased in compliance and improvement in the administration of these taxes. During the year, the Eswatini Revenue Authority initiated a voluntary compliance incentive which contributed positively to compliance," read part of report.

Company taxes on the other hand are expected to E55 million. It is

expected that the reporting period will exceed target by 43 percent. The same amount is expected to be collected in taxes on property.

The report also highlights that total taxes on goods and services are expected to amount to E10.7 billion, which is 98 per cent collection of the annual budget.

Compared to 2018/19, performance improved by 11 per cent which is mainly due to the increase of VAT by 13 per cent, road toll by 71 per cent, SACU receipts, fuel tax by 18 percent and the introduction of alcohol and tobacco levy.

In the third quarter of the 2019/20, fuel tax rate was increased by 85 cents hence a significant increase compared to the last fiscal year.

Meanwhile Non tax revenue expected in the year under review amounted to E823 million, which exceeded annual budget by 24 per cent.

Govt Tender Board awards over E4bn jobs

THE Eswatini Government Tender Board has in the financial year 2019/20 awarded tenders worth over E4.8 billion.

The exact amount of tenders awarded was E4 813 billion of which E2 198 billion was for pharmaceutical and other medical supplies, E2 615 billion for education, goods and services for various government ministries.

According to the ministry of finance annual performance report, as part of the measurers to control expenditure sitting for pressing needs continued to be sanctioned by Cabinet, the award of tenders has only been limited to urgent and priority expenditure.

The report further mentioned that the controls on the award of tenders would continue to ensure that commitments are contained within available sources.

The ministry stated that the training of line ministries and departments on the procurement legal framework was continuing.

"During this financial year, officials from government ministries and parastatals have been trained to ensure capacity is being developed and will lead to sustainability on public procurement issues," it said.

It was also reported that one tenderer was suspended for two years following a violation of the Public Procurement Act 2011.

ESWATINILAGGING BEHINDINQUALITY STANDARDS "...MSMEs still don't see the implementation of quality stan-

ESWATINI is lagging behind in quality standards.

This has led to the inability to meet systematic and internationally accepted standards which remains one of the major challenges for micro, small and medium enterprises (MSMEs) with regards to penetration or access to international markets for their products.

Challenges

Responding to a question on the reasons for the inability to meet systematic and internationally accepted quality standards by MSMEs with regards to penetration or access to international market for their products, Ministry of Commerce, Industry and Trade Communications Officer Thabile Mdluli said Eswatini was partly lagging behind due to a general lack of commitment from MSMEs as they perceived the

adoption of quality management systems/standards as a costly exercise.

"There's also a poor quality culture in that some MSMEs still don't see the implementation of quality standards as a tool that can help them in delivering quality goods and services," she said.

She further stated that the ministry through the Eswatini Standards Authority (SWASA) and the department of regulatory and quality infrastructure development (RQID), remained committed to capacitating MSMEs to comply with quality standards.

"We have a capacity building programme that is tailor-made for MSMEs, including those in the informal sector such as craft producers, amongst others.

Through this programme we hope to help the MSMEs understand the importance of these quality standards, especially where the growth of their respective businesses is concerned," she added. E0.7 million decline in SSELGS funds

THE performance status of the Small Scale Enterprise Loan Guarantee Scheme (SSELGS) shows a decrease from E28.9 million in September 2019 to E28.2 million in December.

The E0.7 million decline is primarily due to a claim of E678 837 that was paid to Eswatini Development and Savings Bank.

According to the ministry of commerce, industry and trade 'Eswatini is open for Business' February 2020 Parliament report, the performance of the SSELGS continued to show some growth as the total cumulative loans disbursed increased from 1 313, amounting to E125.4 million in September 2019, to 1 327 valued at E128.1 million in December 2019, indicating an increase of 14 fresh loans valued at E2.7 million during the quarter.

Out of the total loans issued, those which were either fully repaid or cancelled increased from 1 112 amounting to E90.8 million in September 2019 to 1 119 valued at E93.4 million in December 2019. This being a net change of seven loans valued at E2.6 million being

fully repaid or cancelled during the quarter.

It was also highlighted that the SSELGS commitment to financial institutions increased from 201 guaranteed valued at E30.1 million in September 2019 to 208 guarantees valued at E30.2 million in December 2019.


At the end of December 2019, a cumulative total of E6.3 million due to defaults was written off as a loss by the scheme and an increase from the E5.6 million reported on September 2019 due to the claims paid to EswatiniBank amounting to E0.7 million.

This resulted in the cumulative default rate increasing from 6.03 per cent to 6.61 per cent over the quarter.

Worth noting in the performance of the SSELGS is the leverage ratio that stood at 1.05 times of the total fund balance in December 2019, showing a slight improvement from 1.04 times reported at the end of September 2019.

However, this is still far below the approved leverage ratio of five times.

The SSELGS had an excess guaranteeing capacity of E113.8 million.



'University should improve quality content'

CHARTERED Accountant and Standard Bank Chief Executive Mvuselelo Fakudze says the University of Eswatini (UNESWA) needs to improve the quality and content of their degrees in order to produce ideal accountants and auditors.

Fakudze was reacting to an observation by the Auditor General Timothy Matsebula who recently revealed that in the country there was a deficit of 80 per cent auditors and accountants.

Speaking to the Business Desk yesterday, Fakudze said it all began with ratios, whereby the number of accountants in developed countries to the population and to the number of companies audited determined if there were sufficient accountants or not. "I think there is a lot we can do at our university level to ensure our students get degrees that would easily qualify them to write and pass the board exams needed to qualify for this profession.

I also think that more students need to get the opportunity to go abroad and study and then come back to practice, only then can we close the gap.

The reality is that we are not short of accountants but the shortage of people who have experience in auditing and

have professional qualifications to become accountants," he said.

He added every year, a lot of Bcom students graduate but disappear in other fields they have not studied for.

"The university produces a lot of Bcom graduates every year, so the question is where do they disappear to. Most of them end up being book keepers or semi-accountants because unless they are qualified, they are not recognised

as accountants," he said. He also mentioned that another problem faced by Eswatini was the shortage of firms. "I think the problem we have as Eswatini is that we only have two international firms instead of four. We had them before and are down to two now. This shows that the rate in which we wish to produce accountants will not grow rapidly due to some of these challenges," he said.

Accounting, auditing not gateway to higher positions - Engelbrecht

KPMG Chief Ethics Officer Dr Schalk Engelbrecht has warned against beliefs that being an accountant or auditor is a gateway to a chief executive officer (CEO) or chief financial officer (CFO) position.

Engelbrecht said most people decided on a career in accounting and auditing because they thought it was a gate way or a spring board to other positions, instead of seeing the value and the purpose they can fulfil by doing the job as an accountant or auditor.

"This shows that we have not been focusing sufficiently on the public interest.

My view here is that we need to do a lot more work in studying and that as soon as one joins a firm, they should focus on the public interest they need to serve.

We need people to understand that the purpose of becoming an accountant or auditor is not a gateway to being a CEO or CFO," he said.

He also mentioned that the industry was lacking in this profession because a lot of accountants and auditors have found themselves in trouble in the past.

"What I have noted, especially in South Africa, is that more people find this profession risky and the status is not as desirable as it was in the past.

So, some of the people who decide to become a doctor or an attorney instead of an auditor or accountant is because they have seen a lot of scandals, resulting in them being less interested in

the profession," he said.

He added that once people become qualified and experienced enough to add value as accountants and auditors, other opportunities might open up for them and they might move into those opportunities.

"What needs to be done is those people who are doing the job now must share more with the aspiring and upcoming accountants. Even arrange or organise events whereby the younger professionals can be taught and be advised.

It is important that they see how accountants in the public sector space are doing.

Maybe if more people are inspired, the industry will not lack accountants and auditors," he closed.



Commerce, Industry & Trade Eswatini

AS we conclude our export series, we will look at the flow of goods and funds, which are both activated by documents which must be presented at various points along the export supply chain.

Upon receipt and acceptance of a bona fide export order, it is the duty of the seller (exporter) to organise his business so that the goods are ready for dispatch to the customer. At the same time, the seller should start arranging the necessary documentation to ensure smooth passage of the goods across the borders.

These include:

● The enquiry that invites the exporter to quote in respect of the supply of a particular quantity of specified products.

■ The quotation is the exporter's response to the enquiry once he/she has examined the feasibility of supplying the goods concerned and often takes the form of a pro-forma invoice.

The proforma invoice (which replicates the commercial invoice) contains all the terms and conditions of sale for inclusion in an irrevocable letter of credit. It is also often a prerequisite for the issue of an import permit in the importer's country.

 The importer draws up a purchase order in which he/she formally states his/her intention to purchase specified products subject to certain terms and conditions.

The import licence authorises the importation of the goods concerned and is required by foreign customs at the port of entry for the purposes of import clearance.

The order confirmation by the exporter brings the contract of sale into being.

The contract of sale, when embodied in a stand-alone document, has usually been drawn up by a lawyer to cover large, recurring and/or complex transactions. The document is intended to protect each party in the event of nonperformance by the other and consequently spells out every agreed detail pertaining to the sale of the goods including how any dispute should be handled and which country's law should govern the contract.

An application for export facilities (Form CE 185) must be completed and submitted to the relevant government authority (Eswatini Revenue Authority).

●The freight transit order issued by Eswatini Railway as a receipt for goods consigned by her to a port or other destination

A credit insurance certificate evidence cover of a specific transaction under a credit insurance policy.

● A marine/cargo insurance policy/certificate evidences that a particular consignment is covered against loss or damage attributed to specified risks during transit.

Special certificates (e.g. sanitary, inspection) refer to those certificates required for the export of specific products subject to export control, e.g. fresh meat, poultry, cut flowers, and vegetables. They are issued by the relevant government department.

A certificate of origin/value verifies the origin of a product in accordance with specific rules relating to origin and in the case of a certificate of value and origin, also specifies that the product pricing fairly reflects its value.

 Which is verified (legalised) by a consulate of the importing country situated in or near the exporting country.

The commercial invoice provides the contract details of the exporter and importer, a precise description of the products sold, the prices and currency of the transaction, the terms of delivery and payment, and other conditions of sale.

 The packing list details the various items and their quantities conveyed in each pack so

that the contents of missing or damaged packs can be easily identified and customs officials know where to locate specific items which they may wish to inspect.

● The bill of exchange or draft is a negotiable financial instrument which on signature legally binds an importer to effecting payment on due date.

The export permit permits the export of goods which are subject to export control.

The customs declaration form (SAD 500) is a multi-purpose customs declaration on which the types, volumes and values of goods leaving and entering the country are specified. This enables customs officials to compile trade statistics and monitor adherence to export and import controls.

The internal works order instructs warehouse or production personnel to produce certain quantities of goods according to specification by a particular date.

The forwarding instruction provides the freight forwarder with all the consignment information he is likely to need to effect delivery of the goods to a particular place by a specified time.

The letter of credit indicates the terms and conditions of payment by the issuing bank, compliance with which must be confirmed by the information provided in certain documents, e.g. the bill of lading, cargo insurance policy, commercial invoice, inspection certificate, certificate of origin and packing list.

The container terminal order (CTO) instructs a terminal (in this case inland) to deliver an empty container to appoint within a prescribed area for stuffing, and to collect the packed and sealed container and return it to the terminal for onward conveyance by unit train to a port or other inland terminal. (In South Africa today, the CTO mostly takes the form of a preannouncement EDI message dispatched to a terminal via an on-line web facility.)

The Transnet National Ports Authority export cargo dues order evidences the pay-

ment of cargo dues levied for the use of poet equipment.

The bill of lading is an ocean transport document which evidences receipt of the goods by the vessel captain/shipping line, the contract of carriage and title to the goods.

The Balance of Payments Form (Outward Payment Flows) is an application to purchase foreign currency from the bank.

The Balance of Payments form (Inward Payment Flows) is an offer to sell foreign currency to a bank. This form cancels the obligation of the exporter to repatriate export proceeds

In conclusion, let's remind you about the bilateral agreements that Eswatini has and the size of the markets.

1. Southern African Customs Union (SACU)

Coronavirus outbreak hurts Zimbabwean tourism

PRETORIA – The restriction of movements to and from China in the wake of the outbreak of COVID-19, caused by the coronavirus, has negatively impacted Zimbabwe's tourism industry and small to medium enterprises, local media reported yesterday.

The Herald newspaper said due to the outbreak, entrepreneurs could not travel to China to import clothes, cellphones and vehicle spare parts for resale for fear of contracting the deadly virus.

Chinese tourists have also significantly cut down foreign travel to avoid further spreading the virus which has killed over 2 700 people, mostly in mainland China. Over 79 000 cases have been reported.

Earlier this month, news agency AFP reported that numerous Chinese shop owners in Namibia who had travelled to their country for the year-end break had opted to stay there instead of return-

ing to Windhoek's Chinatown, a vast complex of nearly 200 retail, wholesale, food and electronics outlets. In one block of 90 shops, 20 stores had reportedly not re-opened.

Embassy

On Monday, Standard Bank donated R750 000 to China through its

embassy in South Africa towards the fight against COD-19.

"This disease, this epidemic has the ability to affect the entire world so it is in our own interests to ensure the eradication of it. Secondly, and more importantly, as South Africa we believe in showing solidarity... with the Chinese people," the bank's CEO Sim Tshabalala said. "This is not just a Chinese issue, it affects the entire world."

GATES FOUNDATION DONATES \$10M TO FIGHT LOCUST OUTBREAK

JOHANNESBURG - The United Nations Food and Agriculture Organisation has applauded a \$10 million donation from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation to fight the upsurge of desert locusts in East Africa and called for more funding to help prevent a humanitarian crisis.

The foundation said its donation would help FAO supports governments in Ethiopia, Kenya, and Somalia to combat locust infestation which poses a significant threat to food production and livelihoods in the region.

Outbreak

The outbreak is the worst to strike Ethiopia and Somalia for 25 years and the worst Kenya has experienced in 70 years.

Djibouti and Eritrea are also affected and swarms have spread to the south east of South Sudan and the northern edges of Uganda and Tanzania and as far as the south-west coast of Iran.

The upsurge is threatening people's livelihoods and food security in a region that is already seriously food insecure. FAO has raised its appeal to \$138 million from the initial \$76 million sought a month

metre can eat the same amount of food in one day as 35 000 people. Pasture and croplands have already suffered damage in East Africa and there are potentially severe consequences for the region where millions rely on agriculture and livestock rearing for survival.

JSE All Share Index in its biggest one-day dive

JOHANNESBURG – The JSE on Monday suffered its biggest intra-day fall since 2016 as the benchmark index extended its slump to -4.28 per cent, amid fears of increasing coronavirus cases outside China sparked a global trade-off and concerns that Finance Minister Tito Mboweni's Budget might not avert a Moody's downgrade.

The risk hardened as the epidemic spread to more than 30 countries, with South Korea reporting a jump in infections and Italy locking down an area of 50 000 people near Milan.

The rand weakened to as much as R15.18 to the dollar from Friday's close of R15 after the IMF late revised its global and Chinese growth expectations for 2020 lower on Friday to 3.2 per cent year on year from 3.3 and 5.6 per cent from six per cent. The JSE All Share Index eased 4.28 per cent to 54 881.56 points, and the JSE Top 40 took a beating, dragging losses to 4.46 per cent to 49 282.53 points.

"Investors have sold out of shares for five Fridays in a row, because they were unwilling to hold on over the weekend in the likelihood of bad news about the coronavirus," said London Capital Group head of research Jasper Lawler.

Naspers, which holds about a third of the local bourse value, declined 4.24 per cent, while luxury goods giant Richemont fell 2.77 per cent. Anglo American lost 8.37 per cent,

BHP Billiton fell 5.61 per cent. Bank stocks slid more than four per cent, the biggest drop in more than eight months, as risk-off sentiment batters the rand.

Dropped

Standard Bank led the bank losses with a 5.35 per cent drop, Capitec lost 3.23 per cent, while FirstRand dropped 4.03 per cent.

"It seems the risks over the past several weeks have been understated; that's why the US and some European stocks were testing new highs. Investors have been betting on a V-shaped recovery, supported by central bank easing. It now looks like the easy money won't be enough to offset the impact of the virus," said Hussein Sayed, chief market strategist at FXTM.

Economists also pointed to jitters ahead of the budget today, saying that Mboweni may not be able to avert the downgrade fears.

Shoprite interim earnings down 2.6%

JOHANNESBURG - Supermarket chain Shoprite yesterday reported a seven per cent increase in the sale of merchandise to R81.2 billion in the six months to December, but its diluted headline earnings per share declined by 2.6 per cent to 372.4 cents.

The retail group said it was managing the risks associated with the coronavirus disease (COVID-19) currently wreaking havoc across the globe and did not foresee a material impact on the business. Despite the current difficult economic climate, Shoprite continued to create new jobs and participate in the Youth Employment Service programme, an initiative between businesses in South Africa, the government, labour, civil society and young people, Chief Executive Officer Pieter Engelbrecht said.

The company's interim earnings before interest, tax, depreciation and amortisation increased by 5.3 per cent to R6.8 billion, while trading profit on a reported basis fell 3.9 per cent to R4 billion.

The seven percent rise in interim merchandise sales was achieved on the back of a 4.4 per cent growth in the volume of products sold and a 2.1 per cent expansion in the number of customers, said Engelbrecht. "Our group strategy to capture a larger share of South Africa's pre-

mium food retail segment continues to be one of our drivers of growth as reflected particularly in the Checkers brand, together with Hypers, growing sales by 11.2 per cent," he said. Shoprite supermarkets in the non-South African operating segment, comprising operations in 14 countries across the African continent, recorded positive sales growth of 4.8 per cent in constant currency terms. In rand terms, however, sales declined by 3.1 per cent. "Supermarkets Non-RSA's operating environment is expected to remain challenging until

such time as currencies stabilise and consumer affordability catches up," Shoprite said.

"In terms of future strategy we remain committed to operating on the continent but are limiting future expansion whilst we review our options with regards to alternate operating models. Notwithstanding this, we have taken a number of immediate operational actions, all of which are ongoing and include rent reductions, store closures, productivity improvements and de-dollarising costs." CURRO TO INVEST R1BN IN GROWTH PROJECTS

JOHANNESBURG - South Africa's largest public-listed independent school group Curro Holdings said yesterday its revenue rose 18 per cent to R2.944 billion in the year to December.

'Malema arrest warrant blown out of proportion'

JOHANNESBURG - The National Prosecuting Authority (NPA) has described the reaction to the warrant of arrest issued for EFF leader Julius Malema by the East London Magistrate's Court for his gun case as being 'blown out of proportion'.

The criminal case of Malema and his co-accused Adriaan Snyman - who face five charges over Malema's discharging of a rifle in Mdantsane in 2018 as the EFF was celebrating its fifth birthday anniversary - briefly proceeded during their absence from court on Monday.

NPA Regional Spokesperson Luxolo Nyali said Malema was not facing imminent arrest as the State was aware that he was not going to attend the case, adding that the court had issued the warrant, which has been stayed until May 8, as part of normal procedure. "Even if an arrangement is made, the court may issue a warrant of arrest which may be stayed. It won't be affected. It is not like there are going to be police running around looking for Julius to arrest him," Tyali said. The matter was postponed in November

last year to February 24, for the State to provide the defence with the docket contents and alleged video footage. Tyali said courts issued stayed warrants of arrest daily and very few of the affected individuals actually faced imminent arrest as many could explain the reasons for their nonattendance. "It is just that these days it is happening to people who are prominent," he said.

Tyali said Malema's lawyers were also aware as early as last year that Malema would be issued with a warrant of arrest.

MBEKI SENDS UN DOCUMENT TO DE KLERK

DURBAN - Former president Thabo Mbeki has stayed true to his word that he would send the country's last apartheid president, FW de Klerk, the UN Convention declaration that apartheid was a crime against humanity.

The Sunday Times reported at the weekend that De Klerk had been served by Mbeki with documentation explaining that the apartheid system had been declared a crime against humanity.

This followed De Klerk's comments earlier this month during an interview with the SABC in which he apologised for apartheid, but also said that it was not a crime against humanity.

Mbeki sent De Klerk the UN Convention on the Suppression and Punishment of the Crime of Apartheid.

This came after De Klerk's remarks to Mbeki when he told him that he was not aware of the convention.

De Klerk's comments were widely condemned across the country by political parties, NGOs, on social media and by the international community. At the State of the Nation Address on February 13, the EFF disrupted the start of President Cyril Ramaphosa's address by more than an hour as they demanded that De Klerk, who they referred to as an apartheid apologist, should leave the public gallery, while also branding him a murderer with blood on his hands. *IOL*

Zuma invited to attend KZN SOPA

DURBAN - With the opening of the KwaZulu-Natal legislature and the State of the Province Address (SOPA) pencilled in for next Tuesday and Wednesday respectively, the legislature said it had cut costs close to R1million for the two events.

Speaker Nontembeko Boyce confirmed that former president Zuma was among the guests who had been invited to attend both the opening of the legislature and the SOPA.

Arrived

Zuma arrived back in the country on Saturday after undergoing medical treatment in Cuba. He was welcomed back by scores of supporters at OR Tambo International Airport.

Boyce said that the two events would be held at the Pietermaritzburg Royal Showgrounds due to space constraints and renovations at the legislature precinct, although the construction of the new government precinct was now back on the agenda.

Boyce and her deputy, Mluleki Ndobe, said the two events were expected to draw 1 200 people. In previous years the events have seen as many as 2 800 guests, with this year's significantly lower number of guests representing almost R1m in cost savings, said Boyce.

"We get really concerned when costs escalate,

and all avenues and interventions will be the point this year to reduce costs. We are proud that this year we'll be able to cut costs by nearly close to R1m for the opening of the legislature by reducing the number of people invited to attend both events," she said.

We will have saved even more had we hosted the event at the legislature complex, which proved impossible as a result of the renovations," Boyce said. *Political Bureau*

Zondo's commission of inquiry into state capture has been granted a final extension to complete its work by March next year. The North Gauteng High Court in Protosio

The North Gauteng High Court in Pretoria also reduced the scope of the commission, granting it permission to only investigate state capture complaints directed by the former public protector, advocate Thuli Madonsela.

The ruling by Judge Wendy Hughes further ordered President Cyril Ramaphosa to amend the proclamation signed by former president Jacob Zuma in January 2018, which ordered Judge Zondo to investigate all corruption cases in national, provincial government and all state-owned enterprises, including more than 260 municipalities.

Judge Hughes said Ramaphosa must make these amendments to allow the Hawks, SIU and NPA to investigate 'other general corruption cases' which were initially included in the work of the Zondo Commission by Zuma. Judge Hughes made these rulings after Judge Zondo had submitted, in his application for a 10-month extension to complete his work, that Zuma's proclamation had widened the scope of the commission of the inquiry. *Political Bureau*

SAPS ordered to pay R150k to humiliated, illegally demoted generals

JOHANNESBURG - The 'leadership crisis' within the national SAPS has resulted in it being found guilty of unfair labour practice and ordered to pay R150 000 following the illegal demotion of six major-generals.

Last month at the Safety and Security Sectoral Bargaining Council (SSSBC), the SAPS was found to have 'humiliated' Pretoria major-generals by removing them as cluster commanders of several police stations to mere 'overseers' of individual stations in what has been labelled 'a recipe for disaster' in police leadership.

Major-generals Anna Mateisi, Masego Botshelong, Nicholas Sithole, Girly Mbele, Pooblan Subbiah and Ketlareng Mohajane were each awarded R25 000 by the SSSBC for being unfairly demoted.

This related to a restructuring programme the SAPS embarked on in February last year to deploy senior police managers to local stations to address crime experienced by communities.

However, SSSBC arbitrator advocate PH Kirstein found this process to have been flawed because the six wronged senior officers went from being cluster commanders to being station overseers and were 'stripped of all command and control'.

"The major-generals suffered the humiliation of arriving at stations without knowing who to

report to and without having office space and/or any personnel assigned to them.

"The post of district commissioner into which several of their former equals were promoted are higher up in the hierarchy and report to provincial commissioners, whereas they (the six majorgenerals), as overseers, had to report to district commissioners," wrote Kirstein in his report.

He added that this constituted an unfair labour practice because the SAPS and national commissioner General Khehla Sitole demoted the officers without consulting them on the process, and announced the changes to the media before the major-generals were informed. *IOL*

1 000 tourists are quarantined

ITALY -A Tenerife Hotel was on lockdown yesterday after an Italian tourist tested positive for coronavirus.

The visitor was found to be infected yesterday after feeling unwell during his stay at the H10 Costa Adeje Palace.

Around 1 000 guests have now been quarantined inside the hotel, Spanish media says, with police reportedly surrounding the complex which is popular with Britons.

The case will spark further fears over the spiralling virus outbreak coming from Italy, amid growing calls for EU chiefs to suspend the Schengen free travel rules.

The Italian tourist was tested for the killer virus after going to a private clinic in Adeje in the south of Tenerife after falling ill. The visitor, who comes from Italy's Lombardy region where several people have died, had reportedly been staying at the hotel for seven days with his wife. A report by Canary Islands newspaper Diario de Avisos said state security forces were stationed at the complex to prevent anyone from entering or leaving. Canary Islands President Angel Victor Torres confirmed on Monday: "This afternoon the coronavirus protocol has been activated for an Italian tourist in the south of Tenerife.

"The result from the first test carried out in the Canaries is positive. Tomorrow new tests will take place in Madrid. The patient has been quarantined."

A spokesman for the regional health authority added: "The protocol states that a second test must take place at the National Microbiology Centre at the Carlos III Health Institute in Madrid. "The patient has been

quarantined and is under the care of health workers."

World must prepare for potential pandemic - Chief

INTERNATIONAL - The World Health Organisation chief on Monday warned countries to prepare for a "potential pandemic" of the new coronavirus, calling the sudden increase in cases in Iran, Italy and South Korea "deeply concerning".

Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus also said, however, that a WHO joint mission to China that concluded on Monday found that the virus there "peaked" between January 23 and February 2 "and has been declining steadily since then".

"This virus can be contained. Indeed there are many countries that have done exactly that," he said, crediting the measures taken by China to lock down several cities for helping to prevent an even bigger spread.

The virus, first detected at the end of December, has killed more than 2 600 people so far - mostly in China.

The WHO has declared it a global health emergency but has stopped short of calling it a global pandem-

"For the moment we are not witnessing the uncontained global spread of this virus and we are not witnessing large-scale deaths," Tedros told reporters in Geneva.

He added, however, that countries should be "doing everything they can to prepare for a potential pan-

Trump's administration seeks R38bn funding to fight coronavirus

WASHINGTON - The Trump administration is asking Congress for \$2.5bn (R38bn) to fight the fast-spreading coronavirus, including more than R15bn for vaccines, the White House said on Monday.

With financial markets falling on concerns that the virus will have a significant impact on the global economy, the Trump administration is eager to show it is prepared to combat the virus despite the limited number of cases so far in the US.

The virus has spread to some 29 countries and territories beyond mainland China, with outbreaks in South Korea, Iran and Italy.

"The Trump administration continues to take the spread of the COVID-19 Coronavirus Disease very seriously. Today, the administration is transmitting to Congress

> plan to accelerate vaccine development, support preparedness and response activities and to procure much needed equipment and supplies," said Rachel Semmel, a spokesperson for the White House Office of Management

The money will be used for therapeutics, vaccine development and the stockpiling of personal protective equipment such as masks, the White House said.

Of the R38bn request, R22bn represents new funding. The rest would come from funds already budgeted by Congress, such as unused money to fight the Ebola virus. The administration requires congressional approval to redirect that money to fight the coronavirus.

House of Representatives Appropriations Committee Chairwoman Nita Lowey, a Democrat, said in a statement the Trump administration's funding request was "woefully insufficient to protect Americans from the deadly coronavirus out-

House Speaker Nancy Pelosi said late on Monday that the supplemental funding requested by Trump is "undersized" and "completely inadequate to the scale of this emergency".

"The House will swiftly advance a strong, strategic funding package that fully addresses the scale and seriousness of this public health crisis," Pelosi said in a statement.

The US has not seen the virus spread through its communities the way that China and other countries have experienced, but health officials are preparing for the possibility even as Americans affected so far have been quarantined. There have been 53 confirmed US cases of the new coronavirus so far -

14 in people diagnosed in the US and 39 among Americans repatriated from the outbreak's epicentre of Wuhan, China, and from the Diamond Princess cruise ship quarantined in Japan, according to the US Centres for Disease Control and Prevention. Reuters

TRUMP CLAIMS DEMOCRATS WILL STOP SANDERS

NEW YORK-US President Donald Trump predicted on Monday that the Democratic Party leadership would prevent front-runner Bernie Sanders from becoming its candidate in the November elections.

Sanders' leftist politics alarm many moderate Democrats, who fear that if he heads the ticket in the election, the party could face sweeping losses.

At the weekend, Sanders cemented his new status as the favourite to win the Democratic nomination with a clear victory in Nevada's primary.

Trump has nicknamed Sanders as 'Crazy Bernie' for his socialist policies, but also claimed that he could be a tough candidate to beat.

"They are going to take it away from 'Crazy Bernie,' they are not going to let him win," the president said during a visit to India.

"I actually think he would be tougher than most of the other candidates because he is like me, but I have a much bigger base."

German man drives car into Carnival crowd, injures 30

BERLIN - A man intentionally drove a car into a crowd at a Carnival parade in a small town in central Germany, injuring around 30 people including children, officials said Monday.

The driver, a 29-year-old German citizen who lived locally, was arrested at the scene in Volkmarsen near Kassel, about 280 kilometres (175 miles) southwest of Berlin, prosecutors said. He is being investigated on suspicion of attempted homi-

A spokesman for Frankfurt prosecutors, Alexander Badle, said in a statement that "about 30 people" were injured, among them children. They were taken to surrounding hospitals, some with life-threatening injuries. The suspect was also injured, said Badle.

"The investigation, especially into the circumstances of the crime, continues," he said. "In particular, no information can yet be provided about a motive. The investigation is explor-

ing all avenues."

German Chancellor Angela Merkel sent her condolences to those injured in the crash, wishing them a speedy and full recovery. She also thanked the police and all medical personnel involved.

Emergency responders set up a makeshift clinic in a town pharmacy to treat casualties with minor injuries, the regional Frankfurter Rundschau newspaper reported.

Witnesses said the car drove around a barrier blocking off traffic from the parade, according to the paper.

Video from the scene showed a silver Mercedes station wagon with local license plates on a sidewalk, its front windshield badly smashed and hood dented, and its hazard lights blinking, while emergency crews walked by. Forensic experts could be seen taking photos and measurements around the crashed car, walking around fragments of Carnival costumes that littered the ground.

3 charged after 11-year-old US girl gives birth in bath-tub

MISSOURI - Three relatives of an 11-year-old girl who gave birth in the bathtub of her suburban St Louis home are facing criminal charges.

An adult female and adult male are charged with child endangerment. A 17-year-old male is charged with incest as well as statutory rape and statutory sodomy of a child younger than 12. All three live in St Charles.

Police started investigating after the adult male brought an infant to a hospital on February 11. Charging documents said the baby still had the umbilical cord and placenta attached and had a body temperature of just 90 degrees.

The man initially said someone dropped the infant off on his front porch. He later explained that he was a relative. He said he did not know the girl was pregnant or that she was being sexually assaulted until she

gave birth.

During questioning, the teen told police he had sex with the girl about 100 times but did not know she was pregnant, according to charging doc-

The woman, who was charged on Tuesday, is accused of failing to provide the girl medical care when she gave birth.

Charged

The man was charged last week and bond was set at US\$10 000 cash only. Charging documents say he entered the country illegally and was previously deported.

Bail also was set at \$10,000 for the woman and US\$25 000 for the teen.

No attorneys are listed for them in online court records.

The Associated Press is not identifying the family members to protect the girl's identity.

NEW YORK - Former US president Barack Obama has paid tribute to Nasa mathematician Katherine Johnson, who died on Monday morning at the age of 101.

Johnson was one of the black women who played a crucial role in landing Nasa's Apollo 11 to the moon in 1969. She worked at NASA's Flight Research Division as a mathematician for more than three decades, but remained a hidden figure, reports New York Times.

In 2015, Johnson was awarded a presidential medal of freedom by Obama for her role at the space agency.

The former president shared a picture from the ceremony, saying 'after a lifetime of reaching for the stars, today, Katherine Johnson landed among them'.

The 1969 mission was not the only time Johnson proved herself to be one of the best minds in mathematics. According to BBC, her impeccable calculations helped put US astronaut John Glenn into orbit around the Earth in 1962.

She previously calculated trajectory for the first American in space, Alan Shepard,

Had it not been for Johnson, Glenn would not have carried out the 1969 mission, as he refused to fly until she verified the calculations.

Nasa released a statement on Monday, saying: "At NASA, we will never forget her courage and leadership, and the milestones we could not have reached without her. We will continue building on her legacy and work tirelessly to increase

Pope appears to give thumbs down to peace plan
Outrage over burning of effigy of gay parents

NEW YORK - Pope Francis on Sunday warned against 'inequitable solutions' to the Israeli-Palestinian conflict, saying they would only be a prelude to new crises, in an apparent reference to US President Donald Trump's Middle East peace proposal. Francis made his comments in the southern Italian port city of Bari, where he travelled to conclude a meeting of bishops from all countries in the Mediterranean basin. "The Mediterranean region is currently threatened by outbreaks of instability and conflict, both in the Middle East and different countries of North Africa, as well as between various ethnic, religious or confes-

sional groups," Francis said. AFP

CROATIA - A carnival in Croatia drew outrage on Monday after participants burned an effigy of a gay couple and child, weeks after a court granted same-sex couples the right to foster children. Huge dolls depicting two men kissing and holding a small doll resembling a child were set ablaze in front of a crowd of several hundred people during a carnival in the southern town of Imotski on Sunday.

It came just two weeks after Croatia's top court said that same-sex couples should be able to foster children, an issue that has provoked heated debate in the staunchly Catholic country.

Weinstein found guilty of sexual assault, rape

NEW YORK - Harvey Weinstein was convicted on Monday of sexual assault and rape but cleared of the most serious predatory sexual assault charges, a partial victory for the #MeToo movement that sparked a cascade of allegations against the disgraced Hollywood mogul. The jury of seven men and five women found the producer guilty of criminal sexual acts in the first degree and rape in the third degree, a measure of vindication for the dozens of women who came out against the one-time all-powerful filmmaker. However, the 67-year-old Oscar-winner who produced films including Shakespeare In Love was found not guilty of first-degree rape and predatory sexual assault charges that could have seen him jailed for life. Reuters

British boy, (3), drowns at waterpark

THAILAND - A three-year-old British boy drowned in front of his horrified parents after falling into a pool at a water park in Thailand. Bobby Watson slipped into the landing area of a flume at the Blue Tree Waterpark in Phuket yesterday afternoon.

Lifeguards dragged the struggling toddler from the water and performed CPR at the poolside but he was later pronounced dead in hospital. Bobby had been at the water park with his older brother Billy, seven, and his parents William and Sumitra, 35.

14 ARRESTED AS POLICE CLAMP DOWN ON 'GAS ATTACKS'

RUSTENBURG - Police in Zambia have arrested 14 more people in connection with the mob killings of people suspected of chemical spray attacks, local media reported.

The Zambia National Broadcasting Corporation said eight people were arrested in the Kaoma district of Western Province over the murder of 54year-old Clifford Nosiku by a mob on Friday after he was accused of being involved in the socalled 'gassing' assaults.

Police spokeswoman Esther Katongo told the broadcaster that those arrested included the deceased's nephew Sitwala Namate, who participated when the mob descended on the victim with sticks and stones, not realising it was his uncle. Other suspects have been identified as Kazhila Mutondo Clearance, Kaingu Sikasiye, Mushiba Mushoke, John Mukamba, Felix Mwinga, Moris Mubiana Mukelebai and Paul Misheki Katongo. Police arrested a further six suspects in

Kabwe, Central Province after another mob justice attack which killed the victim, suspected of a chemical spray attack at Katondo Primary School, Katongo said. Meanwhile, the Catholic Church in Zambia has called on its congregation not to participate in such incidents.

Criminal gangs in the southern African country have allegedly been using a chemical that immobilises their victim by making them dizzy.

Nearly 50 rhino killed in Botswana in 10 months

GABORONE - At least 46 rhinos have been slaughtered in Botswana in 10 months, a government official said on Monday as the southern African wildlife haven reported a surge in poaching of the endangered species.

The killings - slightly under 10 Pper cent of Botswana's total rhino population - have occurred in the northern Moremi Game Reserve since April last year.

"Poaching has risen at an alarming rate in this area," Moemi Batshabang, a Deputy Director with the government's wildlife department told

"I can attest that 46 rhinos have been killed by highly organised poachers between April last year to date," he said.

Botswana is home to 500 rhinos, according to international conservation charity, Save the

They are a protected species in Botswana and fall outside the government's recent decision to end a five-year ban on trophy-hunting licences, which is largely targeted at the burgeoning elephant population.

Most of the rhinos roam the grassy plains of the northern Okavango Delta, where Moremi Game Reserve is situated.. "The increase in poaching of both the black and white rhino is of concern and unusual," said Batshabang. The unprecedented rate of poaching last year prompted the government to warn that the rhino population could be wiped out in the southern African country by 2021. Thousands of rhinos that once roamed Africa and Asia have been culled by poaching and habitat loss. Very few are found outside national parks and reserves. Poaching is fuelled by a seemingly insatiable demand for rhino horn in Asia, where it is coveted as a traditional medicine or an aphrodisiac, and can fetch up to \$60 000 per kilogramme. ANA

HUNGER MAY SEE MORE MIGRANTS MOVING ACROSS SADC BORDERS

PRETORIA - The Southern Africa Development Community is besieged with massive food shortages as regional assessments indicate cereal deficits of millions of tons.

Last year, the United Nations said the region was facing the worst drought in decades, affecting around 45 million people in 14 countries.

Experts cite significantly less and late rainfall, coupled with long-term increases in temperatures, as the factors jeopardising the food security and energy supplies of millions of people in the region.

The worst affected nations include Namibia, Zambia and Zimbabwe.

Political analyst Tino Mambeu told African News Agency (ANA) that the current wave of hunger could trigger mass movements of people to economies perceived to be better off, in a region already struggling to cope with mass flows across borders.

"The current drought and poverty in the region will increase the movement of people from countries like Zimbabwe into South Africa. South Africa itself is facing challenges of a broken economy and unemployment," said Mambeu.

The influx of foreign nationals from Zimbabwe will heighten tensions and result in flare ups of xenophobic attacks."

Mambeu said food security and economic development had everything to do with good governance, transparency, investment in research, and proper management of resources.

"It all comes down to proper leadership skills, proper management of resources, and research. Zimbabwe has put more than US\$5 billion into 'Command Agriculture' since 2017 but at the moment the citizens are dying of hunger. Over five million Zimbabweans are reported to be at risk. ANA

Turmoil in Malaysia as PM Mahathir resigns

MALAYSIA - Malaysian Prime Minister Mahathir Mohamad resigned on Monday in a shock move after his political allies sought to bring down the government and block the succession of leader-inwaiting Anwar Ibrahim.

It came after months of rising tensions in the 'Pact of Hope' coalition, which stormed to a shock victory in 2018 against a corruption-plagued government that had ruled Malaysia for six decades.

But there were calls for Mahathir, the world's oldest leader at 94, to stay in office from allies who insisted he had not backed the formation of a new government and had quit in disgust at the plot.

The political drama began on Sunday when Anwar's rivals from the ruling coalition and opposition politicians held a series of meetings around Kuala Lumpur, stoking speculation a new alliance was taking shape.

That coalition would reportedly have excluded Anwar, Mahathir's presumptive successor and a former opposition icon who was jailed for years on questionable sodomy charges, blocking his ascent to the premiership.

With the fate of the government still uncertain Monday, Mahathir submitted his resignation to the king. The monarch accepted it, but appointed him interim leader until a new premier is found, according to an official statement. News24

Journalist Kabendera freed after pleading guilty

TANZANIA - Tanzanian journalist Erick Kabendera, who was held in jail for seven months in a case that prompted international concern, was freed yesterday after pleading guilty to economic crimes.Kabendera, a reporter for local and international press outlets, was initially detained for questioning over his citizenship before the charges were upgraded to sedition. But both lines of enquiry were dropped, and Kabendera was charged in August with tax evasion, money laundering and organised crime. His detention provoked outrage, with rights groups demanding Kabendera be released and warnings that the case reflected worsening press freedoms under President John Magufuli, who came to power in 2015. AFP

Mali seeks to negotiate with jihadists

MALI - With violence wreaking havoc across UGANDA - Kyadondo East MP Robert Kyagulanyi, the country, authorities in Mali are now looking for new avenues to reach a settlement with Islamist insurgents operating in the northern part of the West African country. Malian President Ibrahim Boubacar Keita recently said that his government was ready to hold talks with the main jihadist leaders in the country. "Why not try to contact those who we know are pulling the strings," Keita told French media last week. "The number of deaths in the Sahel is becoming exponential. It's time for certain avenues to be explored." Mali has been struggling to contain a jihadist rebellion that erupted in the country in 2012.

KINSHASA - The World Health Organisation is urgently appealing for \$40 million to salvage its operation to bring the Ebola epidemic to an end in eastern Democratic Republic of Congo.

The Ebola operation in eastern DR Congo's conflict-ridden North Kivu and Ituri provinces is on financial life-support. The World Health Organisation reports its coffers will be empty at the end of this month. It is urging donors to step up immediately and contribute the money needed to tackle this virulent disease. WHO spokesman Tarik Jasarevic says failure to support this operation would be tragic as good progress is being made in containing the Ebola virus.

TREVOR NOAH WAS ON ELLEN'S SHOW

HOLLYWOOD - Two weeks after playing tennis with partner Rafael Nadal in a celebrity doubles encounter against Roger Federer and Bill Gates in SA, comedian Trevor Noah has recounted to television star Ellen DeGeneres how he prepped for the match.

Appearing as a guest on Ellen's talk show on Monday, Trevor spoke about the challenges of learning how to play tennis and how he trained for two months for the Match in Africa charity event that took place in Cape Town on 7 February.

'The Daily Show' host told Ellen how his coach found it hard to teach him tennis and how his coach was scared on his behalf that he was playing with big names.

"People think tennis is easy. I could not hit the ball to where I was trying to hit the ball, and then I panicked. I then got a tennis coach."

Given two months to learn how to play tennis, Trevor said his coach initially thought he had some sort of experience on the court, and didn't know how he was going to coach

"I played every single day for two and a half hours, just learning how to play tennis. What



was wild was that I get this tennis coach. The Roger Federer people called the tennis coach and they got hey, this guy needs a coach, they think I'm a professional, so they go oh, we've got the right person.

"This guy trains professionals but I need to be trained like a child. I don't know how to play the game. So, I get there and he's like, 'you ready to play some tennis', and I'm like 'yeah'."

After his coach realised that Trevor had trouble on his hands because he didn't know how to play tennis, he was taught from scratch how to play the

"So, now he doesn't know how to coach me so he hits the ball but he doesn't know how to teach me because I'm just useless.

He hits the ball to me and it goes in a different direction and then he says, "just keep going, brush the ball, Trevor, just brushhhh it'."

Reflecting on the match, Trevor took to Twitter: "To say tonight was a dream come true is an understatement. We helped raise more than US\$3 million (nearly R45m) to help spur education in Africa."

The match organisers confirmed the crowd of 50 154 broke the world record attendance figure for a tennis match set in November last year, beating a match held in Mexico City in front of 42 517 fans.

MADRID - Manchester City will be up against both Real Madrid and their reputation today as the Champions League's biggest winners play one of its biggest underachievers at the Santiago Bernabeu.

After City's win over Leicester on Saturday, Pep Guardiola said: "We will try to be ourselves. We can win and we can lose but we must try to be ourselves."

Yet in some ways, City will seek a role reversal too. Madrid's record is the envy of Europe but in particular by teams like City, whose financial might and technical talent has translated only into disappointment outside domestic competition.

In the time City have won three Premier League titles and five domestic cups, they have gone past the Champions League's quarter-finals only once, reaching the last four in 2016, only to be beaten by Madrid.

Zinedine Zidane's side, meanwhile, have surrendered dominance in La Liga to Barcelona but made amends for one Spanish league title in seven years by winning an four Champions Leagues out of the last six.

Few would argue that quality explains difference. Madrid's success has certainly been due in

part to the brilliance of Cristiano Ronaldo but City have perhaps boasted an even better all-round collection of players and their excellence in England points to a club well-equipped to excel in Europe



Four members of the Saudi royal family sat incognito at ringside here on Saturday night as Fury transformed not only himself with a phenomenal crushing of the biggest puncher in ring history but also the entire landscape of heavyweight boxing.

The Saudi party dressed in Western fashion was led by Prince Khaled, which will alarm Joshua's promoter Eddie Hearn. It was with this high-ranking dignitary that he collaborated on AJ's vastly enriching December rematch with Andy Ruiz Jr in Riyadh.

Khaled, who is delegated by Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman to bring to Saudi Arabia the major sports events, which can polish the nation's troubled human rights image.

They consider nothing and noone bigger now than the Gypsy King, who not only established himself as the pre-eminent heavyweight in the world today with the outstanding performance overseas by any British fighter in history but also reaffirmed his reputation as the ring's great entertainer. The Saudis were given a preview of Fury the showman when he made a pilot appearance in WWE wrestling in Riyadh before Christmas and it seems not to matter to them whoever Fury fights, nor in what order. He is seen as the key to unlocking a floodgate of international tourism.

Joshua banked US\$85 million for regaining his collection of belts from Ruiz in a temporary arena there. Now they envisage a series of fights for Fury in the national

stadium, the first in October, which could make him rich beyond the dreams of Croesus.

Who against? Well, Wilder expects it to be him. The Bronze Bomber said on Monday night he will trigger a rematch clause for the final part of a trilogy against Fury this summer. Due to the intensity of the games, today we are looking at concussion. Concussion is defined as a complex pathophysiological process affecting the brain, induced by traumatic biomechanical forces.

RISK FACTORS

Previous concussion -a history of concussion substantially increases the risk of recurrence and prolonged recovery from subsequent injury. Patients with unresolved symptoms from a prior injury appear to be at greatest risk; recurrent injury is most likely to occur within the first 10 days after the initial injury.

- · Younger age The developing brain may be more susceptible to concussion.
- Higher risk sports such as American football, ice hockey, rugby, and boys' and men's lacrosse, have the highest concussion rates
- Gender females sustain more concussions than their male counterparts when playing the same sport under similar rules.

CAUSES

Concussion may be caused by a direct blow to the head, face, neck, or elsewhere on the body with an "impulsive" force transmitted to the head.

CONCUSSION



CLINICAL PRESENTATION

Any new neurologic symptom that develops following sports-related head trauma, whether direct or indirect, strongly suggests the diagnosis of concussion.

 Physical – Headache, nausea, vomiting, balance problems, incoordination, dizziness, visual problems, fatigue, photophobia, phonophobia, numbness/tingling, neck pain. An on-field complaint of dizziness by the athlete is among the best predictors of concussion with a protracted recovery

- · Cognitive Feeling mentally foggy or slow, disorientation, difficulty concentrating, difficulty remembering, slow or incoherent speech, word-finding difficulty, slowed reaction time.
- Emotional Irritability, sadness, emotional lability, nervousness, behavioral changes. As changes in mood may be difficult to gauge, it can be helpful to question family, coaches, teammates, or friends to help determine the athlete's baseline.
- Sleep-related Drowsiness, somnolence

Observation - Look closely for signs of disequilibrium and lack of coordination. During the evaluation, be aware of concerning abnormalities such as inattentiveness, confusion, atypical emotionality like crying or laughter that is inappropriate or out of character for the athlete or problems following instructions or focusing on a task.

Memory and attentiveness - After the initial symptom review, assess memory and attentiveness. Deficits in recall and concentration are common with a concussion.

Neurologic examination - You should look closely for focal deficits like weakness of an extremity, speech difficulty, which may signify more serious into nial pathology.

Be certain to include the following elements:

- Cranial nerve testing
- Strength and sensation testing
- Vestibular and ocular motor assess-
- Balance assessment

ON-FIELD OR SIDELINE EVALUATION OF ACUTE CONCUSSION

When a player shows any features of a concussion: - The player should be medically evaluated on-site using stan-

dard emergency management principles and attention should be given to excluding a cervical spine injury.

The appropriate disposition of the player must be determined by the treating healthcare provider in a timely manner. If no healthcare provider is available, the player should be safely removed from practice or play and urgent referral to a physician arranged.

EVALUATION IN EMERGENCY ROOM BY MEDICAL PERSONNEL

Here you need a medical assessment including a comprehensive history and a detailed neurological examination including a thorough assessment of mental status, cognitive functioning and gait and balance. A determination of the clinical status of the player including whether there has been improvement or deterioration since the time of injury. This may involve seeking additional information from parents, coaches, teammates and eyewitnesses to the injury. A determination of the need for emergency neuroimaging in order to exclude a more severe brain injury involving a structural abnormality is needed. Players and officials should know that only team medic is allowed to send player back to the field of play so let's give medics enough time to access and manage according to his expertise and refer when there is a need.

Accordingn to a press statement from Zimbabwe Football Association Communications and Competitions Manager Xolisani Gwesela, CAF has made a decision to bar ZIFA from using local stadiums in all upcoming international matches.

"The decision by CAF comes against the background of a CAF stadium inspection, which was conducted in November 2019 and the subsequent inspection report circulated on December 1, which stipulated areas of improvement for our three stadiums, Barbourfields, Mandava and the National Sports Stadium (NSS), to be fully homologated. While Mandava and NSS were completely struck off the roster, Barbourfields was provisionally certified on the condition that issues raised in the inspection report would be addressed." reads the statement.

Authorities

Stadium authorities were notified of CAF's position and the urgent nature of the situation at hand. "To date, neither of the three stadium authorities has requested us to invite CAF for another inspection, a position which CAF has said led to the decision to bar all three stadiums from hosting international matches. While ZIFA is engaging CAF with a view to appeal this decision, we have asked stadium authorities to send us commitment letters detailing timelines on work that needs to be done before CAF comes for another inspection. Once we receive such commitment, we will send to CAF. We have been using stadiums which do not meet CAF and FIFA standards for a while now, but we need to put our heads together as a country to ensure that our stadiums are renovated to meet required standards," reads the statement. Meanwhile, Zimbabwe has started the process of looking for an alternative venue in neighbouring countries to host their upcoming matches.
