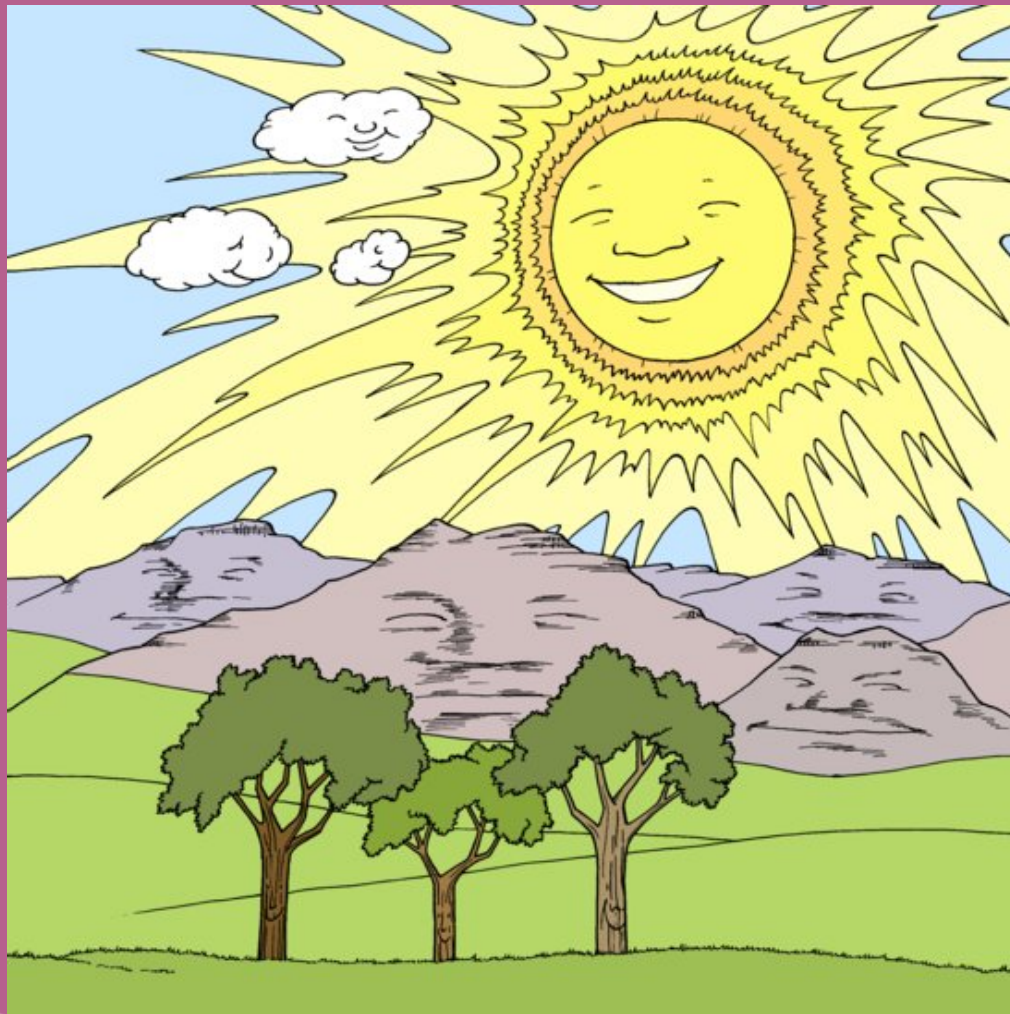


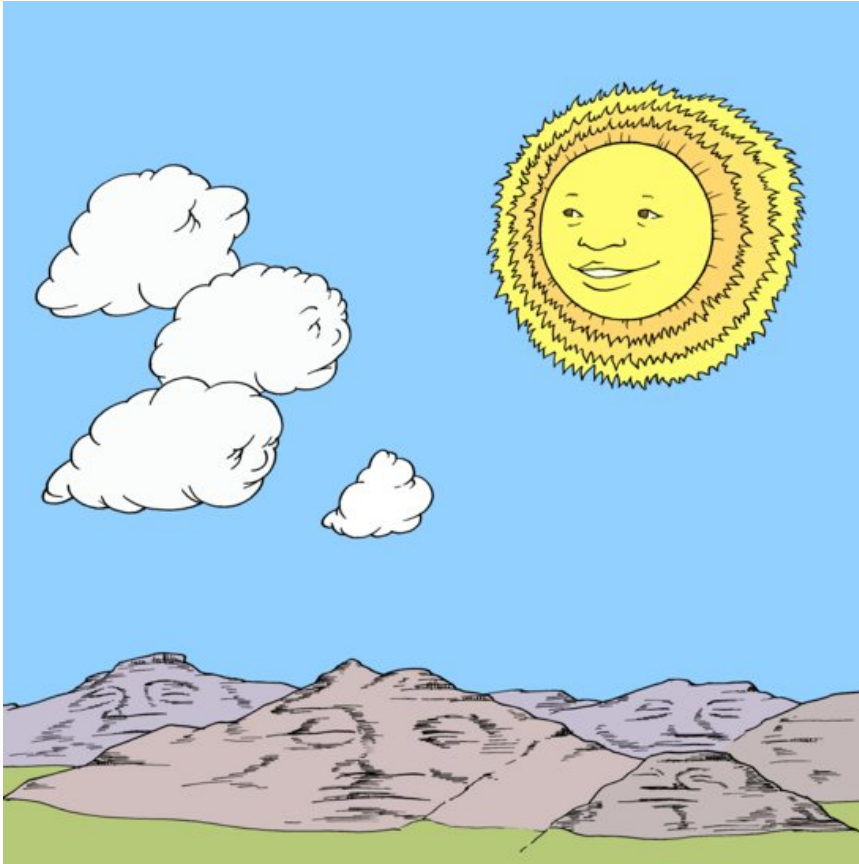
Day the sun went away

When Sun left, the mountains put on their white scarves.





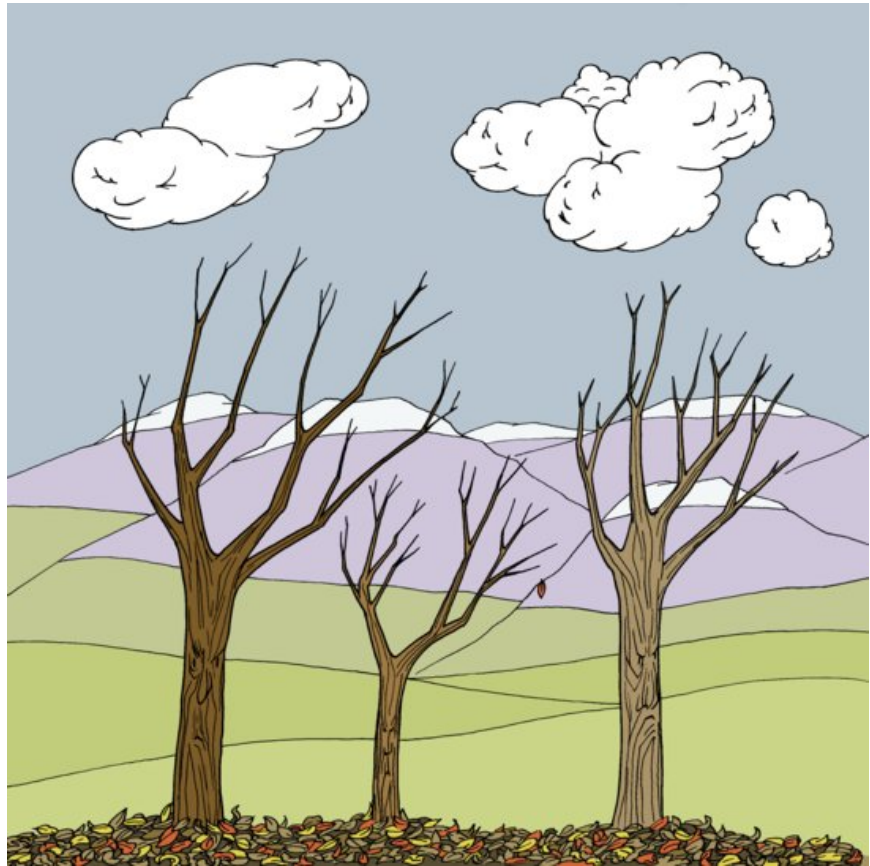
Wind had an argument
with the trees.

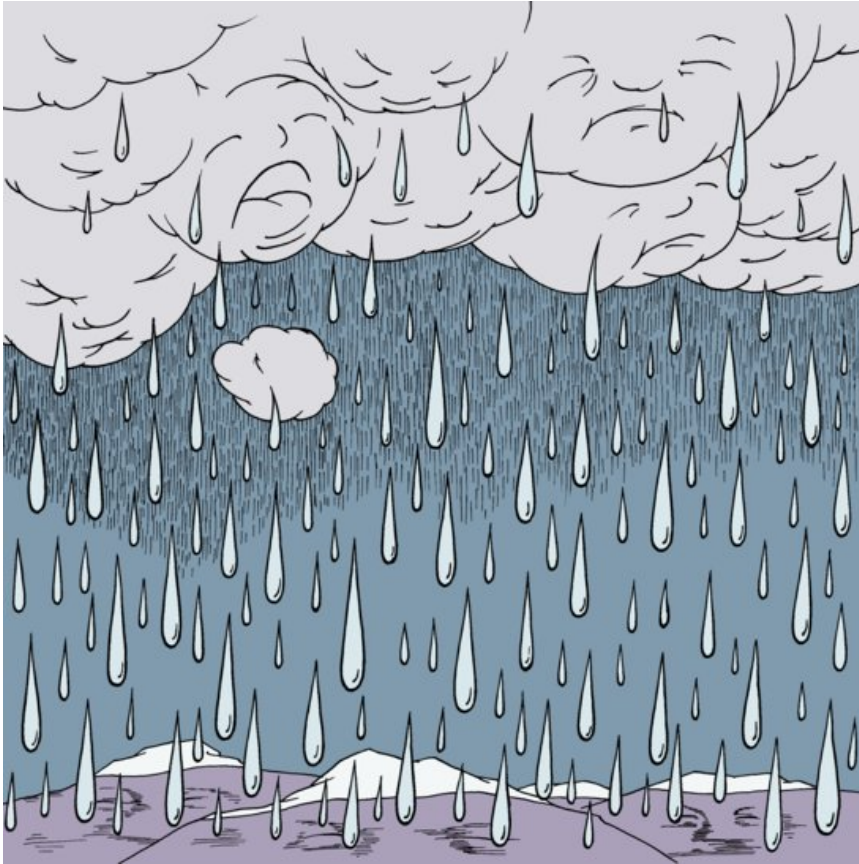
The trees became angry.

They started crying.

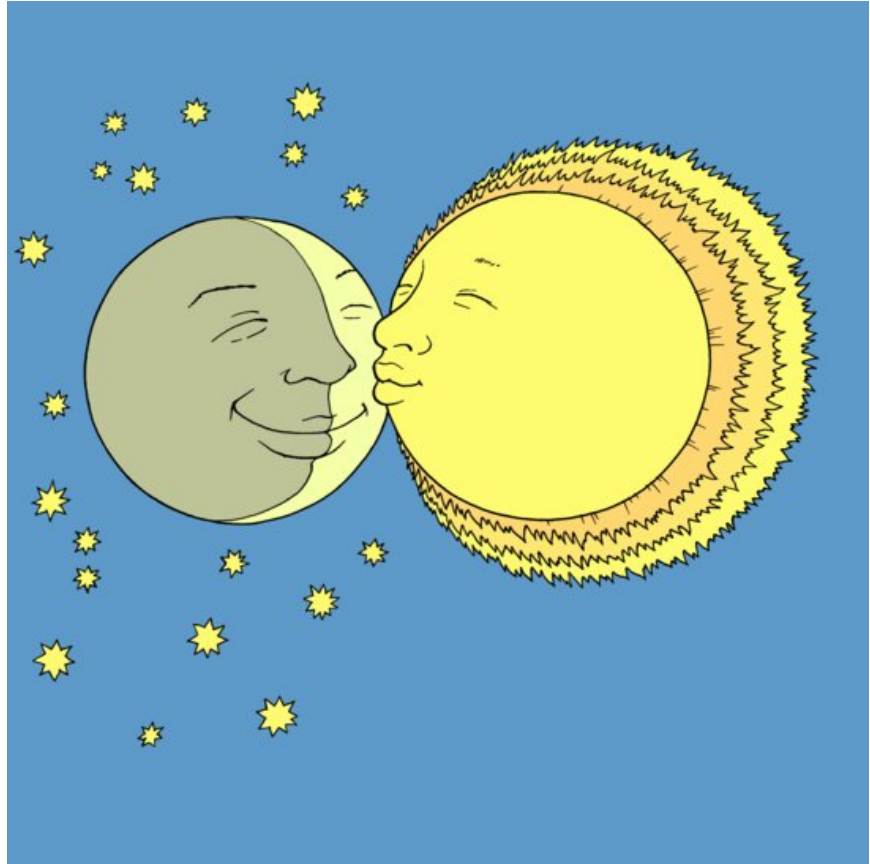
There were many tears.

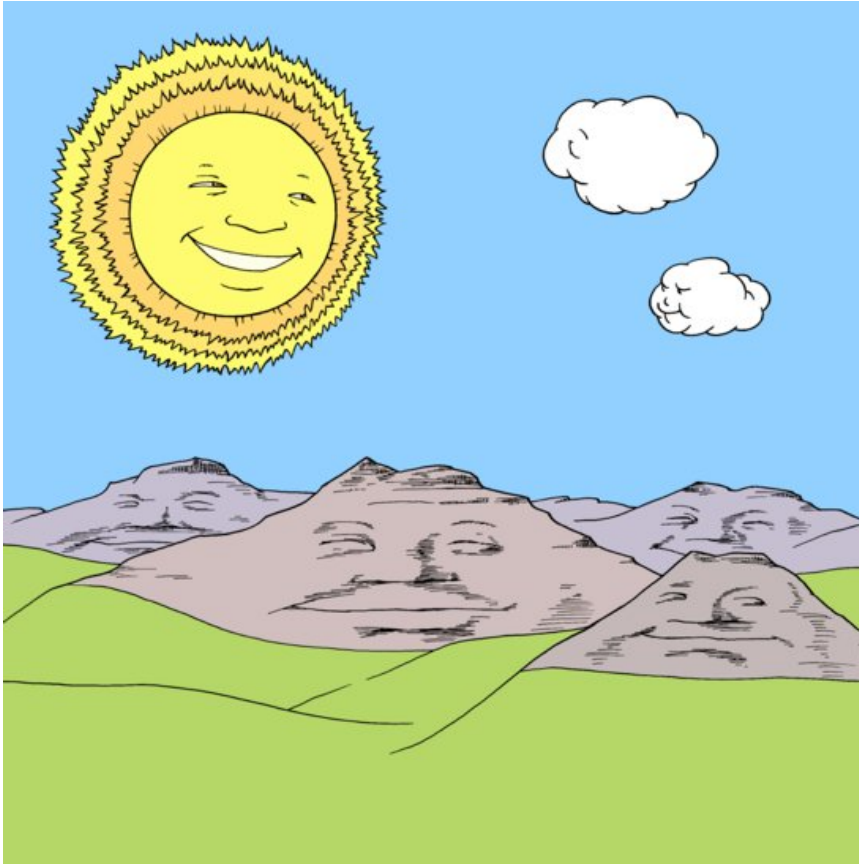
The whole world began

goodbye and went home.



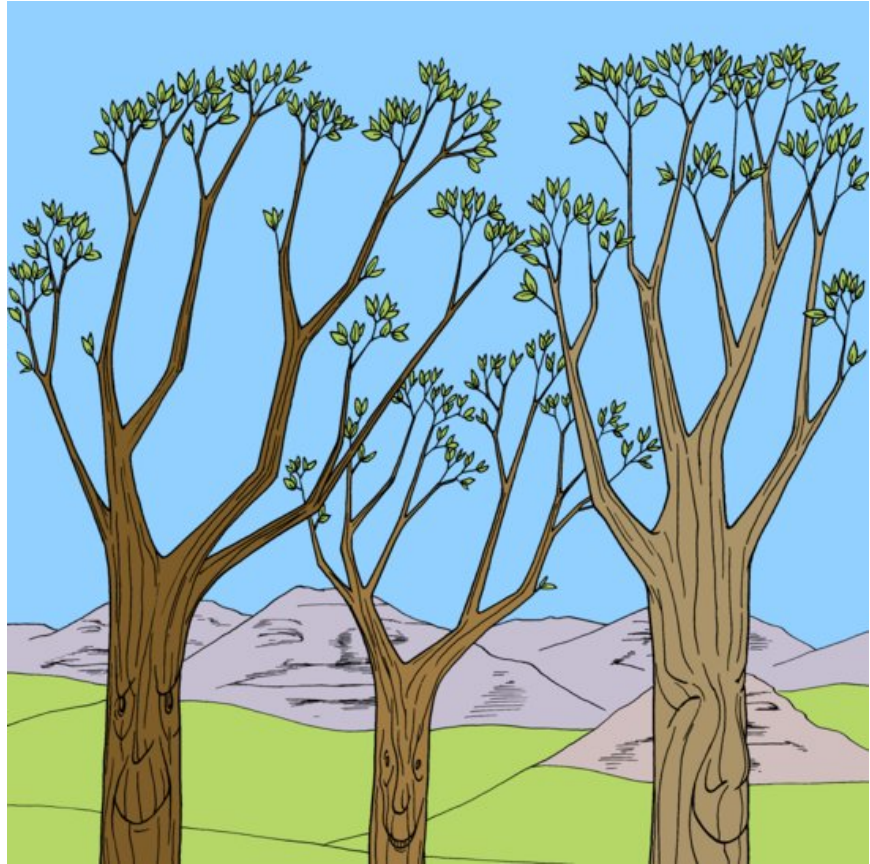


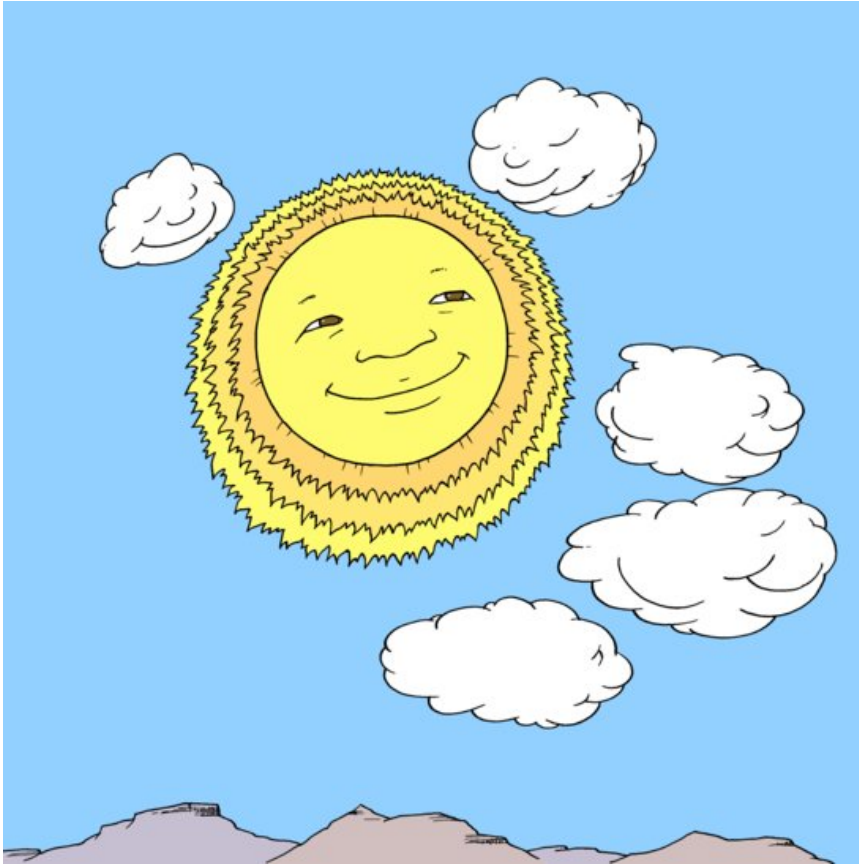
Sky was so happy to see Sun that she turned bright blue.

branches and smiled.





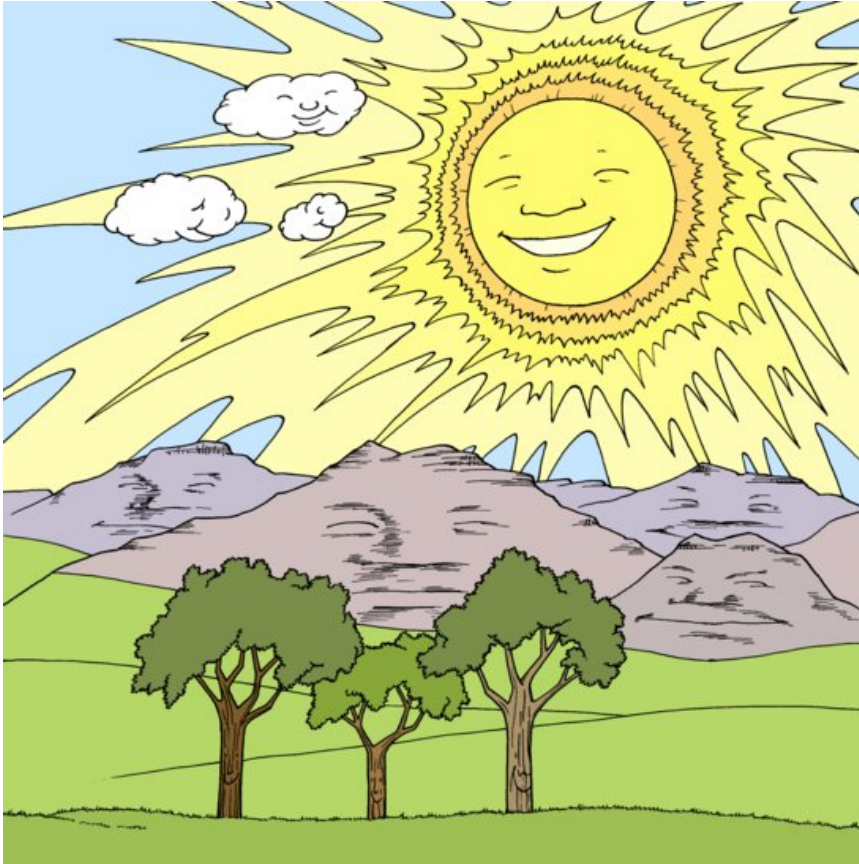
The clouds were very happy to see mother Sun again.
