It is an honour for us to welcome you all to the fourth conference and workshop on Digital Audio Effects, this time at the University of Limerick in Ireland! It is a great responsibility to attempt to follow the success of previous conferences in Barcelona, Trondheim and Verona.

Delegates of from all the ten countries of the COST Action G6 Management Committee have been collaborating reviewing and selecting the 50 papers in the volume. In these courses we teach and research several of the topics related to the DAFx community such as acoustics, psychoacoustics, sound synthesis and analysis, filtering, recording and various other audio processing techniques.

Limerick is one of the cities in Ireland established by the Vikings in the 9th century. There are no visible remains from this period anymore, but the city centre still has several historical sites such as Saint Mary's Cathedral, King John's Castle, the Hunt Museum, and numerous Georgian buildings. In the surrounding county Limerick you have some of the richest farmland in the country, as well as the breathtaking Atlantic coast in the west, in our neighbour counties Clare and Kerry.

During your stay in Limerick, I hope you will meet friends and colleagues from the digital audio effects community, as well as Limerick people who I'm sure you will find to be people who care about people. I also hope you get the time to sit down in a real Irish pub with some of Ireland's famous beverages, and perhaps contemplate writing a Limerick!

Finally, I would like to thank all friends, colleagues and postgraduates who have worked intensively to make this conference possible. I would also like to thank the COST Action G6 Management committee for all their hard work and all the fun we have had over the last few years.
