- 2 *'Funeral services are a great help to the people who are left behind.'*
- (a) Describe the funeral services of Islam and Judaism. [10]
- (b) Explain how these services might help and comfort the followers of these religions. [15]
- 3 *'Whenever we eat we should thank God for our food.'*
- (a) Describe how followers of **two** of the religions which you have studied thank God for their food. [10]
- (b) Explain why these people might feel that it is important to thank God in this way. [15]
- 4 *'All people really worship the same God.'*
- (a) For **two** of Christianity, Islam and Judaism, describe what people believe about God. [10]
- (b) Explain why people might agree **or** disagree with the statement at the beginning of this question. [15]
- 5 *'Leaders such as imams, priests and rabbis are unnecessary.'*
- (a) Describe the work of **two** of the following: an imam, a priest and a rabbi. [10]
- (b) Explain why this work is so important to a religious community. [15]
