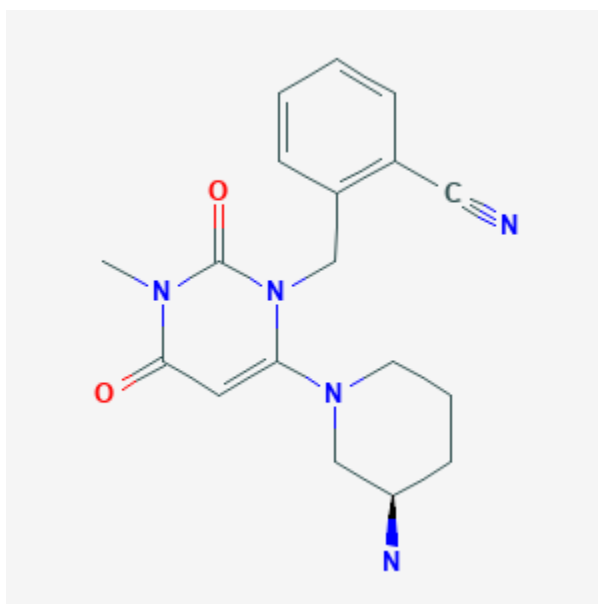

Summary of Use during Lactation
